**PM Modi vows further crackdown on corruption**  
Says full freedom given to probe agencies

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday vowed further crackdown on corruption and black money, saying the government has given 'full freedom' to the probe agencies for taking strongest action against the corrupt. The prime minister said no one will be spared in the crackdown. He also took pot shot at the Congress for first levelling serious allegations with evidence against the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and later forming an alliance with it to fight the Lok Sabha elections. Replying to the Motion of Thanks on the President's address, Modi asserted that taking action against corruption is a mission for the NDA government and not a matter of electoral gains. "I want to state without hesitation and also tell the countrymen that I have given full freedom to the agencies to take the strongest action against the corrupt and corruption. The government will not interfere anywhere," the prime minister said. "Yes, they (probe agencies) should work honestly for honesty. No person embroiled in corruption will be able to escape the law. This is Modi's guarantee," the prime minister said.

them. He also said even the Supreme Court had termed the CBI as a "caged parrot". "Allegations have been made against the central investigative agencies. It has been said that the central government is misusing the investigative agencies. The AAP commits liquor scam, the AAP commits corruption, the AAP commits scam in building classrooms for children, the AAP even commits water scam..." The Congress complains against the AAP.

**City schools declare holiday in view of bandh**

Schools in the city have notified parents via WhatsApp messages that Thursday will be a non-working day. Various student organisations, including the Student's Federation of India (SFI), All India Students' Federation (AISF), and National Students' Union of India (NSUI), have announced a nation-wide educational strike on Thursday. The protest is in response to alleged irregularities in competitive exams such as NEET, overseen by the National Testing Agency (NTA). As a result of the impending strike, some schools and colleges in Hyderabad have preemptively declared Thursday a holiday. A message from preschool read, "Dear parents, Greetings of the day! This is to inform you that tomorrow, Thursday, July 4, 2024, school will remain closed due to bandh called by the SFI. This decision is made to ensure safety of children and staff during school hours. We will be working on Saturday, 13th instead. Thank you."

**Govt relaxes ban on general transfers**

The Telangana government on Wednesday relaxed the ban on general transfers of government employees imposed in 2018 by the erstwhile BRS government. According to the latest orders issued by the Finance Department, transfers will take place between July 5 and 20. For this purpose, the government has decided to prioritize cases involving spouses, employees retiring before June 30, 2025, and employees with 70% disability or more. The lifting of the ban for the period specified follows GO Ms. No. 80 issued by the Finance (HRM.I) Department on July 3, 2024. The ban on transfers will be re-imposed starting July 21, 2024. The government had previously imposed a ban on transfers except in specified cases. After careful consideration, the government has now decided to relax this ban. As per the new guidelines, no person shall be transferred before completing two years of service at a particular station as of June 30, 2024. However, this condition does not apply to transfer requests on spouse grounds. Additionally, no employee will be retained beyond four years of service at a particular station as of June 30, 2024, unless they are retiring before June 30, 2025, and have not requested a transfer. To ensure minimal disruption of work, not more than 40% of employees in any cadre will be transferred. Priority will be given to employees based on various criteria, including medical grounds for serious health conditions and employees with mentally retarded children. Departments such as Education, Commercial Taxes, Prohibition and Excise, Stamps and Registration, Transport, Forest, and Police will follow specific guidelines tailored to their needs.

# UNDIVIDED ASSETS WORTH OVER RS 1,42,601 CRORE Telugu states differ over distribution

The total worth of undivided assets between the two Telugu states is about Rs 1,42,601 crore. These assets are pertaining to 245 institutions. The Andhra Pradesh government is claiming about Rs 75,000 crore worth assets as its share. The Andhra Pradesh State Reorganisation Act said that the assets should be distributed between the two states in the ratio of 58% to residuary. State of Andhra Pradesh and 42% to newly formed Telangana State. According to report prepared by the Andhra Pradesh government 91% of total assets are

located in the Telangana, particularly in and around Hyderabad city. According to the report, the value of the ninth schedule institutions is estimated to be Rs 24,018.53 crore, of which about 94% worth Rs 22,550 crore are in Telangana. The value of 10th schedule institutions is estimated to be Rs 34,642 crore, of which 88% worth over Rs 30,350 crore are in Telangana. Another 12 institutions with undivided assets worth Rs 1,759 crore are also in Telangana. The Andhra Pradesh government's argument is that the 91% of the undivided assets

pertain to institutions located in Hyderabad, have disproportionately benefited Telangana. But the argument of Telangana government is that these assets are developed with the taxes collected from the people of Telangana and hence that the assets should be distributed on geographical basis. That means the assets located in Andhra Pradesh region belong to AP and the assets located in the Telangana region belong to Telangana. The Telangana government also claims some of these assets were created by the erstwhile Nizam government and AP has no share in these institutions. In Andhra Pradesh, seaports were developed and several buildings were constructed in the combined Andhra Pradesh but they are not claiming any share in these assets.



## Assam flood situation worsens; 8 more dead, over 16 lakh hit

The flood situation in Assam continued to deteriorate with eight more people losing their lives and more than 16.25 lakh people reeling under the deluge across 27 districts on Wednesday, an official bulletin said. Till Tuesday, more than 11.3 lakh people were suffering in flood waters across 23 districts of the state.

According to the daily flood report of the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA), two persons died at Tezpur revenue circle of Sonitpur district, while one each drowned at Mayong of Morigaon, Naharkatia of Dibrugarh, Pub Mangaladi of Darrang, Dergaon of Golaghat, Halem of Biswanath and

Margherita of Tinsukia. With this, the total number of people losing their lives in this year's flood, landslide and storm has increased to 56. Besides, three more persons are missing and feared to be washed away by flood waters in Sonitpur, Sivasagar and Golaghat districts.

The report said more than 16,25,000 people are hit due to the floods in Barpeta, Biswanath, Cachar, Charaideo, Chirang, Darrang, Dhemaji, Dhubri, Dibrugarh, Goalpara, Golaghat, Hailakandi, Hojai, Jorhat, Kamrup, Kamrup Metropolitan, East Karbi Anglong, West Karbi Anglong, Karimganj, Lakhimpur, Majuli, Morigaon, Nagaon, Nalbari, Sivasagar, Sonitpur and Tinsukia districts.

## 'BRS MLAs joining Cong as they failed to bear KCR's plots'

Stating that the BRS MLAs are joining the Congress as they failed to bear the conspiracies of BRS chief K Chandrasekhar Rao to topple the Congress government, Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka said that the 'joinings' will be in phased manner.

Speaking to the media at Gandhi Bhavan on Wednesday, Bhatti Vikramarka said that Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy already made it clear that he is not a disciple of Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu and was a companion only and now they are Chief Ministers of neighboring states.

Finding fault with the BRS leaders for demanding the re-merger of seven mandals, Bhatti said that the seven mandals merger was not there in the Division Act. However, the BRS handed over seven mandals through the ordinance that was brought by the BJP-led Centre. He alleged

that the BJP and BRS were the reason for the loss of seven mandals. Nobody believes cock and bull stories of former minister T Harish Rao, he pointed out, alleging that the BRS did nothing in the last 10 years.

Bhatti alleged that the former CM KCR did not implement the Rs1 lakh loan waiver scheme in the last five years. Bhatti said that the Congress government will implement Rs 2 lakh loan waiver scheme soon to make the farmers loan-free. He said that suicide of a farmer in Khammam district is painful.

The government already directed to punish the culprits severely conducting probe into the incident. Bhatti said that the government is implementing the schemes by studying them deeply. He said that the government already constituted a Cabinet Sub-Committee to prepare guidelines for the implementation of the scheme. He said that the government would utilise every paisa that is collected from the people through taxes. He said that the government will conduct workshops in the erstwhile 10 districts and prepare the report.

## Dead snake found in mid-day meal packet, claim parents

A tiny dead snake was allegedly found in a packet of mid-day meal meant for children at an 'Anganwadi' or government-run nursery school in western Maharashtra's Sangli district. The alleged incident was reported by the parents of a child at Palus on Monday, said Anandi Bhosale, vice-president of the state Anganwadi workers' union, though district officials could not be contacted to confirm it.

## Poverty declines to 8.5% from 21.2%

Poverty in India is estimated to have declined to 8.5 per cent in 2022-24 from 21.2 per cent in 2011-12, despite the challenges posed by the pandemic, according to a research paper by the economic think tank NCAER.

The paper titled 'Rethinking Social Safety Nets in a Changing Society', authored by Sonalde Desai of NCAER, used data from the newly completed Wave 3 of the India Human Development Survey (IHDS) as well as data from Waves 1 and 2 of the IHDS.

"According to the IHDS findings... poverty declined significantly between 2004-2005 and



2011-12 (from a headcount ratio of 38.6 to 21.2), and it continued to decline between 2011-12 and 2022-24 (from 21.2 to 8.5) despite the challenges posed by the pandemic," the paper said.

The paper said economic growth and poverty decline create a dynamic climate that requires nimble social protection programmes. Traditional strategies

designed to address chronic poverty in a large segment of society may be less effective as accidents of birth become less important than accidents of life, it added.

The paper noted that ensuring social protection systems keep up with the pace of social transformation will be a key challenge for India as it strives towards equitable development. According to the paper, during an era of economic growth, when opportunities increase, the long-term determinants of poverty may decline while accidents of life associated with natural disasters, illness and death, and changes in occupation-specific opportunities may become more important.

## Attire colour of Ram temple priests changes from saffron to yellow, mobile banned

The priests at the Ram temple here have changed their attire and have been banned from carrying mobile phones to the shrine, according to officials of the temple trust.

Till now the priests in the sanctum sanctorum were seen in saffron clothes. They used to wear saffron turban, saffron kurta and dhoti.

The priests have now started wearing yellow (pitambari) dhoti with a kurta and turban of the same colour.



According to the temple officials, the new dress code has been made effective from Jul 1.

The new priests have been given training to tie the yellow turbans. The 'chaubandi' kurta has

no buttons and a thread is used to tie it. The yellow 'dhoti', a piece of cotton cloth, is tied around the waist and covers the legs till the ankles.

There is a chief priest along with four assistant priests in the temple. Now each assistant priest is also accompanied by five trainee priests.

Each team of priests renders its services for five hours in shifts between 3.30 am and 11 pm.

The priests have also been banned from carrying mobile phones to the temple.

In contrast, every step in BRS' two-and-a-half-decade journey had been marked by remarkable successes, with no tales of failure. ## Rajnath 'lied' in Parl on compensation to martyr Agniveer families, alleges Rahul

He then referred to the purported statement by the father of an Agniveer martyr, Ajay Singh.

Ajay Singh's father said that Rajnath Singh made the statement that families of martyrs have been given Rs 1 crore compensation but no such assistance had been received by his family.

## '15 MLAs to quit BRS' Predicts BJP MP Raghunandan

Krishna Rao highlighted that Somasila in the Krishna River backwaters could be developed into an ideal location for destination weddings and adventure tourism. There are plans to organize flash mobs at tourist spots and shopping malls to promote cultural activities. The Minister mentioned that there would be grand celebrations for the centenary of D a s h a r a t h i Krishnamacharyulu and the birth anniversary of Kaloji Narayana Rao.

