

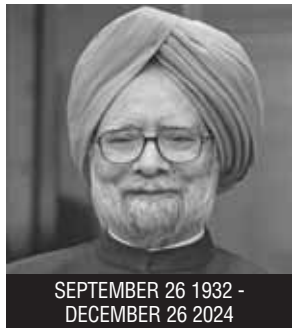
ARCHITECT OF INDIAN ECONOMY PASSES AWAY

Former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh, the architect of India's economic reforms, died on Thursday night. He was 92. Singh's death was announced by the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Delhi, where he was admitted in the Emergency ward around 8.30 PM in a critical condition.

An AIIMS bulletin said "he was treated for age related medical conditions and had sudden loss of consciousness at home" on December 26. "Resuscitative measures were started immediately at home. He was brought to the medical emergency at AIIMS Delhi at 8.06 pm. Despite all efforts, he could not be revived and was declared dead at 9.51 pm," said the bulletin.

Singh, who was PM for two terms in the Congress-led



United Progressive Alliance (UPA) Government from 2004 to 2014, had been in poor health for the last few months. He is survived by wife Gurcharan Singh and three daughters. Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra and her mother Sonia Gandhi reached the hospital as soon as the news of his hospitalisation became known.

Singh, who was Finance Minister under the then PM PV Narasimha Rao, was the



architect and the brainchild of economic reforms in 1991 that pulled India from the brink of bankruptcy and ushered in an era of economic liberalisation that is widely believed to have changed the course of India's economic trajectory. Singh died as the Congress party concluded its Congress Working Committee meeting at Belagavi in Karnataka, where all top party leaders were present. Party chief Mallikarjun Kharge and

Rahul Gandhi rushed to Delhi from Belagavi followed by several top party leaders and workers from across the country. A galaxy of leaders across the political party lines condole the death of Singh with Prime Minister Narendra Modi remarking "We had extensive deliberations on various subjects relating to governance; his wisdom, humility were always visible". "With the passing of former PM Manmohan Singh, India

has lost a visionary statesman, a leader of unimpeachable integrity," said Mallikarjun Kharge. "Manmohan Singh's policy of economic liberalisation and rights-based welfare paradigm profoundly transformed lives of crores," Kharge added before leaving the CWC meet at Belagavi.

"Few people in politics inspire the kind of respect that Sardar Manmohan Singh did. Manmohan Singh's honesty will always be an

inspiration for us. He remained steadfast in commitment to serve the nation despite being subjected to unfair, deeply personal attacks," Priyanka Gandhi said as her husband Robert Vadra was the first to announce on social media the demise of Dr Singh. Rahul Gandhi in his remarks said he lost a mentor and guide as millions like him admired Dr Singh who will be remembered with the utmost pride. "Manmohan Singh Ji

led India with immense wisdom and integrity. His humility and deep understanding of economics inspired the nation. My heartfelt condolences to Mrs. Kaur and the family," Rahul Gandhi said.

Congress and AAP cloud over INDIA Bloc

In a development that could be a major setback to the India Bloc as the growing rift between the Congress and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has escalated into open hostility thereby putting the alliance on shaky grounds. The AAP on Thursday threatened that it would talk to other parties of the INDIA Bloc to remove the Congress from the alliance, if it didn't take action against Delhi Congress leader Ajay Maken for making derogatory remarks against party's supremo Arvind Kejriwal, calling him an 'anti national'. The AAP leaders now demanded that the Congress take disciplinary action against Maken and other party leaders within 24 hours.

Slamming Congress for having crossed all boundaries, Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh accompanied by Chief Minister Atishi warned that the AAP has given an ultimatum to its leadership to take immediate action against Maken within 24 hours, failing which AAP will be forced to demand Congress's expulsion from the INDIA Bloc. "We will ask the other parties in the alliance to remove the Congress," Singh said. He further alleged that the Congress's Delhi unit is working with the BJP to ensure AAP's defeat in the Delhi polls due early next year. Atishi accused the Congress's candidates' list is being prepared by the BJP, and their funding is also being provided by them.

This comes amidst rising tensions and accusations from both sides, further weakening the opposition bloc. The reason for the AAP's grouse is the Congress' FIR against Kejriwal on charges of fraud and forgery, accusing him of "misleading and deceiving" the

Kejriwal may lose NDMC membership

The New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) on Wednesday passed a resolution condemning former Chief Minister and Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) convener Arvind Kejriwal for failing to implement the Narendra Modi-led Government's flagship scheme Ayushman Bharat. The Council is seeking legal opinion from the law department to cancel his membership as he has not been able to attend the meetings.

The AAP Convener is an ex-officio member of the council, which falls under the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), since he is the MLA from the New Delhi Assembly constituency. Kejriwal has consecutively missed the meetings of the

new council for the fourth time since the first took place on November 9 and also missed the oath taking ceremony. Launching an all-out attack on the AAP supremo Arvind Kejriwal from all corners ahead of the Delhi Assembly elections 2025, NDMC Vice-Chairman Kuljeet Chahal flagged the issue of him remaining absent from the council meetings, stating that the law department has been consulted in the matter and will reply by the next weekly meeting about the legality of the matter.

"The matter will be raised in the next council meeting after receiving the department's response," he said while addressing the media. A condemnation resolution was also passed in the meeting against the AAP chief. The members of the Council

also passed a censure motion against Kejriwal on the fraud of 'Mukhyamantri Mahila Samman' and 'Sanjeevani Yojna'. Chahal said, "Kejriwal is not allowing the Ayushman Bharat Yojna implemented by the Prime Minister to reach the citizens of Delhi due to his personal and political reasons." New Delhi BJP Member of Parliament P Bansuri Swaraj, who is also a member of the NDMC, attended the meeting. "Today I attended the weekly meeting of NDMC with the council officials. In the meeting, a resolution condemning the neglect of public interest by former Chief Minister of Delhi Arvind Kejriwal by not implementing the Ayushman Bharat scheme in Delhi was unanimously passed," she shared in a tweet.

public with promises of non-existent welfare schemes and derogatory remarks by senior Congress leaders Ajay Maken and Sandeep Dikshit on party's national convener. The tension escalated during the Winter session of Parliament when murmurs arose about changing the leadership of the INDIA Bloc, with some including Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) chief Lalu Prasad suggesting Mamata Banerjee to take over. The INDIA Bloc, comprising parties like the Samajwadi Party, Trinamool Congress (TMC), RJD, Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK), Shiv Sena (UBT), and AAP, face a crucial test of unity. The AAP's decision to hold talks with its allies could deepen the ongoing crisis.

Singh accused Maken, and Dikshit of targeting AAP instead of focusing on the BJP. Singh slammed Maken for allegedly calling Kejriwal "anti-national" and urged Congress to take action against him within 24 hours. "At this point, all limits have been crossed. Filing an FIR, calling someone anti-national-such audacity from Ajay Maken and his party is unacceptable. I demand that the Congress take action against Ajay Maken within 24 hours. Otherwise, we will appeal to the other constituent parties of the INDIA Bloc to expel Congress from the alliance," asserted the AAP Rajya Sabha MP. Ajay Maken reads the BJP script, makes statements at the BJP's behest, and targets AAP leaders on BJP's instructions. And yesterday, he crossed all limits and called our leader Arvind Kejriwal anti-national," Singh said. The Congress or Ajay Maken have never called any BJP leader in Delhi "anti-national," Singh said.



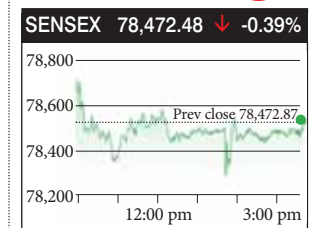
EC makes world's largest electoral dataset public

The Election Commission (EC) on Thursday released the world's largest electoral dataset for 2024 Lok Sabha and four State Assembly polls held this year. The move was aimed at enhancing "public trust" in the country's electoral system at a time when the opposition has been raising doubts over its credibility after it changed its rules to restrict public access to CCTV footage of polling booths and other poll documents. Sources in the election watchdog said since the One Nation One Election (ONOE) has been tabled in the Parliament and a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) is monitoring it, this data will help the stakeholders to tread the path of ambitious simultaneous polls in the country. The EC officials asserted that such granular data is not shared by any of the election management bodies in democracies across the world. "This suo motu initiative is to enhance the public trust that constitutes the underpinning of India's electoral system," the EC said. In its 40 statistical reports related to Lok Sabha 2024 polls, released by the poll body on Thursday showed that the six national parties bagged over 63 per cent share of the total valid votes polled

in the Lok Sabha elections held this year. The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Congress, Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP), Communist Party of India (Marxist) [CPI(M)], Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and National People's Party (NPP) are the six national parties. Six recognised National parties, 47 State parties and 690 registered, unrecognised political parties contested the Parliamentary polls. Besides, 3,905 independent candidates forfeited the deposits. Out of the 3,921 independent candidates, 279 were women, the EC noted. The datasets cover a range of variables, such as details of PC/AC /State wise electors, number of polling stations, State/ PC wise voter turnout, Party wise vote share, gender-based voting behaviour. It also included State wise participation of women electors and much more. "This suo motu initiative, is to enhance the public trust that constitutes the underpinning of India's electoral system," it is the poll body said in the Statement. "The release of extensive data sets is also in furtherance of the Commission's policy of maximum disclosure, greater transparency and accessibility of election-related data for all stakeholders including academia, research and the general public," it added.

FIR registered in forged voter ID case: Delhi Police

The Delhi Police has registered a case against four individuals in connection with forgery in Voter ID card applications for the purpose of new voter registration and address shifting after the Election office flagged such suspicious cases to them in southeast Delhi's Shaheen Bagh.

On Wednesday, the Election Commission flagged four such suspicious cases to the Delhi Police, following which the police registered cases under section 336 (Forgery for the purpose of cheating) and Section 340 BNS (Using forged documents as genuine). "It is to inform you that certain applicants have submitted online applications for voter registration through Form-6 and Form-8 by fraudulent means. These applicants have uploaded false documents, which have been tampered with, in support of their applications," the Election Registration Officer stated.

From deep sea, to outer space, Indian explorers will make history

As India is gearing up for its first space mission in 2026, plans are afoot to send a human into the deep sea the same year thereby showcasing the country's prowess in frontier scientific endeavours. Disclosing this, Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Science, Jitendra Singh said on Thursday "... One Indian up there, and one Indian in the deep sea. That will be once again, a record of sorts." He also emphasised the increasing importance of oceanic exploration in the country's journey toward becoming a 'Viksit Bharat'.

The Centre is planning to send a human into the deep sea with the mission likely to coincide with the human space mission in early 2026, Singh said while speaking at the 'Commemoration of the 20th anniversary of the 2004 Indian Ocean Tsunami' at the Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS). The minister recalled that Prime Minister Narendra Modi had mentioned the Deep Sea Mission in the past Independence Day address.

"We are also planning to send a human into the deep sea. I was telling Ravichandran (Secretary, Ministry of Earth Sciences) that it would be a strange coincidence-one human in space and another in the deep sea. This will

happen almost simultaneously," Singh said. The human space mission, initially planned for 2025, may not take place next year, but is now expected in early 2026, he added. Advocating for the sustainable exploration and conservation of India's 7,500-kilometre coastline and its abundant marine resources, the minister said the government is working to create an ecosystem to support these efforts.

He told a news agency that the services and information provided by INCOIS are not only relevant to coastal communities along India's shoreline but also to people worldwide.

Beware the gangs Gurugram, 200 gangsters arrested so far

In a major crackdown against lactive gangs involved in various crimes, the Gurugram police have arrested 200 members of 80 gangs, between January 1 to December 13 this year. While revealing the data, police said a number of 406 cases were also registered against them, and Rs 3.67 Crore were also recovered from their possession. "The arrested accused were mainly involved in robbery, house-breaking, theft, vehicle theft, snatching, ATM fraud, murder and others. The Gurugram police's crime branch teams and police station teams work hard to nab these criminals and recover huge amounts from them" Vikas Arora, Commissioner of Gurugram Police, said. Meanwhile, police said a special drive was initiated against these criminals at the direction of the Gurugram Police Commissioner. Many among the apprehended

offenders, were evading arrest for a long time. "We identified such offenders by collecting data from courts, sources and other inputs to keep an eye on the movements and activities of the criminals and anti-social elements. We believe such elements can be a threat to the city and disrupt law and order situation or execute any crime," Varun Dahiya, ACP (Crime), said.

