Sacked Min's bodyguard opens fire at protesters, kills 1; MEA says India 'closely following' developments in Colombo

One person has been killed and two others injured in Sri Lanka's capital, Colombo, when the bodyguard of a Cabinet Minister under ousted Prime Minister Ranil Wickremeringhe appeal for the Mickremeringhe appeal for the state of Wickremesinghe opened fire at a crowd of protesters. The shooting on Sunday came amid a constitutional crisis triggered by President Maithripala Sirisena's sacking of the Prime Minister and his Cabinet.

Ruwan Gunasekara, a police spokesperson, told reporters that a bodyguard for Arjuna Ranatunga, Wickremesinghe's Petroleum Minister, fired live rounds at a crowd of people loyal to Sirisena when they attempted to prevent the dismissed Minister from entering his office at the State-run Ceylon Petroleum Corporation.

Meanwhile, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said India is "closely following" developments in Colombo. "India is closely following the recent political developments in Sri Lanka. As a democracy and a close friendly neighbour, we hope that democratic values and the constitutional process will be respected. We will continue to extend our developmental assistance to the friendly peo-ple of Sri Lanka," said MEA Raveesh Kumar.

A 34-year-old man was

killed in the incident, according to police. The guard who opened fire was arrested and a probe is now under way, police said. The shooting was the first incident of serious violence since Sirisena's Friday decision to Wickremesinghe replace

Mahinda Rajapaksa, a former president accused of human rights abuses and corruption. Wickeremesinghe, 69, insists his sacking was unconstitutional and has called for an emergency parliament sitting to prove he still commanded a

majority in Parliament.

But Sirisena has suspended Parliament until November 16 in an apparent bid to shore up support for Rajapaksa's pointment.

Speaker Karu Jayasuriya recognised Wickremesinghe as the lawful Prime Minister earlier on Sunday, and asked the president to back the sacked leader's request to retain the "rights and privileges" of his office until another candidate could prove a majority in Parliament.

"I consider the said request to be a democratic and fair request," the Parliament privileges and security until another candidate could prove a majority, saying it was "democratic and fair'

He also questioned the President's decision to suspend Parliament till November 16, saying it will have "serious and undesirable" consequences on the country.

Sirisena on Friday night sacked Wickremesinghe and appointed former strongman Rajapaksa as the new Prime Minister. Next day, Sirisena suspended Parliament till November 16 Wickremesinghe, who had termed his sacking as illegal and unconstitutional, sought an emergency session to prove

his majority.

The President also withdrew Wickremesinghe's personal security and vehicles in order to accord them to his 72year-old successor, who staged a dramatic political comeback.

In his first address to the nation after sacking Wickremesinghe, Sirisena said his former ally's political conduct since the victory in 2015 elections was unbecoming. "He appeared to treat Sri

Lanka's future as a joyride for a coterie of people around him who had no sense of the common man's thinking," he said. "He completely destroyed the concept of good governance while corruption and waste

became rampant.

### **BJP slams Cong over Tharoor's 'scorpion'** metaphor against PM

m ormer}$  Union Minister Shashi Tharoor has triggered a major controversy by claiming that an unnamed RSS leader had compared Prime Minister Narendra Modi to "a scorpion sitting on a Shivling" and terming it as an extraordinarily striking metaphor. The BJP has slammed Tharoor and asked an apology from the Congress leadership.

In his speech at the Bangalore Literary festival on Sunday, Tharoor said "...There is an extraordinarily striking metaphor expressed by an unnamed RSS source to a journalist which I quote, in which they express their frustration with their inability to curb Mr Modi. The man says Modi is like a scorpion sitting on a Shivling. You cannot remove him with a hand and you cannot hit it with a chappal either,"

Suggesting that it was a very profound understanding of the relationship, the Congress leader said, "Because,



if you remove a scorpion with your hand, you will get stung very badly. If you hit

Shivling with a chappal, then you have undermined all the sacred tenets of the faith."

This might well be a very interesting clue to the rather complex dynamics that exists 'between the Hindutva movement and the Moditva expression...," he added.

Lashing out at Tharoor, Union Law Minister Ravishankar Prasad alleged that Tharoor had disrespected Lord Shiva and sought an apology from Congress president Rahul Gandhi.

## Boxing champ-turned gangster held

#### Vicky had jumped interim bail in a Rohtak student's murder case; was carrying reward of ₹50K

**STAFF REPORTER** ■ NEW DELHI

A junior national boxing champion Vicky (28) — allegedly joined Ashok Pradhan gang to threaten witnesses in a murder case he was involved in — was arrested by the Special Cell of the Delhi Police from Mohan Garden area in Dwarka, police said on Sunday.

After receiving a tip-off that the gang had roped in gangster Vicky, who was involved in the murder of a student at Jat College, Rothak, a team of Special Cell investigating Pradhan gang's activities turned up at the spot.

"Regular efforts were made to nab Vicky, Pradhan and

their other absconding associates. Finally, on Saturday, at about 4 pm, after getting information that Pradhan and Vicky will arrive at Dwarka, Mohan Garden in West Delhi to meet some of their close aides, a raiding party was rushed to the spot," Deputy Commissioner of Police (Special Cell) Sanjeev Kumar Yadav said. In April 2018, during stu-

dents' election at Jat College in Rohtak, he supported Hardik. Following a quarrel with some people, he along with four associates murdered the student near a Dhaba at Sheela bypass, Rohtak, police said.

"And on Saturday, Vicky was found wandering near the



was waiting for his accomplices to turn up. However, even till 6.10 pm, neither Pradhan nor any other person turned up to meet him. After seeing police, he started to run away from the spot but was arrested. One loaded semi-automatic country made pistol with two live rounds were recovered from his possession," said the DCP.

During interrogation, the accused told police that he had joined Pradhan gang to terrorise witnesses in the murder case he was involved in. He wanted the witnesses to either turn hostile or reach a compromise, police said.

But Pradhan asked Vicky to help him identify and trace one Sunil Kumar of Najafgarh, whom Pradhan suspected to be a sympathiser of their rival Tillu gang, said police, adding that there is a long history of gang war in Najafgarh, Alipur and adjoining areas of Delhi, said police.

Gogi gang is one among the desperate gangs having rivalry with Tillu gang. Both

the gang members keep on roping in new recruits and also members of other gangs. It is learnt through sources, that as of now, Pradhan has joined hands with Gogi gang and roped in Vicky," said an officer

looking after the case.
According to police, Vicky was previously arrested in nine cases, including a murder case, rioting, and attempt to murder case and more. He was first arrested in 2011, in a murder case and attempt to murder case and remained in jail for 13 months.

"He was arrested in the case of murder of the student but on July 2018, he obtained four-day interim bail to attend the marriage function of his brother and sister, however, he did not surrender afterwards and jumped the bail. A reward of ₹50,000 was declared by Haryana Police for his arrest," the DCP said.

### Missing 8-yr-old girl's body found in trolley bag at park

An eight-year-old girl, who had gone missing from North Delhi district a few days ago, was found mur-dered on Sunday. Her body stuffed in a trolley bag was recovered from the Yamuna Biodiversity Park, police said on Sunday.

Police officials suspect that the girl was sexually assaulted before being murdered. Police are also scanning through profiles of missing girls and trying to identify the deceased, Deputy Commissioner of Police (North) Nupur Prasad said.

Once the process is over and body identified parents of the missing girl will be informed with chances high of police getting further lead into the crime to crack the case. According to police, at around 7.30 am, a call was



received about an unclaimed bag lying near the roadside and the body was found stuffed inside the bag. Preliminary reports said the body had strangulation marks on the neck, indicating that she might have been strangled to death.
"A cloth was tied around

her neck," the DCP said. The body was taken to the

Aruna Asaf Ali Hospital for post-mortem examination. The DCP said a crime team has visited the spot.



## **Ayodhya getting ready** for spectacular Diwali

Uttar Pradesh government foundation of a ₹50-crore has planned a big religious programme in Ayodhya this Diwali when it will once again try to create a world record by lighting over three lakh earthen lamps on the banks of the Saryu river during Deepotsava. The three-day programme will be attend by Governor Ram Naik, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath and other dignitaries. But the main attraction of the Diwali celebration will be the First Lady of South Korea, Kim Jung-sook, the wife of South Korean President Moon Jae-in.

She will attend the programme on November 6, when three lakh earthen lamps will be lighted. In 2017, over 1.71 lakh diyas were lighted, creating a Guinness record.

Faizabad District Magistrate Anil Kumar told The Pioneer that potters from all over Avodhya and its surrounding places were making diyas.

