

ARCHITECT OF INDIAN ECONOMY PASSES AWAY

 $F_{\mathrm{Manmohan}}^{\mathrm{ormer}\ \mathrm{Prime}\ \mathrm{Minister}}$ architect of India's economic reforms, died on Thursday night. He was 92. Singh's death was announced by the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Delhi, where he was admitted in the Emergency ward around 8.30

PM in a critical condition. An AIIMS bulletin said "he was treated for age related medical conditions and had sudden loss of consciousness at home" on December 26. "Resuscitative measures were started immediately at home. He was brought to the medical emergency at AIIMS Delhi at 8.06 pm. Despite all efforts, he could not be revived and was declared dead at 9.51 pm," said the bulletin.

Singh, who was PM for two terms in the Congress-led



United Progressive Alliance (UPA) Government from 2004 to 2014, had been in poor health for the last few months. He is survived by wife Gurcharan Singh and three daughters. Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra and her mother Sonia Gandhi reached the hospital as soon as the news of his hospitalisation became known.

Singh, who was Finance Minister under the then PM PV Narasimha Rao, was the



architect and the brainchild of economic reforms in 1991 that pulled India from the brink of bankruptcy and ushered in an era of economic liberalisation that is widely believed to have changed the course of India's economic trajectory.

Singh died as the Congress party concluded its Congress Working Committee meeting subjects at Belagavi in Karnataka, where all top party leaders were present. Party chief Mallikarjun Kharge and PM Manmohan Singh, India

Rahul Gandhi rushed to Delhi from Belagavi followed by several top party leaders and workers from across the country.

A galaxy of leaders across the political party lines condoled the death of Singh with Prime Minister Narendra Modi remarking "We had extensive deliberations on various relating to governance; his wisdom, humility were always visible". "With the passing of former

Congress and AAP cloud over INDIA Bloc

n a development that could be a major setback to the India Bloc as the growing rift between the Congress and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has escalated into open hostility thereby putting the alliance on shaky grounds. The AAP on Thursday threatened that it would talk to other parties of the INDIA Bloc to remove the Congress from the alliance, if it didn't take action against Delhi Congress leader Ajay Maken for making derogatory remarks against party's supremo Arvind Rejriwal, calling him an 'anti national'. The AAP leaders now demanded that the Congress take disciplinary action against Maken and other party leaders within 24 hours.

Slamming Congress for having crossed all boundaries, Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh accompanied by Chief Minister Atishi warned that the AAP has given an ultimatum to its leadership to take immediate action against Maken within 24 hours, failing which AAP will be forced



The Delhi Police has L registered a case against four individuals in connection with forgery in Voter ID card applications for the purpose of new voter registration and address shifting after the Election office flagged such suspicious cases to them in southeast Delhi's Shaheen Bagh. In 2023, demonstrations and agitations over the issue intensified with protests spilling onto the streets, including a gherao of the then Higher Education Minister's residence. Despite the widespread unrest, the BJD government did not resume students' unions elections.

 ${f A}$ farmer of Baranga of Bada Madhapur panchayat under Chhatrapur block of Ganjam district committed suicide on Thursday after loss of his paddy crops due to untimely rains for the last few davs.

The deceased Banamali Penthei (64) hanged himself after seeing the loss of his crops. He cultivated paddy by taking five acres of land on lease from others as he didn't have his own land. For this, he incurred loan of more than 2 lakh rupees. The crop loss devastated him and he committed suicide as he lost any hope of help from the government, said his sister Apsara Pradhan.

SDPO Gaurahari Sahu, Chhatrapur police station IIC Niroda Kumar Das, Tehsildar Dibya Mohanty, Additional Tehsildar Smruti Subhadarshini Sahu and other officers reached the deceased's village and started an investigation. The deceased's family has received Rs 60,000 from the Red Cross fund and Rs 3,000 under the Harishchandra Yojana from the administration.

In Keonjhar Widow hangs self over financial strains

Sources said that the deceased, identified as Paki Munda (32), is survived by a son (12) and daughter (16). Paki's husband Niranjan had died of some disease 3 years of

back. After his death, Paki used to run her household by manual work. However, she was reeling under financial strains.

On Wednesday evening, Paki and her son had a brawl over mutton curry. Later they went to sleep after taking their food. However, the same night, she hung herself with her saree. Her son was first to see her hanging from the ceiling. Later, the villagers gathered

there and informed police. Nayakot police station IIC Ravikant Baisa said that Paki had earlier attempted suicide twice due to loss of mental balance.

Peasant dies after seeing crop loss in rains PNS KENDRAPADA A farmer of Derabish block

in Kendrapada district collapsed and died of cardiac arrest after he found his paddy crops damaged due to the low pressure-induced unseasonal rains.

