

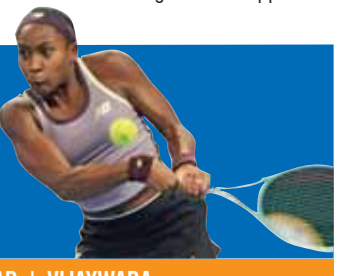

## PATAAKHA BAN EXPLODES, SC REACTS

The Supreme Court on Monday demanded answers from the Delhi Government and Police Commissioner on how its ban on bursting firecrackers to curb pollution was flouted during Diwali celebrations in the National Capital. The Bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Augustine George Masih took a serious view of newspaper reports that indicated a total non-compliance with the Government's restrictions on bursting firecrackers. The Court said that the affidavit, which has to be filed in a week, should also detail the steps that would be taken to ensure that firecracker-related pollution does not arise again during Diwali celebrations next year.

"We want the Delhi Government to immediately respond as to why this has happened. We will simultaneously issue notice to Delhi Police Commissioner as to why there is non-compliance. We have to hear this immediately. The real problem is that this is all under the Air Prevention Act, 1981, which after amendment this year, has only penalty provisions," the SC remarked during the hearing of a plea concerning air pollution in and around the National Capital Region. The Bench also asked the Delhi Government to consider implementing a perpetual firecracker ban in the national capital. The Court further said that these steps should include measures to conduct a public campaign to sensitise the public against such pollution.

hardly implemented. The ban on firecrackers being non-complied is very well clear from the report which amicus cited, which is that this time pollution level was at an all time high. Even a report suggested farm fire was also at a high time rise" the Court further observed in its order. The Court also gave the States of Punjab and Haryana one week's time to submit details of stubble burning incidents in the last ten days. Due to deteriorating air quality in Delhi, the State government had recently banned the production, sale, and use of various types of firecrackers in the national capital till January 1, 2025. Additional Solicitor General (ASG) Archana Pathak Dave agreed that there was absolute non-compliance with these restrictions during Diwali this year. Amicus Curiae Aparajita Singh

added that there is a report suggesting a huge increase in air pollution on the day of Diwali, with the pollution percentage rising from 10 per cent to 27 per cent. The Court observed that something needs to be done to address this issue. "Something has to be done. Either the ones who are selling crackers despite the ban, their premises must be sealed. We will look into this. Amicus Curiae points out that a report suggested that there was a huge increase in the pollution on the day of Diwali. Pollution percentage goes from 10 per cent to 27 percent... This has to be responded to immediately," the Court said. The Judges also flagged concern over people bringing in firecrackers from other States into Delhi to defy the firecracker ban.



### EC reschedules 14 Assembly bypolls

With less than 10 days remaining, the Election Commission (EC) on Monday rescheduled bypolls in 14 Assembly constituencies across Kerala, Punjab, and Uttar Pradesh from November 13 to November 20 after requests from political parties. Bypolls to 14 constituencies will be held with Maharashtra Assembly elections, and the second phase of Jharkhand polls. Sources in the poll panel said political parties had requested for a change in the polling date, citing festivals such as Kalpathi Rastholsavam (November 13-15), Kartik Purnima (November 15) and Prakash Parv of Sri Guru Nanak Dev (November 15). The parties said the festivals may impact voter turnout in these states. "Representations have been received in the Commission from various recognised national and state political parties (including BJP, INC, BSP, RLD) and some social organisations for change of date for poll in some Assembly constituencies having by-elections on 13th November, 2024, considering large scale social, cultural and religious engagements on that day which may cause inconvenience to large number of people, give rise to various logistic issues and may lead to reduced voters participating during the poll," the EC said.

### Packed bus falls in Almora gorge, 36 dead

At least 36 people were killed and 27 injured when a 42-seater private bus carrying 63 passengers plunged into a 200-metre-deep gorge near Marchula in Almora district of Uttarakhand around 7.30 am on Monday. President Droupadi Murmu and Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed deep grief and condoled the bereaved family members. Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami has ordered the suspension of the Assistant Regional Transport Officers (ARTOs) of Pauri and Almora districts while also directing the Kumaon commissioner for a magisterial probe into the accident. According to officials, the bus, owned by Garhwal Motor Owners Union Limited (GMOU), was en route from Naini Danda in Pauri district to Ramnagar in Nainital district when it reportedly lost control around 7.30 am near Sarad Bend and plunged into the gorge along a stream. The force of the fall ejected some passengers, while others managed to escape on their own. Those who climbed to safety alerted authorities, prompting immediate

### Deeply concerned about safety of Indians in Canada: MEA

Taking strong exception to an attack on a Hindu Sabha temple in Brampton in the Canadian province of Ontario, India on Monday condemned the "acts of violence perpetrated by extremists and separatists". New Delhi also urged the Justin Trudeau Government to ensure that all places of worship in the country are adequately protected. "We call on the Government of Canada to ensure that all places of worship are protected from such attacks. We also expect that those indulging in violence will be prosecuted," the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said here. Protesters carrying Khalistani flags clashed with people at

Brampton's Hindu Sabha Temple on Sunday, prompting the High Commission of India in Ottawa to issue a strong statement, condemning the attack by "anti-India" elements. Jaiswal also pointed out that it remains "deeply concerned" about the safety and security of its citizens in that country, asserting that the diplomatic officers providing consular services to Indians "will not be deterred by intimidation, harassment and violence". "We remain deeply concerned about the safety and security of Indian nationals in Canada. The outreach of our Consular officers to provide services to Indians and Canadian citizens alike will not be deterred by intimidation, harassment and violence," he said. According to a PTI report from Ottawa, protestors

carrying Khalistani flags clashed with people at a Hindu temple in Brampton, triggering condemnation by Prime Minister Justin Trudeau who said every Canadian has the right to practise their faith freely and safely. On Sunday, Peel Regional Police said that a protest occurred at the Hindu Sabha temple in Brampton and unverified videos circulating on social media appeared to show demonstrators holding banners in support of Khalistan, Canadian Broadcasting Corporation reported. The videos showed fist fights and people striking each other with poles on what appears to be the grounds surrounding the Hindu Sabha Mandir temple, the report added.

### Jammu and Kashmir Assembly breaks six-year hiatus

The portals of the Jammu and Kashmir Legislative Assembly were thrown open after a gap of more than six years allowing newly elected members to attend the maiden address of Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha to the first-ever legislative Assembly of the Union Territory after the abrogation of articles 370 and 35-A on Monday. The last Budget session of the Mehbooba Mufti-led Peoples Democratic Party-Bharatiya Janata Party (PDP-BJP) alliance government was adjourned sine die by the speaker on February 13, 2018. The alliance government later collapsed in June 2018 leading to the Governor's rule. On August 5, 2019, the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir was reorganised into two Union territories. Meanwhile, a ruckus broke out on the floor of the Assembly soon after the unanimous election of veteran National Conference leader Abdul Rahim Rather as speaker of the house. Waheed ur Rehman Para, a PDP MLA, tried to grab the limelight by bringing in a resolution against the abrogation of Article 370 without giving any advance notice to the chair. Chief Minister Omar Abdullah reacted on the spur of the moment calling out the act as a mere photo exercise. It was also 'vociferously'

opposed by the BJP MLAs. Speaker Rather while trying to calm down the tempers of BJP members stated, "This is my domain, let me examine this and accordingly I will decide on the resolution." Rather said while pacifying the opposition. However, the 28 BJP legislators refused to sit and continued to oppose the PDP MLAs move. In his brief remark, Omar Abdullah said in the Assembly that a single MLA's private resolution during remarks over the Speaker's election carries no meaning. "How the House will reflect and discuss this will not be decided by any one member. The resolution brought today has no importance but it is only for the cameras. If there was a purpose behind it, then they would have discussed this with us before..." During the ruckus, the Speaker, Abdul Rahim Rather adjourned the house for 15 minutes.

### Who created the 'Mallu Hindu Officers' WhatsApp group?

A WhatsApp Group of Hindu Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officers in Kerala has sent shock waves across the Left Democratic Front (LDF) government in the state and a high level probe is on to find out the brains behind the "mischief". P Rajeev, Kerala Minister for Law and Industries, who is also the Chief-Minister-in-waiting, told the media at Kochi on Monday that the government has noted the development with all seriousness and a probe is on to bring to light all factors behind the formation of the group. The group was created on October 31 from the phone used by K Gopalakrishnan, an IAS officer in the state. News about the formation of the 'Mallu Hindu Officers' WA group spread like wildfire across Kerala, and it was taken off cyberspace within 24 hours. However, Gopalakrishnan said that his phone was hacked and he was not aware of the existence of such a group. "It was only when colleagues told me about the WA group that I came to know about it. Multiple Groups were formed using the contact numbers in my phone and I do not know anything more than this," Gopalakrishnan said. He has filed a police complaint about the hacking of his phone. Dr MG Gireeshan, cyber expert who is a leading hackathon specialist, told The Pioneer that it was possible to hack the phone of anybody who is not aware of the potential of the internet, and mobile phones.



