
With Bangladesh descending into chaos, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina surreptitiously fled the country in a military aircraft on Monday and the Army stepped in to fill the power vacuum, ending one uncertain chapter and opening another in the nation's restive history. As news of Hasina's departure spread, hundreds broke into Hasina's residence, vandalising and looting the interiors, providing dramatic expression to the anti-Government protests that have killed more than 100 people in the last two days. At the entre of people anger is the Hasina Government's controversial quota system reserving 30 per cent jobs for families of veterans who fought the 1971 liberation war.

With volatile crowds taking to the some clambering on streets Hasina's father and Bangladesh founder Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's statue and smashing it with hammers in a lasting image underscoring the fickleness of history — Army chief General Waqar-uz-Zaman announced that the 76-year-old

Prime Minister has resigned. An interim Government will be taking over, he said in a televised address amid feverish speculation about where Hasina was headed. "I'm taking all responsibility (of the country). Please cooperate," Zaman added, signalling the end of Hasina's 15-year power run.

The Army chief said he had met political leaders and told them the Army would take over responsibility for law and order. However, there were no leaders from Hasina's Awami League party at the meeting.

As protests spiralled across the country, the Army chief said he had asked both Army and police not to

NSA Doval meets ex-PM Hasina at Hindon Airbase

Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, who resigned on Monday, arrived at the Hindon airbase, Ghaziabad in a Bangladesh air force transport aircraft. She is reportedly planning to leave for London after a brief stopover at the airbase. National Security Adviser Ajit Doval

met Hasina at Hindon Air Base. External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar briefed Prime Minister Narendra Modi about the situation in Bangladesh, sources said. Taking note of the fast evolving situation in Bangladesh, the BSF was on high alert while the Delhi Police further strengthened security around the Bangladesh High Commission in the

national Capital. Air India and Indigo announced the suspension of their operations to and from Dhaka. Hasina's C-130 plane landed at the Hindon airbase in the evening. Indian Air Force fighter jets were airborne as soon as her aircraft entered Indian air space and kept an eye on it for some time, sources said. Continued on Page 2

Bangabandhu memorial The museum — dedicated to Mujibur Rahman who was assassinated along with his wife and their three sons while serving as president in 1975 was also vandalised. Hasina and her sister Sheikh Rehana had survived the purge as they were abroad. Hasina then spent six years in exile in India.

The home of Dr Wajed Miah, Hasina's husband, was not spared either in the vortex of violence on Monday, local reports said.

From Ganabhadan, the Prime Minister's official residence, came extraordinary visuals of protesters storming in and walking away with sofas and even chairs.

Turmoil worries families living in West Bengal

The continuing violence in Bangladesh and the fall of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina Government have raised concern among the families residing on this side of the border. Hundreds of families have lost sleep worrying about the fate of their relatives and other loved ones in the strife-torn neighbouring country.

"I don't know how they are ... though from different communities neighbours are good and understanding but given the scale and magnitude of the violence I wonder how they are now... more than 20 of them," said 80-year-old Chintamani Kar of Behala in South Kolkata expressing concern for his cousin brothers' families at Magura

off Jessore. A Bengali film actor, requesting anonymity, said she was worried about her grand uncle who was in Kolkata last year and was scheduled to visit again during the Durga Puja. Their family was attacked twice at Śatkhira... we asked them to migrate but

they would not... they had unflinching faith in the governance of Hasina ... but now what will happen to them... we have not been able to speak to them for the past fortnight or so," she said.

Sheikh Qamran, businessman from central Kolkata, said he too had not received any news of his relatives from Dhaka. "Traditionally, they are supporters of the ruling party there... it is obvious... that helps in business... but now after the fall of this Government I don't know what will happen to them... particularly because the way the establishments are being attacked and torched," said the trader about his relatives who live near Banani area of Dhaka. He said he had even tried to get in touch with them via relatives in Dubai but in vain.

However the condition of Arindam (name changed) is more pathetic. His uncle is a member of the ruling party and had been a panchayat member somewhere in Pabna district owning several acres of land and

Bloodbath on Dalal Street

Stock market investors lost a whopping ₹15.32 lakh crore on Monday following a crash in Indian equities triggered by other global markets.

The 30-share BSE benchmark plummeted 2,222.55 points or 2.74 per cent to settle at over a month's low of 78,759.40, marking its worst single-day retreat since June 4, 2024. During the day, it tanked 2,686.09 points or 3.31 per cent to 78,295.86.

Following the sharp decline in equities, the market capitalisation of BSE-listed firms dropped by Rs 15,32,796.1 crore to Rs 4,41,84,150.03 crore (USD 5.27 trillion).

"Domestic equity indices came under the grip of global markets carnage as a host of external factors like recession fears in the US on the back of weak jobs data, interest rate hike in Japan leading to impact on Yen-carry trade and a raging Middle East conflict triggered massive sell-off across the board," Prashanth Tapse, Senior VP (Research), Mehta Equities


The Supreme Court said coaching centres have become "death chambers" and are playing with the lives of students. "The incident was an eye-opener for all," it added.

s search and rescue operations con-A state and recent relationship the state of trict in Kerala which has claimed over 380 lives and left more than 100 missing, Union Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav on Monday attributed the tragedy to the "illegal human habitat expansion and protection for illegal mining in the fragile region by local politicians" under the tutelage of the Southern State Government. Talking to reporters here on Monday,

Yadav also accused local politicians of failing to regulate and protect sensitive zones, contributing to the disaster that struck the region six days ago. The impacts of the landslides are still being felt by the locals, exacerbating the

ongoing crisis in Wayanad. "It is an illegal protection to the illegal human habitation by the local politicians. Even in the name of tourism, they are not making proper

zones. They allowed encroachment of



this area. It is a highly sensitive area. We have already constituted a committee headed by former Director General of Forests Sanjay Kumar... There has been illegal human habitation and illegal mining activity under the protection of the local Government...", the Minister said. "We feel it's purely a mistake by the

mining activity under the protection of the local Government. It is very shameful. They must protect nature and human lives," he said. 'The Western Ghats is one of the most

fragile regions in the country like the Himalayas. Serious efforts must be made to prevent disasters in such regions and the Kerala Government is also responsible for ensuring the same," Yadav said hoping that consultations on eco-sensitive zone notifications for the Western Ghats should be completed Last week, i.e. on July 31, the Centre had

issued a sixth draft notification to declare over 56,800 square kilometres of the Western Ghats across six states, including 13 villages in Kerala's landslide-hit Wayanad, Ecologically Sensitive Area (ESA), inviting suggestions and objections within 60

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Wayanad death toll crosses 400; 127 unidentified bodies buried

s the disaster caused by Alast Tuesday's landslide completed seven days on Monday, death toll crossed 400 according to unconfirmed reports. On Monday 27 unidentified dead bodies and 120 mutilated human organs were buried amidst chanting of all religious prayers by Muslim, Christian and Hindu

More than hundred persons who went missing following the landslide and deluge remained missing while the soldiers of the Indian Army and NDRP scan the region for traces of any signals from human beings.

