
Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday said India has become a food surplus country and is also working to provide solutions for global food and nutritional security. the 32nd Inaugurating International Conference of Agricultural Economists (ICAE) at the National Agricultural Science Centre (NASC) Complex in the national Capital, which is being organised in India after 65 years, Modi said, 'now India is a food surplus country," he said, adding that the country is the number one producer of milk, pulses and spices across the world. Also, the country has become the second-largest producer of foodgrains, fruits, vegetables, cotton, sugar and tea.
"There was a time when

Now, India is working to provide solutions for global food security and global nutritional security," he said at the conference, attended by about 1,000 delegates from around 70 countries. Ripple effect of Israel, Iran tension in Delhi

Even as tension flares up in West Asia, the Delhi Police has reviewed the security of the Israeli Embassy and Chabad House following alerts from the intelligence agencies in the wake of the killing of a Hamas leader in Tehran. A multi-layered security has already been put in place with several CCTV cameras installed around both the structures. According to a senior officer, more personnel may be deployed, if required. On July 31, Hamas leader Ismail

Haniyeh and his bodyguard were killed in an airstrike that hit a residence where Haniyeh was staying in Tehran as a guest. According to sources, senior officers of the Delhi Police force have held a meeting to plan a massive security net around the two Israeli buildings in the national Capital.

This came after the Delhi Police debunked rumours of an "explosion" at

the Embassy, calling it a hoax. The police said on X that it was a fake alert before deleting the post. Meanwhile, the Indian Embassy in

Israel on Friday issued an advisory for the Indian nationals living in the country to stay vigilant and "adhere to safety protocols".

"In view of the prevailing situation in the region, all Indian nationals in Israel are advised to stay vigilant and adhere to the safety protocols as advised by the local authorities. Please exercise caution, avoid unnecessary travel within the country and stay close to safety shelters," the Embassy of India in Israel posted on X. Air India has already cancelled its flight to Tel Aviv in the wake of escalating tensions in West Asia.

In the past three years, two lowintensity blasts have taken place near Israeli Embassy in the national Capital No one was injured in the both attacks. Security around the Israel Embassy was upped after a war between Israel and Hamas broke out last year. In December last year, a low-intensity

blast was heard near the Israel Embassy in the high-security Lutyens' zone triggering concern among the Indian security and intelligence agencies and prompting them to carry out an extensive search in the area. During this operation, a letter addressed to the Israeli Ambassador was recovered at the Following back-to-back

assassinations of Haniyeh in Tehran early on Wednesday and top Hezbollah commander Fuad Shukr in Beirut the evening before, international diplomats have scrambled to head off a fullfledged regional war after Iran and its regional proxies vowed to retaliate. Continued on Page 2



Fresh trouble in Manipur

Shots were fired and an abandoned house was torched in Manipur's Jiribam, triggering fresh tensions within a day of the Meitei and Hmar communities reaching an agreement to make efforts to restore normalcy in the district, officials said on Saturday. An abandoned house in Lalpani village was torched by armed men on Friday

night, they said.
"It is an isolated settlement consisting of a few Meitei houses, and most of those were abandoned after violence broke out in the district. Miscreants, who are yet to be identified, took advantage of security lapses in the area to commit the arson," an official said.

The armed men also fired several rounds of shells and gunshots, targeting the village, he said.

Security forces were rushed to the area following the incident, he added. Representatives of the Meitei and Hmar communities reached an agreement in a meeting held at a CRPF facility in adjoining Assam's Cachar on Thursday. The meeting was moderated by Jiribam district administration, Assam Rifles and CRPF personnel. Representatives of the Thadou, Paite and Mizo communities of the district were also

present in the meeting.

Over 10K stranded pilgrims rescued from Kedarnath

The operation to rescue pilgrims stranded along a rain-ravaged trek route to the Himalayan Kedarnath shrine in Uttarakhand entered its third day on Sunday. More than 10,500 people have been evacuated, some airlifted by air force helicopters.

Officials said around 1,300 pilgrims are stranded in Kedarnath, Bhimbali and Gaurikund, and are safe. Personnel of the State Disaster Response Force

(SDRF), the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and police are engaged in the rescue operation. The Indian Air Force's Chinook and MI17 helicopters airlifted some pilgrims from the area Rudraprayag Superintendent of Police (SP) Vishakha Ashok Bhadane dismissed rumours of a large number of people missing following a cloudburst near the trek-

Kejriwal Govt took most Cabinet decisions sans discussion: Docu

n an unusual practice, the Arvind Kejriwal has taken Government majority of the Cabinet decisions by "circulation" in the past three years. This taken place among the Ministers and officers concerned of the Delhi Government and Cabinet agenda dictated from the top. Even the Chief Secretary and concern Heads of Departments were not kept in the loop during the Cabinet discussion.