### Sensex tanks, investors lose ₹5.99 lakh Crore

Investors' wealth eroded by Rs 5.99 lakh crore on Monday due to heavy sell-off in stock markets with the BSE Sensex tumbling more than one per cent. Markets were dragged down by Reliance Industries, banking shares and unabated selling by foreign investors. Investors also turned cautious ahead of the US presidential elections and Federal Reserve interest rate decision scheduled to be announced later this week. The BSE benchmark tumbled 941.88 points or 1.18 per cent to settle at 78,782.24, the lowest closing level since August 6. During the day, it slumped 1,491.52 points or 1.87 per cent to 78,232.60. In line with a weak trend in equities, the market capitalisation of BSE-listed firms eroded by Rs 5,99,539.5 crore to Rs 4,42,11,068.05 crore (USD 5.26 trillion). "Markets witnessed broader sell-off as investors turned risk-averse ahead of key US election outcome and Federal Reserve's policy decision in the next few days time. While stretched valuation concerns have been weighing for sometime, the persistent foreign fund outflows have created a lot of uncertainty amongst the investors resulting in a steep correction. Also, corporate earnings have failed to meet expectations, which has further dampened investors' sentiment," said Prashanth Tapse, Senior VP (Research), Mehta Equities Ltd.

## Honouring the Sun, Chhath Puja greetings

As people gear up to celebrate the revered four days Chhath Puja starting from Tuesday, there is visible enthusiasm among the devotees, especially those from the states of Bihar, Uttar Pradesh and Jharkhand with markets around the country bustling with shoppers splurging on the items related to the sacred festival. In the national Capital, such excitement is visible in different markets across Delhi as people from Purvanchal constitute a sizable and significant fraction of the total population. Amid the palpable enthusiasm, trade related to the auspicious festival, worshipping the God Surya, is expected to be approximately ₹12,000 crores across the country, making it one of India's most culturally significant festivals. The first day of Chhath Puja, Nahay Khay, signifies the start of the rituals with about 150 million devotees,

particularly women, participating to cleanse themselves by taking a holy dip in rivers, especially the Ganga, symbolising spiritual purification. On Wednesday, the second day, Kharna, is marked by a rigorous day-long fast, during which devotees abstain from food and even water from sunrise until sunset. In the evening, the fast is broken with a traditional meal (prasad) offered to Lord Surya, which typically includes rice pudding (kheer) and chapatis. The third day is the main day of Chhath Puja, characterised by a complete fast without water as devotees gather at riverbanks or other water bodies to offer the first Arghya (a traditional offering) to the setting sun. On the last day on Friday, devotees will observe the final day, known as Usha Arghya. This day is marked by offering prayers and Arghya to the rising sun in the early morning. With the

completion of this ritual, the 36-hour fast concludes, and devotees celebrate the end of their Chhath Puja observance sharing a festive meal with family and friends. The festival, which worships both the rising and setting sun, is not just a mere celebration for the devotees, it also brings happiness to the traders who benefit from the sales of the products related to it. The Confederation of All India Traders (CAIT), which has been tracking festive sales this year, on Monday released data on expected sales during the sacred festival, estimating that it will generate approximately ₹12,000 crores in trade across India. Even in the national capital, the Purvanchal population celebrates Chhath Puja on a grand scale. Markets across the city, including Chandni Chowk, Sadar Bazar, Model Town, Ashok Vihar, Shalimar Bagh, Pitampura, Rani Bagh, Uttam Nagar and Tilak

Nagar, are bustling with people purchasing traditional Chhath Puja items. According to CAIT National President BC Bhartiya, that in addition to Bihar and Jharkhand, Chhath Puja is celebrated with great fervour in Eastern Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, Odisha, West Bengal, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Vidarbha, and Madhya Pradesh. "Many Purvanchalis reside in these states, contributing significantly to the local economy. The festival, which involves worshipping both the setting and rising sun, symbolises the inclusive nature of Indian culture," Bhartiya said.

According to CAIT, essential Chhath Puja items like bamboo baskets, banana leaves, sugarcane, sweets, fruits, and vegetables (particularly coconuts, apples, bananas, and green vegetables) have seen a high demand this year. The association also added that traditional attire, including sarees, lehenga-chunni, salwar-kurta for women, and kurta-pyjama, dhoti for men, are being purchased in large quantities, benefiting local traders and small-scale industries. "Handmade items produced on a small scale are also witnessing significant sales," it said. CAIT secretary general and Chandni Chowk Bharatiya Janata party (BJP) MP Praveen Khandelwal, emphasised that "Chhath Puja is not just a religious festival but an integral part of Indian culture, reflecting social unity and dedication. It also boosts trade and directly benefits local producers, reinforcing Prime

Minister Narendra Modi's 'Vocal for Local' and 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat' (Self-Reliant India) vision," he added. Amid the celebration, it is often observed that the majority of products used during the festival are crafted by local artisans and craftspeople, generating new employment opportunities and supporting cottage industries. Upon this, Bhartiya highlighted that Chhath Puja, beyond its spiritual significance, has emerged as a major opportunity for trade and employment, bringing renewed economic energy to Indian markets including the sale of items such as vermilion used by married women. "For women observing Chhath Puja, applying a long streak of vermilion from the nose to the hairline is an auspicious gesture, symbolising their prayers for the health and longevity of their husbands and families," the trader said.

# Punjab Bypolls Rescheduled to Nov 20 Due to Gurburab festivities, Counting on Nov 23

PNS ■ CHANDIGARH

The Election Commission of India (ECI) on Monday postponed the bypolls for four assembly seats in Punjab - Dera Baba Nanak, Chhabawal (SC), Gidderbaha, and Barnala - shifting the date from November 13 to November 20, 2024. The counting of votes is set for November 23.

Notably, the poll panel has rescheduled by-elections for total 14 seats, including nine in Uttar Pradesh, four in Punjab, and one in Kerala following the requests from political parties, including the Congress, BJP, BSP, and RLD, who cited the impact of upcoming festivals saying that it could impact the voter turnout on the polling day.

In Punjab, key concerns were raised about the Sikh community's celebration of 555th prakash parv of Guru Nanak Dev - founder of Sikhism - on November 15, with rituals beginning on November 13. Congress leader Pratap Singh Bajwa, in a letter to ECI, formally requested the postponement, stressing that the prakash parv is significant for Sikhs and other communities alike, and could impact voter participation if polling were held on November 13.

ECI, in its statement on Monday, acknowledged the cultural and religious importance of the festivals and the potential for reduced voter turnout due to widespread participation in celebrations.

The decision to postpone was taken to ensure that people could fully participate in

both the democratic process and their cultural observances. Punjab's Chief Electoral Officer Sabin C said: "ECI, in a communiqué, informed that considering large scale social, cultural and religious engagements on November 13, 2024, may cause inconvenience to large number of people, give rise to various logistic issues and may lead to reduced voters' participation during the poll."

Now, the Commission, having considered these factors and representations, has decided to change the date of poll from November 13, 2024, (Wednesday) to November 20, 2024 (Wednesday)."

The bypolls are critical for all parties as they aim to consolidate their influence in the State before the next full legislative assembly elections. For the ruling AAP, these bypolls are an opportunity to maintain their foothold in Punjab, especially in seats where they have fielded new faces.

The Congress, on the other hand, sought to retain its dominance in constituencies previously under its control, relying on established local figures and familial ties, as seen in Gidderbaha and Dera Baba Nanak.

BJP, which is striving to expand its presence in Punjab, has fielded prominent candidates and hopes to leverage discontent with both the AAP and Congress to carve out a greater share of the electorate.

The recent alliance between the BJP and some regional Sikh parties could further shape the electoral

landscape, potentially swaying voters in rural areas.

The Election Commission's decision to delay the bypolls highlighted its responsiveness to cultural sensitivities, ensuring the electorate can engage both in religious observances and in fulfilling their civic duty. With intense campaigning expected over the next two weeks, political parties are likely to focus on local issues, with candidates aiming to mobilize voters despite the proximity to festival celebrations.

## Key Constituencies and Candidates

The four seats going to polls in Punjab became vacant when former MLAs were elected to the Parliament earlier this year. Gidderbaha, Barnala, Dera Baba Nanak, and Chhabawal are witnessing a tough battle among major parties, including the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), Congress, and BJP.

**Barnala:** Formerly held by AAP's Gurmeet Singh Meht Hayer, now an MP from Sangrur, the seat sees a three-way contest. AAP has nominated Harinder Singh Dhaliwal, while the BJP is fielding former Congress MLA and moneybag Kewal Singh Dhillon, and the Congress has chosen Kuldeep Singh Dhillon as their candidate.

**Gidderbaha:** A hot seat - earlier represented by Punjab Congress president Amrinder Singh Raja Warring, who is now representing Ludhiana in the Parliament. His wife, Amrita Warring, now stands as the Congress candidate, against

former Akali leader and now AAP candidate Hardeep Singh 'Dimpy' Dhillon; and former Finance Minister and five-time MLA Manpreet Singh Badal as BJP candidate. These three are setting up for a high-stakes contest.

**Dera Baba Nanak:** Formerly held by senior Congress leader and former Deputy Chief Minister Sukhjinder Singh Randhawa, now the MP for Gurdaspur; this constituency will see Randhawa's wife, Jatinder Kaur, contesting for Congress. BJP's Ravi Karan Singh Kahlon and AAP's Gurdeep Singh Randhawa are also competing, making for a tight race.

**Chhabawal (SC):** Previously held by Congress's Dr Raj Kumar Chhabawal, who switched to AAP and won the Hoshiarpur Lok Sabha seat, this reserved constituency now has AAP's Dr Ishaank Chhabawal, son of the former MLA, as its candidate. Congress has fielded Ranjit Kumar, while BJP's candidate is former Akali MLA Sohan Singh Thandal.

