

BLUE SKY, BRIGHT SUN, GRAP IV REVOKED

The Supreme Court on Thursday relaxed curbs in Delhi-NCR under the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP) stage III and IV measures imposed in Delhi following the improved Air Quality Index (AQI). The SC advised the CAQM to also consider adding certain measures under GRAP-Stage III. If the AQI crosses 350, GRAP-III should be imposed and if it crosses 400, GRÂP-IV must be imposed, the SC said Following this, the Commission for Air Quality (CAQM) Management revoked restrictions under Stage-III and Stage IV of GRAP in the entire NCR, with immediate effect. The restrictions have been reduced to Stage 2 of the GRAP which involves less stringent curbs such as a ban on the use of coal and firewood in industries and commercial establishments, including eateries.

This means people using BS-3 petrol and BS-4 diesel vehicles can ply their on the road in the National Capital region. Under GRAP III and IV, diesel-powered medium and heavy goods vehicles (BS-IV or lower) are prohibited, except for essential services while non-essential light commercial vehicles from outside Delhi were also restricted under GRAP stages 3 and 4. All construction and demolition activities, including public infrastructure projects like flyovers, and highways, pipelines, were also banned. Sub-Committee, accordingly, has decided to

Avegetarian thali's price increased seven per cent, to Rs 32.7, primarily due to a 35 per cent jump in tomato prices to Rs 53 per kg and 50 per cent increase in potato at Rs 37 per kg. A non-vegetarian thali cost inched up 2 per cent to Rs 61.5 in November due to a three per cent increase in the cost of broilers, which have a 50 per cent weightage computation. A veg thali comprises roti, vegetables onion, tomato and potato, along with rice, dal curd and salad. A non-veg thali has the same elements except for dal, which is replaced by broiler chicken. According to a CRISIL Roti Rice Rate (RRR) report for November, the price of potato increased 50 per cent on-year on a low base to Rs 37 per kg from Rs 25 per kg in November 2023 due to a 20 per cent on-year decline in arrivals amid low yield following late blight infestation in Punjab, Uttar Pradesh and Gujarat. Price of tomato increased 35 per cent on-year to Rs 53 per kg from Rs 40 per kg in November

2023 Additionally, prices of pulses rose 10 per cent, it said, adding that they will decline with fresh arrivals in December, while import duty hike led to a 13 per cent increase in vegetable oil prices.Prices are expected to dip once fresh arrivals begin in December. "Adding to the cost, vegetable oil prices rose 13 per cent on-year due to import duty hike, coupled with the festive and wedding season demand," Crisil stated.

Tata's Air India fares slightly better, standing at 61st with a 4.1/10 score for claim handling. At the top of the list, Brussels Airlines has been named the best airline, followed by Qatar Airways. India's largest domestic carrier, rated 4.80/10. The low rating is attributed to underwhelming customer satisfaction and poor handling of flight disruption claims.

The rankings for airlines are based on three criteria, on-time performance, customer opinion, and processing of compensation claims. According to AirHelp, the three criteria contribute to the airline's score in equal measure, or 33.33 per cent each. The analysis covers data from January to October, incorporating on-time performance, customer claims processing, and feedback from passengers across 54 countries on food, comfort, and service.

The report analyses key performance indicators

including flight punctuality, customer service responsiveness, and claim resolution efficiency. Researchers collected data on how airlines handle flight disruptions, manage compensation claims, and deliver consistent handle service across international routes. The analysis considers not just operational efficiency, but also the human experience of air travel including factors like crew service quality, meal offerings, and passenger comfort.

Responding to the ranking, IndiGo criticised the methodology, saving the survey does not disclose the sample size from India, "casting doubt on the survey's credibility." In its statement, IndiGo pointed out that the survey did not disclose the sample size from India or consider the methodology and compensation guidelines followed by the global aviation industry, "casting a doubt on its credibility" The airline emphasised its strong track record noting that it consistently scores high on punctuality and has the lowest customer complaint ratio among airlines of similar size and operational scale.

Thousands of Delhi Metro commuters were in for a rough ride on Thursday morning when services on the busy Blue Line came to a standstill, due to the theft of 150 metres of signalling cable between Moti Nagar and Kirti Nagar stations. For nearly six hours, the Blue Line, an arterial route that connects Dwarka to Vaishali and Noida City Centre, witnessed frustration, delays, and overcrowded platforms,

overcrowded platforms, throwing off schedules for office-goers and daily passengers alike.

As commuters scrambled to adjust, the theft sparked a wave of reactions, including a sharp critique from former Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, who questioned the city's safety under the Union Home Ministry's watch. The line services key areas such as Rajiv Chowk, Yamuna Bank, Mayur Vihar Phase 1, Noida Sector 16, and Noida Sector 18, where many offices are located. With the delay coinciding with morning office hours, passengers faced inconvenience, particularly has been stolen. Initially, a decision had been made to carry out the repair work at night after the end of passenger services. However, considering the convenience of passengers, particularly during the evening peak hours, a quick decision was taken to attempt the restoration during the afternoon non-peak hours, Daval said.

While the repair work was being carried out on the up line (towards Dwarka), train services continued on the down line, ensuring both directions of travel were

operational, he explained. Earlier, the DMRC had stated that train services on the Blue Line were regulated from the morning due to what appeared to be a case of theft and damage to the signalling cables by miscreants between Moti Nagar and Kirti Nagar stations.

HC prohibits use of heavy machinery for riverbed mining

Ordering that the use of heavy machinery for mining on riverbeds is banned, the Uttarakhand High Court has directed that such work should be done manually. The court also directed the State government to submit its reply within four weeks.

The division bench of acting chief justice Manoj Kumar Tiwari and justice Vivek Bharti Sharma issued this direction while hearing a public interest litigation challenging the permission granted by the State government on use of heavy machinery for mining in the Suswa and another river in the Doiwala area of Dehradun.

According to the case details, Dehradun resident Virendra Kumar had filed the PIL in the HC stating that the State government had granted permission for the use of heavy machinery for mining in the Suswa and another river in the Doiwala area of Dehradun district.

The petitioner stated that the use of heavy machinery for mining has resulted in lowering the level of water in the river. In addition to this, his arable land is also getting affected. He is unable to get water even for irrigation.

Apart from this, the petitioner contended that the use of heavy machinery for mining is rendering the local people without work.

Earlier, the locals used to get work mining on the riverbed but they have been rendered jobless since the government granted per mission for the use of heavy machinery for mining work, the petitioner stated.

