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**BULLETS FIRED IN GOLDEN TEMPLE**

hiromani Akali Dal (SAD) Sleader and former Punjab Chief Minister Sukhbir Singh Badal on Wednesday escaped a brazen assassination attempt in Golden Temple when a former terrorist fired at him from a close range. However, the missed as a plainclothes policeman overpowered the assailant. He was identified as Narain Singh Chaura.

Badal, a 'Z Plus' protectee, who was serving as a guard at the Temple entrance as part of a religious punishment, is safe. Videos showed the wheelchair-bound leader, in a blue 'sewadar' uniform and holding a spear in one hand and a small board hung around his neck, acknowledging his "misdeeds". The attack, which took place around 9:30 am, was captured on cameras of media persons who had gathered to cover the second day of Badal performing the duty of 'sewadar' outside the shrine as penance for "mistakes" committed by the SAD government in Punjab from 2007 to 2017.

Television footage showed the shooter slowly walking towards Badal (62), who was sitting in a wheelchair due to a fractured leg, and pulling out a gun from his pocket. The weapon is reportedly a sophisticated 9mm pistol and sources said prima facie it

appeared to be a lone wolf attack. A police official in plainclothes standing near Badal quickly grabbed the attacker's hands and pushed him away. In the melee, a bullet hit the shrine's entrance wall behind Badal, who escaped unhurt.

Soon other security personnel and Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) task force members also intervened. Badal continued his penance after the attack, with a security ring thrown around him. His wife and Bathinda Member of Parliament Harsimrat Kaur Badal also reached the Golden Temple to meet him

The shooter Narain Singh Chaura, is a resident of Dera Baba Nanak, and a former terrorist owing allegiance to Babbar Khalsa International (BKI). After the attack, he was taken away by security officials, and arrested. Amritsar Police Commissioner

Gurpreet Singh Bhullar said the attack on Badal was foiled because of the alertness of police. Police official Rashpal Singh noticed Chaura first, as he is a former terrorist and has a criminal history.

When Chaura whipped out his weapon, Assistant Sub-Inspector Jasbir Singh and another police

official, Parminder Singh, held Chaura's hands and as a result, the bullet went upwards, said the commissioner. "Narain Singh Chaura has been arrested and an FIR has been registered against him. The weapon used in the attack has been recovered," Bhullar said, adding that the case will be investigated from all

angles. The motive behind the attack will be ascertained after Chaura's questioning. He came alone to the Golden Temple, he said. Responding to a question, Bhullar said the security deployment at the shrine was sufficient. Police cannot carry out frisking because religious sentiments are involved, he said.

Detailed security deployment had been made at the Golden Temple complex. Around 175 police personnel led by an assistant inspector general have been deployed

there, he said. ASI Jasbir Singh, whose brave act won him praise from all quarters, told reporters that he was only performing his duty.

Additional Deputy Commissioner Harpal Singh said police were alert and had been keeping an eye on the accused. "We had covered Sukhbir ji," he said. Chaura was here on Tuesday as well, the officer said.

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann directed police to thoroughly investigate the incident while opposition parties demanded his resignation over the "breakdown" of law and order in the state. Mann lauded police for their promptness in nabbing the attacker and termed it a 'great success". He said "Punjab Police prevented a major incident today. It is the result of the promptness of Punjab Police that the conspiracy to defame Punjab and Punjabis has failed," he said.

"I strongly condemn the attack on Sukhbir Badal ji. I have issued strict instructions to police to immediately investigate the incident and submit a report," he added.

Akal Takht Jathedar Giani Raghbir Singh said it was not an attack on Badal but on the 'sewadar' who was performing his duty outside the Golden Temple. SGPC chief 'SGPC chief Harjinder Singh Dhami said the "targeting" of Badal while performing religious service at the holv shrine was "extremely

saddening" and "immoral". Senior SAD leader Daljit Singh Cheema, who is also undergoing religious punishment, demanded Mann's resignation over the incident. "For Punjab, this is a big incident. Where are we taking the state? I want to ask the Punjab chief minister where Punjab is headed. It is a 100 per cent failure of law and order. The chief minister should resign," he told reporters. Cheema also demanded a judicial inquiry into the incident.

## Delhi boxer kills his entire family to avenge `insult'

According to police, the accused Ariun Tanwar alias Bunty's father had recently scolded him in public, and this proved to be the last straw for him. Arjun decided to kill his parents on their 27th anniversary to gain sympathy, and avoid any suspicion, police said. The deceased have been identified as 51-year-old Rajesh Kumar Tanwar, his 46-year-old wife Komal and their 23-year-old daughter Kavita.

According to police sources, Arjun, who has represented in the Delhi Olympics in boxing and earned a silver medal, executed the brutal

The Counter Intelligence Kashmir (CIK) and State Investigation Agency (SIA) of Jammu and Kashmir Police Wednesday busted an active terror module of proscribed terrorist organizations and recovered mobile phones/SIM cards and other incriminating documents during a surprise raid inside the Central Jail, Srinagar. More than 500 inmates are lodged inside one of the oldest Central Jails of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

The investigating agencies are also looking into the aspect of a major security breach of Central Jail premises as to how these digital communication devices reached the jail premises. According to a statement issued by the Jammu and Kashmir police, the searches at Central Jail, Srinagar were conducted in pursuance to a search warrant issued by

Delhi breathed almost clean air on Wednesday, after a gap of 50 days, as the Air Quality Index (AQI) was recorded in the 'moderate' category. The 24-hour average Air Quality Index (AQI) of the city was recorded at 178 at 4 pm, registering an improvement from 268 on Tuesday. Many people are hoping to get relaxation from the GRAP IV restrictions when the matter comes up for

hearing in the Supreme Court on Thursday. Earlier, the AQI was recorded

in the 'moderate' category with a reading of 198 on October 15. However, the AQI had deteriorated and shifted to the 'poor' category the following day, according to Central Pollution Control Board data. Najafgarh was the least air polluted area with an air quality index of 112 while Mundka was the most polluted area with an AQI

Speaking about the improved air quality, an official of the Meteorological India Department said strong surface winds were forecast in the city on Wednesday. The winds will blow till December 7, when a new western disturbance is expected, which will lead to moderate

fog starting December 8. Of the 38 air quality monitoring stations in the city, only Sri Aurobindo Marg reported air quality in the very poor' category on Wednesday, while eight others showed air quality in the 'poor' category. The remaining reported air 'moderate' air quality, according to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB).