A team of Guinness expert team will be reaching Ayodhya next week for preliminary assessment. The lamps will be lit at Ram Ki Paidi by over 5,000 volunteers. Yogi Adityanath will light the first

During the celebration, the

memorial of Queen Hur Hwang-ok also known as Suriratna, a princess of Avodhva who went to South Korea and married the king, will also be laid. Last year, Diwali celebrations in the temple town were limited to one day while this time it will be a three-day affair starting from November 4. The government has arranged helicopters to recreate the scene of Lord Ram's homecoming along with Sita after killing demon king Ravan. The UP Tourism department is organising a series of events to celebrate Diwali in Ayodhya. All prominent buildings, temples and ghats in the town are being decorated while many cultural programmes are being organised for the grand event.

Meanwhile, the government released the entire programme of the Deepotsava starting from November 4. On the first day, a competition for best Ram and Sita will be held at Ram ki Paidi and the first prize winner will be given ₹51,000 in cash.

On the second day, a rangoli competition will be organspecial diya having a diameter ised at different places in dance by the Korean team.

This Kumbh Mela, which

will start from January 14 and continue till March 4, will be the costliest one ever held. The UP government has estimated an expenditure of Rs 4,200 crore on this Kumbh Mela. During Akhilesh Yadav regime in 2013, the expenditure on Kumbh was Rs 1,200

According to officials, the UP government has sought an assistance of Rs 2,200 crore from the Central government for Kumbh and the Centre has in principle agreed to pay Rs 1,200 crore.

Congress-led UPA regime, then Prime Minister Manmohan Singh had given just Rs 341 crore to then Chief Minister Akhilesh Yadav for organising

The Yogi Adityanath government has so far released only Rs 1,000 crore for Kumbh. With the Centre promising Rs 1,200 crore, the gap between the estimated expenditure and money in the kitty is huge. The government is trying to fill this gap by asking different departments to divert money meant for con-struction of roads, school buildings or restoring power

supply to Kumbh Mela. A stir was created early this week during a review meeting when a senior official in the ment in UP told state minister Suresh Khanna that no infrastructure development work could be carried out as the most of the funds had been diverted for Kumbh Mela, leaving the department high and

Soon after, PWD officials also started complaining that funds were being systematically diverted for the Kumbh and this had adversely affected restoration of roads.

"The government's priority projects like gaddha mukt sadak (pothole-free roads) have been severally hit by paucity of funds. The money has been diverted to spruce up roads in Allahabad (Prayagraj) where Kumbh will be held early next year," said a senior official on condition of anonymity.
Officials, however, say that

sufficient funds have been sanctioned for Kumbh and there is no diversion of funds.

### Two drug peddlars arrested

wo persons were arrested in ■ Bareilly in a joint operation by Special Task Force (STF) and Bareilly unit of Central Narcotics Bureau for drug peddling on Sunday.

The team recovered one kilogram of heroin which costs to ₹25 lakh in Indian market and ₹3 crore in International

The recovered heroin had its colour is pink and is not of off-white colour.

Those arrested were identified as Wasim Khan and Nahim Khan, both of Bareilly. The team also recovered a Renault car, ₹5200, three ATM

cards and other documents from the miscreants.

The police said it got a tipoff that infamous drug peddler Taimur aka Bhola, who is carrying a cash prize of ₹1 lakh, had placed an order for heroin from a Manipur based drug peddler and he would deliver the same to some persons in Hapur. On the information, a team put a tab on the activities of Taimur and his aides and nabbed them later.

Both the accused confessed to their crime and disclosed that they were carrying the drugs on instruction of Taimur, his brother Saddam and their aide Nabi Khan. They disclosed that they used to get the delivery of the drug packets at Satellite bus station in Bareilly and later used to deliver the same to the addresses they were told about. They disclosed that they used get peddler 20,000 each for the packet for delivering successfully in UP while peddler 50,000 for each packet for a delivery outside UP. The said that they were going to Hapur to deliver the goods when they were nabbed. It surfaced that the accused persons had supplied the drug packets at different addresses as many as 25 times in the past. The police found that drug peddling was done of a large scale in Behra Padera village of Bareilly.

The area used to remain abuzz with activities and so there is little threat perception in the mind of parents and they used to allow their children to go all alone. The girl

she did not return home. Her parents thought she would have stayed at the house of her grandparents who live close to the place where Majlis was held on Saturday and so they waited for her. On Sunday morning, the girl's father went out to search for her but did not find her anywhere including at the house of her grandparents. He later lodged a case with the police at 11.31 am on

On the other hand, the residents lambasted the Thakurganj police for failing to put a curb on the crime front. "In the recent past, two brothers -- Imran and Arman — were peppered with bullets in full public view. After a case was registered, the police swung into action and started searching for the missing girl. Around 12.30 pm, some residents informed the police about a girl's body lying in the thickets near Gaughat power house. Later, the girl's father went to the place and he identified the body. "I have asked the police to register a case of murder, rape and also slap provisions of POCSO Act on unidentified miscreant(s). The father of the girl had suspected rape and murder. The circumstantial evidence also indicate the same," SSP Kalanidhi Naithani said. Defending public criticism that the police acted late in the case and that resulted into the murder of the girl, SHO said a case was registered immediately after the girl's father lodged a case with the police. He said the police had obtained the autopsy report and section of murder, rape would be added to the case.

The autopsy report remained inconclusive about the sexual assault. The SHO claimed that the girl was attacked on her head and was smothered to death by miscreants. "The report on sexual assault is inconclusive. We are sending the sample of swab to the forensic lab for further examination. If the report ascertains the sexual assault, the section of rape will be added to the case," he said.

From these camps the realisation came that diabetes is much more common than thought of since in each camp 08-12 fresh cases were detected. He advocated that infections could be controlled but life style diseases with a genetic background like diabetes had grown into epidemic proportions. He said that state, individuals and professionals together by following preven-tive measures could contain

this epidemic since non-communicable diseases are great killers and containing them is more important than preparing for wars. He devoted most of his time in research at a bench in CDRI and in his clinics till 1980 when at age 36 he realised that medicine is all about patients and a physician should be patient-centric first. This changed the medical researcher in him into a practising physician.

#### **Hosp manager** held hostage; ₹1.5L looted

Law and order touched its nadir when a group of miscreants held a manager and staff of a private hospital hostage at the gun-point and looted Rs 1.5 lakh in Vibhuti Khand police station area on Sunday evening when the entire Lucknow police were on patrolling following instructions from senior officials. ASP (North) Anoop Singh said the findings did not match with the claims made by the hospital manager but the police would register a case as per the complaint. Manager of Rishi Hospital Sohrab Ahmad said he was sitting in his cabin when an unidentified man reached there. "He introduced himself as Anuj Yadav and told me that he had to discuss something. The ASP (North) said it surfaced that Ahmad was acquainted with some of the miscreants and most probably with the man who first came to the hospital. "It surfaced that the man, who came first, was in a drunken state and lost his cool when he was asked to leave the hospital. The miscreant later called his friends who reached the scene and broke flower pots and other furniture at the hospital. They apparently had differences with the hospital staff. We will register a case as per the complaint," he

with the Central Pollution Control Board figures displaying 'AQI 323' on Sunday. A scientist from Indian Institute of Toxicological Research (IITR) said the main reason for the increase in pollution was due to the winter setting in and pollutants caused by the traffic and burning of garbage not dispersing with the velocity of wind being low.

There are other reasons too. There is a lot of dust because of the construction activities and it has increased the pollution levels in the city. Moreover, with the passage of

vehicles through the mud, the scattered pollutants are not dispersed," he added. "It is advisable for joggers not to step out early morning because with deep breathing, they may also inhale the pollutants. The main culprit is the PM 2.5 (particulate matter)," he pointed out. Ankita Jyoti, who is working as an environmentalist at Centre of Energy and Environment (CEE), said though the concern area was said to be New Delhi, the air pollution in Lucknow was also alarming. Reactionary measures like formulation and implementation of the Graded Response Action Plan are required. It is also essential for the government to issue health advisory to prevent the exposure of pollutants.



It should also be kept in mind that pollution is not a seasonal affair, but a year-round phenomenon. The state government should chalk out an

affirmative 'Clean Air Action Plan' and a targeted action plan to reduce emissions from all sources. It's time to prioritise the fight against air pollution," she added. Lead campaigner of the Climate Agenda Ekta Shekhar said that critical air pollution days were here again with winters approaching.