The PIL requests the court to impose a ban on the use of heavy machinery

for mining in addition to measures for protecting his arable land and according priority to the local residents instead 01 machinerv in

Two sons murder father in Rudraprayag, attempt to burn body

The police arrested two men on Thursday on charges of murdering their father Balveer Rana in Bedula village of Rudraprayag district. The offi-cials informed that crime came to light on Thursday morning when the brothers, Amit Rana and Manish Rana attempted to cremate the body near a ghat. According to officials, the two sons killed their father on Wednesday night following a heated argument at their home in Kalimath Valley's Bedula village, under Guptkashi police station jurisdiction. The brothers reportedly used a heavy stick to fatally attack their father. The next morning, they reportedly carried the body near the ghat to dispose of it. The officials said that some villagers noticed smoke rising from the cremation site on



approached the brothers. When questioned, the brothers reacted aggressively, hurling abuses at the onlookers. Alarmed, the villagers informed the police. However, by the time officers arrived, the body had already

been almost entirely burnt. The officials claimed that both men have confessed to the crime. They claimed that their

n an effort to combat pollu-Ltion in rivers and streams, the Municipal Corporation of Dehradun (MCD) has launched a special campaign targeting those who dump waste irresponsibly. Under this initiative, the corporation's team has issued fines to 76 violators so far and has been raising awareness about the harmful effects of such practices. The deputy municipal commissioner Gopal Ram Binwal said that the sanitation team imposed a penalty on 76 people for dumping garbage in the Bindal River. Besides this, a hefty penalty of Rs 50,000 was also imposed on a person found disposing of construction debris into the river. He stated that the municipal authorities are actively working to educate the public about the impact of waste on water bodand the environment.

During the monsoon season, clogged rivers and drains often result in water spilling into residential areas, causing significant inconvenience and damage. Despite previous campaigns and repeated warnings, the issue of garbage dumping persists, prompting stricter enforcement measures. Binwal stated that all sanitation inspectors and their teams have been instructed to take continuous action against those found lit tering in public spaces, rivers, drains or vacant plots. Special monitoring is being carried out along the Rispana and Bindal rivers using CCTV cameras to catch offenders. The campaign aims to preserve the integrity of rivers and create a cleaner and healthier environment for all. Regular patrols and public awareness initiatives will continue to address the root cause of the problem and discourage individuals from polluting nat-

The incident also highlighted that the authorities have not learnt any lesson from the Chamoli electrocution incident and the STPs are continuing to remain a major threat to humans and wild animals. It is clear that the dangerous concoction of corruption, negligence and apathy is at the root of the malfunctioning of the STPs of Namami Gange project. Interestingly, the National Green Tribunal (NGT) has also expressed its concern on the poor quality of water being emanated by the STPs and their polluting effect on River Ganga. It is apparent that the Namami Gange, once considered to be the dream project of PM Narendra Modi has failed to get desired results even after 10 years of its launch and spending a whopping sum of Rs 40,000 crore.

Assembly facelift

 W^{ith} multi-crore reconstruction and renovation works nearing completion, the Vidhan Sabha building located in provisional State capital Dehradun is grabbing everyone's eyeballs. The central hall of the assembly is also undergoing a facelift with the latest state of the art modern gadgets being installed on the tables of the legislators. On the entrance of the house, a glittering wall of valour showcasing the pictures of statehood movement martyrs is worth watching. However the pictures of two martyrs of the Khatima firing incident, Saleem Ahmed and Rampal are conspicuous by their absence. One hopes that these bravehearts will also find their due place on the honour roll of the Vidhan Sabha and the swanky new building will prompt the law makers and the government to improve their legislative performance and attendance in the house to effectively put forward the issues of the general public. This, in turn, is also likely to increase the number of annual sittings of the Vidhan Sabha of the Himalayan State which incidentally is among the lowest in the country.



Farmers' 'jatha' will march to Delhi from Shambhu border on Friday: Pandher

PIONEER NEWS SERVICE CHANDIGARH/NEW DELHI

A'jatha' of 101 farmers will embark on a march to Delhi at one pm Friday from the Shambhu border in Haryana-Punjab protest site, farmer leader Sarwan Singh Pandher has said.

Ahead of the Punjab farmers' proposed march to the national capital on December 6, the Delhi Police on Thursday said they are ready to deal with any situation at the Singhu border in the national capital. Police officials, however, said as of now there is no extra deployment of security personnel at the Singhu border with Haryana. Addressing a press conference at Shambhu border on Thursday, Pandher said, "The jatha will march towards Delhi. What the government will do, it is for them to think. We will begin our march towards Delhi at 1 pm from the Shambhu border." He said that even now if the

government stops them from carrying out their march, it will be a "moral victory" for them.

"Because their leaders have been saying if farmers do not bring tractor trolleys then there should be no objection," he said.

Ambala Police in Haryana flagged a high alert following farmers plan of a Delhi march and sent senior officers including Ambala district police chief to the border to assess security. Central paramilitary forces

have also been deployed on the Haryana side of the border.

Ambala had on Wednesday asked farmers to reconsider their march and contemplate any action only after getting permission from the Delhi Police.

The administration has already imposed Section 163 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, restricting assembly of five or more persons in the district and issued notices at



the protest site "It does not look like a Punjab-Haryana border, but an international territory. If they have their way they will

not allow even a bird to cross it," Pandher told reporters. He also said there was no plan yet of a march from Khanauri border in Haryana.

"We have no announcement to march (to Delhi) from Khanauri border point, despite that there is heavy deployment of police," he Earlier in the day, Deputy Inspector General of Police Mandeep Singh Sidhu (Patiala Range) and Senior Superintendent of Police Patiala Nanak Singh met Pandher and Surjit Singh Phul at Shambhu border. Farmers, gathered under the banner of the Samyukta Kisan Morcha (non-political) and the Kisan Mazdoor Morcha, had earlier announced a foot march to the national capital seeking a legal guarantee for minimum support price of crops, and over their several other demands.

Sidhu said the farmer assured police that they will be peaceful and will not take tractortrolleys in the march. "They will go on foot," he said about the marchers.

Farmers have been camping at Shambhu and Khanauri border points between Punjab and Haryana since February 13 after their march to Delhi was stopped by security

Police have also erected a steel mesh to shield them from any stone pelting. Ambala administration is yet to lift the barricading. On February 21, Shubhkaran

Singh, a farmer from Punjab, died during a clash at Khanauri border when protesters tried to march towards Delhi. Teargas shells were also lobbed by the security forces.

Besides the MSP, farmers are demanding a farm debt waiver, pension for farmers and farm labourers, no hike in electricity tariff, withdrawal of police cases and "justice" for the victims of the 2021 Lakhimpur Kheri violence.

I thas been eight years since Jayalalithaa Jayaram breathed her last becoming the second chief minister of Tamil Nadu to die in office. The factors that led to the demise of Jayalalithaa remain a mystery despite a commission of inquiry probing the same for more than five years. It is not known how many among the AIADMK leadership are aware of the findings of the A Arumughaswamy Commission which submitted its report in August 2022.

