War of words follow Manmohan Singh

political row has erupted between the Bharatiya Janata Party-led Centre Congress-led Opposition parties over a memorial for the former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh who was cremated with full State honours on Saturday in the presence of top dignitaries from India and

While the Home Ministry claimed to assure the late PM's family in a communication for a memorial in due course, the Congress, Samajwadi Party (SP) and Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) demanded that the last rites

should have been performed at a designated place where the Manmohan Singh's memorial could have been developed. Singh, 92, died on the night of December 26.

Simultaneously former President late Pranab Mukherjee's daughter Sharmistha too cried foul on the part of the grand old party which failed to honour the rights of Mukherjee who spent his entire life serving the

The Congress alleged that the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) was "deliberately insulting" the first Sikh PM of the country by not designating a place for his funeral and memorial. While Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge urged Prime Minister Narendra Modi to have Singh's funeral at a place where his memorial can be built, SP chief Akhilesh Yadav and BSP president Mayawati urged the Central government to avoid any political controversy over the funeral and memorial of former prime minister Manmohan Singh. Demands for giving Singh a Bharat Ratna, the highest civilian award, were also raised during the last ritual procession of Manmohan Singh.

The tradition of honouring the country's former Prime Ministers must be upheld. There is no need for politics on this issue nor should there be any. Dr. Manmohan Singh's memorial should be constructed at presenting an inappropriate example of its narrow-minded thinking. History will never forgive them for this negative approach," he said.

BSP president Mayawati said the wishes of Singh's family should be respected. "The Central government should ensure that the funeral and memorial of Dr Manmohan Singh, the country's first Sikh prime minister, are conducted at a location preferred by his family. No politics should be done on this matter and the government must honour the sentiments of Singh's family and the Sikh community

Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) also criticised the BJP for not allocating space within the Rajghat complex for the last rites of former prime minister Manmohan Singh and said that it "reflects poorly on India globally". AAP called on the BJP to clarify its stance and demanded an apology to Singh's family and the Sikh community.

"Manmohan Singh, a global icon and India's only Sikh Prime Minister, was denied even 1,000 square yards of land for his cremation and memorial at Rajghat. Almost all former Prime Ministers were cremated there, but the BJP government refused this basic courtesy to Singh," said AAP National Convenor Arvind Kejriwal AAP Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh accused the BJP of disrespecting the Sikh community and questioned the rationale behind the decision.

In a statement, the Ministry of Home Affairs assured that a place would be allocated for Singh's memorial and that his family and Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge had been informed.

BJP President and Union Minister JP Nadda attacked Congress and the Gandhi family for getting into petty politics when the entire nation mourns the demise of Dr. Manmohan Singh.

Delhi LG orders high-level inquiry into AAP's ₹2,100 dole for women

In a move that may once again rattle Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) convener Arvind Kejriwal, and his party ahead of the upcoming assembly polls, Delhi Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena ordered has ordered a high-level inquiry into the AAP led Delhi government's proposed Mukhyamantri Mahila Samman Yojana in which AAP's poll promise of Rs 2,100 to women if elected. The Lieutenant Governor also ordered that the Chief Secretary of the Delhi Government may bring the matter to the knowledge of the Election Commission of India (ECI) through the chief electoral office given that such canvassing is happening ahead of the election.

Saxena also issued instructions to investigate the alleged presence intelligence officials from Punjab outside Dikshit's residence with the objective of "intimidating" him and the alleged transfer of cash, in crores, from various parts of Punjab to Delhi with the Delhi Assembly elections around the corner. Shift Dallewal to hospital: SC gives **Punjab Govt till December 31**

The Supreme Court on Saturday witnessed an unprecedented hearing on the issue of providing medical aid to Punjab farmer leader Jagjit Singh Dallewal, who is on fast-unto-death for over a month at Khanauri border seeking legal guarantee of Minimum Support Price (MSP) of crops among other demands. The hearing was conducted by a vacation bench of justices Surya Kant and Sudhanshu Dhulia, which gave time December 31 to the Punjab Government to shift Dallewal to a nearby makeshift hospital, in an attempt to save his life.

