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SISODIA WALKS TO FREEDOM

Former Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia on Friday night was released from jail after 530 days as the Supreme Court granted him bail earlier in the day in the excise policy scam case saying he is entitled to a "speedy trial" and that returning him to a trial court would be like making him "play snakes and ladders". A bench of Justice BR Gavai and Justice KV Viswanathan also said keeping the AAP leader in jail for an "unlimited time", without a trial, is in violation of his fundamental rights. Listing the conditions for his bail, the top court directed Sisodia to furnish a bail bond of ₹10 lakh with two sureties, surrender his passport and not make any attempt to either influence witnesses or tamper with evidence. Besides, he will have to report to the investigating officer every Monday and Thursday between 10 and 11 am.

"We find that, on account of a long period of incarceration running to around 17 months and the trial having not commenced, the appellant (Sisodia) has been deprived of his right to speedy trial," the bench said. The apex court had reserved its order in the case on August 6. Minutes after the bail order, celebrations broke out at the AAP office as well as

residence of Sisodia. Hours later, Special Judge Kaveri Baweja accepted the bail bonds and surety bonds submitted by the advocates representing Sisodia. The AAP hailed the SC

decision as "victory of truth" and added that it hoped that other jailed leaders of the party "will also get justice." The AAP further said the order is a "tight slap" on the dictatorship of the BJP-led

Centre but rued that the relief came after a year's delay.

Sisodia, who was wearing a maroon shirt, greeted the party workers and leaders, who showered rose petals on him as he walked out of the jail around 6.50 pm.

Addressing the supporters and media after his release, Sisodia expressed his deep gratitude towards Dr BR Ambedkar, saying, "Ever since this order came in the morning, every inch of my skin has been feeling indebted to Babasaheb. I don't understand how I will pay off this debt to Babasaheb."

"We have brought this legal battle to its logical end through the Constitution. I thank you all for being with me," Sisodia said and added that he had many of admirers but their numbers have increased in the last 17 months. "Not only me but every Delhi resident, and children of the country were with me emotionally in jail. I thank the SC from the bottom of my heart for using the power of Constitution to give a hard slap to the dictatorship in the country," he said. The AAP leader said it was an emotional moment for everyone and hoped that the power of Constitution and democracy will pave the way for release of Kejriwal. He raised the slogan, "Bhrasthachaar ka ek hi kaal, Kejriwal, Kejriwal."

Holding aloft flags and cheering loudly, crowds of AAP supporters waited to welcome Sisodia as stepped out of jail. Senior AAP leaders Sanjay Singh, Atishi, and Saurabh Bharadwaj were present outside Tihar to receive Sisodia. Sisodia is a founding member of the AAP and a close confidant of party chief Kejriwal. The bail to Sisodia is a shot in the arm for the beleaguered party, which is gearing up to contest the Haryana Assembly polls and the Delhi elections in the next few months. His release comes as a big win for the AAP. This is because of the three big AAP leaders who were arrested in the liquor policy case, just Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal remains behind bars. Sisodia's release also comes as the AAP struggles to govern Delhi and counter Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena.

According to experts, Sisodia will have to wait to join the Delhi Cabinet as there are several issues that need to be dealt with since the Chief Minister himself is in jail. "For Sisodia to be inducted in his Council of Ministers, Kejriwal needs to send his recommendation to the Lieutenant Governor from Tihar Jail, which seems difficult currently," experts said.

Government alert on India Bangladesh front

The Narendra Modi Government on Friday constituted a high-level committee, headed by a top Border Security Force (BSF) official, to monitor the situation along the Indo-Bangladesh border in view of the ongoing state of affairs in the neighbouring country, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said.

He said the committee would be in touch with counterpart authorities in Bangladesh to ensure the safety and security of Indian nationals, Hindus and other minority communities living there.

"In the wake of the ongoing situation in Bangladesh, the Modi Government has constituted a committee to monitor the current situation on the Indo-Bangladesh Border (IBB).

The committee will maintain communication channels with their counterpart authorities in Bangladesh to ensure the safety and security of Indian nationals, Hindus, and other minority communities living there. The committee will be headed by the ADG (Additional Director General), Border Security Force, Eastern Command, Shah said in a social media post.

Apart from the BSF ADG, the four other members of the

Centre expands CAA for more inclusivity

The Centre has expanded the ambit of the rules issued under the citizenship law Citizenship (Amendment) Act (CAA) through which Indian nationality will be given to persecuted minorities coming from Afghanistan,

Bangladesh or Pakistan. The Union Home Ministry announced that "any document" issued by the Central or State Governments or quasi-judicial body in India proving that either of the parents, grandparents or great-grandparents is or had been a citizen of one of the three countries will be acceptable.

The clarification of the Home Ministry came after many applicants seeking Indian nationality under the Citizenship (Amendment) Act, 2019 were reported to be facing difficulties due to a particular clause of the Citizenship (Amendment) Rules, 2024.



ISIS terrorist caught by Delhi Police

The Delhi Police Special Cell has averted a possible terrorist attack in the national Capital ahead of the Independence Day on August 15 by arresting a most wanted terrorist — a member of the Pune module of the ISIS, carrying a reward of ₹3 lakh.

According to a senior police officer, Rizwan was planning an attack ahead of I-Day as he and his associates were doing recce of many VIP areas of Delhi.

A mother beats all Olympic records

Elated for her son's silver medal, Neeraj Chopra's mother Saroj Devi also expressed happiness for Pakistan's Arshad Nadeem, who broke the Olympic record to beat the Indian defending champion in Paris, saying the latter is also like her "child". Chopra clinched the silver medal at the Paris Games with a season's best throw of 89.45m after Nadeem pulled off an Olympic record-breaking effort of 92.97m on Thursday night. With the silver win, Chopra became only the third Indian and the first in track-and-



field to win back-to-back individual Olympic medals. "We are very happy with the silver, the one who got gold is also our child and the one who got silver is also our child... All are athletes, all work hard," Saroj told PTI Videos in Khandra, Panipat, where the family is based. "Nadeem is also good, he

plays well, there is no difference between Neeraj and Nadeem. We got gold and silver there is no difference for us," she added in the interview given on Thursday night.

Both Chopra and Nadeem are good friends off the field despite being rivals on it. Chopra's fondness for "desi khana" is well-documented and his family is planning to welcome the two-time Olympic medallist with his favourite dish "Churma" "He did really well. We will welcome him with churma which is his favourite. I am delighted, people are lighting firecrackers, we are making laddoos," Saroj added.

Chopra's performance is creditable also because of the highly-competitive field in which as many as seven athletes went beyond the 86m mark.

"We are very happy. He produced his season's best. All were near 88-89m so competition was very tough. It's not about winning a gold or silver, but about winning a medal, and he did his best," Chopra's aunt Kamlesh said. Chopra is one of India's most decorated athletes, having won the gold at every tournament including the Olympics, World Championships, Diamond League, Asian Games and the Commonwealth Games.

Narottam front runner among takers of lone RS seat

The Election Commission of India (ECI) has announced the date of voting for the seat vacated after Jyotiraditya Scindia of Rajya Sabha of Madhya Pradesh was elected a member of the Lok Sabha. Voting will be held on this seat on September 3. The Election Commission has issued a notification for 12 vacant seats of Rajya Sabha across the country. With this, the process of filing nominations will now begin. Jyotiraditya Scindia contested the Lok Sabha elections from Guna-Shivpuri seat in Madhya Pradesh. Scindia defeated Congress's Yadavendra Singh in the election. After this, he resigned from the Rajya Sabha membership. The term left on the vacant seat is till June 21, 2026. Many BJP leaders are in the fray for this seat. Madhya Pradesh

has 230 assembly seats. In the 2023 assembly elections, BJP won 163 and Congress won 66 seats. Congress has lost three MLAs due to joining BJP. In Madhya Pradesh, five Rajya Sabha seats fell vacant in April, for which voting was held in February. In this, four BJP and one Congress Rajya Sabha member got elected. Party experts say that the decision for a seat will now be taken keeping in mind the caste equation. Last time members were elected from Dalit, OBC and women category. This time Rajya Sabha member can be elected from general quota only. However, during the Lok Sabha elections, Union Home Minister Amit Shah had talked about taking him to Delhi. In such a situation, the claim of KP Yadav, who comes from backward class, cannot be rejected. Senior BJP leader and former minister Narottam Mishra is being considered a contender

for the Rajya Sabha seat. During Operation Lotus and Lok Sabha elections, Narottam Mishra got a large number of Congressmen to join BJP. At the same time, he also played an important role in Operation Lotus. He is close to Union Home Minister Amit Shah. Apart from this, the name of former MP Jaibhan Singh Pawaiya is also in discussion. Pawaiya is the co-incharge of Maharashtra BJP. Apart from this, the names of BJP state vice-president Kantdev Singh and Mukesh Chaturvedi are also being discussed. Kantdev Singh is close to senior leaders of the organization. He has a good hold in Vindhya region. At the same time, the names of Mukesh Chaturvedi, who has a strong hold in the Chambal region, senior BJP leader Gopal Bhargava and former MP from Vidisha Ramakant Bhargava are also in discussion.

Lokayukta police raids premises of retired SE of BMC

Massive accumulation of wealth was found after Lokayukta team raided the house and office of retired superintendent engineer of Bhopal Municipal Corporation Pradeep Jain on Friday. Lakhs of rupees in cash, gold and silver jewellery, property related documents were found from his house. The team also found evidence of investment abroad. The house where the action was taken is in the name of his son Yash Jain. Lokayukta had received a complaint of financial irregularities against PK Jain. The action was taken at PK Jain's house located in the posh Lords Colony on Airport Road and the Smart City office located in Govindpura. A large number of documents have been seized from

both the places. His laptop and computer are also being investigated. Laptop and two hard disks have also been seized. A team of 12 people led by DSP Virendra Singh had reached for the action. Lokayukta team also raided PK Jain's office in Smart City located in Govindpura. Investigating investments abroad. Lokayukta sources said that information about investments abroad by Pradeep Jain has also been received. Jain's foreign investments are also being investigated in the documents found during the

action. Lokayukta officials said that documents of foreign trips have been found during the investigation. PK Jain returned from Canada just four days ago. Pradeep Jain is being questioned about his Canada tour. Pradeep Kumar Jain is a retired engineer of Bhopal Municipal Corporation. He is currently on contract as superintending engineer in Smart City Project Bhopal. SP Lokayukta Bhopal had received a complaint of him acquiring assets disproportionate to his income.

On verification of the complaint, prima facie evidence of 300 percent disproportionate assets was found. After this, on 9 August 2024, two teams of Lokayukta conducted search operations at his residence and office. During the search of the house, immovable property worth more than 5 crores, bills of jewelry worth more than 85 lakhs, records of investments worth lakhs, records of foreign travel have been found. Bank lockers will be searched separately. PK Jain's house is built on plot number 11 and 12 of Lords Colony. The house has been built in the mansion-like form on 6 thousand square feet. CCTVs are installed all around. This grand house of his was completed just a year ago. Neighbors told that the Jain family rarely stays here. Only servants live inside. Jain family mostly lives abroad. His son is settled in Canada.

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State govt implements new rules on cash related to ATM

Cash will not be deposited in ATMs located in villages of the state after 7 pm and in cities after 9 pm and it will not be transported. Along with this, the system has also been implemented that the van carrying cash should be of special design. It should not carry more than Rs 10 crore cash at a time. The presence of trained armed guards will be mandatory in the van carrying cash. The state government has made new rules regarding cash transactions and transportation by private agencies. This rule has been named Madhya Pradesh Private Security Agency (Private Security for Cash Transport Activities) Rules 2024.

The state government has made new rules regarding cash transactions and transportation by private agencies. This rule has been named Madhya Pradesh Private Security Agency (Private Security for Cash Transport Activities) Rules 2024.

This includes the process of carrying bank notes, coins, credit cards, debit cards or other valuable items from one place to another and putting it in an ATM machine. The government will provide security only if there is a license. The rules made by the Home Department state that no security will be given to any agency unless a license is taken under this Act. It also says that any private security agency or cash transport

agency will use a specially designed cash van. No taxi or hired vehicle will be used to transport cash. It also says that if a private security agency does not have currency vault services, and can provide assistance in remote areas under tight security of local police, then currency can be transported in other vehicles apart from specially designed vehicles. The vehicle carrying cash will include the driver and two armed security guards and two people including the ATM officer or custodian. If

more force is needed for the security of cash, they can also go along. It has also been clarified that one of the two armed guards will sit next to the driver in the front and the other will sit with the cash amount. Before appointing a person for private security transport, it will be mandatory to take NOC from the police about him. The place of residence of such persons will also be verified and for this verification will have to be done using their own means. The concerned person will have to live in the concerned residential area for at least three years. For the appointment of a private person, information will also have to be taken from the place where he was previously appointed. Provisions have also been

made in the rules for Aadhaar verification of such persons. It will also be necessary to take reliability insurance of all these employees. GPS will be mandatory in the vehicles in which cash will be transported. If more than ten lakh rupees are being carried, there will be armed guards. It will also have to be kept in mind that no van will transport an amount of more than five crore rupees at a time and if more than ten lakh rupees are being carried, it will be necessary to have a safe vehicle. In urban areas, the work of keeping or transporting any cash in ATMs will not be done after nine o'clock in the night. In rural areas, this work will not be done after seven o'clock in the evening.

