

Violence erupts at Sambhal mosque survey, three dead

Tensions flared into violence on Sunday as a court-mandated survey of the Mughal-era Jama Masjid triggered clashes between locals and police resulting in deaths of individuals. Over 40 people including policemen were reported injured in the violence.

Evewitnesses say that during a second survey of the mosque, a mob attacked police personnel with stones and set vehicles ablaze. The police responded with tear gas and a baton charge to control the situation. Over 20 police

the clashes, with reports of three deaths adding to the unrest

According to police, violence erupted when a crowd of nearly a thousand gathered a survey team, led by a courtappointed advocate commissioner, from entering. As tensions escalated, some individuals in the crowd

reportedly began pelting stones at the police, leading to retaliation with tear gas. Amid the chaos, over ten vehicles were set ablaze.

"Some miscreants in the crowd resorted to violence. The police used minor force

officers and more than two dozen civilians were injured in situation under control. Those involved will be identified and strict action will be taken," said Krishna Kumar Vishnoi,

superintendent of police.

District Magistrate Rajendra Pesia confirmed outside the mosque to prevent approximately ten individuals detained. Videos circulating on social media show scenes of stone-pelting and vehicles engulfed in flames.

Aunjaneya Kumar Singh said. Despite the unrest, the survey which commenced at 7:30 am, was completed as planned. Advocate Vishnu Shankar Jain, representing the petitioners, stated that the survey team conducted a detailed examination of the supported

The controversy stems from a court case filed by a Hindu group claiming that the Jama Masjid was originally the Harihar temple. Following a directive, court

BJP win dampens Opposition plans

Winter session of Parliament anticipated to begin on a stormy note on Monday at the backdrop of latest controversy around Adani Group with the Opposition ready to flex it muscles, is now likely to be dampened after BJP's morale booster Assembly results in Maharashtra, by-polls of Uttar Pradesh and last month's Harayana success to its kitty.

The Opposition on Sunday asked the Centre to allow discussions in the Parliament on the US prosecutors' bribery charges against the Adani Group even as Union minister Kiren Rijiju made it clear that the matters to be taken up in the two houses will be decided their authorised committees with the consent of the respective chair.

Following the customary allparty meeting on the eve of the Parliament's Winter Session commencing Monday, Rijiju told reporters that the government has appealed to all the parties to ensure smooth conduct of

business in the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha. Forty-two leaders from 30

parties attended the meeting, which was chaired by senior BIP leader and Union Defence Minister Rajnath Singh. The meeting was attended by BJP President JP Nadda, Congress leader DMK's Jairam Ramesh, Tiruchi Siva, Akali Dal's Harsimrat Kaur Badal and LJP (Ram Vilas) MP Arun Bharti, among others. The government has listed 16

bills for consideration in the Winter Session. The bills pending in the Lok Sabha Wagf include (Amendment) Bill, which has been listed for consideration and passage after a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) of the two houses submits its report on it to the lower house. The panel is mandated to submit its report on the last day of the first week of the winter session. On the Congress party's demand to hold discussions on the Adani issue on priority, apart from a host of other matters, including the Manipur unrest, Rijiju said the business

committees of the two houses will take a call on the subjects of Parliamentary business with the consent of the Speaker of the Lok Sabha and the Chairperson of the Rajya Sabha.

Raising the matter at the meeting, Congress' deputy leader in the Lok Sabha, Gaurav Gogoi, dubbed the Adani issue as a scam, saying the government should not reject or ignore their demand on any technicality as it concerns Indian institutions and investors.

industrialist Billionaire Gautam Adani, whose conglomerate includes a host of companies covering power to ports sectors, has been charged by US prosecutors for allegedly being part of a scheme to pay USD 265 million (about Rs 2,200 crore) bribe to Indian officials in exchange of favourable terms for solar power contracts in four Indian states.



Dowry death case against 7 in woman's suicide

ajaria police have booked 7 Begin people including the RPF personnel, his mother and father in suicide case of RPF personnel's wife who committed suicide on November 15 at Dwarka Nagar; it was revealed that family used to demand dowry of Rs 20 lakh.

Police said that on the night of November 15 newly married woman Kritika Mandrai committed suicide by hanging with

the ceiling. After investigating the case, Bajaria police station has registered a case against 7 people including the deceased's RPF personnel, mother-in-law and father-in-law.

At present, no one has been arrested. Police investigation made it clear that the accused were pressurizing the woman to bring Rs 20 lakh as dowry. They used to harass her if the demand

was not met. They used to taunt her and pressurize her family to bring money in dowry.

Her husband had come to Bhopal just two days before the suicide and had a quarrel with his wife. He even had a scuffle with her. Instead of stopping her, mother-in-law, father-in-law, husband and family members used to taunt the woman.

According to ACP Surabhi Meena, on 15 November, the body of Kritika Mandrai was found hanging at her in-laws' place in Dwarka Nagar. Kritika was married to Sushil Mandrai 9 months ago. Since the marriage, her in-laws were pressuring her to bring dowry. RPF jawan Sushil is posted in Mumbai. He was not even taking Kritika with him to Mumbai. The reason was that the dowry demand was not being met. Based on the facts revealed in the investigation and the statement of the parents, a case of dowry murder has been registered against the accused husband Sushil Mandrai, Manohar Lal, Vimala, Kanchan, Anita, Sangeeta and Lokesh Jatav.

Kritika Mandrai lived with her husband Sushil Kumar Mandrai (25) in her in-laws' house in Dwarka Nagar. She was preparing for competitive exams. Her father Vishnu Prasad Gwale said that the daughter was married on February 14 this year.

The son-in-law is an RPF personnel and is currently posted in Mumbai. At the wedding, he gave all the necessary items to the daughter and a bullet bike of her choice. Even after this, the son-inlaw used to harass the daughter since the wedding demanding a car and an expensive plot in dowry.<Kritika's husband lives alone in Mumbai. Even after telling her many times, he was not ready to keep Kritika with him. Every day he used to tell stories of other girls who were ready to marry him by giving expensive dowry.

