



War of words follow Manmohan Singh

A political row has erupted between the Bharatiya Janata Party-led Centre and Congress-led Opposition parties over a memorial for the former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh who was cremated with full State honours on Saturday in the presence of top dignitaries from India and abroad.

While the Home Ministry claimed to assure the late PM's family in a communication for a memorial in due course, the Congress, Samajwadi Party (SP) and Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) demanded that the last rites

should have been performed at a designated place where the Manmohan Singh's memorial could have been developed. Singh, 92, died on the night of December 26.

Simultaneously former President late Pranab Mukherjee's daughter Sharmistha too cried foul on the part of the grand old party which failed to honour the rights of Mukherjee who spent his entire life serving the Congress.

The Congress alleged that the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) was "deliberately insulting" the first Sikh PM of the country by not designating a place for his funeral and memorial. While Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge urged

Prime Minister Narendra Modi to have Singh's funeral at a place where his memorial can be built, SP chief Akhilesh Yadav and BSP president Mayawati urged the Central government to avoid any political controversy over the funeral and memorial of former prime minister Manmohan Singh. Demands for giving Singh a Bharat Ratna, the highest civilian award, were also raised during the last ritual procession of Manmohan Singh.

"The tradition of honouring the country's former Prime Ministers must be upheld. There is no need for politics on this issue nor should there be any. Dr. Manmohan Singh's memorial should be constructed at

Rajghat. The BJP should refrain from presenting an inappropriate example of its narrow-minded thinking. History will never forgive them for this negative approach," he said.

BSP president Mayawati said the wishes of Singh's family should be respected. "The Central government should ensure that the funeral and memorial of Dr Manmohan Singh, the country's first Sikh prime minister, are conducted at a location preferred by his family. No politics should be done on this matter and the government must honour the sentiments of Singh's family and the Sikh community."

Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) also criticised the BJP for not allocating space within the Rajghat complex for the last rites of former prime minister Manmohan Singh and said that it "reflects poorly on India globally". AAP called on the BJP to clarify its stance and demanded an apology to Singh's family and the Sikh community. "Manmohan Singh, a global icon and India's only Sikh Prime Minister, was denied even 1,000 square yards of land for his cremation and memorial at Rajghat. Almost all former Prime Ministers were cremated there, but the BJP government refused this basic courtesy to Singh," said AAP National Convenor Arvind Kejriwal.

AAP Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh accused the BJP of disrespecting the Sikh community and questioned the rationale behind the decision. In a statement, the Ministry of Home Affairs assured that a place would be allocated for Singh's memorial and that his family and Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge had been informed. BJP President and Union Minister JP Nadda attacked Congress and the Gandhi family for getting into petty politics when the entire nation mourns the demise of Dr. Manmohan Singh.

Delhi LG orders high-level inquiry into AAP's ₹2,100 dole for women

In a move that may once again rattle Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) convener Arvind Kejriwal, and his party ahead of the upcoming assembly polls, Delhi Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena ordered a high-level inquiry into the AAP led Delhi government's proposed Mukhyamantri Mahila Samman Yojana in which AAP's poll promise of Rs 2,100 to women if elected. The Lieutenant Governor also ordered that the Chief Secretary of the Delhi Government may bring the matter to the knowledge of the Election Commission of India (ECI) through the chief electoral office given that such canvassing is happening ahead of the election.

The Lieutenant Governor's order came in the wake of a representation from a former East Delhi Congress MP and the party's proposed opponent against former Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal from the New Delhi Assembly constituency, Sandeep Dikshit, who made serious allegations against the AAP-led Delhi government and Kejriwal.



"This has reference to representation dated 25.12.2024 received from Sh. Sandeep Dikshit... he has alleged that the Chief Minister of Delhi and Sh Arvind Kejriwal have been announcing that Delhi Government is going to give every female in Delhi (above the age of 18 years) an amount of Rs 1000 per month... If AAP is elected back in the 2025 Vidhan Sabha elections, they will raise the amount to Rs 2100..." the communication from the LG's Principal Secretary to Chief Secretary Dharmendra and Delhi Police Commissioner Sanjay Arora stated.

The communiqué read, "Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor has desired the Chief Secretary to get an inquiry conducted through Divisional Commissioner in the matter of collection of personal details and forms by non-government people."

"Accordingly, Further, Commissioner of Police may direct the field officers to take action as per law against the person who is breaching the privacy of gullible citizens by collecting their personal details in garb of giving benefits. DCP's may be advised to take action against private individuals organizing camps for fraudulent enrollment of Government Schemes," the Lieutenant Governor's office said. Meanwhile, the AAP, in response, has alleged that the inquiry came not from the Delhi Lieutenant Governor but from the "office" of BJP leader Amit Shah. Addressing a press conference, AAP convener Arvind Kejriwal also rubbished an order by LG for enquiry into collection of details of women through registration under the scheme as "fake," saying the monetary promise was a poll announcement.

Google maps misguides again: two injured in car accident

In yet another incident of Google Maps leading travelers astray, a car accident occurred on an under-construction highway in Hathras district, leaving two people injured. The mishap took place in the Hathras Junction police station area near Vahanpur. According to the police, Bareilly residents Vimlesh Srivastava and Kushal Kumar were traveling to Mathura using Google Maps for navigation. Late at night, after passing through Sikandra Rao, they followed directions onto the under-construction Mathura-Bareilly Highway. Due to the absence of reflective boards warning about roadblocks, their car collided with a heap of stones and soil, causing significant damage. The injured duo promptly informed the police, who arrived at the scene, cleared the car from the highway, and rushed the victims to a hospital for treatment. This is not the first time Google Maps has caused inconvenience or accidents. Recently, a family from



Meerut endured hours of distress while trying to reach Saharanpur from Haridwar at night. Vinod Kumar, a resident of Meerut's Shastri Nagar, was traveling with his wife and son. Initially, their journey via Google Maps was smooth until they reached Bhagwanpur. The app then suggested a shortcut through a link road to Saharanpur. About 10 kilometers into this route, they encountered a dry but rocky stream, making it impossible to proceed. The app redirected them to another route, leading to hours of wandering in forested areas. Eventually, they managed to contact a

relative near Bihari Garh, who guided them to safety. The family reached their destination close to midnight, heaving a sigh of relief. Last month, Google Maps was blamed for a major accident in Bareilly when it directed a car onto an incomplete bridge, resulting in three friends falling off and sustaining severe injuries. Such incidents highlight the risks of relying solely on digital navigation systems without verifying local conditions. Authorities and travelers are urged to exercise caution, especially on unfamiliar or under-construction routes.

Highest single-day December rainfall in 101 years

Delhiites experienced an overcast and chilly day after the city recorded the highest single-day December rainfall in 101 years. The city received 41.2 mm of rain between 8.30 am on Friday and 8.30 am on Saturday, marking the highest single-day December rainfall in 101 years.

According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), the Capital had last recorded the highest-ever rainfall on a single day in the month on December 3, 1923, at 75.7 mm. While rain in December is not unusual, it is usually light. As per IMD data, Delhi usually sees 8 mm of rain during the month over half a day. The rain in the city over the past 24 hours is over five times that. The rains also made December 2024 the fifth-highest in terms of monthly rainfall since records began in 1901. In December 2024, Delhi logged 42.8 mm, the highest in the last 27 years when 71.8 mm of rain was seen in the month.

"The cumulative 24-hour rainfall ending at 8.30am today is the second-highest since 1901 at Safdarjung. December's monthly rainfall is now the fifth-highest. The 24-



hour cumulative rainfall refers to the precipitation recorded over the past 24 hours ending at 8.30am IST on the given date," the IMD official explained. The rainfall largely attributed to an active western disturbance interacting with easterly winds, transformed the usual dry chill of December into an anomaly. "The interaction between a very active western disturbance and a cyclonic circulation on the east, along with a few other factors, has brought about this unusual weather. November and December are the two driest months in Delhi. During these months, it is usually a western disturbance that brings rain to the capital. It is the different weather systems clashing that lead to heavy downpours," an

IMD scientist said. "Another western disturbance is expected around January 1, but that may not bring rain," IMD further explained. The IMD has issued a yellow alert for Delhi, predicting more showers for Sunday in the capital, Noida, Gurugram and other places in the national capital region. The weather department has forecast very dense fog for Sunday, with the maximum and minimum temperatures expected to settle at 17 and 9 degrees Celsius, respectively

Heavy rainfall coupled with gusty winds continued to lash Delhi in the early hours of Saturday. Several areas, including Palam, Safdarjung, Lodi Road, Mehrauli, and Gurugram, reported uprooted trees, resulting in significant disruptions. In Sector-9, RK Puram, a portion of a road caved in, causing a motorcycle and a car to fall into the cavity. The last time December rains were this intense was in 1997, when the total monthly precipitation was 71.8mm. Going further back, the highest December rainfall was recorded in 1901 at 77.2mm, followed by 1967 (69.5mm) and 1936 (68.1mm). IMD classifies up to 15.5mm of rainfall in 24 hours as "light rain", 15.6-64.4mm of rainfall as "moderate", 64.5-115.5mm as "heavy rainfall" and 115.6-204.4mm as "very heavy rainfall".

Delhi witnessed incessant rainfall since Friday morning causing severe waterlogging and traffic snarls in several parts, leading to the mercury dropping in the National Capital. In June this year, Delhi has recorded 228.1 mm of rain in the 24 hours in one of the wettest spells the capital has recorded causing waterlogging in several parts of the National Capital.