FIR registered in nine year old death of undertrial prisoner

In the case of the death of an undertrial prisoner in Bhopal jail under suspicious circumstances, FIR has been ordered against the then jailor, TI, doctor and 5 constables of the crime branch. On 23 June 2015, prisoner Mohsin Khan (24) died during treatment at Gwalior's JAH hospital. In this case, the mother of the deceased had filed a private complaint in the court. Judge Virendra Yadav had investigated the matter. After this, the court of Judicial Magistrate First Class Manish Mishra issued this order. Advocate Amirullah Khan said that Mohsin, a resident of Tila Jamalpur, Bhopal, died on June 23, 2015 in Gwalior's JAH hospital. His family members alleged that on June 3, 2015, constables Murali, Dinesh Khajuria and Chironji of Crime Branch Bhopal had taken him for questioning. The family had also alleged that when the family reached the crime branch police station to get Mohsin released, they were asked for a bribe of Rs 2 lakh. After the crime branch, the police registered a false robbery case against Mohsin in TT Nagar police station and presented him in the court and sent him to jail. Before this, he was beaten up in the crime branch and TT Nagar police station.

His private parts were electrocuted. This was confirmed in the medical report. The family had also accused the jailor of beating Mohsin in the jail. The deceased's advocate Amirullah Khan said that Crime Branch Bhopal's constables took Mohsin on 3 June 2015. The complaint filed in the court on behalf of the deceased's mother Seema Khan was advocated by advocate Yawar Khan. In this case, three times earlier, the judicial magistrate had registered a case of murder and destruction of evidence. Three times the Sessions Court sent the case back to the lower court for reinvestigation and passing of orders. For the fourth time, the Magistrate Court registered a case of murder and destruction of evidence against the police officer, the jailer and the then medical officer of Hamidia Hospital and issued summons for their presence. The court said in its order that death due to assault in judicial custody is a deep blot on society. The court has registered a case of destruction of evidence of murder against TI Manish Raj Singh, the then jailer Alok Bajpai, the then psychiatrist of Hamidia Hospital RN Sahu, Sub Inspector DL Yadav, SSI constable Murali, Chironjilal. Among them, Manish Raj Singh is currently posted in Misrod police station. RN Sahu, Alake Bajpai have retired.

First skin bank starts at Kamla Nehru hospital

Bhopal: First Skin Bank of Bhopal was inaugurated on Friday on the first floor of Kamala Nehru Hospital, both living and dead persons can donate skin in this skin bank built at a cost of Rs15 lakh. This skin bank is the second in the state and the first in Bhopal, earlier this facility was available in Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Medical Hospital, Jabalpur. During this, Superintendent of Hamidia Hospital Suneet Tandon, Dean of GMC Dr. Kavita Kumar, Professor HOD Dr. Arun Bhatnagar, Designated Professor Dr. Anand Gautam, Assistant Professor Dr. Hari Shankar Singh were present. Actually, skin is needed for the treatment of people burnt in accidents. Due to the absence of a skin bank till now, there was no arrangement for skin donation in Hamidia Hospital. About 9 months ago, a proposal was prepared for this by the Burn and Plastic Department. Its proposal was sent to the Commissioner Medical Education and a budget was sought. On receiving the budget, action was started to start a skin bank by arranging the necessary equipment and infrastructure for the skin bank. However, the process of opening this bank was going on for a year. Last time also the matter reached the ethical committee, but permission was not given due to incomplete arrangements. In live donation, the donor is discharged within 24 hours.

Designated Professor Dr. Anand Gautam said that patients with burns of more than 30 percent to 50 to 60 percent, their own skin gets completely used up, so a skin bank is needed, that is why this skin bank has been opened, the way organ donation happens, blood can be donated or kidney can be donated. In the same way, skin can also be donated. This skin can be used in such patients. If someone is a patient of a private hospital, then according to the protocol, he can take skin from here. Its storage capacity can be kept in a normal fridge for 21 days, we have a deep freezer, here it can be kept for 6 months to one year. In this, the live donor is discharged after 24 hours. The donor's skin also heals in 15 days. HOD Doctor Arun Bhatnagar said that skin bank is a part of our department, it is needed for burn patients. Any person can donate skin in it, which can be stored. We can use it for any patient. Its biggest advantage is that it helps in saving the lives of patients of major burns. Because there is a risk of infection due to skin. This reduces the risk of infection. In this, there is live donation and the second is cadaver donation. If the patient's attendants want, then that person can donate the skin, they can donate. If anyone wants to do this, there is not much blood loss in this. Secondly, in cadaver donation, it is taken from the body of the dead person. This skin is taken from hands and feet.

3 vehicle scrap centres being set up

Bhopal: Vehicle scrapping facility centers are being set up by the Transport Department to systematically scrap vehicles older than 15 years owned by the government and corporations in the state and private vehicles that fail the fitness test. At present, two registered vehicle scrapping facility centres have been started in Bhopal district and one in Indore district. To encourage the general public to scrap vehicles through the Registered Vehicle Scrapping Facility Centre, a discount of up to 15 percent in motor vehicle tax and up to 25 percent for non-transport vehicles is being given on the purchase of new vehicles by them. For motor vehicles of any category and any age limit registered in the state, up to 90 percent discount has been provided on the due amount of any motor vehicle tax or penalty. Through this scheme, revenue of Rs 57 lakh has been obtained from 600 vehicles. A call centre has been set up by the Transport Department to provide information about vehicle tax, permit, fitness etc. to commercial vehicle owners of the state, on which vehicle owners can call and get information related to their vehicles.

Opp silence on threat to Hindus in Bangladesh unfortunate: BJP

BJP MPs on Friday criticised Opposition parties, saying their silence on the situation of Hindus and other minority communities in Bangladesh is unfortunate.

Several Hindu temples, households and businesses have been vandalised in violence in Bangladesh since Monday when Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina resigned and fled to India. During the Zero Hour of the Lok Sabha, BJP MP Anurag Thakur tried to corner the Leader of Opposition and Congress MP, Rahul Gandhi, by alleging that he has not spoken on ensuring the safety of minorities in

Bangladesh. "When the interim Government of Bangladesh took over, Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated them but at the same time he asked them to ensure the safety of minorities," he said. "It is unfortunate that the Leader of Opposition extended congratulations to the interim Government (of Bangladesh) but did not mention the safety and security of Hindus and the minorities. What was the compulsion? You spoke about Gaza but not about minorities in Bangladesh," Thakur said. Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus took oath as the head of the interim Government of

Bangladesh on Thursday, replacing Hasina. BJP MP from Odisha's Dhenkanal Rudra Narayan Pany, while raising the issue of Hindu temples being attacked in Bangladesh, said the Government of India should interfere to ensure their safety. "Hindu temples have been attacked in Bangladesh, and the photos that have come out show that the statue of Lord Jagannath was attacked. This is unfortunate, condemnable and painful..." Pany said. "What is this mentality behind damaging Hindu temples?" he asked. Pany said this has hurt not just the people of Odisha but people all across India. "The Government of India should

talk to Bangladesh to ensure that the guilty are punished," he said.

BJP MP from Assam's Darrang-Udaiguri Dilip Saikia also raised concerns over the situation in Bangladesh and urged the Government to strengthen security along the India-Bangladesh border.

"India wants peace to be restored in Bangladesh. India has a 4,096-kilometer border with Bangladesh," he said and added that security along the Indo-Bangladesh border should be as strong as that along the India-Pakistan border.

He also said the Indian Government should ensure that minorities are protected in Bangladesh. BJP MP from Andaman and Nicobar Islands Bishnu Pada Ray said, "My father came to West Bengal in 1946 from East Pakistan to save his life. Then he went to Andaman... What is happening in Bangladesh today...?" "Congress, CPI(M) and TMC should condemn what is happening in Bangladesh. They are sitting quietly," he said and added that they are quiet due to their "votebank".

He also said that the Parliament should pass a resolution on the situation in Bangladesh.



Parliament adjourned sine die

Both the houses of Parliament on Friday were adjourned sine die, one sitting ahead of the scheduled end of the session. The current session was scheduled to end on August 12. Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla adjourned the House sine die (for an indefinite period). The Rajya Sabha was also adjourned sine die. During the session, the Finance Bill was passed. A Bill to amend the Waqf law was also introduced and referred to a joint committee of Parliament amid protests over its provisions. Birla said the productivity of the House was above 130 per cent.

After multiple adjournments in the post-lunch session, when the Upper House reassembled at 1530 hrs, Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar expressed his concern over the manner in which Opposition members conducted themselves in and outside the house. He later adjourned the House sine die at 1554 hrs.

Parliament marks 82nd anniversary of Quit India Movement

Parliament on Friday commemorated the 82nd anniversary of the Quit India Movement, with Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha paying homage to the martyrs. Both Houses stood in silence for a brief moment as a mark of respect for those who sacrificed their lives. Before the start of proceedings, Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar recalled the historic day when Mahatma Gandhi launched the movement in 1942. "Today marks the 82nd anniversary of the historic day when Mahatma Gandhi launched the Quit India Movement in 1942. His clarion call of 'do or die' ignited the nation and ultimately led Bharat gaining independence from colonial rule," Dhankhar said. The Chairman highlighted the movement's continued relevance, describing it as a "testament to the power and will of the people and their determination to overcome any challenge." As India enters the 75th year of its Constitution's adoption, Dhankhar emphasized that the movement's foundational principles remain crucial in shaping the nation's destiny.

Modi assures BJP MPs on SC/ST reservation policy

A delegation of BJP MPs on Friday met Prime Minister Narendra Modi and expressed concern over the Supreme Court's observation on identifying the creamy layer among the Scheduled Castes (SC) and the Schedule Tribes (ST). After the meeting, Modi said in a social media post, "Met a delegation of SC/ST MPs today. Reiterated our commitment and resolve for the welfare and empowerment of the SC/ST communities." On August 1, Supreme Court Judge Justice B R Gavai had said States must evolve a policy for identifying the creamy layer even among the SCs and STs, and deny them the benefit of reservation. BJP Rajya Sabha member Sikander Kumar, who was part of the delegation, said "All of us were concerned over the Supreme Court's observation. We were getting phone calls from people expressing concern over the matter." "A delegation of MPs representing SCs and STs met the Prime Minister this morning and expressed their concern in this connection," he said in the Parliament complex.



The Prime Minister held a serious discussion with the MPs and assured that the Government will not let the apex Court's observation be implemented, Kumar said. "We express our gratitude towards the prime minister for this," he said. BJP MP Faggan Singh Kulaste said the delegation in its memorandum to the Prime Minister urged that the apex Court's observation on the issue of creamy layer should not be implemented. "The Prime Minister was also held a similar view. He assured us that he will look into the matter and asked us not to worry, saying it will not be implemented in the SC and ST category," he told.



SC stays HC order on college ban on hijab

The Supreme Court on Friday partly stayed a Mumbai college circular banning 'hijab, burqa, cap and naqab' on the campus and said girl students must have the freedom to choose what they wear. Educational institutions, it said, cannot force on them their choice.

A bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Sanjay Kumar issued notice to the Chembur Trombay Education Society, which runs the 'N G Acharya and D K Marathe College', and sought its response by November 18. "Girl students must have freedom of choice in what they are wearing and college cannot force them...It's unfortunate that you suddenly wake up to know that there are many religions in the country," the bench told the college administration at the centre of a fresh row over a dress code for Muslim students. It added why the college did not ban 'tilak' and 'bindi' if it intended the religious faiths of the students to not be revealed.

"Will the students' names not reveal their religious identity?" the bench asked Senior Advocate Madhavi Diwan, appearing for the educational society. The Court, however, said no burqa can be allowed to be worn by girls inside the classroom and no religious activities can be permitted on the campus. The bench said its interim order should not be misused by anybody and granted liberty to the educational society and the college to approach the Court in case of any misuse.

The top Court was hearing a plea challenging a Bombay High Court verdict upholding the college's decision to ban hijab, burqa and naqab inside the campus. Senior advocate Colin Gonsalves and advocate Abiha Zaidi, appearing for the petitioners, including Zainab Abdul Qayyum, submitted that students were not able to attend classes because of the ban.

Bill introduced to expand bank nominees, safeguard depositors

A Bill seeking to provide for four nominees by a bank account holder was introduced in the Lok Sabha on Friday to ensure better protection of depositors and enhance customer convenience.

Introduced by Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary in the Lower House, the Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024, has a provision for simultaneous and successive nominations to bank accounts, lockers etc. As per the provision of the Bill, a bank account holder can nominate up to four persons. The Bill also seeks to transfer of unclaimed dividends, shares, and interest or redemption of bonds to the Investor Education and Protection Fund (IEPF), allowing individuals to claim transfers or refunds from the fund, thus safeguarding investors' interests.

As the banking sector has evolved over the years and with a view to improving bank governance and investor protection, it has become necessary to make certain amendments to five Acts, according to Statement of Objects and Reasons of the Bill.

The Bill, which was approved by the Union Cabinet last week, proposes to amend the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934, the Banking Regulation Act, 1949, the State Bank of India Act, 1955, the Banking Companies (Acquisition and Transfer of Undertakings) Act, 1970, and the Banking



Companies (Acquisition and Transfer of Undertakings) Act, 1980.

The proposed Bill seeks to improve governance standards, provide consistency in reporting by banks to the Reserve Bank of India, ensure better protection for depositors and investors, improve audit quality in public sector banks, bring customer convenience in respect of nominations and to provide for increase in the tenure of the directors in co-operative banks. Therefore, it was felt necessary to amend the said enactments and for that purpose to introduce the Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024 in Parliament.