The deceased was identified as Babagrahi Mallick, a resident of Santhapura village under Derabish block. He had grown paddy in six acres of land, including one acre of his own and another five acres which he took on sharing basis.

For carrying out cultivation, he had taken loans from some local moneylenders.

Mallick's family members said that he was upset for the last couple of days after heavy rains destroyed his crop. He was traumatised due to the heavy loans he had incurred



and how to repay them after all the cultivated paddy had got wet and damaged.

Though He had been taken to a hospital, he was declared dead by the doctor. His family and other farmers demand that the government compensate the crop loss.

Kendrapada district Collector Smruti Ranjan Pradhan said, "I have asked all the nine blocks to submit reports about the crop loss in the district. After getting the reports, we will intimate the matter to the State Government for compensation."



Rainfall damages Pujari asks insurance firms to help farmers

20,000 farmers have already applied for aid PNS BHUBANESWAR

Revenue and Disaster Management Minister Suresh Pujari on Thursday issued a strict warning to insurance companies regarding crop insurance, stating that the government would take firm action if farmers are harassed or if delays are observed in processing insurance claims.

Addressing the media, the minister emphasised that crop insurance policies are not



meant for company profits but to support farmers during crises.

He also stressed that insurance companies must act sensitively towards farmers during times of natural calamities.

He revealed that over 20,000 farmers have already applied for crop insurance by the 24th

of this month.

"Crop insurance is meant to aid farmers and provide them relief in times of distress. It is not ethical for insurance companies to profit off farmers. If the government notices any insurer going against the laws then they will be dealt with accordingly," he stated.

Pujari's statements came as reports of mounting crop losses surfaced from various parts of the State owing to unseasonal rainfall. Moreover, on December 23, he assured farmers of swift crop damage assessment and compensation disbursal while directing all

district Collectors to complete the assessment process within three to four days.

Meanwhile, farmers in the affected districts alleged delays in paddy procurement and increasing financial distress

"The miller has not arrived today and neither has any truck to relocate the harvest to storage locations. My crops are getting spoiled while lying here due to incessant rainfall," claimed Bijay Satnami, a farmer who had brought his crops for procurement at the Palsada mandi in Bargarh district.

Odisha gets new Governor II ASO assaulted by ex-Guv's son get justice now? Street vendors protest

L he family members of a government official, who was allegedly assaulted by outgo-Odisha Governor ing Raghubar Das' son six months ago, on Wednesday expressed hope that the "culprit" will be taken to task in accordance with the law.

Assistant section officer (ASO) Baikuntha Pradhan's wife Savoji said, "We hope that the government will now take

action as Raghubar Das is no longer the Governor. He and his son are now common citizens. Though Das had assured me justice when I met him on July 13, no action has been taken against anyone."

President Droupadi Murmu Tuesday appointed on Mizoram Governor Hari Babu Kambhampati as the new Odisha Governor and accepted the resignation of Das. Pradhan was allegedly as-

the

saulted and mentally tortured by Das' son Lalit Kumar and four others at the Governor's

House in Puri on July 7 when President Murmu visited the pilgrim town to witness Lord Jagannath's Rath Yatra. Pradhan, who then worked at Raj Bhavan in Bhubaneswar, was deployed at Puri Governor's House in light of the President's visit.

Subsequently, Pradhan lodged an FIR in this regard on July 10 with Sea Beach police, seeking justice. Soon after the incident, the State Government transferred the ASO from the Governor's secretariat. Sayoji said, "I feel there has

been no such inquiry into the allegations made by my husband at the police station. The incident has hurt the Odia pride as an outsider physically and mentally tortured a government official and got scotfree. It is painful that the government did not take any action against the culprits."

She, however, said that she and her family are waiting silently on the next course of action of the State government.

The issue was also raised in the Odisha Assembly, and the State government informed

the House that the Puri Collector was probing the allegations and would submit a report within one month.

Leader of the Opposition and former CM Naveen Patnaik had raised the issue in the Assembly and also alleged that action was probably not taken against the accused persons because one of them was the son of the Governor.

"My party and I are disappointed and surprised to find that the present government has taken no action on the Governor's son, who has meted

out violence to a government officer. We are deeply shocked by this," Patnaik had told reporters outside the Assembly on July 23.

In September, Patnaik again raised the issue and said, "Now I have a question for all of us. If you are the Governor's son, a Minister's son, an MP's son, an MLA's son, or a senior officer's son, is the law different for such a person? Is he immune from any prosecution? If this is the case, then the people of Odisha should be informed that certain people are above the law."

opment Authority (BDA). The agitators hit the roads and staged the demonstration at NALCO Square while shouting slogans against the civic body. They also laid forward 10 demands, including a complete halt of the anti-encroachment drive.