### Didi clips Abhishek's wings, asserts her leadership

Forcing the message down the party line as to who the real boss in the Trinamool Congress (TMC) is, West Bengal Chief Minister (CM) Mamata Banerjee has taken some administrative decisions, making it loud and clear that her decision will be final in all spheres.

To begin with the CM has reportedly decided to snap her partv's ties with the professional election managers India Political Action Committee (I-PAC) of Prashant Kishore, who was imported into the state politics by her nephew Abhishek Banerjee five years ago.

Dealing out an assertive message regarding the party command structure during a meeting of a select few, Banerjee said that she was still in command and that she would continue to remain the final word on the party.

"I am still here. I am the final word (in the party). Connect with the people. Speak less, work more. All the decisions will be taken by Bakshi da (former MP Subrata Bakshi) and I," Banerjee said without uttering the name of Abhishek Banerjee, the party general secretary, who is often seen as the CM's successor to the Bengal masnad.

She stopped short of asserting her dislike for the recent chorus in the party in favour of Abhishek, whom many wanted to leaders be

appointed as her deputy Saying that no one should share any information with any "Pack" and that the TMC workers were enough to win elections without any outside "package" Banerjee said that "I am not bothered about these PAC-facs. A lot of incorrect information is coming ... But will decide on the information I get ... so don't share any information with any Pack

CM's The statement apparently was aimed at I-PAC, insiders said, adding the election consultants were likely to work in Delhi with another political party and there was "good possibility of leaving Prashant TMC Kishore.

I-PAC was imported to Bengal politics by Abhishek Banerjee after the 2019 General Elections, which saw the TMC's fortunes dwindle to just 20 seats compared to the Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) 18. In fact, it was the junior Banerjee who introduced Kishore to the CM at state secretariat Nabanna. In 2021 Banerjee roared back to power with a thumping majority and much of the credit was given to the poll consultancy firm. Subsequent to 2021's electoral success the general secretary's office and I-PAC gained in

prominence and height, while Abhishek used the election consultants for conduct electoral surveys advertisements and election campaigns sidelining the

### Opposition protests new railway bill, claims will be used to privatise carrier

Opposition MPs Wednesday said the ment should not privatise Indian Railways as it will hurt the interest of poor people and demanded that concession for senior citizens be restored.

The Bill that seeks to simplify the legal framework in the Railways Act, 1989, however received strong backing from NDA partners, including the TDP, Janata Dal (United), and the LJP (Ram Vilas), in the Lok Sabha on Wednesday. However, the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) partners also highlighted areas that need attention, particularly passenger safety and concessions for senior citizens.

for Railways Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said the number of rail accidents has come down from 171 during UPA regime to 40 in 2023-24. In the current fiscal, 29 rail

accidents have taken place so

Minister was replying during the debate on Railways (Amendment) Bill 2024 bill in Lok Sabha, which proposes to simplify the legal framework by incorporating the proposals of the Indian Railway Board Act, 1905 in the Railways Act, 1989. This will reduce the need to refer to two laws. Also, the Rail Budget has been hiked in 10 years from Rs 29,000 crore in 2014 to Rs 2.52 lakh crore, he said. Neeraj Maurva (SP) said the Government should have sent this bill to an all-party committee for deliberation. Manoj Kumar (INC) claimed that after the passage of the Bill, the government would look for scope to privatise railways. Bapi Haldar (TMC) demanded that rail ticket concessions to senior citizens, which was withdrawn during Covid, be restored. Moving the Bill for discussion, Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said the efficiency

of Indian Railways will improve with the passage of the Bill.

Earlier during the Question Hour, replying to the demands of MPs demanding better facilities, Minister for Railways Ashwini Vaishnaw said Prime Minister Narendra Modi is focusing on the improvement of services of the general coach passengers and, as part of the process, 1000 more general coaches will be added to the railway network by the end of this month. He said the Railways is also planning to build 10,000 additional general compartment coaches in the coming years. "Prime coming years. "Prime Minister Narendra Modi's focus is to improve the services of the general class coaches. As part of the exercise, 1000 more general coaches will be added by the railways by the end of December. Our focus is more on general coaches rather than AC second or AC 3rd class coaches," he said during

the Question Hour. TDP MP GM Harish Balayogi

praised the Bill for its potential. transformative "This Bill marks a significant step towards shedding outdated colonial laws and replacing them with futuristic indigenous,

legislation. It introduces essential changes to streamline administrative and legal procedures, empowering the Railway

Board," he said. Janata Dal (United) MP Kaushalendra Kumar lauded safety measures such as the Kavach automatic train protection system but urged the government to address lingering issues. Shrirang Barne of the Shiv Sena echoed the call for benefits for senior citizens, reminding Parliament that concessions were standard practice before the pandemic. LJP (Ram Vilas) MP Rajesh Verma called for an expansion of mechanised laundries across all railway divisions.

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Wednesday accused Congress MP Rahul Gandhi of enacting a drama over his visit to Sambhal to "appease" the party's Muslim vote bank. The Uttar Pradesh police stopped Gandhi at the Delhi-UP border today, preventing him from visiting the violence-hit city in the BJP-ruled State. BJP's national spokesperson Sudhanshu Trivedi said Gandhi wanted to visit Sambhal without giving prior intimation authorities. He said the Congress and the Samajwadi Party were fighting for Muslim votes.

"Rahul Gandhi had gone there without taking his partner in the INDI Alliance with him just to grab media attention. There is a conflict going on between the two parties,' Trivedi said in an apparent reference to the Congress and the Samajwadi party. Trivedi said Gandhi did not try to visit Sambhal out of "any sympathy" but to grab media attention and get a "better photo-op" than the leaders of ĥis party's ally Samajwadi Party.

Trivedi said Gandhi, who is the Leader of the Opposition in Lok Sabha, was required to give a prior intimation to the authorities about his visit because he has been the "highest level of security" after the Prime Minister. "Rahul Gandhi has Z-plus ASL security. ASL means advanced security liaison. This is the highest level of security after the prime minister's. Only the Home Minister and the Defence Minister have this besides security him (Gandhi)," he said.