Another proposed change relates to redefining 'substantial interest' for directorships, which could increase to Rs 2 crore instead of the current limit of Rs 5 lakh, which was fixed almost six decades ago. Congress member Manish Tewari opposed the introduction of the Bill saying the power to legislate with regard to cooperatives vests with State Governments. RSP member N K Premachandran opposed

amending five legislations through one Bill, while TMC member Saugata Roy termed the Bill "superfluous" saying the amendments proposed in the Bill could have been done through administrative decisions. Responding to Opposition's remarks, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said the various amendments done in Banking Regulations Act with respect to cooperative banks are not just one or two but several. "Simple understanding is we are not touching any aspect of the cooperatives other than that which claims under the name of banking. The sections which have been brought in for amendments, as also the Court verdicts, have repeatedly reinforced the point that Banking Regulation Act and the Cooperative Banks do have this relationship and therefore it has to be taken through this route," she said.

Otherwise, there is no attempt to undermine the cooperatives, particularly cooperatives dealing with everything other than banks, she said defending the Bill. The Bill proposes to increase the tenure of directors (excluding the Chairman and whole-time director) in cooperative banks from 8 years to 10 years, so as to align with the Constitution (Ninety-Seventh Amendment) Act, 2011. Once passed, the Bill would allow a director of a Central Cooperative Bank to serve on the board of a State Cooperative Bank.

Cong accuses RS chairman of partisanship, Opp walks out

The Congress on Friday accused Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar acting in a "partisan" manner against the entire Opposition. Soon after Opposition walked out of the Rajya Sabha protesting against what they termed as "unacceptable" tone and disrespect shown by Dhankhar, the Congress held a press conference to claim that the Chairman was not giving the Opposition the importance it deserves in the Upper House.

"Opposition parties feel that the Chairman's approach is partisan. The Rajya Sabha is a House that sets parameters for other legislatures. In that House, the Chairman should not be seen partisan. The Congress alone does not feel that way, all Opposition parties feel his behaviour is partial towards one side," Congress Leader Ajay Maken said at a press conference. The Opposition is not getting the importance it deserves in the Upper House, he said. "If the Opposition's voice does not resonate in Rajya Sabha, where else will it resonate," he asked.

Congress' Deputy Leader in the Rajya Sabha Pramod Tiwari claimed that Leader of Opposition Mallikarjun Kharge is not allowed to speak, he is frequently interrupted and his microphones are often shut. "It is not about one party. Two-three days ago Ghanshyam Tiwari used such words for the Leader of Opposition which were not



right and were insulting and unacceptable. We had given notice for privilege motion. We wanted to know the ruling on it, the ruling has not come, it has to be in writing," he said.

Earlier, the Opposition walked out of the House, with Congress parliamentary party Sonia Gandhi and other senior leaders in tow. The walkout came after Samajwadi Party MP Jaya Bachchan and Vice President Dhankhar were engaged in a heated exchange in the Upper House. "Main kalakar hoon, body language samajhti hoon, expression samajhti hoon... Par sir, mujhe maaf kariyega magar apka tone jo hai is not acceptable. We are colleagues sir, you may be sitting on the chair," she said.

Dhankhar hit back, saying, "Jaya ji, you've earned a great reputation. You know, an actor is subject to director. You've not seen what I see from here. I don't want schooling. I am a person who has gone out of the way, and you say my tone...enough of it." After the walkout, Bachchan told reporters that she objected to the tone used by the Chair. "We are not school children. I was upset with the tone and especially when the

LoP stood up to speak, his mic was switched off. How can you do this? If he is not going to be heard in the House, then what are we doing? On top of that, every time (they are) using words which are unparliamentary," she said.

Congress General Secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh told reporters that Ghanshyam Tiwari had insulted the Leader of Opposition in the House in front of everybody.

"Today it was said that Ghanshyam Tiwari came and in a closed door meeting praised Kharge ji. So what he said privately, we demanded that he should say it in the House. He insulted Kharge ji, he should say that what I said was wrong and I respect him and by mistake I said what I said," Ramesh said.

"He (Chairman) keeps interrupting me, I have no objection to that but LoP is not allowed to speak. LoP has been insulted. The dignity of a constitutional post has been lowered. We are against this. Jaya Bachchan had gotten up for this issue only that the Leader of Opposition is being repeatedly insulted and not being allowed to speak," he said. "Issue was that Tiwari made serious allegations against Kharge which we wanted wanted should be erased from records," he said.

Addressing the Rajya Sabha, Bachchan, a Samajwadi Party MP, expressed her disapproval of Dhankhar's tone in the House which led to an exchange of words between the two.



Jaishankar updates LS on 69 Indians in Russian army

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on Friday said in the Lok Sabha the Government is awaiting the release of 69 Indians recruited into the Russian army and that in many cases there are indications that the Indian Nationals were misled into joining that country's army.

On action taken with respect to misleading of people and getting them recruited into the Russian army, the Minister told the house that the CBI has registered a criminal case against 19 individuals and entities while evidence has surfaced against 10 human traffickers whose identities the Government knows. Two of the accused were arrested on April 24 and two more on May 7. "We should not jump the gun and say Russians are not serious on this matter. I think it is important to hold the Russian Government to their word and most important for us, we are not here to score points or enter into debates. We are here to get back those 69 people because Indian citizens should not be serving in the army of foreign countries," he said during the Question Hour. He was responding to queries from AIMIM member Asaduddin Owaisi on action being taken against individuals who are misleading youth to join the Russian army and whether India will stop buying discounted oil from Russia if it does not act on releasing Indians recruited into that country's army.

So far, the Minister said there are a total of 91 cases of Indian Nationals being recruited into the Russian army. Out of them, eight have passed away, 14 were discharged or in some manner have come back with the Government's assistance and "there are 69 Indian citizens awaiting release from the Russian army," he added. Out of the eight who died, the mortal remains of four have been sent back to India and in two cases one from Haryana and Punjab DNA samples have been sent to the Russian side.

Lucknow lab finds herbal way to manage gout

In a significant advancement in the management of gout, a prevalent form of arthritis affecting many, particularly those above 35, scientists from the Lucknow-based CSIR-National Botanical Research Institute (NBRI) have developed a herbal formulation to target the condition caused by elevated uric acid levels that leads to severe pain, swelling, and inflammation in joints, most commonly the big toe. Unlike many existing herbal products which lack rigorous scientific backing, 'NBRI-Gout Out', has undergone extensive testing.

Its efficacy has been evaluated through a range of in-vitro and in-vivo assays, demonstrating its effectiveness in reducing uric acid levels by 80 per cent and inflammatory mediators by about 70 per cent. The herbal remedy is developed by Dr Ankita Misra under the mentorship of Dr. Sharad Srivastava (Chief Scientist and Head) at Pharmacognosy Division of CSIR-NBRI. It has been found synergistically efficacious in



gout/gouty arthritis, at par with standard drug colchicine. This highlights its potential as a reliable alternative or adjunct to conventional treatments.

"The bio-efficacy of combination was tested through a battery of in-vitro and in-vivo assays under the laboratory conditions and further, the safety and toxicity of NBRI-Gout out was also established in animal models. Studies showed a significant reduction in uric acid (80%) and about 70 per cent reduction in inflammatory

mediators, the primary causes underlying the pathogenesis of gout," said Dr Misra. Additionally, it showed a significant reduction in pain, and stiffness in joints and improved locomotion. It is completely water soluble with no solvent residue. The raw materials used are widely available in the herbal drug market and do not threaten biodiversity. The product has been developed in AYUSH mode and is cost-effective, and two companies have shown interest in

commercialization.

The herbal remedy can also be used as an adjuvant therapy along with existing line of treatment in gouty arthritis, gouty flare, prophylaxis cases and idiopathic cases having gout symptoms, she added.

"There are few herbal products available in the market specifically targeting gouty arthritis to address the problem. However, many of the existing products with claims like alleviating pain and inflammation of joints, lack scientific validation and are marketed, based on traditional claims only.

"Besides, the number of ingredients in existing products is also quite high. The problem could be addressed through the development of a natural plant-based supplement which can be used as an adjuvant therapy to the existing line of treatment for the management of conditions," said an official from the Union Science and Technology.

The CSIR-NBRI initiative was funded under the "Scheme for Young Scientists and Technologist", SEED Division of the Ministry.

Lightest bulletproof jacket unveiled

Vinesh's Olympics exit echoes of Shiny 1986 heartbreak

The whole of India is yet to recover from the shock disqualification of Vinesh Phogat from the 50 kg wrestling event in the Olympics being held at Paris. Notwithstanding the histrionics displayed by our politicians and "intellectuals" which was similar to adding insult to injury, there are many facts that remain undiscussed. In international events like Olympics, laws are not for breaking.

The judges are intransigent when it comes to rules and regulations. Questions like whether the Prime Minister would congratulate Vinesh Phogat are, to make it blunt, simply childish and premature. In the melee that followed a la Vinesh Phogat affair, our sporting organisations and followers of the game forgot an event that happened during the 1986 Asian Games in Seoul. and was on her way to set a new Asian record. She was well ahead of all other contestants when she inadvertently cut into the inner lane, which was an error and mistake. Though there were no runners anywhere near Shiny, the organizers disqualified her. The entire nation was shocked and the entire news rooms across the country were stunned. But there were no political discourse and channel discussions as sports had not degenerated into the level which we saw when Vinesh Phogat was disqualified. No prime minister or sports minister rang her up to

console her. Shiny had courage in her and she was not the kind who ran away from battlefield. In the Asian Track and Field Events of 1989 she won her favorite item with a gold medal. The story is not yet over. Within months of her having a baby, Shiny ran the 800 meters in a career best time of 1 minute 59.85 seconds in the New Delhi edition of South Asian Federation Games in 1995 and raced with the gold medal to cuddle her baby. The saying during those days was that Shiny ran better and faster after the child birth. Vinesh Phogat, are you reading this?

'Har Ghar Tiranga' initiative now mass movement: Maha CM

"The Quit India call given from the August Kranti Maidan was the final struggle for independence and the new generation should be made aware of the sacrifices of the freedom fighters," Shinde said. Programmes like 'Tiranga March' and felicitation of freedom fighters will be held across the state, he said. On the occasion, Shinde administered a pledge to citizens that they will hoist the national flag in their homes, and also flagged off a cyclathon and a padyatra (foot march) of students and youth. Shinde paid floral tributes to martyrs at the August Kranti Maidan to mark the 82nd anniversary of the Quit India movement.

Andhra CM promises to uplift tribals through all-round development

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu on Friday greeted the tribal community on the occasion of World Tribal Day here and promised to empower them through development on fronts such as education and health. The Chief Minister said his government will explore all possibilities to raise the income of tribal people. "On this World Tribal Day, I not only extend my greetings to all of you but with a definite plan, I will take the responsibility to develop tribal people," said Naidu, addressing a large gathering at Tummalapalli Kalakshetram. Noting that the per capita income of tribal people in the state was only Rs 1.25 lakh per annum, the CM said the government would focus on this aspect to enhance it. Assuring to promote tribal products, which include organic agricultural produce, Naidu said the state government will use the Centre's Open Network for Digital Commerce (ONDC) platform for this purpose. He



observed that ONDC can enable tribals from villages to directly sell their products to consumers in cities such as Bengaluru and Hyderabad. Referring to GI-tagged Araku coffee, cultivated in the southern state, the CM said steps would be taken to promote it. Pointing to the absence of proper infrastructure in tribal villages, Naidu said Rs 2,373 crore will be spent to supply tap water to over 16,000 tribal homes while roads will be laid in 2,191 hamlets without road connectivity. He also promised to build the necessary infrastructure for the community to get access to medical facilities.

Students strip-searched in school: HC issues notice to MP Govt

The Madhya Pradesh High Court on Friday issued a notice to the state government in connection with an incident in a school in Indore where some students were allegedly strip-searched by a teacher to find out who among them brought a mobile phone to class. Justices Sushrut Arvind Dharmadhikari and Duppala Venkata Ramana of the Indore bench of MP HC issued notice to the state government on a PIL filed by social activist Chinmoy Mishra. The notice sought a report within a week from the state government on the steps taken in connection with the alleged incident. During the hearing, Mishra's lawyer Abhinav Dhanodkar claimed Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act provisions have not been complied with in the case as yet, though parents filed a police complaint on August 2.

Gujarat Congress launches 'Nyay Yatra' for victims of major tragedies in State

The Gujarat Congress on Friday launched a 14-day 'Nyay Yatra', a foot march, here to seek justice for the victims of four major tragedies that took place in the BJP-ruled state over the last five years. The Bharatiya Janata Party was shielding the real culprits of these incidents including the recent Rajkot game zone fire, it alleged. Congress Legislative Party leader in the assembly Amit Chavda, Seva Dal president Lalji Desai and MLA Jignesh Mevani launched the campaign. The march will cover nearly 350 kilometers before reaching Gandhinagar on August 23, said party spokesperson Manish Doshi. Family members of the deceased from these tragedies -- 2019 Takshashila fire incident in Surat, Morbi bridge collapse of 2022, and this year's Vadodara boat capsizing incident and TRP game zone fire in Rajkot -- will join the Yatra, he said. Mevani said that nearly 200 people died in these incidents

due to the rampant corruption under the BJP government. "We are taking out this Nyay Yatra because people do not trust ongoing investigations. Victims of Morbi bridge collapse demand that the probe be conducted by the CBI, or some non-corrupt officers. We will get justice the day all the real culprits, be it IAS, IPS officers, businessmen or BJP leaders, are behind bars," said the MLA who is the working president of Gujarat Congress. "We demand that all the cases be tried in fast-track courts. The kin of the victims must get a minimum compensation of Rs 1.5 crore because the compensation of Rs 4 lakh is too meagre. The Morbi Nagarpalika office-bearers should be booked for murder," Mevani added. On July 6, Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi had visited Ahmedabad and met the family members of some of the victims, promising to raise their grievances in Parliament.