He kept talking to him. After a while, a video call was made to the officer to take the statement. In which the caller disconnected the phone after seeing the uniformed officer in front.

White topping as pilot project on 14 roads in Bhopal soon

n a bid to rid roads of potholes and other monsoon-related damage, the Public Works Department (PWD) has decided to add a white topping to existing bitumen roads.

The new road-building technique will first be used on 41 roads in 21 districts, for which the tender process

has already been completed. The work, set to commence soon, is scheduled to be completed within a fourmonth time frame.

White topping refers to the laying of a Portland Cement Concrete (PCC) layer above existing bitumen roads to enhance their longevity. The roads earmarked for the pilot project include 14 prominent roads, including

Vallabh Bhavan road and the CM House Road located at Shyamla Hills.

As part of the project, the PWD has selected one road each in Agar Malwa, Umaria, Khandwa, Dewas, Chhatarpur, Narmadapuram, Neemuch, Betul, Morena, Ratlam, Raisen, Rewa, Satna, and Harda districts for recon-

struction.

From supplements to steroids, the unhealthy side of fitness

ecent social media trends have sold unre-Ralistic fitness goals to gullible youngsters, prompting them to use performanceenhancing supplements and even drugs, without assessing the risks involved.

The melee for bulging biceps and six-pack abs is making these youngsters attempt to hack their genetic makeup and achieve unrealistic muscle growth and definition, while constantly fighting to lower their body fat percent-

On an increasingly low-carb diet, gym-goers rely on protein shakes, pre- and postworkout medication, creatine, and even anabolic steroids to fuel muscle growth, often on the advice of trainers who lack the qualifications to prescribe these supplements.

While there's nothing wrong desiring a set of toned muscles, the worrying aspect is the obsessive nature of the sport and the exposure to health risks. Medical practitioners cause for concern, saying many of these medications and powders may be harmful to kidney and liver health. They warn that supplements often contain hidden harmful ingredients that are not listed on the labels.

Continuous steroid use can lead to addiction and harm mental health. Adolescents and young adults, whose bodies are still developing, suffer from hormonal imbalances and sexual health issues due to these substances. City-based kidney specialist,

Dr Dinesh Upadhyay, says,

Steroids cause numerous side effects, and the list is extensive. If a doctor doesn't prescribe them, people should avoid using them. Even doctors only recommend steroids for short-term use. He cautions that protein pow-

ders too carry substantial risks for the kidneys and liver. "I've seen cases where kidney failure occurs, and patients end up requiring dialysis. Young people should avoid these products. Eating regular, nutritious homecooked food and focusing on exercise is the best way to achieve good health and fitness."Senior liver specialist, Dr Onkar Patel, concurs, saying, "Overusing steroids and protein supplements severely

damages the liver. Many patients suffer liver damage. If protein supple-

ments contain preservatives, people should completely avoid them. These products can harm the body.""We receive many cases of severe conditions like acute and chronic hepatitis. Using these products without medical guidance is dangerous," adds Dr Patel.

Fitness athlete, Arpit Pateria, says, "I have been going to the gym since childhood and use protein powder, but I always consult experts because my body needs it. I prefer crude, unflavoured protein since many powders include artificial flavours and sugars that harm the body.

Experts say bodybuilders will rarely admit that they're misusing drugs or are on a steroid cycle unless they encounter medical issues. Even then, they will first go to their trainer and seek quick-fix

Amir Khan explained, "I have been working out for six years and have six-pack abs. For the last two years, I have used protein powder and experienced no issues. I also own a health supplements shop.""I compete in districtlevel bodybuilding competitions. If people take protein powder, they must work out accordingly; otherwise, it will harm their bodies," he advised.

What those in competitive bodybuilding don't tell you is that athletes keep cutting down sodium intake in the run-up to an event, take diuretics, and stop drinking water or liquids about 48 hours prior to a competition so their dehydrated muscles look more defined. "I had discussed digital arrest in the last episode of 'Mann Ki Baat'. The elderly are the most common victims of such crimes. In such a situation, it is our responsibility to make them aware and help them stay safe from cyber fraud," he said.

We have to explain to people again and again that there is no provision of digital arrest in the government; this is a "I myself have been an NCC blatant lie, a conspiracy to

The forward operating bases (FOB) have come up in Tumpalpad and Rayagudem in Sukma district and Kondapalli in the adjoining Bijapur district. These bases have been made operational over the last week or so, officials told PTI.

The central force is working on a strategy to make inroads into "hardcore" Naxalite areas of the state where the final battle against Left Wing Extremism (LWE) is concentrated.

The FOBs act as launching pads for all security forces, including the CRPF and state police units, to launch specific and intelligence-based anti-Naxal operations in core areas,

Centre issues guidelines for disability | Ex-CJI Chandrachud removed fear of law from political defectors: Raut reservation to ensure uniformity

The Centre has issued **■** comprehensive guidelines to streamline reservation and identification of posts for persons with at least 40 per cent disabilities, mandating periodic identification of such posts and formation of committees to assess them. The guidelines also state that if a post is deemed suitable for them, all subsequent pro-motional posts will also be reserved for persons with

disabilities.
The guidelines are in line with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016.

The move comes after the Delhi High Court flagged inconsistencies in implementation of the the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016 and criticised entities like the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) for unauthorised actions in identify-

The high court earlier this month observed that KVS had overstepped its authority by independently identi-fying posts for PwBDs and highlighted inconsistencies in the understanding of the Act among various departments.

The court mandated the Department

Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD) to establish uniform guide-

The updated guidelines aim to ensure inclusivity, fairness, and uniformity in the employment of persons with disabilities across central government establishments.

The new guidelines also ask ministries and departments to form committees, including representatives with dis-



their suitability.

A comprehensive review of identified posts is required every three years to incorporate technological advancements and evolving job requirements.

The guidelines also mandate a four per cent reservation in direct recruitment and promotions across categories, including blindness, loco-motor disability, hearing impairment, and intellectual disabilities. Additionally, they emphasise timely filling of backlog vacancies, wide publicity to ensure accessibility, and a three-year validity period for exemptions from reservation policies.

