## Supreme Court extremely disturbed over delay in Kolkata FIR

Terming the delay by the Kolkata Police in registering the unnatural death of the woman doctor raped and killed at the RG Kar Medical College and Hospital as 'extremely disturbing', the Supreme Court on Thursday came down heavily on the West Bengal Government about the "14-hour delay" in filing the First Information Report (FIR). The SC flagged discrepancies in police status report questioning the sequence and timing of legal formalities conducted by the police.

During the hearing, Justice JB Pardiwala, who is part of the three-judge bench comprising Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and Manoj Misra, said he has not come across the kind of procedure followed by the State Government of West Bengal in his 30 years of legal career life.

Expressing surprise that the post-mortem of the victim was conducted on August 9 between 6.10 pm and 7.10 pm before the registration of case as unnatural death, the top court pulled up the Kolkata police over "unexplained" delay of 14 hours in lodging of the FIR in the case.

"How come the post-mortem was conducted at 6.10 pm on August 9 and yet the unnatural death information is sent to Tala police station at

11.30 pm on August 9 after post-mortem and the FIR is recorded at 11.45 pm. This is extremely disturbing," the bench, also comprising Justice JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra, said. Questioning the sequence and timing of the legal formalities conducted by police, Justice Pardiwala said, "The entire procedure followed by your State (West Bengal) is something which I have not come across in the 30 years of my professional life."

"The first thing is, is it true that the UD (unnatural death) was recorded at 10.30 hours (10.30 am)? Second, who is this assistant superintendent non-medical (person), her conduct is also very doubtful. Why did she act in this manner?"

It directed the Kolkata Police officer, who registered the first entry about the incident that shocked the country, to appear in the next hearing and disclose the time of the entry. The court also observed that there seemed to be an attempt to pass off the murder as a suicide. Meanwhile, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) while sharing a status report on the matter claimed that the crime scene was altered and tempered with which has hindered the further probe in the case. The CBI also informed the court that the FIR was lodged after the cremation of the trainee doctor.

## Delhi Police deals death blow to Al Qaeda terrorists

The Delhi Police's Special Cell on Thursday claimed to have busted an Al Qaeda-inspired terror module after arresting 11 people and detaining three others from Jharkhand, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh. Six of the suspects were arrested from Bhiwadi in Rajasthan while they were undergoing training to handle weapons, according to a police officer. They have been identified as Hasan Ansari, Enamul Ansari, Altaf Ansari, Arshad Khan, Umar Farooq and Shabbaz Ansari, all natives of Jharkhand. They were staying in Rajasthan for the past few days, the officer said. Five more people were arrested from Ranchi in

Jharkhand. They have been identified as Dr Ishyiaq Ahmed, Motiur, Rizwan, Mufti Rahmatullah and Faizan, he added.

A senior police official said the operation by the Special Cell of the Delhi Police was conducted, along with the police forces of the States after receiving intelligence inputs. "In a coordinated, intelligence based operation, conducted by the Special Cell of Delhi Police in association with State Police forces of Jharkhand, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh, an Al Qaeda (AQ) inspired module has been busted," a Delhi Police statement said. The terror module was aiming to declare 'khilafat' in the country and was planning for carrying out terrorist activities across India.

## Delhi Doctors resume work

Resident doctors at AIIMS, Delhi RML Hospital and Federation of All India Medical Association announced that they were withdrawing their 11-day long strike following assurance from the Supreme Court on Thursday.

"We are resuming duty following the SC's appeal and assurances and intervention in the RG Kar incident and the safety of doctors. We commend the court's action and call for adherence to its directives. Patient care remains our top priority," the Resident Doctors' Association, AIIMS, New Delhi, said in a post on X.

The resident doctors' association of RML Hospital said in a similar statement that they would resume duty from 8 am on Friday. The SC on Thursday directed doctors protesting over the Kolkata rape and murder incident, to resume work and assured them that no adverse action would be taken after they rejoin.

The court said judges and doctors cannot go on a strike since they deal with matters involving life and liberty. "Justice and medicine cannot afford to be stopped. Can we (judges) go and sit outside the Supreme Court now?" the bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud asked. The bench comprising Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud, Justice JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra, was hearing the matter of the progress of the investigations by the two separate agencies — Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and Kolkata police in the alleged rape and murder of a woman doctor at R G Kar Medical College and Hospital in Kolkata.

## Crorepati Forest Range Officer in Vig net

Several flats, farmhouse among assets detected

The Vigilance police on Thursday conducted simultaneous raids at eight locations linked to Bibhudananda Mishra, Forest Range Officer of Dhenkanal Range, on the allegation of amassing disproportionate assets.

The raids were carried out on the properties in Dhenkanal, Cuttack and Bhubaneswar.

A double-storey building over an area of 4,605 sqft at Ratna Bazaar, Dhenkanal town, a flat at Brinda Basera, GGP Colony, Rasulgarh, Bhubaneswar. two flats



at Kaushalya Infra Projects Private Limited, Nanakramguda, Hyderabad, a farmhouse spread over five acres comprising a multi-storey house, a poultry farm, a horticulture nursery and a park at Rahangol, Athagarh, in Cuttack district, eight plots in upscale areas of Bhubaneswar and Dhenkanal. bank deposits worth Rs 40 lakh, gold weighing 300 grams, a diamond necklace and an ear top, Rs 4,13,140 in cash, including Rs 1

lakh concealed in a flush tank, two four-wheelers (Hyundai Creta and Kia Sonet) and six two-wheelers were among the immovable and movable assets of Mishra which were detected by the anti-graft agency.

The measurement and valuation and assessment of the buildings, flats, farmhouse and plots were being carried out by the Vigilance Technical Wing. Other deposits were also being ascertained.

## Prez recommends Ratna for Madhubabu

President of India Droupadi Murmu, on a request of the Utkal Sammilani, has recommended the name of Utkalgaurab Madhusudan Das to the Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) for awarding of the Bharat Ratna to him posthumously.

The President has also written to the MHA and the Parliamentary Affairs Ministry for installing of a statue of



Madhubabu in the Parliament premises.

Notably, during the visit of the President to Odisha, a delegation of the Utkal Sammilani had met her and requested for awarding of the Bharat Ratna to Madhubabu and installing of his statue in the Parliament premises. Utkal Sammilani president Anant Prasad Jena and general secretary Dillip Dashsharma have thanked the President for her initiative.

## Excise Super axed; 2 officials shifted

Brahmapur Excise Superintendent Pradip Panigrahi has been placed under suspension after two persons of the Chikiti area in Ganjam district died due to consumption of spurious country liquor.

The action against Panigrahi came after Excise Minister

Prithviraj Harichandan ordered his immediate removal from the post.

Besides, Excise Inspector Ramesh Chandra Mohanty was transferred to Koraput and Sub-inspector Prasanna Kumar Dhali shifted to Dhenkanal.

The Minister had on Wednesday held discussions with Principal Secretary (Excise) Sushil Kumar Lohani and Excise Com-

missioner Narasingha Bhol on the hooch tragedy and sought all the details regarding the incident.

At least 23 persons from Moundpur, Jenapur and Karabala village of Chikiti block had consumed country liquor from a local unlicensed shop on Monday evening. They later fell ill and were admitted to a nearby hospital in the Chikiti area.

## State Govt invokes ESMA for 6 months

Prohibits strikes by nurses, paramedics, others

To ensure medical services are not disrupted amid the ongoing protest over rape-murder of a Kolkata doctor, the Odisha Government has invoked the Essential Services Maintenance (ESMA) Act prohibiting strikes by Class-III and Class-IV employees in the health sector.

The order will remain in force for a period of six months, a notification issued by the Home (Special Section) Department said.

The ESMA was invoked after the Odisha Nursing Employees' Association threatened to go for a cease-work agitation from August 27. They have been wearing black badges to press on their 10-point charter of demands and planning to-ken strike without affecting patient care by holding a rally in Bhubaneswar on

August 23.

"In the interest of public, it is necessary to prohibit strikes in the form of cessation of work by nurses, pharmacists, paramedics, technicians and other Class-III and Class-IV employees in government hospitals and dispensaries in the state," the notification read.

It also applies to contractual employees in services/engagements connected with the maintenance of medical services in District Headquarters Hospitals,

sub-divisional hospitals, area hospitals, CHCs, PHCs, municipality hospitals and ESI hospitals. This apart, staffs working in the medical colleges and hospitals run by the government and autonomous health institutions receiving grant-in-aid from the government, specifically Acharya Harihar Post Graduate Institute of Cancer, Regional Spinal Injury Centre, jail hospitals and police hospitals will also be covered under the provisions of the Act.

## RDC probe to be held into hooch tragedy

Says Excise Minister

A Revenue Divisional Commissioner (RDC)-level probe would be held into the Chikiti (Ganjam) hooch tragedy and the RDC would submit a report in two months, Excise Minister Prithviraj Harichandan informed on Thursday.

"Chief Minister Mohan Majhi will soon take a decision in this regard and a RDC-level probe will be instituted in a day or two. We will crack down on illicit liquor trade.

Raids are being carried across the State. Since August 20, 217 illegal liquor kilns have been identified and those would be bulldozed. While 117 people have been arrested from different districts and fermented alcohol (pocha) is being destroyed," the minister told reporters.

Harichandan also informed that Brahma Excise Inspector Ramesh Chandra Mohanty and SI Prasanna Kumar Dhali have been suspended and Brahmapur Excise Superintendent Pradeep Panigrahi transferred in the wake of the hooch tragedy.

He added that the govern-

ment would ensure that there are no illegal liquor kilns in the state.

The announcement came as the Chikiti hooch tragedy, which claimed two lives, found its echo in the State Assembly for the third consecutive day.

The BJD has sent a fact-finding team led by its MLA and former Minister Niranjan Pujari to Chikiti.

Congress MLA Tara Prasad Bahuniapati accused the BJD and the BJP government of being in cahoots over illegal liquor smuggling. "Both, BJD and BJP have always backed liquor mafias," he said.

## National Capital brought to a halt

Delhiites face major transportation problem as taxi and autorickshaw drivers began their two-day strike on Thursday demanding better compensation from cab aggregator services with commuters in the national Capital and its adjoining areas to have a tough time.

Meanwhile, drivers who didn't participate in the ongoing strike were threatened and asked to deboard passengers. Taxi and auto unions said inadequate compensation coupled with aggregators launching bike taxi services has hit their livelihood. Delhi Auto Taxi Transport Union (DATTCU) president Kishan Verma claimed that 80 per cent of autorickshaws and taxis are off the road in the city as around 14 unions are participating in the protest.

Anil Pradhan, a cab driver, demanded a ban on bike taxis that offer services using non-commercial number plates. "The Government should step in and ban the commercial plying of vehicles with non-commercial numberplates. It is becoming difficult to make ends meet," he said. Amid the autos and taxis not operating, commuters expressed their frustrations as they took to social media to complain about delay in getting cabs and cancellations.

# Assembly uproar for third day Opp disrupts proceedings over ED, hooch tragedy

For the third consecutive day, chaos prevailed in the Odisha Assembly on Thursday as opposition Congress and BJD members disrupted proceedings over the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and hooch tragedy issues, forcing Speaker Surama Padhy to adjourn the proceedings until 4 pm.



As soon as the House assembled for the Question Hour, members of the two parties rushed to the Well of the House and raised slogans against the BJP governments in the State and at the Centre. The Congress members protested against the Central

Government's alleged misuse of the Enforcement Directorate to target opposition leaders while the BJD members demanded resignation of Excise Minister Prithviraj

Harichandan in connection with the Chikiti hooch tragedy, which has claimed two lives. As soon as the Assembly convened at 10:30 am, the opposition members began shouting slogans and disrupted the proceedings, leading the Speaker to adjourn the House until 11:30 am. When the session resumed, the opposition members continued their protests, once again rushing to the Well and forcing another adjournment until 11:45 am.

Despite repeated appeals from Parliamentary Affairs Minister Mukesh Mahaling for the opposition members to return to their seats and allow the House to function, the protests intensified. With no normalcy in sight, Speaker Padhy adjourned the House until 4:00 pm, bringing the session to a standstill for the third day in a row.

# Gold mine found at Adasa-Ramapalli in Deogarh

A gold mine has been traced in the Adasa-Ramapalli area in Deogarh district of Odisha, informed Mines Minister Bibhuti Bhusan Jena answering a question by Congress MLA Tara Prasad Bahinipati in the State Assembly on Thursday.

The Geological Survey of India (GSI) has traced the presence of gold while inspecting bronze in the area. Formalities are on to auction the gold mine block, said the minister. Earlier, there were reports that gold reserves have also been traced in Keonjhar and Mayurbhanj districts of Odisha. The gold deposits have reportedly been found in one

location in Deogarh, four different places in Keonjhar and four places in Mayurbhanj.

These areas include the Adasa-Ramapalli area in Deogarh and Dimirimunda, Kushakala, Gotipur, Gopur in Keonjhar and Joshipur, Suriaguda, Ruansila and Dhushura hill in Mayurbhanj.

As per Minister Jena, a new survey is being conducted in these areas to determine the amount of gold deposits before the procedure of auction takes place. This apart, gold reserves have been found in Sundargarh, Nabarangpur, Angul, Koraput, Malkangiri, Sambalpur and Boudh districts. However, there has been no official confirmation in this regard, Jena said.

# Samanta Sr Adviser to Guinea Prez

# In BBSR Heavy downpour causes severe waterlogging



**Lack of coordination between agencies blamed**

Heavy rains on Thursday caused waterlogging in several parts of Smart City Bhubaneswar throwing life out of gear.

While National Highway-16 in front of the ISKCON temple resembled a pond following waterlogging, several vehicles were stuck in the pool of water there. Due to the flooding, the movement of vehicles was stopped for hours, causing a heavy traffic jam.

"Due to the lack of proper planning of drainage system near the ISKCON temple and the lack of coordination between the National Highway Authority of India and the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation, waterlogging is a perennial problem here. The

problem should be fixed for the betterment of the city residents," said locals.

Many other parts of the city also got waterlogged due to the torrential rains. People with their motorbikes were seen taking shelter below the flyovers between Baramunda and Rasulgarh, causing traffic congestion in the busy junctions.

Overflowing drain water also flooded roads in many parts of the capital city.

"The administration is not taking any steps to prevent waterlogging; and as a result, people in the area are facing severe problems in their daily communication. We are scared to drive vehicles on the road," said a commuter.

Many other commuters alleged that the administration has completely failed to solve the problem and the lack of coordination between Works Department, BMC and NHAI has led to the mess.

# Loss of Rs 374 cr in LAccMI scheme: Min

The Odisha Government is incurring huge losses in the operation of LAccMI bus scheme, informed Transport Minister Bibhuti Bhusan Jena in the Assembly on Thursday. He said the government has suffered losses amounting to over Rs 374 for the scheme in 10 months duration from October 2023 till August 2024. Answering a question, Jena said a total of 1,340 buses are running across the State under LAccMI scheme. "The government has spent Rs 399 crore for the plying of

buses under LAccMI scheme. However, income of only Rs 25, 03, 86, 585 has been generated," said Jena.

Though the BJD government had initiated the scheme to establish a seamless public transport network from panchayats to the State capital, it completely failed to serve its purpose. After the formation of BJP government, it has been decided to rename the scheme as 'Mukhyamantri Bus Seva'. However, it will be a tough challenge for the new government to run the scheme due to the huge amount of loss, believe experts.

