Atiq's son Asad killed in K'taka call to end 4% Muslim **STF encounter in Jhansi**

Accomplice also shot in encounter

PNS PRAYAGRAJ/LUCKNOW

Asad Ahmad, son of jailed gangster-turned-politician Atiq Ahmad, and shooter Ghulam Mohammad were killed in an exchange of fire with the UP Special Task Force team in Jhansi on Thursday after-noon, officials said. Both were wanted in the Umesh Pal murder case and carried a reward of ₹5 lakh each. Asad Ahmad was caught on CCTV when Umesh Pal was killed and had been on the run for the past 50 days, police said.

"Sophisticated foreign made weapons were recovered from the accused. Further details are awaited," said Special Director General (Law and Order) Prashant Kumar. He added the UP STF team that gunned down Asad and Ghulam was led by deputy superintendents of police Navendu Kumar and Vimal

Atiq Ahmad was in the court of chief judicial magistrate in Prayagraj in connection with the murder case when the news of Asad's encounter broke. He started crying after hearing the news of his son's encounter death. He asked for water and sat down holding his head in the

district court premises. STF officials said Asad and Ghulam were on the run since the murder of Umesh Pal on February 24. Several STF teams were pressed to track them down. On Thursday, they were

trying to flee on a motorcycle when they were intercepted by an STF team in Ihansi, the officials said, adding they opened fire on the police and were killed

in the retaliatory firing.

ADG (STF) Amitabh Yash said, "We knew that they had foreign weapons. We were ready. The way this gang killed Umesh Pal and his two gunners, it was not easy to catch these accused. Both had British Bull Dog revolver and Walther pistol. These weapons are rare. Generally not found".

Visuals showed two bodies lying beside a motorcycle at the site of the alleged encounter. An ambulance later took them away.

With Thursday's encounter in connection with the Umesh Pal murder case, the UP Police have so far gunned down four

shooters. Earlier Arbaaz was killed in the first encounter on February 27 in Prayagraj. Arbaaz was driving the Creta car in which the assailants had reached Umesh Pal's house. Asad was also in it. The second encounter took place on March 6. In this, Vijay Chaudhary, alias Usman, who fired the first

shot at Umesh, was killed. Umesh Pal, a key witness in the 2005 murder case of then BSP MLA Raju Pal, and his two police security guards were shot dead outside his home in Prayagraj's Dhoomanganj area on February 24 this year.

His wife Jaya Pal had lodged a report on February 25 against Atiq Ahmad, his brother Ashraf, Asad, Ghulam and others.

Reacting to the news of the encounter, Umesh Pal's family

thanked Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath and the police administration.

"Whatever they have done is right. He (the chief minister) has punished the killer of his daughter's husband. I express my gratitude. He is like a father. Justice has been done," Jaya told the media, adding she hoped strict action would be taken against other accused.

Umesh Pal's mother said, "The two gunners who were killed in broad daylight today had committed a sin. They have been punished today. We have faith, we will get complete justice." The Samajwadi Party and the Bahujan Samaj Party have demanded an investigation into the Jhansi shootout, suggesting that the Special Task Force staged a fake encounter.

ED books BBC India for foreign funds violations

The Enforcement Directorate **▲** (ED) has registered a case under Foreign Exchange Management Act (FEMA) against British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) India for alleged foreign exchange violations.

The agency also summoned BBC staffers for questioning fol-lowing which its Deputy Managing Editor deposed on Thursday. The ED action came nearly two months after the Income-Tax Department surveved the BBC India's offices in Delhi and Mumbai on February The survey operation lasted for three days. The FEMA case was registered about two weeks back to essentially probe purported foreign direct investment (FDI) violations by the company and related instances, according to officials. The ED has called for documents and the recording of statements of some company executives and a team of lawyers representing the company has already submitted some financial documents last week, they added.

Rahul plea to stay conviction in Modi defamation case: Verdict on Apr 20

Expressing displeasure over the decision of the Karnataka Government to scrap the four per cent reservation for OBC Muslims and raise quotas in government jobs and educational institu-tions for Vokkaligas and Lingayats by two per cent each, the Supreme Court on Thursday observed the decision prima facie appeared to be on a "highly shaky ground" and 'flawed

A bench of Justices KM Joseph and BV Nagarathna said from the records tabled before the court it appears that the Karnataka Government's decision is based on "absolutely fallacious assumption".

Senior advocates Kapil Sibal, Dushyant Dave and Gopal Sankarnarayanan, appearing for members of the Muslim community from



Karnataka said no study was conducted and there was no empirical data available with the Government to scrap the quota for Muslims.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for Karnataka, sought some time to file replies to the petitions and assured the bench that no appointments and admissions will be made in the meantime based on the March 24 Government order which has been challenged by the peti-

Covid 8-month high at 10K+, but just 1 of 1K patients hospitalised

Amid warning that Covid cases in the country will peak in the next couple of weeks, India on Thursday recorded a single-day rise of 10,158 new infections, highest in nearly eight months and up by 30 per cent over the previous day, according to the Union Health Ministry data.

However, low hospitalisation has come as a breather. "Currently, the hospitalisation ratio is 1:1,000 and this is not a wave. It may be an endemic cycle of Covid-19," officials in the Union Health Ministry said. The daily positivity rate was recorded at 4.42 per cent while the weekly positivity rate was 4.02 per cent. The active cases now constitute 0.10 per cent of

the total infections, as per the Union Health Ministry data. AIIMS, Delhi, has issued an

advisory for its staff to follow Covid-19 appropriate behaviour saying that people "must use reusable cloth face cover/surgical mask in the workplace. Ensure proper cleaning and frequent sanitation of the workplace, particularly of the frequently touched surfaces."

20 crop varieties of OUAT get Govt nod YouTuber arrested for training parrot

BHUBANESWAR

he Odisha University of Agriculture and Technology (OUAT), Bhubaneswar has submitted a proposal for 22 new crop varieties to the State Department of Agriculture and Farmers' Empowerment, out of which 20 new crop varieties have

recommended by the Odisha State Sub-Committee.

The approved crop varieties include six rice crops viz. Kolab, Salandi, Nabanna, Bhargavi, Barunei, Suryashree; three oil seed crops such as groundnut 1 (Dhara), mustard 1 (Sampoorna), sesame 1 (Ashrit); one each of ragi viz. Shreeratna and greengram viz

Shreejan. Among these varieties rice variety Kolab is a medium of 130 days with average yield potential of 5,307 kg/ha, long slender grain and moderately resistant to leaf blast, neck blast, sheath rot, brown leaf spot, grain discolouration, BPH and gall midge.