Mizoram, Assam hold border talks after 20 months

Mizoram and Assam discussed the border issues on Friday, twenty months after the two northeastern neighbours held a meeting to find an amicable solution to the inter-state boundary dispute, an official said. The meeting between delegations of both states is being held in Aizawl. The two states held the last round of talks in November 2022 in Guwahati. During Friday's meeting, the Assam delegation is led by Border Protection and Development Minister Atul Bora while the Mizoram side is headed by Home Minister

K Sapdanga, the official said. This is the fourth ministerial-level talks between the two neighbouring states since August 2021 and the first meeting after the Zoram People's Movement (ZPM) came to power in December last year. Three Mizoram districts - Aizawl, Kolasib and Mamit - share a 164.6 km border with Assam's Cachar, Karmganj and Hailakandi districts. The dispute mainly stemmed from two colonial demarcations - 1875 and 1933. Mizoram claims that 509 square miles area of the inner line reserved forest, notified in 1875 under the Bengal Eastern Frontier Regulation



(BEFR) 1873, falls within its territory. Assam, on the other hand, regarded the map prepared by the Survey of India in 1933 as its constitutional boundary. Vast areas within the inner line reserved forest now fall

under Assam. Similarly, a certain extent of the area, as per the 1933 demarcation line, is now on the Mizoram side. There is no ground demarcation of boundaries between the two states.

Gujarat Govt school teacher remains on payroll despite settling in US in 2016; probe ordered

The Gujarat government has ordered a probe against a government schoolteacher who allegedly continues to be on the payroll despite settling in the US and remaining absent from duty for nearly eight years, an official said on Friday. The in-charge principal of a primary school in Panchha village in Banaskantha district claimed the teacher, Bhavna Patel, has been on the school's payroll despite reporting to duty only for a month every year and going on

unauthorised leave as she lives in the US. On learning about the principal's allegations, Gujarat Education Minister Kuber Dindor ordered a probe. Talking to reporters, Dindor said, "I have ordered an inquiry and sought a report from district officials. We do not allow such practice. If found guilty of unauthorised absence, we will punish the teacher and recover the salary she was paid." Minister of State for Education Praful Pansheriya asserted that the teacher had

not been paid since January. "She is one of 11 teachers in Danta taluka of Banaskantha. As per a primary report submitted by officials, she has been taking leaves at regular intervals. However, the report clearly stated that she has not been paid a single rupee since January. We will take action if she is found guilty of availing any other benefits despite living abroad," Pansheriya said. The issue came to the fore after Parul Mehta, the in-charge principal of the school, informed local media that despite settling in the US in

2016, Patel continues to be on the payroll. "Bhavnaven Patel settled in the US in 2016. But, to ensure her service continues, she comes to school once a year and serves for a month. This has been going on for several years. Children are suffering because of her long absence. She should either resign or join duty," Mehta told reporters. She also shared a letter dated July 18, wherein she urged District Education Officer Vinubhai Patel to take action against the teacher, who will retire in 2027.

Assam ex-BJP MLA Sarma joins Congress

Former BJP MLA Ashok Sarma on Friday joined Congress along with hundreds of his supporters. At a joining programme here, the senior BJP leader took the membership of Congress in the presence of its deputy leader in Lok Sabha Gaurav Gogoi, state president Bhupen Kumar Borah, Leader of the Opposition Debabrata Saikia along with AICC leaders Prithviraj Sathe and Vikas Upadhyay. "On this day, the Quit India movement started to get Independence from the British. I chose this day to join the Congress in recognition of the sacrifice made by the party and its leaders," Sarma said, addressing the huge crowd. He said it was a tough decision to join the Congress as his family, including all three brothers and two sisters, was associated with the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS). "My political existence was at stake in the BJP. The party's arrogance to destroy Congress was also not well accepted by common party workers. After Himanta Biswa Sarma joined the BJP, the downfall started. Because of such an attitude, Congress will form a government again next time," he claimed. During the Congress regime in Assam, the society was never divided and it was also



not so during former CM Sarbananda Sonowal's tenure, he added. "However, we are seeing only Hindu-Muslim politics in the last three years. I do not agree with the politics of division in society," Sarma said. Along with him, scores of Nalbari district BJP leaders and workers also joined the Congress. Borah said, "We are really happy to welcome Sarma into the Congress. We are happy that this joining programme is taking place at the Nalbari Congress office and we are not able to accommodate the supporters. It shows our growing popularity." Gogoi said Sarma's joining Congress will create a "tremor" in BJP in lower Assam districts and more leaders will come to the opposition party in coming months.

Centre withdraws ₹66 cr sanctioned for Mizoram border road project

The Centre has withdrawn Rs 66 crore initially sanctioned for the construction of a border road between Sangau and Saisihchhuah, intended to connect south Mizoram's Lawngtlai district with Myanmar's Chin state, Union Minister Sukanta Majumdar said on Friday. In a written reply to a question from Mizoram's Rajya Sabha member K. Vanlalvena in Parliament, Majumdar said the Rs 66.08-crore border road project was sanctioned in February 2021 and was to be executed by the Border Roads Organisation (BRO), a release by the state's Information and Public Relations Department said. "The sanctioned amount for the project was withdrawn by the Centre as the state government failed to provide the required land free of cost by June this year," Majumdar,

the Union Minister of State for Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER), was quoted as saying in the statement. The Minister also mentioned that the Sangau-Saisihchhuah road project has now been incorporated into the Thingsai to Pangkhua-Sangau road project under General Staff (GS) funding of the BRO scheme. In another response, Majumdar, who also holds the Education portfolio, informed Parliament that the Centre has sanctioned Rs 669.75 crore for the construction of a permanent campus for the National Institute of Technology (NIT) at Lengpui, near Aizawl. He added that the government is taking steps to obtain the necessary forest clearance for the project. Majumdar noted that the first academic session of NIT in Mizoram began in 2010, and the institution currently has 668 students.

Post-Wayanad, Goa reactivates disaster management committee

In light of the recent landslides in Kerala that claimed more than 200 lives, the Goa government has reactivated its high-level committee on disaster management, making ground-level revenue officials responsible for reporting illegal hill cutting. Chief Minister Pramod Sawant on Friday chaired a high-level meeting of the state disaster management committee, for which state Revenue Minister Atanasio Monserrate and other high-ranking officials at Porvorim were present. Talking to reporters after the meeting, Sawant said the state government has woken up after the Wayanad landslide, reviving its machinery to prevent such incidents in Goa. Goa shares Sahyadri Hill ranges with Karnataka, Kerala and Maharashtra. Sawant said the committee will now be called the state disaster management



authority, with dedicated officers working around the year. He recalled landslides in Sattari taluka inside the forests of Satrem, Karanzol and Mauxi villages in 2022 and said the committee formed to probe the incident had concluded that it happened due to heavy rains and deforestation. The chief minister said minor landslides have been reported in Bardez, Mormugao, Sattari, Bicholim, Pernem and Salcette talukas in the last few years. The committee will identify landslide-prone areas, he said. The main focus would be on the areas on the foothills, and

the committee has the power to immediately stop hill-cutting if they find that it could be dangerous to people living in the vicinity. Sawant said another committee comprising mamlatdars (local revenue officers), zonal agriculture officers and range forest officers will monitor the situation in their respective areas. Guidelines would be issued to the revenue, forest, town and country planning, public works department, panchayat and urban development departments, which will not allow construction in no development zones and eco-sensitive areas, he said.

Tripura VHP unit urges Centre to ensure safety of Hindus in trouble-torn Bangladesh

The Tripura unit of Vishva Hindu Parishad (VHP) has urged the Centre to ensure the safety of Hindu families living in Bangladesh in the wake of the unrest in the neighbouring country. "Since the fall of the Sheikh Hasina's government in Bangladesh, the minority Hindu community is being targeted, with miscreants looting and setting fire to their homes and businesses," Sankar Roy, VHP Tripura Prantika Mantri, told a press conference here on Friday. Roy alleged that the majority community has been threatening Hindus, asking them to leave the country while also attempting to violate the dignity of Hindu women. "We are in contact with the VHP's central leadership. They have informed us that the unrest in Bangladesh is an international issue. They are pressuring the Indian government to ensure the



safety of Hindu lives and properties in Bangladesh," he said. He called on the Centre to take up the issue with the new regime in Dhaka and ensure that Hindus are not attacked or forced to leave their country. Earlier, Tripura Motha supremo Pradyot Kishore Manikya Debbarma expressed concern over the vandalism of the 135-year-old Maharaja Bir Chandra Library in Comilla, Bangladesh, by hooligans who burned books and historical records.

Goods train derailed in mountainous South Goa

A goods train derailed in a mountainous region of South Goa bordering Karnataka on Friday morning, affecting the movement of trains on the South Western Railway (SWR) route, officials said. The train with 17 loaded wagons derailed in the ghat section between Sonalium and Dudhsagar stations under the Hubballi division at 9.35 am, SWR's chief public relation officer Manjunath Kanamadai said. As a result of the derailment, three trains were diverted and two others were cancelled, he said in a release. Accident relief trains with 140-ton cranes and other required materials have been dispatched to the site and restoration work was underway, he said. Due to the derailment, train number 17420/17022 Vasco Da Gama-Tirupati/Hyderabad weekly express, has been diverted.

PM Modi congratulates Muhammad Yunus, expresses concerns over the plight of minorities in Bangladesh

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi has reached out to Muhammad Yunus, the Nobel Laureate from Bangladesh, to congratulate him on heading the interim government of Bangladesh. PM Modi took to X, to express concerns over the situation of Hindus and other Minorities in Bangladesh amidst the ongoing political turmoil. Muhammad Yunus, on his part has emphasised his commitment to restore law and order. Meanwhile, the Indian government, through various channels has reiterated its concerns about the situation of minorities for regional stability. Hundreds of people trying to cross over to India but have been sent back by the Border Security Force. The situation in Bangladesh is rather fluid as the students, the initial protesters have been overshadowed by the rogue elements who are taking advantage of the situation and indulging in looting and arson while attacking minorities to garner popular support. Slowly but surely the political tension has also exacerbated communal tensions within Bangladesh. The Hindu minority,



which makes up about 8-10% of the population are worst hit. Recent reports have indicated a surge in attacks on Hindu temples, businesses, and homes, triggering fear and insecurity within the community. Prime Minister Modi's outreach to Yunus can be seen as a calculated move to engage with a respected figure in Bangladesh who has international credibility and influence. By engaging with Yunus, Modi may be signalling India's support for democratic values and human rights in Bangladesh, while also voicing concerns about the security and well-being of the Hindu community. India is at the moment in a quandary. It has all along supported Sheikh Hasina and continues to do so but

things have changed drastically. Sheikh Hasina is now unpopular while her opponents are all powerful. She may be called to join the investigation against her which may put India in dilemma. The silver lining is that Yunus is now in command, and he is widely regarded as an honorable man with an impeccable track record, even though he is an outsider in the corridors of power. He is India's best bet as China and Pakistan who have allegedly supported the movement to oust Hasina would like to subvert Indo Bangladesh relationship. He could be persuaded to be neutral. The political instability and potential for communal violence could lead to a refugee crisis, with many Hindus and other minorities seeking asylum in India. This could complicate India's domestic political landscape, especially in the bordering states of West Bengal and Assam. Meanwhile, the trade with Bangladesh has already nose-dived and the refugee crisis is growing. Bangladesh is a key partner in maintaining security in the Bay of Bengal region. This is a time for serious diplomacy. Prime Minister Modi would do well to engage with Muhammad Yunus at the earliest opportunity. While Twitter diplomacy is a good starting point, it needs to be followed up with direct engagement. A lot is at stake for India in Bangladesh's future direction.

Gender rights and reality: Bridging the gap

Gender equality in India remains a distant dream, as deep-rooted gender norms continue to impede the nation's progress towards women emancipation

Gender equality is not just a fundamental human right but a crucial component of a peaceful, cohesive, and sustainable world. It demands equal opportunities, treatment, and access to resources for all individuals, regardless of gender. Historically, women have faced discrimination on multiple fronts, from limited educational opportunities to restricted participation in decision-making processes. However, after years of struggle, women today have made significant strides, becoming prominent members of the workforce and key decision-makers in various fields. This progress aligns with the goals set by 193 countries that signed the Beijing Platform for Action, the most comprehensive global plan to eliminate systemic barriers and achieve women's human rights across social, economic, political, and environmental domains. Since the adoption of the Beijing Platform, much has been achieved. Women now serve as heads of state, entrepreneurs, educators, scientists, judges, and administrators, excelling in many unconventional careers. This paints a promising picture of the progress toward gender equality. However, a closer examination of statistics from government reports, non-governmental organizations, and local surveys reveals a grim reality: significant challenges remain.