# Kingpin Asadur operated set up from Dhaka

**Police to urge for arrest through Interpol**

The Bangladeshi mastermind of the SIM box racket, recently busted in Cuttack, Bhubaneswar and Ranchi, Asadur Zaman was operating the SIM boxes from Dhaka using smartswitch. Commissioner of Police Sanjeeb Panda on Thursday

said Zaman founded a software company in Dhaka and he was directly operating the SIM Box centres at Bhubaneswar and Ranchi. He entered India via Tripura and returned to Bangladesh via West Bengal after staying in India for two months.

"NIA team has interrogated Raju Mandal and he may be grilled further. We will seek permission to take Raju on remand for seven more days," said Panda.

"Raju was a service provider. His job was to set up SIM boxes. More investigation is required to find out who were using those boxes and for which purpose they were using it. We will create awareness among people to give detailed information about the persons whom they are giving their houses on rent," Panda further said.

"We will try to establish that Zaman had stayed in India. Our first work will be to col-

lect evidence against him. Subsequently, we will request for his arrest through CBI and Interpol. Further investigation and cross verification into the incident is ongoing. We are currently questioning Raju to find further information" he added.

As per reports, the SIM boxes were used to make international calls to China, Pakistan, Afghanistan, Turkey and other countries. So, police suspect the duo of having terror links.

# Congress holds demo before ED office

Members of the Congress on Thursday staged a massive demonstration before the Enforcement Directorate (ED) office in Bhubaneswar alleging that the BJP-led Union Government is misusing important Central investigating agencies like the ED and the CBI. He demanded resignation of the SEBI chief. He alleged that the BJP is trying to suppress the Opposition in the country.

The protests were held across the country on the day at the behest of Leader of Opposition in Parliament Rahul Gandhi.

# Tech Asst held taking 50K bribe

The Vigilance police on Thursday caught Ganesh Kalser, Technical Assistant, Soil Testing Laboratory, in the office of Chief District Agriculture Officer, Jharsuguda while accepting a bribe of Rs 50,000 from a person. Kalser had demanded the bribe from the complainant

(Laboratory Attendant) to process a file for facilitating continuance of his contractual job.

Following the trap, simultaneous searches were carried out on the parental house of Kalser at Amasdegi, Dharuadihi, in Sundargarh district, and his office room.

Later, Kalser was arrested and forwarded to court.

# For sustainable waste management

# Solar-powered microwave reactor developed at IIT BBS

A research team from the School of Infrastructure at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Bhubaneswar has developed an innovative solar-powered microwave pyrolysis reactor designed to recover valuable resources from both segregated and mixed waste materials, including biomass and plastics.

The novel reactor uses microwave-assisted pyrolysis to rapidly convert wastes into valuable products such as highly porous carbonaceous material (biochar) and bio-oil, depending on the characteristics of the feedstock and operating conditions.

Current solid waste management practices primarily involve incineration, biogas plants or landfill disposal, offering limited opportunities for recycling. Incineration, while an alternative to landfilling, often leads to significant environmental pollution through the release of toxic gases and ashes.

The microwave-assisted pyrolysis technology developed

by IIT Bhubaneswar represents a promising solution to these challenges.

"Microwave-assisted pyrolysis is a technology that produces valuable end products like biochar, bio-oil and syngas in a very short amount of time, meeting the urgent need for sustainable waste management," said Dr Remya Neelancherry, the lead researcher of the project. "Our research is focused on the feasibility and applicability of these end products across various sectors, including agriculture, transportation, and energy production. Indian patent is granted on the mentioned technology," said he.

Dr Neelancherry explains the technology's working principles: "This emerging technology utilises microwave radiation to generate homogeneous heat within the feedstock, enabling efficient conversion into valuable end products at a faster rate with precise control over reactions. Furthermore, the reactor operates entirely on solar power, ensuring sustainability and self-reliance without imposing



any additional energy demands."

This is a novel, mobile technology requiring minimal footprint area, capable of converting waste at a rate of 10 kg/h into high-value end-products. The ease of mobility pro-

motes decentralised waste management. Moreover, the technology is carbon-neutral, offering investors a direct opportunity to generate carbon credits.

The end products of this process, biochar and bio-oil,

have a wide range of applications, from healthcare to agriculture and industrial applications. Studies suggest that biochar could be a promising replacement for coal while bio-oil can serve as an alternative to petroleum products.

The conversion of high-heat-value refuse into these energy products can support efforts to achieve net-zero emissions and meet the IPCC's (Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change) 2°C global warming challenge.

This environment-friendly technology can be implemented by municipalities and industries across various locations within cities, offering the potential to generate significant revenue with minimal pollution compared to incineration and other conventional waste management techniques.

"Depending on the waste management needs, this technology can be implemented in two forms: with a fixed bed reactor or a fluidised bed reactor. Research indicates promising potential for this technology to impact the alternative energy market positively. We welcome investors to explore this technology, ensuring environmental protection while fostering market growth," Dr Neelancherry concluded.

# Heavy rains to lash State for 3 days

Heavy to very heavy rain and thunderstorm with lightning may continue at one or two places in Sambalpur,

# 5 die in bus-truck collision in Ganjam

# B'swar OT Rd shopkeepers decry eviction order

# Dr Satishchandra gives stroke prevention tips

At 'KIMS Neuro Update 2024'

the 'BE FAST' acronym where the stroke-affected patient will show signs of sudden loss of balance (B), trouble seeing in both eyes (E), facial drooping (F), weakness in arm (A), difficulty in speaking (S) and time to call emergency service (T).

"Whenever you notice any of these symptoms, assume it's a stroke and get to a hospital with advanced stroke facilities, such as KIMS, within three hours," Prof Satishchandra advised.

sumption as key risk factors. "Once you are over 40, regular check-ups are essential to detect and manage these conditions early," he urged.

Over 100 distinguished neurologists from various parts of the country participated, contributing their expertise and insights at the conference inaugurated by the Founder of KIIT and KISS Dr Achyuta Samanta. The Neurology Association of Odisha expressed gratitude to Dr Samanta for his invaluable support of the event.

# HC orders sale of ship detained at Paradip Port

Cocaine worth Rs 220 cr seized from the vessel in 2023

In a landmark decision, the Orissa High Court has ordered the sale of the vessel MV Devi Panama, which was detained at Paradip Port following the discovery of Rs 220 crore worth of cocaine on board.

The vessel was also facing non-payment of port rent issues, with outstanding dues amounting to Rs 7.95 crore. The order was issued by Justice V Narasingh, who serves as both a High Court judge and admiralty judge, marking a first in the history of the Orissa High Court.

The court's decision comes after the realisation that pro-



longed detention could decrease the vessel's value. Consequently, the High Court appointed the Deputy Registrar (Judicial) as the Court Commissioner to oversee the sale. The court has further appointed 'Adoina Offshore Consultants Pvt Ltd' to appraise the vessel's value.

The HC clarified that the proceeds from the sale would be used to settle the outstanding dues owed to the petitioner. The MV Devi Panama, which had left Egypt last November, came to Paradip through Indonesia before heading to Denmark. However, on November 30, 2023,

while docked at Paradip Port's PICT berth, 22 kg of cocaine were seized from the ship, leading to a major international outcry. Since then, the vessel has remained detained at the port.

The case was brought before the HC by PICT, which sought payment of the outstanding port rent. The total amount owed by MV Devi Panama includes Rs 7.95 crore in dues, Rs 20.36 lakh in interest, and Rs 50 lakh in legal expenses.

As the vessel's sale process is set to commence, several questions remain unanswered: What will be the selling price of the ship? Will it be auctioned internationally, or will it be sold directly? The court has left these details to be determined by the hiring company responsible for the sale.

According to Sahu, the victim girl was identified as Swarnalata Mallik of Kelar village under Bhadreswar police station limits.

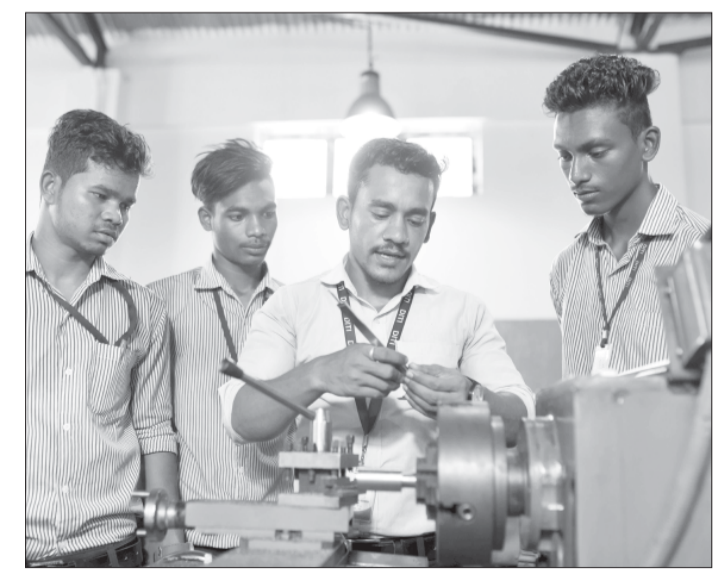

Following a request from the Chief Minister to the Home Minister, four additional NDRF teams arrived in the State to assist in the rescue operations, Tripura Government officials said. Tripura Chief Minister Manik Saha on Thursday said NDRF teams along with relief materials and disaster management equipment have arrived to assist the State Government in flood relief operations, reported PTI from Agartala. At least 10 people were killed and one was missing in landslides and flood-related

incidents in Tripura since Sunday. Over 32,000 people have taken shelter in 330 relief camps due to heavy rainfall. The entire State Government machinery has been working round the clock to tackle the unprecedented natural calamity, he said. "NDRF team along with relief materials arrives in Tripura. Relief materials & disaster management equipment have landed at Maharaja Bir Bikram Manikya Bahadur Airport, Agartala & are being swiftly dispatched to flood-affected areas. Bringing hope & aid to those in need," Saha posted on Facebook. "Spoke to Hon'ble Home Minister Shri Amit Shah Ji on

the current grim flood situation in the State. He informed that a total of eleven NDRF teams would be sent to Tripura... Arrangement would also be made for choppers for airlifting of the stranded people in the flood affected areas. More number of boats would also be sent along with the NDRF teams. I thank Hon'ble HM for providing instant assistance to the people of Tripura," Saha said. "Due to excessive rainfall since Sunday, the water level in all major rivers has already crossed the danger mark flooding several areas. Ten people killed in landslides and flood-related incidents since Sunday. Altogether 32,750 people have taken shelter in 330 relief camps," a State Government release said on Wednesday. The statement said the northeastern State witnessed as many as 1,900 landslides causing disruption in road connectivity. # JPC meets on Waqf Amendment Bill

The Joint Committee of Parliament on the Waqf (Amendment) Bill held its marathon first meeting on Thursday amid objections by Opposition MPs over a host of provisions in the proposed law as the Union Minority Affairs Ministry made a presentation. Heated words were exchanged at times during the meeting but members from various parties sat through several hours, recording their views on the provisions of the Bill, offering suggestions and seeking clarifications. The Trinamool Congress' Kalyan Banerjee, Sanjay Singh of AAP, Asaduddin Owaisi of the All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) and A Raja of the DMK were joined by some other Opposition members in raising questions over the need for several clauses, including the move to give more powers to the collector and have non-Muslim members on Waqf boards. There was a view among the members, some of them said, that the ministry was not "adequately prepared" to address the queries raised in the meeting. The next meeting of the committee will be held on August 30, a member said. Committee Chairperson Jagdambika Pal assured the members that the panel would speak to all stakeholders, including various Muslim bodies. The 31-member committee has been tasked by the Lok Sabha to scrutinise the contentious Bill, which has drawn protests from the Opposition parties and



Muslim organisations. The representatives from the Minority Affairs Ministry were expected to brief the committee on the "amendments proposed on the Bill", the Lok Sabha Secretariat said. The committee will discuss the Bill threadbare and also the concerns over it, Pal said ahead of the meeting, adding that voices of different stakeholders would be heard. "We will discuss all the 44 amendments and bring a good and comprehensive Bill by the next session," he said. Pal said the committee would call various Muslim bodies representing the different sects to hear their views. The Bill is the first major initiative from the BJP-led NDA Government aimed at reforming the registration process for Waqf properties through a centralised

portal. It proposes several reforms, including establishing a Central Waqf Council alongside State Waqf boards with representation for Muslim women and non-Muslim representatives. A contentious provision of the Bill is the proposal to designate the district collector as the primary authority in determining whether a property is classified as Waqf or Government land. The Bill was introduced in the Lok Sabha on August 8 and referred to a Joint Committee of Parliament after a heated debate, with the Government asserting that the proposed law did not intend to interfere with the functioning of mosques and the Opposition calling it a targeting of Muslims and an attack on the Constitution.



# EC trains its guns on fair elections in Haryana, Jammu and Kashmir

The Election Commission (EC) on Thursday advised its over 400 observers being deployed for Assembly polls in Jammu and Kashmir and Haryana to stay vigilant to false narratives trying to derail the election process and to ensure a quick counter. Reminding the observers of their crucial role, Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar emphasised that they, as representatives of the Commission, are expected to conduct themselves professionally and be accessible to all stakeholders including candidates and public at large. He also advised them to overcome language barriers and ensure that there are no gaps in communication. He reminded the observers that they would be under the watchful gaze of parties, candidates, voters and EC alike. Around 200 general observers, 100 police observers and as many expenditure observers, are being deployed in Jammu and Kashmir and Haryana. CEC Kumar advised the officials to be vigilant towards false narratives trying to derail the

election process. Election Commissioner Gyanesh Kumar emphasised that the officials should observe the complete election ecosystem for free and fair polls. Noting that the Assembly elections are keenly contested, he said the role of observers becomes all the more critical in these polls. Election Commissioner Sukhbir Singh Sandhu noted that accessibility, visibility and responsiveness are essential to develop a virtuous spiral enhancing the conduct of the elections. According to the poll authority, observers were strictly directed to remain accessible to all parties, candidates and voters for timely redressal of their grievances. Any complaints in this regard will be viewed seriously by the Commission. As the eyes and ears of the Commission on the ground, the observers were asked to exercise constant vigilance with utmost sincerity. The EC deploys observers under Section 20B of the Representation of the People Act, 1951 and plenary powers of the Constitution. IAS, IPS, IRS and those from other central services are deployed as observers.

