## MEA summons Canadian diplomat

India on Saturday said it summoned the Canadian high commission representative and lodged a strong protest over Ottawa's allegations against Union Home Minister Amit Shah. "We had summoned the representative of the Canadian High Commission yesterday, a diplomatic note was handed over in reference to the proceedings of the Standing Committee on Public Safety and National Security in Ottawa on October 29, 2024," Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said. India protested in the strongest possible terms the references made by a Canadian minister about Shah and said that such "absurd and baseless" allegations will have serious consequences for bilateral ties between the two

countries, the MEA said on Saturday. The comments came after Canada's Deputy Foreign Affairs Minister David Morrison on Tuesday alleged that Shah ordered a campaign of violence, intimidation and intelligence-gathering targeting Sikh separatists inside Canada. Morrison had also told Canadian Parliament members of the national security committee that he had confirmed Shah's name to The Washington Post, which first reported the allegations. Jaiswal said this revelation that high Canadian government officials deliberately leaked unfounded insinuations to international media as part of a conscious strategy to discredit India and influence other nations only confirms the view that the Indian government has long held about the current Canadian government's political agenda and behavioural pattern.

Replying to queries during a weekly Press briefing, Jaiswal said such irresponsible actions will have serious consequences for bilateral ties. He said India summoned a Canadian High Commission representative on Friday and the official was served a diplomatic note to lodge the protest in strongest terms on the "absurd and baseless" references made by the Canadian deputy minister about India's Union Home Minister. While addressing the Parliament members, Morrison did not say how Canada knew of Shah's alleged involvement. The diplomatic relations between India and Canada deteriorated after Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said a year ago that Canada had credible evidence agents of the Indian government was involved in the murder of Canadian Sikh activist Hardeep Singh Nijjar in British Columbia

in June 2023. Dismissing the allegations as absurd, Indian government officials have consistently denied that Canada provided evidence. Last month, India recalled its high commissioner Sanjay Verma after the diplomat was named as 'person of interest' by Canada in its probe into Nijjar's killing. New Delhi withdrew its high commissioner and expelled six Canadian diplomats from its soil. Calling Canada's behaviour "the pits", Verma in an interview last week said India was backstabbed and treated in a most unprofessional manner by a country that is supposed to be a friendly democracy. "A handful of supporters of Khalistan have turned the ideology into a criminal enterprise, which indulges in a range of activities such as gun-running and human trafficking and yet the Canadian authorities turn a blind eye because they comprise a vocal electoral bank for local politicians," Verma said. India also accused Canada of indulging in "harassment and intimidation" of Indian consular staff by putting them under audio and video surveillance in "flagrant violation" of diplomatic conventions. "Yes, some of our consular officials were recently informed by the Canadian government that they have been and continued to be under audio and video surveillance. Their communications have also been intercepted. We have formally protested to the Canadian government, as we deem these actions to be in flagrant violation of relevant diplomatic and consular conventions" Jaiswal mentioned during the briefing. "By citing technicalities, the Canadian government cannot justify the fact that it is indulging in harassment and intimidation," he alleged.



## Patrolling begins at Depsang

The Indian Army has commenced verification patrolling at Depsang, the second friction point in eastern Ladakh, the government said on Saturday. Patrolling at Demchok had begun on Friday, a day after the Indian and Chinese troops completed disengagement at the two friction points in eastern Ladakh. Replying to a query at a weekly press briefing, Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said following the disengagement agreement with China, the verification patrolling has begun on mutually agreed terms in both Demchok and Depsang. On Thursday, Indian and Chinese troops also exchanged sweets at several border points along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) on the occasion of Diwali. The traditional practice was observed a day after both countries completed troop disengagement at the two friction points, bringing a fresh thaw in Sino-Indian ties. Sources had earlier said that the areas and patrolling status were expected to be moved back to pre-April 2020 level.

## Forces gun down three terrorists in Kashmir

A day after a large number of residents, and tourists were seen bursting crackers and lighting diyas during Deepawali celebrations at Lal Chowk, the old city area of Khanar in Srinagar witnessed its first anti-terrorist operation in the last 30 months. The forces gunned down Usman Lashkari, a commander of Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT) by the joint team of security forces and four jawans including two Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) and two Jammu and Kashmir Police (JKP) personnel received injuries in an over eight hour-long operation on Saturday. Meanwhile, two more terrorists, one suspected to be a foreign terrorist, were neutralised by the security forces in the Halkan Gali area of South Kashmir's Anantnag district on Saturday. Of the two terrorists killed, one was a foreigner, and the other a local. Their group affiliation was yet to be ascertained, official sources said. In another terror-related incident, a search operation was launched on Saturday after the movement of terrorists was observed in Jammu and Kashmir's Bandipora district. According to preliminary reports, a joint team of the Special Operations Group of JKP and the CRPF jawans had launched a cordon-and-search operation in Khanar early Saturday morning, following inputs about the presence of terrorists in the area. The search operation turned into an encounter as the terrorists opened fire at the search party, which retaliated, they said. The residential house, where a group of terrorists were hiding, was completely raised to the ground after it caught fire in the heavy exchange of gunfire.



Inspector General of Police, Kashmir range VK Birdi said, "the day-long operation has been completed. Security forces have killed a terrorist, who has been identified as Usman Lashkari. IGP said the slain terrorist was the commander of Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT). He is a foreign terrorist and his role and involvement in the murder of Inspector Masroor has come to light and further investigation is being done in this regard." While the encounter was still going on President of the Jammu and Kashmir National Conference Dr Farooq Abdullah sparked off a fresh controversy by suggesting that terrorists should be captured rather than killed, to uncover the masterminds behind the recent surge in terror attacks across Jammu and Kashmir. Farooq Abdullah also demanded an investigation into the Budgam terror attack and said he doubted that it was done by the people who were trying to destabilise the government in Jammu and Kashmir.



## Four sanitary workers run over by Kerala Express

Four sanitary workers were run over by the speeding New Delhi-Thiruvananthapuram Kerala Express at 3 pm on Saturday. The dead hailed from Tamil Nadu and were working for a firm hired by the Railways to remove the garbage and waste from railway tracks. Three bodies have been recovered and taken to the Government Hospital Shoranur for autopsy. Search for the fourth body, of that of a male, was called off by evening because of strong undercurrents in the river and fading lights. The Fire Brigade told media persons that a scuba team would be deployed on Sunday morning to retrieve the body. All the victims hailed from Villupuram in Tamil Nadu. The incident occurred when the workers were collecting plastic garbage thrown at the tracks by passengers of trains. They were working at Kochin Bridge built over the Bharathapuzha which comes immediately after the Shoranur Railway Station.

## No longer a hoax, live cartridge found on Dubai-Delhi flight

In a major security breach, Air India on Saturday reported the discovery of an ammunition cartridge in the pocket of a seat on a flight from Dubai to Delhi on October 27. The cartridge was found on flight AI916 after it had landed at Indira Gandhi International Airport in the national capital, with all passengers safely leaving the plane. Following this, an FIR was registered under the Arms Act and a probe has been initiated. "One ammunition cartridge was found in the pocket of a seat of our flight AI916 after it had landed from Dubai at Delhi on October 27, and all passengers had safely disembarked," an Air India spokesperson confirmed. The airline emphasised that passenger and crew safety is its top priority and assured the public that it is working closely with airport security and law enforcement to ensure all protocols are observed and the matter is thoroughly investigated. The police shared news on Saturday, an Air India staff found the live round of ammunition during routine cleaning on a flight on October 27. Deputy Commissioner of Police (Indira Gandhi International Airport) Usha Rangani said, "On October 27, Indira Gandhi International Airport Police registered an FIR under the Arms Act after Air India staff found a live round of ammunition during routine cleaning on a flight." She added that



the case is under investigation and further details will be shared as the investigation progresses. However, this incident raises questions about potential lapses in security measures either at the Dubai departure airport or during the screening process, and investigators are expected to examine surveillance footage and passenger records as part of their probe. This comes after over 500 threat messages received by Indian carriers, many of which turned out to be hoaxes. Several air operators have reported such threats on their social media platforms, resulting in flight delays as thorough searches were conducted. To date, most of these threats have proven to be false alarms. Besides huge financial losses to airlines, these threats were spread across social media platforms, creating panic among the passengers.

## Gasp! PM 2.5 is 92 per cent higher this year

The 12-hour (from 8 pm to 8 am) reading of Particulate Matter 2.5 (PM2.5) concentration on Diwali night was 34 per cent higher than Diwali night in October 2022, going from 289 µg/m to 386 µg/m. Moreover, PM2.5 levels this year were more than twice as high as the average nighttime pollution recorded over the seven nights before Diwali. In its Diwali air pollution analysis, the Centre for Science and Environment (CSE) has highlighted that the average concentration of PM 2.5 during this Diwali (6 am to 4 pm) was 92 per cent higher, compared to last year. However, the unique pattern of Diwali trend this year was sudden sharp increase at night and also quicker dissipation the day after. The reasons behind this late build up and early dissipation of pollution on Diwali day were warm atmospheric conditions with relatively more efficient natural ventilation and adequate wind in the city. This is supposed to be one of the warmest October this year. "PM 2.5 levels that were already rising steadily



during the preceding five days leading up to Diwali, showed a marked increase of 46 per cent from October 28 through October 31. By midnight on October 31, PM2.5 hit a peak of 603 microgram per cubic metre (µg/m)-13 per cent higher than Diwali peaks observed in both 2022 (when Diwali had occurred on October 24) and 2023 (on November 12)," it said. According to analysis, the PM2.5 was in the poor category during the afternoon of October 31. But the evening build-up peaked to hit the severe levels

during midnight, and stayed elevated until early morning next day. This time the dissipation has occurred quicker compared to previous years - not lasting as a smog episode (that is remaining elevated at severe level for at least three consecutive days). It came down to more moderate levels of 97 µg/m by noon. Interestingly, the daytime (6 AM to 4 PM) air pollution on Diwali day showed comparatively higher levels. The average PM2.5 concentration during the day was 92 per cent higher than last year's Diwali

daytime average that was affected by the deeper inversion conditions of the winter. This reflects high local and regional pollution aided by the sharp increase in the share of farm fires. The analysis further highlighted that there was a massive build-up of pollution in different parts of the city on Diwali night - hitting severe levels and increasing the peak exposure levels for a large section of the population. This year, 9 out of 38 air quality monitoring stations recorded PM2.5 concentrations exceeding the critical threshold of 900 µg/m on Diwali night. The highest levels were observed at Nehru Nagar, reaching 994 µg/m, followed closely by Anand Vihar at 992 µg/m, Pusa IMD at 985 µg/m, Wazirpur at 980 µg/m, and JLN Stadium at 963 µg/m. Other affected areas are Okhla, CRRIMathura Road, Karni Singh Stadium, Lodi Road, Siri Fort. According to analysis, there was sudden and sharp escalation in farm fire count on the day of Diwali and that combined with the change of wind direction to north westerly. This increased the share of its contribution to Delhi's air quality by 27 per cent.