The agitators also refused to vacate their current spots demanding that the BMC establish a vending zone at the same location and allot them an 8-foot-by-10-foot structure each.

Now a kind of competition is going on between Congress and BJP to show their historical affinity with Dr Ambedkar. But the historical fact was that Pandit Jawarharlal Nehru, Congress Dr Ambedkar, Scheduled Caste Federation, and Shyam Prasad Mukhrajee of Akhila Bharatiya Hindu Mahasabha worked together in the first government of independent India. They respected each other though carrving different ideas and ideologies but when it came to serving the mother India ,they were together. The Nehru Cabinet was represented by people from diverse religions such as Maulana Abdul Kalam Azad and Baldev Singh from Sikh and Muslim community along with others.

Dr Ambedkar was opposed by all major political parties of those days while he fought elections in 1952 and 1954. The Congress ,CPI and Hindu Mahasabha (later Jansanga)--all tried to ensure the defeat of Dr Ambedkar and he was in fourth position. But only the then socialist party had an alliance with him.

However, it was the Congress party that ensured his entry to the Constituent Assembly by electing him from Bombay when his membership ceased due to partition. After the partition, the Constituent Assembly was reduced to a Hindu majority with minimal representation of SCs, STs, Sikhs, Christians, Anglo Indians, Parsis and Muslims and it was mostly

dominated by Congress where Dr Ambedkar was given a key responsibility as the Chairman of the Drafting Committee. Dr Ambedkar said in his speech in the Constituent Assembly that it is because of the discipline of the Congress party that the Drafting Committee was able to pilot the Constitution in the Assembly. The then Communist and Socialist parties had condemned the Constitution because it is based on parliamentary democracy and no provision for nationalisation of private property. There was also criticism of the drafting of the Constitution for not following the ancient Hindu model of a state and only incorporating western theories while ignoring the village panchayat.

Later in Independent India, when Dr Ambedkar brought the Hindu Code Bill for the rights of women it was opposed by some sections of leaders in Congress and Hindu leaders though Pandit Nehru had full support for the Bill. For this opposition, Dr Ambedkar resigned from the post of Law Minister. However, these events happened in a different period of history which should not be used to blame him. Rather history should be used to build unity and reconciliation for working together in a modern democratic State where both ruling and opposition are part of the governance system in a parliamentary democracy.

It was the VP Singh Government that honoured Dr Ambedkar with Bhatar Ratna jointly with Nelson Mandela of South Africa in 1990. And the VP Singh Government has expanded the social justice agenda for the OBCs, besides including Dalit Buddhists in Scheduled Caste list. The Dalit converts to Buddhism were not included in the SC list of 1950 because the list was limited to the Hindu untouchables.

Dr Ambedkar's social justice ideas were not limited to a particular section or religious group; rather, they were based on the concept of equality, equal protection and equal opportunity in matters of education, employment and governance. Today the benefit of reservation is available to almost all the SC, ST ,OBC and the poorer

section among upper caste Hindus and other religions. The Congress government has made efforts to publish the unpublished works of Dr Ambedkar in volumes. After 2014, the Narendra Modi government has declared Panchtritha linking all five places, Mahu, Delhi, Mumbai, London and Nagpur--the places carrying historical significance in the life of Ambedkar. The Union Government is building a 450-foot statue, the statue of equality as one of the biggest memorials of Dr Ambedkar at Indu Mill compound in Mumbai. In 2015, the 125th Birth anniversary year of Dr Ambedkar, 26th November was declared as the Constitution Day to celebrate his legacy as Chairman of the Drafting Committee and to reaffirm faith in the Constitution.

The growing popularity of Dr Ambedkar should not be misused by selective use of history for petty political purpose; rather his ideas should reach all sections of people to build a modern India sans discrimination, exploitation and harassment.

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Odisha's green benchmark: Spotlight on S Odisha in ISFR

The India State of Forest Report (ISFR) 2023, released by the Forest Survey of India (FSI), has positioned Odisha as a top performer in enhanc-

ing forest and tree cover. The State's combined forest and tree cover grew by an impressive 559 sq km, placing it among the leading contributors to India's green revolution

Notably, the southern districts of Odisha, rich in biodiversity and ecological significance, have been at the forefront of the achievement.

Odisha's forest cover grew by 152 sq km, while tree cover accounted for an additional 407 sq km. This remarkable progress places Odisha third nationally in forest cover growth and among the top four States in overall green cover expansion. South Odisha, encompassing districts like Ganjam, Gajapati, Koraput, Rayagada, Kandhamal, Nabarangpur, and Malkangiri, plays a critical role in these statistics. These districts, with their lush forests and ecological

wealth, contribute significantly to carbon sequestration, water conservation, and biodiversity.