## Voter and Polling Station

CEO Sabin C, providing additional details, noted that the four constituencies collectively represent 6,96,316 registered voters who will cast their ballots at 831 polling stations. Dera Baba Nanak has 193,268 voters and 241 polling stations; Chhabawal has 159,254 voters and 205 polling stations; Gidderbaha has 166,489 voters with 173 polling stations; and Barnala has 177,305 voters and 212 polling stations.

## Vivek Joshi takes charge as new Hry chief secretary

## Haryana Agriculture Minister reviews DAP availability; Says all steps taken to meet demand

Haryana Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Minister Shyam Singh Rana on Monday assured farmers that there is no shortage of DAP fertilizer in the state, urging them to remain calm as the government is committed to ensuring adequate supplies.

The minister conducted a review of DAP availability and emphasized that all necessary steps are being taken to meet the demand.

According to ministry data, DAP consumption in the October 2023 Rabi season stood at 1,19,470 metric tonnes, while consumption in October 2024 was slightly lower at 1,14,000 metric tonnes. Presently, the state has a stock of 24,000 metric tonnes of DAP, with a daily supply mechanism in place to keep up with farmers' needs.

# HP CM Sukhu urges Railways to operate Kalka-Shimla Rail Line on Green Hydrogen

Himachal Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu on Monday said that the State Government has urged the Union Ministry of Railways to explore the possibility of converting the Kalka-Shimla UNESCO World Heritage train to run on green hydrogen. In a letter written to the Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, he urged the ministry to consider transforming this historic rail line into a green energy-powered route.

He added, "The state government aims to make Himachal Pradesh a green energy state by March 31, 2026 and has undertaken several initiatives to achieve this goal." He said that the State government is working on a six-pronged strategy to transform the State into a certified Green Energy State, contributing significantly to India's climate commitments and aligning with the Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs). This strategic transition will ensure a fair and just shift towards sustainable energy while also boosting the state's economy.

Sukhu stated that the State is on track

to replace its current thermal power consumption of 1,500 Million Units (MUs) with renewable sources, including hydro, solar, and wind power. He said that currently, the state consumes 13,500 MUs of power, with a large portion already derived from renewable sources. Achieving 90 per cent renewable energy consumption in the power distribution network will enable Himachal Pradesh to be certified as a fully Green State of the country. This transition is expected to be completed within a year and will also allow industries in the State to apply for the 'Eco Mark', enhancing the value of their products.

The CM stated that the Government is also laying a strong focus on solar power generation, with plans to establish a capacity of 2,000 MW over the next four to five years. Solar power generation has doubled in the last two years, reflecting the government's commitment to this clean energy source, he added.

Sukhu said that, in addition, the Government has launched the 'Green Panchayat' scheme, a decentralized renewable energy initiative in the State. Under this scheme, 500 KW grid-connected

ground-mounted solar power plants are being set up at the Panchayat level. Income from the sale of this power will be used to fund eco-friendly and sustainable development projects.

He further said that the State is also making significant progress in the production of 'Green Hydrogen'. The first facility, in collaboration with Oil India Limited (OIL), is underway and discussions with private investors for more such facilities are ongoing.

The CM said that as part of the State's efforts to promote electric vehicles (EVs), 1,500 buses from the State Transport Corporation's fleet of 3,200 buses will be replaced with electric buses over the next two to three years. He said that the government is also transitioning its own fleet of diesel and petrol vehicles to electric. Additionally, six major National Highways have been developed as green corridors for EVs. Under the Rajiv Gandhi Startup Yojana, unemployed youth are being provided with a 50 per cent grant to purchase EV taxis and buses, ensuring the deployment of environment-friendly vehicles within government services.

# Farmers stage protests outside homes of AAP, BJP candidates in Punjab

In Punjab, farmers have intensified their protests over delayed paddy lifting and the shortage of DAP (Diammonium Phosphate) fertilizer. The farmer-protestors from various farmer unions began staging demonstrations outside the residences and offices of Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) candidates, contesting in the upcoming by-elections, from Monday.

The protests were organized at key locations, including the offices of BJP candidate Manpreet Singh Badal in Gidderbaha, BJP candidate Kewal Singh Dhillon in Barnala, and AAP candidate Harinder Singh Dhaliwal in Barnala. Additionally, toll fees at 26 plazas across the State have been waived by the protesting farmers as part of their ongoing agitation.

BKU (Ekta-Ugrahan) leader Joginder Singh Ugrahan announced that the protests would also extend to the residences of AAP candidate Hardeep Singh 'Dimpy' Dhillon in Gidderbaha starting

Tuesday.

He further highlighted the ongoing shortage of DAP, a critical fertilizer for the current cropping season. "A recent shipment of 32,000 DAP bags, which had been detained by demonstrators at Malerkotla, was partly allocated to local districts," he said, urging the public to join the protests to pressure both the State and Central Governments to address these issues. The protests coincide with the upcoming by-elections scheduled for November 13 in four assembly constituencies - Barnala, Gidderbaha, Dera Baba Nanak, and Chhabawal. According to farmer leaders, both the Central and State Governments are responsible for the ongoing issues affecting Punjab's agricultural sector. "Had they acted in a timely manner, the delays in paddy lifting and fertilizer shortages would have been mitigated," they argued.

The decision to stage protests outside the candidates' homes aimed at pushing the authorities to take immediate action.

For the past 18 days, farmers have conducted demon-

strations outside the residences of BJP and AAP leaders, disrupting routine political activities. These protests were paused recently to allow for the deployment of farmer leaders at local mandis (markets) to monitor the situation. In parallel, the Samyukta Kisan Morcha (SKM), a non-political farmers' union, continued to lead highway protests across five major routes in Punjab, focusing on similar agricultural issues.

The current protests mirror previous actions taken during this year's Lok Sabha elections when the SKM organized gatherings outside the residences of BJP candidates. Farmers had prepared a list of grievances and demands, which they presented to BJP candidates during their village campaigns, creating considerable challenges for the party's outreach efforts.

Ultimately, BJP failed to secure any of Punjab's 13 Lok Sabha seats, though the party managed to secure the third-highest vote share with over 19 per cent, trailing behind Congress and AAP, both of which garnered more than 26 per cent of the vote.

# Haryana CM inaugurates 'Third Panchkula Book Fair'

## Finding strength in the face of life's deepest sorrows

Adversities are integral to our lives. However, we possess a wellspring of strength that enables us to recover and move on

First read about resilience in my physics classes in school as the ability of a material to absorb energy and release back that energy as it springs back to its original shape.

Later, I understood a third element, the ability to spring back without creating a permanent distortion. Human resilience is no different. I have met many people who bounced back. I then understood its meaning in daily life. It was about humans and their strength to face adversities and move forward with renewed vigour. I remember an incident from almost four decades back. I was only 26-years-old. My colleague was 56. His only child, a son around my age, died in a boat accident while on vacation with his friends in the Sundarbans. I went with my wife to console and realised that words were superfluous. What do you tell an old couple who had just lost their only child? I had tears in my eyes, and I found the gentleman consoling me instead. He sought solace



and strength from the scriptures. Another colleague lost her 41-year-old son. She wanted to write about it, had even tried multiple times, but could not bring herself to articulate her feelings. I encouraged her to write. She shared her innermost thoughts, 'A woman goes through severest of physical pains and mental suffering through labour pain at the time of her child's birth. This is the natural cycle of life. But what is unnatural is when this cycle of life breaks due to the untimely death of the younger per-

son, whom the woman had given birth to, and nurtured, to become a good and strong human being to face the world.'

The lady now lives through her son's memories. She also expresses her emotions by writing poetry or short stories. This is her way of coming out of her traumatic experience and honouring her son's life. Another lady that I recently interviewed for an episode of a virtual show lost her young son of 22 a few years back. She 'transcended' her grief cherishing the fond memories of a limited time spent together. She helps others transform their grief into growth. The loss of a child is probably the most difficult form of adversity. We face challenges and find the inner strength to deal with them. There are a few, who unfortunately are not able to cope, and sometimes take extreme steps. There are also a few people who may require additional medical help to deal with feelings of depression. Above all, they require love

and support from the near and dear ones. Each human is a wellspring of resilience. All that is needed is to tap within and for others to help. We may adopt a few lessons from the lives of resilient persons. They believe they are masters of their destiny, they are aware of their strengths and weaknesses, they adapt to situations, they do not obsess over factors over which they do not have control, they are optimists and many more. However, resilience does not require us to present a brave facade at all times. It is also important to create a social environment and not hesitate to seek help. I close the article, with a prayer that all of us find the courage to be resilient, and with a quote from Emil Dorian, a Romanian poet, prose writer, and physician, "Strong people alone know how to organise their suffering so as to bear only the most necessary pain."

Resilient leaders foster a growth mindset within their teams, viewing setbacks as learning opportunities rather than failures.

Only fostering a team-based environment where collaboration and mutual support are encouraged enables employees to rely on one another in times of need. When employees trust their teammates, they are more likely to share concerns, ask for help and aid others, which collectively contributes to a resilient workforce. In conclusion, managing resilience in the workplace is essential for creating a thriving, adaptable, and supportive work environment. Investing in resilience is ultimately an investment in organisational success and individual wellbeing. By prioritising resilience, businesses will be better prepared to face future challenges, ensuring a sustainable and positive work environment.