According Government, 222 persons have lost their lives in he disaster notwithstanding the fact that dismembered and mutilated body numbering more than 200 were retrieved from Chaliyar River and underneath the rock

M B Rajesh, minister for local self-government said on Monday that those who suffered losses and left without a roof over their shoulders would be offered certificates by the authorities that they were victims of the landslides and flash flood. He said the



documents would facilitate the victims to approach anybody in the country seeking help and aids for building houses or to get a livelihood.

Meanwhile a statement of war

erupted between Kerala Government and Bhupender Yadav, the Union Minister for Environment and Forests over the cause of the devastating landslide and deluge in Wayanad. The Union Minister in an interaction with the media at New Delhi made some disclosures which were unpalatable to the ministers belonging to the CPI(M).

'Though Kerala forewarned about consequences of massive quarrying, mining deforestation in the ecologically fragile Wayanad region, the political parties seenm to have ignored the same and went ahead with whatever was not advisable in the region. Taking into account

repercussions on Wayanad's environment, the Centre has not allowed any projects during the last ten years," Yadav had said. What he told was what Prof Madhay Gadgil noted environmentalist, had said in his expetrt committee report on Western Ghats.

Gupta, a former Delhi BJP president, will succeed Ramvir Singh Bidhuri, who resigned from the post after being elected to the Lok Sabha.

A meeting of the legislative party at the State BJP office elected Gupta as the new Leader of Opposition, the statement said. All seven BJP MLAs, Delhi BJP co-incharge Alka Gurjar, president Virendra Sachdeva and general secretary (organisation) Pawan Rana were present in the meeting.

Gupta's name was proposed by the party's chief whip in the assembly Ajay Mahawar. His election was unanimous, the statement said and added that his name for the post was declared by the Delhi BJP president.

Gupta held the post of leader of opposition from 2015 to 2020. He will have a short tenure of a few months as Assembly polls in Delhi are

Huge shortage of staff at Asha Kiran, says House panel

The Committee on Petitions of Delhi Assembly on Monday claimed "huge Monday claimed "huge shortage" of staff at the Asha Kiran shelter home in East Delhi's Rohini where 14 inmates died last month while alleging that a corrupt officer was appointed as the administrator of the shelter home under Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena without consulting the Delhi government. The committee, chaired by AAP MLA Kuldeep Kumar, also held a meeting with the officers of the Asha Kiran shelter home in the assembly. Alleging that the officer was corrupt, Kumar said, "An officer previously suspended for five years after his arrest by the CBÍ had been administrator on the direction of Lieutenant Governor V K Saxena?

"The LG office has been issuing false statement over appointment administrator of the shelter home. The administrator was appointed on October 4, 2022



by the LG without any involvement of the minister in charge of the social welfare department," Kumar claimed. Both the decisions — the Supreme Court's order on nomination by the lieutenant governor and the Delhi High Court's verdict in excise policy case — are victories of the people of Delhi, BJP state president Virendra Sachdeva said in a press conference.
"The question now is

whether Kejriwal has the moral authority to remain the Chief Minister of Delhi," Sachdeva said and added the administration "paralysed" and no AAP government minister was ready to be accountable for it. "The high court order has RIP's allegations that AAP and the Kejriwal government looted Delhi in the excise policy scam," he charged. It has become necessary that Kejriwal steps down as Delhi Chief Minister and someone else comes forward to take responsibility by the E and bring administration Directorate (ED).

Meanwhile, the Border Security Force (BSF) on Monday issued a "high alert" across all its formations along the 4,096km India-Bangladesh border in the wake of the developments in the neighbouring country, officials said.

BSF Director General (Acting) Daljit Singh Chawdhary and other senior commanders have landed in Kolkata to review the security situation, they said. The BSF chief toured the North 24 Paragans district and Sunderbans area to review

The force has directed all its field commanders to be "on ground" and "deploy all personnel on border duty immediately," it was learnt.

An spokesperson for its South Bengal Frontier based in the Kolkata headquarters said, "In view of the changed situation in Bengal delta it. BOR in Bangladesh, the BSF has issued alert all along Indo-Bangladesh border and the number of troops deployed along the border has been increased." SC issues notice to Centre, Delhi Govt over IAS aspirants deaths

The Supreme Court on Monday took suo motu cognisance of the deaths of three IAS aspirants due to flooding in the basement of RAU's IAS Study Circle in Old Rajinder Nagar, issuing a notice to the Centre and Delhi Government, to examine if safety norms are being followed.

The Court said coaching centres have become "death chambers" and are playing with the lives of students. "The incident was an eyeopener for all," it added.

A bench of Justices Surya Kant and Ujjal Bhuyan was hearing an appeal by the Coaching Federation of India challenging directions of the Delhi High Court regarding the proliferation of coaching institutes in Mukherjee Nagar. The bench said it was not sure as to what effective steps regarding safety had taken Government of the National Capital Territory of Delhi or the Central Government. recent unfortunate incidents taking away lives of some of the young ones who joined coaching centres for their career pursuits are eye openers for one and all.

We therefore deem appropriate to expand the scope of these proceedings as suo motu to issue notice to Union of India (through Ministry of Urban Affairs) and NCT of Delhi to show cause as to what safety norms have been prescribed so far and if so what is the effective mechanism introduced for



their compliance," the court coaching said in its order.