He said that such operations against the Proclaimed Offenders (POs), bail jumpers and as well as other dreaded culprits will be continued in future to further ensure a sense of security and safety among the people. Dahiya said that specific information and public cooperation are very important when it comes to tackling and preventing crime. Apart from that, he emphasised that cooperation between police and the public plays a significant role in investigating and prosecuting criminals engaged in different offences. "They were arrested after receiving information

from specific resources to keep an eye on the movements and activities of the criminals and anti-social elements. We believe such elements can be a threat to the city and disrupt law and order situation or execute any crime," he said. Apart from this, the Gurugram police had also recovered Rs 83.41 crores from 1,658 Cyber Fraudsters, including 22 bank officials of different banks in just 11 months from January 2024 to 30 November 2024, the Gurugram police said. Senior police officers of the Gurugram claimed that the police are closely working with other agencies and organisations to counter these

frauds. "The cyber fraudsters commit fraud by luring people with good profits, investing in the stock market, reducing electricity bills, in the name of buying/selling cheap goods online, sextortion through video calls on WhatsApp, morphing, sending links through various means, posing as a customs officer/police officer in the name of implicating false case, in the name of issuing a No-Objection Certificate, digitally arresting people by showing the fear of implicating them in a criminal case, etc," Priyanshu Divan, ACP (cybercrime), said. Cyber fraudsters call people

and pretend to be police officers and commit fraud by telling them that any of their acquaintances or relatives have broken any law or that any of their relatives or acquaintances are ill, police said. They also dupe people; when people search for customer care numbers on Google for online hotel booking, wine delivery or for taking loans, cyber fraudsters keep their numbers there so that people call cyber fraudsters, and cyber fraudsters cheat them by taking them into confidence," Divan said. "As per the instructions of the Gurugram police chief, and to create awareness about cyber crimes, officials of RWA of residential societies, schools, companies and various institutions in Gurugram are being made aware by giving information about cyber crimes. We appealed to the public to steer clear of such dubious callers and advised caution in sharing personal details to strangers stalking them online," he added.



Yellow warning- moderate to heavy snowfall likely in State

The weather is set to get colder from today. The India Meteorological Department has issued a yellow warning (Watch) while forecasting that mountainous regions in Uttarakhand situated at altitudes of 2,500 metres and above may witness moderate to heavy snowfall from December 27 to 29. This may lead to slippery roads due to ice deposition, minor damage to electrical and telecommunication lines and road blockage due to snow accumulation. Apart from this, cold day conditions are forecast in all districts of the State on Saturday. According to the IMD, cold day conditions are likely on December 28 with low temperature and chilly winds likely to aggravate the cold. This may pre-



ent mild to moderate health concerns for vulnerable people including children, pregnant women, elderly and people with chronic diseases.

Meanwhile, the recent rain and snowfall witnessed in the State attracted a considerable number of tourists especially

The government has also restored a four per cent quota in the jobs to the sportspersons, he added.

The CM exhorted the sportspersons to give their best performance in the National Games. In her address, Arya said that the State government has opened the floodgates for the children to take sports as a career. She said that the different schemes of the government are not only helping in preparing sportspersons but also helping them from their childhood. Arya appealed to the sportspersons of the State to come in the top five in the medal tally in the upcoming National Games. It will usher in helping a sports culture in the State and will make the medal winners as a role model of the youth in the State, she said.

He averred that the State government is committed to develop a sports culture in Uttarakhand. The CM said that under the Mukyamantri Udaiman Khiladi Yojana, the State government is providing a scholarship of Rs 1,500 per month to the youngsters between eight to 14 years of age. Similarly the sportspersons between 14 to 23 years of age are being provided a scholarship of Rs 2,000 per month and they are also given a sum of Rs 10,000 for purchase of sports kits and

Govt should focus on safe & sustainable management of Char Dham Yatra: Nautiyal

The State government should focus on safe and sustainable management of the Char Dham Yatra rather than merely counting the number of pilgrims, the founder of the Social Development for Communities (SDC) Foundation Anoop Nautiyal said. Launching the foundation's report 'Pathways to Pilgrimage' on Thursday, he elicited focus on various aspects of the pilgrimage and its impact.

Addressing the media, Nautiyal said that he and his team compiled this report considering every aspect of the Char Dham Yatra. The 66-

page report highlights 10 major findings from the Yatra and offers fresh assessments regarding the pilgrimage. He noted that while the government typically releases figures on the total number of pilgrims during the entire Char Dham Yatra, this report includes a weekly analysis of pilgrimage data for the 2024 Yatra. The report presents an analysis of pilgrimage numbers over 28 weeks, he said. Nautiyal said that the report features a special analysis of media representation and provides recommendations for simplifying the registra-

tion process for pilgrims. Sharing some key statistics from the report he said that during the second week of the Yatra, a total of 5,63,292 pilgrims visited the Char Dham which accounts for 12 per cent of the total for the entire pilgrimage period. He added that due to the disaster on July 31, pilgrims could not visit Kedarnath from August 1 to 10. Only 7,418 pilgrims visited Kedarnath in August. Nautiyal emphasised that the report also addresses challenges encountered during the Yatra, including overcrowding, safety concerns, environmental degradation and others.



Regarding the recommendations, Nautiyal stated that the government should work on 10 key suggestions for effective Char Dham Yatra management in the State. These recommendations focus on safe and sustainable Yatra practices, paying attention to carrying capacity, enhancing disaster management preparations, improving healthcare facilities along the Yatra routes, simplifying the registration process, increasing revenue opportunities and requiring extensive stakeholder involvement. He said that the government should also prioritise local perspectives for the winter Char Dham Yatra.

More patients visiting GDMC hospital for cataract surgeries

Several factors including the conclusion of the Char Dham Yatra and the onset of the winter season have contributed to an increase in patient visits for cataract surgeries at the Government Doon Medical College (GDMC) hospital. Senior eye specialist at the hospital Dr Sushil Ojha said that the number of patients seeking cataract operations tends to rise each year from October. Compared to the summer months, there is a notable rise in the number of cataract procedures during the winter season. This trend is primarily due to the belief, particularly among the elderly, that winter is a more favourable time for cataract surgery due to a reduced risk of post-operative eye infections, which tend

to be more prevalent in the summer due to increased sweating.

He said that another crucial factor contributing to the rise in cataract surgeries is the closure of the Char Dham Yatra during this period. Many residents of the mountainous regions refrain from travelling during the Char Dham Yatra, which may adversely affect their health. After the conclusion of the Yatra, residents of the Garhwal region begin to visit hospitals for cataract procedures, he said.

He further added that currently, the GDMC team, which comprises about 20 eye surgeons, conducts between 28

and 30 surgeries each day. He said that under the leadership of governor lieutenant general (Retd) Gurmit Singh, free screenings for eye diseases and cataract surgery camps have been commenced in 15 medical units across the State from December 25 to 31.

U'khand tableau to be part of Republic Day parade in New Delhi

UTC's divisional manager suspended for negligence after Bhimtal mishap

PNS ■ DEHRADUN

The State administration suspended Kumaon's divisional manager (Operations) of Uttarakhand Transport Corporation (UTC) of Kathgodam division, Pooja Joshi for dereliction of duty as she reportedly failed to answer calls from senior officials during the critical hours after the Bhimtal bus accident which resulted in the death of the fifth passenger on Thursday. The UTC general manager Pawan Mehra confirmed the suspension stating that Joshi has been attached to the corporation's headquarters. As per the order issued late on Wednesday, while police and rescue teams acted promptly at the accident

site, Joshi failed to do so. She reportedly neglected her departmental duties and failed to respond to calls, which was deemed a serious lapse. Joshi also had a history of negligence, with disciplinary action previously proposed against her reportedly for similar lapses. Following this, the Transport department issued her suspension order, Mehra said. Also, the fifth victim Diksha Prakash (21) succumbed to her injuries on Thursday. As per the officials, the health of six victims admitted in Sushila Tiwari Hospital in Haldwani is quite critical. A team of the doctors from AIIMS-Rishikesh is treating them there, they said.

Bhimtal accident reminds citizens of unfit buses, UTC claims all is well

The bus accident at Bhimtal in Nainital district on Wednesday which claimed the lives of five passengers has reignited concerns over the use of unfit vehicles on Uttarakhand's mountainous routes. It is being speculated that the Roadways bus, which plunged into a gorge while traveling from Pithoragarh to Haldwani, was not suitable for operation.

The vehicle, a model from August 2016, had reportedly exceeded its operational age limit in 2023 and should have been decommissioned according to the State regulations. As per the rules, buses on mountain routes must not exceed seven years or seven

lakh kilometres of operation, after which they should not be operated on roads. However the general manager of Uttarakhand Transport Corporation (UTC) Pawan Mehra told

The Pioneer that though there are several old buses running on the mountainous routes, all are being operated after they are declared as fit to operate by respective regional transport officers (RTOs). "The Roadways bus in the Bhimtal accident also had a fitness certificate from the RTO. It had no mechanical problem," he said. He claimed that the accident happened when the bus driver tried to save a car that suddenly came in front of the bus from the wrong

side. "The bus driver was also not overspeeding as claimed by several media reports. He has the experience of 25 years.

It was an unfortunate accident but it is not right to cite wrong reasons for the accident," he said. Mehra also said that the UTC is planning to buy more buses for operation in mountain regions. The use of aging vehicles on hill routes has become a contentious issue, with many questioning the Transport department's commitment to passenger safety. The recent fatal accidents clearly indicate the urgent need for stricter adherence to transport regulations and accountability within the system.

CM meets Bhimtal accident victims in Haldwani hospital

He said that the licences and other documents of the vehicles coming from other States should be checked. The CM assigned responsibility of managing the traffic in the Kumaon region to the commissioner Rawat.

Aspiring councillors crowd MCD for NOCs as nomination deadline draws near

MCD issues 1,000 NOCs, expects to issue at least 3,000

As the deadline for filing nominations for civic bodies elections approaches, many prospective candidates flocked to the tax section of the Municipal Corporation of Dehradun (MCD) on Thursday to clear years of pending

The municipal tax superintendents and other staff of the tax section could be seen handling constant requests and complaints from individuals, particularly outgoing councillors and ex-councillors, seeking rebates on their long-pend-

ground, maintaining a polite but firm stance against such requests. They reiterated that the rules and processes are strictly online and uniformly applicable to all. While a few individuals attempted to bypass the system using



property tax to obtain NOCs, a mandatory requirement for filing nominations.

The tax section has received about 1,500 applications so far for NOCs for clearance of property tax by people expected to file for nominations for the elections. The corporation has issued about 1,000 NOCs and is expected to issue at least 3,000 NOCs before the last date of the filing of the nomination, as per the municipal tax superintendent Dharmesh Panuly.

The tax section was packed with individuals, many of them former or aspiring councillors, lining up to clear property tax dues to secure their NOCs to ensure their eligibility for the upcoming elections.

ing property tax dues. Many of these individuals have not cleared their taxes for over a decade and are now facing the full brunt of the system's automated calculations, which include penalties and interest.

The MCD officials made it clear to them that the online system leaves no room for manual intervention. "The system automatically calculates the tax along with all pending dues and penalties. There is no scope for any rebate or discount," explained an official to an outgoing female councillor. Despite repeated clarifications, some hopeful candidates were observed making phone calls to influential connections in a bid to secure concessions. However, the tax superintendents stood their

ground, maintaining a polite but firm stance against such requests. They reiterated that the rules and processes are strictly online and uniformly applicable to all. While a few individuals attempted to bypass the system using

their influence, the officials remained consistent in declining any deviation from the established procedure. The tax superintendents Painuly and Poonam Rawat were also seen working in counters in the tax submission room rather than in their offices to ensure smoother and faster work. As the countdown to the elections continues, the tax section of the MCD is expected to remain a hive of activity, with more candidates joining the fray to settle their dues and secure their NOCs before the filing deadline. The corporation has already installed barriers using metal grills and wooden logs in the premises to ensure the individuals coming for NOCs can stay in queue to ensure smooth operation.