# India's gold repatriation: Safeguarding India's wealth

India has taken a bold step by repatriating 214 tonnes of gold from the Bank of England, signalling a strategic move to protect national wealth against global shock



In a striking move to safeguard national wealth, India has repatriated 214 tonnes of gold from the vaults of England, a signal of heightened concern over escalating geopolitical tensions and looming sanctions. This shift reflects a broader trend, with central banks globally ramping up their gold purchases. In May alone, India recalled 100 tonnes from the Bank of England, reinforcing a strategy to shield assets amid global uncertainty. Now, as global gold prices soar toward a potential \$3,000 per ounce, the world is watching closely, with India emerging as a key player in the race to secure precious metals in these volatile times. The government of India has decided to prioritise protecting its assets in the face of global geopolitical unrest. About 100 tonnes were returned from the Bank of England in May.

A total of 324.01 metric tonnes of gold were held in the custody of the Bank for International Settlements (BIS) and the Bank of England, while 510.46 metric tonnes were retained domestically. Additionally, 20.26 metric tonnes of gold were stored as deposits. The gold in the world market is projected to rise to \$3000 per ounce, according to Goldman Sachs. The Diwali 2024 market sparkle appears subdued for several reasons despite cracker sales going back almost to the fuzzy pre-ban eras of the National Green Tribunal. The traditional gold sales could not touch previous years' highs as the metal was priced at around Rs 78,430, almost 30 per cent higher than last year. "Silver sales rose 33 per cent, while gold volume fell by 15 per cent," according to the Indian Bullion and Jewellers Association. The market is stated to be as dizzy as it was in 2015 or 2019, marked by slowdown. In its report titled "43rd Half Yearly Report on Management of Foreign Exchange

Reserves: April - September 2024," the RBI stated that it had a total of 854.73 metric tonnes of gold in both domestic and foreign repository facilities.

The RBI has been buying gold to diversify its forex reserves and hedge against external risks. In 2024, the RBI added 54.7 tons of gold to its reserves, the highest acquisition in three years. After the Ukraine war, \$ 300 billion worth of Russian currency and other assets, kept as reserves in the US dollar, Euro and sterling pound, were seized by the US and the G7 countries. The assets are being used to bolster funding arms and other supplies to Ukraine. India has since acted cautiously even in deals with the purchase of Russian crude. The recent spat with Canada and the US-Israel escalation of the war to Lebanon and Iran has added to the caution.

This forced the repatriation of gold by RBI, which has been purchasing gold and stocking it abroad for payments in terms of gold instead of dollars. The RBI saves huge amounts in terms of vault rents as well. Robust demand in the world's second-biggest gold consumer could further push up global prices, which hit record highs last week. Rising demand for imports of gold could also widen India's trade deficit and put pressure on the rupee. Yes, India's gold purchases have contributed to rising global gold prices.

India's gold demand in 2024 is likely to fall to its lowest in four years as a rally in prices to a record high is seen denting purchases during the peak festival season, the World Gold Council

(WGC) said on Wednesday. Gold demand in the world's second-biggest consumer of the precious metal could stand around 700 and 750 metric tonnes in 2024, the lowest since 2020 and down from last year's 761 tonnes, according to Sachin Jain, CEO of WGC's Indian operations. This Dhanteras, gold sales dipped in India to 35 tonnes, down from last year's 42 tons.

Gold has risen to multiple all-time highs this year. Sizable central bank purchases of gold bars have reset the relationship between rate and price levels since 2022. Goldman Sachs Research estimates that 100 tonnes of physical demand lifts gold prices by at least 2.4 per cent. Credit card usage also hit new highs, with card spending reaching Rs 80,000 crore in September, a 57 per cent increase from last year. The retail mom-and-pop shops have problems as the footfall was subdued due to many turning to online shopping. Both Amazon and Flipkart reported a strong Diwali season, with Flipkart leading with a 64 per cent market share during the initial October sales.

Sales from online platforms saw year-on-year growth of 23 per cent, with goods worth Rs 32,000 crore sold. More are BNPL or Buy Now Pay Later customers, or paying in instalments helped by credit cards, indicating a cash shortage among the people.

This trend was especially pronounced among new shoppers from tier 2 and tier 3 cities. Car sales have suffered during most of the year before just margin-

ally picking up during the Dussehra and Diwali festive seasons. Maruti profits lowered to Rs 3102 crore in September, by 18 per cent, as against Rs 3762 crore a year ago. Maruti CEO RC Bhargava says "Affordability is a concern". The demand for cars below Rs 10 lakh is in demand. Small cars inventory levels hit a "historic high" of 80-85 days, leaving dealers with a stock of 790,000 vehicles worth 800 billion rupees, the Federation of Automobile Dealers Associations says.

Despite high inflation, Indian consumers opened their wallets wide this Diwali season, pushing festival-related spending to about Rs 1.25 lakh crore, claimed Confederation of All India Traders (CAIT) general secretary Pravin Khandelwal. Delhi alone saw spending of Rs 25,000 crore, including FMCG goods, consumer durables and home décor earthen lamps and electronic goods, traditional and modern products, he says. Mobile phones in the below Rs 20,000 range had brisk sales. Mobile phones were among the hottest sellers this season, with a 12-15 per cent rise in the average selling price, driven partly by a shortage in device availability. This scarcity led to consumers grabbing whatever stock was available, increasing the average price of phones sold. Rising gold and commodity prices, a fall in rupee value, crunch in income and manufacturing are concerns amid a global unstable war-like situation.

It was three years after the Indo-Pakistan war. The year was 1968. India's external intelligence agency, The Research and Analysis Wing (R&AW) was formed and its director was firmly advised by the then Prime Minister, Indira Gandhi, to develop deep ties with Mossad; Israel's formidable intelligence agency. The two have been working closely together to eliminate potential threats and impending security challenges. The interests of both agencies aligned; obliterating the similar nature of terror emanating from their borders. As Israel confronts Iran's proxies in the region, Indian security forces battle Pakistan's proxies, Jaish-e-Mohammad and Lashkar-e-

Taiba, daily in the restive state of Jammu and Kashmir; which also happens to be one of the world's most heavily militarised zones. Pakistan, a nuclear-armed country, also happens to be the epicentre of global terrorism. Fast-forward to the year 1999 when India was engaged in the Kargil conflict with Pakistan. It was then that Israel provid-

ed India with drones to monitor the treacherous Himalayan terrain. Now, as Israel is entangled in its battles, India's Adani group has delivered several Hermes 900 drones which are also capable of aerial bombardment. They have been deployed in Gaza. This, of course, is beyond the ambit of the Indian Government's control since it's a joint venture between Adani Defence and Aerospace and Israel's Elbit systems. Besides, allegedly India sent two shiploads of arms to Israel early this year. Over the past few years, Mossad has conducted a series of assassinations. These have included top Iranian nuclear physicists, professors and the head of

Iran's nuclear programme. Benjamin Netanyahu has vowed that Israel will not tolerate a nuclear Iran. So, in the foreseeable future, it is very likely that Israel will strike Iran's nuclear facilities because Iran is going to relentlessly pursue the nuclear path. This is irrefutable.

In recent times, the agency in collaboration with the Israel Defence Forces (IDF) has assassinated the top leadership of Hamas and Hezbollah; Ismael Haniyeh-the Hamas political leader in Tehran, Hassan Nasrallah-the Hezbollah leader and Yahya Sinwar who was the chief architect of the 7th October 2023 attacks on Israel. The very recent precision



strikes in and around Tehran would have sent shockwaves in the power corridors of Iran. The reverberations of these calculated strikes would have sent Iran's security cabinet scrambling to fathom how Israel could pursue such an accurate military operation. One will have to wait and watch Iran's reaction. Will it retaliate and escalate the exacerbated situation in the West Asia or

will it choose to mitigate the situation and let its proxies corner Israel? But this outcome was almost certain. Israel had to engage in a limited military response. But what captured the imagination of the world was how Hezbollah paggers and walkie-talkies exploded simultaneously. Contentious debates regarding such a deadly operation were circulating to the centre stage. The vociferous debates focus on the morality and ethics of such an unprecedented operation.

After all, it does set a precedent for future attacks anywhere in the world. But as Israel's Ambassador to New Delhi put it; you have to surprise your enemy in a manner that does not involve the

conventional use of force. They say necessity is the mother of all inventions. Israel's campaign epitomises it perfectly. They say that offence is not the best form of defence but in Israel's case, this chain of thought is unconvincing. The state exists in a precarious security zone. Israel may find itself alienated from the rest of the world as the valiant men and women of the IDF battle on various fronts, but the war and Israel's meticulous planning must continue.

Iran's proxies must be annihilated. Its relentless campaign to eliminate groups like Hamas and Hezbollah must not end anytime soon. Political parties or not, these actors harbour a twisted,

malicious and hostile ideology. There is no space for such entities to exist in a modern world. Israel must never forget that the long-lasting ties between the two nations will continue and India's explicit support will not fade anytime soon. The Indo-Israeli ties will be a durable bond in the years to come. This relationship which hinges on mutual respect and specific interests will bloom and crystallise in the years to come. Golda Meir, the fourth Prime Minister of Israel, articulated it quite clearly; 'peace will only usher in when Arabs love their children more than they despise us.'