"This is horrible what we are

If need be, we will even close down these coaching centres. For the time being, the coaching should go online, unless there is meticulous compliance of building regulations and other safety norms."These places (coaching centres) have become death chambers. Govt collects ₹8,263 cr towards GST on health insurance premium in FY'24

Amidst Opposition from Union Cabinet Minister Nitin Gadkari, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, and several MPs against the 18 per cent GST on health insurance premiums, the Government on Monday told Parliament that it collected ₹8,263 crore from this tax in the 2023-24 fiscal year. Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary noted that the 18 per cent GST rate on health insurance has been consistent since GST's introduction and the Government has received representations requesting for exemption or reduction in the rate of GST on life insurance and health insurance.

Meanwhile, it is learnt that several Opposition parties are planning to stage a protest in the Parliament complex on Tuesday to press for the rollback of 18 per cent GST on life and health insurance premiums.

Replying to a written query on the GST in the Lok Sabha, Chaudhary said that certain insurance schemes catering to poor sections of the society and differently-abled, such as Rashtriya Swasthya Bima Yojana (RSBY), Universal Health Insurance Scheme, Jan Arogya Bima Policy and Niramaya Health Insurance Scheme are exempt from GST. 2023-24, the GST collection from health insurance premium stood at

It "delves into multiple blunders at the time of Independence culminated into the unjust

regimen of Article 370.

It discusses the social, political and economic ramifications of Article 370 since its inception in 1949", a statement by Penguin said on Monday, which marks five years of revocation of Article

370. "It sheds light on the historical reluctance to challenge this provision and the eventual paradigm shift brought about by its abrogation in 2019...," it said.

Bill on quota for STs in Goa Assembly tabled in LS

Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal on Monday introduced a Bill in the Lok Sabha to provide reservation to Scheduled Tribes (ST) in the Goa Legislative Assembly. As of now, the ST community has no seats reserved in the State's The Bill is titled Readjustment

Scheduled Tribes in Assembly Constituencies of the State of commissioner to notify the population of STs in Goa. According to the Bill, the population of the Scheduled Tribes has increased considerably in Goa as per 2011 census vis-à-vis 2001 census figures. It noted that a "peculiar situation" has arisen in the State, wherein the population of the STs there



vis-à-vis the population of SCs is considerably higher -- as per Goa Bill, 2024 and will the Primary Census Abstract, the census 2011 for Goa. The total population was 14,58,545; the population of SCs was 25,449 and the population of STs was 1,49,275. "But no seats are reserved for the STs and they are unable to avail the constitutional benefit of reservation..."

As there is no power with the Election Commission to determine the number of seats for SCs and STs in any State prior to the next census, the Bill was being brought to enabling provisions. The Bill will empower the census commissioner to notify the population of STs in Goa. Based on it, the Election Commission will amend the Delimitation of Parliamentary and Assembly Constituencies Order, 2008, to make way for member Goa Assembly.

The EC will take into consideration the revised population figures of STs and readjust the Legislative Assembly constituency once the Bill becomes a law. The proposal to bring the Bill was cleared by the Union Cabinet in March this year. As of now, no seat in the 40-member Goa Assembly is reserved for the ST community while one seat is reserved for Scheduled

SC seeks data on status of castes included in Bengal OBC list

The Supreme Court on Monday asked the West Bengal Government to provide quantifiable data on social and economic backwardness and the inadequate representation in public sector jobs of the castes that were included by it in the OBC list for granting quota benefits. More than 130 people were airlifted to safety as rescue operations on the damaged Kedarnath yatra route entered its fifth day on Monday.

Air rescue operations gained momentum with the weather clearing in Kedar Valley and the Indian Air Force's (IAF) Chinook and MI17 helicopters aiding in the evacuation of pilgrims, earlier being carried out largely by small helicopters, officials said.

Till 9 am, 133 people were evacuated to safety outside Kedarnath Dham, they said.

State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and other rescue teams sent 100 other people from Kedarnath Dham to Lincholi from where they will be airlifted to Shersi helipad.

Disaster management and rehabilitation secretary Vinod Kumar Suman on Sunday said that 10,374 people had been rescued from various stops on the yatra route such as Kedarnath, Lincholi, Bhimbali and Gaurikund.

Justice delayed

Chief Justice of India highlights frustration over court delays, calls for urgent reforms to address pendency

The Chief Justice of India has voiced a growing concern shared by many: the prolonged delays in Indian courts are causing immense frustration among the public, turning the judicial process into an unwelcome ordeal. In a recent statement, the Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud remarked, "People get fed up with protracted court proceedings, the process becomes a punishment." This stark observation brings to light the urgent need to address the pervasive issue of case pendency in India's legal system. The Indian judiciary is grappling with an overwhelming backlog of cases, which has long been a subject of public discontent and legal scrutiny. The Chief Justice of India's recent statement underscores the severity of this issue, highlighting how extended court delays are not only hindering justice but also eroding public trust in the legal system. As of recent estimates, over 40 million cases are pending across various levels of the Indian judiciary and may take 300 years to clear it at the going pace. This

> staggering number includes civil, criminal, and administrative cases, many of which have been unresolved for years or even decades.

The backlog creates a bottleneck that prevents timely justice, leading to prolonged legal battles and increasing costs for the litigants. Extended delays can lead to a lack of confidence in the judiciary, with people perceiving the legal process as slow and inefficient. When cases languish in the courts for years without resolution, individuals begin to doubt the effectiveness and reliability of the judicial system. Knowing that legal proceedings are likely to be drawn out, many individuals may avoid seeking justice through the courts altogeth-

er. This reluctance is particularly pronounced among those who cannot afford prolonged litigation or who need prompt resolution due to personal or financial constraints. The inordinate delays can drive people to seek alternative, and often extrajudicial, means of resolving disputes. Moreover, businesses and investors rely on a robust legal system to enforce contracts and resolve disputes. Addressing these delays is crucial for maintaining the integrity and efficacy of the judicial system and ensuring that justice is accessible and timely for all citizens. Several factors contribute to the chronic issue of case pendency in India. A significant number of judicial positions remain unfilled. The legal procedures in India can be highly complex, often leading to unnecessary delays. Many courts lack the necessary infrastructure and technological support. But the biggest source of delay is the practice of frequent adjournments, often granted for frivolous reasons. A Bollywood film dialogue 'tareekh pe tareekh' sums it up succintly. Some issues have been dealt with in the amendments to the Indian penal code which are now called 'Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita' but a lot more needs to be done to expedite justice and establish a rule of law! As the saying goes, "Justice delayed is justice denied," and the legal system must cope with the needs of a fast-paced society that we have today.