Normally, the SC, during winter break, does not have vacation Benches to conduct urgent hearings on emergent issues, and sitting of a Bench on Saturday is unusual. The Bench pulled up the Punjab Government for allowing the situation to escalate and not complying with its earlier directions to provide medical assistance to Dallewal

Expressing helplessness, the Punjab Government said it is facing huge resistance from protesting farmers who have encircled Dallewal and are preventing him from being taken to hospital. Punjab Advocate General Gurminder Singh told the

bench that a team of experts visited the protest site and tried to persuade Dallewal to shift to hospital and take

medical help. "He (Dallewal) has refused any kind of medical aid, including (IV) drips, saying

that it will undermine the

cause of movement," he said.

Google maps misguides again: Highest single-day December rainfall in 101 years two injured in car accident

yet another incident of Maps leading astray, accident occurred on an under-construction highway two people injured. The mishap took place in the Hathras Junction police station area near Vahanpur. According to the police, Bareilly residents Vimlesh Srivastava and Kushal Kumar were traveling to Mathura using Google Maps for navigation. Late at night, after passing through Sikandra Rao, they followed through directions onto the under-Mathuraconstruction Bareilly Highway. Due to the absence of reflective boards warning about roadblocks, their car collided with a heap of stones and soil, causing significant damage.

The injured duo promptly informed the police, who arrived at the scene, cleared the car from the highway, and rushed the victims to a hospital for treatment.

This is not the first time Google Maps has caused inconvenience or accidents. Recently, a family from



Meerut endured hours of distress while trying to reach Saharanpur from Haridwar at night.

Vinod Kumar, a resident of Meerut's Shastri Nagar, was traveling with his wife and son. Initially, their journey via Google Maps was smooth until they reached Bhagwanpur. The app then suggested a shortcut through a link road to Saharanpur. About 10 kilometers into this route, they encountered a dry but rocky stream, making it

impossible to proceed. The app redirected them to another route, leading to hours of wandering in forested areas. Eventually, they managed to contact a

relative near Bihari Garh, who guided them to safety The family reached their destination close midnight, heaving a sigh of relief. Last month, Google Maps was blamed for a major accident in Bareilly when it directed a car onto an incomplete bridge, resulting in three friends falling off and sustaining injuries.

Such incidents highlight the risks of relying solely on digital navigation systems without verifying conditions. Authorities and travelers are urged to exercise caution, especially unfamiliar construction routes.

Delhiites experienced an overcast and chilly day after the city recorded the highest single-day December rainfall in 101 years. The city received 41.2 mm of rain hetween 8.30 am on Friday and 8.30 am on Saturday, marking the highest single-day

According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), the Capital had last recorded the highest-ever rainfall on a single day in the month on December 3, 1923, at 75.7 mm. While rain in December is not unusual, it is usually light. As per IMD data, Delhi usually sees 8 mm of rain during the month over half a day. The rain in the city over the past 24 hours is over five times that.

The rains also December 2024 the fifthhighest in terms of monthly rainfall since records began in 1901. In December 2024, Delhi logged 42.8 mm, the highest in the last 27 years when 71.8 mm of rain was seen in the month.

'The cumulative 24-hour rainfall ending at 8.30am today is the second-highest since 1901 at Safdarjung. December's monthly rainfall is now the fifth-highest. The 24-



over the past 24 hours ending at 8.30am IST on the given date," the IMD official explained. The rainfall largely attributed to an active western disturbance interacting with easterly winds, transformed the usual dry chill of December into an anomaly. 'The interaction between a active western disturbance and a cyclonic circulation on the east, along with a few other factors, has brought about this unusual weather. November and December are the two driest months in Delhi. During these months, it is usually a western disturbance that brings rain to the capital. It is the different weather systems clashing that

