

## **Constitution Sparks Volatile Debate**

nitiating a two-day debate on Friday in the Lok Sabha on "Discussion on the Glorious Journey of 75 Years of the Constitution of India", Defence Minister Rajnath Singh accused Congress for always choosing "satta" always choosing (power) over the Constitution and never tolerated autonomy of institutions and tried to destroy constitutional principles and spirit. Singh was countered by Priyanka Gandhi, leading the Opposition said that it seems Prime Minister Narendra Modi has not understood that it is 'Bharat ka Samvidhan' not 'Sangh ka Vidhan'. She described the Constitution as 'suraksha kavach'

(protective shield) of justice, unity and freedom of expression and one the BJPled Government has made every effort to break in the past 10 years.

Provoking the Opposition MPs, Rajanth Singh said Congress has sought to project the Constitution as its own contribution, while deliberately ignoring the contribution of several leaders. "The talk of protection of the Constitution does not seem appropriate coming from it (Congress). These days, I see that many Opposition leaders keep the Constitution in their pockets. Actually, this is what they have learnt from childhood, they have seen their families keep the Constitution in their pockets for generations," he

said, adding "the BJP (Bharatiya Janata Party), on the other hand, always bows before the Constitution and has never played with the independence and autonomy of institutions." Singh's of

assertion drew jibes from the members of the Opposition benches during a speech that was largely heard in attention. "Congress, during its decades in power, often amended the Constitution with a malicious spirit to change it gradually, while the Narendra Modi Government has effected amendments to strengthen its fundamental values and for people's empowerment", Singh, alleged inviting objections from Congress MPs. Whenever there was a choice,

the Congress chose power

over the Constitution, he claimed. It always tried to "hijack and appropriate" the framing of the Constitution, Singh said, highlighting the imposition of Emergency, dismissal of many state governments and superseding of Supreme Court judges for "standing up" to the then Indira Gandhi government to charge the party with violating constitutional principles The BJP leader said he is

surprised that those who subverted the Constitution are now speaking for its protection. "Expressions for protecting the Constitution from the Congress do not look good," he said in a jibe at the Opposition party. The two-day debate, which is likely to end with Prime Minister's Modi's speech, is being seen as a highlight of the ongoing parliamentary session amid a running battle between the ruling party and the Opposition since the Lok Sabha poll campaign, which was marked by the INDIA bloc building its campaign on the Constitution being allegedly under threat from

the BIP mention of the Singh's country's first Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru, a persistent target of the BJP's attack over the years, as one of those who contributed to the making of the Constitution drew rare cheers from the Opposition benches. The BJP leader, though, later also charged Nehru with amending the Constitution to override a Supreme Court judgment for 'stifling' freedom of expression.

## Three Indian students killed in Canada: MEA

Three Indian students have been murdered in Canada last week and the Indian High Commission in Ottawa has taken up the matter of safety of Indians with the Canadian authorities, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said on Friday. The safety, security and welfare of Indian nationals in Canada remains of utmost importance to us, MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said.

Jaiswal said the Indian missions in that country are in touch with the local authorities for thorough investigation of the incidents. "In the last week or so we have had unfortunate tragedies. Three Indian students have been murdered. We are saddened at these terrible tragedies that have struck our nationals in Canada. We deepest extend our

condolences to the grieving families. Our High Commission and Consulates in Toronto and Vancouver are extending all possible help in the matter," he said.

"Issues faced by them, especially Indian students, are raised by our high commission and Consulates with the relevant Canadian authorities on a regular basis, he said. "We have also issued an advisory for our nationals and Indian students to exercise extreme caution and remain vigilant in view of the deteriorating environment in Canada as a result of the growing incidence of hate crimes and criminal violence," Jaiswal added.

According to official data, over 400,000 Indian students are studying in Canada. Asked about reports of instances of the Indian high commission not granting visas in Canada, Jaiswal described them as a "disinformation" campaign.

'We have seen the said media report. It is yet another example of Canadian media's disinformation to malign India," he said. "Granting of Indian visas is our sovereign function and we have the legitimate right to deny visas to those who undermine our territorial integrity," he said. The commentary that we see in the Canadian media on this matter is akin to foreign interference in sovereign affairs," India's Jaiswal added.

Investigation (CBI) investigation into the case on Friday after two key suspects got bail from a court.

The Sealdah court granted bail to RG Kar Medical College and Hospital's ex-principal Sandip Ghosh and former officer-in-charge of the Tala police station Abhijit Mondal in the rape and murder case of the on-duty doctor. They were granted bail after the CBI failed to file a charge sheet against them within the mandatory 90-day period.

extremely "We are disappointed with the pace with which the CBI is handling this case," said junior doctor Aniket Mahato, a leading face of the protests that rocked the state.

"The system has failed us, and the accused have been allowed to go free due to the sluggishness of the investigation. This delay in justice is a slap on the face of all those who have been

fighting for accountability," he added. The junior doctors started their demonstration after the body of their colleague was found at the RG Kar hospital on August 9. Following 50 days of cease work that paralysed the state's healthcare system, they went on hunger strike on October 5 amid the Durga Puja festival, demanding justice. The hunger strike was called

off on October 24 after Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee met them. Mahato said they were firm in their resolve for justice. "We are not backing down," he said. "The CBI's inaction has only fueled our frustration. We will decide our next course of action soon and continue our fight for justice," he added. The CBI took over the case on the direction of the high court following allegations of mishandling by the police.