Grim prospects for peace in West Asia



The killing of Hamas leader threatens to derail any hopes for a ceasefire in Gaza further complicating efforts for peace in the region



srael seems to have eliminated Hamas leader Haniyeh, using an airborne guided projectile in an early morning attack. Understanding and managing stress effectively is essential for a healthier life



he human body is designed to experience stress. The 'fight or flight response' otherwise thought of as an 'acute stress' response are inbuilt mechanisms that allow an individual to deal with threats to survival. Stress at the workplace can arise from various factors, often stemming from the demands of the job, the work environment and individual characteristics. Chronic stress is a state of ongoing, persistent stress that can develop when a person faces prolonged challenges or pressures without adequate periods of relaxation or recovery. Unlike acute stress, which is short-term and can even be beneficial in certain situations (like a deadline or a sudden challenge), chronic stress lasts for an extended period and can have deleterious effects on both physical as well as mental health.

Signs of chronic stress at the workplace can manifest in various ways, affecting an individual's physical health, emotional well-being, cognitive abilities and behaviour. Cognitive-behavioural approaches, mindfulness training and resilience-building programs have been shown to help employees manage stress more effectively. These strategies can enhance employees' ability to cope with stressors and reduce the negative impact of stress on their health and performance. It can lead to significant economic costs for employers, including healthcare expenses, lost productivity, absenteeism and turnover. Organizations through interventions such as job redesign, flexible work arrangements, employee wellness programs and stress management training can reduce chronic stress as these interventions aim to reduce job



demands, increase job control and provide employees with the resources they need to cope effectively with stress. Recognizing these signs early can help in addressing the underlying issues before they escalate. Research shows that in the United States, the American Institute of Stress (AIS) has estimated that around 40% of worker turnover is due to stress and the cost of stress in the workplace has been estimated to be over \$300 billion per year.

The shift to remote work during the COVID-19 pandemic has introduced new stressors related to work-life balance, isolation and digital overload. Ongoing research is exploring how these changes affect chronic stress levels and what interventions are most effective in this new work environment. Furthermore, studies highlight the role of leadership in either mitigating or exacerbating stress. Supportive leadership styles, clear communication and recognition of employee efforts can reduce stress, while authoritarian or inconsistent management can increase it. There is no denying the fact that different industries have unique stressors. For instance healthcare professionals often face stress due to high-stakes decision-making and emotional demands, while employees in tech industries might experience stress from rapid changes and constant innovation.

This type of stress can lead to individual burnout, which is when the body's budget is depleted. Japan's defence dilemma: Pacifism vs security



As the world commemorates the 79th anniversary of the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, Japan contemplates pivotal shift in its defence policy



s the world commemorates the 79th anniversary of the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, a profound moment of reflection intersects with a pivotal shift in Japan's defence policy.

On August 6 and 9, 1945, the cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki in Japan were devastated by atomic bombs dropped by the United States, marking a pivotal moment in World War II and the history of warfare. The bombings resulted in the immediate deaths of tens of thousands of people, with the total number of casualties, including those from radiation sickness and injuries, rising to over 200,000. the world grapples with evolving geopolitical threats, Japan has announced a significant shift in its defence policy.

The government has decided to allocate 2% of its GDP to defence spending, marking a departure from its longstanding pacifist stance. This decision, driven by perceived threats from North Korea and China, positions Japan as the second-largest arms importer globally, following Saudi Arabia.

Japan's new national security strategy is a response to the growing tensions in the region. Bangladesh's political shakeup: A diplomatic setback for India

The resignation of Sheikh Hasina poses a significant challenge for New Delhi, as it now faces an uncertain political situation in its neighbouring country

Thile Bangladeshis may be celebrating the outer of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina after she was forced to resign and flee the country on Monday, her removal is a huge blow to India. Not only had New Delhi-Dhaka ties flourished under her prime ministership but the Awami League leader had been mindful of India's strategic interests. She had even tried to keep India's strategic interests in mind vis-à-vis China while adroitly balancing relations with both. During her 15 years of unbroken rule, New Delhi-Dhaka ties enjoyed both stability and mutual trust.

But with the army taking charge in Bangladesh and an interim government set to take over, India has a lot to



worry about. For one, it now has to deal with a new dispensation after having built a very comfortable working relationship with the Sheikh Hasina government over the last 15 years. Secondly, it will also have to contend with the fact that it is the army that will be exercising actual control even with an interim government in place. Thirdly, India will be dealing with an entirely new politi- with Dhaka had been a "son-

cal set-up if and when elections are held in Bangladesh to install a new government. With India having thrown all its weight behind Sheikh Hasina, it may be faced with a huge challenge to build ties with the Opposition parties. India could also be in deep trouble if the pro-Pakistan Bangladesh National Party (BNP) returns to power. It had recently triggered antisentiments in Bangladesh by carrying out an 'India Out' campaign which fortunately fizzled out early. Already home to a sizable number of illegal Bangladeshi immigrants, illegal India would also be concerned about a further influx of refugees seeking to flee their troubled country. With five Indian states in the northeast sharing a border

influx could pose a huge security challenge for the

region. Additionally, prolonged turmoil there could hurt Indian efforts to boost connectivity to the NE via Bangladesh using rail links and the sea route. India has for long been seeking alternative routes to bypass the vulnerable Siliguri corridor, which if blocked can cut off land access to its entire NE. The push for shorter routes to the NE via Bangladesh, which would cut down time and costs for the movement of goods, could also receive a setback.

The quota stir has already hit bilateral trade after the movement of trucks was stalled at the land ports. While cross-border trade

has now resumed, there have been huge economic losses on either side. Prolonged turmoil can only worsen trading ties between the two countries. Bangladesh is India's biggest trading partner in South Asia. In FY 2022-23, the bilateral trade was \$15.9 billion, though it remains heavily skewed in favour of India. A lot is at stake for India as its close neighbour witnesses some tectonic changes in its governance and political landscape. It means it will have to put in all its diplomatic and political heft into its outreach to whoever is in charge of the dispensation in Bangladesh.

