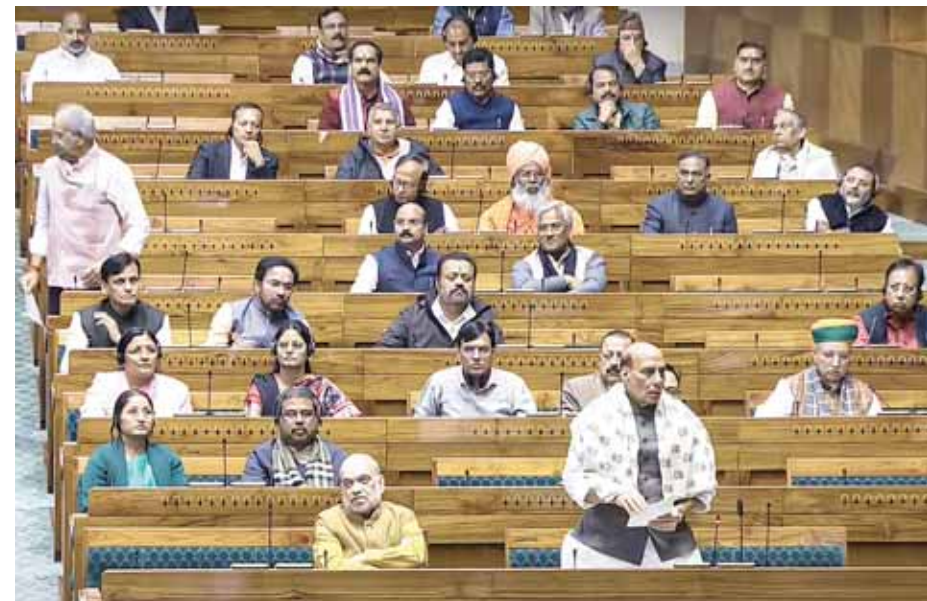


Constitution Sparks Volatile Debate

Initiating a two-day debate on Friday in the Lok Sabha on "Discussion on the Glorious Journey of 75 Years of the Constitution of India", Defence Minister Rajnath Singh accused Congress for always choosing "satta" (power) over the Constitution and never tolerated autonomy of institutions and tried to destroy constitutional principles and spirit. Singh was countered by Priyanka Gandhi, leading the Opposition said that it seems Prime Minister Narendra Modi has not understood that it is 'Bharat ka Samvidhan' not 'Sangh ka Vidhan'. She described the Constitution as a 'suraksha kavach' (protective shield) of justice, unity and freedom of expression and one the BJP-led Government has made every effort to break in the past 10 years.

Provoking the Opposition MPs, Rajnath Singh said Congress has sought to project the Constitution as its own contribution, while deliberately ignoring the contribution of several leaders. "The talk of protection of the Constitution does not seem appropriate coming from it (Congress). These days, I see that many Opposition leaders keep the Constitution in their pockets. Actually, this is what they have learnt from childhood, they have seen their families keep the Constitution in their pockets for generations," he

said, adding "the BJP (Bharatiya Janata Party), on the other hand, always bows before the Constitution and has never played with the independence and autonomy of institutions." Singh's assertion drew jibes from the members of the Opposition benches during a speech that was largely heard in attention. "Congress, during its decades in power, often amended the Constitution with a malicious spirit to change it gradually, while the Narendra Modi Government has effected amendments to strengthen its fundamental values and for people's empowerment", alleged Singh, inviting objections from Congress MPs. Whenever there was a choice, the Congress chose power

over the Constitution, he claimed. It always tried to "hijack and appropriate" the framing of the Constitution, Singh said, highlighting the imposition of Emergency, dismissal of many state governments and superseding of Supreme Court judges for "standing up" to the then Indira Gandhi government to charge the party with violating constitutional principles. The BJP leader said he is surprised that those who subverted the Constitution are now speaking for its protection. "Expressions for protecting the Constitution from the Congress do not look good," he said in a jibe at the Opposition party. The two-day debate, which is likely to end with Prime Minister's Modi's speech, is being seen as a highlight of the ongoing parliamentary session amid a running battle between the ruling party and the Opposition since the Lok Sabha poll campaign, which was marked by the INDIA bloc building its campaign on the Constitution being allegedly under threat from the BJP. Singh's mention of the country's first Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru, a persistent target of the BJP's attack over the years, as one of those who contributed to the making of the Constitution drew rare cheers from the Opposition benches. The BJP leader, though, later also charged Nehru with amending the Constitution to override a Supreme Court judgment for "stifling" freedom of expression.



Notice moved in RS for Allahabad High Court Judge's impeachment

The notice for moving the impeachment motion was signed by 55 opposition MPs, including Kapil Sibal, Vivek Tankha, Digvijaya Singh, John Brittas, Manoj Kumar Jha and Saket Gokhale. These MPs met the Rajya Sabha secretary general and handed over the notice for impeachment a few minutes before the start of the day's proceedings, the sources said. Some of the other prominent MPs who have signed the notice are P Chidambaram, Randeep Surjewala, Pramod Tiwari, Jairam Ramesh, Mukul Wasnik, Naseer Hussain, Raghav Chadha, Fauzia Khan, Sanjay Singh, AA Rahim, V Sivadasan and Renuka Chowdhury.

Three Indian students killed in Canada: MEA

Three Indian students have been murdered in Canada last week and the Indian High Commission in Ottawa has taken up the matter of safety of Indians with the Canadian authorities, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said on Friday. The safety, security and welfare of Indian nationals in Canada remains of utmost importance to us, MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said. Jaiswal said the Indian missions in that country are in touch with the local authorities for thorough investigation of the incidents. "In the last week or so we have had unfortunate tragedies. Three Indian students have been murdered. We are saddened at these terrible tragedies that have struck our nationals in Canada. We extend our deepest

condolences to the grieving families. Our High Commission and Consulates in Toronto and Vancouver are extending all possible help in the matter," he said. "Issues faced by them, especially Indian students, are raised by our high commission and Consulates with the relevant Canadian authorities on a regular basis," he said. "We have also issued an advisory for our nationals and Indian students to exercise extreme caution and the remain vigilant in view of the

deteriorating security environment in Canada as a result of the growing incidence of hate crimes and criminal violence," Jaiswal added. According to official data, over 400,000 Indian students are studying in Canada. Asked about reports of instances of the Indian high commission not granting visas in Canada, Jaiswal described them as a "disinformation" campaign. "We have seen the said media report. It is yet another example of Canadian media's disinformation to malign India," he said. "Granting of Indian visas is our sovereign function and we have the legitimate right to deny visas to those who undermine our territorial integrity," he said. "The commentary that we see in the Canadian media on this matter is akin to foreign interference in India's sovereign affairs," Jaiswal added.

IndiGo Airlines apologises 'On-Time, Every Time'

Days after being tagged as the worst airlines in the world, Indigo on Friday apologised to the passengers stranded in Istanbul airport for hours owing to delays in flights to New Delhi and Mumbai. The airliner apologised for the inconvenience and assured that the issue would be sorted at the earliest. Passengers took to social media to recount their terrible experience. The trouble began when a flight from Istanbul to Delhi, scheduled to depart at 8.10 pm on December 12, was initially delayed to the next day at 1.30 pm. Passengers were left at the airport with little information or support from IndiGo staff. Similarly, the flight from Istanbul to Mumbai, originally set to depart at 8.15 pm on December 12, was first pushed to 11.00 pm, then delayed again to the following morning at 10 am. IndiGo operates one flight each daily from Delhi and Mumbai to Istanbul with Boeing 777 aircraft. Many of them have been stranded since Thursday. While the exact details of the impacted flights could not be immediately ascertained. Frustrated travellers took to social media to express their dissatisfaction, saying they

received no communication from IndiGo regarding the ongoing delays. Despite promises of lounge access as compensation, the lounge at Istanbul Airport was overcrowded and unable to accommodate all the stranded travellers, they claimed on social media. "We are aware of the delays on the IndiGo flight connections to Istanbul. We accord the highest priority towards customer convenience and our teams are available at all contact points to assist customers," IndiGo said in a statement on Friday. The airline also apologised for the "inconvenience" caused to the passengers. Some passengers also shared pictures of people stuck at the airport. In a post on X, a passenger said, "first time to India and stranded at the Istanbul Airport for the last 24 hours because the IndiGo flight keeps cancelling. No food. No clarity. No representative. No compensation. Pathetic treatment". "Lot of people stranded at the airport due to pathetic services by @IndiGo6E and @TurkishAirlines operators. Never book flights with them as they don't value passengers time. You can never be on time with @IndiGo6E," another passenger said in a post on X.

Actor Allu Arjun granted interim bail

The Telangana High Court on Friday granted a four-week interim bail to actor Allu Arjun, who was arrested earlier in the day by the city police in connection with the death of a woman during the screening of his latest movie 'Pushpa 2' here last week. The HC order came shortly after the actor was remanded to judicial custody for 14 days by a local court. He was sent to the jail at Chanchalguda here following the remand, amid tight security arrangements. The HC pronounced the order granting bail to Arjun while he was being taken to the jail. The court directed the actor to cooperate with the authorities in the investigation, while granting him interim bail. Earlier in the morning, Allu Arjun was arrested by the city police in connection with the death of a woman during the premiere of his latest movie 'Pushpa 2: The Rule'. The actor was taken into custody, amid tight security, from his residence and taken to Chikkadpally police station in a police vehicle.

The system has failed us, say RG Kar docs

The junior doctors, who led the months-long protest over the rape and murder of the resident doctor at the RG Kar Medical College and Hospital, expressed disappointment with the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) investigation into the case on Friday after two key suspects got bail from a court. The Sealdah court granted bail to RG Kar Medical College and Hospital's ex-principal Sandip Ghosh and former officer-in-charge of the Tala police station Abhijit Mondal in the rape and murder case of the on-duty doctor. They were granted bail after the CBI failed to file a charge sheet against them within the mandatory 90-day period. "We are extremely disappointed with the pace with which the CBI is handling this case," said junior doctor Aniket Mahato, a leading face of the protests that rocked the state. "The system has failed us, and the accused have been allowed to go free due to the sluggishness of the investigation. This delay in justice is a slap on the face of all those who have been



fighting for accountability," he added. The junior doctors started their demonstration after the body of their colleague was found at the RG Kar hospital on August 9. Following 50 days of cease work that paralysed the state's healthcare system, they went on hunger strike on October 5 amid the Durga Puja festival, demanding justice. The hunger strike was called off on October 24 after Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee met them. Mahato said they were firm in their resolve for justice. "We are not backing down," he said. "The CBI's inaction has only fueled our frustration. We will decide our next course of action soon and continue our fight for justice," he added. The CBI took over the case on the direction of the high court following allegations of mishandling by the police.

CCPA puts 17 direct selling firms in the dock

The Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) has issued notice to 17 direct selling firms including Oriflame India, and Suii Dhaaga Lifestyle, that were found in unfair trade practices, service deficiencies, and violations of the Consumer Protection (Direct Selling) Rules, 2021. According to the CCPA, of these 13 entities are currently under investigation while reply from three of the entities is awaited. Direct selling is a method of marketing, distribution and sale of goods or services directly to consumers, away from fixed retail premises. This method relies on independent representatives of the entity, known as direct sellers, selling products directly to customers, typically through personal contact, online platforms, or home presentations. The list includes multiple firms and the action comes in response to concerns about deceptive practices in the direct selling industry. "However, some fraudulent entities misuse the direct selling model to promote illegal pyramid or money circulation schemes. These firms often make unrealistic promises of high commissions, foreign trips, entrepreneurship, high returns and a wealthy future, contingent on recruiting others, which violates consumer trust and established laws, thereby exposing consumers to fraudulent pyramid and money circulation schemes. Three major signs that a product is being used to disguise pyramid schemes include large joining fee or investment, compensation paid for recruiting and no right of return, buy-back or cooling off period offered," the CCPA said. "The government remains



steadfast in its mission to create a fair, transparent, and consumer-friendly market ecosystem," the statement said. Consumers have been advised to exercise caution by checking disclosures carefully, avoiding recruitment-based earnings, understanding return and refund policies, reading contracts thoroughly and verifying direct sellers' credentials. The Consumer Protection (Direct Selling) Rules, 2021, were introduced to regulate direct selling entities and protect consumer interests and consumers will have to check certificate of Incorporation, PAN, GST Registration, important licenses as per the goods and services offered, Certificate of Registration of Trademark of the direct selling companies. These rules complement other existing regulatory frameworks, including the Consumer Protection (E-Commerce) Rules, 2020, and the Legal Metrology (Packaged Commodities) Rules, 2011. The Department has advised consumers to stay vigilant and report any suspected illegal activities or violations related to direct selling to the appropriate authorities.