The government has also clarified that exemptions from reservation are valid for a maximum of three years and must be periodically reviewed. The move aims to ensure fairness while leveraging advancements in assistive technology.


Effective immediately, these guidelines supersede all previous instructions on the matter, except notifications issued in 2021 and 2022. Arman Ali, Executive Director, National Centre for

Promotion of Employment of Disabled People (NCPEDP), said identifying posts suitable for persons with benchmark disabilities is not just about fulfilling reservation mandates; it's a stepping stone to enabling career growth.

Extending this process to promotional positions ensures that persons with disabilities are not confined to entry-level roles but have equal opportunities to advance in their careers.

"It's important to emphasise that the one per cent reservation for different categories of disabilities does not imply any hierarchy or chronology. While these measures needed to be enforced more effectively in the past I welcome this step as a positive move towards inclusivity. The for-mation of expert committees and their regular meetings must be strictly adhered to," he said.

"I see the two most crucial tasks of the committee are to ensure the inclusion of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities which is the most important part and to have people with disability have a seat on the table," he said.

Yogi Adityanath's by-election win paves way for 2027 dominance

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has emerged stronger after the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) clinched a decisive 7-2 victory in the state's by-elections. This triumph not only revives the BJP's morale following its disappointing performance in the Lok Sabha elections earlier this year but also cements Yogi's leadership ahead of the 2027 assembly polls.
"This is a booster dose for our

workers," said Vijay Bahadur Pathak, a senior BJP leader. "The results show that when we work unitedly under Yogi ji's guidance, the BJP is

The BJP's campaign focused on unity, encapsulated in Yogi Adityanath's rallying cry, "Batenge to katenge" (If we divide, we will be cut). The slogan resonated deeply, underscoring the party's collective strength. Prime Minister Narendra Modi reinforced this message during a campaign in Maharashtra, campaign in Manarashtra, stating, "Ek hain to safe hain" (If we are united, we are safe). Political analyst Rajesh N. Bajpayee highlighted the impact of this messaging. "The BJP's narrative of unity struck a chord with voters and played a key role in their victory. It's a



lesson in disciplined, cohesive campaigning.

The Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS), often the BJP's ideology backbone, amplified its support for Yogi Adityanath during the by-polls. Unlike its limited involvement in the Lok Sabha elections, the RSS fully backed Yogi's leadership in these by-elections, emphasizing societal cohesion.

"Yogi ji's vision aligns with our principles," said a senior RSS functionary during a high-level meeting in Mathura. "His leadership is crucial for the BJP's continued success in Uttar Pradesh."

Opposition in Turmoil While the BJP celebrated, the opposition struggled. The Samajwadi Party (SP), touted as the BJP's primary rival, secured just two seats. SP chief Akhilesh Yadav's reliance on caste-based vote banks failed to counter the BJP's development narrative.

"The SP's inability to tap into anti-incumbency sentiments is glaring," Bajpayee noted.
"Akhilesh Yadav must rethink his strategy if he hopes to remain relevant."

The Congress performed dismally, opting to contest only a handful of seats. In Phulpur, Congress district president Suresh Yadav rebelled and contested independently, managing just 1,365 votes.

(BSP) fared no better, with over 60% of its traditional vote bank shifting to other parties. The by-election results provide a glimpse into Uttar Pradesh's political future. While the BJP has regained its footing, the opposition faces an uphill battle to recalibrate and mobilize effectively before

As the dust settles, the bypolls have reaffirmed Yogi Adityanath's stature as a for-midable leader. Whether the BJP can sustain this momentum will depend on its ability to address voter aspirations and maintain its narrative of unity and progress.

Astrict vegetarian diet, alcohol abstinence and behavioural training are among the steps the Uttar Pradesh Police is taking to ensure its personnel act as "servants of faith" and create a pleasant experience for the devotees gathering in this holy city for the Maha

Kumbh. The Maha Kumbh will commence on January 13 on the occasion of Paush Purnima and conclude on February 26 on Mahashiyratri.

Senior Superintendent of Police (Kumbh) Rajesh Dwivedi emphasised that the primary focus of the police, alongside maintaining security, would be to foster a welcoming environment for the pilgrims.

He said, "Our aim is to ensure that the devotees have a pleasant experience, and the police behave with warmth -- not just as enforcers of the law but as servants of faith."

Police personnel to be deployed for the Maha Kumbh are undergoing behaviour-focused training at a designated facility within the mela area. External trainers are also being invited to impart lessons in etiquette and public service. So far, 1,500 police personnel have completed the training. By the time the mela commences, 40,000 personnel will have completed the exercise. Atul Kumar Singh, the training programme in-charge, said 700 police personnel were receiving training at a time, following a 21-day mod-



The duration will gradually come down to 14 days as the mela draws closer, he added. Personnel such as Satish Kumar Yadav, a head constable from Mathura who will be deployed during the mela, expressed appreciation for the training.

"I have learned the importance of courteous behaviour and how to assist the devotees during times of distress. The training also covered topics such as cybercrime prevention," he said.

The force is also receiving expert instruction from the National Police Academy. Personnel trained there are now preparing trainers who, in turn, are equipping the larger police contingent for their role at the mela.

In addition to behavioural training, the police are also

being instructed to maintain the Maha Kumbh's sanctity. District police chief Dwivedi reaffirmed the Maha Kumbh's strict policies regarding food and drink and said non-veg-etarian food or alcohol would not be permitted in the mela ground.

The food in the police mess is entirely vegetarian and we have instructed all personnel to act in a manner that respects the devotees' faith," he said. New technologies will also be deployed at the Maha Kumbh this time.

An AI chatbot -- Kumbh Sahayak -- is being developed to assist the devotees with information in more than 10 languages via the Bhashini app. This initiative is designed to bridge language barriers and provide instant support to the vast number of devotees.