Congress hit by internal differences as many aspire to contest ULB polls

Internal squabble and a large number of aspirants has resulted in a delay in the process of the selection of the candidates of the Congress party for the Urban Local Body (ULB) elections in the State. The Pradesh Congress Committee (PCC) is waiting for the report of the observers appointed by it in all the districts of the State. The PCC had set Wednesday as the last date for the observers to submit their report but till Thursday not all observers had submitted their report. The party had intended to finalise the names of the mayoral candidates in 11 municipal corporations and announce the names of the candidates ahead of the ruling BJP. However due to the delay in submission of the reports by the observers the candidate declaration can take place at least two to three days more. The process of nomination for different posts in the 100 ULBs of the state is commencing from Friday (December 27). It is learnt that the internal differences over the choice of the candidates, interference of senior leaders and large number of aspirants is forcing the observers to hold their report. For example, there are more than 20 aspirants for the Congress party's ticket for the post of mayor of Municipal Corporation of Dehradun. The PCC will forward the report of the observers to the seven member screening committee which will mull over the names and prepare a panel of the candidates for the post of mayors. The announcement of the final list of candidates is expected after endorsement of the party high command and the State in-charge. On Wednesday, the members of the screening committee held a round of discussions at the residence of the leader of opposition (LoP) in State Assembly Yashpal Arya. Former chief minister Harish Rawat, the co-in-charge of the State Congress Surendra Sharma, PCC president Karan Mahara, LoP Arya, former PCC presidents Pritam Singh and Ganesh Godiyal, Harak Singh Rawat and the deputy leader of Congress legislature party (CLP) inbtge Assembly Bhuwan Kapdi are the members of the screening committee. The State vice president (Organisation) of the Congress, Mathuradutt Joshi told The Pioneer that the process of the selection of the candidates is in the final stage and the list is expected soon. The elections will be held in 11 municipal corporations, 43 municipalities and 46 Nagar Panchayats. The last date for filing of the nomination papers is December 30 and the voting will be held from 8 AM to 5 PM on January 23.

BJP to go beyond reservation, may field more women candidates in ULB elections

The Bharatiya Janata Party will announce the names of its official candidates for the ensuing urban local bodies elections by Friday evening. The party plans to field women candidates in numbers exceeding the reservation mandates for women. The Congress leader and former president of Srinagar Palika Vipin Maithani also joined BJP in the presence of the BJP State president Mahendra Bhatt and cabinet minister Dhann Singh Rawat in Dehradun on Thursday. Bhatt stated that after two days of discussions, the BJP has prepared a panel of names for all civic body seats. The final decision regarding candidates for municipal councils and Nagar Panchayat presidents have been made in the State election committee meeting. Also, names of mayoral candidates for municipal corporations have been sent to the central leadership for approval. He expressed optimism that the central leadership would finalise and send back the names by Friday evening, allowing the party to announce candidates for all posts. He stated that the process for selecting councillors, ward members and other representatives is also nearly complete, with most of their names expected to be announced by Friday as well. Bhatt highlighted the strong support the BJP has consistently received from women voters, crediting the Modi led central government and the Dhama led State government for their remarkable work in promoting women's welfare. He stated that the party is considering women candidates even for general seats, apart from those reserved for women. The final list will feature women candidates in numbers exceeding 33 per cent reservation, reflecting the party's dedication to empowering Matri Shakti, he said.

Imported liquor worth Rs 25 lakh seized ahead of ULB elections

Dehradun police seized a large cache of imported liquor valued at about Rs 25 lakh from Rajpur area ahead of the ensuing urban local body elections. The police raided a flat in Rajpur and recovered 16 cartons containing a total of 181 bottles of imported liquor, some of which were marked for sale in Haryana, the Dehradun senior superintendent of police Ajai Singh said. The raid was conducted after the SSP received a tip off about an illegal liquor

warehouse in the Rajpur area. Singh said that police are conducting regular checking in view of the municipal elections, New Year celebrations and the Mussoorie Winter Carnival to curb illegal activities, including the storage and smuggling of illicit liquor and narcotics. Based on a tip off, the Rajpur police raided a flat located at Plot Number 5, Shipra Vihar, Canal Road. The police uncovered an illegal liquor warehouse within the premises, stocked with the

smuggled liquor. A case has been registered under section 60 of the Excise Act against the occupant of the flat, he said. He informed that the recovered liquor includes high-end imported brands and some bottles bore markings for sale in Haryana, indicating possible inter-state smuggling. Investigation is ongoing to trace the network behind this illegal operation and to ensure stringent action against the culprits, the SSP added.

The defence secretary said the website and mobile app, developed by the ministry, "also has



a system for managing the tableaux proposals and historic data regarding events". It will host a tableau management portal to facilitate states and Union Territories, ministries and departments in designing and finalising their tableaux for the Republic Day event, the statement said. The website and mobile application have been a result of a consultative process adopted by the ministry. The states had suggested for a portal for the management of data related to the design of tableaux. Similarly, viewers of Republic Day events in the feedback had

suggested having information regarding events, parades, tableaux. The Rashtraparv website has been developed by incorporating all these inputs, it added. The website can be accessed at rashtraparv.Mod.Gov.In and the mobile app can be downloaded from the government app store (M-Seva), the ministry said. The initiative is a step further towards openness, transparency and citizen-centric governance and is a fitting tribute to the late former prime minister on Good Governance Day, the statement said.

Delhi tutor held for protests by civil service aspirants in Patna

A Delhi-based tutor was held on Thursday on the charge of instigating aspirants who tried to "storm into" the Bihar Public Service Commission (BPSC) office in Patna, demanding cancellation of its December 13 examination, an official said. Patna's District Magistrate (DM) Chandrasekar Singh told PTI that preliminary investigations into Wednesday's protests found that one Rohit, a tutor, mobilised and instigated the aspirants. Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Rajeev Mishra said, "Initial investigations have revealed that Rohit had come from Delhi and brought along a number of persons, including girls, posing as disgruntled BPSC aspirants. He is being examined by the investigators." The source of their funding is also being investigated as they seem to be part of a larger conspiracy, he said. "We are probing the larger conspiracy behind yesterday's



incident. What is the source of funding for those who came from outside the state to instigate BPSC aspirants is also the focus of our probe. Rohit seems to be the mastermind of yesterday's protest. Patna Police will send a preliminary report to the Economic Offences Unit (EOU) to investigate their source of funding," he told PTI. Alleging irregularities in the 70th Integrated Combined Competitive Examination (CCE), aspirants demonstrated outside the BPSC office and sought re-examination. The police baton-charged the aspi-

ants to bring the situation under control. The protesters claimed they were treated "like terrorists" and many of them were injured in the police action, a charge which was denied by the authorities. Popular vlogger Motiur Rahman Khan, known as Guru Rahman, also joined the protests at Gardani Bagh. "Police action against BPSC aspirants was highly condemnable. Protesting BPSC aspirants should not have been treated like this. My support is always with the students," he said.

Home Minister Shah to embark on two-day visit to Odisha from Dec 28

Union Home Minister Amit Shah will embark on a two-day visit to Odisha from December 28, during which he will hold an interactive meeting with BJP leaders and workers and attend several other events, a senior party leader said on Thursday. BJP's Odisha in-charge Vijaypal Singh Tomar said that Shah will arrive in Bhubaneswar on December 28 night and stay till the evening of December 29. Thousands offer prayers at Sabarimala during mandala puja

Thousands of devotees offered prayers at the Sabarimala Lord Ayyappa temple on Thursday as the auspicious mandala puja was performed at the hill shrine. The mandala puja was conducted in a deeply devotional atmosphere between noon and 12.30 pm after the idol of Lord Ayyappa, the principal deity, was adorned with the "thanka anki," the sacred golden attire brought to the sannidhanam (temple complex) in a ceremonial proces-



sion on Wednesday evening. The temple will close for the night with the recitation of 'Harivarasanam,' temple

authorities said. They added that the Sabarimala temple will reopen at 5 pm on December 30 for the makar-

avilakku festival, which will conclude on January 14. The rituals were led by the temple's head priest, Kandararu Rajeevaru, who adorned the idol with the sacred attire. Thousands of pilgrims from Kerala and other states, who waited in queues for hours in and around the sannidhanam, attended the ceremonies. Prominent officials of the Travancore Devaswom Board were also present near the sanctum sanctorum. According to officials of the TDB, the apex temple body that manages the shrine, as of Wednesday, 32.5 lakh pilgrims had visited the shrine, an increase of 4.07 lakh compared to the same period last

year. In 2023, 28.42 lakh devotees visited the shrine during this period. Spot bookings were limited to 5,000 on December 25 and 26 as part of the arrangements for mandala puja. However, darshan was ensured for all devotees who arrived at Sabarimala, TDB officials said. On Wednesday, when the 'thanka anki' procession reached the sannidhanam, over 62,000 devotees had darshan, they said. By noon on Thursday, nearly 20,000 devotees visited the hill shrine through virtual queue and spot booking facilities before the temple closed, they added.

Yogi Adityanath's 2024: A year of fiery rhetoric and political messaging

In a year marked by political contests and cultural debates, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's speeches in 2024 transcended electoral rallies, becoming rallying cries that resonated deeply across India. His carefully crafted remarks, blending critique of opposition parties with appeals for unity among followers of Sanatan Dharma, cemented his position as a mass leader with a vision for a unified and culturally proud India. Among his most impactful slogans was "Katenge Toh

Batenge, Ek Rahenge Toh Nek Rahenge," delivered in Agra in August. This phrase, urging unity among communities, gained traction nationwide as a symbol of his call for solidarity and shared purpose. It underscored a year where Adityanath repeatedly sought to redefine narratives on governance, culture, and justice. Throughout 2024, his speeches targeted the opposition, particularly the Samajwadi Party (SP) and Congress, accusing them of fostering division, lawlessness, and pseudo-secularism. In Etawah, he raised the issue of justice for the families of victims of mafia violence, including the widows

of slain leaders like BJP MLA Krishnanand Rai and Umesh Pal. He said: SP should give account of Mangalsutra of Alka Rai, Pooja-Jaya Pal" (April 25, Etawah). By questioning the opposition's silence on these matters, Adityanath positioned himself as a crusader for justice and law and order. In his addresses to marginalised communities, Adityanath invoked symbols like Bajrang Bali to emphasize the collective power of unity. At a BJP Backward Class Morcha meeting in Lucknow, he likened the strength of the OBC community to Bajrang Bali's might,



declaring their unity as a force capable of dismantling the divisive strategies of pseudo-secular politics. He said:

"Bajrang Bali's power in OBC society will burn Ravana's Lanka" (July 29, Lucknow) The Chief Minister's rhetoric

often combined vivid imagery with sharp criticism. Phrases like "No Sadbhavna for Mafia and Goons, only the Bullet Train of Justice" captured his administration's stance on women's safety and law enforcement, while "SP ki Topi Laal, Kaarname Kaale" evoked allegations of corruption and criminality against his political opponents. In Haryana, during an election rally, Adityanath criticized Congress leaders as "Accidental Hindus raised in Roman culture," a remark aimed at reinforcing BJP's Hindutva narrative. His comments drew sharp criticism but also bolstered his party's

ideological position among its core supporters. Adityanath's speeches also highlighted his focus on cultural pride and historical legacy. At the unveiling of Rashtreev Durgadas Rathore's statue in Agra, he called for national unity by reflecting on the lessons of divided nations like Bangladesh. His one-liner: "Batenge to katenge, ek rahenge to nek rahenge" (August 26, Agra) became the theme of election campaign in Haryana and Maharashtra. In the Winter session of the state assembly, he reaffirmed India's cultural identity, emphasizing the legacy of

figures like Ram, Krishna, and Buddha while advocating mutual respect among religious communities. He said: "India will uphold the legacy of Ram, Krishna, and Buddha" (December 16, Lucknow). Through his speeches, Adityanath painted a narrative of a strong, unified, and culturally rooted Uttar Pradesh, countering what he described as the opposition's failures and divisive politics. As the year closes, his rhetoric has not only solidified his political standing but also ensured his voice continues to echo in the state's political and cultural discourse.