The Pioneer was the first newspaper in the country to predict that with the death of Ĵayalalithaa, the AIADMK would become a part of history. With dozens of leaders belonging to the Thevar, Vanniyar and Gaunder communities pulling the party in different directions, the AIADMK, Tamil Nadu's largest political party ended up in groups, sub-groups headed by families and local

chieftains. Jayalalithaa who during the Independence Day led the party to impressive Flag Hoisting Ceremony at Fort Saint George (Tamil

victories in 2011 and 2016 assembly elections and 2014 Lok Sabha polls ensured that the party reached an unassailable position. Though there was deterioration in her health after the

2016 assembly election, neither her aides or party subordinates took any interest in admitting her to a hospital. She was seen shivering and struggling to take even a step through a palace coup staged

by her close aide V K Sasikala and her nephews.

Stage was set in for the swearing in of Sasikala as chief minister on 14th February 2017. But the Supreme Court order upholding the Parappana Agrahara special court verdict which had sentenced Jayalalithaa and Sasikala for four years rigorous imprisonment in a disproportionate asset case. Since Jayalalithaa was no more, Sasikala and her two relatives, who were the coaccused had to undergo the imprisonment.

On the day she was to sworn in as chief minister, Sasikala's cavalcade rushed to the Bangalore jail and surrendered before the IG (prisons). Before leaving for serving her jail term, Sasikala had anointed Edappadi Palaniswamy as chief minister. But within months, TTV Dhinakaran, her nephew who had successfully infiltrated into Veda Nilayam (Jaya's palatial building in Poes Garden) launched his mission to overthrow

Palaniswamy and appoint himself as chief minister. That attempt failed and the disintegration of AIADMK commenced on the 45th year of its launching. What Tamil Nadu saw after Jayalalalithaa's demise was the withering away of the AIADMK while the DMK became a rallying point.

Jayalalithaa's first tenure as chief minister wad enmeshed in corruption while her subsequent tenures (2001-2006 and 2011-2016 did not throw out any corruption charges. The male chauvinistic Dravidian parties could not digest the fact that a woman could speak chaste English, Hindi, Telugu and Kannada. It was Jayalalithaa who taught the north Indian politicians some basic rules of the game. Brand Amma became a household name by the time she was hospitalized. With her passing away, the second rung leadership went astray and the AIADMK is in deep trouble from which the party is unlikely to get out.

What happened in Ayodhya and Sambhal 500 years ago is happening today in Bangladesh: Yogi

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, speaking at the inauguration of the 43rd Ramayana Mela at Ram Katha Park, drew parallels between the historical actions of Babur's commanders in Avodhya and Sambhal 500 years ago and the ongoing events in Bangladesh. He stressed that both share a common intent of division and cautioned against ignoring such threats.

"Divisive forces are active within our society, eroding social harmony and unity, the Chief Minister stated. He

added that those promoting discord often have properties abroad and would flee in times of crisis, leaving others to face

the consequences. Drawing parallels between the past and present, Adityanath remarked, "What a general of Babur did 500 years ago in Ayodhya and Sambhal is reflected in what is happening in Bangladesh today. The nature and intent of these forces are the same?

Korean crisis

President Yoon Suk Yeol briefly declared martial law, a move that ignited domestic outrage and international condemnation

brief martial law was imposed in South Korea, a country known to have a stable democracy and prosperity to vie for. The South Korean President Yoon Suk A Yeol took this extreme step to preserve his position amid falling popularity. He faces the toughest challenge of his presidency after a controversial decision to impose martial law backfired spectacularly, plunging the nation into a deep political crisis. The fallout has sparked widespread protests, calls for his resignation, and even moves toward impeachment. Yoon declared martial law, citing national security concerns and the need to eliminate "anti-state elements." However, many viewed the measure as a desperate attempt to consolidate power amid mounting political and personal scandals. The backlash was immediate and severe, with lawmakers rushing to overturn the decree and protesters gathering en masse in the streets of Seoul. Within hours, Yoon revoked the order, but the reversal failed to quell public anger.



The damage was done. Yoon's presidency, which began with a narrow 2022 election victory, has been riddled with controversy. His platform, focused on gender neutrality and hawkish stances on North Korea, initially appealed to younger male voters. However, a series of missteps and scandals—ranging from allegations of corruption involving First Lady Kim Keon Hee to tensions with the opposition-controlled National Assemblyhave steadily eroded his approval ratings. The Democratic Party's landslide win in April's parliamentary elections further isolated Yoon politically. With an emboldened opposition, efforts to impeach

key government officials linked to Yoon's administration gained momentum, leaving the president with limited room to maneuver. The martial law declaration was a lastditch effort by a president grappling with dwindling support and mounting resistance within his own party. Indeed the move was a miscalculation, a desperate attempt which backfired miserably with significant political fallout. The incident has intensified efforts by the opposition to impeach Yoon, with some members of his party now openly calling for his resignation. Protesters have taken to the streets in unprecedented numbers, with labour unions threatening nationwide strikes unless Yoon steps down. The crisis has raised alarm among South Korea's allies, including the United States and Japan have expressed serious concerns. Their worst fear of course is that North Korea may exploit the internal chaos to escalate tensions with the South, further destabilising the region. For South Korea, this moment represents a critical test of its democratic resilience. The swift revocation of martial law suggests that institutional checks and balances remain robust. However, the path forward will require careful navigation to prevent further polarisation and ensure stability in one of Asia's most vibrant democracies.



US-CHINA TRADE WAR HEATS UP

Trump set to amplify Biden's tough stance with tariffs and export controls

he loaded guns are out for the two largest economies of the world, the US and China, even before the original hard hitter Donald Trump takes charge as the new President in January next year. In one of his last "Containing China" measures outgoing President Joe Biden has imposed additional export controls on high-end chips, chip-making equipment to China, which can be used as components or in the manufacturing of weapons as well. The new restrictions also directly target some of the largest chipmakers in China, thus throwing in as many road blocks as possible in the dragon's aggressive weaponisation programme. Not, to be cowered China imposed retaliatory controls on the export of critical minerals such as Gallium, Antimony etc, which are essential components of the chips

Even as these measures were being announced, President-elect Donald Trump has been threatening the 9 member BRICS nations with severe 100 per cent tariffs, in case, they choose to create an alternate global currency to the dollar. Mr Trump has already threatened Canada, Mexico and the EU with the tariffs scalpel unless they come back to him with offers that are hard to ignore. Trump's third favourite word is tariffs, which he uses as leverage to negotiate trade deals with allies and enemies. The nations that have faced the latest threat of high tariffs from Donald Trump have already taken a cautionary approach to negotiating with the tough business person. Canada and Mexico have sounded out that would be more interested in sweetening the deal with the US under Trump, than confronting him on the tariff issues. China knows that Trump would be higher on optics, than his predecessor Joe Biden, on issues where the



US considers them as a direct threat. In one of the recently published editorials in the Chinese government mouthpiece Global Times, the Internet Society of China, the China Association of Automobile Manufacturers, the China Semiconductor Industry Association, and the China Association of Communications Enterprises are quoted to have issued statements terming US chips as unsafe and unreliable

