

# Gandhi family wounded the Constitution: PM

rime Minister Narendra Photo on Saturday said that the "Congress led by Gandhi family", having "tasted blood", repeatedly "wounded the Constitution", while his Government's policies and decisions since it took office in 2014, have been aimed at boosting India's strength and unity in line with the vision of the Constitution. In his 107minute speech, outlining 11 'Sankalps' For 'Viksit Bharat', Modi accused the Gandhi family, from Nehru to Sonia Gandhi, of "doing everything

in their power to harm the Constitution". He said his Government "changed the Constitution for the betterment of dalits, women empowerment" and "removed Article 370 to unify the country"

PM Modi emphasised that he was specifically targeting the family due to their prolonged rule, with its members in power for 55 years. Replying to a two-day debate in Lok Sabha on the 75th anniversary of the adoption of the Constitution, he took a swipe at the past Congress governments, accusing them of planting "poisonous seeds" in the country's diversity to

accentuate its contradictions and damage its unity. Training guns at the Nehru-

Gandhi family of the Congress, he said they left no stone unturned to strike blows to the Constitution. 'This family challenged the Constitution at every level," he said, adding that he was singling out the family as its members were in power for 55 years. The family, having "tasted blood", repeatedly wounded the Constitution, he said, citing several decisions of Jawaharlal Nehru, Indira Gandhi and Rajiv Gandhi when they held the office of Prime Minister.

"Their next generation is also into the same game", he said in a swipe at the Leader of Opposition in the House Rahul Gandhi and his MP sister Privanka Gandhi Vadra. The PM said leaders like him, and many others who came from ordinary families could never have reached where they did but for the strength

of the Constitution, as he long underlined his commitment to its values. As Chief Minister of Gujarat, PM Modi said that his government celebrated the 60th year of the Constitution's adoption by placing a copy of the document on an elephant while he walked underneath barefoot in a symbolic gesture to highlight its supremacy. Slamming the Nehru-Gandhi family, he said India's first PM Jawaharlal Nehru "amended the country's guiding document to curb freedom of expression and his daughter Indira Gandhi imposed Emergency to defy a Supreme Court judgment that annulled her election as an MP'

"She throttled democracy and mutilated the Constitution" when the 25th year of its adoption was approaching, to save her chair as PM", he said, adding that "she also effected an amendment to protect the President, Vice president and herself from any legal challenge to their position with a retrospective effect. The country was turned into jail and the judiciary was throttled".

"Rajiv Gandhi, who took over as PM after his mother's assassination, also amended the Constitution. This blot on the Congress cannot be washed off", Modi asserted.

Without naming Rahul Gandhi, the PM said an "arrogant" person tore the decision of the Cabinet when the Congress-led United Progressive Alliance (UPA) Government headed by the then PM Manmohan Singh was in power. The National Advisory Council (NAC), which was headed by Sonia Gandhi, was put "above" the Cabinet during the UPA rule, the PM added. While the makers of the Constitution took a considered decision to disallow reservation on the basis of religion and faith in the interest of the country's unity and integrity, the PM said that the Congress in its "greed for power" and to "appease its vote bank" pushed for it in violation of the constitutional spirit, he said. His government, Modi said, repealed Article 370 to "unify the country" and brought in GST to roll out "one nation one tax regime".

### Police lob teargas, 17 injured, farmers suspend march to Delhi

 $A_{made}^{group}$  of farmers, who made a fresh attempt to march towards Delhi from Shambhu border point of Haryana on Saturday at around 12 pm, faced tear gas and water cannons launched again by the Haryana police. After that, they suspended their march to Delhi and announced a tractor march on December 16 and "rail roko" protest in Punjab on December 18. Farmer leader Sarwan Singh Pandher said, "On December 16, a tractor march will be organised outside Punjab, and on December 18th, we have called 'Rail Roko' in Punjab. We appeal to all Punjabis to participate in "Rail Roko' in large numbers... The Opposition should not run away from their role by just giving a statement." Ahead of the 'Dilli Chalo' foot march, Pandher compared the ongoing farmers' protest to the Parliament's Constitution debate. The clash took place when a group of 101 farmers, who had resumed their march from the Shambhu protest site on the Punjab-Harvana border around noon, reached the barricades set up by Haryana police. A few farmers were injured during the tear

### tackle winter pollution

The Commission for Air L Quality Management (CAQM) on Delhi-NCR air quality has issued a revised plan to tackle winter pollution, asking states to implement stricter measures when the air quality deteriorates and making it mandatory for schools to shift to hybrid learning on days with severe air pollution.

