Oh Canada! Student Direct Stream service scrapped

Indian students dreaming of studying in Canada may face hardship now, as it has ended the fast track visa programme. The decision came in the backdrop of ongoing diplomatic tension between the two countries. The decision to cancel the fast-track visa service known as Student Direct Stream (SDS) raised concerns over delays in processing and uncertainty for many international students from India. In 2023, nearly 200,000 Indian students received study permits. The SDS was launched in 2018 to provide faster processing for eligible post-secondary students. It was introduced to simplify the visa application process for students from 14 countries, which included India.



In the latest measure targeting international students planning to study at a Canadian institution, Ottawa has announced that it is immediately ending the SDS initiative. According to a notice from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) late on Friday, SDS was launched in 2018 to "provide faster processing for eligible post-secondary students" and "eventually opened to legal residents" of 14 nations including India. It stated that "Canada's goal is to strengthen program integrity, address student vulnerability, and give all students equal and fair access to the application process, as well as a positive academic experience" to "meet this commitment" the SDS was scrapped on November eight. Study permits applied for after the announcement will be processed under the regular stream. The Canadian government has refrained from giving an explanation for ending the fast-track visa service. The move comes at a time when India and Canada's ties are strained due to the Trudeau government blaming the Indian government agents for the killing of Khalistani terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar. Indian aspirants are now likely to face extended waiting times for their study permits, which can be a significant setback. Indian students now have to navigate additional hurdles to

secure their study permits on time. Meanwhile, a PTI report from Ottawa, on Saturday, said Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau has acknowledged the presence of Khalistan supporters in Canada but said they do not represent the Sikh community as a whole. His comments came during Diwali celebrations at Ottawa's Parliament Hill recently amid an ongoing diplomatic row with India over the killing of Khalistan extremist Hardeep Singh Nijjar. "There are many supporters of Khalistan in Canada, but they do not represent the Sikh Community as a whole. Similarly, there are supporters of Prime Minister (Narendra

Modi's government in Canada, but they do not represent all Hindu Canadians," Trudeau said. The relations between the two countries came under severe strain following Trudeau's allegations in September last year of a "potential" involvement of Indian agents in Nijjar's killing. New Delhi rejected Trudeau's charges as "absurd". India expelled six Canadian diplomats and withdrew its high commissioner Sanjay Verma and other "targeted" officials from Canada after strongly dismissing Ottawa's charges. India has been maintaining that the main issue between the two countries is that of Canada giving space to pro-Khalistan elements operating from Canadian soil with impunity. Last week, Khalistani supporters disrupted a consular event co-organised by the Hindu Sabha temple in Brampton and the Indian Consulate. The incident was condemned by Trudeau who said every Canadian has the right to practise their faith freely and safely. In a statement, the Ministry of External Affairs said that New Delhi remains "deeply concerned" about the safety and security of Indian nationals in Canada. The Indian consulate in Toronto said it was scrapping some of the planned consular events this month because of Canadian "security agencies conveying their inability to provide minimum security protection" to organisers.

3rd phase of Subhadra money on Nov 24

2.47L rejected applicants urged to make corrections

Deputy Chief Minister Pravati Parida on Saturday announced that the third phase of the first installment of the Subhadra Yojana money would be credited on November 24. Over 20 lakh women will receive the money in the third phase on November 24 which would be launched in Sundargarh. Parida revealed that at least the application of 2.67 lakh applicants had been rejected



due to various reasons and advised them to make the required corrections in their documents needed for enrolment under Subhadra. Speaking to the media at the airport here after arriving from London, Parida advised the rejected applicants to verify any mistakes in their Aadhaar cards and bank accounts to get their money in the third phase.

"The rejected list has been sent to block offices through the District Collectors. So, I request the rejected applicants to make necessary corrections in their Aadhaar cards and bank accounts to avail their share of money," the Deputy CM said.

Parida further advised the applicants not to panic and assured that everyone would be included in the fourth phase which would be credited in December.

"Even if there is a delay in the corrections of Aadhaar card and bank accounts, the applicants will be included in the fourth phase. Not a single eligible applicant will be left out of the scheme," she assured.

Home Guard recruitment ban lifted

The State Government on Saturday withdrew the ban on the recruitment of Home Guards. The ban was lifted on the directions of Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi.

By this decision, the vacant Home Guard posts in the State would be fulfilled soon.

Notably, while there are 17,675 Home Guard posts in the State, 15,306 Home Guards are currently on duty. So, 2,369 posts are vacant now. By the government's decision the vacant posts would be filled up. This was informed through a release from the Chief Minister's Office.

Rs 30K for a Padma awardee a month

All Padma awardees in Odisha will be paid a monthly honorarium of Rs 30,000.

Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi took this decision on Saturday.

As a result, all the 55 living persons of the State with Padma awards will be benefited. The decision will entail an annual expenditure of about Rs 2 crore from the State exchequer, according to release from the Chief Minister's Office.

In higher education sector Nat'l Edu Policy to be implemented in State

4-year Honours course to be introduced

In the higher education sector, the National Education Policy 2020 will be implemented in all the government universities and colleges in Odisha from the academic year 2024-25.

Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi on Saturday gave approval for this. Due to this step, there will be many changes in the education system.

According to the 2020 education policy, there would be a four-year Honours course. Under this, the successful students would be provided certificates, diplomas, degrees and Honours.

A State Credit Framework has been prepared on the basis of the credit framework provided by the University Grants Commission and there are opportunities for internship and skill development.

Credit would also be provided for extracurricular activities, community service, NCC and NSS. By this, the students can choose the subjects as per their choices and complete their degree courses within seven years.

'Love Jihad'

Accused youth arrested, forwarded to court

Mobile phone sent for forensic test

In a development in the alleged 'love jihad' by a Kashmiri youth, who was detained by police after a woman filed a complaint that he forced her to undergo religious conversion and marry him, he was arrested and forwarded to court on Saturday.

The arrested Samir Mansoor was produced before the court after a medical examination. His mobile phone was seized and sent for forensic examination. Earlier on Saturday, police recorded the statement and performed the medical examination of the victim, who hails from Jagatsinghpur.

The action by police followed the victim accusing Mansoor of forcing her to convert to his religion and marry him. She had lodged a complaint at the Mahila police station in Bhubaneswar in this connection.

The man also allegedly threatened the victim to upload video clips of their earlier intimate moments on the internet.

Based on the complaint filed by the victim, police registered a case and nabbed Mansoor while he was trying to leave Odisha by train. Mansoor claimed



that he hails from Bihar and is presently staying in Kashmir.

In the FIR, the woman claimed that she came to know Mansoor through an online game in 2022 and was not aware of his religion initially.

"Mansoor forced me to change my religion and marry him. When I refused to convert, he captured our intimate moments and blackmailed my father," she stated in her complaint.

The woman's lawyer Sanghamitra Rajguru said she was in love with Mansoor without knowing his real identity and religion.

Indian Navy's 'Op Demo' at Puri on Dec 4

In city Woman duped of Rs 4L while recharging mobile

A woman in Bhubaneswar has allegedly been duped of Rs 4 lakh by cyber fraudsters. The victim has been identified as Usharani Behera.

As per the allegation of Behera, she mistakenly recharged an unknown person's mobile number with Rs 349 while trying to recharge her own phone number. When she contacted the person and requested him to recharge for her, he denied it.

Finding no other option, Behera searched the customer care number of PhonePe on Google to seek assistance



from the digital payment and financial service company over the matter. But unknowingly, she got the number of cyber fraudsters.

When she sought assistance on the number, she was duped to the tune of Rs 1 lakh. After losing the cash, she froze her bank account. After a month,

she visited the bank and submitted an application to reactivate it again. As soon as her bank account was reactivated, the scammers cleaned off Rs 3 lakh in phases, the victim alleged.

"I wrongly recharged some other person's mobile number with Rs 349. Then I contacted and requested him to recharge my number. But, he denied it. Later, I searched for the PhonePe helpline number on Google. After calling the number found on the internet, they guided me assuring refund. But, instead Rs 1 lakh was debited from my account. I did not know that it was a fraud number," Behera alleged.

HC raps lawyer for taking Rs 16L, gold chain from client to bribe judge

The Orissa High Court recently came down heavily on a lawyer who has been accused of taking over Rs 16 lakh, a gold chain and a bracelet from a client on the pretext of using the same to bribe a judge. The High Court also refused to quash an FIR lodged against the lawyer, the Bar and Bench reported.

Justice Siboo Sankar Mishra dismissed the lawyer's plea to quash the

FIR and imposed costs of Rs 10,000 on him.

"The Court is not inclined to quash the FIR as the allegations are not only at a nascent stage of investigation but also as quite serious in nature as the name of a former Judge of this Court has been soiled," the court said.

"The facts of the present case, as alleged, would show that the Petitioner has insinuated and attributed wrongdoing to a former judge of this Court... The informant is

aware of the social status of the Petitioner as an advocate. No common person would normally dare to make false allegations of such grim nature against a member of the bar knowingly fully well there would be dire consequences in case the allegations are found to be false or motivated," the court observed.

The court also directed the State Bar Council to hold an inquiry into the allegations.

In her FIR, the bail seeker's wife alleged that she paid Rs 16.35 lakh to one Anil Kumar

Patra in Bhubaneswar on the lawyer's instruction. Additionally, she claimed to have given the lawyer a gold chain (65 grams) and a gold bracelet (50 grams) who asked her on the pretext of gifting it to the daughter of the judge who was to hear her husband's bail plea.

The FIR stated that land deeds were also later transferred to the lawyer on his demand. However, the lawyer continued to demand more money and he demanded an additional Rs 16 lakh.

Row over ex-MLA's wife's cremation

Police on Saturday seized a half-burnt body of Ashrukana Pradhan, wife of former Brahmagiri MLA Ajay Jena, from the Satya Nagar crematorium in Bhubaneswar following allegations by family members that Pradhan's daughter-in-law performed the cremation rites without informing the family or securing a postmortem examination.

The Kharavela Nagar police acted upon the complaint, taking possession of the body and sending it for an autopsy, scheduled at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences here on Sunday.