Direct selling is a method of marketing, distribution and sale of goods or services directly to consumers, away from fixed retail premises. This method relies on independent representatives of the entity, known as direct sellers, selling products directly to customers, typically through personal contact, online platforms, or home presentations.

The list includes multiple firms and the action comes in response to concerns about deceptive practices in the direct selling industry. "However, some fraudulent entities misuse the direct selling model to promote illegal pyramid or money circulation schemes. These firms often make unrealistic promises of high commissions, foreign trips, entrepreneurship, high returns and a wealthy future, contingent on recruiting others, which

violates consumer trust and established laws. thereby exposing consumers to fraudulent pyramid and money circulation schemes. Three major signs that a product is being used to disguise pyramid schemes include large joining fee or investment, compensation paid for recruiting and no right of return, buy-back or cooling off period offered," the CCPA said. mission to create a fair, transparent, and consumer-friendly market ecosystem," the statement said.

Consumers have been advised to exercise caution by checking disclosures carefully, avoiding recruitment-based earnings, understanding return and refund policies, reading contracts thoroughly and verifying direct sellers' credentials. The Consumer Protection (Direct Selling) Rules, 2021, were introduced to regulate direct selling entities and protect consumer interests and consumers will have to check certificate of Incorporation, PAN, GST Registration, important licenses as per the goods and services offered, Certificate of Registration of Trademark of the direct selling companies.

These rules complement other existing regulatory frameworks, including the Consumer Protection (E-Commerce) Rules, 2020, and the Legal Metrology (Packaged Commodities) Rules, 2011. The Department has advised consumers to stay vigilant and report any suspected illegal activities or violations related to direct selling to the appropriate authorities.

The trouble began when a flight from Istanbul to Delhi, scheduled to depart at 8.10 pm on December 12, was initially delayed to the next day at 1.30 pm. Passengers were left at the airport with little information or support from IndiGo staff.

Similarly, the flight from Istanbul to Mumbai, originally set to depart at 8.15 pm on December 12, was first pushed to 11.00 pm, then delayed again to the following morning at 10 am. IndiGo operates one flight each daily from Delhi and Mumbai to Istanbul with Boeing 777 aircraft. Many of them have stranded been since Thursday.

SC to hear SPG petition on fate of three specialised vehicles



order of the National Green Tribunal (NGT) which refused to allow extension of registration period of three specialised armoured vehicles by five years. The matter came before a bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Augustine George Masih, which took objection that the elite force approached the NGT for registration of its vehicle instead of moving the top court in the MC Mehta matter.

The SC has been monitoring the air pollution crisis in Delhi in an

ongoing Public Interest Litigation in the MC Mehta case. Appearing for the SPG, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, urged the Bench to consider the matter on an urgent basis and sought extension of registration period citing

The NGT on March 22 had refused to grant the relief, saying such vehicles being diesel vehicles cannot be permitted to ply in the National Capital Region (NCR) on completion of 10 years. "We are conscious of the fact that these three vehicles are special purpose vehicles which are not normally available and these vehicles have run very less in the last 10 years and are needed for the specific purpose of security of the prime minister

With an aim to enhance road safety and safety highway strengthen patrolling, National Highways Authority of India (NHAI), the central road making agency will implement an upgraded and forwardlooking Incident Management Services. The guidelines on the subject include updated specifications for new Route Patrolling Vehicles (RPVs) named 'Rajmarg Saathi' and outlines design, functions, technology, components and manpower specifications for the **R**PVs.

The RPVs conduct inspection of National Highway stretches to monitor and respond to emergency situations. In the existing RPVs, the rear space open for keeping

instruments and equipment to support in case of situations. emergency However, due to open space, the operators were not able to keep these equipment in a

well organised manner, which at times led to delays in taking prompt action. In order to overcome such a situation, the rear or trunk of RPV has now been replaced by a closed cabinet with dedicated space for different equipment and inventory The shelves have been created to provide quick & easy access to different equipment during the emergency situations and is a significant upgrade from the earlier RPVs.

Additional advanced feature of this new RPV is the provision for dashboard cameras equipped with 'AI video analytics' to capture and identify cracks & potholes as well as other elements



including vehicles, pedestrians, road signs, and other infrastructure assets. The data/ video footage

including road distresses shall be collected on a weekly basis by NHAI and this road distress data shall be integrated with NHAI One application for more efficient maintenance of roads.

The guidelines for 'Rajmarg Saathi' RPVs include detailed specifications related to the use of vehicle, equipment and manpower. To ensure service fitness of the vehicle, the RPV shall be replaced with a new RPV, once it has exceeded run of 3,00,000 km or has been in operation for three years.

Special emphasis has been laid on branding and external appearance of the RPVs to maximise its visibility as a Highway Patrol Services on the National Highways. Equipped with the advanced communication and safety tools, these vehicles will be useful in minimising traffic disruptions, improving road safety and enhancing overall road user experience along the National Highways.