This so-called yatra of the Congress was motivated by mutual competition among the parties in the INDI alliance to capture and get hold of the core vote. 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## Peace in border areas pre-requisite for developing ties with China: EAM

 $E_{\rm Jaishankar}^{\rm xternal\,Affairs\,Minister\,S}$ said in the Rajya Sabha peace and tranquility in border areas is a pre-requisite for the development of bilateral ties with China and the two side will be discussing de-escalation and effective management of activities in these areas in the coming days,

He made these assertions while making a statement on India-China relations. A brief uproar was also wit-nessed following the statement and Opposition MPs walked out of the House after Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar, disallowed them from seeking some clarifications.

Jaishankar, while making a statement on "Recent Developments in India's Relations with China", also

said disengagement has now been achieved in full in eastern Ladakh through a step-

by-step process, culminating in Depsang and Demchok. He had earlier made an identical statement in the Lok Sabha on Tuesday. Jaishankar, in his statement,

said India was and remains very clear that the three key principles must be observed in all circumstances, he said explaining: "one: both sides should strictly respect and observe the Line of Actual Control (LAC), two: neither side should attempt to unilaterally alter the status quo, and three: agreements and understandings reached in the past must be fully abided by in their entirety"

"Our relationship had progressed in many domains, but was obviously negatively affected by recent events. We are clear that the mainte-



nance of peace and tranquility in border areas is a preof our ties. In the coming

Over one lakh positions vacant in CAPFs, AR: Government | Were OCCRP's Adani reports funded by US agencies?

Over one lakh positions are vacant in Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) and Assam Rifles (AR), Rajya Sabha was informed on Wednesday. The total posted strength of CAPF and AR was 9,48,204 as on September 30, according to the Union Home Ministry data.

Minister of State for Home Affairs Nityanand Rai said the government is taking steps to fill the vacancies expeditiously.

It has created 71,231 new posts in the CAPFs and AR in the last five years, according to the data provided by Rai in a written response to a question.

The minister said vacancies in CAPFs and AR arise on account of retirements, resignations, promotions, deaths, the raising of a new battalion, the creation of new posts, etc,

The data cited by the minister shows that 42,797 CAPF and AR personnel have availed 100 days' leave in a year between 2020 and Óctober 2024.

To a question on financial a question on financial assistance provided to mar-tyred CAPF and AR person-nel through the Bharat ke Veer portal, the minister said financial assistance of Rs 25 lakh in addition to other financial entitlements is being provided to next of kin (NoKs) of martyrs through the portal.

French newspaper 'Mediapart' in an investigative piece published on Monday has revealed about its ties with the US government and certain

vested stakeholders. "While the OCCRP does indicate on its website that it receives funding from the US Department of State, and notably from the US Agency for International Development, USAID, it conceals the extent of the funding and the strings attached to it from its media partners, journalists and the wider public. The US government financing is never mentioned in OCCRP-produced articles," the French newspaper mentioned.

It mentioned OCCRP receives OCCRP has funded a proa huge share of funding from gramme which uses investigacertain stakeholders from United States including US Agency for International Development (USAID). "The OCCRP has omitted from its official history the role played by the US government in its creation, only mentioning the funding by the UN. Sullivan responds to that by underlin-ing that the UN Democracy Fund payment was indeed the the first that the NGO received,"

Mediapart stated. Since its inception, OCCRP has received at least \$47 million from the US government, \$14 million from European countries (Britiain, Sweden, Switzerland, Denmark, Slovakia and France) and 1.1 million from the European Union. Stalled MGNREGS funds:

Centre not discriminating

With funds under the flag-ship MGNREGS stalled for West Bengal for more than two years now, Union Rural Development Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Wednesday said the Centre is not discriminating against the state, which he blamed for not complying with the Union government's directives

His comments comes a day after the Trinamool Congress (TMC) and the central government clashed in Parliament over the disbursal of funds under the MNREGA to the State, after TMC MP Kalyan Banerjee claimed in the Lok Sabha that the West Bengal government is yet to receive funds under the central scheme for the fiscal years 2022-2023 and 2023-2024.

The funds for West Bengal under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGN-REGS) have been stopped since March 2022 due to non-compliance of directives of the Central government, according to the Ministry of Rural Development.

Asked what is the way forward, Chouhan told reporters at a press conference here, "We are concerned about the poor people in West Bengal as well. We have asked for certain compli-ances, and if the state fulfils them, we will consider it".

Chouhan also said the state has been provided funds under other schemes such as the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY).

"West Bengal has received funds under PM Sadak Yojana

because there were no discrepancies in that. We give funds for a purpose. If that pur-

security. pose is not met, if names of schemes are changed, non-eligible people are made beneficiaries, standards are not followed, should we not ask for answers? Should we keep giv-ing money," Chouhan asked. "The Centre has the right to conduct a probe. It was done, irregularities were found, so we had to take action," he said.

The minister added that action will be taken if similar irregularities are found in other states.

While replying during the Question Hour in the Lok Sabha on Tuesday, Chouhan strongly refuted Trinamool Congress member Kalyan Banerjee's allegation that Central funds under various welfare schemes were not released to West Bengal.

Chouhan also accused the West Bengal government of diverting Central funds and making "undeserving" people benefi-ciaries of welfare schemes.

"It has been demonstrated that non-beneficiaries have been registered as beneficiaries, and vice versa, under this scheme. The names of village development schemes were changed, which is not permissible. For instance, they committed an offence by renaming the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana as their own. Furthermore, benefits intended for beneficiaries have been given to non-beneficiaries," Chouhan had said in Parliament on Tuesday. The Supreme Court on Wednesday observed that the Uttar Pradesh Gangsters and Anti-Social Activities (Prevention) Act appeared to be "draconian". The observation by a bench of Justices Gavai and KV BR Viswanathan came while it was hearing a plea filed by a man who has challenged a May 2023 Allahabad High Court order dismissing his application seeking to set aside proceedings against him pending before a District Court in Kasganj in a case registered under the Act. "This Act appears to be draconian," the apex court observed. "We will consider it," the bench said while admitting the appeal. While hearing the matter in November last year, the SC had sought responses from the Uttar Pradesh Government and others on the plea and said, "By way of ad-interim order, no coercive steps be taken against the petitioner qua Gangster Act." On Wednesday the petition-

booked in the case under the provisions of the 1986 Act on allegations of illegal mining in the Ganga river. The counsel argued that earlier, another FIR related to alleged illegal mining was registered. "They have booked me twice for the same allegation," the lawyer argued.

The counsel appearing for the State referred to the provi-sions of the 1986 Act. "It requires consideration," the bench said, adding that a separate plea challenging the constitutional validity of certain provisions of the Act was also pending adjudication before it. Before the High

Court, the counsel appearing for the petitioner argued that he was falsely implicated in the case lodged under the Gangsters Act.

