Out on bail, Hemant Soren to become **Jharkhand CM again**

In a major development, minutes after Jharkhand Chief Minister Champai Soren resigned as the State's Chief Minister barely 152 days after taking oath, his predecessor and Jharkhand Mukti Morcha's chief, Hemant Soren who is out on bail in the money-laundering case by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) staked claim to form the next Government which he relinquished a few months ago before his arrest by the probe agency.

This is for the third time that Hemant will become the Chief Minister of Iharkhand, He will be the 13th Chief Minister of the State, which was carved out of Bihar on November 15, 2000.



"A few days ago, I was made the Chief Minister and I got the responsibility of the State. After Hemant Soren was back, our alliance took this decision and we chose Hemant Soren as our leader. I have resigned as per the decision of the JMM-led alliance. Our alliance is strong. All know what had happened with Hemant Soren... I was given the responsibility by the coalition partners. Now, the alliance has decided in favour of Hemant Soren", Champai said after coming out of Raj Bhawan.

A request was also submitted to Governor C P Radhakrishnan by Hemant to form the Government. After meeting with the Governor, Hemant told the media that all formalities to form the Government are complete.

Even as a high-level panel of Ethe Bihar Government has launched a probe into the recent spate of bridge collapses across the State, yet another incident on Wednesday involving a bridge over the Gandak river in Siwan district of the State has raised serious concern about the quality of infrastructure and public safety. The latest bridge collapse marks the seventh such incident in a span of just 15 days in the State and second in Siwan district in the last 11 davs. Mercifully, however, despite the severity of these collapses, there have been no casualties thus far. With the State's rivers swelling due to continuous heavy rain, the possibility of more such incidents occurring in the coming days cannot be discounted, members of the Bihar Engineering Services Association (BESA) have warned. The troubling series of incidents began on June 19 with the collapse of an under-construction bridge in Araria, followed by collapses in Siwan on June 22, East Champaran on June 23, and Kishanganj on June 24.

Development r Mukesh Deputy Commissioner Kumar said the exact cause is under investigation. Senior officials from the block have already reached the site, he added.

"A portion of a bridge in Deoria block collapsed this morning. The exact cause is being investigated," he added. "The incident took place around 5 am. As per initial information, the bridge was constructed in 1982-83. Repair work was going on the bridge for the last few days,"

Following the collapses, the blame game has already begun, intensifying concerns about accountability and oversight in Bihar's oversight oversight in Bihar's infrastructure management. Rajya Sabha Leader of Opposition and Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge took a swipe at the bridge cave-in in the State while Union Minister Jitan Ram Manjhi smelled a possible conspiracy behind the conspiracy incidents, implying a deliberate attempt to defame

the BJP-led State Government. "Why has the State suddenly started witnessing incidents of bridge collapse? Why is it happening after the Lok Sabha polls? Why were such incidents not taking place a month before? I suspect some conspiracy behind it. Authorities concerned must look into this aspect," Manjhi said. He also acknowledged the use of sub-standard materials by contractors as a contributing factor and assured that the State Government is taking action against those responsible.

Twitters of Koo set to fall silent

 $T^{he \ Indian \ dream \ of \ having \ an}_{has \ been \ shattered \ as \ the \ 'desi' \ social}$ media platform launched in 2020 with much fanfare, and with many top Indian politicians and Government departments joining in, is to shut down.

The world came to know about the yellow bird, Koo, stopping to chirp when its co-founders penned a touching note on Wednesday about the tough decision to bid adieu.

The disheartening news has been received with anguish by many Koo users. Die-hard Koo fan Vinit Goenka, former Governing Council Member of CRIS, Ministry of Railways, is upset with the news.

"This shutdown will be a significant setback for those who believe in the democratic values of social media, as

dominance of Western media and their colonisation of the social media app space," he said.

In an emotion-filled post on LinkedIn, co-founders Aprameya Radhakrishna and Bidawatka shared Mavank their frustrating journey and insurmountable challenges, and writing, "We explored partnerships with multiple

larger internet companies, conglomerates, and media houses, but these talks didn't yield the outcome we desired."

They expressed their regret, saying, "While we would regret. have loved to keep the app running, the high cost of technology and services to maintain a social media platform has highlights the unending forced us to take this tough

decision. Founded in India, Koo soared to

great heights, spreading its wings to Kenva and Brazil while in its prime. Its rise in Kenya followed the country's indefinite ban on Twitter for deleting a tweet by President Nigerian Muhammadu Buhari. Around 2021, Koo's popularity surged in India amid a contentious spat between the Indian Government and Twitter.

conflict This prompted calls to expand the ecosystem of homegrown digital platforms, echoing strongly across the virtual platforms, world and propelling Koo to prominence. For a while, it seemed that this homegrown platform would significantly

challenge and perhaps even surpass Twitter's popularity in India. However, this anticipated turn of event never came to pass as Twitter managed to smoothen its relationship with the Government. Koo experienced a rollercoaster ride in its short existence. At its peak, this indigenous platform boasted around 2.1 million daily active users, approximately 10 million monthly active users, and over 9,000 VIPs, including some of the most prominent personalities from various fields.