Sheikh Hasina, who was elected for a record fourth consecutive term and fifth overall term this year, was always admired by her supporters as an "Iron Lady" before the dramatic development that abruptly ended her 15-year-rule in Bangladesh.

Hasina, who provided stability to the once military-ruled Bangladesh but at the same time criticised as an "autocratic" leader by opponents, was among the world's longest-serving female heads of government. The 76-year-old daughter of Bangladesh founder Sheikh Mujibur Rahman had been ruling the strategically located South Asian nation since 2009. She was elected for a record fourth consecutive term in January in an election boycotted by the main opposition party Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) of for-mer premier Khaleda Zia and

Born in erstwhile East Pakistan (now in Bangladesh) in September 1947, Hasina became active in politics while studying at the University of Dhaka in the late 1960s. She served as her father's political liaison during his imprison-ment by the Pakistani govern-

After Bangladesh gained independence from Pakistan in 1971, her father Mujibur Rahman became the president and then prime minister of the country. However, in August 1975, Rahman, his wife and their three sons were assassinated in their home by military

Hasina and her younger sister Sheikh Rehana survived the purge as they were abroad. Hasina, who spent six years in exile in India, was elected as the leader of the Awami League, a party founded by her father. În 1981, Hasina returned home and became vocal about

democracy in the country ruled by the military, which placed her under house arrest on multiple occasions.

In the 1991 general elections, the Hasina-led Awami League failed to secure a majority. Her rival Khaleda Zia of the BNP

became prime minister. Five years later, Hasina was elected prime minister in the 1996 general elections.

Hasina was voted out of office in the 2001 elections but returned to power with a thumping victory in 2008 polls. Khaleda Zia-led BNP has been left in the lurch since then.

Hasina escaped an assassination bid in 2004 when a grenade exploded at her rally. Soon after coming to power in

2009, Hasina set up a tribunal to try 1971 war crimes cases. The tribunal convicted some high-profile members of the opposition, sparking violent protests.

Jamaat-e-Islami, an Islamist party and a key ally of BNP, was banned from participating in elections in 2013. BNP chief Khaleda Zia was sentenced to 17 years in prison on corruption charges.
The BNP boycotted the 2014

elections but joined the one in 2018, which party leaders later said was a mistake, alleging that the voting was marred with widespread rigging and intimidation. In the 2024 elections,

the BNP and its allies boycotted the votes, demanding polls under a non-party caretaker government. They alleged that Hasina cannot deliver credible voting. The polls were fought by 27 political parties, including the parliamentary opposition

Jatiya Party. The rest were members of the ruling Awami League-led coalition, which experts dubbed as the "satellite parties." The BNP's boycott, however, raised questions about the credibility of the polls, which registered a low turnout.

Six months after the elections, a massive protest erupted against her government over a controversial quota system that reserved 30 per cent of government jobs for relatives of veterans who fought in Bangladesh's War of Independence in 1971.

Over 300 protesters were killed in violence during the protests that led to her dramatic ouster. Hasina presided over one of the world's fastest-growing economies and improved living standards in the South Asian nation in the past 15 years. The NEWSNEXTBD.com dubbed her the "Iron Lady" several years back and since then it was used by the Western media to

North Korea marked the delivery of 250 nuclear-capable missile launchers to frontline military units at a ceremony where leader Kim Jong Un called for a ceaseless expansion of his military's nuclear program to counter perceived US threats, state media said on Monday.

Concerns about Kim's nuclear program have grown as he has demonstrated an intent to deploy battlefield nuclear weapons along the North's border with South Korea and authorised his military to respond with preemptive nuclear strikes if it perceives the leadership as under threat. North Korea's official Korean Central News Agency said the launchers were freshly produced by the county's munitions factories and designed to fire "tactical" ballistic missiles, a term that describes systems capable of delivering lower-

Australia lifts terror threat level from 'possible' to 'probable'

The Australian government on Monday elevated the nation's terrorism threat alert level from "possible" to "probable," citing concerns about increasing radicalisation among young people and community tensions over the Israel-Hamas war.

It is the first time the threat level has been elevated to the midpoint of the five-tier National Terrorism Threat Advisory System since November 2022. The level had been "probable" the previous eight years.

But Prime Minister Anthony Albanese added that while government officials think the current climate makes terrorism an increased danger, they didn't know of any specific threats. "I want to reassure Australians probable does not mean inevitable, and it does not mean there is intelligence about an imminent threat or danger," Albanese told reporters.

He said the government was acting on the advice of the Australian Security Intelligence domestic spy agency known as ASIO.

'The advice that we've received is that more Australians are embracing a more diverse range of extreme ideologies and it is our responsibility to be vigilant," Albanese said.

'We've seen a global rise in politically motivated violence and extremism. Many democracies are working to address this, including our friends in the United States and in the United Kingdom. There are many things driving this global trend towards violence. Governments around the world are concerned about youth radicalisation, online radicali sation and the rise of new mixed ideologies." Australian authorities last declared a terrorist act in April, when a 16year-old boy was accused in the stabbing of a Sydney bishop while a church service was

Concern over increasing arrests in Venezuela after disputed poll

Voices across the globe expressed concern Sunday over the growing number of arrests in Venezuela following last weekend's disputed elections. Pope Francis said Venezuela is "living a critical situation" in his traditional Sunday remarks at the Vatican, adding, "I appeal to all parties to seek the truth, to avoid all kinds of violence.

The remarks came hours after Venezuelan President Nicolás Maduro announced Saturday that the government has arrested 2,000 opponents. At a rally in the Venezuelan capital Caracas, Maduro pledged to detain more people and send them to prison. US Deputy National Security Adviser Jon Finer told CBS program "Face the Nation" Sunday that the Biden administration is worried

And in a statement, the leaders of several European countries including France, Spain, Germany and Italy said "the rights of all the Venezuelans, especially the political leaders, should be respected during this process. The billionaire was the chairman and founder of the FLC Group, which owns the discount Bamboo Airways and has broad real estate holdings including hotels, resorts and golf courses, among other

assets. According to the indictment, Quyet fraudulently inflated the value of the group's general contractor subsidiary, FLC Faros, by reporting fictitious capital contributions, before taking the company

public in 2016 In the initial public offering, the company sold some 391 million shares to about 30,000 investors, defrauding them of 3.6 trillion Vietnamese dong (about USD 144 million) according to the indictment. Among Quyet's co-defendants were officials from Vietnam's State Securities Commission and Securities Depository Center, who were accused of being complicit in the scheme by approving and facilitating the initial public offering despite knowing of discrepan-

cies in the figures. Details on the verdicts for the co-defendants were not imme-

diately released Quyet was arrested in 2022, as part of a crackdown on corruption instituted by Vietnamese authorities. China's marriage registrations in 2024 were set to register a record low since 1980, a demographic expert has warned after the marriage registrations in the first half of this year fell by 4.98 lakhs, heightening the country's looming demographic crisis.