South Odisha's forests are ecological powerhouses, harbouring rare flora and fauna while supporting the livelihoods of tribal communities.

Kandhamal, known for its dense, pristine forests, remains a biodiversity hotspot. Gajapati district, with its unique agroforestry systems, not only aids conservation but also sustains local economies

Koraput, famed for its rolling hills and bamboo-rich forests, has emerged as a key contributor to Odisha's bamboo-bearing area, now ranked fourth in the country.

The ISFR 2023 also sheds light on mangroves, which play a crucial role in coastal ecosystems. While Odisha's mangrove forests are primarily concentrated in



Bhitarkanika National Park in the north, their ecological influence extends Statewide, including to southern districts. Mangroves offer invaluable protection against coastal erosion and support rich wetland biodiversity, which benefit the broader ecological net-



Silent woes of Kolkata's heritage trams

olkata is often cel ebrated as a 'City of Joy' with historical, social, political and religious lineage. The very city having a colonial British connection is suffused with art, culture and heritage, a melting pot of trade and commerce.

But when it comes to an environment-friendly mode of transport, the city boasts of its trams which were introduced by the British in 1873 and survived long, offering services to the millions daily. However, when it comes to holding on to the trundling trams, things are not rosy. After running non-stop for 151 years, it steadily declined over the years from 52 routes in the 1970s down to 25 in 2015. Now,

cially operative, of them two are actually functional at the moment and the third remains suspended due to pipeline work. Nearly ten trams move across the city, only a sign that

it is still alive. During the regime of the Trinamool Congress, trams that were setting apart from other Indian cities are hit hard by its sudden sabotage of tramways. The city suspended several tram routes that never returned to life, gently losing one of its distinctive features.

The tram lovers raised their voices against the government's proposal to shut the iconic Kolkata tram. The protest was called by the general public under the banner "Save Heritage, Save Tram" participated by many

> The allegations against the tramways made by the traffic police and the Kolkata Municipal Corporation, rhetorically hold no truth by saying that slow-moving trams cause traffic jams and cracks on roads, resulting in road accidents, seems quite ridiculous, ought to be rejected for the prevailing traffic congestion. No data are available by the custodian transport department regarding accidents that have happened, but it can be rebutted that only two people died in tram accidents of 151year history. Legally, the future of the



tram at the moment is in the Calcutta High Court, which formed an advisory committee in June 2023 and sought a report on how services could be restored, maintained and preserved. All eyes are set to the juries' judgment of its fateful existence.

Consequent upon public

dissent, the government continued the heritage tram line from Maidan to Esplanade for the purpose of tourism to experience Kolkata's historical charm and identity.

While the world recognises tram, a proven system for the urban planners of modern technology, the Kolkata tram is dolefully at its dying stage. Urban transport activist Arghyadip Hatua of CTUA remarked that the government should invest in upgrading infrastructure and integrating it with the metro and bus, saying that "trams can serve as efficient feeders to other tran-

In fact, Tagore and tram were born at the same time, more relevant today as poetical and iconological entity. The poet has portrayed the tram as a symbolic civic pride for the Kolkatans, un-diminishing but growing. Considering tram as a signature of the city like the steel Howrah Bridge or white-domed Victoria Memorial monument, the eminent filmmakers Satyjit Ray, Mrinal Sen, Budhadeb Dasgupta, to name a few, are no exceptions to immortalise "tram" in film reels, the moments etched in mind forever. Celebrating "Tram Jatra" by the living heritage activists, helped to show what trams have done to the city's life and culture for more

than a century, exposing the

love-driven sentiments of the

younger people to trams.

In the name of modernisation, deliberate destruction is done to tramways with an intention by the WBTC (West Bengal Transport Corporation) to vacate and sell the sprawling tram depots to the city's real estate promoters which is quite disappointing.

The ticking erasure of trams from the streets of Kolkata may not be as easy as the city's century-old heritage and nostalgia are deeply ingrained in it. The younger generation will never pardon such heartrending stories of its annihilation done to the city's heritage.

Yogi Adityanath's 2024: A year of fiery rhetoric and political messaging

In a year marked by politi-cal contests and cultural debates, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's speeches in 2024 transcended electoral rallies, becoming rallying cries that resonated deeply across India. His carefully crafted remarks, blending critique of opposition parties with appeals for unity among followers of Sanatan Dharma, cemented his position as a mass leader with a vision for a unified and culturally proud India.