"We were just months away from beating Twitter in India in 2022 and could have doubled down on that short-term goal with capital behind us," they said.

"Unfortunately for us, the mood of the market and the fund crunch got the better of us," the note mentioned as the founders signed off.

Sensex breaches 80,000 mark for first time

The 30-share Sensex hit the historic 80,000 mark for the first time earlier in the day. It surged 632.85 points or 0.79 per cent to a record intraday high of 80,074.30.

The index later closed near the 80,000 level at 79,986.80, up by 545.35 points or 0.69 per cent over the last close. As many as 24 Sensex shares closed with gains and six declined.

The BSE Sensex breached the 78,000 level on June 25 and 79,000 for the first time on June 27.

The Nifty climbed 162.65 points or 0.67 per cent to end at an all-time high of 24,286.50. During the day, it zoomed 183.4 points or 0.76 per cent to hit a fresh intraday record peak of 24,307.25. As many as 40 Nifty shares advanced, nine declined and one closed unchanged.

Among the Sensex pack, Adani Ports rose the most by 2.49 per cent.

Encroachments main cause of traffic snarls in Aminabad

It is 12 noon on Wednesday morning and entering Aminabad is itself becoming a tedious process. Right from the Kaiserbagh crossing through the Latouche road one has to face traffic snarls which become more acute as one reaches the Aminabad police station.

Haphazardly placed carts, wrongly parked vehicles and numerous vendors lined up in front of shops make the Aminabad roads look like clogged arteries. All the roads of Aminabad, whether it is the road in front of the Burma bakery, on the four sides of the Jhandewala Park, roads around

Hanuman temple, near Gadbadjhala, Pratap market, the Sri Ram road, Prakash Kulfi road and the medicine

market, face snarls during the peak hours. Two-wheelers, three-wheelers move at a snail's pace and pedestrians struggle through the same chaos despite barriers being placed at two points in the busy area for traffic regulation.

Nitin Maheshwari, a resident of Aminabad, says that it is a big illusion that the roads of Aminabad are narrow, "One should have a look at the roads at midnight or during a VIPs arrival and one would be able to estimate their correct width. The excessive number of encroachments give a wrong perception that the roads are

narrow. Both the residents and the traders have been dealing with this problem of encroachment for a long time. God forbid if there is a fire, the results will be disastrous. Several complaints have been made in this regard but there has been no permanent solution to the problem," he said.

Sanjay Gupta, president of the Adarsh Vyapar Mandal, said that illegal encroachments were slowly destroying the tradition-al market of the city in this area which counted amongst the renowned markets of the coun-

People don't want to come to Aminabad and the traditional trader is thinking of migrating from this market. Those who have set shops after spending

crores of rupees are facing losses while those who have set shops on the footpath and do not pay any taxes are minting money. There is laxity on the part of the police, the admin-istration and the nagar nigam because of which roads have been encroached upon completely, he said.

Recalling old times, Gupta said that during his childhood days buses would easily run through Aminabad area and today the situation is such that one cannot even walk on foot through the market.

Several times campaigns have been carried out to remove the unauthorized vendors and points have been identified for them with yellow lines drawn. This occurred over one and

half years back but the vendors have returned. The market was so well known that it drew customers from the nearby dis-tricts at one time," he lamented.

Another trader on conditions of anonymity while making allegations of connivance between local nagar nigam staff and the police said that encroachment was not possible without their tacit support. "Whenever a campaign is car-ried out these vendors disappear and return no sooner that the campaign ends. They have prior knowledge as to when the drive will occur," he said.

He further pointed out that the Aminabad market, which was at one time called the first

choice of the city denizens, was fast becoming the last choice, "The residents of the city who would not shop from any other market except Aminabad now choose to visit the market if any product is not available in any other market of the city," he

added. President of Lucknow Vyapar Mandal Amarnath Mishra said that for the last 30 years they have been raising the plea that if Aminabad was not a vending zone then the vendors should be removed from the area, "When the roads have not one or two but three layers of vendors then how will the traffic move through the roads. Until the nagar nigam creates a vend-

ing zone and rehabilitates the vendors, exercises carried out



Acid attack on BBA girl student, medico cousin

In a chilling reminder of inci-dents of acid attacks that had forced previous state governments to bring stringent laws to ban the sale of acid in the open market and speedy trials of such cases, a 21-year-old girl pursuing her BBA from a pri-vate college was attacked with acid by a youth when she was going along with her younger cousin near Lohia Park (Chowk Stadium) in the Chowk police station area on Wednesday morning.

As her cousin attempted to save her by covering her from acid, he also suffered injuries on his back.

Both have been admitted to King George's Medical University, where their condi-tion is said to be stable.

A relative of the girl said she suffered burns on her entire face, while her cousin suffered burns on his back. He said the name of a vouth had surfaced in connection with the attack and police were hunting for him.