Ruling JMM retains Jharkhand and the BJP-led Mahayuti,

Maharashtra, indicating anti-incumbency is not at play right now

he Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), alongside its allies, achieved significant electoral victory in Maharashtra while the Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM) fought its way to victory in Jharkhand despite many handicaps proving once again that it is difficult to read the voters' mind. In Maharashtra, the BJP-led Mahayuti coalition, including factions of the Shiv Sena and the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP), secured a decisive majority, capitalising on effective consolidation of OBC votes and strategic welfare schemes like direct cash transfers for women. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership and grassroots outreach programmes further bolstered their appeal. Meanwhile, in Jharkhand, the BJP failed to wrest power from the ruling alliance of JMM. It could not emphasise governance issues and leverage dissatisfaction with the Hemant Sorenled coalition. The JMM's success was amplified by strong voter mobilisation in tribal areas and development-focused messaging. In Maharashtra, the Maha Vikas Aghadi



(MVA) alliance, comprising the Congress, Shiv Sena (UBT), and the original NCP, struggled with internal divisions and a lack of clarity on critical issues such as reservations for the Maratha community.

In Jharkhand, the BJP's limited reach and failure to address rural distress effectively diminished its appeal. The electoral outcome in Maharashtra underlines the BJP's ability to adapt and dominate state politics. All this while the Opposition struggled to regain voter trust. The NDA led by the BJP, achieved notable success in Maharashtra due to a combination of strategic alliances, effective voter outreach and targeted welfare initiatives. In Maharashtra, the BJP presented itself

as a cohesive force with Eknath Shinde's Shiv Sena faction and Ajit Pawar's Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) group, ensuring a consolidated voter base. The party's focus on OBC consolidation, welfare schemes such as direct cash transfers for women, and the influence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership resonated strongly with voters. But it was different story in Jharkhand where the BJP could not harness dissatisfaction with the governance of the Hemant Soren-led coalition and failed to highlight local issues like unemployment and tribal welfare and banked more on its national agenda. The JMM also benefited from a grassroots campaign that addressed tribal and rural voter concerns, further solidifying its position. Similarly, in Maharashtra the opposition failed to effectively capitalise on the BJP's perceived shortcomings, such as economic challenges and allegations of governance lapses. In Maharashtra, the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) coalition, comprising the Congress, Shiv Sena (Uddhav), and Sharad Pawar's NCP, struggled with internal divisions and inconsistent messaging, particularly on sensitive issues like Maratha reservations. In Jharkhand, JMM and Congress were able to counter the BJP's narrative and present a compelling vision for change. These results indeed underscore the innate acumen of the voters to vote on the issues they deem important.

Emerging contours of artificial intelligence



The interplay between AI and human intelligence offers both challenges and opportunities, heralding a future where adaptability and innovation are key

he foundation of understanding an organisation lies in understanding the role relationships within it. An individual may even, lose their identity in living up to the requirements of his organisational role. Illustratively, the President of an organisation is no longer just an individual who occupies that position. The person who occupies that position becomes the President of the organisation with the President's characteristics, the President's traits, and the President's attrib-

Being a true President may often require his acting in denial of his inclinations in favour of the role requirement. This issue has usually constituted the foundation of organisation analysis and operations. The theoretical basis of this thinking was laid out in 1952 by Elliott Jaques in his classical book "Changing Culture of a Factory." This was a report of 1948 and 1950 of a Glacier Metal Company, London. The Tavistock Institute of Human Relations was the sponsor.

The significance of the book lies, among other things, in the theoretical and operational implications of the research findings. The study went back to 1938. That is another story. Since then, few things have so fundamentally affected organisations understanding till the coming of artificial intelligence (AI). These are indeed seminal times in terms of understanding organisations. AI has affected how one looks at manufacturing, finance, logistics, and more. The expressions of job design have changed. If the basis of job design has changed, the understanding of organizational structure stands to change. The key issue is whether the fundamental changes through the new model of business products for increasing profit have impacted organisational operations. And how they have affected pricing, job market changes, and created or altered new revenue streams. Currently, the world of products and academia is dealing with a lot of jargonise. The popular refer-ences are two models, one is the platform-based model, other is the subscription model.



There may be several others but are yet to acquire significance. Many of them who would survive, would get modified, and much of them would evolve into something totally different. Time can tell. For the present, efforts are being made to understand business models and their impact on work conduct. An obvious outcome of AI is the redundancy of many tasks. As the character of tasks changes, the character of organizational models is open to change.

The whole approach of aggregation of organizational tasks into job designs has undergone a fundamental change. Many humanly rendered tasks have become redundant, and they have then been replaced either by machines or machine-led aggregation of skills. This whole process is akin to a major revolution in the understanding of the work. It needs to be realized that once such forces are generated, there is no reversal that can take place in its entirety. It also impacts job designs, which for whatever reason may not change. Put simply, the nature of the task itself has revolutionized organizations. Practically everyone needs to understand AI because there is nothing that can be quite untouched by that process. The overlapping jobs

When such fundamental changes are let loose, job displacement is not just job displacement but the seedbed of new forms of job creation. This would happen because of the ability of the AI specialist to affect the nature of the work itself. The chances are clear that AI as a service is on the way to acquiring a character of its own. For some AI will be the first lan-guage, and they will affect the running of the organization in a very critical manner. For the

The upshot of all these is the

rest, AI would be a second language, and everyone would need to understand a little bit of the nature of AI.

Put simply, the future of work will be a diligent factor in many ways, which might be an outcome of the revolution of AI. The fascinating thing is to observe how the character of AI affects other functions of the organization like finance, marketing, the functioning of ports, and more. The above is not to say that pathways are clear and the shift in organisational nature is irrevocable. The AI is a job in progress. It's a work in progress that is still taking shape and a character that remains in service of organization management, will only gradually become clear. How this will roll out is difficult to predict, but one thing

is clear: AI is here to stay. All in all, it will be interesting to observe how AI and human intelligence deal with each other and create an amalgam of human efforts for organizational growth. The future is here, and over time, it will take shape with better clarity and hopefully some predictability.