IMD classifies up to 15.5mm of rainfall in 24 hours as "light rain", 15.6-64.4mm of rainfall as "moderate", 64.5-115.5mm as "heavy rainfall" and 115.6-204.4mm as "very heavy

rainfall". Delhi witnessed incessant rainfall since Friday morning causing severe waterlogging and traffic snarls in several parts, leading to the mercury dropping in the National Capital. In June this year, Delhi has recorded 228.1 mm of rain in the 24 hours in one of the wettest spells the capital has recorded causing waterlogging in several parts of the National Capital

Villagers clash over land demarcation, vehicle of Special DG's son-in-law attacked

major ruckus erupted in Barkheda Salam, Khajuri police station area, on Saturday afternoon during a land demarcation exercise, resulting in violence and chaos. Villagers, protesting against the land measurement, turned violent and attacked the Patwari and the land seller. Stones were pelted, and a farmer's wife consumed poison in the midst of the commotion.

The land in question belongs to the son-in-law of Police Reform Cell Special DG Shailesh Singh. A Patwari had issued a notice to the opposing party to ensure the land measurement was conducted in their presence. However, the situation escalated into a dispute, with villagers attacking using their authority.

the Special DG's vehicle using stones and a sickle. Upon receiving reports of the incident, a heavy police force was dispatched to the scene. Special DG Shailesh Singh also arrived later and attempted to counsel the villagers, eventually bringing the situation under control. However, the team responsible for measuring the land was initially surrounded and assaulted by the villagers. According to Khajuri Police Station In-Charge Neeraj Verma, the unrest stemmed from irregularities in the land settlement. The brother of the farmer who owns the land reportedly sold it without informing him. This discrepancy in land records is already under review in the SDM office. During the chaos, villagers accused the police of mis-

Slogans were raised against the police and the administration, and the DG's car was targeted. A policeman at the scene attempted to cover the nameplate of the DG's vehicle, but the villagers removed the cover and continued their protest. The situation worsened as women armed with sickles and daggers joined the agitated crowd. A scuffle ensued, but the police managed to separate the groups and control the violence. Villagers, however, continued to pelt stones at the DG's car and blocked attempts by the police to move it.

Special DG Shailesh Singh clarified that the land belonged to his son-in-law, Gagan Gupta, and that all necessary documentation was in place. The Patwari had issued a notice to con-

proceedings. Gupta emphasized that he had purchased the land in 2023, and the title and transfer were in his name. He added that he was unaware of any internal dispute between the seller and their family, whose adjacent land might be involved. The incident highlights the persistent tensions surrounding land disputes and the challenges in resolving them. Born prematurely at just 30 weeks of pregnancy, in June 2024, the female infant weighed a mere 710 grams, classifying her as an extremely low birth weight (ELBW) newborn.

The delivery was necessitated by high-risk pregnancy complications, including Oligohydramnios (A condition during pregnancy where there is too little amniotic fluid surrounding the fetus) and absence of Doppler flow, which prompted an urgent cesarean section. Under the expert supervision of the Department of Neonatology, the infant was provided intensive care in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) for two months while being

Boy falls in borewell, rescue efforts on

Bhopal: Emergency operations were continuing to save the life of a ten-year-old boy after he fell into a defunct borewell in the Janjali area of Raghogarh in Guna district of Madhya Pradesh on Saturday.

Rescue teams from the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) said the boy was trapped at a depth of 25 feet. A National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) team has also been requisitioned from the state capital to aid the rescue operation.

The boy, Sumit Meena (10), a resident of Pipaliya village, went to his family's fields around 4 PM. His parents launched a search after he did not return home for several hours. Fearing the worst, the parents

found him stuck in the narrow

hole in the ground, with only his head visible. Villagers alerted the police, and a subsequent rescue operation was launched, with the administration pressing excavators into service to dig a parallel hole to rescue the child.