The document accessed by The Pioneer shows the numbers of decisions taken by the Cabinet through circulation were 15 in 2024 (as on July 31, 2024) and only six were in physical modes.

Similarly, the number of decisions taken through circulation in 2022 are 17 out 21 and in the year 2023 this number rose to 29 circulation and only a meager five are through deliberations and physical mode.

The Cabinet decisions taken through circulation in 2024 include Delhi Solar Energy Policy, 2023, Budget Session Delhi Legislative

Notably, the Government approves agenda or proposal through circulation only in an emergency situation.

Inspiring tales of human valour emerge from heart of Wayanad

Property registration made easy in Delhi

 $R^{\text{egistration of properties in}}_{\text{Delhi} \ \text{and} \ \text{other related}}$ services will now be easier, quicker and more transparent than ever before with implementation of the National Document Generic Registration System (NGDRS), in all 22 Sub-Registrar Offices in the national capital. So far, 2.31 lakh properties in Delhi have been registered with NGDRS After a review meeting, Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena has directed to complete registration of all properties in Delhi with NGDRS by January 2025 and also directed integrating Delhi Development Authority (DDA), Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) and Delhi State Industrial and Infrastructure Development Corporation (DSIIDC) property database with NGDRS to ensure seamless, integrated, transparent and citizen-friend-

Giving details, officials said NGDRS that will prove to be a landmark in urban governance with the use of technology in promoting ease of doing business and service delivery to citizens, was already implemented in 18 states and UTs but

ly public service delivery.



Delhi was severely lagging behind in implementing the same. The system will gradually pave the way for faceless registration of properties in the national capital.

With sustained efforts and constant monitoring by Delhi Lt Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena, NGDRS has been successfully implemented in Delhi. The pilot project was launched in two SR offices last year. The initiative integrates technology to streamline the registration process, enhance transparency, reduce processing times and prevent fraud and corruption. The NGDRS, launched by the Government of India, is based on the concept of "One Nation, One Software" that caters to the requirements of core property registration as well as docu-

The NGDRS is an online integrated portal for appointment, valuation, fee calculation, pay-

ment registration.

presentation and registration. This allows the citizens to calculate stamp duty, registration fees, and other applicable fees through the property valuation module. The citizens can also book prior appointments for document registration at the SR

Under NGDRS, the registered document are stored on a central server and hence, there is no need for physically searching the documents at the SR offices as they can be instantly be searched by Deed Number, PAN No., or Property Number, and thus save huge time in processing. With this, any property buyer will also be able to check and authenticate the actual ownership of a property that will rule out the chances of fraud.

The LG directed DDA to integrate its house allotment and execution of lease deeds system with NGDRS to rule out the possibilities of fraud in DDA property registration. It will save time of Sub registrar in verification of documents that are required from DDA and Citizens will get documents registered on the spot at SR office.This will be big step towards faceless registration

Why suspended official appointed administrator of Asha Kiran Home, AAP questions LG Saxena

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) on Saturday questioned Lt Governor (LG) V K tioned Lt Governor (LG) V K Saxena why an officer previously "suspended" for allegedly taking bribe was appointed as administrator of Asha Kiran shelter home where 14 inmates died in July.

At a Press conference, senior AAP leader and Delhi Minister Saurabh Bharadwaj claimed that administrator of the shelter home Rahul Agarwal was arrested by the CBI in 2016 for taking "bribe" and remained suspended for

"I want to know on what ground the LG appointed Rahul Agarwal as administrator of the shelter home where various irregularities and shortcomings have been reported after extraordinarily large number of deaths of intellectually changed persons," he said.

He also asked the LG why no action was taken so far against the shelter home administrator and the social welfare department secretary in the matter.

The AAP leader said the power of transfer and posting



of officers was welded by the LG through the Services department and the responsibility lies with him.

He also claimed that no action was taken against any officer of MCD or DDA in other cases of deaths in Old Rajinder Nagar and East Delhi. He further questioned why no action was taken against the chief secretary for not furnishing report of third party audit of desilting

AAP MLA Durgesh Pathak, while addressing a press con-ference, said there cannot be a bigger blot for any society than this.

We got information around two to three days ago that 14 people have died there because they were not given proper water, food, and medical facilities," he alleged.

A lleging that the BJP won 79 seats in the 2024 General Elections by voter turnout manipulation, the Congress today sought clarification from the Election Commission of India (ECI) over the substantial difference in the preliminary/initial and the final voter turnout figures in the 2024 General Elections.