# Talented youth of Haryana exploited in name of Kaushal Rozgar Nigam: Cong

A day after the Election Commission (EC) barred Haryana authorities from announcing the results of an ongoing recruitment process, the Congress on Thursday lashed out at the BJP and alleged that the "anti-youth" Government in the State was remembering the youth after "harassing" them for 10 years. regarding violation of the model code of conduct in the process of recruitment against 5,600 vacancies for the post of constable in the Haryana Police, 76 posts of two categories of teachers by the Haryana Staff Selection Commission (HSSC) and recruitment for various posts by the Haryana Public Service Commission (HPSC). Ramesh said in a social media post in Hindi, "The double-break BJP Government of Haryana harassed the youth during the last 10 years, kept recruitment on hold and whatever little recruitment was made was given to their own people. The talented youth of Haryana were exploited in the name of Kaushal Rozgar Nigam ie Government contracts." "There was a lot of rigging in Government recruitment, papers were leaked... Keeping



the elections in mind, on the day of announcement of the elections, to lure youths, recruitment was announced

that would never fructify," he said. "Today, when the Election Commission has reminded

about the code of conduct, the anti-youth Government has remembered the youth," he said. The Assembly elections

in Haryana will be held in a single phase on October 1 and the results declared on October 4. The Election Commission on Wednesday said the model code instructions did not bar the continuing regular recruitment process or promotion through the Union Public Service Commission, the State public service commission or the staff selection commission or any other statutory authority but "recruitment through non-statutory bodies will require prior clearance of the commission". After ascertaining the facts from the State Government and in view of the existing model code of conduct instructions, the poll panel found no violation of the code in the ongoing recruitment processes by the HSSC and the HPSC.

over a month as he is scheduled to retire next month. A rank piping ceremony was held at the Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) headquarters on Lodhi Road here on Thursday in the presence of Director General Rahul Rasgotra and other senior officers. As per officials, this is only the second time in the 1962 and raised ITBP when a cadre officer has been elevated to the ADG post, the second highest rank in the force after the DG. The ADG post in the ITBP and other central armed police forces (CAPFs) is essentially headed by officers who come on deputation to these organisations from the Indian Police Service (IPS). "This appointment also came late as the departmental promotion committee

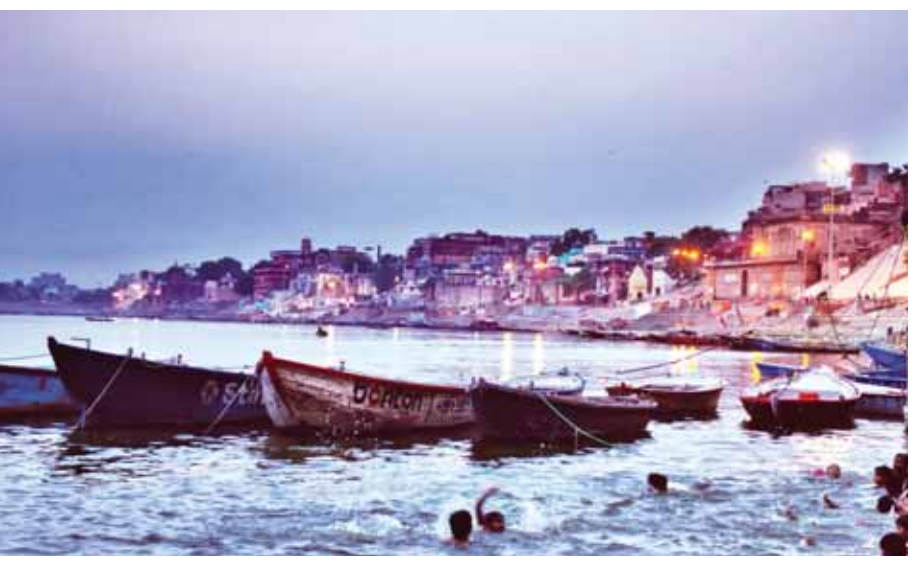
meeting was delayed. Jaspal Singh will be appointed ADG after Raina's retirement and he too will retire in a few months in December," a senior officer said. Raina, who hails from Kashmir, joined the ITBP in November, 1987 and has served tenures in Ladakh, Jammu and Kashmir, and northeast, and is credited with setting up the famed counter insurgency and jungle warfare (CIJW) school of the mountain-warfare trained force in Mahidanda, Uttarakhand. Apart from the LAC, the ITBP having strength of about 98,000 personnel is deployed for rendering a number of internal security duties in the country including conduct of anti-Naxal operations.

# Smart lab launched to revive small rivers

With an aim to revitalise small rivers through cutting-edge technology and innovative practices, a Smart Laboratory on Clean Rivers (SLCR) has been launched under the Green Strategic Partnership between India and Denmark. With an initial investment of Rs 16.80 crore from the Union Ministry of Jal Shakti and an additional Rs 5 crore from Denmark, the SLCR project focuses on rejuvenating the Varuna River. It aims to create a dynamic platform for collaboration among Government agencies, academic institutions, and local communities to develop and implement effective

solutions for clean and sustainable river water. This initiative, part of the Green Strategic Partnership between India and Denmark, aims to rejuvenate small rivers through innovative and sustainable approaches, the Ministry said in an official statement. A hybrid lab model will be established at IIT-BHU, coupled with an on-field living lab at the Varuna River. This model will allow for real-world testing and scaling of solutions aimed at improving river health, the statement said. The SLCR's institutional framework includes a robust appraisal mechanism to ensure excellence and



diligence in project execution. The Indo-Danish Joint Steering Committee (JSC), the highest authority within the SLCR, will provide strategic guidance and review the project's progress. Additionally, a Project Review Committee (PRC), comprising members from the National Mission on Clean Ganga (NMCNG), Central Water Commission (CWC), Central Ground Water Board (CGWB), IIT-BHU and Denmark's Urban Sector Counsellor, will oversee quality control at the project level. Coordination efforts will be managed by the Multi-Stakeholder Working Group (MSWG), chaired by the

district magistrate of Varanasi and co-chaired by representatives from NMCNG and IIT-BHU. The Joint Steering Committee has already cleared four key projects under the SLCR initiative. Among them is the development of a Decision Support System (DSS) for water management aimed at analysing basin water dynamics through advanced hydrological models and data analytics. This project, expected to last two to three years, will facilitate real-time monitoring and scenario simulations to support holistic planning and effective water management. Another vital project focuses

on the characterisation of emerging pollutants in the Varuna River. Over the next 18 months, advanced analytical techniques will be employed to identify and quantify contaminants, creating a comprehensive fingerprint library for water quality monitoring and proposing effective remediation strategies, the statement said. Utilising advanced geophysical techniques, the project will identify optimal recharge sites and develop a comprehensive river-aquifer flow dynamics model over the next 24 months, supporting informed decision-making and water resource optimization.

# Would soon form panel to end farmers' woes for all times: SC

The Supreme Court on Thursday said it would soon form a multi-member panel to amicably resolve the grievances of farmers 'for all times' and asked both the Punjab and Haryana governments to persuade the agitators at the Shambhu border between the states to remove their tractors and trollies from the site.

A bench of Justices Surya Kant, Dipankar Datta and Ujjal Bhuyan, which posted the matter for further hearing on September 2, asked the Punjab and Haryana governments to convey to the agitating farmers that the court as well as the two states are concerned about their issues and a forum is being constituted for the redressal of their grievances.

"We have suggested to the advocate general and the AAG of Punjab and Haryana respectively to submit the proposed issues, which will be the subject matter of reference for the committee to be constituted by this court," the bench noted in its order.

It further said, "We have clarified that the reference to the committee will have a wider mandate, so that the issues which are time and again causing law-and-order problems can be amicably resolved in a fair and just manner. That is why the needful shall be done in this regard within three days."

One of the counsel, appearing in the matter, said Leader of Opposition in the Punjab Assembly Partap Singh Bajwa has included in the committee as he was one of the original petitioners before the high court.

The submission was opposed by Senior Additional Advocate General Lokesh

Sinhal for Haryana, who said no political person should be included in the panel. The bench said "we will not allow any politician to be in the committee".

The bench allowed the representatives of both Punjab and Haryana to continue engaging with the farmers and directed them to apprise the court about the outcome of such meetings on the next date of hearing.

The bench said both the states must take it as a joint initiative and continue persuading the agitating farmers to remove their tractors and trollies and clear the highway.

"If need be, you (the states) can informally discuss the issues with them also. The committee may be small or big, but we may give some kind of power or authority to make recommendations to the state governments and, if need be, to the Union of India to consider their grievances sympathetically, so that the issues are resolved for all times," it said.

# Assam move to waive job application fee for SC, ST candidates

The Assam government on Thursday introduced a bill to make all applications for its jobs free for Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates.

Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pijush Hazarika tabled The Assam Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Reservation of Vacancies in Services and Posts) (Amendment) Bill, 2024 in the Assembly on behalf of Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma, who also looks after the Personnel department.

Presently, application fees for

SC and ST candidates are half in government jobs compared to those from the general category.

In the Statement of Objects and Reasons, Sarma said that the Bill "proposed to provide exemption of fees for examinations for selection to any service or posts under Government of Assam to be collected from Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribe candidates".

He also said that it will have financial implications with the total fees collected against applications will be reduced as there will be complete waiver of fees from the SC and ST candidates.

# Actor-politician Vijay unveils party flag, gears up for 2026 TN polls

# Solvent leak could have triggered fire in AP pharma unit: Official

Committee probe into the Adani issue, accused the BRS leaders of spreading "false" propaganda on farmer loan waiver.

"Farmers should not get carried away by the canards spread by the BRS. My government is ready to address all peoples' problems. Don't trust the BRS, who robbed Telangana for ten years," he said.

Reddy said he is ready for a debate on the BRS contribution to people (during its) in ten years (regime) and the Congress government's assistance in just 10 months.

The Telangana CM also hit out at Harish Rao, accusing him of playing dramas without resigning from his MLA post.

Reddy had recently challenged Rao to quit his MLA post as the Congress government fulfilled its promise of Rs two lakh crop loan waiver.

# Assam proposes to make Manipuri Associate Official Language in four districts

Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pijush Hazarika tabled The Assam Official Language (Amendment) Bill, 2024 on behalf of Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma, who also looks after the Home and Political Department.

In the Statement of Objects and Reasons, Sarma said that a number of people living in the Barak valley and other parts of the state speak Manipuri language and there have been persistent demands to officially recognise their language.

"The proposed amendment will allow Manipuri language

to be used as an Associate Official Language for all or any of the official purposes as are specified in the Schedule-II, in four districts of the state, namely, Cachar, Karimganj, Hailakandi and Hojai," he added.

The bill proposed to insert a new section 5B in the Assam Official Language Act, 1960 to recognise Manipuri language in the four districts, Sarma said.

# City court extends Senthil Balaji's remand

The examination pertained to the transactions of Senthil Balaji, his wife Meghala and his brother Ashok Kumar.

As the cross examination was not completed, the judge posted to August 28, further hearing of the case.

Earlier, Special Public Prosecutor N Ramesh, appearing for the ED had on August 16 examined Harish Kumar.

PSJ Alli had on August 8 issued summons to three witnesses for examination in the case. Accordingly, all the three witnesses were present on August 16.

In total, the prosecution has cited 22 witnesses in the case.

# Heavy rain lashes parts of Rajasthan

# Prithviraj meets Jarange, says Maha Govt must take call on quota now

"While the Mandal Commission and Kaka Kalelkar Commission did not consider the Marathas as backward, the community is part of the Other Backward Classes segment in Karnataka and Madhya Pradesh. So we (Congress-NCP government) decided to give them 16 per cent reservation," Chavan said.

"We asked the state OBC commission to find out the ground reality about the community's backwardness but it refused claiming the community does not need quota. Landless labourers and those with small plots are in distress and finding it tough to spend on education. If they get reservations, they will have some hope of getting government jobs," the Congress leader added.

Chavan said the reservation given to the Maratha and Muslim communities by the Congress-NCP government in July 2014 was not taken forward by the next government (of the BJP-Shiv Sena under Devendra Fadnavis).

# Tourist taxi operators protest in Goa against Mopa airport management

Hundreds of tourist taxi operators and those owning shacks and water sports facilities held a protest in Pernem in Goa on Thursday alleging their rights had been ignored despite giving land for the Manohar International Airport in Mopa.

Manohar International Airport but they have not got their due share after the facility was commissioned. "The Manohar International Airport must have a special tourist taxi counter for operators from Pernem. Parking fee must be capped as well," another protester told reporters.

# Kerala HC asks State Govt to submit Hema panel report in sealed cover

The Kerala High Court on Thursday asked the state government to submit to it in a sealed cover the Hema Committee report on atrocities against women in the Malayalam film industry.

A division bench comprising Acting Chief Justice A Muhamed Mustaque and Justice S Manu, while considering a PIL filed by a resident said the report contains serious allegations.

The high court admitted the writ petition and directed the government to file its counter affidavit. The court asked the government its next course of action based on the report

submitted by the Hema Committee. The government lawyer submitted that it is not possible to register a case unless someone files a complaint.

The state government said it has all the names mentioned in the uncensored original report which was a confidential document. It said the committee was entrusted to study and report the situation of women in the movie industry but the government has limitations in registering cases as the statements were recorded by the committee upon ensuring confidentiality. It is not possible to register a case against that confidentiality statement, the

government said, adding that cases will be registered if someone comes forward and files a complaint. The high court on Thursday on its own implied the State Women's Commission in the matter. The PIL sought to publish the original report and asked the high court to direct the state government to initiate criminal proceedings in connection with the alleged sexual offences mentioned in the report.

The Justice K Hema Committee was formed after the 2017 actress assault case involving actor Dileep, to study issues of sexual harassment and gender inequality in Malayalam cinema.

# K'taka Govt to give advice to Guv to act on requests for prosecution of Kumaraswamy

The Karnataka Cabinet on Thursday decided to give "aid and advice" to Governor Thawarchand Gehlot to act on requests seeking sanction for prosecution against JD(S) leader and Union Minister H D Kumaraswamy and three former BJP Ministers including mining baron G Janardhan Reddy. The Congress government's move comes within a week of the Governor granting sanction for prosecution of Chief Minister Siddaramaiah in the Mysuru Urban Development Authority (MUDA) site allotment 'scam' on August 16.

"To take decisions in the pending cases at the earliest and to smoothen the judicial process, under article 163 of the Constitution the Cabinet can give aid and advice to the Governor. Using it, the Cabinet has given its approval to give the Governor aid and advice," Law and Parliamentary Affairs Minister H K Patil said.

Briefing reporters after the Cabinet meeting, he said: "the advice will be sent to the Governor."

"Out of the four cases that are pending regarding which we have given aid and advice, in two of these cases (Janardhan Reddy and Kumaraswamy) the charge sheet has been

filed..." he added.

Asked whether the Governor can reject the Cabinet's aid and advice, Patil said: "According to us, he is bound by our advice; his discretion is limited. I am sure he shall use his discretion very judiciously."

The Governor on August 16 accorded sanction against Siddaramaiah, under Section 17A of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 and Section 218 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 for the commission of the alleged offences as mentioned in the petitions of Pradeep Kumar S P, T J Abraham and Snehamayi Krishna.

# The shadow games of Pakistan's ISI

Often accused of overstepping its professional bounds, ISI has become a player in domestic politics, international intrigue, and personal vendettas

Spies as complicated and lonely beings, living double lives. Such seclusion makes deception, intrigue and unrequited ambition, their default mode. The fact that they know the deep and dark secrets but are still expected to comply by restrains occasionally leads them to flex their 'privilege' (read, confidential information) towards reckless ends. Because they are dangerously privy to so much dirt, they fear their ambition.

Like the proverbial Ceasar's wife, must always be above suspicion - but often aren't. Pakistan's notorious spy agency Inter-Services-Intelligence (ISI) is infamous for going beyond its professional remit and dabbling in domestic politics, commercial interests or even partaking in cross-border dalliances, beyond their approved mandate. If the Pakistani Army Chief is the real power (pretence of civil politicians, notwithstanding), arguably the second most powerful person is the DG-ISI. Supposed loyalty to the Army Chief or to the PM (in times when the Army takes a backseat and politicians have an upper hand) is implicit, though, in the Pakistani narrative, backstabbing is common.