It further states "The US has used this measure to greatly expand its power, affecting many countries and regions, including Japan, the Netherlands, Israel, Malaysia, Singapore, South Korea, and China's Taiwan region. This will severely disrupt the stability of the global industrial and supply chains and undermine the international economic and trade order." Incoming President Trump is likely to have a harder stance on export controls and, high tariffs for China imports. The incoming administration is likely to focus on high decibels, high optics, and control China measures than what the Joe Biden administration has achieved. It would be worthwhile to note, that some of the restrictive measures against China introduced, during Trump's first presidency, have only been upgraded and made tougher under President Joe Biden. Therefore at some level, there is bipartisan support for containing China in the US government.India has been watching this space carefully and knows well that it cannot escape the US tariff cannon for too long. It is also well aware that, there is a trade surplus with the US, which means it exports more than imports. Incoming President Trump even though has good relations with Indian PM Modi, is hardly going to miss this infraction. Obviously, the only safe prediction is a degree of unpredictability. Different countries have had their own experiences from the first Administration and would presumably draw from that to approach the second. Naturally, between two major economies, there will always be some give and take. When we look at economic or technology domains, the case for trusted and reliable partnerships have actually increased in recent years. A lot of what lies ahead would be in fashioning terms of engagement that are perceived as mutually beneficial. "A careful recalibration of India's trade relations is on the anvil, not just with the US, but also with its other allies

Charting Bharat's role in a multipolar world Renowned Russian philosopher Aleksandr Gelyevich Dugin advocates

leksandr Gelyevich Dugin, the Russian philosopher, presents a compelling vision of a multipolar world that seeks to restore balance and harmony to inter-

national relations. His recent visit to India, during which he delivered an insightful speech at the Russian Centre in New Delhi on November 19, highlighted his ideas on the importance of civilisational revival. Listening to Dugin was a profound experience, as he articulated the need for great civilisations such as Bharat (India), Russia, and China to assume their rightful roles in shaping a new global order. Dugin's philosophy is deeply intertwined with the concept of State-Civilisation, which transcends the boundaries of the Nation-State model imposed by the Westphalian system. In this framework, civilisations are not merely political entities but repositories of spiritual, cultural, and historical identity.

For Dugin, Bharat exemplifies this notion as it represents a civilisation rooted in ancient wisdom, from the teachings of the Vedas and Upanishads to its rich traditions of Dharmic philosophy. He argues that this heritage uniquely positions Bharat to lead a process of decolonisation—not just politically, but mentally and spiritually. Decolonisation of the mind, Dugin asserts, is essential for nations seeking to reclaim their civilisation al sovereignty. Bharat's re-engagement with its Vedic and Upanishadic traditions is not merely an academic exercise but a means of reconnecting with eternal principles that transcend the temporal constructs of modernity. In his view, traditional spiritual processes should be revived as living, evolving frameworks that can guide contemporary governance and social organisation. He draws a parallel with Russia's return to Orthodox Christianity, which he sees as a similar act of reclaiming spiritual identity in defiance of Western liberalism.The philosopher emphasises that the post-Cold Var unipolar world order, dominated by Western hegemony, has exhausted itself. Dugin critiques the universalisation of liberal values, arguing that they are inherently tied to the Atlanticist worldview and therefore unfit to govern the plurality of human cultures. Liberalism, he contends, prioritises individualism and market ideology at the expense of collective, spiritual, and civilisational values.

"Modernity is a project that has exhausted itself. The future lies in the revival of traditional societies, metaphysical truths, and spiritual values." For Dugin, multipolarity represents an alternative to this unipolar dominance, offering a framework for civilisations to engage with one another as equals.

This vision is rooted in dialogue rather than conflict, with each civilisation contributing its unique insights and values. Bharat, China, and Russia, he argues, form a nat-ural triad that can anchor this new world order. He views these three civilisations as distinct yet complementary, with Bharat's Vedic tradi-BHARAT'S RE-Taoism, and Russia's Orthodoxy

providing diverse philosophical and ENGAGEMENT spiritual foundations for a balanced WITH ITS VEDIC global system. Dugin's ideas resonate with contemporary geopolitical real-ities, as platforms like BRICS

He argues that the geographic, cultural, and economic ties between Bharat, China, and Russia make them natural allies in reshaping global power structures. By aligning their civilisational and strategic interests, these three powers can mediate international conflicts and create a more equitable world order. As Dugin writes in Foundations of Geopolitics, "Russia's mission is to unite the peoples and nations of Eurasia into a single geopolitical space that rejects Western domination and promotes a multipolar world." Central to Dugin's vision is the rejection of Western universalism.

He critiques the West's attempt to impose its values globally, arguing that this approach erases the distinctiveness of other cultures and leads to alienation. In contrast, the multipolar world Dugin envisions celebrates diversity, recognising the plurality of human experience and thought. Civilisations, he asserts, should engage in dialogue while preserving their unique identities. As he states in The Great war of Continents,' "The salvation of humanity lies in preserving the plurality of cultures and civilisations."

ability to mediate tensions, whether between China and the Islamic world or within the broader multipolar framework, highlights its potential as a stabilising force. Bharat's emphasis on spiritual heritage and cultural unity, he argues, sets an example for other civilisa-tions seeking to harmonise their internal diversity with their external roles. The path to a multipolar world is not without challenges. Dugin acknowledges that the West's resistance to relinquishing its dom-inance could lead to conflicts, even escalating to dangerous levels. However, he remains optimistic about the long-term prospects of multipolarity, which he sees as a natural evolution of global history. This optimism is grounded in his belief that civilizational revival offers a more stable and equitable alterna-

tive to the power struggles of unipolarity. In Dugin's analysis, the future lies in the hands of civilisations willing to reclaim their spiritual and cultural identities. Bharat's role is pivotal in this transformation. By embracing its Vedic heritage and fostering



Barnier govt in France

French President Emmanuel Macron will address the nation Thursday, a day after the National Assembly ousted Prime Minister Michel Barnier in a historic no-confidence vote that has left France without a functioning government. Macron is expected to focus on stabilising the political crisis and possibly naming a new prime minister to navigate the fractured parliament.

Barnier formally submitted his resignation Thursday morning at the Elysée Palace, fulfilling a constitutional obligation. The no-confidence motion passed by 331 votes in the National Assembly, forcing Barnier to step down after just three months in office - the shortest tenure of any prime minister in modern French history. Pressure to act swiftly: Macron faces the critical task of naming a replacement capable of leading a minority government in a parliament where no party holds a majority. Yaël Braun-Pivet, president of the National Assembly and a member of Macron's party, urged the

president to move quickly. 'I recommend he decide rapid ly on a new prime minister," Braun-Pivet said Thursday on France Inter radio. "There must

No-confidence vote topples Yoon replaces defence minister as S Korea's parliament nears vote on their impeachments

South Korea's president replaced his defence minister Thursday as opposition parties moved to impeach both men over the stunning yet short-lived imposition of martial law that brought armed troops into Seoul streets.