The fall in marriage numbers was expected to add to the declining birth rates, which have been steadily falling over the years amid the rapid rise of the ageing population.

The latest statistics from China's Ministry of Civil Affairs show that 34.3 lakh Chinese couples got married during the first half of 2024, a drop of 4.98 lakh couples compared to the same period from last year, state-run Global Times reported on Monday. It said that 1.27 million couples also got divorced. He Yafu, an independent demographic expert who tracks marriage registration data, predicted that based on the present trend, the annual figure of marriage registrations in 2024 will drop to

a record low since 1980. The decline in the number of marriage

registrations since 2014 was attributed to a decrease in the young population, the gender imbalance with more men than women among the marriageable population, the postponement of the age of first marriage, high costs of getting married, and changing attitudes toward marriage

He said the continued decline in the number of marriage registrations in 2024 indicates that the number of new-borns will go downward again in

Due to factors such as the decrease in the young population and low childbirth intentions, the declining trend in China's birth rate, in the long run, will be difficult to fundamentally change unless substantial childbirth support policies are implemented in the future to address this challenge, the report quoted him as saying.

China's population continued to decline as the overall population fell by 20.8 lakh last year to 140.97 crore, down from 141.18 crore in 2022, as India overtook China to become the most populous country in the world in 2023. according to official data released early



this year. China's population reported its first decline in six decades in 2022 after the birth rate hit a new low, resulting in decades of the child policy pursued vigorously by the ruling Communist Party of China (CPC) to control population growth, with experts predicting a steeper decline in the coming years

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer has called an emergency COBRA meeting of senior ministers and police chiefs at 10 Downing Street here on Monday after a weekend of riots across several cities in the country, which he termed a "far-right thuggery" that will face the full force of

Hundreds of arrests have been made as police officers in riot gear responded to violent Rotherham, Middlesbrough, Bolton and other parts of the UK on Sunday, after days of some of the worst rioting seen on the streets of the country in the wake of the fatal stabbings of three schoolgirls in Southport, north-west England.

Hotels housing asylum seekers and mosques have been among the targets of the anti-immigrant mobs after initial false claims spread online regarding the stabbing suspect being an immigrant who arrived in the country illegally.

"I utterly condemn the far-right thuggery we have seen this weekend. Be in no doubt: those who have participated in this violence will face the full force of the law" said Starmer in a of the law," said Starmer in a statement on Sunday. "There is no justification –

none – for taking this action, and all right-minded people should be condemning this sort of violence. People in this country have a right to be safe and vet, we've seen Muslim communities targeted, attacks on mosques, other minority communities singled out, Nazi salutes in the street, attacks on the police, (and) wanton violence alongside racist rhetoric. So, no, I won't shy away from calling this what it is: far-right thuggery," he said.

He will chair the emergency Cabinet Office Briefing Room A (COBRA) meeting with UK Home Secretary Yvette Cooper to discuss the future course of

He says he was heading to a falconry excursion with friends when a woman driving ahead of him hit and killed the young bear with her vehicle. He says he put it in his own vehicle, intending to skin it and eat the meat, but the day got away from him. Eventually, he says, he was in Manhattan and needed to get the bear carcass out of his vehi-cle. His friends, fueled by alcohol, concocted the Central Park plan as a prank, he said, adding he was not drunk himself. At the time, bicycle accidents were getting significant media attention, so Kennedy and his friends thought it would be funny to make it look like the bear was hit by a bicycle.

Antisemitic incidents in Czech Republic rose sharply in 2023

AP ■ PRAGUE

ntisemitic incidents in the ACzech Republic sharply increased last year, with their peak appearing in the final quarter of 2023 following the deadly Hamas attacks on Israel on October 7, an assault that triggered the war in Gaza, the country's Jewish community said on Monday.

In its annual report, the Federation of the Jewish Communities said it registered 4,328 antisemitic incidents in 2023, up 90 per cent from 2,277 in the previous year. The report said that 1,800 inci-

dents — or 41,59 per cent, of the total — happened in the last three months of the year.

"The October 7 was immediately followed by a global explosive wave of antisemitism, which also strongly hit the Czech Republic," the report The bulk of the anti-Jewish hatred, 98 per cent, was expressed online, most of them through social media, it said. Those included the publication of false, dehumanizing, demonizing, vulgar and conspiracy theories and stereotypes as well as hatred aimed at the state of Israel. The report, however, concluded the Czech Republic remains a safe country for Jews. It said there was no physical attack registered for the second straight year. But 18 incidents involved antisemitic threats, harassment and verbal insults, more than double than the previous year. The rest of the incidents included demonizing the Jewish community with conspiracy theories and stereotyping, according to the report. The Hamas attacks on Israel killed some 1,200 people, mostly civilians. The militants also took around 250 people

physicist Tsung-Dao Lee dies at age 97 hinese-American physicist

Tsung-Dao Lee, who in 1957 became the secondvoungest scientist to receive a Nobel Prize, died on Sunday at his home in San Francisco at age 97, according to a Chinese university and a research center. Lee, whose work advanced the understanding of particle physics, was one of the great masters in the field, according to a joint obituary released Monday by the Tsung-Dao Lee Institute at Shanghai Jiao Tong University and the Beijingbased China Center for Advanced Science and

Technology. Lee, a naturalized US citizen since 1962, was also a professor emeritus at Columbia University in New York.

Robert Oppenheimer, known as the father of the atomic bomb, once praised Lee as one of the most brilliant theoretical physicists of the time, whose work showed "remarkable freshness, versatility and style.