# Suffocation in the pollution of environmental politics

Before the onset of winter season, the country's capital starts suffocating and news coming from all directions starts blaming the farmers for this. From primetime debates on Doodarshan to seminars of intellectuals, farmers of Punjab, Haryana and Western Uttar Pradesh are blamed amid scenes of burning paddy straw for the poisonous smoke spreading in Delhi's air, while the truth is something else.

The deterioration in Delhi's air quality, which has reached a level of deep concern, is largely Delhi's own contribution; the contribution of farmers in this is just like salt in flour. The huge number of vehicles in Delhi is not only sucking up all the oxygen from the air, it is also spewing poison into the air of Delhi. At present, approximately 1.15 crore vehicles are registered in Delhi. The smoke emitted from these vehicles contains

particles like particulate matter (PM) PM2.5 and PM10, which cause respiratory problems and cardiovascular diseases arising from them. According to a report from South Asia, 40 per cent of the total pollution in Delhi comes from vehicles alone.

The amount of oxygen consumed by a car upon traveling 967 kilometers is equal to the amount of oxygen required for a person to breathe for a year. On top of that, emissions from vehicles include carbon dioxide, nitrogen oxides, carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, ozone, peroxy acyl nitrate (PAN), volatile organic compounds (VOCs) and PM between 2.5 and 10 micrometres, polluting the entire environment, flora and fauna included. They badly affect human health.

Large scale building work, road construction, excavation here and there, and development of infrastructure in Delhi emit dust. Its share as an important source of pollution in Delhi is about 20 per cent.

The National Capital Region (NCR) in itself is also an important industrial area of the country. Factories located in Delhi and the entire NCR, especially in cities like Ghaziabad, Faridabad, Modinagar, Muradnagar etc, are major sources of the "gift" of pollution to Delhi. Delhi seems to be unaware

of the fumes, harmful chemicals and carbon emissions emitted from these industries. Coal-fired power plants are also notorious sources of pollution. The smoke emitted from thermal power plants installed around Delhi contains sulphur dioxide and nitrogen oxides which are very harmful for public health. Pollution from industries and thermal power plants in Delhi and NCR account for about 20 per cent of the total pollution contribution.

The trend of burning garbage in Delhi, like in rest of the country, is no less toxic. Waste includes the burning of plastics and other harmful materials, which emit toxic gases into the air. According to the report, garbage burning contributes about 5 to 8 per cent of the total pollution in Delhi. Delhi has the world's highest garbage mountain (call it the Everest of garbage) with heaps of garbage everywhere. The gradual biological decomposition of garbage also emits gases like ammonia, methane and carbon dioxide, which would contribute to an estimated 1 to 2 per cent of Delhi's pollution.

Every year in October-November, farmers in Punjab, Haryana, and western Uttar Pradesh burn the stubble after harvesting paddy. This process also produces undesirable pollu-

tion, which adds a little to Delhi's own pollution, but all sections put the blame on the farmers of the three States. According to data, stubble burning in these



States increases Delhi's pollution by about 10 per cent, while almost 90 per cent of the pollution is Delhi's own "accomplishment".

Despite stubble burning contributing very little to the overall pollution, according to the National Air Quality Monitoring Report,

around 25-30 per cent of Delhi's total PM 2.5 levels come from stubble burning, but the truth is that Delhi's own pollution problem itself makes this problem more

serious. Why is there an uproar regarding pollution in Delhi only during these days and not in the remaining months of the year, when the same situation of emission of pollutants persists throughout the year? The reason for this is "inverted

dispersion" of pollutants, which is a weather-related phenomenon. In this phenomenon, cold air remains towards the surface and hot air remains upwards. This

smog is produced as a result of chemical processes of pollutants in the atmosphere. The smog covers the ambient environment of cities with a poisonous blanket. It is caused by a chemical reaction between nitrogen oxides and volatile organic compounds (VOCs) catalyzed by solar ultraviolet radiation, leading to the formation of ground-level ozone and PAN (peroxy acyl nitrate) as the main products of smog.

As Delhi grapples with rising air pollution, former AIIMS director Dr Randeep Guleria has warned that air pollution could cause more deaths than Covid-19. A 2021 report by the Health Effects Institute said that about eight million people died in the world due to air pollution. This is more than the number of people who have died due to Covid-19. Dr Guleria said, "We are worried about Covid, but we are not worried about air pollution."

Additional solicitor general Aishwarya Bhati, on behalf for the Central government, said Section 15 of the CAQM Act, which deals with penalty for stubble burning, will be effectively implemented. She said an adjudicating officer would be appointed and all necessary action would be taken to implement the law effectively. Ultimately, there is a preparation to make the

farmers who burn stubble the scapegoats.

It is true that incidents of stubble burning are polluting and there should be a complete ban on farmers doing so and there should also be a provision for punishment for those who disobey the law, even though farmers contribute only 10 percent to Delhi's pollution by burning stubble. But there should be some concrete policy on what action should be taken against those who contribute 90 percent to Delhi's pollution. How can ten percent pollution be sin and 90 per cent virtue?

If the pollution generated by farmers spoils the air of Delhi, then the pollution many times greater in Delhi would also be hurting the farmers of Punjab, Haryana and Western Uttar Pradesh, affecting their health. But the farmers never blamed Delhi which keeps cursing them these days.

The country's capital can be saved from becoming a gas chamber by preventing pollution from its own sources. Delhi also needs to be free from the dark shadow of pollution of environmental politics.

### Govt sends notice to 118 absentee doctors

Sources said that some of these doctors have remained absent since 2017.

The job aspirants have been asked to register themselves at the Union Government's national career service portal www.ncs.gov.in with latest photographs and academic qualification documents by November 10.

### 10 lakh tourist footfalls in Nainital till Aug this year

## Police penalise 1,365 individuals for drinking in public places in Doon

Acting against the continuing issue of people drinking in public places in Dehradun, the police have penalised 1,365 individuals and collected fines amounting to more than Rs four lakh in the past one month. The Dehradun senior superintendent of police Ajai Singh said that this campaign was launched with the aim to curb public intoxication and related disturbances as many people indulge in arguments and fights that often escalate to something serious. All the police station-in-charges have been directed to conduct regular inspection and take strict action against those found drinking in public places. The police team conducted inspections of parking lots, vacant grounds, eateries, forest areas and all possible places among others. The police also carried out regular patrolling and established checkpoints across various public spaces to identify and penalise individuals drinking in public or creating disturbances throughout October. The campaign led to the penalty of 1,365 individuals under the Police Act with fine collection of



Rs 4.09 lakh, the SSP said. He informed that maximum individuals were penalised for drinking in public places under the Raipur police station. He said, "The police imposed a penalty on 785 individuals under the Police Act in the Raipur area alone in the past one month. Out of total Rs 4.09 lakh penalties

collected in October, Rs 2.76 lakh was collected from violators in Raipur area. The Raipur police station turned out to be the most active unit in this campaign." Singh said that this drive will continue in Dehradun to uphold public safety and maintain law and order in the city, especially at night.

# Women leaders hold sway in Kedarnath Assembly constituency

## Late Shaila Rani Rawat and Asha Nautiyal have registered victories from the constituency on two occasions each

Women candidates have won in four out of five Assembly elections held in Kedarnath constituency after the creation of Uttarakhand in the year 2000. Late Shaila Rani Rawat and Asha Nautiyal have had the honour of representing the constituency in the State Assembly twice while Manoj Rawat has registered victory once.



In the first Assembly election of the State held in the year 2002, Asha Nautiyal was given ticket by the BJP against Shaila Rani Rawat of Congress. In this election Nautiyal defeated Shaila Rani Rawat by a margin of 3,465 votes. Nautiyal got 13,080 votes while Rawat got 9,615 votes.

In the Assembly elections of 2007, BJP reposed its faith in Nautiyal while Congress fielded veteran Kunwar Singh Negi from the constituency. Nautiyal registered her second consecutive victory from the constituency in the election as she defeated Negi by a margin of 2,979 votes. The winning streak of Nautiyal got broken in the Assembly elections of 2012 when Shaila Rani Rawat registered victory on Congress ticket. She received 19,960 votes while Nautiyal received 17,632 votes. In this election Ganga Dhar Nautiyal of CPI (M) received 2,395 votes.

Shaila Rani Rawat was one of the 11 MLAs of the Congress party who crossed sides in the revolt on the floor of the

Assembly against the then chief minister Harish Rawat. As promised by the top leadership of BJP, Shaila Rani Rawat was given the ticket by BJP in the Assembly elections of 2017. As expected, Asha Nautiyal revolted and contested the election as an independent candidate. The Congress on the other hand gave its ticket to journalist turned politician Manoj Rawat. In the four cornered contest Manoj Rawat defeated Kuldeep Rawat (Independent) by a margin of 869 votes. Nautiyal finished third while BJP candidate Shaila Rani Rawat was relegated to the fourth spot. In this election Manoj Rawat received 13,906 votes; Kuldeep Rawat got 13,037, Nautiyal 11,786 and Shaila Rani Rawat 11,780 votes.

7,544. Manoj Rawat received 12,557 votes to finish third.

The death of Shaila Rani Rawat on July 9 this year necessitated the by-election in Kedarnath. Contrary to the expectations that ruling BJP will field either Aishwarya Rawat, the daughter of late Shaila Rani Rawat or Kuldeep Rawat who had finished second in the elections of 2017 and 2022 and had joined BJP after the Assembly elections of 2022. However taking lessons from the defeat in the neighbouring Badrinath bypoll the BJP fielded the head of its Mahila Morcha Asha Nautiyal from the constituency in the hope of pleasing its core vote bank and party cadre.