Ironically for such a powerful 'number two' post, there have been 29 DG-ISIs so far, and only one has ascended to the post of Army Chief i.e., the current Army Chief, General Asim Munir. It is reflective of the slippery slope that the post entails which invariably ends up making some power centres in Pakistan unhappy about their conduct e.g., Clergy, Politicians, Americans/Chinese or even their alma mater, the Pakistani 'establishment'. Even the current Army Chief, General Asim Munir was abruptly moved out as the DG-ISI as the then PM Imran Khan felt uncomfortable with his conduct (karma later evened out the equation as Imran finds himself languishing in the jail today). Seemingly the profile is for a loyal, unquestioning and low-key DG-ISI who does the job is satisfied with obscurity (shouldn't be overambitious) and effectively rides into



the sunset after retirement, without much fuss. Given the opportunity, lure and access, many do try to take their chances.

There is a curious case of one DG-ISI who did get appointed as the Army Chief, but his tenure was only for a few hours and the same does not go in official records as having become the Pakistani Army Chief. Lt Gen Ziauddin Butt was a typical DG-ISI who went across the Afghan border to meet the dreaded leader of the Taliban, Mullah Omar, to negotiate - he was in the thick of the dark corridors and machinations of the Pakistani State. Ziauddin had direct access to the other competing power centre i.e., PM Nawaz Sharif, and was a willing accomplice in Sharif's attempt to remove Pervez Musharraf as the Army Chief. Before the coup (or counter-coup as Musharraf calls it), 'General' Ziauddin was hastily appointed the Army Chief and then immediately dumped by the Pakistani Army which refused to back their DG-ISI's ambition. Spymaster's gambit failed. Ziauddin was not the first or the last of DG-ISIs to harbour personal ambition beyond what was warranted constitutionally. The shadowy likes of Lt Gen Akhtar Rahman,

Hamid Gul, Shamsur Kallu, Zaheerul Islam etc., operated with questionable interests. Yet another one who is in the news for harbouring extraconstitutional ambitions and paying the price for the same is the former DG-ISI, Lt Gen Faiz Hameed. Forced into premature retirement over his dubious role amid the recent turf war between the Pakistani 'establishment' (led by previous and current Army Chiefs i.e. Qamar Bajwa and Asim Munir, respectively) against the Imran Khan dispensation - he has been brought back to public news for having misused his then powerful position and arm-twisting people in some really deal.

While he was earlier afforded a relatively face-saving 'early retirement' (though everyone knew better), he could be embarrassingly court-martialed to score fresh brownie points against the deposed Imran Khan dispensation (which Lt Gen Faiz Hameed is popularly believed to be identified with). Instead of backing their henchman who did their bidding, Imran said, "if Faiz Hameed was involved, it should be investigated" and he welcomed the enquiry!

The whole saga says a lot about the unprofessionalism and complete absence of loyalty in overall governance, as exemplified by Lt Gen Faiz Hameed or by Imran Khan - the former was disloyal to his institution, and the latter to his word. As Israeli Michael Bar-Zohar notes in Mossad: The Greatest Missions of the Israeli Secret Service, "Dirtiest actions should be carried out by the most honest men", perhaps former DG-ISI Faiz Hameed wasn't one and will pay the price, again.

**THAW IN INDO-MALDIVES TIES**

The Maldives after a break is now trying to mend fences with India

India's recent outreach to Maldives, with External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar visiting the island nation, a couple of weeks back signifies a reset in the currently stressed bilateral relationship between the neighbours. After new President Mohammed Muizzu took charge, there has been a spate of anti-India voices, which has derailed decades of carefully curated strategic defence partnerships. Mr Muizzu's PNC-PPM coalition came to power last year, largely driven by India's campaign. Soon after Indian defence forces manning some critical equipment for the Maldives, were given marching orders and it seemed relations with India's nearest maritime neighbour were on a downward spiral without any checks. However, things began to change somewhere towards the beginning of this year and President Muizzu was invited to PM Modi's third swearing-in ceremony in June.

In his speech at the inauguration of the India-assisted projects to hand over water and sewerage projects across 28 islands of the Maldives President was all praise for the Indian PM. He said "The Government and people of Maldives extend our deep gratitude to Prime Minister of India, His Excellency Narendra Modi, the Government, and the friendly people of India for their generous and continued assistance to the Maldives and discuss strengthening our bilateral relations."

The speech highlighted a rethink regarding India relations and perhaps a silent acknowledgement that the Maldives needs India, to come out of financial stress. Maldives needs nearly millions of dollars in budgetary support for which the President has already reached out to China, Türkiye



and some Middle Eastern nations. However, any bailout by the lending countries has stiff collaterals attached, which could have risky consequences in future. Meanwhile India despite getting a bloodied nose, has been committed to rolling over nearly \$100 million in payments due from the Maldives, to ease off its financial burden. Maldives has also realised that beyond the India Out rhetoric, a recalibration of the bilateral in terms of economic and security ties would be a great midway for a stronger partnership with India. It was no coincidence that several critical India-assisted infrastructure projects inaugurated pre-President Muizzu's tenure were an important peg during S Jaishankar's visit to Male.

The press release issued by the ministry highlighted "EAM visited the India-assisted Greater Male Connectivity Project (GMCP) site and jointly reviewed the progress of this flagship development project that will connect Male with the adjoining islands of Villingili, Gulhifalhu and Thilafushi...EAM also visited Addu city on 11 August 2024, during which he, along with Foreign Minister and Minister of Construction and Infrastructure, jointly inaugurated the Addu Reclamation and Shore Protection Project and Addu Detour Link Bridge Project. The visit highlights the importance of Maldives, India's maritime neighbour, as a key partner in the 'Neighbourhood First' policy and India's Vision 'SAGAR' i.e. Security and Growth for All in the Region.

Maldives remains an important partner of India in maintaining peace, stability and prosperity in the Indian Ocean region. "India and Maldives are dependent on each other for their respective economic, security and climate change-related issues. However, the resentment in the Maldives relationship is also a greater message to the new government in Bangladesh, which in the past has not been a great sympathiser with India's concerns. While the interim government in Bangladesh has so far maintained a moderate line of continuity on India bilateral, the political parties in power may not be too kind in future. Like many of India's neighbours, Bangladesh too is under severe economic crisis, and sooner or later the realisation would dawn that the best bet for the country is to have a good neighbour.

**Monsoon mayhem: Tackling urban flooding**

There is urgent need for comprehensive disaster management and infrastructure reforms to protect lives and property from future monsoon fury



In the warming world Sea surface temperature is rising followed by excessive evaporation and deposition of moisture laden vapours in the form of clouds. When conditions are favourable, incessant rainfall occurs. Many times, half the annual rainfall occurs in 24 to 48 hours. Urban infrastructures are unable to take the challenge; flooding on roads, public places, ground floors and the basement of buildings is quite common leading to disruption of rail, road and air traffic as well as businesses. Rural areas face the brunt of the mayhem; loss of crops, landslides, and landslids in hilly terrain can claim lives and livelihoods and can throw the economy out of gear.

It can put additional stress on the budget as the public fund (taxpayers' money) has to be diverted for the reconstruction of damaged infrastructures and also for compensating the losses for the private properties. The disaster that hit Wayanad on 30th July claimed more than 400 human lives and injured an equal number has been one of the worst of its kind in living memory.

Big boulders and stones from an 8.26 ha (82600 sq meter) area on the top of the hill located at 1550 meters above the mean Sea level have rolled for 7 km on a downward slope and smashed buildings, damaged roads and bridges etc in three-four villages at 650 meters above the mean Sea level. One ton boulder has attained the energy of 9 mega Joule, which is enough to destabilize and knock down an RCC building in a rural area. Monsoon mayhem has caused damage in many other places in Western Ghats as well as in the Himalayas. Landslides and damage to roads and bridges have posed a challenge to people and tourists in Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand.

In this column let me confine to the issues faced by metropolitan cities and make some suggestions to deal with it. The death of three civil service aspirants in the basement flooding of Rau's coaching centre in Rajendranagar Delhi last month and also another aspirant dying

of electrocution are chilling reminders of the apathy of the civic body. We must know the precautions that must be undertaken by the agencies and the building occupants to make sure that such incidents are not repeated. Civic Body of Mumbai had earlier designed stormwater drains and related infrastructure to take care of 25 mm of rain in an hour.

Severe flooding repeatedly occurring during the past several years has forced them to remodel their drainage system to take care of more intense rains up to 50 mm per hour. However, in places like Mumbai, Ratnagiri, Satara, Mahabaleshwar and many other locations 80 to 100 mm of rain per hour has been recorded. Similarly, places in some other regions of the country are also experiencing frequent cloud bursts resulting in 80 to 100 mm of rainfall per hour for three to four hours. Wayanad tragedy was the result of 570 mm of rain in 48 hours.

All Civic authorities in cities like Mumbai, Chennai, Hyderabad, Bengaluru, Delhi, Gurugram etc should remodel the drainage system to take care of at least 100 mm of rain per hour. The encroachments on storm water drains as well as on lake beds should be removed.

Further, the drains should be regularly de-silted and cleaned up so that plastics, polythene bags silts etc are removed and disposed of at far-off places. The lakes in the cities are balancing reservoirs where the water level should be regulated by opening the sluice gates. De-weeding and de-siltation of lakes are also required to be done periodically to ensure that the water reservoirs are kept clean up to maximum flood level. All the inlets of the lakes are

monitored to ensure that none carry untreated sewage into them. There is the possibility that lake water may enter people's houses at the time of flash floods; it must be ensured that sewage water does not enter houses. Stormwater drains in metropolitan cities are often found partly encroached and occupied for living by erecting small huts. Such occupants must be rehabilitated elsewhere and drains must be fully opened for flow of water. Let us not forget that the existing stormwater drain is insufficient to take the load of more than 25 mm of rainfall per hour.

Beds of many urban lakes have also been encroached. Lake beds up to high flood levels are meant for storage of water. The reduction in volume for storage indicates that the water flows in the basement and ground floor of the buildings, causing undue hardship for the people. Incessant rains in November 2015 (approximately 483 mm in 24 hours) led to one of the biggest catastrophes in Chennai. 500 people were killed and nearly 10 lakh houses were submerged resulting in the displacement of 1.8 million people. Two reasons were attributed to the disaster.

One was the encroachments on lake beds in Chennai and the other was the delay in regulating the water level in the Chembaram Bakkam reservoir. The situation came under control only when 1.5 lakh cusecs water from this reservoir was released into the Adiyar river.

Many wetlands in Chennai have been occupied by communities. Pallikarnai wetland used to have an extent of over 5000 ha has shrunk to 10% and only 500 ha is remaining as wetland at present. Unless the encroachments are cleared, we are likely to face

a similar tragedy in future. Civic bodies while working on drainage systems for stormwater as well as sewer lines must take enough precautions and keep the drains and man-hole covered, so that no person accidentally falls into them and perishes.

When the road is flooded and becomes a flowing river, uncovered drains and sewer lines cannot be identified by people wading through. People in Mumbai, Delhi, Gurugram and many other metropolitan cities find flood water trapped in the basements of their houses. Often they resort to pumping it out, which requires time and energy. It is advisable to construct a sump underneath so that the rainwater can be effectively harvested and later used for various purposes.

If the basement is kept clean, then flood water collected would be of drinkable quality. Several Civic Bodies mandate water harvesting structures along with new constructions while approving Plans. At the implementation stage, however, such structures generally take care of harvesting water from the rooftop and ignore basements, prone to flooding during cloud bursts.

Water harvesting for basements should be made compulsory and must be seriously implemented. Building by-laws if necessary be amended by respective civic agencies to make sure that the basement of the buildings is used for parking vehicles, storing unserviceable items and water harvesting/ storage only. In no circumstances should people be permitted to use it for housing, hotels and businesses.

**Prime Minister Modi's Ukraine visit: A strategic balancing act**

PM's visit underscores India's evolving role on the world stage, where it seeks to navigate complex alliances and assert its national interests

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Kyiv marks a significant moment in international diplomacy, reflecting India's strategic balancing act between Russia and the West amid the ongoing conflict in Ukraine. As the first leader from a nation that maintains strong relations with both Russia and Western countries, Modi's visit sends a nuanced message to global powers, particularly Russia.

While some observers suggest that Modi's visit is intended to placate Western disappointment following his two recent visits to Russia, the reality appears more complex. Modi's trip to Ukraine serves primarily as a subtle signal to Moscow that India can engage with Ukraine as well. This visit

As India seeks to strengthen its ties with Western nations, particularly in the Indo-Pacific region where China's assertiveness is a growing concern, Modi's visit to Ukraine reaffirms India's commitment to a multipolar world. India values its strategic autonomy, making decisions based on its national interests—a stance that has occasionally drawn criticism from its allies.

Another important aspect of Modi's visit is India's interest in contributing to Ukraine's reconstruction efforts. The war has left Ukraine in ruins, and India sees an opportunity to play a role in its rebuilding process. This involvement would not only be a humanitarian gesture but also a strategic investment that could benefit the Indian economy. India has already provided humanitarian aid to Ukraine, and Modi's visit could pave the way for more substantial support, including infrastructure projects and logistical assistance, which would also benefit related Indian industries.

Furthermore, India's involvement in Ukraine's reconstruction could serve as a counterbalance to China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI). By offering an alternative model of development cooperation that respects the sovereignty of partner countries, India positions itself as a more favorable partner for nations in need. This approach aligns with

India's broader goal of positioning itself as a global leader and a moral force in international diplomacy. As the world closely watches Modi's visit to Ukraine, the potential outcomes could have far-reaching implications for global power dynamics. Should Modi's diplomacy contribute to a ceasefire between Russia and Ukraine, India could emerge as a significant peacemaker and problem solver on the world stage. This would enhance India's reputation as a nation capable of navigating complex geopolitical landscapes while maintaining its principles and strategic autonomy.

# Clinton: Harris is clear choice over 'other guy'

"Kamala Harris will work to solve our problems, seize our opportunities, ease our fears, and make sure every single American, however they vote, has a chance to chase their dreams," Clinton, 78, said.

Clinton's wife, Hillary Clinton, lost the 2016 election to former President Trump, the current Republican presidential nominee. Clinton said he wants America that more joyful, inclusive, and future-focused.

"Where we weather the storms and earn the benefits together. That's the America Kamala Harris will lead. She's already made her first presidential decision, picking a running mate," Clinton, who served two terms in the White House until January 2001, said.

Clinton riffed on the famous "place called Hope" line he gave at the 1992 Democratic convention to encourage Americans to vote the "president of joy," Harris, into the White House. Clinton, who is from Hope, Arkansas, famously said in the 1992 convention, "I still believe in a place called Hope." On Wednesday, the-

# Brazil to limit entry for some Asians

Brazil will begin imposing restrictions on the entry of some foreigners from Asia who use the country as a launching point to migrate to the United States and Canada, the justice ministry's press office said Wednesday. More than 70% of requests for refuge at the airport come from people with either Indian, Nepalese or Vietnamese nationalities, an official document says. The African nations of Somalia, Cameroon, Ghana and Ethiopia are among the remaining 30% of refugee seekers. The move, which starts on Monday, will affect migrants from Asian countries who require visas to remain in Brazil. It does not apply to people from Asian countries currently exempt from visas to Brazil. US citizens and many European nationals also do not require visas for Brazil. A Federal Police investigation has shown these migrants often

buy flights with layovers in Sao Paulo's international airport, en route to other destinations, but stay in Brazil as a place from where they then begin their journey north, according to official documents provided to The Associated Press.