Lee was born in Shanghai on November 24, 1926, the third of six children to a merchant father, Tsing-Kong Lee, and a mother, Ming-Chang Chang, who was a devout Catholic, according to local newspaper Wenhui Daily.

He went to high school in Shanghai and attended National Chekiang University in Guizhou province and National Associated Southwest University in Kunming in Yunnan province. After his sophomore year, he

In the early 1950s, Lee worked at the Yerkes Observatory in Wisconsin, at the University of California at Berkeley and at the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, N.J. His research in elementary par-

Sensex, Nifty nosedive nearly 3% to month low

Amid global equity rout on US growth concerns

¬tock market benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty Ocrashed nearly 3 per cent on Monday following extremely weak trends in global equity markets amid fears of a slowdown in the US economy

The 30-share BSE Sensex plummeted 2,222.55 points or 2.74 per cent to settle at over a month's low of 78,759.40, marking its worst single-day retreat since June 4, 2024. During the day, it tanked 2,686.09 points or 3.31 per cent to 78,295.86.

The NSE Nifty slumped 662.10points or 2.68 per cent to settle at 24,055.60. During the day, it tumbled 824 points or 3.33 per cent to 23,893.70. Nifty also saw its worst single-day fall since June 4, 2024, when markets crashed more than 5 per cent due to general election results.

An over 12 per cent plunge in Japan's Nikkei and geopolitical tensions in the Middle East dented market sentiment,



In Asian markets, Seoul, Tokyo, Shanghai and Hong Kong settled sharply lower. Japan's benchmark stock index plunged 12.4 per cent on Monday, compounding a global market rout set off by investor concerns that the US economy could be headed for

A report on Friday showing hiring by US employers slowed last month by much more than expected convulsed financial markets, vanquishing the euphoria that had taken the Nikkei 225 to all-time highs of over 42,000 in recent weeks. On Monday, the Nikkei closed

down 4,451.28 points at 31,458.42. It had dropped 5.8 per cent on Friday, making this its worst two-day decline ever. Its worst single-day rout was a plunge of 3,836 points, or 14.9 per cent, on October 19, 1987, a global markets crash that was dubbed "Black Monday" but proved to be only a temporary setback despite fears it might have augured a worldwide

India's services sector growth eases slightly in July

India's services sector growth recorded another month of robust expansion in July, albeit at a slightly slower pace than in June, largely supported by robust demand conditions and investment in technology, a monthly survey said on Monday.

The seasonally adjusted HSBC India Services Business Activity Index was at 60.3 in July, down only fractionally from 60.5 in June. In the Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) parlance, a print above 50 means expansion, while a score below 50 denotes contraction.

"Service sector activity rose at a slightly slower pace in July, with new business increasing further, primarily driven by domestic demand. Looking ahead, services firms remained optimistic about the outlook for vear ahead," Pranjul Bhandari, Chief India Economist at HSBC, said.

New export orders increased at the third-strongest pace since the inception of the series in September 2014, amid strengthening demand for Indian services from across the world. Some of the sources of rising export orders mentioned by panellists included Austria, Brazil, China, Japan, Singapore, the Netherlands and the US. Favourable economic conditions and optimistic expectations for output supported recruitment among services firms, the survey said. On the price front, higher wage

and material costs continued to

with the overall rate of inflation quickening from June. Stronger cost pressures and positive demand trends contributed to

the steepest rise in prices charged for the provision of services for seven years. Looking ahead, services firms remained strongly optimistic about growth prospects. Around 30 per cent of the survey panel forecast greater out-

Indian economy likely to grow at 7-7.2% in FY25, says Deloitte

India's economy is expected to grow at 7-17.2 per cent in the current fiscal year driven by robust economic fundamentals and continuity in domestic policy reforms, Deloitte India said on Monday.

The August update of Deloitte's India Economic Outlook said several initiatives in the Union Budget 2024-25 toward improving agriculture productivity, creating jobs for the youth, and in manufacturing and addressing the challenge of access to finance for micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs), would help improve supply-side demand, curb inflation, and prop up consumer spending, especially in rural areas.

Deloitte India Economist Rumki Majumdar said, India will witness robust growth in the second half after a period of uncertainty in the first six months of the year. "Key contributing factors include the continuity in domestic policy reforms, reduced uncertainties in the US post-elections, and more synchronous global growth within a low inflation

"Additionally, improved global liquidity conditions, as central banks in the West ease their monetary policy stance, will enhance capital flows and drive higher investments, particularly in the private

economic Observing that strong fundamentals would drive GDP growth between 7 per cent and 7.2 per cent in FY25, the Economic Outlook report said

customers recover the loss on account of fraudulent transactions, the RBI has issued instructions to banks on limiting the liability of customers in cases of unauthorised electronic banking transactions.

A customer need not bear any loss if the deficiency is on the part of the bank and in cases, where the fault lies neither with the bank nor with the customer but lies elsewhere in the system and the customer notifies the bank within three working days of receiving the communication about the unauthorised transaction. Where the loss is due to the customer's negligence, the customer



has to bear the entire loss until he/she reports the unauthorised

transaction to the bank Where the fault lies neither with the customer nor with the bank and lies elsewhere in the system, and the customer reports between 4-7 working days of the unauthorised transaction, the maximum liability of the customer ranges from Rs 5,000 to Rs 25,000, depending on the type of account/ instrument.

If the unauthorised transaction is reported beyond 7 working days, the customer liability shall be determined as per the bank's Board approved policy.

"The burden of proving customer liability in case of unauthorised electronic banking transactions shall lie on the bank," Chaudhary said.

To facilitate the citizens to report any cyber incidents, including financial frauds, the Home Ministry has launched a National cybercrime

reporting portar (www.Cybercrime.Gov.In) and a National cybercrime Helpline Number '1930'.

Sebi amends mutual fund rules to curb front-running, insider trading

Capital markets regulator Sebi has amended mutual fund norms requiring Asset Management Companies (AMCs) to put in place an institutional mechanism to identify and deter frontrunning and insider trading in securities. Additionally,

management of AMCs will be responsible for ensuring the effectiveness mechanism. institutional Also, the regulator has directed AMCs to have a

whistle-blower mechanism. This came in the wake of Sebi's passing two orders regarding front-running cases involving Axis AMC and Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC). In a gazette notification dated August 1, Sebi said, "Asset management companies shall put in place an institutional mechanism, as may be specified by the Board, for the identification and deterrence of potential market abuse including frontrunning and fraudulent transactions in securities".