"The Chief Secretaries of Delhi and NCR shall frequently review the actions and implementation of the GRAP especially when the air quality falls or is likely to fall in the 'Severe' or 'Severe +' category (Stage III and beyond). The Commission may decide upon any exceptions and additional measures to the schedule of the GRAP, under different air pollution categories i.e., Stages I to IV, as per the prevalent AQI and weather said.

forecast," read the advisory. During the first stage, Discoms are advised to minimise power supply interruptions in NCR. According to CAQM, the total number of days with 'Good to Moderate' air quality in 2024 is 207 so far, which is the highest since 2018 (barring 2020, the COVID Year). The record highest number, six days with 'Moderate' AQI in 2024, as against only one day each in 2018 ,2019 and 2020; '0' days in 2021 & 2023; and '2' in 2022. On the other hand, the number of days with 'Poor to Severe' AQI in December are also the lowest in the current year since 2018 i.e. only eight . A lowest avg AQI of 234 for the month of December (till 14th) has also been recorded in the current year 2024, since 2018, when the AQI has generally been in the range of still active in New Delhi which may help him to counter Kejriwal's narratives.

# Ayodhya Ram Temple is UP's most visited destination of the year

Ua tourism surge, breaking records with an impressive 47.61 crore tourists visiting the state between January and September 2024. Ayodhya, home to the under-construction Shri Ram Temple, has emerged as the state's most visited destination, surpassing even the iconic Taj Maĥal in Agra.

According to the Uttar Pradesh Tourism Department, Ayodhya alone welcomed 13.55 crore domestic tourists and 3,153 international visitors during this period. The upcoming inauguration of the Ram Temple has played a pivotal role in essential stop for international drawing unprecedented crowds. tourists," remarked Suresh Gupta,

"The rise in Ayodhya's tourism is nothing short of phenomenal,"

said Rajesh Tiwari, a Lucknow-based travel agent. "We have seen a 70% increase in bookings for Ayodhya tours compared to last year. Devotees and cultural enthusiasts from across the country want to be part of this

historic transformation." While the Taj Mahal remains a global icon, its tourist numbers have seen a slight decline in domestic visitors, though international arrivals rose from 26,84,825 in 2022-23 to 27,70,340 in 2023-24. The overall domestic tourist count to the Taj Mahal decreased by 1,93,298 compared to the previous year. "The Taj Maĥal is still an

a tour operator from Agra. "However, domestic travelers now prefer spiritual and culturally significant sites like Ayodhya and Varanasi. People are looking for meaningful travel experiences that connect them to their heritage."

Tourism Minister Jaiveer Singh highlighted the state's broader tourism success. "The tourism surge is not limited to Ayodhya," he stated. "Varanasi attracted 6.2 crore domestic tourists and 1.84 lakh foreign visitors. Prayagraj drew 4.80 crore tourists, including 4,790 foreigners. Mathura, the birthplace of Lord Krishna, saw 6.8 crore visitors, including 87,229 international tourists. Even Mirzapur recorded 1.18 crore visitors.

The state's Buddhist circuit hub,



Kushinagar, also saw substantial growth, welcoming 16.2 lakh visitors, including 1.53 lakh international tourists. Agra, despite competition from Ayodhya, received 1.25 crore tourists, including 9.24 lakh foreigners. Tour operators remain optimistic. "We expect even higher numbers with the upcoming Pran Pratishtha ceremony at the Ram Temple," said Poonam Verma, a tourism consultant from Delhi. "Religious tourism has become a defining factor in Uttar Pradesh's tourism industry. Events like the Kumbh Mela, along with better infrastructure and connectivity, have boosted travel significantly. Industry experts believe that consistent marketing and improved facilities have helped

Uttar Pradesh build a strong global tourism presence. "The government's focus on religious tourism is commendable," noted Amit Sharma, a hospitality consultant. "We now see better hotels, guided tours, and easier transport options, making the state an attractive destination for all types of travelers."

Other destinations like Siddharthnagar (86,215 visitors), Lakhimpur Kheri (46.5 lakh), Pilibhit (30.6 lakh), Bijnor (34.4 lakh), and Sonbhadra (19.4 lakh) also contributed to the state's growing tourism footprint. With the Ram Temple nearing completion and major religious events on the horizon, Uttar Pradesh is poised to strengthen its position as India's top cultural and religious tourism hub.

#### Bhopal branch of FIITJEE coaching closed, accused of fraud BMC collects Rs 83K fine

◄he Bhopal branch of Delhi-based FIITJEE L coaching institute has been closed for the past seven days amid allegations of embezzling crores of rupees from students.

In the last two days alone, 30 students and their families have lodged complaints of fraud at the MP Nagar police station. Around 700 students were enrolled at the institute, each paying fees ranging from Rs 1.5 lakh to Rs 3 lakh for coaching services. Parents and students alleged

that the coaching center operator collected lump-sum fees from hundreds of students in July and August this year, while some students were allowed to make part payments. However, it is now revealed that the teaching staff have not received salaries

This is not the first controversy involving FIITJEE. Five months ago, in Indore, 67 parents filed a complaint with the Additional DCP of the Crime Branch, accusing FIIT-JEE branches in the city of taking advance payments without providing promised coaching services. A case was subse-quently registered against the director, branch manager, and admin in charge of the coaching institute. As the investigation unfolds in Bhopal, students and parents remain anxious about the fate of their education and the fees they have paid. The authorities have assured swift action to address the grievances and ensure accountability.