The relative thanked Defence Minister Rajnath Singh's son Neeraj for helping them in their hard times.

Zone, Vishwajeet Srivastava, the BBA student and her younger male cousin, a medical student, were walking towards KGMU. As they neared the Chowk Stadium, an unidentified man confronted them. He left and then returned minutes later and threw acid on them

before fleeing the scene. Onlookers quickly alerted the police, and the victims were initially taken to SPM (Civil) Hospital from where they were referred to the KGMU Trauma Centre.

Senior police officers are working to apprehend the attacker and determine the motive behind the acid attack.

The father of the 21-year-old victim, a member of the city's trade union, told newsmen that his daughter was in a critical condition and hoped for her speedy recovery. He also mentioned that the condition of his daughter's cousin was serious, as he suffered more severe burns.

The police suspect the accused attacker was stalking the girl. "In cases of acid attacks, it has been seen commonly that the attacker has developed a fancy for the victim and launched the

attack on being spurned by her. The KGMU Trauma Centre According to ADCP, West doctors said the victims were being given treatment and were under the constant watch of a team of doctors. They said they were also taking the opinion of the doctors of the plastic surgery department.

Meanwhile, a video grab of the suspect youth shows him in a black T-shirt and he is carrying a bag in which he had put a bottle filled with acid.

The father of the victim alleged in a video statement that one Abhay Verma had been making calls to his daughter for the last two days and she had blocked his mobile phone number.

'The accused had introduced himself as Abhay Verma. He kept making calls from another mobile phone number after being blocked several times and snubbed. Every time he expressed his liking for her, and even threatened her with dire consequences. The accused had made the call the previous night also," the victim's father

alleged. He said the police were helping him in the difficult times, and he hoped the miscreant would be brought to justice. He gave a description of the face and complexion of the accused, saying the middle-statured, dusky youth was scolded by his nephew when he first approached the girl for a dialogue and shooed him away. The accused moved away and came back again, and this time

he launched the acid attack. On the other hand, the police said more than one person could be involved in the crime. "It is possible the prime accused was helped by his aide to flee the scene on a twowheeler," sources in the police said.

According to doctors, the girl has sustained 5 per cent burns on her face.

"We are currently assessing the extent of the damage. Depending on our findings, we will determine if reconstructive surgery is necessary," a doctor said. The boy, who suffered more severe injuries, has burns covering 10 per cent of his back. "The burns on the boy's back are being treated with specialised dressings," a doctor said. Both victims are being treated in the plastic surgery department under the supervision of Dr Ravi Kumar Singh and Prof Brijesh Mishra.

'Bhole Baba' has a criminal past, went to jail in sexual exploitation case

Suraj Pal aliaa Sakar Narayan Hari alias Sakar Vishwa Hari Bhole Baba, who is known for his controversial 'satsangs', has a history of legal troubles, including allegations of sexual assault. Despite multiple cases filed against him in various jurisdictions including Agra, Etawah, Kasganj, Farrukhabad and Rajasthan, he continues to command a considerable following, drawn to his promises of spiritual enlightenment and blessings.

Born in Bahadur Nagar, Kasganj, Suraj Pal had a stint in the police department before facing legal troubles in 1997 related to allegations of sexual assault, for which he served time in prison. Upon his release, he reinvented himself as 'Saakar Vishwa Hari Baba', attracting devotees to his ashram in his ancestral village. He completed his journey from a common man to a self-proclaimed baba in a very short

time. Baba completed his studies in the village itself. 'Bhole Baba' has three brothers: the eldest brother has died, the second brother's name is Suraj Pal while the third brother is a leader in Bahujan Samaj Party and has also been the pradhan of Bahadur Nagar village 15

years ago. Bhole Baba's name is Suraj Pal. Before becoming a baba, he was a head constable in LIU. He left the job in 1999. After becoming a baba, white suit has been his identity. His

wife's name is Prem Bati. Allegations have been made that many 'agents' are working for 'Bhole Baba'. He gives money to the agents to mis-lead people. To confuse the public, the agents say that a chakra is visible on Baba's fin-

ger. Saakar Narayan has also been accused of illegally occupying the land of the village and building an ashram. The ashram has been built by illegally occupying the inhabited

land of the village. It has also been alleged that beautiful girls live in his ashram. Apart from the girls, only special people are allowed to enter his room. Other people are not allowed to enter Bhole Baba's room. No outsider is allowed to enter his room at all. Bhole Baba has many expen-

sive luxury cars. However, none of the luxury cars used by the Baba are registered in his name. All the cars are registered in the names of other people, especially devotees. Bhole Baba' has not registered anything in his name. It is said that he has also gone to jail once, but Baba's popularity has been increasing continuously for some time. Last year, former UP chief minister and Samajwadi Party president Akhilesh Yadav also visited Baba's court. Pictures of Akhilesh visiting Baba's court are going viral on social media.