INDIA WAITS FOR GOLDEN BOY NEERAJ TO SHINE

A man of many firsts in Indian athletics, Neeraj Chopra would be eyeing another piece of history with his javelin when he takes aim at his second Olympics amid expectations of a golden finish yet again.

His fabled consistency would be tested after a season that has seen him battle a nagging adductor niggle. He_would begin his quest on Tuesday with the qualifications round from where the Haryana lad is expected to make the finals on August 8.

A top podium finish will make Chopra only the fifth man in Olympics history to defend his title and the first Indian to win two gold medals in an individual event in the multi-sporting spectacle.

Eric Lemming (Sweden; 1908 and 1912), Jonni Myyra (Finland; 1920 and 1924), Chopra's idol Jan Zelezny (Czech Republic; 1992, 1996 and 2000) and Andreas and 2000) and Andreas Thorkildsen (Norway; 2004 and 2008) are the only ones to

have defended the men's javelin gold medals in the Olympics

He has competed in just three events this year but the 26-year-old world champion is back in full flow in a season where none of his global competitors have exceptionally well.

After finishing second in the Doha Diamond League in May with a throw of 88.36m, which is his season's best, Chopra withdrew from Ostrava Golden Spike on May 28 as a precautionary measure after he felt "something" in his adductor (group of muscles located on inner thighs).

Chopra, who has a personal best of 89.94m, made a strong comeback by winning gold at the Paavo Nurmi Games in Finland on June 18 with a throw of 85.97m. He later opted out of the Paris

Diamond League on July 7, insisting that the event was never a part of his competition calendar this

Chopra's fitness, telling PTI that his adductor has no issues now and his ward has been in high intensity phase of

One of the most consistent javelin throwers in recent times, Chopra has sent his times, Chopra has sent his spear below 85m mark just twice out of his 15 competitions since winning gold in the Tokyo Olympics.

Triathlon mixed relay goes ahead with swims in the Seine amid water quality concerns

Olympic triathletes plunged into the Seine River Monday morning as the mixed relay event got underway after organizers said the bacteria levels in the long-polluted Paris waterway acceptable levels.

The plan to hold swimming portion of the triathlons and the marathon swimming events in the Seine was an ambitious one. Swimming in the river has, with some exceptions, been off-limits since 1923 because it

has been too toxic. Representatives from World Triathlon and the International Olympic Committee along with Paris Games organizers and regional and weather authorities met Sunday night to review water tests. The results indicated the water quality at the triathlon site had improved over the preceding hours and would be within the limits mandated by World Triathlon by Monday morning, they said in a statement. In a very close sprint finish, the team from Germany won the gold medal, with the United States taking silver and Britain

clinching bronze. The decision to allow the event to go forward with swims in the Seine came after Belgium's Olympic committee announced Sunday that it would withdraw its team from the mixed relay triathlon after

one of its competitors who swam in the river last week fell ill. It was not clear whether her illness had anything to do with her swim in the Seine. Paris spent 1.4 billion euros

(\$1.5 billion) on infrastructure improvements to clean up the river that flows through its center. That included the construction of a giant basin to capture excess rainwater and keep wastewater from flowing into the river sewer infrastructure and upgrading wastewater treatment plants.

Athletes swam in the river for the men's and individual triathlons Wednesday, though the men's race had been delayed by a day because of the water quality. Boxer Imane calls for end to bullying after backlash over gender misconceptions

Olympic boxer Imane Khelif said the wave of hateful scrutiny she has faced over misconceptions about her gender "harms human dignity," and she called for an end to bullying athletes after being greatly affected by the international backlash against her.

The Algerian athlete spoke about Olympic tumultuous experience on Sunday night in an interview with SNTV, a sports video partner of The Associated Press.

^{ta}I send a message to all the people of the world to uphold the Olympic principles and the Olympic Charter, to refrain from bullying all athletes, because this has effects, massive effects," Khelif said in Arabic.

"It can destroy people, it can kill people's thoughts, spirit and mind. It can divide people. And because of that, I ask them to refrain from

The victories of Khelif and fellow boxer Lin Yu-ting of Taiwan in the ring in Paris have become one of the biggest stories of the Paris Games. Both women have clinched their first Olympic medals even as they have faced online abuse based on and its president, Thomas Bach, for

unsubstantiated claims about their gender, drawing them into a wider divide over changing attitudes toward gender identity and toward regulations in sports.

25-year-old Khelif acknowledged the pressure and pain of enduring this ordeal while competing far from home in the most important event of her athletic

Scottie Scheffler was a model of calm and greatness as he delivered the greatest closing round of his career.

The final two hours were about charges and collapses, pure theater that ended Sunday with the Olympic gold medal fittingly No. 1 player.

It was only when Scheffler stood on the top podium, when the final few bars of the national anthem belted out across Le Golf National, that he lost control. The medal dangling beneath his right hand fixed across his chest,

Scheffler raised his left arm to cover the sobs. Tears are nothing new for Scheffler. His latest trophy brought out his very best.

Four shots behind to start the final round, six shots behind early on the back nine, Scheffler birdied five of six holes down the stretch and matched the course record with a 9-under 62 for a one-shot victory over Tommy Fleetwood.

"It's been a long week. It's been a challenging week. I played some great golf today, and I'm proud to be going home with a medal," Scheffler said. "These

guys played tremendous golf and I think we should all be proud of the golf that we played this week." It was a show-stopper, the best of the three men's competitions since golf returned to the Olympic program in 2016 before 30,000 spectators that got their euros' worth.

The remarkable surge by Scheffler, who shot 29 on the back nine. The relentless play of Fleetwood (66) and Ĥideki Matsuyama, who had birdie chances on the final six holes and had to settle for pars for a 65 to win the bronze.

And there was a stunning collapse by Jon Rahm, who saw a four-shot lead disappear in two holes and his hopes vanish with a double bogey; by Rory McIlroy, one shot behind until hitting wedge into the water; and by Xander Schauffele, the PGA and British Open champion who had a chance to win another gold until playing a four-hole stretch in 4-over par.