UP Government mandates property disclosure for employee promotions

New police recruits will undergo specialised training to handle law and order situations, says Manipur CM

Manipur Chief Minister Biren Singh on Thursday said the newly recruited personnel of the 10th and 11th India Reserve Battalion (IRB), who recently concluded training in Assam, would undergo specialised exercise so that they can be deployed for highway protection and handling the law and order situation. During a visit to Manipur Police Training Centre at Pangei in Imphal East district, the CM said the recruits would undergo specialised training at this centre before being deployed across the state. "They will undergo specialised training at Pangei where they will be taught

how to handle law and order situation. If the personnel are deployed in various police stations now, their morale may be down. So, we decided to keep them at one place and use their services wherever and whenever needed," the CM said. "Some of them will be used for highway protection, while others will be used to tackle law and order situation," Singh added.

Singh also said many of the police personnel will undergo refresher courses, and arrangements for procuring new gear for mob control have been made. The CM said construction and maintenance work at the battalion headquarters of 10th and 11th IRB at Nungba and Saivom are also going on currently, he said. "Police are the backbone of society and cannot be demoralised. Many of them will undergo refresher courses to improve their physical fitness and mob control with full gear. Their identity needs to be protected also," Singh added. Singh also requested recruits' parents not to approach ministers and MLAs for transfers and allow them to serve the

state and nation. "Today, I visited the Manipur Police Training Centre at Pangei to inspect the newly constructed barracks, which will soon be utilised for training purposes. Given the current law and order situation in the state, the newly recruited constables will undergo specialised training. This step is essential to enhance the strength and readiness of our police force to ensure safety and security across Manipur," he posted on X. "We are committed to equipping our police personnel with the best facilities and training to meet any challenges," Singh said. He also said houses are being made for internally displaced persons (IDPs) who are staying in schools and colleges.

Yogi Govt accelerates land allocation for Mahakumbh

As Mahakumbh 2025 draws nearer, preparations in Prayagraj are in full swing, with the Yogi Adityanath-led Uttar Pradesh government expediting the land allocation process. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, during a recent review meeting, instructed officials to complete all allocations by December 31. Responding promptly, authorities have so far allocated land to over 4,000 organizations, with an estimated 8,000 to 10,000 participants expected to partake in the grand event.

One of the event's key highlights is the establishment of Akharas, which is progressing steadily. While several Akharas have already set up their camps, the Mela Authority has successfully allocated land to most Akharas and associated organizations. Pending allocations, including for new applicants, are expected to be finalized within the stipulated deadline. According to the Mela Authority, the land allocation

process is nearly complete for Akharas and their followers, Mahamandaleshwars, Khalsa, Dandiawada, Acharyawada, and Khakachowk. Allocations for Prayagwal groups and new organizations are underway and will be concluded by December 31. Thus far, a total of 4,268 organizations have received land, including 19 allocations for Akharas and their sub-groups, 460 for

Mahamandaleshwars, 750 for Khalsa, 203 for Dandiawada, 300 for Acharyawada, 300 for Khakachowk and 1,766 for other organizations. Additionally, 450 allotments have been made to Prayagwal groups, with their allocation process, which began on December 12, scheduled to continue until month-end. Allocations for new organizations, which commenced on December 16, are pro-

gressing simultaneously. The allocated areas have turned into hubs of activity, with tents being erected and traditional decorations underway. The Jhuni area, in particular, is abuzz with representatives from Akharas, Mahamandaleshwars, Khalsa, Dandiawada, Acharyawada, Khakachowk, and other groups working tirelessly to prepare their camps in alignment with their cultural practices. To facilitate smooth navigation, the administration has installed checkered plates across the sprawling site and is rapidly putting up signages to help visitors locate their destinations. Other arrangements, including lighting and essential amenities, are also being completed at a brisk pace. The Juna Akhara, Avahan Akhara, and Agni Akhara have already established their cantonments, signaling the rapid progress on the ground. With activities picking up speed, the entire Mahakumbh Nagar is expected to be fully operational and adorned by January 1 setting the stage for one of the largest religious gatherings in the world. Mahakumbh, held every 12 years in Prayagraj, is a grand spiritual confluence attracting millions of pilgrims, saints, and tourists from across the globe. The Yogi government is leaving no stone unturned to ensure that Mahakumbh 2025 is an unparalleled success, emphasizing enhanced infrastructure, meticulous planning, and cultural vibrancy.

Over 70 hours on, girl still stuck in borewell in Rajasthan

Three-year-old Chetna has been stuck inside a narrow 150 feet deep borewell for over 70 hours as the rescue operations were still underway on Thursday to save the girl. Worried about her daughter's condition, Dholi Devi has not eaten anything since the tragic accident on Monday. Chetna fell into the borewell while playing in the agriculture farm of her father in Badiyali Dhani under Sarund police station of Kotputli-Behror district. With each passing moment, the hope for the girl being well is diminishing as the rescue team was not able to supply any food or water to Chetna. Dholi Devi and others are constantly praying for the well being of Chetna amid the non-stop rescue operation by NDRF and SDRF teams, assisted by the local police and administration. Initially, efforts were made to

pull the girl out of the borewell with the help of a ring but all attempts failed. After two days of repeated attempts that fetched no results, a piling was brought to the spot on Wednesday morning and a pit parallel to the borewell was dug. "... Now a horizontal tunnel will be made through which the experts will reach the girl," Sarund SHO Mohammad Imran said. He said all possible efforts were made to pull out the girl but all hard work went in vain as the borewell is narrow and

the technique could not deliver results. A team of doctors with an ambulance are at the spot. "The rescue operation is likely to conclude today," the SHO said. Kotputli-Behror District Collector Kalpana Agarwal reached the village late Wednesday night to take stock of the situation. She said that the rescue operation had been constantly going on. A lot of preparations had to be done to bring the piling machine to the farm.

Kerala Govt declares two-day mourning as mark to respect MT Vasudevan

Kerala bade a tearful farewell to M T Vasudevan Nair, the numero uno of Malayalam literature who breathed his last on late Wednesday night at a corporate hospital in Kozhikode, a city which was immortalized by his presence. He has been honored with Jnanpith Award in 1995 for his comprehensive contributions to Malayalam literature. The President of India had decorated him with Padma Bhushan in 2005. Ninety-one year old MT (as he is known) was ailing for some time due to age related issues and a team of doctors were attending to him on a round-the-clock basis. M T is rated as the last of the titans of Malayalam literature. In addition to short stories, novels, and travelogues, he left the characteristic "MT Touch" in six feature films which he directed, by walking away with the best director award (three times) in the National Film Festival). One has lost count of the number of times he bagged the Kerala State Film Awards as a director and

script writer. He has authored scripts for more than 60 films and all were run away hits. Nirmalyam (Malayalam for Yesterday's Offerings"), his first venture as a director bagged many national and international awards. P J Antony, who played the role of a village oracle was honored with Bharath award for perfecting the role in the movie which turned out to a trendsetter in Malayalam movies. The novels authored by M T remain as fresh and interesting decades after they were published. Having born and brought up in a village on the banks of Nila, all his literary works feature people whom

one meet in the day-to-day life in the countryside. The theses in his novels and short stories were based on the rising, disintegration and fall of the Nair ancestral families in Malabar. His novel Randamoozham (The Second Turn) published in 1984 tells the story of Mahabharath as seen through the eyes of Bheem. There are no literary works attributed to MT which have gone unrecognized and it is said that he was the one who elevated Malayalam literature to the global arena. The multi-faceted author leaves behind his wife Saraswathi and daughter Aswathi. MT had married

Prameela Nair in 1962 but they were separated in 1978. The couple has a daughter Sitara born out of this marriage. Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed his sorrow over the passing away of the celebrated writer and movie maker. "Saddened by the passing away of Shri MT Vasudevan Nair Ji, one of the most respected figures in Malayalam cinema and literature. His works, with their profound exploration of human emotions, have shaped generations and will continue to inspire many more. He also gave voice to the silent and marginalised. My thoughts are with his family and admirers. Om Shanti," the PM wrote in X. The Kerala Government has declared a two-day mourning as a mark of respect to MT. The last rites were performed at Smriti Path, the Kozhikode corporation owned crematorium on Thursday evening in the presence of thousands of fans and well wishers of the last of the Titans in Malayalam literature.

Chhattisgarh Govt cancels constable recruitment in Rajnandgaon, sets up SIT to probe irregularities

The Chhattisgarh government has cancelled the process of recruitment of police constables in Rajnandgaon district amid allegations of irregularities and set up an SIT for a probe into it, an official said. State Deputy Chief Minister Vijay Sharma, who holds the home portfolio, gave an order to this effect on Wednesday afternoon, he said. "Irregularities came to light in the ongoing recruitment process in the 8th battalion of Rajnandgaon and a case was registered in this connection at Lal Bagh police station on December 17," the official said. Since November 16, candidates from Rajnandgaon, Khairagarh-Chhuikhadan-Gandai, Kabirdham (Kawardha) and Mohla-Manpur-Ambagadh Chowki districts have been participating in the recruitment process here, he said. The police have so far arrested seven persons -- four police constables, two employees of

the event management company and one female candidate -- in connection with the alleged irregularities in the recruitment process, the official said. During the investigation in the case, constable Anil Ratnakar allegedly committed suicide. A note written with a pen was found on his left palm, which stated employees were being targeted in alleged irregularities in recruitment and officers were being protected, he said. Rajnandgaon (Range) Inspector General of Police Deepak Jha has set up a Special Investigation Team (SIT) for a probe into Ratnakar's suicide and sought a report in 10 days, he said. Meanwhile, Superintendent of Police Mohit Garg has handed over the investigation of the alleged irregularities in the recruitment process to the Rajnandgaon City Superintendent of Police Puspendra Nayak, the official said. Garg on Wednesday said the

order to cancel the recruitment process for District Police Force Constable Cadre Selection Examination 2023-24 has not been received from the state government so far. Former chief minister and assembly speaker Raman Singh welcomed the state government's decision to cancel the recruitment process. "Today, on the occasion of Good Governance Day, under the leadership of Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri @vishnuhsai, Home Minister Shri @vijaysharmacg took a commendable decision to cancel the entire recruitment by taking immediate cognizance of the Rajnandgaon Police Recruitment case," Singh said on X. The CM has directed formation of an SIT for an impartial investigation into the entire matter, he said. "No kind of negligence or corruption will be tolerated in this government of good governance," Singh added. During the recruitment process, the marks obtained by

Full support to Telugu film industry but no compromise on law and order: Telangana CM

Telangana Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Thursday made it clear to a visiting Telugu cinema industry delegation that there would be no compromise on law and order in the state and that it applies to everyone including the film fraternity. The CM also conveyed to the delegation of Telugu film personalities led by ace producer and Telangana Film Development Corporation (FDC) Chairman Venkata Ramana Reddy, that a Cabinet Sub-Committee will be constituted to resolve the problems of the film industry and suggested to them to set up an in-house panel as well. The meeting between the CM and the film personalities was held at the Police Integrated Command Control Centre here, and in the wake



of actor Allu Arjun's recent arrest that had led to speculations of 'strained' ties between the ruling dispensation and the cinema industry post the police action against the 'Pushpa' star. A 35-year-old woman died at Sandhya Theatre here in a stampede where Allu Arjun-starrer 'Pushpa 2' was screened on December 4, leading to his subsequent arrest on December 13 and release. "As the Chief Minister, it is my responsibility to enforce the laws. I do not have any personal preferences. Let us all develop the film industry together without confining ourselves to Telugu only. Government is ready to extend all support to the film industry, official sources quoted the CM as saying. Asserting that the cinema industry is as important to the

government as the IT and pharma sectors, Reddy said a Cabinet Sub-Committee will be constituted to resolve the

problems of the film industry. The government is considering organising a major convention to encourage other

film industries to come to the city, he said. "Our intention is to take the (Telugu movie) industry to the next level," the sources quoted the CM as saying. He also pointed out that the film industry should remember its social responsibility and join the efforts to check drugs and other societal problems. Venkata Ramana Reddy, popularly known as Dil Raju, said besides Telugu movies, shooting of movies of other languages, including Hindi, Tamil and Kannada, are also happening in the city. "So, the view of the CM is that the film industry should give suggestions to government to see that, not just Indian films but Hollywood films are also shot in Hyderabad," he told reporters after the meeting. Asked for the government's stance on allowing benefit shows and hiking ticket prices on special occasions, Dil Raju said they are only a "small part" of the issue and that the

bigger vision is how to take Telugu cinema to the international level and to make Hyderabad city an "international hub". "Time would throw light on all that," he said. When contacted, producer Daggubati Suresh who was part of the delegation which called on Revanth Reddy, told PTI that permission for benefit shows and ticket price hike during the initial days of film release is not a necessary requirement for all filmmakers, but an individual production house. The delegation included actors Nagarjuna, Venkatesh, Murali Mohan and directors Trivikram Srinivas, K Raghavendra Rao and producers Daggubati Suresh, Allu Aravind (father of Allu Arjun) and C Kalyan. Asserting that there would not be any benefit shows

(special shows), Cinematography minister Komatireddi Venkat Reddy recently said the state government, in future, may consider ticket price hike only for certain categories such as films made on history, freedom struggle or others like those with messages against the use of drugs. The minister's statement, if implemented, will have a huge impact on the high budget films such as Ram Charan's "Game Changer", Nandamuri Balakrishna's "Daaku Maharaj" and Venkatesh's "Sankranthiki Vasthunnam" which are slated for release during Sankranti in three weeks from now. Directed by popular Director S Shankar, Game Changer is produced by Dil Raju. The film is reportedly made with a budget of nearly Rs 400 crore.

