INCLEMENT WINTER WEATHER LASHES DELHI

elhi's weather took a dramatic turn on Friday, thunderstorms, moderate to heavy rainfall lashing the city. The waterlogging that ensued threw traffic out of gear in many places. Continuous rainfall compounded the coldwave conditions gripping Delhi and its surrounding areas. The frigid weather is expected to last longer and a yellow alert has also been issued as light to moderate rain, accompanied thunderstorms, is likely to continue on Saturday, and Sunday.

With dense fog enveloping the National Capital, Delhi's Indira Gandhi International Airport (IGIA) Airport has activated low-visibility procedures to ensure smooth operations. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast shallow fog on Saturday morning, with light to moderate spells

of rain in the evening.

According to the IMD, the National Capital recorded its highest December rainfall in the last 15 years. The rain began on Friday around 2.30 am and continued throughout

December stands at 42.8 mm, marking the highest rainfall this month in the last 15 years, based on data from 2009 to 2024 available on the weather department's website. Meanwhile, the all-time highest December rainfall was recorded in 1884, when the city received 134.4 mm of

For comparison, the city's December rainfall in 2023 was trace, while in 2022 it was 0.0 mm, 2021 saw 9.6 mm, and 2020 recorded just 1.6 mm. In 2019, Delhi recorded 33.9 mm of rainfall in December, which now stands as the second-highest in the last 15 years.

Following the rain, the maximum temperature was recorded 14 degree Celsius, six notches below the normal while the minimum temperature stood at 11 degree Celsius, four degree above the normal. The gap between the maximum and

GRAP Stage-III lifted

As Delhi gets some respite from toxic air and air quality improves, Commission of Air Quality Management (CAQM) has lifted stringent pollution curbs under Stage-III of the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP) in the national capital and surrounding areas with immediate effect. As the GRAP-III was revoked, the Commission lifted a ban on non-essential construction work and plying of BS-III petrol and BS-IV diesel fourwheelers in Delhi-NCR. pollution However, restrictions under GRAP Stage-II and I, will continue in place in the National Capital Region (NCR).

Delhi's air pollution levels showed a declining trend and the 24-hour average Air Quality Index (AQI) stood at 324 at 7 pm. According to forecasts from the India Meteorological Department (IMD) and the Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology, the air quality

situation is predicted to improve further owing to favourable conditions.

"Owing to the favourable meteorological conditions and continuous rains since early morning, the AQI of Delhi has been continuously improving and has been recorded as 348 at 5:00 PM, 341 at 6:00 PM and 334 at 7:00 PM and the trend/forecast suggest the AQI levels to further go down," the CAQM said in its order.

'While GRAP Stage-III is being revoked, keeping in view the winter season when weather conditions may not be always favourable and in order to ensure that the AQI levels do not slip further, citizens are requested to strictly adhere to the citizen charter under GRAP Stages II & I.The Sub-Committee, shall be keeping a close watch on the air quality scenario and review the situation from time to time for further appropriate decision depending upon the Air Quality in Delhi and forecast

Controversy over Manmohan's State funeral

controversy has erupted over the location Afor performing the last rites of former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh following the Centre's announcement that his State funeral will be performed at Nigambodh Ghat crematorium, at 11.45 am on Saturday morning. The Congress has asked the ruling party to allot a place befitting the stature of the two-time Prime Minister.

The Congress party has approached the Centre seeking a memorial for Dr Singh, the party's stalwart leader. According to sources, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge has conveyed the party's desire to Prime Minister

Narendra Modi. According to an order issued on Friday, by the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), the funeral will take place at Nigambodh ghat, located on the banks of the Yamuna river, and arrangements will be made by the Defence Ministry for a State funeral with full military honours.

Meanwhile, traffic is expected to be affected in Central Delhi till around 2 pm, as security arrangements will be in place.
Several dignitaries including Prime
Minister Narendra Modi will be there to pay their tributes. According to a senior police official, arrangements have been made accordingly with all protocols in place, since it is one of the busiest crematoriums in the city. The complex also has a CNG crematorium.

Commuters to and from Central Delhi will have to plan their journey on the weekend accordingly as security protocols and VVIP routes are in place for the last rites of the senior Congress leader.

Delhi's power bills get leaner

In a big relief to electricity **L**consumers, the Delhi Regulatory Electricity Commission (DERC) has reduced the Power Purchase Adjustment Cost (PPAC) imposed by the Discoms in the National Capital. The PPAC collected by BSES Rajdhani Power was 35.83, BSES Yamuna Power 38.12 and Tata Power 36.33.

According to the DERC's order, PPAC will be reduced from 37.75 percent to 13.63 percent in areas under the BSES Yamuna; 35.83 percent to 18.19 percent in areas under BSÉS Raidhani and 37.88 percent to 20.52 percent in Tata Power's areas from December 21, 2024 to March 20, 2025. It is estimated that to 20 percent electricity bill will come down after the DERC's order. to

According calculations, a consumer in South Delhi (under BRPL) using up to 400 units of power will likely get relief of around Rs 285 in their monthly bill. Those using up to 600 units of power will likely get relief of around Rs 563 in their monthly bill. An East Delhi consumer using up to 400 units, will likely get relief of Rs 390 per month. Those using up to 600 units, will get relief of Rs 554 per month in their electricity bill. For a north Delhi consumer who uses 400 units, will likely get relief of Rs 281 per month. Those who use 600 units will likely get relief of Rs 554 per month in

their electricity billing.

Pilgrims wait in vain as Katra protests continue

Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Sangarsh Samiti extended the ongoing bandh call for another 72 hours on Friday in protest against the proposed Ropeway project. The extension of the Bandh call across Katra township is bound to aggravate the hardships faced by the pilgrims. On the eve of the New Year celebrations, Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine witnesses a huge rush of pilgrims who usher in the New Year by offering prayers in the sanctum sanctorum.

Due to the ongoing agitation, pilgrims are already deprived of basic amenities, refreshments and transport facilities along the Yatra trek and in the Katra township, the base camp of the cave shrine. The local shopkeepers and other service providers have been observing a complete shutdown since December 25.