Trump 2.0: Stark challenges for the climate and global stability



With promises to overhaul bureaucracy, impose steep tariffs and retreat from climate commitments, Trump's policies are set to reshape the US and the world

onald Trump will take over as US President on January, 20 2025 and his pre-election promises would have economic and environmental consequences. On the economic front, countries worldwide would face still stronger dollars sucking money out of emerging markets, high protectionist tariffs imposed and consequent trade war slowing the growth and increasing inflation globally. His regime is not only committed to sacking thousands of bureaucrats and replaced by his supporters but has also announced a new department named the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) to be headed by Elon Musk and Vivek Ramaswamy to slash the bureaucracy.

No doubt it would disrupt the continuity of the functioning of government, and it would also lead to job losses. Nationwide federal government employs nearly 3 million people. Trump says Musk and Ramaswamy would dismantle government bureaucracy, slash excess regulations, cut wasteful expenditure and restructure federal agencies. With limited domestic consumption in China, the country would face a backlash.

If all countries take action to cut on imports, it certainly boomerangs somewhere and exports would be adversely impacted in most cases. A 10 per cent tariff on imports would increase US prices of goods by at least 3 per cent and a continued trade war may even further raise the prices. While domestic producers in the US would welcome it, the consumers will have to pay more. Tariff is not the solution to all problems. Trump's idea to shift manufacturing back to the US may MANUFACTURING be hit by supply chain disruption on

account of higher tariffs. The job creation in the US may be impacted. In his first term, Trump increased tariffs on Aluminum and Steel to bring its manufacturing back to the US, but the goal was not achieved. His acceptance of higher prices to be paid by consumers, while protecting producers had also made consumers pay 18 per cent extra on Washing machines in 2018. Later some of Trump's tariff was increased by Biden too. It went up to 100 per cent on electric vehicles, 50 per cent on solar cells and 25 per cent on batteries from China. It had its impact on climate action too the transition to cleaner energy was slowed down. Herbert Hoover, a Republican, US President nearly a century ago had similarly announced the imposition of tariffs, which ultimately culminated in the adoption of the Smoot-Hawley Act, of 1930 and increased tariffs by 40 to 60 per cent.

It led to a trade war and the US faced retaliation from its trade partners too. It triggered the great depression and the

worst economic crisis humankind has ever experienced. Presently global economy is already facing considerable headwinds, any trade war can have disastrous consequences. US's technological advancement for decades has placed it as the leading powerhouse in the world. Its investment in research and

development has been quite rewarding as evident from the fact that there have been more Nobel laureates in the last five or six years than the rest of the world put together have produced. With its technological superiority, the rest of the world is dependent on it economically too and the tariff policy would leave them behind in the trade war. So far China's growth has been manufacturing followed by exports, it is dealing with the problem of overcapacity of its industries and making efforts to boost domestic consumption. There has been budget constraint in Europe - money is spent on subsidies in several countries, causing growth retardation. Germany, to continue producing in the country has to match the US subsidy offering 900 million euros to Swedish battery makers Northvolt, which is experiencing sluggish growth of the economy. Subsidies continue to slow the growth globally.

As the growth suffers, climate action also suffers. For instance, countries in the African subcontinent have vast potential for solar and wind energy, which has remained untapped so far. China's interest in Africa is going up through its belt and Road initiatives; it has an eye on the natur-

Lebanese soldier killed, 18 wounded in Israeli strike

AP ■ BEIRUT

 $A^{\,\mathrm{n}}$ Israeli strike on a Lebanese army centre on Sunday killed one soldier and wounded 18 others, the Lebanese military said. The Hezbollah militant group meanwhile fired barrages of rockets into northern and central Israel, wounding at least five people. Israeli strikes have killed over 40 Lebanese troops since the start of the war between Israel and Hezbollah, even as Lebanon's military has largely kept to the sidelines.

There was no immediate comment from the Israeli military, which has said previous strikes on Lebanese troops were accidental and that they are not a target of its campaign against Hezbollah. Lebanon's caretaker prime minister, Najib Mikati, condemned it as an assault on US-led cease-fire efforts, calling it a "direct, bloody message rejecting all efforts and ongoing contacts" to end the war. "(Israel is) again writing in Lebanese blood a brazen rejection of the solution that is being discussed," a statement from his office read.

The strike occurred in southwestern Lebanon on the coastal road between Tyre and Naqoura, where there has been heavy fighting between Israel and Hezhollah

Hezbollah fires rockets after strikes on Beirut Hezbollah began firing rockets, missiles and drones into Israel after Hamas' October 7, 2023, attack out of the Gaza Strip ignited the war there. Hezbollah has portrayed the attacks as an act of solidarity with the Palestinians and Hamas. Iran supports both armed groups.

Israel has launched retaliatory airstrikes since the rocket fire began, and in September the low-level conflict erupted into all-out war, as Israel launched waves of airstrikes across large parts of Lebanon and killed Hezbollah's top leader, Hassan Nasrallah, and several of his top commanders.

Hezbollah fired barrages of rockets into northern and central Israel on Sunday, some of which were intercepted.

Israel's Magen David Adom rescue service said it was treating two people in the central city of Petah Tikva, a 23-year-old man who was lightly wounded by a blast and a 70-year-old woman suffering from smoke inhalation from a car that caught fire. The first responders said they treated three other people in northern Israel, including a 60-year-old man in serious condition

It was unclear whether the injuries and damage were caused by the rockets or interceptors. Israeli airstrikes early Saturday pounded central Beirut, killing at least 20 people and wounding 66, according to Lebanon's Health Ministry.

Israeli attacks have killed more than 3,500 people

in Lebanon, according to Lebanon's Health Ministry. The fighting has displaced about 1.2 million people, or a quarter of Lebanon's population. On the Israeli side, about 90 soldiers and nearly 50 civilians have been killed by bombardments in northern Israel and in battle following Israel's ground invasion in early October. Around 60,000 Israelis have been displaced from the country's north.