His counsel had claimed before the high court that the case has been lodged under the Gangsters Act only on the basis of another case in which the petitioner has not been named.

On November 29, the top court agreed to hear a separate plea challenging the validity of certain provisions of the Act and issued notice to the Uttar Pradesh government seeking its response on the petition.

Narain Singh Chaura, the shooter who fired at Sukhbir Singh Badal, had crossed over to Pakistan in 1984 and was instrumental in smuggling large consignments of weapons and explosives into Punjab, it was learnt. More than 20 cases were registered against him. In Pakistan, Chaura reportedly authored a book on guerrilla warfare and "seditious" literature. He was also accused in the Burail jailbreak case. He has already served a jail term in Punjab.

In the sensational Burail jail-break case of 2004, four inmates, including assassins of former Punjab Chief Minister Beant Singh, escaped after digging a 94-foot tunnel. Chaura has been booked in around a dozen cases in Amritsar, Tarn Taran and Ropar districts.

Chaura, associated with the Akal Federation, studied at the Sikh Missionary College in Amritsar and holds a



Master's degree in Political Science. He has authored several books, including his recently released work Khalistan Virudh Sajish. Chaura is also known for translating the speeches of Jarnail Singh Bhindranwale. He has a long history of involvement in militancy and Khalistani activities. Born on April 4, 1956, in the village of Chaura near Dera Baba Nanak (Gurdaspur), he is allegedly linked to organizations such as the Khalistan Liberation Force and the Akal

Federation. Chaura is accused of aiding

the masterminds of the Burail jailbreak case by providing clothes and other supplies to the prisoners.  $A^{n\,expedition\,team\,from\,the}_{Sikkim\ government's}$ Science & Technology Department on Wednesday reached Muguthang in North Sikkim's Lhonak valley to assess the impact of glacial floods and its mitigation through various measures, officials said.

The team investigated whether Lhonak lake's behaviour was aligned with typical patterns of glacial floods which carry debris, sediment and boulders with massive destructive potential, officials said.

The study team observed that flood water from Lhonak lake slowed down as it passed through the wide areas of the valley between Goma and Dolma Sampa sections.

This natural dissipation of force caused debris deposition, reducing the flood's destructive impact downstream, the officials said.

### No love lost

The relations between India and Bangladesh are on the ebb and if steps are not taken now, could deteriorate further

he relations between India and Bangladesh, long characterised by cultural ties and strategic cooperation, have soured in recent months. Protests, diplomatic outrage and heightened security concerns are the latest manifestations of the growing rift between the two neighbours. The arrest of a Hindu monk in Bangladesh has sparked unrest, further straining ties that have been under pressure since the ousting of former Bangladeshi Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in August 2024. The minority has historically faced discrimination and sporadic violence, often exacerbated by political upheavals. Sheikh Hasina's government, in power until her abrupt ousting in August, was seen as somewhat supportive of minorities, though her critics argue this support was inconsistent. Hasina's exit, triggered by mass protests against alleged corruption and authoritarianism, plunged Bangladesh into political instability. The arrest of Hindu monk Chinmoy Krishna Das in Bangladesh has reignit-



ed long-standing grievances about the treatment of minorities in the country. Das was detained on charges of sedition and inciting unrest during an October protest advocating minority rights in Chittagong. His denied bail and the subsequent delay of his hearing until January 2025 have escalated tensions.

This has led to protests in India, headed by Hindu organisations and supported by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). These protests culminated in an attack on the Bangladeshi consulate in Agartala, causing significant diplomatic fallout. The vandalism at the consulate prompted sharp criticism from Dhaka,

which labeled the incident 'heinous' and demanded stringent action from India. Bangladesh also summoned Indian High Commissioner in Dhaka to show its displeasure over the incident. Meanwhile, Indian authorities, while condemning the attack and increasing security for Bangladeshi diplomatic missions, have struggled to contain public sentiment. In Dhaka, the storming of the consulate sparked counter-protests, with students and activists condemning the incident and demanding accountability from India. The situation has become a flashpoint for nationalist and religious tensions on both sides. The strained relations carry significant risks. For India, Bangladesh is a vital partner in maintaining border security and managing regional stability. The two countries share deep economic ties and cultural connections, making any prolonged estrangement costly. However, mutual trust has eroded. While Indian side urge Bangladesh to address violence against minorities, Bangladeshi officials accuse Indian media of propagating disinformation. Both nations have had good relations and they must urgently de-escalate tensions. Resolving the immediate crisis surrounding the monk's arrest, addressing minority rights concerns in Bangladesh, and curbing inflammatory rhetoric in India are critical steps.



## Election results challenge the Opposition unity


The electoral setbacks have exposed fractures within the INDIA alliance while the BJP has emerged stronger after the recently held state elections

he aftermath of the recent election results in Maharashtra and Jharkhand has led to cracks within the Opposition coalition known as the INDIA alliance. Following these disappointing results, some partners in the INDIA bloc, such as the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and the Trinamool Congress, are focusing on their agendas and show little interest in collaborating for the current winter session of Parliament. AAP chief Kejriwal has announced that his party will go solo in Delhi Assembly polls, ruling out tie-up with Congress. The INDIA bloc hoped to con-solidate anti-BJP votes in the capital.

Still, Kejriwal's announcement signals a potential fracture in unity. Additionally, it seems unlikely that the Uddhav Thackeray coalition will work together in the upcoming civic election. Consequently, the immediate concern for these partners is to unite and collaborate effectively. However, achieving this is proving to be quite challenging. Every political party makes mis-

takes, but the successful ones learn and improve. The INDIA bloc aimed to defeat the BJP in the Lok Sabha polls, ultimately allowing the BJP to form a government with support from the JD(U) and the Telugu Desam Party. The Assembly polls lacked a joint strategy. Two key points stand out in the recent elections in Maharashtra and Jharkhand. First is the significant victory of the BJP-led NDA in Maharashtra.

Second is the ease with which Hemant Soren retained his position in Jharkhand despite being jailed on allegations of corruption.Another important ques-tion is whether the Congress, NCP and the Uddhav faction of the Shiv Sena misinterpreted the signals on the ground. Did the BJP make errors in Jharkhand? The recent results reveal missed growth opportunities.It could



entirely under the control of Rahul Gandhi, the Leader of the Opposition, and his chosen associates. Rahul worked hard and campaigned, but the party could not deliver. The results suggest they have yet to learn from the recent Haryana Assembly elections, such as relying heavily on one leader, ignoring the others, and the wrong distribution of tickets despite being in a winning position.