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## **Delhi CM announces** Rs 1,000 monthly assistance for women

Delhi Chief Minister Atishi on Friday announced that the Mukhya Mantri Mahila Samman Yojana, to provide monthly assistance of Rs 1,000 to women in the city, will be rolled out in the next 10-15 days as the government is working on the registration process. It is estimated that there are 38 lakh women who will be eligible for the scheme. Under the Atishi said that before the end

of the current financial year - by March 31, 2025 -- women will receive one or two install ments under this scheme. AAP supremo Arvind Kejriwal

had announced the launch of the scheme on Thursday and promised that the amount would be raised to Rs 2,100 if his party returns to power.

During a press conference here, Atishi said the scheme is a fulfillment of the government's promise to empower women.

"We have kept our promise of providing Rs 1,000 assistance to women. Despite all efforts by the opposition to obstruct this initiative, we have successful-

ly ensured its rollout," she said. The scheme aims to provide financial independence to women, ensuring they do not have to depend on family members for small personal needs, she added.

Regarding eligibility, Atishi explained that permanent government employees, women who paid income tax in the last financial year and those already receiving any form of pension will not qualify for the benefits. Cleared by the Delhi Cabinet on Thursday, the scheme entails a monthly payment of

Rs. 1000 as a direct benefit transfer (DBT) to the beneficiary's Aadhaar-linked bank account to eligible women beneficiaries living in the city based on certain criteria. However, certain categories of

women are not eligible for this scheme which include current or former permanent government employees, whether in the Central Government, Delhi Government, or MCD, women MPs, MLAs, or Councillors, women who paid income tax in the previous assessment cycle and those who already réceiving pensions under Delhi government schemes, such as

old-age pensions, widow pen-sions, or disability pensions. "All other women aged 18 and above will be entitled to receive Rs 10,000 as an honorarium under this scheme. The notification was issued vesterday evening, and efforts are under-

way to begin the registration process. We aim to start registrations within the next 7-10 days," CM Atishi said. Speaking about other measures taken by the AAP government to empower women,

Atishi highlighted the improved quality of education in government schools, which are predominantly attended by girls, ensuring equal opportunities for education.

She also mentioned the provision of free healthcare through Mohalla Clinics, allowing women to access treatment without financial constraints. Additionally, the government provides free bus travel to women, helping them commute easily for education, jobs, or job searches, she said. In the run for the upcoming Delhi elections, AAP is vying for a third consecutive term, having won 62 out of 70 seats in the last election.

Delhi Police Crime Branch has apprehended three members of a family who had been on the run for 14 years after allegedly burning a woman alive. Singh lauded the role of the Supreme Court as the "custodian" and "interpreter" of the Constitution, citing its judgments that negated the then Congress regime's bid to topple opposition-ruled state governments. "Today, there is talk of protecting the Constitution. This is the duty of all of us. But we also need to understand who has respected the Constitution and who has disrespected it," he said, slamming the Congress for its idea of "committed judiciary, committed bureaucracy and committed institutions", a reference particularly to Indira Gandhi's rule in the 1970s.

Privanka in her 32-minute maiden speech, countered the BJP and said had it not been for the Lok Sabha poll results, the ruling party would have started changing the

Constitution. The Congress leader even took on Union Minister Rajnath Singh, saying said those in the ruling party mostly talk about the past but should tell the country what they are doing now. "What is your responsibility? Or does all the responsibility lie with Jawaharlal Nehru ji?" she asked in a swipe at the BJP over its repeated criticism of India's first PM.

"Our Constitution laid the foundation of economic she said. justice, distributing land to farmers, the poor and the needy.... Whose name is often used by them (BJP) to save themselves, he (Jawaharlal Nehru) created many PSUs and institutions such as HAL, BHEL, SAIL, GAIL, ONGC, NTPC, Railways, IIT, IIM," she said. "His name can be erased from the books, but his role in the Independence struggle and nation building can never be

erased from this country," the Congress general secretary about her great grandfather. Addressing criticism of the Emergency, she said the BJP

Priyanka Gandhi also challenged the BJP to hold elections by using the ballot paper, saying it will expose the reality. In a stinging critique of the PM, the Congress leader

said, "There used to be a story that the king used to go among the people in disguise to listen to criticism. Today's king is also very fond of changing his disguise... But he neither has the courage to go among the public nor to listen to criticism."

Slamming the BJP over its alleged divisive politics, she said seeds of suspicion and hatred are being sown where the Constitution gave a protective shield of unity. "The 'suraksha kavach' of unity is being broken. The prime minister touches his forehead to the Constitution but when there are cries for justice from Hathras Sambhal and Manipur, there is not a wrinkle on his forehead," said Priyanka, adding that "it seems Prime Modi Minister hasn't understood that 'Bharat ka Samvidhan' is not 'Sangh ka Vidhan".

Yadav entered into public debate or expressed his views in public on political matters relating to a uniform civil code, in violation of the Restatement of Values of Iudicial Life, 1997. The notice mentioned that the public remarks of the judge were inflammatory and targeted minority communities.