Ahead of the Assembly elections of 2022, Nautiyal returned to the BJP's fold in the hope of party ticket. However the party again fielded Shaila Rani Rawat from the constituency. The Congress party fielded Manoj Rawat while Kuldeep Rawat again contested as an independent. Shaila Rani won from the constituency by a margin of

Interestingly, the BJP leadership has also ensured that Aishwarya and Kuldeep do not turn rebel and mar the chances of the official candidate of the party. The Congress party has again fielded Manoj Rawat. The stage is now all set for a direct contest between Congress and BJP in the important by-election.

# Congress set to win Kedarnath Assembly bypoll: Dhasmana

The vice president of Uttarakhand Congress Surya Kant Dhasmana has claimed that Congress candidate Manoj Rawat will register victory in the Kedarnath Assembly by-election.



Interacting with the media-persons here on Saturday, the Congress leader said that the people of Kedarnath have suffered from the mismanagement and lack of preparations during this year's Yatra. He said that the tall claims of the State government were exposed by the rain triggered natural disaster on July 31 when all the leaders of the BJP remained busy in election campaigns in different States. Dhasmana said that the Yatra remained almost closed for one and half months and even now the damaged bridge path to Kedarnath shrine has not been repaired completely.

The Congress leader added that people of Kedarnath and

the State want to know the truth behind the theft of 228 kilogrammes of gold from Kedarnath temple. # 108 emergency ambulance service helps 1,592 callers during Deepawali

The wheels of the ambulances of the 108 service of the State were constantly on the move to respond to the emergency calls during the Deepawali festival.

The data released by the ambulance service suggests that it provided help in 1,592 cases from October 29 to November 1 (Dhanteras to Deepawali) this year. It is worth mentioning here that the emergencies related to medical, fire and accidents increase appreciably during the festival of Deepawali and the service was all geared up to meet emergencies on the day.

The service responded to 53 cases of burn, 189 cases of road accident, 409 cases related to pregnancy and 817 other cases during the period of Deepawali. The personnel of the services helped in safe deliveries (births) during transit to the hospitals in the ambulances during the four day long festival



period. With 331 cases, Dehradun district had the maximum number of emergencies during the festival of lights from October 29 to November 1. Udhm Singh Nagar had 232 while 225 cases were reported from Haridwar district during the festival period. In Nainital district 137 emergency calls were received by the service.

In Dehradun district 55 cases of road accidents were reported. Maximum cases of burn (18) were reported in Bageshwar district followed by 10 cases in Nainital and six each in Dehradun, Haridwar and Udhm Singh Nagar districts.

The state head of 108 service, Anil Sharma reviewed the services provided by the

ambulance service during the Deepawali festival in a video conferencing session held in Dehradun office on Saturday. He said that the ambulance service was in a state of high alert to respond to emergencies during Deepawali. Sharma said that it is a matter of great pride that the personnel of the ambulance service worked with full commitment on the day when people celebrate the festival with their family members.

He added that arrangements were made to ensure that the ambulances don't get stuck up in the traffic during the festival. Sharma further informed that additional technical staff was deployed during the festival to ensure fast response and smooth operation.

# Rain likely in parts of Kumaon today, warmer weather to continue in State

The provincial State capital Dehradun and various other parts of the State have continued to experience above normal temperatures even with the start of November. However, parts of Kumaon may witness a change in weather on Sunday. The State meteorological centre has forecast that very light to light rain is likely to occur in Bageshwar and Pithoragarh districts today. Dry weather is likely to prevail in the remaining districts of the State.

The meteorological centre has further forecast that Dehradun is likely to witness a mainly clear sky with mist/haze likely to occur during the morning hours. The maximum and minimum temperatures are likely to be about 30 degrees

Celsius and 17 degrees Celsius respectively in Dehradun on Sunday. There appears to be no respite from above normal temperatures in Dehradun in the immediate future.

The maximum and minimum temperatures recorded on Saturday in various parts of the State were 30.7 degrees Celsius and 16.1 degrees Celsius respectively in Dehradun, 31 degrees Celsius and 16.6 degrees Celsius in Pantnagar, 20.6 degrees Celsius and 11.1 degrees Celsius in Mukteshwar and 22.8 degrees Celsius and 11.7 degrees Celsius in New Tehri. The temperatures in all of these locations have remained above normal. The maximum and minimum temperatures in Dehradun were three degrees Celsius

each above normal in Dehradun while the maximum was two degrees Celsius and the minimum was four degrees Celsius above normal in Pantnagar. Similarly, the maximum was two degrees Celsius above normal and the minimum was four degrees above normal in Mukteshwar while the maximum was a degree above normal and the minimum was three degrees above normal in New Tehri on Saturday. It is pertinent to mention here that the substantial deficit of rainfall and snow in the post-monsoon season in Uttarakhand this year has resulted in above normal temperatures in most parts of the State. With the start of November, proper cold is yet to arrive in most parts of the State unlike the scenario in general.

# BJP says it stands for credibility of promises under PM Modi, Congress for crisis

BJP on Saturday asserted that it stood for credibility of promises made to people under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership and the Congress for crisis of credibility, as the ruling party fired a fresh salvo at its rival in a war of words between them over unkept poll pledges.

BJP spokesperson Sudhanshu Trivedi told the media that the ruling party had gradually stepped up the scope of its welfare schemes, ranging from health insurance to free grains and cash transfer for farmers, by resorting to first creation of wealth followed by its

distribution as the size of the Indian economy grew over the past decade.

"We believe in first the creation of wealth and distribution. The Congress stands for creation of corruption and destruction of wealth," he said, citing a host of alleged unfulfilled promises of Congress-led governments in different states.

A day after Mallikarjun Kharge claimed that "Modi ki guarantee" was a cruel joke on people after the prime minister had seized on the Congress president's advice to his state colleagues that they should be guided by budgetary constraints in making poll announcements, the BJP

made a fresh charge. Was Kharge speaking the truth on Friday or a day before, Trivedi said mockingly, suggesting that the Congress president's attack on the BJP was made under pressure to cover up for what he had said earlier.

Trivedi cited the construction of the Ram temple, abolition of Article 370, construction of more than 14 crore houses for the poor, opening of over 51 crore Jan Dhan accounts, and India's tough stand against Pakistan on terrorism under Modi to assert that his government had walked the talk.

As a veteran Congress member who has served in senior positions, Kharge has



seen leaders such as PV Narasimha Rao and Pranab Mukherjee, who deftly handled the economy under difficult circumstances, and is now seeing the party under the grip of urban

Organisation) data suggested that its account holders had grown to 25 crore compared to 11 crore a decade ago.

He also cited a host of infrastructure work, including the construction of houses for the poor, 74 airports and 37 kilometres of road per day, and asserted that all these activities had led to a lot of employment.

India is now third in auto manufacturing and second in mobile phones manufacturing and if anyone still cannot see the country's development, then there is some serious weakness in their sight and mindset, the BJP spokesperson said.

When the BJP was in power

in Karnataka, it was the top state in attracting investment while Maharashtra under the Congress-led alliance's rule had slipped, he said, adding that the situation was reversed after the BJP came to power in the western state while losing to the Congress in the southern state.

"The brains of some parties are so empty that they end up emptying the treasury when in power," he said.

The Congress, Trivedi alleged, had lost the ability to govern, noting that its promise to provide one woman in every household Rs 1 lakh annually would have cost the country Rs 31 lakh crore even though its entire budget was only about

Rs 27 lakh crore. It was like a Ponzi scheme promise and could be part of a well thought-out conspiracy as the Congress believes in triggering chaos, he said.

Citing the welcome Modi received recently in the US, Russia and Ukraine from their top leaders, the BJP spokesperson said it was a testimony to the prime minister's standing. Any attempt to belittle him will have no impact on his popularity, reputation and image, he added.

To a question, he refuted opposition MP Asaduddin Owaisi's claim on Waqf boards, saying these were not religious bodies but constituted for land management.

## India records 17.7 per cent decline in TB incidence from 2015 to 2023: WHO report

India has recorded a 17.7 per cent decline in tuberculosis incidence from 237 per lakh population in 2015 to 195 in 2023, which is more than double the global decline of 8.3 per cent, Health Ministry sources have said citing a WHO report.

In its Global TB Report 2024 released on October 29, WHO has acknowledged the tremendous progress India has made in closing the gap of missed tuberculosis cases since 2015, the sources said.

"In 2023, India is estimated to have had 27 lakh TB cases, of which 25.1 lakh were diagnosed and put on treatment. This has buoyed India's treatment coverage to 89 per cent in 2023 from 72 per cent in 2015, thereby bridging the gap of missing cases," an official source said.

The source said WHO has "acknowledged a drop in India's tuberculosis incidence from 237 per lakh population in 2015, to 195 per lakh population in 2023 accounting for a 17.7 per cent decline.

"This is more than double the pace of decline as compared to the global decline of 8.3 per cent," the source said.

The Health Ministry sources asserted that the leap in coverage has been due to the momentum India has created around tuberculosis case finding and reflects the efforts of decentralisation of healthcare services through over 1.7 lakh Ayushman Arogya Mandirs in the country.

While WHO had downsized its estimation of tuberculosis mortality in India last year, the current report documents the sustained reduction in deaths due to the disease achieved by India from 28 per lakh population to 22 per lakh population, a 21.4 per cent decline, they said.

The government has been able to strengthen and expand the National TB Elimination Programme with sustained domestic financing, official sources said.



The tuberculosis budget saw a historic 5.3 times leap in allocation from R 640 crores in 2015 to Rs 3400 crores in 2022-23. The WHO report noted that a majority of the funding for the TB programme comes from government resources.

Over the years, India has been able to scale up state-of-the-art molecular diagnostic tools, introduce newer and more efficacious treatment regimens and provide free screening, diagnosis and treatment to all tuberculosis patients.

The government is procuring over 800 artificial intelligence-enabled portable chest x-ray machines to complement India's extensive TB laboratory network, the largest in the world with 7,767 rapid molecular testing facilities and 87 culture and drug susceptibility testing laboratories, the sources said.

"This acknowledgement by WHO signifies the paradigm shift India has brought to tuberculosis care over the past eight years. In October, the government announced the enhancement of support under Nikshay Poshan Yojana (NPY) from Rs 500 per month to each patient for the entire duration of the treatment to Rs 1,000," another source said.