The most crucial aspect the Congress Party, NCP and the Uddhav fsction of Shiv Sena must address is the narrative. For the Congress, the focus on caste issues, defending the Constitution, and making personal attacks on the Prime Minister has not resonated with the voters. This disconnect is a clear sign that the party needs to reevaluate its strategy and focus on issues that truly matter to the electorate, such as the bread and butter issues.

It is a pressing concern that needs alignment. Even earlier, Rahul Gandhi's Gandhi's attack on Savarkar did not garner any support for Congress; instead, it created friction between the Shiv and Congress. These parties

Elections in India happen almost continuously in various states, which means the election season never truly ends. The next significant event will be the Rajya Sabha elections for six seats on December 20. The National Democratic Alliance (NDA) is expected to win five of these six seats. At the same time, the Trinamool Congress is likely to secure one. If this prediction holds, the NDA will gain a majority in the Upper House, which could weaken the Congress Party's position in Parliament. There are currently eight vacancies: four in the nomination category and four in Jammu and Kashmir.Elections around the world highlight both victories and defeats. Each election offers valuable lessons regarding the suc-cesses and mistakes of the candidates and parties involved. These outcomes are not exclusively driven by generational change, as change is a constant process. Future generations must strive to advance their party. ### **DELHI NEEDS TO BE DECONGESTED**

Madam — Delhi's role as India's political capital and administrative nerve centre has created a lopsided dependence on a single city, which is becoming increasingly untenable for several reasons. Delhi is overcrowded and heavily polluted, with air quality regularly breaching hazardous levels. This is posing several health risks to its residents, particularly children and the elderly, leading to long-term implications for public health. Basic amenities like water and electricity are stretched thin. Traffic congestion and overburdened public transportation systems result in wasted time and reduced productivity. Concentrating the country's entire administrative apparatus in one city makes it vulnerable to dangers of terrorism, natural disasters and other calamities. The concentration of central government offices in Delhi, apart from inflating property prices, skews economic activity and perpetuates regional inequal-

The idea is not to displace Delhi as the national capital entirely but only to distribute its administrative load. The toplevel officials of all the ministries and departments may be retained in Delhi for administrative convenience. Ministries and departments within ministries could be relocated to different cities/towns best suited for their focus areas, avoiding already congested metros like Bengaluru and ensuring balanced regional development. The government may start with a pilot involving one or two ministries, followed by an evaluation of costs, benefits, and scalability. Advances in IT and communication enable virtual conferences and seamless coordination, making physical proximity less critical. The conduct of G-20 meetings last year successfully should give the government confidence to take off in this direction.Decentralising national capital is not merely an administrative adjustment; it is also a transformative step toward equitable development and stronger governance.

### **SVABHAVNA: A PATH TO TRANSFORMATION**

Our innate nature is both, a defining force in our lives and a formidable adversary

e are born with it. Nature ('svabhava') is what we have done in earlier lives and our deep desires, which are still unfulfilled. It is part of our fate and big events, both good and bad ('prarabdha'). Svabhava defines us. Character, personality, behaviour, moods, attitude, opinions, faith, preferences, how we decide, how we interact and what we care about, all have links with our natures. Spiritually speaking, three modes ('gunas') constitute this. They are present in every person in different percentages.

For example, a good man will have more of the goodness mode; not a good man will have more of the mode of darkness and the rest will fall in between. However, these modes always compete for supremacy. "Goodness become predominant by overpowering passion and darkness; darkness becomes predominant by overpowering even goodness and passion; and passion becomes predominant by overpowering goodness and darkness." (The Bhagavad-Geeta 14.10)This is what happens with good people.

Temporarily, their thinking and actions come under darkness, and they behave lustily, angrily, etc. Compare this with what happens with bad people, who naturally behave badly. Only when the mode of goodness gains ascendency they behave better. Unfortunately, a common man falls in between, and he has many faults in his svabhava. What does he normally do? He wishes to enjoy his senses as much as possible; likes to avoid duties; tries to act smart, even resorts to cheating; feels superior; laughs at others; and hates suffering, whenever



it comes, blames others for it. This is not so bad as to come under negative emotions like lust, anger, greed, hate, etc. Driven by them, one acts badly and becomes deserving of punishment. For example, when lust overpowers, one crosses limits ('maryada') and does what will taint for life. A greedy person thinks nothing beyond gaining more and wastes precious human life. Anger raises its ugly head when lust is denied. (18.66) And hate, when it is uncontrolled, dooms a person. (16.19)Therefore, one has to be very careful at all times. Svabhava, which controls our thinking and surely our actions can be our worst enemy. What can be done to safeguard ourselves? The very first thing is to introspect at all times. Are my deep desires faulty? Am I crossing social norms? Am I violating dharma? Am I avoiding duties? We will find that we are. Then, what is to be done? Can I control myself? Maybe, a little, but not fully. Am I stuck? Yes and no. Yes, because drastic change in nature is not possible, as svabhava is part of our destiny, just like big occurrences such as losing one's job will come and we cannot stop them from coming. No, as God is very merciful, He has left an opening in both cases. If one takes shelter from God sincerely, God helps one to come out of all one's troubles (18.58) As far as nature goes, God can help change it for the better if one is determined. This is tough and a slow process, but doable. What is the conclusion? We have a problem with our natures. Whether it is lust or anger or greed or hate or overinflated ego, we are well and truly stuck. Therefore, rush to God's shelter, i.e. get started to please Him now. Let God be convinced that you are determined; He will surely help. And when we do that, those around us will also begin to have some inspiration from us, rather than trying to correct one another, which is an impossibility

## COP29: A disappointing climate finance deal

COP29, held in Baku, Azerbaijan, left developing nations frustrated over unmet climate finance commitment making chances of climate reversal bleak



NFCCC's COP29 concluded in Baku, Azerbaijan on November 24, leaving the vulnerable countries disappointed in the deal made in climate finance. The deal was announced by the Presidency to mobilise \$300 million annually by 2035 as against the \$ 1.3 trillion tar-get put forth by developing nations, which was also supported by India. Developed countries have abandoned the global south, and have to muster their resources for mitigation and adaptation towards the challenges of the climatic crisis.