Raghogarh Sub Divisional Magistrate (SDM) Vikas Kumar Anand remained present to oversee the rescue operation. He expressed optimism about the success of the rescue mission.

Bhopal Municipal Corporation levies spot fines, fails to impress residents

In an effort to improve air quality and city cleanliness, the Bhopal Municipal Corporation (BMC) on Saturday imposed spot penalties on builders and offenders, collecting

over Rs 30,000 in fines. The penalties come amid intensified efforts by the BMC to curb particulate matter contamination in the city's air. A recent report by the National Clean Air Programme (NCAP) had recorded a negative growth of these microscopic pollutants in the

state capital. Even as the Air Quality Index (AQI) registered a significant improvement in the city's air on Saturday due to a shift in weather conditions, municipal employees surveyed the city and penalised polluters responsible for releasing stagnating pollu-

Those penalised on the day included persons failing to cover their under-construction civil projects with green nets, and improper disposal of construction and demolition (C&D) debris. In six cases involving C&D waste, Rs 8,500 was collected in fines.

tors to adhere to environmental norms governing construction in the city limits fell on deaf ears. The municipal team also took action against those failing to segregate waste at source, urinating in public spaces, and using banned plastic. In total, the team collected Rs 30,750 in spot fines/penalties across 113 cases. The BMC has renewed its appeal to building contractors to ensure full use of green nets during construction and cooperate with the ongoing efforts to improve air quality in the city, as failure to adhere could invite severe penal-

ties in the future. Environment watchers, however, remain unmoved by the BMC's efforts. They say that seasonal initiatives, during peak pollution months in the winter, will not be enough to curb the worrying surge in contaminants that remain suspended in the air the city

The fears are echoed by residents in high-pollution areas where the air quality has worsened due to continuing and abandoned road construction activities by the district administration.

Last year, too, the BMC had embarked on an ambitious plan to curb PM10 and PM2.5 contami-The municipal administration initiated fines after repeated nation. However, the efforts ended appeals to builders and contracwith the conclusion of winter.

Hailstorms and rain disrupt life across MP, farmers bear the brunt

adhya Pradesh witnessed hailstorms Land rain in several regions, including Bhopal and Khandwa, on Saturday, disrupting normal life and causing widespread challenges for farmers. The weather brought temporary relief after 1:30 pm as mild sunshine broke through the clouds, offering some respite. Similar weather patterns were observed on Friday across districts such as Ratlam, Mandsaur, Betul, and Alirajpur, where hailstorms and rain battered the region.

The unseasonal rain caused significant difficulties for farmers. In Raisen, farmers who brought paddy in tractor trolleys to the Dussehra

ground spent the night protecting their produce with tarpaulin sheets to prevent damage. Despite their efforts, hundreds of sacks of paddy and wheat were soaked in Karhiya and Jabalpur of Rewa. Such losses have left many farmers anxious about recovering from the damage to their already harvested crops.

In the past 24 hours, rainfall was recorded in 250 cities and towns across 42 districts, including Bhopal, Morena, Neemuch, Ratlam, Ujjain, Indore, Jabalpur, and others. According to the Meteorological Department, Garoth in Mandsaur district and Satwas in Dewas received the highest rainfall, with 2.5

inches recorded.

N a r m a d a p u r a m , Nasrullaganj in Sehore, and Udaipur in Raisen also recorded over two inches of rainfall. Thunderstorms and hailstorms were reported in multiple regions, adding

to the intensity of the

weather.

The maximum wind speed during this period was recorded at 62 kmph in recorded at 62 kmpn m Bhind, followed by 56 kmph in Shajapur and 54 kmph in Sehore. Other regions, including Jabalpur, including Jabalpur, Barwani, Guna, Ujjain, and Chhindwara, experienced wind speeds ranging from 26 to 37 kmph. These strong winds, combined with heavy rain, caused damage to infrastructure, trees, and crops.