Quoting a report by the 'Vote for Democracy (VFD), senior party leader and ex-MP Sandeep Dikshit said at a press conference here today, while the overall difference in the voter turnout between what the ECI said initially and what figures it gave finally, was on an average 4.7 percent, it counted to about 5 crore votes nationally.

Quoting the VFD report he disclosed that in some states like Odisha and Andhra Pradesh, where the BJP or its allies did unexpectedly better, the difference between the initial and final turnout figures was 12.5, which is huge and needs answers from the ECI. The senior Congress leader observed that while a difference of around 1 percent is understandable, but the massive difference up to 12.5 percent and in some places like Lakshadweep up to 25 percent raises serious

NHRC issues notice to authorities on recent rain-related deaths

The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) on Saturday issued notices to the Delhi government, the vice chairman of the Delhi Development Authority (DDA), and authorities in Haryana and Uttar Pradesh concerning recent incidents of drowning and electrocution in the national capital and neighboring cities.

The NHRC's action comes in response to media reports indicating that at least 13 lives were lost in the Delhi-NCR region, including six due to electrocution and four due to drowning in over-flowing drains amid heavy rain, "magnifying the creaky infrastructure and civic neg-

The NHRC has expressed concern over what it the civic authorities," which it believes highlights significant issues in infrastructure and civic management.

The Commission's suo motu cognizance of these reports follows similar recent instances of negligence resulting in tragic losses. Notices have been issued to various officials, including the Delhi



chief secretary, DDA vice chairman, Delhi police commissioner, and district magistrates in Gurugram and Gautam Budh Nagar, seeking detailed reports on the incidents within four weeks.

The reports should cover the status of FIRs, actions taken against responsible officials, compensation provided to the victims' families, and measures to prevent future occurrences, said the country's top rights body. Recent încidents include a 23-

Giving details of the report, carried on August 2, the NHRC noted that most of these deaths happened after heavy rain on July 31.

"A 23-year-old woman, holding her three-year-old son's hand, slipped into an over-flowing drain in east Delhi's Ghazipur area on July 31 and died. Reportedly, the rescue operation for them was delayed over a "jurisdictional dispute" between the police of Delhi and Ghaziabad," the statement said.

"Another incident occurred in the Dwarka area of Delhi when a 12-year-old boy playing in a waterlogged area got electrocuted while "iIn two separate incidents in Gurugram, Haryana, a 44year-old man reportedly drowned in a stormwater pedestrians were electrocuted while walking on a waterlogged road near IIFCO

"An elderly couple died in the Ambedkar Nagar colony of Dadri, Gautam Budh Nagar in Uttar Pradesh as a wall collapsed on their make-shift accommodation due to heavy rain," it added.

Wayanad: Death toll crosses 360, CM says rescue ops in final stage

As the death toll in the landsides at Wayanad crossed the 360 marks by Saturday, the ruling CPI(M) has launched a State-wide collection drive to mobilize money for the disaster relief operations. "Party workers and leaders would make house-to-house visit and make people donate generously to the Rebuild Wayanad mission," said M V Govindan, the all powerful secretary of the party on Saturday.

Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan, who was expected to donate more than a crore rupees towards the disaster relief fund announced on Saturday that he had given Rs one lakh towards the Wayanad fund and also said that the rescue mission in the district is being called off.



The CPI(M) cadre enthused by the announcement of the party secretary has launched a collection drive including 'bucket collection', according to Prakash Pranam, a social activist in Ernakulam district. Bucket Collection is the mode of mobilization of funds by CPI(M) activists who tour areas allocated to them with plastic buckets and make people part with their money.

No receipts are issued and the party has collected crores through these drives in the A right to information activist

P Rajiv was told by the Government of Kerala that Rs 380 crore collected during the 2018 flood remain unspent Government. Meanwhile the Indian National Congress declared that it would construct 100 houses for the rehabilitation of those who lost their apartments in the landslide and flashflood. More than 400 houses were perished in Tuesday's landslides at Mundakkai and Chooralmala areas in the district leaving thousands without a roof over their heads. Government of Karnataka, ruled by the Congress Party announced that it would build 100 houses for the victims.

He said the bank is confident of growth picking up in the remainder of the fiscal year, and achieving his aspiration of the largest lender reporting a net profit of Rs 1 lakh crore in FY25.



India's Lakshya Sen will need to play out of his skin to keep his maiden gold medal hopes alive when he takes on the reigning Olympic champion Viktor Axelsen in the men's singles semifinals at the Paris Games here on Sunday.