# People-smuggling gangs to be treated like terrorists: Starmer

Prime Minister Keir Starmer says he will double funding for Britain's border security agency and treat people-smuggling gangs like terror networks in an attempt to stop migrants crossing the English Channel in small boats. In a speech Monday to a meeting of the international police organization Interpol, Starmer will say the gangs behind irregular migration are a serious threat to global security. Arguing that "the world needs to wake up to the severity of this challenge," Starmer will say that "we're taking our approach to counterterrorism, which we know works, and applying it to the gangs," according to extracts released by his office. He'll call for more cooperation between law-enforcement agencies, closer coordination

with other countries and unspecified "enhanced" powers for law-enforcement. Starmer plans to increase the UK Border Security Command's two-year budget from 75 million pounds (\$97 million) to 150 million pounds (\$194 million). The money will be used to fund high-tech surveillance equipment and 100 specialist investigators. Like previous Conservative British governments, Starmer's Labour Party administration is struggling to stop thousands of people fleeing war and poverty from trying reach the UK from France in flimsy, overcrowded boats. More than 31,000 migrants have made the perilous crossing of one of the world's busiest shipping lanes so far this year, more than in all of 2023, though fewer than in 2022. At least 56 people have perished in

the attempts this year, according to French officials, making 2024 the deadliest since the number of channel crossings began surging in 2018. Starmer leads a center-left government, and has raised some eyebrows in September when he visited Italian Premier Giorgia Meloni and praised her nationalist conservative government's "remarkable" progress in reducing the number of migrants reaching Italy's shores by boat. Starmer will argue on Monday that "there's nothing progressive about turning a blind eye as men, women and children die in the channel." The opposition Conservative Party argues that Starmer should not have scrapped the previous government's plan to send some asylum-seekers who reach Britain by boat on one-way trips to Rwanda. Supporters of the pro-

posal say it would act as a deterrent. Human rights groups and many lawyers say it is unethical and unlawful to send migrants thousands of miles to a country they don't want to live in. Starmer called the plan a "gimmick" and canceled it soon after he was elected in July. Britain paid Rwanda hundreds of millions of pounds for the plan under a deal signed by the two countries in 2022, without any deportations taking place. Senior police and government officials from the 196 Interpol member states are attending the global police body's four-day congress in Glasgow, Scotland. On Tuesday, Brazilian police official Valdecy Urquiza is expected to be named the new general secretary of the Lyon, France-based organization, replacing Jürgen Stock of Germany.

# S. Korea, EU condemn N. Korea's reported troop dispatch to Russia

Top South Korean and European Union officials on Monday strongly condemned North Korea's reported troop dispatch to aid Russia's war against Ukraine and agreed to work together to try to block deepening military cooperation between Moscow and Pyongyang. North Korea's alleged troop deployment threatens to expand the almost 3-year-long war and is causing security jitters in South Korea, where many worry Russia might reward the North by giving it sophisticated weapons technology or offering a defense commitment in the event of a conflict on the Korean Peninsula. In a meeting in Seoul, South Korean Defense Minister Kim Yong Hyun and the EU's visiting foreign policy chief, Josep Borrell, expressed "serious concerns" about North Korea's reported troop dispatch and "strongly condemned" it, according to a statement from the South Korean Defense Ministry.

The two agreed to work together with the international community to try to obstruct Russian-North Korean security cooperation, the statement said. The US government said Thursday that about 8,000 North Korean soldiers were in Russia near Ukraine's border and preparing to join Russia's fight against Ukraine in the coming days. Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenskyy on Friday urged allies to stop just "watching" and take steps before North Korean troops deployed in Russia reach the battlefield. According to US, South Korean and Ukrainian intelligence assessments, North Korea was estimated to have moved about 10,000-12,000 troops to Russia. If they start fighting against Ukraine forces, it would mark North Korea's first participation in a large-scale conflict since the end of the 1950-53 Korean War. North Korean leader Kim Jong Un has used the Russia-Ukraine war as a way to expand defense and economic cooper-

ation with Russia in the face of an intensifying US-led pressure campaign against his advancing nuclear program. The US, South Korea and others accuse North Korea of having already exported artillery shells, missiles and other conventional arms to Russia. In the past two years, Kim has also ramped up tests of nuclear-capable missile systems, as Russia and China have repeatedly blocked US-led attempts to toughen international sanctions on North Korea over its testing activities in defiance of UN bans. North Korea has also pushed to sever relations and abandon its long-standing goal of reconciliation with South Korea. In a background briefing with local media Monday, South Korea's military said North Korea has built anti-tank, trench-like structures at two sites near the Korea's heavily armed border, where it blew up northern parts of unused cross-border road and rail routes last month in a display of anger toward South Korea. One of the sites is on the western portion

of the border and the other on the eastern section. Details of the briefing were shared with The Associated Press. The structure at the eastern part of the border was assessed to be 160 meters (524 feet) long while the one at the western part of the border was about 120 meters (393 feet) long, according to the South Korean military briefing. In a war situation, the North could easily fill up the trenches with piles of dirt nearby to create routes to invade the South, according to the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Recent commercial satellite images suggest that the work on the trenches began shortly after North Korea staged choreographed demolitions of a road near the western North Korean border city of Kaesong and a combined road and rail section near the Korea's eastern border on Oct. 15. Last week, North Korea test-launched an intercontinental ballistic missile designed to attack the U.S. mainland for the first time in almost a year.

# Chinese astronauts return safely after six months in space station

Three Chinese astronauts who spent six months developing China's low orbit space station returned to Earth safely early Monday, the China Manned Space Agency (CMSA) said. The capsule of the spaceship Shenzhou-18 carrying astronauts Ye Guangfu, Li Cong and Li Guangsu, touched down at the Dongfeng landing site in north China's Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region at 1:24 am (Beijing Time). The three astronauts, after staying in orbit for 192 days, were all in good health and the Shenzhou-18 mission was a success, the CMSA said. Ye, the Shenzhou-18 mission commander, has become the

first Chinese astronaut with an accumulative spaceflight time of more than a year, setting a new record for the longest duration of stay in orbit by a Chinese astronaut. He served as a crew member in the Shenzhou-13 mission from October 2021 to April 2022. "Chinese astronauts have flown to space in successive missions. I believe that the record of the duration in orbit will be broken in the near future," Ye said. Another astronaut Li Guangsu said that they grew two types of plants — cherry tomatoes and lettuce — and they had harvested some lettuce leaves for food. "Being able to eat fresh vegetables in space is truly a blessing. These green plants have also brought a touch of green and

good cheer to our busy work," Li was quoted by state-run Xinhua news agency. China launched the Shenzhou-18 manned spaceship in April this year. During the mission, the Shenzhou-18 crew utilised the scientific experiment cabinets and extravehicular payloads to carry out dozens of experiments in the fields of basic physics in microgravity, space material science, space life science, space medicine and space technology, Xinhua report said. The three were relieved by another set of three Chinese astronauts, including a woman who docked with the orbiting space station on October 30. China changes crew for the station every six months. China built its space station

after it was reportedly excluded from the International Space Station (ISS) over concerns that China's space programme is manned by its military, the People's Liberation Army, (PLA). The two robotic arms of the station, especially the long one which has the ability to grab objects including satellites from space, drew international concerns. Early this month China announced its plans for the further development of space programmes which included launching a manned lunar mission, construction of a lunar space station, exploration of habitable planets and extra-terrestrial life to expand its space programme in the next few decades.

# Turkiye ousts 3 pro-Kurdish mayors from office; replaces them with state officials

Turkiye on Monday removed three elected pro-Kurdish mayors from office over terrorism-related charges and replaced them with state-appointed officials, the Interior Ministry said. The move, which comes days after the arrest and ouster from office of a mayor from the country's main opposition party for his alleged links to a banned Kurdish militant group, is seen as a hardening of President Recep Tayyip Erdogan's government's policies toward the opposition. It also raises questions about the prospects of a tentative new peace effort to end a 40-year conflict between the militant group and the state that has led to tens of thousands of deaths. The mayors of the mainly Kurdish-populated provincial capitals of Mardin and Batman, as well as the district mayor for Halfeti, in Saniurfa province, were ousted from office over their past convictions or ongoing trials and investigations for links to the banned Kurdistan Workers' Party, or PKK, according to an Interior Ministry statement. The mayor are members of the pro-Kurdish Peoples' Equality and Democracy Party, or DEM, which is the third-largest party represented in Parliament. They were elected to office in local elections in March. Last month, the leader of the far-right nationalist party that's

allied with Erdogan had raised the possibility that the PKK's imprisoned leader could be granted parole if he renounces violence and disbands his organisation. His comments had sparked discussion and speculation about a potential peace effort. Ozgur Ozel, the leader of

Turkiye's main opposition party, CHP, branded the mayors' removal from office as a "a coup" and accused Erdogan of seizing "municipalities" he could not win in the elections. Politicians and members of Turkiye's pro-Kurdish movement have frequently been targeted over alleged links to the

PKK, which is considered a terror organisation by Turkiye, the US and the European Union. Legislators have been stripped of their parliamentary seats and mayors removed from office. Several lawmakers as well as thousands of party members have been jailed on terror-related charges since 2016.