The main opposition Democratic Party and other small opposition parties submitted a joint motion to impeach President Yoon Suk Yeol on Wednesday over his martial law declaration the previous night. Martial law lasted about six hours, as the National Assembly quickly voted to overrule the president, forcing his Cabinet to lift it before daybreak Wednesday. On Thursday, Yoon's office said he decided to replace Defense Minister Kim Yong Hyun with Choi Byung Hyuk, a retired four-star general who is South Korea's ambassador to Saudi Arabia.

Vice Defense Minister Kim Seon Ho will be the acting minister until Choi assumes the job after a parliamentary hearing. The hearing is a formality as the president holds the power to appoint ministers outside of the prime minister without the approval of lawmakers. Yoon's office didn't provide

any further comments by him. rebellion or coup."

He hasn't appeared in public since he announced in a televised address that his government was lifting the martial law declaration.

The opposition parties earlier submitted a separate motion to impeach Kim, alleging he recommended that Yoon impose martial law. Kim had offered to resign and apologized for causing disruption and concern to the public. Kim said "all troops who performed duties related to martial law were acting on my instructions, and all responsibility lies with me," according to the Defense Ministry.

The impeachment motion against Yoon was introduced in parliament early Thursday, meaning it can be put to a vote between Friday and Sunday. It will be scrapped if it isn't voted within 72 hours of its parliamentary introduction, but a new motion can be submitted if the current one is scrapped or voted down, according to National Assembly officials.

Jo Seoung-lae, spokesperson of the Democratic Party, said it will push for a National Assembly vote on the impeachment motion on Saturday evening, to provide sufficient time for the conservative lawmakers to contemplate their decisions on what he described as an "unconstitutional, illegal

On Friday, the Democrats and other opposition lawmakers voted to impeach Choi Jae-hae, chairman of the country's board of audit and inspection, and three top public prosecutors, including Seoul Central District Prosecutors' Office chief Lee Chang-soo. The four will be suspended from their duties until the Constitutional Court rules whether to remove them from office. Members of the Yoon's ruling conservative People Power Party boycotted the votes, leaving the totals overwhelming over the threshhold to impeach them.

The Democratic Party's continued impeachment attempts of senior government officials and prosecutors have been a major source of conflict with Yoon, who during his martial law announcement accused the opposition of "anti-state activities" and "paralyzing the government."

Prospects for Yoon's impeachment isn't clear as Yoon's People Power Party decided Thursday to oppose the motion's passage. Choo Kyung-ho, the floor leader of the PPP, told reporters that his party would hold another meeting to determine how to oppose the motion's passage. Observers say PPP members could simply boycott a floor vote or cast ballots against the motion

Impeaching him would require support from two-thirds of the National Assembly, or 200 of its 300 members. The opposition parties together have 192 seats and they need additional votes from the PPP. Some experts earlier said the motion will likely be passed through parliament as 18 PPP lawmakers, who belong to an anti-Yoon faction in the party, already voted down Yoon's martial law decree together with opposition lawmakers. But speaking to reporters Thursday, PPP leader Han Dong-hun, head of the anti-Yoon faction, said he would work to ensure that the impeachment motion doesn't pass though he remains critical of Yoon's action, which he described as "unconstitutional." Han said that there is a need to "prevent damage to citizens and supporters caused by unprepared chaos."

Experts say rival factions in PPP could unite not to repeat their traumatic experiences following the 2016 impeachment of scandal-ridden conservative President Park Geun-hye, which happened after some lawmakers at her own party voted to impeach her. Park was eventually removed from office and arrested in 2017, and the liberals easily won the presidency in a by-election as conservatives remained in disarray

Syrian army withdraws from Hama after insurgents broke through its defences

¬he Syrian army says it has withdrawn from the central city of Hama after insurgents broke through its defences, in another setback for President Bashar Assad. The announcement Thursday

came hours after opposition fighters said they had entered the city and were marching toward the centre. The Syrian army said it redeployed from Hama and took positions outside the city to protect the lives of civilians.

The capture of Hama, Syria's fourth largest city, is another blow for Assad days after insurgents captured much of the northern city of Aleppo, the country's largest city.

Syrian state media confirmed violent clashes between government forces and opposition gunmen on the eastern edges of Hama city but denied that the

insurgents had breached it. Hama is one of the few cities that remained under full government control during Syria's conflict, which broke out in March 2011 following a popular uprising. Its capture would be a major setback for President Bashar

Assad. The offensive is being led by the jihadi group Hayat Tahrir al-Sham as well as an umbrella group of Turkish-backed Syrian militias called the Syrian National Army. Their sudden capture of the northern city of Aleppo, an ancient business hub, was a stunning prize for Assad's opponents and reignited the conflict which had been largely stalemat-

ed for the past few years. Aleppo's takeover marked the first opposition attack on the city since 2016, when a brutal Russian air campaign retook it for Assad after rebel forces had initially seized it. Intervention by Russia, Iran and Iranian-allied Hezbollah

and other militant groups has allowed Assad to remain in power. The latest flare-up in Syria's long civil war comes as Assad's main regional and international backers are preoccupied with their own wars.

Tens of thousands of people have been displaced by the renewed fighting, which began with the surprise opposition offensive on November 27.

The insurgents claimed on their Military Operations Department channel on the Telegram app Thursday that they have entered Hama and are marching toward its centre. "Our forces are taking positions inside the city of Hama, the channel quoted a local commander identified as Maj. Hassan

Abdul-Ghani as saying. The Britain-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, an opposition war monitor, said gunmen have entered parts of the city, mainly the neighbourhoods

of Sawaaeq and Zahiriyeh to the northwest. It added that gunmen are also on the edge of the northwestern neighbourhood of Kazo. "If Hama falls, it means that the beginning of the regime's fall has started," the Observatory's chief, Rami Abdurrahman, told The Associated Press.

Hama is a major intersection point in Syria that links that country's centre with the north as well the east and the west. It is about 200 kilometres north of the capital, Damascus, Assad's seat of power. Hama province also borders the coastal province of Latakia, a main base of popular support for Assad.

The city's name is synonymous with the 1982 massacre of Hama, one of the most notorious in the modern Middle East, when security forces under Assad's late father, Hafez Assad, killed thousands to crush a Muslim Brotherhood uprising.

Starmer to outline his 'Plan for Change'

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer is trying to change the narrative on his fivemonth-old government after plummeting approval ratings, business anxiety over tax hikes and protesting farmers clogging London streets.

Conservative opposition leader Kemi Badenoch calls it an "emergency reset" by a floundering administration.

But Starmer's office says the "Plan for Change" speech the prime minister will deliver on Thursday is not a relaunch or about-face, but "the next phase" in his government plan, intended to persuade voters that the government is making their lives better.

Starmer's centre-left Labour Party was elected in Jul — ending 14 years of Conservative government — on a promise to get Britain's sluggish economy growing and restore frayed public services such as the state-funded National Health people how their lives will improve any time soon.