It also stated that Justice Yadav in his lecture asserted that "the country would function according to the wishes of the majority in India". "Justice Yadav's actions contravene the directive principles enshrined under Article 51A(e) of the Constitution of India, which mandate promoting harmony and renouncing practices derogatory to the dignity of individuals," the MPs said in

"We request the Hon'ble Chairman to admit this motion and forward it to the Hon'ble President of India in accordance with the Judges (Inquiry) Act, 1968, and constitute an inquiry committee to investigate the charges of hate speech, communal disharmony, and violations of judicial ethics," according to the notice. Allu Arjun, on December 11, approached the Telangana High Court seeking to quash the FIR registered against him in connection with the

death of a woman. After the formal arrest, Allu Arjun was taken to state-run Gandhi Hospital for medical tests. Allu Arjun last week announced Rs 25 lakh to the family of the deceased and also assured the grieving family that they are not alone in this painful situation and he will meet the family personally. Earlier, the police arrested three persons, one of the owners of the theatre, its senior manager and lower balcony incharge (at the theatre), in connection with the case registered over the death of the woman due to asphyxiation as crowds jostled at the theatre during the premiere show of Allu Arjun's movie. 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

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## Indian forces going to all patrolling points in Depsang: Jaishankar

### PIONEER NEWS SERVICE NEW DELHI

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said on Friday that security forces would be going to all patrolling points in Depsang in Ladakh and also to the eastward limit which are historically been India's patrolling limit. He said in Lok Sabha that the last of the disengagement agreement with China was related to Depsang and Demchok.

"I want to convey that it was mentioned in my (previous) statement (in Parliament) that the understanding envisaged that Indian security forces would be going to all patrolling points in Depsang, and would be going to the eastward limit which are historically been our patrolling limit in that part," he said during Question Hour. The minister said in the same

statement, he has made it clear that India had disen-

gagement agreements with China in the past too.

'Those disengagement agreements also had certain provisions where both sides on a temporary basis had agreed to put certain restraint on themselves. So I think the position is very clear in that statement. I would urge the honourable member to read that statement again," he said replying to a supplementary question on India-China boundary agreement.

Replying to a question on a picture of Nepal currency that allegedly showed a part of Indian territory as its own, Jaishankar said India's position regarding the border is very

clear. He said if any of India's neighbours thinks that by doing something they want to change India's position, they should be very clear that it is not going to happen. "I think the entire House is clear on that with me," he said.



On Myanmar, the minister said because of the very disturbed conditions in Myanmar, India had to review the Free Movement Regime (FMR), which allows people residing close to the India-Myanmar border to venture 16 km into each other's territory without any documents. He, however, said the govern-

ment is sensitive to the requirements of the border communities and is working something on that.

Jaishankar said part of the challenge along Myanmar border is that there is very little government authority on the other side of the border and whatever is required to do, India itself has to do on its

"But today definitely there is much greater presence there to secure our border, to monitor people across the border," he said.

On a question on India's neighbourhood first policy,

Jaishankar said before Prime Minister Narendra Modi visited Nepal, there was no visit by any Prime Minister to Nepal for 17 years but that did not mean that nobody in India cared for Nepal.

Similarly in case of Sri Lanka, before Modi visited the country, for 30 years, there was no bilateral visit, he said.

The minister said with regards to Maldives under the current government, the Addu Link Road and Reclamation Project, which was funded by India, was inaugurated and he himself was present. "By the way, the President of Maldives was present at the oath taking ceremony of this new government," he said.

Jaishankar said if an opposition member desires to somehow show the foreign policy of this government in bad light for political purposes, that is the member's privilege.

"That is not my nature to make foreign policy partisan.

But I would like to remind the member through you that the very Maldives which he was talking about was, Indian companies were driven out from there from an important project in 2012.

## **UP court summons Rahul Gandhi over remarks against Savarkar**

local court here on Friday Asummoned Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on January 10, 2025, to face trial for allegedly promoting enmity and disturbing harmony among people by making mischievous statements about freedom fighter Vinayak

Damodar Savarkar. Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate (ACJM) Alok Verma passed the order on a criminal complaint filed by local lawyer Nripendra Pandey.

The court found that prima facie offences under sections 153(a) (promoting enmity between different groups) and 505 (statements conducing to public mischief) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) were made out against Gandhi, also the leader of opposition in the Lok Sabha.

The ACJM rejected the complaint on June 14, 2023, but the revisional court set aside the rejection order on October 3, 2024, and remanded the matter to the ACJM for passing a fresh order based on the material that

had come on record in the complaint and statements of witnesses.

In the inquiry, police confirmed that Gandhi made the "objectionable" statement against Savarkar in Maharashtra and it was broadcast on television and other communication mediums.

The complaint in the case states that at a press conference during his Bharat Jodo Yatra in Akola, Maharashtra on November 17, 2022, Gandhi made serious remarks against Savarkar that spread communal disharmony, according to the order.

The complainant alleged that Gandhi called Savarkar "a servant of the British who received a pension from them" and distributed pamphlets to mediapersons to tarnish his image.

Passing the summoning order, the court observed, "The material presented demonstrates that Gandhi's remarks, broadcast nationwide via TV and social media, were intended to spread hatred and enmity, undermin-ing the nation's unity".

## All Indian nationals who wished to return home from Syria evacuated: MEA

ndia has evacuated from Svria all its nationals who wished to return home after rebel forces overthrew President Bashar Assad's authoritarian government in the Arab nation.