In Bhopal, the capital city,

heavy rain accompanied by maize-sized hailstones and strong winds lashed the region for about 45 minutes on Saturday afternoon. Areas like MP Nagar, Kolar, New Market, and Ayodhya Bypass reported temporary flooding due to the downpour. Once the rain subsided, the sun emerged, clearing the skies and restoring normalcy in some areas.

parts continue to grapple

with the consequences of

the sudden weather

changes. Dense fog blanketed Bhopal on Saturday morning following Friday night's rain. The fog lasted until 9 am, reducing visibility and disrupting early morning activities. This weather anomaly is coupled with a recordbreaking cold winter. On December 15, Bhopal recorded a minimum temperature of 3.3 degrees Celsius, the lowest since 1966, when the temperature dropped to 3.1 degrees Celsius.

The combination of rain, hailstorms, and cold has created an unusual weather pattern for December in Madhya Pradesh. While the second fortnight of December is typically cold, this year winter began earlier and has been accompanied by persistent rain. Meteorological experts attribute these changes to global climatic variations and predict that the pattern of rain and cold will continue throughout December, affecting agriculture and daily life in the state.

he second day of the 11th Bhopal Science Fair was filled with engaging discussions, insightful lectures, and vibrant cultural performances. The day kicked off with a student dialogue session, where Dr. Sunil Chaturvedi, the keynote speaker, set the tone for the event. The session's main objective was to foster direct communication between students and scientists. Dr. Chaturvedi emphasized that science is not just confined to laboratories but is a part of our daily lives.

He described science as a "jourknown" and explained that its purpose is to improve human life through discoveries and innovations. Sharing his insights on how research shapes our future, he also highlighted significant scientific events up to the 18th century. During the session, students posed intriguing questions on science, which Dr. Chaturvedi answered in a simple and accessible manner. A special discussion on groundwater conservation followed, where Dr. Chaturvedi shared his research experiences and elaborated on how science provides a perspective that motivates us to solve real-world problems.

Delayed GG flyover sparks safety concerns with 32 accidents in past 10 months

The construction of the GG flyover, which connects Gayatri Mandir to Ganesh Mandir, has faced delays of over two years, creating significant traffic and safety concerns. The ongoing metro and flyover construction have resulted in the formation of ten accidental zones in the area, including four major hotspots. Over the past ten months, 32 accidents have been reported in these zones, leading to 22 injuries and one fatality.

Traffic police have raised several objections to the flyover's issuance of a no-objection certificate (NOC) for its opening. Among the issues highlighted are the lack of dividers, unresolved road closures, the absence of speed breakers, and the need for road widening at key points. Officials have emphasized that addressing these problems is essential to ensure the safe operation of the flyover.

One of the significant concerns is at Ganesh Mandir Chauraha, where a junction has formed between the Veer Savarkar Bridge and the flyover. A divider is needed to manage traffic flow reduce accidents. Additionally, the connection between the Ganesh Mandir service road and the main road

has created another hazardous zone that needs to be closed to mitigate risks. The turning near Narmada

Hospital poses a particular challenge, with vehicles converging from multiple directions, leading to congestion and accidents. This location has already witnessed 12 accidents due to poor road design and the absence of proper traffic management.

In front of DB Mall Square, a pillar located near MP Nagar police station has caused 15 accidents in the past year. Officials have proposed increasing the rotary's size from nine meters to 18 lation and reduce collisions. Similarly, the Vallabh Bhawan Rotary has become a problematic spot due to the combination of a rotary and signal, prompting a recommendation for a permanent rotary to ease traffic

Safety measures such as speed breakers and speed limits on the descending sections of the flyover are also absent, increasing the risk of high-speed accidents. Moreover, officials have stressed the need to widen the roads on both sides of the flyover by five feet each to accommodate the increasing traffic volume. Accidental zones have been reported in various areas.

Ajay Bajpai, ACP Traffic, confirmed that the PWD has been informed about the formation of four major accidental zones under the metro and flyover between Gayatri Mandir and Ganesh Mandir. He noted that these objections must be addressed before traffic can be allowed on the route.