This is particularly true in India, a country where women have historically been revered as goddesses and have played crucial roles as scholars, rulers, and warriors. Despite this rich history, modern India continues to struggle with deeply entrenched gender inequalities. India, in the 21st century, is a country with progressive laws and robust institutions rooted in its Constitution. The Indian Constitution, one of the world's finest legal documents, guarantees equal rights for men and women. Rights such as personal liberty, freedom of speech and expression, free movement and association, and the freedom to choose one's residence and occupation all imply that Indian women, like



men, have the right to make decisions about their personal and professional lives. However, these constitutional rights do not always translate into practice, especially in rural areas, where customary and religious laws often override legal protections. In rural India, where a significant percentage of the population resides, gender equality remains elusive. Here, rigid customary practices contribute to a skewed sex ratio, early marriages, and limited educational opportunities for women. Women are often married off at a young age, without receiving proper education or being informed about their rights. Even when they are aware of their rights, they frequently lack access to opportunities for personal and professional growth. Legislation like the Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PNDT) Act has helped improve the sex ratio in India, but the harsh reality remains that many women face discrimination in basic survival needs. In many families, women and girls eat last and least, while boys and men are given nutritionally rich diets. Women who cook for their families often do not cook for themselves, and from a young age, they are conditioned to prioritize the needs and preferences of men. The average age at which an Indian woman

has her first child is 22 years, but in rural areas, this age is often much lower, with many girls married off before they turn 18. These young women are not physically or mentally prepared to handle the responsibilities of marriage and family life, making them vulnerable to physical, sexual, and verbal abuse for perceived failures in their duties. In urban households, gender stereotypes are beginning to shift, with men taking on more household chores. However, they are not held to the same standards of diligence and regularity as women. Most women, regardless of age, class, caste, or community, remain vulnerable to domestic violence for reasons as trivial as poorly prepared meals or wearing a dress of their choice—issues that men rarely face. One of the most fundamental aspects of personal freedom is the ability to exercise control over one's body and sexuality. Sadly, the right to make choices about intimate relationships, whether or when to have a child, and the use of contraception is still denied to many women in India. According to a survey, a significant percentage of women aged 18-49 have experienced forced sex or sexual abuse at least once in their lives. This gendered expression of power has severe consequences for the mental

and emotional well-being of women, who are often reluctant to share their ordeals. Despite advancements in healthcare, many Indian women do not enjoy the right to health. In conservative settings, cultural norms discourage men from addressing the health needs of their female family members, and women themselves often do not recognize or report health issues. The presence of male doctors in rural areas further restricts women from undergoing necessary examinations and checkups. The literacy gap between men and women in India remains significant, particularly in rural areas where deeply entrenched gender norms discourage girls from pursuing education. Girls are often pushed into work at a much earlier age than boys, with little or no control over their earnings. Even in urban settings, working women are often not financially independent, either bearing the burden of family expenses or having no say in how their money is spent. Achieving gender equality in India requires a fundamental shift in attitudes among both men and women. Only through such changes can the goal of true gender equality be realized. Also, the hierarchical system of judiciary has ensured that no litigant goes unsatisfied with a particular court's verdict. The Supreme Court has time and again reiterated that no court in the country is above another. Besides, the SC has made it clear that although its judgments are binding on every court in India under Article 141 of the Constitution, the High Courts are in no way inferior to it because the former's administrative control is independent of the top court. SC has consistently refused to direct High Courts to clear cases in a time bound manner for the same reason. Justice Abhay Oka of the SC, during the course of a hearing, had succinctly remarked that "a court is a court". Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, in 2022, had decried the tendency to refer to the district courts as subordinate judiciary because there was no definition of the word "subordinate" although the world is frequently used in the Constitution.

Bangladesh: Uncertainty and chaos grip the nation

As the nation grapples with a rising wave of Islamist extremism and escalating violence, the future of its democracy and regional stability hangs in the balance



The turmoil in Bangladesh, which led to Sheikh Hasina's resignation as prime minister and departure to India, raises two questions.

Why could she not prevent it? What lies ahead for Bangladesh and India? She should have reached out to the students-trying to win over the bulk of them who are moderates, and isolating the Islamist fundamentalist extremists--before their Anti-Discrimination Students' Movement (ADSM), had snowballed. She could have argued that her government did away with 30 per cent reservation for the descendants of the freedom fighters of the 1971 liberation war in 2018, which was their demand to start with. Bangladesh's High Court restored it following a petition by several descendants. Indeed, her government had appealed to the Supreme Court against the High Court's order.

In fact, the appellate division of the Supreme Court had, on July 21, 2024, ordered the allocation of 93% of government jobs on the basis of merit, reserving five per cent for freedom fighters and their descendants, and one per cent each for tribes, the differentially abled and sexual minorities. There could have been two reasons for the agitation continuing even after that. First, the rancour created by the government's harsh response to the agitation, which had led to a large number of deaths of students and others, was too great for the students to call a halt. They now wanted Sheikh Hasina's resignation. Second, Islamist terrorist organisations like Ansar al-Islam, linked to Al-Qaeda in the Indian Sub-continent (AQIS) and Jamaat-ul-Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB), as well as the Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami (BJE) and its students' wing, Bangladesh Islami Chhatra Shibir (BICS), closely tied to them, had joined the movement and tried to steer it to serve their own agenda--ousting Hasina and the Awami League Government, and installing a fundamentalist Islamist and pathologically anti-India dispensation in its place.

Sheikh Hasina knew all this, and should also have known the convulsive impact students' movement has in Bangladesh on at least four occasions. The first was the language

movement which demanded that Bengali along with Urdu, and not the latter alone, should become Pakistan's official language, and not Urdu alone, which Pakistan's ruling establishment, based in West Pakistan, wanted. Defying police repression, the movement peaked on February, 21, 1952, when there was a country-wide general strike. Police firing led to the deaths of four students, whose names--Rafiq, Barkat, Jabbar and Salam--shine prominently in Bangladesh's martyrs' pantheon. The movement continued to swell and compelled Pakistan's acceptance of both Bengali and Urdu as the country's official language. Again, students were at the forefront of the movement against General Ayub Khan's coup in 1958 and establishment of a military dictatorship, whose character could not be disguised by the fraudulent representative government introduced on March 23, 1962.

Students also played a prominent role in the liberation struggle against Pakistan's colonial rule, which explains the Pakistan Army's savage attacks on the campus and hostels of Dhaka and other universities on the night of its notorious crackdown, codenamed Operation Searchlight, killing hundreds of students, on the night of March 25, 1971. Finally, there was the massive Shahbag Square movement in Dhaka (February-May 2013) demanding death penalty to the war criminals of 1971. The government agreed to move the International Crimes Tribunal, set up by an amendment in 2009 to the International Crimes (Tribunals) Act, 1973, to investigate and prosecute personnel of the Pakistan Army and Razakars, Al-Badr and Al-Shams, accused of committing genocide during the 1971 liberation war.

Given all this, Hasina should have

tried to diffuse the latest movement at the beginning. Be that as it may, what now in Bangladesh? What should India do now? Things do not look good. Hindu temples, including the emblematic Dhakeshwari temple, from which Dhaka derives its name, have been attacked and vandalised. Hindus shops, business establishments and homes, have been attacked, a Hindu municipal councillor aligned with the Awami League, has been killed. Many have been injured. Women have been assaulted.

Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's statues have been pulled down and/or vandalised. Awami League ministers, leaders and activists are under attack, as are many of their homes and establishments. In Khulna, three persons, including an Awami League functionary, Mohsin Reza, have been lynched. Film producer Selim Khan, who made a movie on Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's life, has been murdered along with his son, Shanto Khan. A hotel owned by an Awami League politician was set ablaze, causing 24 deaths, in Jashore. The house of Mashrafe Mortaza, Awami League MP and former Bangladesh test cricketer, has been destroyed.

These are just a few instances indicating the kind of open season that has been declared on the minorities, supporters of the Awami League and civil society elements opposed to Islamist fundamentalists. The question is whether things will improve or become worse. Much would depend on whether the interim government, headed by Nobel laureate, Muhammad Yunus, is able to establish order, or whether supporters of the BJE, BICS and Ansar al-Islam, who are behind the current violence along with sections of Begum Khaleda Zia-led Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), are contained or allowed to escalate their campaign of vio-

lence and terror.

Yunus is neither a fundamentalist nor known for his pathological hatred for India. The backgrounds of some of his colleagues, however, raise questions. The Army's role is of critical importance. The report that it is being purged of those perceived to be pro-Sheikh Hasina, should worry those who want a peaceful, democratic and tolerant Bangladesh. Looking beyond the interim government, of critical importance is how free and fair are the parliamentary elections, that would have to be held now that Bangladesh's national parliament has been dissolved.

New Delhi is rightly watchful. The BNP-Jamaat-led coalition government ruling Bangladesh from 2001 to 2006, was pathologically hostile to India and actively sheltered and armed the secessionist groups active in the north-eastern parts of this country. A hostile Bangladesh, engaged in a repeat performance, is not what New Delhi wants.

Meanwhile, External Affairs' Minister, S. Jaishankar, has said that he does not rule out the machinations of a foreign hand behind the Bangladesh developments. Given his official position, he has to be circumspect with his words. But it is prima facie clear that Pakistan's ISI, and perhaps even China, have been involved.

Pakistan, which is having serious problems with the Taliban which it had once wet-nursed, and China, which has its troubles with Islamists, should remember William S. Baring-Gould's limerick, "There was a young lady of Rigal/ Who went for a ride on a tiger/ They returned from the ride/ With the lady inside/ And a smile on the face of the tiger."

Israeli troops launch new assault as mediators push for cease-fire

Israeli troops launched a new assault Friday into the southern Gaza city of Khan Younis, targeting Hamas fighters who the military claims still operate there despite repeated offensives, as American, Qatari and Egyptian mediators renewed their push for Israel and Hamas

Israeli evacuation orders triggered yet another exodus of Palestinians from the heavily destroyed eastern districts of Khan Younis, where many had just returned less than two weeks ago — after the Israeli military's last incursion into the city in July. Thousands fled Thursday, carrying essentials like small gas cylinders, mattresses, tents, backpacks and blankets. Officials from Israel and the United States have said they believe Yahya Sinwar, Hamas' newly named top leader and one of the architects of the October 7 attack on Israel, could be hiding in tunnels under Khan Younis. The military said Friday its warplanes struck 30 Hamas targets in the city, including fighters and weapons storage sites. It said troops were searching for Hamas tunnels and other infrastructure while engaging in combat "above and below ground." After 10 months of war in Gaza, the mediators' push aims to resume indirect negotiations for a cease-fire that have been on hold since Sinwar's predecessor, Ismail

There was no immediate response from Hamas, which announced Tuesday that Sinwar, the group's leader in Gaza, would replace Haniyeh as the group's top leader. Haniyeh previously served as the key interlocutor in the negotiations. Haniyeh's killing and that of a top Hezbollah commander in an Israeli airstrike in Beirut brought vows of retaliation from Hezbollah and Iran. International diplomats have been scrambling to prevent an escalation and to seal a deal to stop the fighting in Gaza and release the hostages still captive in the enclave. In a joint statement, the United States, Egypt and Qatar called for the new round of talks, to be held either in Doha or Cairo, and pressed both sides to move ahead. "There is no further time to waste nor excuses from any party for further delay," they said, adding that the negotiators have already finalized a framework for the deal. They said mediators were prepared to present a final compromise "that resolves the remaining implementation issues in a manner that meets

Sinwar has already been closely involved in negotiations from behind the scenes. Hamas officials and mediators have said Hamas negotiators regularly sought his approval on the group's positions as it pressed for guarantees that a deal would bring a complete end to the war and withdrawal of all Israeli troops from Gaza, in return for the release of all hostages. Israel has vowed to destroy Hamas after the Oct. 7 attack, in which militants from Gaza stormed into southern Israel, killing around 1,200 people and abducting 250 others. After a round of release exchanges in November, Israel says 111 hostages remain in Gaza, including 39 bodies. Its campaign in Gaza has killed more than 39,600 Palestinians and wounded more than 91,700 others. More than 1.9 million of Gaza's pre-war population of 2.3 million have been driven from their homes, fleeing repeatedly across the territory to escape offensives. Most are now crowded into ramshackle tent camps in an area about 50 square kilometers (19 square miles) on the Gaza coast.