"It's been a long-pending demand of the Climate Agenda that SPCB must prepare a 'Clean Air Action Plan' and ensure its implementation. One action plan must be in place under National Clean Air Action Plan. The only solution is to work out a longterm action plan," she said. IITR scientists said that air pollution creates a series of significant health problems,

including premature deaths, aggravated asthma, acute respiratory symptoms and decreased lung function in the form of shortness of breath, chronic bronchitis, etc. Particulate matter is also a major cause of visibility impairment enhancing coefficient of haze in many parts of Asian countries and the United States because these particles can scatter and absorb light. "Further fine particles can remain suspended in air and travel long distances across regional and international borders without sinking and settling. Numerous epidemiological studies indicate that an increase in particulate matter concentration is associated with increased mortality, increased hospitalisation for respiratory and cardiovascular diseases. increased respiratory symptoms and decreased lung functions. PM 2.5 and PM 10, when inhaled, penetrate beyond the larynx. Small particles penetrate deeply into the lungs and can cause respiratory disease such as emphysema and bronchitis, and aggravate existing heart disease. Ultra fine particles ranging from 0.001 to 0.1 micron in diameter are able to penetrate deep into the lungs and to the alveolar sacs where gaseous exchange occurs. These particles increase the rates of blood flow and vascular permeability to white blood cells, elevating clotting activity, constriction of the airways and fever induction," a scientist explained.



## Keep rotating officers holding key posts: CVC

oncerned with instances of alleged irregularities in public sector banks, insurance companies and Central Government departments, the Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) has directed to make sure personnel did not stay in sensitive posts for too long. The most recent direction is a reiteration of its earlier order instructing these institutions to implement a rotational transfer policy for officers who have been in sensitive posts more than three years.

The move assume significance as the CVC while dealing with a case pertaining to a public sector bank and insurance companies recently noticed that a high ranking official, who was associated with procurements etc, was posted in the department for an unduly long period which is against the spirit of the

Commission's guidelines. CVC officials said that its directive also stands for central govern-ment departments and public sector units.

The CVC repeated its observation that rotational transfer policies for officials in such posts would mitigate the probability of such scams occurring. Stating that it was the non-implementation of the rotational policy that has led to many frauds, CVC said: "It is once again reiterated that rotational transfers of officers continuing beyond three years may be strictly carried out from sensitive seats/posts," adding however, that this advice was for changes from the sensitive seat/post, and not necessarily from the station, which is to be governed by the policy of respective organisa-

"Analysis of frauds that have taken place in public secorganisations shows that one of the reasons for such frauds was non-implementation of the rotational policy," the CVC stated in its order. It has also asked heads or Chief Vigilance Officers to strictly ensure that the rotational policy is implemented in their respective organisations

According to the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), over 23,000 cases of fraud involving a whopping ₹1 lakh crore have been reported in the past five years in various banks. "A total of 5,152 cases of fraud, up from over 5,000 cases in 2016-17, were reported in banks from April, 2017, to March 1, 2018, it had stated. The highest ever amount of ₹28,459 crore is said to have been involved in these cases of fraud reported from April, 2017, to March 1, 2018, the central bank said. In 2016-17, banks had reported 5,076 cases of fraud involving

### Rly plans aircraft-like pressurised coaches for world's highest railway track in Leh

PNS NEW DELHI

With the Centre approving the significant Bilaspur-Manali-Leh line along the Indo-China border making it the world's highest rail track, the Railways are now planning to use aircraft-like pressurised coaches in its trains so that passengers do not have breathing difficulties on board. Aircraft cabins are pressurised because the air is very thin at the altitude planes fly. To prevent complications, the cabins of many aircraft are adjusted to near sea-level pressure, which makes breathing almost the same as at sea level.

At a height of 5,360 metres above the sea level, the 465-km strategically significant line to be built at a cost of Rs 83,360 crore, will see railways' first pressurised coaches which are currently used only in the Quinghay-Tibet Railway Line in China.

"Special pressurised rolling stock to deal with lack of oxygen will have to be used in these trains as passengers might feel uneasy because of the high altitude. These will be like the pressurised cabins used by aircraft to maintain the oxygen levels inside," said a senior Railway Ministry official.

The Chinese coaches, manufactured by



Canada's Bombardier Inc, which also makes small planes, are specially designed to carry passengers in an oxygen-deficient atmosphere. In order to do this, the train cars have to be pressurised, to ensure that all of the passengers do not finish their journey with severe cases of altitude sickness.

The official said that in the Tibet train, two kinds of systems are used to maintain oxygen levels — one is through the main controls which maintains standard oxygen levels and gets switched on at high altitude areas and the other is through oxygen ports equipped for each passenger to use when they feel that they lack oxygen.

The Integrated Coach Factory (ICF) which is in expansion mode is already pepping up to produce both metro coaches as well as coaches for the Ahmedabad-Mumbai bullet train and could be roped

in to make coaches for the Bilaspur-Manali-Leh line as well.

The line, once completed, will connect important locations between Bilaspur and Leh like Sundernagar, Mandi, Manali, Keylong, Koksar, Darcha, Upshi and Karu and other important towns of Himachal Pradesh and Jammu & Kashmir en route. The project will include 74 tunnels, 124 major bridges and 396 minor bridges, according to the first phase of the survey. Final location survey for the project is currently underway.

Besides this, the railways would spend an amount of ₹20,000 crore towards augmenting rolling stock which includes train coaches during 2019-20. Railway Board member (rolling stock) Rajesh Agrawal said the railways had done strategic planning for the financial outlay and there would be no problem for funds.

"The annual rolling stock production volume is around 6000 to 8000 coaches per year. However, we need to prioritise the requirements of the various railway zones and try to meet their demands," said Agrawal. He shared that some new coaches have come and waiting for CRS (Commission of Railway Safety) permission.

# brief Parl panel on note ban on Nov 12

**New Delhi:** A parliamentary panel, of which former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh is a member, has called RBI Governor Urjit Patel for the third-time to brief it on the Government's demonetisation move.

The 31-member Parliamentary Standing Committee on Finance, headed by Veerappa Moily, has been deliberating on the issue for almost two years.

The Government had scrapped ₹500 and ₹1,000 notes on November 8, 2016 and announced issuance of new ₹500 and ₹2.000 notes.

Patel has been called on November 12 to brief the committee's members on demonetisation of ₹500 and ₹1,000 notes and the "ramifications thereof", according to the panel's meeting notice.

The RBI Governor will also brief the committee on the banning of the Unregulated Deposit Schemes Bill and related issues.

"Members wanted some more information and details about demonetisation, especially on its impact. Therefore, the RBI Governor Moily said when contacted. He said

### **Kannur airport yet to** be opened, but its Govt allowed Shah to land

Acontroversy has erupted over BJP president Amit Shah landing in the yet to be opened Kannur airport, with a Kerala Minister slamming him Sunday for threatening to oust the LDF Government despite it allowing him to arrive there as part of state's 'tradition of hospitality'

State Finance Minister TM Thomas Isaac tweeted that though the state had shown the 'tradition of hospitality' by permitting Shah to land in the airport, which had not been formally inaugurated, the BJP leader had threatened to oust the left ruled Kerala Government.

The official inauguration of the Kannur airport, the fourth in the state, is scheduled to be held on December 9.

But, by arriving in a special flight there yesterday to inaugurate the BJP's new district committee office, Shah has unofficially become the first passenger to land in the airport at Mattanur in Kannur.

Isaac said shah's "empty threats" were out of frustration as the saffron party is yet to get more members in the state Assembly.

Former Union Minister, O Rajagopal, is the lone MLA of the BJP in the house.

"Amit Shah permitted to land in Kannur airport which is yet to be opened. That is our tradition of hospitality. But he is threatening to oust Kerala Government. Such empty threats do not frighten us. Try to win few seats in Assembly. Your frustration is understandable," Isaac tweeted. Hundreds of party workers had gathered Saturday

## Intel cop, PDP worker shot dead in J&K

Suspected militants shot dead junior police intelligence officer and a worker of pro-India Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) worker in Kashmir Valley on Sunday.

Police sources said that militants waylaid the private car of Imtiyaz Ahmad Mir, the subinspector with counter-intelligence department of (CID) J&K police, at Washibugh village along the banks of Romshi rivulet in south Kashmir's Pulwama district on Sunday

Mir's body was found with bullet wounds. Sources said that militants abducted him before he was fired upon from a point blank range. He was resident of Tekina village in Pulwama and was on way to his home in his private car. He was posted in Shergarhi police station in summer capital Srinagar.

In the other incident, militants shot at and injured a senior PDP worker Muhammad Amin Dar at Gangbugh village near Hyderpora on the outskirts of Srinagar. He was immediately

rushed to hospital where he succumbed to his injuries. Suspected militants also

attacked an army patrolling party at Poterwal area in south Kashmir's Shopian district.

Security sources said the army personnel retaliated in a befitting manner. They said there was no immediate report of any casualties on the forces' side. Security forces launched manhunt to nab the attackers.