Musk, Ramaswamy seen as biggest threat to Beijing

 $U^{\text{S President-elect Donald Trump's plan to over-haul the government with a new department}$ headed by tech billionaire Elon Musk and Indianorigin entrepreneur Vivek Ramaswamy will be the biggest threat for China as it has to compete with far more efficient US political system, a policy advisor to the Chinese government said. China's biggest risk during Donald Trump's 2.0 would be US government overhauls driven by Musk and Ramaswamy, according to Zheng Yongnian, China's top academic and policy advisor to Beijing.
"A more efficient US political system would put huge

pressure on China's current system," Zheng, dean of the School of Public Policy at the Chinese University of Hong Kong's Shenzhen campus, said while speaking at Baichuan Forum hosted by the Institute for International Affairs (IIA) on Saturday.

"Of course, the pressure is not exclusive to China but also others, especially Europe," he said. Trump named Musk and Ramaswamy to lead a new

Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE). The duo has already planned to scrap "thousands of regulations" and reduce the size of the government workforce. Zhena said, "In the medium to long term, the greatest pressure on China may come from changes within the US."

If Trump succeeds in his efforts to overhaul the government, the US would "develop a new, more competitive system", Zheng said, calling it a form of "state capitalism with American characteristics".

"I think we should not underestimate the institutional reforms prioritised by figures like Musk," he warned, the Hong Kong-based South China Morning

Post reported on Sunday. China is gearing up for Trump's second term, begin-

ning on January 20 next year, on several fronts, including his threat to impose a 60 per cent increase of tariffs on its over USD 427 billion annual exports to the US. Trump, who acted tough on China during his pre-

vious term, is expected to reinforce measures against Beijing on various global fronts, including Taiwan and the South China Sea. China asserts Taiwan as part of its mainland and claims ownership over most of the South China Sea.

The Philippines, Vietnam, Malaysia, Brunei and Taiwan have counterclaims over the area.

Islamabad locked down ahead of protest | Absence of 'no vote' doesn't

Pakistan deployed heavy security forces in the national capital, sealed key roads and suspended mobile and internet services in certain areas as supporters of jailed former premier Imran Khan on Sunday geared up for a protest march towards Islamabad. Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party has called on the public to join the march to "break the shackles of slavery."

A convoy under the leadership of Khan's wife Bushra Bibi and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur left for Islamabad from Peshawar. Geo News reported that Bibi was part of the convoy that started from Peshawar, but the KP chief minister was leading the protest.

Earlier, it was said that Bibi would not attend the protest. KP government spokesperson Muhammad Ali Saif said all arrangements have been made to remove the obstacles. He also alleged that last night police opened fire on the anti-barricading machinery and tried to set it on fire, but the PTI supporters foiled the arson attempt. He also said that the govern-ment still has time to fulfil their demands, warning that there could be a situation like Bangladesh, where a mass protest led by students toppled longtime prime minister Sheikh Hasina's government in August. Khan's party shared pictures and videos of various groups leaving from different cities for Islamabad to take part in the protest. In the national capital,

to let anyone enter the city and arrested about 16 protestors from the Faizabad area of Rawalpindi as they tried to enter Íslamabad.

Meanwhile, internet tracking monitor Netblocks said WhatsApp backends have been restricted in Pakistan, according to a post on X.

Live metrics show WhatsApp backends have been restricted in Pakistan corroborating reports of media sharing issues; the measure comes as authorities tighten security ahead of protests planned by opposition party PTI calling for the release of former PM Imran Khan," Netblocks said.

The federal government has taken several steps to block the protest, including deploying heavy security forces, sealing key roads, and setting up barriers around the capital.
The Interior Ministry has

emphasised that, in accordance with court orders, no protests or sit-ins will be allowed in Islamabad, and any attempts to disrupt public order will be met with legal action.

Khan, in a statement, urged the masses to unite for the protest, calling it a movement for freedom and justice.

The PTI leaders earlier held a high-level meeting at the KP Chief Minister's House to finalise the strategy for the planned protest, Geo News reported. Ignoring calls by the government to postpone the protest – the second one in as many months - Khan's party declared to go ahead with its planned march to Islamabad,



coinciding with the arrival of a large Belarusian delegation even as the authorities issued a warning of a potential threat during the protest.

The PTI gave a call last week for a long march to Islamabad to press for three demands: the release of the jailed party founder and other leaders, against the alleged "stolen mandate" during the February 8 elections and restoration of the judiciary by revoking the recent 26th amendment to the Constitution that granted legislators more power in appointing top judges.

Containers have been placed across Islamabad, including along the Srinagar Highway, GT Road, and the Expressway, limiting access to strategic areas like Islamabad Airport and D-Chowk, which is located close to several important government buildings: the Presidency, the Prime Minister's Office, the Parliament, and the Supreme Court.

Rangers, along with police and Frontier Constabulary (FC), have been deployed to monitor the area. The federal government has also warned against any unlawful protests, stating that no one will be permitted to hold a demonstration in violation of judicial orders, with legal action promised against any violators

Also, Pakistan Railways has suspended all train services between Lahore, Rawalpindi, and Peshawar in light of the ongoing PTI protest, according to the Express Tribune newspaper. According to railway authorities, services between Peshawar and Rawalpindi, Lahore and Rawalpindi as well as between Multan and Faisalabad to Rawalpindi, have been halted immediately. "We missed a chance to shield our most vulnerable from the climate crisis and heal our planet. Strong concerns remain over the adopted climate finance goal. Thanks to all who stood with us. We fight on," he said in a post on X.

The chair of the African Group of Negotiators (AGN) said the deal was done "acrimoniously". Developed countries taking a lead with USD 300 billion by 2035 is a joke," Nkiruka Maduekwe, a negotiator from Nigeria, said during the closing plenary on Saturday.

It is not something we should take lightly. I think we should rethink it... We have a right as countries to choose if we want to take this or not," she added. R R Rashmi, a fellow at Teri Energy Resources Institute of India, told PTI that technically, an agreement is adopted in the absence of a vote against it.