# Hyd office market jumps 40% to reach 5 M sqft

PNS ■ HYDERABAD

The Hyderabad office market is experiencing a period of phenomenal growth, fueled by a surge in demand from both domestic and global companies since the Congress government came to power.

According to Cushman & Wakefield's latest report, Gross Leasing Volume (GLV) for H1 2024 is projected to reach an impressive 5 million square feet, a significant increase of nearly 40% compared to the 3.6 million square feet recorded in H1 2023. This positive momentum is attracting a wave of companies to Hyderabad, solidifying its position as a leading business destination.

During the first quarter of the year, the Hyderabad office market witnessed a healthy gross leasing of 2.5 million square feet, recording a significant 125% growth on a year-on-year basis, although it was a 19% decline quarter-on-quarter. The leasing activity



observed in Q1 surpassed the average quarterly leasing activity recorded in 2023 by 11%, primarily driven by occupiers' expansion initiatives. Notably, more than 60% of deals involved smaller-sized office spaces with area requirements below 50,000 square feet, a trend that remained consistent with the quarterly figures recorded in 2023.

Net absorption in the Hyderabad office market remained relatively stable at 1.6 million square feet, with a

slight year-on-year decline of 2%. The report states that demand for office space was primarily fueled by the BFSI sector, commanding a 36% share of gross leasing, followed by the IT sector with a 23% share.

Flexible workspace operators accounted for a significant 20% of the leasing activity in Q1, nearly doubling from the average quarterly volume recorded in the previous year. The prime submarket of Madhapur dominated leasing

activity, accounting for 89% of quarterly office space leasing. Several factors are contributing to Hyderabad's office market boom, according to the report.

The entire supply in Q1 was concentrated towards the Gachibowli submarket, leading to a 367 basis points rise in vacancy, which stood at 45.92%. Nearly 5.8 million square feet of new supply is expected in Gachibowli for the rest of 2024, thus pushing the vacancy rate to an expected 47% by the end of 2024. Rental values slightly elevated in key markets, as stated in the report. Over the next three quarters, approximately 13 million square feet of new supply is anticipated in Madhapur and Gachibowli combined, indicating a further increase in vacancy rates. This growth trajectory positions Hyderabad as a frontrunner in the Indian office space market, offering a vibrant and fertile ground for businesses of all sizes to flourish.



## Man who fled with breathalyser held

The Bowenpally traffic police on Wednesday arrested a man who fled with a breathalyser during a drunk driving test. The accused was identified as Kothapli Sravan Kumar (27), a car driver. The police were conducting drunk and drive checking in the early hours of June 27 at Pulla Reddy building when they stopped the accused.

The traffic official asked Kumar to blow into the breathalyser. However, he pushed the official away and drove with the machine.

Kumar was finally arrested by the police. The car was also seized.

# TG govt starts HY-CITI to complete pending works

The Telangana government has started a new scheme named Hyderabad City Innovative Transformative and Infrastructure (HY-CITI) for the comprehensive development of basic facilities and infrastructure in Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC).

On Wednesday, the GHMC mentioned that the previous government had started Strategic Nala Development Programme (SNDP), Strategic Road Development Plan (SRDP), Comprehensive Road Maintenance Programme (CRMP) for doing various works. Under the HY-CITI programme the pending works of those programmes would be completed.

The Telangana government has directed the GHMC officials to prepare proposals on the priority works which were undertaken in the past. The GHMC set a target of 42 works for the development of flyovers, road-over bridges (ROBs), under bridge and other roads for better transport



system as a signal-free city, out of which 35 works have been completed and 7 works are in various stages of progress.

A total of 58 works have been undertaken by SNDP in the first phase in the GHMC and peripheral areas and 39 of them were completed. A total of 69.49 km-long capacity canals have been targeted to be developed and 42.48 km canals have been completed.

In total 37 works have been completed in the limits of the GHMC. Also 7 works in GHMC and 12 works in remaining municipalities are at

an incomplete stage.

Among the works proposed to be undertaken by SNDP in the second phase, 35 works at an estimated cost of Rs 582.42 crore will be undertaken in the city through the HY-CITI programme. There are several works pending in the GHMC zones, which are, seven works should be completed in the LB Nagar zone, nine works in Charminar zone, three works in Khairatabad zone, seven works in Serilingampally zone, six works in Kukatpally zone and three works in Secunderabad zone would be completed.

# Special drive against child labour through Operation Muskan-10

Rachakonda Commissioner Tarun Joshi stated that the police officials launched a special drive from July 1 to July 31, 2024 through 'Operation Muskan-10' which aimed at rescuing and rehabilitating homeless children and forced children caught in begging and child labour during the Operation Muskan tenth coordination meeting.

The Commissioner said that child labour system has become like a disease in society and it is destroying the childhood of many innocent children. The main reason behind child labour is poverty of the parents which forces their children into the trap of begging, workers at construction sites and other harsh chores thereby ruining their golden future. The government is implementing many free schemes for the education of children and parents should take advantage of them regardless of their financial situation. He called for public participa-



tion in eradication of bonded labour and people should consider it as their moral responsibility. "Special teams have been formed for this purpose, consisting of a sub-inspector and four police constables (including a woman police constable). These teams rescue and rehabilitate trafficked children. A facial recognition software application called Darpan is being used to identify children who are separated or missing from their families due to various reasons," he added.

Furthermore, strict measures are being taken to eliminate human trafficking and child labour in Rachakonda. He also reminded that work-site schools are being run in their residential areas so that

the children of workers should not be deprived of education because of the bricks brought from other states like Odisha and Bihar.

The High Court took the case as suo moto based on a news item published in a newspaper. The newspaper published that the confessional statement of Bhujanga Rao revealed that High Court Justice Sarath Kaja's phone was tapped during BRS government tenure.

## Flaws in ticket booking via IRCTC app, website under fire

Just like other government platforms, the Indian Railway Catering and Tourism Corporation (IRCTC) has collaborated with private payment apps to increase the rate of bookings by the customers through its official portal and app. However, a majority of people raised their grievances over irregularities of both the IRCTC portal and the app while booking train tickets.

Hyderabad activist Robin Zacheus criticised the railways officials by saying, "During the month of May, I was booking tickets from Delhi to Hyderabad through IRCTC app, but the app failed to book my tickets successful-

ly due to frequent app crashes and logouts. Also, a large number of passengers are attempting to book the tickets from 11:00 am to 11:30 am thereby leading to app crashes and frequent logouts. Apart from the frequent logouts and the app getting frozen, there is an issue with Captcha code which lacks AI. In regards to Tatkal booking including the premium version, a majority of people face issues with booking train seats from 10 am due to freezing issues or crash issues during the booking procedure. It's really pathetic for the customers to use the app for booking seats in trains. Also, as per the Right to Information (RTI) says user capacity of booking

train tickets is 26,000 per minute. However, the annual report of IRCTC states that the user capacity of booking train tickets is 28,000 per minute as per RTI."

He also said that Paytm app (third party) was showing the waiting list from 10:00 am - 10:20 am and was allowed to book the tickets with some surety of confirmation chances but not the official IRCTC app. According to the RailwaySeva, the partners and agents are not allowed to book the Tatkal tickets but paytm users were able to book the tickets with IRCTC login requirements. "Why the Indian Railways giving more preference to paytm than IRCTC officials?", Robin questioned.

## AITUC activists protest exploitation of contract workers

The All India Trade Union Congress (AITUC) on Wednesday held a protest at the Directorate of Medical Education (DME) regarding exploitation of contract workers at government hospitals.

Addressing the issue, AITUC Telangana president Mohammed Yousuf said, "Today's protest was held over three major issues, including non-payment of salaries as per the Government Order No. 60. Whenever the employees approach the contractor, he says the government hasn't released salaries. As per the law, contract workers should be given eight leaves for festivals and national holidays annually. There should be 16 earned leaves, which is not being given. As per the Supreme Court's judgement on September 26, 2016 our salaries must be increased including basic, dearness allowance and HRA. We had

released a statement regarding implementation of the same. Today, the AITUC submitted a memorandum to a representative of the DME."

Yousuf further said, "We couldn't meet the DME. However, the representative assured us that the authorities would look into the demands and resolve the issue. The AITUC members will meet the DME in a couple of days."

Contract workers complained of increased workload at Gandhi, Osmani and Niloufer hospitals due shortage of attendants. The protestors further said that there are discrepancies in provident funds; While the PF amount of Rs 3,200 must be deposited, only Rs 1,500 is being put in their accounts. The contract employees accused contractors of corruption regarding the PF.

# Govt set target of planting 66 lakh saplings in Nalgonda dist

District Collector C. Narayana Reddy said that a target has been set to plant 66 lakh saplings in Nalgonda district this year under the Vanamahotsava programme.

On Wednesday, he held a video conference with district and mandal level officials on various issues from the district Collectorate.

Every sapling planted under Vanamahotsava should survive and the right places should be chosen for planting saplings. It is mandatory to plant saplings on both sides road, not to leave any office or road without planting.

District Medical and Health Department officials have been directed to organise awareness campaigns on infectious diseases.

District Superintendent of Police Sarat Chandra Pawar said that if any forest land is encroached, the police would provide protection to the officials to dismantle encroachments.

Girls secured a large number of seats in the six-year BTech programme offered by the Rajiv Gandhi University of Knowledge Technologies (RGUKT), Basar, for the academic year 2024-25. A list of candidates provisionally selected was released by Principal Secretary (Education), Burra Venkatesham, along with RGUKT Vice-Chancellor Prof V Venkata Ramana, on Wednesday.

According to RGUKT officials, 976 girls got provisional admissions as against 428 boys, translating the ratio of girls and boys among those selected to 69:31. Overall, 1,404 candidates were given provisional admission by the university in the first phase of

admissions. The list has been made available on the university website Rajiv Gandhi University of Knowledge Technologies, Basar.

The highest number of students was from Siddipet with 330 students being allotted seats followed by 157 students from Nizamabad and 132 from Sangareddy district. Among those selected, 95 per cent were from the government schools and remaining from the private schools.

The first phase of certificate verification will be conducted on the university campus from July 8 to 10. It is mandatory for all provisionally selected candidates to attend the counselling on the prescribed dates along with original certificates, said a senior officer of RGUKT.

# Elderly man hit by train in Telangana; body found hanging on Loco

An unidentified elderly man died after he was hit by a train on the city outskirts and his body was found hanging on the Loco of an empty rake, Government Railway Police (GRP) said on Wednesday.

The deceased man is aged about 65-70 years, an Investigation Officer of the GRP, who visited the scene, said, adding he was hit by an empty rake while he was "trespassing" railway track and died on the spot. A case was registered at RPS Secunderabad. Further investigation including to identify the deceased person, was on.