SC to hear SPG petition on fate of three specialised vehicles

The Special Protection Group (SPG), which protects the Prime Minister, on Friday, moved the Supreme Court (SC) challenging an order of the National Green Tribunal (NGT) which refused to allow extension of registration period of three specialised armoured vehicles by five years. The matter came before a bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Augustine George Masih, which took objection that the elite force approached the NGT for registration of its vehicle instead of moving the top court in the MC Mehta matter. The SC has been monitoring the air pollution crisis in Delhi in an ongoing Public Interest Litigation in the MC Mehta case. Appearing for the SPG, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, urged the Bench to consider the matter on an urgent basis and sought extension of registration period citing

importance of the vehicles. Tushar Mehta said these vehicles are an essential and integral part of Special Protection Group technical logistics.

The Bench converted the matter in an interlocutory application and posted the matter for hearing on December 16. The NGT on March 22 had refused to grant the relief, saying such vehicles being diesel vehicles cannot be permitted to ply in the National Capital Region (NCR) on completion of 10 years. "We are conscious of the fact that these three vehicles are special purpose vehicles which are not normally available and these vehicles have run very less in the last 10 years and are needed for the specific purpose of security of the prime minister but in view of the order of the Supreme Court dated October 29, 2018, the prayer made in the M.A. Cannot be granted," the NGT had said.



'Rajmarg Saathi' promises enhanced safety on National Highways

With an aim to enhance road safety and strengthen highway patrolling, National Highways Authority of India (NHAI), the central road making agency will implement an upgraded and forward-looking Incident Management Services. The guidelines on the subject include updated specifications for new Route Patrolling Vehicles (RPVs) named 'Rajmarg Saathi' and outlines design, functions, technology, components and manpower specifications for the RPVs. The RPVs conduct inspection of National Highway stretches to monitor and respond to emergency situations. In the existing RPVs, the rear space is open for keeping

instruments and equipment to support in case of emergency situations. However, due to open space, the operators were not able to keep these equipment in a well organised manner, which at times led to delays in taking prompt action. In order to overcome such a situation, the rear or trunk of RPV has now been replaced by a closed cabinet with dedicated space for different equipment and inventory. The shelves have been created to provide quick & easy access to different equipment during the emergency situations and is a significant upgrade from the earlier RPVs. Additional advanced feature of this new RPV is the provision for dashboard cameras equipped with 'AI video analytics' to capture and identify cracks & potholes as well as other elements



including road distresses shall be collected on a weekly basis by NHAI and this road distress data shall be

integrated with NHAI One application for more efficient maintenance of roads. The guidelines for 'Rajmarg Saathi' RPVs include detailed specifications related to the use of vehicle, equipment and manpower. To ensure service fitness of the vehicle, the RPV shall be replaced with a new RPV, once it has exceeded run of 3,00,000 km or has been in operation for three years. Special emphasis has been laid on branding and external appearance of the RPVs to maximise its visibility as a Highway Patrol Services on the National Highways. Equipped with the advanced communication and safety tools, these vehicles will be useful in minimising traffic disruptions, improving road safety and enhancing overall road user experience along the National Highways.

U'khand Govt hikes cash prize for 38th National Games medal winners

To boost the morale of athletes, the State Government has increased the prize money for medal-winning players in the upcoming 38th National Games, which will be held in Uttarakhand starting January 28, the Sports minister Rekha Arya said.

The government has decided to double the incentive amount awarded to gold, silver and bronze medal winners from Uttarakhand in the National Games. The revised

prize money will now be Rs 12 lakh for gold medal, Rs eight lakh for silver medal and Rs six lakh for bronze medal. In the earlier provision, players received Rs six lakh for a gold medal, Rs four lakh for a silver medal and Rs three lakh for a bronze medal, she added.

Arya emphasised that these efforts aim at motivating athletes to excel at the national level and perform better in international competitions, including the Olympics. She expressed confidence that this initiative would inspire the State's athletes to win as many medals as possible in the upcoming games. Arya further congratulated all the State's

players participating in the 38th National Games and thanked chief minister Pushkar Singh Dhami for the decision to double the medal amounts.

It will be recalled that recently the State government has also taken measures to ensure that trainers, assistant support staff and players do not face financial obstacles that could negatively affect their performance. This includes revising its order regarding the 38th National Games, which encompasses updated expenditure standards for special training camps, accommodation, food allowances and other related expenses.

U'khand police to learn from Chandigarh's approach to tackle cyber crimes

A police team will be sent to Chandigarh to study the successful implementation of the 1930 helpline and the



Strategies employed by the Chandigarh Police to combat cyber crimes considering the high rise in cyber crimes in Uttarakhand. The insights gained from this visit are expected to guide further initiatives in Uttarakhand. This was decided in a meeting held at the Police Headquarters chaired by director general of police Deepam Seth on Friday.

The primary focus of the meeting was to enhance the capabilities of the state's police force in tackling cyber crimes more effectively. The DGP reviewed the performance of the Cyber Crime Police Station in Chandigarh, urging for an increase in the registration of complaints and the resolution rate of cases. In response to the rising number of cyber crimes, several key measures

were discussed, including the creation of a State Cyber Crime Headquarters (S4C) and a Cyber Centre of Excel-

lence to improve the technological capabilities of the police force. The formation of dedicated cyber police stations at the district level, particularly in the Kumaon and Garhwal regions, was also proposed. Emphasising the importance of public awareness, the meeting also highlighted the need to educate citizens about cyber crimes and their prevention. Seth directed that police personnel must be trained in cyber-related issues and appointed to cyber cells at district-level stations. These efforts are aimed at building a robust and technologically empowered police force to combat the growing threat of cyber crimes in the State, as per the DGP.

More than a dozen children rescued in Dehradun

In an effort to address the issue of child labour in Dehradun, the Labour department has rescued over a dozen children engaged in labour through a special campaign conducted on Fridays and Saturdays so far. Informing about this, assistant Labour commissioner Deepak Kumar informed that in alignment with the instructions of district magistrate Savin Bansal and the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPDR), the department has initiated a targeted campaign aimed at identifying children involved in child labour. This campaign is carried out consistently on Fridays and Saturdays. So far, the Labour department has rescued about 14 child labourers during these special initiatives. In September, six child labourers were rescued, followed by four in

October as part of this campaign. Further, Kumar said that the department rescued three to four additional cases of child labourers recently.

He further claimed that the department has been dedicated to rescuing children from child labour under this initiative. It has been noted that with increased vigilance and the recent implementation of intensified campaigns, there has been an average reduction of 70 per cent in child labour complaints. He added that prior to June, the department had received a significant number of complaints but since September, there has been a marked decline in such complaints within the Dehradun district. He also highlighted that the Labour department plans to promote awareness of child labour at the gov-

ernment universities, college and school levels.

In the meanwhile, the DM has also implemented a new initiative aimed at addressing child beggary in the Dehradun district. According to officials at the collectorate, three mini buses have been designated for this purpose and their trial operation has commenced. These mini buses will enable a team to visit various locations to rescue children engaged in beggary and transfer them to the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) for counselling. It has been observed that, based on the trial, an average of two children are being rescued daily by the mini buses and subsequently referred to the CWC for counselling sessions and other necessary services

Fake job scams- STF nabs two cyber fraudsters in Doon

The Uttarakhand Special Task Force (STF) has arrested two cyber fraudsters from the Patelnagar area of Dehradun on charges of cheating unemployed youths, mainly of southern States, by offering fake job offers and charging processing fees under the guise of multinational companies. The arrested individuals were found in possession of two

Dehradun, where unemployed youths were being tricked with fake job offers from companies like IBM, HCL, Tech Mahindra and Amazon and money was being extorted in the form of processing fees. Upon investigation, it was found that the fraudsters had purchased data of unemployed youths, primarily from southern states of the country and promised them jobs in multinational companies. Singh said that through intensive investigation, STF arrested the main accused, Ishvinder Shergil (30) and Vivek Rawat (32). During interrogation, it was revealed that Shergil had previously been jailed for cyber fraud and had resumed such activities after his release. The two accused admitted to collecting large sums of money from unemployed youths in the name of processing fees, medical examination fees and other false charges, Singh claimed.

DVMUVM to meet SSP for CCTV cameras in major markets

The Doon Valley Mahanagar Udyog Vyapar Mandal (DVMUVM) intends to meet Dehradun senior superintendent of police Ajai Singh regarding the installation of CCTV cameras in the city's major markets, including Paltan Bazaar and the fruit market in Dhamawala, among other locations. Notably, the district authorities had recently acknowledged issues such as eve teasing and theft, and had proposed the installation of CCTV cameras in the city's major markets. However, directives from the district magistrate have yet to be implemented, resulting in a lack of deterrence with incidents of theft and eve teasing continuing in the market area, as per the local shopkeepers. In light of these ongoing issues, many shopkeepers and local residents have expressed their concerns and are advocating for the prompt installation of CCTV cameras in the market areas.

eras to provide security for local residents and shopkeepers. She believes this initiative should be implemented by the State administration urgently.

A shopkeeper at Paltan Bazaar, Himanshu Saxena stated that shopkeepers often experience theft attempts when individuals visit the market especially during the weekends when the number of shoppers are more. He added that the recent incident at one of the shops in Paltan Bazaar has instilled a sense of fear among shopkeepers in the area.

He further emphasised that the installation of CCTV cameras is crucial for addressing this issue. He remarked that although authorities earlier claimed to have installed these cameras, it appears to have been merely a formality, as no tangible progress has been made on the ground.

Other shopkeepers have expressed similar concerns regarding the delays in the installation of CCTV cameras in the market area of Dehradun.

Further, DVMUVM president Pankaj Masson informed this correspondent that it is indeed true that incidents of theft, eve teasing and other activities have risen in the market. Recently, a shopkeeper apprehended a young man for stealing a mobile phone in the area. He noted that, in light of this, they have repeatedly written to the

DM requesting the installation of CCTV cameras. Subsequently, funding for the installation of CCTV cameras in major markets, including Paltan Bazaar, Dhamawala and others has been allocated. He stated that approximately Rs 12 lakh has been sanctioned for this purpose and the DM has instructed the police to proceed with the installation of the CCTV cameras. However, the police have not adhered to any guidance from the DM and have yet to initiate the installation of CCTV cameras.

Masson averred. He highlighted traders' intention to meet the Dehradun SSP concerning the CCTV camera installation and urged prompt action in this matter. Should there be an absence of a response from the police following this meeting, they plan to organise a protest, he added.

JP Research Institute submits report to MoRTH on ONGC intersection accident

The expert team from the JP Research Institute has submitted its findings to the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) and other relevant agencies in Uttarakhand regarding the tragic road accident that claimed the lives of six youths and left one seriously injured near the ONGC intersection in Dehradun on November 11. The regional transport officer (Enforcement) of the Dehradun division, Shailesh Tiwari informed

The Pioneer that the JP Research Institute consists of experts who analyse road

safety concerns and fatal accident cases. Their report on the ONGC intersection accident concluded that there were no road-related issues that could have caused the accident. "Based on the condition of the car and the extensive damage observed at the accident site, it was evident that the vehicle was being driven at an extremely high speed as per the report," Tiwari stated. According to him, the report also highlighted that the container the car collided with lacked proper headlights and mirrors. However, it did not attribute these deficiencies as contributing factors to the fatal

accident, as per Tiwari. The report also made several recommendations to enhance safety in the area, such as installing rumble strips and proper street lighting, which have already been implemented. He added that the findings align closely with reports previously prepared by the State Transport department and the police. "The JP Research Institute's report has been submitted to MoRTH, the State Transport commissioner, the Inspector General of Traffic and other Central agencies," he said.