The deceased's brother alleged that he had not been al-

lowed to see his sister for the past year. "My younger sister informed me of our elder sister's death. My family and I were kept away from her," he said.

The daughter-in-law refuted the allegations, asserting that all necessary steps were followed. "After doctors at a private clinic declared her dead, I arranged her cremation; and proper documents were verified," she said, adding that she informed her husband's elder brothers of the death and did not see a need to alert police.

Kharavela Nagar Police Inspector Rajanikanta Mishra confirmed that a case has been registered based on the sister's complaint and an investigation was underway.

Demand for HC Bench in W Odisha renewed

Former Sambalpur MP Bhabani Shankar Hota has renewed the demand for an Orissa High Court Bench in the region, a call that has persisted for over 40 years.

Hota highlighted that multiple States already have more than one High Court Bench and there is no reason why western Odisha should be deprived.

Both the Odisha Chief Minister and the Union Law Minister have requested the Orissa High Court to consider the proposal for a bench.

However, the court has not responded, for which residents of the region are frustrated. Officials have suggested that virtual hearings could serve the area's needs, but advocates argue that this is insufficient due to low literacy rates and limited digital access, especially among tribal



and poor communities. Hota said that in the last five years till November 5, 2024 there are 1,43,962 pending cases in the Orissa High Court. A virtual court is not a viable solution for people of western Odisha.

The push for a bench in western Odisha gained further momentum after Supreme Court Justice SR Gavai recently supported a fourth bench in Maharashtra, citing the importance of providing justice to people in remote ar-

reas. This was highlighted by Kishore Hota and Gyanendra Behera, co-convenors of the People's Forum for High Court Bench in western Odisha.

"The demands are not just about a bench but reflect the overall neglect of western Odisha's 15 million people," Behera stated.

Hota added, "The Supreme Court has approved the demand for a fourth High Court Bench in Maharashtra. It is to be established at Kolhapur.

Similarly, in Karnataka, there are also three High Court Benches. If Maharashtra can push for a fourth bench, western Odisha certainly deserves its first."

He further said, "Selection of land for establishment of a High Court Bench is not as complex a process as lack of political interest has made it."

Hota also sought an Advocate Academy in Sambalpur on the ground that this would enhance the potentials of advocates in the region.

In Cuttack Bombs hurled at contractor's vehicles

Extortion bid by miscreants suspected

Unidentified miscreants hurled bombs at Kainmudi Square under the Banki police station in Cuttack district on Friday night. The motive behind the incident was suspected to trigger panic to collect extortion money.

Getting information, the Banki police rushed to the spot and launched a probe into the incident.

According to sources, a contractor has undertaken the construction of a bridge at Kainmudi village. A few miscreants allegedly threatened him and tried to extort money from him. When he refused, the miscreants left after threatening him with dire consequences.

On Friday night, the miscreants hurled two bombs at the vehicles engaged at the construction site and fled from the spot.

Neither the contractor nor the police have yet commented on the incident.

Gangster Sakil fears encounter by cops

Releases video of Facebook

Notorious gangster Md Sakil, who has several cases pending against him, on Saturday claimed in a video on Facebook that police are trying to kill him in a 'fake encounter'.

Sakil is currently out on bail. The 1.03-second video was released on his Facebook page. He expressed his wish to shun violence and join the mainstream.

"There is the top court and laws to provide justice to everyone. So, I request the top court to provide me justice. Law means that a culprit should be punished. But the law also says that an innocent should not get punished. I'm



innocent now. There is no case now against me. So, as a common citizen, I have all the rights for justice," Sakil said through a video message.

"Even the law states that society should let the criminals shun violence and join the mainstream. But, it is the complete opposite here. They are trying to find and encounter me. So, I request for justice through this video," he ended.

Yamuna released into deep Similipal forest

Tigress Yamuna, which was recently brought from the Tadoba- Andheri Tiger Reserve in Maharashtra and was kept in a soft enclosure, was released to the core areas of the Similipal Tiger Reserve (STR) in Mayurbhanj on Saturday.

The two-and-a-half-year-old tigress had been brought from Maharashtra on October 28. It made its first hunt on October 31 and was in good health. After monitoring its condition, it was released into the wilds of the tiger reserve

on Saturday, informed STR Deputy Director Samrat Gowda.

Notably, the inter-State translocation project aims to infuse a fresh gene pool in Similipal. The translocation of the tigress has been done with the permission of the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA).

Recently, a special team from the wildlife wing of Odisha Forest Department comprising 10 members visited Maharashtra to translocate another tigress from the Tadoba- Andheri Tiger Reserve to Similipal.

High-speed corridor to link Ganjam, G'pati, R'gada, K'put

Meet held for 287-km road on which vehicles can run up to 120km/h

The proposed Brahmapur-Jaypur high-speed corridor and the green field project review meeting was held under the chairmanship of Law, Energy and Excise Minister Prithviraj Harichandan on Thursday in Bhubaneswar. The high-speed corridor, which will stretch approximately 287 km, will connect the districts of Ganjam, Gajapati,

Rayagada, and Koraput. The expansive route is expected to allow vehicles to travel at speeds of up to 120 km/h. Currently, a journey from Brahmapur to Jaypur takes around seven hours, but with the completion of the corridor, travel time will be reduced to just three hours. The new route aims to bypass the hilly and accident-prone paths that have long been a challenge on the existing road network. In order to mitigate the frequent accidents on the hilly terrain, the project includes proposals to construct tunnels at four critical points along the route. The Minister highlighted

the important role of mining and industrial sectors in the State's rapid growth. He emphasized that the high-speed corridor will significantly enhance connectivity between major cities, mining areas, and industrial zones, thus facilitating smoother transportation of goods and people. Minister Harichandan also stressed that special care would be taken to ensure that the corridor does not negatively impact wildlife sanctuaries, small forests, or biodiversity-rich areas. He urged the officials to prepare the best possible plans to avoid any environmental damage while implementing the project.

The Minister also directed the concerned authorities to focus on acquiring land and addressing issues related to forest land, ensuring a smooth process for the project. The meeting was attended by senior officials, including Principal Secretary of Energy Department BB Yadav, Secretary of the Department of Independent Governance Deepak Das, Chief Engineer (Civil) Purnachandra Mahapatra, OBC Consultant Joint Advisor Jay Krishna Das and Director of Spark Operations, Shubhdarshi Mishra along with other senior officials from various departments.

Addressing a Press meet at Umarkote, he further said that there is uncertainty as no process has been initiated for the project so far. It remains to be seen what steps the double engine government will take in this regard, he added.

Tiger sightings trigger alarm in Ganjam

Forest Department issues warnings

Reports of sightings of a Royal Bengal Tiger have sparked widespread concern across Ganjam district, prompting the Forest Department to issue urgent warnings and increase surveillance on Saturday. Local residents have reported seeing tigers in several areas near the Odisha-Andhra Pradesh border with the most recent sighting reported on Saturday. According to sources, the tiger was last seen moving from Golanthara towards Chikiti. Forest officials have since discovered fresh pugmarks across three different blocks. The Forest Department has deployed teams to monitor the RBT's movements. Warning posters and banners have

been put up in Chikiti and Patrapur-surrounding villages. Patrolling has been intensified in regions such as Patrapur and Chikiti blocks and nearby Mahendragiri Hill villages to ensure public safety. Several videos allegedly showing tigers roaming the

region have gone viral on social media. However, forest officials have urged the public to be cautious, clarifying that many of these videos are misleading. "We are actively monitoring the situation and advise everyone to avoid spreading unverified information," Brahmapur Divisional Forest Officer Sunny Khokhar stated. Farmers are being instructed to safeguard their livestock. The Forest Department is collaborating with local communities to enhance safety measures and prevent any potential attacks. Patrapur bordering the Mahendragiri Hill has emerged as a hotspot, with reports indicating that a tiger was seen near Samatiyapada. An auto driver reportedly encountered an RBT near the Maa Balakumari Temple on Thursday night. However, despite extensive searches, no concrete evidence of tiger presence has been found so far. The DFO has reassured the public that all necessary precautions are in place. "Our teams are patrolling high-risk areas and closely tracking any tiger movements. We urge residents to remain calm and vigilant," he said.

First-ever Boita Bandana at Gopalpur on Nov 15

Hundreds to join

The Gopalpur beach will host its first-ever Boita Bandana Festival, a unique cultural celebration by the district administration on November 15. The event, which is set to be a major attraction for locals and tourists alike, will take place at the Haripur Muhana, a scenic location near Gopalpur. The festival will revive the centuries-old tradition of Boita Bandana, a ritual performed by Odia people to honour their maritime heritage. The tradition recalls the ancient seafaring voyages of Odia traders who sailed to distant lands like Java and Sumatra for trade, State Transport, Mining and Steel Minister Bibhuti Bhusan Jena stated at a Press meet here on

Friday. The highlight of the festival will be three beautifully decorated boats, which will be used for the ceremonial event. Devotees, dressed in traditional attire as sailors, will take part in the boat procession, recreating the maritime trade journeys of Odisha's ancient past. Early in the morning, rituals such as Mangala Puja and Danga Puja will be performed, followed by a series of cultural programmes. In the evening, there will be performances of traditional Odia folk dances and music, as well as a session on the history of Odisha's maritime trade. The event will also feature the release of a commemorative booklet celebrating Odisha's maritime legacy. The festival is expected to draw over 100 dignitaries and visitors, with free transportation arranged for local residents to reach the event.