The Shrine board authorities have made some alternate arrangements at the Railway station and bus station to provide refreshments to the pilgrims reaching Katra via the rail/road network. Inclement weather conditions

have further compounded the miseries of pilgrims as it becomes difficult for them to trek the serpentine trek along with their luggage in the absence of pony wallahs and pithoos (men who ferry luggage, and children on their back). So far 93.60 lakh pilgrims have offered prayers inside the cave shrine this year.

The decision to extend the bandh call was taken after several rounds of consultations by the members of the sangarsh samiti in Katra. Meanwhile, family members of the

In a bizarre incident, a poor man reportedly travelled about 300 kms, from Itarsi to Iabalpur in Madhya Pradesh. He is said to have clung under the train's bogie, placing himself between the wheels of the Patna bound Pune Express Danapur Thursday. The yet to be identified man

was caught during a routine 'rolling test' in which check personnel undercarriage, near Jabalpur railway station. The staff of the Carriage and Wagon department found the man hiding under the coach. Till the filing of this report the incident was being probed by the Railway Protection Force (RPF). The RPF and railway



officials said employees were conducting a routine undergear check of the coaches when they found the man lying in the trolley beneath the S4 coach of Danapur Express. The identity of the man was not revealed who has admitted to board the train at Itarsi but he confessed to travel in that manner since

went viral on social media. The video has left the netizens perplexed, with some calling 'Bangladeshi' and 'Rohingya', and others questioning the need to undertake such a lethal stunt for want of money. Some of them even blamed the railways saying it is still unable to provide an affordable journey for a poor man. CM reviews paddy procurement and gives necessary instructions

hief Minister Mohan Yadav has said that ✓ arrangements should be made to ensure payment to the farmers as early as possible whose paddy has been pro-cured. The procurement amount should be paid in three to four days by simplifying the process. He said that in view of the weather, transport the paddy lying in the open as soon as possible and protect it from rain. He said that even if the procured paddy is kept in the open in the godown premises, it should be kept inside as soon as possible. Chief Minister Dr. Yadav was reviewing paddy procurement at Samatva Bhavan (CM's residence) on Friday. Cooperative Minister Vishwas Kailash Sarang, Farmer Welfare and

Agriculture Development

Minister Aidal Singh Kansana, Additional Chief Secretary Dr. Rajesh Rajoura, Additional Chief Secretary and Agriculture Production Commissioner Mohammad Suleman, Additional Chief Secretary Cooperation Ashok Barnwal, Principal Secretary Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Protection Smt. Rashmi Arun Shami and other senior officers

were present in the meeting. Chief Minister Dr. Yadav said that in the cooperative societies where paddy is kept under the open sky, in view of the possibility of bad weather, the societies should immediately cover the paddy lying in the open with tarpaulin etc. to protect the procured paddy from rain. He asked the departmental officers to request the farmers to wait for a few days or bring their paddy for procurement only when the paddy milling.

weather is clear. If the weather remains bad for a long time, the government will also consider extending the fixed period of paddy procurement. Yadav asked the officers to direct the paddy millers to also get their paddy lifted as soon as possible. He asked the officers of the Civil Supplies Corporation to immediately transport the procured paddy and take it to a safe place and make arrangements as per

Chief Minister Dr. Yadav said that the procurement process should be simplified so that paddy of maximum farmers can be procured by the stipulated time limit. The paddy that is being procured from the farmers, try to give it to the millers in maximum quantity, this will save time, money and labour spent on the process of

year 1393 paddy procurement centres have been set up in the state, in which 22.86 lakh metric paddy has been procured so far. So far 3.48 lakh farmers have sold their paddy. Arrangements are being made to ensure that payments to the farmers from whom procurement has been done are made in the shortest possible time. Till December 26, 45 lakh metric tonnes of paddy common (grade A category) has been procured. The farmers from whom paddy has been procured have been paid Rs 1,961 crore as procurement price. There is no shortage of gunny bags in the state. Transportation and storage of procured paddy is also being done properly. There are a total of 674 contracted millers in the state. So far, 3.36 lakh metric tonnes of procured paddy has been lifted by them.

2024 was the year of achievements for MP Transco: Tomar

adhya Pradesh Energy Minister Pradyuman Singh Tomar announced that 2024 has been a year of historic achievements for the Madhya Pradesh Power Transmission Company (MP Transco). The company has played a pivotal role in strengthening, expanding, and ensuring the reliability of the state's transmission network infrastructure. The minister highlighted that the transformation capacity of the state's power network increased by an additional 1,729 MVA this year, bringing the total capacity to an impressive 80,774 MVA. The installation of 47 new power transformers raised the number of energized transformers to 1,023 across the state. These include 37 transformers of 400 KV, 215 of 220 KV, and 771 of 132 KV, all operational in the



MP Transco network. In terms of transmission lines, the state witnessed the addition of 176 circuit kilometers, increasing the total length of power transmission lines to 42,133 circuit kilometers. These lines ensure efficient electricity transmission across 416 Extra High Tension (EHT) substations in the

One of the significant milestones achieved this year was MP Transco's ability to handle a record power demand of 18,913 MW on December 20, 2024, without any disruption. This historic achievement also included the successful supply of 3,368.56 lakh units of electricity in a single day, setting a new benchmark for the state's power

The integration of advanced technologies into the transmission system marked another

achievement for MP Transco. Various transmission elements are now controlled using Human Machine Interface (HMI) technology, and operations at three old 132 KV EHV substations have been successfully transitioned to remote management. The state also expanded drone patrolling to monitor 400 KV and 132 KV transmission lines, a firstof-its-kind initiative in India. MP Transco has also introduced several online services for its pensioners, enabling retired employees to upload life certificates and access pension-related information conveniently through its website. Additionally, young engineers benefited from webinars and knowledge-sharing workshops, fostering a positive shift in work culture.

Spike in viral cases: Post-viral syndrome and air pollution worsen

¬he changing weather and rising air pollution have significantly altered the nature of viral fever this season, prolonging recovery and exacerbating complications. Patients are taking 15 to 20 days to recover, with lingering symptoms such as fatigue and weakness persisting for weeks. Medical experts report a sharp increase in OPD visits, with numbers surging from 650 to 1,100 daily at major hospitals like Hamidia, JP, and AIIMS.