Among his most impactful slogans was "Katenge Toh violence, including the widows

Batenge, Ek Rahenge Toh Nek Rahenge," delivered in Agra in August. This phrase, urging

unity among communities, gained traction nationwide as a symbol of his call for solidarity and shared purpose. It underscored a year where Adityanath repeatedly sought to redefine narratives on governance, culture, and justice. Throughout 2024, his speeches targeted the opposition, particularly the Samajwadi Party (SP) and Congress, accusing them of fostering division, lawlessness, and pseudo-secularism. In Etawah, he raised the issue of justice for the families of victims of mafia

of slain leaders like BJP MLA Krishnanand Rai and Umesh Pal

He said: SP should give account of Mangalsutra of Alka Rai, Pooja-Jaya Pal" (April 25, Etawah). By questioning the opposition's silence on these matters, Adityanath positioned himself as a crusader for justice and law and order.

In his addresses to marginalized communities, Adityanath invoked symbols like Bajrang Bali to emphasize the collective power of unity. At a BJP Backward Class Morcha meeting in Lucknow, he likened the strength of the OBC community to Bajrang Bali's might,



declaring their unity as a force capable of dismantling the divisive strategies of pseudosecular politics. He said:

"Bajrang Bali's power in OBC society will burn Ravana's Lanka["] (July 29, Lucknow) The Chief Minister's rhetoric

often combined vivid imagery with sharp criticism. Phrases like "No Sadbhavna for Mafia and Goons, only the Bullet Train of Justice" captured his administration's stance on women's safety and law enforcement, while "SP ki Topi Laal, Kaarname Kaale" evoked allegations of corruption and criminality against his political opponents.

In Haryana, during an elec-tion rally, Adityanath critiqued Congress leaders as "Accidental Hindus raised in Roman culture," a remark aimed at reinforcing BJP's Hindutva narrative. His comments drew sharp criticism but also bolstered his party's

ideological position among its core supporters. Adityanath's speeches also highlighted his focus on cultural pride and historical legacy. At the unveiling of Rashtraveer Durgadas Rathore's statue in Agra, he called for national unity by reflecting on the lessons of divided nations like Bangladesh. His oneliner: "Batenge to katenge, ek rahenge to nek rahenge" (August 26, Agra) became the theme of election campaign in Haryana and Maharashtra

In the Winter session of the state assembly, he reaffirmed India's cultural identity, emphasizing the legacy of figures like Ram, Krishna, and Buddha while advocating mutual respect among religious communities. He said: India will uphold the legacy of Ram, Krishna, and Buddha" (December 16, Lucknow).

Through his speeches, Adityanath painted a narrative of a strong, unified, and culturally rooted Uttar Pradesh, countering what he described as the opposition's failures and divisive politics. As the year closes, his rhetoric has not only solidified his political standing but also ensured his voice continues to echo in the state's political and cultural discourse.

Yogi Govt accelerates land allocation for Mahakumbh Over 70 hours on, girl still stuck in borewell in Rajasthan

As Mahakumbh 2025 draws nearer, prepara-tions in Prayagraj are in full swing, with the Yogi Aditmenth balling Party Adityanath-led Uttar Pradesh government expediting the land allocation process. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, during a recent review meet-ing, instructed officials to complete all allocations by December 31. Responding promptly, authorities have so far allocated land to over 4,000 organizations, with an estimated 8,000 to 10,000 participants expected to partake in the grand event.

One of the event's key high lights is the establishment of Akharas, which is progressing steadily. While several Akharas have already set up their camps, the Mela Authority has successfully allocated land to most Akharas and associated organizations. Pending allocations, including for new applicants, are expected to be finalized within the stipulat-

ed deadline. According to the Mela Authority, the land allocation



process is nearly complete for Akharas and their followers, Mahamandaleshwars, Khalsa, Dandiwada, Acharyawada, and Khakachowk. Allocations for Prayagwal groups and new organizations are underway and will be concluded by December 31.

Thus far, a total of 4,268 organizations have received land, including 19 allocations for Akharas and their sub-460 groups, for Mahamandaleshwars, 750 for Khalsa, 203 for Dandiwada, 300 for Acharyawada, 300 for Khakachowk and 1,766 for other organizations

Additionally, 450 allotments have been made to Prayagwal groups, with their allocation process, which began on December 12, scheduled to continue until month-end. Allocations for new organizations, which commenced on December 16, are pro-

gressing simultaneously. The allocated areas have turned into hubs of activity, with tents being erected and traditional decorations underway. The Jhunsi area, in particular, is abuzz with representatives from Akharas, Mahamandaleshwars, Khalsa, Dandiwada, Acharyawada, Khakachowk, and other groups working tirelessly to prepare their camps in alignment with their cultural prac-

To facilitate smooth navigation, the administration has installed checkered plates across the sprawling site and is rapidly putting up signages to help visitors locate their destinations. Other arrangements, including lighting and essential amenities, are also being completed at a brisk pace.