Upholding UP Madrasa Act

SC underscores meaning of 'positive secularism'

CJI Chandrachud, an erudite interpreter of Constitutional values, drew sharp flak because of his public statement of having received divine enlightenment in deciding Ayodhya Babri Masjid imbroglio. On November 5, he managed to salvage his reputation by upholding the UP-Madrasa Act of 2004, which was struck down by a bench of Allahabad High Court as being unconstitutional and violative of the principle of secularism. The 2004 Act was introduced to frame regulations, directions, and rules to regulate education in about 13,364 madrasas having 12.34 lakh students, involving an annual budget of Rs 1,960 crore. The High Court observed that the Act promotes education segregated along religious lines, fails to ensure quality education as mandated under Article 21 A, and violates S22 of the UGC Act in terms of awarding higher education

degrees. A bench headed by CJI Chandrachud struck down the High Court order to close all Madrasas but upheld the High Court's contention regarding the violation of S22 of the UGC Act. The Supreme Court, in the process, underscored the meaning of 'positive secularism' and reiterated its oft-repeated concept of 'substantive equality'. In the process, the SC has visited a few important judgments in support thereof. In the Kerala

Education Bill 1957, CJI SR Das argued that the minority can not ask for aid or recognition without competent teachers, a fair standard of teaching, and teaching matters that subservise the welfare of the scholars. The State can enact regulatory measures to promote efficiency and excellence of education standards. The court also put three satisfactory tests for regulation viz reasonable and rational, conducive to effective education and excellence of education. In the SR Bommai case, the court had averred that secularism is a positive concept of equal treatment of all religions. By recognizing and regulating Madrasa education, the State legislature is taking positive action to safeguard the educational rights of minorities. CJI Chandrachud argued that positive secularism allows the State to treat some persons differently to treat all persons equally. The positive concept of

secularism requires the State to take active steps to treat minority interests on par with secular institutions while allowing them to retain their minority character. In the Josephine Case, the court had argued that formal equality is contrary to the Constitution's vision of a just social order. Substantive equality is aimed at producing equality of outcomes through different modes of affirmative action or State support. In the opinion of the court, equal opportunity for capability development secures the interests of minorities regulating the standard of education imparted by recognized Madrasas, conducting examinations, and conferring certificates to students to pursue higher education. The activities of the UP-Madrasa Education Board are consistent with the obligation of the students that students studying in the recognized Madrasa attain a minimum level of competency,

effectively participate in society, and earn a decent living. Such supervision and regulation of Madrasas further substantive equality and do not fall foul of Article 14 as contended by the Allahabad High Court. On the question of alleged violation of Article 21A, the Supreme Court ruled that 21A can not abrogate the right of minorities to establish and administer schools of their choice. RTE Act 2009 may destroy the minority character of the school. Art 30 (1) provides rights to establish and administer educational interests of their choice to religious and linguistic minorities. The Supreme Court agreed with the contention of the appellants that the State can regulate Madrasa education in terms of Article 246, read with Entry 25 of the Concurrent List of the Seventh Schedule of the Constitution. Alluding to the distinction between religious

instruction and religious education, the court observed that while Madrasas impart religious instruction, their primary aim is education. The court observed that the UGC must coordinate and determine the standard of education and research activities in line with Entry 66 of the Central List in Schedule 7. State legislation that seeks to regulate higher education will be in conflict with the UGC Act. In Prof Yashpal Vs State of Chattisgarh case, the State legislation was struck down. The Supreme Court has struck down degrees being awarded to Fazil and Kamil by the State Madrasa Board. In conclusion, CJI Chandrachud has observed that the 2004 Act is consistent with the positive obligation of the State to ensure that students studying in recognized Madrasas attain a level of competence that will allow them to effectively participate in society and earn a living. Article 21A would

have to be read consistently with the rights of linguistic and religious minorities to establish and administer educational institutions under Article 30(1). By embracing a more positive approach to secularism and by invoking substantive equality, the Supreme Court has nullified the draconian fallout of the High Court judgment. In a country like ours, imparting secular values to the upcoming generation is of paramount value. CJI Chandrachud on the last Constitution Day quoted Dr Martin Luther King Junior's famous words "The arc of moral universe is long, but it bends towards justice." He has in a sense bent the moral arc for the minorities, who are at the receiving end of a ruthless government like Yogi's in UP towards substantive justice. (Dr Misra is a Professor Emeritus)

Shah likens Jharkhand Govt to 'burnt transformer'

Taking a jibe at the JMM-led coalition in Jharkhand, Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Saturday equated it with a "burnt transformer" that "failed" to relay the power of prosperity sent through the "high tension line" of Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led Centre.

He also appealed to the people to vote for the BJP for peaceful Ram Navami celebrations, promising that he would participate in such festival in Hazaribag if the BJP government was voted to power. "Narendra Modi's government is like an HT (high tension) power line. An HT line cannot supply electricity directly to your homes; a transformer is needed. The Hemant Soren government (Jharkhand CM) is like a burnt transformer. The Centre sends lakhs of



crores of rupees through its HT line for development, but it is not transmitted to you. The time has come to change this burnt transformer," Shah claimed addressing a poll rally in Hazaribag. Shah alleged that the JMM-led regime was involved in multiple scams, including Rs 1,000 crore in MGNREGA, Rs 600 crore in land deals, Rs 1,000 crore in mining, and liquor. He further accused the state

JMM-Congress coalition of "devouring" the free ration sent by PM Modi. "The JMM-led alliance in Jharkhand allowed Maoists to prosper, but PM Modi uprooted them in 10 years," he claimed. Hitting out at the Congress, Shah alleged, "The Congress made Kashmir the hub of terrorism. Its leaders feared going to Lal Chowk, but now I ask them to fearlessly visit Lal Chowk with their grandchildren."

Water quality of Ganga in UP deteriorating due to discharge of sewage, observes NGT

The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has observed that the water quality in the Ganga in Uttar Pradesh is deteriorating because of the discharge of sewage or sullage into the river.

Earlier, while considering the prevention and control of pollution in the Ganga, the green body sought compliance reports from various states, including Uttar Pradesh.

In an order dated November six, a bench of NGT Chairperson Justice Prakash Shrivastava said according to the report from Uttar Pradesh, there was a gap of 128 million litres per day (MLD) in sewage treatment in Prayagraj district. Also, 25 untapped drains discharged untreated sewage into the Ganga in the district and 15 untapped drains discharged the sullage into the Yamuna, the bench, also comprising judicial member Justice Sudhir Agarwal and



expert member A Senthil Vel, said. "We find that out of the 326 drains disclosed in the report of the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) dated October 22, 247 drains are untapped (in the state) and discharging 3,513.16 MLD of waste water into the river Ganga and its tributaries," the tribunal said. Expressing dissatisfaction, it directed the state's chief secretary to file an affidavit disclosing the information regarding each drain across different districts, the sewage generated from those, the sewage treatment plants (STP) to which those were proposed to be connected and

the timeline for making the STPs functional. "The affidavit will also disclose the short-term measures that will be adopted to prevent the discharge of untreated sewage in the river in respect of each of the districts and drain till STPs are made fully functional and 100 per cent household connectivity is achieved," the bench said. It also took note of the CPCB report disclosing the status of 41 STPs across 16 Ganga-front towns, which said six plants are non-operational and of the 35 operational STPs, only one complied with the rules.

Demonising Constitutional institutions pastime for some, cautions VP Dhankhar

Demonising constitutional institutions and sermonising people is fast becoming a "pastime", Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar said on Saturday and cautioned that such actions are a recipe for chaos.

He also said even those who "constitutionally matter in the political arena" are "sermonising all and demonising our constitutional institutions".

Addressing an event of an educational institution here, the vice president said it is time to "bid adieu to this". "Also, I say with utmost restraint -- time for our elites to be elites. To them, I appeal -- to be a worthy elite, you have to be spurred by the fervour of nationalism," he said, without naming anyone. Dhankhar also spoke on the crucial role of the alumni in strengthening the educational ecosystem, urging for active participation and



contributions to alumni associations. "The alumni of an institution are in several ways its lifeline.... I strongly urge to have an alumni fund. Making annual contributions is all important. Some of the best institutions globally have been on an upward trajectory because these institutions are fuelled by alumni energy," he said. The vice president said associations of trade, industry, business, and commerce must also come forward to fuel research and spur innovation through liberal financial contributions.

BJP claims Congress' Maharashtra unit has assured Muslim body of 10 per cent reservation, other demands

The BJP on Saturday here claimed that the Maharashtra unit of Congress has assured a Muslim body that it will take steps to fulfil its demands including a 10 per cent quota for the minority community in jobs and education and a ban on the RSS if Maha Vikas Aghadi is voted to power in the state assembly polls.

Addressing a press conference at the BJP headquarters, senior party

leader Ravi Shankar Prasad said that the All India Ulama Board (AIUB) has written to Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) offering its conditional support in the assembly elections. "In its letter, the organisation has said that if Nana Patole (Congress), Uddhav Thackeray (Shiv Sena-UBT), Sharad Pawar (NCP-SP) and other parties want their support they will have to fulfil their demands which include opposition to Waqf Bill, 10 per cent reservation to Muslims in jobs and education..." he

claimed. It has also demanded a ban on the RSS if the MVA is voted to power in Maharashtra, Prasad claimed, terming the organisation's demands as "divisive and a charter for the disintegration of the country".

What is "painful" here is that the Maharashtra Pradesh Congress Committee in its reply to the organisation has assured that it will "definitely" take steps to fulfil their demands if voted to power in Maharashtra, the BJP leader



claimed. "We vehemently oppose such disruptive demands. We will never let them be implemented," he said,

adding that the BJP will also "expose the so-called INDIA coalition" before the people and show that they can go to any extent for votes.

Prasad said that Muslims cannot be given a 10 per cent quota on the basis of religion as it is not permissible under the Constitution.

If a 10 per cent quota is given to Muslims on other grounds it will slash the existing share in reservations meant for the OBCs, SCs and STs, he said and asked Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and Rahul Gandhi if it is acceptable to them. "What has happened to you, Uddhav Thackeray? You forgot your own legacy. Balasaheb Thackeray had struggled so much against these things... You are his son." "We vehemently condemned

it. It's very painful because we were once together," the BJP leader said as he accused Uddhav Thackeray of deviating from his party's original ideology. Prasad also took on Sharad Pawar, asking why he has kept silent on the issue. "You are a seasoned player. I know you understand the Constitution. You are 80 plus and you command a lot of respect there. Did you make them understand that it's not possible (to fulfil AIUB's demands)... How far will you go for votes," he said.

Congress poses questions to PM Modi on his vision for Marathwada region

Congress on Saturday posed questions to Prime Minister Narendra Modi on his vision for the Marathwada region including his solution for water scarcity and inadequate rail infrastructure.