Every Fourth Patient Reporting Viral Symptoms

Doctors note that one in four OPD patients presents with symptoms of fever, cold, cough, and sore throat. Post-viral syndrome, characterized by prolonged weakness, fatigue, and muscle pain, has become increasingly common. Approximately

40% of patients at JP and Hamidia hospitals report these symptoms after the fever subsides, indicating compromised immunity following viral infec-

Dr. Anil Shejwar, a professor at Gandhi Medical College, attributes the surge in cases to sudden weather fluctuations. "The weather has changed twice in the last 10 days, with daytime temperatures dropping. This has increased cases of cold, cough, and sore throat among people outdoors," he explained. Additionally, itching and rashes have been reported, further bur-

dening clinics and hospitals.

Impact on Children: Rising **Lung Infections**

Air pollution is severely affecting children, with many suffering from lung infections and persistent coughs. Dr. Rajesh Tikkas, Professor of Pediatrics at Gandhi Medical College, revealed that

one in three children visiting the OPD shows symptoms of lung infections caused by viral fever. Histamine release from platelets during the infection is causing red rashes on the face and body, typically appearing on the second or third day of fever. Up to 35% of pediatric patients exhibit these

symptoms. Child specialist Dr. Rahul Agarwal highlighted the worsening situation among children. "Cough is the most persistent symptom this time, taking up to two weeks to resolve. Air pollution is rapidly worsening lung infections, making breathing difficult for children." he stated ficult for children," he stated. Preventive Measures and

Recommendations Doctors emphasize the importance of taking precautions during this weather and pollution crisis. They advise:

Balanced Diet: Consume pro-

enriched foods to boost immu-

Hydration: Drink plenty of water and warm liquids to ease symp-

Rest: Ensure adequate rest to help the body recover fully. Immunity Boosters: Use natur-

al remedies like kadha and dry fruits, especially for children and the elderly. Senior medical professionals also urge the public to avoid unnec-

essary exposure to polluted air and sudden temperature changes.

Private Clinics Overwhelmed Private clinics are witnessing increased footfall as the viral fever wave spreads. Senior doctors stress the need for heightened caution in this weather. The combination of weather changes and air pollution has made people more susceptible to infections, and vigilance is cru-

cial," said Dr. Shejwar.

POCSO Act provides death penalty for sexual offenses against children

Protection of Children from Sexual Offenses Act (POCSO) has been enacted to protect children from sexual crimes. Under this law made by the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development, action is taken in cases of sexual crimes and molestation of minor children like sexual harassment, sexual exploitation, and pornography. In this, different punishments are also prescribed for dif-

ferent crimes. This Act is applicable in the entire country. All offenses under POCSÓ are heard by a Special Court on camera in the presence of the child's parents or people whom the child trusts.

After the implementation of the POCSO Act 2012, in the year 2020, along with many other amendments, the scope of punishment has been increased in the POCSO Act and provision of punishment ranging from life imprisonment to death penalty has been made. Section 3 of the Act provides for imprisonment of at least 10 years for sexual assault, which can be extended up to life imprisonment, and provision for fine in Section 4. For aggravated penetrative sexual assault there is a minimum imprison-

ment of 20 years under Section 5, which may extend to life imprisonment/death penalty. In this, provision for a fine has also been made in Section 6. In case of sexual assault, Section 7 provides for a minimum imprisonment of 3 years, which can be extended up to 5 years and a fine is also provided for in Section 8. In case of aggravated sexual assault, Section 9 provides for a minimum imprisonment of 5 years, which can be extended up to 7 years. Besides, a provision for a fine has also been made in Section 10. In the Act, for sexual harassment, there is a provision of 3 years imprisonment in Section 11 and a fine in Section

The POCSO Act has stringent provisions against using children for obscene purposes. There is a provision of 5 years imprisonment in Section 13 for using children for obscene purposes/pornography and in case of subsequent offenses in Section 14(1), there is a provision of 7 years imprisonment and fine. Section 14(2) of the Act provides for a minimum imprisonment of 10 years which may extend to life imprisonment/death penalty in case of serious case of sexual exploitation while using children for obscene purposes.

ED raids former RTO constable Saurabh Sharma's premises in Bhopal, Gwalior, Jabalpur

he Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Friday conducted simultaneous raids on the properties of former RTO constable Saurabh Sharma in Bhopal, Gwalior, and Jabalpur. Multiple teams of the ED carried out the searches, uncovering crucial documents and suspected evi-

dence of hidden wealth. In Bhopal, ED officials inspected Jaipuria School in the 1100 Quarters area and two houses in Arera Colony (house numbers 78 and 657) starting at 5 AM. Using metal detectors and modwalls and floors for hidden valuables. These searches were prompted by previous Lokayukta raids that revealed 2.5 kilograms of silver concealed under floor tiles in Sharma's home.

In Gwalior, the ED team raided Sharma's residence in Bahodapur with police assistance. However, Gwalior SP Dharamveer Singh stated that no investigation agency had contacted local police, leaving them unaware of the raid's specifics. Retired DSP Munish Raioria, who lives nearby, confirmed that the property belongs to Dr. Rakesh Sharma, father of Saurabh Sharma.

Simultaneously, another ED team reached the Shastri Nagar residence of builder Rohit Tiwari in Jabalpur, Tiwari, a relative of Saurabh's wife, is under scruti-

Sharma's investments. ED officials reportedly questioned Tiwari's family members about Sharma's financial dealings. Sources revealed that Saurabh Sharma had invested crores in properties under the names of his wife's brother Shubham Tiwari, friend Chetan Singh Gaur, and brother-in-law Rohit Tiwari. Investigations also revealed that Sharma founded a

construction company, Omega Realcon Private Limited, in 2012, appointing Gaur and Sharad Jaiswal as directors, while Tiwari served as an additional During Lokayukta raids on Saurabh Sharma, originally from cash, two quintals of silver, gold jewelry, and numerous property documents were seized from

Sharma's properties in Arera Colony. A car reportedly carrying 54 kilograms of gold and ?11 crore in cash was also seen leaving the premises during the raid. The vehicle, traced to a farmhouse in Mendori, was linked to Sharma's associate, Gaur.