It is more than three decades that Scientists have been constantly reminding us of the transition of our energy dependency from coal, oil and gas to solar, wind and other renewables. Burning of fossil fuels ever since industrialisation began in 2019 has caused the cumulative emission of 2400 gigabits (Gt) of CO2 equivalent greenhouse gases (CO2, methane, oxides of nitrogen and fluorocarbons - measured as CO2 equivalent). It was also added that an additional 500 Gt would warm the planet by 1.50 C above the preindustrial level leading to frequent and destructive climate events like cyclones, cloudbursts, forest fires, floods, droughts and heat waves disrupting our lives and liveli-Despite such a warning, global annual emis-sion is nearly 40 Gt of CO2 equivalent. World Meteorological Organization (WMO) has found 2023 as the warmest year in recorded history and evident from the data till September 2024 is set to register a new temperature record. United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) has brought all 200 countries together to review actions on their pledges in the annual conference of parties (COP). At COP29 held in Paris in 2015, countries made certain pledges to be fulfilled by 2030 about cutting dependency on fossil fuels, transitioning towards renewables and providing finance to vulnerable countries for adaptation and mitigation etc. G20 countries which contribute 80 per cent of the global emissions and also hold 85 per cent of global GDP have become rich at the cost of global warming. Except for India, none of the G20 countries is on course to fulfil NDC pledges by 2030. South Asian, African and island countries have been the most vulnerable and greatest suf-

ferers of extreme climate events and have been deprived of adequate funds for adaptation and mitigation. It was resolved at the COP held in 2009 in Copenhagen that developed nations would provide climate finance of \$100 billion to vulnerable countries annually with effect from 2020, but only \$400 million was provided till 2022. The annual \$100 billion fund committed by developed nations is set to continue till 2035 and only after that, it would be \$300 billion. Though the Paris climate deal set in 2015 called for an upward revision of the annual fund of \$100 billion in 2025, the Baku conference did not EXCEPT FOR respect it and revised it only with effect from 2035.

Brazil 122, Indonesia 101 and India 89. The cumulative figure of China has recently gone passed the EU. At present annual emissions of China have been 14 Gt, the US 8 Gt, the EU 6 Gt and India under 3 Gt. China's cumulative emission is 213 Gt behind the US and as it closes the gap by 6 Gt every year, it would take 36 years at this rate to surpass the US's cumulative emission. Developed countries that con-tributed to 2400 Gt cumulative emission have announced measures and pledged to cut emissions, but their action is not visible on the ground and the emissions are rising every year. Also, there has been an expansion of oil and gas production in the EU, US, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Iran, Russia etc. and many fold expansion of coal in China. Developed countries that want bigger economies like China, India, Indonesia, Brazil, and Saudi Arabia should also contribute to climate finance towards NCQG. China's scuttling this move is unjustified.

would be severely impacted. The delegates from developing nations voiced anger and lambasted wealthy nations for not doing enough. The rich countries responsible for warming the planet are now leaving vulnerable countries in the lurch to face the consequences. Starting from 2005, Carbon trading has been increasing exponentially, but a lot of fraudulent accounting and greenwashing have under-mined its credibility.

Rule 6 dealing with the carbon market needed some resolution and the same was pending for the last few COPs, although the funds are quite useful for climate mitigation works. COP29 cleared this long pending agreement allowing countries to trade carbon credits - certified reductions of carbon emissions at prices determined as a consequence of emission caps imposed by the countries. It has also been agreed that the operations of the carbon market would be supervised by the

UN body. Strict UN control is needed, as a project proponent in the developed nation can pay for an afforestation project to absorb 1000 tons of CO2 in a developing nation where trees fail to put in desired growth and are unable to sequester the entire quantity of carbon credited. Further, whether the countries claim credit generated across borders and also whether it can be counted in their NDC? Last year at Dubai COP 28 it was agreed to transition away from fossil fuel consumption, but none of the developed nations have demonstrated to cut the emissions. It is distressing that COP29 did not take up a review. The leading economies are consuming fossil fuels increasingly, without bothering about disastrous consequences. I recommend countries to slow down GDP growth, till renewable energy is fully developed.

## **Oppn parties in S Korea move to impeach President**

South Korea's opposition par-ties Wednesday submitted a motion to impeach President Yoon Suk Yeol over the shock ing and short-lived martial law that drew heavily armed troops to encircle parliament before lawmakers climbed walls to reenter the building and unanimously voted to lift his order. Impeaching Yoon would require the support of twothirds of parliament, and at least six justices of the nine-member Constitutional Court would have to endorse it to remove him from office.

The motion, submitted jointly by the main liberal opposition Democratic Party and five smaller opposition parties, could be put to a vote as early as Friday.

Yoon's senior policy advisers and Defense Minster Kim Yong Hyun offered to resign as the nation struggles to make sense of what appeared to be a poorly-thought-out stunt. The Democratic Party on Wednesday submitted a sepa-

rate motion to impeach Kim, who it alleged recommended the martial law declaration to Yoon

In his speech announcing the abrupt order Tuesday night, Yoon vowed to eliminate "antistate" forces and continued to criticise the Democratic Party's attempts to impeach key gov-ernment officials and senior prosecutors. But martial law lasted only about six hours, as the National Assembly voted to overrule Yoon before his Cabinet formally lifted it around 4:30 am. The Democratic Party, which holds a majority in the 300-seat parliament, said Wednesday that its lawmakers decided to call on Yoon to quit immediately or they would take steps to

It wasn't clear how the 190 lawmakers were able to enter a parliamentary hall to vote down Yoon's martial law decree.

Opposition leader Lee Jae-myung and National Assembly Speaker Woo Won Shik were seen climbing over walls. As troops and police officers blocked some from entering, they didn't aggressively restrain or use force against others.

No major violence has been reported. The troops and police personnel were later seen leaving the grounds of the National Assembly after the parliamentary vote to lift the martial law. Woo said: "Even with our unfortunate memories of military coups, our citizens have surely observed the events of today and saw the maturity of our military.

Under South Korea's constitution, the president can declare martial law during "wartime, war-like situations or other comparable national emergency states" that require the use of military force to restrict the freedom of press, assembly and other rights to maintain order. Many observers question whether South Korea is currently in such a state. The constitution also states that the president must oblige when the National Assembly demands the lifting of martial

law with a majority vote. A presidential official said that Yoon decided to impose martial law as a way to resolve a political deadlock and did it in the middle of night to minimise its negative impacts on the economy. The official requested anonymity to discuss sensitive nature of the issue.