Kashmiriyat shines as snow envelops J and K

When it snowed heavily in different parts of Kashmir valley, unmatched Kashmiri hospitality and timely response of the Indian army brought much-needed cheer to the faces of stranded tourists stuck in snow-bound areas since Friday afternoon. Over 300 tourists were rescued across different locations in the last 24 hours as most parts of Kashmir valley were under a virtual whiteout. Normal life was thrown out of gear in the Union Territory as several parts of the Valley received snowfall that disrupted flight and railway operations and also led to the closure of the Srinagar-Jammu National Highway. Due to bad weather conditions, all flights at Srinagar Airport were cancelled on Saturday, a

spokesman of the Srinagar airport posted a message on X. Kashmir University also postponed all its examinations scheduled for Saturday due to the inclement weather. Fresh dates for the postponed exams will be notified separately, the University said. Moderate to heavy snowfall was recorded across Kashmir since Friday, including the season's first snowfall in Srinagar city and other plain areas of the valley. Tourists camping in Srinagar were seen enjoying snowfall in the busy Lal Chowk area and near the banks of Dal Lake. In south Kashmir, heavy to very heavy snowfall was recorded in the plains, while central Kashmir's plains received moderate snowfall. The plains of north Kashmir received light to moderate snowfall, the officials said. In

the Jammu region, higher reaches of Doda, Kishtwar and Kathua also witnessed a fresh spell of snowfall. Residents of the Gund area on the Srinagar-Sonamarg highway turned out to be real saviours when they decided to throw open the gates of Jamia

Masjid late Friday night to accommodate stranded passengers from Punjab during the night. The warm hospitality and delicious food served by the locals to these tourists not only won their hearts but also sent a message of bonhomie and



mutual trust among the members of the different communities. A video of stranded passengers, relishing delicious meals inside Jamia Masjid, Gund also went viral on various social media platforms. "It was the best possible solution as the mosque has a 'hamaam', which stays warm throughout the night," said Bashir Ahmad, a resident. The tourists expressed their gratitude to the locals for their help. "We were stuck in the snow, and you came to our rescue. We are extremely thankful to all of you," one of them said. The Jamia Masjid at Gund is located less than 10 kilometres from the site of a terrorist attack in Gagangir, where six people, five non-local labourers and a local doctor, were killed in October this

year. In the South Kashmir district of Kulgam, Chinar Warriors responded to an emergency distress call to evacuate a pregnant lady from Munad village, Kulgam. Amidst heavy snowfall, the rescue team reached the location on time and the patient was evacuated to Government Hospital, Yarpora inside a JCB machine. The Indian Army also came to the rescue of stranded passengers in the famous tourist resort of Gulmarg. At least 68 civilians including eight children were safely evacuated by the army personnel from the snow-bound areas and several other passengers were provided with hot meals, shelter and medication. A family in the Kangan area of Ganderbal district also hosted stranded passengers during the night

after they were left stranded in the snowbound area. Chief Minister Omar Abdullah convened a video conference meeting with all districts across Jammu and Kashmir to review snow clearance operations and restoration of essential services following heavy snowfall in the Kashmir Valley. Police and civil administration across different district headquarters have already begun reaching out to stranded tourists, providing hot drinks and other necessities to keep them warm. While authorities launched snow clearance operations at the respective district headquarters, most of the main roads and roads to hospitals were cleared of snow, but many interior roads were still blocked, the officials said.



District hospital seeks clearance for bedsheets

The administration of the Deen Dayal Upadhyay District Hospital has formally written to the director general of Health seeking clearance on the order of a new policy regarding the regular changing of bedsheets according to the days of the week. In a statement regarding this matter, the hospital's medical superintendent, Dr VS Chauhan, informed that the Health Minister Dhan Singh Rawat has recently issued instructions to all government hospitals within the state to establish a practice of routinely changing bed linens in patient wards. Further, it has been recommended that the hospital management utilise bed linens of various colours each day. In light of the Health Minister's



guidance, the hospital administration has recently started the process of acquiring bed linens in different colours that correspond to each day of the week. To expedite the purchasing process, the adminis-

tration has also directly engaged with the concerned officials. He further stated that while procuring bed linens in various colours, the administration encountered confusion regarding the guideline for how frequently the bed linens should be changed, whether weekly or daily. To prevent any violations of this guideline, the hospital administration has ceased the purchasing of bed linens. Additionally, they recently sent a letter to the director general of health to clarify the policy on changing bed linens in the hospital. He emphasised that the purchasing process for bedsheets will only resume once the clearance has been granted by the director general of health.

It will be recalled that earlier Chauhan informed that the district hospital will acquire approximately 2,000 to 3,000 bed linens in various colours. The hospital administration has been ensuring the quality of these bed linens before making any purchases. Chauhan added that the funding for these linens comes from the State government under the Ayushman scheme. The goal of this initiative is to regularly change the bed linens according to the designated colours for each day, which will help maintain hygiene for the patients and enhance the overall aesthetic appeal of the hospital.

Another Roadways bus meets accident, driver killed

HALDWANI: Another Uttarakhand Roadways bus heading to Haldwani from Delhi met with an accident as it collided with a rice-laden truck near Bilaspur police station at around 5 AM. The driver died on the spot while some passengers were injured and rushed to Bilaspur Hospital. Police said that the driver might have fallen asleep, leading to the mishap. They added that the post-mortem of the driver was being done to ascertain the exact cause of the accident.

Earthquake strikes Chamoli, no loss of life reported

CHAMOLI: With rain and snowfall continuing across Uttarakhand since Friday morning, an earthquake of magnitude 2.4 on the Richter scale was felt in Chamoli town at 9.36 AM. Though the panicly people rushed out of their homes no report of loss of life or damage to property was reported from anywhere. The district disaster management officer N K Joshi confirmed this, adding that the epi-centre of the quake was five kilometres beneath the earth's surface. Importantly, Uttarakhand falls in the Zone 5 in terms of earthquake sensitivity.

Rawat directs drunk driving checks ahead of NY

NAINITAL: With tourist influx gaining momentum ahead of the New Year celebration in Nainital, the Kumaon commissioner Deepak Rawat who is also the secretary to the chief minister directed the sub-divisional magistrates and transport, excise and police officers to jointly conduct regular checking drives in their jurisdictional limits to stop drunk driving which often ends up in accidents. He stressed on laying pickets on roads at regular intervals to check drunk driving.

Business owners wary of New Year eve on Tuesday

Revellers reluctant to drink and eat non-veg on Mangalwar

Owners of cafés and lounges in Dehradun are anxious due to a projected 10 to 20 per cent decline in business for New Year's Eve on December 31 as the occasion falls on a Tuesday this year. Notably, many people belonging to Hindu religion regard Tuesday as a spiritual day, leading many individuals to refrain from consuming non-vegetarian food and beverages. However, this December, a significant number of patrons did not make prior reservations for New Year parties at local cafés and lounges, likely due to it coinciding with this particular day of the week. Consequently, several café and lounge owners have expressed apprehension about the reduced number of bookings from local residents for the festivities.

A café owner Daniel Mann stated that each year, approximately 15 days before the New Year's Eve festivities on December 31, many residents of Dehradun begin making reservations at their favourite cafés for the celebrations. As a café owner, he has noticed a decline in advance bookings for this year's event, primarily because it falls on a Tuesday. Traditionally, many individu-



als refrain from consuming non-vegetarian dishes and alcoholic beverages on this particular day of the week, which poses a challenge given that these offerings are central to the party atmosphere. Consequently, numerous individuals have opted to abstain from attending, which will have a further impact on business during this busy period, he said.

"In previous years, my lounge thrived on New Year's Eve, but this year, advance bookings have decreased by an average of 10 to 20 per cent due to the date falling on Tuesday," said another lounge owner Ganesh Chaturvedi. He further said that to entice

Dehradun residents to his lounge for the celebration, he has chosen to lower the entry fee, alongside offering standard amenities, in hopes of enhancing attendance.

Numerous café and lounge owners have voiced similar concerns regarding a decline in business this New Year's Eve. In this context, resident Sanjay Nagpal noted that he and his friends traditionally celebrate New Year's Eve at a lounge or café each year. However, this year, he has chosen to cancel their plans due to the occasion falling on a Tuesday. He said that on Tuesdays, he refrains from consuming alcoholic beverages and non-vegetarian meals.

Digital Bharat-Beggars and roadside vendors go digital in Doon

Apparently inspired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Digital India campaign, street vendors, beggars and numerous other roadside entrepreneurs have embraced digitalisation. Both roadside vendors and beggars have begun utilising various online payment options. However, many individuals have raised concerns regarding the lack of awareness about engaging in digitalisation. They state that without proper knowledge, individuals may become vulnerable to cybercrime. Commenting about this, a vegetable vendor Gagan Kumar stated that digitalisation provides an effective means of safeguarding his earnings from theft or loss. He noted that previously, he collected payments in cash for vegetable sales and experienced significant losses due to theft. Recently, inspired by the PM's initiative for digitalisation, he has started using online payment applications, which has enabled him to protect his finances from theft, he said. In addition to vendors, it has been noted that many individuals experiencing homelessness in Dehradun ask money from residents by utilising online payment applications, which they successfully receive. A local resident and retired government employee, Jagmohan Dimri, said that he has also observed how both roadside vendors and individuals in need have embraced digitalisation. They employ

online payment applications and various digital media platforms. While there is nothing inherently wrong with this, it is concerning that these individuals, particularly those experiencing homelessness, may possess limited knowledge regarding the rising issue of cybercrime in the country. Engaging in digital transac-

tions without adequate understanding could expose them to the risks associated with cybercrime. Dimri emphasised the importance of authorities organising free training sessions focused on digital literacy for the more vulnerable segments of society to mitigate these risks. "I recently encountered a beggar near the

Rispana bridge who asked me for money, but I did not have cash on hand. I informed him of my situation. In response, he unexpectedly pulled out a phone and showed me a scanner for digital payment," shared local resident Shilpa Gupta. She further noted that this experience highlighted how digitalisation has reached

even the more vulnerable segments of society. Additionally, she observed that many roadside vendors have also adopted online payment methods. While she believed that the shift towards digitalisation is beneficial, she emphasised the importance of individuals being well-informed about it, as a lack of knowledge could potentially lead to cybercrime and other related issues.

The managing director of the Uttarakhand Power Corporation Limited (UPCL), Anil Kumar has put the officers and employees of the corporation on high alert to ensure power supplies amid inclement weather conditions and snow fall in the State.

The UPCL has set up a control room in the office of the director (Operations) at the headquarters to keep an eye on the availability of power supply. The MD has also directed all the chief engineers to update him regularly on the status of power supply in their areas .

The corporation claimed that its regional units restored the power supplies disrupted at various places in the state due

to bad weather on Friday night.

The MD said that the consumers of the State can contact the nearest power house or centralized call center (1912) for any kind of power related disruption in their area. For the convenience of pilgrims/tourists visiting during winter, the MD has directed all regional units to ensure smooth power supply at important pilgrimage and tourist places such as Mussoorie, Auli, Lansdowne, Joshimath, Dhanaulti, Rishikesh, Haridwar, Chamoli, Chakrata, Rajaji National Park, Tehri, Devprayag, Chamba and Harsil. The UPCL officers have also been directed to ensure uninterrupted supply of power at the winter abodes of the

Char Dhams. The MD said that all the substations, HT/LT lines and street lights are being monitored on a daily basis and arrangements of material like conductors, cables, poles, transformers are also being ensured at all the places so that in case of power disruption, supply can be restored in minimum time.

The MD has directed all the superintending engineers and executive engineers to inspect the 33/11 KV substations and 11 KV feeders under their jurisdiction. He said that lopping of trees coming in the way of the power lines should be done.