A blow to regional peace

The fragile peace of South Asia faced a severe setback when Pakistan conducted airstrikes in Afghanistan

n the night of December 24, 2024, a series of airstrikes conducted by Pakistan in Afghanistan's Barmal district of Paktika province claimed the lives of at least 15 civilians, including women and children. The strikes targeted seven villages, causing significant destruction, particularly in areas like Murg Bazaar and Laman, where an entire family of five was killed. This incident has further strained relations between Pakistan and Afghanistan, raising serious concerns about the stability of South Asia. The airstrikes appear to be a direct response to Pakistan's growing concerns over the activities of the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP). Pakistan has justified the strikes as a necessary measure to eliminate TTP hideouts and secure its borders. However, the Afghan Taliban strongly denies these allegations, claiming instead that the airstrikes targeted civilians, including Waziristani refugees who had previously fled military operations in Pakistan's tribal areas. The implications of this attack extend far beyond the imme-



diate violence, casting a shadow over peace and security in South Asia. The airstrikes, coupled with the Taliban's vow to retaliate, risk escalating into a broader conflict between Pakistan and Afghanistan. Such hostilities could destabilise the region, which is already grappling with insurgencies, cross-border terrorism, and long-standing disputes.

In addition to the geopolitical ramifications, the humanitarian impact is profound. Afghanistan, a nation still recovering from decades of war, now faces further devastation. Civilian populations, particularly refugees, are bearing the brunt of this violence, with villages like Murg Bazaar reduced to rubble and count-

less families displaced. The destruction exacerbates an already dire humanitarian crisis, highlighting the urgent need for international aid and support. This conflict also undermines ongoing peace efforts in the region. Dialogues involving Afghanistan, Pakistan, and other stakeholders, essential for fostering stability, risk being derailed by such incidents. Additionally, it hinders cooperative initiatives against terrorism, a shared threat that requires coordinated regional action. The situation further complicates geopolitics in South Asia, prompting countries like India, China and Iran to reassess their strategies. Pakistan's actions, though driven by immediate security concerns, may strain its relationships with traditional allies and global powers advocating for peace in the region. To address this growing crisis, both countries must prioritise dialogue and cooperation. Constructive bilateral engagement is crucial to resolving mutual concerns, particularly regarding the TTP and border security. Neutral mediators, such as the United Nations, could play a vital role in facilitating these discussions. Beyond bilateral efforts, regional cooperation is essential. A unified initiative led by organisations like the South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) could encourage collective action against terrorism and promote economic interdependence, reducing the incentives for conflict.



Jordan's ambivalent stance on Palestine



While maintaining a façade of solidarity, Jordan's actions often reveal a pragmatic, if controversial, approach to safeguarding its own interests in a volatile region

ordanian reality towards the PalestiniansJ ordanians have had a wounded, complicated, and manipulative history. House of Hashim or the Hashemite dynasty rules Jordan with the current King Abdullah II, as the 41st generation of the direct descendants of Prophet Muhammad. While Hashemites were the Sharif and Emir of Mecca with rule over larger Hejaz, they were violently ousted from the control over the same by the rival Saud family. This military loss led to the loss of the symbolically vital title of the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques" to the Saud family, of modern-day Saudi Arabia. Hashemites were also to lose monarchial claim of rule on lands of Syria, Lebanon, Palestine and Iraq and were left with only the Jordanian swathes – which unlike other Arab lands was bereft of oil, natural resources, ports, or any other meaningful lever of power. They had to be creative in dealing with the situation and remain-ing relevant and protected. Geographical contiguity to Palestinian lands led to Jordan demonstrating fluctuating concern that oscillated from supporting the Palestinian cause to willynilly, acting against the same. During the Arab-Israeli War of 1948, Jordan occupied the West Bank and East Jerusalem (which it annexed in 1950), only to lose the same to Israel in the Six-Day War of 1967.

Historians often note the unique culture of "back channels" (facilitating clandestine meetings) between the Jordanians and Israelis that led to counterintuitive accommodations, even amid war. In the subsequent Arab-Israel War of 1973 (Yom Kippur War), Jordan had curiously avoided joining Arab ranks against Israel. Jordanian King Hussein had secretly flown to Tel Aviv to warn Israeli Prime Minister Golda Meir of the impending Arab plans to attack Israel. Ultimately when Jordan was morally forced to support the war against Israel, declassified accounts confirm that it was