# Cong govt fails to ensure development of Nagarkurnool: Marri

Police on Wednesday arrested another person for his alleged involvement in the public flogging of a couple in Chopra in West Bengal's Uttar Dinajpur district, an officer said. A team of officers of Islampur police station arrested Amirul Islam alias Badhua from near the state's international border with Bangladesh on Wednesday morning, the officer said. Islam, a resident of Chopra's Ghimar village, was spotted in the video grab which showed the other arrested accused Tajmul Islam alias 'JCB' mercilessly caning a couple who were allegedly involved in an extra-marital affair. The rest of the accused will be identified and arrested. Amirul was seen beside the prime accused JCB in the video, the police officer said. The police on Sunday registered a suo moto case after the video of the incident that happened on Friday went viral on social media, sparking widespread outrage. PTI could not independently verify the video.



RTI appeals pendency coming down every year: Union Minister Jitendra

Union minister Jitendra Singh on Wednesday said the pendency of Right to Information (RTI) appeals is coming down every year. The assertion came while chairing a meeting with Chief Information Commissioner Heeralal Samariya, who gave an update on the working and progress of the Central Information Commission. "The pendency of RTI appeals is substantially reducing from 35,718 appeals in 2019-20 to 29,213 appeals in 2021-22, further reducing to 23,087 appeals in 2023-24 and 22,666 appeals in 2024-25 which is remarkable," said Singh, the Minister of State for Personnel. There has been almost 100 per cent disposal of appeals, with pendency coming down every year, he was quoted as saying in a statement issued by the Personnel Ministry. The minister appreciated the progress made in reducing pendency and increasing the ease of providing information to citizens by the proactive role played by the Commission.



Woman accuses Goa policeman of assault, forcing to lick his shoes

A woman has accused a sub-inspector of Goa Police of assaulting her and forcing her to lick his shoes following which an inquiry has been initiated, an official said on Wednesday. A First Information Report (FIR) would be registered against the police officer after a preliminary probe, he added. The issue was raised by AAP MLA Venzy Viegas who on Tuesday met Superintendent of Police (South) Sunita Sawant with the woman complainant. As per the complaint, the police sub-inspector (PSI) attached to Colva police station called her and her husband to a spot on the border of Benaulim and Nuvem on June 22 after they were involved in an altercation with a truck driver following a minor road accident. The couple had asked the truck driver to pull over after they narrowly escaped a major accident, but the dispute was sorted out amicably, she claimed in the complaint lodged with Margao police station.



Cong, INDIA bloc spreading lies on NEET issue: Pradhan

Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan on Wednesday attacked the opposition alleging it is misleading students by spreading lies on the NEET issue and should stop its "cheat policy". Pradhan's comments came after Prime Minister Narendra Modi told the Rajya Sabha that the government will not spare those playing with the future of students. Amid a raging row over alleged irregularities, including paper leaks, in competitive examinations such as the NEET and the NET, the opposition has been demanding a discussion on the issue in Parliament. "Congress has a history of cheating the country on past and present issues. This intention of theirs has come out in the open in the NEET case as



well. The intention of the INDI alliance to create instability by deviating from the issues with the help of lies and rumours is anti-national and anti-student," Pradhan wrote on X in Hindi. "During his speech in Rajya Sabha today, the Prime Minister has again told the youth of the country that youth power and their bright future is the priority of the govern-

ment and this government is with every young student of the country. No injustice will be allowed to happen to anyone. "The government is taking strict steps by bringing a law for this. The country is confident that no one guilty of irregularities in the examination will be spared. Now Congress party and Indi Alliance should stop their misleading cheat policy

on NEET issue," he added. In the line of fire over the alleged irregularities in the NEET and the PhD entrance NET, the Centre removed National Testing Agency (NTA) director general Subodh Singh last week and notified a high-level panel headed by former Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) chief R Radhakrishnan to ensure transparent, smooth and fair conduct of examinations through the NTA. While the NEET is under the scanner over several irregularities, including alleged paper leaks, the UGC-NET was cancelled as the education ministry received inputs that the integrity of the exam was compromised. Both matters are being probed by the CBI. Two other exams -- CSIR-UGC NET and NEET-PG -- were cancelled as a preemptive step.

Cop mowed down by tractor carrying illegally mined gravel

A Rajasthan Police head constable was mowed down by a tractor driver who was transporting illegally mined gravel in the state's Tonk district, officials said on Wednesday. The incident occurred in the Kotwali police station area when Head Constable Khushiram Bairwa (35) tried to stop the tractor late on Tuesday night, police said. "Instead of stopping the vehicle, the driver hit the head constable and left him grievously injured. The policeman was referred to the Sawai Man Singh (SMS) Hospital, Jaipur where he died during treatment," Kotwali Station House Officer (SHO) Bhanwarlal Vaishnav said. The tractor driver, Javed, has been arrested and further investigation is underway, he said.

Jharkhand CM Champai resigns; Hemant stakes claim

Jharkhand chief minister Champai Soren resigned on Wednesday and Hemant Soren, who is out on bail in a money laundering case, staked claim to form the government, hours after leaders of the JMM-led alliance in the state unanimously elected him as the legislature party leader. Champai Soren, who had taken oath as the 12th chief minister of Jharkhand on February 2 after Hemant Soren's arrest, met Governor CP Radhakrishnan at Raj Bhavan and tendered his resignation in the presence of the JMM executive president, capping a day-long drama full of speculations. Hemant Soren staked claim to form the government and the swearing-in ceremony is likely to be held soon. If sworn in, Hemant Soren will be the 13th chief minister of Jharkhand, which was carved



out of Bihar on November 15, 2000. "I have resigned as per the decision of the JMM-led alliance. Our alliance is strong," Champai Soren said after coming out of Raj Bhavan. "All know what had happened with Hemant Soren Ji... I was given the responsibility by the coalition partners. Now, the alliance has decided in favour of Hemant Soren Ji," he said. Hemant Soren told the media all formalities to form

the government are complete. "Everything will be disclosed soon," the JMM executive president said when asked about the swearing-in. Earlier, leaders and MLAs of the alliance during a meeting at Champai Soren's residence here unanimously decided to elect Hemant Soren as the JMM legislature party leader, party sources said. "A decision was taken in the meeting to make Hemant Soren as the Chief Minister of the state again," a party source said.

Delhi Police increases security outside Rahul's residence

The Delhi Police has stepped up security outside Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's residence following an intelligence input of disturbance by right wing groups, sources said on Wednesday. One platoon of paramilitary, including the local police personnel, have been deployed around Gandhi's residence, sources said. Gandhi's remarks against the saffron party had created ruckus in the Lok Sabha on Monday. Sources said an input regarding disturbance by right wing group members was received on Tuesday after which the security has been

increased around the Congress leader's residence in central Delhi. The police have suspected the people may gather with placard or hoardings outside his residence. The local police has been asked to increase the vigil for 24 hours around his residence, sources said. Gandhi enjoys Z plus security with ASL (advanced security liaison) category under the CRPF (Central Reserve Police Force) personnel. On Wednesday, the Delhi BJP leaders and workers staged a protest here over Gandhi's remarks against the saffron party and sought an apology from him.

Govt constitutes cabinet committees on security, economic and political affairs

Economic Affairs comprises defence minister, home minister, finance minister, external affairs minister, Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari, Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, and Heavy Industries and Steel Minister H D Kumaraswamy. Others in the committee are: Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal, Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan and Minister of Panchayati Raj and Fisheries Rajiv Ranjan Singh alias Lalan Singh. The Cabinet Committee on Parliamentary Affairs comprises defence minister, home minister, finance minister, panchayati raj minister, Health Minister J P Nadda, Social Justice Minister Virendra Kumar, Civil Aviation Minister Kinjarapu Ram Mohan Naidu, Tribal Affairs Minister Jual Oram, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijju, and Minister of Jal Shakti C R Patil. The special invitees in the committee are Union Minister of State for Law (Independent Charge) Arjun Ram Meghwal and Minister of State for Law L Murugan.



Pushing by Baba's security, slippery slope led to Hathras stampede, says prelim report

Chaos caused after Narayan Sakaar Hari's followers, who tried to reach near his vehicle to seek "darshan", were pushed by the godman's security and a "slippery slope" resulted in the stampede that killed 121 people in Hathras, a preliminary report of the SDM said. Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM) Sikandra Rao submitted the preliminary report on the stampede to the district magistrate (DM). The SDM, who gave permission for the 'satsang' (religious congregation), was also present at the venue when the incident occurred, according to the report. "A crowd of more than 2 lakh people was present in the satsang pandal. Shri Narayan Sakaar Hari (Bhole Baba) reached the satsang pandal at about 12.30 pm and the program went on for 1 hour. "After this, at about 1.40 pm, Shri Narayan Sakaar Hari (Bhole Baba) came out of the pandal to go towards Etah on National Highway-91," the preliminary report said.

PIL in Allahabad HC seeks CBI probe into Hathras stampede

A public interest litigation was filed in the Allahabad High Court on Wednesday demanding a CBI inquiry into the stampede at a religious congregation in Hathras which claimed 121 lives. The PIL filed by advocate Gaurav Dwivedi said the district officials are "fully responsible" for the negligence that led to the stampede. In his petition addressed to the chief justice and other judges, Dwivedi has said that it was learnt through media that more than a hundred people had died and many were injured in the stampede that took place after the 'satsang' in Hathras district. The district officials have all the arrangements to deal with any untoward situation and the Uttar Pradesh government is spending a lot of money on the new technologies.

Tripura urges Centre to introduce inland waterway

The Tripura government has urged the Centre to introduce inland waterway transport in the northeastern state. In a letter to Union Minister for Ports, Shipping and Waterways Sarbananda Sonowal on Tuesday, Tripura Transport Minister Sushanta Chowdhury sought that linkage of Gomati River in Tripura with Meghna River system in Bangladesh be set up through the Sonamura-Daudkandi protocol route. "Initiative may be taken for linking Sonamura-Daudkandi waterway to ports in Bangladesh such as Ashuganj, Mongla and Chittagong... further connecting with important Indian rivers such Ganga, Brahmaputra, Barak and ultimately to connect Haldia port in West Bengal through sea routes and Sittwe port of Kaladan project in Myanmar," he stated in the letter. Experts have pointed out that the cost of transporting goods between India and Bangladesh will come down if the Sonamura-Daudkandi protocol route is operationalised. Chowdhury also requested the Centre to approve the proposal to purchase six to ten passenger vessels to boost tourism and ease crossing of Gomati River by commuters.

Delhi court extends Kejriwal's custody till July 12

A court here on Wednesday extended till July 12 the judicial custody of Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal in the money laundering case related to the alleged excise policy scam. Kejriwal, who is in jail till July 12 in the CBI case related to the excise policy, appeared before the court of Special Judge Kaveri Baweja through video conference. The court, meanwhile, reserved for June 6 its order on Kejriwal's application to allow his wife Sunita Kejriwal to be present as an attendant during his medical checkup. During the proceedings, Kejriwal requested the court's permission to speak

but the court said he is already being represented through his counsels. Kejriwal said his wife was instrumental in managing his health over the years and as she had a detailed knowledge about his ailments and medical history, granting her access to his medical records every week was justifiable and essential. "Transparency in his medical care is not only a legal requirement but also a critical component of ethical medical practice. Therefore, the applicant (Arvind Kejriwal) and his wife must be duly informed of all aspects of the treatment being administered, ensuring their capability to make informed decisions about his health," the plea said.