Bhopal: As part of its campaign against polluters, the Bhopal Municipal Corporation (BMC) on Saturday collected Rs 83,200 in fines from 136 cases across the

Of these, 24 cases involved the spreading of Construction and Demolition (C&D) waste and building materials on roads, resulting in fines amounting to Rs 52,900.Municipal Commissioner Harendra Narayan has directed officials to closely monitor such activities. The couple appeared before Additional Principal Judge Varsha Sharma, who facilitated the reconciliation. With the judge's intervention, the wife agreed to return to her husband, and the couple left the courtroom together, with the wife wearing a garland, symbolising their rec-

onciliation. The National Lok Adalat, organised across various courts in Madhya Pradesh, saw the resolution of cases related to civil, criminal, family disputes, and traffic fines, among others.

### Doctor to face action as checks | Eye checkup camp continue at health centres for SBI pensioners

he services of an absentee doctor may soon be terminated after he was charged with continued negligence, as the office of the Chief Medical and Health Officer (CMHO) continued its inspection of staff attendance at health institutions for the second consecutive day on Saturday. A day after CMHO Dr

Prabhakar Tiwari initiated disciplinary action against doctors and staff for tardiness, health institutions in the state capital recorded a significant improvement, with almost all staff members adhering to timings.

On Friday, the CMHO had conducted surprise checks at various morning Out-Patient Departments (OPDs) at health institutions.

The inspection resulted in disciplinary proceedings against 20 doctors and paramedical staff who had reported late for duty.

On Saturday morning, departmental officers once again visited health institutions to ascertain OPD schedules, staff attendance, and the quality of service

### delivery. Inspection teams visited Civil

Hospital Govindpura, Civil Dispensary Pipeline, Civil Dispensary Anand Nagar, Civil Dispensary 1100 Quarter, Civil Dispensary Baghsevania, Sanjeevani Clinic Baba Nagar, and Urban Primary Health Centre Ishan Nagar. In addition, they also assessed the OPD services at primary health centres and Ayushman Arogya Mandirs in rural areas. In almost all institutions, the staff was found to be present by 9:00 AM. During the inspection, Dr Sanjay Malhotra, the Medical Officer at Urban Primary Health Centre Ishan Nagar, was found to be absent. He had signed the attendance register a day earlier. Complaints regarding Dr Malhotra's work ethic had been received in the past as well. In view of his continued negligence and carelessness towards his duties, action for termination of his services has been proposed.

Dr Tiwari said surprise inspections will continue as part of a process to ensure better and timely health services in the district.

**Bhopal:** Sewa Sadan Eye Hospital and SBI Pensioners Association as well as the local SBI Main Market Branch jointly organized a free eye camp on Saturday for SBI pensioners, working employees and their relatives. 108 persons were examined which included 75 male and 33 female out of whom 7 were identified and advised for cataract surgery. hough welcomed by citizens, the Bhopal Municipal Corporation's (BMC) decision to impose spot fines on air polluters triggers concerns about the potential misuse of the penalties in the absence of transparent mechanisms for enforcing them. The spot fines, which will aver-age over Rs 45 lakh per month, based on the recoveries over the past week, came into force after the civic body stepped up action against polluters in the city.

BMC attributes the move to a significant decline in the quality of air in the state capital; however, the timing of the intensified campaign remains suspect as it coincided with the release of performance data for 131 cities included in the National Clean Air Programme (NCAP).

The data, released by the Government of India, noted that Bhopal had recorded a one per cent growth in the concentration of PM10 stagnation, despite fairly clear guidelines issued by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC). Even as BMC discontinued the practice of garbage burning, annulled the distribution of free firewood to the poor, initiated action against eateries that con-

sume solid fuels, and stepped up its campaign for spot fines, the civic body has stopped short of formalising any of these moves by presenting them at the recent Mayor-in-Council meeting and the subsequent meeting of the city council.

The absence of ratifications for the campaign is a pointer towards the civic administration's desire to persist with discretionary action against polluters, a prospect that is almost certain to derail the anti-pollution drive in the near future.

Last year, too, the BMC had initiated action against eateries using tandoors during the peak pollution season of winter, but the campaign had dwindled within a few months. Also missing is transparency in the spot fine mechanism, which

currently ranges between Rs 500 and Rs 10,000, with no clear administrative or even scientific reasoning to explain the gap between the penalties.

The civic body's reluctance to lay out a clear framework for its moves places immense power in the hands of BMC staffersincluding contractual workerswho will be able to selectively impose these levies in a scenario reminiscent of the days of the Inspector Raj.