A blow to regional peace

The fragile peace of South Asia faced a severe setback when Pakistan conducted airstrikes in Afghanistan

On the night of December 24, 2024, a series of airstrikes conducted by Pakistan in Afghanistan's Barmal district of Paktika province claimed the lives of at least 15 civilians, including women and children. The strikes targeted seven villages, causing significant destruction, particularly in areas like Murg Bazaar and Laman, where an entire family of five was killed. This incident has further strained relations between Pakistan and Afghanistan, raising serious concerns about the stability of South Asia. The airstrikes appear to be a direct response to Pakistan's growing concerns over the activities of the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP). Pakistan has justified the strikes as a necessary measure to eliminate TTP hideouts and secure its borders. However, the Afghan Taliban strongly denies these allegations, claiming instead that the airstrikes targeted civilians, including Waziristani refugees who had previously fled military operations in Pakistan's tribal areas. The implications of this attack extend far beyond the immediate violence, casting a shadow over peace and security in South Asia. The airstrikes, coupled with the Taliban's vow to retaliate, risk escalating into a broader conflict between Pakistan and Afghanistan. Such hostilities could destabilise the region, which is already grappling with insurgencies, cross-border terrorism, and long-standing disputes.



In addition to the geopolitical ramifications, the humanitarian impact is profound. Afghanistan, a nation still recovering from decades of war, now faces further devastation. Civilian populations, particularly refugees, are bearing the brunt of this violence, with villages like Murg Bazaar reduced to rubble and countless families displaced. The destruction exacerbates an already dire humanitarian crisis, highlighting the urgent need for international aid and support. This conflict also undermines ongoing peace efforts in the region. Dialogues involving Afghanistan, Pakistan, and other stakeholders, essential for fostering stability, risk being derailed by such incidents. Additionally, it hinders cooperative initiatives against terrorism, a shared threat that requires coordinated regional action. The situation further complicates geopolitics in South Asia, prompting countries like India, China and Iran to reassess their strategies. Pakistan's actions, though driven by immediate security concerns, may strain its relationships with traditional allies and global powers advocating for peace in the region. To address this growing crisis, both countries must prioritise dialogue and cooperation. Constructive bilateral engagement is crucial to resolving mutual concerns, particularly regarding the TTP and border security. Neutral mediators, such as the United Nations, could play a vital role in facilitating these discussions. Beyond bilateral efforts, regional cooperation is essential. A unified initiative led by organisations like the South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) could encourage collective action against terrorism and promote economic interdependence, reducing the incentives for conflict.

While Hashemites were the Sharif and Emir of Mecca with rule over larger Hejaz, they were violently ousted from the control over the same by the rival Saud family. This military loss led to the loss of the symbolically vital title of the "Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques" to the Saud family, of modern-day Saudi Arabia. Hashemites were also to lose monarchical claim of rule on lands of Syria, Lebanon, Palestine and Iraq and were left with only the Jordanian swathes - which unlike other Arab lands was bereft of oil, natural resources, ports, or any other meaningful lever of power. They had to be creative in dealing with the situation and remaining relevant and protected. Geographical contiguity to Palestinian lands led to Jordan demonstrating fluctuating concern that oscillated from supporting the Palestinian cause to wily-nilly, acting against the same. During the Arab-Israeli War of 1948, Jordan occupied the West Bank and East Jerusalem (which it annexed in 1950), only to lose the same to Israel in the Six-Day War of 1967. Historians often note the unique culture of "back channels" (facilitating clandestine meetings) between the Jordanians and Israelis that led to counterintuitive accommodations, even amid war. In the subsequent Arab-Israel War of 1973 (Yom Kippur War), Jordan had curiously avoided joining Arab ranks against Israel. Jordanian King Hussein had secretly flown to Tel Aviv to warn Israeli Prime Minister Golda Meir of the impending Arab plans to attack Israel. Ultimately when Jordan was morally forced to support the war against Israel, declassified accounts confirm that it was only to preserve Jordan's image in the Arab world and that it had already entered into a tacit agreement with Israel that it would not attack Israeli elements. By 1994 the two countries



It wasn't the first time the Jordanians had worked duplicitously against the Arab or Palestinian cause, as just a couple of years earlier, the infamous and bloody "Black September" (Sep 1970 - July 1971) had occurred. Jordanian Army had surrounded camps and townships with Palestinians fideyeen of various groups and brutally cut them down to size. Nearly 3500 were killed in the purge and the PLO (Palestinian Liberation Organisation) fighters were expelled to neighbouring Lebanon. Again, the Jordanians had aligned with Israel before commencing this attack. Importantly Syrian forces that had intervened on behalf of Palestinian fighters were repulsed leaving 600 Syrians dead and a loss of 120 tanks. Interestingly, like the historically insincere support of Jordanians towards the Palestinians, one important figure who participated along the Jordanian forces in massacring the Palestinians was a then Pakistani Brigadier (later dictator) Zia-ul-Haq, who was on deputation! In 1987 Jordanian King Hussein and Israeli foreign affairs minister (later President) Shimon Peres met secretly to work on a peace treaty which was followed up with Jordanians forsaking their claim on the West Bank, the subsequent year. By 1994 the two countries

signed a formal Peace Treaty (the second Arab nation after Egypt) and normalised relations with Israel. Odd public bickering on issues like Al Aqsa Mosque aside, the top leadership of both countries kept meeting discretely, whilst Jordan kept maintaining the façade of support towards Palestine. Practically, they engaged and operated as allies. Post the Hamas terror attack (7th Oct 2023) on Israel and the subsequent and disproportionate budgeoning of the Gaza Strip, the Jordanians had no choice but to expel the Israeli ambassador to maintain face in the Arab world. However, as it was only Iran and its proxies like the Syrian Bashar Al Assad government and the Lebanese Hezbollah who were offering any meaningful resistance to the Israelis - then the Jordanians did the unthinkable in favour of the Israelis when they shot down Iranian drones attacking Israel. Practically, the Jordanians weighed in favour of the Israeli military (all perfunctory concerns towards the beleaguered Palestinians, notwithstanding). Jordanians watched silently as Southern Lebanon was attacked and as the Syrian regime was overrun by forces born out of Al Qaeda, ending the last possible faction that had taken on the Israelis in favour of the Palestinians. For

a long, Jordanian King Abdullah had warned against the spectre of a rising "Shia Crescent" (assertion of Shiite rule in Iran, Iraq, Syria and Lebanon). He therefore would be presumably pleased to see the decimation of the sectarian rivals, which coincidentally also ended the last modicum of challenge to the Israelis. Beyond vacuous words, the practical conduct of the Jordanians has been suspiciously two-faced on the ostensible redlines as defined by King Abdullah i.e., "No to abandoning the guardianship of Jerusalem and the holy sites, no to the one-state solution, and no for Jordan to be an alternative homeland for the Palestinians". The picture has perhaps never been further from the so-called Jordanian redlines, as now, the fate of Palestinians, Jerusalem, and the possibility of a two-state solution, is at its lowest. History will judge the conduct of Arab monarchies and their lip-serving commitment towards Palestine, but perhaps none as ambidextrously as the Jordanians, who often fancy themselves to be of the highest order. SOLVING INDIA'S WATER CRISIS
Madam — Recently, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has laid the foundation stone of the Ken-Betwa river linking project, the first initiative under the national river linking policy, at Khajuraho in Madhya Pradesh. It is really a welcome step in solving the water crisis in India. Nearly 65 lakh people of Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh will get drinking water, and more than 7 lakh farmer families of 2000 villages will benefit from the project. Also, it has been proposed to generate 103 MW of hydropower. The project aims to transfer surplus water from the Ken River in Madhya Pradesh to Betwa in UP to irrigate the drought-prone Bundelkhand region. Under the project, a 77 m high and 2.13 km long Daudhan dam and two tunnels will be constructed on the Ken River. Interlinking rivers can control both floods and droughts. This river linking project can have significant ecological consequences, can impact the biodiversity of the region, and can affect Panna Tiger Reserve too. Even then the project will create many employment opportunities as well as boost the rural economy. Ken-Betwa is the first river linking project under the National Perspective Plan (NPP) for the linking of rivers. The National Water Development Agency should identify a few more river linking projects to avoid floods and to cultivate more lands in drought-prone areas in India.

With a Rs 6,000 crore budget allocated for 2025-2027, ONOS will provide subscriptions to international research journals, academic databases, and other resources, addressing disparities in education and research. The initiative will empower students and researchers, especially from rural and smaller institutions, by granting them access to resources previously limited to well-funded universities. This inclusivity will bridge the rural-urban divide and foster innovation by enabling access to global advancements. Additionally, its focus on digital platforms reduces dependency on physical materials, supporting environmental sustainability and the objectives of the Digital India campaign. Despite its promise, ONOS faces challenges, including concerns over its high cost and limited digital infrastructure in rural areas, which could restrict access. Critics caution that without transparent implementation, the initiative may primarily benefit larger institutions.

India's hidden crisis: Battling malnutrition for a healthier future

Malnutrition among children in India stands as a pressing public health challenge, intricately linked to poverty, systemic inequalities and environmental hurdles

Malnutrition among children remains a critical public health issue in India, deeply intertwined with poverty, systemic inequalities, and environmental challenges. Despite the nation's economic progress, the persistent issues of undernutrition and micronutrient deficiencies continue to hinder India's overall growth and development, casting a shadow over its aspirations for a healthier future. The 2023 Global Hunger Index paints a grim picture, with India ranked 111th out of 125 countries and a score of 28.7, indicating a "serious" hunger situation. Although there has been marginal improvement from a score of 29.2 in 2015, the pace of progress lags behind peer economies. Disturbingly, India records the world's highest rate of child wasting at 18.7 per cent, while 35.5 per cent of children under five are stunted. These figures highlight the long-term health and developmental implications of malnutrition. Several interconnected challenges exacerbate this issue.