Some experts say Yoon clearly violated the constitution in how he imposed martial law. While martial law allows "special measures" to restrict individual freedoms and the authority of agencies and courts, the constitution does not permit the functions of parliament to be restricted.

Manila (AP): A group led by left-wing activists filed a second impeachment complaint against the Philippine vice president on Wednesday over her alleged misuse of government funds and demanded that she be permanently barred from holding public office.

The impeachment complaint filed by at least 74 activists, including human rights, labour and student leaders, before the House of Representatives reflects the extent of the political hostilities faced by Vice President Sara Duterte. She did not immediately comment on the new impeachment complaint or an earlier one filed Monday.

Duterte, a 46-year-old lawyer, is the daughter of also-controversial former President Rodrigo Duterte, who oversaw a bloody anti-drug crackdown while in office. The killing of thousands of suspects during the crackdown is being investigated by the International Criminal Court as a possible crime against human-

### **Jewish settlers attack Palestinian** towns, clash with Israeli troops

The war in Gaza began when Hamas-led militants stormed into southern Israel on October 7, 2023, killing some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and taking around 250 people hostage Israel's blistering retaliatory offensive has killed at least 44,500 Palestinians, more than half of them women and children, according to Gaza's Health Ministry, which does not say how many of the dead were combatants. Israel says it has killed over 17,000 militants,

Jewish settlers mounted a string of attacks on Palestinian towns in the occupied West Bank overnight, burning homes and clashing with Israeli troops. There were no immediate reports of any Palestinian casualties.

The Israeli military said one group entered the village, where they threw stones and burned property. An Associated Press reporter saw a blackened home and a destroyed car on Wednesday

morning. The military said Jewish settlers attacked the village of Beit Furik after troops arrived in the area to dismantle an unauthorized farming outpost they had built nearby on land privately

tigating the settler attacks. They said they arrested eight Israelis for suspected property damage and assaulting security forces.

The West Bank has seen a surge in settler violence since the start of the war, which was triggered by Hamas' Oct. 7, 2023 attack into Israel. Settlers have also raced to establish new farming outposts that rights groups say are among the biggest drivers of the violence.

The UN's humanitarian office said settler attacks on Palestinian farmers during the recent olive harvest season "at least tripled" in 2024 compared to the last three years. İsrael captured the West Bank the Gaza Strip and east Jerusalem in the 1967 Mideast war. The Palestinians want al three territories for an independent state.

Palestinian medics said an Israeli airstrike on the Gaza Strip killed at least five people, including four children, on Wednesday.

Bangladesh interim govern-ment's Chief Adviser Muhammad Yunus has said the Sheikh Hasina regime "destroyed everything", as he pledged to hold general elections only after ushering in constitutional and judicial reforms, Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha reported on Wednesday citing an interview he gave to a Japanese newspaper. The 84-year-old Nobel laureate, in an interview with Nikkei Asia, said, "We need comprehensive reforms in the economy, governance, bureaucracy and judiciary (before holding elections)."

Yunus also reiterated that India should extradite Hasina once her trial in the International Crimes Tribunal in Bangladesh concludes. "Once the trial concludes and

a verdict is reached, we will formally request India to hand her over," Yunus said, adding that under an international law signed by both countries, "India would be obligated to comply.

The chief adviser also said the Indian government's concern about the safety of Hindus is not based on facts as much of what's being said is "propaganda". The relations between the



two neighbours have deteriorated ever since the ouster of Sheikh Hasina as prime minister in August with India expressing concern over Hindus and other minorities being targeted in Bangladesh and aggravated further with the arrest of the Hindu monk Chinmoy Krishna Das last week. Nepal and China on Wednesday signed the much-awaited Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) Cooperation Framework, an agreement which is expected to pave the way for the implementation of the BRI projects. The agreement was inked during Prime Minister K P Sharma Oli's official visit to China - his first official visit to that country after assuming office for the fourth time."Today, we signed the Framework for Belt & Roads Cooperation. As my official visit to China concludes, I am honoured to reflect on the bilateral talks with Premier Li Qiang, discussions with NPC Chairman Zhang Leji, and the highly fruitful meeting with President Xi Jinping," Prime Minister Oli posted on X. The Nepal-China economic cooperation will further strengthen under the Belt and Road Framework Cooperation, he added. The BRI framework agreement was inked by Foreign Secretary Amrit Bahadur Rai and Liu Sushe of the National Development and Reform Commission of China, according to the Prime Minister's secretariat. The agreement is expected to pave the way for the implementation of BRI projects, sources said. The BRI is a mega connectivity project that connects China with Southeast Asia, compromise and decided to

Though Nepal and China signed the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) agreement in 2017, not a single project has so far been implemented under the framework. However, details of the BRI cooperation framework agreement have not been made public. A joint statement issued by both sides on Tuesday said that "the two sides expressed their readiness to sign the MoU on building the Trans-Himalayan Multi-Dimensional Connectivity Network and the framework for Belt and Road Cooperation between the two governments as soon as possible," without specifying deadline.

"Both sides expressed their commitment to strengthening connectivity between the two countries in such areas as ports, roads, railways, aviation, power grids and telecommunication. to help Nepal transform from a land-locked country to a landlinked country," said the joint statement.

According to The Kathmandu Post newspaper, the Chinese side had removed the word 'grant" proposed by the Nepali side and suggested replacing it with "investment" for projects under the BRI.

The World Bank's International Debt Report 2024 released on Tuesday ranks Pakistan among the top three loan recipients from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) this year and also notes that Pakistan's high debt-toexport and debt-to-revenue ratios indicate a weakening fiscal position. The International Debt Report 2024 put Pakistan's total external debt (including that from IMF) at USD 130.85 billion in 2023, accounting for 352 per cent of its total exports and 39 per cent of gross national income (GNI) while Pakistan's total externa debt servicing amounted to 43 per cent of total exports and 5

## **20 per cent cybercrimes involve dark** Sebi notifies rules on uniform standards for nomination facilities across securities markets web usage by attackers says report

### PTI NEW DELHI

At least 20 per cent of cybercrimes in India involve attackers using dark web, according to a report by security cyber firm Lisianthus.

The dark web is a platform on the internet that can be accessed using special tools. It is usually very difficult to trace the identity and location of a dark web user.