It wasn't the first time the Jordanians had worked duplicitously against the Arab or Palestinian cause, as just a couple of years earlier, the infamous and bloody "Black September" (Sep 1970 – July 1971) had occurred. Jordanian Army had surrounded camps townships with and Palestinians fidayeen of various groups and brutally cut them down to size. Nearly 3500 were killed in the purge and the PLO (Palestinian Liberation Organisation) fighters were expelled to neighbouring Lebanon. Again, the Jordanians had aligned with Israel before commencing this attack. Importantly Syrian forces that had intervened on behalf of Palestinian fighters were repulsed leaving 600 Syrians dead and a loss of 120 tanks. Interestingly, like the historically insincere support of Jordanians towards the Palestinians, one important figure who participated along the Jordanian forces in massacring the Palestinians was a then Pakistani Brigadier (later dictator) Zia-ul-Haq, who was on deputation!In 1987 Jordanian King Hussein and Israeli foreign affairs minister (later President) Shimon Peres met secretly to work on a peace treaty which was followed up with Jordanians forsaking their claim on the West Bank, the subsequent year. By 1994 the two countries

signed a formal Peace Treaty (the second Arab nation after Egypt) and normalised relations with Israel. Odd public bickering on issues like Al Aqsa Mosque aside, the top leadership of both countries kept meeting discretely, whilst Jordan kept maintaining the façade of support towards Palestine. Jordanians watched silently as Southern Lebanon was attacked and as the Syrian egime was overrun by forces born out of Al Qaeda, ending the last possible faction that had taken on the Israelis in favour of the Palestinians. For

a long, Jordanian King Abdullah had warned against the spectre of a rising "Shia Crescent" (assertion of Shiite rule in Iran, Iraq, Syria and Lebanon).

He therefore would be presumably pleased to see the decimation of the sectarian rivals, which coincidentally also ended the last modicum of challenge to the Israelis.Beyond vacuous words, the practical conduct of the Jordanians has been suspiciously two-faced on the ostensible redlines as defined by King Abdullah i.e., "No to abandoning the guardianship of Jerusalem and the holy sites, no to the one-state solution, and no for Jordan to be an alternative homeland for the Palestinians".

The picture has perhaps never been further from the socalled Jordanian redlines, as now, the fate of Palestinians, Jerusalem, and the possibility of a two-state solution, is at its lowest. History will judge the conduct of Arab monarchies and their lip-serving commitment towards Palestine, but perhaps none as ambidextrously as the Jordanians, who often fancy themselves to be of the highest order.

alnutrition among children remains a critical public health issue in India, deeply intertwined with poverty, systemic inequalities, and environmental challenges. Despite the nation's economic progress, the persistent issues of undernutrition and micronutrient deficiencies continue to hinder India's overall growth and development, casting a shadow over its aspirations for a healthier future.

The 2023 Global Hunger Index paints a grim picture, with India ranked 111th out of 125 countries and a score of 28.7, indicating a "serious" hunger situation.

Although there has been marginal improvement from a score of 29.2 in 2015, the pace of progress lags behind peer economies. Disturbingly, India records the world's highest rate of child wasting at 18.7 per cent, while 35.5 per cent of children under five are stunted. These figures highlight the long-term health and developmental implications of malnutrition. Several interconnected challenges exacerbate this issue.

Compounding this is inadequate nutrition and sanitation, as poor dietary intake, restricted access to clean water, and insufficient healthcare facilities worsen the situation.

The health and cognitive impacts of malnutrition are profound, weakening immune systems, increasing susceptibility to diseases, and impairing cognitive development. These effects the Pradhan Mantri Matru

SOLVING INDIA'S WATER CRISIS

Madam — Recently, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has laid the foundation stone of the Ken-Betwa river linking project, the first initiative under the national river linking policy, at Khajuraho in Madhya Pradesh. It is really a welcome step in solving the water crisis in India. Nearly 65 lakh people of Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh will get drinking water, and more than 7 lakh farmer families of 2000 villages will benefit from the project. Also, it has been proposed to generate 103 MW of hydropower. The project aims to transfer surplus water from the Ken River in Madhya Pradesh to Betwa in UP to irrigate the drought-prone Bundelkhand region.

Under the project, a 77 m high and 2.13 km long Daudhan dam and two tunnels will be constructed on the Ken River. Interlinking rivers can control both floods and droughts. This river linking project can have significant ecological consequences, can impact the biodiversity of the region, and can affect Panna Tiger Reserve too. Even then the project will create many employment opportunities as well as boost the rural economy. Ken-Betwa is the first river linking project under the National Perspective Plan (NPP) for the linking of rivers. The National Water Development Agency should identify a few more river linking projects to avoid floods and to cultivate more lands in drought-prone areas in India.