The Syrian government collapsed on Sunday as the rebels seized control of capital Damascus after capturing several other prominent cities and towns. India evacuated its nationals from Syria on Tuesday. "We have evacuated all Indian nationals in Syria who wished to return home following recent developments in that country. So far, 77 Indian nationals from Syria have been evacuated," Ministry of xternal Affairs(MEA)spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said on Friday. Our embassy personnel in Damascus accompanied them to the border, after which our mission in Lebanon received them and facilitated their



immigration, he said. He was replying to a question at his weekly media briefing. Jaiswal said the embassy made arrangements for their boarding and lodging in Beirut and for their travel back home.

"Most of our nationals have already returned to India and the remaining will be arriving later today or tomorrow," he said.

"The 44 Zaireen who were on a pilgrimage to Syria have also left Beirut yesterday to visit other religious sites in the region," Jaiswal added. The Indian Embassy in Syria con-

Zero poverty, employment, skilling and human resources development, water security, farmer-agri tech and best global logistics were some of the 10 principles.

Others include cost optimisation of energy and fuel, product perfection, swachh (clean) Andhra and incorporating deep tech in all walks of life.

## **One Nation One Election**

India's democratic system is on the verge of a transformative change with the 'One Nation, One Election' initiative

he concept of 'One Nation, One Election' has been a subject of significant debate in India's political discourse. On December 12, 2024, the Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, approved draft legislation to implement simultaneous elections for the Lok Sabha, state assemblies, and local bodies within 100 days. This proposal seeks to streamline India's electoral process, reduce the economic and administrative burden of frequent elections and enhance governance. The 'One Nation, One Election' initiative aims to align the election schedules of the Lok Sabha, state assemblies, municipal corporations and panchayats. The proposed legislation is likely to be introduced in Parliament during the ongoing Winter Session, reflecting the government's intention to initiate nationwide consultations on this transformative reform. The draft legislation incorporates 11 recommendations made by a high-level committee led by former President Ram Nath Kovind. These recommendations aim to address the frequent



disruptions caused by the current staggered election schedule, which is a drain on economic, social, and political resources. One of the primary suggestions involves synchronising the election dates for the Lok Sabha and state assemblies in the first phase, followed by municipal and panchayat elections within 100 days. To ensure smooth execution, a dedicated implementation group will oversee the reforms.

Constitutional amendments, such as the introduction of Articles 324A and 325, are proposed to facilitate simultaneous elections, create unified voter rolls. Elections demand significant financial resources and conducting them simultaneously could reduce costs

related to security, logistics and administrative expenses. Frequent elections also result in prolonged enforcement of the Model Code of Conduct, halting developmental activities, which a unified schedule could minimise. However, implementing this ambitious reform involves substantial logistical and constitutional challenges. Synchronising elections requires amendments to several constitutional articles, including Articles 83, 85, 172, 174, and 356, which must be ratified by a majority of state legislatures. Building political consensus among parties with diverse regional interests is another critical requirement. Furthermore, the Election Commission will need to mobilise resources, including additional EVMs and VVPATs and ensure readiness of polling staff and infrastructure nationwide. Besides, simultaneous elections might overshadow local issues due to the dominance of national narratives, potentially affecting regional representation. Coordinating nationwide elections within a short timeframe also poses logistical challenges. Moreover, synchronising subsequent elections in cases of mid-term dissolutions could create governance gaps, leading to policy paralysis. While the proposal promises efficiency and cost-effectiveness, its implementation demands careful consideration of constitutional, logistical, and political complexities.

Communication is the lifeblood of human connection, yet it remains one of the most intricate and fragile aspects of our existence


onversation is a delicate business. It is made even more fragile by being central to all human interaction. The more knowledgeable individuals feel that communication is only partially through words. It can also be through eyes, through touch, through gestures, and even through silence. The list can go on. This makes communication not only complicated but also sensitive matter. Communication can be with oneself. It can be between two persons, or in groups. It can be

a short distance or a long distance. The possibilities are immense. The pitch of the voice could

matter. The eye's movement can be an intervening variable, and sometimes the more wellversed practice cross-communication. It means giving one message through one medium and another through another. In other words, it can be one message through words and another message through the eyes.

If technology intervenes, it becomes even more complex. The technological interventions can be through a medium such as a handset, a telephone, or, in some parts, a piece of paper. In the past, pigeons have been known to serve a useful purpose. The permutations and combinations are immense, and each has a value, just as each medium has a context.Like in the case of many essentials in life, there is no primer available and there is no one author who has covered comprehensively all aspects of communication. Hence, much of this is on learning by practice.

Much of this is also learning by grief because in the absence of a proper 'Guru' one can only learn by trial and error.Many relationships get under strain or break because one meaning is intended, but another mean-



cult if they are systematically put into operation. In early childhood, when a per-son is being taught words, it would be helpful if the person is also helped to choose the better word to communicate his ideas. Proper pronunciation should also be taught. If the circumstances permit bye linguicism or multi-linguicism can be practiced.

This would help adjustment to different levels of people; people of different ages and from different contexts. The solutions are known just as much as the problems are known.

But there is little systematic attempt to put it in a frame and help better communication. It is obvious that communication can be between two people of equal age, between somebody who is older and somebody younger, people of the same gender, people of the oppo-

However, this may not always work. So options and support systems have to be generated. Like in many things, psychological factors become very heavily involved, and unfortunately, those who are not capable of deep thought fumble more. There is a case for serious research on all aspects of the communication enumerated above and more research on communication per se, in a scholastic mode, would help.