To date, Rs 3,202 crore has been disbursed to 1.13 crore beneficiaries through Direct Benefit Transfer under the scheme. While enhancement of NPY support will benefit all 25 lakh tuberculosis patients in a year, the introduction of Energy Dense Nutritional Supplementation (EDNS) would cover approximately 12 lakh undernourished TB patients.

## Jaishankar, Thai counterpart discuss bilateral ties, multilateral cooperation

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and his Thai counterpart Maris Sangiampongsa discussed bilateral ties, multilateral cooperation and regional developments during a meeting in Delhi on Saturday.

In a social media post, Jaishankar said Sangiampongsa's visit for the Royal Kathina ceremony "exemplifies the longstanding historical and cultural relations" between the two countries. The Thai minister is scheduled to depart India on Sunday. Jaishankar also shared pictures of the meeting at the South Block.

"Delighted to meet FM @AmbPoohMaris of Thailand today in Delhi. His visit for the Royal Kathina ceremony exemplifies the longstanding historical and cultural relations between our two countries. We discussed India-Thailand ties, multilateral cooperation and regional developments," he said. Royal Kathina is a traditional Buddhist ceremony.



Sangiampongsa's first official visit to India was during July 11-13 for the second BIMSTEC Foreign Ministers' Retreat, hosted by the external affairs minister in New Delhi.

On July 12, Jaishankar held a bilateral meeting with Sangiampongsa and hosted a lunch in his honour. During that meeting, the two ministers reviewed progress across various areas of partnership.

The two ministers also exchanged views on issues of mutual interest and reiterated their commitment to closer cooperation in sub-regional, regional and multilateral fora, the Ministry of External Affairs had said.

In accordance with the vision of the two prime ministers, the ministers reaffirmed the mutual desire for a stronger India-Thailand partnership, it had added.

Thailand is a key partner for India in the ASEAN. India's 'Act East' policy, which is in its tenth year, finds convergence with Thailand's 'Act West' policy. Interactions between Jaishankar and the Thai foreign minister have contributed to further strengthening of bilateral ties, it had added.

## SC to hear Rajoana's plea seeking commutation of death sentence

The Supreme Court is scheduled to hear on November 4 a plea by Balwant Singh Rajoana, convicted in the 1995 assassination case of the then Punjab Chief Minister Beant Singh, seeking commutation of his death sentence to life term due to an "inordinate delay" in deciding his mercy petition.

A special bench of Justices B R Gavai, P K Mishra and K V Viswanathan will hear the plea of the former Punjab Police constable.

On September 25, the top court had sought responses from the Centre, the Punjab Government and the administration of the Union Territory of Chandigarh on Rajoana's plea. In his plea, Rajoana has sought directions to the Centre and the Punjab government to commute his death sentence "due to inordinate delay" in its execution and in deciding the "mercy petition filed on his behalf".

Rajoana was convicted in Beant Singh's assassination



case. The former chief minister and 16 others were killed in a blast at the entrance of the civil secretariat in Chandigarh on August 31, 1995. A special court had sentenced Rajoana to death in July 2007. Rajoana has said that in March 2012, a mercy petition under Article 72 of the Constitution was moved by the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) on his behalf. On May 3 last year, the apex court had refused to commute his death sentence and said the competent authority could deal with his mercy plea.

In his fresh plea filed in the top court, Rajoana has said he

has undergone a total sentence of about 28 years and eight months, of which he served 17 years as a death row convict. It has been over a year since the top court directed the competent authority to decide on his mercy petition, he said. The plea referred to an April 2023 order of the top court in a separate matter in which it directed all States and appropriate authorities to decide the pending mercy petitions at the earliest and without any inordinate delay.

"Despite the above directions, the mercy petition of the petitioner herein has been kept pending. It is submitted that this extraordinary and inordinate delay in deciding his mercy petition, for reasons beyond the petitioner's control and not attributable to him, is an infringement of his right to life guaranteed under Article 21," said the plea, adding that the issue of keeping mercy petitions pending for long and the incarceration of the convict has come up for consideration before the apex court in numerous cases.

## Modi destroyed dignity of PM's post with repeated hollow promises: Priyanka

In a scathing attack on Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi on Saturday said the prime minister has "destroyed" the dignity of the highest post of the country by repeatedly making "hollow promises" to 140 crore Indians.

She also said that instead of worrying about the Congress, Modi should work on "restoring the dignity of his post by resorting to truth". Her remarks came after Modi on Friday said the Congress stands "badly exposed" in front of the people for promising to them what the party knows it will never be able to deliver.

The prime minister launched a fierce attack on the opposition party as he seized on Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge's comments that the Congress' state units should make promises that are properly budgeted.

He also said the developmental trajectory and fiscal health in the Congress-ruled states of Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka and Telangana is going from bad to worse.

Hitting back at the prime minister, Priyanka Gandhi said in a post in X in Hindi, "Mahatma Gandhi used to say 'Truth is God'. 'Satyameva Jayate' written in Mundaka Upanishad is our national motto. These mottos establishing truth became the ideals of the



Indian freedom movement, the reconstruction of India and public life.

"In a country where truth is the basis of thousands of years of culture, the person sitting on the highest post should not resort to falsehood." The allegations levelled by the prime minister against the Congress are far from the

truth, she said.

"The Congress started fulfilling the promises made to the people as soon as it formed the government, without waiting for the next elections. Be it Karnataka, Telangana or Himachal Pradesh, people's money is being put into their pockets everyday through guarantees," the Congress general secretary said in the post.

The prime minister has understood that his words no longer have any value before the country's people, she claimed.

Sharpening her attack on Modi, Priyanka Gandhi continued, "The '100 days plan', 'taking opinion of 20 lakh people for the roadmap for 2047', '2 crore jobs every year', '100 smart cities',

'bringing back black money', 'reducing inflation and unemployment', 'doubling farmers' income', 'bringing rupee at par with dollar' and 'bringing 'Acheche Din' -- these are all promises which have been proven false and now the people of the country have no faith in them."

Congress' media and publicity department head Pawan Khera also slammed the prime minister, saying the latter has lowered the dignity of his post by resorting to false promises. Claiming that the Congress governments have fulfilled their promises in the states ruled by them, Khera alleged in a video statement that Modi had to even delete a post attacking the party out of fear of being fact-checked.

## We are in touch with US authorities: MEA on sanctions on Indian entities

In the wake of the US imposing sanctions on several individuals and entities, including from India, for allegedly supporting Russia's military-industrial base, the MEA Saturday said New Delhi is in touch with Washington to clarify issues.

MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal, in response to a query during his weekly briefing, also said India has a "robust legal and regulatory framework" on strategic trade and non-proliferation controls.

"We are also a member of three key multilateral non-proliferation export control regimes," he added. "In keeping with India's established non-proliferation credentials, we are working with all relevant departments and agencies to sensitise Indian companies on applicable export control provisions as also inform them on new measures being implemented that



could impact Indian companies in certain circumstances," Jaiswal said.

The US has imposed sanctions on 275 individuals and entities, including 15 from India, for allegedly supporting Russia's military-industrial base. The US Department of Treasury said in a statement on Thursday that companies from China, Switzerland, Thailand, and Türkiye have also been slapped with sanctions for supplying Russia with advanced

## India committed to Sendai Framework for disaster risk reduction: Principal Secretary to PM

Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister P K Mishra has affirmed India's commitment to the Sendai Framework for disaster risk reduction and called for increased international collaboration on knowledge sharing, technology transfer and sustainable development to enhance disaster resilience globally.

Mishra said this while participating in the G-20 Disaster Risk Reduction Working Group (DRRWG) ministerial meeting in Belem, Brazil, according to an official release. He led a high-level Indian delegation which took part in the meeting held from October 30 to November 1.

With the active participation of the Indian delegation, a consensus was arrived at on finalising the first ministerial declaration on Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR), the release issued by the Union Ministry of Home Affairs said. During various sessions, Mishra shared the progress made by the government of India in



reducing disaster risks and in upscaling disaster financing. He emphasised India's proactive approach to disaster risk reduction on five priorities of the DRRWG which were enunciated during India's presidency of G20 -- early warning systems, disaster resilient infrastructure, DRR financing, resilient recovery and nature-based solutions.

On disaster resilient infrastructure, he spoke about Prime Minister Narendra Modi's global initiative of Coalition for Disaster Resilience Infrastructure (CDRI), which now has 40 countries and seven international organisations as

members, the release said.

The Indian delegation also participated in a troika meeting with the ministers of Brazil and South Africa. It also held bilateral meetings with ministers from Brazil and other countries, namely Japan, Norway, South Africa, South Korea, Germany, and heads of invited international organisations. Responding to discussions on extreme heat, Mishra shared experience and steps being taken, including the focus on promoting traditional practices, to suit local conditions.

The first DRRWG was established on India's initiative during its G20 presidency in 2023. Mishra congratulated Brazil on its continuation of the DRRWG and scaling it up to the ministerial level and affirmed India's support to South Africa on the DRRWG during their G20 presidency next year. India's participation underscores its growing role in global DRR efforts and its commitment to building a safer and more resilient world, the release said.

## CPI(M) slams Government for denying permission to its MP to attend Venezuela event

The CPI(M) on Saturday slammed the Government for not granting political clearance to party MP V Sivadasan to participate in a parliamentary forum in Venezuela and called it an attempt to stifle the voices of those who did not conform with the ruling party's views.

Termining the denial of permission "political discrimination", the CPI(M) said this should be a matter of concern for all opposition parties and their MPs.

"The Polit Bureau of the Communist Party of India (Marxist) condemns the Central Government's decision denying political clearance to Dr V Sivadasan, Member of Parliament (Rajya Sabha), to attend the Parliamentarian Forum Against Fascism, being held in Caracas, Venezuela," the CPI(M) said in a statement.

"This is an attempt to stifle any voice that does not conform with the ruling party's views," it said.

The statement said the CPI(M) received an invitation from the National Assembly of Venezuela to nominate its Parliament members for the forum. The party nominated Sivadasan to participate in the forum, where parliamentarians from many countries are going to be present. "It is highly deplorable that in spite of getting the FCRA (Foreign Contribution Regulation Act) clearance, the Ministry of External Affairs denied political clearance to Sivadasan, thus infringing his rights as a Member of Parliament," the CPI(M) said.