Witch-hunting in India: A persistent plague claiming women's lives Despite legal interventions, witch-hunting remains a grim reality in parts of India, targeting marginalised women

n 2014, Partners for Law in Development (PLD), a Llegal resource group working on social justice and women's rights, carried out a study to understand the reasons behind rising violence against women in the name of witch hunting in Bihar, Chhattisgarh and Jharkhand. They found that women were blamed for illness, death and even a bad crop and branded as witch-




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

Literary World

t is not without reason that the word novel has been assigned two meanings. Although the English

language can often be amusing with its many words having multiple meanings, the term novel has a significant connection to its different interpretations. The dictionary defines novel as "an invented prose narrative that is usually long and complex and deals especially with human experience through a usually connected sequence of events." The word also has another meaning - something that is new, original, and never seen, used, or even thought of before. A novel, as a literary form, tells a story and features multiple characters interconnected through a sequence of events. Each novel offers a new, fresh and unprecedented experience. What makes a novel truly special is its readability and the ease with which it allows readers to identify with the characters it presents. Let us reflect on the novels of the past. Timeless classics like War and Peace, Anna Karenina (Leo Tolstoy) The Mother(Maxim Gorky), Gone with the Wind (Margaret Mitchell), The Far Pavilions (M. M. Kaye), and Crime and Punishment(Fyodor Dostoevsky) continue to resonate with readers. These masterpieces transport us to a different world through their narrative, characters, and the time and space they depict. It is rare to encounter someone who feels these novels fall short of their

Bandyopadhyay, whose works include Ganadevata and Arogya Niketan, the latter being particularly popular. Bankimchandra Chatterjee's Anandamath (1882), set against the backdrop of the Great Bengal Famine of 1770, is widely regarded as the finest novel ever written in the subcontinent. During my school days, our language teacher, P. U. Madhavan,

emphasised the importance of reading these classics. He was our gateway to the world of literature. Years later, at university, we studied a prose piece by A. J. Cronin, the renowned Scottish novelist, about the art of writing a novel. Cronin often told his wife that he would write a novel loved by all. During a period of recovery from illness, Cronin wrote Hatter's Castle, a landmark in English literature. He abandoned his medical career to pursue writing full-time. Cronin's success, along with that of other novelists, lies in their ability to tell compelling stories. Ponniyin Selvan (Son of Ponni) by Kalki Krishnamurthy, for instance, is based on the life of Arulmozhivarman, a 10th-century Chola prince. Reading this book is akin to watching a film projected on a Vistarama screen, the most advanced film projection system

These authors wrote straight from the heart. Today, however, publishers often dictate the content to maximise sales. In India, literary works that criticise certain religions or spiritual figures tend to attract significant attention and awards.

While we lack the likes of Mitchell, Tolstoy and Kaye, a few noteworthy works of fiction emerged in 2024, offering hope for the novel genre. Swallowing the Sun, the debut novel by Lakshmi Murdeshwar Puri, was a breath of fresh air. Puri masterfully narrates India's freedom struggle and the emancipation of women from societal constraints. The protagonist, Malati, guides readers through a vivid journey across the Konkan region and Bombay, where she and her sister Kamala break into a male-dominated world. Thrilling and vibrant, Swallowing the Sun feels like a long-awaited monsoon, refreshing and full of intensity. Another standout author is Harinder S. Sikka, a former Indian Navy commander known for Gobind, Vichhoda and Calling Sehmat. Drawing on his naval experiences, Sikka crafts authentic stories, earning him the title of "India's Jeffrey Archer." Readers eagerly await more from writers like Puri and Sikka, who draw inspiration from real life. As Malayalam literary rebel Keshava Dev once said, "You will understand life only if you learn how to live. That experience will guide you in writing novels and stories. No university can teach

Top order hepls Australia score 311/6, Bumrah keeps battle alive

asprit Bumrah's knack of coming up with magic deliveries in crunch situations kept India alive after Australia's top-order, headlined by teen debutant Sam Konstas⁷ stroke-filled half-century, guided the hosts to 311 for 6 on the opening day of the fourth Test here on Thursday.

If Konstas' audacious 60 off 65 balls enthralled the near sell-out crowd of over 80,000 at the MCG during a humid morning session, Bumrah's (3/75 in 21 overs) deception of length to dismiss Travis Head (0) also had its takers as chants of 'Boom, Boom, Boooomraaaaaah reverberated through the stands.

Coming into the Test with back-to-back hundreds, Head couldn't judge the length of a Bumrah delivery that was pitched slightly fuller than what the batter expected. He shouldered his arms trusting the bounce but the 66.2 overs old Kookaburra nipped back to clip the off-bail.

In the next over, he removed an out-of-form Mitchell Marsh (4), having got Usman Khawaja (57 off 121 balls)

with the half-tracker in the post-lunch session. The first two sessions,

belonged however, to Australia with senior players Khawaja, Marnus Khawaja, Marnus Labuschagne (72 off 145 balls) and Steve Smith (68 batting, 111 balls) scoring half-centuries.

The final session was all about Bumrah magic. The Indian spearhead didn't let the hosts completely walk away with the game which they threatened to do at one stage.

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
India needed Rohit to open, Washington's variation at MCG, says Nayar on axing Gill