Till then, one can only hope that the general conversation on communication will alleviate the confusion that sometimes arises on communication points. One also hopes that research will help good communication all around.

A thorough analysis of the present situation would lead us to the conclusion that the current situation, which is leading us either to tension or depression or short-lived pleasure, is due to our own consumerist attitude, which is geared mainly to cater to man's indulgence in sensual pleasure or comforts. In order to bring a change to this callous attitude and wrong lifestyle, we need to reform our mind by adopting a spiritual attitude through a spiritual set of values, or what is called 'Spiritualism,' which is a turnaround of thoughts and a way of living. Today, those people who are trying to cope with change without bringing change to their mindset, value system, and lifestyle through spirituality have really missed the message of the wise. Therefore, it's high time that we as a society realised that simplicity of lifestyle, by embracing spiritual values, alone would be the remedy to the present precarious situation that would empower us to manage rapid change with vigor and enthusiasm.


# Bangladesh's secular fabric under siege

The suppression of dissent, coupled with the growing boldness of extremist ideologies, risks steering the nation towards a fundamentalist Islamist state



t is increasingly clear that fundamen-talist Islamist organisations, which are pathologically hostile to India as well as to all secular and democratic persons and organisations in Bangladesh, are increasingly calling the shots in that country under the rule of its interim government. An indication of this is the relentless persecution of Shahriar Kabir, an internationally acclaimed author, journalist, champion of human rights, democracy and secularism, and a tireless campaigner to bring to justice the perpetrators of war crimes during Bangladesh's liberation war in 1971. He continues to languish in Kashimpur jail under terrible conditions. Despite being designated as a prisoner of conscience by Amnesty International, a magistrate's order giving him Division One status, which would give him a separate room and other facilities remains to be carried out. This is because the deputy commissioner of Ghazipur district, where Kashimpur prison, where he is lodged, is located, has not signed the order, which will be effective only after his signature is affixed to it. Nor, according to reports, does he seem inclined to sign it soon. is a result, Kabir, who is 74-years-old has to live among common prisoners and sleep on the floor during a cold winter as his health continues to deteriorate. Earlier, during a remand hearing at Dhaka's Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court on 20 October, Kabir had complained that he was not receiving adequate medical treatment in jail. On November 2, he was taken to Shaheed Tajuddin Ahmed Medical College Hospital for a check-up. According to its deputy-director, he suffered from various old age-related ailments but these were not critical Kabir has high blood pressure and diabetes and a large accumulation of stones in his kidney. it certainly has a wide measure of influence and has its way wherever it wants, however small or big the event or the demand is. The "Mahati Sadhusanga and Lalon Mela"(great gathering of sadhus and Lalon fair) hosted by Muktidham Ashram and Lalon Academy in Madya Narsingpur, Kashipur Union Parishad in Narayanganj, was sched-uled to begin on November 22, 2024. There was to be singing, dancing, festivities and food. Baul singers and devotee from all over Bangladesh were coming over for the occasion. The district administration, however, ordered its cancellation. A report in The Daily Star (November 23, 2024) quoted Fakir Shah Jalal, founder of the ashram and academy, said, "All arrange-ments had been made, but the administration did not permit the event, citing warning from some members of the "Muslim" community. Even when we requested to hold the event indoors, without loudspeakers, it was denied." A spiritual leader, philosopher, mystic poet and social reformer, Lalon articulated a weltanschauung, which encompassed the essence of the Bhakti cult and Sufism, rejected all distinctions of caste, class and creed, opposed theological conflicts and racism. It is not surprising that such a person would be anathema to fundamentalist Islamists. The report in The Daily Star, cited above, had stated that Hefazat-e-Islam leader Maulana Abdul Auwal had warned the administration in a speech to stop the event or face intervention by protestors.

Bangladesh, adding that the country was destined to undergo an

Islamist transformation. Not surprisingly, Ahmadiyas and Sufis have come under attack. Several of the former's mosques were attacked on August 6. A violent mob destroyed Baba Pagla Ali's Sufi shrine at Sherpur district on August 29; another such mob vandalised and looted Ismail Pagla's shrine in Sirajganj district on September 3.

Meanwhile two Islamist terrorist outfits-Ansar al-Islam (erstwhile Ansarullah Bangla Team) and Hijb-ut Tahrir (Tahrir) are increasingly active. Despite the ban on Tahrir, its supporters organised, on August 9, a rally in Dhaka city and demanded the establishment of an Islamic Caliphate in Bangladesh. Also, the statues of two police officers who died fighting the terrorists at the Holey Artisan Bakery in July 2016, have been destroyed and a Hijb-ut Tahrir poster has been found at the site. ## **Blinken urges nations to support** peaceful Syrian political transition

### AP JERUSALEM

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken is pressing ahead with efforts to unify Middle East nations in support of a peaceful political transition in Svria.

He is meeting on Friday with Turkiye's foreign minister after talks with President Recep Tayyip Erdogan to try to bring Turkive into a consensus to prevent Syria from collapsing into wider turmoil.