## Wind chill sends mercury plummeting to 3.8 degrees in Bhopal

reezing cold conditions prevailed in Bhopal as the mercury dipped by 4°C, recording a low of 3.8°C on Friday night. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) issued a severe cold wave warning for the state capital, cautioning of further deterioration in weather conditions. The intense cold is expected to

have a significant impact on both residents and agriculture, with frost and cold day conditions forecasted across several districts. Major regions likely to be severely affected include Vidisha, Raisen, Sehore, and Shajapur. The lowest temperature in the state was recorded at Kalyanpur (Shahdol), where the mercury dropped to a freezing 1.5°C.

Other low temperatures included Pachmarhi (2.0°C), Girvar in Shajapur (2.5°C), Umaria (2.8°C), and Mandla

(3°C). In stark contrast, the warmest nights in the state were observed in Chitrakoot (13.2°C), Kannod (11.2°C), Seoni (9.0°C), Indore (8.9°C), and Sagar (8.5°C). Many regions that previously recorded sub-10°C temperatures have now dropped to sub-5°C, making conditions unbearably cold.

Weather scientists predict that the cold wave will persist for the next three to four days, with temperatures taking longer to return to normal. Continuous snowfall in northern India has intensified the effects of icy winds sweeping through Madhya Pradesh, leaving the state in the grip of

severe cold for the past five days. This phase is expected to last until December 16, after which some relief is anticipated.

Cold winds are likely to affect Neemuch, Mandsaur, Dhar, Shajapur, Rajgarh, Sagar, Seoni, Jabalpur, Katni, Shahdol, Chhatarpur, Panna, Tikamgarh, and Niwari. Severe cold day conditions are expected in Sehore, Raisen, and Vidisha, while Narsinghpur will also remain under the influence of a cold day. Friday night in Bhopal was reported as the second coldest picht in a dagada Tha drop in

night in a decade. The drop in temperature is attributed to the incursion of cold winds caused by heavy snowfall in northern India. Subtropical jet stream winds, blowing at a speed of 296 km/h at an altitude of 12.6 km in West-North India, have further exacerbated the chill. The IMD noted that the effect of cold will intensify further if these winds descend to lower altitudes.

A Western Disturbance active in northern India has also contributed to melting snow, which, in turn, has caused a dip in temperatures. Over the last 24 hours, the weather remained dry across all divisions of the state, with cold wave conditions prevailing in Rajgarh, Ratlam, Umaria, Mandla, Seoni, Guna, Narmadapuram, Badwani, Marukheda (Neemuch), Amarkantak (Anuppur), Piprasama (Shivpuri), and Singrauli.

Severe cold wave conditions were reported in Bhopal, Raisen, Sehore, Girvar (Shajapur), Kalyanpur weather conditions.

### Graphic designer foils digital arrest attempt

ybercriminals attempted to intimidate a graph-⊿ic designer, Aniruddha Bapat, into compliance with a fake arrest threat on Friday morning. The scammers accused Bapat of using his mobile number to make extortion calls to celebrities. Alert to such frauds, Bapat outsmarted the criminals and reported the matter to the Crime Branch on Saturday. Bapat, 35, who resides near

Gurunanakpura Capital Petrol Pump and works for a Mumbai-based company, received a call from a suspicious number with a +97 country code. The caller claimed an FIR had been registered against his number in Mumbai and demanded his immediate surrender. When Bapat expressed

his inability to travel to Mumbai, the caller connected him to a so-called senior officer.

Shortly after, a video call was initiated by a man dressed in a police uniform, who identified himself as an SHO of the Mumbai Crime Branch. The fraudster claimed that Bapat would be arrested at his home if he did not cooperate. However, Bapat, aware of such scams, disconnected the call. Despite Bapat's refusal to engage, the scammers persisted, repeatedly calling him and escalating their threats. They claimed to have people monitoring his movements and demanded he comply with their

instructions. In an ironic twist, the scammers even asked Bapat for feedback on their act. "Tell us where our acting went wrong. How did

you recognize us? We will improve for next time," they said. When Bapat responded sarcastically, pointing out that this would only help them cheat others, the scammers admitted to their intent but continued calling him relent-

lessly. Bapat revealed that this wasn't his first encounter with such scams. Four months ago, he received a call claiming his parcel had been seized by customs. Thanks to his awareness of such frauds through news reports, he avoided falling vic-

tim on both occasions. The Crime Branch has registered a case and launched an investigation into the incident. Authorities have urged citizens to remain vigilant against such scams and report any suspicious activity immediately.