He said that 10,298 rooftop solar plants under the PM Surya Ghar Yojana have been installed so far this year. "We have set a target of installing 40,000 solar rooftop plants in the State by 2027 and we are receiving very good public response. Solar energy is clean energy and everyone can contribute in the effort to make our environment pollution free," he said. The MD said that the State has set a target of gen-

erating the number of empanelled vendors servicing the residential sector has increased to 365.

Arora added that Uttarakhand is one of the leading States providing state subsidy, in addition to central subsidy under PM Surya Ghar. The State is providing a subsidy of Rs 17,000 per kW. For installing a solar plant of three KW capacity the State government provided a subsidy of Rs 51,000 which is highest in the country. The Union government is providing an additional subsidy of Rs 85,800 for installing a three KW solar plant.

Police recover weapon used to kill senior citizen

Acting on the confessions made by both the accused, the police recovered the murder weapon - a black paper cutter, along with two jackets they wore while committing the crime. They had dumped these items in a bag at an open ground on Canal Road on Friday, the Dehradun senior superintendent of police Ajai Singh said. Garg had been fatally attacked by the accused after an attempt to extort money from him failed. The two accused, who had initially

approached the victim under the pretext of inquiring about a rental property, decided to kill him after learning about his wealth. They used the paper cutter to carry out the murder. Singh said that following the interrogation of the accused, the police team located the bag based on their directions, in a vacant field opposite Kailash Nursery on Canal Road. Inside the bag, the police found one blue jacket, one black jacket, and the paper cutter, which were all used in committing the crime. The SSP said that the police are continuing their investigation and the two accused are currently in custody. The police are collecting all evidence in the case to strengthen their case to ensure the culprits are brought to justice, he added.

Punjab Govt should procure all crops of farmers at MSP: CM Saini

Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini on Friday said that all crops of farmers in Haryana are being procured at Minimum Support Price and the Punjab government should also come forward and announce that the produce of farmers in the AAP-ruled state will be purchased at MSP.

Interacting with reporters here on the sidelines of a handicraft exhibition, Saini said the works done by Prime Minister Narendra Modi during the past ten years for farmers' benefit are "historic". He was asked a question about Punjab farmer leader Jagjit Singh Dallewal, who is sitting on fast-unto-death, and has also written an open letter to Prime Minister Modi in which he said that MSP to every farmer is like the fundamental right to live. Saini said the AAP dispensa-

tion in Punjab and the states where Congress is in power should also take a decision to empower the farmers.

"Punjab government should also take a decision to procure crops of farmers at MSP. They should not have a problem in this. When farmers of Punjab are facing problem, Punjab government should come forward and announce that they will procure all crops of farmers at MSP," Saini said.

"In Haryana, we are procuring all crops of farmers at MSP and the state government is taking every such step which empowers farmers," he said.

The Congress and other outfits which are part of the opposition's INDIA bloc do politics on everything, he charged.

Dallewal has been on a fast-unto-death at the Khanauri border between Punjab and Haryana since November 26 to press the Centre to accept



the agitating farmers' demands, including a legal guarantee of MSP on crops. Farmers under the banner of Samyukta Kisan Morcha (Non-Political) and Kisan Mazdoor Morcha have been camping at Shambhu and Khanauri border points

between Punjab and Haryana since February 13 after their march to Delhi was stopped by security forces. A group of farmers made two attempts to enter Delhi on foot on December 6 and December 8. They were not allowed to proceed by security

personnel in Haryana. The protesting farmers would make another attempt to march on December 14. Saini also trained his guns at the Congress, saying it has been rejected by people of the country. The Congress "speaks lies"

and people have realised this and they have been rejected in Maharashtra also, he said, referring to results of the assembly polls held recently. "People have put their stamp of approval. In 2029 too under Narendra Modi's leadership the BJP will form government for the fourth time," the Haryana CM asserted.

The country is progressing fast and the government is working towards welfare of all sections, including farmers, and various steps have been taken for the empowerment of farmers, women, youth and poor, he further said.

To another question, Saini welcomed the Centre's move to implement its key plank of "one nation, one election", as the Union Cabinet headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday approved the constitutional amendment bill to roll out the concept of simultaneous Lok Sabha and state assembly

polls.

"We used to be stuck in one election after the other. Sometimes, it is panchayat polls, sometimes municipal polls, Vidhan Sabha or the Lok Sabha polls. It not only involves a lot of expenditure in holding elections, but there is involvement of time too. We were not able to undertake development at the pace at which we want as the Model Code of Conduct comes into effect and development works get impacted," he said.

"I congratulate the prime minister and his entire team for the approval they have given to the One Nation One Election (initiative). The common people will get the benefit of this," he said.

Saini said the prime minister's vision is to make the country a developed nation by 2047 and the move will help the nation realise that goal even faster.

To another question, Saini hit out at AAP national convenor and former Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal.

"In Punjab, they showed greener pastures to people at the time of polls, but they have not been able to fulfil," he charged.

Further slamming Kejriwal, Saini said, "he went to jail for corruption. The AAP had come to power (in Delhi) saying they will give a transparent administration and claimed they were honest. But Kejriwal turned out to be more corrupt than even the Congress."

"Again, he has started showing greener pastures to the people of Delhi. He talked about giving clean drinking water, he had talked about making Yamuna river clean. People have understood his tall claims. Now, people of Delhi are waiting for the election to oust the AAP from power," he said.

Govt working hard to ensure rights, respect of indigenous people: Manipur CM

Manipur Chief Minister Biren Singh on Friday said his government is working hard to ensure rights, respect and ownership of land for the indigenous people in the state.

Speaking at the inaugural function of the Manipur Indigenous People Cultural Exchange Festival in Chadong village in Kamjong district, Singh called for "constitutional protection" for the indigenous people.

"Now it is a critical period for indigenous people who have been living since time immemorial. Our land was safeguarded by spear and swords in the history of more than 2000 years and guns arrived only after the British came," he said.

Singh said he initiated the "Go to Hills" campaign to strengthen shared cultural and historical legacy.

"Understanding the indigenous communities is the need



of the hour...Many people do not want to acknowledge the demographic changes caused by events happening outside the state. We have been struggling to save the indigenous communities which are under threat," Singh claimed.

He also said, "The government is working hard to ensure the rights, respect, ownership of land and authority of the indigenous people. We will succeed in our endeavour."

An indigenous ethnic cul-

tural centre was developed at Rs 6 crore in Makhel village which is considered as the origin of indigenous people, he said.

"Ever since I became a chief minister, I initiated the 'Go to Hills' campaign as part of understanding our shared cultural and historical legacy. Several historical sites have been developed," Singh said. The festival organised by the Indigenous Peoples' Forum was supported by the government as part of its effort to

foster unity, the CM said. Singh also urged those who consistently criticise the government to first "study the changes in population and electoral rolls".

He appealed to them to "look at satellite images of the number of villages that have grown in the state and the size of forests that have disappeared due to deforestation".

"Please also study why there is a massive rise in population among one community and not in other communities. If there was anything wrong with what I had said and done, you could punish me. Mere gossip cannot save land and indigenous people" Singh said.

Singh also asked the residents of the state to "support the steps taken up by the government to protect the indigenous people". "The government will continue its struggle to protect the indigenous population until and unless constitutional protection for these people is achieved," Singh said.

The chief minister said his government is committed to "ensure constitutional protection of indigenous communities" in the state.

He asserted that the war on drugs to protect the youths of the state would continue. Singh appreciated the efforts of the Assam Rifles and Ukhrul district SP for destroying more than 100 acres of illegal poppy cultivation in Ukhrul and Kangpokpi areas.

The government will definitely extend assistance to any reasonable demand, and all recognised tribes in the state should unite to save land, he said.

Singh also highlighted how the people of Chadong village were shifted due to the construction of a dam and said the project has ushered in new means of livelihood for the villagers through fisheries and tourism.

Singh also extended his wishes for Christmas and called for peace in the state.

Personal banker held for selling bank account to cyber fraudsters

A personal banker of DBS bank was arrested for allegedly changing the bank details of the victim and selling to the cyber fraudsters for Rs 5 lakh, police said.

Priyanshu Diwan, Assistant Commissioner of Police (cybercrime), said that the arrested accused had been identified as Tipu Sultan, a native of Muzaffarnagar, Uttar Pradesh. According to the police, a man filed a complaint at the Cyber Crime Police Station East on Wednesday that an employee of DBS Bank located on DLF Phase-2.

The complainant told the police that he had opened an account in DBS Bank DLF Phase-2, Gurugram, and he asked the bank employee to close the account.

The employee told him that the bank account would have to be closed by coming to the branch.

After that, on December 6, he received a message on his mobile number that Rs 15,000 had been credited to the bank account.

When he told the bank employee, he said that this money had come from the bank and his account would be closed. After this, on December 9, Rs 1.96 crore had been credited to the complainant's account. After this, the complainant got suspicious; he went to the bank and enquired, and then he came to know that the bank employee had changed his mobile number and email ID from the bank account without his knowledge and registered another mobile number and email ID.

Based on his complaint, a case was registered under the relevant sections in Police Station Cyber East, Gurugram.

During the probe, a police team of the said police station arrested the suspect from Gurugram's Indra Colony on Thursday. The accused was later taken on

police remand.

During interrogation, the accused disclosed that he was working as a Personal Banker at DBS Bank located in the DLF Phase-2 area in Gurugram. He has been working in the bank since June 2023.

The accused disclosed before the police that he met a person to open a current account but he refused. After this, the person said that he has an online betting business for which he needs a current bank account. That person asked the accused to provide a current bank account. In return, he lured the accused with Rs 5 lakh. "The accused then fraudulently changed the mobile number and email ID of the complainant's bank account in the matter and the accused gave the same bank account to his companions. The police have recovered 1 mobile phone and 2 SIM cards used in the crime from the possession of the accused," Priyanshu Diwan, ACP (cybercrime), said.

Tripura Govt planning to bring 7,000 hectares of wasteland under palm oil cultivation by FY' 27

The Tripura government has planned to bring around 7,000 hectares of wasteland under oil palm cultivation by the 2026-27 financial year (FY'27), an official said on Friday.

Initially, the Centre had identified 7,000 hectares for oil palm cultivation in the state but the ICAR-Indian Institute of Oil Palm Research reassessment committee classified 1.46 lakh hectares as a potential area for such farming in 2020 through digital mapping. "Under the National Mission on Edible Oil-Oil Palm (NMEO-OP), the state planned to bring at least 7,000 hectares of wasteland under oil palm cultivation by the 2026-27 financial year. The state has a favourable agro-climate for palm cultivation. Accordingly, we are working rigorously to achieve the target," Horticulture and Soil Conservation Department's Director P B Jamatia told PTI. He said the department has



selected two processors as technical associated partners-Godrej Agrovet Pvt Ltd and Patanjali Foods Pvt Ltd -for implementation of the national mission and allotted areas to these companies.

Jamatia said Godrej Agrovet has already set up an oil palm nursery at Nalkata in Dhalai district where 1.55 lakh of both exotic and indigenous type seedlings will be produced.

Patanjali Foods has also established another oil palm nursery at Jumerdepa in Sepahijala district for producing seedlings, he

said. Claiming that oil palm cultivation will be beneficial for the rural people in future, Jamatia said beneficiaries could grow intercrops like vegetables, papaya, turmeric, cocoa, ginger, bush pepper, banana and pineapples. Intercropping is a sustainable agricultural practice that involves growing multiple crops simultaneously in the same field.

Jamatia said the Centre has released Rs 5.14 crore as its share while the state has released Rs 51.41 lakh for oil palm cultivation during the 2022-23 financial year.

Marine Pilots on work-to-rule agitation in Kerala

Maritime Pilots in Cochin Port Trust, disappointed by the union ministry of shipping's indifferent attitude to their demand for pay parity with other officers are on a work to rule agitation mode. This has affected the operations in Cochin Port at a critical time when India aspires to become a five trillion dollar economy within the next couple of years. Shipping operations have come to a standstill following the "work to rule" policy being followed by the maritime pilots under the auspices of Master Mariners Association.

Cochin Port accounts for 4.44 per cent of India's total import and export of 818 million tons which makes it crucial for business operations. Good manufactured in Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Karnataka and meant for US, Europe and Africa are routed through this port.