Poverty remains a significant factor, with India contributing nearly 40 per cent to the global poverty rate and 389 million people living in poverty across South Asia. Millions of children are left vulnerable to malnutrition due to limited resources. Compounding this is inadequate nutrition and sanitation, as poor dietary intake, restricted access to clean water, and insufficient healthcare facilities worsen the situation. The health and cognitive impacts of malnutrition are profound, weakening immune systems, increasing susceptibility to diseases, and impairing cognitive development. These effects

ripple through to academic performance and future opportunities, trapping many in a cycle of poverty. Regional disparities further intensify the problem, with states like Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and Madhya Pradesh shouldering a disproportionate burden of malnourished children. Higher poverty rates and systemic challenges in these regions make addressing the issue even more complex. To combat malnutrition, the Government of India has implemented various programs. POSHAN Abhiyaan aims to enhance the nutritional status of children, pregnant women, and lactating mothers. The Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) program offers supplementary nutrition, education, immunisation, and health check-ups. The Mid-Day Meal Scheme addresses hunger and malnutrition among school-going children, while the National Food Security Act (NFSA) provides subsidised food grains to economically vulnerable populations. Other initiatives, such as the Pradhan Mantri Matru

Vandana Yojana (PMMVY) and the National Health Mission (NHM), include financial incentives for pregnant women and specialised care through Nutrition Rehabilitation and Lactation Management Centres. While these efforts have yielded positive outcomes, more comprehensive strategies are needed to address the root causes of malnutrition. Tackling poverty, improving education, expanding healthcare access, and ensuring sanitation are critical steps toward sustainable progress. Collaborative efforts among policymakers, non-governmental organisations, and local communities are essential to create meaningful change. True progress is reflected in the wellbeing of every individual, especially the youngest members of society. By prioritising nutrition and equity, India can foster a healthier, well-nourished generation and pave the way for sustainable development. Witch-hunting in India: A persistent plague claiming women's lives

Despite legal interventions, witch-hunting remains a grim reality in parts of India, targeting marginalised women

In 2014, Partners for Law in Development (PLD), a legal resource group working on social justice and women's rights, carried out a study to understand the reasons behind rising violence against women in the name of witch hunting in Bihar, Chhattisgarh and Jharkhand. They found that women were blamed for illness, death and even a bad crop and branded as witches.

The targets of this belief system were largely middle-aged married women with little formal education, from lower economic strata and marginalised castes and communities. Moreover, victims and perpetrators were, more often than not, closely related to each other and,



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there was complicity in the community. Their study also revealed that although laws in Bihar, Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh criminalising acts/offences particular to witch hunting, such as 'identifying' any person as a witch along with the mental and physical torture accompanying such identification existed, the apathy of the state led to the continuation of witch hunting prac-

tices. Ten years later, nothing seems to have changed. Witch hunting continues to claim women's lives even in 2024. Over 663 were killed for allegedly practising witchcraft during 2015 and 2021 according to the National Crime Research Bureau (NCRB). Worryingly, the main perpetrators of this violence also remain the same, says Nirantar Trust, an NGO working on gender and education. Findings of the Trust's recent survey on witch hunting in 114 villages across 10 districts in Bihar showed 43 per cent of the victims were targeted by members from their own family. Their study, released earlier this month, also found a significant proportion of the

women victimised as witches were between the age group 45 to 60. Moreover, 73 per cent of the victims had never been to school. Nirantar also found that more than single women or widows, it was married women who were branded as witches, corroborating the findings of the 2014 PLD study. In many instances, perpetrators were related to the male kin of the husband and thus negated the traditional belief that married women were safer than single women. Another grave concern raised in the 2024 study is the targeting of women from marginalised backgrounds who have shown agency and the courage to raise their voices against the



deeply entrenched patriarchy. The inability of the government to sensitise men while pushing for women's empowerment has endan-

gered many women in leadership roles. One of the easiest ways to show the woman her place has been to brand her as a witch. Of the 44 per cent of women who faced

accusations of witchcraft from castes other than their own, the majority were from the upper caste. Nirantar found that most women preferred not to report this mental and physical assault as they were afraid it would lead to increased violence, greater social ostracisation and humiliation. They also lacked trust in the sincerity and efficacy of law enforcement agencies. The inability to provide timely justice can be fatal was found by Action Aid Association. The NGO, which detailed 102 case studies from Odisha's 12 districts reporting maximum witch-hunting incidents in 2021, found that despite the law, more than 30 per cent of the total cases had led to the death of the

woman branded as a witch. Chhnuti Mahto, the firebrand social activist from Jharkhand, who received the Padma Shri in 2021 for her role in rescuing over 100 women accused of witchcraft, knows the pain because she too, was targeted as a witch. She survived and embarked on a mission to help others. But why is the onus only on survivors? NCRB data shows that since 2000, over 2,500 women have been killed for being witches. How many more women need to die before action against such inhuman acts is given the priority it deserves?

China approves world's largest dam over Brahmaputra river

China has approved the construction of the world's largest dam, stated to be the planet's biggest infra project costing USD 1.37 billion, on the Brahmaputra River in Tibet close to the Indian border, raising concerns in riparian states — India and Bangladesh. The Chinese government has approved the construction of a hydropower project in the lower reaches of the Yarlung Zangbo River, the Tibetan name for the

Brahmaputra, according to an official statement quoted by state-run Xinhua news agency on Wednesday. The dam is to be built at a huge gorge in the Himalayan reaches where the Brahmaputra river makes a huge U-turn to flow into Arunachal Pradesh and then to Bangladesh. The total investment in the dam could exceed one trillion yuan (USD 137 billion), which would dwarf any other single infrastructure project on the planet including China's own

Three Gorges Dam, regarded as the largest in the world, the Hong Kong-based South China Morning Post reported on Thursday. China has already Operationalised the USD 1.5 billion Zam Hydropower Station, the largest in Tibet in 2015. The Brahmaputra dam was part of the 14th Five-Year Plan (2021-2025) and National Economic and Social Development and the Long-Range Objectives Through the

Year 2035 adopted by Plenum, a key policy body of the ruling Communist Party of China (CPC) in 2020. Concerns arose in India as the dam besides empowering China to control the water flow, the size and scale of it could also enable Beijing to release large amounts of water flooding border areas in times of hostilities. India too is building a dam over Brahmaputra in Arunachal Pradesh. India and China established the Expert Level Mechanism (ELM) in 2006 to discuss various issues related to trans-border rivers under which China

provides India with hydrological information on the Brahmaputra river and Sutlej river during the flood seasons. Data sharing of trans-border rivers figured in the talks between India, China Special Representatives (SRs) for border question, NSA Ajit Doval and Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi, held here on December 18. The SRs "provided positive directions for cross-border cooperation and exchanges" including data sharing on trans-border rivers, a statement by the Ministry of External Affairs said.

The Brahmaputra Dam presents enormous engineering challenges as the project site is located along a tectonic plate boundary where earthquakes occur. The Tibetan plateau, regarded as the roof of the world, frequently experiences earthquakes as it is located over the tectonic plates.

The official statement on Wednesday sought to allay concerns about earthquakes, saying that the hydropower project is safe and prioritises ecological protection. Through extensive geological explorations and technical advancements, a solid foundation has been laid for the science-based, secure, and high-quality development of the project, it said.

RBI sets up eight-member panel on ethical use of AI

The Reserve Bank on Thursday announced the setting up of an eight-member committee to develop a framework for responsible and ethical enablement of artificial intelligence (FREE-AI) in the financial sector.

Headed by IIT Bombay professor Pushpak Bhattacharyya (Department of Computer Science and Engineering), the panel will assess the current level of adoption of AI in financial services, globally as well as in India.

It will also review regulatory and supervisory approaches on AI with focus on the financial sector globally. The panel will also identify potential risks associated



with AI, if any, and recommend an evaluation, mitigation and monitoring framework and consequent compliance requirements for financial institutions,

including banks, NBFCs, FinTechs, PSOs, etc. The committee will recommend a framework including governance aspects for responsible, ethical

adoption of AI models / applications in the Indian financial sector, the RBI said. The other members of the panel are: Debjani Ghosh (Independent Director,

Reserve Bank Innovation Hub); Balaraman Ravindran (Professor and Head, Wadhvani School of Data Science and AI, IIT Madras), Abhishek Singh (Additional Secretary; Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology), Rahul Matthan (Partner, Trilegal); Anjali Rathor (Group Head and Chief Digital Experience Officer, HDFC Bank); Sree Hari Nagaralu (Head of Security AI Research, Microsoft India); and Suvendu Pati (CGM, FinTech Department, RBI). The Committee will submit its report within six months from the date of its first meeting, the RBI said. The central bank had made the announcement regarding the panel in its December monetary policy meeting.

Rupee plunges 12 paise to close at 85.27 against US dollar

The rupee stayed weak for the third straight session and fell 12 paise to settle at a fresh all-time low of 85.27 (provisional) against the US dollar on Thursday, amid a strong greenback and rising crude oil prices. Forex traders said, increased month-end as well as year-end dollar demand from importers and fear of an aggressive import tariff by the Donald Trump administration lifted the American currency. At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened weak at 85.23 and touched the lowest-ever level of 85.28 against the greenback during intraday trade. The unit finally ended the session at its lifetime low closing level of 85.27 (provisional) against the dollar, registering a loss of 12 paise from its previous close. The rupee fell 4 paise to settle



at 85.15 against the US dollar on Tuesday, a day after losing 9 paise on Monday. The forex market was closed on Wednesday for Christmas. According to Anuj Choudhary, Research Analyst at Mirae Asset Sharekhan, the rupee fell to a fresh all-time low on strong dollar and rising US treasury yields that are at the highest levels in seven months. Also, he said the surge in crude oil prices, month-end/year-end dollar demand and FII outflows may also weigh on the rupee.

“However, any intervention by the RBI may support the rupee at lower levels. Traders may take cues from weekly unemployment claims data from the US. USD-INR spot price is expected to trade in a range of 85.10 to 85.45,” Choudhary added. Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading marginally lower by 0.09 per cent but remained elevated at 107.93, amid soaring US Treasury yields (4.61 per cent) and the fear of delayed interest rate cuts by the US Federal Reserve. Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, rose 0.56 per cent to USD 73.99 per barrel in futures trade. In the domestic equity market, the 30-share BSE Sensex closed almost flat at 78,472.48 points, while Nifty inched up 22.55 points, or 0.10 per cent to close at 23,750.20 points.

West Bengal's 2024 economy: Story of growth amid challenges

West Bengal's economic narrative in 2024 was one of striking contrasts - steady growth and fresh investments juxtaposed with fiscal concerns and a worrying trend of industry flight from a perceptively “non-investor friendly” state. The state demonstrated a significant economic expansion outlook, with its Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) projected to surge by 10.5 per cent in the 2024-25 fiscal, significantly outpacing the national average of 7.32 per cent and reinforcing its position as the fourth-largest economy in India, according to state industries minister Shashi Panja. The manufacturing sector played a crucial role in this upward trajectory during the year, achieving a robust growth rate of 7.8 per cent, exceeding the national average. This growth was further propelled by substantial investments across various sectors. Infosys inaugurated a Rs 426 crore development centre, spread over 3,20,000 sq ft, in New Town. It is set to house over 4,000 employees and focus on cloud computing and digital services. Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, calling it “A New Year gift to



West Bengal”, expressed hope for increased IT investments in the state. The manufacturing sector's strong performance was underscored by the inauguration of two major projects with investments totalling Rs 2,100 crore - Shyam Steel's integrated steel facility and Dhunseri Poly Films venture. These projects are expected to create over 5,000 jobs, providing a significant boost to the state's industrial health. The state government is developing a 200-acre Silicon Valley project in New Town, aiming to attract Rs 27,000 crore in investments and create 75,000 jobs, positioning Bengal as a key IT hub. In terms of data infrastructure, NTT completed the first phase of

its data centre campus in Kolkata which began operations in March 2024, with an initial capacity of 6 mw and a potential expansion of up to 25 mw. CtrlS Datacenters also announced an investment of Rs 2,200 crore (about USD 264 million) to develop a data centre in Kolkata, to be implemented in four phases, with the first phase, a 16 mw facility, expected to go live shortly. The Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector also displayed resilience, with the state looking to exceed its credit target of Rs 1.53 lakh crore for the fiscal year 2024-25, building upon the previous year's achievement of Rs 1.42 lakh crore and representing a 7.7 per cent increase.