Starting next week, travellers without visas will either have to continue their journey by plane or return to their country of origin, the ministry said.

A report signed by federal police investigator Marinho da Silva Rezende Junior informs the justice ministry that since the beginning of last year there has been "great turmoil" due to the influx of migrants at the airport in Guarulhos, a city located in the Sao Paulo metropolitan area.

"Evidence suggests that those migrants, for the most part, are making use of the known - and extremely dangerous - route that goes from Sao Paulo to the western state of Acre, so they can access Peru and go toward Central America and then,

finally, reach the U.S. from its southern border," one of the documents says.

An AP investigation in July found migrants passing through the Amazon, including some from Vietnam and India. Earlier on Wednesday, Brazil's federal prosecutors' office said in a statement that Sao Paulo's international airport "is once again counting a high number of foreigners who arrive on flights of the airline LATAM and do not exit quickly due to the overload on the Brazilian migration system."

The prosecutors' office added that it will put pressure on airlines to give migrants some basic supplies as they wait for their concession of refuge. The term refers to an application for refugee status, regardless of the reason. LATAM did not immediately respond an AP request for comment.

"It is important that we quickly decide on these refugee requests so that the growing arrival of foreigners does not impact the operation of the airport itself," federal prosecutor Guilherme Rocha Göpfert said after a meeting at Sao Paulo's international airport Wednesday. One of the documents says Brazil's federal police received 9,082 requests for refuge this year through July 15. That is more than the double the amount for the entire 2023, and the most in over a decade, according to the figures. However, federal police said that just a few hundred of those sought to get documents to remain in Brazil. The same document says federal police are convinced there is "a consolidated route of irregular migration in Brazil, with a strong presence of people who are involved in migrant smuggling and human trafficking, with an evident fraudulent use of the application for refugee status."

# French destroyer rescues 29 mariners from stricken Red sea oil tanker

A French destroyer rescued 29 mariners from an oil tanker that came under repeated attack in the Red Sea, officials said Thursday, while also destroying a bomb-carrying drone boat in the area.

Yemen's Houthi rebels are suspected to have carried out the assault on the Sounion. The attack, the most serious in the Red Sea in weeks, comes during a monthslong campaign by Houthi targeting ships over the Israel-Hamas war in the Gaza Strip that has disrupted a trade route through which \$1 trillion in cargo typically passes each year. The Sounion is now at anchor in the Red Sea and no longer drifting, the European Union's Operation Aspidos said. However, it wasn't clear if the vessel was still ablaze. The vessel had been staffed by a crew of Filipinos and Russians. Military officials did not name the French



destroyer involved in the rescue. In the attack Wednesday, men on small boats first opened fire with small arms about 140 km (90 miles) west of the rebel-held Yemeni port city of Hodeida, the British military's United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations centre said. Four projectiles also hit the ship, it added. It wasn't immediately clear if that meant drones or missiles. The Houthis did not immediately claim responsibility for the attacks, though it can take them hours or even days before

they acknowledge their assaults. However, they did acknowledge US airstrikes in Hodeida that the American military's Central Command said destroyed a Houthi surface-to-air missile and radar system. The Houthis have targeted more than 80 vessels with missiles and drones since the war in Gaza started in October. They seized one vessel and sank two in the campaign that also killed four sailors. Other missiles and drones have either been intercepted by a US-led coalition in

# 'British tech magnate Mike Lynch's body found in yacht wreckage'

Porticello (AP): The Italian coast guard said Thursday the body of British tech magnate Mike Lynch is among those recovered off the coast of Sicily from the wreckage of a superyacht whose builders had called it unsinkable.

One woman remains missing. The bodies of Lynch, who had been celebrating his recent acquittal on fraud charges with his family and the people who had defended him at trial in the United States, and five others were recovered by rescue crews following Monday's tragedy.

The Bayesian, a 56-metre (184-foot) British-flagged yacht, went down in a storm early Monday as it was moored about a kilometre (half-a-mile) offshore. Civil protection officials said they believe the ship was struck by a tornado over the water, known as a waterspout, and sank quickly.

The chief executive of The Italian Sea Group, which owns the Bayesian's manufacturer, said superyachts like these are "the safest in the most absolute sense".

"First of all, because they have very little surface compared to a yacht facing into the wind," CEO Giovanni Costantino told Sky News on Wednesday. "Second, with the structure, the drift keel, they become unsinkable bodies."

Investigators are now looking at why the Bayesian sank, killing at least six people. A seventh remains missing.

Fifteen of the 22 people aboard survived, including a mother who reported holding her 1-year-old baby over the waves to save her.

Divers have struggled to find the bodies in the yacht's hull on the seabed 50 metres (164 feet) underwater.

"We would need a crystal ball to know when we'll be able to find the next body," said Luca Cari, spokesperson for the fire rescue service.

"It's very difficult to move inside the wreckage. Moving just one meter can take up to 24 hours," Cari said.

# America faces many elevated threats all at once: FBI Director

The country is facing heightened threats from many corners at a time when law enforcement agencies are struggling, FBI Director Christopher Wray said in an exclusive interview, adding that he is "hard pressed to think of a time in my career where so many different kinds of threats are all elevated at once."

Wray spoke Wednesday with The Associated Press while visiting the Minneapolis field office to talk about partnerships between law enforcement agencies and also with other entities. His remarks come as the FBI confronts heightened concerns over terrorism, both domestic and international, as well as Chinese espionage and intellectual property theft and foreign election interference.

"I worry about the combination of that many threats being elevated at once, with the chal-



lenges facing the men and women in law enforcement more generally," Wray said at the office in the suburb of Brooklyn Center. "And the one thing that I think helps bridge those two challenges is partnerships. That's how we get through. It is by all working together."

Wray's assessment of an elevated threat landscape is consistent with alarm bells he has

sounded for months. Soon after the Oct. 7 attack by Hamas in Israel, Wray began warning that the rampage could serve as an inspiration to militants, "the likes of which we haven't seen since ISIS launched its so-called caliphate years ago." The FBI has also scrambled to deal with security concerns related to the United States' southern border, with officials revealing in June that eight people from Tajikistan with suspected ties to the Islamic State group were arrested and were being held on immigration violations. Officials are also dealing with the specter of foreign election interference.

The FBI and other federal agencies announced Monday that Iran was responsible for a hack targeting the Trump campaign and for an attempted breach of the Biden-Harris campaign, part of what officials portrayed as a brazen and

aggressive effort to interfere in American politics.

Wray declined to talk about any specific investigation or threat but said investigations into cyberattacks, including against election infrastructure, candidates or campaigns, require help from the private sector.

"One of the things that we have been doubling down on with every passing day is, is on partnerships, because ultimately you're talking about the ability to connect the dots, whether it's against some kind of election influence threat or some other kind of threat," Wray said. "You need to have partners sharing information with each other to put the two pieces together to see the bigger picture." Law enforcement officers are being killed in the line of duty at a rate of about one every five days, Wray said, noting that four first responders have died in Minnesota alone in 2024.

# Visa data shows Indian students hesitant to apply to UK universities

London (PTI): Indians may continue to top the tally of student visa grants but they are beginning to show signs of being put off applying to UK universities amid greater migration curbs, the latest Home Office statistics revealed on Thursday. The Home Office data for the past year until June 2024 shows a 23 per cent fall in Indian students coming to the UK for higher studies, even as they continue to represent the largest group granted leave to remain on the Graduate Route visa which allows foreign students to work in Britain for two years after their degree. This fall in Indian student numbers is the first indication of the impact of tighter curbs on the right of most student visa holders to bring along dependent family members, which came into effect earlier this year.

"There were 110,000 sponsored study visa grants to main

applicants who were Indian nationals in the year ending June 2024 (25 per cent of the total), 32,687 fewer than the previous year," the Home Office statistics reveal. "Most of the increase in foreign students between 2019 and 2023 were from Indian and Nigerian nationals, but numbers for these nationalities have fallen in the latest year (by 23 per cent and 46 per cent respectively)," it notes. The India-UK Young Professionals Scheme, which involves a two-way flow of young graduates to live and work in either country for up to two years, brought in 2,234 Indian nationals since the first ballot was held in February last year - well below the annual 3,000 visa cap.

"In the year ending June 2024, Indian nationals represented the largest group of students granted leave to remain on the Graduate Route (67,529), representing almost half (46 per

cent) of grants of Graduate Route extensions to main applicants," the data reveals. However, a gradual decline in student numbers will cause concern among UK universities as they struggle through financial pressures and rely on the much higher fees paid by overseas students.

The National Indian Students and Alumni Union (NISAU) UK fears a review launched into the Graduate Route visa last year, which concluded only in May to confirm it would not be abandoned, put many Indians off applying. "It is critical that we ensure that the chaos and uncertainty that the review of the Graduate Route had led to is now fully put to rest. NISAU has engaged with millions of students in India to spread the message that the UK remains a warm and welcoming destination for Indian students," said NISAU UK chair Sanam Arora.

# Man opens plane door, walks on wing at Australian airport

Melbourne (AP): A passenger was arrested at an Australian airport after he left a stationary airliner through an emergency exit, walked along a wing, and then climbed down a jet engine to the tarmac on Thursday, officials said.

Jetstar Flight JQ507 had arrived at Melbourne Airport from Sydney and had parked at a terminal gate when the man left the plane by the right-side exit, officials said. Opening the exit automatically deployed a slide from the back of the wing at the fuselage to the ground, a Jetstar statement said.

But the man instead walked along the wing and climbed down one of the Airbus A320's two engines, an official said.

Passenger Audrey Varghese said passengers screamed and shrieked as the man began "erratic" behaviour shortly before he opened the

hatch.

"The man was exhibiting some quite strange behaviour," Varghese told Melbourne Radio 3AW.

"As soon as the plane had started coming to a stop, he immediately got up and basically charged to where the emergency exit row is, and in the process shoving people, causing a bit of commotion, (and) ripped open the emergency door," Varghese said.

Another passenger, identified as Maddison, told Nine News television the man had been vaping, which is not allowed, during the 90-minute mid-morning flight and had unsuccessfully demanded the air crew provide him with alcohol.

Australian Federal Police officers had been alerted by Jetstar staff and arrested the man for "alleged aggressive behaviour and breaching aircraft safety protocols", a police statement said.

# Pressure mounts on Mexico's judicial overhaul amid market concerns

Mexico City (AP) President Andrés Manuel López Obrador is facing mounting pressure against his controversial proposal to overhaul the Mexican judicial system, which would have judges be elected.

Judges and magistrates on Wednesday joined a strike begun early this week by federal court employees to oppose the proposal, while Morgan Stanley and other financial institutions warned that the overhaul could pose serious market consequences and risks for potential investors in Mexico.

In a response to rising criticism, President-elect Claudia Sheinbaum joined her political ally López Obrador in defending the proposal Wednesday.

"Investors shouldn't be worried. On the contrary, we will have a better justice system in Mexico," Sheinbaum said.

López Obrador, a populist leader who is nearing the end of his six-year term, has long been

at odds with Mexican courts. He contends judges are part of a "mafia" against him, and says the proposal is meant to clean up corruption. He has gone on winding rants against the judicial system, ignored court orders and publicly sparred with judges whose rulings he has disagreed with.

Among the changes sought by the López Obrador it to have judges be elected and allow virtually anyone with a law degree with a few years experience as a lawyer to become a judge through popular vote.

Given major electoral wins by López Obrador's party Morena in June elections, many academics have voiced concerns that selecting judges by popular vote would put politically biased judges on the bench and deal a blow to checks and balances.

The striking court employees also fear that the measure could put their careers in danger. Since Monday, thousands of employees have camped outside

federal court buildings, and the rallies grew Wednesday with judges and magistrates joining in. The demonstrators gathered under tents chanting and holding protest signs, with Mexicans with court appointments turned away.

"It could do damage to society," said Fernando Rangel Ramirez, a federal judge on strike. He said the judicial branch "is an institution that historically, and in its nature, should not be politicized. There should be people in it that have enough experience."

The National Association of Circuit Magistrates and District Judges said the strike will go on indefinitely, until the president's proposal with "its many imperfections" is blocked. The group said it hopes to redirect "public discussion toward a well-considered comprehensive reform to address the structural causes that have been steadily weakening the quality of justice" in Mexico.

# 90-foot-tall Hanuman statue in Texas becomes new landmark

Houston (PTI): A 90-foot-tall bronze murti of Lord Hanuman, unveiled near here, symbolising "a new milestone in the cultural and spiritual landscape of America," has become the latest landmark in Texas visible from miles away, and the third tallest sculpture in the US. The Statue of Union, as it has been named, is one of the tallest statues in the world and holds several other distinctions: it is the tallest Hanuman murti outside India, the tallest in Texas, and the third tallest statue in the United States, surpassed only by the Statue of Liberty in New York (151 feet) and the Pegasus and Dragon in Hallandale Beach, Florida (110 feet), the organisers said.

The 'Statue of Union' Hanuman murti, which was unveiled at the Sri Ashtalakshmi Temple in Sugar Land, about 35-odd km from here, during a grand Prana Prathishtha Mahotsavam ceremony from August 15 to 18, symbolises "selflessness, devo-



tion, and unity," the organisers said, adding, the murti is named so to "honour Hanuman's pivotal role in reuniting Lord Ram and Sita."

"This awe-inspiring structure is the result of the visionary efforts of His Holiness Sri Chinna Jeeyar Swamiji, a Padma Bhushan awardee, and a renowned Vedic scholar, who envisioned the project as a spiritual epicentre for North America," the organiser said in a statement.

The festivities commenced on August 15, coinciding with India's Independence Day and the core of the celebrations unfolded on August 18, with the grand Prana Prathishtha ceremony. "The rituals, led by Sri Chinna Jeeyar Swamiji and overseen by a multitude of Vedic priests and scholars, were a powerful display of devotion and spirituality," the statement said. The ceremony featured a helicopter showering flowers upon the murti, sprinkling of sacred water, and placing of a 72-foot-long garland around Hanuman's neck amid thousands of devotees chanting the names of Shri Ram and Hanuman in unison. The statue stands tall not only as a symbol of Hanuman's indomitable spirit but also as a new milestone in the cultural and spiritual landscape of America, embodying the principles of devotion, strength, and unity for all who come to witness its grandeur, the organisers added.



# Ukraine's Zelenskyy visits border area

President Volodymyr Zelenskyy toured the northeastern Ukrainian region of Sumy on Thursday in his first visit to the border area since his forces entered Russian territory more than two weeks ago.

After a meeting with Ukraine's military commander, Zelenskyy said Ukrainian forces have claimed control of another settlement in the Russian region of Kursk and taken more Russian prisoners of war whom he hopes to exchange for captured Ukrainians. He referred to that as Ukraine's "exchange fund."