The main ashram of Suraj Pal, who does satsang in the name

of Bhole Baba, is in Bahadurnagar village of Patiyali in Kasganj district, but he has many ashrams in other cities as well. One such ashram or say a house is also in Agra. He has a house in D Block of Kedar Nagar Colony of Shahganj in the Agra city in which he earlier used to live. A few years ago, a huge crowd of his devotees used to gather to see Baba, now it is just locked. Despite this, even today his disciples pass by this closed house and bow down. Meanwhile, retired DGP Vikram Singh said that many cases were already registered against the Bhole Baba who was holding the satsang. This includes a case of sexual exploitation.

He said that the local administration should take action against these babas who talk about miracles as this is a legal crime. Action should be taken against these babas under the Magic Remedies Act, he added.

UP Roadways to ensure smooth transportation to Kumbh Mela

In his concluding remarks of the 264th session of Rajya Sabha before adjourning the House sine die, Dhankhar also termed the instance of Leader of Opposition Mallikarjun Kharge walking into the well of the House during the session "a disgrace to parliamentary conduct and proprietary".

Summing up the proceedings of the session, the chairman said while there was active participation from both the treasury as well as opposition benches, he was constrained to make some observations that "weighed heavily on my mind



over the disruptions that marred the proceedings". Witnessing seasoned members conduct themselves irresponsibly was particularly disheartening. I wish to reiterate that disruption not only impedes the transaction of the listed business but also erodes the prestige of this esteemed institution,"

asserted.Pointing out the instance of Kharge entering the Well of the Rajya Sabha on Friday, Dhankhar said, "It was extremely painful to notice that even the Leader of the Opposition walked into the Well of the House and that was



a disgrace to parliamentary conduct and proprietary." He asked the members of the House to "exemplify their conduct so that this becomes a temple for deliberations, discussion, dialogue and debate". "Their walkout today was extremely painful. It was a historic occasion.

The government was in its third term with the prime minister heading it continually after six decades. They walked away from their constitutional ordainment and that has set dangerous precedent antithetical to democratic values," Dhankhar said.

The 264th session of the Upper House began with President Droupadi Murmu's address to both houses of Parliament which the chairman described as "an important tradition that set the tone and outlined the

Modi introducing his new council of ministers after he was sworn-in as the prime minister for the third consecutive term.

"The Motion of Thanks to the President's address witnessed lively participation by 76 members for over 21 hours. The House also heard maiden speeches by 19 newly-elected members," Dhankhar said.

The Rajya Sabha chairman said while the prime minister gave a "spirited address while participating in the debate" the House lost 43 minutes due to forced adjournments but the shortfall was "made up by continuing discussion during lunch break and sitting beyond

the scheduled time".

Putin, envoys condole devotees' deaths in Hathras stampede

Russian President Vladimir Putin on Wednesday expressed condolences over the stampede at a religious congregation in Uttar Pradesh in which 121 people were killed. Several envoys here including Germany, China, France and Israel also mourned the deaths. New law makes sexual offences gender neutral



Apolice officer can detain a person who resists or disregards lawful directions to prevent a cognisable offence, according to the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) which came into effect on Monday.

Also, the newly enacted Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, which replaces the British-era Indian Penal Code, has made sexual offences "gender neutral" for the victim and the perpetrator, according to official documents.

The BNSS, which replaced the British-era Code of Criminal Procedure, has introduced "a new insertion" as Clause 172 in 'Preventive Action of the Police'. It states that people must conform to directions of the police issued in the course of preventing the commission of a cognizable offence, officials arrested person can conduct

said. The pi allows a poli officer to detain such person and produce them before a magistrate or, in petty cases, release the person as soon as possible within 24 hours, they said. Under the BNSS, police officials have been given a layer of immunity in cases of dereliction in carrying out duties on the orders of an executive magistrate to disperse unlawful assembly. In such cases, police officers cannot be prosecuted without the sanction of the government.

Innocent lives lost

Stampede at a satsang in Hathras kills at least 121, highlighting the urgent need for stronger regulations

n a tragic and devastating incident in the Hathras district of Uttar Pradesh, a stampede during a satsang resulted in the deaths of at least 121 people. Although the exact cause of the mishap will be determined after a detailed investigation, eyewitness accounts reveal that the stampede occurred when devotees surged forward to seek blessings from Narayan Sakar Vishwa Hari, also known as Bhole Baba. The devotees rushed to touch Bhole Baba's feet and attempted to gather soil from his path, a customary practice that led to the chaos. Many people fell into a nearby drain. Some eyewitnesses reported that after the satsang concluded, many followers rushed toward Bhole Baba to touch his feet or catch a glimpse of him as he departed in his car. People wanted to get his darshan and collect soil from the road on which his car left the venue. As the satsang ended, people started leaving in groups. Due to the rain, many slipped, and others fell on top of them, lead-



ing to a crushing cascade. Others maintain that people started rushing out due to the humidity when the incident occurred, and many followers, most of whom were women, felt suffocated.