Making his Olympics debut, Sen created history on Friday after becoming the first Indian individual male shuttler to reach the last four of the showpiece with a 19-21 21-15 21-12 win over Chinese Taipei's Chou Tien Chen in an intense quarterfinal match.

The Indian will have yet another uphill task at hand when he takes on Axelsen, the baby-faced badminton giant, who has terrorised his opponents in the last few years. The 30-year-old from Odense, Denmark, has won the Tokyo gold and Rio bronze, two world championship titles in 2017 and 2022, a Thomas Cup triumph in 2016 and multiple BWF world tour and Superseries titles to experience a dominating run as world No. 1 from December 2021 to June 2024. Sen, a 2021 World championships

India look to find a way past Lankan spinners, slow pitch in second ODI

easures to battle a sluggish pitch and an assortment of Sri Lankan slow bowlers will feature high on India's strategy list for the second ODI to be played here on Sunday.

Chasing a manageable 231 India were comfortably placed at 130 for three in the first ODI on Friday before losing their way against Lankan spinners, who showed enough pluck to bowl out the visitors for 230 to earn a tie.

Once they survived the Rohit Sharma onslaught upfront, Lanka executed their plans well against the Indian batters, who are not the cleverest performers on rank turners, while not many are though.

The home side employed their army of tweakers against Virat Kohli, KL Rahul and Shreyas Iyer, the meat of Indian top and middle-order, with a telling amount of success.

troika was uncomfortable but was unable to break free either against some well-directed moves of the Lankans, who were precise in their calculations

Kohli was tied up by Dunith

Wellalage, the left-arm spinner, and leg-spinner Wanindu Hasaranga as the 29 balls that the Indian batter faced out of a total of 32 were by the spinners.

Hasaranga eventually nicked him off, while seeing the comfort of Shreyas against spinners, Lankan skipper Čharith Asalanka pacer Asitha Fernando into

My coaching days end here: Boe bows out after Chirag-Satwik fail to win Olympic medal

Mathias Boe, the coach of Chirag Shetty and Satwiksairaj Rankireddy, on Saturday announced his retirement from coaching following the ace Indian badminton pair's exit from the ongoing Paris Olympics.

Satwik and Chirag were considered India's biggest medal hope at the Olympics but the Indian duo lost to Malaysia's Aaron Chia and Soh Wooi Yik, the Tokyo bronze medallists, in the men's doubles quarterfinals 21-13 doubles quarterfinals 21-13, 14-21, 16-21 here on Thursday. Boe, a silver medal winner in the London Olympics, had joined Chirag and Satwik as their coach ahead of the Tokyo

"For me, my coaching days ends here, I'm not going to continue in India or anywhere else, for now at least. I have spent too much time in a badminton hall and it's also pretty stressful to be a coach, I'm a tired old man," the 44year-old from Denmark wrote on his Instagram account. Under Boe's guidance, Satwik and Chirag had claimed a

bronze medal at the 2022 world championships and a gold at the 2022 Commonwealth Games in Birmingham.

The duo went on to win the Asian Games gold, the Asian Championships title and also achieved the feat of becoming the first Indian badminton doubles team to become world



The Indian pair additionally won BWF World Tour titles, including the Indonesia Open Super 1000 and Korea super 500 in in 2023 and the French Open super 750 and Thailand Super 500 this year, besides reaching three more finals. Their sensational run ahead of

the Olympics made Satwik and Chirag hot favourites for the coveted title but the duo couldn't go the distance at Paris, and Boe consoled them. "I know the feeling all too well myself. Pushing yourself to the limit every day, to be in the best shape of your life, and

then things doesn't go as you would have hoped for. 'I know you guys are gutted, I know how much you wanted to bring a medal back to India,

but this time it wasn't meant to be," Boe said. Boe, however, said he is leaving the position as a satisfied man despite his wards failing to return from Paris with a

Rohit unleashed Bumrah in the death overs on the well-set Rizwan and the wicket shifted the momentum back to India.



changer because you know what David (Miller) can do," Shastri said. "Another big shot (from Miller), and then, you know, the game's in the balance. So, I thought the timing couldn't have been better." Shastri said he was amazed by Pant's resoluteness to return to topnotch cricket after a near-fatal car crash, which left him out of the game for more than a year.

He did his job with the bat, but it was his keeping that really surprised everyone. For someone to recover that quickly and then move the way he did.

"He hardly missed anything, albeit he must have felt the pressure as the tournament got on because it's not easy to come back and do all the stuff he did," Shastri added.