The Pilots are agitated because the Union



Government has not responded to their woes. "Though we have been highlighting the disparities faced by us with the ministry since 2010 the latter has been coldshouldering our demands for pay parity with officers who were much junior to us. Moreover, marine pilots have to be more qualified and experienced than the other categories of officers," said a representative of MMA. Maritime pilots are former

mariners with experience in Foreign Going Vessels and have passed advanced examinations held by the union shipping ministry. All mariners will not be able to graduate to the level of maritime pilots. Only the creme Dela creme among them are graduated as pilots. Their main responsibility is to navigate the ships from outer seas through the narrow channels to the berth and back to the outer seas. Once the ships

reach the outer seas, the pilots take command.

"One has to know the shipping channels like the back of one's hands to ensure the safety of the ships. This is an operation that has to be performed with care, concentration and calm," a senior pilot told The Pioneer. He said the agitation is to protect the dignity of the profession. "As masters of the ships we used to draw salaries running into lakhs of rupees per month. The high salaries itself is in recognition of our professional qualification and competence," he said.

"Though the Cochin Port Trust needs 14 pilots for round-the-clock operations, there are only seven pilots as on date working in the port. Any disruption in shipping operations in Cochin Port Trust is sure to dampen the State's economy," said Rajmohan Pillai, chairman, Beta Group, a Malta based company which is a major client of Cochin Port. A senior bureaucrat in Kerala Government said that recent

events like the closure of the much talked about Smart City in Kochi and entrepreneurs leaving the State en masse to neighboring States has already tarnished the image of Kerala. "Cochin Port is infamous for "work to rule" and labor agitations. The pilots' agitation is like adding fuel to fire," said the bureaucrat. He said the maritime pilots are getting a raw deal from the union government.

"The babus in the ministry should learn the significance of the work being done by the pilots. Then only they will understand the seriousness of the issue," he said.

An office bearer of the Cochin Steamer Agents Association said that the work-to-rule agitation is a setback for the port as shipping operations are a continuous process. "We cannot ask the vessel managers to wait because the pilots are on strike. They will set sail to the nearest available port because for them time is more precious than money," said the CSAA office bearer.

Swarna Andhra 2047: CM unveils vision for 'wealthy, healthy and happy' State

The foundation has been laid to transform the Telugu community as the world's top community today and I am telling you all that it is possible," said Naidu, addressing the public meeting.

Exhorting that India should emerge as a developed country by 2047, he said the vision will change the fate and future of the southern state's younger generations.

Zero poverty, employment, skilling and human resources development, water security, farmer-agri tech and best global logistics were some of the 10 principles. Others include cost optimisation of energy and fuel, product perfection, swachh (clean) Andhra and incorporating deep tech in all walks of life.

During the recent second district collectors conference at the Secretariat in Amaravati, Naidu stressed that the TDP-led NDA government's governance will be based on the Swarna Andhra-2047 vision at state, district, mandal and panchayat levels.

Naidu introduced the SwarnaAndhra@2047 vision document during the

Assembly session in November to achieve its objectives in the next 23 years. He noted that 2047 is a significant milestone as it will mark the centenary of Indian independence from colonial rule, and everyone will need to proudly say what we have achieved in 100 years.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched Viksit (developed) Bharat 2047 and we are launching 'SwarnaAndhra@2047', said Naidu, adding that he wants the state to achieve a per capita income over USD 47,000 from the current level of USD 3,000.

According to the CM, the vision document was drafted following widespread consultations and grassroots-level engagement such as conducting workshops at mandal and municipality level and covering over 1.18 crore households, among others. Along with feedback from



school and college students, he said the Niti Aayog had also contributed to its creation, reviewing several programmes being implemented in foreign countries.

If all the resources such as rivers, coastline, talent pool and others available in Andhra Pradesh could be properly utilised, Naidu said the goals of the vision could be achieved.

Further, the CM briefly explained each of the 10 principles, which also included his plans to eliminate poverty by involving high net worth individuals to uplift the poorest people and turn the state into a green energy hub.

The CM also spoke of his vision to interlink rivers to make sufficient water available all over the state and highlighted that south India is

facing a water crisis. Similarly, he reiterated his call to have more children as the state could face the prospect of having more older people in the next 15 to 20 years.

"By 2047, Andhra Pradesh envisions a state of happy, thriving, and responsible Telugus, fostering a progressive and inclusive community, a valley of innovation, a knowledge hub for global speed of doing business," Naidu had said, reading the vision statement earlier in the Assembly.

Other goals of the vision include top per capita income for the state in the country with family as a unit and raising global thinkers. Likewise, incorporating deep-tech in all walks of life and making the southern state a global hub for skills, among others.

Naidu had asserted that an irreversible foundation was

being laid with this vision document, irrespective of who comes to power in the state in the future.

"If we can correctly lay the foundation for this, then it (the state) will irreversibly go ahead," he had said, noting that he was laying a foundation whose progression cannot be reversed.

Further, he called upon MLAs to carry out a similar exercise at their constituency level, and prepare constituency-specific vision documents. Naidu in September solicited suggestions from the people of the state to catapult it into Swarna Andhra Pradesh (golden state) with a GSDP of USD 2.4 trillion by 2047.

The chief minister had called for suggestions for the future vision of the southern state for achieving a per capita income of over USD 43,000 by 2047.

"Our target is to lead India with a GSDP of USD 2.4 tril-

lion and a per capita income of over USD 43,000 by 2047. As we embark on this journey towards SwarnaAndhra@2047, we're inviting suggestions from our fellow citizens on shaping a brighter AP (Andhra Pradesh)," Naidu said earlier in a post on 'X'.

After launching the vision, Naidu highlighted that achieving a per capita income of USD 43,000 is viable if a GSDP of USD 2.4 trillion could be accomplished in the next 23 years. Further, he called on the people of the state to read the vision and formulate their own household visions, along with emerging as partners in this growth story. He ended by leading a collective pledge to achieve the vision document, calling on the people of the state to dedicate themselves for the development of the state and building a Swarna Andhra.

One Nation One Election

India's democratic system is on the verge of a transformative change with the 'One Nation, One Election' initiative

The concept of 'One Nation, One Election' has been a subject of significant debate in India's political discourse. On December 12, 2024, the Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, approved draft legislation to implement simultaneous elections for the Lok Sabha, state assemblies, and local bodies within 100 days. This proposal seeks to streamline India's electoral process, reduce the economic and administrative burden of frequent elections and enhance governance. The 'One Nation, One Election' initiative aims to align the election schedules of the Lok Sabha, state assemblies, municipal corporations and panchayats. The proposed legislation is likely to be introduced in Parliament during the ongoing Winter Session, reflecting the government's intention to initiate nationwide consultations on this transformative reform. The draft legislation incorporates 11 recommendations made by a high-level committee led by former President Ram Nath Kovind. These recommendations aim to address the frequent disruptions caused by the current staggered election schedule, which is a drain on economic, social, and political resources. One of the primary suggestions involves synchronising the election dates for the Lok Sabha and state assemblies in the first phase, followed by municipal and panchayat elections within 100 days. To ensure smooth execution, a dedicated implementation group will oversee the reforms.

Constitutional amendments, such as the introduction of Articles 324A and 325, are proposed to facilitate simultaneous elections, create unified voter rolls. Elections demand significant financial resources and conducting them simultaneously could reduce costs related to security, logistics and administrative expenses. Frequent elections also result in prolonged enforcement of the Model Code of Conduct, halting developmental activities, which a unified schedule could minimise. However, implementing this ambitious reform involves substantial logistical and constitutional challenges. Synchronising elections requires amendments to several constitutional articles, including Articles 83, 85, 172, 174, and 356, which must be ratified by a majority of state legislatures. Building political consensus among parties with diverse regional interests is another critical requirement. Furthermore, the Election Commission will need to mobilise resources, including additional EVMs and VVPATs and ensure readiness of polling staff and infrastructure nationwide. Besides, simultaneous elections might overshadow local issues due to the dominance of national narratives, potentially affecting regional representation. Coordinating nationwide elections within a short timeframe also poses logistical challenges. Moreover, synchronising subsequent elections in cases of mid-term dissolutions could create governance gaps, leading to policy paralysis. While the proposal promises efficiency and cost-effectiveness, its implementation demands careful consideration of constitutional, logistical, and political complexities.

Why simplicity and equality must redefine weddings

There is a pressing need to rethink our approach to weddings; advocating for a shift towards simplicity, equality and genuine joy rather than crass display of wealth

Weddings have long been a grand celebration where two people unite, signifying not just the union of two souls, but also the joining of two families. These joyous occasions are infused with rituals, traditions, and celebrations designed to enhance the richness and pride of cultural heritage.

Within the shimmering lights, the grand feast, and the spirited festivities, there exists a frequently ignored reality: the rising expenses these celebrations impose on families, especially those in the middle and lower-middle classes. Dowry, once regarded as a remnant of outdated and oppressive traditions, has taken on a contemporary guise. The concept of "dowry" may no longer be prevalent in everyday language, yet its core remains hidden beneath the polished surface of what we now refer to as "gifts." What was once viewed with disdain has now been embraced, illuminated by a fresh perspective that aligns with contemporary feelings. What's the final takeaway? Families, particularly the bride's, face immense



financial strain due to these "gift" expectations, which frequently manifest as expensive items, vehicles, and cash contributions. In many cases, what are presented as gifts are actually disguised demands. Middle-class families, determined to avoid the label of being stingy, frequently push themselves to the limit to maintain their standing. The expectation to host lavish weddings adds an extra weight, as in many cultures, these ceremonies are seen as a reflection of the family's standing in the community. In severe situations, for struggling families, this can be devastating; for individuals find themselves compelled to deplete their life savings or other assets, while others are

drawn into loan schemes. This debt, incurred at the expense of societal expectations, is repaid over years—and even decades—creating a relentless cycle of instability. The most concerning aspect of this situation is its ongoing nature and the way it sustains economic and gender disparities. When a groom traditionally requests gifts for the bride, it often creates an unfair financial burden on the bride's family, even if the demand is subtle. It merely reinforces the outdated notion that a family must "pay" to marry off their daughter. This approach truly detracts from the principle of equality in relationships and adds unnecessary stress to what should be a welcoming event.

Now is the moment for society to reevaluate its values and confront these detrimental customs. Marriage ought to be a celebration of love and togetherness, rather than a cause for financial distress or societal expectations. A shift away from materialism is essential, emphasising the importance of mutual respect, understanding, and equality. Families and communities should collaborate to foster an atmosphere that values simplicity and authenticity over extravagance and false displays of wealth. Both governments and social organisations can play a vital role in addressing this issue by implementing laws against all forms of dowry and raising awareness about its psychological and financial consequences. A debt-free, joyful beginning to married life is the greatest blessing any couple could hope for. The true essence of celebration is not found in the extravagance of the occasion, but rather in the commitment to a shared future rooted in love and respect.

Unraveling the delicate threads of human interaction

Communication is the lifeblood of human connection, yet it remains one of the most intricate and fragile aspects of our existence

Conversation is a delicate business. It is made even more fragile by being central to all human interaction. The more knowledgeable individuals feel that communication is only partially through words. It can also be through eyes, through touch, through gestures, and even through silence. The list can go on. This makes communication not only complicated but also a sensitive matter. Communication can be with oneself. It can be between two persons, or in groups. It can be a short distance or a long distance. The possibilities are immense.

The pitch of the voice could be an intervening variable, and sometimes the more well-versed practice cross-communication. It means giving one message through one medium and another through another. In other words, it can be one message through words and another message through the eyes.

If technology intervenes, it becomes even more complex. The technological interventions can be through a medium such as a handset, a telephone, or, in some parts, a piece of paper. In the past, pigeons have been known to serve a useful purpose. The permutations and combinations are immense, and each has a value, just as each medium has a context. Like in the case of many essentials in life, there is no primer available and there is no one author who has covered comprehensively all aspects of communication. Hence, much of this is on learning by practice.