Meanwhile, army and Intelligence officials foiled militants' attempt to abduct an Army major in north Kashmir area. Security sources did not divulge further details on the

**PTI adds:** The desperation to see his parents prompted subinspector Imtiyaz Ahmad Mir to shave off his beard and change appearance in his unsuccessful attempt to dodge militants who had laid a death trap for him in his village, his colleagues said on Sunday.

Mir, 30, was shot dead by militants on Sunday when he was on his way home.

Posted in the CID department, Mir had been warned against venturing into his village as there was a possibility of attack by militant groups, who have been targeting policemen

in the state recently.
"I had told him that he should not go as militants could attack. But he was desperate to see his parents who reside at Sontabugh in the interiors of Pulwama district," recalled one of his supervising officers.

This morning as he was preparing to leave for home, he came with a changed appearance. He shaved off his beard and decided to use his personal vehicle to go to his native village, the officer said.

"Now they (militants) will not be able to recognise me" were possibly his last words to his officer before he left for home with a smiling face as he was seeing his parents after a long time. Mir is survived by his father and mother.

Son of a retired police officer, Mir, who was from 2010 batch of sub-inspector, had served in Ganderbal district of South Kashmir for five years before being transferred to Kulgam district last year.

### Four highly-trained JeM snipers active in Kashmir

Sniper attack by Jaish-e-Mohammed terrorists has emerged as a new source of worry for security agencies in Kashmir Valley with three personnel having been killed since mid-September, prompting the law enforcement agencies to recalibrate their strategy to thwart such strikes by the Pakistanbased group, officials said.

The first such attack took place at Newa in Pulwama on September 18 when a CRPF personnel was injured. Security officials thought it to be a oneoff strike till the recent spate of sniper attacks that claimed the lives of a Sashastra Seema Bal jawan and an Army personnel in Tral, and a CISF jawan in

Based on intelligence inputs, security agencies believe

'buddy' groups of the proscribed Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) comprising two terrorists each have entered Kashmir Valley in early September and have entrenched themselves in South Kashmir's Pulwama district with the help of some

These terrorists, according to the officials, have been thoroughly trained by Pakistan's external snooping agency ISI for carrying out sniper attacks in Kashmir Valley and have been armed with M-4 carbines, used by the US-led allied forces in Afghanistan.

There is a possibility that these weapons may be part of the arms and ammunition captured by the Talibans, with whom the JeM cadre were fighting the allied forces in

that at least two separate Afghanistan, security officials in the state said. However, they said that the weapon was also being used by the special forces of Pakistan Army.

In all the instances of sniper attacks, the terrorists used a nearby hillock to carry out strikes on a security force campus when unsuspecting jawans were using their mobile phones to talk to their family or friends. 'These attacks have been

precise, even while targeting a personnel inside a sentry post as he uses his mobile phone. They pick up the light of the mobile phone to carry out the attack on jawans," said one of the officials.

Former Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah has reacted to the rising cases of sniper attacks. 'We've dealt with snipers on the

border/LoC regularly and have SOPs to deal with those but never in the hinterland. This will force a rethink of all manner of security and protection procedures."

The M-4 carbine is mounted with a telescope and the terrorists are using night vision devices to locate their potential targets, the officials said. The weapon can fire at its target up to 500-600 metres with preci-

The security agencies, including army, CRPF and Jammu and Kashmir police, have already issued fresh guidelines to their jawans and officers located in camps in the militancy-hit areas.

Maintaining a silence over the change in tactics, the officials said that more combing operations would be carried out around the security camps.

#### 71 tourists saved off Goa coast from rough seas this month

**Panaji:** Seventy-one tourists have been rescued off the coast of Goa since the first week of October as the state witnesses rough seas and rains, an official of a lifeguard service commissioned by the State Government said Sunday.

A statement from Drishti Lifesaving further said that of the 71 tourists rescued, nine were foreign nationals including three Russians who were saved on October 25.

"A total of 217 Indian tourists and 46 foreigners have been rescued while swimming off the state's beaches from Ianuary to Oct this year," Drishti Lifesaving's spokesperson informed.

## Strongman's return

Mahinda Rajapaksa making a comeback as Lankan PM

he political twist in Sri Lanka may seem like a sudden overnighter but the signs have taken some time coming. The growing strongman clout of former President Mahinda Rajapaksa, who has surged ahead in relevance as his new outfit crested the popular verdict of the local elections, almost left no option for his one-time protégé, current President Maithripala Sirisena, but to pull out of the coalition Unity government, coopt his party and name him Prime Minister. With Sirisena joining hands once again with the leader he ousted in 2015, it shows that allegations of autocracy, corruption, nepotism, China tilts and, of course, war crimes while eliminating the Tamil movement from the face of the island, have slid of Rajapaksa's back as easily as a duck's and for the larger Sinhalese identity, he has emerged as a saviour and a doer. So though Sirisena's UPFA is in minority in the ruling coalition (even with Rajapaksa's faction) and, therefore, his sacking of Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe, whose UNP has the bigger mandate, may seem unconstitutional, the pictures of Rajapaksa addressing crowds have wrested the popular narrative. Besides, there is already talk that though constitutionally he cannot become the President, having served two terms, as Prime Minister and then betting on a comeback giving him a two-thirds majority, he could well attempt amendments to arrogate more powers to himself. At

Rajapaksa's return is a big blow for India although he has been engaging with the Modi government. As President, he had veered away from India and bent towards the Chinese, giving them infrastructural access to strategic ports, allowing them to dock submarines and adding another pearl to China's string of debt-trap colonies around the Indian Ocean. Wickremesinghe has been the most favourable for us and India engineered a profitable coalition with Sirisena in 2015, weaning him away as a moderate opposed to the absolutist Rajapaksa. But he too drifted towards the Chinese axis quite a bit, guaranteeing a 99-year lease on Hambantota port as India has a tough time negotiating contracts. Not as magnetic as Rajapaksa, he was, in a short time, coopted by his one-time mentor. Meanwhile, anti-India sentiment has returned to Lanka's mainstream discourse. In fact, Wickremesinghe's ouster is largely being seen as a result of Sirisena's disagreement with him over the development of a container terminal in Colombo. He also alleged assassination attempts given Wickremesinghe's pro-India tilt and claims that India was disappointed with the pace of its projects in the island. Even Rajapaksa had in 2015 claimed assassination attempts by RAW. So the bitter narrative is somewhat similar. Clearly stitching up rainbow coalitions with Wikremesinghe as the pivot hasn't worked successively now. So India must engage itself with Lanka very delicately, considering the Chinese inroads into neighbouring Maldives. Though the Modi Government has met all three parties diplomatically and Rajapaksa himself has made some discernible attempts to alter his rules of engagement, there has to be a studied strategic response. And with China's Belt and Road Initiative hitting roadblocks in its own backyard states, it might seek greater manoeuverability in the island states of Lanka and Maldives, something that India must be up for. Then there's the larger question of the assault on democratic systems and practices but then that has long been a casualty of totalitarian regimes assuming charge across the world.

## **Equal partners**

Uncomfortable they might be but JD(U) and BJP need to stay together for 2019 elections

D(U) chief Nitish Kumar has proved yet again that when it comes to politics, he is quite the old warhorse, can swerve the trajectory of political discourse on his terms and has a keen ear to the ground. That's the reason why despite being a cropper in the 2014 elections — having won just two of the 40 Lok Sabha seats from Bihar — he has managed to extract much more than his pound of flesh by striking a 50:50 seat-sharing deal with the BJP. This notwithstanding the fact that the BJP, LJP and RLSP won more seats than the JD(U) in 2014. Even the BJP, which was seen to be in the driver's seat until a couple of months ago, seemed to cede territory to a grassroot regional entity in what could be its key battleground state for 2019. The BJP, which had presumptuously apportioned a confident tally for itself, is clearly not taking any chances post-Karnataka. And while the *mahagatbandhan* politics is somewhat muted at the moment nationally, in Bihar it has a recognisable face in RJD supremo Lalu Yadav's younger son Tejaswi Yadav. He has been consistently shoring up his political stock after the party's stunning victories in three of four bypolls in March and has been spinning an anti-Modi narrative among the sizeable population of Dalits and economically backward castes. Couple that with pictures of him challenging the solidity of the NDA alliance by courting Upendra Kushwaha of the Rashtriya Lok Samta Party (RLSP), who can be an obstacle to both Nitish and BJP's hopes of a clean sweep, and you know why the two must stick together. Tejaswi has already invited Kushwaha to join the RJD-led alliance and is keen to accommodate BSP chief Mayawati in the state. Enough to give jitters to both Nitish and BJP, who cannot afford a slide in caste-based support base if they are to make good in 2019.