MPs are required to obtain prior permission of the Centre for accepting any foreign hospitality during their private visits abroad or visits abroad in their personal capacity under the FCRA. The CPI(M) further said, "The Government is following a policy of political discrimination, where differing voices are prevented from expressing their views. This should be a matter of concern for all opposition parties and their members of Parliament."

# Elephant attack leaves two dead in Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve, locals believe 'it's an act of revenge'

In an incident that is sure to echo in the sal-covered forests of Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve for generations, three wild elephants trampled three men, killing two, on Saturday morning, barely four kilometres from Salakhaniya, where ten elephants have died in less than a week.

Attribute it to Bollywood or a local penchant for folklore, but many in the area are absolutely convinced that the elephant attack is an act of revenge.

Forest officials have neither confirmed nor denied that the attacking wild mammals belonged to the herd of thirteen, of which ten have perished this week.

They said that the remaining three from the herd are believed to have made their



way into the neighbouring Katni district, and efforts are underway to track their movement. Forest officials camping in the area since the outbreak of the elephantine tragedy have ordered the destruction of the Kodo millet harvest and crops in the area.

are deadly for human and animal health, indigenous tribals who have grown the grain for generations say that they have never encountered any such issue with the crop.

The order for the destruction of 'contaminated' Kodo is causing heartburn among the marginal farmers that dot the area, especially as there is no official word on how they would be compensated for their loss of earnings.

Kodo has been widely grown in the region for decades, if not centuries, but the little-known millet came into the limelight last year when the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) and the United Nations declared 2023 as the International Year of Millets. The crop is now added to multigrain atta preferred by the health-conscious, and the state government has incentivised its production by offering an MSP on the yield.

People in the area concede that the fungus-infested Kodo does cause intoxication but refute claims and research suggesting that the tiny grain is detrimental to human or animal health.

With the controversy gaining mammoth proportions, Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav convened top forest administration officials at his residence late on Friday evening.

A brief released to the media stated that Chief Minister Yadav has dispatched a high-level team, including MoS for Faorets Dilip Ahirwar, to Bandhavgarh to supervise investigations and present their report in 24 hours.

# Gangotri temple to close for winter season

The portals of the Gangotri temple at Uttarkashi were closed on Saturday for the winter season when it remains snowbound, an official of the temple committee said.

All temples located in the Garhwal Himalayas, also known as Char Dham, are closed during the winter.

Gangotri temple committee secretary Suresh Semwal said the gates of the temple located at a height of around 10,000 feet above sea level were closed amid rituals at 12.14 pm on the auspicious occasion of the Annakoot festival.

After the ceremonial closure of the temple gates amid chants of "Har Har Gange, Jai Ma Gange" by devotees and priests, the idol of

Goddess Ganga left in a palanquin for Mukhba where she will be worshipped for the whole of winter, he said.

Gangotri is the first of the Char Dham temples to be closed.

More than eight lakh devotees visited the temple this season. The doors of Yamunotri and Kedarnath temples will be closed on Sunday while those of Badrinath will be shut on November 17.

These famous Himalayan temples are reopened in April-May each year with the onset of summer.

# BJP faces tough battle for Seesamau seat in UP by-elections as SP's Solanki family holds firm ground

# Karnataka CM withdraws notices on farmers related to Waqf land issues

Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah on Saturday instructed officials to immediately withdraw all notices sent to farmers concerning Waqf land issues.

A decision to this effect was taken during a high-level meeting, with senior officials from the Revenue department, the Minority Welfare department, and the Karnataka Board of Waqfs.

"Chief Minister Siddaramaiah has issued a strict directive for the immediate retraction of all notices sent to farmers about Waqf land, emphasising that no disruption should be caused to them," a statement from the Chief Minister's Office (CMO) read.

The statement noted Siddaramaiah's dissatisfaction with recent actions by certain officials and highlighted concerns that the JD(S) and BJP were

allegedly using the Waqf issue for political gains, potentially disrupting peace in the state.

"Siddaramaiah has urged the public to ignore any misinformation and directed officials to handle the matter with sensitivity," it added.

The statement also emphasised that all notices issued to farmers regarding land records tied to Waqf properties must be promptly withdrawn.

Officials were instructed to avoid harassing farmers or causing any issues related to lands under their possession. The CM further directed that any unauthorised changes made to land records (Pahani or RTC) without prior notice or legal procedures should be immediately nullified.

The meeting was attended by Karnataka Law and Parliamentary Affairs Minister H K Patil, Revenue Minister Krishna Byre Gowda, and senior government officials. However, Minority Welfare and Waqf Minister B Z Zameer Ahmed Khan was not present.

Earlier, Karnataka Home Minister G Parameshwara said all District Deputy Commissioners have been directed not to issue notices to farmers under the Waqf Act.

He affirmed that revenue records would be considered final, and administrative actions would adhere to them.

"The Chief Minister has instructed all deputy commissioners to withdraw such notices or letters. The matter is now resolved, though we are unsure of any future developments," Parameshwara told reporters.

# Mumbai Police files extradition of Anmol Bishnoi

The Mumbai police have forwarded a proposal for extradition of jailed gangster Lawrence Bishnoi's younger brother Anmol Bishnoi, who has been named as an accused in some high-profile crimes, including the Baba Siddique murder case, an official said.

The proposal was sent after the US authorities informed the Mumbai police about Anmol Bishnoi's presence in their country, the senior police official said on Saturday.

Last month, the Mumbai police's crime branch moved the special Maharashtra Control of Organised Crime Act (MCOCA) court here stating that it intends to "initiate the extradition procedure of fugitive criminal Anmol Bishnoi".

Mumbai police filed an affidavit "for further necessary action", which was allowed by the special court. Both Lawrence and Anmol Bishnoi have been named as wanted accused in the April 14 firing incident outside the Bollywood actor Salman Khan's Galaxy Apartment in Mumbai's Bandra area. Vicky Gupta and Sagar Pal had carried out the firing. They, along with Sonukumar Bishnoi, Mohammed Rafiq Choudhary and Harpal Singh, were arrested and are currently in judicial custody. One accused Anjukumar

Thapan committed suicide during his police custody. In the chargesheet filed in the case, police have shown Lawrence Bishnoi and Anmol Bishnoi as wanted accused in the case.

NCP leader and former MLA Baba Siddique was shot dead by three gunmen near the office of his MLA-son Zeeshan Siddique on October 12.

The police have so far arrested 15 persons in connection with the murder. The role of Bishnoi brothers, who hail from Fazilka in Punjab, is suspected in the case.

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) recently announced a reward of Rs 10 lakh for information leading to the arrest of Anmol Bishnoi.

Lawrence Bishnoi is currently lodged in a jail in Sabarmati in Gujarat. A lookout circular was issued in April against Anmol Bishnoi, who had claimed responsibility for the firing incident outside Salman Khan's residence. An FIR was also registered by the NIA against nine accused, including both the Bishnoi brothers, in August 2022 for being part of a conspiracy to raise funds, recruit youth to carry out terrorist acts in the Union Territory of Delhi and other parts of the country besides "targeted killings of prominent persons".

# Mahakumbh set to boost tourism in Uttar Pradesh, creating jobs for over 45,000 families

The Yogi Adityanath government is set to elevate Uttar Pradesh's tourism industry through a focused initiative on skill development, with the upcoming Mahakumbh in Prayagraj anticipated to generate direct or indirect employment for over 45,000 families.

This monumental event, scheduled for 2025, is expected to attract millions of pilgrims and tourists, creating a significant demand for trained local service providers.

In an effort to prepare for this surge, extensive training programs are underway across Prayagraj. These programs aim to upskill local vendors, boatmen, street vendors, and tour guides, ensuring they are equipped to meet the needs of visitors with professionalism and customer-friendly service.

By empowering these service providers, the government is not only supporting existing businesses but also laying the foundation for new employment opportunities around religious tourist destinations, contributing to the region's economic growth.

The Yogi administration's comprehensive tourism strategy took root with the launch of the Tourism Policy-2022, approved on November 16, 2022. This policy envisions a substantial investment

The Tourism Department is providing training to 2,000 boatmen to broaden their skill set, enabling them to take on dual roles as river guides. This initiative, undertaken in collaboration with Manyavar Kanshiram Tourism Management Institute, has already trained 300 boatmen,

giving them the skills to enhance the tourist experience by sharing insights about the area's cultural and spiritual significance. "We are dedicated to preparing a robust, skilled workforce for the Mahakumbh 2025," Singh said. "Our goal is to support livelihoods while enhancing the quality of services provided to our visitors." The training for tour guides is also progressing rapidly. Assistant Professor Prakhar Tiwari from the Manyavar Kanshiram Tourism Management Institute, who is overseeing the program, reported that seven batches of guides have completed the course, resulting in 420 well-trained tour guides ready to assist pilgrims and tourists.

The government's efforts extend to street vendors and taxi drivers as well. Recognizing the important role of street vendors in providing accessible goods to locals and tourists alike, the Tourism Department has launched a training program focused on customer service skills and cleanliness standards. So far, 600 street vendors and 600 taxi drivers in Prayagraj have enrolled, with 250 vendors and 120 drivers already completing their training.

With the Mahakumbh serving as a catalyst, Uttar Pradesh's tourism sector is undergoing a transformative phase, with skill development programs creating a wide range of employment opportunities for local youth. Singh estimates that over 45,000 families will benefit from this initiative, securing income through tourism-related roles and fostering a sustainable environment for the industry's growth around key religious sites.

# Jharkhand CM urges PM Modi to pay coal dues of 1.36 lakh crore

Ahead of the scheduled visits of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah to poll-bound Jharkhand, Chief Minister Hemant Soren on Saturday urged the Centre with "folded hands" to clear Rs 1.36 lakh-crore coal dues to the State. Modi is scheduled to address two rallies in Jharkhand on November 4 while Shah will address three public meetings on November 3.

"The PM and the Home Minister are coming to Jharkhand. I once again request them with folded hands to clear the outstanding (coal dues) of Rs 1.36 lakh crore to Jharkhand. This amount is crucial for Jharkhand," Soren posted on X. He also appealed to BJP MPs to facilitate clearance of the amount.