It's Blinken's 12th trip to the Mideast since the Israel-Hamas war erupted in Gaza last year but first since the ouster of Syrian President Bashar Assad. The outgoing Biden administration is particularly concerned that a power vacuum in Syria could exacerbate already heightened tensions in the region and create conditions for the Islamic State group to regain territory and influence. The fighting between Israel and Hamas has plunged Gaza into a severe humanitarian cri-

sis. Israel's offensive has killed over 44,800 Palestinians in Gaza, more than half of them women and children, according to the Gaza Health Ministry, which does not say how many were combatants. The Israeli military says it has killed over 17,000 militants, without providing evidence. The war in Gaza was sparked by an October 7, 2023, attack by Hamas in southern Israel in which some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, were killed and around 250 others were taken hostage. Some 100 hostages are still inside Gaza, at least a third of whom are believed to be dead.

"America was built on the promise of possibility and second chances. As President, I have the great privilege of extending mercy to people who have demonstrated remorse and rehabilitation, restoring opportunity for Americans to participate in daily life and contribute to their communities, and taking steps to remove sentencing disparities for non-violent offenders, especially those convicted of drug offences," Biden said in a statement on Thursday

"That is why, today, I am pardoning 39 people who have shown successful rehabilitation and have shown commitment to making their communities stronger and safer. I am also commuting the sentences of nearly 1,500 people who are serving long prison sentences - many

of whom would receive lower sentences if charged under today's laws, policies, and prac-

tices," he said This was the largest single-day act of clemency in recent times In December 2012, Dr Meera Sachdeva was sentenced to 20 years in prison and ordered to repay nearly USD 8.2 million for fraud at a former Mississippi cancer centre she ran. She is now 63. Babubhai Patel was sentenced to 17 years on 26 convictions for a healthcare fraud conspiracy, a drug conspiracy, and related fraud and drug violations in 2013. Also in 2013, Krishna Mote, 54, was sentenced to serve life in prison after he was convicted of conspiracy to distribute more than 280 grams of crack cocaine and more than 500 grams of cocaine, and distribution of crack cocaine as an aider and abettor.

Vikram Dutta, 63, was in January 2012 sentenced in a Manhattan federal court to 235 months in prison after he was found guilty of conspiracy charges stemming from his use of his perfume distribution business to launder millions of dollars for a Mexican narcotics organisation.

### AP KYIV

Russia on Friday launched a massive aerial attack against Ukraine, involving dozens of cruise missiles and drones, the latest such strike aimed at crippling the country's electricity system.

The Russian military targeted the Ukrainian power grid, energy minister Herman Halushchenko wrote on his Facebook page. "The enemy continues its terror," he said. Halushchenko said energy workers do everything necessary to "minimize negative consequences for the energy system," promising to release more details on damages once the security situation allows it. Ukraine's air force reported multiple strike drones launched at Ukraine overnight followed by swarms of cruise missiles in the country's air space. It said Russia also used air-launched ballistic Kinzhal missiles against Ukraine's western regions.

Friday's attack is the latest in a series of such raids that has heightened fears that the

Kremlin aims to destroy the country's power generation capacity as the winter sets in. Since launching its invasion in February 2022, Russia has relentlessly pummelled Ukraine's electricity system, resulting in repeated shut-downs of critical heating and drinking water supplies during the bitter winter months in an apparent attempt to break Ukrainian spirits and resolve. Moscow has declared that the attacks are aimed at hobbling Ukraine's defence industry, thwarting the production of missiles, drones, armoured vehicles and artillery, among other weapons.

A similar massive attack on November 28 involved about 200 missiles and drones and left more than a million households without power until emergency teams restored supplies. Ukrainian officials have warned that Russia is stockpiling cruise and ballistic missiles for more attacks.

On November 21, Russia for the first time used an intermediate range hypersonic ballistic missile to strike an industrial plant in the city of Dnipro, in eastern Ukraine. Russian President Vladimir Putin described the attack with the Oreshnik missile as retaliation for Ukrainian strikes on Russian territory with longer range Western weapons. He declared that more attacks with the new weapon could follow. The Pentagon warned Wednesday that Russia could use its new missile against Ukraine again soon. Around half of Ukraine's ener-

gy infrastructure has been destroyed during the almost three years of war with Russia, and rolling electricity blackouts are widespread.

Kyiv's Western allies have provided Ukraine with air defence systems to help it protect critical infrastructure, but Russia has sought to overwhelm the air defences with combined strikes involving big numbers of missiles and drones.

Russia has held the initiative this year as its military has steadily rammed through Ukrainian defences in the east in a series of slow but steady offensives.



## Trump invites Xi Jinping to his Jan 20 inauguration

### PTI WASHINGTON

US President-elect Donald Trump has invited Chinese President Xi Jinping to attend his inauguration on January 20, according to his spokesperson. "This is an example of President Trump creating an open dialogue with leaders of countries that are not just our allies but our adversaries and our competitors too," the incoming White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitte told Fox News in an interview on Thursday.

"We saw this in the first term. He got a lot of criticism for it, but it led to peace around the world. He is willing to talk to anyone. He will always put America's interest first," she said.

Leavitt, however, did not say if the invitation had been accepted by the Chinese president. The White House preferred not to comment on the merit of the invitation.

## Switzerland suspends India's most favoured nation status

### PTI NEW DELH

 $T^{he \ Swiss \ government \ has}_{suspended \ the \ most} \\ {}^{favoured \ nation \ status \ (MFN)}$ clause in the Double Taxation Avoidance Agreement (DTAA) between India and potentially Switzerland, impacting Swiss investments in India and leading to higher taxes on Indian companies operating in the European nation.