OVERCOMING HIV STIGMA YOUTH BREAKING BARRIERS

In the face of deep-seated stigma and discrimination, young people living with HIV in Goa, are finding hope and resilience through the Human Touch Foundation. SHOBHA SHUKLA explores their personal journeys and examines the collective efforts that are transforming their lives and challenging societal norms

iving with HIV often comes with a heavy burden of internal and external stigma. For many young people, this fear of discrimination can be paralyzing, affecting their ability to live normal lives. HIV-related misconceptions remain a significant barrier for those living with the virus, impacting their mental health, relationships, and opportunities in life. However, through the dedicated support of the Human Touch Foundation, these youths are not only overcoming their fears but also becoming advocates for change in their communities.

THE WEIGHT OF STIGMA

A young person living with HIV shared, "As a young person living with HIV, I had self-stigmatised myself due to the fear of discrimination... fear of discrimination if I dare disclose my HIV positive status to others... this fear had stopped me from living life like a normal person." This sentiment, echoed by many, underscores the protound impact of internal stigma. Internal stigma, a mindset of negative beliefs, thoughts, and behaviours about HIV, manifests as shame, guilt, feelings of contamination, reduced self-efficacy, selfloathing, low self-esteem, and self-rejection. "Internal stigma happens when we internalise external stigma and judgements and believe that they are true. Internal stigma also happens in the absence of external stigma and discrimination," explained Nadine Ferris France, CEO of Beyond Stigma. A youth shared his trauma, "I and my youth peers have confronted HIV-related stigma and discrimination in schools, workplaces, and societal levels. Sometimes, it is the teachers who were not cooperating or discriminating against them. The fear of disclosure – which means sharing our HIV positive status with family members, friends or others in society - the fear of being discriminated, is faced by many... the fear if we would be thrown out of the house or will our friends unfriend us... The Human Touch Foundation, based in Goa, India, is dedicated to supporting young people living with HIV. The organization provides a comprehensive range of services including mental health counselling, nutritional support, educational and vocational training, and medical assistance. By fostering a supportive community and empowering youth-led initiatives, the foundation addresses stigma and discrimination at multiple

levels. Their efforts ensure that

those living with HIV can lead



shared how the Human Touch Foundation helped her overcome her fears of stigma and discrimination: "From my childhood I have been touched by Human Touch Foundation which helped me overcome my fears of stigma and discrimination related to disclosure - and helped me in various ways." She added, "As I am living with HIV, I faced a lot of stigma and discrimination from my own family as well as from society. People in the society told the family to not let me come out otherwise I will spread the virus to their children. I even faced it in my relationship with one guy. I knew him for one year and had shared everything with him but still he blamed me that I got infected because I have been sleeping with others." Despite these challenges, she found a supportive community within the Human Touch Foundation, which provides a range of services including nutritional counselling, mental

health support, and job opportunities.

PERSONAL TRIUMPHS AND COLLECTIVE SUPPORT

Another young person recounted their journey: "I got to know my HIV status at the age of 13. I was with my relatives because I had lost my parents. That is when I first felt being stigmatised and discriminated against by my own family. For example, I was told not to use the common family nail cutter because if any blood comes out while cutting my nails then it can put others at risk. Or sometimes there were separate utensils for eating food. It used to hurt

Finding support through the Human Touch Foundation, this individual connected with peers facing similar challenges and received guidance from Peter Borges, the foundation's CEO. "Peter Sir helped me a lot from the very beginning. He helped me with my documents too. We used to

have residential camps back then too, with adolescents living with HIV. I learnt a lot from these camps. Doctors were involved in these camps where we learnt a lot about HIV and how can we overcome problems we face."

THE POWER OF YOUTH

The Human Touch Foundation emphasizes the importance of youth-led initiatives in the HIV response. "Youth are the best equipped to lead the response to HIV," said a young intern at the foundation. Sandhya Chavan, Lead for Adolescent Health and Wellbeing, highlighted the comprehensive support provided: "We at Human Touch Foundation provide a range of youth-led services, such as mental health counselling, psychosocial support, help them avail a range of social protection schemes, nutritional packages, medical help, or treatment adherence support, among others." Masooma Sheikh, a

counselling psychologist at the foundation, stressed the need for proper mental health services in HIV care centres and a holistic approach to support young people living with HIV.

A BEACON OF HOPE AND

RESILIENCE As the Human Touch Foundation celebrates its 15th anniversary, its impact is evident in the lives it has touched. Peter Borges reflected on the journey: "Human Touch always had something different to offer when it came to support system or ecosystem which surrounded HIV care and support. For example, young people themselves speaking at different conferences including AIDS 2024 is so important. Lately, the realisation has grown over us about the importance of resilience: we must focus more on building the resilience of the young people. Issues like relationships or livelihoods cannot be missed while young counsellors themselves provide

mental health services."
The foundation continues to address various needs, including relationships, sexual and reproductive health, substance abuse, TB and HIV coinfection, and child sexual abuse. Their commitment to non-institutional care and resilience-building for families and communities remains steadfast.