Similarly, Nabanna rice variety is an early duration rice

variety, which matures in 86 days with an average yield potential of 2,775 kg/ha and suitable for rainfed upland. Further, the horticultural crop varieties include Brinjal 1 (Banita), Chili 1 (Ragini), Tomato 1 (Gouri), Dolicos Bean 1 (Jaykrushna), Ginger 1 (Subhada), Ginger 2

(Sourabh), Ginger 3 (Prayag),

Turmeric 1 (Surangi) and Ginger 2 (Gourab). The Mustard 1 oil content is 40.3% with average yield of 1,337 kg/ ha moderately resistant to aphids, alternaria blight, powdery mildew, white rust and sclerotinia rot.

These varieties will be helpful to the farmers of the State for attaining higher yield.

Ponzi co Rose Valley scam

Court orders attachment of firm's properties

BHUBANESWAR

The Cuttack OPID Court on Thursday confirmed attachment of properties worth Rs 6.52 crore of Rose Valley Hotels and Entertainment, which was allegedly into unauthorised collection of public money by promising high rate of interest.

The court also directed the competent authority, i.e., ADM, Cuttack to recover the amount from the bank accounts of the companies under attachment along with interest accrued thereon for equitable distribution among duped investors depositors. Earlier, the Economic Offences Wing (EOW) had registered a case under the Prize Chits and Money Circulation Schemes (Banning) Act, 1978 against Rose Valley Group of companies and its directors by taking over a Soro police station case.

During probe, the EOW found the company was taking deposits camouflaging the same as advance payment for hotel booking under the holiday package, and were issuing provisional certificates. The Rose Valley Group

without any authorisation either from RBI or SEBI was collecting public deposit under its different schemes by opening 65 branches in Odisha alone.

Five charge-sheets were submitted in this case against the group and its directors Goutam Kundu and Sibamoya Dutta and managers Bikramjit Bhoumik and Badal Kumar Kar. The movable and immovable properties created by the accused companies through directors out of the public deposits in their names as well as in the name of Rose Valley Group of Companies

Three ad-interim proposals for attachment of those properties were submitted by the EOW under the OPID Act. On the basis of said proposals, the Finance Department had issued adinterim order for attachment of properties, which was made absolute by the OPID Court.

birth anniversary



Many people in India have contributed differently towards annihilation of caste in spite of their differences in approach and understanding, but all of them strive towards achieving social equality based on human dignity. The celebration of the birth anniversary of Dr Ambedkar takes us to revisit the legacy of his struggle for composite equality in India. With the change of time, the shackles of the caste system are slowly getting weakened in India. The trends in caste-based social

change in caste-based occupations, priesthood, intercaste marriage, inter-caste dining and freedom in faith

Post independent India has

adopted constitutional morality and universal human value system in place of religious morality. The last 75 years witnessed a kind of holistic intervention by both the Central and State Governments that range from execution of protective legislation to various forms of affirmative action targeted towards achieving a radical social transformation but still there is a long way to go in

achieving social equality. In the recent past, castebased differences were the main challenges of unification of India during anti-colonial and anti-feudal struggles while constructing Indian nationalism to give birth to a new modern political nation -State that is full of many differences and diversities. The Constituent Assembly has taken note of these historical limitations while farming the Constitution as a result of

India becomes one of the most powerful legal instruments for annihilation of caste. The credit goes to Dr Ambedkar, the architect of the Constitution and one of the makers of modern India.

The famous crusaders who

clubbed nationalism with the anti- caste movement were Gandhi (1869-1948), Savarkar (1883-1966) and Ambedkar (1891-1956). different in their understanding and approach, they all stood firmly for annihilation of caste to build a casteless India. In spite of their different social backgrounds, they all experimented with their ideas of unity in the then Maharashtra. Gandhi vehemently fought for abolition of untouchability and caste rigidity by integrating the social reform agenda with Congress party's struggle for freedom. Savarkar's social idea was to liberate the Hindu society from its seven shackles - denial of access to Vedic literature to non-Brahmins, choice of profession by merit and not

barring crossing the seas fearing loss of caste, denial of reconversions to Hinduism, denouncement of inter-caste dining and denial of inter-caste marriage.

However, during the preindependence era, the most aggressively influential and politically powerful voice



against caste was Ambedkar, maybe because of his own life experience with the rigid caste system of those days. His famous book 'Annihilation of caste' (1936) is most popular, original and full of logical analysis on caste system in India. The book reminds us of how social reform is important political and economic reforms. Inter –caste marriage is being suggested there as one of the most important social reform actions to end caste which is also recommended by both Gandhi and Savarkar.

Amongst all the social reforms of his time, Ambedkar emerged as the most celebrated anti-caste icon not just for the caste oppressed communities but also for those who believed that nationalism was inclusive social equality. Unfortunately, the presentday followers of Gandhi, Savarkar and Ambedkar have almost forgotten the social reform plan. They seldom join in protest against caste-based atrocities increasingly happening in different parts of the country. The inter-caste marriage once being promoted by Gandhi and later Lohiaties, atheists and many anti-caste activists is not spreading much either by the followers of Savarkar or Gandhians. Even many socalled Ambedkarites without the thoughts and ideas have no social reform programme to pursue. It has been observed

that the change of religion by Dalits has not impacted much in their social status as a result of which today the caste bias is evident in almost all communities irrespective of religion.

Periyar and Lohia's social justice politics was helpful in raising caste consciousness among the OBCs but that did not help much in building anti-caste movements both in southern and northern parts of the country. The early Kansiram was politically acceptable in a way to bring the SCs and OBCs in the larger umbrella of Bahujan but later it become more power centric with less social reform programme and even reduced to a movement of few castes rather than more perceptible in movement of annihilation of caste. The social justice politics of the South has been an example for others with pioneering work of Periyar, the Left and others. The most striking attempt in the social reform movement in Kerala during the last 100 years, which changed history, was the appointment of five Dalits as temple priests in the temples under Travancore Devaswom Temple Board (TDB) in 2018. The TDB follows a recruitment process adhering to the norms of reservation for SCs and OBCs while conducting exams and interviews to recruit priests for its 1,252 temples in south and central Kerala having more than 2,500 regular priests getting salary and pension while they are instrumental in generating an annual revenue of about Rs 400 crore. The Hindus constitute 55 percent of the population of the State and the Muslims, 26 per cent, while 18 per cent are the Christians as per 2011 census. Almost all Scheduled Castes are Hindu in Kerala. Not just socio religious reforms, the subsequent Governments of Kerala have laid focus more on education as a powerful means progressive

the early Left in India were more focused on economic reforms than social reforms as its superstructure but later many Left parties have recognized social reforms as part of a larger class struggle.