The incident exposes many disturbing facts, ranging from the negligence of the administration to the unchecked influence of godmen over innocent people. Bhole Baba is reportedly absconding. First of all, the number of attendees far exceeded the permitted limit. The chief sewadar (organizer) of Baba's program estimated an attendance of around 80,000 people, but the actual number was significantly higher. Indeed, this breach of the permitted

capacity likely exacerbated the situation, leading to overcrowding in a venue that was inadequate. Now, after this horrific incident, the government is in damage control mode. Compensation for the deceased has been announced, and the Chief Minister is expected to visit Hathras. Additionally, a team has been set up to investigate the cause of the incident. However, in all probability nothing will change and that this incident will soon be forgotten like many before. As we mourn the loss of 121 lives and support the injured and their families, it is imperative to learn from this tragedy and implement effective measures to prevent such incidents in the future. We must prioritise safety, preparedness, and responsible management to ensure the safety of the people. Moreover, shouldn't there be a check on the activities of mushrooming godmen who exploit people's faith and endanger their lives? Many such godmen become so powerful that they are able to dictate terms to the administration and have considerable political clout which gives them power. However, the lack of awareness among people and their sense of helplessness contribute to the proliferation of these godmen who thrive on the ignorance and innocence of the people.

As the Modi Govt navigates a new power dynamic, the increased presence and assertiveness of the Opposition suggest a challenging path ahead

he 18th Lok Sabha has the potential for positive functioning. The Modi government said they wanted consensus. Prime Minister Narendra Modi sought agreement and criticised the Opposition for causing problems. Modi stated that in his third term, his Government would aim to build consensus. The Leader of the Opposition, Rahul Gandhi, also emphasised the importance of the Opposition's role in representing the 'voice of the people' in the House. But at the start of the session, they couldn't agree on important issues. Congress leader Sonia Gandhi wrote in an editorial recently in an English daily that Prime Minister Narendra Mod was "Preaching consensus, provoking confrontation.'

Sonia Gandhi criticised Prime Minister Modi for not acknowledging the electoral outcome and for promoting confrontation over consensus. She expressed disappointment with the first few days of the 18th Lok Sabha, pointing out that there's no sign of a changed attitude from the Prime Minister. The 18th Lok Sabha is a significant shift in Indian politics, marking the first time in a decade that Modi is leading a Parliament from a less dominant position. This shift in power dynamics requires him to navigate a coalition and contend with a more assertive opposition. The Modi government now relies on crucial support from two key allies - $JD(\dot{U})$ and TDP. This means the NDA allies could significantly influence the Government's plans and actions, a departure from the substantial majority the BJP enjoyed in 2019 and 2014. The increased presence of the Opposition in various parliamentary panels is likely to generate greater engagement. The first session of the curent Lok Sabha began with a strong Opposition asserting its rights. Before the session started, there was a dispute over the appointment of BJD M.P Bhartruhari Mahtab as the protem Speaker to administer. The Congress and the INDIA



bloc members felt that Congress MP Kodukkunil Suresh, elected eight times, should have been given the position. However, the BJP argued that they followed the rules. Mahtab was elected to the House seven times in succession, while Suresh lost two elections. This appoint-ment is significant as the Speaker plays a crucial role in the Indian parliamentary system as the head of the Lok Sabha, responsible for maintaining order, conducting debates, and ensuring the House's smooth functioning. Secondly, Rahul Gandhi said he would back Om Birla, the NDA candidate, but only if the Deputy Speaker position, usually given to the Opposition, was assured. While Thambi Durai of the AIADMK, a BJP ally at the time, served as the Deputy Speaker from 2014 to 2019, the position remained vacant from 2019 to 2024.

Article 93 states two Lok Sabha members will be selected as the Speaker and Deputy Speaker. Om Birla has been re-elected as the Speaker of the 17th Lok Sabha, bringing continuity and stability to the House. After being congratulated, the newly elected Speaker took out a paper and read a resolution against the 1975 Emergency imposed by

late Prime Minister Indira Gandhi. This surprising move caught many off guard and caused tension with Congress, as the Emergency was declared on the same date in 1975. 

International Plastic Bag Free Day, observed annually on July 3, aims to raise awareness about the escalating crisis of plastic pollution