Much of this is also learning by grief because in the absence of a proper 'Guru' one can only learn by trial and error. Many relationships get under strain or break because one meaning is intended, but another meaning gets conveyed. This can sometimes be incomplete or even distorted. Put simply, coding and decoding a message is a complex process and has to



do with many variables, most of which may not be under the control of the parties involved. Hence, it could become like fiddling with wires in the dark. The solutions are not difficult if they are systematically put into operation. In early childhood, when a person is being taught words, it would be helpful if the person is also helped to choose the better word to communicate his ideas. Proper pronunciation should also be taught. If the circumstances permit by linguicism or multi-linguicism can be practiced.

This would help adjustment to different levels of people; people of different ages and from different contexts. The solutions are known just as much as the problems are known. But there is little systematic attempt to put it in a frame and help better communication. It is obvious that communication can be between two people of equal age, between somebody who is older and somebody younger, people of the same gender, people of the opposite gender, people with prior antecedents of relationships, and people with no prior antecedents of relationships.

The contexts are huge and almost impossible to exhaustively list. This is not to say that the problem is not solvable or cannot be handled. The usual response when there is a lack of clarity on where to begin, one should begin just somewhere and hope that it runs on satisfactorily. If it is not entirely satisfactory, it can be corrected as one goes along. Being inundated by problems and not beginning at all cannot be the answer. Sometimes a simple problem can be so elusive that it becomes difficult to structure it for a solution. Effective communication is one such problem.

Any discussion touching on communication will be incomplete without the realisation, as already noted, that communication is not always with words. There is an oft-repeated quote to the effect of 'if you cannot understand my silence, you will not understand my words'. Interestingly, silence also communicates, and there are different types of silence. Often, body language takes over, but that is another matter. Unfortunately, communication through silence also needs deep insights and research. Communication

can be between people where one of the limbs that is centrally used in communication, loses its function or becomes unusable. For example, if someone has a problem with listening through one ear, the best course of action would be to help the person concerned restore their hearing through the other ear.

However, this may not always work. So options and support systems have to be generated. Like in many things, psychological factors become very heavily involved, and unfortunately, those who are not capable of deep thought fumble more. There is a case for serious research on all aspects of the communication enumerated above and more research on communication per se, in a scholastic mode, would help.

Till then, one can only hope that the general conversation on communication will alleviate the confusion that sometimes arises on communication points. One also hopes that research will help good communication all around.

Gukesh youngest world chess champion



India's young Grandmaster D Gukesh defeated China's World Champion Ding Liren in the 14th and final round, claiming the title of the youngest world chess champion. In order to bring a change to this callous attitude and wrong lifestyle, we need to reform our mind by adopting a spiritual attitude through a spiritual set of values, or what is called 'Spiritualism,' which is a turnaround of thoughts and a way of living. Today, those people who are trying to cope with change without bringing change to their mindset, value system, and lifestyle through spirituality have really missed the message of the wise. Bangladesh's secular fabric under siege

The suppression of dissent, coupled with the growing boldness of extremist ideologies, risks steering the nation towards a fundamentalist Islamist state



It is increasingly clear that fundamentalist Islamist organisations, which are pathologically hostile to India as well as to all secular and democratic persons and organisations in Bangladesh, are increasingly calling the shots in that country under the rule of its interim government. An indication of this is the relentless persecution of Shahriar Kabir, an internationally acclaimed author, journalist, champion of human rights, democracy and secularism, and a tireless campaigner to bring to justice the perpetrators of war crimes during Bangladesh's liberation war in 1971. He continues to languish in Kashimpur jail under terrible conditions. Despite being designated as a prisoner of conscience by Amnesty International, a magistrate's order giving him Division One status, which would give him a separate room and other facilities remains to be carried out. This is because the deputy commissioner of Ghazipur district, where Kashimpur prison, where he is lodged, is located, has not signed the order, which will be effective only after his signature is affixed to it. Nor, according to reports, does he seem inclined to sign it soon.

As a result, Kabir, who is 74-years-old has to live among common prisoners and sleep on the floor during a cold winter as his health continues to deteriorate. Earlier, during a remand hearing at Dhaka's Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court on 20 October, Kabir had complained that he was not receiving adequate medical treatment in jail. On November 2, he was taken to Shaheed Tajuddin Ahmed Medical College Hospital for a check-up. According to its deputy-director, he suffered from various old age-related ailments but these were not critical. Kabir has high blood pressure and diabetes and a large accumulation of stones in his kidney. Blood is coming out with his stool. Given the role of the deputy commissioner, who presumably has nothing personal against him, it is difficult not to feel that it is the interim government, led by Nobel laureate Chief Advisor Muhammad Yunus, that wants to deny him Division One status. That it continues to do so despite considerable international demand for his release is clearly the result of pressure from

organisations like the Hefazat-e-Islam (Hefazat) and Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami (Jamaat). Hefazat's hand in Kabir's persecution is clear from the fact that one of the several charges on which he has been jailed was filed with Bangladesh's International Crimes Tribunal on August 20, 2024, by Mufti Harun Izhaz Chowdhury, Hefazat's joint secretary. It showed him, along with Sheikh Hasina, as one of the 23 accused, charged with crimes against humanity and mass killing in connection with the violent clashes between Hefazat's supporters and members of security forces and Awami League activists during it rally in Dhaka, on May 5, 2013, to press its 13-point charter of demands. The latter included demand for a stricter dress code as ordained by Islam, a ban on statues, candlelight vigils and public mixing of men and women, besides the scrapping of the Awami League government's women's development policy promising women equal rights to property. Comprising mainly of Sunni clerics heading a network of 19,199 Quami madrasahs and its students in Bangladesh, it has considerable power to mobilise in the streets. Its intensely anti-India orientation was reflected in its violent protests against Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Dhaka on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of Bangladesh's independence on March 26, 2021. Thirteen persons were killed and scores injured in clashes between its supporters and members of the security forces and Awami League's supporters. While the Hefazat is not calling all the shots in the interim government,

it certainly has a wide measure of influence and has its way wherever it wants, however small or big the event or the demand is. The "Mahati Sadhusanga and Lalon Mela" (great gathering of sadhus and Lalon fair) hosted by Muktidham Ashram and Lalon Academy in Madya Narsingpur, Kashipur Union Parishad in Narayanganj, was scheduled to begin on November 22, 2024. There was to be singing, dancing, festivities and food. Baul singers and devotee from all over Bangladesh were coming over for the occasion. The district administration, however, ordered its cancellation. A report in The Daily Star (November 23, 2024) quoted Fakir Shah Jalal, founder of the ashram and academy, said, "All arrangements had been made, but the administration did not permit the event, citing warning from some members of the "Muslim" community. Even when we requested to hold the event indoors, without loudspeakers, it was denied." A spiritual leader, philosopher, mystic poet and social reformer, Lalon articulated a weltanschauung, which encompassed the essence of the Bhakti cult and Sufism, rejected all distinctions of caste, class and creed, opposed theological conflicts and racism. It is not surprising that such a person would be anathema to fundamentalist Islamists. The report in The Daily Star, cited above, had stated that Hefazat-e-Islam leader Maulana Abdul Auwal had warned the administration in a speech to stop the event or face intervention by protesters. Other Islamist organisations are also flexing their muscles. Speaking at a grand convention of the District Qaumi Madrasa Council in Dhaka on November 25, Mamunul Haque, the secretary general of Bangladesh Khelafat Majlis, described the August 5 revolution as a significant step toward an Islamic revolution in

Bangladesh, adding that the country was destined to undergo an Islamist transformation. Not surprisingly, Ahmadiyas and Sufis have come under attack. Several of the former's mosques were attacked on August 6. A violent mob destroyed Baba Pagla Ali's Sufi shrine at Sherpur district on August 29; another such mob vandalised and looted Ismail Pagla's shrine in Sirajganj district on September 3. Meanwhile two Islamist terrorist outfits—Ansar al-Islam (erstwhile Ansarullah Bangla Team) and Hijab-ut Tahrir (Tahrir) are increasingly active. Despite the ban on Tahrir, its supporters organised, on August 9, a rally in Dhaka city and demanded the establishment of an Islamic Caliphate in Bangladesh. Also, the statues of two police officers who died fighting the terrorists at the Holey Artisan Bakery in July 2016, have been destroyed and a Hijab-ut Tahrir poster has been found at the site. Despite the arrest of its media coordinator in Dhaka in early October, its activities continue, albeit clandestinely, in many parts of Bangladesh.

This is because the interim government is pursuing a much softer line against both Ansar al-Islam and Tahrir than Sheikh Hasina's government. An example is the release of the 'chief' of Ansar al-Islam on bail on August 26. As a consequence, while the Hefazat and Jamaat are riding high and terrorist bodies are quietly active, champions of secularism like Shahriar Kabir are imprisoned and organisations opposing communalism are apprehensive and defensive. In a situation like this, one can hardly rule out Bangladesh slowly sliding towards becoming a fundamentalist Islamist country and even an exporter of terrorism.

President Macron names centrist ally Bayrou as France's next PM

French President Emmanuel Macron on Friday named centrist ally Francois Bayrou as prime minister in an effort to address the country's deep political crisis, after a historic parliamentary vote ousted the previous government last week. Bayrou, 73, a crucial partner in Macron's centrist alliance, has been a well-known figure in French politics for decades. His political experience is seen as key in efforts to restore stability as no single party holds a majority at the National Assembly. Macron's office said in a statement that Bayrou "has been charged with forming a new government." Former Prime Minister Michel Barnier resigned last week following a no-confidence vote prompted by budget disputes in the National Assembly, leaving France without a functioning government. Macron in an address to the nation vowed to remain in office until his term ends in 2027. Bayrou is expected to hold talks with political leaders from various parties in the coming

days in order to choose new ministers. The task appears challenging because Macron's centrist alliance does not have a majority in parliament and Bayrou's Cabinet will need to rely on moderate lawmakers from both the left and right to be able to stay in power. Some conservatives are expected to be part of the new government. Macron's strategy aims at preventing far-right leader Marine Le Pen from holding "make or break" power over the government. Le Pen helped oust Barnier by joining her National Rally party's forces to the left to pass the no-confidence motion last week.

The president of the National Rally, Jordan Bardella, said Friday his party will take a wait-and-see approach for now. "Our red lines are still there, they're not going to change," he warned. National Rally officials, including Le Pen, have said they want any new budget law to preserve the purchasing power of the French people. Bayrou's appointment comes also in line with Macron's efforts to build a non-aggression pact with the Socialists so that they commit not to vote against the government in any future confidence motion. Mathilde Panot, head of the hard-left France Unbowed

group at the National Assembly, criticised Bayrou's appointment in a message on X as "the continuity of (Macron's) bad policies." She said her party is ready to vote for a no-confidence motion again against the new government. Bayrou leads the centrist Democratic Movement, known as MoDem, which he founded in 2007. In 2017, he supported Macron's first presidential bid and became a weighty partner in the French president's centrist alliance. At the time, he was appointed justice minister, but he quickly resigned from the government amid an investigation into the MoDem's alleged embezzlement of European Parliament funds. Bayrou this year was cleared in the case by a Paris court, which found eight other party officials guilty and sentenced the party to pay a fine. Bayrou became well known to the French public when he was education minister from 1993 to 1997 in a conservative government. He was three times a candidate for president, in 2002, 2007 and 2012.