The Human Touch Foundation has also been instrumental in initiating viral load monitoring in Goa and ensuring the uninterrupted supply of antiretroviral therapy during the COVID-19 pandemic. They offer free vocational training for young people with HIV, helping them build skills and secure employment.

Dr. Kashyap Bandodkar, a volunteer with the foundation, emphasized the importance of humane and holistic care: "Usually patients appear as a 'number or statistic' in a report. But experiences (like Human Touch) tell us the life story behind those numbers or statistics. This help us – doctors – provide better care because I believe that humane and holistic care is so key."

it supports underscore the importance of tackling HIVrelated stigma and discrimination through empathy, education, and comprehensive support. Their work serves as a beacon of hope and a model for other organizations worldwide. Despite significant advancements in the treatment of HIV, societal stigma continues to pose a major challenge for those living with the virus. The personal stories shared by young people in Goa highlight the persistent fear of discrimination that can prevent individuals from living their lives to the fullest. Internal stigma, which manifests as selfloathing and low self-esteem, often results from the external judgments and prejudices of society.

Organizations like the Human Touch Foundation are making remarkable strides in addressing these issues. By providing comprehensive support services, fostering youth-led initiatives, and promoting resilience, the foundation is helping to dismantle the barriers that stigma creates. Their work emphasizes the importance of empathy, understanding, and community in overcoming the challenges faced by people living with HIV. However, the fight against stigma requires collective effort.

It is crucial that society as a whole becomes more informed and compassionate towards those affected by HIV. We must reject discriminatory attitudes and instead offer support and acceptance. By doing so, we can create an environment where individuals living with HIV can thrive without fear of prejudice. Only through such a unified approach can we hope to eradicate the stigma associated with HIV and ensure that everyone has the opportunity to live a healthy, fulfilling life.

A RECIPE FOR DISASTER IGNORED WARNINGS AND THE PERILS OF UNSUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

Despite advice in 2020 to relocate 4000 families from landslide-prone areas, Kerala proceeded with a mega hydro-electric project nearby. Incessant rains led to devastating landslides, highlighting the urgent need for sustainable development and better disaster management

he flooding and landslides in Kerala since 1991 had reportedly claimed several human lives, till the state witnessed the worst disaster of its kind at Mundakkai, Wayanad in the wee hours of 30th July. In 2020 State Disaster Management Authority advised relocation of 4000 families from landslide-prone areas included Mundakkai. State did not heed the warning and on the contrary, has proposed a mega hydro-electric project involving an underground tunnel barely two km from the site of the current

Incessant rains of 572 mm in 48 hours have led to two major landslides, one at 2.00 am at Mundakkal followed by another at 4.00 am at Chooralmala towns trapping hundreds of families. The debris further covered Vellarmala GVH school. The landslide also washed away the bridge connecting Chooralmala town with Mundakkai & Attarmala. So far 126 people have been found killed, 196 injured and more than a hundred missing or marooned in swathes of slush, mud and misery triggered by continuous and heavy rainfalls for two days. Dead bodies have also been found at Pothukal village that were carried by flowing water for 20 km in the Chaliyar River. High Tension lines and transformers of the Mekkadi electrical section have also been damaged and resuming power in the area has been a challenge. Landslides washing away the bridge have posed further challenges for relief and rescue operations, though all state and central agencies are putting up their might to remove debris, find survivors, treat the injured and move the people to safer locations and camps. Rescuers are crossing the river in spate with the help of the ropeways but mist, bad weather and unstable terrain are making it more difficult. Army has up Bailey Bridg the site, which has been moved on the road from Chennai.



This deluge affected adjoining areas of Karnataka and left the Kapila River in the Mysuru district in spate, after 80,0000 cusecs of water were let out of the Kabini dam, severely affecting the traffic between Karnataka and Kerala. Kodagu roads were also flooded and many persons stuck were rescued. L'andslides also occurred repeatedly on the Shiradi Ghats section of NH 75 connecting Bengaluru and Mangalore holding the traffic for several hours and eventually re-routing them via Kodagu and Sampaji Ghats. A few weeks earlier a landslide had occurred near Ankola, Uttar Kannada district along the newly widened National Highway burying moving vehicles underneath that claimed a dozen lives, and many others Next to the Himalayas, the plantations.