"Another settlement in the Kursk region is now under Ukrainian control, and we have replenished the exchange fund," Zelenskyy wrote on the social media platform X after hearing a report from the military commander, Col Gen Oleksandr Syrskyi.

But the gains there come as Ukraine continues to lose ground in its eastern Donetsk region. The Russian Defence Ministry announced Thursday that its military has claimed control of the village of Mezhevo.

Ukraine's push into Russia marks the first capture of Russian territory since World War II. It comes as both sides in the war use drones to attack far within enemy lines.

A Ukrainian drone attack Thursday sparked a fire at a military facility in southern Russia as Kyiv pushes its offensive in the Kursk region and struck key infrastructure including bridges.

Andrei Bocharov, governor of the Volgograd region, said Thursday that a "defence ministry facility" was on fire after being attacked by drones in the area of Marinovka, in a sign that Ukraine is not letting up on its attacks. He did not specify what was damaged.

## 'Poorly trained recruits contribute to loss of Ukrainian territory on eastern front'

Some new Ukrainian soldiers refuse to fire at the enemy. Others, according to commanders and fellow fighters, struggle to assemble weapons or to coordinate basic combat movements. A few have even walked away from their posts, abandoning the battlefield altogether.

While Ukraine presses on with its incursion into Russia's Kursk region, its troops are still losing precious ground along the country's eastern front — a grim erosion that military commanders blame in part on poorly trained recruits drawn from a recent mobilization drive, as well as Russia's clear superiority in ammunition and air power.

"Some people don't want to shoot. They see the enemy in the firing position in trenches but don't open fire. ... That is why our men are dying," said a frustrated battalion commander in Ukraine's 47th Brigade. "When they don't use the weapon, they are ineffective."

The accounts come from commanders and soldiers who spoke to The Associated Press on condition of anonymity in order to speak freely about sensitive military matters. Others spoke on the condition that they be identified only by their call signs in keeping with Ukrainian military protocol.

Commanders say the recruits have contributed to a string of territorial losses that enabled Russia's army to advance, including near the city of Pokrovsk, a critical logistics hub. If it falls, the defeat would imperil Ukraine's defenses and bring Russia closer to its stated aim of capturing the Donetsk region. Russian soldiers are now just 10 kilometers (6.2 miles) away.

Adding to Ukraine's woes are Russia's huge advantage in manpower and its willingness to accept staggering losses in return for capturing small objectives.

The recently conscripted Ukrainians are a far cry from the battle-hardened fighters who flocked to join the war in the first year of the full-scale invasion. The new troops lack even a minimal level of training, commanders and soldiers from four brigades defending the Pokrovsk area said.

They described having to plan operations with infantry who are unable to shoot targets and uninformed about basic topography. Some recruits simply lacked faith in the battle plans of their superiors and walked away from prepared positions.

Frustrated with the quality of the new conscripts sent to the front line by territorial recruitment centers, commanders are now seeking to conduct their own mobilization drives to better screen and train new fighters, multiple commanders and soldiers said.

"The main problem is the survival instinct of newcomers. Before, people could stand until the last moment to hold the position. Now, even when there is light shelling of firing positions, they are retreating," said a soldier with the 110th Brigade.

Not everyone is turning around and running away from battle, he added. "No, there are motivated people, but they are just very, very few," he said. "The position is held as far as there are these people who are motivated and committed." Following the implementation of a controversial mobilization law in May that established clearer regulations for territorial recruitment centers, Ukraine is reportedly

drafting tens of thousands of fighters per month. Demand is highest in the infantry. But there are logistical hurdles to train, equip and pay so many incoming people, and commanders constantly demand new soldiers. To ease that pressure, military leaders have had to take units from brigades in one region and transfer them to different areas to stabilize weak spots.

Some point the finger back at commanders who single out recent recruits for losses. Viktor Kevliuk, a military expert with the Ukraine-based Center for Defense Strategies think tank, said the training offered to recruits is adequate. He said brigade commanders "are looking for an explanation for tactical failures."

"Likewise, the brigade commander has the appropriate tools to influence morale. If all these processes are established in the brigade, there will be no significant problems. If these mechanisms fail, we read about the negativity in social networks," he added.

And in intense fights such as the one in Pokrovsk, "it is the timely tactical decisions of commanders that make the difference, Kevliuk said. In some instances, terrified new recruits have fled from the fight. "This fear creates panic and chaos," said the battalion commander in the 47th Brigade. "This is also the reason we have lost."

The loss of the village of Prohres last month in the Pokrovsk region is the most recent example of territorial loss blamed on new recruits, commanders said. Units from the 31st Brigade left in a poorly coordinated frenzy, prompting the 47th Brigade to enter the battle and attempt to stabilize the line. A similar scenario unfolded in the village of Ocheretyne in May.

## Drone attacks on military facility in southern Russia spark fire

Kyiv (AP): A drone attack sparked a fire at a military facility in the Volgograd region of southern Russia on Thursday, regional officials and the country's Ministry of Defence said. Regional Volgograd Governor Andrei Bocharov said on Telegram that a "defence ministry facility" was on fire after being attacked with drones in the area of Marinovka. There were no casualties, he said.

Bocharov did not specify what was damaged but Russian Telegram channels said that drones attempted to attack a military air base near Marinovka in the village of Oktyabrsk. Ukraine did not acknowledge the attack but it comes as Ukraine has intensified its attacks on Russia, with a ground offensive into the Russian region of Kursk and drone attacks that targeted Moscow on Wednesday in what the capital's mayor called one of the largest done attacks to date since Russia's all-out invasion of Ukraine in February 2022. Videos shared on Russian social media channels showed thick black smoke rising from the air base and an explosion in the night sky reportedly near the base.

Marinovka is about 300 kilometers (185 miles) east of the Ukrainian border and about the same distance west from the border with Kazakhstan. Ukraine claimed responsibility for the attack. Ukraine's Security Service and

# Putin meets Li as Moscow, Beijing deepen their ties

Russian President Vladimir Putin met with Chinese premier Li Qiang Wednesday, hailing growing trade relations as Moscow becomes increasingly dependent on Beijing for political and economic support. "Our trade relations are developing, developing successfully ... The attention that the governments of the two countries on both sides are paying to trade and economic ties is yielding results," Putin said at the meeting in the Kremlin. He also said that Russia and China have developed "large-scale plans" for economic and other projects.

"Chinese-Russian relations are at an unprecedentedly high level," said Li, who earlier had met with his Russian counterpart, Prime Minister Mikhail Mishustin. The meeting took place as Russia struggled to push back a Ukrainian incursion into the Kursk region now in its third week. And overnight, Moscow experienced one of the largest



waves of drone attacks on the Russian capital since the start of the Ukraine conflict. Russian news reports did not indicate whether Putin and Li discussed Ukraine. China has tried to position itself as neutral in the Ukraine conflict, but it shares with Russia high animosity toward the West.

After Western countries imposed heavy sanctions on Russia in response to Russia sending troops into Ukraine in February 2022, China strongly stepped up its

purchase of Russian oil, increasing its influence in Russia. Putin underlined the importance of China by meeting in Beijing with Chinese leader Xi Jinping soon after being inaugurated for a fifth term in the Kremlin. A U.S. intelligence assessment released this year indicates that China has significantly increased sales to Russia of machine tools, microelectronics and other technology Moscow uses to produce missiles, tanks, aircraft and other weaponry.

# Another case filed against Hasina, aides in B'desh

A case was filed on Thursday against Bangladesh's deposed prime minister Sheikh Hasina and 46 others over the killing of a hawker in the national capital during the recent mass protests, taking the number of cases against her after her ouster to 45.

The case was filed in Ashulia Police Station following a court order, the state-run BSS news agency reported. Md Mojibul Hossain, a relative of the victim, Shaon, filed the complaint with the court of Dhaka Senior Judicial Magistrate Rabeya Sultana. The court, after recording the statement of the complainant, asked the officer in charge of Ashulia Police Station to accept the matter as a first information report (FIR), the report said. According to the case docu-

# Former ISI chief's close aide flees Pakistan amid probe

Lahore (PTI): A close aide of Pakistan's former ISI chief Lt General (Retd) Faiz Hameed, who has been in the Pakistan Army's custody on corruption and other charges, has fled the country to evade arrest, according to a media report.

Mohsin Habib Warriach, who is said to have managed major business deals for Gen Hameed in Pakistan and abroad, has reportedly fled to the UK, Samaa TV reported.

Several military officers and some civilians have been taken into custody in connection with the alleged links with Hameed. Federal Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi didn't confirm nor deny reports about Warriach's leaving the country. Gen Hameed is facing court-martial proceedings for misusing his position to extort money from a private housing society and his role in May 9 attacks on military installations and his close ties with jailed former prime minister Imran Khan are also being probed. Khan feared that Gen Hameed might be used against him as an approver

so that he could be tried at a military court. Warriach, son of former federal minister retired Maj Habibullah Warriach, reportedly left the country for the UK before the arrest of Hameed. According to the report, Warriach, a central figure in the multi-billion rupees scam at the National Insurance Company Limited, has been managing major business deals for Hameed since 2014. He was the frontman of Hameed in securing business deals for the former spymaster.

Gen Hameed led the ISI (Inter-Services Intelligence) during Khan's administration from 2019 to 2021 before taking early retirement in December 2022. Hameed was arrested following action in the complaint of a private property developer over alleged misuse of official authority. According to the report, Warriach travelled the world on behalf of Hameed, acting as his de facto representative, negotiating and executing deals, often introducing himself as an arms dealer working for the Pakistan Army.

# Imran's party defers power show in Islamabad till next month

PTI ■ ISLAMABAD

The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party on Thursday postponed its planned rally in the capital here until next month on the direction of its founder and jailed former premier Imran Khan after the government refused to permit the demonstration.

Party leader Azam Swati said while talking to the media outside the Adiala Jail Rawalpindi where he along with party leader Gohar Khan met Khan. "The rally has been rescheduled and now will be held on September 8 as directed by Imran Khan," Swati made the announcement, adding that the government also agreed to the new date.

He also quoted Khan as saying that the party workers, who were already out on the road to reach the venue, should go back. The announcement comes as the capital city was tense due to the threat by the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party (PTI) leaders to go ahead with its plan



to hold the rally in Islamabad despite the government's refusal to give permission. The government closed all schools in Islamabad and also blocked all main entries to the city by placing shipping containers on roads to stop the movement of the PTI workers. There were reports of traffic jams and long queues of vehicles on the inter-city roads which were still open. PTI had sought to hold a power show after months of political wrangling over the cases against its party chief and former premier Khan and other leaders. However, the government can-

celled its no-objection certificate (NOC) at the last minute. Islamabad Chief Commissioner Muhammad Ali Randhawa on Wednesday issued an order, stating that he was immediately suspending the NOC issued on July 31 by the deputy commissioner to hold a rally, elaborating that it was unsafe to allow the PTI rally given the current situation. Separately, the Punjab Home Department imposed Section 144 across the province in light of "the prevailing law and order situation and security threats" and it prohibited gatherings, sits-in, rallies, demonstrations, protests and similar activities across Punjab with effect from Thursday to Saturday. Officials feared violence and possible sit-ins if the PTI was allowed to bring thousands of supporters to the capital because it has a history of such protests. It staged a 126-day-long sit-in in Islamabad in 2014, while on May 9, 2023, the party held a violent protest when Khan was arrested.

# Pakistani man to remain in officers' custody over misinformation that sparked riots in UK

A court in Pakistan on Thursday allowed investigators to question a man in their custody for four more days about his role in spreading misinformation that sparked widespread rioting in the UK earlier this month, officials said.

The court's decision came a day after authorities charged the suspect Farhan Asif, 32, with cyber terrorism following his arrest from his home in Lahore, the capital of eastern Punjab province.

Asif, who is a freelance web developer, was produced before the court amid tight security. He was not allowed to talk to the media. Kiran Muqem, a prosecutor for the Federal Investigation Agency, told the court that Asif did not cooperate with officers after the same court the previous day allowed them to question him for a day. They demanded his custody for two weeks but the court said it would only allow it for four more days.

Muqem later told reporters that Asif disseminated fake news and caused riots in England. Asif was handcuffed and wearing blue shalwar kameez garments when brought to the court. His lawyer Rana Rizwan told reporters that the court remanded his client into the custody of the federal agency in a hurry and without hearing him. "We were informed by the court that the case of Asif would be taken up after lunch break. But the court took up the matter before the lunch break, and allowed FIA to keep him in their custody," Rizwan said. Asif is accused of spreading misinformation from YouTube and Facebook about the British teenage suspect in a stabbing attack that killed three girls and injured 10 other people on July 29 at a dance class in Northwest England.

# Lanka SC orders govt to hold postponed local election soon

Slamming the Sri Lankan government for violating the fundamental rights of citizens, the Supreme Court on Thursday ordered it to hold the long-postponed local council elections as soon as possible.

The ruling by a five-member bench of the apex court came in response to four fundamental rights petitions filed by the Opposition and civil society groups. Elections for over 340 local councils were postponed since early last year.

The court found that the members of the independent election commission and President Ranil Wickremesinghe, in his capacity as finance minister, had violated the fundamental rights of citizens by failing to hold the elections. The local elections, initially scheduled for March 9 last year, were not held due to the

Treasury's claim that it couldn't fund the election expenditure amidst the ongoing economic crisis. However, the court rejected the argument, stating that the Treasury had not provided sufficient evidence to support its claim of a total inability to hold the election. "Other than referring to the economic crisis and difficulties faced, the affidavit of the secretary to the Treasury and Ministry of Finance has not averred sufficient material to indicate a total inability to hold the election," the court said. In an interim order, the court directed the Treasury to allocate the necessary funds for the local council election, which had already been budgeted for. The court emphasised that the local council election must be conducted by the elections commission without disrupting the preparations for other elections, including the presidential election scheduled for September 21.

# Thousands of Indonesians attempt to storm parliament

Thousands of protesters attempted to storm Indonesia's parliament Thursday, tearing down a section of fence and throwing stones at police, and forcing the legislature to delay a vote on controversial changes to election laws that could further enhance the political influence of outgoing President Joko Widodo.

Parliament was to meet in an emergency session in order to overturn one decision made by the country's Constitutional Court on election procedures, while amending another. Protesters held banners and signs, while others started a fire and burned tires. The Constitutional Court court on Tuesday dismissed a challenge to an age limit that prevents people younger than 30



for running for regional governorships, which would prevent the Widodo's 29-year-old youngest son, Kaesang Pangarep, from running in a regional contest in Central Java. The court also made it easier for political parties to nominate

Wednesday, and planned to ratify the vote in a plenary session on Thursday.

The moves triggered widespread condemnation on local social media and raised concerns about a potential constitutional crisis. The legislature was forced to delay the vote after failing to achieve a quorum. Widodo's eldest son, Gibran Rakabuming Raka, is the incoming vice-president after the same court created an exception to the age limit for the post for former regional leaders, while Widodo's brother-in-law was serving as chief justice. He was criticised for participating in a case involving a close relative and later dismissed. Activists, students, workers, and a number of Indonesian celebrities and musicians also joined the protest, voicing concerns about democracy in Indonesia.