Dental wing handed over to hospital administration at Gandhi Shatabdi Eye hospital

The new dental wing has been developed on a larger scale, encompassing eight to ten outpatient department (OPD) areas, whereas the district hospital currently accommodates only two OPD areas.

Several Union Ministers and CMs to attend WEF at Davos

Union Ministers Ashwini Vaishnav, CR Patil, Chirag Paswan, K Ram Mohan Naidu and Jayant Chaudhary, alongside three Chief Ministers -- Devendra Fadnavis, Chandrababu Naidu and Revant Reddy, will join hundreds of Government and business leaders from across the globe in Swiss ski resort town Davos next month for the World Economic Forum Annual Meeting 2025. Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Naidu will also be joined by his son and senior minister in his state Nara Lokesh, while Karnataka's Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar, Tamil Nadu Minister TRB Rajaa and Uttar Pradesh Minister Suresh Khanna will also be there for the five-day annual congregation of the world's rich and powerful, starting January 20, 2025. Actor Bhumi Pednekar,

known for films like Dum Laga Ke Haisha, Toilet: Ek Prem Katha, Shubh Mangal Saavdhan, Pati Patni Aur Woh, Badhai Do and Saand Ki Aankh, would also be there. Besides over 50 Presidents and Prime Ministers from across the world, top officials of international organisations like the United Nations, IMF, World Bank, Interpol, NATO, European Central Bank and WTO are also expected to be in Davos for the WEF Annual Meeting 2025. Senior ministers from Pakistan and Bangladesh, including Bangladesh Government's Chief Adviser and head of the interim government Muhammad Yunus would also be present. Vaishnav, Minister for Railways, Information & Broadcasting and Electronics & IT, had also attended the last WEF annual meeting, alongside Smriti Irani and Hardeep Singh Puri from the Union Council of Ministers.

This time, Vaishnav will be joined by Jal Shakti Minister Patil, Food Processing Industries Minister Paswan, Civil Aviation Minister Naidu and Minister of State for Skill Development and Education Chaudhary. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has also attended the meeting in the past, but there is no official word so far about his participation in the high-profile summit, for which the main theme this time will be 'collaboration for the intelligent age'. Expected to be attended by nearly 50 heads of state and governments from across the world, the annual meeting would take place against the backdrop of a change of regime in the US and various geopolitical and macroeconomic issues, including the Ukraine war and continuing West Asia crisis. Both Modi and Donald Trump attended the WEF Annual Meeting in 2018 for the first time as India's Prime



Minister and the US President, respectively. While Modi became Prime Minister of India for the third consecutive term earlier this year, Trump is set to assume office for the second time on January 20, and his return is expected to be among the key topics of discussion at Davos. Maharashtra Chief Minister Fadnavis and Andhra Pradesh

Chief Minister Naidu have been to Davos multiple times, while Telangana Chief Minister Reddy attended the WEF Annual Meeting in January 2024 as well. Besides Government leaders and civil society members, the Indian presence would comprise top executives of business conglomerates like Reliance, Tata, Adani, Birla, Bharti,

Mahindra, Godrej, Jindal, Bajaj and Vedanta groups. Besides Mukesh Ambani and Gautam Adani, the next-generation leaders from their groups are also expected to be present, while technology leaders, including Salil Parekh of Infosys, Rishad Premji of Wipro, as also Sumant Sinha of ReNew, Vijay Shekhar Sharma of Paytm and Adar Poonawalla of Serum Institute are expected in the Swiss Alpine resort town. Geneva-based WEF, which describes itself as an international organisation for public-private cooperation, will convene leaders from government, business and civil society as well as scientific and cultural thinkers for its 55th annual meeting under the theme of 'Collaboration for the Intelligent Age'. According to the WEF, the meeting will serve as a trusted global platform for dialogue and cooperation, bring together a diverse community

of stakeholders, seek to connect the dots in an era of complexity and be firmly future-oriented -- both in terms of insights and solutions. Several sessions are expected to be attended by Indian leaders, including one on 'India's Economic Blueprint'. As one of the world's fastest-growing major economies, India has been growing at over 8 per cent, and this growth has been buoyed by a focus on promoting local innovation and startups in technology and manufacturing, representing a departure from traditional export-oriented models. The leaders would deliberate how India has capitalised on this new blueprint and to what extent it can continue to drive global growth. According to the WEF, the annual meeting will take place at a time when geo-economic fragmentation, geopolitical polarisation and divisions over values continue to impact countries and communities across the world. At the same time, exponential innovation and deployment around whole sets of inter-connected technologies -- from AI and quantum to energy tech, biotech and health tech -- offer an unprecedented opportunity to increase productivity and hence, standards of living. Reviving and reimagining growth is critical to building stronger and more resilient economies, and the meeting would seek to discuss how to avoid an Age of Fragmentation and instead work together on a can-do, people-centred agenda for an Intelligent Age. The global leaders would also deliberate on how to reinvent the muscle of collaborative innovation to get out of the current low-growth, high-debt world economy and address common challenges from climate change to the ethical use of AI.

PM CARES fund contributions fall to Rs 912 crore in FY 23

The total voluntary contribution to the PM CARES Fund fell to Rs 912 crore in the fiscal year 2022-23, its lowest since the public charitable trust was created in March 2020 following the COVID-19 outbreak. A study of the audited statements of the Prime Minister's Citizen Assistance and Relief in Emergency Situations (PM CARES) Fund website shows that the voluntary contribution peaked at Rs 7,184 crore in 2020-21 and then fell to Rs 1,938 crore in 2021-22, before declining further in 2022-23 as the Covid threat receded after 2021. The fiscal 2022-23 is the last year for which the statement is available on the website.



Foreign contribution has seen a sharper decline, registering a high of Rs 495 crore in 2020-21, before falling to Rs 40 crore and Rs 2.57 crore in the next two years. The total expenditure in 2022-23 was around Rs 439 crore, with Rs 346 crore of it used by the "PM Cares for Children", a government

initiative to support children who lost both of their parents, legal guardians or surviving parents to the Covid pandemic. An amount of nearly Rs 92 crore was spent on the procurement of oxygen concentrators, according to the statement. The Narendra Modi government had set up the

PM CARES Fund with the primary objective of dealing with any kind of emergency or distress situation, like the one posed by the Covid pandemic, and to provide relief to the affected. It was registered as a public charitable trust. The prime minister is the ex-officio chairman of the body and the fund consists entirely of voluntary contributions and does not get any budgetary support. The fund has been used over the years to boost emergency care, including for setting up oxygen plants and purchasing ventilators in hospitals run by the central and state governments as part of the larger exercise to meet the challenges posed by the pandemic. In 2021-22, an amount of Rs 1,703 crore was spent on

pressure-swing adsorption oxygen plants, besides spending Rs 835 crore on ventilators, out of a total expenditure of nearly Rs 1,938 crore. Its objective was to undertake and support relief or assistance of any kind relating to a public health emergency or any other kind of emergency, calamity or distress, either man-made or natural, including the creation or upgradation of healthcare or pharmaceutical facilities, other necessary infrastructure, funding relevant research or any other type of support. To render financial assistance, provide grants of payments of money or take such other steps as may be deemed necessary by the Board of Trustees to the affected population.

Indian Army contingent leaves for Nepal to participate in joint military exercise Surya Kiran

An Indian Army contingent comprising 334 personnel departed for Nepal on Saturday to participate in 18th edition of battalion level joint military exercise Surya Kiran. The exercise will be conducted in Saljhandi, Nepal from December 31 to January 13, defence ministry said here adding it is an annual training event conducted alternatively in the two countries. The Indian Army contingent is led by a battalion from the 11th Gorkha Rifles. The Nepal Army contingent will be represented by Srijung Battalion. The aim of the exercise is to enhance interoperability in jungle



warfare, counter terrorism operations in mountains, and Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief under United Nations Charter. The exercise will focus on enhancing operational preparedness, aviation aspects, medical training, and environment conservation. Through these activities, the troops will enhance their

operational capabilities, refine their combat skills and strengthen their coordination to operate together in challenging situations. This edition of the exercise follows successful visits by Army chief General Upendra Dwiwedi to Nepal, and the visit by General Ashok Raj Sigdel, Chief of the Army Staff of Nepali Army to India.

Mauritius announces flying flag at half-mast as mark of respect to Manmohan Singh

Mauritius has announced that its national flag will fly at half-mast at all government offices and institutions till sunset on Saturday as a mark of respect to India's former prime minister Manmohan Singh. Bhutan's national flag was flown at half-mast across the country, its embassies and consulates abroad, according to the Royal Bhutan government as a mark of respect to the departed. In a note, Mauritius Prime Minister Navin Ramgoolam's office also urged the private sector to fly the flags at half-mast. Mauritius Foreign Minister Dhananjay Ramful travelled to Delhi and paid respects to the former prime minister. "Following the passing away of Dr Manmohan Singh,

former Prime Minister of the Republic of India, the public is hereby informed that the Mauritius Flag will be flown at half-mast on all government buildings until sunset today Saturday, the day of his funeral," the Mauritius prime minister's office said. "An appeal is also made to the private sector for all flags to be flown at half-mast," it said in the note. Singh, who served as the prime minister from 2004 to 2014 and widely known as the architect of India's economic reforms, died on Thursday night. He was 92. India's relations with several key countries, including Mauritius, saw significant upswing during Singh's prime ministership. Singh's last rites were held with full state honours on Saturday at the Nigambodh Ghat cremation ground in Delhi. President Droupadi

Murmu, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and King of Bhutan Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck were among those who attended Singh's funeral. Bhutan's King Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck attended the funeral of former prime minister Manmohan Singh, a day after leading the Himalayan nation in offering prayers for the Indian leader at a Buddhist monastery in Thimphu. Separate prayer ceremonies were held for the former Indian prime minister at all 20 Dzongkhags or districts of Bhutan, according to the Bhutan government. Bhutan's national flag was flown at half-mast across the country and at its embassies, and consulates abroad, according to the Royal Bhutan government. A thousand butter lamps were lit at the ceremony held in



Thimphu's Kuenrey of Tashichhodzong that was led by the King. The prayer was attended by Prime Minister Tshering Tobgay, Indian ambassador Sudhakar Dalela, several members of the Royal family and senior officials of the Bhutanese government. "As a mark of respect to the

late former prime minister and in solidarity with the government and people of India, all national flags across the country and at Bhutan's embassies, missions, and consulates abroad are being flown at half-mast," the Bhutanese government said in a social media post on Friday.