As individuals age, singlehood may also bring economic, emotional challenges: Study

Although marriage or long-term relationships are often seen as the norm, remaining single for life is becoming an increasingly common choice. While singlehood can provide independence and freedom, a new study reveals that it may also bring economic and emotional challenges, particularly as individuals' age and become more dependent on others for

support. Published in the journal Psychological Science, the study highlights the lower life satisfaction and distinct personality traits of lifelong singles compared to their

partnered peers.
"When there are differences, they might be especially important in elderly people who face more health issues and financial issues," said Julia Stern, one of the lead authors, and a sonior authors and a senior researcher at the University of Bremen in Germany. "They need more help, and

The study used a survey of

more than 77,000 Europeans over the age of 50 and was the first of its kind to look across cultures and at people who had been single their entire lives. Stern and colleagues compared single people and partnered individuals on life satisfaction ratings and the Big Five personality traits (openness to experience, relationships, conscientiousness, socialization, extraversion, agreeableness, relationships could change neuroticism). The findings revealed that, in points to the former. Stern

satisfaction scores, lifelong singles are less extraverted, less conscientious, and less experience, compared to partnered

Although this study cannot definitively decipher if personality differences are due to selection, people with certain personality types may be more likely to start long-term

personalities, the evidence

that changes to personality from being in a relationship are small and temporary. For instance, although an extraverted person beginning a new relationship may be keen to stay in with their partner, eventually their extraversion comes back. But she warned that the

results are average effects and not necessarily descriptive of everyone; of course, there are single extraverts and introverts in committed relationships. For singles, living in a

society where marriage is the expectation may affect their life satisfaction. For instance, in countries with higher marriage rates (such as southern European countries), singlehood resulted in even lower life satisfaction scores, but the effects were small.

Stern suggested developing new kinds of programs to prevent loneliness that take these personality traits into consideration and help older singles meet like-minded

Tribals who received recognition from Manmohan Singh mourn his demise, recall cherished memories

As the nation bid adieu to former prime minister Manmohan Singh in New Delhi on Saturday, two tribals in a remote Odisha district, who were honoured by him in 2012 for biodiversity conservation, recalled with tears cherished memories with the beloved

Raila Muduli, a resident of Boliguda village and Chandra Pradhani of Nuaguda, said words were not enough to express their grief over the demise of Singh. The former PM passed away on Thursday night at Delhi's All India Institute of Medical Sciences due to age-related medical complications. He was 92. Muduli and Pradhani had received Certificates of their Recognition contribution to biodiversity



conservation from Singh during the 99th Indian Science Congress held at Bhubaneswar 12 years ago. "I was at a loss for words when I heard about his demise on Friday," said Raila, a farmer from the Bhumia tribe. "I remember feeling very nervous that day (in 2012), but receiving the award from the former prime minister was an unforgettable moment.

He was gentle and spoken, and encouraged us to dedicatedly biodiversity conservation," he said. Pradhani couldn't hold

back tears while recalling his brief interaction with Singh. "Sir smiled at me as I received the award and motivated us to continue our efforts in preserving biodiversity. His words will remain an inspiration for years to come," he said. "I wish I had more opportunities to meet him," Pradhani said.  $R^{\mathrm{ussian\ President\ Vladimir}}_{\mathrm{Putin\ on\ Saturday\ apolo-}}$ gised to his Azerbaijani counterpart for what he called a "tragic incident" following the crash of an Azerbaijani airliner in Kazakhstan that killed 38 people.

The Kremlin said in a statement that air defence systems were firing near Grozny, the regional capital of the Russian republic of Chechnya, due to a Ukrainian drone strike as the plane attempted to land on Wednesday. It stopped short of saying the plane was shot down by Russian air defences.

According to a Kremlin readout of the call, Putin apologised to Azerbaijani President Ilham Alivey "for the fact that the tragic incident occurred in Russian airspace.