People in India exposed to humid heat extremes increased by 67 crore: Study

People in India exposed to extreme levels of humid heat during monsoons increased by at least 67 crore over the period 1951-2020, a research has found. Researchers investigated trends in hot and humid conditions or 'moist heat extremes', commonly seen in monsoons during the summer months, in terms of Wet-Bulb Globe Temperature (WBGT). The researchers, including those from Cornell University,



US, found that area exposed to extreme and detrimental wet-bulb temperatures exceeding 31 degrees Celsius increased by close to 43 million square kilometres - representing over 67 crore people.

"The consistent increase in exposed area (of close to 43 million square kilometres above 31 degrees Celsius) can adversely impact the labour-intensive work during the monsoon break," the authors wrote in the study published in the journal Earth's Future. They also found that the regions most vulnerable to moist heat extremes with wet-bulb temperatures higher than 38 degrees Celsius were primarily along the Indo-Gangetic plain and eastern coast.

3% babies with low birth weight born during pandemic

Amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, number of babies in India born with a low birth weight rose sharply -- by about three per cent, a new study has found. Babies born during the pandemic were also found to be at double the risk of having a low weight at birth. The increase in babies born with a low weight could impact the development of "human capital" in the long term, as these infants are known to often "struggle with school", corresponding author Santosh Kumar, an associate professor of development and global health economics at the University of Notre Dame, US, said.

"Children who have lower birth weight as infants often go on to struggle with school and this limits their capacity to develop what economists often call 'human capital' -- the key knowledge and skills that will affect their ability to earn a good living and support themselves and their families," Kumar said. Roughly one in every four babies (3 crore) around the world are born with a low weight, which the World Health Organization (WHO) defines as being less than 2.5 kilograms. About 95 per cent of these babies are born in low- and middle-income countries, with around half being born in South Asia, according to the authors of the study published in the journal Communications



Medicine. In this study, the researchers found that babies born between April 2020 and April 2021 weighed less than the WHO-defined limit, compared to those born before the pandemic. Over two lakh infants were analysed, of which 12,000 were born during the pandemic and

about 1,92,000 born pre-pandemic. Data was taken from the fifth round of the Indian National Family Health Survey (NFHS-5), conducted during 2019-2021. "The low birth weight prevalence rate (among babies) is 20 per cent in the pandemic cohort and 17 per cent in the pre-pandemic cohort," the authors wrote in the study, which they claimed is the first one to look at how the pandemic affected birth outcomes in India using a nationally representative sample. On average, birth weights during the pandemic years were found to be lowered by 11 grams. The authors also found that babies born during the pan-

demic were at double the risk of having a low birth weight compared to those born pre-pandemic. While a significant number of pandemic-affected children were observed in rural areas and socially disadvantaged communities, the researchers found that a large number of babies from the richest households were also impacted. Multiple factors related to the pandemic, including COVID-causing SARS-CoV-2 virus, stress related to social distancing, economic upheaval and the disruption of maternal and neonatal care, may have affected the health behaviours of pregnant women and contributed to lower birth weights, Kumar said.

## Innocent lives lost

Stampede at a satsang in Hathras kills at least 121, highlighting the urgent need for stronger regulations

In a tragic and devastating incident in the Hathras district of Uttar Pradesh, a stampede during a satsang resulted in the deaths of at least 121 people. Although the exact cause of the mishap will be determined after a detailed investigation, eyewitness accounts reveal that the stampede occurred when devotees surged forward to seek blessings from Narayan Sakar Vishwa Hari, also known as Bhole Baba. The devotees rushed to touch Bhole Baba's feet and attempted to gather soil from his path, a customary practice that led to the chaos. Many people fell into a nearby drain. Some eyewitnesses reported that after the satsang concluded, many followers rushed toward Bhole Baba to touch his feet or catch a glimpse of him as he departed in his car. People wanted to get his *darshan* and collect soil from the road on which his car left the venue. As the satsang ended, people started leaving in groups. Due to the rain, many slipped, and others fell on top of them, leading to a crushing cascade. Others maintain that people started rushing out due to the humidity when the incident occurred, and many followers, most of whom were women, felt suffocated.



The incident exposes many disturbing facts, ranging from the negligence of the administration to the unchecked influence of godmen over innocent people. Bhole Baba is reportedly absconding. First of all, the number of attendees far exceeded the permitted limit. The chief sewadar (organizer) of Baba's program estimated an attendance of around 80,000 people, but the actual number was significantly higher. Indeed, this breach of the permitted

capacity likely exacerbated the situation, leading to overcrowding in a venue that was inadequate. Now, after this horrific incident, the government is in damage control mode. Compensation for the deceased has been announced, and the Chief Minister is expected to visit Hathras. Additionally, a team has been set up to investigate the cause of the incident. However, in all probability nothing will change and that this incident will soon be forgotten like many before. As we mourn the loss of 121 lives and support the injured and their families, it is imperative to learn from this tragedy and implement effective measures to prevent such incidents in the future. We must prioritise safety, preparedness, and responsible management to ensure the safety of the people. Moreover, shouldn't there be a check on the activities of mushrooming godmen who exploit people's faith and endanger their lives? Many such godmen become so powerful that they are able to dictate terms to the administration and have considerable political clout which gives them power. However, the lack of awareness among people and their sense of helplessness contribute to the proliferation of these godmen who thrive on the ignorance and innocence of the people.

# Pandemonium in Parliament

As the Modi Govt navigates a new power dynamic, the increased presence and assertiveness of the Opposition suggest a challenging path ahead

The 18th Lok Sabha has the potential for positive functioning. The Modi government said they wanted consensus. Prime Minister Narendra Modi sought agreement and criticised the Opposition for causing problems. Modi stated that in his third term, his Government would aim to build consensus. The Leader of the Opposition, Rahul Gandhi, also emphasised the importance of the Opposition's role in representing the 'voice of the people' in the House. But at the start of the session, they couldn't agree on important issues. Congress leader Sonia Gandhi wrote in an editorial recently in an English daily that Prime Minister Narendra Modi was "Preaching consensus, provoking confrontation."



Sonia Gandhi criticised Prime Minister Modi for not acknowledging the electoral outcome and for promoting confrontation over consensus. She expressed disappointment with the first few days of the 18th Lok Sabha, pointing out that there's no sign of a changed attitude from the Prime Minister. The 18th Lok Sabha is a significant shift in Indian politics, marking the first time in a decade that Modi is leading a Parliament from a less dominant position. This shift in power dynamics requires him to navigate a coalition and contend with a more assertive opposition. The Modi government now relies on crucial support from two key allies - JD(U) and TDP. This means the NDA allies could significantly influence the Government's plans and actions, a departure from the substantial majority the BJP enjoyed in 2019 and 2014. The increased presence of the Opposition in various parliamentary panels is likely to generate greater engagement. The first session of the current Lok Sabha began with a strong Opposition asserting its rights. Before the session started, there was a dispute over the appointment of BJD M.P Bhartruhari Mahtab as the protem Speaker to administer. The Congress and the INDIA

late Prime Minister Indira Gandhi. This surprising move caught many off guard and caused tension with Congress, as the Emergency was declared on the same date in 1975. This led the Leader of the Opposition, Rahul Gandhi, to lead a group to the Speaker to express their objection to a political statement from the chair. Fourthly, some opposition parties thought the president's inaugural speech to a joint session of Parliament ignored the country's most serious problems. Also, the Opposition called for removing the Sengol, which the Prime Minister had installed with much fanfare before the Election. Fifthly, Rahul and other Opposition MPs proposed discussing the leakage of the NEET question paper first. The Speaker, however, insisted that a discussion on the Motion of Thanks to the President's address, a significant issue, should be held first. The first week's confrontation shows despite the decrease in numbers, the BJP is unlikely to change its working methods. An energised opposition will also be belligerent. The proceedings in Rajya Sabha also saw disruptions and adjournments as Opposition members raised slogans demand-

ing a discussion on the NEET question paper leak issue. There was also a heated argument between the Chairman and Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge. The functioning of the House lies with the Speaker, a position of utmost importance in maintaining order and ensuring fair debates. The Rajya Sabha Chairman presides over the Upper House. A functioning House is necessary and a prerequisite for a healthy democracy. The need for constructive cooperation between the Government and the Opposition cannot be overstated. The House functions effectively in addressing the pressing issues facing the nation. Both sides must recognise the truth and collaborate to make Parliament more organised. After all, the Government is accountable to Parliament. The parliamentary system emphasises collective responsibility, accountability, and flexibility. As former President Pranab Mukherjee said, its functioning is based on Debate, Dissension, and Decision.

### Tragedy strikes Hathras



More than 100 people died and several others were injured in a stampede at a religious congregation in a village in Hathras district on Tuesday, 2 July, police said. Senior Superintendent of Police, Etah,

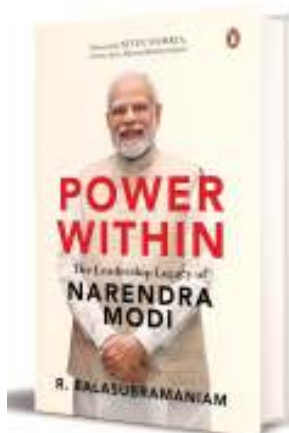

# Wake-up call against rising plastic pollution

International Plastic Bag Free Day, observed annually on July 3, aims to raise awareness about the escalating crisis of plastic pollution