India's relations with several key countries including Bhutan saw significant upswing during Singh's prime ministership. India and Bhutan enjoy strong bonds of friendship based on goodwill, trust and mutually beneficial cooperation. The basic framework of India-Bhutan relations is the "Treaty of Friendship and Cooperation" signed in 1949. It was renewed in February 2007 when Singh was the prime minister. The cooperation in the hydro-power sector is one of the cornerstones of the relations. The ongoing cooperation between India and Bhutan in the hydro-power sector is covered under the 2006 bilateral agreement for cooperation and its Protocol signed in 2009. The pact and the protocol were inked during Singh's

tenure as the prime minister. Meanwhile, Abed Elrazeg Abu Jazer, the charge d'affaires of the Palestine embassy in India, on Friday paid his last respects to the former prime minister and appreciated his support to Palestine. Jazer said Singh played a key role in Palestine getting land for its embassy in Delhi. "We have a history of relationships. He (Singh) met Yasser Arafat in 1991 when he was finance minister, he met (State of Palestine) President Mahmoud Abbas several times throughout his tenure," the diplomat told reporters outside the Congress headquarters where he paid tribute to the former prime minister on behalf of Palestine. He also laid a wreath on behalf of the president of the State of Palestine. "We had good relations with

him (Singh). He met our president several times during his tenure. He also provided land for establishing the Palestinian embassy in Delhi, gave support to build the embassy, and also inaugurated it in 2012," Jazer said. "We appreciate his support to Palestine, we are remembering his contributions. We stand with the Indian people to show our respect for the leader," he added. Abbas visited New Delhi several times during the United Progressive Alliance (UPA) government. In a speech before the UN General Assembly in September 2011, Singh had said India supported "the Palestinian people's struggle for a sovereign, independent, viable and united State of Palestine with East Jerusalem as its capital".

As individuals age, singlehood may also bring economic, emotional challenges: Study

Although marriage or long-term relationships are often seen as the norm, remaining single for life is becoming an increasingly common choice. While singlehood can provide independence and freedom, a new study reveals that it may also bring economic and emotional challenges, particularly as individuals' age and become more dependent on others for support. Published in the journal Psychological Science, the study highlights the lower life satisfaction and distinct personality traits of lifelong singles compared to their partnered peers. "When there are differences, they might be especially important in elderly people who face more health issues and financial issues," said Julia Stern, one of the lead authors and a senior researcher at the University of Bremen in Germany. "They need more help, and



the help is usually the partner." The study used a survey of more than 77,000 Europeans over the age of 50 and was the first of its kind to look across cultures and at people who had been single their entire lives. Stern and colleagues compared single people and partnered individuals on life satisfaction ratings and the Big Five personality traits (openness to experience, conscientiousness, extraversion, agreeableness, and neuroticism). The findings revealed that, in

addition to lower life satisfaction scores, lifelong singles are less extraverted, less conscientious, and less open to experience, compared to partnered people. Although this study cannot definitively decipher if personality differences are due to selection, people with certain personality types may be more likely to start relationships, or socialization, long-term relationships could change personalities, the evidence points to the former. Stern

said that changes to personality from being in a relationship are small and temporary. For instance, although an extraverted person beginning a new relationship may be keen to stay in with their partner, eventually their extraversion comes back. But she warned that the results are average effects and not necessarily descriptive of everyone; of course, there are single extraverts and introverts in committed relationships. For singles, living in a society where marriage is the expectation may affect their life satisfaction. For instance, in countries with higher marriage rates (such as southern European countries), singlehood resulted in even lower life satisfaction scores, but the effects were small. Stern suggested developing new kinds of programs to prevent loneliness that take these personality traits into consideration and help older singles meet like-minded people.

CBI searches premises of Assistant Director of ED in Shimla

The CBI has searched the premises of an Assistant Director of the ED in Shimla, who managed to give a slip to the agency during a trap operation on Sunday and escaped, officials said. The Assistant Director of the Enforcement Directorate (ED) posted at Shimla and his brother Vikas Deep, a senior manager in the Punjab National Bank in Delhi, had allegedly gone to Chandigarh to receive bribe money from a businessman, who is facing a case lodged under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), they said. The businessman filed a complaint with the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) about alleged extortion, based on which the Chandigarh unit of the agency planned the trap operation where the complainant was asked to give a bribe of Rs 55 lakh in cash to the officer with CBI sleuths keeping an eye, the officials said. It was planned that the



CBI would nab the accused after the bribe was allegedly received by him, they said. The ED officer, who is on deputation from the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC), got alerted during the operation and allegedly fled the spot with the cash, the officials said. The agency has been trying to locate him for six days. It has even launched technical surveillance to pin-point his location but to no avail. So far, cash amounting to around Rs 1 crore, including the bribe amount, has been recovered, they added. The

car used by the absconding officer to escape was also located at the ED office, the officials said. The CBI has arrested Vikas Deep in connection with the case and produced him before a court, they said. The agency is questioning him regarding his alleged involvement in the case. Sources in the ED said the accused assistant director of its Shimla sub-zonal office and his supervisory officers -- a deputy director and the joint director (based in Chandigarh) -- have been transferred to Delhi following the case.

Tribals who received recognition from Manmohan Singh mourn his demise, recall cherished memories

As the nation bid adieu to former prime minister Manmohan Singh in New Delhi on Saturday, two tribals in a remote Odisha district, who were honoured by him in 2012 for biodiversity conservation, recalled with tears cherished memories with the beloved leader. The former PM passed away on Thursday night at Delhi's All India Institute of Medical Sciences due to age-related medical complications. He was 92. conservation from Singh during the 99th Indian Science Congress held at Bhubaneswar 12 years ago. "I was at a loss for words when I heard about his demise on Friday," said Railla, a farmer from the Bhumia tribe. "I remember feeling very nervous that day (in 2012), but receiving the award from the former prime minister was an unforgettable moment. He was gentle and soft-spoken, and encouraged us to work dedicatedly for biodiversity conservation," he said. Pradhani couldn't hold back tears while recalling his brief interaction with Singh. "Sir smiled at me as I received the award and motivated us to continue our efforts in preserving biodiversity. His words will remain an inspiration for years to come," he said. "I wish I had more opportunities to meet him," Pradhani said. Prasant Parida, director of the M S Swaminathan Research Foundation in Jeypore, said Koraput was recognised as a Globally Important Agricultural Heritage System (GIAHS) by the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) in 2012. "Railla and Chandra were instrumental in representing Koraput at the event where the former prime minister acknowledged their community's efforts," said Parida.

Manipur CM N Biren Singh condemns militant firing, four injured in Imphal east district

was rushed to a hospital, they said, adding that he was hit by a bullet fired likely by a sniper. Kabichandra was reporting the attack by armed men at Thamnepokpi village since Friday. Security forces also retaliated the fire, they said. On Friday night firing by militants towards Thamnepokpi in Imphal East district from the surrounding hills of Kangpokpi district an elderly woman was injured. She was rushed to Yaingangpokpi Primary Health Centre for treatment and is out of danger. Earlier on Friday, two persons including a security personnel were injured in firing at Sanasabi.

Kerala Congress slams CM Pinarayi Vijayan for inaugurating airport event amid national mourning for former PM

Earlier in the day, Vijayan inaugurated the Taj Cochin International Airport, a five-star hotel developed by Cochin International Airport Limited (CIAL) and operated by the IHCL Taj Group. In New Delhi, former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh was cremated with full state honours on Saturday in the presence of top dignitaries from India and abroad. The last rites were attended by President Droupadi Murmu, Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar, and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, along with top Congress leaders including Mallikarjun Kharge, Sonia Gandhi, and Rahul Gandhi.

Four lives lost in separate road accidents in Madhya Pradesh

Four men were killed and two others suffered injuries in separate road accidents in Sehore and Katni districts of Madhya Pradesh on Saturday, police said. Vinand Gyanchand (20) and his cousin Ajay Ghasiram Verma (25) were crushed to death by a truck when they were returning home in Kothari village of Sehore district, Ashta area Sub Divisional Officer of Police (SDOP) Akash Amalkar told PTI. The truck driver fled from the spot, located around 25 km from the district headquarters, but was caught within a few minutes, he said. The victims' bodies were sent to a government hospital for post-mortem, Amalkar said. The process to register a case against the driver was on and investigation was underway, he added. In the second accident, drivers of two trucks were killed after their vehicles collided on Katni-Damoh road, about 33 km off the Katni district headquarters, Rithi police station inspector Rajendra Mishra told PTI.

Denial of fireworks permission sparks row at Thrissur Temples, shrine managements cry foul

The district administration's denial of permission for the fireworks display during 'Vela Ezunnallippu', a traditional ritual, at the famed Paramekkavu and Thiruvambady temples here has sparked a row with the shrine managements viewing it as a "test dose" to destroy the iconic Thrissur Pooram. The Additional District Magistrate (ADM) here on Friday issued an order denying permission for the fireworks display in connection with the annual ritual citing the new amendment to the union government's Explosive Rules and based on reports of various state government departments in accordance with that. The Vela Ezunnallippu ritual and the related fireworks display of the two temples are scheduled in January first week. In the order, the district administration stated that there is no physical circumstance to carry out the fireworks display in the area and it may pose a threat to the life and property of the public. The opinion of concerned investigating officers that the fireworks should not be allowed taking into account the safety of public life has also been considered, said the order. The order was issued on the request for permission to conduct fireworks display submitted by Thiruvambady Devaswom. Meanwhile, the order denying permission to the

fireworks display citing the central explosive rule guidelines drew sharp reactions from the temple managements. K Girish Kumar, Secretary, Thiruvambady Devaswom, vehemently criticised the move and said permission for the fireworks display is being denied citing technical reasons and urged political leaders and ministers from the district to raise their voice against it. "The Vela Ezunnallippu and its related fireworks are held on the same Swaraj Round where the Thrissur Pooram is conducted annually. The present move is a test dose to destroy the iconic Pooram," he told reporters here. Rejecting the reasons for denying permission for the fireworks display, he said the school, hospital, petrol pump and other such institutions have been there in the area for years and the rituals were held there without any issues in the past. The fireworks display is to be conducted in the midnight after taking all necessary precautions and so it won't pose any security issues as claimed in the order, the Devaswom Secretary further said. Without naming anyone, he further alleged that there were attempts to block the parading of jumbos and the apex court granted permission for the same recently. Now-a-days, the temple authorities are forced to approach the court for each and everything to protect the traditional rituals, he added.