"I would also appeal to my BJP colleagues, especially the

MPs, to help Jharkhandis in getting our dues," Soren posted on Social Media, sharing a copy of a letter to the Prime Minister. Soren emphasised that the dues with central PSUs, like Coal India, are "rightful" to the state and claimed that "non-clearance is causing irreparable harm to Jharkhand's development".

"I, Hemant Soren, the Chief minister of Jharkhand, am drawing your attention towards a serious issue which is creating obstacles in the path of state's development.

Our dues from coal companies stand at Rs 1.36 lakh crore," Soren wrote in the letter to the PM. "In spite of provisions in the law and judicial pronouncements, coal companies are not making any payment... These questions have been raised at various forums, including your kind office, Finance Ministry and NITI Aayog. But till now this compensation (Rs 1.36 lakh crore) has not yet been paid," he said.

A recent ruling by a nine-judge Supreme Court bench affirmed the State's right to collect its mining and royalty dues. Soren pointed out that the development of Jharkhand and essential socio-economic projects are getting hampered owing to the non-clearance of dues.

"Jharkhand is an underdeveloped state and there are lots of social economic development projects which are getting hampered due to non-payment of our

justifiable demands," Soren wrote. Last month, he suggested a direct debit from Coal India's account to the state, similar to the arrangements made for Jharkhand State Electricity Board dues to the DVC. "This delay in payment of the just demand raised by the state has constrained me to write to you that this negligence is causing irreparable damage to Jharkhand and its people. Various social sector schemes in education, health, women & child development, clean drinking water and last mile connectivity are unable to be translated on the ground because of lack of funds," Soren said. Earlier, he accused the Central Government of indifference to the state's plight, highlighting the disparity in treatment regarding dues.

The Jharkhand assembly polls will be held in two phases - November 13 and 20. The counting of votes will take place on November 23.

# AQI 'poor', 'very poor' in several parts of Himachal post-Diwali

The air quality at various places across Himachal Pradesh deteriorated post-Diwali due to bursting of crackers, officials said.

This year the average AQI in the state was at 140 (moderate) as compared to 92 last year.

As per the data from the pollution department, industrial areas in the state recorded air quality ranging between moderate to very poor and Baddi (industrial area) was the most polluted with a "very poor" AQI of 392 followed by Parwanoo at 217, Poanta Sahib at 145, Barotiwala at 139, Nalagarh at 128 and Una at 122.

An AQI between zero and 50 is considered 'good', 51 and 100 'satisfactory', 101 and 200 'moderate', 201 and 300 'poor', 301 and 400 'very poor', 401 and 450 'severe' and above 450 'severe plus'. The air quality of Shimla was satisfactory with AQI 66 against 78 last year as the

district administration had allowed the bursting of firecrackers from 8 pm to 10 pm only. Though some violations were seen but majority of the residents abided by the directions, officials said.

The production of green crackers and its supply chain has increased. With people being aware of the environmental hazards and the regulations in place, people generally have preferred bursting green crackers and adhering to the norms, they added.

Meanwhile, Dharamshala recorded AQI at 109 against 140 last year. However, Manali saw an increase in air pollution with AQI increasing from 55 in 2023 to 80 in 2024 on Diwali day. Industrial areas of Baddi-Barotiwala-Nalagarh, Poanta Sahib, Una, Damtak and Kala Amb have witnessed AQI above 100 but overall air quality in the state is average, the data indicated.



# SPINNERS DO THEIR JOB WELL, TIME FOR BATTERS TO SALVAGE PRIDE

Exploiting the spin-friendly conditions, Ravindra Jadeja and R Ashwin chiselled through the New Zealand batting line-up to bring India to a stage from where they can force a face-saving victory in the third Test which is now headed for an intriguing finish. New Zealand ended day two at 171 for nine with an overall lead of 143, which might look small but even a target in the vicinity of 150 will pose serious challenge for the Indian batters, considering the fast deteriorating Wankhede track. This was after half-centuries from Shubman Gill (90) and Rishabh Pant (60) and a crucial 38 not out from Washington Sundar gave India a slender 28-run lead as they put on board 263. A total of 15 wickets fell on the second day, underlining the fact that life won't be easy for the hosts while batting fourth. Ashwin (3/63) found his rhythm while Jadeja (4/52) added four more dismissals after his 5/65 in the first essay to keep India's hopes alive to avert a clean sweep at home for the first time. Ajaz Patel (7) was at the crease when Jadeja cleaned up Matt Henry (10) for the penultimate wicket on the final ball on the second day. Will Young's gutsy 51 was the only resistance from the Kiwis who succumbed to pressure, after Patel (5/103) recorded yet another five-wicket haul.

Having made a subdued impact so far, Ashwin's delight on getting Rachin Ravindra (4) stumped was evident as he beat the charge of the batter with bounce and turn. With Glenn Phillips (26) using the long handle to a good effect, Ashwin cleaned up the New Zealand batter for another crucial breakthrough. Young, who batted as solid as he did in the first innings, was Ashwin's third victim giving the bowler catching practice after being outfoxed on a carrom ball. The 37-year-old Ashwin made impact beyond his bowling when he took an outstanding catch to end a stubborn 50-run association between Young and Daryl Mitchell (21), who, for a passage of play, threatened to take the game away. Young and Mitchell had steadied the ship after New Zealand's top-order was blown away, but the latter's charge against Jadeja proved costly as he did not get the distance in his stroke. From mid-off, Ashwin covered 19 metres running sideways to his left and put in a fabulous dive to complete the dismissal, post which New Zealand crumbled further. Tom Blundell (4) chopped one onto his stumps off Jadeja while Ashwin cleaned up Phillips, who had switched to aggressive batting knowing New Zealand desperately needed more runs. At the start of Kiwis' reply, Akash provided a rare sight of a pacer disturbing a batter's furniture on turning track when he dismantled



Tom Latham's (1) off and middle stumps in the first over. Earlier, India's progress suffered a severe blow with the exit of Pant towards the end of the morning session, as its effects were felt acutely when play resumed post

lunch. From Pant's dismissal in the 38th over to India eventually folding in the 60th, the team managed eight fours and two sixes - the wicketkeeper-batter alone hit that many during his brisk half-century earlier. Patel, finding the right length, reaped rewards as the Kiwi spinner claimed another five-for at the Wankhede Stadium, following up his world record 10/119 in the first innings of the 2021 Test here.

Gill fell short of his century while others continued to disappoint. Perhaps, there was no greater disappointment than to see Sarfaraz Khan looking like a fish out of water during his four-ball struggle, failing to open his account at his home turf

where at times he has plundered runs for fun. Sarfaraz failed to read the length of his first ball and went for a mighty sweep against Patel in his pomp, but was beaten by the bounce and turn on the next. He might have fallen on the third ball when it bounced off his glove but there was no silly point. But he had to walk back when the bounce and turn had the ball settling in 'keeper Tom Blundell's gloves after kissing the shoulder of his bat. Gill, who showed no flaws in his 146-ball stay with seven fours and a six - longest for any batter in this Test - was also among Patel's victims on the day as the Mumbai-origin Kiwi spinner had him caught at the first slip after a fine knock. Jadeja (14) too was caught at first slip, albeit off Glenn Phillips, as Washington waged a lone battle among the three all-rounders scoring a brisk 36-ball 38 not out with four boundaries and two sixes. Having ceded control to New Zealand in final minutes of the opening day's play with an embarrassing collapse, India showed better resolve to make a speedy recovery. Pant's quickfire 60, laced with eight fours and two sixes, was instrumental in taking the advantage away from the Kiwis who were gifted three unexpected wickets by the Indians with batting mainstays Virat Kohli (4) and Yashasvi Jaiswal (30) committing harakiri.

## Virat Kohli drops hints of staying with RCB till 2027

Virat Kohli has dropped elaborate hints that he would like to continue playing competitive cricket till 2027 with an aim to complete 20 years with Royal Challengers Bengaluru after being retained by the franchise for a hefty fee of Rs 21 crore. Having entered the twilight zone of his illustrious career, speculations are rife about how long the 36-year-old would continue in top flight cricket having endured a prolonged lull for the last four years since the start of COVID-19. Kohli has been playing for RCB ever since IPL's inception in 2008 and is the leading run-scorer in the competition, amassing over 8,000 runs at a healthy if not spectacular strike rate of 131.97, including eight hundreds and 55 fifties. "At the end of this cycle, it is going to be 20 years that I am going to be playing for RCB and that in itself is a very, very special feeling for me," Kohli told 'RCB Bold Diaries' indicating that he aims to continue for at least another three years till 2027. "I have never thought that I am going to play so many years for one team, but the relationship has truly become special over so many years. He reiterated that he doesn't see himself playing for any other franchise. "I don't see myself anywhere other than RCB, and I am very happy that it happened. I am very excited that I got a chance to create a strong new squad in this auction, something that we are really looking forward to as a franchise, as a team," Kohli said in RCB's Bold Diaries video.



He also pondered on the fact that he shared a close bond with the franchise and its fans, while his goal would be to win the elusive title. "I am super excited as ever as everyone knows what RCB means to me. It's been a very, very special relationship over so many years, which continues to grow stronger, and what I have experienced playing for RCB is truly special. I hope that the fans and everyone who's connected to the franchise feel the same way," he continued. "I am also just looking forward to this cycle. Obviously, the goal is to win the IPL title at least once in the next cycle." He promised that RCB will leave no stone unturned to win their elusive IPL title. "We are going to give it our best shot as always and try to make everyone proud of the way we play our cricket. A big shout out to the fans for your unwavering support over so many years. I am really grateful, really thankful," Kohli concluded. **KOHLI WILL BE A KEY TO RCB'S SUCCESS; ANDY FLOWER:** Meanwhile,

following Kohli's retention, RCB head coach Andy Flower admitted that while the retention itself is not surprising, he would be the key to RCB's success in the coming years. "Virat's retention won't come as much of a surprise to anyone in India. He is and will be a key to RCB's success in the future. He was sensational last year. He was one of the leaders who propelled us into the playoffs despite a poor first half of the season," he told JioCinema. Besides Kohli, RCB has also retained two more players - Rajat Patidar (Rs 11 crore) and Yash Dayal (Rs 5 crore). As a result, RCB will have a purse of Rs 83 crore heading into the mega auction tentatively scheduled later this month. The franchise would also contain three Right To Match (RTM) cards, allowing it to retain three more players (an uncapped player and two capped players). Glenn Maxwell, Mohammed Siraj, Faf du Plessis and Cameron Green are among the top RCB players set to go under the hammer.