# Japan successfully launches defence satellite carried by new H3 rocket

Japan launched a defence satellite aimed at speedier communication and military operations on a new flagship H3 rocket on Monday and successfully placed it into orbit, as the country seeks to build up its military capability amid growing tension in the region. The H3 No. 4 rocket lifted off from the Tanegashima Space Centre on a southwestern Japanese island. Everything went as planned and the satellite was successfully put into a targeted orbit, the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency, or JAXA, announced. The rocket was carrying a Defense Ministry satellite, Kirameki No. 3, which uses X-band communication for information and data sharing, as well as military operations and command. X-band satellite is less affected by weather conditions and is capable of supporting stable communication. Kirameki No. 3 follows two earlier X-band satellites already in operation to meet Japan's growing communication demands and enhance its satellite operations. Maj. Gen. Yasuhiro Kato, the

Joint Staff Systems Department chief, told an online joint news conference from Tanegashima that the triple X-band communication satellite system would enable high-speed, large-capacity data transmission and communication across Japan's Ground, Maritime and Air Self Defence Forces, as well as with units deployed overseas on peacekeeping missions or exercises. "It will further contribute to Japan's national security and the operational capacity of the Self Defence Forces," Kato said. Ipeki Kikuta, an Acquisition, Technology and Logistics Agency official, said Kirameki No. 3 will start operations by the end of March after being shifted to a designated geostationary orbit above Japan and tested, joining forces with the two other X-band satellites, Kirameki No. 1 and No. 2, which are in undisclosed locations. Japan is accelerating its military strategy that calls for Japanese troops to play a greater role in regional defense amid rising tension from China, North Korea and Russia. Monday's launch was initially

planned for October 20 and came after four postponements due to a technical glitch and bad weather. Kato said the delay had no impact on Japan's security and defence activity. JAXA President Hiroshi Yamakawa said he felt "relieved" that the H3 rocket was able to successfully deliver the satellite to its planned location after the two-week delay. The launch was the third consecutive successful flight of the H3 system after the shocking failed debut flight last year when the rocket had to be destroyed with its payload. Japan sees a stable, commercially competitive space transport capability as key to its space program and national security. JAXA and its main contractor, Mitsubishi Heavy Industries, have been developing the H3 launch system as a successor to its current mainstay, H-2A, which is set to retire after two more flights. MHI will eventually take over H3 production and launches from JAXA and hopes to make it commercially viable by cutting the launch cost to about half of the H-2A.

# Moldova's president wins 2nd term

AP ■ CHISINAU (MOLDOVA)

Moldova's pro-Western President Maia Sandu has won a second term in a pivotal presidential runoff against a Russia-friendly opponent, in a race that was overshadowed by claims of Russian interference, voter fraud, and intimidation in the European Union candidate country. With nearly 98% of votes counted in the second round of the presidential election held Sunday, Sandu had 54% of the vote, according to the Central Electoral Commission, or CEC, compared to 46% for Alexandr Stoianoglo, a former prosecutor general who was backed by the pro-Russia Party of Socialists. The result will be a major relief for the pro-Western government, which strongly backed Sandu's candidacy, and her push for closer Western ties on Moldova's path toward the EU. "Moldova, you are victorious! Today, dear Moldovans, you have given a lesson in democracy, worthy of being written in history books. Today, you have saved Moldova! In our choice for a dignified future, no one lost," Sandu said.

# Iran executes Jewish citizen

AP ■ TEHRAN

Iran on Monday executed a Jewish citizen convicted of murdering another man in 2022 following a person dispute, reports said. It was a rare case of an execution of member of a religious minority in the predominantly Muslim nation. Mizanonline.ir, a website affiliated with Iran's judiciary, said 23-year-old Arvin Ghahremani was put to death after the country's Supreme Court affirmed the capital punishment handed down in the case earlier last year. The report quoted Hamid Reza Karimi, the prosecutor of Kermanshah, as saying the court and the convicted man's lawyers and relatives had

failed to convince the victim's family to abstain from qisas — an act under Islamic penal code that calls for similar punishment, or an "eye for an eye" — and effectively pardon his killer. The victim's name was not provided. According to the report, Ghahremani attacked the victim outside a gym in Kermanshah in 2022 and stabbed the man several times following a dispute over money he had loaned the victim. Jewish citizens are a small minority in the country of 85 million. In 1999, Iran arrested 13 Jewish citizens, accusing them of spying for Israel and sentenced several to up to four years in prison.

# Bushra Bibi breaks down during court proceedings

A court in Pakistan on Monday witnessed emotional scenes when jailed former premier Imran Khan's wife Bushra Bibi burst into tears, expressing her utter helplessness against the inefficient justice system and her husband's "unjust sentencing." The former first lady appeared before Islamabad District Magistrate Afzal Majoka's court to acquire bail for her husband in six cases and herself in another case, registered at Tarnol, Karachi Company, Ramna, Secretariat and Kohsar police stations. During the hearing held at the Adiala Jail in Rawalpindi, Khan was not produced in the court. He was also not allowed to appear through a video link. When Bushra took to the rostrum to speak, she became emotional. "I have been facing injustice by those responsible for serving justice for the past nine months. I and the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf founder were unjustly sentenced," she said. "There is no justice. I haven't come to seek justice," she sobbed, and even blamed lawyers, saying all lawyers, including the one representing her, "only waste the time." "The person inside [the prison], isn't he a human? Doesn't any judge see this?" she said, adding that she would not come to this court again, where "there is no justice."

# India's manufacturing sector regains growth momentum

India's manufacturing sector growth recovered from September's eight-month low to 57.5 in October fuelled by faster increases in total new orders and international sales, a monthly survey said on Monday. The seasonally adjusted HSBC India Manufacturing Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) rose from September's eight-month low of 56.5 to 57.5 in October, indicating a substantial and accelerated improvement in operating conditions.

In PMI parlance, a print above 50 means expansion, while a score below 50 denotes contraction. "India's headline manufacturing PMI picked up substantially in October as the economy's operating conditions continue to broadly improve. Rapidly expanding new orders and international sales reflect strong demand growth for India's manufacturing sector," Pranjul Bhandari, Chief India Economist at HSBC, said. The upturn in performance was boosted by stronger demand for Indian goods. Moreover, the introduction of new products and successful marketing initiatives helped enhance sales performance. New export orders also exhibited stronger growth, following the weakest uptick in a year-and-a-half during September. Panel members reported gains in new contracts from Asia, Europe, Latin America and the US. On the prices front, the October data signalled stronger inflationary pressures across India's manufacturing sector. Goods producers were also

more willing to take on additional staff, which coupled with rising material costs, added to business expenses. Both input prices and selling charges increased at stronger rates. "Input and output prices are both increasing as a result of persistent inflationary pressures in materials, labour and transportation costs," Bhandari added. On the employment front, not only did manufacturers hire extra staff at the start of the third fiscal quarter, but also to a greater degree than in September. Around one in ten panellists reported an increase in employment, while 1 per cent shed jobs. Going ahead, Indian manufacturers became more optimistic regarding future output volumes. "To start the third fiscal quarter, business confidence is also very high due to expectations of continued strong consumer demand, new product releases and sales pending approval," Bhandari said. The HSBC India Manufacturing PMI is compiled by S&P Global from responses to questionnaires sent to purchasing managers in a panel of around 400 manufacturers.

# India re-elected as President of International Solar Alliance

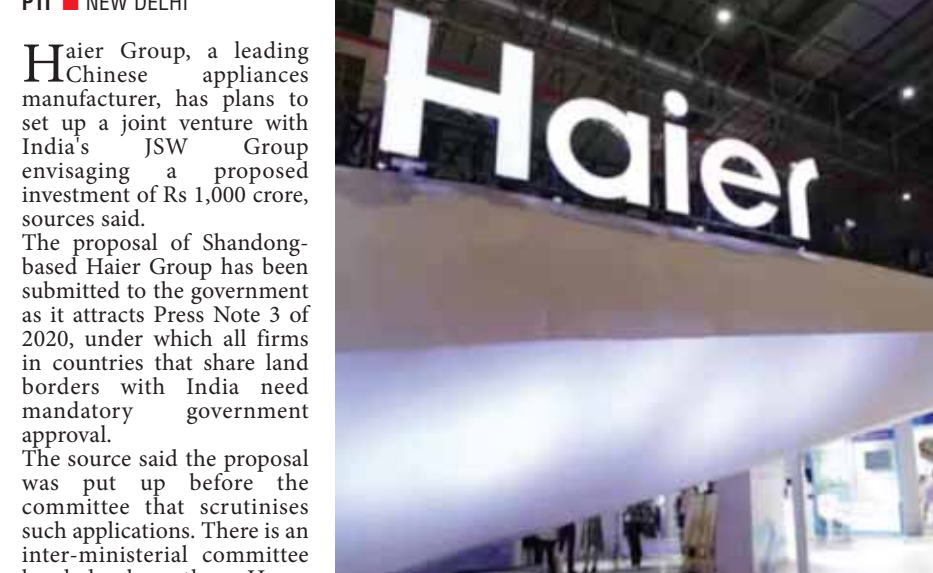
Union Minister Pralhad Joshi on Monday said India has been re-elected as the President of Indian Solar Alliance (ISA) from 2024 to 2026. Addressing the press conference at 7th General Assembly of the ISA, Joshi informed that France has been re-elected as Vice-President of the ISA. India's election to the President post is a testament to the impactful work the country, under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has been doing over the years for the global good in advancing solar energy adoption across the globe and boosting investment in essential solar projects, including mini-grids and healthcare solutions, Joshi opined. Eight Vice Presidents of the Standing Committee, two from each of the four ISA geographical regions, were also selected by the Assembly. From the Africa Region, Ghana and Seychelles have been selected as the Vice Presidents, while South Sudan and the Comoros will support the Vice Presidents as Vice-Chairs of Africa. From the Asia and the Pacific Region, Australia and Sri