Israeli strike in Gaza kills 25 people as US makes new push for a ceasefire

An Israeli airstrike has hit the central Gaza Strip, killing at least 25 Palestinians and wounding dozens more, Palestinian medics said, just hours after President Joe Biden's national security adviser raised hopes about a ceasefire deal to end the war in Gaza. Officials at two hospitals in the Gaza Strip, al-Aqsa Hospital in the north and al-Aqsa Hospital in central Gaza, reported they received a combined total of 25 bodies from an Israeli strike on a multi-storey residential building in the urban Nuseirat refugee camp on Thursday. Palestinian medics also reported that over 40 people, most of them children, were receiving

treatment at the two hospitals. The al-Aqsa Hospital said that the Israeli attack also damaged several nearby houses in Nuseirat. There was no immediate comment from the Israeli military on the deadly strike. Israel is trying to eliminate Hamas, which led the attack on southern Israel in October 2023 that sparked the war in Gaza. The Israeli military says Hamas militants hide among Gaza's civilian population. Photos from the site showed a completely collapsed building with people walking through its mangled and charred remains, smoke rising from piles of belongings strewn over the rubble. The bombardment came just

hours after Jake Sullivan, President Biden's national security adviser, told reporters in Jerusalem that Israel's ceasefire in Lebanon has helped clear the way for another deal to end the war in Gaza. He plans to travel next to Qatar and Egypt, key mediators in the ceasefire talks, as the Biden administration makes a final push on negotiations before Donald Trump is inaugurated. Sullivan said "Hamas' posture at the negotiating table did adapt" after Israel decimated the leadership of its ally Hezbollah in Lebanon and reached a ceasefire there. "We believe it puts us in a position to close this negotiation," he said. Israel's offensive has killed over

44,800 Palestinians in Gaza, more than half of them women and children, according to the Gaza Health Ministry, which does not say how many were combatants. The Israeli military says it has killed over 17,000 militants, without providing evidence. The fighting has plunged Gaza into a severe humanitarian crisis, with experts warning of famine. Israel says it allows enough aid to enter and blames UN agencies for not distributing it. The UN says Israeli restrictions, and the breakdown of law and order after Israel repeatedly targeted the Hamas-run police force, make it extremely difficult to operate in the territory.

Biden watching situation in Bangladesh very closely: White House

President Joe Biden is closely monitoring the situation in Bangladesh and the US will hold the country's interim government accountable for ensuring the protection of religious and ethnic minorities, the White House has said. The security situation in Bangladesh has been difficult following the ouster of the former prime minister Sheikh Hasina, White House National Security Communications Advisor John Kirby said. "We have been working closely with the interim government to enhance the capability of their law enforcement and security services to deal with the challenge," Kirby said at a news conference on Thursday.

Hasina was ousted as prime minister in the face of a massive anti-government protest in August. There have been a spate of incidents of violence against Hindus and other minorities, as well as attacks on temples in the last few weeks in Bangladesh. "We've been very clear in our engagement with all Bangladeshi leaders that protection of religious and ethnic minorities is absolutely critical, and the leaders of the interim government have repeatedly committed to providing security to all Bangladeshis, regardless of religion or ethnicity," he said. "We want to hold them to that," Kirby said in response to a question. Over the past few weeks, Indian Americans have held

peaceful protests and marches in several cities, including in front of the White House, in Chicago, New York, SFO, Detroit, Houston and Atlanta, urging Biden to help stop alleged brutalities against the minority Hindu community in Bangladesh. Earlier in the day, Indian-American Congressman Raja Krishnamoorthi urged members of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee to address the issue of violence against minorities, primarily Hindus, in Bangladesh during the confirmation hearing of Senator Marco Rubio for the position of secretary of state. President-elect Donald Trump has nominated Senator Rubio for the top diplomatic position. The date of his confirmation hearing has not been announced yet.

Speaker resigns in Sri Lanka

Colombo (PTI): Sri Lanka's Parliament Speaker Asoka Ranwala announced his resignation on Friday following days of speculation about him falsifying his educational qualifications.

"In recent days, a problem with my educational qualifications has been raised in society. I have not made any false statements about my educational qualifications," Ranwala said in a statement. Asserting that he currently does not possess any documents to prove his qualifications, Ranwala said that it would also not be possible for him to obtain these from the relevant institutions. "However, in order to stop the inconvenience caused to the government and the people who had placed trust in the government, I have decided to resign from the post of Speaker," he said.

Blinken urges nations to support peaceful Syrian political transition

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken is pressing ahead with efforts to unify Middle East nations in support of a peaceful political transition in Syria. He is meeting on Friday with Turkey's foreign minister after talks with President Recep Tayyip Erdogan to try to bring Turkey into a consensus to prevent Syria from collapsing into wider turmoil. It's Blinken's 12th trip to the Mideast since the Israel-Hamas war erupted in Gaza last year but first since the ouster of Syrian President Bashar Assad. The outgoing Biden administration is particularly concerned that a power vacuum in Syria could exacerbate already heightened tensions in the region and create conditions for the Islamic State group to regain territory and influence. The fighting between Israel and Hamas has plunged Gaza into a severe humanitarian cri-

sis. Israel's offensive has killed over 44,800 Palestinians in Gaza, more than half of them women and children, according to the Gaza Health Ministry, which does not say how many were combatants. The Israeli military says it has killed over 17,000 militants, without providing evidence. The war in Gaza was sparked by an October 7, 2023, attack by Hamas in southern Israel in which some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, were killed and around 250 others were taken hostage. Some 100 hostages are still inside Gaza, at least a third of whom are believed to be dead. Blinken says there's broad agreement between US and Turkey on Syria's future: US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said Friday there was "broad agreement" between Turkey and the United States on what they would like to see in Syria following the ouster of President Bashar Assad. "There's broad agreement on

what we would like to see going forward, starting with the interim government in Syria, one that is inclusive and non-sectarian and one that protects the rights of minorities and women" and does not "pose any kind of threat to any of Syria's neighbours," Blinken said in joint statements with Turkish Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan. The insurgent groups that toppled Assad in Syria have not made clear their policy or stance on Israel, whose military in recent days has bombed sites all over the country, saying it is trying to prevent weapons from falling into extremist hands. Blinken also said it was crucial to keep the Islamic State group under control. "We also discussed the imperative of continuing the efforts to keep ISIS down. Our countries worked very hard and gave a lot over many years to ensure the elimination of the territorial caliphate of ISIS to ensure that that threat doesn't

rear its head again," Blinken said. The Turkish foreign minister said the two discussed ways of establishing prosperity in Syria and ending terrorism in the country. "Our priority is establishing stability in Syria as soon as possible, preventing terrorism from gaining ground, and ensuring that IS and the PKK aren't dominant," Fidan said, in a reference to the banned Kurdistan Workers Party. Blinken said: "We're very focused on Syria, very focused on the opportunity that now is before us and before the Syrian people to move from out from under the shackles of Bashar al-Assad to a different and better future for the Syrian people, one that the Syrian people decide for themselves." Blinken and Fidan said they had also discussed a ceasefire for Gaza. "We've seen in the last couple of weeks more encouraging signs that (a ceasefire) is possible," Blinken said.

British Indian hedge fund trader jailed in Denmark

A British hedge fund trader of Indian heritage has been sentenced to 12 years in prison by authorities in Denmark after being found guilty of a tax fraud amounting to over GBP 1 billion. Sanjay Shah, 54, was handed the maximum prison sentence for an economic crime by a district court in Glostrup this week. The Danish prosecution said in a statement that the court found it proven that Shah was the mastermind behind a complex setup in which 190 American pension companies and 24 Malaysian companies entered into agreements to purchase Danish list-

ed shares at times when the shares were traded with the right to dividends. "The verdict is a milestone in the criminal justice settlement following the dividend tax cases, as the convicted person was the main instigator of a fraud against the Danish state of historic proportions," said Marie Tullin, special prosecutor at the State Attorney for Serious Crime (SSK). "It is therefore with satisfaction that I can now state that the court has imposed a sentence that reflects the extremely serious and extensive nature of the case," she said. In addition to the prison sentence, the court confiscated a total of approximately 7.2 bil-

lion kroner (USD 1bn), corresponding to the economic gain of the convicted person. Among other things, deposits in accounts in foreign banks, shares and bonds, as well as a number of properties or shares thereof belonging to the convicted person, his companies or his wife were confiscated. "The fraud has caused a major loss for the Danish state, and it is therefore of crucial importance that the court today has confiscated an amount that corresponds to the convicted person's profits from the fraud," says Dennis Bæckmann, special prosecutor, National Unit for Serious Crime (NSK). Shah, who has denied wrong-

doing, was also expelled from Denmark permanently, and he was denied the right to participate in the management of a business in Denmark or abroad without being personally and unlimitedly liable for the company's obligations. He has lodged an appeal against the Glostrup district court's verdict in the High Court. According to the Danish Prosecution Service (AnklageMyndigheden), the British national was convicted of committing fraud of a "particularly serious nature for 9,025,205,871 kroner (GBP 1bn) and attempted fraud for an additional 553,346,302 kroner during a period from 2012 to 2015".

Suspected spy with business ties to Prince Andrew barred from UK

A suspected Chinese spy with business ties to Prince Andrew has been barred from the UK because of concerns he poses a threat to national security. A British immigration tribunal upheld the decision on Thursday in a ruling that revealed the Chinese national had developed such a close relationship with Andrew that he was invited to the prince's birthday party. Government officials were concerned the man could have misused his influence because the prince was under "considerable pressure" at the time, according to the ruling. British authorities believe the Chinese national, whose name wasn't released, was working on behalf of the United Front Work Department, an arm of the Chinese Communist Party that is used to influence foreign entities. The government determined that the businessman "was in a position to generate relationships between senior Chinese officials and prominent UK fig-

ures which could be leveraged for political interference purposes by the Chinese State," according to the tribunal's decision. Prince Andrew, the younger brother of King Charles III, has been repeatedly criticised for his links to wealthy foreigners, raising concerns that those individuals are trying to buy access to the royal family. Andrew's finances have been squeezed in recent years after he was forced to step away from royal duties and give up public funding amid concerns about his relationship with Jeffrey Epstein, the American financier and convicted pedophile who committed suicide in prison in 2019. British intelligence chiefs have become increasingly concerned about China's efforts to influence UK government policy. In 2022, Britain's domestic intelligence service, known as MI5, warned politicians that a British-Chinese lawyer had been seeking to improperly influence members of Parliament for years. A parliamentary researcher was arrested in 2023 on suspi-

cion of providing sensitive information to China. The 50-year-old Chinese national covered by this week's ruling was described as a man who worked as a junior civil servant in China before he came to the UK as a student in 2002. He earned a master's degree in public administration and public policy at the University of York before starting a business that advises UK-based companies on their operations in China. He was granted the right to live and work in the UK for an indefinite period in 2013. Although he didn't make Britain his permanent home, the man told authorities that he spent one to two weeks a month in the country and considered it his "second home." He was stopped while entering the UK on November 6, 2021, and ordered to surrender his mobile phone and other digital devices on which authorities found a letter from a senior adviser to Andrew confirming that he was authorised to act on behalf of the prince in relation to potential partners and investors in China.

Biden grants clemency to four Indian-Americans

Four Indian-Americans facing sentences ranging from 17 years to life imprisonment are among nearly 1,500 people granted clemency by President Joe Biden. These four Indian-Americans are Meera Sachdeva, Babubhai Patel, Krishna Mote and Vikram Dutta. "America was built on the promise of possibility and second chances. As President, I have the great privilege of extending mercy to people who have demonstrated remorse and rehabilitation, restoring opportunity for Americans to participate in daily life and contribute to their communities, and taking steps to remove sentencing disparities for non-violent offenders, especially those convicted of drug offences," Biden said in a statement on Thursday. "That is why, today, I am pardoning 39 people who have shown successful rehabilitation and have shown commitment to making their communities stronger and safer. I am also commuting the sentences of nearly 1,500 people who are serving long prison sentences - many

of whom would receive lower sentences if charged under today's laws, policies, and practices," he said. This was the largest single-day act of clemency in recent times. In December 2012, Dr Meera Sachdeva was sentenced to 20 years in prison and ordered to repay nearly USD 8.2 million for fraud at a former Mississippi cancer centre she ran. She is now 63. Babubhai Patel was sentenced to 17 years on 26 convictions for a healthcare fraud conspiracy, a drug conspiracy, and related fraud and drug violations in 2013. Also in 2013, Krishna Mote, 54, was sentenced to serve life in prison after he was convicted of conspiracy to distribute more than 280 grams of crack cocaine and more than 500 grams of cocaine, and distribution of crack cocaine as an aider and abettor. Vikram Dutta, 63, was in January 2012 sentenced in a Manhattan federal court to 235 months in prison after he was found guilty of conspiracy charges stemming from his use of his perfume distribution business to launder millions of dollars for a Mexican narcotics organisation.