The ED entered the case on December 23, registering a money laundering complaint against Saurabh Sharma and his associates. Lokayukta also issued summons to five individuals, including Sharma, in connection with the case. Legal Challenges and Rejected

Cooperative Minister Vishwas Kailash Sarang, Farmer Welfare and Agriculture Development Minister Aidal Singh Kansana, Additional Chief Secretary Rajesh Rajoura, Additional Chief Secretary and Agriculture Production Commissioner Mohammad Suleman, Additional Chief Secretary Cooperation Ashok

Barnwal, Principal Secretary Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Protection Smt. Rashmi Arun Shami and other senior officers were present in the meeting. Yadav said that in the coopera-

tive societies where paddy is kept under the open sky, in view of the possibility of bad weather, the societies should immediately cover the paddy lying in the open with tarpaulin etc. to protect the procured paddy from rain. He asked the departmental officers to request the farmers to wait for a few days or bring their paddy for procurement only when the weather is clear. If the weather remains bad for a long time, the government will also consider extending the fixed period of paddy procurement. CM Dr. Yadav asked the officers to direct the paddy millers to also get their paddy lifted as soon as possible. He asked the officers of the Civil Supplies Corporation to immediately transport the procured paddy and take it to a safe place and make arrangements as per the need.

Yadav said that the procurement process should be simpli-

fied so that paddy of maximum farmers can be procured by the stipulated time limit. The paddy that is being procured from the farmers, try to give it to the millers in maximum quantity, this will save time, money and labour spent on the process of

ment systems.

paddy milling. For paddy transportation, maximum vehicles should be deployed through contracted transporters and if necessary, other transporters/vehicles should be acquired and paddy should be transported. The paddy stored in the open at the warehouse level procurement centre should be stacked in the warehouse through cooperative societies. Approval letter should be issued quickly for prompt payment to the farmers selling paddy at the support price. Paddy should be procured as per FAQ norms by the Government of India, for its monitoring staff of other departments should

also be deployed. Principal Secretary Food and Civil Supplies informed that this year 7.72 lakh farmers have registered for paddy procurement, which is more than last year 2023-24 (7.27 lakh). This year 1393 paddy procurement centres have been set up in the state, in which 22.86 lakh metric paddy has been procured so far. So far 3.48 lakh farmers have sold their paddy. Arrangements are being made to ensure that payments to the farmers from whom procurement has been done are made in the shortest possible time. Till 26 December, 45 lakh metric tonnes of paddy common (grade A category) has been procured. The farmers from whom paddy has been procured have been paid Rs 1,961 crore as procurement price. There is no shortage of gunny bags in the state. Transportation and storage of procured paddy is also being done properly. There are a total of 674 contracted millers in the state. So far, 3.36 lakh metric tonnes of procured paddy has been lifted by them.

Farmers are being informed through SMS that paddy procurement will be postponed on 30, 31 December and I January. The last date for paddy procurement has been extended from 20 January to 23 January.

Singh's half-brother Surjit Singh Kohli said the former prime minister had deep affection for his grandmother, who raised him following his mother's death when he was very young.

After migrating to India, the Singh family settled in a small rented house in Amritsar till he graduated.

His passing also witnessed people from various fields sharing their anecdotes about him. The social media was flooded with pictures that people posted along with the former prime minister and shared their memories with fondness and nostalgia.

Issued more than one million nonimmigrant visas for second year in row: US mission in India

The US mission in India on Friday said it issued more than one million nonimmigrant visas for the second year in a row, including a record number of visitor visas, underscoring the huge demand of Indians for travel to the US.

Washington is also working to formally establish a US-based to renew H-1B visas in that country in 2025 that is expected to benefit a significant number of Indians.

In the past four years, visitor numbers from India have increased by five times, and more than two million Indians travelled to the US in the first 11 months of 2024, a 26 per cent increase over the same period in 2023, it said.

Over five million Indians already have a nonimmigrant visa to visit the US and each day the mission issues thousands more, the embassy said. "The US mission to India issued more than one million nonimmigrant visas for the second year in a row, including a record number of visitor visas, underscoring the huge demand of Indians for travel to the United States for tourism, business, and education," it said in a readout.

The embassy noted that the State Department completed a successful pilot programme to renew H-1B visas in the US States this year. This allowed many specialty occupation workers from India to renew their visas without leaving the

US.
"This pilot program streamlined the renewal process for thousands of applicants, and the Department of State is working to formally establish a US-based renewal program

in 2025," it said. The US mission to India issued tens of thousands of



legal family reunification and the migration of skilled professionals, according to the

These immigrant visa holders became permanent residents upon their arrival, adding to the already rich and sizable Indian diaspora community in the US, it said.

The US mission to India also provided more than 24,000 passports and other consular services to American citizens living and travelling in India,

A new version of the Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP) debuted in 2024, making it easier for the embassy and consulates to contact American citizens during emergencies and send them safety and security alerts, the embássy added.

It said increase in processing of thousands of interview waiver-eligible nonimmigrant visa applications each week made it quicker and easier than ever for Indians to renew their nonimmigrant visas.

"By streamlining operations and utilizing global consular resources, the US mission has been able to redirect its own resources to focus on in-person interviews, reducing wait times for all applicants," it said. The mission also provided details about visas issued to Indian students. "More Indian students than ever before now

2024, India became the top sender of international students for the first time since the 2008/2009 academic year with more than 331,000 students overall studying in the US," it said.

It further added that India also remained the largest sender of international graduate students in the US for the second

Índian graduate student numbers increased by 19 per cent to reach almost 200,000 students, according to the details "Many exchange visitors will now be able to remain in the United States and not need to return home for two years after completing their programmes in the US, offering them more opportunities to further their careers and education," the embassy said.

The removal of India from the Exchange Visitors Skills List has provided greater flexibility for these Indian J-1 nonimmigrant visa holders," it said.