Lanka has been selected as Vice Presidents, with the United Arab Emirates and Papua New Guinea as the Vice-Chairs, he informed. Germany and Italy have been selected as Vice Presidents from the Europe and the Others Region, along with Greece and Norway as Vice-Chair. Leading the Regional Committee of the Latin America and the Caribbean region will be Grenada and Suriname, Jamaica and Haiti as Vice-Chairs, he said. ISA Member Countries have also selected the third Director General of the Alliance. Ashish Khanna is the Director General Designate and will assume office in March 2025, when the tenure of the incumbent Director General, Ajay Mathur, comes to a close, he informed. ISA initiated Demonstration Projects in 2020 to meet the needs of Least Developed Countries (LDCs) and Small Island Development States (SIDS). The aim was to exhibit solar technology applications that can be scaled up and build the capacity of member countries to replicate these solar-powered solutions. Joshi noted that 11 of these projects were dedicated to the people of the respective countries: Bhutan, Burkina Faso, Cambodia, Cuba, Djibouti, Ethiopia, Mauritius, Samoa, Senegal, The Gambia, and Tonga. ISA remains committed to supporting governments in their efforts to scale up solar energy projects and improve the lives of their people, he stated. An important topic of discussion will be the guidelines for the Viability Gap Funding (VGF) Scheme, which provides for 10 per cent to 35 per cent of the total solar project cost to be given as a grant for developing solar projects in LDCs and SIDS identified by the countries themselves, provided 90 per cent of the project cost is locked in, he said. The ISA Assembly will also consider a proposal for promotion of greater involvement of women in ISA's initiatives, programs, and support activities, wherever feasible, across member countries, he said.

# China's Haier Group plans JV with JSW Group envisaging ₹ 1K Crore investment

Haier Group, a leading Chinese appliances manufacturer, has plans to set up a joint venture with India's JSW Group envisaging a proposed investment of Rs 1,000 crore, sources said. The proposal of Shandong-based Haier Group has been submitted to the government as it attracts Press Note 3 of 2020, under which all firms in countries that share land borders with India need mandatory government approval. The source said the proposal was put up before the committee that scrutinises such applications. There is an inter-ministerial committee headed by the Home Secretary to consider applications under the press note. Countries which share land borders with India are China, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Bhutan, Nepal, Myanmar and Afghanistan. An email query sent to both companies remained unanswered. Last year in November, the USD 24-billion JSW Group signed a JV with China's auto major SAIC Motor to acquire a 35 per cent stake in MG Motor India. The JV was named JSW MG Motor India Private Ltd. Around 51 per cent of the company's shares are with Indian entities, including JSW, which has a 35 per cent stake.

# CIL should prioritise augmenting coal production, supplies to reduce import

State-owned CIL's priorities should be to ramp up production of coal and scale up supplies to reduce imports, Union Minister G Kishan Reddy has said. Coal India Ltd (CIL) accounts for over 80 per cent of domestic coal output. Speaking at CIL's 50th Foundation Day on Sunday, the minister stressed upon the importance of miners' welfare and the rehabilitation of communities affected by mine closures. "Contractual workers play a significant role in Coal India's output, and I applaud the management's decision to implement Performance Linked Incentives for them, effective FY 2023-24," he was quoted as saying in a coal ministry statement. The launch of commercial coal mining has led to transparency, ease of doing business and investment opportunities, helping open the coal sector. Exuding confidence in CIL, he stated that the company has the competency and commitment to compete in the current open market scenario. While coal will remain a central component of the country's energy landscape for the coming decades, India is also heavily investing in renewable energy and addressing climate change, the coal minister explained. He commended CIL's diversification efforts, including setting up of a thermal power plant and foraying into critical mineral acquisition. "In the Viksit Bharat initiative, Coal India has a vital role to play and it needs to shoulder this responsibility," he emphasised. Coal Secretary Vikram Dev Dutt highlighted that CIL provides coal to Indian consumers at competitive rates compared to imported coal. He added that coal stocks at power plants reached 31.6 MT as on October 28, 2024, as compared to 18.8 MT a year ago. This growth of 68 per cent is largely attributed to the contribution of CIL. Coal India, he said, should recalibrate its processes, operational and cost efficiency in accordance to the changing business dynamics.

# Air purifier sales spike over 50 per cent as air quality worsens

Demand for air purifiers has witnessed a surge as air quality, especially in Delhi-NCR, dropped to hazardous levels, according to manufacturers of the product. Companies, including Kent RO Systems, Xiaomi, and LG Electronics India, said in the festive season, air purifiers sales grew up to 50 per cent as the Air Quality Index (AQI) of Delhi and the adjoining moved towards an alarming level. Like the previous year, the appliance makers have witnessed growth in the last 2-3 weeks in sales and enquiries for air-purifiers and expect a further uptick with the increase in the AQI index in the coming weeks. Air purifier is a very small segment of the appliances market and its sales generally peaks in October and November, when the pollution level in North India, particularly Delhi NCR, and some other parts worsens due to stubble burning and Diwali celebrations. LG Electronics India Senior VP-Home Appliances Sanjay Chitkara said: "As Delhi battles one of its worst pollution seasons yet, suddenly the demand for air purifiers has surged in Delhi NCR". The city's AQI has crossed hazardous levels, with pollutants that are much smaller than the common PM2.5 particles, making them extremely dangerous and hard to filter out, he said. Kent RO Systems CMD Mahesh Gupta said sales of air purifiers and filters witnessed a significant surge during the winter months in India, coinciding with the deterioration in air quality. The alarming levels of pollution, especially in the northern regions, create a sense of urgency among consumers to protect their health, he said. "During the festive season, we observe a noticeable increase in sales of about 20-25 per cent as consumers become more conscious of indoor air quality and their overall well-being," he said. Xiaomi said amid rising pollution levels, particularly in the North region, there has been a noticeable shift in consumer behaviour, with a growing focus on health and cleaner indoor environments. "This has driven a sharp rise in Xiaomi's air purifier & air purifier filter sales, with numbers climbing over 50 per cent higher than usual in the past month," said a Xiaomi spokesperson. According to a report from EMR,



2032, it said. Some of the makers such as Panasonic and Daikin have either scaled down their presence in the segment or have exited due to below-expectation growth and seasonal sales. Last month, Consumer Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi had criticised air purifier manufacturers for making false claims about their products, and called for increased consumer awareness ahead of winter when air pollution worsens in Delhi due to crop stubble burning in neighbouring states. 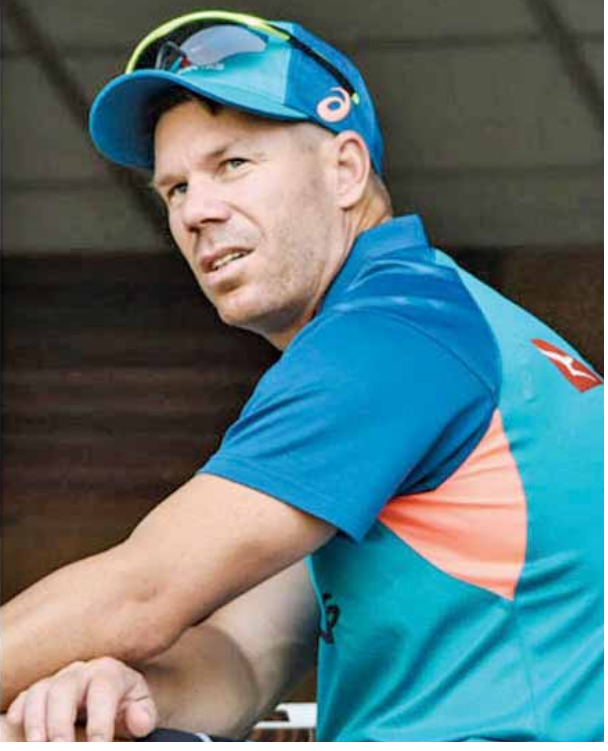