Kushwaha is the strongest leader of the influential Koeri community, which consists around eight per cent of the population in Bihar. The Koeris are double the number of Kurmis (four per cent), whom Nitish represents and can well make or mar the NDA's prospects. No wonder Tejaswi has been consistently wooing him, even on the day of the NDA seat-sharing declaration. It would not be a surprise if Kushwaha does an opportunist switchover. Having nursed a grudge since the Assembly elections three years ago, when his party got a reduced seat share, he may not settle for being given the short shrift a second time. While the BJP and JD(U) have sorted themselves, they have yet to assess the fallout of leaving just six seats for Kushwaha and Ram Vilas Paswan's LJP. Paswan, the leader of eight per cent Dalits, too, seems to be cut up over the BJP-JD(U) deal. BJP's number crunching won't work amid ego battles.

## Behind the big cat deaths

The death of 23 Asiatic lions in Gir is a reminder that the big cat's management is a gigantic challenge. However, the State's forest department must be complimented for quick action



he death of 23 Asiatic lions (three lions, 11 lionesses and nine cubs above ing end of September and beginning of October, set alarm bells ringing for the Gujarat Forest Department. Initially, conusion prevailed but progressive deaths compelled the authorities to go for a prompt scientific investigation. Samples of the dead lions were sent to the National Institute of Virology, Pune, College of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry, Junagadh, and FSL Junagadh to find out the possible reason that killed the lions. Samples of five

lions confirmed the attack of a virus – Canine Distemper Virus (CDV). The Veterinary College, Junagadh, confirmed the presence of *Babesia* protozoa in about a dozen samples. Suspecting an attack of the CDV, all surviving lions from the Sarasiya Round in Dalkhaniya Range were captured and kept in isolation at the Jasadhar lion care centre to avoid any contact with other lions. Another 33 lions from the adjoining area of Dalkhaniya Range were also captured and sent to Jamwala lion care centre. Of the infected lions kept in Jasadhar, all died but three survived as their immune system was better equipped to tackle the dis-

August this year in the same region due to a similar disease cannot be ruled out. The Gir protected area (1,452 sq km) and its surrounding forests cover an expanse of 1,882 sq km, which is distributed in 15 ranges, 60 forest rounds and 152 forest beats. The spread of the CDV disease was confined to 26 lions in Sarasia Round in Dalkhania Range. Other 33 lions in the adjoining Dalkhania range were suspected of such an attack, but a laboratory test proved that they were free from the fatal disease. Statistics reveal that only about two per cent of the Gir protected area and about four per cent of the

Over the years, most countries have used forecasting as an important input in the process of planning future development. In other words, technology foresight is a process by which one comes to a better understanding of the forces shaping the long-term future that should be taken into planning and decision-making. Therefore, it is closely tied to planmerely a step in the process of Countries, like Japan, the

For instance, TF exercise in Japan involves more than 2,000 top rated scientists/academia/technologists to map out the evolution of possible technologies in the next 25 years of the time horizon. Better and easier returns over shorter periods of time, riding the penetration of marketing drives (which does not need commensurate investment), is every investor's dream. As an upshot, beauty products get more and more common in the prosperous sections of the poorer

Perhaps in the same breadth, it needs to be added that there is no need o feel gloomy on this surge. This because there is a parallel surge of celebrating heritage which is also sweeping the world. If Dubai has had notable display of technology, UAE cultural week in France also made it a point to highlight the Emirati heritage. China has drummed up traditional medicine in its unique promotional style. The revival of tribal arts and crafts in India is an equal success story. Perhaps the best hope for future positive trends is the instinctive direction which the human psyche inevitably takes when faced with



### **Use Aadhaar eKYC for DBT** | Petrol, diesel price users: UIDAI to banks

The Aadhaar-issuing authority Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) wrote to the banks last week clarifying the instances and modes in which Aadhaar can be used, and a copy of the same was also sent to the Reserve Bank of India, a senior UIDAI

The UIDAI wrote to banks after it received legal opinion on the matter, in the wake of a recent Supreme Court verdict that restricted the use of Aadhaar by private entities but

banks that they can use availing subsidies, benefits, ser-Aadhaar authentication for beneficieries of Government subsidies and welfare schemes, and listed various 'options' for the use of Aadhaar (such as Quick Response or QR code and offline Aadhaar) for other banking customers in the light of Supreme Court judgement in the Aadhaar case, said the official who did not wish to be

Physical Aadhaar card can be used for verification in an offline mode if produced voluntarily, it clarified.

When contacted UIDAI CEO, Ajay Bhushan Pandey told PTI, "There are viable and completely paperless and digital options available through digitally signed electronic form of Aadhaar which allows identity to be verified online without pinging our server. And through such methods the services can be seamlessly and digitally offered by banks for non-DBT customers". He also confirmed that UIDAI's views have been sent to banks but

did not elaborate on details. UIDAI has said that banks cleared it for welfare schemes. will be entitled to seek authen-

The UIDAI informed the tication of the beneficiaries vices under Aadhaar Act, for transfer of any subsidy or benefit to the bank account of the beneficiary, as well as for facilitating the withdrawal of money through Aadhaar based micro-ATM machines.

This means Aadhaar enabled Payment System (AePS) and BHIMAadhaar Pay shall remain operative and bank can continue to maintain and provide these facilities so that Direct Benefit Transfer or DBT beneficiaries can withdraw their money through the micro-ATMs, ÁePS, BHIM Aadhaar Pay.

In its circular to banks, the UIDAI said that for customers giving declaration that they want to receive entitled benefits or subsidies of welfare schemes funded from the Consolidated Fund of India in their account directly, banks can perform Aadhaar-based authentication using e-KYC for opening bank accounts

For all other customers, banks cannot use Aadhaar electronic know your customer (e-KYC) authentication for opening bank accounts.

# cut for 11th time

Petrol price was cut by 40 paise a litre and diesel by 33 paise a litre on Sunday, the 11th straight reduction in rates on softening international oil prices.

Petrol in Delhi now costs ₹80.05 a litre and diesel is priced at ₹74.05 per litre, according to a price noti-fication issued by state-owned oil firms.

In 11 straight cuts, petrol price has been reduced by ₹2.78 per litre and diesel by ₹1.64 a litre.

The rates are off their record high of ₹84 per litre for petrol and ₹75.45 a litre for diesel touched on October 4. On that day, the government decided to cut excise duty on petrol and diesel by ₹1.50 per litre each and asked stateowned fuel retailers to subsidise by another ₹1 a litre by reducing their margins.

Subsequent to this, the petrol price came down to ₹81.50 per litre and diesel at ₹72.95 a litre on October 5, the statement said.



But as the international oil prices continued to rise, price of petrol and diesel in Delhi increased to ₹82.83 per litre and ₹75.69 per litre by October 16. But beginning October 18, international oil prices have been falling and rupee has also appreciated.

The twin factors have

brought down fuel prices to two-month low. "As per the assessment, the retail prices of petrol and diesel may reign easy in the next few days," an official statement had said on October 26.

The retail selling price of petrol and diesel is dependent on the international prices of benchmark fuel and the rupee-US dollar exchange rate. This is because a large proportion of country's requirement is met through imports.

### GST Council met 30 times, took 918 decisions in 2 years: FinMin

The all-powerful GST Council, chaired by Finance Minister Arun Jaitley, has met 30 times and taken 918 decisions related to laws, rules and rates for the new tax regime within a span of just over two years, the Finance Ministry said on Sunday.

The Goods and Services Tax (GST) Council, which comprises state finance ministers and Union Minister of State in charge of Revenue as members, was set up on September 15, 2016, as the country's first 'federal institution'.

"Till date, GST Council has taken 918 decisions related to GST laws, rules, rates, compensation, taxation threshold etc. More than 96 per cent of the decisions have already been implemented through 294 notifications issued by the Central Government," the Ministry said in a statement.

The remaining decisions are under various stages of implementation. Almost equal number of corresponding notifications have been issued by each state, it added.

The working of GST Council has ushered in a new



phase of cooperative federalism where the Central and state Governments work together to take collective decisions on all issues relating to indirect tax regime of the country, it said.

Besides, tax officers of the Centre and states met ahead of the GST Council meetings to enable the council members to fully discuss the issues under consideration.

The Council has held discussions in a "harmonious and collaborative spirit" in the 30 meetings that have taken place far, it added.

The detailed agenda notes

for the 30 GST Council meetings ran into 4,730 pages, while the minutes of the meetings ran into 1,394 pages, the statement said. After 17 tumultuous years,

a nationwide GST was rolled out at the stroke of the midnight hour on July 1, 2017, overhauling India's convoluted indirect taxation system.

The GST, which replaced 17 central and state levies including factory-gate, excise duty, service tax and local sales tax or VAT, is India's biggest tax reform in 70 years of independence and will help modernise Asia's third largest economy.

Affairs Ministry. Flipkart's revenue from operations was at ₹2,790.2 crore for 2017-18 as against ₹1,882.4 in the previous financial year, a growth of 48.2 per cent, it added.