Similarly, the reservation in education and job has universalised the access of public to any scripture and knowledge and public occupations with common workplace irrespective of social identities by birth in a particular caste. But largely it has been observed that the social reform ideas of freedom struggle have not been taken forward in the politics of post independent India by integrating the socio-religious reform with economic and political changes as many of the unfinished tasks of the social reform plans remain as before. While celebrating Azadiki Ka Amrit Mahotsav it is worth remembering Dr Ambedkar's ideas and visions relevant to contemporary India, specially to build a casteless society through annihilation of caste. Garjanbahal mishap 'Safety rules lapses rampant in all MCL projects'

Ensure their strict adherence, TUs urge CMD

he April 11 fatal accident in the Garjanbahal open cast project of the MCL in Sundargarh district has had its tremors in Talcher coal fields as sharp reactions were expressed over the lapses over mines safety rules and engagement of untrained and inexperienced workers in works not suitable for them by the outsourcing firms in various coal mines.

The Balanda-based Orissa Collieries Mazdoor Sangha af-



filiated to the INTUC, in a letter to the CMD MCL, Burla, alleged that deployment of untrained operator in HEMM by outsourced agencies without any special job training/ work experience in open cast project; light vehicle carrying supervisors/ operators to the active mining operation area without maintaining safe distance have caused the mishap. Sangha general secretary SC Pradhan in the letter citing them as violation of safety guidelines and SOPs issued by the ISO/DGMS, said such fatal accidents are frequently occurring in different mines of the MCL. He urged the CMD to instruct the concerned officials to strictly adhere to the safety guidelines in all projects of MCL to avoid such type of accidents in fu-

Similarly, Talcher Koilakhani Mazdoor Sangh affiliated to the BMS demanded an inquiry into the mishap as per Mining Rules. In Press meet here, BMS Koila Prabhari K Lachhma Reddy besides denouncing the open violations of safety rules demanded Rs 50 lakh compensation each to the kin of the two deceased in the mishap. Among others, trade union leaders Arun Kumar Pradhan, Subash Chandra Pradhan, Biren Kumar Khilar, Ananda Chandra Acharya, Manoranjan Pradhan were present. Notably, two MCL

employees died and five others were injured after a heavyduty mining truck crushed a four-wheeler carrying seven persons in the Garjanbahal mines on Tuesday morning. Mahanadi Coalmines Workers Union area secretary Biswadutta Ray ame down heavily on the officials who are not serious about adhering to the safety standards at the mining fields. Besides, he had demanded that the MCL need to maintain attendance registers in Form B format.

Meanwhile, sources said a team from Chaibasa region of the Directorate General of Mines Safety (DGMS) and members of Corporate Safety Board of the Coal India Limited would probe the incident soon.

Opp slams Govt for omitting Maulana Azad's name from NCERT textbook

Yet another omission, this time removal of references to freedom fighter and India's first Education Minister Maulana Abul Kalam Azad from the new class 11 political science textbook by the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT), has invited sharp reaction from the Opposition parties.
While Congress lashed out

at the Government saying there is a concerted attempt to "rewrite" history and pass on a "distorted legacy built on lies", CPI(M) alleged that such "vengeful rewriting of history" is aimed at creating a false nar-rative to further the RSS' "ideological projects".

The NCERT has, however, claimed that no curriculum trimming has taken place this year and the syllabus was ratio-



nalised in June, last year.

As part of its "syllabus rationalisation" exercise last year, the NCERT, citing "overlapping" and "irrelevant" as reasons, dropped certain portions from the course including lessons on Gujarat riots, Mughal courts, Emergency, Cold War, Naxalite movement, among others from its textbooks. The rationalisation note had no mention of any changes in class 11 political science text"Certain changes not finding mention of in the rationalised content book could be an 'oversight," NCERT Director Dinesh Saklani reiterated.

In the class 11 political science textbook's first chapter, titled 'Constitution - Why and How, a line has been revised to omit Azad's name from the constituent assembly committee meetings. The revised line now reads, "Usually, Jawaharlal Nehru, Rajendra Prasad, Sardar Patel or BR Ambedkar chaired

In the tenth chapter of the same textbook, titled "The Philosophy of the Constitution", the reference to Jammu and Kashmir's conditional accession has also been deleted.

"For example, the accession of Jammu and Kashmir to the Indian union was based on a commitment to safeguard its autonomy under Article 370 of the Constitution," says the dropped paragraph.

Tender apology for anti-judiciary remarks: SC orders Lalit Modi

The Supreme Court on Thursday came down heavily on ex-IPL commissioner Lalit Modi over his remarks against the judiciary made in social media posts and directed him to tender an unconditional apology on social media platforms and national newspapers. Observing that Modi is not above law and the institution, a Bench of Justices MR Shah and CT Ravikumar warned any repeat of such conduct will be viewed very seriously.

The apex court also directed him to file an affidavit before it tendering an apology and stating no such posts will be made in future which would tantamount, even remotely, to tarnishing the image of the Indian judiciary. "We have

The Enforcement Directorate
(ED) on Thursday recorded

Bengaluru company unveils chip that could revolutionise satellite-based navigation

This will enable high precision and accuracy for all the three types of applications such as navigation, positioning and timing, providing India much needed self-reliance in this domain.

The company has been pursuing advance technologies to manufacture these chips and modules; some of which have been supplied to the Indian Army and plied to the Indian Army and some private entities. Elena Geo Systems, was incubated at IIT-Kharagpur in 2012 and is now a member of the Delhibased Indian Association.

Data on attacks on Christians not correct, Centre tells SC

The Centre on Thursday **I** disputed in the Supreme Court the figure pertaining to alleged attacks on Christian institutions and priests, terming the data "wrong" and claiming the petitioners wanted to keep "the pot boiling" to sully the image of the country abroad. The apex court was hearing a PIL filed by Rev. Peter Machado of the National Solidarity Forum, Rev. Vijayesh Lal of Evangelical Fellowship of India, and others claiming violence against Christians.

A Bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud was earlier told by the PIL petitioners that from 2021 to May 2022, 700 cases of violence against Christians were reported and a majority of those arrested were followers of the

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Centre, referred to a report containing the case data

Chhattisgarh and said most of them related to disputes involving neighbours and, coincidentally, one of the parties happened to be a Christian.

He said the Bench, also including Justices PS Narasimha and JB Pardiwala, had taken note of the matter based on the figures provided by the PIL petitioners which were wrong. "The petitioner claimed that there are some 500 incidents where Christians were attacked. We sent everything to the State Governments. We collated all the information we got. The figure given by them, which obviously persuaded your lordships, was not correct," said Mehta, citing that Union Home Ministry has collated the responses from all the States. Altogether 38 such incidents were reported from Bihar, and as per the report, they pertained to fights between two neighbours of whom one happened to be a Christian.

Delhi HC speeds up appeal process in 2G scam cases

Speeding up the appeal process in 2G scam cases, the Delhi High Court on Thursday asked the CBI, ED, former Telecom Minister A Raja and others to file their submissions in the appeals challenging the acquittal by the trial court. Justice DK Sharma said the parties shall file brief written submissions not exceeding five pages. The CBI demanded day-to-day hearings and its counsel urged the court to list the matter on an early date when he would argue on the aspect of granting leave to appeal, the judge fixed the

matter for May 22 and 23.

The CBI and ED filed appeal against the trial court's verdict acquitting all accused persons on March 2018, five years ago. There were 95 listings and seven judges presided on the appeal process. At one point Justice Ñajmi Waziri in mid 2018, fined some accused for delaying the process and

IMD warns of heatwave in 4 States PNS ■ NEW DELHI schools till 16 April in the wake

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Thursday issued a heatwave warning for four states - West Bengal, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, and Bihar - over the next three to four days. Earlier this month, the IMD predicted above-normal maximum temperatures for most parts of the country from April to June, except parts of the northwest and the peninsular regions.

According to the IMD, heatwave conditions are likely in isolated pockets of Gangetic West Bengal until April 17, north coastal Andhra Pradesh and Odisha until April 15, and in Bihar from April 15 to 17. The IMD said that the maximum temperatures in several parts of the western Himalayan region and northeast India, West Bengal, Sikkim, Odisha,

Above-normal heatwave days are expected in most parts of central, east, and northwest India during this period.

Man held for marriage with minor, tampering with her date of birth on Aadhaar card

In a classic case of the groom **L**of a "Balika Badhu" landing in trouble within hours of their marriage, the Mumbai police have arrested a 23-year-old man for entering into a court marriage with a minor girl after allegedly tampering with her real date of birth on her Aadhaar card to prove that she

The fraud came to light within hours after they got married in a civil marriage on Tuesday (April 11) at the office of Marriage Registrar at Bandra in north-west Mumbai, when the boy and girl visited the Dahisar Police Station to complete the mandatory legal formalities.

Suspecting foul play, the police summoned the girl's father Sabajit Pal, a tailor, to ascertain facts about the bride's age. Pal told the police that his

daughter's date of birth had been tampered with allegedly by the boy to prove that she was 18 years, an age criterion for Court Marriage.

Under the Special Marriage Act, 1954, the Court Marriage age for a boy is 21 years and the Court Marriage age for a girl is 18 years. On his part, Pal produced his daughter's original birth certificate, as submitted to a local school as proof of the real date of birth. The girl also admitted that the groom had committed the fraud with her knowledge.

Immediately afterwards, Pal later lodged a complaint against the boy with the Dahisar police.

Taking serious cognisance of the complaint, the police registered an FIR against the accused "groom" — Gaurav Makwana, booked him on charges of kidnapping, cheating, forgery and child marriage.

SC quashes Calcutta HC order for CBI probe into attack on Union Min Pramanik's convoy

They will also be able to apply for LPG distributorship and have the option to convert existing Wholesale Consumer Licensed PACS into retail out-

This was decided at a meetng held between Union Home Minister Amit Shah and Union Minister for Petroleum and Natural Gas Hardeep Singh Puri here in the national Capital on Wednesday.

The move was taken with an aim to strengthen the PACS as well as pave a way for them to convert into multipurpose economic units, which will provide regular sources of income to crores of farmers of

the country and hence realize the goal of 'Sahakar se Samardhi' as envisioned by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Giving details, a senior official from the Cooperation Ministry said that Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas agreed to convert existing wholesale petrol and diesel dealership licensed under Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS) into retail outlets, provided they fulfil all the requirements for setting up

retail outlets in rural areas, including statutory approvals and other permissions.

The decision also aims to give priority to PACS in the allotment of new petrol and diesel dealerships. Now, PACS have been made eligible to get LPG distributorship as well.

As per an official from the Union Ministry of Cooperation, the existing PACS will be given a one-time option to convert their wholesale consumer pumps into retail outlets.

With the eligibility for LPG distributorship, the PACS will become the economic hub of rural development, the official said, adding that the PACS will become a strong empowered entity after the option to convert existing wholesale consumer-licensed PACS into a retail outlet. In addition to the above, rules will also be changed by the Ministry of

Petroleum to make PACS eligible for LPG distributorship.
Also, under the Ethanol Blending Program, the Ministry of Petroleum will ensure that cooperative sugar mills are given priority for ethanol procurement at par with other private companies, explained the officials.

It has also been decided that PACS will be considered under the Combined Category -2(CC 2) along with the freedom fighter and sports quota in the allotment of new petrol/diesel dealerships, he





Systemic failure

A 12-year-old was tried for murder, convicted, and spent his best years on death row

■ iranaram Chetanram Chaudhary is a living testament to the pathetic state of our police and justice systems. In 1994, he was 12 years old — and tried for murder on the presumption that he was 22. This happened because somehow he got dragged into a murder case in Pune, in which five women and two children were knifed to death. After class three he ran away from his school at Bikaner in Rajasthan, went to Pune, and began working in a tailoring shop. He doesn't remember why ran away from his home or with whom, nor could any of his brothers. Some cop misspelled his name as Narayan instead of Niranaram, leading to his trial, conviction, and death sentence. What is startling and heartrending is the fact no one in the system — from cops of various ranks and lawyers to judges at different lev-

els in the judicial hierarchy — could even notice that a child was being on trial. A junior police officer may have misspelled the name, but could he tell a 12year-old kid from a 22-year-old youngster? And what about the senior officers? And the prosecuting lawyers and defence counsels? And judges in the trial and appeal courts? A 42-year-old man, if he abuses his own body, may look 52; and a 52-yearold man, who takes good care of his body, may pass off as 42. But how on earth can a 12-year-old boy be mistaken as 22 years of age? Even if he did commit the crime, he could not have been imprisoned for more than three years, as per the juvenile law in effect at that time.