# Series defeat against NZ will impact India's performance against Aussies: Gilchrist, Warner

Australian legends Adam Gilchrist and David Warner have little doubt that Indian players' psyche would have been scarred after the recent whitewash at home by New Zealand, but they said it will be naive to consider Rohit Sharma's side "easy beats" in the five-Test Border-Gavaskar Trophy, beginning at Perth from November 22. The Tom Latham-led Kiwis blanked India 3-0, marking one of the lowest points in their Test history, also denting the chances of qualifying for the World Test Championship (WTC) final next year. "It does (series defeat has an impact), more for the Indian players and the Indian team internally. They have to be asking themselves pretty hard questions," former wicketkeeper batter Gilchrist told Fox Sports. "But I'm not expecting them to come out and be easy beats,

but I do think on the back of that loss and the fact that it was a clean sweep - I cannot remember when that's happened to them, just losing a series, let alone a clean sweep - I think that will raise some questions internally. "The pressure and the expectation and the desire from a passionate cricketing nation to see that change around, that'll ride heavily on those shoulders of all those players." Gilchrist said India has the wherewithal to regroup after the heavy setback. "There are a few ageing players (with the Indian team) who may start to even second guess themselves a little bit. There're some high-class cricketers in that Indian squad. It's going to be fascinating to see how they rebound from that challenge," he added. **WE NEED RUNS AGAINST BUMRAH, SIRAJ; WARNER:** Former opener Warner said the series defeat



against the Black Caps will certainly be playing in Indian cricketers' minds. "It (the series defeat) helps the Australian guys. They're coming here after being beaten at home 3-0 for five Tests against the Australian boys, (who have) three world class quicks and a world class spin bowler, and I'd be nervous if I'm in their batting order. I would be nervous," said Warner. The left-hander felt that countering pacers Jasprit Bumrah and Mohammed Siraj would be key to Australia's success in the upcoming series. "The Australian top order needs to make runs against Bumrah and Siraj who are their spearheads. I think if Australia can get through those two gentlemen, there could be some big runs put on the board. "But we're going to have to come out with our chest out against India. We have lost our last two series here against India (and) they have got a lot to play for." Warner also did not read too much into the modest form of Indian veterans like Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli. "You have got Rohit Sharma, Virat Kohli, Ashwin, Jadeja. You got these guys there who are in the back end of their careers. So, there's a lot to play for there, and whether or not they finish their careers this year or next year, they will want to finish on a high. "I know those guys very, very well, and they will be so determined to come out here and score big runs." Former Australian batter Mark Waugh said India will miss the services of seamer Mohammed Sham, who is still recuperating from a surgery. "If Mohammed Shami is not on the tour, that is a huge blow for India because I think their pace attack would worry us with Shami in there. He is a big loss," reckoned Waugh.



## So proud of you: Ravindra reveals rare message from dad after NZ historic series win

New Zealand's Rachin Ravindra revealed a rare text message he received from his father, expressing pride in the batter's achievements after the Black Caps notched a "special" Test series win in his parents' place of birth. New Zealand wrapped up a memorable tour of India, becoming the first team in history to register a 3-0 Test series sweep against the Asian giants in their own backyard. The 24-year-old, who was the star of the first Test, was born and brought up in Wellington but his familial roots are firmly entrenched in Bengaluru. "I haven't heard my dad say to me, 'so proud of you' often in my life, so it was nice to get that message when we won," Ravindra said on Sen Radio. The stylish left-hander's parents Ravi Krishnamurthy and Deepa hail from Bengaluru, while his grandparents T. Balakrishna Adiga, a noted educationist, and Poornima still stay in the Indian city. He revealed that his father was present to witness Ravindra's match-winning exploits first-hand in Bengaluru where he scored a century and an unbeaten 39 in his two innings to fashion New Zealand's eight-wicket win in the series opener.

## I've come to know the feeling of running the drinks really well: Will Young

Replacing a player of Kane Williamson's stature can be a daunting task but Will Young, who played a pivotal role in New Zealand's historic 3-0 Test series win in India, saw it as an opportunity to create his own mark after "running the drinks" as a reserve batter for four years. If New Zealand's batting appeared thin with Williamson not making it to India for the first Test in Bengaluru due to injury, the 31-year-old Young banished any such doubts with his unbeaten 48 as the Kiwis hammered the hosts by eight wickets. As it became evident that Williamson would not make it to India in time to help New Zealand clear trials by spin at Pune and Mumbai, Young had given enough indications that he was ready for the challenge. "Since my debut about four years ago, I've been in and out through form (or) through selection. "I've been a reserve batter for a number of years now so I've come to know the feeling of running the drinks really well," Young told media here after New Zealand's historic win, insinuating that

he was always ready. "When I do get an opportunity to play, I'm more excited to go out and do my own thing in my own way and not try to replace Kane or whoever it might be, just play my own game and see it as a great opportunity rather than big boots to fill," he added. Young acknowledged the role Williamson played in New Zealand's training camps back home and also during his presence on the earlier assignments in the Indian subcontinent. "Unfortunately Kane's not here and if he was, he'd be a great person to lean into and to ask what he thinks in certain situations. We also had three really good camps leading into the series back home and he was at those camps. "But it's great at the moment because we've got fantastic batters all throughout our line-up and they've all got slightly different methods and on the day you've just got to pick what method you think will work and you've got to have the courage to back that and show your skills. "Yeah, I try not to bat like Kane, I try to bat like me and do it my own way," he added.

For New Zealand to beat India at their own game on spinning wickets was as special as their series win in this part of the world, and Young conceded scoring runs on turning tracks in Pune and Mumbai was more satisfying. "If you look at all three matches, there was different challenges in each. In Bangalore, a lot of wickets fell to spin and then (in) Pune and Mumbai it was a lot more challenging against spin." "As a New Zealander coming over here and playing in Indian conditions, it's always going to be slightly more satisfaction of scoring runs against spin, so I'd suppose scoring runs in Pune or Mumbai felt more special," said Young, who ended the series as the third highest run-getter. With 244 runs at 48.80 across three Tests, Young finished behind India's Rishabh Pant (261 runs) and compatriot Rachin Ravindra (256 runs). However, his biggest contributions came in the third Test at Mumbai when Young's 71 and 51 across the two innings helped New Zealand become the first team ever to beat India 3-0 in their own backyard.

"I had Dad watch the first Test in Bangalore in his hometown, which was nice, and I'm sure Mum was biting her nails in front of the TV, not moving an inch back home. "It's very special and to be able to do it in the country of (my parents') birth is amazing," Ravindra admitted. "Although I've always maintained I'm

100 percent Kiwi born and brought up, it's nice to get that reminder every now and again," he added. Ravindra ended the series as New Zealand's leading run-getter, collecting 256 runs at an average of 51.20. It was his father's passion for the game that inspired a young Ravindra to take

## 'Superman' Wriddhiman, one of India's finest keeper-batter to retire

Spectacular with the big gloves, quietly assured with the willow and yet happy to be in the shadows, Wriddhiman Saha, in his 40 Test matches for India, has certainly been more than the sum total of all his parts. But having been out of India reckoning for over three years now, the 40-year-old has decided to call it quits from the game at the end of his team Bengal's ongoing Ranji Trophy campaign. The announcement was made on his social media page late last night. "After a cherished journey in cricket, this season will be my last. I am honoured to represent Bengal one final time, playing only in the Ranji Trophy before I retire," Saha said. "Let's make this season one to remember," he added in a post that went up late on Sunday night, typically unambiguous from the unassuming player. He never had the aura of a Mahendra Singh Dhoni or the insane daredevilry of a talented Rishabh Pant but Saha, with his hands as safe as a house, was more than a mere hyphen between the two powerhouse performers of

Indian cricket. The 104 dismissals behind the stumps, including 92 catches in Tests, some of them absolutely splendid, Saha's three centuries and six fifties aren't always spoken about for their effectiveness. Neither the eight six-laden century in a losing cause for erstwhile Kings XI Punjab in the 2014 IPL final. But Saha, for the better part of the 17 years since his Ranji debut in 2007, was happy to stay out of the spotlight. Patience came easy to him as he had to wait nearly two years between his debut and second Test and nearly three years between his second and third Tests. He was always that ever present understudy to Dhoni, knowing well that he will have to wait till the great man called time in whites. Saha was an old fashioned Indian keeper like Syed Kirmani or Nayan Mongia -- brilliant behind the stumps and a safe batter, who could be used as a floater in the middle order. Whether keeping up to R Ashwin and Ravindra Jadeja on perennially under-prepared Indian tracks or gauging the



wobbly seam movement of Ishant Sharma's deliveries, between 2015 and 2018, Saha was undoubtedly one of the world's best glovemen at work. And one can say that with assurance despite his contemporaries being Matthew Wade, BJ Watling, Mushfiqur Rahim, and Jonny Bairstow. There were moments behind the stumps that one simply cannot forget. A flying catch to pouch South Africa's Faf du Plessis off Ashwin's delivery in front of silly point, which earned him the moniker of 'Superman WriddhiMan', was a moment of sheer brilliance. His keeping was so exceptional that despite an IPL hundred, three Test tons and a brilliant Irani Cup double ton in a tricky chase, his batting never got the due it deserved. And when Pant burst into the scene with his 'X-factor' batting, he was again confined to being the second keeper. Once Gabba happened, the writing was on the wall for Saha and Rahul Dravid, the new coach, in a frank discussion during the tour of South Africa decided to show him the mirror that at 38, it makes no sense to be a second

keeper behind a 20-something. Having scored a fifty (vs New Zealand) in a preceding series and probably misunderstanding former BCCI president Sourav Ganguly's generic encouragement as an assurance, his impregnable patient "defence" was breached as he fired some verbal salvos. A spat with a Cricket Association of Bengal office-bearer saw him leave for Tripura for a couple of years before coming back home for a final hurrah. His attitude towards life remained the same. From the time he was a 16-year-old, who came from North Bengal's Siliguri and stayed at a dingy PG in central Kolkata's Koley Market area, to the time he became a known figure with a posh South Kolkata apartment and a luxury car, all he wanted to do was complete his tasks and answer only in mono-syllables. Trust Virat Kohli to find that enduring. "You particularly feel happy when a team-man like Saha does well. Such a nice person, never cribs about anything, does not have a bad word to say about anybody, ready to bat at Nos 8, 9, or 10," the skipper had once said about his teammate.