When contacted, Flipkart declined to comment.

On standalone basis, the total loss narrowed to ₹1,157 crore, while revenue was higher at ₹2,790.2 crore for 2017-18

as against the previous year. Flipkart, which operates different entities for various functions, provides e-commerce and support services through Flipkart Internet. The revenue of Flipkart Internet is

mainly generated from services like collection, marketplace, storage and logistics.

Earlier in the year, Flipkart inked a blockbuster deal with Walmart under which the American retailer picked up about 77 per cent stake for about \$16 billion. The deal gave handsome return to investors like SoftBank who sold their complete shareholding.

În India, Flipkart is locked in an intense battle with USbased e-tailing giant Amazon with both entities pumping in millions of dollars towards promotions, building infrastructure and logistics as they woo customers to shop online.

Studies indicate the Indian e-commerce market is set to cross \$200 billion over the next few years.

sented on February 1 Finance Minister Jaitley is scheduled to present his 6th consecutive Budget with 2019

being Vote-on-Account. As per practice, a Vote-on-

Account or approval for essential G overnment spending for a limited period is taken in an election year and a full-fledged budget presented by the new vernment.

While P Chidambaram had presented the previous UPA Government's Vote-on-Account in February 2014, Jaitley presented a full budget in July that year. Narendra Modi-led Government scrapped a colonial-era tradition of presenting the budget at the end of February.

With the preponement of budget, ministries are now allocated their budgeted funds from the start of the financial year beginning April.

This Government departments more leeway to spend as well as allow companies time to adapt to business and taxation plans. Previously, when the

budget was presented at the end of February, the three-stage Parliament approval process used to get completed some time in mid-May, weeks ahead of the onset

of monsoon rains. This meant Government departments would start spending on projects only August-end September after the monsoon

## **Americans mourn death of 11** people at Pittsburgh synagogue

n armed man stormed a Asynagogue and shot worshippers in the US city of Pittsburgh, killing at least 11 people and injuring six others, including four policemen, in the deadliest attack on Jews in the history of America.

The shooter, identified as 46-year-old Robert Bowers, surrendered after he was injured during an exchange of fire with the police at 'Tree of Life' Congregation Synagogue at Squirell Hill in Pittsburgh, where a large number of people had gathered for a baby naming

Pittsburgh Public Safety Director Wendell Hissrich said that 11 people were killed and six others injured including four policemen. He added that there were no children among fatalities or injured.

Bowers, whose social media account reflected his hatred against the Jews, was charged with 29 counts of federal crimes of violence and firearms offens-

es, federal prosecutors said. The charges include 11 counts of obstruction of exercise of religious beliefs resulting in death; and 11 counts of use of a firearm to commit murder during a crime of violence. 'The crimes of violence are based upon the federal civil rights laws prohibiting hate crimes," US Attorney for the Western District of Pennsylvania Scott W Brady said. The FBI is investigating this as a "hate crime". Before opening fire, Bowers reportedly yelled, "All Jews must die!"

FBI Pittsburgh Special Agent in Charge Bob Jones said the investigation was in its early stages and there was no knowledge if the shooter was known to the law enforcement till this date. "Gunman targeted (people) because of their faith. At this time, we believe that he was acting alone," he

Describing the mass shooting as an "anti-semitic act", President Donald Trump called for death penalty for such shooters. "This wicked act of mass murder is pure evil, hard

to believe, and frankly something that is unimaginable. Our nation and the world are shocked and stunned by the grief. This was an anti-semitic

act," he said. President Trump ordered that American flags be flown at half-staff at the White House and upon all public buildings and grounds, and all military bases till October 31 as a mark of "solemn respect" for the victims. Despite his earlier reservations, Trump continued with his days programme and addressed a well-attended election rally in Illinois arguing that one cannot let their schedules or

### US synagogue attack 'inhuman act of violence': Pope

Pope Francis on Sunday called a deadly attack on a synagogue in the United States "an inhuman act of violence", expressing his "closeness to the Jewish community". A man suspected of burst-

ing into the synagogue in Pittsburgh on Saturday during a baby-naming ceremony and gunning down 11 people has been charged with murder, in the deadliest anti-Semitic attack in recent US history.
"We are all, in truth,

wounded by this inhuman act of violence," Francis said at the end of the Angelus prayer in Saint Peter's Square.

"May the Lord help us put out the flames of hate that develop in our societies, strengthening the sense of humanity, respect for life, moral and civil values and holy fear of

Suspect Robert Bowers, 46, reportedly yelled "All Jews must die" as he sprayed bullets into the Tree of Life syna-gogue during Sabbath services before exchanging fire with police, in an attack that also wounded six people.

The United States is witnessing a sharp spike in anti-Semitic incidents, surging 57 percent from 2016 to 2017, to 1,986 from 1,267, according to the Anti-Defamation League, a civil rights group which has tracked anti-Semitism there since the 1970s.

Saturday's attack comes at a time of heightened tensions — a day after a supporter of President Donald Trump was arrested for mailing explosive devices to Democrats and liberals, setting the country on edge ahead of close-fought

### Saudis vow 'complete' probe of Khashoggi murder: Mattis

Saudi Arabia has promised a "full" investigation into the killing of journalist Jamal Khashoggi, US Defence Secretary Jim Mattis said on Sunday following talks with Saudi Foreign Minister Adel al-Jubeir in Bahrain.

"We discussed it... The need of transparency, full and complete investigation. Full agreement from FM Jubeir, no reservations at all," Mattis told reporters following the talks, during which he warned the Saudi kingdom that the murder attributed to the Saudi authorities risked destabilising the

'No reservations at all. He (Jubeir) said we need to know what happened and it was very collaborative, in agreement," the Pentagon chief told reporters on a flight from Manama to Prague where he will mark the centenary of Czechoslovakia.

Saudi journalist Khashoggi, 59, who had criticised the kingdom's powerful Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, had lived in self-imposed exile in the United States since 2017.

He was murdered after entering his country's Istanbul consulate on October 2 to

Iranian organisers say more than 1.8 million Iraqi visas have been issued for Iranians this year for the Arbaeen pilgrimage which culminates on Tuesday as the devout head, many by foot, to Karbala and one of the holiest sites of Shiite Islam, the shrine of Imam Hussein.

Men and women, young and old, toddlers in prams and elderly pushed in wheelchairs -- they converge from all over the Islamic republic.

"I go because my heart demands it of me, I go because of my love for Imam Hussein." said Morteza Taghikhani, a 39-year-old auto worker, who had already been on the pilgrimage five times before.

### Georgians choose new President directly for last time

**AP** ■ TBILISI (GEORGIA)

Voters in Georgia are choosing a new President for the former Soviet republic on the Black Sea, the last time the president will be elected by direct ballot.

Opinion polls ahead of Sunday's election suggested that none of the 25 candidates is likely to receive the absolute majority need for a first-round win. If no one wins 50 per cent support, a runoff between the top two candidates is to be held by December 1.

After the new president's six-year term in completed, future presidents are to be chosen by a delegate system, part of constitutional changes that make the Prime Minister the most powerful political figure in Georgia.

The president functions as head of state and commander in chief but is otherwise largely ceremonial.

Margvelashvili is not running. The three top contenders are all former foreign ministers

Salome Zurabishvili, Grigol Vashadze and David Bakradze who served during the presidency of now-exiled Mikheil Saakashvili. Zurabishvili was sacked in

2005 amid disagreements with parliament.

She is running as an independent but is backed by the powerful Georgian Dream party, which is funded by controversial billionaire Bidzina Ivanishvili, a Saakashvili foe. Georgian Dream holds an

overwhelming majority in the parliament. Zurabishvili, however, has

been heavily criticised for her contention that Georgia started the 2008 war with Russia.

### **VALUES, MEDITATION CAN CLEANSE THE SYSTEM**

As the nation gets plagued by more corrupt politicians, only trust and self-contentment can bring about peace in the country. By Rajyogi Brahmakumar Nikunj Ji

Tn today's democracies, we, the citi-Izens, elect some individuals to represent us, to talk on our behalf. In this way, political leaders embody the beliefs, wishes, and will of populations and act as citizen's representatives.