Justice is said to be blind, but those responsible for dispensing it are not supposed to be blind; their cognitive and cogitative faculties ought to be sound. In Chaudhary's case, all these were found wanting — and he paid a terrible price. He had to spend 28 long years in prison, and on death row to boot. The best years of his life — adolescence and most of his youth — were spent behind bars. "When you are on death row, every hope is broken. You just try to get through the day," he recently told a newspaper after his release, adding that he now feels blessed to look at the stars on a dark night after spending years confined to four walls under the glare of lights. In prison, he studied a lot, getting a master's degree in sociology. It was at this time that he realised that he was much younger than the prison records showed. The Supreme Court ended his ordeal in March when it concluded that Niranaram was 12 years and six months old at the time of the murders. School documents and medical examination proved that. The exercise was carried out as part of the National Law University's Project 39A which works on death penalty reform. This episode proves, if any proof is needed, that India's justice and police systems urgently need reforms. Our political masters, however, have not shown great zeal for reforms in the justice system. People like Niranaram Chetanram Chaudhary continue to suffer.

stagnant at 0.3 to 0.5 per cent in the last two decades. It is much lower than in the US (2.8 per cent), China (2.1 per cent), South Korea (4.3 per cent), and Israel (4.2 per cent).

For a country that experiences almost extreme weather every year, adaptation and resilience building must be a priority. India needs more granular risk analysis that can help target appropriate adaptation action locally while making new infrastructure climate resilient and strengthening early warning systems.

An analysis by the Council on Energy, Environment, and Water found the frequency and intensity of extreme climate events increasing by almost 200 per cent since 2005 and three out of four districts of India are facing extreme climate change. Four, and the most significant, is enhanced research and development for impact studies compared with conventional farming across agro-climatic

Importance of being Dr BR Ambedkar



Our true homage on his jayanti would be to resolve to end poverty and ensure justice and equality for all by sharing national opportunities and facilities

or centuries, we as a nation struggled to cope with untouchability and caste-based discrimination. Such inhuman practices demeaned a vast section of Hindus, who were categorized as untouchables. From time to time, great souls tried to salvage us from the repercussions of various social evils. Some of them were Sant Shiromani Ravidas, Sant Chokhamela, Sant Kabir Das, Swami Dayanand Saraswati, Swami Ram Krishna Paramhans and Sant Tukaram to name a few.

At the fag-end of the 19th century, a boy full of promises was enjoying his classroom teaching the school. One day he was made to sit at the back of the classroom when it was found that he was untouchable. Once he was travelling to his maternal uncle's village along with his brother and cousin. The cart man dropped them midway when he came to know that they were untouchables. One day the boy was going somewhere. In between, he stopped to drink water from a public tap. He was beaten as untouchables were not allowed to use the facility.

The boy was none other than Dr Bhim-

rao Ramji Ambedkar, popularly known as Babasahéb Ambedkar, born to Ramji Maloji Sakpal, father, and Bhimabai Murbadkar Sakpal, mother, on April 14, 1891, in Mhow Army Cantonment. He was the 14th child of his parents. His tryst with social evils as worse as untouchability, caste-based persecution and discrimination during his childhood left an indelible mark on his life and thought process.

His own experience from the incidents in his life made him realize how deeply casteism, untouchability, insults and humiliation were rooted in Hindu society. Even the cruelty of fate did not spare him. He lost his mother when he was just six years old. Notwithstanding the trauma of discrimination and discrimination, he did not give up and continued his struggle and studies against all odds. It was an incredible example of exemplary grit, determination and a never-say-die spirit.

Dr Ambedkar did his matriculation in 1908 from Elphinstone High School. His father gave him good sanskar and used to share stories and thoughts of great saints like Tukaram, Gyaneshwar, teachings of the Ramayana and the Mahabharata. He studied Economics and Political Science at Elphinstone College. In 1912, he got a degree from Bombay University. With a scholarship irom Manaraja of Baroda, në went to Columbia University, New York City where he got a Master's degree in June 1915 after successfully completing his thesis on 'Ancient Indian Commerce.'

In 1916, he went to the London School of Economics and worked on his doctoral thesis – 'The problem of the Rupee: Its Origin and its solution.' He took Rs 5000 as a loan from Chhatrapati Shahu ji Maharaj for his further studies. In 1920, received the D Sc from London University! He also went to the University of Bonn, Germany. In June 1927, he was awarded a Doctorate by the University of Columbia. He was a rare Indian politician of his time who studied at Columbia University, LSE and the University of Bonn.

Dr Ambedkar was worried about the fate of poor people, and untouchables. Dr Ambedkar wanted them to be independent. He established the Depressed Classes Society under the presidency of Baroda Maharaj. In 1920, he started The Mooknayak, a Marathi publication that enabled him to criticize the rigid Hindu

beliefs and Bahishkrit Bharat, also a Marathi magazine in 1927, to highlight the issues and aspirations of depressed sections of society. He was so passionate about eradicating the practice of caste discrimination in India that led him to establish Bahishkrit Hitakarni Sabha. In 1936, he founded the Independent Labour Party. It contested the 1937 Bombay election to the Central Legislative Assembly for 13 reserved and four general seats and won 11 reserved and three seats respectively. For him, democratic values were

of paramount importance!
After completing his studies and defying all hardships, Dr Ambedkar dedicated his life to the cause of the downtrodden, their emancipation and empowerment. Hence, the struggle became an integral part of his life. In 1927, Dr Ambedkar led a peaceful agitation by drinking water from Chowdar tank in Mahad, Raigad district in Maharashtra along with thousands of his followers when untouchables were not allowed to access water from the tank despite a 192 resolution moved by CK Bole and adopted by the Bombay government, allowing all untouchables to use public watering places, wells and Dharamshala, which were maintained through public funds.