SC expresses concern over condition of farmer leader Dallewal

The Supreme Court on **▲** Friday expressed concern over the condition of farmer leader Jagjit Singh Dallewal, who is on an indefinite hunger strike, and directed the Punjab Government to ensure he was given medical assistance. A vacation bench of Justices Surya Kant and Sudhanshu Dhulia issued a notice to the Punjab government on a contempt petition against its chief secretary and the director general of police (DGP) for noncompliance of an order directing medical aid to Dallewal. "If there is a law and order situation, you have to deal with it with iron hands. Somebody's life is at stake. You need to take

it seriously. Medical aid has to be given and the impression is that you are not following it," the bench said. The top court directed the State Government to file a compliance report by December 28, when it would again hear the matter and ordered the Punjab chief secretary and the DGP to virtually remain present during the

hearing. During the hearing, Punjab Advocate General (AG) Gurminder Singh submitted a delegation of eight cabinet ministers along with the Punjab DGP visited the protest site to convince Dallewal to move to a hospital but the farmers resisted it. "We have provided everything on site. If there is physical jostling, we cannot take that risk," he added.



The bench however responded, We have serious doubts about those farmers, those who are not conscious and aware and concerned about his life." The AG said the State Government was "very earnestly" following up on the issue. When the bench wondered if the Centre could offer assistance to the

State Government, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta said its interference might lead to complications. "Few people cannot keep him (Dallewal) hostage. One man's life is in danger. The State Government can take measures," said Mehta.

The Punjab AG informed the

bench when the Ministers' delegation went to meet Dallewal on December 24, he gave a letter addressed to the Prime Minister. "He says, if some dialogue is opened up, only then he is willing to cooperate with medical assistance," Singh said. Mehta said Dallewal's admission in a hospital should be the top priority. Dallewal has been on an indefinite fast at the Khanauri border since November 26 to press the Centre to accept the farmers

demands, including a legal guarantee of minimum support price for crops.

On December 20, the top court

left it to the Punjab government officials and doctors to decide on the hospitalisation of Dallewal. The court had said 70-year-old Dallewal could be moved to the makeshift hospital setup within 700 metre of the protest site at Khanauri border between Punjab and Haryana.

The bench on December 19 referred to civil rights activist Irom Sharmila continuing her protest for more than a decade under medical supervision and asked the Punjab government to convince Dallewal for a health examination. It had pulled up the state for not running medical tests on Dallewal.

Achilling international connection has surfaced in the case of three Khalistan Zindabad Force (KZF) terrorists who were killed in a police encounter in Pilibhit. Local police investigations revealed that a call from England played a crucial role in arranging the terrorists' stay in Puranpur, where they were hosted with the help of local accomplices.

The incident has led to the detention of two individuals—Jaspal Sunny, a resident of Gajraula Japati village, and his associate Deepak-whose involvement came to light through CCTV footage obtained from Harji Hotel, where the terrorists were lodged. The police have also registered cases against the

Acting on this request, Jaspal, accompanied by Deepak, traveled to Puranpur, where they met the three terrorists and took them to a dhaba for dinner before arranging their stay at Harji Hotel. The terrorists were checked

into Room 105 of the hotel using fake Aadhar cards, allegedly sent from England by Sidhu. The police have since sealed the room and initiated a detailed investigation

Adhikari however said that if there was any threat from the organizations like Lashkar e Toiba or Harkat ul Mujahideen then the people of Bengal and India would protect him.

A silent crusader

Dr Manmohan Singh a reluctant politician yet a resilient leader and a gentleman is no more but his legacy lives on

The man with the vision and selfless dedication to the nation, Dr Manmohan Singh is no more. Dr Singh passed away on December 26, 2024, at the age of 92. Dr Singh, a towering figure in Indian politics and economics, breathed his last at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences. His demise marks the end of an era defined by humility, intellect and steadfast dedication to nation-building. 

While presented as a solution to counter declining population trends, Bhagwat's remarks have ignited debates over their communal undertones, potential to deepen gender inequality, and disconnection from contemporary realities. larger discourse on demographic imbalances, often aimed at minority communities. This rhetoric fosters fear, undermines social harmony, and contradicts India's pluralistic traditions. Today's youth prioritise quality of life over larger families, influenced by rising living costs, career aspirations, and financial stability. Bhagwat's appeal appears disconnected from these realities, highlighting a gap between traditionalist agendas and contemporary Indian values.

The RSS chief's observations clash with India's family planning efforts from the late 1960s and 1970s when the emphasis was on small families. Even former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi, during her tenure, highlighted the dangers of unchecked population growth, stressing the need for planned families. Bhagwat's outdated stance ignores

India must stand firm against Sheikh Hasina's extradition



India faces a pivotal decision as it considers Bangladesh's request to extradite Sheikh Hasina, former Prime Minister and a steadfast ally



heikh Hasina must not be sent back to Bangladesh in response to the note verbale received from that country's interim government calling for her extradition. Dhaka's move has followed the issue of an arrest warrant by Bangladesh's International Crimes Tribunal (ICT) against her and a number of her former ministers, advisers, military and civil officials. The allegation? "Crimes against humanity and genocide". There are two broad reasons why India should not send her back. As prime minister of Bangladesh, she has been a steadfast friend of India whereas other heads of that country's government, except her father, Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, have tended to be unfriendly. Second, she will, by no means, receive a fair trial in Bangladesh and perhaps even be lynched, given the intense hostility of the current rulers of Bangladesh harbour towards

There will be solid legal basis for India's stand. Article 8 (1) (a) of the 'Treaty Between the Republic of India and the People's Republic of Bangladesh Relating to Extradition, says that a person may not THAT IT WOULD BE extradited if he satisfies the Requested State that it would, having regard to all the circumstances, be unjust or oppressive to extradite him" because, in the words of Article 8 (1) (A) (iii), the accusations against him "have not been made in good faith in the interests of justice." Besides Article 8 (2) reads, "A person who has been convicted of an extradition offence may not be extradited AGAINST HER HAD therefor unless he was sentenced to imprisonment or other form of detention NOT BEEN MADE IN for a period of four months or more." Sheikh Hasina has yet to be sentenced to any period of imprisonment or detention. Also, she can very well claim that it would be "unjust or oppressive" to extradite her because the accusation against her had not been made in "good faith in the interest of justice", and are a result of pure vindictiveness. That she would be justified in saying so becomes clear on considering the diatribes unleashed against her by the advisers of the interim government and the relentless persecution, including involving in hundreds of false cases, of