Western Ghats have the most fragile ecosystem and despite the disasters striking frequently, we have not mended our ways and continued to engage in unsustainable activities in the name of development. The entire Ghats section from Gujarat to Kerala once had luxuriant tree/ forest cover that provided the source and the catchment of several east-flowing and west-flowing rivers – a key lifeline for everyone in peninsular India. With the changes in land use patterns, the integrity of the catchment of the rivers is compromised, resulting in many of the streams and rivers becoming seasonal. People who have enjoyed the perennial flow of water in the streams in the past have now been drinking, agriculture

undulating terrain and diverting lands comprising tree growth for cultivation of tea, coconut, banana, coffee, spices etc is never sustainable. Kerala has lost its natural forests at a very fast pace and individuals, public and private agencies have grown plantations for quick cash. Some areas are also encroached. Proponents of such projects argue that destroying forests and growing bananas, tea, cashew coconut etc provide employment and help in GDP growth. This perception is highly misplaced. Such projects are not evaluated on a long-term basis. There are hardly any methods to work out an economic valuation of forests destroyed in the process. When a heavy downpour occurs

infrastructure we need to further spend money. The infrastructure destroyed in 2018 and 2019 in the Kerala flood disaster was rebuilt by spending more than 50,000 crores rupees. If the true environmental cost is considered, none of the plantation projects of growing tea etc would be viable. Labourers of tea gardens as well as banana and coconut gardens must be re-skilled and their services can be utilized for manufacturing etc.

2018 floods in Kodagu Karnataka, a district adjoining Wayanad, also played havoc with the life of the people. I have discussed the reasons for flooding and landslides in this region in my hook in this region, in my book, "Changing Land Uses - Shrinking Streams and Carbon Sinks". Like Wayanad, Kodagu is again a hilly landslips, destroys houses, roads 4200 sq km. However only 1750 sq

Protected Areas, leaving another 1000 sq km occupied by habitation and agriculture; the remaining 1450 sq km had still quite a luxuriant tree cover until the 1980s. These were wooded areas under the control of the Revenue Department of the state, and the tree felling in such areas was regulated by the Karnataka (Preservation) of Trees Act, where forest officers were empowered to grant/ deny permission for the removal of trees. There is evidence on record to suggest that some officers had connived with the timber merchants and granted permission to remove tens of thousands of trees every year. This has resulted in compromising the ecological security of the region leading to frequent disasters of the

bridges etc. To rebuild the km was reserved as forests and everyone's mind is to stop

destroying the natural forests and making any changes in land use. There is a proposal to tag the Western Ghats as Eco sensitive area, but both governments of Kerala and Karnataka have yet not come on board. Unless they mend their ways the disasters would keep on striking more frequently and would be more destructive. Finally, let the column also deal with the reasons why there are heavy downpours for days in this warming world. The world at present including India is faced with heat waves, wildfires and heavy downpours leading to flooding. The uncontrollable wildfires in Canada, California and other parts of Western world are the consequences of global warming. Leh in India, which is located 3 km above the mean Sea level has the airfield at the highest altitude in the country and has been registering 32 degree Celsius temperature for some days in the last week of July. Due to such unusual temperatures, the air at this altitude gets rarefied and engines cannot develop the thrust required for takeoff. For the first time, all flights to and from Leh have remained suspended for these

High downpours are functions of higher rate of evaporation from Sea surfaces. As the Sea surfaces warm, evaporation increases leading to excessive moistureladen clouds in the atmosphere. Once the conditions are favourable, it leads to heavy downpours. It can have very dangerous consequences in urban centres, as we have recently seen the drowning of three students in the basement of Rau coaching centre, Rajendranagar Delhi. The Civic Agencies must re-model the stormwater drains to take the load of 100 mm of rain per hour. These drains were originally designed for 25 mm of rain per hour. Building bylaws should also change; Basements should have only huge sumps and Parking space for vehicles and nothing else.

If seen from a feministic lens, tropes like the witch, the evil stepmother and the damsel in distress reflect and reinforce harmful stereotypes about women and limit and distort our understanding women's experiences.

The portrayal of witches in fairy tales as powerful but wicked beings reflects society's fear of women who do not conform to traditional gender roles. Witches are often depicted as old, ugly, and dangerous, embodying traits that are seen as undesirable in women. This portrayal reinforces the idea that women who are independent, assertive or different are to be feared and marginalised, perpetuating a culture of misogyny and

witchcraft and executed in brutal witch hunts. These women were often healers, midwives or other powerful figures in their communities targeted for their knowledge and independence. The fear of witches and the persecution of women accused of witchcraft spread to colonial countries like India where women were often accused of witchcraft and subjected to violence and even death. Even today, women in some parts of India are killed in the name of witch hunts accentuating the lasting impact of this harmful stereotype. This concept of the witch reflects society's discomfort with powerful women and is a reminder of the importance of challenging stereotypes and celebrating women's

autonomy and strength. These stories send a harmful message to audiences particularly young girls by implying that women are incomplete without a man to rescue them. They fail to acknowledge women's strength and ability to overcome challenges on their own. By perpetuating this these stories

emphasize outdated gender

roles and limit the potential of women to be seen as capable and independent individuals.