The International Plastic Bag Free Day is celebrated on Jul 3 every year. The awareness created due to observance of this day helps put focus on the threat of the silently growing footprint of plastic pollution. This is essential given the fact that plastic pollution, especially of Single Use Plastics (SUP) has now permeated all aspects of the environment. Today SUP and plastic microfibre pollution can be found from the highest point to the deepest part of the earth. The influx of 45,000 trekkers per year to Mt. Everest has unfortunately ensured that microplastic pollution can now be found in snow samples close to the peak of the world's highest mountain. Similarly, relentless marine traffic and indiscriminate disposal of garbage into the oceans has resulted in high microplastic pollution across the seas including in The Mariana Trench, Earth's deepest point in the Pacific Ocean, more than 11 km deep from mean sea level. As humanity achieves this dubious distinction of spreading litter to virtually all corners of the planet, India unfortunately is firmly at the forefront of plastic pollution spree. The figures speak for themselves. According to the Plastic Overshoot Day report by Swiss non-profit EA, Earth Action states that global plastic waste generation has risen by 7.11 per cent since 2021. The world is estimated to have generated 220 million tons of plastic waste this year, 70 million tons of which will end up polluting the environment. India is not far behind. India ranks 3rd globally contributing 5.5 KT of SUP and ranked ninety-fourth with per capita single-use plastic waste of 4 kg per year. The much-publicised SUP ban in India addresses only 11 per cent of the entire gamut of SUP plastic waste. India is among the twelve countries responsible

for 60 per cent of the planet's mismanaged plastic waste. With a population of more than 1.44 billion, India generates 26,000 tonnes of plastic waste every day. This is the equivalent of approximately 26,000 small cars. Unfortunately, only 8 per cent of this plastic is recycled. The Swiss report also states that India is poised to release 391,879 tonnes of microplastic into water bodies by the end of 2024. Second only to China. With abysmal conditions such as these, India's grip on plastic pollution can at best be described as feeble. The efforts to rein in the runaway plastic pollution have to begin at the grassroots level. The International Plastic Bag Free Day focuses on the same by increasing awareness about the harmful impact of plastic bag usage and pollution. Additionally, stress is also laid on encouraging individuals, businesses, and organisations to adopt sustainable alternatives for SUP products. The special day urges governments across the world to step up policy changes and introduce radical systemic solutions to reduce plastic use and waste. The current statistics of plastic pollution in India demand serious and innovative solutions that look beyond the traditional answers such as simple unsorted recycling of plastic, landfilling or co-processing. The need of the hour is ultra-innovative remedies that deliver scalable and sustainable results in

record time. While India continues to construct a circular economy that reduces plastic waste, the focus must now be firmly shifted to handling the plastic pollution problem on large scale basis. As a part of this India must set up large-scale waste sorting facilities that can use artificial intelligence-based algorithms to automatically sift through various types of plastic waste and identify the same. This as compared to traditional recycling methods can speed up the process of recycling and therefore increase the quantum of plastic recycled at the facility in one shift. This in turn can ensure that the facility can sort and recycle an entire district's monthly plastic waste within a week. An example in this regard is Sweden's plastic waste sorting facility called Site Zero which can handle up to 200,000 tonnes of plastic packaging every year, more than any other facility in the world, and enough to deal with the whole country's household plastic packaging waste. Similarly, microplastic pollution in water is a major concern. The various water bodies in the country and the seas are rife with microplastic contamination. In this regard, India can take a leaf out of the innovative initiative taken by Germany. Wasser 3.0 in Germany has perfected the process of not only removing microplastics but also micro-pollutants from water—that too without any filters.

The process followed is called "Agglomeration Fixation" which clumps microplastics together on the surface of the water after which they are simply skimmed off. The process is simple, scalable with no side effects and can be applied to a variety of water bodies be it freshwater, seawater or even wastewater. Furthermore, the science of biochemical research can be leveraged to access plastic-degrading enzymes that can degrade and consume plastic waste in record time. This can go a long way in accelerating a year's plastic waste recycling activity to a few months. With the aid of science, and artificial intelligence (AI) software the possibilities of innovative plastic pollution combat options are endless. AI aided by satellite support for instance can help India clean up its seas on a large-scale manner, special software-driven clean-up technologies can dredge up decades of plastic and other pollutants thereby providing a chance of survival for the delicate marine life. Plastic is in our everyday life and diet as well. A World Wildlife Fund study has revealed that an average human being ingests 5 gm of plastic every week. It is time to cut the growing footprint of this harmful substance to size in the interests of mankind and the environment. So next time we reach for that plastic bag, let us not. 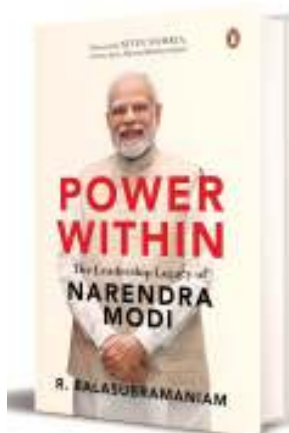

## ISMA urges govt to reconsider sugar exports amid surplus

Sugar industry body ISMA on Wednesday called on the government to reconsider allowing sugar exports, citing a projected surplus and the potential financial strain on mills. The Indian Sugar and Bio-Energy Manufacturers Association (ISMA) estimates a surplus sugar of up to 3.6 million tonnes in the 2023-24 season ending September, while experts predict closing stocks of 9.1 million tonnes. "This estimated surplus... can potentially lead to additional costs for the millers on account of idle inventory and carrying costs," ISMA said in a statement. The industry body argues that domestic consumption and availability are 'more than comfortable' and that the Ethanol Blending Programme can be managed effectively. ISMA Director General Deepak Ballani said allowing exports would ensure adequate domestic stocks, sustain the ethanol programme, and help maintain mills' financial liquidity for timely farmer payments.



## Vraj Iron shares settle nearly 22% higher in debut trade

Shares of Vraj Iron And Steel Ltd on Wednesday ended with a premium of nearly 22 per cent against the issue price of Rs 207. The stock listed at Rs 240, recording a jump of 15.94 per cent on both the BSE and NSE. It zoomed 21.71 per cent to settle at Rs 251.95 -- its upper circuit limit -- on the BSE. On the NSE, the stock climbed 21.73 per cent to settle at Rs 252 -- its highest trading permissible limit for the day. The company's market valuation stood at Rs 831 crore. In traded volume terms, 2.86 lakh shares of the company were traded at the BSE and 20.45 lakh shares at the NSE during the day. The initial public offer of Vraj Iron and Steel got subscribed 119 times on the last day of bidding on Friday helped by heavy participation from institutional investors. The Rs 171-crore initial share sale was entirely a fresh issue of equity shares with no offer-for-sale component. Shares were available for public subscription in the range of Rs 195 to Rs 207 per scrip.



## Karnataka government signs MoUs with two Korean firms

The Karnataka government on Tuesday signed two MoUs worth Rs 1,040 crore with DN Solutions and EMNI Company Limited in Seoul, South Korea. The MoUs were signed on the second day of the delegation's visit, led by Karnataka Minister for Large and Medium Industries and Infrastructure Development M B Patil. He participated in the 'Roadshow on Investment Opportunities in Karnataka' in Seoul, South Korea, which was organised by the Karnataka government and Embassy of India. A statement issued by his office said these strategic partnerships are set to advance the state's manufacturing, research and development, and battery technology sectors. "Karnataka secures Rs 1,000 crore investment from DN Solutions and has committed from the company for an investment of Rs 1,000 crore towards establishing machine manufacturing facilities, a research and development centre, and a technical support centre for Indian manufacturing companies," the statement read.



# India initiates anti-dumping probe into import of Chinese lift guide rails

India has initiated an anti-dumping probe into the import of Chinese lift guide rails following a complaint by a domestic player.

The duty is aimed at protecting the domestic industry from cheap imports.

The commerce ministry's investigation arm Directorate General of Trade Remedies (DGTR) is probing the alleged dumping of 'T-Shaped Elevator/Lift Guide Rails and Counterweight Guide Rails' from China.

Savera India Riding Systems Company has filed an application for the initiation of an anti-dumping investigation on the imports of this product from China.

The applicant has alleged that material injury is being



caused to the domestic industry due to the alleged dumped imports and has requested for the imposition of anti-dumping duties.

"On the basis of the duly substantiated written application submitted by the domestic industry and having reached satisfaction based on the prima facie evidence submitted by the industry con-

cerning the dumping of the product...the Authority, hereby, initiates an anti-dumping investigation," the DGTR has said in a notification.

If it is established that the dumping has caused material injury to domestic players, the DGTR would recommend the imposition of anti-dumping duty on these imports. The finance ministry takes the final

decision to impose duties.

Anti-dumping probes are conducted by countries to determine whether domestic industries have been hurt because of a surge in cheap imports.

As a countermeasure, they impose these duties under the multilateral regime of the Geneva-based World Trade Organization (WTO).

# Sebi reduces face value of debt securities to Rs 10,000 to boost retail participation

PNS ■ NEW DELHI

Markets regulator Sebi on Wednesday drastically cut the face value of debt securities to Rs 10,000 from Rs 1 lakh at present to boost participation of retail investors in the corporate bond market.

Market participants are of the view that lower ticket size of debt securities may encourage more non-institutional investors to participate in the corporate bond market which in turn may also enhance liquidity.

In a circular, Sebi said, "the issuer may issue debt security or non-convertible redeemable preference shares on private placement basis at a face value of Rs 10,000".

This, however, would be subject to certain conditions like the issuer should appoint at least one merchant banker, and non-convertible debentures and non-convertible redeemable prefer-

ence shares be plain vanilla, interest or dividend-bearing instruments.

Sebi said that credit enhancements would be permitted in such instruments.

With respect to General Information Document (GID), which is valid as on the effective date of the circular, Sebi said the issuer may raise funds through tranche placement memorandum or Key Information Document at a face value at Rs 10,000 provided at least one merchant banker is appointed to carry out due diligence in respect of such issuances.

"Necessary addendum shall be issued by such issuer to the shelf placement memorandum or General Information Document, as applicable," it added.

In October 2022, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) reduced the face value of corporate bonds to Rs 1 lakh from Rs 10 lakh.

## Family offices increasingly investing in startups, diversifying portfolios: PwC India report

New Delhi, Jul 3 (PTI) Family offices are increasingly investing in startups, diversifying their portfolios, and seeking higher returns as they are shifting from traditional investments, a PwC India report said.

Currently, there are over 300 family offices in India, as against 45 such offices in 2018. The number is set to rise exponentially, with promoters building impressive businesses in Tier 2 and Tier 3 cities, the report titled 'Creating

Holistic Value for Family Businesses' said.



Noting that the Indian economy is on a roll, the

report said that contributing to its expansion are family businesses, both large conglomerates and small-to-medium-sized enterprises, spanning sectors such as manufacturing, retail, real estate, healthcare and finance.

"...family offices have catalysed the creation of jobs, entrepreneurship and a culture of self-reliance in the country, unlike those that have gone south owing to a lack of adaptability, succession planning, innovation, and effective governance," the PwC India report said.

# Institutional investments in Indian real estate up 20% to US\$ 2.52 billion: Colliers

Institutional investment in Indian real estate rose 20 per cent annually to US\$ 2.52 billion in the April-June quarter on higher inflow in warehousing and residential projects, according to Colliers India.

Real estate consultant Colliers India on Wednesday released the data, stating that the institutional investments in real estate stood at US\$ 2,528.5 million in the April-June quarter this year, up 20 per cent from US\$ 2,106.4 million in

the year-ago period. As per the data, investments in office assets declined 83 per cent to US\$ 329.6 million from US\$ 1,900.2 million.

However, the inflow of funds in residential rose to US\$ 543.5 million from US\$ 72.3 million.

Institutional investments in industrial & warehousing projects jumped sharply to US\$ 1,533.1 million during April-June 2024 from US\$ 133.9 million a year ago.

With 81 per cent share, foreign investors, predominantly from the US and UAE, drove real estate investments during the April-June period of this calendar year.

Domestic investors infused US\$ 0.5 billion in the second quarter of this calendar year, nearly three times from the year-ago period.

Bengaluru and Delhi-NCR cumulatively attracted about 23 per cent of the inflows in the last quarter.

During April-June 2024, institutional investments in the industrial & warehousing segment rose manifold, 11 times, compared to the year-ago period, led by select large deals in the segment.

"Amidst rising demand for superior quality Grade A supply and evolving supply-chain models, investor confidence in the segment has significantly improved."