According to a report in The Daily Star carried under the headline, "No option but to succeed: Yunus" on August 18, 2024, Ced: Yunus on August 18, 2024, Chief Adviser Muhammad Yunus had said during a "Meet and Greet" session with foreign diplo-mats in Dhaka, "In their efforts to stay in power, the Sheikh Hasina dictatorship destroyed every institution of the country. Judiciary was broken. Democratic rights were suppressed through a brutal decade-and-a-half long crackdown. Elections were rigged blatantly. Generations of young people grew up without exercising their voting rights. Banks were robbed with full political patronisation. And the state coffer was plundered by abusing

Referring to a proposed Awami League rally on November10, 2024, Muhammad Yunus' press secretary, Shafiqul Alam, had written in a Facebook post on November 9, - I ne Awami League "UNJUST OR in its current form is a fascist party. There is no way this fascist party will be allowed to hold protests in Bangladesh. Anyone who would try to hold rally, gathering and processions by taking orders from the mass murderer and dictator Sheikh Hasina will face full force of the law enforcing agencies."

Leaders of the Students Discrimination Movement (ADSM), formed on July 1, 2024, to carry the students' struggle forward, and Jatiya Nagarik Committee (National Citizens Committee), formed on 8 September, 2024, to consolidate the movement's message and political goals, have spoken in a similar strident and denunciato-

Áccording to a report by Ashibul Islam Rifat in the Dhaka Tribune Standard on October 16 itself, (23 October, 2024) appearing

under the headline "Nahid: Awami League will never be allowed back into politics in our lifetime," Md Naĥid Islam, an ADSM leader who is now advisor, in charge of information and broadcasting and other ministries, said at a discussion, that the Awami League's return to politics in the manner and ideology it previously adhered to would be tantamount to "a betrayal to the martyrs of the uprising. And certainly, as long as we are alive, we will not allow this to happen." Leaders of political parties like the Bangladesh Nationalist Party and the Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami (Jamaat) have also denounced the Äwami League.

One can argue that the ICT, and any other court where Sheikh Hasina and other accused may be tried, will ignore such vituperations and pronounce its judgement on the basis of the evidence and arguments placed before it. A horse would guffaw on hearing this. The judiciary has been brought to heel through forced resignations and dismissals. The process began as early as August 10, 2024, when chief justice Obaidul Hassan of the Supreme Court and five judges of the appellate division, resigned as hundreds of students affiliated to the ADSM gathered on the court premises demanding that they quit, and threatened to besiege their residences if they did not. On October 16, the new chief justice, Syed Refaat Ahmed, sent 12 High Court judges, appointed during the Sheikh Hasina-led Awami League rule, on leave following a demonstration in the court premises by adherents of the ADSM led by Hasnat Abdullah and Sarjis Alam. According to a report in Bangladesh's The Business announcing the plan, Hasnat

Abdullah, had written in a Facebook post on October 15, "In demand of the resignation of the fascist judges of the Awami League, we will besiege the High Court tomorrow (Wednesday) at 11am.

The ICT itself was reconstituted on October 15, 2024, with Justice Md Golam Mortuza Majumder from the High Court Division of Bangladesh Supreme Court as its new chairman, and Justice Md Shafiul Alam Mahmud and retired District and Sessions Judge Md Mohitul Haque Enam Chowdhury as members of the

The result is a pliant judiciary and the use of the justice system to persecute not only those associated with the Awami League but civil society activists, writers, journalists and human rights activists. A shocking example is the levelling of a false murder charge against a highly-respected senior advocate of Bangladesh's Supreme Court, ZI Khan Panna. Referring to the Star wrote in an editorial titled "This weaponisation of legal cases must stop" and published on October 21, 2024, "Over the two months and a half since August 5, we have published multiple reports and editorials on the indiscriminate filing of such murder cases without any evidence, mostly implicating the leaders, activists, and suspected supporters of the Awami League regime. Even journalists and rights activists were not spared. In many cases, fabricated FIRs were filed. There were also instances of the names of accused in cases predating August 5 being replaced. This is nothing but a weaponisation of the legal process for harassment and political vendettas." Will Sheikh Hasina get justice in such a situa-

Unlocking economic potential: Bridging the gender gap in public procurement

In India, strides in gender budgeting and supportive policies are fostering greater opportunities for women entrepreneurs

ow much of the goods and services purchased by government departments and public sector enterprises come from womenowned businesses? This crucial question is rarely asked, and it underscores the need for gender-responsive procurement policies in India and across South Asia. With government procurement "accounting for an average of 12 per cent of gross domestic product (GDP) in OECD countries, and up to 30 per cent of GDP in many developing countries," the untapped economic potential for women entrepreneurs to contribute as suppliers of solutions to governments is

immense. Yet, globally, women-owned enterprises still win only 1 per cent of this significant public actual gender budget expendi more resources are being allo-

procurement WEConnect International is actively working to bridge this gap. Our efforts are making headway, especially in countries such as India, where policy frameworks are beginning to reflect a greater emphasis on gender inclusivity. The central government has

increasingly prioritised women-centric policies, evident from the substantial rise in gender budget allocations, which is another way to support women and girls in addition to buying their products and services. For example, in 2013-14, Rs 97,134 crore was earmarked for women's welfare and empowerment. By 2024-25, this figure had reached Rs 3.27 lakh crore, marking a 19

In the last year (2023-24), the actual expenditure on gender budgeting was 16 per cent higher (Rs 2.75 lakh crore) than the total budgeted amount (Rs 2.38 lakh crore). The Indian government's Public Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs) Order, 2018, exemplifies this progress. The policy mandates that every central ministry, department, and PSU must procure at least 25 per cent of their needs from MSEs, with 3 per cent specifically reserved for womenowned micro and small enterprises. There has been progress since the mandated 3 per cent procurement target for women-owned MSEs was introduced in 2018. Public procurement from these enter-

prises has risen from almost

zero in 2017-18 to 1.8 per cent

The number of women-owned (owned and controlled by women having the minimum financial interest of 51 per cent of the capital and with women constituting at least 51 per cent of generated employment) MSEs benefiting from public procurement grew from 1,410 (accounting for Rs 232.56 crore) to 21,128 (Rs 3056.4 crore) in six years.

challenges that, if addressed, could help India achieve a more gender-inclusive public procurement ecosystem. For example, there is currently no independent body to resolve complaints in the procurement system, leaving unhappy bidders with only two options: filing complaints directly with the purchasing entity or taking them to arbitration or court as outlined in the General Financial Rules (GFR) 2017.