Kejriwal urges Shah to discuss Law and Order in Delhi

ormer Delhi Chief Reprint Chief Minister and AAP con-venor Arvind Kejriwal has venor Arvind Kejriwal has written to Union Home Minister Amit Shah, requesting a meeting to discuss concerns related to law and order in Delhi. Kejriwal expressed his concerns, highlighting that despite Delhi's law and order being under the control of the central government, the city is increasingly being referred to as the "crime capital" both within India and abroad.

In a letter to Shah, the former Delhi chief minister claimed that the city was being called the country's "crime capital" as he cited the recent bomb threats to numerous schools as well as the IGI airport. The letter comes ahead of the Delhi Assembly polls scheduled to be held in February 2025.

"It's so shameful that under your watch, our grand capital due to failure of law and order is being called rape capital, gangster capital, drug capital," Kejriwal said. Crimes against women are rising, extortion gangs are active everywhere, drug mafia is spreading across the city and people are harassed by mobile phone and chain snatching incidents, he claimed. In the past six months, more than 600 schools, more than 100 hospitals, malls and airport have received bomb threat messages, he said and questioned, "Why aren't the culprits being arrested?".

Due to these bomb threats, children and their parents in Delhi are living in constant fear. Have you ever thought about the children and their parents when the schools are vacated and the students are sent back home, he asked Shah.

He said Delhi's law and order was under the Centre and emphasised that Shah needed

to act and cooperate to immediately rectify the situation. Among the 19 metro cities, Delhi is the number one in terms of crimes against women and murders. Drug-related crimes registered a 350 per cent rise since 2019, an average of three women are raped every day and businesspersons regularly receive extortion calls, Kejriwal claimed. "These statistics are evidence of the dilapidated law and order situation," he said. Kejriwal said he was going

among the people and found "deep concern" among them towards law and order. "Now the biggest question of the people is if they don't deserve a bet-ter law and order condition in the national capital?" he said. The situation is very poor and law and order must be brought back on track by rising above politics, Kejriwal wrote to Shah seeking time for a meeting. In a scathing attack on Kejriwal, BJP MP Manoj Tiwari accused him of neglecting critical issues

### Congress did not give Ambedkar his due: Union Minister Kiran Rijiju

Union minister Kiren Rijiju on Saturday tore into the Congress for not giving BR Ambedkar his due, as he questioned the opposition's claims that minorities were being denied their rights.

Intervening in the debate in the Lok Sabha on 75 years of the adoption of the Constitution, the parliamentary affairs minister cautioned that "our words and actions should not diminish

the image of the country in the world fora" Rijiju was the first speaker on the second day of the debate in

the Lower House. While India has given equal voting rights to all, some claim that minorities have no rights in the country, Rijiju said in an apparent iibe at the opposition. In his over an speech, Rijiju hour-long suggested that the Congress should "apologise" to

Ambedkar to "lessen its sins". He alleged that "you" (apparently the Congress) made Ambedkar lose in the 1952 parliamentary polls.

Rijiju also questioned the delay in bestowing Ambedkar with the Bharat Ratna and asserted that the chief architect of the Constitution was conferred with India's highest civilian honour after a government supported by the BJP came to power at the Centre. Continuing his tirade, Rijiju cited Ambedkar as saying that while Jawaharlal Nehru delivered more than 2,000 speeches in 20 years, he never spoke about the welfare of Scheduled Castes "even once"

"Pandit Nehru is always for Muslims," the minister, said quoting Ambedkar.

Citing a document, Rijiju said while Ambedkar wanted reservation indefinitely till equality was achieved, Nehru advocated for it to be in place for 10 years. A day after

several opposition leaders claimed in the Lower House that the rights of minorities were shrinking, the Union minister said India not only provided legal protection to minorities, it also had a provision for affirmative action to protect their interests. said

Rijiju successive governments worked for the welfare of minorities. "The Congress has also done that, I am not undermining its role." The minister also cited a survey to claim that minorities, including Muslims, were facing discrimination and hate crimes in many nations. The situation in Pakistan, neighbouring Bangladesh and Afghanistan where minorities are facing persecution is well-known, he said. Groups seek refuge in India as they feel this country is safe for them, Rijiju added and wondered why such narratives on minorities' rights were being floated.

### WHO report sounds alarm: drowning claims 300,000 11 Indian districts at very high risk of both lives annually, may claim 7.2 Million by 2050 floods and droughts: IIT climate risk report

The Global Status Report on Drowning Prevention, released by the World Health Organisation (WHO) on Friday has painted a grim pic-ture of the global toll of drowning, which claimed over 300,000 lives in 2021-equivalent to 30 deaths per hour.

Alarmingly, it said, if current trends persist, over 7.2 million lives, predominantly children, could be lost to drowning by 2050. More so, with climate change increasing the frequency and flooding, intensity of drowning prevention becomes an urgent priority, as 75 per cent of flooding deaths result from drowning.