The speech will set out "milestones" for measuring progress on economic growth, clean energy, reforming childcare and education, bolstering the NHS and cutting crime. It includes a pledge of 13,000 more neighbourhood police

officers within five years Starmer's office said he will say that "hard-working Brits ... reasonably want a stable economy, their country to be safe, their borders secure, more cash in their pocket, safer streets in their town, opportunities for their children, secure British energy in their home, and an NHS that is there when they need it."

Taiwan, Guam should work together to defend freedom, says Prez Lai

Taiwan and Guam should L work together to defend freedom and democracy in the region, Taiwanese President Lai Ching-te said Thursday on a visit to the American territory

Guam was Lai's second US stop during an ongoing tour of the Pacific Islands, following a visit to Hawaii last weekend. China's government claims Taiwan as its territory and says the self-governing island must come under its control at some point in the future.

Lai, speaking to Guam's legislature, emphasised the shared values and strategic

importance of Taiwan and sanctions on Thursday on Guam in the Indo-Pacific

region "Let us together become the crucial force in defending freedom, democracy in the first island chain," he said, referring to a string of islands off the Asian continent that includes Japan, Taiwan and part of the Philippines. China, which considers Taiwan a renegade province, opposes any official interaction between the island's government and the United States. The US is the main overseas supplier of arms for Taiwan's defence, and has

naval and air force bases on Guam. In Beijing, China's Foreign Ministry announced

13 American companies and six executives in response to recently announced weapons sales to Taiwan. The executives include the president

and vice president of Raytheon's Naval Power strategic business unit. The sanctions include a ban on entering China, including Hong Kong and Macao. Earlier this week, the ministry said it "strongly condemned" US support for Lai's visit to Hawaii and had lodged a complaint with the United States.

A resolution from Guam's legislature welcomed Lai and expressed appreciation for Taiwan's "significant contri-

butions to Guam's economy and community," Speaker Therese Terlaie said.

Lai called for deeper cooperation with Guam, highlight ing aquaculture, hydroponic agriculture, construction projects and alternative energy as potential areas of partnership. Lai arrived in Guam on Wednesday night after visits to the Marshall Islands and Tuvalu. He was scheduled to fly to Palau, the final stop on his trip. The three Pacific Island countries are among 12 governments that recognise Taiwan diplomatically. The rest of the world, including the United States, has official ties with the Chinese government in Beijing.

The International Crimes Tribunal (ICT) of Bangladesh on Thursday ordered the authorities to ban the dissemination of all the "hate speeches" of ousted prime minister Sheikh Hasina in the media and on social networking platforms. The order follows Hasina's recent speech, her first public address after fleeing Bangladesh four months back, in which she mounted a stinging attack on the country's interim leader Muhammad Yunus. accusing him of perpetrating "genocide" and failing to protect minorities including Hindus. Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha (BSS) reported that a two-member tribunal led by Justice Md

passed the order and directed the authorities to remove all the "hate speeches" of Hasina from social media and take necessary steps to stop their dissemination in future in all types of mass media. Prosecutor Advocate Abdullah Al Noman told the news agency that the tribunal asked secretaries of the ICT Division, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, and Bangladesh Telecommunication Regulatory Commission (BTRC) to execute the order. The prosecution earlier filed the

petition, pleading to remove and restrict all types of hate speech and incitement by the ousted prime minister, which may intimidate the witnesses or vic-

Earlier, prosecutor Gazi MH Tamim briefed the media in this regard, saying not only in Bangladesh, making hate speech is a criminal offence in every law and every country around the world. She was even heard giving threats to the victims and witnesses of the cases against her, through these speeches," Tamim said.

Bitcoin tops USD 100,000 as big rally sparked by Trump election win rolls on

m itcoin}$ has topped the USD mark as a massive rally in the world's most pop ular cryptocurrency sparked by the election of Donald Trump rolls on.

The milestone comes just hours after the President-elect signalled a lighter regulatory approach to the crypto industry when he said he intends to nominate cryptocurrency advocate Paul Atkins to be the next chair the Securities and Exchange Commission. Bitcoin has soared to unprecedented heights since Trump

won the election November 5. The cryptocurrency has climbed dramatically from USD 69,374 on Election Day and rose as high as USD 103,713 Wednesday, according to CoinDesk. Just two years

go, bitcoin dropped below USD 17,000 following the collapse of crypto exchange FTX. How long bitcoin will stay above the USD 100,000 mark is uncertain. It fell back to just under USD 102,000 early Thursday. As with everything in the volatile cryptoverse, the future is impossible to predict. And while some are bullish on future gains, other experts continue to warn of investment risks. Back up. What is cryptocur-

rency again? Cryptocurrency has been around for a while now. But, chances are, you've heard about it more and more over the last few years.

In basic terms, cryptocurrency is digital money. This kind of currency is designed to work through an online network without a central authority -

backed by any government or banking institution – and transactions get recorded with technology called a blockchain. Bitcoin is the largest and oldest cryptocurrency, although other assets like ethereum, tether and dogecoin have also gained popularity over the years. Some investors see cryptocurrency as a "digital alternative" to traditional money, but the large majority of daily financial transactions are still conducted using fiat currencies such as the dollar. Also, bitcoin can be very volatile, with its price reliant on larger market conditions.

Why is bitcoin soaring?: A lot of the recent action has to do with the outcome of the US presidential election. Trump, who was once a crypto sceptic, has pledged to make meaning it's typically not the US "the crypto capital of the

planet" and create a "strategic reserve" of bitcoin. His campaign accepted donations in cryptocurrency and he courted fans at a bitcoin conference in July. He also launched World Liberty Financial, a new venture with family members to trade cryptocurrencies.

Crypto industry players have welcomed Trump's victory, in hopes that he would be able to push through legislative and regulatory changes that they've long lobbied for - which, generally speaking, aim for an increased sense of legitimacy without too much red tape.

Trump made a move in that direction Wednesday when he said he intends to nominate Paul Atkins to chair the Securities and Exchange Commission. Atkins was an SEC commissioner during the presidency of George W. Bush.

In the years since leaving the agency, Atkins has made the case against too much market regulation. He joined the Token Alliance, a cryptocurrency advocacy organization, in 2017. Under current chair Gary Gensler, the SEC has cracked down on the crypto industry, penalizing a number of companies for violating securities laws. But he's also faced criticism from industry players in the process, like the chief legal officer of Robinhood, who described Gensler's approach toward crypto as "rigid" and "hostile." Gensler will step down when Trump takes office. One crypto-friendly move the SEC did make under Gensler was the approval in January of spot bitcoin ETFs, or exchange trade funds, which allow investors to have a stake in bitcoin without directly buying it. confidence in crypto overall,

The Spot ETFs were the dominant driver of bitcoin's price before the election — but, like much of the crypto's recent momentum, saw record inflows postelection.