Patna district administration offers to facilitate meeting between BPSC and protesting candidates over exam cancellation demand

The Patna district administration on Saturday said it has made an offer to the candidates, demanding cancellation of the Bihar Public Service Commission (BPSC) examination held on December 13, to facilitate a meeting with it so that they could put forth their grievances. The candidates, seeking cancellation of the 70th Integrated Combined Competitive Examination (CCE), 2024, under the BPSC over allegations of question paper leak have been protesting for more than a week. The protestors would be required to nominate five of

their representatives for talks after which the BPSC would take a decision "within a reasonable time", Patna District Magistrate (DM) Chandrasekhar Singh said. "The district administration has offered the protesting

aspirants to give a list of the representatives (all of them examinees) so that we can facilitate their meeting with the BPSC authorities over the issue," the DM told PTI on Saturday. "They can apprise the

commission's officials of their grievances in the meeting. The district administration also assures the protesting aspirants that the commission would take appropriate decisions or a stand within a reasonable time," Singh said. The commission is an independent body and it is free to make decisions on its own, he said. The BPSC had decided to cancel the preliminary examination held at Babu Pariksha Parisar centre only due to disruption created by a group of unruly aspirants. The re-examination will be held on January 4 at some other centre in the city. The protestors have been

sitting on dharna at Gardani Bagh for several days. They contend that cancellation should be ordered across the board since re-examination for just one centre would go against the principle of "level playing field". Meanwhile, the Patna Police have issued notices to certain people, associated with coaching institutes, and sought clarification over allegedly instigating the protesting aspirants and delivering provocative speeches while addressing students at Gardani Bagh, the dedicated site for organising protests in the city. "Yes, notices have been served to them by the Patna Police in this regard.

Punjab Govt reclaims 12,809 acres of land worth ₹3,080 Crore, generates ₹573.66 Crore in revenue

The Punjab government has so far reclaimed 12,809 acres of land and handed them over to panchayats since the start of a campaign in 2022 to remove encroachments, Minister Tarunpreet Singh Sond said on Saturday. The market value of this reclaimed land exceeds Rs 3,080 crore, he added. About 6,000 acres of the reclaimed land was leased out, generating an annual income of Rs 10.76 crore during the 2024-25 fiscal, the rural development and panchayat minister said. During the current financial year, the rural development and panchayats department

auctioned 1.36 lakh acres of 'shamlat' (village common land) for Rs 469 crore. Another Rs 93.90 crore was generated by leasing livestock markets through e-auctions, the minister said. Under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Gramin), 18,000 homes, costing about Rs 220 crore, will be completed by the end of this fiscal, he said. In the 2025-26 fiscal, an additional 25,000 houses will be constructed. To identify new beneficiaries, a fresh survey has been underway since November 1, with dedicated surveyors deployed in each village, Sond said. He said the department

initiated the Rural Library Scheme from Issru village (in Khanna) this year, realising Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann's vision of establishing libraries in villages. The chief minister inaugurated the first library on August 15. At present, 114 rural libraries are functional across Punjab while work on 179 is underway, he said. The department also facilitated financial assistance for self-help groups by enabling them to secure loans worth Rs 94.35 crore from banks, according to an official statement. Under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), Rs 983.98 crore was spent

during the 2024-25 fiscal, generating 2.15 crore person-days of employment. An average of 7.02 lakh rural families were provided employment under the scheme this year, according to the statement. The department also planted 95.03 lakh saplings in 2024. Besides, 2,461 sports grounds were built and work on 1,623 is underway. Various initiatives are being undertaken to enhance the aesthetics of villages and effectively manage waste, the minister said. He mentioned that panchayat elections were conducted in 2024, during which 3,044 panchayats were elected unanimously.

ED raids Chhattisgarh Cong MLA Kawasi Lakhma, son in money laundering case linked to liquor scam

The Enforcement Directorate on Saturday conducted raids at the premises of Chhattisgarh Congress MLA and former excise minister Kawasi Lakhma, his son and some others as part of a money laundering investigation linked to an alleged liquor scam in the state, official sources said. They said a total of seven premises - including Lakhma's residence in Raipur and his son Harish Lakhma's premises in Sukma district apart from that of some linked persons - are being searched under the provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA). The Chhattisgarh Congress alleged the raids were part of a conspiracy by the BJP to harass the opposition party's leaders ahead of urban body and panchayat polls. Lakhma, 71, is a six-time MLA from Korta assembly seat and served as excise minister in the previous Congress government. Harish Lakhma is stated to be a

panchayat president in his district. The ED sources said they are investigating allegations made by some "key accused" that Lakhma was paid about Rs 2 crore per month between 2020-2022 when he held the excise portfolio. According to the agency, the alleged liquor scam was orchestrated between 2019-22 under the then chief minister Bhupesh Baghel-led Congress government. "The Chhattisgarh liquor scam resulted in massive loss to the state exchequer and filled the pockets of the beneficiaries of the liquor syndicate with more than Rs 2,100 crore illegal proceeds of crime," the agency had claimed earlier. Chhattisgarh Congress communication wing president Sushil Anand Shukla told PTI that central agencies are being misused as urban body and panchayat elections are expected to be held in the state. This is a conspiracy by the BJP to harass Congress leaders, he said.

Cyber fraudsters target Mahakumbh mela, police crackdown on fake booking websites

In a growing trend of cyber fraud targeting the Maha Kumbh Mela, several fake websites promising hotel, tent, and cottage bookings have come to light, prompting the police to launch an intensive crackdown. On Friday, the cyber police registered cases against four such fraudulent websites and subsequently shut them down. Deputy Inspector of Cyber Cell Vinod Kumar Yadav stated that cybercriminals were exploiting the faith and enthusiasm of devotees by



creating fake platforms offering premium services, including accommodations

and special VIP bathing arrangements. "These websites are deceiving pilgrims and extorting significant sums of money under the guise of bookings," he said, urging people to remain vigilant. This marks the fifth case registered against fake websites since November 18, when the cyber police began targeting such fraudulent activities. A dedicated team is now investigating the domains of these sites to identify their operators. Emails have been sent to hosting services to uncover the registrants and locations from where these sites are

being managed. The four websites identified and acted upon are: *https://mahakumbhfestival.com/ *https://mahakumbhcottagesreservation.org/ *https://jainmandiranddharamshala.in/ *https://mahakumbhcottagesreservation.org/ The cyber police confirmed that FIRs have been filed, and efforts are underway to track down the fraudsters. "Once the domain details are received, we will expedite the arrest of those behind this scam," Yadav added.

Putin apologises to Azerbaijani leader for 'tragic incident' involving crashed plane

AP ■ MOSCOW Russian President Vladimir Putin on Saturday apologised to his Azerbaijani counterpart for what he called a "tragic incident" following the crash of an Azerbaijani airliner in Kazakhstan that killed 38 people. The Kremlin said in a statement that air defence systems were firing near Grozny, the regional capital of the Russian republic of Chechnya, due to a Ukrainian drone strike as the plane attempted to land on Wednesday. It stopped short of saying the plane was shot down by Russian air defences. According to a Kremlin readout of the call, Putin apologised to Azerbaijani President Ilham Aliyev "for the fact that the tragic incident occurred in Russian airspace." The plane was flying from Azerbaijan's capital of Baku to Grozny, when it turned toward Kazakhstan and crashed while making an attempt to land. There were 29 survivors. On Friday, a US official and an Azerbaijani minister made sep-

arate statements blaming the crash on an external weapon. Friday's assessments by Rashan Nabiyev and White House national security spokesman John Kirby echoed those made by outside aviation experts who blamed the crash on Russian air defence systems responding to a Ukrainian attack. Neither Kirby or the Azerbaijani minister directly addressed the statements blaming air defences. Kirby told reporters on Friday that the US "have seen some early indications that would certainly point to the possibility that this jet was brought down by Russian air defence systems," but refused to elaborate, citing an ongoing investigation. Nabiyev, Azerbaijan's minister of digital development and transportation, told Azerbaijani media that "preliminary conclusions by experts point to external impact," as does witness testimony. Passengers and crew who survived the crash told Azerbaijani media that they heard loud noises on the aircraft as it was circling over Grozny. Dmitry Yarov, head of Russia's

civil aviation authority Rosaviatsia, said Friday that as the plane was preparing to land in Grozny in deep fog, Ukrainian drones were targeting the city, prompting authorities to close the area to air traffic. Yarov said that after the captain made two unsuccessful attempts to land, he was offered other airports but decided to fly to Aktau in Kazakhstan, across the Caspian Sea. He didn't comment on statements from some aviation experts, who pointed out that holes seen in the plane's tail section suggested that it could have come under fire from Russian air defence systems. Earlier this week, Rosaviatsia cited unspecified early evidence as showing that the pilots diverted to Aktau after a bird strike led to an emergency on board. In the days following the crash, Azerbaijan Airlines blamed "physical and technical interference" and announced the suspension of flights to several Russian airports. It didn't say where the interference came from or provide any further details.

Israeli airstrikes hit Yemen airport

Jet with hundreds onboard was landing at that time, says UN official

AP ■ UNITED NATIONS Israeli airstrikes hit Yemen's main airport as a civilian Airbus 320 with hundreds of passengers on board was landing and a UN delegation was waiting to leave, the UN's top humanitarian official in Yemen said Friday. Julien Harneis told UN reporters that the most frightening thing about the two airstrikes on Thursday wasn't their effect on him and about 15 others in the VIP lounge at the international airport in Yemen's capital, Sanaa, including the head of the UN World Health Organisation. Rather, it was the destruction of the airport control tower as a Yemenia Airways plane was taxiing in after touching down. "Fortunately, that plane was able to land safely and the passengers were able to disembark, but it could have been far, far worse," said Harneis, who was with WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus in the lounge. He said one airstrike landed approximately 300 metres (330

yards) south of the VIP lounge and another about 300 metres to the north around 4:45 pm, while about five members of the UN team were outside the building. "Not only obviously did we have zero indication of any potential airstrikes, but we cannot remember the last time there were airstrikes in Sanaa during daylight hours," Harneis said in a video news conference from Sanaa. The UN said at least three people were killed and dozens injured in the strike. Among the injured was a crew member from the UN Humanitarian Air Service, which was about to fly the UN delegation of some 20 people out of Sanaa. He suffered a serious leg injury from shrapnel and lost a lot of blood, Harneis said. Immediately after the airstrikes, Harneis said, UN security officials moved the delegation out of the VIP building and into five armoured cars where they waited for approximately 40 minutes to ascertain what happened and help the injured crew member. He was taken to a hospital in