'This case is complex. Here countries were not satisfied with the decision, but they were pushed to adopt it," he said. On Saturday evening, negotiators from the LDC group and

South Korea's absence at Sunday's memorial, to which Seoul government officials and Korean victims' families were invited, is a major setback in the rapidly improving ties between the two countries, which since last year have set aside their historical disputes to prioritise US-led security coop-

The Sado mines were listed in Heritage site after Japan moved past years of disputes with South Korea and reluctantly acknowledged the mines' dark history, promising to hold an annual memorial service for all victims, including hundreds of Koreans who were mobilized to work in the mines

On Saturday, South Korea announced it would not attend the event, saying it was impossible to settle unspecified disagreements between the two governments in time.

Families of Korean victims of the mine accidents were expected to separately hold their own ceremony near the mine at a later date. Masashi Mizobuchi, an assistant press secretary in Japan's Foreign Ministry, said Japan has been in communication with Seoul and called the South Korean decision "disappointing."

South Korea had long opposed the listing of the site as World Heritage on the grounds that the Korean forced laborers, despite their key role in the wartime mine production, were missing from the exhibition. Seoul's backing for Sado came as South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol prioritized improving relations with Japan. The Japanese government said Sunday's ceremony was to pay tribute to "all workers" who died at the mines, but would not spell out inclusion of Korean laborers — part of what critics call a persistent policy of whitewashing Japan's history of sexual and labor exploitation before and during the war.

Chief Justice Syed Refaat Ahmed administered the oath of office to the new commission at the Supreme Court Judges' Lounge at a ceremony joined by the top court judges and concerned officials. The swearing-in ceremony was staged days after a search

committee appointed by the interim government of Muhammad Yunus recommended the names of the new Election Commission chief and members who previously served as civil servants, military officers and lower judiciary judges.

The new chief election commissioner (CEC) is a retired secretary to the government. The four election commissioners are retired district judges Mohammad Anwarul Islam Sarker and Abdur Rahmanel Masud, retired joint secretary to the government Begum Tahmida Ahmed and retired army brigadier general Abul Fazal Md Sanaullah. Mohammed Shahabuddin appointed the November 21.

The commission had been vacant since September 5 when members of the previous commission, led by Kazi Habibul Awal, resigned after former prime minister Sheikh Hasina's Awami League regime was toppled.

Awal and other commission members had tendered their resignation letters on September 5 while officials said the EC had never been vacant for this long since it was founded in 1972.

The interim government on October 29 formed a sixmember search committee led by retired Supreme Court judge Zubayer Rahman Chowdhury to come up with

the names of two individuals for each EC membership. The interim government formed after the ouster of the

review committee formed Aby Bangladesh's interim government on Sunday recommended engaging an investigation agency to examine power agreements signed by deposed prime minister Sheikh Hasina's regime with different business groups, including one with India's Adani Group.

'The National Review Committee on Ministry of Power, Energy and Mineral Resources has recommended the appointment of a reputed legal and investigation agency to review the major power production agreements signed during the autocratic regime of Sheikh Hasina from 2009 to 2024," an official statement said. The statement, issued by Chief Adviser Muhammad Yunus's office, said the committee was currently review-

ing seven major energy and power projects, including the Adani (Godda) BIFPCL 1234.4 MW coal-fired plant, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Adani Power Limited.

The six other agreements include one with a Chinese company that built a 1320 MW coal-fired power plant, while the rest are with Bangladeshi business groups said to be close to the past regime. According to the statement, the committee gathered "enormous proof' warranting the agreements be "scrapped or reconsidered" in line with international arbitration laws and procedures. It said the committee needed additional time to further analyse other solicited and unsolicited contracts. "In doing so, we recommend immediate appointment of one or more top-level international legal and investigation

agency or agencies to assist the committee," the statement said quoting a letter of the committee, headed by retired High Court judge Moyeenul Islam Chowdhury.

India's External Affairs Ministry had earlier said that cooperation in the power and energy sector has become one of the crucial pillars of India-Bangladesh relations.

The Adani Group, however, recently sent a letter to the Bangladesh government over its unpaid USD 800 million power supply bill while Bangladesh's state-run Power Development Board said they had already paid USD 150 million despite its dollar crisis and was expecting to pay the full amount.

Adani's Godda thermal plant was set up exclusively to supply power to Bangladesh but India recently changed a law allowing the Indian company to sell the Godda power in the domestic market sparking speculation if Bangladesh would get dedicated power supply from the plant. The interim government had

earlier formed a committee to examine contracts made under

five-year term and has significant decision-making powers in areas such as national security, foreign policy, and judicial appointments. Romania will also hold parlia-

Simion, 38, is a vocal supporter of US President-elect Donald Trump and has long been a controversial figure. Himanshu Srivastava Associate Director - Manager Morningstar Research, Investment Research India, said.

According to the data, FPIs recorded a net outflow of Rs 26,533 crore so far this month (till November 22). This came following a net withdrawal of Rs 94,017 crore in October, which was the worst monthly outflow. However, September, foreign investors made a nine-month high investment of Rs 57,724 crore. Concerns over the elevated valuations of Indian equities persist, prompting FPIs to redirect their attention toward

Additionally, China continues to draw significant foreign inflows at India's expense, bolstered by its compelling valuation levels and the recent announcement of stimulus measures aimed at revitalizing its slowing economy, he said. Furthermore, India's sub-par corporate earnings and elevated inflation figures have raised concerns about potential delays in domestic interest rate cuts, he added.

V K Vijavakumar, Chief Investment Strategist, Geojit Financial Services, flagged investors' concerns surrounding FY25 earnings. He added that while the 'Sell India, Buy China' trade is over, 'the Trump trade' also appears to be on its last leg since valuations have reached high levels in the US.

In terms of sectors, FPIs have been buying IT stocks while banking stocks have been resilient despite facing selling pressure, mainly due to domestic support from institutional investors.

On the other hand, FPIs withdrew Rs 1,110 crore from the debt general limit and invested Rs 872 crore in the debt Voluntary Retention Route (VRR) this month until November 22.