Environmental impacts of bit coin mining boil largely down to the energy source used. Industry analysts have maintained that clean energy has increased in use in recent years, coinciding with rising calls for climate protections.

US Senate for designating Dec 3 as Chemical Disaster Awareness Day

On the occasion of the 40th anniversary of the Bhopal chemical disaster, three Senators have introduced a resolution to designate December 3 as National Chemical Disaster Awareness Day. Introduced by Senators Jeff Merkley, Ron Wyden and Peter Welch, the resolution recognises the 40-year effort of the survivors of the 1984 Bhopal chemical disaster in India to ensure that no other community around the world suffers another such catastrophe by designating December 3 as National Chemical Disaster Awareness Day.

On December 3, 1984, a Union Carbide pesticide factory released a dense cloud of toxic methyl isocyanate gas into Bhopal, killing 8,000 people within 72 hours and permanently injuring 5,00,000 more in what is considered to be the world's worst industrial disas-

ter. Applauding the resilience of the Bhopal chemical disaster survivors in battling to overcome ill health, poverty, and marginalization to try to establish a deterrent against future chemical disasters; the resolution calls on the Department of Justice to take timely steps in response to requests by the Indian Government concerning Dow Inc., who purchased the Union Carbide facility where the disaster took place. The resolution also calls for any other actions necessary for the United States to comply with obligations under the Treaty on Mutual Legal Assistance in Criminal Matters, signed at New Delhi on October 17, 2001 (TIAS 05-1003). It seeks to engage with the sur-vivors of the Bhopal chemical

disaster to strengthen the public's understanding of the dan-

gers of chemical disasters; and emphasises that supporting human rights and protecting the right to freedom from discrimination are and should remain key pillars of United States foreign policy worldwide. The resolution notes that Union Carbide and its representatives have ignored repeated summonses to appear in court in India, and applications under 2 extradition treaties between India and the United States dating back to 1942 have failed to secure their appearance. Amnesty International says genocide being committed against Palestinians in Gaza, Israel rejects accusation

Amnesty International Accused Israel of committing genocide in the Gaza Strip during its war with Hamas, saying it has sought to deliberately destroy Palestinians by mounting deadly attacks, demolishing vital infrastructure and preventing the delivery of food, medicine and other aid

The human rights group released a report Thursday in the Middle East that said such actions could not be justified by Hamas' Oct. 7, 2023, attack into Israel, which ignited the war, or the presence of militants in civilian areas. Amnesty said the United States and other allies of Israel could be complicit in genocide, and called on them to halt arms shipments. "Our damning findings must serve as a wake-up call to the international community: this is genocide. It must stop now," Agnès Callamard, Secretary General of Amnesty International, said in the report.

Israel, which was founded in the ential voice to a growing list of aftermath of the Holocaust, has adamantly rejected genocide allegations against it as an antisemitic "blood libel." It is challenging such allegations at the International Court of Justice, and it has rejected the International Criminal Court's accusations that Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and his former defense minister committed war crimes in Gaza.

The deplorable and fanatical organization Amnesty International has once again produced a fabricated report that is entirely false and based on lies," Israel's Foreign Ministry said in a statement. Israel accused Hamas, which has vowed to annihilate Israel, of carrying out a genocidal massacre in the attack that triggered the war, and said it is defending itself in accordance with international law. **Amnesty says Palestinians face**

But last month, Pope Francis called for an investigation to determine if Israeli actions amounted to genocide, and Saudi Arabia's crown prince, Mohammed bin Salman, who has signaled readiness to establish diplomatic relations with Israel, accused it of committing genocide.

Israel says it is at war with Hamas, not the people of Gaza. And key allies, including the US and Germany, have also pushed back against the genocide allegations. But Amnesty accused Israel of violating the 1951 Genocide Convention through acts it says are intended to bring about the physical destruction of Gaza's Palestinian population by expos-

ing them to "a slow, calculated death?

Amnesty said it analyzed the overall pattern of Israel's conduct in Gaza between Oct. 7, 2023 and early July. It noted that there is no casualty threshold in proving the international crime of genocide, which is defined by the United Nations as acts intended to destroy, in whole or in part, a national, ethnic, racial or religious group.

To establish intent, Amnesty said it reviewed over 100 statements by Israeli government and military officials and others since the start of the war that 'dehumanized Palestinians, called for or justified genocidal acts or other crimes against them?

Israeli officials have previously said that such statements were taken out of context or referred to their stated goal of destroying Hamas, not Palestinian civilians. Israel says it goes to great lengths to protect civilians and comply with international law — including ordering civilians to evacuate areas ahead of airstrikes and ground offensives. It also says it has facilitated the deliveries of large quantities of food and humanitarian supplies — a claim that is disputed by the UN and aid organizations working inside Gaza

On Sunday, a former top Israeli general and defense minister accused the government of ethnic cleansing in northern Gaza, where the army has sealed off the towns of Beit Hanoun and Beit Lahiya and the Jabaliya refugee camp and allowed almost no humanitarian aid to enter.

Amnesty said it found that Israel "deliberately inflicted conditions of life on Palestinians in Gaza intended to lead, over time, to their destruction." Those actions included the destruction of homes, farms, hospitals and water facilities; mass evacuation orders; and the restriction of humanitarian aid and other essential services.

14 fresh cases against Imran PTI ISLAMABAD

Fagainst former premier Imran Khan in Islamabad after the violent protest by his supporters last week, taking the total cases against him in the national capital to 76, according to a report submitted to a Pakistani court.

The details were shared with the Islamabad High Court (IHC) in a report submitted by the Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) police.

His Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party launched the protest on November 24 to give a sit-in at D-Chowk in Islamabad's Red Zone, where most government buildings are located. His supporters were forcibly dispersed on the night of November 26 when they reached close to D-Chowk.



DRI report reveals rise in commercial fraud, FTA misuse worth ₹1,427 Crore in 2023-24 INBRIEF

RAJESH KUMAR NEW DELHI

The Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI)'s report on 'Smuggling in India' 2023-24 highlights a rise in commercial fraud, including misuse of foreign including misuse of foreign trade agreements (FTA) by in dividuals/companies. According to the report, the agencies have detected cases of FTA misuse worth Rs 1,427 crore during 2023-24 compared to Rs 481 crore in 2022-2023 2022-2023.

Moreover, the DRI booked 109 cases involving 8223.61 kg of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances including 107.31 kg of cocaine, 48.74 kg of heroin, 136 kg of methamphetamine, 236 kg of mephedrone and 7348.68 kg of ganja in 2023-24.

The seizures indicate an increasing trend of smuggling of cocaine through air passenger route, from 21 cases in 2022-23 to 47 cases in 2023-24, with majority of seizures effected at airports. According to report, Free

'Though illicit cigarettes are reportedly manufactured in certain South East Asian countries, it appears that the consignments are initially shipped to Dubai from southeast Asia and then re-routed to India," it said.