"The non-biological PM is in Nanded and Akola. Four questions for him - Where does the BJP stand on the issue of a caste census and raising the cap of 50% once 50 percent cap reservations for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, and OBCs imposed by the Supreme Court?" Congress General Secretary Jairam Ramesh said in a statement.

He claimed the Congress government in neighbouring Telangana is starting its door-to-door caste survey on Saturday and will cover 1.17 crore households. "Meanwhile, the non-biological PM will be in Vidarbha - which has played such a central role in the struggle for social justice in the country - and will likely be entirely silent on the pressing issue of a caste census and the raising of the cap of 50% on reservations for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, and OBCs.

Why is the non-biological PM so silent? What is he afraid of?" he asked. Congress leader also asked whether the PM will deliver on his promise to put the BJP's Rajya Sabha MP Ashok



Chavan in jail. Ramesh said while campaigning in Nanded on March 30, 2014, Modi had announced he would send Ashok Chavan to jail "within six months" if he became PM.

Ten years later, Ashok Chavan has joined the BJP and been rewarded with a Rajya Sabha seat.

His daughter is now a BJP contestant from the Bhokar assembly seat, he noted. "Will this prove to be a promise delayed but not denied - or has the BJP Washing Machine cleared Mr. Chavan of any alleged wrongdoing?" Ramesh asked. The Congress leader also asked why has the Indian Railways performed so poorly in the Nanded division.

The Congress leader said the railway infrastructure in the Nanded division, which serves many areas in Marathwada, has been subjected to blatant neglect by the Modi government. According to data furnished by the South Central

Railway (SCR) in 2021, Nanded only has 35 km of route electrification and only 83 km of track-doubling.

This puts it at the bottom in terms of electrification and only marginally ahead of the bottom in track-doubling compared to other SCR divisions, Ramesh said. Additionally, it is the only division in its zone that still has 130 km of colonial-era meter-gauge tracks, he claimed.

In 2019, he said, the then Maharashtra Chief Minister Fadnavis promised a 20,000 to 25,000 crore package to build a water grid from Marathwada that would supply piped drinking water to every village. Summer this year marked five years of this promise -- and it was one of the most water-scarce years that Marathwada has faced, the former Union minister said. He claimed that more than 600 villages and 178 hamlets in Marathwada were dependent on water tankers.

SC agrees to hear plea seeking to restrain felling of trees in Delhi without its nod

The Supreme Court has agreed to hear a plea seeking to restrain the Delhi government from allowing felling of trees in the national capital without the apex court's permission.

The application, which stated that five trees are felled in Delhi every hour, also sought to restrain the Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change from permitting diversion of forests in Delhi without the top court's nod.

The matter came up for hearing before a bench of Justices A S Oka and A G Masih on Friday. The court asked the Delhi government and others to respond to the

application by November 22. The application has also sought the constitution of an expert committee, headed by a retired judge of the SC or the Delhi High Court, to assess the tree protection regimen in the national capital. A report containing its recommendation for the protection and preservation of existing trees and forests in Delhi should be submitted by the committee before the apex court, it said. The application referred to a February 2023 order of the Delhi High Court and said it was recorded that five trees were felled every hour in the national capital, based on the data provided by the Forest Department of Delhi. It sought to restrain the Delhi



government from allowing felling of trees in the national capital without the apex court's permission. The preamble of the Delhi Preservation of Trees Act (DPTA), 1994 clearly states that it is "an Act to provide for the preservation of trees in the National Capital Territory of Delhi", it said. "There are procedural safeguards provided within

the DPTA which are clearly visible in the flow of the Act wherein protection and preservation of trees precede the regulatory mechanism for felling of trees. These procedural safeguards have been grossly violated," it added.

Referring to Section 7 of the DPTA, it said it is clearly enshrined in the Act that it shall be the responsibility of the tree authority to "preserve all trees within its jurisdiction" and also undertake critical study of the proposals of various government departments for construction of buildings, roads and factories with regard to the protection of the existing trees and planting more.

"A comprehensive study of all the meetings of the tree authority revealed that the tree authority has met a total of only eight times since its inception in 1995 till March 2021. Whereas, the tree authority had an obligation to meet once every three months," the application said. It said the importance of preserving fully grown trees, including generational trees or heritage trees, cannot be undermined and it was the need of the hour. The law laid down by the apex court has great significance for Delhi as the National Forest Policy mandates that one-third of the total land area of the country should be under forest or tree cover, it said.

BRGavai nominated as executive chairman of NALSA

Supreme Court judge B R Gavai has been nominated as the executive chairman of the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA), which is mandated to provide free legal services to the weaker sections of society.

A notification issued by the Department of Justice on Friday said Justice Gavai's nomination as the executive chairman of NALSA will be effective from November 11. While the chief justice of India is the patron-in-chief of NALSA, the seniormost judge after the CJI is its executive chair.



As of now, CJI D Y Chandrachud is its patron-in-chief and Justice Sanjiv Khanna is the executive chairperson. Justice Chandrachud demits office as the CJI on Sunday and Justice Khanna will assume office on Monday. Justice Gavai will be the seniormost judge after the CJI from Monday.

Indian Navy set to demonstrate its maritime capabilities in Odisha on Navy day

President Droupadi Murmu has consented to be the chief guest for the event, a Navy spokesperson said in a statement.

This event showcases the Navy's multifaceted competencies, enhances maritime awareness among citizens and honours India's

rich seafaring heritage. The 2024 'Operational Demonstration' or 'Op Demo' is set to be held against the backdrop of the pristine Blue Flag Beach that symbolises the connection between the Indian Navy and the maritime legacy of the state of Odisha, the statement said.

Puri received the Blue Flag Beach certification a few years ago. The Blue Flag designation signifies an eco-tourism model aimed at providing beachgoers with clean and hygienic bathing facilities, a safe environment, and sustainable development practices. The Indian Navy said it is

working closely with the Odisha government and local authorities to ensure the smooth execution of the event. Seating arrangements would be made to accommodate local spectators and tourists, offering everyone a chance to witness the live demonstration from the beach.

The event will also be broadcast live on national television and streamed via the Indian Navy's YouTube channel to reach a wider audience, it added. In 2022, President Murmu witnessed the operational demonstration by the Indian Navy at Visakhapatnam on December 4.

LJP (Ram Vilas) to counter RJD's 'MY' combine in Bihar with own support base: Chirag

Tarari (Bihar), Nov 9 (PTI)

Union minister Chirag Paswan on Saturday claimed that his Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas) would counter the RJD's formidable 'MY' (Muslims and Yadavs) combine in Bihar with its own support base of women and the youth.

The NDA partner was talking to reporters in Tarari assembly constituency, on the sidelines of a rally he addressed for BJP candidate Vishal Prashant along with Chief Minister and JD(U) president Nitish Kumar,

among others. "I am glad at the candidature of Vishal Prashant who is young. My party had contested and won five seats in Lok Sabha polls. Four of our candidates were young", said Paswan, who himself clinched Hajipur, the pocket borough of his late father Ram Vilas Paswan. The 42-year leader, who did not mention the RJD by name, said "There are some who speak of an MY combination which is just mobilisation along the lines of cast and religion. My party, too, has its own MY

combination which stands for mahila and yuva. Our stance towards women is obvious with two of our MPs being females".

Paswan, who is known to have excellent personal relations with the family of RJD supreme Lalu Prasad, extended birthday greetings to the latter's son and heir apparent Tejashwi Yadav, calling himself a "big brother" of the young leader. When asked whether he would like to give any political advice to Yadav, the third-term MP broke into a sheepish grin and remarked



"Given his family background, he has no dearth of good advisors".

Paswan, however, deplored a statement by RJD's Buxar MP Sudhakar Singh who

recently threatened to "beat up with sticks" BJP workers in Ramgarh assembly constituency where assembly by-poll has been necessitated by his election to Lok Sabha and his party has fielded his younger brother Ajit. Paswan said, "This is the type of language and behaviour that is always associated with RJD, a reason why the party is blamed for jungle raj in Bihar while it was in power. I was a teenager back then and still remember how much the bad reputation of the state used to rile its self-

respecting people". Responding to another query, the Union minister said "Hindus are being targeted, in countries where they are a minority, by extremists from other faiths. Canada is an example. But, it is disgusting that when Narendra Modi government brought the CAA for persecuted Hindus, the opposition criticized it". "Fear-mongering has become the defining trait of INDIA bloc. They claimed CAA would deprive a section of population of citizenship though there was

no such provision in the Act. They also said Modi, in his third term, will do away with quotas and scrap the Constitution. That too has been proven false", Paswan said. Asked about Independent MP Rajesh Ranjan alias Pappu Yadav's claims of getting threatening calls from people posing as aides of jailed gangster Lawrence Bishnoi, the Union minister "if he is making such complaints, these must be investigated and he must be provided with adequate security".

Safety must get highest priority while constructing roads: Gadkari

Union minister Nitin Gadkari has drawn attention to the rising number of road accidents and consequent deaths, and stressed on giving safety the highest priority while constructing pathways in the country. Addressing the 83rd annual session of the Indian Roads Congress at Pt Deendayal Upadhyay Auditorium here on Friday, he said if anyone dies in an accident due to road engineering fault in the future, then he will hold himself guilty for it. Highlighting the Centre's

efforts to prevent road accidents, he urged government engineers to quit their jobs and start a good DPR (detailed project report) making company, assuring them to give work on a priority basis. The Minister of Road Transport and Highways emphasized on production of bitumen and CNG from stubble in agriculture-dominated Chhattisgarh, arguing the move will cut dependence on fossil fuels and check pollution. He announced a slew of road projects for Chhattisgarh and said he believes the state will have a road network

similar to that of America in the next two years. "Every year 1.50 lakh deaths due to road accidents are reported which has now increased to 1.68 lakh. Efforts are on to improve the shortcomings in road engineering and automobile engineering but defective DPR has created a major problem," the minister maintained. He advised government engineers to quit their jobs and start a good DPR-making company. "We have been making serious efforts to prevent road accidents. Nearly 60 per cent victims of road



accidents are aged between 18 and 34 years. I would like to urge you to build roads where no accidents take place (due to defective engineering works)," he said.