Generally, there is a pressing need for transparency, welldefined processes, and a robust mechanism for addressing grievances in tender and procurement procedures so that women-owned businesses receive constructive feedback if their bids are unsuccessful.

refine their future proposals and compete more effectively. Such measures would help mitigate biases in tendering and procurement processes that disproportionately disadvantage women-owned enter-prises. The government could also pass procurement legislation to standardise bidding processes using a central law that sets national standards and state laws that fit specific needs, with the central government providing comprehensive over-

Public authorities could also sensitise officials on the need to counteract gender biases that may influence the design of procurement processes. A strong starting point would be to appoint more women to oversee public procurement Public procurement from women-owned enterprises in India over the past six years has grown at an average annual growth rate of 70.5 per cent, while the number of beneficiary women entrepreneurs has increased at an average annual rate of 77 per cent because the baseline was close to zero. In 2023-24, total public procurement in India reached Rs 1.70 lakh crore, highlighting a growing opportunity for women to engage with the expanding public procurement market in the world's fastestgrowing economy.

Germany's president dissolves parliament; polls on Feb 23

Terman President Frank-GWalter Steinmeier on Friday ordered parliament dissolved and set new elections for February 23 in the wake of the collapse of Chancellor Olaf Scholz's coalition, saying it was the only way to give the country a stable government capable of tackling its problems. Scholz lost a confidence vote on

December 16 and leads a minority government after his unpopular and notoriously rancorous three-party coalition collapsed on November 6 when he fired his finance minister in a dispute over how to revitalise Germany's stagnant economy. Steinmeier said he made the decision because it was clear after consultation with party leaders that there was no agreement among Germany's political parties on a majority for a new government in the current parliament. thIt is precisely in difficult times

like these that stability requires a government capable of taking action and a reliable majority in parliament," he said as he made the announcement in Berlin. "Therefore I am convinced

that for the good of our country new elections are the right Since the post-World War II constitution doesn't allow the Bundestag to dissolve itself, it was up to Steinmeier to decide whether to dissolve parliament and call an election. He had 21 days to make that decision. Once parliament is dissolved, the election must be held within 60 days. Leaders of several major parties agreed earlier on the election date of February 23, seven months earlier than originally planned.

Steinmeier warned about outside interference in the poll, saying it is "a danger to democracy, whether it is covert, as was evidently the case recently in the Romanian elections, or open and blatant, as is currently being practiced particularly intensively on platform X." A top Romanian court annulled the first round of the

country's presidential election, days after allegations emerged that Russia ran a coordinated online campaign to promote the far-right outsider who won the first round. The campaign is already well

underway. Polls show Scholz's party trailing the conservative opposition Union bloc led by Vice Friedrich Merz. Chancellor Robert Habeck of the environmentalist Greens, the remaining partner in Scholz's government, is also

bidding for the top job though his party is further back. If recent polls hold up, the likely next government would be led by Merz as chancellor in coalition with at least one other Key issues include immigra-

tion, how to get the sluggish economy going, and how best to aid Ukraine in its struggle against Russia. The populist, anti-immigration Alternative for Germany,

or AfD, which is polling strongly, has nominated Alice Weidel as its candidate for chancellor but has no chance of taking the job because other parties refuse to work with it. Germany's electoral system tra-

ditionally produces coalitions, and polls show no party anywhere near an absolute majority on its own. The election is expected to be followed by weeks of negotiations to form a new government.

It's only the fourth time that the Bundestag has been dissolved ahead of schedule under Germany's post-World War II constitution. It happened under Chancellor Willy Brandt in 1972, Helmut Kohl in 1982 and Gerhard Schroeder in 2005. Schroeder used the confidence vote to engineer an early election narrowly won by centreright challenger Angela Merkel.

Ukraine's military intelligence says North Korean troops suffering heavy losses

North Korean troops are suffering heavy losses in the fighting in Russia's Kursk region and facing logistical difficulties as a result of Ukrainian attacks, Ukraine's military intelligence has said. The intelligence agency, known under its acronym GUR, on Thursday said Ukrainian strikes near Novojvanovka inflicted heavy casualties on North Korean units. It said North Korean troops also faced supply issues and even short-

ages of drinking water. Ukrainian Pres President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said earlier this week that 3,000 North Korean troops have been killed and wounded in the fighting in the Kursk region. It marked the first significant estimate by Ukraine of North Korean casualties several weeks after Kyiv announced that North Korea had sent 10,000 to 12,000 troops to Russia to help it in the almost 3-year war.

The casualty disclosure came as the Biden administration was pressing to send as much military aid as possible to Ukraine before President-elect Donald Trump takes over in January. Ukrainian forces launched an incursion into the Kursk region in August, dealing a significant blow to Russia's prestige and forcing it to deploy some of its troops from eastern Ukraine, where they were pressing a slow-moving offensive. The Russian army has been

able to reclaim some territory in the Kursk region from Ukrainian forces, but has failed to fully dislodge them. At the same time, Russia has

sought to break Ukraine's resistance with waves of strikes with cruise missiles and drones against Ukraine's power grid and other infrastructure. The latest attack on Christmas

morning involved 78 missiles and 106 drones, striking power

facilities, Ukraine's air force

said. It claimed to have intercepted 59 missiles and 54 drones and jammed 52 other drones.

On Thursday, Russia attacked Ukraine with 31 exploding drones. Twenty were shot down and another 11 didn't reach their target due to jamming, the Ukrainian air force said.

As part of the daily barrage, Russian forces also struck a central market in Nikopol in the Dnipropetrovsk region with a drone, wounding eight people, according to local author-

Russian President Vladimir Putin threatened Thursday that Russia could again hit Ukraine with the new Oreshnik hypersonic ballistic missile that was first used in a Nov 21 strike on the Ukrainian city of Dnipro.