However, nowadays we see a crisis of confidence between citizens and politicians, as a result of which there is mass discontent and a lack of trust in many countries. Undoubtedly, the role of politicians in conducting the affairs of the state, for running the government and for ministering the polity is crucial. In fact, there is no alternative to it in a democracy. Democracy in India, as Pandit Nehru said, in early 1950s, while addressing college students and the intelligentsia, is not the best form of government but the best available form of government. Here, the representatives of the people have to do so many things — make laws, run the internal affairs of a state according to the will of the people, devise and enact the state policy for education, human resource development, social welfare, commerce, trade & industry, environment, rural and urban development, transportation, communications, health, multi-media, arts and culture, science and technology, agriculture, natural resources, national economy or finance, accounts, excise and taxation and so on. They also plan and assure defence of the country against external aggression and security against internal criminal elements and insurgency, safeguard the interests of the country, vis- a-vis other countries, regulate the relationships of the state with other states, maintain law and order, national solidarity and public peace. They have to resolve the conflicts between diverse or antagonistic interest of different communities and sectional demands of various groups and classes, provide relief in the case of natural calamities and govern all the internal and external affairs of the state. All of these show the importance of the work of politicians and their respon-

All these are inter-connected and require co-ordination, mutual consultation and team work. If there is mutual bickering and there is lack of team spirit, then the affairs of the state and the people are bound to suffer. If the ministerial seats are constantly shaking and the game of musical chairs is always on the nation, it will certainly lag behind other countries on all indexes. These are precisely the rea-sons why even after seven decades of independence. India has been left far independence, India has been left far behind by nations like Singapore, Japan which had to rebuild its shattered economy after the Second World War. Now it has become one among a dozen affluent nations whereas India still remains way behind. It is because of disunity, dishonesty, lack of sense of responsibility, poor management of our resources, utter selfishness and lack of a spirit of service for the nation that has led our country to its present plight.

There are two kinds of politicians. One — genuine, patriotic, self-sacrificing or a saintly politician, who has an inner drive to plunge into politics because he is tired with a vision. He wants to work for the poor, the exploited and the neglected. He may work for noble causes such as freedom, human rights, justice and dignity of women. Two — there may be politicians who stealthily enter the portals of politics or gate-crash into it for power, position, prestige, privileges or for amassing wealth without any moral scruples. The latter are over-ambitious and make all attempts to capture levers of power for selfish goals or for narrow interests of a class, community, party or coterie.

Many reports have been published about the links of some politicians with the mafia, the underworld, criminals and musclemen. One finds that chargesheets have been filed alleging not only economic offences by front-rank politicians but legal proceedings for such heinous crimes like mass killings are



been reports of booth-capturing, abductions and even killings during the elections to State Assemblies or Parliament. Thus, there has been an all round degeneration of moral standards and the wrong doings of some have done a great damage to the whole party and nation as a whole.

Since politicians hold prominent positions and are in the eye of the general public, the scandals and scams in which they are involved and the strictures passed against them set a bad trend among the people. Common people then also begin to think of mak-ing money by shortcuts. As film stars set trends for new fashions in dress and sportspersons set in vogue new styles in their game, politicians, because of their power and position, sway the minds of the masses either the right or the wrong way. So, if politicians are persons of upright conduct, they can do a lot of good to the people and can help mobilise public opinion in the right direction but, to-day, we find that peo-ple are demoralised and disappointed and feel that they have been let down

Today we see that so many trees are cut so as to produce paper and so much is spent on the electronic media and the politicians get lot of publicity. But what is this publicity about? Much of the publicity is about the in-party squabbles, intra-party defections, manipulations for capturing seats of power, pandemoniums in parliament, cases in courts, constant in-fights and instabil-



ity. So, very little time and energy are left with the politicians to do solid and constructive work and to fulfil the promises made in their respective manifestos. Much of their time is lost in party conflicts rather than doing good for the public and the country.

There are also leaders who are not in active politics but have remote-controls over their parties. There are some power-brokers also who remain in the background but work through their agents. Just as a guided nuclear missiles in the hands of misguided people can spell doom so also powers in the hands of those politicians (however few) who don't observe certain essential principles, can wreck a nation. It is time for politicians, as for anyone else, to have a change in their outlook, lifestyle and work-culture. This is possible only through India's powerful system of values and yoga meditation, its unique contribution to the world-culture. Remember, there is no other method of cleansing the public life except through values and meditation.

he co-working revolution has swept across the global business environment and announced itself as the future of work. While interactions with colleagues from the same organisation often evoke apprehensions, co-working spaces offer employees an opportunity to interact with fellow professionals from different organisations under the same roof. hidden intentions.

It also breeds healthy competition. Under a single roof, the achievements of a colleague in the same department but at a different organisation do not remain unknown. #### **EXERCISE MAY CUT STROKE RISK IN WOMEN**


Mid-aged menopausal women may be able to lower their risk of developing stroke, heart disease and Type-2 diabetes if they exercise more or eat a low calorie diet, as per a

study. It showed that physically active women were less likely to get incidents of metabolic syndrome than inactive women. The syndrome shows a cluster of risk factors that increase the chances of developing heart disease, stroke, and diabetes. Genetic factors, excess body fat, and lack of exercise can add.

For the study, published in the Journal of Clinical Endocrinology and Metabolism, researchers examined 3,003 mid-life menopausal women, identifying patterns of cardiometabolic risk. They found central obesity as the most common factor for causing metabolic syndrome. "Discovering modifiable factors like exercise and low-calorie diet could help with preventive strategies that women can follow earlier" said Jennifer Lee, Professor, Stanford Health Care, US.

#### PROCESSED MEAT UPS KIDNEY FAILURE RISK

If your diet consists of proinflammatory foods such as processed meat, carbonated beverages and vegetables other than green leaves and dark vellow variety, you may be at a higher risk of developing kidney failure,



researchers suggest. The findings showed that diets that contribute to inflammation are linked to a higher risk of chronic kidney disease (CKD) progression. "These findings have implications for the prevention of kidney failure using dietary approaches with low inflammatory potential," said author Tanushree Banerjee, from the University of California-San Fransisco. For the study, shown at ASN Kidney Week 2018 at San Diego Convention Center, the team studied a national sample of 1,084 adults with CKD. They found that 11.1 per cent of participants developed kidney failure over 14 years of follow-up.

#### **CANNABIS AFFECTS WOMEN DIFFERENTLY**

Hormones could be the reason why cannabis affects women differently than men, brain studies on animals and humans suggest. The studies showed that sex differences in response to cannabis are not just sociocultural, but biological too. The



findings showed that men are up to four times more likely to try cannabis and use higher doses, more frequently.

"Male sex steroids increase risk-taking behaviour and suppress the brain's reward system which explains why males are more likely to try drugs including cannabis," said Liana Fattore, Senior Researcher, National Research Council. Italy.

"This is true for both natural male sex steroids and synthetic steroids like nandrolone." But despite lower average cannabis use, women go to habit faster than men. Men and women differ not only in the prevalence and frequency of cannabis use, pattern and reasons of use, but also in the vulnerability to develop cannabis use disorder.

#### **WEIGHT-LOSS PREVENTS WOMB CANCER**

Undergoing bariatric surgery to combat obesity can prevent women from developing womb cancer (also known as uterine or endometrial cancer), claims a study. The study, led by University



of Manchester, showed that women who had gastric sleeve or bypass surgery for obesity found that precancerous tissue in their womb reverted to normal tissue when they lost weight. "For super obese women, guick access to weight loss surgery has benefits beyond improving diabetes and risk of heart disease. It can also reduce womb cancer risk," said Emma Crosbie, clinical senior lecturer from Manchester. "Losing weight through dieting is also likely to be effective, but we know that it is very hard to do and the weight lost is often re-gained." she said. In the study, published in International Journal of Cancer, the team examined nearly 100 women with an average BMI of over 50 — considered to be super obese — had biopsies taken from their wombs during gastric or bypass surgery.

#### TOOTH LOSS IN OLD LINKED TO MALNUTRITION

Older adults with just 10 to 19 teeth are at a higher risk of malnutrition, warns a study. These patients also had higher rates of weight loss, lower appetite and



were at increased risk for dementia and/or depression as well as severe illnesses than those who had a normal nutrition status. They were also found to be at risk for impaired oral health, the study showed. "The mouth is the entry way for food and fluid intake. If its integrity is impaired, the functional ability of an individual to consume an adequate diet may be adversely impacted," said Rena Zelig, lead author at Rutgers University, US. The study, published in Journal of Ageing Research and Clinical Practice, analysed the health records of 107 senior citizens treated aged 65 and above. The results showed that 20.6 per cent of participants were at risk for malnutrition and 4.7 per cent were malnourished. In addition, greater than 87 per cent of them partially or completely lacked teeth.



rom community festivals to harvest ≺ seasons, wedding rituals and religious ceremonies, cooking and dining, storage and even down to house decor, earthenware is the only artform that threads us to our origins as a people and gets seared over fire on our collective imagination. But creativity is a game of talent. So artists at Terrafest — who have come a long way from Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Haryana and Manipur — showed how the earth could still be moulded to changing destinies at the Triveni Kala Sangam. Trustee Ravi Batra of Delhi Blue

Pottery Trust, who organises Terrafest every year says, "Pottery is extremely important, potters use their bare hands to transform, almost magically, a lump of clay into products that are functional as well as decorative. If you see the process, you'll instantly fall for the art form's innate ability to reinvent and transform itself. It's one of the traditional crafts which has been alive for hundreds and thousands of years. Yet it too can now die in the next 15-20 years if it doesn't make economic sense for the young generation to continue their family profession. And for that we do showcases to push new markets, upgrade skills and diver sify into new bouquets."