New manufacturing golden age for India beckons: Tata Sons chief to staff

With global supply chains continuing to shift in India's favour as the world's largest businesses strike a new balance between resilience and efficiency, manufacturing has the potential to transform the country's economy, Tata Sons Chairman N Chandrasekaran said on Thursday. In his New Year message to employees of the salt-to-software conglomerate, Chandrasekaran termed it as “a new manufacturing golden age for India” and said he was looking ahead to 2025 “with a sense of hope and optimism” after 2024, a year marked by the loss of Tata Group Chairman Emeritus Ratan Tata. “While AI-led breakthroughs in healthcare and mobility can help the whole of humanity, manufacturing has the potential to transform our economy in India,” he wrote. Elaborating, he said, “Global supply chains continue to shift in India's favour as the world's largest businesses strike a new balance between resilience and efficiency. What might have seemed like a short-term reaction to the pandemic has proved much more enduring.” Amid relentless geopolitical instability, Chandrasekaran said, “The equation has tilted

firmly toward resilience and India, with our vast talent pool and growing manufacturing capacity, is poised to benefit.” Reiterating Tata Group's plans to create 5 lakh manufacturing jobs over the next half decade, he said these will come in part from investments in facilities across India's “factories and projects that will produce batteries, semiconductors, electric vehicles, solar equipment and other critical hardware destined to play a central role in the economy of tomorrow”. He said ground-breaking ceremonies and construction began at over seven new manufacturing plants, including India's first semiconductor fab in Dholera, Gujarat, and a brand new semiconductor OSAT plant in Assam. “There is the electronics assembly plant in Narasapura, Karnataka, an automotive plant in Panapakkam, Tamil Nadu, and new MRO facilities in Bengaluru, Karnataka,” Chandrasekaran said. He further said, “We also have new battery cell manufacturing factories in Sanand, Gujarat, and in Somerset, UK. We inaugurated the C295 final assembly line (FAL) in Vadodra, Gujarat, and began solar module production in Tirunelveli, Tamil Nadu.”

AI, machine learning to help Indian pharma industry to pivot on innovation

As technological advancements like AI, machine learning and precision medicine revolutionise drug discovery, manufacturing and patient care, Indian pharmaceutical industry is set for a ‘profound transformation’ in 2025 with innovation, wider global access and improvement in quality becoming key themes for the future. The industry, which is expected to grow nearly twofold to around USD 130 billion in size by 2030, is looking to take advantage of conducive policies, demographic and digital talent, in making India play a pivotal role in advancing global health for all. Currently accounting for around 20 per cent of the overall generic drug sales globally, the Indian pharma industry is focussing on research excellence and innovation in order to position the country as a global hub for high-quality,

affordable pharmaceuticals. “The Indian pharma market is expected to move up to USD 120-130 billion by 2030 from the current size of USD 58 billion. Initiatives in terms of quality, innovation and wider global reach will help the Indian pharma sector to realise the potential,” according to Indian Pharmaceutical Alliance (IPA) Secretary General Sudarshan Jain. Given the conducive policies and the advantage of demographic and digital talent, India will play a pivotal role in advancing global health for all in years to come, he added. IPA represents 23 leading research-based Indian pharmaceutical companies like Sun Pharma, Cipla, and Dr Reddy's Laboratories, among others. Jain said innovation will continue to be a major focus for the industry going forward. He noted that the government is expected to soon announce the operational details of the Promotion of Research & Innovation Programme which would also spur innovation. Elaborating on the initiatives lined up in the private sector, he said that leading companies are increasing their focus on specialty portfolios and diversifying into higher-value drugs. “Additionally, the industry is set to make notable progress

in areas such as CAR-T cell therapy, mRNA vaccines, and the development of complex molecules, which hold immense potential for driving future growth,” Jain said. Besides, the patent expiries of blockbuster biologics by 2025 present a significant growth avenue in the global biosimilars market, he stated. Similarly, Organisation of Pharmaceutical Producers of India (OPPI) Director General Anil Matai said the industry is set for a profound transformation in 2025. Technological advancements like AI, machine learning and precision medicine are set to revolutionise drug discovery, manufacturing and patient care, he said. OPPI represents research-based pharmaceutical companies, including AstraZeneca, Novartis and Merck, in India. Besides, strengthened regulatory frameworks will enable the swift adoption of innovative therapies while prioritising patient safety, Matai said. “A focus on research excellence and innovation will position India as a global hub for high-quality, affordable pharmaceuticals. Collaboration between policymakers, academia and industry stakeholders will address unmet medical needs, particularly in underserved regions,” he stated.

Branded hotels to log 13 to 14 per cent growth: Report

Gold rises ₹250 to ₹78,850 per 10 grams, silver climbs ₹300

Gold prices increased Rs 250 to Rs 78,850 per 10 grams in the national capital on Thursday amid a firm global trend, according to the All India Sarafa Association. The yellow metal had settled at Rs 78,600 per 10 grams on Tuesday. Silver extended its rally for the third straight session by climbing Rs 300 to Rs 90,800 per kg on Thursday. The metal had ended at Rs 90,500 per kg in the previous close. The commodities market was closed on Wednesday on the occasion of Christmas.

The price of 99.5 per cent purity advanced Rs 250 to Rs 78,450 per 10 grams from the previous close of Rs 78,200 per 10 grams. Traders attributed the climb in gold prices to firm trends in the overseas markets which aided in bullion prices. In futures trade on the Multi Commodity Exchange (MCX), gold contracts for February delivery advanced Rs 442 or 0.58 per cent to Rs 76,712 per 10 grams. “Gold prices edged higher on Thursday, supported by a slightly weaker dollar as markets resumed trading post-Christmas.

CCPA fines three coaching institutes for misleading UPSC exam claims

The Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) has imposed penalties totalling Rs 15 lakh on three coaching institutes for making misleading advertisements about their success rates in civil services examinations, the government said on Thursday. Vajirao & Reddy Institute and StudyIQ IAS were each fined Rs 700,000, while Edge IAS was penalised Rs 100,000 for deceptive claims regarding their results in the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) Civil Services Examinations of 2022 and

2023, an official statement said. The CCPA, led by Chief Commissioner Nidhi Khare, found that the institutes deliberately concealed that most of their successful candidates had only enrolled in Interview Guidance Programs, creating a misleading impression about the effectiveness of their other courses. Vajirao & Reddy Institute claimed “617 selections out of 933” in the 2022 examination, while StudyIQ IAS advertised “120+ selections” in 2023. Investigations revealed that the majority of successful candidates at both institutes had only taken interview preparation courses. StudyIQ

IAS was also unable to substantiate its “Success Pakka Offer” and “Selection Pakka Offer” promotions, failing to provide enrolment forms and fee receipts for its claimed successful candidates. The institute advertised over 60 courses but did not disclose that its Interview Guidance Programme, which most successful candidates took, was not among the advertised offerings. The consumer protection body has issued 45 notices to various coaching institutes for misleading advertisements and has collected total penalties of Rs 71.6 lakh from 22 institutes to date.

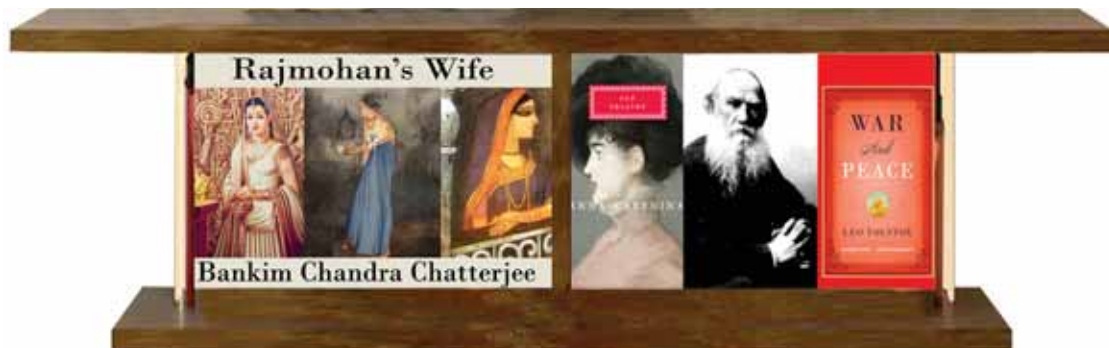

2025 ushers in lot of hope in literary world

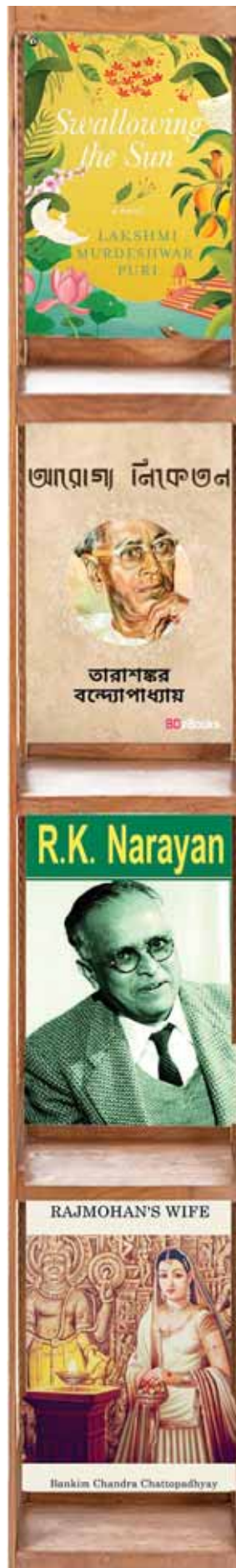
EXPLORING THE TIMELESS CHARM OF NOVELS, THEIR UNIQUE STORYTELLING AND THE PROMISING VOICES SHAPING INDIA'S LITERARY LANDSCAPE IN 2024, SAYS **KUMAR CHELLAPPAN**



It is not without reason that the word novel has been assigned two meanings. Although the English language can often be amusing with its many words having multiple meanings, the term novel has a significant connection to its different interpretations. The dictionary defines novel as "an invented prose narrative that is usually long and complex and deals especially with human experience through a usually connected sequence of events." The word also has another meaning - something that is new, original, and never seen, used, or even thought of before. A novel, as a literary form, tells a story and features multiple characters interconnected through a sequence of events. Each novel offers a new, fresh and unprecedented experience. What makes a novel truly special is its readability and the ease with which it allows readers to identify with the characters it presents. Let us reflect on the novels of the past. Timeless classics like *War and Peace*, *Anna Karenina* (Leo Tolstoy), *The Mother* (Maxim Gorky), *Gone with the Wind* (Margaret Mitchell), *The Far Pavilions* (M. M. Kaye), and *Crime and Punishment* (Fyodor Dostoevsky) continue to resonate with readers. These masterpieces transport us to a different world through their narrative, characters, and the time and space they depict. It is rare to encounter someone who feels these novels fall short of their expectations. The first novel to grace bookshelves in India was *Rajmohan's Wife* by Bankimchandra Chatterjee in 1864. This makes the novel as a literary genre relatively new in this region. India has produced remarkable writers like *Tarasankar*

Bandyopadhyay, whose works include *Ganadevata* and *Arogya Niketan*, the latter being particularly popular. *Bankimchandra Chatterjee's Anandamath* (1882), set against the backdrop of the *Great Bengal Famine of 1770*, is widely regarded as the finest novel ever written in the subcontinent. During my school days, our language teacher, *P. U. Madhavan*, emphasised the importance of reading these classics. He was our gateway to the world of literature. Years later, at university, we studied a prose piece by *A. J. Cronin*, the renowned Scottish novelist, about the art of writing a novel. *Cronin* often told his wife that he would write a novel loved by all. During a period of recovery from illness, *Cronin* wrote *Hatter's Castle*, a landmark in English literature. He abandoned his medical career to pursue writing full-time. *Cronin's* success, along with that of other novelists, lies in their ability to tell compelling stories. *Ponniyin Selvan* (Son of Ponnai) by *Kalki Krishnamurthy*, for instance, is based on the life of *Arulmozhivarman*, a 10th-century *Chola prince*. Reading this book is akin to watching a film projected on a Vistarama screen, the most advanced film projection system I've ever seen. Novels, poems and stories resemble rivers and streams flowing from mountains, meandering through valleys, plains and plateaus. A well-written novel provides the sensation of sailing smoothly down a serene river. Conversely, a poorly written one feels like driving on a pothole-filled road. Unfortunately, contemporary Indian literature in English often lacks the quality we once enjoyed with authors like *R. K. Narayan*, *Raja Rao* and *Shobhaa De*.