Improvement in road engineering will curb accidents and save lives, Gadkari asserted. "We have made rules in automobile engineering. If anyone dies in an accident due to road engineering in the future, then I will feel that I am guilty for it," he told participants at the event. Pointing at the gathering of officials and engineers, the minister said no tenders should be issued without carefully examining DPR for projects. Road safety should be given the highest priority to prevent accident deaths, he added.

Gadkari emphasized the significance of waste-to-energy technologies and urged Chhattisgarh to work on producing CNG and bitumen using paddy straw. The Central Road Research Institute (CRRI) and the Indian Institute of Petroleum, Dehradun, have developed bio-bitumen from paddy straw and it is being used in Meghalaya, he told the gathering. "It (paddy straw) can be used up to 35 per cent in bitumen. The country's requirement of bitumen is 90 lakh metric tonnes and capacity of refinery is 40-50 lakh metric tonnes. We are importing 50

lakh metric tonnes," Gadkari said. If Chhattisgarh starts producing bitumen from stubble, it will be a waste-to-wealth move, he said. Similarly, 400 projects for producing bio-CNG and bio-LNG from paddy straw have started in Punjab and Haryana. If Chhattisgarh will do the same, no petrol and diesel will be required in the state, the Union minister opined. Gadkari underlined the need to develop robust infrastructure to realise Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of "Aatmanirbhar Bharat" (self-reliant India).

Indian Army flags off motorcycle expedition in Arunachal Pradesh

A motorcycle expedition organised by the Indian Army was flagged off from Mipi in Arunachal Pradesh's Dibang Valley, an official said on Saturday. The expedition was organised to honour the soldiers who fought for the nation during the 1962 Sino-India conflict and commemorate the Battle of Walong, defence spokesperson Lt Col Mahendra Rawat said. Dao Division's General Officer Commanding Major General VS Deshpande flagged off the expedition on Friday in the presence of Anini MLA Mopi Mihi and state government officers. The expedition team, comprising 10 personnel of the Army's Spear Corps and 10 civilians, have scheduled halts at Roing in the Lower Dibang Valley district and Hayuliang in the Anjaw district. Lt Col Rawat said the motorcyclists will ride through the Mishmi ranges and cross the pristine Dibang and Lohit valleys. The ride will end at the historic Walong War Memorial in Anjaw district on November 11, he said. The fierce Battle of Walong unfolded in the unforgiving terrain of Kibithu, Namti Tri Junction (famously known as



Tiger's Mouth), Walong and adjoining features in the easternmost parts of Arunachal Pradesh, according to the Army. "In October 1962, as Chinese forces advanced aggressively into Indian territory, the responsibility of defending the strategically crucial Walong sector fell upon the gallant 11th Infantry Brigade of the Indian Army's esteemed 2nd Infantry Division," the Army earlier said. This brigade, comprising the battle-hardened units of 6 Kumaon, 4 Sikh and 3/3 Gorkha Rifles, was tasked with holding their ground against an adversary that was not only numerically superior but also better equipped and entrenched in advantageous positions, it added. The valiant stand of the 11th Infantry Brigade delayed the Chinese advance, providing a

critical morale boost to the nation and demonstrating the unyielding courage of the Indian soldiers, the Army said. The route, tracing a historic path through the beautiful landscapes of Arunachal Pradesh, symbolises the Indian Army's commitment to fostering unity and promoting adventure tourism in border areas, Lt Col Rawat said. Each halt will be an opportunity for the riders to connect with the local communities, highlighting the strength, resilience and solidarity that define the spirit of the region, and promote national integration, he said. The motorcycle expedition is a part of the month-long celebrations that started on October 17 to mark the 62nd anniversary of the Battle of Walong fought during the 1962 Sino-Indian War.

India has effective mechanism to monitor oceans: Navy Chief

India has a highly effective mechanism for monitoring the oceans, known as maritime domain awareness, and is fully aware of "who is where and who is doing what" to ensure the country's interests are not compromised, Chief of Naval Staff, Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi has said. The Navy Chief also dismissed the dual carrier operation by China in the South China Sea as "nothing we should be concerned of". Addressing the media after the grand finale of THINQ 2024, a nationwide quiz competition organised by the Indian Navy on Friday evening, Tripathi also said India keeps a "close watch" on activities in its "area of interest". He made these remarks at the Ezhimala Naval Academy here in response to a question on China's growing influence in the region through its cooperation with Sri Lanka. "What China does in any part of the globe, let them do it. What they do in our area of interest, we are keeping a close watch. Nothing happens in our part of the world which we do not know," CNS added. He said the Navy is keeping a very close watch in our areas so that India's national interests are not



compromised in any way, anywhere. "When their units, whether military or non-military, operate in the Indian Ocean region, we do ensure that our national interests are not compromised. We have got a fantastic organisation to keep the oceans under watch, which is maritime domain awareness, and we know exactly who is where and who is doing what," the Navy Chief said. He said the dual carrier operation is nothing concerning India. "We have done these dual carrier operations for many years now," he added. Tripathi also said the Indian Navy is very proud of the two young women Naval officers who are now on a mission to circle the globe in a boat as part of the Navika Sagar Parikrama-2. "They are reaching their first port of call in Australia on Saturday. During the voyage, they will only touch four ports across the globe. It is a very challenging journey, as

they will have to face rough seas and weather. But they are well-equipped and well-trained. They already have training for 36,000 nautical miles," Tripathi said. Talking about the initiatives like THINQ quiz competition, he said that the Navy has several such initiatives to popularise the force among the countrymen, especially youths, and educate them on what the Navy does during peace and during 'not-so-peaceful times'. He said innovation is one of the top priorities for the Navy, and the Indian Navy always wanted to remain on top of the technology curve. "There is a process in which we recruit our officers and cadets. We assess the suitability. I am not worried about the quality (of resources) which we are getting," he added. He said the Navy also involved big public sector undertakings, medium, small, and micro establishments, and start-ups for technology sessions in an initiative to popularise the Navy's pursuit of technological mastery. For the THINQ 2024 editions, as many as 12,600 schools from 3,800 cities and towns in the country participated. Sixteen teams entered the semifinals, and eight teams contested in the grand finale held here.

Odisha DCM announces date for three-phase disbursement of Subhadra Yojana's first installment

Odisha Deputy Chief Minister Pravatī Parida on Saturday said that around 20 lakh more beneficiaries under the Subhadra Yojana are likely to receive their first instalment of Rs 5,000 by November end in the third phase of disbursement. The state government so far has disbursed Rs 5,000 each to about 60 lakh beneficiaries in two phases. Parida told reporters that about 20 lakh women beneficiaries during the third phase of disbursement are likely to get the money in their bank accounts on November 24 at a function to be held at Sundergarh. Union Ministers Dharmendra Pradhan and Jual Oram are scheduled to attend the function. The remaining eligible beneficiaries will get the money in the 4th phase of disbursement sometime in December, she said. The scheme was launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on September 17. The state government's flagship Subhadra Yojana is aimed at empowering women under which each beneficiary is entitled to get Rs 50,000 over a period of five years. The beneficiaries will receive



Rs 10,000 in two instalments in a year. While around 25 lakh women received the money in the first phase, the amount was credited to the bank accounts of 35 lakh beneficiaries in the second phase on October 9. Asked about the applications rejected so far, Parida said that every panchayat office has been asked to publish the rejection list. "We also have a list of those with problems in their bank details. They can be included in the subsequent phase," she said adding that applications of around 2.67 lakh women beneficiaries have reportedly been rejected for various reasons. Stating that about 1 crore women would be covered under the Subhadra Yojana, Parida said the government would expand its coverage, extending the benefits to Anganwadi workers, without a government employee in their family.

AP CM launches demo seaplane flight from Vijaywada to Srisaillam

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu on Saturday launched a seaplane demo flight from Prakasam Barrage in Vijayawada to Srisaillam in Nandyal district. Within an hour, he landed on water at Srisaillam project (reservoir) in Nandyal. After disembarking from the flight, the chief minister, who was also accompanied by Union Civil Aviation Minister K Ram Mohan Naidu, was received by the district officials. Later, the CM took a ropeway to reach the top of a hill at Srisaillam project and boarded

a bus to visit Sri Bhramaramba Mallikarjuna Swamy Varla Devasthanam (temple). Earlier, addressing a meeting during the launch of the demo flight at Punnami Ghat on the Krishna river in Vijayawada, the CM said, "This is a new experiment (seaplane demo flight). I am very happy. If anything new happens in the country, it should happen in Amaravati. We are going ahead with that motto." According to Naidu, seaplane services would be an innovative opportunity which will promote economic activities to create employment.

Air quality poor in large parts of Punjab, Haryana; Chandigarh very poor

The air quality in several parts of Punjab and Haryana was recorded in the 'poor' category on Saturday, while it was worst in the joint capital city of Chandigarh with an AQI of 322 which falls in the 'very poor' band. According to the Central Pollution Control Board's Sameer App, which provides hourly updates, Haryana's Bahadurgarh recorded an Air Quality Index of 314 -- also in the 'very poor' category -- at 9 am. Among other places in Haryana, the AQI at Sonapat was 290, Hisar (285), Bhiwani (277), Jind (275), Charkhi Dadri (258), Gurugram (259), Faridabad (220), Yamunanagar (213), Rohtak (238), Kurukshetra (202), Kaithal (205), Fatehabad (198), Ambala (160), Sirsa (181), and Karnal (144). In Punjab, the AQI was registered at 264 in Mandi Gobindgarh, 258 in Amritsar, 257 in Rupnagar, 248 in Jalandhar, 197 in



Ludhiana, 183 in Bathinda, 176 in Khanna, and 133 in Patiala. An AQI between zero and 50 is considered 'good', 51 and 100 'satisfactory', 101 and 200 'moderate', 201 and 300 'poor', 301 and 400 'very poor', 401 and 450 'severe', and above 450 'severe plus'. The rise in air pollution levels in the two states and Delhi during this time of year is often blamed on farm fires. Punjab reported 730 farm fire incidents on Friday, taking the total count to 6,029 in the state this season. As the window for the Rabi crop -- wheat -- is very short after paddy harvest, some farmers set their fields on fire to quickly clear off the crop residue for sowing of the next crop.