Dr Ambedkar led a movement on March 3, 1930, to secure the entry of all Hindus to Kalaram temple in Nasik. He was in favour of a complete overhauling of Hindu

society and Hindu theology and securing equal rights for all Hindus. He was a votary of inclusivity. Casteism and untouchability go against the spirit of Hinduism, the Vedas. Its essence lies in quality, justice, fraternity and brotherhood. He was surprised that Hinduism is so accommodating and yet treats a vast chunk of Hindus as untouchables, even worse than animals. This was his pain.

He was not inimical to Hindutva. He had resentment against Hinduism but he was not opposed o Hinduism. His acceptance of Buddhism on October 14, 1956, is a case in point as Buddhism is very much rooted in Bharatiya culture. He did not embrace any other religion though Islamic and Christian scholars tried their best to influence him. It is said that when Dr Ambedkar met Mahatma Gandhi during the second Round Table Conference, he told him that he could not accept a religion that treats humans as cats and dogs, and he will embrace a religion that is less harmful to Hinduism.

The versatility of Dr Ambedkar's personality was matchless. His ability to listen to his critics was simply brilliant. Notwithstanding his differences with Veer Savarkar and Mahatma Gandhi on a number of issues, they were unanimous in their views of achieving the goal of social equality and freeing society from abominable evils such as untouch-

port armed struggle but always favoured unity among oppressed social groups to get their socio-political and economic rights. He wanted downtrodden and oppressed sections of society to stay united and acquire knowledge and education so that they are not oppressed.

As the architect of our Constitution, Dr Ambedkar has given us the mantra and roadmap to build a stronger, healthier and more inclusive society. His commitment to the cause of social equality and social justice is a guiding force for all those who are part of public life. He is not only the leader for the oppressed and depressed. He is the leader of 135 crore people in our country - India. He was a true nationalist leader, a true patriot. He has achieved an eternal place in people's hearts. His contributions cannot be estimated but can only be felt and lived by all.

Our true homage to Dr BR Ambedkar on his Jayanti would be to resolve to end poverty and ensure justice and equality for all by sharing national opportunities and facilities. We have rejected untouchability but still, a lot needs to be done to end social disparities in totality. Those who are deprived have to be holistically empowered. Japan to counter China with like-minded countries China's exports

Tapan has unveiled a new plan to provide "like-minded" countries especially in Asia with military aid as it looks to expand its influence in the Indo-Pacific region to counter China's aggressive push over Taiwan and the South China Sea issues.

The guidelines announced by Tokyo early this month included a new programme to strengthen the militaries of likeminded countries by providing "official security assistance" - a move that breaks with its previous policy of avoiding the use of development aid for military purposes other than disaster relief, the Japan Times reported.

Japanese Foreign Ministry officials said the Philippines will be one of the first beneficiaries of Overseas Security Assistance (OSA), with Malaysia, Bangladesh and Fiji also among those being considered, the report said.

Japan, a member of the

US, India and Australia, is actively pursuing the Indo-Pacific strategy which China claims aimed at countering its

Tokyo's decision to use international aid for military purposes is a 'paradigm shift' but won't lead to an arms race in Asia, the Hong Kong-based South China Morning Post reported on Thursday.

The move will not only build up the defence capabilities of Asian nations amid changing security dynamics, but boost the competitiveness of Japan's defence sector, it said.

Japan's new policy of defence aid to neighbours was announced after this month's visit of Japanese Foreign Minister Yoshimasa Hayashi to

In his talks with Hayashi on April 2, Chinese Foreign Minister Qin Gang said Japan should not "help a villain do evil", apparently referring to Tokyo's close ties with

China rolls out new wartime military recruitment rules

released a new set of revised rules for military recruitment in wartime, including giving pri-ority to the veterans, drafting high-calibre soldiers and optimising conscription procedures, which an analyst described as combat readiness for a war over Taiwan.

A set of revised rules regarding military recruitment has been released by the State Council and the Central Military Commission (CMC) the high command of the Chinese military headed by President Xi Jinping - aiming to provide institutional guarantees for consolidating national defence and building strong armed forces, state-run Xinhua news agency reported on Wednesday. The new regula-

This was the first visit by the Japanese Foreign Minister to Cĥina since 2019.

China and Japan have a long-festering dispute over uninhabited East China Sea islands controlled by Japan but claimed by China.

The islands are known as the Senkakus by Japan, while China named them as Diaoyu.

Taiwan also claims the islands but has forged agree-ments with Japan to avoid any conflict as Tokyo maintains close defence ties with Taipei. The purpose of Tokyo's new

initiative is to "contribute to the

creation of a desirable security environment for Japan," while maintaining Japan's "basic principles as a peaceful nation," according to the Japanese ministry statement.

The OSA is being presented as an expansion of Japan's official development assistance (ODA) - one of the world's largest foreign aid programs - to cover projects "for the benefit of

armed forces and other related organisations," the Japan Times

The new framework was revealed as Tokyo moves away from a strict non-military approach to ties with its neighbours and looks to realise its vision of a Free and Open Indo-Pacific (FOIP), it said.

According to its fiscal 2023 budget, the Japanese government has set aside two billion Japanese Yen (USD15 million) for OSA. Funding will be separate from the Yen 570.9 billion in economic and social development assistance that Tokyo pro-

vides to developing countries. While this year's modest OSA budget appears largely symbolic, especially compared with the ODA funds, experts say the decision to launch the program is significant, as it marks another step in Japan's march toward a more robust and proactive defence posture that could ultimately allow it more leeway in defence transfers, Japan Times report said.

Beijing (AP): China's exports rebounded unexpectedly to growth in March despite a decline in US and European demand following interest rate hikes to cool inflation.

Exports rose 14.8 per cent over a year earlier to USD 315.6 billion, recovering from a 6.8 per cent decline in January and February, customs data showed Thursday. Imports sank 1.4 per cent to USD 227.4 billion, a smaller contraction than the 10.2 per cent slide in the previous two months.

China's politically sensitive global trade surplus widened by 82 per cent over a year earlier to USD 88.2 billion.

Exports to the United States and the 27-nation European Union, China's biggest foreign markets, declined after the Federal Reserve and other central banks raised rates to slow consumer and business activity.

That was offset by doubledigit gains in sales to Canada, Indonesia, Russia and other markets. "The current external environment still is severe and complex," said a government spokesperson, Liu Daliang, at a news conference.