Russia targets Ukrainian power infrastructure

Russia on Friday launched a massive aerial attack against Ukraine, involving dozens of cruise missiles and drones, the latest such strike aimed at crippling the country's electricity system. The Russian military targeted the Ukrainian power grid, energy minister Herman Halushchenko wrote on his Facebook page. "The enemy continues its terror," he said. Halushchenko said energy workers do everything necessary to "minimize negative consequences for the energy system," promising to release more details on damages once the security situation allows it. Ukraine's air force reported multiple strike drones launched at Ukraine overnight followed by swarms of cruise missiles in the country's air space. It said Russia also used air-launched ballistic Kinzhal missiles against Ukraine's western regions. Friday's attack is the latest in a series of such raids that has heightened fears that the

Kremlin aims to destroy the country's power generation capacity as the winter sets in. Since launching its invasion in February 2022, Russia has relentlessly pummelled Ukraine's electricity system, resulting in repeated shutdowns of critical heating and drinking water supplies during the bitter winter months in an apparent attempt to break Ukrainian spirits and resolve. Moscow has declared that the attacks are aimed at hobbling Ukraine's defence industry, thwarting the production of missiles, drones, armoured vehicles and artillery, among other weapons. A similar massive attack on November 28 involved about 200 missiles and drones and left more than a million households without power until emergency teams restored supplies. Ukrainian officials have warned that Russia is stockpiling cruise and ballistic missiles for more attacks. On November 21, Russia for the first time used an intermediate range hypersonic ballistic missile to strike an industrial

plant in the city of Dnipro, in eastern Ukraine. Russian President Vladimir Putin described the attack with the Oreshnik missile as retaliation for Ukrainian strikes on Russian territory with longer-range Western weapons. He declared that more attacks with the new weapon could follow. The Pentagon warned Wednesday that Russia could use its new missile against Ukraine again soon. Around half of Ukraine's energy infrastructure has been destroyed during the almost three years of war with Russia, and rolling electricity blackouts are widespread. Kyiv's Western allies have provided Ukraine with air defence systems to help it protect critical infrastructure, but Russia has sought to overwhelm the air defences with combined strikes involving big numbers of missiles and drones. Russia has held the initiative this year as its military has steadily rammed through Ukrainian defences in the east in a series of slow but steady offensives.

Trump invites Xi Jinping to his Jan 20 inauguration

PTI ■ WASHINGTON US President-elect Donald Trump has invited Chinese President Xi Jinping to attend his inauguration on January 20, according to his spokesperson. "This is an example of President Trump creating an open dialogue with leaders of countries that are not just our allies but our adversaries and our competitors too," the incoming White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt told Fox News in an interview on Thursday. "We saw this in the first term. He got a lot of criticism for it, but it led to peace around the world. He is willing to talk to anyone. He will always put America's interest first," she said. Leavitt, however, did not say if the invitation had been accepted by the Chinese president. The White House preferred not to comment on the merit of the invitation.

Switzerland suspends India's most favoured nation status

The Swiss government has suspended the most favoured nation status (MFN) clause in the Double Taxation Avoidance Agreement (DTAA) between India and Switzerland, potentially impacting Swiss investments in India and leading to higher taxes on Indian companies operating in the European nation.

According to a December 11 statement by the Swiss finance department, the move follows the Supreme Court of India last year ruling that the MFN clause doesn't automatically trigger when a country joins the OECD if the Indian government signed a tax treaty with that country before it joined the organization. India signed tax treaties with Colombia and Lithuania that



provided tax rates on certain types of income that were lower than the rates it provided to OECD countries. The two countries later joined OECD. Switzerland in 2021 interpreted that Colombia and Lithuania joining the OECD

meant a 5 per cent rate for dividends would apply to the India-Switzerland tax treaty under the MFN clause, rather than 10 per cent as outlined in the agreement. But post suspension of the MFN status, Switzerland will from January 1, 2025, levy a 10

per cent tax on dividends due to Indian tax residents who claim refunds for Swiss withholding tax and for Swiss tax residents who claim foreign tax credits. In the statement, the Swiss Finance Department announced suspension of the

application of the MFN clause of the protocol to the agreement between the Swiss Confederation and the Republic of India for the avoidance of double taxation with respect to taxes on income. Switzerland cited a 2023 ruling by Indian Supreme Court in a case relating to Vevey-headquartered Nestle for its decision to withdraw the MFN status. This means that Switzerland will tax dividends that Indian entities will earn in that country at 10 per cent from January 1, 2025.

According to the statement, in 2021, the Delhi High Court in the Nestle case upheld the applicability of the residual tax rates after taking into account the MFN clause in the double taxation avoidance treaty. However, the Indian Supreme

Court, in a decision dated October 19, 2023, reversed the lower court's decision and concluded that, the applicability of MFN clause provided "was not directly applicable in the absence of 'notification' in accordance with Section 90 of the Income Tax Act". Commenting on the decision of Swiss authority decision, Nangia Andersen M&A Tax Partner Sandeep Jhunjhunwala, said the unilateral suspension of application of the MFN clause under its tax treaty with India, marks a significant shift in bilateral treaty dynamics. "This suspension may lead to increased tax liabilities for Indian entities operating in Switzerland, highlighting the complexities of navigating international tax treaties in an evolving global landscape," he

said. It also underscores the necessity of aligning treaty partners on the interpretation and application of tax treaty clauses to ensure predictability, equity, and stability in international tax framework, Jhunjhunwala said. AKM Global, Tax Partner, Amit Maheshwari, said that the main reason behind the decision to withdraw MFN is of reciprocity, which ensures that taxpayers in both countries are treated equally and fairly. "Swiss authorities announced in August 2021 that based on the MFN clause between Switzerland and India, the tax rate on dividends from qualifying shareholdings would be reduced from 10 per cent to 5 per cent, effective retroactively from July 5, 2018.

However, the subsequent Supreme Court ruling in 2023 contradicted the same," Maheshwari said. Overall, he added that this could impact Swiss investments in India as dividends would be subject to higher withholding now and income accruing on or after January 1, 2025, may be taxed at the rates provided for in the original double taxation treaty between Switzerland and India, regardless of the MFN clause. JSA Advocates & Solicitors Partner Kumaramanglam Vijay said this would especially impact Indian companies having ODI (overseas direct investment) structures with subsidiaries in Switzerland and will raise the Swiss withholding tax on dividends from 5 per cent to 10 per cent from January 1, 2025.

Delhi-Dehradun expressway to be completed within three months says Union minister Nitin Gadkari

Union minister Nitin Gadkari on Friday said that the Delhi-Dehradun expressway, which is expected to reduce travel time between the two cities to two hours, will be completed within the next three months. Currently, the travel time between the two cities is five to six hours. Addressing 'Times Network India Economic Conclave 2024', Gadkari further said that construction of the Delhi-Mumbai Expressway is expected to be completed within two months. The travel time between the two metropolitan cities is expected to reduce to 12 hours with the completion of the expressway from the present

24 hours. The road transport and highways minister said Delhi-Dehradun highway project has two packages. "A Rs 10,000 crore project has been approved for Delhi's Kalindi Kunj, extending to Faridabad. Prime Minister Narendra Modi is set to inaugurate the project within the next 15-20 days," Gadkari said. Gadkari also said that the Modi government is working to reduce air pollution, lower the import of fossil fuel and enhance farm income. "The transport ministry is responsible for 40 per cent of the air pollution... While a huge part of pollution is due to stubble burning in neighbouring states of Punjab and Haryana, road construction and fossil fuels

also add to the annual problem," he said. The minister also pointed out that the problem of stubble burning will be solved in two years as the government is working on 400 projects that will convert 200 lakh tonnes of rice straw every year to alternate fuels. Gadkari said that his ministry is working on 36 green express highways, which will help reduce the logistics costs in the country. "India's logistics cost is 14-16 per cent compared to 8 per cent in China and 12 per cent in the US and European Union. We aim to bring this down to 9 per cent in two years," he said. According to the minister, this will push India's exports by 1.5 times and help us become more competitive.

CCPA issues notices to 17 direct selling firms over 'unfair practices'

Consumer protection regulator CCPA on Friday said it has issued notices to 17 direct selling firms, including Oriflame India, for alleged unfair trade practices and violations of consumer protection rules. The notices have been served on companies such as Vihaan Direct Selling India, Triptales Pvt Ltd, Oriens Global Marketing, Zennesa Wellness, and others for alleged service deficiencies and non-compliance with the Consumer Protection (Direct Selling) Rules, 2021. An official statement revealed that 13 of these cases are under investigation, while replies



from three companies are still awaited. The action comes in response to concerns about deceptive practices in the direct selling industry. The ministry warned that some fraudulent entities are misusing the direct selling

"The government remains steadfast in its mission to create a fair, transparent, and consumer-friendly market ecosystem," the statement said. Consumers have been advised to exercise caution by checking disclosures carefully, avoiding recruitment-based earnings, understanding return and refund policies, reading contracts thoroughly and verifying direct sellers' credentials. The Consumer Protection (Direct Selling) Rules, 2021, were introduced to regulate direct selling entities and protect consumer interests. These rules complement other existing regulatory frameworks, including the Consumer Protection (E-Commerce) Rules, 2020, and

the Legal Metrology (Packaged Commodities) Rules, 2011. The consumer affairs ministry warned that such fraudulent practices violate consumer trust and expose individuals to potential financial risks. No staff fired, it was campaign to highlight workplace stress: YesMadam co-founder

After beauty services platform YesMadam faced backlash on Monday over a purported internal email leaked on social media suggesting the termination of staff who indicated workplace stress, the company co-founder on Friday clarified that no staff was fired and called it a marketing initiative "to shed light on workplace stress and mental health". YesMadam Co-Founder Mayank Arya in a note said the intent behind the campaign was to highlight an important issue, but it inadvertently triggered negative reactions. "It is important to clarify that



no firing mail was sent to employees, and no one was terminated. The picture shared on LinkedIn was the first step toward introducing the initiative, and the clarification shared the following day was meant to serve as a wake-up call for the industry about the importance of mental health awareness,"

he said. He added that the campaign was conceptualised with the genuine objective of raising awareness about mental health challenges in corporate and startup environments. "Our intentions were rooted in addressing workplace stress and fostering a healthier work culture. However, we understand that the approach taken was inappropriate and led to unfavourable feedback. I deeply regret any confusion or discomfort caused by this initiative," he said. He acknowledged that the "execution fell short and unintentionally triggered unintended emotions". Anushka Dutta, whose

LinkedIn profile identifies her as a UX copywriter at the company, on Monday posted on LinkedIn, "What's happening at YesMadam? First you conduct a random survey and then fire us overnight because we're feeling stressed?" She attached a screenshot showing an email from the company's HR official, which suggested that the company was laying off employees who reported workplace stress in an internal survey. Noida-headquartered YesMadam secured investments from Lenskart's Peyush Bansal, Sugar's Vineeta Singh, OYO's Ritesh Aggarwal and boAt's Aman Gupta on Shark Tank India.

Sebi extends timeline to submit comments on proposed appointment process of key officials at MIIs

Sebi on Friday extended the deadline to December 31 for submitting public comments on a proposal on the process to appoint key officials of stock exchanges and other market infrastructure institutions and a cooling-off period before they can join a competing institution. Earlier, the deadline was December 12 for submitting comments. In a statement on Friday, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) said, "It has been decided to extend the timeline to submit the public comments on the consultation paper till December 31, 2024."

The regulator, in its consultation paper issued in November, proposed a process for the appointment of KMPs (key managerial personnel) - Compliance Officer, Chief Risk Officer, Chief Technology Officer, and Chief Information Security Officer - of an MII and cooling-off period for KMPs, including MDs and directors, including public interest directors of an MII joining a competing MII. On the proposed process for appointment, Sebi stated that market infrastructure institutions (MIIs) comprising stock exchanges, clearing corporations and depositories, should engage an independent external agency to identify suitable

candidates for specific KMP roles. The agency should submit recommendations to the Nomination and Remuneration Committee (NRC) for evaluating the recommendations and forwarding them to both the governing board of the MII and Sebi. Thereafter, Sebi should review the NRC's recommendations and provide comments within a specified time frame. If no comments are received, the governing board may assume Sebi has no objections. The governing board should make the final appointment decision, considering NRC's recommendations and Sebi's comments, if any.