Bangladeshis welcome interim govt with hope for normalcy

People in Bangladesh welcomed the new interim government led by Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus, hoping it would restore order, end repression and hold a fair election to facilitate a democratic transition of power. Yunus, 84, on Thursday took oath as the head of an interim government, replacing Sheikh Hasina who abruptly resigned and fled to India leaving the country in turmoil following deadly protests against her government over a controversial quota system in jobs. He was sworn in as the chief advisor — a position equivalent to prime minister. Women's rights activist Farida Akhtar, right-wing party Hefazat-e-Islam's deputy chief AFM Khalid Hossain, Grameen Telecom trustee Nurjahan Begum, freedom fighter Sharmeen Murshid, chairman of Chittagong Hill Tracts Development Board Supradip Chakma, Prof Bidhan Ranjan Roy and former foreign

secretary Touhid Hossain are among the advisory council members. Dhaka University Professor Emeritus Serajul Islam Choudhury said that one of the duties of the interim government would be to restore order, which has been disrupted over the last few days following the fall of Hasina. "The other task is to ensure the safety of citizens," The Daily Star newspaper quoted Choudhury as saying after the oath-taking of the interim government. The government would also need to eliminate all forms of oppression and the culture of fear prevailing across the country, he said. However, the main responsibility of the government, he emphasised, would be to hold a fair and acceptable election to facilitate a democratic transition of power. Eminent jurist Kamal Hossain said, "The change that has happened was welcomed by everyone. There has been an extraordinary turnout at the event. Everyone feels that

change has come. "We hope they [members of the advisory council] will be able to address the new crises. People will expect a meaningful change — let this be that change," he said. Barrister Sara Hossain said: "My main expectation from this government is that it will enable substantial reforms to institutions in Bangladesh and clear the path for truth-telling about what has happened not only in the immediate past or the past few weeks but even over the last 14 years and before that." The students' anti-discrimination movement was for reforms and against repression and these should be the interim government's main themes, she told the newspaper. "What I perhaps am a bit troubled by is that, unlike previous years, there is no balance of political background and police. We obviously have no representation from (Hasina-led) Awami League. This absence of balance could cause a problem," she said.

Bangladesh has a secular Constitution, history and tradition, which has not denied any faith but encouraged pluralism, but the swearing-in today did not reflect that, she said, expressing hope that "it is not a sign of things to come." The inclusion of students is of course unprecedented, she said, adding, "But I think it can only add energy to the whole process... I believe they can be a part of keeping the interim government in the right direction and keep it within the demands of the students and general people. We need to remember that even post-Liberation in 1971, we had many young leaders." Samina Luthfa, associate professor at Dhaka University, said, "While I welcome the interim government, it is to be noted that many of them are from non-government organisations and require a specific kind of skill set. However, there is much work to be done to reform the nation, whether they have the skills for that remains a question. I think

including the students [leaders of the anti-discrimination student movement] in the government brings hope." Asked whether minority and women representation were enough, she said, "I believe those could be higher. Many other women and actors from religious minority backgrounds are skilled and have been supporting the movement, they too could have been included. More people from these segments of society could have ensured a higher possibility of a 'discrimination-free' country." She added that since the Jamaat-e-Islami was banned, the Hefazat Ameer may have been included to balance out participation from all religious backgrounds. "We are in an extraordinary situation and of course, we cannot expect everything to be perfect already, it will all take time. "However, at this moment, the first thing the interim government must look after is the safety of all citizens, justice, the economy, and restoring law and order."

UN concern over racially-based attacks in B'desh

Amid violence against the minority Hindu community in Bangladesh, a spokesperson for UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said he stands against any racially based attacks or incitement to violence. "What we've made clear is we want to make sure that the violence that has been occurring in Bangladesh in recent weeks is stamped down. Certainly, we stand against any racially based attacks or racially based incitement to violence," Farhan Haq, Deputy Spokesperson for the Secretary-General, said here on Thursday. He was responding to a question on the Secretary-General's reaction to attacks on Hindus and other minorities in Bangladesh. Several Hindu temples, households and businesses have been vandalised, and at least two

Hindu leaders affiliated with former Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's Awami League party have been killed in the violence since Monday, when Hasina resigned and fled to India. Since Hasina fled the country, media reports from Bangladesh have flagged more and more cases of violence against minorities, including the massive vandalism and destruction at popular folk band Joler Gaan's frontman Rahul Ananda's residence on Monday, prompting the singer and his family to go into hiding. However, it is not just Hindus that are targeted. At least 232 people were killed in Bangladesh in the incidents of violence that erupted across the country following the fall of the Hasina government on Monday, taking the death toll to 560 since the anti-quota protests first started in mid-July.

Police stations reopen with military support in Dhaka

Police stations in Bangladesh, which were deserted during the peak of the anti-government protests, are slowly resuming their normal activities with the assistance of the military, according to media reports on Friday. Following the fall of the Sheikh Hasina government on Monday due to student-led protests, all police station activities came to a halt. Several police stations were attacked, looted and set on fire, leading to many officers evacuating their stations and going into hiding due to the threat of more attacks. More than 400 people, including police personnel, were killed in the violence centring the students' movement. After about four days, activities resumed at some 29 police stations with the assistance of the military, the Dhaka Tribune newspaper reported, quoting military and police officials. On Thursday, Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus was sworn

in as the head of Bangladesh's interim government, vowing to restore law and order in the country. Company Commander Shakhawat Khandakar from 25 East Bengal Regiment said: "Seeing how criminals were killing people, including the police, we decided that it was critical to save the police members. They serve the people; we needed to give them a chance to reform. "Many weapons are in the Tejaogaon police station. If these fell into the hands of criminals, the country would be in grave danger. That is when we took measures to reinforce the security of the station," Khandakar said. Tejaogaon Deputy Police Commissioner Azimul Haque said, "We are grateful to the members of the military who came forward to save our policemen and played an important role in protecting the lives and properties of the people. Today, we have started all police activities with the help of the military. I request all citi-

zens to come to the police station. We are ready to serve you." He added that out of six police stations in Tejaogaon division, three police stations have been fully operational. "Work is underway on a small scale at the affected police station. In the meantime, many policemen have joined work in the police stations. The others are starting to arrive. We hope that all our policemen will join the workplace by afternoon," Haque said. On Wednesday, the newly-appointed Inspector General of Police, Md Mainul Islam, ordered officers to join their respective units within the next 24 hours. People from all walks of life, including different political parties leaders and students, are extending all-out necessary support to the returnee police personnel so they can come to their workplaces safely, according to a press release issued by police headquarters on Thursday.

British authorities still on alert for further unrest

British authorities said Thursday they were preparing for the possibility of further unrest, even as they applauded the efforts of anti-racism campaigners and police officers who largely stifled a threatened wave of far-right demonstrations overnight. Prime Minister Keir Starmer sounded the note of caution after a week of anti-immigrant violence that has scarred communities from Northern Ireland to the south coast of England. Starmer spoke to reporters at a mosque in Solihull, near Birmingham, where demonstrators shut down a shopping center on Sunday. "It's important that we don't let up here," Starmer said. At an emergency meeting with law enforcement officers at his office, Starmer said on Thursday evening that police need to remain on "high alert," Britain's Press Association

reported. He credited strategic police staffing and swift justice for rioters in the courts for creating a deterrent that kept trouble at a minimum the night before. Police across the United Kingdom had braced for widespread disorder on Wednesday, after far-right activists circulated a list of more than 100 sites they planned to target, including the offices of immigration lawyers and others offering services to migrants. But those demonstrations failed to materialize as police and counter-protesters filled the streets. Carrying signs saying "Refugees Welcome" and chanting "Whose streets? Our streets," people turned out in force to protect asylum service centers and the offices of immigration attorneys. The government also declared a national critical incident, putting 6,000 specially trained police on standby to respond to any disorder. Police said that protests and counter-protests

were largely peaceful, though a small number of arrests were made. "The show of force from the police and, frankly, the show of unity from communities together defeated the challenges that we faced," said Commissioner Mark Rowley, the head of London's Metropolitan Police Service. "It went off very peacefully last night, and the fears of extreme right disorder were abated." But tensions remain high after right-wing agitators fueled the violence by circulating misinformation about the identity of the suspect in a knife attack that killed three young girls in the English seaside town of Southport last week. The last child hospitalized in the July 29 stabbing has been released, police said Thursday. Nearly 500 people have been arrested around the country after anti-immigrant mobs clashed with police, attacked mosques and overran two hotels housing asylum-seekers.

3rd person in custody over foiled plot targeting Swift show

A third teenager has been arrested in connection with a foiled attack on now-cancelled Taylor Swift concerts in Vienna, Austria's interior minister said Friday. Austrian Interior Minister Gerhard Karner said an 18-year-old was taken into custody Thursday evening in Vienna after allegedly being in contact with the main suspect. Karner announced the arrest during an unrelated news conference Friday. Investigators are scrutinizing the "networks" of the suspects, the Austrian interior ministry told The Associated Press on Friday, adding in a statement that investigators have turned to evaluating physical and electronic evidence. The 19-year-old main suspect and a 17-year-old were arrested Tuesday, while a 15-year-old was also interrogated but was not arrested. Officials said Thursday afternoon that no additional suspects were being sought. They did not immediately offer further details Friday.

Authorities say the plot appeared to have been inspired by the Islamic State group and al-Qaida. Investigators found bomb-making materials at one of the suspects' homes. Officials say one suspect has confessed to planning to "kill as many people as possible outside the concert venue." Officials say the main suspect and the 18-year-old arrested Friday both pledged "oaths of allegiance" to the Islamic State group. "He had been in contact with the main perpetrator, but is not directly connected to the attack plans," Karner said. "But, as was found out a few days ago, he took an oath of allegiance specifically to the IS on August 6." The 18-year-old "comes from the social environment" of the main suspect, Karner said. Three sold-out concerts were cancelled Wednesday because of the plot, devastating Swifties from across the globe. Many of them had dropped thousands of euros (dollars) on travel and lodging in Austria's expensive capital city to attend the

Eras Tour shows at the Ernst Happel Stadium, which sat empty Thursday morning. Europe is enamoured with the American superstar: The German town of Gelsenkirchen renamed itself "Swiftkirchen" before its mid-July concerts. Concert organisers in Austria said they had expected up to 65,000 fans inside the stadium at each concert and as many as 30,000 onlookers outside, where authorities said the suspects planned to strike. The foiled attack was planned for Thursday or Friday, according to Austria's interior minister, Gerhard Karner. Austrian Chancellor Karl Nehammer defended the decision to cancel the concerts, saying the arrests of the suspects took place too close to the shows, scheduled for Thursday, Friday and Saturday. "I understand very well that those who wanted to experience the concert live are very sad," Nehammer told a news conference Thursday. "Moms and dads are looking after their daughters and sons, who were full of enthusiasm and

anticipation for this concert. But it's also important that in such serious moments as now, it's inevitable that safety comes first." Swift is also scheduled to perform at London's Wembley stadium in five concerts between August 15 and 20 to close the European leg of her record-setting Eras Tour. London Mayor Sadiq Khan said that while he understood Vienna's reasons for canceling, "We're going to carry on." Khan said the capital's authorities were prepared for shows there following lessons learned from a 2017 attack at an Ariana Grande concert in Manchester, England, that killed 22 people. A suicide bomber had set up a knapsack with explosives in Manchester Arena. The bomb detonated at the end of Grande's concert as thousands of young fans were leaving. Last month, an attacker in England killed three girls and wounded 10 people in a knife attack during a Taylor Swift-themed dance and yoga class. Swift at the time said she was "completely in shock" over the

violence. In Austria, the main suspect confessed that he had started planning the attack in July, authorities said. The 19-year-old just a few weeks ago uploaded to the internet an oath of allegiance to the current leader of the Islamic State group. He was "clearly radicalised in the direction of the Islamic State and thinks it is right to kill infidels," said Omar Hajjawi-Pirchner, head of the Directorate of State Security and Intelligence. Hajjawi-Pirchner added that the suspect "wanted to carry out an attack in the area outside the stadium, killing as many people as possible using the knives or even using the explosive devices he had made." During a raid of the suspect's home in Ternitz, south of Vienna, investigators found chemical substances and technical devices that indicated "concrete preparatory acts," said Franz Ruf, director general for public security at the Ministry of the Interior.

Iran accelerating cyber activity to influence US poll: Microsoft

Iran is ramping up online activity that appears intended to influence the upcoming US election, in one case targeting a presidential campaign with an email phishing attack, Microsoft said Friday. Iranian actors also have spent recent months creating fake news sites and impersonating activists, laying the groundwork to stoke division and potentially sway American voters this fall, especially in swing states, the technology giant found. The findings in Microsoft's newest threat intelligence report show how Iran, which has been active in recent US campaign cycles, is evolving its tactics for another election that's likely to have global

implications. The report goes a step beyond anything US intelligence officials have disclosed, giving specific examples of Iranian groups and the actions they have taken so far. Iran's United Nations mission denied it had plans to interfere or launch cyberattacks in the US presidential election. The report doesn't specify Iran's intentions besides sowing chaos in the United States, though US officials have previously hinted that Iran particularly opposes former President Donald Trump. US officials also have expressed alarm about Tehran's efforts to seek retaliation for a 2020 strike on an Iranian general that was ordered by Trump. This week, the Justice Department unsealed criminal charges against a Pakistani

man with ties to Iran who's alleged to have hatched assassination plots targeting multiple officials, potentially including Trump. The report also reveals how Russia and China are exploiting US political polarisation to advance their own divisive messaging in a consequential election year. Microsoft's report identified four examples of recent Iranian activity that the company expects to increase as November's election draws closer. First, a group linked to Iran's Revolutionary Guard in June targeted a high-ranking US presidential campaign official with a phishing email, a form of cyberattack often used to gather sensitive information, according to the report, which didn't identify which campaign

was targeted. The group concealed the email's origins by sending it from the hacked email account of a former senior adviser, Microsoft said. Days later, the Iranian group tried to log into an account that belonged to a former presidential candidate, but wasn't successful, Microsoft's report said. The company notified those who were targeted. In a separate example, an Iranian group has been creating websites that pose as US-based news sites targeted to voters on opposite sides of the political spectrum, the report said. One fake news site that lends itself to a left-leaning audience insults Trump by calling him "raving mad" and suggests he uses drugs, the report said. Another site meant