Speaking to reporters, Putin said Russia has just a few Oreshnik missiles, but added that it wouldn't hesitate to use them on Ukraine.

Aviation experts say Russia's air defence fire likely caused Azerbaijan plane crash

experts said viation AThursday that Russian air defence fire was likely responsible for the Azerbaijani plane crash the day before that killed 38 people and left all 29 survivors

Azerbaijan Airlines' Embraer 190 was en route from Azerbaijan's capital of Baku to the Russian city of Grozny in the North Caucasus on Wednesday when it was diverted for reasons still unclear and crashed while making an attempt to land in Aktau in Kazakhstan after flying east across the Caspian Sea.

The plane went down about 3 km (2 miles) from Aktau. Cellphone footage circulating online appeared to show the aircraft making a steep descent before crashing into the ground and exploding in a fireball.

Other footage showed a part of its fuselage ripped away from the wings and the rest of the aircraft lying upside down on the grass Azerbaijan mourned the crash victims with national flags at halfstaff across on Thursday. Traffic stopped at noon, and sirens sounded from ships and trains as it observed a nationwide moment of silence.

Speaking at a news conference Azerbaijani Wednesday, President Ilham Aliyev said that it was too soon to speculate on the reasons behind the crash, but said that the weather had forced the plane to change from its planned course.

course between Baku and Grozny due to worsening weather conditions and headed to Aktau airport, where it crashed upon landing," he said.

China defends plan to build dam over Brahmaputra River in Tibet; says will not affect lower reaches

hina on Friday defended its →plan to build the world's largest dam on the Brahmaputra River in Tibet saying that the project will not affect riparian states and safety issues have been addressed through decades of

Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson, Mão Ning played down apprehensions over the massive project estimated to cost around USD 137 billion being built in the ecologically fragile Himalayan region located along a tectonic plate boundary where earthquakes occur frequently.

She said China has carried out in depth studies for decades and taken safeguard measures.

China has always been responsible for the development of cross-border rivers, Mao told a media briefing here a question on the concerns related to the dam. She said the hydropower development in Tibet has been studied in an in-depth way for decades and safeguard measures have been taken for the security of the project and ecological and environmental protection.

The project will not affect lower reaches, she said.

China will continue to maintain communication with countries in the lower reaches through existing channels and step up international cooperation on disaster prevention and relief for the benefit of the people by the river, she said.

China on Wednesday approved the construction of the world's largest dam, stated to be the planet's biggest infra project on the Brahmaputra River in Tibet close to the Indian border, raising concerns in riparian states -India and Bangladesh.

The hydropower project is to be built in the lower reaches of the Yarlung Zangbo River, the Tibetan name for the Brahmaputra, an official statement here said.

The dam is to be built at a huge gorge in the Himalayan reaches where the Brahmaputra River makes a huge U-turn to flow into Arunachal Pradesh and then to Bangladesh.

Mao said China's hydropower development in the lower reaches of the Yarlung Zangbo River aims to speed up the development of clean energy and respond to climate change and extreme hydrological disasters. The total investment in the dam could exceed one trillion vuan (USD 137 billion), which would dwarf any other single infrastructure project on the planet including China's own Three Gorges Dam, regarded as the largest in the world, the Hong Kong-based South China Morning Post reported on Thursday.

The Brahmaputra dam was part of the 14th Five-Year Plan (2021-2025) and National Economic and Social Development and the Long-Range Objectives Through the Year 2035 adopted by Plenum, a key policy body of the ruling Communist Party of China (CPC) in 2020.

Concerns arose in India as the dam besides empowering China to control the water flow, the size and scale of it could also enable Beijing to release large amounts of water flooding border areas in times of hostilities. India too is building a dam over

NCLT directs initiation of insolvency proceedings against Hero Electric

PTI NEW DELHI

The National Company Law Tribunal **▲** (NCLT) has directed initiation of insolvency proceedings against Hero Electric after admitting a plea filed by Metro Tyres, an operational creditor claiming a default of Rs 1.85 crore.

As per provisions of the Insolvency & Bankruptcy Code (IBC), NCLT has appointed Bhoopesh Gupta as Interim Resolution Professional to run the company after suspending the board of Hero Electric. The Delhi-based bench of NCLT

rejected the contentions of Hero Electric of a pre-existing dispute with the operational creditor saying that it was "not just a moonshine or feeble legal argument".

The objections raised by Hero Electric are not found "tenable in law" and have been duly negated by Metro Tyres, which had supplied tyres and tubes to the company.

"In the facts and circumstances of the instant case, we are of the view that the corporate debtor has not been able to raise a plausible contention regarding the pre-existence of "dispute" between the parties. Hence, the present petition filed under Section 9 of the IBC, 2016 ought to be admitted," it said.

Besides, a two-member bench in its 16-page order passed on December 20, declared a moratorium, protecting the company from decree or order of any court, tribunal or arbitration panel and ban on transferring, encumbering, alienating or disposing of its assets.

Hero Electric had approached Metro Tyres, for the purchase of cycle tyres and tubes. Pursuant to that it supplied goods to Hero Electric and in lieu of that various invoices were raised from



August 9, 2022 to December 3, 2022 amounting to Rs 3.69 crore out of which Rs 4.27 lakh was paid.

However, Rs 1.85 crore was due on Hero Electric, and Metro Tyres submitted that despite its several requests, the payment was denied by Hero Electric taking a 'moonshine defence' stating that in 90/90x10 tyre and 90/90x12 tyre supplied by it, there was issue of 'tread separation', 'bubbles' and 'air leakage'. It further contended that Hero Electric had never raised any quality issue or any sort of dispute in any manner and this was evident from the Balance Confirmation Letters by

the corporate debtor. The insolvency tribunal also observed

that Hero Electric had not raised any dispute over the quality of goods until nine months after the supply "It is amply clear from the records that

the corporate debtor (Hero Electric) being the purchaser of goods never raised any quality issue or any sort of dispute in any manner whatsoever as per their own inspection/quality control policies immediately after the receipt of the goods and continued to purchase goods," said NCLT.

Hero Electric itself has declared in the user manual/warranty policy for its products that "tyres/tubes" are not covered under it's warranty and the original manufacturer is liable for all or any claim for tyres and tubes.