Batra strongly feels that the competition from plastic and metal ware has pushed terracotta to the edge of survival. He adds, "We must go back to it even in terms of environment as pottery is the most purest form that uses sand and clay." One of the

artists, Anil Kumar Prajapati from Alwar, says that tradi-



tional artisans are finding it more and more difficult to live above subsistence level. Neither the money nor the recognition comes close to balance the hard work, that goes into the making. "Fests like these helps the artists like us and provide a platform for us where we can showcase our skills,' he adds.

He also explains the procedure of how the products are made. Says he, "First of all we collect the sand or clay by digging it from mountains and forests that has been

decomposed from rock within the earth's crust for millions of years. The clay is kept for 20-25 days so that it tightens a bit. It is then divided in different ratios because the uses vary. The clay is modelled, dried, and fired, usually with a glaze. We also knead it like dough

before glazing it. It is important to note that a clay body is not the same thing as clay. Clay bodies are clay mixed with additives that give the clay different properties when worked and fired; thus pottery is not made from raw clay but a mixture of clay and other materials. There are different ways of making the product, it completely depends on the artisans who create it. Clay may be modeled by hand or with potter's wheel, may be jiggered using a tool or cut or stamped into squares or

**T**ndia has been hit by some of the worst scandals related to education and employment in the past decade. The Vyapam scandal and Bihar school examination cheating in 2016 were only a few that caught the attention of the national imagination. Every day there are multiple students and parents who are scammed by setters" or agents who assure a seat in exchange of lakhs of rupees. National award winning writer-director Ashwini Chaudhary's next film Setters, starring Aftab Shivdasani, Shreyas Talpade, and a large ensemble cast, based on true life events will expose the networks that events, will expose the networks that work behind the scenes in India.

"I was a journalist before coming into films. For a while I had been thinking of making a film about the education and employment scenario in our country. I met the people who were producing the film, Lovely Films, and they had done their research and had ideas about the subject. The chapters in the film are in public domain and its based on real life. They deal with both education and employment mafia across the country," he said, keeping the particular cases under wraps since the film is still in the process of being

"It's a socio-political film because of the subject. It concerns the people of the country and nothing is detached from politics. In that sense, we're not trying to make a political statement but raise an issue, which concerns an entire generation like students who are appearing for competitive exams," he said.

The film will try to be an eyethough it is brushed under the carpet because of how desperate lakhs of people for getting a government job or become a doctor or an engineer. "This subject has not been explored before on the screen. Students and parents are in touch with the mafia some way or the other. When we were students we also knew about them. Times have changed and technology has come in and their method of working has changed. While people know about the issue nobody has talked about it before the way we are trying to do. We're trying to expose the mafia and their modus operandi and their whole chain," he said.

They met victims, who are students and parents, investigative agencies who are trying to track down such mafia, and the mafia as well, while doing research for the film. Surprisingly, coaching centres all fall into the ambit and the film will touch upon the role of these coaching centres in the chain of events. Shivdasani had added, "The biggest curse the country has been facing for the last two decades is commercialisation of education. Examinations have virtually become a multi-crore industry today. The malpractice has grown to gigantic proportions. While India needs to combat the prevailing malpractices in education system on its own, it will do no harm to glance around, observe as to how education has improved globally. India, too, like fellow educationally-advanced nations must put into practice the adage that investment in education pays the highest returns."

Shreyas Talpade added, "Today the mafia has extended its tentacles everywhere. From establishing new universities, framing the curriculum to control examinations to pilfering with coaching systems and fudging grades, the mafia strikes at the very roots of talent creation. The burgeoning power of the mafia poses a petrifying threat to New India who have flooded the country with bogus doctors, illiterate teachers, crippled sanitation and a degraded environment. Unless the establishment is freed from its noxious grip by backing honest officials and eliminating the loopholes, the very soul of the nation will be endangered."

Chaudhary believes that print media has been instrumental in exposing the mafia but nobody in the film space has explore this topic so far so as a director I found it exciting. The film will be a realistic thriller opener but the director believes on the lines of Catch me if you can, who's also made lighthearted films like Jodi Breakers.

"These days content has become important and for filmmakers like us, who are not big in the perception of the industry, the set-up has been difficult lately. But in the last 4-5 years, the audience doesn't care if there is not Salman or Shah Rukh, if the content excites them they will watch it. So we chose an ensemble cast with 18 interesting and fine actors," he said. "Earlier, multiplexes in cities had engineered this push towards better content, but now good cinema in smaller cities is being equally appreciated," he said. "It's a good sign and shows the change in taste of the audience. Star-driven films will work in the future as well though but content driven cinema has carved out a space for itself and will continue to do so," said the director.

## Apple's all-new dual SIM feature

As the company releases its iOS 12.1, iPhone users can now enjoy group Facetime and the other new additions

Apple has reportedly updated its "iPhone User Guide" for the upcoming release of iOS 12.1, indicating that the latest version of the mobile operating system (OS) will include Group FaceTime and dual-SIM support for its newly-launched iPhones.

The e-book, which serves as a digital manual for new iPhone users, now lists Group FaceTime as an iOS 12.1 feature.

It allows users to conduct FaceTime video conference calls with up to 32 participants.

"Available for free through

Apple Books, the revised 'iPhone User Guide for iOS 12.1' is largely unchanged from a previous version created for iOS 12," reported Apple Insider.

"There are, however, two major additions that confirm upcoming availability of features teased at Apple's Worldwide Developers Conference (WWDC) 2018 in June and Conference Apple's iPhone unveiling last month," the report added.

In addition to group



FaceTime, the user guide also notes dual-SIM functionality for iPhone XR, XS and XS Max will go live when the iOS point update sees release.

A tentpole feature of Apple's latest smartphones, dual-SIM support allows iPhone users to utilise two cellular plans on a single device without constant SIM

card swapping.

Apple's solution relies on "Dual SIM-Dual Standby technology," which keeps both a physical SIM and an embedded eSIM — or a second physical SIM card in China simultaneously. Apple has not specified a release date for iOS 12.1, though

## PALACE HALT GUNNERS RUN

Emery's side fail to win 12th successive match in all competitions after Milivojevic's late penalty rescues Crystal Palace

rsenal's 11-match winning run came to a dramatic end as Luka Milivojevic's late penalty rescued Crystal Palace in a contentious 2-2 draw on Sunday.

Unai Emery's side failed to win a 12th successive match in all competitions as they fell short of the club's record of 14 victories in a row.

Granit Xhaka equalised with a sublime free-kick before Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang poked in his ninth goal of the season in controversial circum-

Arsenal striker Alexandre Lacazette flicked the ball to Aubameyang with his hand, but officials failed to spot the

Angered by that blow, Palace felt justice was done when Wilfried Zaha won a second penalty with seven minutes left and Milivojevic slotted home again.

It was a frustrating afternoon for Emery, whose captain Mesut Ozil reacted angrily when he was substituted in the 68th minute, the German throwing his gloves to the floor after stomping past the Arsenal manager.

It was the latest flare-up between the pair after Ozil was reportedly angered by Emery's demand that he work harder in matches earlier this season.

Arsenal remain fourth in the Premier League, but missed the chance to keep pace with leaders Liverpool, who are four points clear of the north Londoners.

"I'm disappointed with the result but our work is good. We drew, it's not bad, it's better to win but looking at the game in 90 minutes it is a deserved result," Emery said.

"Áfter the second goal, we were on a good result, but I knew we needed another goal for calm.'

Palace boss Roy Hodgson was furious with Arsenal's dubious second goal, saying: "I'm not even happy to end up

New Delhi: Indian golfer Khalin Joshi clinched his maiden Asian Tour title, claiming the Panasonic Open India at the Delhi Golf Club here on Sunday. Overnight joint leader Joshi carded four under 68 on the final day to win the title by one stroke with a four day aggregate of 17-under. Bangladesh's Siddikur Rahman finished second best after finishing with a par on the 18th even as Joshi birdied the final hole. Joshi thus became the seventh Indian to win the Panasonic Open India in the last eight editions of the tournament. "I have no words. Huge monkey off my back. Last few holes were tricky for me. I am really relieved and happy to win. I made some poor decisions. Starting with two bogeys but I remained patient and it was rewarded," Joshi said.