Drowning remains a huge burden given that it is the third leading cause of death for children aged 5-14 years and the fourth leading cause for those aged 1-4 years. As per the report, 92% of drowning deaths occur in low- and middle-income countries, with the South-East Asia Region (including India) accounting for 28% of drowning

global deaths in 2021. While global drowning deaths have decreased by 38% since 2000, progress varies significantly. For example, the European region saw a 68% drop, while South-East Asia achieved a 48% decline. Data limitations exclude deaths caused by natural disasters (e.g., floods) or

water transport, likely underestimating the true scale. Only 33% of countries offer national programmes to train bystanders in safe rescue and resuscitation. Just 22% of countries include swimming and water safety education curricula. significant investment in

economic losses could reach \$4 trillion globally by 2050, as per the report which emphasises the need for multi-sectoral involvement to address drowning, including government, health, and education, infrastructure sectors Providing day care for preschool children and teaching students basic school swimming skills could help protect millions of lives in countries with high rates of drowning, the report states. # SOUTH KOREA'S PARLIAMENT IMPEACHES PRESIDENT YOON

outh Korea's parliament on Saturday impeached President Yoon Suk Yeol over his stunning and short-lived martial law decree, a move that ended days of political paralysis but set up an intense debate over Yoon's fate, as jubilant crowds roared to celebrate another defiant moment in the country's resilient democracy.

The National Assembly passed the motion 204-85. Yoon's presidential powers and duties were subsequently suspended and Prime Minister Han Duck-soo, the country's No. 2 official, took over presidential powers later Saturday.

The Constitutional Court has up to 180 days to determine whether to dismiss Yoon as president or restore his powers. If he's thrown out of office, a national election to choose his successor must be held within 60 days.

It was the second National Assembly vote on Yoon's impeachment after ruling party lawmakers boycotted it last Saturday. Some People Power Party lawmakers had since said they would vote for Yoon's impeachment as public protests intensified and his approval rating plummeted.

National Assembly Speaker Woo Won Shik said Yoon's impeachment was an outcome driven by "the people's ardent

order! In a central Seoul plaza, another huge crowd gathered supporting Yoon, but they grew subdued after hearing he had been impeached. Both rallies have

largely been peaceful. The new leader bolsters the country's security posture: Yoon issued a statement saying he would "never give up" and calling for officials to maintain stability in government functions during what he described as a "temporary" pause of his presidency.

'I will carry with me all the criticisms, encouragement and support directed toward me, and I will continue to do my utmost for the country until the very last moment," Yoon said Yoon's December 3 imposition of

martial law, the first of its kind in more than four decades in South Korea, lasted only six hours, but has caused massive political tumult, halted diplomatic activities and rattled financial markets. Yoon was forced to lift his decree after parliament unanimously voted to overturn it.

Han, who became the acting leader, ordered the military to bolster its secudesire for democracy, courage and rity posture to prevent North Korea

from launching provocations by miscalculation. Han asked the foreign minister to inform other countries that South Korea's major external policies remain unchanged, and the finance minister to work to minimize potential negative impacts on the economy by the political turmoil, according to Han's office.

South Korea's executive power is concentrated with the president, but the prime minister leads the country if the president becomes incapacitated. Han is a seasoned official and has previously held a string of top government posts such as trade and finance and was the ambassador to the US. He also served as a prime minister from 2007-2008. After declaring martial law, Yoon sent hundreds of troops and police officers to the parliament to try to impede its vote on the decree, before they withdrew after the parliament rejected Yoon's decree. No major violence occurred.

Opposition parties and many experts accuse Yoon of rebellion, citing a law that categorises as rebellion the staging of a riot against established state authorities to undermine the constitution. They also say that a president in South Korea is allowed to declare martial law only during wartime or similar emergencies and has no right to suspend parliament's operations even under martial law.

Observers say Yoon's speech suggest ed a focus on legal preparations to defend his martial law decree at the Constitutional Court, even as opinion surveys showed more than 70 per cent of South Koreans supported his impeachment. A survey released Friday put Yoon's approval rating at 11 per cent, the lowest since he took office in 2022. Some of Yoon's claims don't align with testimony by some military commanders whose troops were deployed to the Assembly.

Most notably, Kwak Jong-keun, commander of the Army Special Warfare Command, said that after martial law was announced, Yoon called him and asked for his troops to "quickly destroy the door and drag out the lawmakers who are inside." Kwak said he didn't carry out Yoon's orders.

Yoon is the third South Korean pres ident impeached while in office. In 2016, parliament impeached Park Geun-hye, the country's first female president, over a corruption scandal. The Constitutional Court upheld her impeachment and dismissed her from office.

In 2004, President Roh Moo-hyun was impeached at parliament over an alleged election law violation but the court later overturned his impeachment and restored his presidential powers. Roh jumped to his death in 2009, after he had left office, amid a corruption scandal involving his fam-

Yoon has been banned from leaving South Korea: He has the presidential privilege of immunity from criminal prosecution but that doesn't extend to allegations of rebellion or treason. Subsequently, Yoon could be investigated, detained, arrested or indicted over his martial law decree, but many observers doubt that authorities will forcefully detain him because of the potential for clashes with his presidential security service.