Protests were also reported in other big cities, including Bandung, Yogyakarta, Surabaya and Makassar. In Yogyakarta, at least 1,000 protesters including students and workers rallied in front of Yogyakarta's Parliament building, the state palace and the city's ceremonial centre. Their demands included voting down the regional election bill, respecting the Constitutional Court's ruling and rejecting political dynasties. The simultaneous protests in the major cities showed anger at Parliament's efforts to overrule the Constitutional Court decision to allow more candidates to compete in the regional elections, said Yoes Kenawas, a political analyst at Atma Jaya Catholic University. "They also opposed the dynastic politics carried out by President Jokowi," Kenawas said.

# India sustains growth momentum

## Set to achieve 6.5-7% growth: FinMin Report

**PTI ■ NEW DELHI**  
India's economic momentum remains intact despite a somewhat erratic monsoon, and real GDP growth of 6.5-7 per cent projected in the Economic Survey seems appropriate, a finance ministry report said on Thursday.  
According to the Monthly Economic Review for July, the Indian economy has sustained its momentum in the first four months of FY25. Goods and Services Tax collections in the first four months of FY25 underwent a level shift pushed up by the widening of the tax base and heightened economic activity, the report released by the finance ministry said.  
"The resilience of domestic activity is also reflected in the strong performance of the manufacturing and services sector purchasing managers' indices. The manufacturing growth has been driven by expansion in demand conditions, a rise in new export orders and growth in output prices," it said.  
On the fiscal front, it said, the Union



Budget FY25 has laid out a glide path of fiscal consolidation. Supported by strong revenue collection, discipline in revenue expenditure, and robust economic performance, the fiscal deficit is projected to decline. At the same time, it said, capital

southwest monsoon has supported kharif sowing. Replenishing water levels in the reservoir bodies well for the current kharif and upcoming rabi crop production and this will further aid in reducing food inflation in the coming months, it said.  
"On balance, India's economic momentum remains intact. Despite a somewhat erratic monsoon, reservoirs have been replenished. Manufacturing and services sectors are expanding, according to the Purchasing Managers' indices," it said. Tax collections, especially indirect taxes, which reflect transactions, are growing healthily, and so is bank credit, it said.  
"Inflation is moderating, and exports of both goods and services are doing better than they did last year. Stock markets are holding on to their levels. Foreign direct investment is looking up as gross inflows are rising," it said.  
As of now, it said, the projection of real GDP growth of 6.5-7.0 per cent for FY25, made in the Economic Survey for 2023-24, seems appropriate.

# India's steel sector tech investment likely to hit USD 2.7 bn by 2030: Report

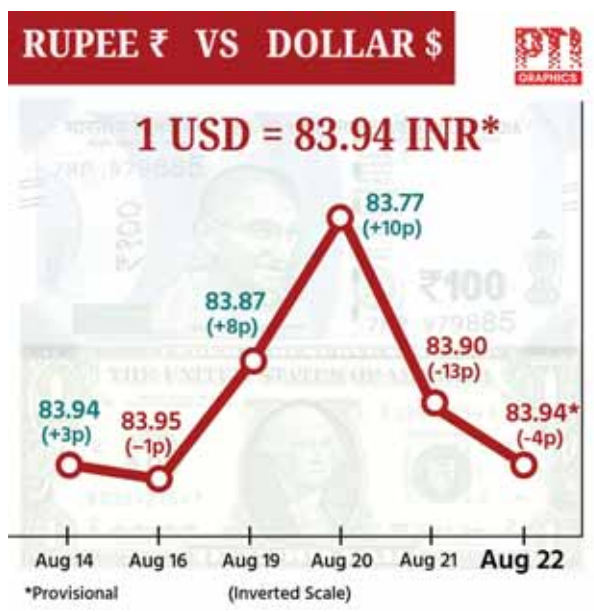

The investments in process and digital technologies across the steel value chain in the country are expected to grow up to USD 2.7 billion by 2030, according to a report.  
These investments will advance technological capabilities and drive progress toward a more efficient and sustainable mining and steel industry, the FICCI-Deloitte Report said on Thursday.  
"The investment in process and digital technologies across the steel value chain in India is projected to increase from USD 1-1.2 billion in 2024 to USD 2.3-2.7 billion by 2030, excluding ERP upgrades," said the report on 'Automation, Digitalisation and Technology Integration for the Indian Mining and Steel sector'.  
The year 2030 is significant for the domestic steel industry as the government's National Steel Policy 2017 aims to scale up India's installed steel-making capacity to 300 million tonne by 2030.



As per the report, the per capita steel consumption is anticipated to reach 160 kg by 2030 and around 220 kg by 2047.  
Digital tools can help to enhance compliance with environmental regulations through better energy efficiency and emission monitoring, it said.  
Furthermore, digital technologies offer the flexibility and scalability necessary to adapt to market changes, drive innovation, and improve worker safety, the report noted.  
Integrating digital technologies across the value chain can thus unlock transformative capabilities, it

# Rupee falls 4 paise to close at 83.94 against US dollar

The rupee traded in a narrow range and settled lower by 4 paise at 83.94 (provisional) against the American currency on Thursday, as relentless dollar demand from importers and relentless foreign fund outflows dampened investor sentiments.  
However, a positive trend in domestic equities and lower global crude oil prices supported the domestic currency and restricted its fall, forex traders said.  
At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened weak at 83.93 and touched an intraday low of 83.97 against the US dollar. The domestic currency finally settled at 83.94 (provisional), 4 paise lower from its previous close.  
On Wednesday, the rupee fell 13 paise to 83.90 against the US dollar.  
"We expect the rupee to trade with a slight negative bias on outflows by foreign investors and demand for the greenback by importers. However, a positive tone in the domestic markets and



declining global crude oil prices may support the rupee," said Anuj Choudhary - Research Analyst at Sharekhan by BNP Paribas. Traders will now take cues from the weekly unemployment claims, existing home sales and PMI data from the US.  
"Investors may remain cautious ahead of Fed Chair Jerome Powell's speech at Jackson Hole Symposium for any cues on rate cuts by the central bank. USD/INR spot price is expected to trade in a range of Rs 83.75 to Rs 84.20," Choudhary added.  
Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading 0.19 per cent higher at 101.23.

# Expect scooter segment to account for over 40% of two-wheeler sales, says TVS Motor

TVS Motor Company expects the scooter segment to grow further and account for around 40 per cent of the overall two-wheeler sales, its CEO KN Radhakrishnan said on Thursday.

# Sensex rises 147 points, Nifty ends above 24,800 on firm global trend

Benchmark BSE Sensex rose by 147 points to settle above 81,000 level while Nifty closed above 24,800 following buying in commodity, telecom and consumer stocks amid a firm trend in global markets.  
Rising for the third straight day, the 30-share BSE Sensex rose by 147.89 points or 0.18 per cent to close at 81,053.19, registering gains for the third day in a row. During the day, it climbed 331.15 points to hit an intra-day high of 81,236.45.  
Extending gains to a sixth session in a row, the NSE Nifty went up by 41.30 points or 0.17 per cent to end at a two-week high of 24,811.50.  
Bharti Airtel was the biggest gainer in the Sensex pack, rising 1.63 per cent, followed by Tata Steel, ICICI Bank, Titan, Asian Paints and Ultratech Cements.  
On the other hand, M&M, NTPC, Tata Motors, TCS and PowerGrid were the major losers.  
"The domestic market witnessed modest gains owing to the positive global



sentiments. Particularly, the recent signs of weakness in the US non-farm payroll data have strengthened the case for potential interest rate cuts in September," Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services said.  
In the broader market, the BSE smallcap gauge jumped 0.47 per cent, and the midcap index climbed 0.67 per cent.  
"Markets are closely monitoring global indices for direction, and the recent pause in US markets ahead of the Jackson Hole Symposium is leading to some caution locally also," Ajit Mishra - SVP, Research, Religare

# Gold loan market projected to double in 5 years to ₹14.19 lakh crore: PwC India

India's organised gold loan market is projected to double in next five years to Rs 14.19 lakh crore despite expected moderation in growth due to stricter regulations, said a PwC India report.  
In fiscal 2023-24, the organised gold loan market demonstrated substantial growth, reaching a valuation of Rs 7.1 lakh crore, according to the report titled 'Striking gold: The rise of India's gold loan market'.  
"It is expected to reach around Rs 14.19 lakh crore by FY 2029 at a five-year CAGR of 14.85 per cent," it said.  
Indian families own massive



quantities of gold, estimated at 25,000 tonne. Existing gold holdings with Indian households are valued at roughly Rs 126 lakh crore, the report said.  
It further said the gold loan market is poised to see moderate growth over the next two years, as gold lenders are facing increased scrutiny from regulatory authorities

regarding loan-to-value (LTV) maintenance and auction-related procedures.  
"The second-largest player in the gold loan market being inactive would have an impact on market growth in FY25," the report said.  
Also, the RBI's advisory to NBFCs on cash disbursement, which limits the amount of cash disbursal to Rs 20,000, could push customers to rely on the unorganised sector. The regulator has also raised concerns about the evaluation process for lending activities through fintech startups.  
The increased regulatory scrutiny and revised guidelines have led to a dip in the share prices of leading NBFCs, PwC said.

# GoM on GST rate rationalisation discusses tax cut for some items

The ministerial panel on GST rate rationalisation on Thursday broadly converged towards retaining a 4-tier slab structure and asked the committee of tax officers to analyse the implication of tinkering rates on some items and present it before the GST council.  
The issue of GST on health and life insurance was also raised by some states in the meeting of the Group of Ministers (GoM) on rate rationalisation and referred to the fitment committee, comprising central and state tax officers, for further data analysis.  
The suggestions of the GoM will be taken up on the September 9 meeting of the GST Council headed by Union Finance Minister

Nirmala Sitharaman and comprising state counterparts.  
Talking to reporters after the first meeting of the GoM under his convensorship, Bihar Deputy Chief Minister Samrat Chaudhary said, "Some GoM members are demanding that there should be no change in tax slabs under GST".  
"More discussions will happen, and then only a final decision will be taken," Chaudhary said, adding the GoM has received representations from restaurants, beverages and online gaming sectors, which will be reviewed and some of them will be sent to the Fitment committee.  
West Bengal Finance Minister Chandrima Bhattacharya stated, "I have said there should be no changes in the



GST slab. A presentation will be made before the Council".  
The next GoM meeting will be held after the September 9 Council meeting, she added.  
Asked if the GoM deliberated on reducing 4 slabs to 3, Bhattacharya said, "That will not happen for now. Slabs will be retained at 5, 12, 18, and 28 per cent. This will be

that we will discuss it (reducing slabs)," she added.  
On health and life insurance taxation, Byre Gowda said, "We have asked for further report (from fitment committee). We are not sure if it's part of the agenda".  
The Opposition has been demanding the removal of GST on health and life insurance premiums, which attract an 18 per cent rate.  
Sitharaman had earlier this month said that tax was levied on insurance premiums even before the imposition of GST, and GST revenues are shared between the Centre and states.  
Gowda said the GoM had asked for a break up of changes in tax rates on some items. "What will be the implication of tax rates going up or down on those items," he said.

# Adopt more supportive, empathetic approach towards MSMEs, lenders told

Reserve Bank Deputy Governor Swaminathan has asked financial institutions to adopt a more sensitive and empathetic approach towards MSMEs, and deploy supportive measures like restructuring options for loans, to support the sector which plays a key role in the economy.  
In a speech at the Annual Day of the Foreign Exchange Dealers Association of India (FEDA) here, the deputy governor said MSMEs face challenges like access to affordable finance, delayed payments, infrastructure bottlenecks, and

requirements of compliance, among others.  
The journey of India's economic transformation cannot be complete without the robust development of the MSME sector.  
"MSMEs are not just the backbone of our economy, they are the engines of growth, innovation, and employment," he said at the event held on Wednesday.  
However, for these enterprises to truly thrive and scale up, the financial sector must step up with innovative solutions, sensitivity, and a forward-looking approach, Swaminathan said.  
"This is not just about

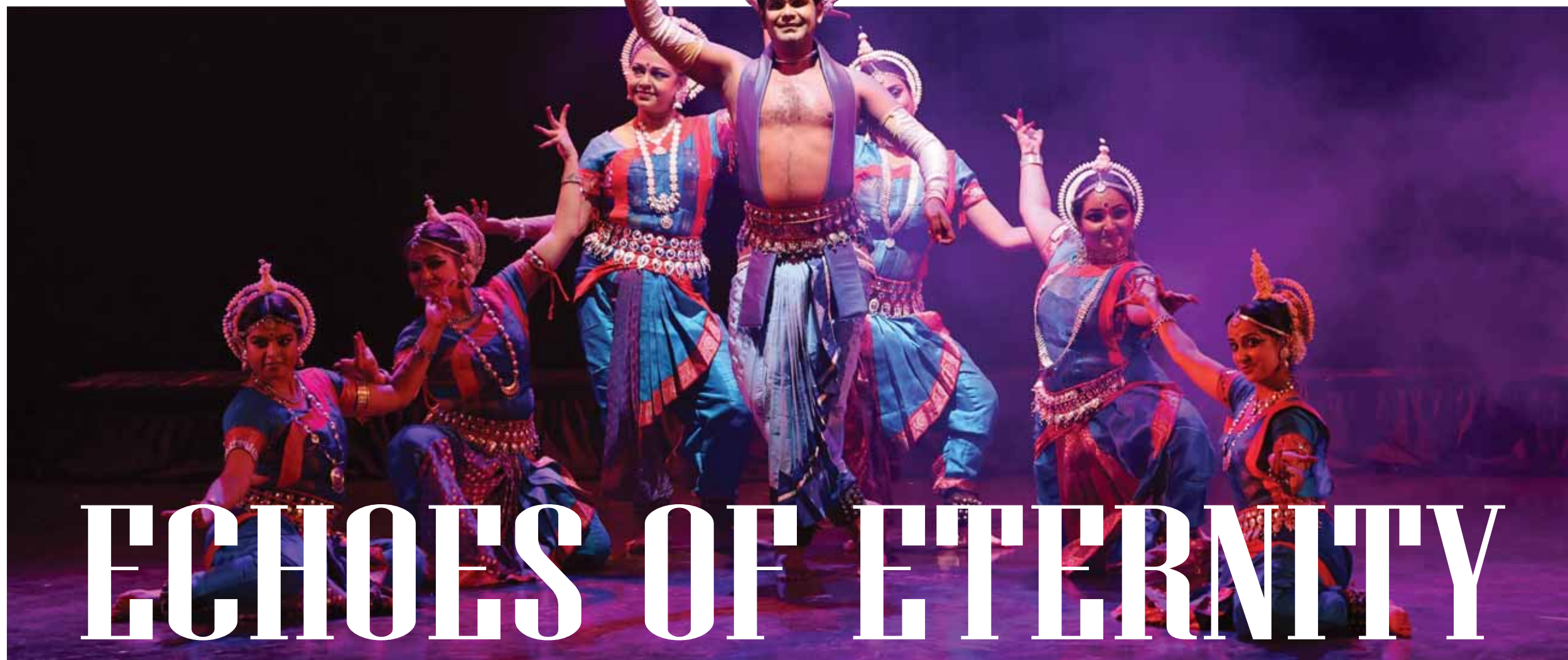


providing credit; it's about enabling these enterprises compete globally, drive exports, and contribute to

the nation's goal of becoming a developed economy by 2047. While financial instruments and support

mechanisms are crucial, the way we engage with the MSME sector, our sensitivity to their challenges and our commitment to their success, will ultimately determine the strength and sustainability of this partnership," he said.  
The deputy governor also emphasised that considering the key role that MSMEs play in the economy, the financial sector should adopt a more sensitive and empathetic approach towards them.  
"While financial discipline is crucial, the unique challenges faced by MSMEs, such as low capital base, lack of scale, cash flow constraints from delayed payments, fluctuating market

conditions, and external economic pressures, necessitate a more nuanced approach to assessment as well as follow-up," he said.  
While timely repayment of dues is crucial to maintain the health of the financial system, financial institutions should focus on deploying supportive measures such as restructuring options, grace periods, and tailored repayment plans that give MSMEs the breathing space they need to recover and get back on track while encountering difficult situations, the senior official said at the event attended by representatives of financial sector, among others.