## Gold rises Rs 50; silver jumps Rs 300

Gold prices rose Rs 50 to Rs 72,550 per 10 grams in the national capital on Wednesday in line with firm trends in the international markets, according to HDFC Securities.

The precious metal had closed at Rs 72,500 per 10 grams in the previous session.

Additionally, silver prices also jumped Rs 300 to Rs 91,300 per kg. It had settled at Rs 91,000 per kg in the previous session.

"In Delhi markets, spot gold prices (24 carats) are trading

at Rs 72,550 per 10 grams, up Rs 50 from the previous close," Saumil Gandhi, Research Analyst at HDFC Securities, said.

The yellow metal traded at Rs 74,650 per 10 grams in local markets in the national capital, marketmen said. Silver traded at Rs 92,300 per kg.

Gold traded within range with a modest gain on Wednesday, as traders are awaiting the release of US macro data that could provide new insights into the timing of the Federal Reserve's interest rate cut, Gandhi said.

# Sensex breaches 80,000 level for 1st time

Nifty at record high on gains in banking shares

Benchmark BSE Sensex breached the historic 80,000 level intraday for the first time while Nifty raced more than 162 points to close at a fresh lifetime high on Wednesday following heavy buying in banking and FMCG shares amid firm global market trends.

The 30-share Sensex hit the historic 80,000 mark for the first time earlier in the day. It surged 632.85 points or 0.79 per cent to a record intraday high of 80,074.30. The index later closed near the 80,000 level at 79,986.80, up by 545.35

points or 0.69 per cent over the last close. As many as 24 Sensex shares closed with gains and six declined.

The BSE Sensex breached the 78,000 level on June 25 and

zoomed 183.4 points or 0.76 per cent to hit a fresh intraday record peak of 24,307.25. As many as 40 Nifty shares advanced, nine declined and one closed unchanged.

Among the Sensex pack, Adani Ports rose the most by 2.49 per cent. Kotak Mahindra Bank, HDFC Bank, ICICI Bank Axis Bank, IndusInd Bank, State Bank of India, Power Grid, JSW Steel, Bajaj Finance and Tata Steel were the biggest gainers.

On the other hand, Tata Consultancy Services, Titan, Reliance Industries, Tata Motors and Larsen & Toubro were the laggards.

## India's rating upgrade possible if fiscal deficit falls to 4%: S&P

A sovereign rating upgrade for India in the next 24 months is possible if the central government is able to prudently manage its finances and bring down fiscal deficit to 4 per cent of GDP, an S&P Global Ratings official said on Wednesday.

S&P Global Ratings Director, Sovereign Ratings, YeeFam Phua, said the trigger for upgrade would be general government (Centre + states) deficit falling below 7 per cent of the GDP, and a lot of this would have to be driven by the central government.

"If the central government is able to bring down fiscal deficit to 4 per cent of the GDP, we will consider a rating upgrade over the next 24 months," Phua said.

The central government estimates to bring down fiscal deficit to 5.1 per cent of the GDP in the current fiscal, from 5.63 per cent in 2023-24.

As per the fiscal consolidation roadmap, the deficit -- the difference between government expenditure and revenue -- will be brought down to 4.5 per cent by 2025-26. The US-based rating agency had in May upgraded outlook for India to positive, from stable, while retaining the rating at 'BBB-'. Phua further said the Indian economy has clocked an average of 8 per cent growth in the last three years, driven by domestic consumption and infrastructure investment that has made real difference on the ground.

## Mcap of BSE-listed firms hit all-time high of Rs 445.43 L cr

The market capitalisation of BSE-listed firms hit a record high of Rs 445.43 lakh crore on Wednesday, driven by a sharp rally in equities, where the benchmark Sensex breached the historic 80,000-mark for the first time ever.

The 30-share Sensex hit the historic 80,000-mark for the first time earlier in the day. It surged 632.85 points, or 0.79 per cent, to hit a record intra-day high of 80,074.30. The benchmark later ended near the 80,000-level at 79,986.80, up 545.35 points, or 0.69 per cent.

The market capitalisation (mcap) of BSE-listed firms hit a record peak of Rs 4,45,43,642.29 crore (US\$ 5.33 trillion).

The BSE Sensex breached the 78,000 level on June 25 and 79,000 for the first time on June 27. Markets continued their ongoing streak of making new highs supported by firm global trends.

# Food services market in India to reach Rs 10 lakh cr by 2030: Report

The food services market in India is expected to reach up to Rs 10 lakh crore by 2030 with the addressable customer base estimated to expand to up to 45 crore, according to a report.

The online food delivery segment is estimated to grow at 18 per cent CAGR (compound annual growth rate) and penetration is set to rise from 12 per cent in 2023 to 20 per cent by 2030, said the report titled 'How India Eats' by Bain & Company and Swiggy.

The food services market in

India, which encompasses dining out and ordering in, is currently valued at Rs 5.5 lakh crore. The market is poised to grow at 10-12 per cent annually over the next seven years,

reaching Rs 9 lakh crore to Rs 10 lakh crore by 2030, it said.

"This growth trajectory will be driven by robust fundamentals, including an expanding customer base, growing con-

sumption occasions, and a rise in supply. Additionally, online food delivery is expected to grow faster at (around) 18 per cent CAGR, contributing 20 per cent to the overall food services market by 2030," the report said.

Swiggy Food Marketplace CEO Rohit Kapoor said the Indian food services market, especially food delivery, has witnessed buoyant growth over the last few years.

"Higher incomes, digitisation, improved customer experience, and an inclination to try new experiences have all contributed to this growth," he added.

## 'Tyre makers facing severe crunch in domestic natural rubber availability'

Automotive Tyre Manufacturers' Association on Wednesday said its members are witnessing a 'severe crunch' in the availability of domestic natural rubber and it may disrupt production unless supply issues of the raw material are addressed.

Despite high prices of natural rubber (NR), its availability has shrunk, Automotive Tyre Manufacturers' Association (ATMA) said,

expressing apprehension that some "sections of natural rubber producing interests or trade are withholding the material in anticipation of an increase in the NR prices worsening the availability".

The 'tyre industry has been experiencing tightness in domestic availability of natural rubber for some time. However currently a severe crunch is being witnessed despite the fact that NR prices have touched a multi-year high.

## 'Superhero' battling the digital revenge

**THE PIONEER PRESENTS TO YOU OUR INTERVIEW WITH NAKSHATRA BAGWE, WHO IS FIGHTING AGAINST THE TIDE OF REVENGE PORNOGRAPHY, DESPITE ALL THE OBSTACLES IN HIS PATH AND IS FREQUENTLY REFERRED TO AS A 'SUPERHERO' BY THE VICTIMS HE HAS ASSISTED.**

Undeniably, with the advent of technology, digital abuse has certainly been on the rise. And one such is revenge porn. It is a sort of digital abuse in which naked or sexually explicit images or films are released without the agreement of the individuals depicted. This type of nonconsensual pornography is directly related to sexual abuse. A current or former partner may release such photographs for "revenge" or threaten to distribute them as a form of blackmail.

With an aim to bring down such cases, we have Nakshatra Bagwe, hailing from a simple middle-class family, who dons multiple hats, including that of being an award-winning filmmaker, actor, LGBTQ+ activist, entrepreneur and most of all, an influencer. Coming from a family where a proper 9-to-5 job was considered an ideal one, he chose to go out of the box. In fact, it was his work that, in January 2024, he became the only Indian to win an International LGBTQ Association fellowship.

But you may wonder, how did his curb to bring down the cases of revenge pornography

happen? So here he tells us during an exclusive chat: "Back then, I was simply browsing through an adult site and realised there was this one video of a girl, and I realised, she was very uncomfortable in the video. It was clear that she was forced to do all of it and that video was up on the site. And somehow, I reported the video and got it down." However, in one such incident, what really kicked in was, "There was this app, which people used to go live and interact with each other. One day, a couple's video of them kissing each other had just gone viral on the internet. There was this user who was uploading it on site. I realised that there were more than 79 videos as such, and they were all non-consensual. I sat down one night and reported all such videos and within a week all these videos were deleted." This was something he knew was not the end, and there were many such cases. And so, more than him being inspired to work around the cause, he feels it was the cause that has chosen him to work on. Last year, he recalls how he made a reel showcasing how he helped

out a victim and showing the process of his work. The reel eventually went viral, reaching 16 million views and his followers increased by 2 lakh.



"My majority of followers were from the LGBTQ+ community," shares the first gay brand ambassador of India. "However, post that video, I even had heterosexual people. The majority of the people who follow are



doing so for help. I realised there were 10-12k people who were seeking my help and there are so many people who are victims but don't know how to help themselves."

But it was also not easy for him. It was during this that he revealed slipping into depression because of the intensity of these cases and people crying for help in his DMs. He realised that these cases had to be solved swiftly. "I had to take a 14-day break before I could get with it and I wasn't prepared for this Pandora box that opened in front of me. I didn't get viral because of dancing, singing, or doing any stupid things on social media, but it was for a cause."

But ironically, things turned out against him after people learned about his identity. Moving ahead, he shares, "Generally, I am not a hacker, which people believe me to be. What I am good at is the 'art of reporting' and I figured out how to effectively report. I finally created a tutorial for people to also know how they could help themselves or their loved ones in such cases. These tutorials had certainly turned out to be very helpful."

All the cases that are knocked into his DMs include a very intense level of negativity. Each case, he says, comes with a different set of trauma and on the other hand, he tries to keep positive for the victims to have hope. "There have been cases I have come across where the victim commits suicide, especially girls. All the cases come with their own trauma. There have been times I had to sit down until 2 or 3

in the morning personally to comfort them. There have been sleepless nights and they do keep me in negativity, but I need to make sure I'm strong because these people come to me as a hope."

Today, you go through his social media and he has now been called a 'Superhero'. However, he has a different perspective. "I have come across comments where people have come up and said that 'we love this gay guy because he is helping us'. And I feel that there are so many gay people out there who are not coming out but are working towards helping out people in need. I'm glad people like me for my work helping out innocent people. However, there is another section of people who end up unfollowing me because I post things like a pride flag or any romantic posts. I remember putting up a post on Valentine's Day, and people went so against it just because I expressed my love for a man. Ironically, it was the same people who were praising me for my work."

Being an award-winning filmmaker and an actor, he has worked in several films around the community and he shares that his agenda is to cast and sign people from the community. Currently, he is working on a film that has the entire cast and crew from the community. "The mainstream cinema may not give opportunity to all of us, so why don't I? I'm not a big-shot person and there are many other filmmakers more popular than me, maybe doing much better work than I do. However, I have a separate fan base for my work where I am recognised. I was recently contacted by YouTube India to create more content related to the community." On a concluding note, he believes that the film festivals are a private concept. However, he desires to create content that aims to raise positive awareness for people in his own community.