## Zverev beats Tsitsipas and joined by Rune, Humbert, Khachanov in Paris Masters semis

Alexander Zverev advanced to the semifinals of the Paris Masters by beating Stefanos Tsitsipas 7-5, 6-4 and knocking the Greek player out of contention for the ATP Finals. The third-seeded German saved the only break point he faced. Zverev, the French Open runner-up, next faces 2022 champion Holger Rune for a shot at the title. He's into his third Paris semifinals in the past four years, though he's never won the hard-court tournament. The first break point opportunity came in the 11th game as Tsitsipas struggled with his first serve. Zverev got the break for 6-5 on an unforced error. Tsitsipas then saved two set points but squandered his only break point chance with his 17th unforced error before Zverev



closed out the set. Zverev broke again in the third game of the second set to take full control. He rattled off 12 straight points in his final three service games. With the victory, Zverev became the first player born in the 1990s to record 100 wins over top-20 players. Daniil Medvedev is on 99. The 10th-seeded Tsitsipas, who reached the ATP Finals for five consecutive years,

had 28 unforced errors to 18 winners. Rune outlasted Alex de Minaur 6-4, 4-6, 7-5 in a 2 1/2-hour baseline fight. Rune improved to 3-2 against the Australian. Grigor Dimitrov's hopes of making the ATP Finals were set back after the 2023 finalist was upset by 2018 champion Karen Khachanov 6-2, 6-3 for the first time. Khachanov lost their four previous matches. Dimitrov was 10th in the race to the top-eight ATP Finals in Turin. Khachanov improved to 12-1 in the last three weeks after winning the Almaty title and reaching the Vienna final. He'll face in the semifinals local hope Ugo Humbert, who defeated Jordan Thompson of Australia 6-2, 7-6 (4) a day after stunning Carlos Alcaraz. Humbert has reached his first Masters semifinal, and he's the first Frenchman to go this far in Paris in seven years.

## Mohun Bagan SG say AFC 'recognised' club's decision to forego match in Iran

Mohun Bagan Super Giant said the Asian Football Confederation has "recognised" the top Indian club's pullout from their AFC Champions League 2 match in Iran last month as a case of force majeure. Keeping the players' "safety and security" in mind, Mohun Bagan SG last month decided to forgo their October 2 match against Tractor FC in Iran due to the volatile situation prevailing in the West Asian nation at the time. The continental body reacted promptly and the Kolkata-based club was withdrawn from the tournament, pending further decision on the matter. According to the MBSG, the AFC has now recognised their concerns but added the club remained withdrawn from the



tournament. "On 2nd November 2024, Mohun Bagan Super Giant has been communicated by the Asian Football Federation (AFC) that in response to the club's appeal, the AFC Competitions Committee has decided to recognise the matters raised by Mohun Bagan SG as an event of force majeure," the club said in a statement. "Consequently, as per clause 5.7

of AFC Champions League 2 Competition Regulations shall not apply to Mohun Bagan SG." MBSG added in their statement, "However, in terms of AFC Champions League 2 Competition Regulation clauses 5.5 and 5.6 even in case of force majeure events MBSG shall stand withdrawn from the tournament for ongoing season." Mohun Bagan SG were scheduled to play Tractor FC on October 2 in a Group A match of the ACL - the continent's second-tier club competition. However, the players expressed their unwillingness to travel to Iran, which was then in a state of mourning following the death of a prominent general of the Revolutionary Guard in an Israeli air strike. Mohun Bagan had taken the decision to not travel to the country after Iran launched missiles on Israel, escalating political tensions between the two countries. Meanwhile, the AFC had rescheduled matches across its tournaments due to the security situation in Iran, weeks after Mohun Bagan Super Giants were "withdrawn" from competitions, forcing the Indian club to accuse the continental football body of "unequal treatment".

## Two-time Olympic medallist Lily Owsley signs for Delhi SG Pipers

Delhi SG Pipers on Saturday announced the acquisition of England's woman hockey midfielder and superstar Lily Owsley for the upcoming season of Hockey India League (HIL). The 29-year-old two-time Olympic medallist will be replacing 28-year-old Dutch midfielder Xan de Waard following her pull-out from HIL this season due to personal reasons. Owsley is one of the most highly decorated players in English hockey, having won the gold medal at the Rio Olympics 2016, followed by the bronze in Tokyo 2020. Besides, she also won the gold and silver at the Commonwealth Games in Birmingham 2022 and Glasgow 2014, respectively. Owsley also clinched two European Championship medals - gold in London 2015 and bronze in Amstelveen 2017. "Losing Xan de Waard, undoubtedly one of the best players in the world, is a setback for the team. But, being able to replace her with a 2-time Olympic medal winner, Lily Owsley, is a big relief," said Delhi SG Pipers women's team coach Dave Smolenaars in a statement. "She will bring in her experience, leadership and high-speed play to help the team reach its potential." It will be the inaugural edition of the Women's HIL, slated to get underway on December 28, comprising four teams, with the other three sides being Odisha Warriors, Rarh Bengal Tigers and Soorma Hockey Club. The tournament final takes place in Ranchi on February 1 next year.

## F1 braces for more Verstappen-Norris drama and Hamilton to drive Senna's car

Max Verstappen suggests he won't change his aggressive driving this weekend at the Brazilian Grand Prix as he bids for a fourth successive Formula 1 title. Lando Norris needs a win at Interlagos in Sao Paulo to maintain any realistic title hopes. New elements could spice up the clash between the drivers, who have received penalties in the past two races in Austin, Texas and Mexico for their boldness on the track. Interlagos has a new tarmac, rain is expected all weekend, and Verstappen received a five-place penalty on the grid after he and Red Bull decided to use a new engine. Friday's free practice was not a good omen for Verstappen; he finished 15th, more than one second behind Norris, who clocked the best lap in his McLaren. Ferrari's Charles Leclerc, who also has a shot at the title, was sixth. The sprint race qualifier in the afternoon was better for

Verstappen; he was fourth but almost one second behind leader and Norris teammate Oscar Piastri. Norris was second. Saturday will feature the penultimate sprint race of the season and a tribute to three-time world champion Ayrton Senna, who died 30 years ago. Seven-time F1 champion Lewis Hamilton will drive a McLaren once steered by Senna in front of 60,000 fans. Norris closed the gap on Verstappen to 47 points in Mexico after a furious encounter that caused penalties to the Dutchman amounting to 20 seconds. The British driver was penalized in the previous race at the U.S. Grand Prix as he battled the defending champion. Leclerc, 70 points behind Verstappen, told media on Thursday he was not expecting a leading performance by his team this weekend. The Monegasque driver also had to face the stewards in Brazil for swearing in a press conference after

the Mexican GP last weekend. He was fined 10,000 euros (almost \$11,000), of which half is suspended as long as there is no further breach of a similar nature within the next 12 months. "During the hearing Leclerc expressed his regret for his momentary lack of judgment and shared that he understood his responsibility as a role model for the sport," the stewards' decision said. Verstappen was punished with one day of community service for the same reason during the Singapore GP. **CHALLENGES FOR VERSTAPPEN AND MCLAREN:** Verstappen said in Mexico that F1 has become over-policed. Upon his arrival in Brazil, he said he didn't care about critics of his aggressive driving. Though he and Norris claim to have a respectful relationship, another showdown is expected between the two in Sunday's race. The McLarens are expected to have the upper hand. Verstappen has won twice at the 84-



year-old Interlagos circuit, including last year, when Norris finished second. Verstappen's last victory was 10 races ago in Spain in June, after a period of seven wins in the first 10 races. "We want to do well, but of course it also needs to be possible. We still

have a good lead," Verstappen said. "I just try to enjoy the moment, try to just always optimize the performance." The earliest the title could be won by Verstappen is in Las Vegas on Nov. 24. For Norris to have a chance, he will likely have to take the title fight to the December finale

in Abu Dhabi. Norris' bid is a tough one, and McLaren has a better chance of dethroning Red Bull in the constructors' championship. Ferrari jumped ahead of Red Bull to second in the standings after Carlos Sainz Jr's win in Mexico. Red Bull, which has won the last two constructors' titles, is third. Another challenge for drivers at Interlagos is the new asphalt. McLaren's Piastri was not excited about it on the first day of practice. "I think everybody was thrown off a bit by just how bumpy the track was," Piastri said. **HAMILTON HONORS SENNA:** For the second time in his life, Mercedes' Hamilton will be on board a McLaren once driven by Senna, who died in 1994 after crashing during the San Marino GP. Hamilton will steer Senna's title-winning MP4/5B after Saturday's sprint race. Weeks ago, Honda and McLaren said they would bring the car that allowed the Brazilian to clinch the 1990 drivers'

championship. During his time at McLaren, Hamilton drove Senna's MP4/4 car around Silverstone in 2009 for a British TV program. "It will be an emotional experience," Hamilton said in Sao Paulo. He arrived at Interlagos for Thursday's media day wearing a shirt that read "rest in peace, Ayrton Senna" and pants in the color of the Brazilian flag. "Every time we come here it's an opportunity to do that (honor Senna), and I think so many of the drivers also do that," Hamilton said. "But I never in a million years thought I'd ever get to drive Senna's car here." Not everyone was excited about Hamilton driving Senna's car. "We have a lot of love for Hamilton, but he will be racing anyway," former driver Rubens Barrichello told TV Band. "I have Interlagos in my heart. The thing is, I think it should be a Brazilian driver." Senna won six races in the season he drove the car that Hamilton will steer around Interlagos.

## LONELY PLANET A FAILED ROMANTIC DELIVERY

A lacklustre narrative undermines *Lonely Planet's* visual appeal, writes **ABHI SINGHAL**

Shot with landscapes around Morocco giving a beautiful backdrop, *Lonely Planet* is an addition to the old woman young man romantics list. The film is an American Netflix romantic drama directed by *Susannah Grant*. The movie stars *Laura Dern* as *Katherine Loewe* and *Liam Hemsworth* as *Owen Brophy*. The film plots around a writer, *Laura Dern* and explores her romantic angle with *Owen Brophy* after they meet on a retreat of writers. *Laura Dern* as *Katherine Loewe* has been shown as a successful female novelist who comes on a writers retreat to overcome a struggling love life due to a separation from her longtime partner. *Liam Hemsworth* as *Owen Brophy* comes on the same retreat with her girlfriend *Lily Kemp* (played by *Diana Silvers*), whose first novel becomes a best seller. Changing attitude of *Lily Kemp* on the retreat creates a rift between her and her boyfriend *Owen Brophy*, after which *Owen finds* himself attracted towards *Katherine Loewe* after meeting her closely in some sudden circumstances.