Her graceful movements and deep emotional connection to the piece were evident throughout. In Yahi Madhava, she portrayed Radha's inner turmoil and vulnerability with such sensitivity that it left a lasting impact. The subtlety of her facial expressions and the fluidity of her movements beautifully conveyed Radha's frustration and sorrow, giving the audience a glimpse into the emotional complexity of the character.

Vinod Kevin Bachan's performance, *Devi Mahamaya: The Rise of the Divine Shakti*, was a powerful display of strength and grace. Bachan's portrayal of Durga embodied the goddess's divine energy and formidable presence. Each movement exuded confidence, reflecting the unstoppable force of the feminine divine. Bumrah is a combination of legendary pacers, says Chappell

Jasprit Bumrah embodies the qualities of pace legends such as Dennis Lillee, Andy Roberts and Richard Hadlee but at the same time is forging his own legacy, one that is set to inspire future generations of pacemen, feels former India coach Greg Chappell. He also said that Bumrah is the only player standing between Australia and the Border Gavaskar Trophy. "What sets Bumrah apart is his combination of skills: (Malcolm) Marshall's adaptability, Lillee's aggression, Richard Hadlee's control, Roberts' strategy, Wasim (Akram) and Waqar's (Younis) reverse swing, (Glenn) McGrath's precision, (Dale) Steyn's explosiveness, and (Kagiso) Rabada's modern versatility." "As Nasser Hussain aptly observed, "He's the complete bowler. As he has had back



against the best batsmen of his era. "His ability to make it hard for batsmen to score runs with his probing line and length, allied to his guile and determination, made him the champion that he was. Bumrah, though less overtly

combative, channels Lillee's ability to unsettle batsmen. His deadly yorkers and disconcerting bounce – especially with his unorthodox release point and trajectory – echo Lillee's capacity to dictate terms. "Bumrah's quiet intensity and precision make him a nightmare, much like Lillee's unrelenting aggression." Another great of the game was Roberts, who combined pace with strategic brilliance. Chappell felt Bumrah's 2018 performance at the MCG where he used variations to get the better of the batters was reminiscent of the way Roberts operated. "Bumrah shares Roberts' cerebral approach. Both bowlers use subtle variations to outfox batsmen, relying on strategy rather than brute force. Bumrah's spell in the 2018 Boxing Day Test against Australia – culminating in 6-33 – was a modern echo of Roberts' game-changing bursts." "Roberts had a loping and relaxed run-up and a very strong shoulder action like Bumrah, and skidded onto you quite quickly, so it was important to be focused on the ball leaving the hand. "The danger of a bowler who zeroes in on the stumps, as Roberts did and Bumrah does, is that if you relax for a moment and try to hit across their deliveries, you become even more vulnerable to LBWs and bowled. I would use the same approach against Bumrah," Chappell added. The 31-year-old has consistently churned out stellar performances and is the go to bowler when the Indian team is in need of wickets. "With 151 wickets at an average of 21.03 in just 30 Tests, his ability to excel in diverse conditions recalls Marshall's dominance. Bumrah's reverse swing on abrasive surfaces and his ability to seam and swing the ball under cloudy skies have been pivotal, evoking the same uncertainty that batsmen faced against Marshall. "As Ian Botham famously remarked of Marshall, "He gave you no respite." Today, batsmen echo similar sentiments about Bumrah," Chappell wrote. Drawing comparison to Hadlee, Chappell said "Bumrah's meticulousness draws comparisons to Hadlee. His mastery of English conditions, where he averages 22.02, and his ability to exploit even the slightest movement resemble Hadlee's clinical dismantling of batting orders. "Like Hadlee, Bumrah's focus on perfecting every delivery has made him indispensable in critical moments. He is also carrying the Indian pace attack at present as Hadlee did for New Zealand in his era," he added.



Dismissals during first innings did affect his flow, admits Gill

Shubman Gill admitted that the fall of wickets at the other end affected his game in the Adelaide Test but expressed confidence that the Indian batting group would deliver a stronger first-innings effort in what is now effectively a three-match series. Gill didn't play the first Test due to a finger injury but looked good in his brief innings of 31 and 28 during the pink ball Test at Adelaide which India lost by 10 wickets. "As a batting group, we are looking to post a big total first up. That's been the key discussion and every batter has his own game plan," Gill said in the pre-match press conference after the team scored 150 and 180 in the first innings at Perth and Adelaide respectively. Gill believes that he wouldn't curb his natural game although he did get edgy seeing wickets tumble at the other end. "I still have the freedom as a batter. One of the challenges is whether you can play the game you want to play, irrespective of what's happening at the other end and irrespective of scorecard. "I faltered in the first innings because of what happened at the other end and I take that upon myself." There was a four-over period

Ignore the criticism, it comes with the territory: Anand to Gukesh

Legendary chess player Viswanathan Anand on Friday asked D. Gukesh to ignore those questioning the standard of the World Championship title showdown with China's Ding Liren, saying criticism always comes with success. Indian Grandmaster Gukesh made history on Thursday, becoming the youngest-ever to win the world title defeating Liren in the 14th and final game of the championship in Singapore. Former world champion Vladimir Kramnik was not impressed with the quality of chess on display during the match, calling it the "end of chess as we know it." Kramnik expressed his frustration over the game's quality, calling a critical blunder by Ding Liren "childish." In his reaction, Kramnik wrote on 'X', "No comment. Sad. End of chess as we know it." In another tweet, he said, "Never yet has a WC title been decided by such a childish one-move blunder." Five-time world champion, Norway's Magnus Carlsen too has been critical of the quality on display in earlier rounds, saying, "This does not look like a game between two World Championship contenders. It just looks like maybe the second round or third round of an open tournament." However, Anand, the five-time world champion and Gukesh's mentor, said he saw "history being made by Gukesh." "I feel very happy. I was literally watching history being made yesterday," Anand told PTI Videos. "It (criticism) comes with every match. To be honest, I think it just comes with the territory. You ignore it and that's all. You know Gukesh's achievement, everything and his concomitant rise. I mean if you look at the Olympiad, he showed that he's actually become a much stronger player. "He won the Candidates this year, so many good results in Toronto and he's here. So this stuff (criticism) just comes with it. You cannot expect to become world champion and not face some random criticism," added Anand. The championship match seemed destined for a draw. However, Liren faltered under pressure and committed a blunder. "Most of us had written the game off (as a draw) by this point. If Ding had brought his bishop back, Gukesh would have had a long task to make any progress. But then, suddenly, the game turned, and he won. It was fantastic," he added. Anand praised the psychological depth of the young champion's approach. "Gukesh was not playing aggressive or anything. He had an extra pawn and was circling around, trying to find a way through," Anand said. The tactic of wearing down the opponent, even when it looked as good as a stalemate, proved crucial.



Hazlewood replaces Boland in Australia XI for third Test against India

Australian captain Pat Cummins on Friday announced that pacer Josh Hazlewood will replace Scott Boland in his playing XI for the third Test against India after having recovered from a side strain. The injury had forced Hazlewood to sit out of the Pink Ball Test in Adelaide last week. Cummins exuded confidence that Hazlewood would pull through the match without any "hiccups." "He had a really good bowl yesterday, he had another bowl in Adelaide a couple of days previously. Him and the medical team are really confident," he said on the eve of the game at the Gabba. Cummins said he had to take the ball away from Hazlewood at Perth to prevent his injury getting worse. "We've seen it a few times where Josh has pushed through to get through a Test match and a little bit of soreness turns into a month or two of injury. "So, we made the call then that it probably wasn't worth the risk of keeping him bowling. I think he bowled an extra two overs leading into tea break and he said it felt ok, but I just kind of thought from there, 'that's enough,' said Cummins. The Australian captain was sympathetic for Boland after the veteran pacer made a stirring return to Test cricket at Adelaide after last year's Ashes. Boland had a match-haul of five wickets that included the prized scalp of star India batter Virat Kohli in the second innings. "It's tough. He was fantastic in Adelaide. Unfortunately, he's spent quite a bit of time on the bench over the last 18 months and whenever he plays he's fantastic. "It's a shame for Scotty, but still a fair bit to play out this series. I'd be surprised if he didn't play again in this series," said the New South Wales player. Green is fading at Gabba The green tinge on the Brisbane deck was significantly reduced on the match eve. Once a fortress of the Aussies, India had breached the 'Gabba' barrier during the 2020-21 series to end the hosts' winning run dating back to 1988. After that the West Indies too beat Australia here, riding on the back of pacer Shamar Joseph's heroics. "I looked at it yesterday – it looked like a good wicket, like it has been the last few years," said Cummins. "A bit of sun baking it the last couple of days (means) I don't think it's as green and leafy as it was against South Africa," he said. Cummins was referring to the Test against South Africa here in 2022 which ended inside two days.

Treesa-Gayatri bow out of BWF World Tour Finals

Indian women's doubles pair of Treesa Jolly and Gayatri Gopichand missed out on a semifinal spot at the BWF World Tour Finals after losing to Japan's Nami Matsuyama and Chiharu Shida in straight games in their third and final group A match here on Friday. Treesa and Gayatri, who won their maiden BWF Super 300 title at Syed Modi International in Lucknow recently, lost 17-21 13-21 to their world number 4 opponents in 49 minutes. It was the fourth defeat for the Indian pair against the Paris Olympics bronze medallists Japanese rivals in five meetings. World number 13 Treesa and Gayatri, the only Indians to have qualified for the prestigious season-ending tournament, needed a win to secure a spot in the knockout stage of the tournament. On Wednesday, the Indians had narrowly lost to world No.1 pair Liu Sheng Shu and Tan Ning of China in their opening group match before stunning the Malaysian duo of Pearly Tan and Thinaah Muralitharan in their second match to keep their hopes alive. But the Japanese pair proved too hot to handle for the Indian duo, who stayed level with Matsuyama and Shida till 5-5. Thereafter, the Japanese pair zoomed ahead and a six-point burst took them to 18-10. Treesa and Gayatri narrowed down the deficit to 17-19 but Matsuyama and Shida prevailed. After the change of sides, Treesa and Gayatri had a slender 4-2 lead but Matsuyama and Shida turned the tables quickly and entered the break with a four-point advantage. The Japanese pair kept a firm grip on the rallies and slowly and steadily kept moving ahead to eventually shut the door on the Indians. Matsuyama and Shida joined the Chinese pair of Sheng Shu and Ning in the semifinal stage of the tournament.



Hojlund scores twice for Manchester United to beat Viktoria Plzen 2-1 in Europa League

Rasmus Hojlund scored twice after coming off the bench and Manchester United rallied to beat Viktoria Plzen 2-1 in the Europa League. The Denmark striker netted in the 88th minute after collecting Bruno Fernandes' pass off a free kick to seal the victory and put United into the top eight of the standings. Hojlund replaced Marcus Rashford in the 56th and scored an equalizer six minutes later after Amad Diallo's shot was deflected by goalkeeper Martin Jedlicka into his path for an easy finish. The 21-year-old Hojlund also scored twice in the previous round, when United beat Norwegian team Bodø/Glimt 3-2, and has five goals in his six appearances in the second-tier competition. "It feels good to have scored two goals but I am more happy with the win," Hojlund said. "My instructions? Go out there and score two goals! Just to use my qualities, run the channels and be

Roma showed signs of improvement by beating Braga 3-0 for a second straight victory that came after the struggling club earned its first win under new coach Claudio Ranieri, 4-1 over visiting Lecce in Serie A. Braga goalkeeper Matheus received a red card in the 68th minute with the score 2-0. Conference LeagueA youthful Chelsea lineup made the most of a long trip to Kazakhstan by beating Astana 3-1 to stay perfect in the UEFA Conference League. Marc Guiu struck twice within five minutes early in the first half. The 18-year-old forward opened the scoring on a solo effort in the 14th and added his second after meeting a cross from Pedro Neto from the right in freezing conditions in the city of Almaty. Guiu, who joined Chelsea from Barcelona this summer, has scored three in the competition. Renato Veiga, who is 21, headed home the third before Marin Tomasov scored for the hosts late in the first half. Neto was the only player to remain from the squad that beat Tottenham 4-3 on Sunday to move to second in the Premier League. Chelsea has 15 points atop the standings of third-tier competition with one more game to play in the league phase. Fiorentina crushed LASK 7-0 and Legia Warsaw lost 2-1 at home to Lugano.