to appeal to Republican readers centres on LGBTQ issues and gender-affirming surgery. A third example Microsoft cited found that Iranian groups are impersonating US activists, potentially laying the groundwork for influence operations closer to the election. Finally, another Iranian group in May compromised an account owned by a government employee in a swing state, the report said. It was unclear whether that cyberattack was related to election interference efforts. Iran's UN mission sent The Associated Press an emailed statement: "Iran has been the victim of numerous offensive cyber operations targeting its infrastructure, public service centres, and industries. Iran's cyber capabilities are defensive

and proportionate to the threats it faces. Iran has neither the intention nor plans to launch cyber attacks. The US presidential election is an internal matter in which Iran does not interfere." The Microsoft report said that as Iran escalates its cyber influence, Russia-linked actors also have pivoted their influence campaigns to focus on the US election, while actors linked to the Chinese Communist Party have taken advantage of pro-Palestinian university protests and other current events in the US to try to raise US political tensions. Microsoft said it has continued to monitor how foreign foes are using generative AI technology. The increasingly cheap and easy-to-access tools can generate lifelike fake images, photos

and videos in seconds, prompting concern among some experts that they will be weaponised to mislead voters this election cycle. While many countries have experimented with AI in their influence operations, the company said, those efforts haven't had much impact so far. The report said as a result, some actors have "pivoted back to techniques that have proven effective in the past — simple digital manipulations, mischaracterisation of content, and use of trusted labels or logos atop false information." Microsoft's report aligns with recent warnings from US intelligence officials, who say America's adversaries appear determined to seed the internet with false and incendiary claims ahead of November's

vote. Top intelligence officials said last month that Russia continues to pose the greatest threat when it comes to election disinformation, while there are indications that Iran is expanding its efforts and China is proceeding cautiously when it comes to 2024. Iran's efforts seem aimed at undermining candidates seen as being more likely to increase tension with Tehran, the officials said. That's a description that fits Trump, whose administration ended a nuclear deal with Iran, reimposed sanctions and ordered the killing of the top Iranian general. The influence efforts also coincide with a time of high tensions between Iran and Israel, whose military the US strongly supports.

Russia declares emergency in region under attack from Ukraine

Russia's Ministry for Emergencies on Friday declared the situation in the Kursk region a "federal level" emergency, four days after hundreds of Ukrainian troops poured over the border in what appeared to be Kyiv's biggest attack on Russian soil since the war began. Meanwhile, a Russian plane-launched missile hit a Ukrainian shopping mall late morning Friday, killing at least nine people and injuring 26, authorities said.

The mall in Kostiantynivka, in the eastern Donetsk region, is located in the town's residential area. Thick black smoke rose above it after the strike.

"This is another targeted attack on a crowded place, another act of terror by the Russians," Donetsk regional head Vadym Filashkin said in a Telegram post.

"The operational situation in the Kursk region remains difficult," Kursk acting governor Alexei Smirnov said on Telegram.

Social services and civic associations are providing assistance to people forced to flee their homes by the fighting, he said. The last Russian figure for evacuations in Kursk was 3,000. Little reliable information about the surprise Ukrainian operation has emerged, and its strategic aims are unclear. Ukrainian officials have refused to comment specifically about the incursion, which is taking place about 500 km (320 miles) southwest of Moscow.

But a top adviser to Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said Thursday that border region attacks will cause Russia to "start to realise that the war is slowly creeping inside of Russian territory." Mykhailo Podolyak also suggested that the operation would improve Kyiv's hand in the event of negotiations with Moscow.

The assault came as the Ukrainian army toils to hold at bay an intense Russian push at places on the front line in eastern Ukraine, especially in the Donetsk region. Russian President Vladimir Putin has

made clear he wants to capture the parts of Donetsk that the Kremlin's forces don't already occupy.

Russia declares federal level emergencies when there are more than 500 victims or damage exceeds 500 million rubles (about \$6 million).

The Institute for the Study of War, a Washington-based think tank, says Ukrainian forces have pressed on with their "rapid advances" deeper into the Kursk region, reportedly going up to 35 km (20 miles) beyond the border.

"The lack of a coherent Russian response to the Ukrainian incursion into Kursk... and the reported rate of Ukrainian advance indicates that Ukrainian forces were able to achieve operational surprise," said the Washington-based ISW late Thursday.

A Russian Defence Ministry statement Friday said only that the military "continues to repel the attempted invasion" and is responding with airstrikes, artillery and troops on the ground.

Ukraine has also kept up its strategy of hitting rear areas with long-range drones, targeting military sites, oil refineries and other infrastructure.

Ukrainian drones attacked Russia's Lipetsk region, which is about 300 km (180 miles) from the Ukraine border, during Thursday night, authorities said.

Drones operated by Ukraine's Security Service hit a military airfield there, a security official told The Associated Press on condition of anonymity because he was not authorised to speak publicly.

The airfield was a base for fighter jets and helicopters and more than 700 powerful glide bombs in storage, the source said.

Ukraine's Army General Staff also confirmed the strike on Lipetsk-2 airfield Friday morning, saying it was used as a base for multiple Su-34, Su-35 and MiG-31 jets.

The Russian Defence Ministry said that 75 Ukrainian drones were shot down during the night, 19 of them over Lipetsk.

Upset over curbs, Paraguay orders US ambassador to leave

The government of Paraguay on Thursday effectively ordered the US ambassador to leave the South American nation, escalating tensions between the allies in the wake of the Biden administration's sanctions on a tobacco company linked to the country's powerful former president.

In a dramatic statement that took diplomats aback, the Paraguayan Foreign Ministry asked the US government to "accelerate the departure process" of Ambassador Marc Ostfield, a career diplomat appointed by President Joe Biden in June 2021.

Ostfield's expedited departure, the ministry said, would "avoid the loss of confidence in a person damaging the relationship that we have historically maintained."

The request appeared to be in protest against the White House's latest move to tighten its sanctions against Horacio Cartes, one of Paraguay's

wealthiest people who served as president from 2013-18, owns dozens of lucrative businesses and retains considerable influence over the country's ruling Colorado party.

The US government first sanctioned the cigarette tycoon last year, accusing him of "significant corruption."

On Tuesday, the US Treasury Department announced sanctions on Tabacalera del Este, a large tobacco producer that the US government accused of illegally funneling millions of dollars to Cartes, its former majority shareholder.

The company, also known as Tabesa, has angrily rejected the accusations and referred to the sanctions as an "abuse of power" by the US government.

Cartes has denied all allegations of corruption and said he no longer owns nor is directly involved in Tabesa's operations.

The US Embassy in Paraguay confirmed that the Foreign Ministry had summoned Ambassador Ostfield for a

meeting Thursday, saying only that they "had a good discussion and talked about the sanction announcement as well as other topics."

Summoning a foreign ambassador for explanations is typically intended to express protest on the part of a host country.

The embassy did not comment on Paraguay's demand that Ostfield leave on an accelerated timeline. Ambassador Ostfield had planned to remain in his post until the end of Biden's term in January 2025.

His successor has been named but the Senate has not started the confirmation process, which could take anywhere from a few months to a few years.

In a news conference, Paraguayan Foreign Minister Ruben Ramirez Lezcano said the government objected "to the media coverage and politicization of the administration's sanctions."

"The direct or indirect intervention of any state in the inter-

national affairs of Paraguay compromises our independence and sovereignty," he said.

His remarks seemingly referred to a news conference called by Ambassador Ostfield earlier this week in which he stressed his commitment to anti-corruption reforms in Paraguay, saying that the Biden administration was prepared to "use the range of relevant tools to combat corruption, including visa restrictions, designations, financial sanctions, and extradition."

Although standard language in diplomacy, the mention of extradition nonetheless raised alarms and stirred frantic debate in Paraguay, where Cartes' loyalists have a majority in both houses of Congress.

In a show of support and defiance — and a display of Cartes' enduring influence — dozens of lawmakers from the conservative Colorado party showed up to Cartes' mansion in the capital of Asuncion on Tuesday after the sanctions announcement.

US jury convicts Mozambique's ex-finance minister in 'tuna bonds' corruption case

Former Mozambican Finance Minister Manuel Chang was convicted Thursday in a financial conspiracy case that welled up from his country's "tuna bond" scandal and swept into a US court.

A federal jury in New York delivered the verdict.

Chang was accused of accepting payoffs to put his African nation secretly on the hook for big loans to government-controlled companies for tuna fishing ships and other maritime projects. The loans were plundered by bribes and kickbacks, according to prosecutors, and Mozambique ended up with USD 2 billion in "hidden debt," spurring a financial crisis.

"Today's verdict is an inspiring victory for justice and the peo-

ple of Mozambique who were betrayed by the defendant, a corrupt, high-ranking government official whose greed and self-interest sold out one of the poorest countries in the world," Brooklyn-based US Attorney Breon Peace said in a statement.

Messages seeking comment were sent to Chang's attorneys and to Mozambique's embassy in Washington. Chang was his country's top financial official from 2005 to 2015.

Chang had pleaded not guilty to the US conspiracy charges. His lawyers said he was doing as his government wished when he signed off on pledges that Mozambique would repay the loans, and that there was no evidence of a financial quid-pro-quo for him.

No sentencing date was set for Chang, 48. The charges carry

the possibility of up to 20 years in prison, though sentencing guidelines for any given case can vary depending on a defendant's history and other factors.

Between 2013 and 2016, three Mozambican-government-controlled companies quietly borrowed USD 2 billion from major overseas banks. Chang signed guarantees that the government would repay the loans — crucial assurances to lenders who likely otherwise would have shied away from the brand-new companies.

The proceeds were supposed to finance a tuna fleet, a shipyard, and Coast Guard vessels and radar systems to protect natural gas fields off the country's Indian Ocean coast.

But bankers and government officials looted the loan money to line their own pockets, US

prosecutors said.

"The evidence in this case shows you that there is an international fraud, money laundering and bribery scheme of epic proportions here," and Chang "chose to participate," Assistant US Attorney Genny Ngai told jurors in a closing argument Monday.

Prosecutors accused Chang of collecting USD 7 million in bribes, wired through US banks to European accounts held by an associate.

Chang's defence said there was no proof that he actually was promised or received a penny. The only agreement Chang made "was the lawful one to borrow money from banks to allow his country to engage in these public infrastructure works," defense lawyer Adam Ford said in his summation Monday.

Maduro suspends X network in Venezuela for 10 days

President Nicolas Maduro said he has ordered a 10-day block on access to X in Venezuela, accusing the owner Elon Musk of using the social network to promote hatred after the country's disputed presidential election.

Associated Press journalists in Caracas found that by Thursday night posts had stopped loading on X on two private telephone services and state-owned Movilnet.

"Elon Musk is the owner of X and has violated all the rules of the social network itself," said Maduro in a speech following a march by pro-government groups. Maduro alleged Musk "has incited hatred."

Maduro also accused the social network of being used by his opponents to create political unrest.

Venezuela's president said he had signed a resolution "with the proposal made by CONATEL, the National



Telecommunications Commission, which has decided to remove the social network X, formerly known as Twitter, from circulation in Venezuela for 10 days so that they can present their documents." Maduro did not provide more details about the process taken against X. X's press office did not immediately respond to an email from AP requesting comment. "X out for 10 days! Elon Musk out!" Maduro said. The president's announcement

comes after Maduro and Musk exchanged accusations over Venezuela's disputed July 28 presidential election. Electoral authorities declared Maduro the winner but have yet to produce voting tallies. Meanwhile, the opposition claims to have collected records from more than 80 per cent of the 30,000 electronic voting machines nationwide showing the winner was his candidate, Edmundo Gonzalez. Musk used the social network to accuse the self-proclaimed socialist leader of a "great electoral fraud."

"Shame on the dictator Maduro," Musk said on Monday in a post.

Since the election, Maduro has expressed the need to "regulate" social networks in Venezuela. Maduro also denounced that the social platform was used by his adversaries to threaten the families of his followers and political allies, military personnel, police officers and to generate a state of anxiety in Venezuela.

Houthi rebels attacks ship off Yemen

Three suspected attacks by Yemen's Houthi rebels targeted a ship in the strategic Bab el-Mandeb Strait linking the Gulf of Aden to the Red Sea, including one that saw private security guards shoot and destroy a bomb-loaded drone boat, authorities said Friday.

The Houthis did not immediately claim the assaults, though they follow a monthlong campaign by the rebels targeting shipping through the Red Sea corridor over Israel's war on Hamas in the Gaza Strip.

"The operations are ongoing — our operations toward occupied Palestine to target the Israeli enemy, our operations at sea, the inevitable forthcoming response, as well as coordination with the axis in any joint operations," warned the Houthi's secretive leader, Abdul Malik al-Houthi, in a speech Thursday.

Indian Consulate in NY cautions community against using unscrupulous agents for services

Amid instances of unscrupulous elements overcharging members of the Indian community for consular services and other fraudulent activities, India's mission here has cautioned against using such agents and highlighted measures undertaken by it to streamline visa, passport and other services for the diaspora.

Consul General of India in New York Binaya Pradhan told reporters here that several instances have come to the notice of the Consulate where various travel agents are "misusing people's trust."

They have been charging higher amounts of money in the name of providing services. Such unscrupulous elements have overcharged applicants for assistance in getting Consular services such as Overseas Citizen of India (OCI), visa, passport and an emergency certificate. Pradhan cited instances where travel agents have charged as much as USD 450 to provide an emergency certificate to travel to India, while such a service costs only USD 17.