I-T raids Soren's aide ahead of Jharkhand polls

The Income Tax Department on Saturday conducted searches at multiple locations in poll-bound Jharkhand, including on the premises of a person linked to Chief Minister Hemant Soren, as part of a tax evasion probe, official sources said. A total of nine premises in the state's capital Ranchi and Jamshedpur are being raided in an operation that started early morning. A security team of the CRPF is assisting the I-T sleuths, the sources said. The locations linked to Sunil Shrivastava, an aide to the CM, are also being searched, they said. The action is linked to recent probes launched by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) over alleged illegal liquor trade and mining in the state, the sources said. The assembly elections are scheduled for November 13 and 20, and the counting of votes will take place on November 23.

IAS officer in dock for Mallu Hindu Officers WhatsApp Group

The controversial WhatsApp groups-Mallu Hindu Officers and Mallu Muslim Officers-- were created using the same phone, according to the Forensic Science Laboratory of the Kerala Police. Sources in FSL said that a serious scrutiny of the phone belonging to IAS officer K Gopalakrishnan has shown that the phone number was not at all hacked and the groups would not have been formed without the concurrence of the person who owns the phone. On 30th October two WhatsApp Groups were set up based on communal lines from the phone used by Gopalakrishnan, director of industries, government of Kerala. When some of the officers whose names figured in the WA Group Mallu Hindu Officers questioned the admin (none other than Gopalakrishnan) about the propriety of including their names in the Group, the IAS officer washed his hands off the controversy and said that his phone has been hacked. He also said that he had filed



a police complaint against the hacking of his phone. Both the Groups have been taken off the cyberspace following widespread condemnation of the same. Initial investigation by the Kerala Police with WhatsApp, Google and the Internet Service Provider proved that Gopalakrishnan's phone was not hacked. They also established the fact that the Mallu Muslim Officers' Group too was formed making use of the same phone and that too hours after the formation of the Hindu Officers Group. "It has been done to ward off any adverse comments arising out of the charge that a WA Group was formed to create a communal

divide among the officers," said a police official. The initial investigation found that no unauthorized applications have been installed in the handset. Dr M G Gireeshan, a cyber expert and hackathon specialist, had said that hacking was possible when strange and unfamiliar applications were installed by the phone users. If the findings of the FSL are true, Gopalakrishnan stands facing serious charges of attempting to divide the bureaucracy on communal lines destroying the secular fabric of the society. The officer remained incommunicado while his office staff said that he was travelling.

VHP demands liberation of Sabarimala shrine from Government control, wants Vavar mosque to go

In a major development akin to the agitation for the control of Kasi Viswanatha Temple and Lord Krishna Temple, Mathura, a demand has been made by the Kerala wing of Viswa Hindu Parishad (VHP) to "liberate" the holy shrine of Lord Ayyappa atop the Western Ghats from the shackles of government control and hand over the administration to the devotees. Viji Thampi, president, Kerala VHP, told the media after a daylong conclave of the "Save Sabarimala Action Committee" at Chengannoor

that political parties like the CPI(M) and Congress are working overtime to make Sabarimala Temple a milch cow to harvest the income received by the shrine to fill their party coffers. "It has been thrice proved through Deva Prasnam (astrological probe) that there never was a character by name Vavar in the history associated with Lord Ayyappa whose birth is recorded in Bhagavata Purana. Ayyappa was born out of the union between Lord Shiva and Mohini (the female form of Lord Vishnu) and there never was an Islamic character named Vavar in

this chronicle," said Thampi while addressing the media after the deliberations. The VHP as well as the Save Sabarimala Action Committee demanded that the ritual of worshipping at Vavar Mosque by Ayyappa devotees should be stopped forthwith. "There is no evidence of any connection between Vavar and Lord Ayyappa. The Ayyappa devotees paying obeisance at the Mosque during the pilgrimage to Sabarimala shrine is against tradition and customs. Vavar is part of created history by vested interests," said Thampi. Interestingly, this demand



has been made a week ahead of the annual 41-day festival (Mandala Pooja) in the holy shrine which commences on 16th November. This is the period when lakhs of devotees assemble at the shrine after observing a stringent 41-day observation of fasting, celibacy and prayers. The VHP also alleged that mainline political parties are trying to create a wedge among the followers of Sanatana Dharma. Those who attended the conclave and addressed the gathering include Kummanam Rajasekharan, former governor of Mizoram

and the representative of the Pandalam Royal Family, the traditional trustee of the shrine. Thampi exhorted the devotees making the pilgrimage to the shrine not to make any financial offerings at the temple as the entire income generated in the temple is diverted to non-spiritual purposes. "The Travancore Devaswam Board that administers the shrine is charging exorbitant rates for the prasadam which has not been blessed by Lord Ayyappa. The Board is cheating the believers," said Thampi. This is the first time Ayyappa

devotees, who throng the shrine from India and abroad cutting across caste, communities, religions and nations, coming out with a statement openly condemning the concept of Vavar and 'mismanagement' of the temple administration. A Constitution Bench of the Supreme Court is all set to hear a petition filed by believers challenging the earlier order of the apex court allowing women devotees between the age group of 12-55 from worshipping at the sanctum sanctorum of the temple situated in the dense forests of the high ranges.

27 killed, 62 hurt in suicide attack on railway station in Pakistan

At least 27 people, including 14 security forces, were killed and 62 others injured on Saturday in a suicide bombing at a railway station in Pakistan's restive Balochistan province, officials said. The explosion ripped through the railway station of the provincial capital Quetta as passengers gathered on the platform before the departure of the Jaffar Express, scheduled to depart for Peshawar at 9:00 am. There were around 100



people on the platform when the blast occurred. "So far, we have received 27 bodies and at least 62 people are injured, with some in critical condition," said Dr Wasim Baig of the Quetta Trauma Centre. Dr Arbab Kamran Kasi, Managing Director of the Trauma Centre, warned that the death toll may increase since several wounded individuals, aged 20 to 50, remain in critical condition. Quetta Division Commissioner Hamza Shafiq said it was a suicide attack targeting security forces and civilians were also hit badly. "There are around 14 members of the law enforcement agencies among the dead and dozens more among the wounded," he said. The suicide bomber had entered the station with luggage, Shafiq said, adding that was difficult to stop a per-

son coming with an intention to carry out a suicide attack. Earlier, SSP Operations Muhammad Baloch had also said that initial findings point to a possible suicide bombing. The Baloch Liberation Army (BLA), an ethnic Baloch separatist group designated as a terrorist organisation, has claimed responsibility for the attack. The BLA alleges that the federal government exploits Balochistan's resources while neglecting the province's development. However, the federal government dismisses these allegations and claims that foreign powers are manipulating disgruntled elements to perpetrate sabotage. "All bus stations, public spots have been put on high alert and gatherings discouraged," Shafiq said. Balochistan Inspector General of Police (IG) Moazzam Ansari said early investigations suggest the terrorists 'targeted per-

son from the Army Infantry School". Rescue and law enforcement teams responded immediately, securing the area and transporting the injured and deceased to Civil Hospital Quetta, according to the provincial government spokesperson Shahid Rind. An emergency was declared at the hospital where additional medical staff was summoned to deal with the injured. The blast, which also damaged the platform's roof, was heard far and wide in various areas of the city. BLA has stepped up attacks in the restive Balochistan province in recent months. Saturday's suicide bombing comes a week after a blast near a girl's school and a hospital in Balochistan's Mastung district killed eight people, including five children. The terror group has also been targeting Chinese nationals working in the province and in Karachi. Last month a suicide bombing near the Karachi airport killed two Chinese employees.

ic act targeting innocent civilians", and ordered an immediate investigation. He said that terrorists are increasingly aiming civilians, labourers, women, and children, and vowed that those responsible would be pursued relentlessly. Pakistan, particularly the Balochistan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa provinces, has seen a sharp uptick in terrorism-related incidents over the past year. According to the Centre for Research and Security Studies (CRSS), the third quarter of the ongoing year witnessed a 90 per cent surge in violence in Pakistan, the Geo News reported. With a total of 722 people being killed, including civilians, security personnel, and outlaws, while 615 others were wounded in as many as 328 incidents recorded during the period under review, 97% of these fatalities occurred in Balochistan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa provinces. Over 92% of these incidents of terror attacks and security forces' operations were recorded in the same provinces. The total fatalities from three quarters of this year have now surpassed the total fatalities recorded for the entire 2023; the number of fatalities rose to at least 1534 in the first three quarters compared to 1523 in 2023, the report said.

B'desh interim govt not to allow Awami League rally

Terminating Awami League as "fascist", Bangladesh's interim government on Saturday said it will not permit the deposed prime minister Sheikh Hasina's party to hold Sunday's planned rally. Chief Adviser Muhammad Yunus press secretary Shafiq Alam in a Facebook post said that the interim government won't tolerate any violence or any attempt to break the law and order situation in the country. "The Awami League in its current form is a fascist party. There is no way this fascist party will be allowed to hold protests in Bangladesh," he said. Alam further cautioned that "anyone who would try to hold rally, gathering and processions by taking orders from the mass murderer and dictator Sheikh Hasina will face full force of the law enforcing agencies". Alam's statement followed a call from the Awami League on its

verified Facebook page, urging supporters to gather at Shaheed Noor Hossain Chattar, or Zero Point, in Gulistan on Sunday to protest what they described as "misrule". "Our protest is against the deprivation of the rights of the people of the country; our protest is against the rise of fundamentalist forces; our protest is against the conspiracy to disrupt the lives of the common people," read the Facebook post. This was the first call for a rally by the Awami League since August 5, when Hasina fled to India amid a mass student-led uprising against her government. Awami League also urged party men to stage rallies at grassroots levels across the country on Sunday in line with "the spirit of the call" as described in the Facebook post. The protest venue, Shaheed Noor Hossain Chattar, holds historical significance, as it was where Awami League youth leader Noor Hossain was killed on November 10,

1987 during a demonstration against the autocratic rule of the then military dictator General HM Ershad. The interim government earlier banned Awami League's student front Bangladesh Chhatra League over allegations of its "fascist role" during and before the July-August Anti-Discrimination Students Movement. Initially launched as a campaign for job quota reforms, the student-led movement intensified into a mass protest that ultimately led to the fall of the Hasina government. While several political factions have called for the Awami League to be banned, Yunus said such a decision is up to political parties. Some ministers of the interim government also oppose the ban, emphasising political inclusivity. Awami League's main rival Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) led by former prime minister Khaleda Zia also opposed banning any political party.