Trade weakness adds to complications for President Xi Jinping's government, which is trying to revive economic growth that sank last year to 3 per cent, the second-weakest rate since the 1970s. The ruling Communist Party set this year's growth target at "around 5 per cent."In the first three months of the year, exports edged up 0.5 per cent over the same period of 2022 to USD 821.8 bil-Administration of Customs of China reported. Total imports contracted 7.1 per cent to USD 617.1 billion.A revival in Chinese demand would be a boost to global suppliers, replacing weak US, European and Japanese sales. China is the

biggest export customer for its Asian neighbors and a key consumer market.

Retail sales and other activity are gradually improving after anti-virus restrictions that kept millions of people at home and temporarily shut down Shanghai and other industrial centers were lifted in December.

The economy also is under pressure from tighter controls on the use of debt in China's vast real estate industry, which triggered a slump in mid-2021.

Exports to the United States slid 7.7 per cent in March from a year earlier to USD 45.9 billion, an improvement over the 21.8 per cent contraction in January and Imports of US goods gained 5.6 per cent to USD 16.1

billion, rebounding from a 5 per cent decline in the first two months of the year. The Chinese trade surplus with the United States shrank by 14 pr cent compared with a year earlier to USD 27.6 billion. Imports from Russia,

mostly oil and gas, surged 40.5 per cent over a year ago to USD 11 billion, accelerating from a 31.3 per cent increase in January and February.

China, the biggest global energy consumer, has stepped up purchases from Russia to take advantage of price dis-counts after Washington, Europe and Japan cut imports to punish President Vladimir Putin's government for its attack on Ukraine. China can buy Russian oil and gas without triggering Western sanctions. That helps to buoy the Kremlin's foreign revenue, but President Joe Biden has warned Beijing against helping Moscow's military.Exports to Russia more than doubled to USD 9 billion. China's trade deficit with Russia narrowed by 50 per cent to USD 2 billion.

North Korea fires missile that may **NY fraud lawsuit: Trump** set to give 2nd deposition

New York (AP): Former President Donald Trump was expected to visit the offices of New York's attorney general Thursday for his second depo-

sition in a legal battle over his company's business practices.

The Republican was scheduled to meet with lawyers for Attorney General Letitia James, who sued Trump last year. Her lawsuit claims Trump and his family misled banks and business associates by giving them false information about his net worth and the value of assets such as hotels and golf courses. The lawsuit is unrelated to the felony criminal charges filed against Trump by the Manhattan district attorney, which led last week to his historic arraignment, the first for a former president.

Trump and his lawyers have said the Democrat's lawsuit against him is politically motivated and legally baseless. He and the company have denied doing anything wrong. James declined to answer a question about the planned deposition at a news confer-

Trump previously met with James' lawyers Aug. 10, but refused to answer all but a few procedural questions, his invoking Amendment protection against self-incrimination

"Anyone in my position taking the Fifth Amendment would be a fool an absolute fool," he said in the session, which was recorded on video and later released publicly. Trump predicted a "renegade" prosecutor would try to make a criminal case out of his answers, if he gave them. "One statement or answer that is ever so slightly off, just ever so slightly, by accident, by mistake, such as it was a sunny, beautiful day, when actually it was slightly overcast, would be met by law enforcement at a level seldom seen in this country, because I've experienced it," he said. A trial for the lawsuit is sched-

uled for October.

US Prez to expand migrant access to health plans

Biden is set to announce that his administration is expanding eligibility for Medicaid and the Affordable Care Act's health insurance exchanges to hundreds of thousands of immigrants brought to the US illegally as children, according to two ÚS officials briefed on the

The action will allow participants in the Obama-era Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program, or DACA, to access government-funded health insurance programs. The officials spoke on the con-

dition of anonymity to discuss the matter before the formal announcement on Thursday.

The 2012 DACA initiative was meant to shield from deportation immigrants brought to the US illegally by their parents as young children and to allow them to work legally in the country. However, the immigrants were still ineligible for government-subsidised health insurance programs because they did not meet the definition for having "lawful presence" in the US That's what Biden's Department

The White House action comes as the DACA program is in legal peril and the number of people eligible under the program is shrinking. An estimated 580,000 peo-

ple were still enrolled in DACA at the end of last year, according to US Citizenship and Immigration Services. That number is down from previous years. Court orders currently prevent the US Department of Homeland Security from processing new applications. The DACA program has been mired in legal challenges for years, while Congress has been unable to reach consensus on broader immigration reforms. DACA recipients can work legally and pay taxes, but they don't have legal status and are denied many benefits available to US citizens and foreigners living in the USIn



that Mr Khan can be targeted by snipers on his way to courts and these can be verified from the law enforcement agencies, he said. In November last year, Khan survived an assassination attempt on his life.

Benchmark equity indices Sensex and Nifty ticked higher for the ninth straight session on Thursday, buoyed by fag-end buying in banking, financial and realty stocks amid encouraging stocks amid encouraging domestic retail inflation data.

Weak trends in IT counters and fall in the overnight US equity markets triggered by fresh concerns over recession, however, put a check on market's uptrend.

In a largely subdued session, the 30-share BSE Sensex went up marginally by 38.23 points or 0.06 per cent to settle at 60,431. During the day, it hit a high of 60,486.91 and a low of 60,081.43.

The broader NSE Nifty climbed 15.60 points or 0.09 per cent to finish at 17,828.

"After the flat start, pressure in the IT majors pushed the Nifty lower however buying in select heavyweights especially from the banking pack trimmed all the losses and helped index to close flat," said Ajit Mishra, VP Technical Research, Religare Broking Ltd.

The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) has released Time-Series data as updated up to fiscal 2021-22 and also provided provisional data for 2022-23.

Direct Tax Buoyancy at 2.52 in FY 2021-22 is the highest Direct Tax Buoyancy recorded over the last 15 years. The direct tax to GDP ratio has increased from 5.62 per cent in 2013-14 to 5.97 per cent in 2021-22.

'India's exports up 6% to \$447 billion in 2022-23'

The country's exports rose by about 6 per cent to a "record" USD 447 billion during 2022-23 on account of healthy growth in the outbound shipments of sectors such as petroleum, pharma and chemicals and marine, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said on Thursday.

The country's imports also grew by 16.5 per cent to USD 14 billion in 2022-23 as against USD 613 billion in 2021-22.

He said that the exports of goods and services together scaled "new heights" and has increased by 14 per cent to USD 770 billion in 2022-23 as against 676 billion in 2021-22.