"At least 20 per cent of cybercrimes in India involve the usage of the dark web by online attackers," the study conducted by Lisianthus Tech said. The attackers used the dark web for cybercrimes like data breaches, hacking, phishing, ransomware, identity theft, sale and



purchase of banned products Khushhal Kaushik, founder like narcotics and weapons. The study is based on a detailed analysis of several cases of cybercrime reported of two across the country, said

and CEO of Lisianthus Tech. The study was conducted on a sampling basis over a period months which concluded last week, he said.

"Study was completed using several samples of crime data taken from state police, National Crime Records Bureau and other relevant portals reporting cyber crime

and analyzing these in detail with industry experts, cyber security consultants and law enforcement representatives, Kaushik said. Recently a man was arrested for cultivating cannabis in his rented flat and selling it off through the dark web. Attackers had also used the dark web for ransomware attacks on AIIMS in Delhi last year, he said. Gurugrambased Lisianthus Tech is into cyber-security audits and conducting security assessments. As per the report, the usage of dark web has grown two-fold in the past decade and to avoid being a victim of this, users must not give permission to any online notification seeking access to their phone book and other applications.



During the 2023-24 financial year,I has seized 1,319 kg of gold and smuggling through India's porous eastern borders, particularly with Bangladesh and Myanmar, has also emerged as a major concern for law enforcement agencies. The Smuggling in India Report released by the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) on its 67th Revenue foundation day said in recent years, law enforcement agencies have observed a "troubling increase" in the circulation of 'Yaba', a potent drug tablet that combines methamphetamine and caffeine, mostly produced in Myanmar. Yaba, meaning crazy medicine, has evolved into a recreational drug infamous for its severe addiction potential and and devastating health effects, leading to significant seizures

across the region. The data on narcotics seizure by theI showed that during FY24,I officers seized 107.31 kg cocaine worth Rs 974.78 crore in the illicit market. During the year, about 49 kg

heorin valuing Rs 365 crore was seized, followed by 136 kg of Methamphetamine worth Rs 275 crore.

7,349 kg ganja worth Rs 21 crore was seized during the last fiscal.

During the financial year 2023-24,I seized 1,319 kg of gold. Additionally. I has shared actionable intelligence with Customs field formations, leading to significant gold seizures by those units as well. This is part of the 4,869.6 kg of gold seized by the CBIC including by Customs officers, in 2023-24. 1,922 persons were arrested by the CBIC during the year.

It said India has become a major destination for illicit gold imports, with gold and silver predominantly originating from Gulf states such as the UAE and Saudi Arabia, where these metals are sourced and available at lower prices.

during a Meeting of the Energy storage capacity of Parliamentary Consultative 16.13 GW/82.37 GWh with Parliamentary Consultative Committee of Members of Parliament for Ministry of Power here last evening. Union Power Minister Manohar Lal chaired the meeting. As per 20th Electric Power Survey (EPS) report published by the Central Survey Electricity Authority (CEA), the peak demand and energy requirement is pegged at around 366 GW and 2474 BU by 2031-32, it stated.

PSP(pumped storage) based storage of 7.45 GW capacity and 47.65 GWh storage and BESS based storage of 8.68 GW/34.72 GWh is required by 2026-27.

Scheduling the 2034 World Cup in Saudi Arabia back-to-back with the 2034 Salt Lake City Winter Games would pose "no risk" to the Olympics a senior IOC Olympics, a senior IOC official said.

"We don't see at this stage a major issue. On the contrary, it is a lot of sport in the time frame," Christophe Dubi, the Olympic International Committee executive director for the games, said at an online briefing after a board meeting, suggesting two major sports events close together would be "a real feast" for fans. Dubi's comments suggested January 2034 is surprisingly open for FIFA and Saudi Arabia to stage soccer's marquee event despite a near-clash with the Salt Lake City Olympics that aims to have an opening ceremony

opening on Feb. 4. Saudi Arabia will be confirmed next week by FIFA as host of a 2034 World Cup that cannot realistically be played in summer months when temperature routinely exceeds 40 Celsius (104 Fahrenheit) The new 48-team, 104-game World Cup format takes 38 days to play. Asked if the IOC wants January and early February to be off limits for FIFA in 2034 to protect Salt Lake City, Dubi said: "I think that the risk of having those two in parallel is immensely

### **Rishabh Pant has taken to Test cricket** like a duck to water, says Rahul Dravid

The void left by MS Dhoni's retirement I in Indian cricket lineup was quickly filled by Rishabh Pant, who embraced Test cricket like a "duck to water", feels former head coach Rahul Dravid.

The flamboyant wicketkeeper-batter, who returned after surviving a horrific car crash in December 2022, scored a match-winning 89 in the fourth Test at the Gabba and contributed 274 runs throughout the series, playing a key role in India's historic 2-1 triumph in the 2020-21 tour.

"It's hard to imagine that, after Dhoni left, you felt there might be some time for someone to come in and replace him," Dravid told Star Sports.

"I'm not saying he's replaced him, but certainly in Test cricket, his performances have been absolutely sensational, an incredible performance. "Watching Rishabh there and chasing to get 89 to win that Test match at the Gabba, with everything on the line and such a depleted side, to put in that kind of performance under that kind of pressure - truly sensational... What a



special cricketer he's been. He's just taken to Test cricket like a duck to water. It's just phenomenal?

Pant's heroics that included two fifties at 68.50 in five innings helped India become the first Asian side to win successive Test series wins Down Under. In the ongoing five-Test series, the 27-year-old scored a vital 37 off 78 balls in the first innings of the Perth Test, including a remarkable six that lifted India's spirits, helping them recover from 59/5 to 150 all out.

The Jasprit Bumrah-led team then bowled out Australia for 104 and won the match by 295 runs to take a 1-0 lead

going into the Adelaide Test beginning on Friday

While India have dominated Australia lately, Dravid's knock of 233 during the Adelaide Test in 2003 still remains a fanfavourite.

Nostalgia and regrets

Reflecting on his knock, Dravid admitted that he still regrets not winning the series.

"I'm grateful for it, but I wouldn't have voted for myself, put it that way. Probably, I've got a lot of recency bias as well," he continued.

"I think the way India has performed in Australia over the last two series in particular - winning series there - that counts for a lot.

'However great my performances or India's performances were, we couldn't actually win that series. We came close, but we couldn't get the wickets on the final day in Sydney that we needed.

'The last two teams that have gone to Australia have done that, and that's a fantastic achievement -- a terrific achievement -- and there have been absolutely some sensational performances right through those."