Justice Dept brings criminal charges in Iranian plot to kill Donald Trump

AP ■ WASHINGTON

The Justice Department on Friday disclosed an Iranian murder-for-hire plot to kill Donald Trump, charging a man who said he had been tasked by a government official before this week's election with planning the assassination of the Republican president-elect. Investigators were told of the plan to kill Trump by Farhad Shakeri, an accused Iranian government asset who spent time in American prisons for robbery and who authorities say maintains a network of criminal associates enlisted by Tehran for surveillance and murder-for-hire plots. Shakeri told the FBI that a contact in Iran's paramilitary Revolutionary Guard instructed him this past September to set aside other work he was doing and assemble a plan within seven days to surveil and ultimately kill Trump, according to a criminal complaint unsealed in federal

court in Manhattan. The official was quoted by Shakeri as saying, "We have already spent a lot of money" and that "money's not an issue." Shakeri told investigators the official told him that if he could not put together a plan within the seven-day timeframe, then the plot would be paused until after the election because the official assumed Trump would lose and that it would be easier to kill him then, the complaint said. Shakeri is at large and remains in Iran. Two other men were arrested on charges that Shakeri recruited them to follow and kill prominent Iranian-American journalist Masih Alinejad, who has endured multiple Iranian murder-for-hire plots filed by law enforcement. "I'm very shocked," said Alinejad, speaking by telephone to The Associated Press from Berlin, where she was about to attend a ceremony to mark the arrival of the tearing down of the wall. "This is the third attempt

against me and that's shocking." In a post on the social media platform X, she said, "I came to America to practice my First Amendment right to freedom of speech — I don't want to die. I want to fight against tyranny, and I deserve to be safe. Thank you to law enforcement for protecting me, but I urge the US government to protect the national security of America." Lawyers for the two other defendants, identified as Jonathan Loadholt and Carlisle Rivera, did not immediately return messages seeking comment. Iran's UN Mission declined to comment. Shakeri, an Afghan national who immigrated to the US as a child but was later deported after spending 14 years in prison for robbery, also told investigators that he was tasked by his Revolutionary Guard contact with plotting the killings of two Jewish Americans living in New York and Israeli tourists in Sri Lanka.

India batter Sanju Samson reflected on his early struggles in international cricket, saying that a string of failures made him doubt his ability, but self-belief and support of the captain and coach helped him stage a strong comeback. Samson hit back-to-back centuries in T20 Internationals with a breathtaking 50-ball-107 to headline India's comfortable 61-run win over South Africa in the opening game here on Friday. "I have faced a lot of failures in my career. I think when you go through that failure, you have lot of doubts in your mind. People definitely say that social media definitely plays a role," Samson told reporters in the post-match press conference. "But you also think a lot about yourself. Sanju, are you not made for international level? I think you are doing well in IPL. Why are you not doing well internationally? So I have a lot of such thoughts. But after so many years of experience, I know what my ability is. "If I spend some time in the wicket, then I have a shot-making ability in spin and pace and I know that I can

definitely contribute well to the team. I can win the match. This is also a reality. There are definitely a lot of downs happening but the upside is also really good. So I kept telling myself that." Samson, who turns 30 on Monday, has often been criticised for not fulfilling his potential despite abundant talent. He had scored successive ducks in Sri Lanka but responded with a 111 against Bangladesh in the third T20I and followed it up with another ton on Friday. The Kerala batter acknowledged the crucial support he received from Captain Suryakumar Yadav and Coach Gautam Gambhir during his low phase. "When you have a supporting captain like Suryakumar Yadav and Gautam bhai and VVS Laxman sir, they all support you during failures. The way they communicate with you in your failures is very important. Everyone knows that if we are going through a negative phase, then the player can get lost there," he said. "So at that time, I received a lot of phone calls from Gautam bhai and Surya, telling me what to work on. Your spin is a little bit like that. You collect all the



spinners in Kerala and practice in rough wickets there. You do this, you do that. "So if your Indian team's captain is calling you and telling you how to practice after a duck, then

you have confidence that the captain is trusting you. He wants you to do well. So I think all those small, small things plays a huge role, I think, coming back here," Samson said.

"I'm very grateful about the trust shown on me. I think I've been able to give it back to my team management. I feel that it's just a start. I would like to just practice hard, train hard, just be very

grateful walking out to play for my country and just look to contribute and win games for my country every time I walk in." His innings included as many as 10 monstrous sixes which

propelled India to 202 for 8 in 20 overs. "When you score 100 for your country, it's definitely a very special feeling. The wicket was a little more bounced, a little spongy in the beginning. It's

been raining here for 3-4 days, so I think it was a bit more challenging condition," Samson said. "So according to that, we are talking to the team and we are preparing accordingly. Even when it rained for 3-4 days, our team came here and practiced. We did batting for 2-3 hours, so it was a little beneficial." "We're the World Champions and we need to play like that," Samson said they are focused on playing an aggressive brand of cricket, regardless of conditions, to live up to their reputation as world champions. "What we have been talking in the dressing room from so many seasons right after winning the World Cup or even from last 2-3 years is even if you lose the toss and even the conditions are tough, we have to go all in." "We can't think that we will have to look for something like 160-170 in these wickets because I think chasing becomes a bit easier. We were just looking to attack even knowing that the condition is slightly helping the bowlers," he said. "We are definitely the world champions at the moment. So I think we have to play like that and just keep on looking to dominate in this format," he said.



Stewart Cink maintains lead in PGA Tour Champions finale, with 67-year-old Langer 2nd after a 64

Stewart Cink shot a 5-under 66 to maintain a three-stroke lead in the PGA Tour Champions' season-ending Charles Schwab Cup Championship. Bernhard Langer, the 67-year-old German star who has a Champions-record 46 career victories, was second after a 64 on Friday. He shot his age or better for the 21st time on the tour. "Every once in a while I look back at my career and have to almost pinch myself and say, 'Man, that's pretty amazing what you've done the last whatever so many years,'" Langer said. "Like a day today, to shoot 64 - 3 under my age - not a whole lot of people can do that." The 51-year-old Cink had a 12-under 130 total at

Phoenix Country Club, shooting a 64 of his own in the first round. The Ally Challenge winner in August in Michigan for his first senior title, Cink entered the week 12th in the season standings. "It was actually probably a cleaner round than yesterday as far as just my processes and the quality of the shots was probably a little bit better overall," Cink said. "I just didn't have the hot long putts going in today quite as much, but it was a really solid round. I would love to play golf like that every day." Langer birdied five of the first seven holes and closed strong with birdies on 17 and 18. He's trying to win at least one event for the 18th consecutive year. "It's fun to make some putts,

that's what the game is all about," Langer said. "If you want to score low, you've got to make some putts." Alex Cejka was third at 7 under after a 66. Defending champion Steven Alker, second behind Ernie Els in the season standings, was tied for fourth at 4 under after a 68 - putting himself in position to pass Els for the \$1 million bonus. Vijay Singh (65), Miguel Angel Jimenez (68), Jerry Kelly (70) and Cameron Percy (68) also were 4 under. Stephen Ames, third in the standings, was 2 under after a 72. The top 36 players on the points list qualified for the event, with Steve Stricker the lone qualifier not in the field.

Czech legend Zelezny comes on board as Neeraj's coach ahead of 2025 season

Star Indian javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra on Saturday roped in three-time Olympic champion and world record holder Jan Zelezny as his coach, setting the ball rolling for the upcoming season, where he will defend his World title. The star Indian athlete said he was a great admirer of Zelezny, 58, is widely considered the greatest javelin thrower of the modern era. The Czech won three Olympic gold medals (1992, 1996, 2000) and as many world titles (1993, 1995, 2001) in his illustrious career. Zelezny holds the world record of 98.48m in the event.

Chopra till recently worked with German biomechanics expert Klaus Bartonietz, who also doubled up as his coach. Neeraj, after becoming the first Indian athlete to win a gold at the Tokyo Olympics, finished second best at the 2024 Paris Games. The star Indian athlete said he was a great admirer of Zelezny in his formative days and watched the Czech legend's videos to hone his skills. "Growing up, I admired Jan's technique and precision and spent a lot of time watching videos of him. He was the best in the sport for so many years, and I believe that working



with him will be invaluable because our throwing styles are similar, and his knowledge is unmatched," Neeraj said. "It's an honour to have Jan by my side as I push towards the next level in my career, and I can't wait to get started," he added. Neeraj, who has not crossed

the 90m mark in competition so far, would be eager to break the 'barrier' and Zelezny's experience could come in handy. The collaboration also symbolises a fusion of generations, with the young champion drawing inspiration and expertise from what many consider the greatest javelin thrower of all time. Zelezny expressed his happiness, saying he was always looking forward to train the Indian star as he still has a lot of potential. "I have already spoken about Neeraj as a great talent many years ago. When I saw him

early in his career, I realised great possibilities for top results," Zelezny said in a statement. "I also said that if I should start to coach somebody from outside Czechia (Republic), my first choice would be Neeraj. I like his story and I see big potential, as he is young and able to improve. There have been many athletes contacting me for coaching, so for me to take this up means that it is a great honour to have him in my team. We are getting to know each other more closely and will start in person at a traditional winter camp in South Africa.