"I am delighted to share

with you the outstanding export performance for 2022-23, with India's overall exports scaling new heights at USD 770 billion, registering 14 per cent growth over the previous year and alltime high record growing from USD 500 billion in 2020-21 to USD 676 billion in 2021-22," the

Goyal is on a three-day visit to France and Italy from April 11-13 to hold a series of meetings with leaders and top CEOs in these two countries to further boost trade and investment ties.

minister told reporters here.

India's services exports too have increased by 27.16 per cent to USD 323 billion in 2022-23 as compared to USD 254 billion in 2021-22.

"This is truly a sign of

India's expanding our international footprints," he added. The overall imports of

oods and services have touched USD 892 billion and it reflects that the country's economic activities are growing and that has supported the exports.

Talking to reporters here, Goyal said that the growth in exports would help in containing the current account deficit.

In the services sector, there is a healthy growth in areas including IT, accounting and business processing. In the goods segment, sectors which recorded growth include oil meals, electronic goods, tobacco, oil seeds, rice, coffee, fruits and vegetables, leather goods, ceramic, pharma, marine products, chemicals, and ready-made garments of textiles.

Services imports are estimated at USD 178 billion in 2022-23 as against USD 147 billion a year ago.

Goyal said that the exports of goods and services has increased by about USD 100 billion to cross USD 770 billion in such challenging times, when the world is seeing softening and slowing of international trade, recessionary conditions in the developed world, and unprecedented high inflation in many developed countries.



is not a solution". Around 650 resolutions of debt-ridden corporates have happened since the implementation of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC) in late 2016. While acknowledging that delays and haircuts, among other things, Mital said the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (IBBI) did an analysis which showed that the IBC is for resolutions but it is being evaluated on the basis of

performance or haircuts. Resolution is a thing which requires innovations. Resolution professionals are the best to do such innovations with the help of the Committee of Creditors

"We should encourage innovation and desist from overregulation and writing everything in the Act," he said.

Mital said the Chennai bench of the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) recently passed an order where it said a part of Hindustan Photo Films can go into resolution and another part can go into liquidation. "This is an innovation... I am not saying that it can be done in every case but that is an innovation that we should encourage," he added.

IBBI is the key institution under the IBC.

He was speaking at the conference on 'Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code - Evolving Paradigms and Reforms' organised by industry body CII along with National Foundation for Corporate Governance (NFCG) and the IBBI in the national cap-

In the last six-and-a-half years, Mital said the IBC has done about 650 resolutions, adding that the IBC has led to without resolution or without

admission or with withdrawals The IBBI Chairperson said IIM Ahmedabad has been asked to conduct a study to find out whether these resolutions have led to a change in the economy, adding that the report is expected to come out in the next two

"I have seen the preliminary figures that they have collected and I find that sales (of companies) have increased or turnover has increased manifold after the resolution, EBITDA, Profit after tax, market cap have increased manifold... These things have not been documented, these things are not in

public domain. "So, I hope that in next two months, once this report comes out, we will have a better understanding of what the IBC has achieved in terms of resolutions," Mital said

EBITDA refers to Earnings Before Interest, Taxes, Depreciation and Amortisation.

Wagering barred in all forms, be it game of skill or chance: MoS IT

nline gaming rules do not need to get into is barred in all forms of games irrespective of the nature of the game, Union Minister Rajeev Chandrasekhar said in a tweet on Thursday.

The minister of state for electronics and IT was responding to an editorial, which said that the online gaming rules avoid dealing with nuances of games of chance versus games of skill.

Chandrasekhar said that wager is a welldefined expression in contract law, and decisions have clearly held the meaning of wager.

"There is no need in this framework to get into "nuances" of chance or skill, bcz the harm of wagering is directly being prohibited - regardless of the nature of the game," the minister tweeted. The Centre had last week notified norms to

regulate the online gaming sector, wherein real

money games involving wagering or betting have been prohibited. The ITRules for OnlineGaming hv been developed after extensive consultation, are quite clear n deal wth every aspect. This framework liberates startups from multiple conflicting state laws, court decisions etc n establishes clarity n growth," Chandrasekhar said. The government has opted for a self-regulation model for the online gaming sector and will initially notify three self-regula-

tory organisations that will approve the games that can operate in the country as per the rules. Under the notified rules, SROs will have to publish a framework to safeguard users against



the risk of gaming addiction, financial loss and financial fraud on its website.

Chandrasekhar said real money games involving prize money, are permitted, but real

money games with wagering are not. "ŚROs will evolve framework on how to deal wth addictive n harmful gaming as they develop capacity," the minister said. As per the rules, the online games will be regulated by SROs, which will include the industry, gamers and other stakeholders and not the government.

The SROs, as per the rules, should also include an educationist, an expert in the field of psychology or mental health, an individual who is or has been a member or officer of an organisation dealing with the protection of child rights etc.

The online gaming rules have been includas an amendment in the IT Rules of 2021.

According to the rules, the online gaming selfregulatory body may declare an online real money game as a permissible online real money game if "the online real money game does not involve wagering on any outcome".

'Rupee trade arrangement to help cut transactions cost'

International trade in the **L**domestic currency will help industry and several countries are in discussion with the RBI on this, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said on Last year, the RBI and

finance ministry asked the top management of banks and representatives of trade bodies to push export and import transactions in the rupee. Goyal said that today several countries are realising that in trade, there is a need for change in currency for that and it involves a conversion cost, which in turn increases transactions cost also.

"We can address these issues through rupee trade (arrangement)," he told reporters here, adding that several countries are under discussions with the RBI

That the two wins have come without any significant contribution from their star power-hitter Andre Russell and skipper Nitish Rana, make them an even more dangerous side.

While Shardul and Rinku have undoubtedly provided the finishing options, KKR think-tank would be keen to prove that these two wins were not a fluke. By his standard, Russell,



"With so much cricket going choosing most important tournaments. It is about how can a player secure his financial future and at the same time play enough to secure his cricketing legacy and help his country.

"You want guys like Bumrah and Jofra playing at their best with cutting edge pace. That is what when they have great value. Be very meticulous and specific with when you want them to play," he said.

In 2020, the great Michael Holding had expressed his doubts over Bumrah's longevity considering he generates a huge amount of pace with a short run-up and a unique action.

For Bishop, changing action following injuries did not work and he believes Bumrah is past that stage too.

"Everybody has got a unique way in how they formulate their action and Jasprit is more unique than most others so I think he has got to use the physical gifts he was blessed with and fine tune it as he goes along.