Yoon's defence minister, police chief and the head of Seoul's metropolitan police agency have been arrested. Other senior military and government officials also face investigations.

# Shoot them down: Trump on mystery drone sightings

### PTI WASHINGTON

US President-elect Donald Trump has called for the "shooting down" of the mystery drones that have been appearing in various parts of the

country. These drones were first spotted in New Jersey a few days ago and are now being seen in other areas as well.

The federal government and the White House have so far maintained that these do not pose any national security threat and nor there is any evidence of a foreign hand in it. The appearance of the mystery drones, however, continues to

be the subject of investigation. "Mystery Drone sightings all over the Country. Can this really be happening without our government's knowledge? I don't think so," Trump said on Friday in a post on Truth Social, a social media platform owned by him.

"Let the public know, and now. Otherwise, shoot them down!!! DJT," he said with his personal signature at the end of the post

The Department of Homeland Security and the FBI are investigating these sightings, working closely with state and local law enforcement to provide resources, using numerous detection methods to better understand their origin, White House National Security Communications Advisor John Kirby told reporters.

If the law is not overturned, the two companies have said that the popular app will shut down by January 19, just a day before Trump takes office again. More than 170 million American users would be affected, the companies have said.

The Justice Department had opposed TikTok's request for a pause, saying in a court filing last week that the parties had already proposed a schedule that was "designed for the precise purpose" of allowing Supreme Court review of the law before it took effect.

The appeals court issued its December 6 ruling on the matter in line with that schedule, the Justice Department filing said.

Meanwhile, two influential US lawmakers, including Indian-American Raja Krishnamoorthi, have asked Google and Apple to remove TikTok from their app stores ahead of a potential ban on the video-sharing platform next month.



The medical examiner's office determined the manner of death to be suicide and police officials said there is "currently, no evidence of foul play." The Office of the Chief Medical Examiner (OCME) has identified the decedent as Suchir Balaji, 26, of San Francisco," the office's Executive Director David Serrano Sewell said.

"The manner of death has been determined to be suicide. The OCME has notified the next-of-kin and has no further comment or reports for publication at this time." The San Francisco Police

Department (SFPD) said in a statement that officers responded to a residence on the 100 block of Buchanan St. at about 1:15 pm for a well-being check. "Officers and medics arrived on scene and located a deceased adult male from what appeared to be a suicide. No evidence of foul play was found during the

initial investigation," SFPD officer Robert Rueca wrote in a statement.

Balaji spoke to the Times in October, saying he was one of the researchers who worked gathering data to train OpenAI's programmes like GPT4, which users interact with through the chatbot ChatGPT



New Zealand steadily squandered a good start, slumping from 172-2 to 231-7 before rallying to 315-9 at stumps Saturday on the first day of the third test

against England. Mitchell Santner hit the last ball of the day for six to reach his fourth test half century and was 50 not out while Will O'Rourke had yet to score. The New Zealand tail added 76 runs in the last eight overs of the day to bring some balance back into the game after the failure of the middle order. After a 105-run opening partnership between Tom Latham and Will Young, New Zealand enjoyed the rare experience of holding the upper hand over England in a series which so far has been one-sided in favor of the tourists. England holds an

unassailable 2-0 lead, winning the first test in four runs. In those seven days,

There was an anxious pause when the television umpire checked for a no ball but there was no reprieve for Ravindra and this time no bad news for Carse who bowled Williamson with a no-ball in the second test. Kane Williamson reached 44 with every sign of authority on his home pitch on which

he averages 94. Then he clamped down on a ball from Matthew Potts which bounced back onto his stumps and he tried vainly

to kick it away. Potts marked his return in place of the rested Chris Woakes with figures of 3-75 and the prized wicket of Williamson.

"I didn't have a great view of it. I was a bit confused but then I saw a bail drop down by his feet and it was pure elation after that," Potts said. "It was a massive wicket at that point in the innings. It's less about personal milestones and

achievements of getting good players out but, at that key point in time, Kane could have taken the game away from us."

Rahul Bose provides a solid supporting role as the commanding officer, adding gravitas to the film.

The film's plot, while emotionally charged, follows a predictable trajectory. The narrative, unfortunately, lacks originality, relying heavily on familiar tropes seen in countless other army-related films. The fast-paced nature of the film often leaves little room for viewers to fully process the emotional impact of certain

scenes. The film could have benefited from a slower pace, allowing for greater emotional depth and character development.

The soundtrack features some catchy tunes. While some songs may appeal to a specific audience, they do little to enhance the narrative or elevate the emotional impact of the film. The background score, however, effectively builds tension and adds to the overall atmosphere of the film.