## NEERAJ GOYAT ON BIGG BOSS

When asked about memorable moments, Neeraj fondly recalled his bond with fellow contestant Deepak. "Taking care of Deepak Bhai stands out. I've never gone out of my way for someone like that before. It's something I'll cherish forever."

disappointment over not being able to showcase his full potential. "It was a brief stint and unfortunately, I couldn't even complete a round in the *Bigg Boss* house." Despite this, Neeraj remained philosophical about the experience, highlighting the unpredictability of human connections within the house.

Reflecting on his eviction, Neeraj expressed a mix of frustration and resilience. "Whatever happened was unfair. I went in with an open mind, but it's hard to truly understand people in such a short time." His departure, though abrupt, garnered an outpouring of support from fans across social media platforms, affirming his belief that he had indeed won hearts during his brief tenure.

Looking ahead, Neeraj's focus shifts back to his passion for boxing. "I have a big fight scheduled for November 15 at the

couldn't conceive naturally and wanted to proceed with fertility treatment. After evaluation, it was found that they weren't trying the right position during intercourse and hence couldn't conceive. They were completely oblivious about the whole process of sex. These incidents don't just highlight the scope of the issue at hand but also the unspoken pain and confusion among these people.

There has been a dire need of attention to be given to awareness and education about sexual issues, along with providing psychological support for couples undergoing sexual problems. This can be achieved through anonymous help-seeking mediums or platforms producing educational content. It is also important to provide accurate information on major media platforms to support individuals seeking help. This is why it's encouraged to use technological support to reach experts through their phones at their comfort. Nowadays, 24/7 support has become commonly available at no cost and consultations are provided at a subsidised cost. It is important to promote such educational and service-oriented healthcare platforms to the public.

There are many women-oriented platforms providing consultation and free educational resources for sexual wellness awareness. Applications like coto, Practo and Cult Fit bring sexual experts to help individuals with psychological, sexual and fertility-related therapeutic counselling. Platforms like Rocket Health provide individual psychotherapy and sexual wellness consultations online at your convenience. Most women do not understand that libido depends on foreplay, communication, and relationship intimacy. Women who have been married for many years often come with issues of difficulty in climaxing. This is due to the psychological mindset of ignoring one's needs or not expressing their individual needs to their partner, which often leads to suppression and eventually avoidance.

Additionally, statistics reveal a 30% to 90% range of sexual dysfunctions among the general public, especially in India. The openness to talk about such issues, even with a healthcare provider, is a major struggle for couples. If many people are suffering silently, it is time to explicitly normalise the conversation through media platforms. This isn't an illness; it is an epidemic. If we do not help young people navigate their sexuality in a healthier way, we will see more people living in fear.

One day, a couple with issues related to difficulty having sexual intercourse after being married for seven years, reached out to a counsellor. The husband avoided looking at the counsellor and the wife was extremely anxious to open up about her issue. She said, "I'm scared to do it." It was then that the mental health expert asked her if she had given it a try and she replied, "No." After the assessment, she was ruled out for vaginismus (a condition that makes it painful and uncomfortable for women to have sexual intercourse); rather, it was due to her fear stemming from conversations she had with her friends before marriage. She believed that sex would be extremely uncomfortable and that it would lead to pain and bleeding. In similar contexts, there have been many cases of couples coming with different explanations for avoiding intercourse, with the reason often being one: no proper sex education.

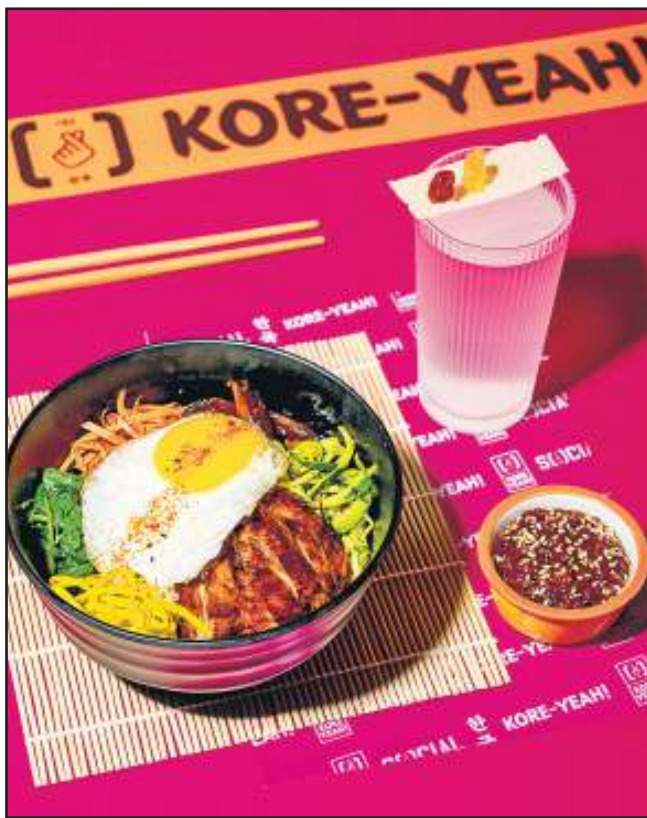
In India, many young women and men engage in unhealthy sexual activity without taking cautionary steps. The only instruction women receive before entering their auspicious first night is, "Do what he says." This creates a sense of confusion, uncertainty and neglect of marital rape! Women have also been told not to express their needs, and asking for it is considered shameful. The result of this secret suffering is an epidemic of women experiencing no sexual pleasure in relationships and men feeling shame, eventually leading to the complete avoidance of sexual activities.

This brings us to the discussion of rendering the right information for young men and women to understand their bodies and respect them in the right way. There have been cases of many young women falling into unhealthy attachment patterns and impulsive sexual behaviours to be loved and seen. The generational trauma and lack of self-esteem lead women to completely neglect their bodies for temporary pleasure. Instead of avoiding the 'sex talk', engage with your children to understand their uncertainties and confusions.

Unfortunately, the current source of knowledge is often porn, which gives rise to unrealistic standards and expectations. Couples face issues of lack of libido, discomfort, pain and difficulty in erection. A young man from Bihar once reported having anxiety issues due to a lack of erection. When asked about his issue, he mentioned that his erection issue was a consequence of masturbation. The lack of awareness affects not just their sexual performance but also their overall sense of self and well-being. In another case, a couple

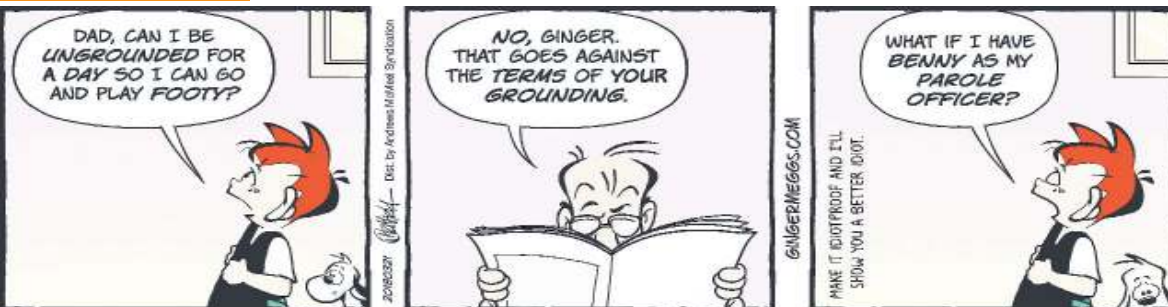

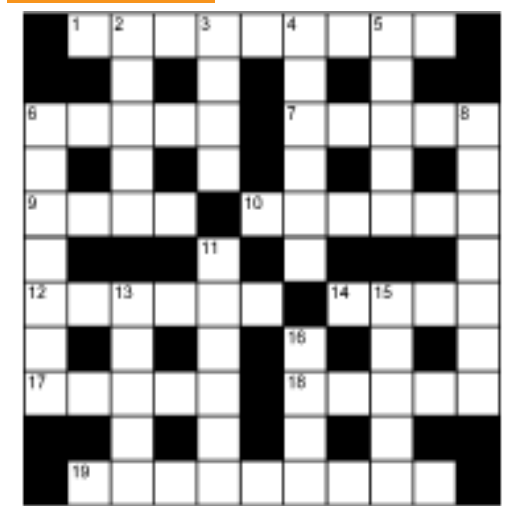

The entire squad had departed from Mumbai on Tuesday, while Gill, who was a travelling reserve with the T20 World Cup side in the Americas, arrived here from New York after a break. "We welcome T20 World Cup champions India," wrote ZC on Tuesday night in a post on X. Young top-order batter Riyan Parag, who will be making his India debut in the series, said in a video posted by BCCI that he had a childhood dream of travelling like this (with the national side).

"The feel of donning India jersey, travelling with the side is different. Coming from Assam, I had this dream of playing for India. Really happy. There will be a special connection for Zimbabwe when I play my first match. "That will be a special moment for that ground and myself, which would be very sacred," he said. "After misplacing my passport, to phones, we are finally here after a 20 hour journey. Now, really looking forward to the tour," Parag added. Another newcomer, medium pacer Tushar Deshpande, said the feeling of being in the national setup is "slowly sinking in and it's like a dream come true for me. Playing for the country is a very special thing." "Travelling with the team is the most important and getting to know them, knowing the atmosphere of the team and most important for me is the fun we have during travel," added



Deshpande. Big-hitting left-hander Abhishek Sharma said from the day he started playing cricket, he had only one dream, which was to play for the country. "I know if I continue working hard, I will get an opportunity but I didn't know I will get it outside India in Zimbabwe. "I got a call from (skipper) Shubman after my name was announced in the squad. Everyone has been giving me so much of affection. For me it was a very big thing," added Sharma. "When I reached home after my name had been announced, I saw my family members giving interviews. So, I think, that was one moment I will always remember," he said. India will play their opening match against the Sikandar Raza-captained Zimbabwe on July 6 at the Harere Cricket Ground. The remaining four games will also be played at the same venue. The series will

conclude on July 14. T20 World Cup travelling reserves Sanju Samson and Yashasvi Jaiswal along with all-rounder Shivam Dube were slated to join the Zimbabwe-bound group but are stranded in Barbados due to hurricane Beryl. Sai Sudharsan, Jitesh Sharma and Harshit Rana were on Tuesday named as replacements for trio in the Indian squad for the first two matches of the series. Samson, Jaiswal and Dube along with the other senior players will be arriving in India aboard a charter flight on Thursday morning. The players will later be felicitated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in New Delhi. Pacer Khaleel Ahmed and batter Rinku Singh, travelling reserves for the T20 World Cup, are also currently in Barbados. The BCCI has not named replacements for the duo even though they are in the squad for Zimbabwe series.