Mobile industry seeks enhanced air cargo handling capacity

Association Chairman Pankaj Mohindroo told PTI that the turnaround time at customs is a major hurdle for the electronics industry which shipments' processing further. "In China, while the factory to export take-off from the cargo terminal is achieved on Day 1, in India, the export take off happens only by Day 2. This is a glaring chasm especially when seen in the context of the volume of exports which in the case of China is more than 30 times electronics output (USD 959 billion) compared to India (USD 29 billion) in 2023," Mohindroo

Electronics is already India's largest export in air cargo while it's ranked third overall behind engineering and

"To keep pace with the expected growth in exports, concerted efforts are needed at the Central and State level. The infrastructure at current airports has already reached saturation levels as they are operating at 80-100 per cent of their capacity which calls for and developing new ones," Mohindroo said.

According to ICEA, total electronics exports stood at USD 29.1 billion for the period from financial year 2023-24, out of which mobiles stood at USD 15 billion



To achieve the USD 500 electronics production by 2030 requires airport capacities to increase parallelly to handle USD 180 of exports, the vast majority on an annual basis which would be 6 times higher than the current exports. By 2030, electronics will not only be India's top 2 exports (at the rate of USD 180-200 billion per year), but also significantly larger in terms of air cargo as compared to any other export from India," Mohindroo said. The helpline has seen dramatic growth in usage, with monthly calls surging to 141,817 in January 2024 from 14,795 in January 2015. Monthly complaint registrations have tripled to 112,468 in 2024 from 37,062 in 2017.

"These technological upgrades are aimed at making the


grievance filing process more seamless, efficient, and inclusive," the Department of Consumer Affairs said in a statement.

The partnership programme, known as the Convergence Programme, has expanded to include major companies across sectors such as ecommerce, travel, education, and banking. The number of participating

companies has grown nearly fourfold from 263 in 2017 to 1,009 currently. The department has identified

several major companies with high grievance numbers, including Delhivery Ltd and Dominos Pizza, and plans to meet with them next week to discuss bringing them into the partnership programme. Consumers can access the

helpline through multiple channels including a toll-free number (1915), WhatsApp, SMS, email, and a dedicated mobile app. Unresolved complaints can be escalated to the Consumer Commission under Consumer Protection Act, 2019.





Thus, collaboration and commitment across all sectors are vital for achieving lasting improvements in air quality and safeguarding public health.

Rishabh Pant becomes most expensive IPL buy at ₹27 crore

ishabh Pant became the most expensive player in the history of IPL as Super Giants Lucknow splurged a humongous Rs 27 crore to buy the flamboyant India keeper-batter in the tournament's mega auction here on Sunday.

The amount LSG spent for Pant ensured Shreyas Iyer's record of being tournament's costliest player lasted barely a few minutes after Punjab Kings broke the bank to buy the India batter for Rs 26.75 crore.

Moments before Pant emerged as the most expensive player, Iyer surpassed the record held by Australian pacer Mitchell Starc, who was bought by Kolkata Knight Riders for Rs 24.75 crore in the last auction. Pant went to LSG after his former franchise Delhi Capitals did not use the Right to Match card to buy him back Starc got a much lower price this time and was sold to Delhi Capitals for Rs 11.75 crore,



while England's Jos Buttler went to Gujarat Titans for Rs 15.75 crore.

others, left-arm Among seamer Arshdeep Singh's consistency earned him a massive bid of Rs 18 crore, also from Punjab Kings via the Right to Match card, while South African speedster Kagiso Rabada was bought for Rs 10.75 crore by Gujarat Titans.

Iyer, the former Kolkata Knight Riders captain, started with a base price of Rs two crore.

Delhi Capitals had the bid at Rs 26 crore for him but PBKS raised the amount to get the player. Chennai Super Kings started with the first bid for Arshdeep, whose base price was also Rs two crore.

Eventually, after an intense bidding war, the seamer was bought back by Punjab, who exercised the right to match option to complete the deal, having released him earlier. This is the second time an IPL auction is being held outside

the country after last year's event in Dubai.



Max Verstappen cruised to a fourth consecutive Formula 1 championship by finishing fifth in the Las Vegas Grand Prix.

Verstappen needed only to finish ahead of Lando Norris of McLaren to give Red Bull a fourth straight driver championship. The Dutchman started fifth but was already up to second by the 10th lap around the street circuit that includes the famed Las Vegas Strip on Saturday night. Norris, who had to score at least three

points more than Verstappen to extend the championship fight, finished sixth. Verstappen needed only to finish higher than Norris to win the title, which he did with two races remaining on the season

"Max Verstappen you are a four-time world champion," team principal Christian Horner said on the radio. That is a phenomenal, phenomenal achievement. You can be incredibly proud of yourself as we are.

Verstappen, only the sixth driver in F1 history to win at least four titles, sounded unusually emotional on the "Oh My God, what a season. Four

times. Thank you, thank you guys," he said. "We gave it all."

The race was won, meanwhile, by George Russell who was followed by Lewis Hamilton in the first 1-2 sweep for the Mercedes drivers since 2022. Hamilton came from 10th on the grid two weeks after a demoralizing race in Brazil — to capture his podium finish.

Down Under. "People who have to criticise will criticise. If a big player takes a lot of time to bounce back, (the) media's job is (to do) that," Kapil told PTI at the Vishwa Samudra Golden Eagle Golf Championship. "One has to see his ability and talent. He's a big, big player. He

prove me or prove (it to the) media.

"What he's done for cricket is amazing. We should all say, well done (to him). (Even) if he doesn't get too many runs, it's (also) okay. But what he's given to cricket is unparalleled," Kapil added.

Kapil said he was happy to see the mix of young and senior Indian batters making their mark.

"I need not say anything — his records show (how good he is). He is the top bowler in the world, what else do we need?" he said.
"I hadn't thought before that a fast

bowler would be discussed so much in India but that is happening today and I feel happy and proud about that," he added. Kapil said India's performance was contrary to the exceptions given the team was recently trounced 0-3 by New Zealand at home.

"The team is playing really well. They should win the first Test, positive thinking should always be there," he said. "It wasn't expected that the team

would play so well after the New Zealand series. You feel angry when they play badly but also (rediscover the) love when they do well," he said. "It (the praise) is for all, it is a