The Consulate said it has also come across instances where fake documents about identity, residential address, and utility bills have been submitted by the agents on the applicants' behalf, often without the knowledge of the applicant. The Consulate said that this not only causes undue avoidable delay but is also a violation of prescribed Indian

rules and puts the applicants on the wrong side of the law in the US.

The agents "claim that they have a relationship with the Consulate," Pradhan said, adding that "they put our community members in trouble by providing false documents, fake certificates."

Pradhan underscored that whether it is an Indian citizen, an American citizen or an Indian-American person, they "don't have to come to us through an agent. You can come to us directly for the services that we provide at the Consulate. There is no requirement of using an agent, and on top of that to pay money, which is exorbitantly higher," Pradhan said.

Additionally, Pradhan noted that it has also been brought to the Consulate's notice that several fake E-visa websites, claiming to provide such services, are active on the internet. To mislead the applicants, some of these websites have created images and home page templates mimicking the Government of India's websites.

The Consulate strongly urged members of the community and diaspora to apply on the correct website for E-visa services and not go through any other portal listed on the internet.

The Consulate has issued an advisory to create awareness about not using the services of "unscrupulous elements" who have been overcharging and submitting fraudulent docu-

ments on behalf of applicants. It has also publicised the fees and charges for all the services provided to ensure applicants don't end up paying higher amounts.

The New York Consulate serves the northeastern states of Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island and Vermont. Pradhan noted that of the 5.4 million strong Indian diaspora in the US, about 2.5 million or 40-45 per cent of the total, live in these 10 states. Over 113,000 Indian students out of the 354,000 in the whole country study in universities in these 10 northeastern states.

Pradhan also highlighted a slew of measures undertaken by the Consulate to ensure efficient consular services, including digital initiatives for ease of availing services and digital assistance tools like 'Pramit', 'Bharti Chatbot' and mobile app. It also organizes an open house twice a month when applicants can walk in without prior appoint-

ment and meet the Consular Officers for any query they may have regarding the consular services.

Amid a string of tragic and concerning incidents involving Indian students in the US in the recent past, Pradhan emphasised that there has been a "special focus" on students. The Consulate's approach has been to connect the student community to the larger Indian community so they get a "helping hand" in their initial months. In this regard, the Consulate developed a special platform for the students to find internship opportunities at companies in the US as well as provide access to attorney and medical information.

Deputy Consul General Varun Jeph added that under a recent initiative aimed at addressing the problems of students, the Consulate will host an open house twice a month when they can walk in without taking prior appointments and meet officials.

Trump praised Minnesota Gov. Walz in 2020 over Floyd's murder

While former President Donald Trump and running mate JD Vance have been hammering Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz over his response to the violence that erupted after George Floyd's murder, Trump told the governor at the time that he fully agreed with how Walz handled it.

"What they did in Minneapolis was incredible. They went in and dominated, and it happened immediately," Trump told Walz and other governors and officials in a phone call on June 1, 2020. The Associated Press on Wednesday obtained an audio recording of the call, which has taken on new significance now that Walz has been tapped as Vice President Kamala Harris'

running mate against Trump and Vance. Other administration officials on the call included Defense Secretary Mark Esper; Army Gen. Mark Milley, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff; and Attorney General William Barr.

ABC News reported on the call earlier Wednesday, a day after Harris introduced Walz as her vice presidential pick. CNN posted a transcript of the call back in 2020.

Protests erupted in Minneapolis and around the world after Floyd was murdered by Derek Chauvin, a white former officer who knelt on the Black man's neck for nearly 9 1/2 minutes, on May 25, 2020. A bystander video captured Floyd's fading cries of "I can't breathe." His death forced a reckoning with

police brutality and racism. Some of the protests turned violent. Walz mobilized the Minnesota National Guard three days later to help restore order to Minneapolis after rioting that included the burning of a police station and numerous businesses. Trump offered federal help to Walz later that day, but the governor did not take him up on it.

During a May 2024 fundraiser in St. Paul, Trump repeated a claim he had been making lately that he was responsible for deploying the National Guard. "The entire city was burning down. ... If you didn't have me as president, you wouldn't have Minneapolis today," Trump told a Republican audience. Trump made similar claims at a rally in St. Cloud last month.

It was actually Walz who gave the mobilization order in response to requests from the mayors of Minneapolis and St. Paul. Although Walz came under criticism at the time for not moving faster. There was finger-pointing between Minneapolis Mayor Jacob Frey and Walz on who bore responsibility for the delays.

Trump, in the June 1, 2020, call, described Walz as "an excellent guy" and later said: "I don't blame you. I blame the mayor." The president didn't criticize the governor at the time.

"Tim, you called up big numbers and the big numbers knocked them out so fast, it was like bowling pins," Trump said.

But Trump campaign spokesperson Karoline Leavitt put a different spin on the call in a statement to the AP on Wednesday.

LEGENDARY ATHLETE ON FIELD, A SUPERSTAR SANS PRETENSIONS

Neeraj Chopra is all about greatness without pretensions. A fierce competitor, a superstar of Indian sports, a humble human being who would make no bones about his limitations or desires, the double Olympic medalist from India, is all rolled into one. He may want the top prize for himself but would not be envious if the rival pips him. He would tell himself to accept what he got, and work harder to achieve what he desires. He would not pretend that he does not care for brand endorsement. He certainly wants it, money matters, but would not compromise on his training for that. The 17-minute interaction with the Indian media after winning a silver medal in the Paris Olympics was more than just a routine question-answer session. "Your first throw was foul then in the second...," the scribe had not even completed his question before Chopra quipped, "Saari throw fouls hi thi sir sirf doosri hi theek thi (All throws were foul, except the second one)," he said, chuckling, and the 50-strong group joined him in laughter.

It was not a great deal for him to say he fouled five of his six attempts. The long Q and A session was largely in Hindi with Indian and Pakistani journalists asking questions, but when the volunteer requested an answer in English for the benefit of few foreign scribes, Chopra laid bare his simplicity. "Now I need to motivate myself to speak in English, the way I motivate myself for competition," he said with a smile, as the gathered group burst out in laughter. "Can you describe the competition between you and Nadeem, India and Pakistan," the foreign scribe asked again, requesting the answer in English. Well, he explained pretty well, effortlessly. "It was a really great competition. Maybe one of the greatest competitions in history. Arshad threw really well. I was also in good shape. But I don't know. My runway was not that good today," he responded quickly, without having to think much. It was inevitable that he would be asked about the missed competitions in the 2024 season, leading up to the Paris Games. It led to speculations whether he was carrying injury into the Paris Games.



He had skipped the Paris Diamond League in July, just before the Games, though he later clarified that the event was not part of his competition calendar. He revealed how difficult it becomes for him to say no to the organisers despite fitness concerns. "With a wide grin, he said, "Of course I need to play more but then I send those carefully drafted messages that I have suffered a strain and I won't compete. "In few competitions I have played just for the sake of organisers so that they don't feel bad. I keep thinking that I have entered the competition and if I don't go, they will say I am making excuses. Personally I love to compete as much as possible. "I make plans but then you tell your team, let's draft a good message, saying sorry for pulling out," he said, laughing, but the pain of missing the event was writ large. "No happiness is greater than playing. You work hard to compete only. Whatever strength God has given me I do." Then came a tricky one. He was asked about the pressure of sponsors in the Olympic cycle. How he finds that balance between brand endorsements, obligations and training? Again, he came up with an honest answer. "I put my game on top priority after Tokyo and after Tokyo Games only I got the opportunity to get associated with brands. It is difficult for us that brands come after you, and if you get it, why will you leave that opportunity. Just do it," he said, with all honesty. "It also opens the way for kids (next generation), nahi to shreer hi tootega khel khel key, last mein kuch nahi rahega." How many athletes say that so openly? "So I balance it. Priority is sport. This was an Olympic year, so whatever commitments I had, I fulfilled in the first half. "You have seen I have been training outside since Tokyo." He could be upset inside for not being able to defend his title but accepted that Thursday was Nadeem's day. Lastly, volunteers did their best to push him out of the mixed zone but he would keep coming back either to sign autographs or honour the request for selfies. After all, he knows how to find a balance between different things and saying no is the most difficult thing for him.

Sreejesh to join Bhaker as India's flag-bearer in closing ceremony

Celebrated hockey goalkeeper PR Sreejesh will join star shooter Manu Bhaker as the flag-bearer of the Indian contingent in the closing ceremony of the Olympic Games here on Sunday, a fitting honour and recognition for his contributions to the team. Before homing in on Sreejesh, Indian Olympic Association (IOA) chief PT Usha spoke with Neeraj Chopra, and she said even the superstar javelin thrower wanted to see the retiring legend as flag-bearer. Chopra claimed a silver here to become the first Indian track and field athlete to win two Olympic medals. He won a historic gold in the Tokyo



edition three years ago. "I spoke with Neeraj Chopra and appreciate the spontaneity and grace with which he agreed that Sreejesh should be the flag-bearer at the Closing Ceremony," Usha said in a statement. "He told me 'Maam, even if

you had not asked me, I would have suggested Sree bhai's name'. It is reflective of the immense respect Neeraj has for Sreejesh and his contribution to Indian sport," she revealed. Usha said Sreejesh was "both an emotional and popular

choice" within the IOA leadership, including Chef-de-Mission Gagan Narang, and the entire Indian contingent. The legendary Sreejesh retired from the game after India's bronze medal-winning feat at the ongoing Games, bringing to an end a glorious career spanning 18 years. "The Indian Olympic Association is delighted to announce the nomination of hockey goalkeeper PR Sreejesh as the joint flag-bearer with pistol shooter Manu Bhaker at the Closing Ceremony of the Paris 2024 Olympic Games," the IOA said in a statement. The 2-1 triumph over Spain, in the bronze medal playoff match here on Thursday, was a

fitting farewell for the 36-year-old custodian who has served the team with distinction for so long. "Sreejesh has served Indian hockey in particular and Indian sport in general admirably through more than two decades," Usha said. Sreejesh was also the flag-bearer in the closing ceremony of the Hangzhou Asian Games last year. The IOA had earlier named Bhaker as the female flag-bearer after she became the first Indian athlete post Independence to win multiple medals in a single Olympic Games. She won bronze medals in the women's 10m air pistol and the 10m air pistol mixed team (with Sarabjot Singh).

Boxer Imane fights for Gold to cap Olympics filled with misinformed scrutiny

Algerian boxer Imane Khelif is one victory away from wrapping up her tumultuous Paris Olympics with a gold medal around her neck - a potential prize that she has called the best response to a cascade of online abuse she has endured over misconceptions about her sex. Khelif fights Yang Liu of China on Friday night in the final of the women's welterweight division at Roland Garros. Khelif has yet to lose one round on a judge's scorecard in her first three fights in Paris, going on the most dominant run of her boxing career while facing an extraordinary amount of scrutiny. It stems from Khelif and fellow two-time Olympian Li Yu-ting of Taiwan getting disqualified from last year's world championships by the Russian-dominated International Boxing Association, which claims both fighters failed a murky eligibility test for women's competition. The International Olympic Committee took the unprecedented step last year of permanently banning the IBA from the Olympics following years of concerns about its governance, competitive fairness and financial transparency. The IOC has called the arbitrary sex tests that the sport's governing body imposed on the two boxers irretrievably flawed. The IBA did nothing to help its argument this week at a shambolic news conference in which its leadership contradicted itself about the tests and declined to answer

basic questions about them, citing privacy concerns from the Olympic committees of France and Taiwan. The IOC repeatedly reaffirmed the two boxers' right to compete in Paris, with President Thomas Bach personally defending Khelif and Lin while calling the criticism "hate speech." "We have two boxers who are born as women, who have been raised as women, who have a passport as a woman and have competed for many years as women," Bach said. That hasn't stopped the international outcry tied to misconceptions around the fighters that have been amplified by Russian disinformation networks, but neither has it slowed the two. Khelif has dominated all three bouts. But she faces her most significant test in Yang, the 2023 world champion and the No. 2 seed in their weight class. Khelif told SNTV, a sports video partner of The Associated Press, that the wave of hateful scrutiny she has received "harms human dignity," and she called for an end to bullying athletes. She also said a gold medal would be "the best response" to the backlash against her. The crowds in Paris, however, have embraced both Khelif and Lin, who have heard nothing but cheers during their bouts. A huge contingent of flag-waving Algeria fans greeted and serenaded Khelif throughout her semifinal victory Tuesday night, and she's become a hometown hero in her North African country. Khelif has already secured Algeria's first Olympic medal in women's boxing. She will

attempt to become only her country's second boxing gold medalist, joining Hocine Soltani (1996). The gold medal fight is the culmination of Khelif's nine-day run through an Olympic tournament that began with a bizarre event. Khelif's first opponent, Angela Carini of Italy, abandoned their bout after just 46 seconds, saying she was in too much pain from

Khelif's punches. An already brewing story suddenly became major international news, with the likes of former US President Donald Trump and "Harry Potter" author JK Rowling weighing in with criticism and false speculation about men competing with women in sports. Italian Premier Giorgia Meloni personally visited with Carini to share her condolences and

to cast doubt on Khelif's eligibility. Carini later said she regretted her actions and wished to apologize to Khelif. The Italian newspaper La Stampa detailed Carini's mindset in the days leading up to the bout, describing pressure from both inside and outside her team to avoid the fight amid the growing speculation over Khelif's status.