The International Plastic Bag Free Day is celebrated on Jul 3 every year. The awareness created due to observance of this day helps put focus on the threat of the silently growing footprint of plastic pollution. This is essential given the fact that plastic pollution, especially of Single Use Plastics (SUP) has now permeated all aspects of the environment. Today SUP and plastic microfibre pollution can be found from the highest point to the deep-est part of the earth. The influx of 45,000 trekkers per year to Mt. Everest has unfortunately ensured that microplastic pollution can now be found in snow samples close to the peak of the world's highest mountain. Similarly, relentless marine traffic and indiscriminate disposal of garbage into the oceans has resulted in high microplastic pollution across the seas including in The Mariana Trench, Earth's deepest point in the Pacific Ocean, more than 11 km deep from mean sea level. As humanity achieves this dubious distinction of spreading litter to virtually all corners of the planet, India unfortunate-ly is firmly at the forefront of plastic pollution spree. The figures speak for themselves. According to the Plastic Overshoot Day report by Swiss non-profit EA, Earth Action states that global plastic waste generation has risen by 7.11 per cent since 2021. The world is estimated to have generated 220 million tons of plastic waste this year, 70 million tons of which will end up polluting the environ-ment. India is not far behind. India ranks 3rd globally contributing 5.5 KT of SUP and ranked ninety-fourth with per capita single-use plastic waste of 4 kg per year. The much-publicised SUP ban in India addresses only 11 per cent of the entire gamut of SUP plastic waste. India is among the twelve countries responsible



'Israel has made largest West Bank land seizure in 3 decades'

An anti-settlement watch-dog says Israel has approved the largest seizure of land in the occupied West Bank in over three decades. Bank in over three decades. The Israeli group Peace Now said Wednesday that authori-ties recently approved the appropriation of 12.7 sq km (nearly 5 sq miles) of land in the Jordan Valley. The group's data indicate it was the largest cincle appropriation emproved single appropriation approved since the 1993 Oslo accords at the start of the peace process. The land appropriation was likely to worsen already soar-ing tensions linked to the ongoing Israel-Hamas war in Gaza. Violence has surged in the West Bank since the start of the war, with Israel carrying out near-daily military raids that often spark deadly gunbat-tles with Palestinian militants. The land seizure, which was approved late last month but only publicised on Wednesday, only publicised on Wednesday, comes after the seizure of 8 sq km (roughly 3 square miles) of land in the West Bank in March and 2.6 sq km (1 square mile) in February. Egypt swears in Trump Campaign outraises Biden by over \$67 mn in 2nd quarter new Cabinet

PTI WASHINGTON

Cairo (AP): Egypt's new Cabinet was sworn in Wednesday as the country faces an ailing economy and raging conflicts in neighbou ing nations.

Prime Minister Mustafa Madbouly — who was first appointed in 2018 — has been again tapped to form the new Cabinet which includes several technocrats.

Some ministers, including those in charge of police and tourism, remain in place, but others, particularly defence, foreign affairs and economyrelated portfolios, represent major challenges. The ministers have taken the oath before President Abdel Fattah el-Sissi in Cairo. Among the changes were the finance, electricity, justice, petroleum, education and investment portfolios. The new government comes three months after el-Sissi was sworn in for his third term.

Republican presumptive nominee and former president Donald Trump has out-

raised incumbent President Joe Biden by over USD 67 million in the second quarter of this year by raising USD 331 million. Trump, 78, the pre-sumptive Republican Party candidate, is pitched against 81year-old incumbent President Joe Biden from the Democratic

Beryl heads toward Jamaica

St Georges (AP): Hurricane Beryl roared through open waters Tuesday as a powerful Category 4 storm heading toward Jamaica after earlier crossing islands in the southeast Caribbean, killing at least six people. A hurricane warning was in effect for Jamaica, Grand Cavman, Little Cayman, and Cayman Brac. Beryl was losing intensity but was forecast to still be near major-hurricane strength when it passes near or over Jamaica early Wednesday, near the Cayman Islands on Thursday and into Mexico's Yucatan Peninsula on Friday, according to the National Hurricane Centre. A hurricane watch was in effect for Haiti's southern coast and the Yucatan's east coast. Belize

issued a tropical storm watch stretching south from its bor-der with Mexico to Belize City. Late Monday, Beryl became the earliest storm to develop into a Category 5 hurricane in the Atlantic and peaked at winds of 165 mph (270 kph) Tuesday before weakening to a still-destructive Category 4. On Tuesday night, the storm was about 300 miles (480 kilometres) east-southeast of Kingston, Jamaica. It had top winds of 150 mph (240 kph) and was moving west-north-west at 22 mph (35 kph), the centre said.

Beryl was expected to bring lifethreatening winds and storm surge to Jamaica, where officials warned residents in floodprone areas to prepare for evac-

uation. "I am encouraging all Jamaicans to take the hurricane as a serious threat," Prime Minister Andrew Holness said in a public address Tuesday. "It is, however, not a time to panic." In Miami, National Hurricane Centre Director Michael Brennan said Jamaica appears to be in the direct path of Beryl. We are most concerned about Jamaica, where we are expecting the core of a major hurricane to pass near or over the island," he said in an online briefing. "You want to be in a safe place where you can ride out the storm by nightfall (Tuesday). Be prepared to stay in that location through Wednesday." Storm surge of 6-9 feet (1.8 to 2.7 metres) above typical tide levels are likely in

fall. "This is a big hazard in the Caribbean, especially with the mountainous islands," Brennan said. "This could cause life threatening flash floods and mudslides in some of these areas." India's services sector growth rises in June: PMI

India's services sector growth quickened in June from May's five-month low, amid a stronger rise in new orders and an unprecedented expansion in international sales, a monthly survey said on Wednesday.