According to a December 11 statement by the Swiss finance department, the move follows the Supreme Court of India last year ruling that the MFN clause doesn't automatically trigger when a country joins the OECD if the Indian government signed a tax treaty with that country before it joined the organization. India signed tax treaties with

Colombia and Lithuania that

provided tax rates on certain meant a 5 per cent rate for dividends would apply to the types of income that were India-Switzerland tax treaty lower than the rates it provided to OECD countries. under the MFN clause, rather The two countries later joined than 10 per cent as outlined in the agreement. per cent tax on dividends due to Indian tax residents who claim refunds for Swiss withholding tax and for Swiss tax residents who claim foreign tax credits. In the statement, the Swiss

Department Finance announced suspension of the

application of the MFN clause of the protocol to the agreement between the Swiss Confederation and the Republic of India for the avoidance of double taxation with respect to taxes on income.

Switzerland cited a 2023 ruling by Indian Supreme Court in a case relating to Vevey-headquartered Nestle for its decision to withdraw the MFN status.

This means that Switzerland will tax dividends that Indian entities will earn in that country at 10 per cent from January 1, 2025

According to the statement, in 2021, the Delhi High Court in the Nestle case upheld the applicability of the residual tax rates after taking into account the MFN clause in the double taxation avoidance treaty. However, the Indian Supreme

Court, in a decision dated October 19, 2023, reversed the lower court's decision and concluded that, the applicability of MFN clause provided "was not directly applicable in the absence of 'notification' in accordance with Section 90 of the Income Tax Act".

Commenting on the decision of Swiss authority decision, Nangia Andersen M&A Tax Partner Sandeep Jhunjhunwala, said the unilateral suspension of application of the MFN clause under its tax treaty with India, marks a significant shift in

bilateral treaty dynamics. 'This suspension may lead to increased tax liabilities for Indian entities operating in Switzerland, highlighting the complexities of navigating international tax treaties in an evolving global landscape," he

It also underscores the necessity of aligning treaty partners on the interpretation and application of tax treaty clauses to ensure predictability, equity, and stability in international tax framework, Jhunjhunwala

said. AKM Global, Tax Partner, Amit Maheshwari, said that the main reason behind the decision to withdraw MFN is of reciprocity, which ensures that taxpayers in both countries are treated equally and fairly.

"Swiss authorities announced in August 2021 that based on the MFN clause between Switzerland and India, the tax rate on dividends from qualifying shareholdings would be reduced from 10 per cent to 5 per cent, effective retroactively from July 5, 2018.

However, the subsequen Supreme Court ruling in 2023 contradicted the same, Maheshwari said.

Overall, he added that this could impact Swiss investments in India as dividends would be subject to higher withholding now and income accruing on or after January 1, 2025, may be taxed at the rates provided for in the original double taxation treaty between Switzerland and

Sebi on Friday proposed facilitating the participation of retail investors algorithmic trading (algo trading), which provides advantages of faster order execution and improved liquidity. The proposal, if implemented, is expected to fill the void for retail investors who want to trade using algos with adequate safeguards. In an effort to enhance market efficiency and transparency, Sebi introduced algo trading through the Direct Market Access (DMA) facility, which provided significant advantages like faster order execution, reduced transaction costs, greater transparency, better audit

trails and improved liquidity. However, access to these facilities has been limited to

institutional investors. In its consultation paper on Friday, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) proposed extending the existing regulatory framework, with additional safeguards, to facilitate the participation of retail

investors in algo trading. "The evolving nature of algo trading, particularly with the increasing demand for algo trading by retail investors, has necessitated a further review and refinement of the regulatory framework so that retail investors are also able to participate in algo trading with proper checks and balances," Sebi said. regulator

Further, the

proposed spelling out the rights and responsibilities of the main stakeholders of the ecosystem trading providers/

investors, stock brokers, algo vendors and Infrastructure Market Institutions (MIIs)-- so that the retail investors can avail algo facilities with requisite safeguards.

Ajay Garg, Director and CEO, SMC Global Securities, said allowing algorithmic trading for retail investors is indeed the need of the hour.

Under the new framework, retail investors will get access to the approved algos only from the registered brokers, which will safeguard the interests of these investors. This presents great opportunities for stockbrokers to expand their customer base in a regulated

environment. The past study of Sebi in F&O trading revealed that around 97 per cent of FPI profits and 96 per cent of proprietary trader profits were generated from algo trading in FY24.

refined The proposed framework of algo trading will build the trust of retail investors and help them generate higher profits, given that it benefited the FPIs and institutional investors in the past, Garg said.

## **Bumrah is a combination of legendary pacers, says Chappell**

He also said that Bumrah is the only player standing between Australia and the Border Gavaskar Trophy.

"What sets Bumrah apart is his combination of skills: Marshall's (Malcolm) adaptability, Lillee's aggression, Richard Hadlee's control, Roberts' strategy, Wasim (Akram) and Waqar's (Younis) reverse swing, (Glenn) McGrath's precision, (Dale) Steyn's explosiveness, and (Kagiso) Rabada's modern versatility."

"As Nasser Hussain aptly observed, "He's the complete bowler. As he has had back surgery already, it is not certain he will have a long career, but if he does, his name will be mentioned in the same breath as the