These authors wrote straight from the heart. Today, however, publishers often dictate the content to maximise sales. In India, literary works that criticise certain religions or spiritual figures tend to attract significant attention and awards. While we lack the likes of *Mitchell*, *Tolstoy* and *Kaye*, a few noteworthy works of fiction emerged in 2024, offering hope for the novel genre. *Swallowing the Sun*, the debut novel by *Lakshmi Murdeshwar Puri*, was a breath of fresh air. *Puri* masterfully narrates India's freedom struggle and the emancipation of women from societal constraints. The protagonist, *Malati*, guides readers through a vivid journey across the Konkan region and Bombay, where she and her sister *Kamala* break into a male-dominated world. Thrilling and vibrant, *Swallowing the Sun* feels like a long-awaited monsoon, refreshing and full of intensity. Another standout author is *Harinder S. Sikka*, a former Indian Navy commander known for *Gobind*, *Vichhoda* and *Calling Sehmat*. Drawing on his naval experiences, *Sikka* crafts authentic stories, earning him the title of "India's Jeffrey Archer." Readers eagerly await more from writers like *Puri* and *Sikka*, who draw inspiration from real life. As Malayalam literary rebel *Keshava Dev* once said, "You will understand life only if you learn how to live. That experience will guide you in writing novels and stories. No university can teach you this." Thank you, *Lakshmi Puri* and *Harinder S. Sikka*, for giving us hope. And thank you, 2024, for these promising voices in literature.

Top order hepls Australia score 311/6, Bumrah keeps battle alive

Jasprit Bumrah's knack of coming up with magic deliveries in crunch situations kept India alive after Australia's top-order, headed by teen debutant Sam Konstas' stroke-filled half-century, guided the hosts to 311 for 6 on the opening day of the fourth Test here on Thursday.

If Konstas' audacious 60 off 65 balls enthralled the near sell-out crowd of over 80,000 at the MCG during a humid morning session, Bumrah's (3/75 in 21 overs) deception of length to dismiss Travis Head (0) also had its takers as chants of 'Boom, Boom, B o o o o m r a a a a a h' reverberated through the stands.

Coming into the Test with back-to-back hundreds, Head couldn't judge the length of a Bumrah delivery that was pitched slightly fuller than what the batter expected. He shouldered his arms trusting the bounce but the 66.2 overs old Kookaburra nipped back to clip the off-bail.

In the next over, he removed an out-of-form Mitchell Marsh (4), having got Usman Khawaja (57 off 121 balls)

with the half-tracker in the post-lunch session. The first two sessions, however, belonged to Australia with senior players Khawaja, Marnus Labuschagne (72 off 145 balls) and Steve Smith (68 batting, 111 balls) scoring half-centuries.

The final session was all about Bumrah magic. The Indian spearhead didn't let the hosts completely walk away with the game which they threatened to do at one stage.

He now has 24 wickets in the series. With Mohammed Siraj (0/69 in 15 overs) off-colour, Bumrah didn't have much support save off-spinner Washington Sundar (1/37 in 12 overs), who bowled a containing line.

Akash Deep (1/59 in 19 overs) though got Alex Carey with the second new ball at the fag end of the day. Even Ravindra Jadeja (1/54 in 14 overs) leaked runs despite getting Konstas out and Nitish Reddy, the batting all-rounder, was only used before the second new ball was taken.

'Sam Jams at the G'

The morning was owned by the precocious 19-year-old



from New South Wales. Konstas didn't show any nerves during his scintillating knock, which comprised of two sixes off Bumrah. He also didn't mind a good scrap with India's superstar Virat Kohli, whose shoulder brush with the 19-year-old led to a brief confrontation. In fact, Bumrah was hit for a six for the first time in a Test since Cameron Green hit him for one back in 2021. The gap between Konstas' first six, which was a lap scoop, and the one that Green hit three years ago was 4000 legal Test match deliveries. After a conventional lap scoop for maximum, Konstas also hit a reverse lap scoop towards third man for another boundary. The second six was pummelled over mid-on. The way he attacked the Indian bowling with gusto gave his veteran opening partner Khawaja a chance to get back to form with a patient half-century.

But Khawaja would be really annoyed with himself as he couldn't time a pull shot off a Bumrah half-tracker, which went straight into KL Rahul's hands in the post-lunch session.

The duo added 89 runs in such quick time that Labuschagne and last match's centurion Smith didn't need to show any urgency. For Konstas, it all began with a few play and misses off Bumrah's opening over but as soon as the teenager got his first couple of runs, things changed dramatically.

The fearlessness of youth stood out on the big stage as Konstas pulled off the lap-scoop against Bumrah before smashing him over mid-on for another maximum.

The fans and experts alike were forced to think the last time Bumrah (1/50 in 15 overs) was hit for two sixes in his first spell of a Test match. They couldn't because it never happened in a first spell.

The stump mic caught Bumrah saying "Beginner's Luck" but Konstas seemed to have enough wares to answer his probing queries. And it was laced with a lot of spunk as he got into a verbal duel

with Kohli after their shoulders brushed while crossing each other. He often shuffled towards leg-stump to make room and on one occasion, crunched Bumrah past cover. Mohammed Siraj was welcomed into the attack with a loud round of boos as he sledged the youngster due to his unconventional hitting style.

In all, Konstas hit six fours apart from the two maximums. Only Akash bowled a good channel among the pacers as Siraj was guilty of going too full or too short.

As Australia scored at more than a fair clip, skipper Rohit Sharma had to introduce Ravindra Jadeja (1/33 in 11 overs) in the 16th over to at least stem the flow of runs before it went out of hand. The decision did pay dividends as the seasoned spinner got an arm ball to skid through with the angle to trap Konstas in front. Khawaja and Labuschagne then added 65 for the second wicket with the Pakistan-born opener hitting Akash for a couple of boundaries to complete his first fifty of the series.



Indian women on course for clean sweep against West Indies

India would aim to push their boundaries in the batting department when they face a down-and-out West Indies in the third and final Women's ODI here on Friday.

Following another series loss against the mighty Australia, India have been able to dominate the West Indies in home conditions.

What has stood out is their ability to put scores in excess of 300 consistently in the series, something they must do against the likes of Australia to get themselves out of the doldrums.

Pratika Rawal, who has been opening the innings alongside Smriti Mandhana, did not set the stage on fire in her maiden international appearance but improved her play considerably in the second ODI to raise hopes for the future.

The Delhi-based cricketer was able to clear the ropes once, which is expected considering she has replaced Shafali Verma in the team.

Harleen Deol has been around for a long time but it was only in the previous game that she was able to record her maiden ODI hundred. She stuck at a 100 plus strike rate batting at number three and she would like to carry the momentum in the final game of the series.

Skipper Harmanpreet Kaur has looked good since regaining full fitness but is yet to get a big knock. With series in the bag, the skipper will have another reason to play freely and get a substantial knock under her belt.

On the bowling front, Renuka Thakur has once again led the pace attack well with the young Titas Sadhu also chipping in with the wickets.

Leg-spinner Priya Mishra has impressed in her fledgling career and would be eyeing another productive outing.

With the game being a dead rubber, India can also afford to test a few fringe players including Tanuja Kanwar

and Tejal Hasanbis. West Indies will need to pull something out of the bag to upset India. Having conceded 300 plus run in both the games, the Hayley Matthews-led side needs to improve on all fronts.

Matthews is the lone West Indies batter who has made an impact. That will need to change on Friday.

United States is easier said than done, given the proficiency of the trio in quick chess. The participants list is a virtually who's who of the chess world and the only big name missing is D Gukesh, who withdrew after winning an exhausting world championship match against Ding Liren of China just a

couple of weeks back in Singapore. From India, much can be expected from R Praggnanandhaa as well. He is well rested and must be looking for this event to end the year on a high note.

Apart from Erigaise and Praggnanandhaa, Raunak Sadhwani and Aravindh Chithambaram are the other two Indians to take note of in the open section.

In the women's section, Humpy will start yet again as favourite amongst the Indians. R Vaishali and Divya Deshmukh are the two emerging stars and have been doing pretty well in the last one year.

Vaishali, in fact, had taken the chess world by surprise by qualifying for the Women's Candidates in 2023.



Andy Pycroft completes 100 Tests as match referee

Former Zimbabwe captain Andy Pycroft on Thursday became only the fourth official in the history of men's Test cricket to complete 100 games as a match referee with the Boxing Day contest between India and Australia that began here on Thursday.

The exclusive list is led by former Sri Lanka player Ranjan Madugalle as the most experienced match referee with 225 Tests, followed by New Zealand's Jeff Crowe (125) and England's Chris Broad (123). The 68-year-old Pycroft played three Tests and 20 ODIs for Zimbabwe from 1983-1992.

"Pycroft, who has also officiated in 238 men's ODIs, 174 men's T20Is and 21 women's T20Is since 2009, said he has enjoyed every minute of the journey to 100 matches as a match referee," the ICC said on its website.

Pycroft said touching the mark is a great honour and he is thankful to have been afforded the opportunity to officiate all over the world, "embracing different cultures."

"It has been a rewarding journey and I have treasured every moment of it," he added.

Virat Kohli fined 20 per cent match fees for altercation with Sam Konstas

Virat Kohli and Australian youngster Sam Konstas were on Thursday involved in a physical altercation because of which the Indian superstar was fined 20 per cent of his match fee and handed a demerit point even though it was played down as an accidental bump by the 19-year-old debutant.

The brief showdown took place after the 10th over of the Australian innings on the opening day of the fourth Test here when the players were crossing over. Kohli and Konstas bumped shoulders while moving across the pitch in the face off that was initiated by the travelling star.

Kohli was eventually charged with breaching Level 1 of the ICC Code of Conduct by on-field umpires Joel Wilson and Michael Gough, third umpire Sharfuddoula Ibne Shahid and fourth umpire Shawn Craig.

He accepted the sanctions proposed by match referee Andy Pycroft at the end of day's play. "Virat Kohli has been fined 20

percent of his match fee and awarded one demerit point for breaching Level 1 of the ICC Code of Conduct," the ICC said in a statement.

"No formal hearing was needed as Kohli accepted the sanctions proposed by Match Referee Andy Pycroft," it added.

After the physical contact, both players quickly turned around to glance at each other and engage in a heated exchange of words before Konstas' teammate Usman Khawaja stepped in to separate them. The on-field umpires also had a word with the two and things cooled down rather quickly.

Speaking to reporters after stumps, Konstas said Kohli bumped into him but it wasn't deliberate.

"I was just doing my gloves and I think he accidentally bumped me. I think that's just cricket and can happen with tension," said the teenager.

"I think the emotions got to both of us," Konstas had told 'Channel 7' during the second session. The ICC's Code of Conduct states



that "any form of inappropriate physical contact is prohibited in cricket. Without limitation, players will breach this regulation if they deliberately, recklessly and/or negligently walk or run into or shoulder another player or umpire". Kohli's match fee for the game was to be Rs 15 lakh but that amount would be reduced to Rs 12 lakh owing to the fine. This is the first demerit point that Kohli has logged since 2019. Four demerit points over a period of two years

lead to a suspension of one Test. Konstas, who was batting on 27 at the time, went on to hit Jasprit Bumrah for two boundaries and a six in the next over. The teenager scored a stunning fifty on debut before Ravindra Jadeja trapped him leg before wicket.

India assistant coach Abhishek Nayar, who addressed the media in the end-of-day press conference, also brushed aside the incident as nothing big.

"When you play a game, there will be emotions but it is not as big as it seems. I wasn't aware of what happened and don't know what was said," he said in response to queries.

Kohli criticised for his actions. Konstas might have dismissed it as routine but former Australian skipper Ricky Ponting blamed Kohli for instigating the exchange. He went to the extent of saying that Kohli could face disciplinary action for it.

"Have a look where Virat walks. Virat's walked one whole pitch over to his right and instigated that confrontation. No doubt in my mind whatsoever," Ponting

said on Channel 7 while watching the replay of the incident. "I have no doubt that the umpires and the referee will have a good look at that. Fielders should be nowhere near the batsman at that stage."

"It looked to me that Konstas looked up really late, wouldn't even know anyone is in front of him. That man on-screen there (Kohli) might have a few questions to answer," Ponting added.

Former India head coach Ravi Shastri, who was at the helm during Kohli's captaincy, said the run-in was unnecessary.

"There is a line and you don't want to overstep that line. That's unnecessary, totally unnecessary. You don't want to see that. You know Virat is a senior player, he has been captain of the side," he said on 'Fox Sports'.

"He will have his own explanations for this but it's something you don't want to see. One person who would be watching, his eyes locked into the proceedings is Andy Pycroft," he added.