The seasonally adjusted HSBC India Services Business Activity Index rose from 60.2 in May to 60.5 in June, pointing to a sharp expansion in output.

In the Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) parlance, a print above 50 means expansion, while a score below 50 denotes contraction.

"Activity growth in India's service sector accelerated in June, with the index rising by 0.3 ppt (percentage point) to 60.5, led by an increase in domestic both and international new orders. This encouraged services firms to increase their staffing levels at the fastest pace since August 2022," said Pranjul Chief Bhandari, India Economist at HSBC.

Demand strength and rising intakes of new business were cited as the key determinants of growth. New orders received by Indian service providers continued to increase in June, extending the current sequence of expansion to nearly three

years. There was also a record expansion in international orders. Asia, Australia, Europe, Latin America, the Middle East and the US were all cited as sources of new work from abroad.

Positive client



encouraged service providers in India to recruit additional staff at the end of the first fiscal quarter. Staffing levels increased at the fastest pace since August 2022, as shortterm and permanent staff were taken on to support pipelines of new work.

On the price front, service providers recorded a moderate increase in their average expenses due to higher food, fuel and labour costs. The pace of inflation was nevertheless the weakest in four months. Subsequently, selling prices also rose at the slowest pace since February. ahead, service Going providers remained confident of a rise in business activity over the course of the coming 12 months, with nearly 23 per cent of panellists expressing

optimism. "Înput costs rose at a moderate pace, resulting in a softer uptick in output charges in June. Overall, service providers remain confident about the year appetite ahead business outlook.

although the level optimism moderated sharply during the month," Bhandari said. Meanwhile, the HSBC India

Composite Output Index recovered from 60.5 in May to 60.9 in June, as new business and output expanded at faster rates.

"The Composite PMI also accelerated in June, supported by greater inflows of new orders. Manufacturing firms contributed more to the expansion than services firms," Bhandari said. Composite PMI indices are weighted averages of comparable manufacturing

and services PMI indices. Private sector employment expanded at a sharp pace that was among the quickest since the series started in

December 2005, the survey said. The HSBC India Services PMI is compiled by S&P Global from responses to questionnaires sent to a panel of around 400 service sector companies.

Food services market in India to reach ₹10 lakh crore by 2030: Report

The food services market in India is expected to reach up to Rs 10 lakh crore by 2030 with the addressable customer base estimated to expand to up to 45 crore, according to a report.

The online food delivery segment is estimated to grow at 18 per cent CAGR (compound annual growth rate) and penetration is set to rise from 12 per cent in 2023 to 20 per cent by 2030, said the report titled 'How India Eats' by Bain & Company and Swiggy. The food services market in

India, which encompasses dining out and ordering in, is currently valued at Rs 5.5 lakh crore. The market is poised to grow at 10-?12 per cent annually over the next seven years, reaching Rs 9 lakh crore to Rs 10 lakh crore by 2030, it said.

"This growth trajectory will be driven by robust fundamentals, including an expanding customer base, growing consumption occasions, and a rise in supply. Additionally, online food delivery is expected to grow faster at (around) 18 per cent CAGR, contributing 20 per cent to the overall food services market by 2030," the report said. Swiggy Food Marketplace CEO Rohit Kapoor said the

Indian food services market, especially food delivery, has witnessed buoyant growth over the last few years. "Higher incomes, digitisation, improved customer

experience, and an inclination to try new experiences have all contributed to this growth," he added.

Upbeat about the growth in the coming years, Kapoor said China has four times the number of restaurants per million urban population compared to India and the highlights study this headroom.

Bain & Company Partner and co-author of the report Navneet Chahal said the Indian food services market is at the cusp of transformation and the sector's dynamic nature, characterised by shifting consumer behaviours, digitisation, and regional diversity, offers immense growth potential.

As we look toward the next decade, with an estimated growth rate of 10-12 per cent exciting opportunities loom on both the demand and supply fronts. By 2030, the market is poised to serve an additional 110 million customers, gradually shifting eating out from a special event into a convenient lifestyle," she said. The addressable customer base

for the Indian food services market is expected to expand by 11 crore, growing from the current 32 crore to 34 crore to approximately 43 crore to 45 crore by 2030.

"This surge will be supported by macroeconomic tailwinds, including rapid urbanisation and a rise in affluence," the report said.

The study pointed out that approximately 70 per cent of food services consumption as of 2023 is concentrated in the top 50 cities and among uppermiddle and high-income segments, which are expected to remain demand hotspots in the medium term.