Sanaa and underwent four hours of surgery while the rest of the delegation spent the night in a UN compound, Harneis said. The UN plane with Tedros and the UN team, including the injured crew member, was able to depart for Jordan on Friday afternoon - without an operating control tower. The United Nations said the injured crew member was taken to a hospital in Jordan, and Tedros was heading back to Geneva, where WHO is based. Yemen's Iran-backed Houthi rebels, who control Sanaa and much of the country's north, have gone after Israel since it started attacking Gaza following the Oct 7, 2023 attacks by Gaza's Hamas militants on southern Israel. The Houthis have attacked ships in the Red Sea, disrupting one of the world's main maritime routes, and recently stepped up missile and drone attacks on Israel. Israel has escalated its response. The Israeli army said it wasn't aware that the WHO chief or UN delegation were at the

Sanaa airport on Thursday. Israel said it bombed the airport because it is used by the Houthis and Iran. Harneis responded, stressing that the airport is civilian, not military, and is used for transporting UN and other humanitarian workers, and for one civilian flight - Yemenia to and from Amman, Jordan. The flight operates as a result of an international agreement, and thousands of Yemenis have used the flight to get advanced medical treatment abroad, he said. Yemen is the Arab world's poorest nation and has been engulfed in a 10-year civil war between the Houthi rebels, who control Sanaa and much of the country's north, and the internationally recognised government forces in the south. Tedros was in the country to discuss its worsening humanitarian crisis and to seek the release of about 50 people detained by the Houthis since June from the UN, nongovernmental organisations and civil society. Harneis said 18 million

Yemenis - about half the country's population - need humanitarian assistance this year, and the UN expects the number to increase to 19 million next year because of the worsening economy. In addition to airstrikes on the Sanaa airport, Israel has been attacking the country's key port of Hodeida, in western Yemen. Harneis said Yemen relies on imports through Hodeida for 80% of its food and more than 90% of its medical supplies to the north. A recent Israeli airstrike destroyed two tugboats and is estimated to have reduced the harbor's capacity by 50%, the UN official said, while damage from Thursday's airstrikes hasn't been assessed yet. As for the detainees, Harneis said he joined the WHO chief at meetings with the Houthi prime minister, foreign minister and a member of the group's Supreme Political Council. He said they received commitments on the detainees' possible release and a pathway to it, and on conditions under which they are being held.

Israel detains director of Gaza hospital

AP ■ DEIR AL-BALAH Israel's army detained the director of one of northern Gaza's last functioning hospitals as overnight strikes in the territory killed nine people, including children, Palestinian medical officials said Saturday. Gaza's Health Ministry said Dr Hussam Abu Safiya, director of Kamal Adwan Hospital, was arrested by Israeli forces Friday along with dozens of other staff and taken to an interrogation centre. The ministry said Israeli troops stormed the hospital and forced many staff and patients outside and told them to strip in winter weather, according to the ministry. Israel's army didn't respond to questions about the

director. On Friday, it denied it had entered or set fire to the hospital complex but acknowledged it had ordered people outside, and said it was conducting operations against Hamas infrastructure and militants in the area. The military repeated claims that Hamas militants operate inside Kamal Adwan but provided no evidence. Hospital officials have denied that. The hospital has been hit multiple times over the past three months by Israeli troops waging an offensive in largely isolated northern Gaza against Hamas fighters it says have regrouped. The health ministry said a strike on the hospital earlier this week killed five medical personnel.

MedGlobal, the humanitarian organisation for which Abu Safiya worked, said Friday it was gravely concerned about him. It said the incident follows the October detention of five other staff, calling it an "alarming and egregious pattern of targeting medical personnel and spaces." Israel's nearly 15-month-old campaign of bombardment and ground offensives has devastated Gaza's health sector. The World Health Organisation has said the raid on Kamal Adwan has put northern Gaza's last major health facility "out of service" after growing restrictions on access, adding that "this horror must end and healthcare must be protected."

Trump asks Supreme Court to delay TikTok ban

PTI ■ WASHINGTON US President-elect Donald Trump asked the Supreme Court on Friday to pause the potential TikTok ban from going into effect until his administration can pursue a "political resolution" to the issue. The request came as TikTok and the Biden administration filed opposing briefs to the court, in which the company argued the court should strike down a law that could ban the platform by Jan 19 while the government emphasised its position that the statute is needed to eliminate a national security risk. "President Trump takes no position on the underlying merits of this dispute. Instead, he respectfully requests that the Court consider staying the Act's deadline for divestment of

January 19, 2025, while it considers the merits of this case," said Trump's amicus brief, which supported neither party in the case and was written by D John Sauer, Trump's choice for solicitor general. The argument submitted to the court is the latest example of Trump inserting himself in national issues before he takes office. The Republican president-elect has already begun negotiating with other countries over his plans to impose tariffs, and he intervened earlier this month in a plan to fund the federal government, calling for a bipartisan plan to be rejected and sending Republicans back to the negotiating table. He has been holding meetings with foreign leaders and business officials at his Mar-a-Lago club in Florida while he assembles his administration,

including a meeting last week with TikTok CEO Shou Chew. Trump has reversed his position on the popular app, having tried to ban it during his first term in office over national security concerns. He joined the TikTok during his 2024 presidential campaign and his team used it to connect with younger voters, especially male voters, by pushing content that was often macho and aimed at going viral. He said earlier this year that he still believed there were national security risks with TikTok, but that he opposed banning it. The filings Friday come ahead of oral arguments scheduled for Jan 10 on whether the law, which requires TikTok to divest from its China-based parent company or face a ban, unlawfully restricts speech in violation of the First Amendment.

The law was signed by President Joe Biden in April after it passed Congress with broad bipartisan support. TikTok and ByteDance filed a legal challenge afterwards. Earlier this month, a panel of three federal judges on the US Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit unanimously upheld the statute, leading TikTok to appeal the case to the Supreme Court. The brief from Trump said he opposes banning TikTok at this juncture and "seeks the ability to resolve the issues at hand through political means once he takes office". In their brief to the Supreme Court on Friday, attorneys for TikTok and its parent company ByteDance argued the federal appeals court erred in its ruling and based its decision on "alleged risks" that China could

exercise control" over TikTok's US platform by pressuring its foreign affiliates. The Biden administration has argued in court that TikTok poses a national security risk due to its connections to China. Officials say Chinese authorities can compel ByteDance to hand over information on TikTok's US patrons or use the platform to spread or suppress information. But the government "concedes that it has no evidence China has ever attempted to do so," TikTok's legal filing said, adding that the US fears are predicated on future risks. In its filing Friday, the Biden administration said because TikTok "is integrated with ByteDance and relies on its proprietary engine developed and maintained in China," its corporate structure carries with it risk.

AP ■ ROME Italy's parliament on Saturday approved the government's 2025 budget, worth about 30 billion euros (USD 31 billion) in tax cuts and social security contributions for low-income citizens. The measures, pushed by the far-right cabinet headed by Premier Giorgia Meloni, won final approval in the Upper House by 108 votes to 63. The country's centre-left opposition had harshly criticised the economic package, saying it didn't meet the premier's pledges to slash taxes for most Italians and boost employment.

Afghan forces target Pakistan in retaliation for deadly airstrikes

AP ■ KABUL Afghanistan's Defence Ministry said Saturday that its forces hit several points inside Pakistan in retaliation for deadly airstrikes last week. Pakistan last Tuesday launched an operation to destroy a training facility and kill insurgents in Afghanistan's eastern Paktika province. The strikes killed dozens of people, mostly women and children. Comments from the Taliban Defence Ministry on

Saturday, posted on X, said its forces targeted Pakistani points that "served as centres and hideouts for malicious elements and their supporters who organised and coordinated attacks in Afghanistan." Ministry spokesman Enayatullah Khwarzami gave no further information about the strikes, including how they were carried out and if there were any casualties on either side. However, a pro-Taliban media outlet, Hurriyet Daily News,

cited ministry sources as saying that the strikes killed 19 Pakistani troops and three Afghan civilians. No one from Pakistan's Foreign Ministry was immediately available for comment. People celebrated Afghanistan's retaliation in the country's southeastern Khost province, according to the organiser, Rasheedullah Hamdard. Thousands turned out to show their happiness and assure the Afghan military of their support against Pakistan. Khost neighbours Paktika, which was targeted

last week. "All of them were chanting angry slogans against this action by Pakistan, such as death to Pakistan," Hamdard said. "All Afghans are brothers, so it is necessary that the nation and government show their pride in their blood." Pakistani officials have accused the Taliban of not doing enough to combat cross-border militant activity, a charge the Taliban government denies, saying it does not allow anyone to carry out attacks against any country from its soil.

BNP criticises Yunus' suggestion to lower voting age to 17

PTI ■ DHAKA The Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) on Saturday said that Chief Adviser Muhammad Yunus' suggestion to set the minimum voting age at 17 would put pressure on the Election Commission and could delay the election process. Yunus, 84, who was sworn-in to lead the interim government after the ouster of former prime minister Sheikh Hasina in August, on Friday suggested that

the minimum voter age should be lowered to 17 years, The Dhaka Tribune newspaper reported. In a video message played in an election dialogue, Yunus said, "To give their (youth) opinion on their own future, I think the voting age for them should be fixed at 17 years." BNP secretary general Mirza Fakhruddin Islam Alamgir, during a discussion at the Jatiya Press Club here, said the chief adviser's suggestion to lower the voting age to 17 means a new voter list would have to be prepared. "Now, people will fear that even more time will be wasted and further delays will occur," he was

quoted as saying. Alamgir said there is an impression among the people that the interim government is deliberately trying to delay the election process. "But that is not my perception," he added. The BNP leader said the chief adviser should not have raised the issue without first consulting the stakeholders. "You are the chief executive, and you said that 17 years is better. When you say this, it becomes binding on the Election Commission," he said. Alamgir said the government should have left the matter to the Election Commission, allowing it to make a decision.

He said that the current minimum age of 18 for becoming a voter is acceptable to all. "If you want to reduce it by one year, then let the new Election Commission propose it and engage in discussions with the political parties," the BNP leader said. During his Victory Day speech on December 16, Yunus indicated that elections might be held by early 2026. "Broadly speaking, the election can be scheduled between the end of 2025 and the first half of 2026," he said. Yunus said that the elections would be held after updating the voters' list.

9th telecom firm hit by massive Chinese espionage campaign, White House says

AP ■ WASHINGTON A ninth US telecom firm has been confirmed to have been hacked as part of a sprawling Chinese espionage campaign that gave officials in Beijing access to private texts and phone conversations of an unknown number of Americans, a top White House official has said. Biden administration officials said this month that at least eight telecommunications com-

panies, as well as dozens of nations, had been affected by the Chinese hacking blitz known as Salt Typhoon. But deputy national security adviser Anne Neuberger told reporters Friday that a ninth victim had been identified after the administration released guidance to companies about how to hunt for Chinese culprits in their networks. The update from Neuberger is the latest development in a

massive hacking operation that has alarmed national security officials, exposed cybersecurity vulnerabilities in the private sector and laid bare China's hacking sophistication. The hackers compromised the networks of telecommunications companies to obtain customer call records and gain access to the private communications of what officials have said is a limited number of individuals.