Hence, it is time to challenge these harmful tropes and create new narratives that empower young girls and women and celebrate their diversity and strength. Instead of portraying women as either wicked witches, evil stepmothers or helpless damsels, fairytales must depict women as complex, multifaceted individuals with agency and autonomy. By telling stories that reflect the diverse experiences and identities of women, we can create a inclusive and empowering narrative for future generations. One must realise that the witch, evil stepmother and damsel in distress tropes in old fairy tales are not harmless storytelling devices; they are powerful tools that shape our perceptions of women and their place in society. By examining these tropes through a feminist lens, we can begin to challenge and dismantle the stereotypes they perpetuate paving the way for a more inclusive and empowering narrative for women everywhere. It is time to tell new stories to our kids; stories that empower and inspire women to embrace their true selves and rewrite their destinies.





picking up threads from the previous issue, it's time to look at few other dimensions of the Shakti -trinity. Inherent in Sata is the 'revealing principle'. We have already discussed that when Tamasa engages with the seeds of creation stirred up by Rajas element, it leads to creation. The creation, however gains stability and thereby form existence with name when aided by Sata element. Once the form existence is in place, the eternal element of Consciousness finds a platform to manifest. The radiance inherent in Consciousness Element brings into light (in cognitive domain), the form-existence designated with a name and form. Tamasa, its counterpart, is marked with 'veiling nature', as it does all the processing in hiding. It is something like a plant bearing seed, which has to necessarily go into hiding in the dark realms of mother earth's womb for a specified period, for it to draw succour from the earth mass. Following which, the seed first sprouts, and then grows into a fruit bearing tree. Evidently, the treeform remains veiled in the seed; but once manifest, the particular seed

creating it would not be in sight. Similarly, at the primal-source, which is supposedly self-revealed, the fine print of manifest world remains veiled in seed-form. But once the world becomes manifest, the root on which life cycle is premised gets veiled, as it goes out of reckoning in human being's perceptible domain. It is for this very reason that in Indian context, darkness is not perceived as negative. For, it remains just one phase of nature's creation process. So, veiling and unveiling aspects are just two faces of nature's creation cycle. But then a look at the way seed-treeseed cycle runs, an intriguing question arises in mind, especially in view of the fact that seed goes out of sight once it transforms into a plant. Would it mean that the primal source would also lose its presence once the manifest world comes to light? Looking at the seed-tree cycle analogy, it may appear so. But then, it needs to be appreciated that the manifest ephemeral world has to be rooted somewhere in some inexhaustible eternal reality. Otherwise, it will not be able to draw succour necessary to

continue recycling again and again. But for which, the manifest world would not have sustained so long. Here, it also needs to be appreciated that the Primal-Source is infinite,

inexhaustible and an outflowing eternal reality, beyond the bounds of time, space, and causality. It is only a finite thing that may lose its presence, once transformed into another form.

disappearance of tidal waves in the sea may throw further light. When the sea is in fury, tidal waves envelope the sea. The sea goes out of our sight. Once the tidal waves settle down after doing their round for a while, it comes out that only the surface water had temporarily gone into fury. The main sea body was there in its place. Even in tidal wave state, it remains a part of the main sea body itself. So, whereas existence of the tidal wave can be measured in time frame, the main sea body remains beyond its limit. Similarly, the disorder just at the surface level of the primal source is enough to manifest the world we live in. But the primal source would remain very much in place, and therefore, is beyond the limitation of time. Again, when the manifest world finally disintegrates, it gets back to its primal source, the way main sea body takes back the tidal waves into its womb. So, the primal source happens to be an eternal reality beyond the binds of time.

have psychological imperatives on human minds as well, in so far as their individual character is concerned. As already discussed above, with bodymind organism getting revealed, the root of life gets veiled. That clouds human perceptible and comprehensible abilities in five different ways. Since these limitations arise as a sequel to the design parameters underlying the making of a being, they are there by birth. We may call them as elemental limitations. Kashmir Shaivism calls this as being under the spell of Maya(delusion). The human limitations are viewed in the backdrop of the primal source believed to be enjoying singular ownership of the whole manifest world and thereby carrying a sense of fullness; being omniscient; being beyond limitation of time and space as wells as laws of causation.