# LORDS TO HOST ITS FIRST-EVER WOMEN'S TEST BETWEEN INDIA AND ENGLAND

The 'home of cricket' Lord's will host its first-ever women's Test to be played between India and England in 2026, the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) announced on Thursday. The ECB said on its website that after a three-match ODI

series between India and England in July 2025, the former will return in 2026 for a one-off Test. "I'm also delighted we can confirm that India Women will return in 2026 to take on England Women in the first-ever women's Test match at Lord's. It will be a truly special occasion, and one of real significance," ECB CEO

Richard Gould said. India and England will play three ODIs on September 2, 4 and 7 at Headingley, Lord's and Southampton respectively. "It has also been confirmed that India Women will return in 2026 for a one-off Test match at Lord's - the first-ever Women's Test to be staged at the Home of Cricket," the ECB added.

"England Women have played white-ball matches at Lord's for the past three years, with another scheduled next year, but it will be the first time the ground has hosted a Women's Test match." India have played nine Tests so far against England in their backyard from June 1986 with their last clash at Bristol in June 2021 ending in a draw.

# 'Future economist' Archana bids farewell to TT

Archana Kamath will dearly miss donning the Indian jersey, but the table tennis player is determined to serve the country in a "different way" in future, helping to shape its public policies as an economist. Days after recording India's only success in the quarterfinal loss to Germany in the recent Paris Olympics, the 24-year-old from Bengaluru has re-entered student life in the USA where she is studying for a Masters in Public Policy at the University of Michigan. Having started her professional career as a teenager, Archana's decision to move away from table tennis has been quite emotional. But she has equally enjoyed studying since her school days where she was a topper, securing 98.7 and 97 percent in her 10th and 12th exams. Now, she is pursuing her second masters degree in Michigan, having already completed her post graduation in International Relations. Archana obtained her bachelor's degree in economics and she wants to return to India after two years and serve



the nation, probably as an economist. Her role models range from well-known economist Sanjeev Sanyal to the likes of tennis stars Carlos Alcaraz and Rafael Nadal whom she met at the Games Village in Paris earlier this month. Speaking to PTI from Ann Arbor in Michigan, Archana explained her decision to leave elite sport right after the Olympics. She categorically stated that "she is not in it" for a better financial future as she has been taken care of by her employers Indian Oil, OGQ and the government. "I have always liked studying,

as much as table tennis. I had inquired about this course in Michigan last year as well but then we qualified for the Paris Olympics as a team for the first time and I wanted to focus on that. "Now that the Olympics are done, I want to study more and come back to India after two years and serve the people in a different capacity. My decision has nothing to do with financial returns. "I have got all the support I have needed while playing for India, which has been the biggest honour," said the soft-spoken athlete, who has gone to Michigan after applying for

a study leave with her employer. She comes from a financially secure family of doctors with both her parents being ophthalmologists. Her brother is currently pursuing a PhD in aerospace engineering in the USA. But her memories cannot be ripped away from table tennis as it was the first time that both Indian men and women had qualified for the team event of the Olympics. Archana hopes to continue playing table tennis in the USA and will miss the team environment the most. "The best thing about the Olympics was being with seniors like Sharath Kamal and Manika Batra. The environment was so good. I also got to meet Novak Djokovic, Rafael Nadal and Carlos Alcaraz. I made memories for life there. "I have also loved fighting for my country and that is something I will miss the most. I hope to keep playing here (in the US)," she said. Archana is certain about being a public servant in India after her course in Michigan but she is yet to work out the finer details.

# Berge joins Fulham and Liverpool sells teenager Clark

Fulham completed the signing of Sander Berge from relegated Burnley for a reported 25 million pounds (\$32.8 million) on a five-year contract on Thursday, with the Norway international set to

replace the departed Joao Palhinha as the club's holding midfielder. Palhinha left for Bayern Munich in the transfer window. "It's been a little bit back and forth the last few weeks," Berge said, "but I'm finally sitting

here in the shirt in this beautiful stadium, knowing that my future is here, which feels great." Berge, who has also played for Sheffield United in the Premier League, could be in contention to make his debut for Fulham against Leicester

on Saturday. Liverpool sold 19-year-old midfielder Bobby Clark to Salzburg for a reported 10 million pounds (\$13 million). Clark was one of the youngsters who helped Liverpool win the English League Cup last season.



# Mohun Bagan, East Bengal to clash in Lucknow on September 2

Lucknow, the city of Nawabs, is gearing up to host traditional rivals Mohun Bagan and East Bengal for the first time on September 2 as part of plans to promote football in Uttar Pradesh. The derby will be played at state capital's K.D. Singh Babu Stadium. State Sports Director R.P. Singh told PTI that preparations are on full swing for the high-voltage match that will be played under floodlights. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath is also expected to watch the proceedings and about 10,000 spectators are expected to throng the stadium. As part of the preparations, the testing of the recently-installed flood lights in the stadium has started and dressing rooms and other facilities are being arranged for the players. Singh said that All India Football Federation (AIFF) President Kalyan Chaubey had met Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath in Lucknow recently and expressed the need to promote football in Uttar Pradesh. It was during that time, that he had proposed to organise the derby and the state government accepted the proposal. Both the teams will reach Lucknow on September 1.

# Teen prodigy Kartik to lead Indian challenge at Asia Pacific Amateur golf

A year after becoming the youngest golfer to make the cut at the Asia-Pacific Amateur Championship, 14-year-old Kartik Singh will spearhead the Indian challenge at the 15th AAC to be held here from October 3-6. Kartik is the highest ranked Indian at 199 while the other three players to have received the invitation for this prestigious event are Krishnav Nikhil Chopra, Vedant Sirohi and Rakshit Dahiya. Krishnav and Vedant have earlier participated in the tournament. A regular winner in junior and amateur events, Kartik has also been named in the 2024 Junior Presidents Cup team. Apart from Kartik, seven

others have been named in the 2024 Junior Presidents Cup International Team. They are Joshua Bai, Warut Boonrod, Xihuan Chang, Rayhan Latief, Khanh Hung Le, Thangwin Lee, Anh Minh Ngyuyen. As many as 113 players have been confirmed for the Championship, which will be held at Taiheiyō Club in Gotemba, Japan. The field will have 120 players with a few more names to be added by the organisers. India's best ever performance has been the second-place finish by Rayhan Thomas in Sentosa, Singapore in 2018. The Dubai-based Indian has since turned professional, and last week won his first pro title on India's Professional Tour of India Tour. Krishnav, who plays college



golf in the US, is the son of former India cricketer turned commentator Nikhil Chopra, who often takes the role of a caddie for his son. Created in 2009, the Asia-Pacific Amateur Championship was established by the Asia-Pacific Golf Confederation (APGC), The R&A and the Masters Tournament to further develop

amateur golf in the Asia-Pacific region. The champion will receive an invitation to compete in the 2025 Masters Tournament and The 153rd Open, while the runner(s)-up will gain a place in Final Qualifying for The Open. The confirmed list which has players from 38 APGC member organizations is

highlighted by defending champion Jasper Stubbs of Australia and four players representing China inside the top 100 of the World Amateur Golf Ranking: Wenyi Ding (No. 4), Xihuan Chang (No. 36), Xiangyun Bai (No. 61) and Paul Chang (No. 97). Ding finished runner-up to Stubbs in the 2023 Asia-Pacific Amateur while Xihuan Chang reached the semi-finals of the U.S. Junior Amateur in July. Other top-100 participants include Vietnam's Anh Minh Nguyen (No. 68) and Japan's Rintaro Nakano (No. 78). Notable past competitors include 2021 Masters champion Hideki Matsuyama, a two-time winner of the Asia-Pacific Amateur, and 2022 Open champion Cameron Smith.



# Guys like Pant have muscle memory and thirst for victory: Hayden

Batting great Matthew Hayden feels Rishabh Pant will be a key player for India when they travel to Australia for a five-Test series later this year owing to his "muscle memory and thirst for victory" that made him such a sensation during the team's previous tour Down Under. The eagerly-anticipated five-Test series starts on November 22 at Perth. "Guys like Rishabh Pant have got a muscle memory and the thirst for victory. He was such a key player last time he played there and the Australian public loved him as well, because of the nature of the way he played his game," Hayden told media on the sidelines of 'CEAT Cricket Rating Awards' here on Wednesday. "It was exciting. It was innovative. It was just fresh and good. Then you have got your old stewards, like Virat Kohli, (he) will want to make an impression again. From a batting point of view, I'm excited to see how India have that strategy to take on the Australian conditions," the Australian added. Pant, who has made a successful return to cricket after a life-threatening accident in 2022, was an outstanding performer for India in the 2020-21 tour, notching up brilliant knocks of 97 and 89 not out in the land-

mark trip. India outgunned a full-strength Australia despite missing several frontline players in one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history Test cricket. The visitors bounced back from the ignominy of 36 all out in the opening Adelaide Test to win the Border-Gavaskar Trophy 2-1 for a second consecutive time. Kohli had to return home after the Adelaide game due to personal reasons and five other players, including key pacers Jasprit Bumrah and Mohammed Shami, were forced out due to injuries and fitness issues. "The great thing from an Indian perspective is that when you look at the last victory, there was no Virat Kohli. There was a very much a second team bowling line-up that won at the Gabba," Hayden said. "That's the kind of confidence that you can expect this Indian unit to go to our shores (with) and go, guys, we've done this before, and we've done it in a way that's second to none, even without our key players," he said. **PINK TESTS TAKE AWAY AUSTRALIA'S HOME ADVANTAGE:** Hayden said scheduling a day-night Test tends to take away the advantage enjoyed by Australian teams in the past. Even in the upcoming tour, the two teams will play a Pink Test in Adelaide.

# Bahrain's track team sanctioned over doping and blocked from naturalising more athletes

Bahrain's track team will have to pause its successful strategy of naturalizing athletes from Africa after accepting a package of sanctions related to doping. World Athletics said Thursday that Bahrain had been restricted to a maximum of 10 athletes in the track and field events at the Paris Olympics - which wasn't announced at the time - and at next year's world championships in Tokyo. Bahrain's team in Paris included Kenya-born Winfred Yavi, who won gold in Paris in the women's 3,000-meter steeplechase, and Nigeria-born sprinter

Salwa Eid Naser, the silver medalist in the 400. Neither athlete was accused of any wrongdoing in the case announced Thursday. The Bahrain Athletics Association admitted a charge of "conducting itself in relation to doping, negligently and/or recklessly and/or so as to prejudice the interests of World Athletics or bring the sport of athletics into disrepute," and another related to its employment of staff to work with athletes, governing body World Athletics said. That followed an investigation into allegations two athletes used blood transfusions at the Tokyo Olympics in 2021 and into the BAA having



"engaged" a coach who was under a doping-related ban, World Athletics added. Bahrain has agreed not to recruit any more foreign athletes until 2027, World Athletics said. The next Summer

Olympics are in Los Angeles in 2028. Bahrain has also committed to fund a "talent academy" to develop local athletes and has set up a new national anti-doping body. It's not the first time Bahrain has faced scrutiny over doping, particularly among its roster of athletes who were naturalized. Naser missed the Tokyo Olympics while serving a ban for not being available for drug testing. Kemi Adekoya, a former world indoor champion in the 400, got a four-year ban in 2019 in a steroid case. Marathon runner Marius Kimutai was banned for three years in April after failing a drug test.

# Cash-strapped Barcelona sheds players one year after their arrival

If trying to compete with Real Madrid and newly arrived Kylian Mbappé wasn't daunting enough, now Hansi Flick's Barcelona squad is being thinned out by departures. Barcelona looks set to lose both Ilkay Gundogan and Vitor Roque in the coming days - or even hours - with both players reportedly close to exits. Gundogan appears set on returning to Manchester City a year after the midfielder left the serial winners to start a new chapter in Spain. That could be cut short because of Barcelona's need to trim its salary burden, leaving the team without one of its top playmakers from last season. Roque is also reportedly close to leaving on loan for Real Betis, although Portugal's Sporting has made inquiries.

The young Brazilian forward cost Barcelona a 30-million-euro (USD 33-million) transfer last summer. He arrived in the winter transfer market but never earned consistent playing minutes despite the significant investment made to sign him. When their exits are made official, it will confirm that the club's efforts last summer to strengthen the squad turned out to be makeshift moves. Last summer, Barcelona maintained the quality of a squad that lost veteran leaders Sergio Busquets and Jordi Alba without spending much money. Gundogan and former Athletic Bilbao defender Inigo Martinez arrived as free agents, Oriol Romeu's move from Girona cost a reported 4 million euros, and João Félix and João Cancelo both arrived on loan deals from Atletico Madrid and Manchester City,



respectively. But a year later, only Martínez appears set to continue with the team that finished last season without a title and the departure of coach Xavi Hernández, who was pushed out after he publicly complained that the club's lack of money would make it hard to compete with Madrid or the other top European clubs. Barcelona has locked up the arrival of Spain midfielder

Dani Olmo from Leipzig. But, it has yet to meet the financial requirements of the Spanish league necessary to register him to play. Flick is also without key players Gavi Páez and Ronaldo Araújo, who are recovering from leg injuries. With players hurt or leaving, Flick has not hesitated in relying heavily on the products of Barcelona's famed La Masia youth academy. He gave debuts to midfielders Gerard Martín and Marc Bernal at the always demanding outing at Valencia in their Spanish league opener when Robert Lewandowski scored a brace for a 2-1 victory. In total Flick aligned three 17-year-olds in his starting 11 between Lamine Yamal, Bernal and Pau Cubarsi. As Lewandowski said after the victory, "We can win games with these youngsters." **NEXT TEST:** Barcelona will face a good test on Saturday in

the second round of league fixtures when it hosts Athletic Bilbao, including Nico Williams. Williams and Barcelona teen Lamine Yamal helped lead Spain to the European Championship title this summer. Barcelona had been rumoured to be interested in securing Williams' transfer from Athletic, but right now that looks like wishful thinking given the Catalan club's ongoing financial struggles. Coached by former Barcelona manager Ernesto Valverde, Athletic will look for its first victory at Barcelona since the 2001-2002 season. Since then, it has gone 22 visits without a victory, with Barcelona winning 19 times. Athletic, which won the Copa del Rey last campaign, will likely have to use its youth-team goalkeeper, Alex Padilla, after minor injuries to Spain's

keeper Unai Simón and backup Julen Agirrezabala.