Gutsy Reddy's maiden ton keeps India afloat

Nitish Reddy, an unknown entity in red ball cricket before the start of Border-Gavaskar series, virtually bailed India out with his dogged maiden Test century here on Saturday, severely denting Australia's hopes of winning the Boxing Day contest.

Reddy's unbeaten 105 took India to 358 for nine, still 116 runs short of Australia's first innings score of 474 as rain brought an early end to the third day's play.

With the flat MCG deck not offering much to the bowlers, saving the Test match shouldn't be a big deal for India. Reddy, easily India's 'find of the series', played a pivotal role in visitors' fightback.

Reddy's combative spirit and the invaluable 127-run stand he shared with Washington Sundar (50 off 162 balls) proved to be the turning point for the hosts.

Reddy's innings was termed as one of greatest Test knocks by the legendary Sunil Gavaskar given the situation as India were in a precarious

position after Rishab Pant's dismissal courtesy a rash shot had left India tottering at 191 for six.

The young Andhra batter could have been stranded on 99 when Jasprit Bumrah got dismissed, leaving Reddy with last-man in Mohammed Siraj, who walked in to another round of boos and faced three deliveries from home skipper Pat Cummins.

Both Reddy and his father Muthyala's expressions changed with each ball but Siraj survived to allow Reddy savour the moment he must have dreamt a thousand times.

A picture-perfect straight drive off Scott Boland was the moment of the series for India as Reddy balanced his helmet with the bat and took a knee, expressing his gratitude towards the Indian dug-out which gave him a standing ovation.

The 21-year-old struck the 'Pushpa' pose after completing his fifty and the 'Salaar' pose to celebrate the century.

A decade back, when his father Muthyala left a secured job to open a micro-



finance (lending) business and incurred losses, the Reddy family was advised not to give wings to young Reddy's cricketing dreams but they were unrelenting.

Sitting in the stands near the boundary, Reddy's father broke down when his son achieved the milestone.

As Indian fans clicked selfies with him it must have reminded of the day when his son received the best U-16 cricketer award from the BCCI in 2017, and an impressive Reddy was seen clicking selfie with his idol Virat Kohli and his wife Anushka Sharma while leaving the hotel premises.

Reddy's batting was based on stable core, playing the ball late and only going for the drive when the ball was pitched up. He wasn't defending unnecessarily and 10 fours and a six was a testimony to that.

If the morning was more about Rishabh Pant's inexplicable shot selection, the afternoon session belonged to Reddy, whose attacking game put the pressure right back on Australia.

There were plenty of boundaries and a six off Nathan Lyon but none more gorgeous than the off-drive off Cummins. Reddy has been by far India's most consistent batter in the series and the maiden Test century couldn't have come at a more opportune time and that too at an iconic venue.

Washington, at the other end, grew in confidence and trusted his defence apart from punishing the loose deliveries. It did help that the drop-in surface at the MCG has got better for batting as the match progressed.

The second new ball did very little for Australian bowlers and the Indian duo ran very well between the wickets. With Mitchell Starc's back acting up a little, the two batters looked to reduce the deficit further.

In the morning it was all about Pant's shot selection that hurt India.

The third day's MCG track is perhaps the best to bat on with green grass making way for a brownish tinge and an old Kookaburra hardly doing anything.

Had Pant stuck around,

there was no way he wouldn't have scored big. Pant did start well and got a few boundaries but then the urge to play the falling lap pull over long-leg brought about his dismissal.

When he tried it for the first time off Scott Boland, who came round the wicket, Pant was hit in the naval area and seemed to be in pain.

He got up but didn't realise that Cummins had placed one fielder at deep fine-leg and one at deep third man for both the conventional and reverse lap shot.

Without learning his lessons or caring about success percentage, Pant tried a similar shot but the extra bounce meant that the top edge flew to third man for a regulation catch.

"If there was a word called 'worstest', then this was one such shot," former India skipper Sunil Gavaskar said on air.

But Reddy showed steely resolve as he started with a punchy off-drive off Lyon and also jumped down the track to loft him over for a straight six during a splendid recovery act.

Nitish Reddy: Story of sacrifices made by middle class family

Nitish Reddy loves his tattoos like most 21-year-olds do, and one on his ankle is a picture of 'Achilles' Heel'. He considers it a reminder of all the difficulties that his family has endured in the last 10 years to power his cricketing dream.

For Reddy, becoming a cricketer was both a choice and a compulsion. He wanted to do something for his parents, who gave their tears and sweat to fuel his India dream.

The middle-class family gambled with its finances to allow Reddy soar high. The risks taken and losses suffered will not bother them now.

"Getting into the Indian team is a proud feeling but it is only 50 percent of the dream. It will be fulfilled if I can wear that jersey and win matches for my country," an emotional Reddy had told PTI in June this year.

"I want to see respect for my father in the eyes of those who once tore him to shreds for believing in my talent."

The maiden Test ton

celebration in 'Salaar' style was a tribute to his father Muthyala, who watched his son rescue India from the stand behind team's dug-out.

The journey was not just Reddy's but also of his father's sacrifices and belief that his son was special.

As a 12 year-old, Reddy overheard his relatives cursing his father for losing money in his micro-financing business after taking a voluntary retirement from service (VRS) from Hindustan Zinc.

He took the decision to avoid getting transferred to Udaipur since he knew the city did not have the facilities and coaching to help his son excel as a cricketer.

He invested the payout of Rs 20 lakh to start his business. However, his friends, who took loan from him never returned the amount, resulting in massive losses.

"I could hear those discussions and even as a 12-year old. I understood everything. It was a promise I made to myself that only one thing can redeem my



dad's prestige — an India call-up," Reddy had told back then.

It was the time when he could just afford one bat a year (one good seasoned English willow cost around 15,000 back then. It is close to 50k now for international players).

"I can't tell you how happy I am," Muthyala said, struggling to express his emotions, standing outside the MCG after his son's rescue act.

"Virat sir has told him to work hard," he said.

A few years back, Reddy was adjudged the best U-16 cricketer by the BCCI and

he attended the Annual Awards Function in Bengaluru.

The entire Indian team was in attendance and the 14-year-old was desperate for a selfie with Kohli and his wife Anushka, who were waiting near the elevator of the hotel.

Kohli was in a hurry but obliged and it became a memorable moment for young Reddy. Now getting applauded for his effort by his idol is an unforgettable memory for him.

Reddy's family also can't thank enough former Andhra Cricket Association's head MSK

Prasad for enrolling him in its state-of-the-art academy in Visakhapatnam.

"Initially, he was placed in our U-14 academy, located far from his hometown. However, his parents encouraged him to pursue his dreams, and he steadily progressed through our academies. Nitish eventually earned a spot in India's U-19 team, showcasing his skill and determination," Prasad recently told PTI.

In 2023, Reddy secured spot in India's Emerging Asia Cup team but was dropped after playing a few games. The squad had players like Yash Dhull, Nishant Sindhu, who are far away from national reckoning.

There are certain events that change the course of one's career and that Emerging Asia Cup made him realise that to make a mark at the international level, he needed to think out of the box. "I started spending more time at the nets and also hired a few side arm specialists (throwdown) available in Vizag and practised for a month."

"They were all hurling the

ball at 145 clicks and initially I found it hard. And then by the end of the month got adjusted. That practice went a long way when I played IPL this season where I could hit sixes," he had said.

His SRH skipper Pat Cummins might be smiling quietly and thinking aloud as to why he told Reddy that he has the potential to play for India and develop into a good all-rounder.

India head coach Gautam Gambhir also deserves credit for putting his foot down for having Reddy Down Under after watching his exploits in a T20 series against Bangladesh.

It was a leap of faith and Reddy is now the 'find of the series' for India. On the Christmas Day, when everyone was fretting about India's combination, Sanjay Manjrekar had questioned, "Will Leaving Reddy out give India a better balance?" On Saturday, one of Reddy's sponsors, a popular sports equipment and apparel brand quote tweeted Manjrekar with the cricketer's pic urged the cricket pundit to keep quiet.

Nick Kyrgios heavily criticizes Sinner, Swiatek for doping-related issues

Just days away from his return to tennis at the Brisbane International, Nick Kyrgios hasn't minced his words in referring to doping-related charges against Jannik Sinner and Iga Swiatek, labelling breaches of the sport's anti-doping program as "disgusting for our sport."

The International Tennis Integrity Agency (ITIA) levelled charges against world No.1 Sinner and former world No.1 Iga Swiatek. Sinner tested positive twice for an anabolic steroid in March, but avoided a ban because the ITIA determined he was not to blame.

Swiatek also accepted a one-month suspension in November after testing positive for the banned substance trimetazidine.

"Two world No.1s both getting done for doping is disgusting for our sport. It's a horrible look," Kyrgios said at his Brisbane International



press conference on Saturday. "Tennis integrity right now, and everyone knows it but no one wants to speak about it, it's awful."

Kyrgios, 29, has not played tournament tennis since June 2023 due to wrist and knee injuries. He was asked about his motivations for speaking out on the Sinner and Swiatek situations.

"Someone like me ... I would never even in my entire life ever try and dope in this sport," he said. "Especially going through an injury like I went through, obviously there are things out there that could speed up healing, help me get back to prime level, help my recovery."

Carlsen disqualified from top chess meet for violating dress code

Five-time world champion Magnus Carlsen was first fined and then disqualified from the World Rapid and Blitz Chess Championship here for his refusal to comply with the FIDE's dress code after turning up in jeans here. Defending champion Carlsen was fined USD 200 for wearing jeans, which are "explicitly prohibited" under tournament regulations and when he refused the request to change his attire right after the eighth round by chief arbiter Alex Holowczak, he was disqualified.

He was not paired for Round 9 of the Rapid championship, taking place at Wall Street.

One of the game's greatest players, the Norwegian ace had agreed to follow the dress from the next day but was not ready to do it immediately, resulting in his disqualification.

"I would rather be at someplace with better weather," was how Carlsen summed up his disqualification from the championship in which he has won in the last two editions.

In a statement, the game's global governing body FIDE emphasised that the dress code rules are well-communicated to all participants and designed to ensure professionalism.