Busquets, once ruled out, now may play alongside Messi for Inter Miami against Atlanta United

Inter Miami practiced thinking there was no way Sergio Busquets was going to play in its win-or-else playoff match against Atlanta United. A few hours later, the team got quite the surprise on Friday. Busquets - who coach Gerardo "Tata" Martino said was ruled out for Saturday's game - received medical clearance on Friday afternoon to play and is being listed as questionable. Busquets went through a training session on his own after the rest of the team worked out Friday, meaning Lionel Messi could have one of his most trusted teammates alongside him with the season on the line. "We're confident in the progression of his recovery,



and are hopeful he'll be available for (Saturday's) match," the team said. Busquets was struck somewhere around his midsection in Game 1 of the best-of-three series and developed pneumonia-like symptoms. He didn't play in Game 2 last week - a 2-1 Atlanta win - and Inter Miami

has to win Saturday just to extend its season and reach the second round of the MLS Cup playoffs. "At best, there are four finals left," Martino said on Friday morning, in the same interview session during which he revealed that Busquets wouldn't play - because that's what he truly thought at the

time. "Each of the remaining games has the characteristics of a final game and we, with the expectations we have, are ready to face it in the best way." Inter Miami hopes to have four games left this season - Saturday's conclusion to Round 1, and then a conference semifinal, conference final and the MLS Cup final. If Inter Miami keeps winning, all four of those matches would be at home. If it loses a match, the season ends there for the team that won the Supporters' Shield and posted the best regular-season record in MLS history. Atlanta has already won four elimination games this season - their two must-win matches to keep hope alive at the end of the regular season against the New York Red Bulls and

Orlando City, then a wild-card match at Montreal and Game 2 of this series against Inter Miami. The difference is that this one is an elimination match for Messi as well. And when asked this week about how Messi's numbers haven't been great in this series - no goals and one assist in the two matches - Atlanta interim coach Rob Valentino wanted no part of that storyline. "Messi is fantastic," Valentino said. "There is no slander on my end. He's a fantastic player. Whether people say he's produced, not produced, I don't want to hear it because he's fantastic." Atlanta is the only MLS team to beat Inter Miami twice this season, and both wins came with Messi in the lineup; the

club is 2-1-1 so far this season against the No. 1 overall seed. The rest of MLS, combined, went 0-12-5 against Inter Miami when Messi was in the lineup. But Atlanta's plan

order could prompt India to rethink their options moving forward. While the team management is unlikely to make changes to the playing XI, it will be disappointed with Sharma's continued failure, especially as India look for second-line opening option after Yashasvi Jaiswal following Rohit Sharma's retirement from the format. Tilak Varma showed promise with a quick-fire 33 off just 18 balls in the first match but will need to convert such cameos into bigger knocks. Varma has been largely off the radar since his last appearance against Afghanistan in January, and with competition for spots in the middle order heating up, the young batter will want to cement his place in the side. Skipper Suryakumar Yadav also got a start but fell cheaply, while all-rounder Hardik Pandya was unable to live up to his potential in the opening match. India's middle-order, which looked solid on paper, struggled to build partnerships as they lost six wickets for just 36 runs, slipping from a

commanding 166/2 to 202/8 by the end of their 20 overs. This collapse highlighted the fragility of India's middle and lower order, something that they will aim to address before the second T20I. In the bowling department, India were clinical as they restricted South Africa to just 141 in 17.5 overs in the opening match. Varun Chakravarthy continued his excellent form from the Bangladesh series with a brilliant three-wicket haul, while Ravi Bishnoi was equally impressive, claiming 3/28.

Starring *Blake Lively* and *Justin Baldoni* as the lead actors, *It Ends With Us* is all set to release on Netflix after a phenomenal box-office response from the cinema in August. The film is the cinematic adaptation of the best-seller novel *It Ends with Us* by Colleen Hoover.

Keeping the book aside, and talking about the film baldly for those unfamiliar with the book, the film gives a complete glimpse of a relationship with physical abuse with what comes with mental instability. It is a complete package initially starting from the butterflies of a relationship to the phase of its exciting and it and then beyond.

Ajay Devgan, the hero, felt a little undermined from his role if compared to the super hit cop film *Singham*. *Kareena* played her role well in the movie. The characters have somewhere done justice to their characters except some. each step. After two hours of waiting and moving through the crowd, I finally had darshan of *Lord Jagannath*, along with visits to the *Sakshi Gopal* and *Ganesh* temples within the premises. I spent some time exploring the intricacies of the carvings and the grandeur of the structure, feeling a sense of reverence as I walked through the sacred grounds.

After immersing myself in the history of the *Sun Temple*, I continued to *Chandrabhaga Beach*, just 4 kilometres away. The beach is very popular among tourists and offers fun activities like *ATV* bike rides and boat rides. 



Devotion to our rishis, sages, Gurus and following their guidance, one must unfold the meaning of and uphold their teachings, and sacred wisdom

Just like a Financial Balance sheet, Vedic traditions look at another balance sheet - analysing the Karmas of an individual with a focus on our Rina or Debts. Rina (debts) a key concept in Vedic tradition, emphasises the accountabilities and obligations each individual is born with and is compelled to repay-as an obligation towards the karmic inheritance to help understand one's duties for spiritual & material progress. The debts include an obligation towards Deities, seers & sages, ancestors, nature & elements, and community & mankind. We strengthen our karmic balance sheet, when we fulfil our duties with humility and no expectations. Rishi Vyasa Deva says in the Shrimad Bhagwatam says: ऋणसन्निर्दिनजो जातो देवर्षिपितृणां प्रभो । यज्ञध्यान-पुत्रेसनसित्यजन्पतत ।। rinaṁ tribhīr dvijo jaato devarṣhi-pitṛiṇaam prabho. Yajñāadhyaṇa-putrais taany anisteerya tyajanpate. A twice born (Brahamaṇa) has three debts: to God, to the sages and to the ancestors. These are cleared by yajnas sacrifice, studying and learning of the Vedic texts and looking after children. A successful person accomplishes these before forsaking the body. The sacred texts, including the Matsya Purana, elaborate on 5 primary debts -

The first 3 one is born with **Debt to the Gods (Deva Rina)** **Debt to the Ancestors (Pitru Rina)** **Debt to the Sages (Rishi Rina)** **Debt to Fellow Humans (Manushya Rina)** **Debt to Nature and All Living Beings (Bhuta Rina)** **Deva Rina:** The debt to the Gods emphasizes Bhakti devotion, worship, performing rituals and Yajnas sacrifices paying obeisance to the Divine power seen as nourishing and sustaining the cosmic order. यज्ञशिष्टाशिनःसन्तोमुच्यन्तेसर्वकिल्बिषैः । भुञ्जतेतेत्वघ्नपापायेपचन्त्यात्मकारणात् ।। Yajñashishtāshino santomuchantesarvakilbīṣhāiḥ Bhūñjate te tvaghñāṁ pāpā ye pachantyāt-makāraṇāt The wise and spiritually-minded, who eat the food that is first offered in sacrifice, are released from all kinds of sin. Others, who eat food for their own enjoyment, verily eat only sin. A reminder to eat food as prasada (sanctified food from the rituals) as a sense of gratitude towards the Divine order that is the provider. **Pitru Rina:** The debt to ancestors involves rituals like Shraadh and Tarpanto ensure the peace and well-being of our forefathers - an expression of reverence and connection to the Cosmic order reinforcing the values of family lineage.



अथैतानिप्राणाधाराश्चवर्चसस्तिष्ठन्ति यस्त्वयमुक्त्वा । सर्वअपामथस्तुस्वामिभूतास्थितातस्त्वाऋत्विजंयस्त्वेानुत्तम् ।। Atha itānīprāṇādhārāścha var-chasastishthanti yas tvayāni bhuktvā Sarvā apāmātha santu svāpi bhūtā sthītā-tastva rtvijaṇi yastevānṛttam "These offerings, rooted in our forefathers, sustain our vitality and merit. Those who partake of these and perform the rites in adherence to tradition, their ancestors are respected, and their lineage remains blessed." Remembering and performing with devotion Shraaddh (rituals for ancestors) is crucial to fulfilling this debt and ensuring their spiritual contentment. **Rishi Rina:** The debt to sages underscores the obligation to perpetuate the wisdom of

seers. It is about engaging in jigyasa - inquiry and learning the scriptures and living by their teachings. गुरुपितरं वसिष्ठं च स्वधर्मण्यो बलत् । सर्वमूलविमुञ्चत्यस्मिन्गृहे तु सदा हिता ।। Gurūṇi pitarāṇi vasiṣṭhaṁ cha svadharmṇyobalāt Sarvamūlaṇi vimuchatyasminguhye tu sadā hitā "He who adheres to his Svadharma - his Dharma duties and responsibilities and respects the Guru, teacher, father, and the sage Vasishtha, is freed from all fundamental debts." Devotion to our rishis, sages, Gurus and following their guidance, one must unfold the meaning of and uphold their teachings, and sacred wisdom. **Manushya Rina:** The debt to humanity highlights virtuous conduct and social responsibility... being compassionate and empathetic to our community. विवेकदृष्टिं प्रजानां पुण्यायेत वयं यथा । गुणानामुपतिष्ठन्ति सन्तो च हिता तु ।। Vīvekadarṣṭiṁ prajānāṁ puṇyāyeta vayaṁ yathā Guṇānām upatiṣṭhanti santāḥ santo cha hitā tu "May we always look upon people with discernment and fulfil our duties towards them. The virtuous, by maintaining this, ensure their own welfare and that of others." Fulfilling social duties is vital to maintaining harmonious relationships and societal

balance. **Bhuta Rina:** The debt to Mother Nature and the elements, is key to our sustenance and evolution. Being sensitive & considerate to all life forms. विवेकदृष्टिं प्रजानां पुण्यायेत वयं यथा । गुणानामुपतिष्ठन्ति सन्तो च हिता तु ।। "Rinaṁ tu pṛthivyāḥ pitṛiṇāṁ ca sarvadā" Pitarāṇi ca vṛṣṭivyaḥgrāṇi dānaṁ ca tuyat-nataḥ" "One is always indebted to the Earth and to one's ancestors. Always be diligent in offering reverence and donations to both the Earth and the forefathers." It is our conscientious duty to respect Nature and all the Universal forces. This Balance sheet provides comprehensive framework for understanding one's Dharma towards life and its stakeholders, living authentically, and fulfilling our dues to the Universe.