## Markram was brave, tactically astute while leading South Africa in T20 World Cup: Smith

Aiden Markram was 'brave' and 'tactically astute' while leading South Africa to their first-ever appearance in the final of the T20 World Cup which they narrowly lost to India last week at Barbados, said former skipper Graeme Smith on Wednesday. South Africa had a near-perfect campaign in the T20 World Cup under Markram's captaincy with their only defeat coming in the final when India pipped the Proteas by seven runs. "Aiden was particularly good during the tournament. He was tactically astute, had good plans and was brave enough to make the big calls and then get all his players to commit to it," said Smith in a media release. "We have, of course, seen Aiden captain in this manner before over the course of the past two SA20 seasons, leading the Sunrisers Eastern Cape to back-to-back championship titles, but now he has transferred this experience to the international arena," added Smith, who is SA20's league commissioner. Smith said SA20, in its two seasons so far, has been able to prepare the South African cricketers to be ready for

pressure and challenges at the highest level. "From the outset, the league, alongside Cricket South Africa, has wanted to provide South African cricketers with the opportunity to be exposed to a higher level of domestic cricket where the players are able to rub shoulders and learn from some of the best the game has to offer," he said. "Players are exposed to high-pressure and competitive cricket and this experience stood them in good stead in the US and Caribbean," said one of the greatest South Africa captains. Smith praised Ottneil Baartman for his impressive performances, particularly in the group stage, wherein the right-arm bowler produced measly spells. "Ottneil is the epitome of a SA20 success story. A relatively unknown player before SA20 that has transformed and grown in confidence due to experiences with the Sunrisers Eastern Cape is phenomenal," Smith said. "Despite playing in his very first T20 World Cup, he backed his skills under immense pressure. The four wickets against the Netherlands and the last over against Nepal definitely stands out," he added.

## Hardik Pandya becomes first Indian to occupy top spot in ICC T20I all-rounders' rankings

Hardik Pandya rose two places to become the first Indian to occupy the number one spot in the ICC's T20I all-rounders' rankings on Wednesday, as the country's cricketers improved their standings following their title-winning performance in the just-concluded World Cup. The 30-year-old, who handed telling blows to South Africa in the T20 World Cup final on July 29 by dismissing half-centurion Heinrich Klaasen and David Miller in his 3/20 effort, climbed up two places to go level with Sri Lankan star Wanindu Hasaranga as the top-ranked men's T20I all-rounder. Following a topsy-turvy IPL where he was the target of fans' boos as Mumbai Indians' new captain, Pandya turned it around in style in the T20 World Cup in the USA and the Caribbean. His best performance came in



Pandya made impactful cameos down the order with the bat and made breakthroughs with the ball when the team needed him to. He finished with 144 runs at a batting strike-rate of over 150 and also took 11 wickets in the tournament. His best performance came in

the final when he triggered a dramatic South African collapse after the Proteas needed 30 runs from 30 balls with Klaasen in full flow. Pandya gave the decisive blow by dismissing Klaasen in the first ball of the 17th over. He went on to bowl the tense final over and defended 16

runs to help India pip South Africa by seven runs and win their second T20 World Cup title.

### BIG MOVER BUMRAH

India's star fast bowler Jasprit Bumrah, who won the Player of the Tournament award at the T20 World Cup for his 15 wickets, moved up 12 spots to be just outside the top-10. He's at 12th, his highest position since the end of 2020. There were other movements in the top 10 of the T20I all-rounders' rankings, with Marcus Stoinis, Sikandar Raza, Shakib Al Hasan and Liam Livingstone rising by one spot each. Mohammad Nabi moved down four spots to go out of the top five. In the T20I bowling rankings, South Africa's Anrich Nortje rose seven places to a career-best second spot to be just behind top-ranked Adil Rashid with 675 rating points.

## Praggnanandhaa draws with Bogdan-Daniel, Alireza shines in Superbet Classic chess

Indian Grandmaster R Praggnanandhaa was held to a draw by lowest ranked Deac Bogdan-Daniel of Romania in the sixth round of the Superbet Classic tournament, a part of the grand chess tour here. Iranian-French Grandmaster Alireza Firouzja shined with his moves against Wesley So of the United States. With the World Championship on his mind, India's D Gukesh seemed to keep in reserve his real weapons and signed for peace with Maxime Vachier-Lagrave of France. Praggnanandhaa tried his hand against the ever-solid Nimzo Indian defense. But it was an off day for the Indian who was confidently breached by the Romanian. Bogdan-Daniel matched Praggnanandhaa move for move and the game was drawn through repetition after 38 moves.



It was not so easy for Gukesh as well as he seemed to withhold his true preparation for the World Championship match against Ding Liren, scheduled in November this year in Singapore. Alireza stole the show on a dull day in the grand chess tour. He was at his best and crawled back with his second win of the tournament to be in striking distance of tournament leader Fabio Caruana of the United States. With just three rounds remaining in the USD 350000 prize money tournament, Caruana seems to be sitting pretty at the top, with three aspirants in Gukesh Praggnanandhaa and Alireza in pursuit.

## I had momentum, could have done better: Nagal on first-round loss in Wimbledon

Indian tennis ace Sumit Nagal feels he had the momentum in the third set of the Wimbledon first-round tie against higher-ranked Miomir Kecmanovic of Serbia but his relative inexperience on grass cost him the match. The 26-year-old Indian, who is set to participate in his second Olympics in less than a month, lost the Wimbledon men's singles opener to Kecmanovic, ranked 19 places higher than him, in a marathon four-setter lasting nearly three-and-a-half hours. Nagal lost 2-6, 6-3, 3-6, 4-6. The 71st-ranked from Jhajar, making it to the Wimbledon main draw for the first time, won the second set to come

on even terms but the Serbian, ranked 52nd, won the next two to advance. "This is my first main draw at Wimbledon, and playing on the grass surface is not easy; you need a bit of experience. But I think I did whatever I could, I fought hard. I felt like I could have served better, and there were a few things here and there in the match I could have done better," Nagal told Star Sports. "Later on in the third set, the momentum was kind of shifting towards me. I think, like I said, if I could have broken him at 5-3, him serving, I think the match could have changed in a funny way." He said the SW19 experience was the one to cherish. "It was a great experience.



Obviously, when you play for three, three-and-a-half hours, you always feel like, 'this could have been done or that could have been done'. But like I said, if I could have changed things in the third set, I would have really liked that (broken the opponent at

5-3). Nagal said his aim is to keep climbing up the rankings ladder and he is looking forward to a good show at the Paris Olympics, where he will have to shift to clay courts. "I keep on climbing the rankings. There are a few

goals that I need to finish, and that will be one of them - to keep on climbing the rankings. "Now, I'm going back on clay to get ready for Paris. I'm looking forward to it; it's going to be my second Olympics, and I'm super, super excited for it." Nagal, who was ranked 160th during the Tokyo Olympics, had lost in straight sets to Daniil Medvedev in the second round. Tennis legend Mahesh Bhupathi also indicated that Nagal should have converted half chances. "Everyone's disappointed, but he's had a breakthrough year, he's played high-quality tennis. That guy's a good player and he had his chances there in the third set and that's

the way it is. In events like this, you've got to take your chances, otherwise, you're going to come out on the losing end." Former Davis Cupper Zeeshan Ali said Nagal should not get disappointed as he gave his opponent a tough time. "I feel that Sumit should not be very disheartened by this loss because he played a very good match. He played an incredibly good second set and he had a lot of chances. "Going forward, I think he definitely needs to prepare better to play in a tournament like Wimbledon, maybe get a couple of matches in before the main draw of Wimbledon starts, and that would definitely help him prepare better," said Ali.

Star Indian men's doubles pair of Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty has "cracked" the service variation challenge and is focussing on "comprehensive physical and mental conditioning" to ensure peak performance at the upcoming Paris Olympics. Satwik, 23, and Chirag, 26, have been troubled by the wide variations of tumble, spin and wide serves that their opponents, mainly the Koreans and Indonesians, have employed against them during the recent tournaments. Chirag said they have addressed the "new challenge" and remains confident of negotiating it during the Paris Games. "Regarding serve variations, they are a new challenge, but placing complete importance on that wouldn't be right," Chirag told PTI in an email interview. "There was a time when we struggled with receiving them, but we eventually cracked it. We know what to do, we've been practicing, and we're confident we'll come out strong at the Olympics to counter that."

## Satwik-Chirag eyeing great things at Paris Olympics after cracking service variation challenge

The current world number 3 pair had narrowly missed out of a quarterfinal berth in the last Olympics when despite winning two of their three group matches, the duo couldn't qualify for the knockout stage as it was settled on the basis of the number of games won and lost. "The experience of playing in the Tokyo Olympics has been invaluable in our preparation for the Paris Games. Competing at such a high level has taught us crucial lessons about handling pressure, staying focused, and adapting to different playing conditions," Satwik said. Chirag added: "The intensity and atmosphere of the Olympics are unparalleled, and having been through it once, we now have a better understanding of what to expect and the initial jitters of being at the Olympics for the first time are also not going to be there. "Additionally, winning the



French Open has naturally given us a significant confidence boost." In the last couple of years, the duo worked its way to become the world number one after a

series of sensational performance, including winning the Commonwealth Games gold medal, a bronze at the World Championships in 2022, and gold in the Hangzhou Asian

Games. They also played a crucial role in India's epic Thomas Cup win in 2022. Satwik and Chirag have won the French Open and Thailand Open this

year after reaching the finals at the Malaysian Super 750 and India Super 750. "As the Olympics draw closer, our approach is becoming more focussed and strategic. We're fine-tuning every aspect of our game to ensure peak performance when we step onto the court in Paris," Satwik said. "This includes developing specific game plans for our potential opponents by studying their strengths and weaknesses in detail, concentrating on targeted drills, and enhancing our on-court positions and shot selections. "We are taking a holistic approach to our preparations. We're in a good rhythm and are eagerly looking forward to be back at the Olympics. Comprehensive physical and mental conditioning is at the heart of our preparation." The duo has been troubled sometimes by the left-right combinations such as Korean Seo Seung-jae and Kang Minhyuk and Danish Kim Astrup

and Anders Skaarup Rasmussen but Chirag feels they don't have any problem against any particular pair. "I can't really pinpoint a specific pair that we find particularly tricky to play against. On any given day, if a pair plays well, they can pose a challenge. However, I believe that if we play at our best, we can beat anyone," he said. "So, there's no specific pair or lefty-righty combination that particularly affects us. That said, all our competitors in the Olympics will be quite good..." On expectations and handling pressure at the big-ticket event, Satwik said: "We understand Olympics is the greatest, biggest tournament there is and naturally there are hopes and wishes from each Olympic-bound athlete. "We don't want to think so much about the pressures, we're looking to go out there, enjoy the atmosphere, have a great time on court and take it one game at a time and see

how it goes. We do not want to put ourselves under any pressure from the word go. "We're used to the expectations and pressures that come along in our game... We're primarily looking to go out there and do great things on the court and have fun while doing that." Chirag and Satwik are also mentors of PNB MetLife Junior Badminton Championship (JBC), which will begin on August 1 in the national capital. "JBC offers a fantastic opportunity to nurture budding badminton talent in India. JBC also offers players access to mentoring, coaching, and training from veterans in the sport. Badminton has significantly shaped my life, and I want to share its benefits with the next generation, helping them achieve their dreams," Chirag said. Satwik said: "As JBC mentors, we offer guidance on videos to young athletes on drills, techniques, strategies to improve their game, tips on mental resilience, and managing competition stress. Chirag and I will also be offering tips to players in person, whenever we visit any city edition matches."