"The dress code regulations are drafted by members of the FIDE Athletes Commission, which is composed of professional players and experts. These rules have been in place for years and are well-known to all participants and are communicated to



them ahead of each event," FIDE said in the statement, posted on X.

"FIDE has also ensured that the players' accommodation is within a short walking distance from the playing venue, making adherence to the rules more convenient." It added, "Today, Mr. Magnus Carlsen breached the dress code by wearing jeans, which are explicitly prohibited under long-standing regulations for this event. The Chief Arbiter informed Mr. Carlsen of the breach, issued a USD 200 fine, and requested that he change his attire."

"Unfortunately, Mr. Carlsen declined, and as a result, he was not paired for round nine. This decision was made impartially and applies equally to all players."

Earlier, Russian Grandmaster Ian Nepomniachtchi was also penalised for a similar violation but he complied by changing his attire, allowing him to continue in the event.

Meanwhile, "upset" with the turn of events, Carlsen said he won't participate in the Blitz section of the championship as he is "pretty tired" of FIDE's dress code policies.

"I am pretty tired of FIDE, so I want no more of this. I don't

want anything to do with them. I am sorry to everyone at home, maybe it's a stupid principle, but I don't think it's any fun," Carlsen told Norwegian broadcasting channel NRK.

"I said I don't want to bother changing now, but I can change until tomorrow, that's fine. But they didn't want to compromise. I've reached a point where I am pretty upset with FIDE, so I didn't want to either. Then that's how it goes," he added.

The Carlsen dress code fiasco is being seen as a signal to the chess world about his keenness to develop the faster version of the game that he considers as a 'real skill' as well as his personal interest about developing the 'freestyle chess' for which he recently raised USD 12 million.

Freestyle chess, as he prefers to call it, is the version of the game wherein chess pieces can be shuffled in any order. This was an idea propagated by the great Bobby Fischer.

"This is a war with FIDE (the game's apex body)," said Norwegian sports broadcaster Kaja Snaare before adding that this is the end of an era for world chess.

Chhetri farewell signals end of an era in forgettable year for Indian football

Indian football found itself in the throes of despair throughout 2024 with the senior men's team failing to register a single win in a year when the long-serving Sunil Chhetri finally decided to hang up his boots internationally after 19 years of yeoman service.

The familiar sight of the diminutive No. 11 running into the box, deftly chipping the ball into the back of the net, bringing out his trademark 'namaste' celebration, and looking skywards with his fingers pointing to the heavens will forever be etched in the hearts of Indian football fans.

With his record 151 appearances and 94 goals for India, Chhetri became synonymous with the sport in the country, inspiring millions while leading the team with distinction.

The talisman's retirement, at 39, marked a poignant end in a year of more lows than highs with the men's national team facing transitional challenges and failing to notch a single win across 12 months for the first time in a decade.

"You don't wish to stop playing for the country. But one day you have to, and you will be fine. Finally, I reached this decision. And I think I made the right decision," an emotional Chhetri had said after his decision to retire.

India's FIFA World Cup qualifier against Kuwait was his last appearance for the country.

On June 6, in his final match at Salt Lake Stadium, 58,921 fans gathered to bid farewell



to the legend but the game ended in a goalless draw, much to the disappointment of his supporters.

It was a night heavy with emotion, as Indian football lost its torchbearer, the unifying figure who had carried the sport on his shoulders for nearly two decades. The national team has never been the same since his retirement.

World Cup Qualifiers debacle

The disappointing exit from the second round of FIFA World Cup Qualifiers was followed by the acrimonious sacking of head coach Igor Stimac, a year before his contract expired.

Stimac initially demanded USD 920,000 (Rs 7.72 crore) as compensation and approached the game's governing body FIFA after rejecting the All India Football Federation's (AIFF) offer of first three, then five, and finally 10 months' salary as settlement.

The matter escalated before both parties reached an

agreement, setting the national federation back by USD 400,000.

Stimac was earlier given an extension until 2026 on the condition of reaching the quarterfinals of the AFC Asian Cup but India finished last in their group after failing to win a single match.

Manolo Marquez, a familiar face in Indian football having led Hyderabad FC to an ISL title in 2022, was appointed as the new head coach in July while keeping his job at FC Goa till the end of the ongoing season.

But his appointment failed to turn around India's fortunes as the team lost once and drew thrice under the Spaniard.

The Indian team ended the year with a 1-1 draw against Malaysia. In all, the side played 11 matches and suffered six losses in a forgettable year. The lack of results reflected in their rankings as the team slipped to 126 in the FIFA chart from 102 in December last year.

At club level, Mohun Bagan continued their dominance with the two teams winning the Shield and ISL title respectively.

There was, however, also a setback for Mohun Bagan who were considered 'withdrawn' from the AFC Champions League 2 after refusing to travel to Iran for their match against Tractor SC on October 2, citing security concerns amid political unrest in that part of the world.

The Asian Football Confederation (AFC) cancelled all of Mohun Bagan's matches in the competition, considering them null and void. This followed the club's goalless draw against Ravshan Kulob in their opening Group A match at Salt Lake Stadium.

The year proved to be a historic one for Odisha FC who secured a spot in the AFC Women's Champions League Group Stage after topping their preliminary stage group with two wins, including a 4-1 victory over Lion City Sailors and a 2-1 win against Etihad Club.

and using AIFF funds for personal expenses from the ousted Bhattacharjee.

Former India captain Bhaichung Bhutia also called for Chaubey's resignation citing 'issues' with AIFF's administration.

If that was not enough, the federation found itself embroiled in a new controversy over its handling of the broadcasting rights for the I-League 2024-25 season.

After initially entering into a deal with Sony for the coverage of matches, the AIFF abruptly switched to Shraci Sports, an inexperienced entity. The move led to sponsor concerns, with club owners threatening to withdraw teams if proper broadcasting arrangements aren't made.

The AIFF, though, denied any wrongdoing.

Future tense

The Indian team is currently in a transition phase, with head coach Marquez experimenting with various combinations and giving opportunities to a group of promising youngsters to identify the next No. 10.

However, the team remains unsettled, with the veteran duo of Gurpreet Singh Sandhu and Sandesh Jhingan carrying significant responsibility at the back.

Following a challenging year, Marquez faces the task of steering India to a third consecutive AFC Asian Cup qualification.

The Blue Tigers are placed in a competitive Group C and will face Hong Kong, Singapore, and Bangladesh after beginning their campaign on March 25 next year.

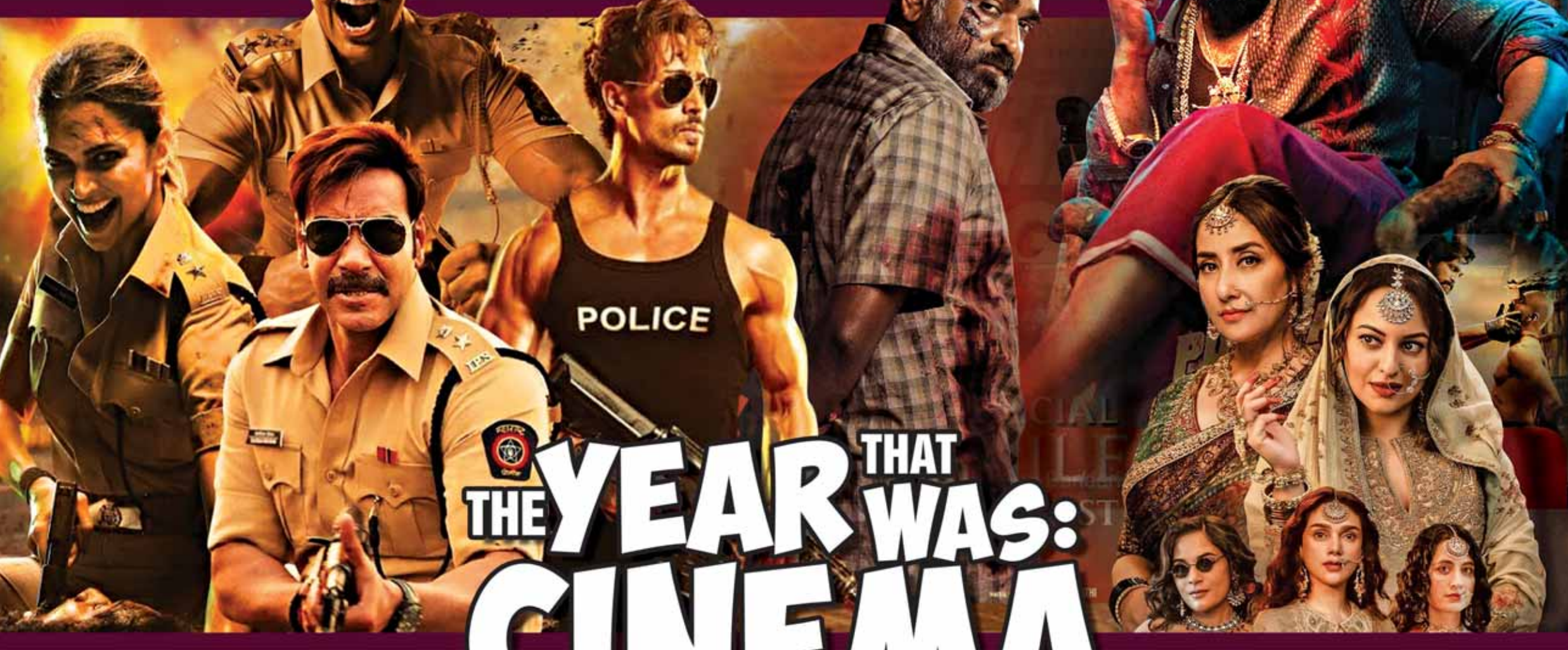

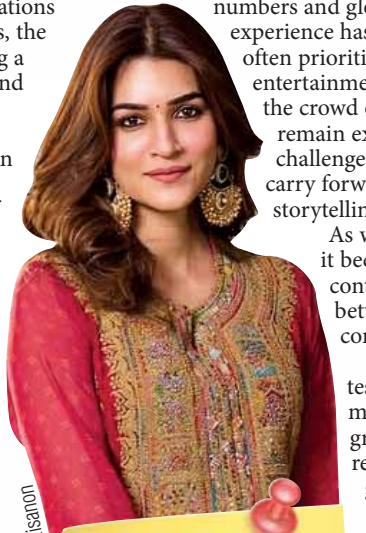

The Significance of Khar Maas



Khar Maas, a revered period in the Vedic calendar, begins on December 15, 2024, when the Sun enters Sagittarius and concludes on January 14, 2025, with its transition into Capricorn, marking the celebration of Makar Sankranti.