According to the report for the fiscal 2023-24, the DRI initiated 485 import cases, involving illegal benefits totaling Rs 5,907.79 crore. The most common offenses included mis-

declaration/mis-classification (201 cases), misuse of enduse and other notifications (52 cases), misuse of Free Trade Agreements (FTA) (51 cases), undervaluation (47 cases), and evasion of anti-

dumping duties (38 cases). Misuse of the ASEAN-India FTA (33 cases) and Notification No. 50/2017-Customs (27 cases) were also notable issues. On the export side, 27 cases

were booked, involving illegal benefits worth Rs 123.34 crore.

The first half of 2024-25 saw cigarette seizures climb by 19 sticks during the same period in FY24.

Illicit foreign currency seizures have also surged. DRI officials seized Rs 13.8 crore in foreign currency during the first half of FY25, surpassing the Rs 12.4 crore confiscated in all of FY24. Additionally, the agency uncovered a Rs 576 crore trade-based money laundering (TBML) racket. The scheme involved importing cheap electrical goods and cosmetics at inflated prices to channel foreign exchange out of the country. According to the report, gold

smuggling in India follows a "hub and spoke" model.

In this system, contraband is first brought into the country and transported to central hub locations before being distributed to various destinations.

During the financial year the DRI seized 2023-24. a total of 1,319 kg of gold, with the land route accounting for 55% of the per cent, reaching 3.95 crore accounting for 55% of the sticks, compared to 3.31 crore seizures and the air route

contributing around 36%. The DRI has also shared valuable intelligence with Customs field formations, resulting in significant gold

employ a wide range of "mules," including foreign nationals, families, and even insiders. These syndicates are increasingly using international departure gates, where airport workers and other staff are involved in smuggling gold from transit

passengers. Furthermore, there has been a rise in the number of carriers used by these syndicates to transport smaller amounts of gold, which helps reduce potential losses if the gold is intercepted by law enforcement.



Revamping India's Housing

he governments at the Centre and the States are sincere in their efforts to provide shelter to those without roofs over their heads. It must be said that food, clothing, and shelter remain the essential elements that constitute the life of any ordinary person. The administrations have conceived and executed many housing projects such as the Prime Minister's Awaas Yojana and the Indira Gandhi Housing Scheme. In Tamil Nadu, former Chief Minister J Javalalithaa launched a mission to construct houses for the poorest of the poor at heavily subsidised rates.

During the tenure of C Achutha Menon as Chief Minister (1969 to 1977), the Kerala Government launched Laksham Veedu (1,00,000 Houses), a housing scheme for the poorer sections of society. Small houses were built under this scheme across the State for the benefit of people below the poverty line. Although the intention was noble, these houses ended up as dens of all vices. Residents of Laksham Veedu colonies were treated as anti-social elements, as many excelled in dubious professions such as theft, dacoity, bootlegging, pimping, and prostitution. The scheme died a natural death, like many other governmentsponsored initiatives. Later, the LDF Government led by Pinarayi Vijayan launched Life Mission in 2016 with the aim of providing residential accommodation to those without homes. However, this multicrore project is reportedly embroiled in corruption, with central agencies investigating the issue.

In Tamil Nadu, the Slum Clearance Board has constructed four-storey apartments for the poor along the scenic Marina Beach. However, the quality of construction and the ambience are worse than the slums themselves. Why do government schemes fail so frequently? The answer is not difficult to ascertain. Massive corruption involving public works departments, bureaucrats, contractors, and politicians turns these schemes into milch cows. "To hell with the beneficiaries... we can make as much money as possible from these schemes," seems to be the driving mantra of these antinationals.

Government housing schemes often fail due to corruption and poor execution, highlighting the stark contrast with private sector successes, says KUMAR CHELLAPPAN




The Central Public Works Department, responsible for constructing central government buildings, and the State PWDs, entrusted with building roads, offices, and residential accommodations, are classic examples of corruption in high places. One need only look at the buildings, be they office complexes, hospitals or housing projects for the poor. What stands out is the careless manner in which they have been designed and built. Hygiene and sanitation in these buildings are often appalling. Walls double as spittoons, toilets are worse than hell, and cleanliness seems alien to such structures.

Contrast this with the apartments and villas built by private developers, and the difference is stark. Major players such as Tata Housing, L&T, DLF, Ashok Leyland, the Godrej Group, Hiranandani, Chettinadu Group, Ceebros, Puravankara, and Sobha City (to name a few) create visual treats. Their projects cost a fortune and cater to the affluent, but they stand as a testament to

quality construction and planning. The townships they build, with their panoramic views, starkly contrast the stinking lowincome group apartment complexes constructed by CPWD and PWDs. These public works departments have effectively become Public Waste Departments, proving themselves incapable of fulfilling their intended purpose.

It is indeed possible to build beautiful and safe houses for the poor. What is needed is a change in the attitude and approach of bureaucrats. The success of private developers in building well-planned townships and apartments stems from thoughtful planning and treating construction as an art. The life and achievements of Kushal Pal Singh (KP Singh), who single-handedly built the DLF empire, illustrate this point. The township at Gurugram (which I have read about and seen on television) is a breathtaking achievement. Thanks to companies like DLF, India has become a global player in

constructing townships, major software parks, and apartment complexes. Is it not possible for doyens like K P Singh to build affordable housing for the poor?

Such a vision could materialise by loosening the stranglehold of the government (both Centre and State) on these sectors. For every high-end township that private developers construct, they could be tasked with building housing complexes for low-income groups, complete with well-laid-out landscapes. Given proper incentives and recognition, these companies would likely embrace such missions. It would also be crucial to foster respect for business leaders like Singh, the Godrejs, the Tatas, and others. India cannot afford to view its entrepreneurs, who employ millions, with suspicion. Business and entrepreneurship are forms of art that can drive progress where the government cannot.

The memoir Why The Heck Not, by K P Singh with Aparna Jain, is an eye-opener. It highlights the often-overlooked role of Indian entrepreneurs in nation-building. Figures like JRD Tata and Dhirubhai Ambani were visionaries who lacked the recognition they deserved within India, even as foreign media sought their insights. Singh's story, from studying aircraft maintenance engineering in Coventry to heading the DLF Group, is nothing short of inspiring. His advice, peppered throughout the book, offers valuable lessons for parents, youth, and policymakers alike.

After reading the memoir, one cannot help but wish Singh another 95 years of health, strength, and happiness. His contributions to India's infrastructure and business landscape make him a national treasure. The insights he shares about India's fragile infrastructure and the steps needed to achieve the five trillion-dollar economy are profound. His vision of a better, more inclusive India should inspire policymakers to let a thousand flowers bloom.

One blemish on Singh's otherwise remarkable career is his association with a less-than-reputable individual, often referred to as Damaad Shree. With his wisdom and experience, Singh could have avoided such associations and still achieved success.

"In my mind, it was very clear you can't do worse than that (Adelaide). You'll have a day when the luck is in your favour and you can bounce back. And that's exactly what happened.