The film undoubtedly aims to create strong emotions, and in some instances, it succeeds. The scenes depicting the love story between Mukund and Indhu, as well as the poignant moments of grief and loss, are genuinely moving. However, the film's reliance on melodrama and predictable plot points sometimes undermines its emotional impact. The film could have benefited from a more nuanced portrayal of the complexities of war and its impact on the soldiers and their families.

Amaran is a well-intentioned film that pays tribute to the sacrifices made by our soldiers. While the performances are commendable, and the film boasts some emotionally resonant moments, its predictable plot and reliance on familiar tropes prevent it from reaching its full potential.





Other notable designers included *Patricia Zadeng* from Mizoram, who focused on







Thoughts shape The spiritual purport of variety and ingredients - cooked rice as the beginning of life, variety of fruits forNaivedyam or Bhog to God as a gratitude to Him being the provider, destiny. clarified butter (ghee) in rituals symbolizes the cosmic connect. Cinnamon and cloves signify energy givers and absorbers, sweets for auspicious beginnings, Ganesh Chaturthi brings in ModhakandTeej / Raksha Bandhanannounces Ghewar. Pongal (the festival)beckons Pongal - The dish, Dhokar Dalnarings in Puja festivities in Bengal.

# The Spiritual significance of food



Simple water is so inspiringly sacrosanct - 'Mindfulness and Gratitude' Sprinkling water with recitation of mantras (invoking the divine within), is a way of seeking blessings, purifying oneself & the food making us more receptive eating - to be aware and present during meals bringing sanctity. Festivals ring in the community sharing embodying principles of generosity and hospitality.

A recommended spiritual practise isUpavasa(Staying near Oneness) or abstinence from food signifyinga direct connect to the Self- an act of self-

discipline and sacrifice abstaining from all the four forms chewing, licking, swallowing, and drinking. Going within to Purge and Purify for heightened awareness.

As per Vedic traditions, food is intertwined with spiritual evolution and the attainment of higher consciousness. In the Taittiriya Upanishad, the concept of "Annam Brahma" (Food is Para Brahman - The One and Only Supreme)encapsulates that foodis not just material sustenance but embodying the divine consciousness (Para Brahman). Taking our connect with

Annam to another level of spiritual awareness.

Everyday offering to God is Bhog or Naivedyam. Central to Vedic rituals is Yajna(rituals with sacred fire and mantras)- where offerings, including food, are made into the sacred fire as a deference to the Deities. Krishna explains in the Bhagavat Gita ...:

अन्नादभवन्तिभुतानिपर्जन्यादन्नसम्भवः| यज्ञादभवतिपर्जेन्योयज्ञःकर्मसमूदभवः|| 'All beings are born from and subsist on food. Food is produced by rains. Rains arise from the performance of sacrifice (Yajna), and sacrifice is produced by the performance of prescribed duties."

A brilliant explanation of the interrelationbetween food, sustenance (rain), and the performance of sacrificial duties (Yajna). We are what we consume. The idea of Ahara (food) and Vihara (lifestyle) -Sattvic(simple) Aharaand Spiritual Evolution in Ayurveda is exceptional. Everything is composed of 5 basic elements (Pancha Mahabhootas),-Earth (Prithvi), Water (Appu), Fire (Teja), Air (Vayu) Ether (Akasha). So, the Panchabhuta components of ingested food nourishes their respective elements in the body. Correct Ahara is the best medicine - essentially sayingthat Ahara and Vihara are agreeableto metabolism and constitution of an individual.

The gunas qualities of sattvic foodis considered to promote clarity of mind and spiritual growth. The Bhagavad Gita describes this as

आयुरूसत्त्वबलारोग्यसुखप्रीतिविवर्धनाः| रस्याः स्निग्धाः स्थिरा हृद्या आहाराः सात्त्विकप्रियाः || 'Foods that promotes life span, purity, increase virtue, strength, health, happiness, and satisfaction, which are juicy, succulent, wholesome, naturally tasteful, nourishing and pleasing to the heart, are dear to those in the mode of purity, goodness and righteousness (Sattva).'

Consuming Sattvic food supports physical health, nurtures a harmonious state of mind for spiritual practice. Food is Prasadawhen consumed with piety-with Blessings and Gratitude यत्करोशि यदश्नासि यज्जुहोशि ददासि यत् यत्तपस्यसि कौन्तेय तत्कुरुंश्व मदर्पणम् ||27|| "All that you do, you eat, you offer as oblation &gift, and all austerities that you perform, do them as an offering to Me'

Surrendering of one's actions, including that of consuming food, as a pious offering fosters spiritual growth. It is not food and eating. It is spiritually evolving with masterful compositions of gratitude, mindfulness, self-discipline, interweaving us with nature and divine awareness. It is about 'Prana' - The Life Force.