Sebi notifies institutional mechanism for brokers to prevent market abuse

Markets regulator Sebi has notified an institutional mechanism that requires stock brokers to put in place systems for detection and prevention of market abuse. Before this, there were no specific regulatory provisions

that cast responsibility on brokers to have a system to prevent market abuse. Under the institutional mechanism, broking firms as

well as its senior management will be accountable for detection and prevention of fraud or market abuse, by setting up robust surveillance

control systems. and according to a notification. Further, brokers need to frame appropriate escalation and reporting mechanisms. Sebi has also listed out probable instances of fraud or market abuse which a broker's system needs to be equipped to monitor. The probable instances can include creation of misleading appearance of trading, price manipulation, front running, pump and dump, insider trading and mis-selling and unauthorised trading, including facilitation of 'mule accounts'.

In its notification dated June 27, the stock broker will have to inform details pertaining to detection of any suspicious activity to the stock exchanges within 48 hours from such detection.

Further, they will have to submit a summary analysis and action taken report on instances of suspicious activity, fraud and market abuse or a 'nil report' where no such instances were detected, on a half-yearly

basis to the stock exchanges. "Any deviation in adherence to internal controls, risk management policy, surveillance policy, policy for onboarding of clients along with the proposed corrective actions for such deviation shall be placed before the appropriate Committee, Board of Directors or such other equivalent or analogous bodies of the stock broker at regular intervals and such deviations shall also form a part of the report to be submitted by the stock broker

to the stock exchanges," Sebi said. The stock broker will have to establish and implement whistleblower policy providing for a confidential channel for employees and other stakeholders to raise concerns about suspected fraudulent, unfair or The unethical practices. policy should establish procedures to ensure

adequate protection whistleblowers.

Also, the regulator has tightened rules to curb trading through the mule accounts. In its notification, Sebi said that transactions through mule accounts for indulging in manipulative, fraudulent

and unfair trade practice shall be and shall always be deemed to have been included in PFUTP (Prohibition of Fraudulent and Unfair Trade Practices) norms.

Mule account is a trading account maintained with a stock broker or a demat account or bank account linked with such trading account, which is controlled by another person.

To give these effects, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) has amended stock brokers and PFUTP rules that became effective from June 27.

Tyre makers facing severe crunch in domestic natural rubber availability: ATMA

Automotive Tyre Manufacturers Tyre Association on Wednesday said its members are witnessing a 'severe crunch' in the availability of domestic natural rubber and it may disrupt production unless supply issues of the raw material are addressed. Despite high prices of natural rubber (NR), its availability

has shrunk, Automotive Tyre Manufacturers Association (ATMA) said, expressing apprehension that some "sections of natural rubber producing interests or trade are withholding the material in anticipation of an increase in the NR prices worsening the availability".

The "tyre industry has been experiencing tightness in domestic availability of natural rubber for some time. However currently a severe crunch is being witnessed despite the fact that NR prices have touched a multiyear high. The paucity of natural price needs to be addressed at the earliest so that tyre production processes are not disrupted," ATMA Director General Rajiv Budhraja said in a statement.

The Rubber Board had estimated the total domestic natural rubber stock available in the country at 3.7 lakh production efficiency and efficacy at the high-tech labs of the NBRI following intensive research, 'Pio' is all set to become a preferred | to support domestic demand is not there".

ATMA said it has asked the Rubber Board to closely monitor the volume of domestic NR sales transacted in recent weeks and advise growers, dealers and to ensure processors adequate and uninterrupted availability of natural rubber so that the consuming interests are not adversely impacted.

Vondrousova is 1st defending woman Wimbledon champ out in first round since 1994

AP LONDON

Marketa Vondrousova became the first defending women's champion at Wimbledon to lose in the first round the next year since 1994, eliminated 6-4, 6-2 by Jessica Bouzas Maneiro at Centre Court. Vondrousova was a surprise title winner at the All England Club 12 months ago, the first unseeded woman to claim the trophy at the grass-court Grand Slam tournament.

Now she enters the books in another - and less-wanted historic way. The only other time in the sport's Open era, which dates to 1968, that a woman went from a championship at Wimbledon to an immediate exit a year later was when Steffi Graf was defeated by Lori McNeil 30 years

ago. "I was happy to be back on the Centre Court," Vondrousova said. "It just didn't go as planned today." Vondrousova was seeded No. 6 this time, but the left-hander, who was the runner-up at the 2019 French Open and a silver medalist at the Tokyo Olympics three years

ago, was never quite able to demonstrate her full game Tuesday. She appeared to still be suffering after-effects from a fall during a tuneup tournament on grass in Berlin last month that hurt her hip. "I was a bit slower, maybe. I was a

bit scared," Vondrousova said. "But credit to her. She was playing a good match, too. I didn't feel at my best, (but) she didn't gave me many points for free."

How big a deal was this for Bouzas Maneiro?

She is competing in a Grand Slam tournament for only the third time and came into the day with an 0-2 record at those events. Bouzas Maneiro also had never won a match at a tour-level grass tournament and never beaten an opponent ranked in the top 10. "This is one of the most important

moments in my life, in my career, here in this sport. This is amazing," said Bouzas Maneiro, a 21-year-old from Spain who is ranked 83rd this week, equaling her career high.

"I was like, I have no pressure. Just enjoy the moment, enjoy the