The story explores an understanding romance between *Laura* and *Liam*. The story tries to emphasise on the importance and need of having an understanding partner with whom you can feel light and help you grow, but doesn't fall up to the point. Talking about the characters the cast seems to have overplayed their



part due to the weak plot. *Owen* doesn't have deep talks with his love interest, which is the want of the movie. *Laura's* character has been too into herself killing the expectations of what the audience really wants. *Lily Kemp's* character feels like a character played without an effort. *Lonely Planet* fails to deliver the truly wanting script because of its weak plot. It tries to land up to a space of the fantasy world where

the guy meets the woman and they fall in love, with all the butterflies which is actually not the demand of the film. The film's pacing is uneven, with certain scenes dragging while others feel rushed. The ending doesn't compliment the story at all and becomes too flat. The movie can be too boring for the people who love the romantic genre as it doesn't live up to the standards. The 96 minutes drama has been failing

to deliver a desired thoughtful romance being a romantic genre. Summarising, *Lonely Planet* is a missed opportunity. It has the potential to be a poignant and thought-provoking exploration of love and loss, but it settles for a generic and formulaic approach. While the stunning Moroccan landscapes are a visual treat, the film's lackluster script and characters ultimately leave a lot to be desired. **Rating - 2.5/5**

# THE COMEBACK MIAN

After nearly a year away from the field, 34-year-old Indian pacer Mohammad Shami is set to make his highly anticipated comeback. Having missed out due to an ankle injury that sidelined him since November last year, Shami has been seen practicing hard on the main pitch at the M Chinnaswamy Stadium in Bengaluru, following the first Test between India and New Zealand. With a five-Test tour of Australia approaching this November, fans are eagerly awaiting the return of one of India's most formidable fast bowlers.

After a year-long hiatus, Mohammad Shami, India's lethal pace bowler, has returned to international cricket with renewed vigour, reminding fans of his remarkable skill and unyielding determination. Shami's journey back to the pitch is not just a testament to his resilience, but also an inspiring comeback story that showcases his unwavering commitment to the game. With career-defining spells and an uncanny knack for turning games in India's favor, Shami's return has once again fortified the Indian bowling lineup.

In 2023, Shami delivered an outstanding season, claiming 56 wickets in 27 innings and earning the prestigious Purple Cap in the IPL. He finished the ICC Cricket World Cup 2023 as the tournament's leading wicket-taker, with an impressive 24 wickets across seven matches. His remarkable performances included three five-wicket hauls and a four-wicket haul, highlighted by a career-best 7/57 against New Zealand in the semi-finals.

Despite battling a persistent heel issue, Shami's dedication to cricket was unwavering, playing a crucial role in India's World Cup journey. Since India's defeat to Australia in the ODI World Cup final in November 2023, Shami has been sidelined. He was initially selected for India's two-Test series in South Africa in December 2023, but fitness concerns prevented his participation. In January 2024, Shami travelled to London for specialized injections to treat his ankle. Following this treatment, he was advised to gradually resume physical activity. Unfortunately, the injections did not bring the desired relief, leading to surgery on his Achilles tendon. Following a prolonged break due to injuries and personal challenges, Shami's return has been nothing short of extraordinary, proving that his time away from the game did little to diminish his prowess. "Every comeback has its own set of challenges but cricket has always been my calling. Being on the field and playing for the country puts me on cloud nine", Says Shami. Known for his high-velocity deliveries and pinpoint accuracy,



Shami has remained dedicated to refining his craft, training rigorously to ensure his return was one for the books. His work with renowned trainers and sports psychologists was instrumental in fortifying both his physical and mental resilience, setting the stage for a triumphant return to the Indian squad.

Returning from a prolonged injury is always a test of resilience, particularly for a cricketer under the global lens. The mental challenges of injury can be as tough as the physical ones, with constant scrutiny adding to the pressure. Shami's journey reflects the dedication required to overcome these obstacles, as he not only returns to the sport but does so with a renewed sense of self-belief.

Comeback after an injury is not easy, the biggest setback is psychological apart from the physical challenge. And if it extends for a year the challenge is immense. "I had one resolve to be back on the field and play for the country. And if the goal is clear God gives you resilience and courage to withstand the storm. I practiced and maintained my poise and worked on my game and fitness and my overall wellbeing." Says Shami with a smile.

Shami's transformation has not been limited to his athletic pursuits. In addition to his rehabilitation, he recently underwent a hair transplant as his hairline had thinned. Now when he will be back on the field he would be sporting the look of a younger man with flowing hair. "Indeed it was his perseverance and health regime that the results were better than we expected," says Dr Arika Bansal, at Eugenix Hair Sciences Shami's choice of Eugenix highlights the clinic's reputation for delivering outstanding hair restoration results. Dr. Pradeep Bansal also expresses his gratification working with Shami, calling it "an honour to serve an eminent cricketer who exemplifies resilience." Indeed, the results have not only enhanced Shami's appearance but also reignited his confidence, adding a renewed energy to his presence on and off the field.

Mohammed Shami's home ground is Eden Gardens in Kolkata, where he made his Test debut against the West Indies in 2013. Shami has always had a special connection with India's cricketing venues, with the Eden Gardens, his home ground in Kolkata being particularly close to his heart. He considers the iconic stadium to be his lucky ground, where he has delivered several memorable performances. "Eden Gardens has a special vibe; the crowd and atmosphere push you to go that extra mile. There's no place quite like it." He quips. Shami has now earned a name for him as a right-arm fast-medium bowler. He's known for his ability to swing the ball at pace, and for his reverse swing. He hails from Amroha, Uttar Pradesh. Shami was a mainstay in India's T20 World Cup teams in 2021 and 2022. In the 2023 World Cup, he was India's highest wicket-taker.

The Uttar Pradesh government is building a mini-stadium and gymnasium in Shami's village, Sahaspur Alinagar, to honor him. The stadium will be built on one hectare of land and will also include an open gym and race track. Shami's journey has been marked by significant challenges, both on and off the field. Despite setbacks, he has shown a profound level of mental toughness, using the time off to focus on his inner resilience. He once remarked, "The game of cricket teaches you a lot about life. It's a test of patience, hard work, and mental strength." His perspective has evolved to not only focus on physical fitness but also to prioritize mental well-being, which has been a key element in his recent comeback. When asked who he finds the hardest batsman to ball, he simply smiles and replies, "No one!" Shami's return has not only bolstered India's pace attack but has also brought in a seasoned leader for the younger bowlers. His experience and ability to read the game are assets that elevate the team's overall performance. Known for his tactical approach, Shami's presence is invaluable, particularly in high-stakes matches, where his sharp instincts and seasoned techniques shine.

As Shami steps back into the limelight, his journey stands as a testament to grit and resilience. The Indian cricket fraternity and millions of fans eagerly watch as he once again takes to the pitch, embodying the spirit of Indian cricket at its finest.

# LIVING IT UP IN AN AIRBNB IN LONDON

When planning my trip to London, selecting the perfect Airbnb was crucial. I focused on vibrant neighbourhoods, safety and charming details to ensure an unforgettable experience in this bustling city

## RELYING ON AIRBNB

For my travels, I have relied on Airbnb with unwavering confidence. Whether transitioning between flat shares or advising friends, it remains my top choice. The perks include local insights, a genuine neighbourhood experience, and costs often lower than hotels but far superior to hostels. While some listings require minimum stays, and occasionally hosts can be problematic, the advantages far outweigh the drawbacks. Thus, I enthusiastically recommend London Airbnbs.

## SELECTING THE NEIGHBOURHOOD

When selecting my Airbnb in London, the area was my first consideration. If you have a specific itinerary in mind, staying nearby is a no-brainer. Each neighbourhood in London feels like its own city, so I explored options that sparked my excitement. For a taste of the hipster scene, Hackney, Brixton, and Shoreditch were perfect choices. For luxury, Westminster, Soho, Fitzrovia, or Kensington beckoned, while Hampstead, Islington, and Greenwich offered a cosy, local vibe. These insights gave me a clearer picture of what each neighbourhood had to offer.

I opted for a two-bedroom flat in Marylebone. Nestled between Hyde Park and Regent's Park, this area embodies serene sophistication in London's heart. Its upscale charm provided easy access to Mayfair, Westminster, and The City, as well as the captivating shopping, dining, and majestic architecture of the iconic West End. It's truly a refined oasis amidst the bustle. My Airbnb was within walking distance of Marylebone Station, Tesco, and a couple of delightful restaurants, including one that served amazing Vietnamese food and another renowned for its Fish and Chips.

## DETAILS MATTER

When considering my stay, I focused on price points, assessing my overall budget and daily accommodation expenses. In London, Airbnbs typically range from £30 for a private room to £80-£100 for an entire unit. Prices climb as you approach Central London. I always seek discounts for first-time stays, ensure my flat has a kitchen to save on meals, and choose a location within walking distance of must-see sites. This time, the Airbnb I liked was



roughly £300 over my budget for the entire stay. I messaged the host on the app, and they kindly waived the extra cost. While it may not be paramount for everyone, the details matter when finding the perfect Airbnb in London. I prioritise essentials like Wi-Fi, a washing machine, a tea kettle, microwave, toaster, hairdryer, lift, and air conditioning. I also appreciate visually appealing rooms, often with a splash of colour or, if I'm fortunate, a lovely view. This time, I enjoyed a spacious terrace adjacent to the living room, offering beautiful views and sunlight.

## SUPERHOST FOR THE WIN

When browsing for an Airbnb, I always make it a point to delve into the reviews. No matter how visually appealing a property might be, a poor host can mar the entire experience. I pay particular attention to feedback from other women, as safety is my foremost concern when selecting accommodations. While security measures are in place, one can never be too cautious. If I encounter a single negative review over something trivial, I typically brush it off. However, if there are multiple red flags, it's wise to take your hard-earned pounds elsewhere. I personally favour the "Superhost" option. These hosts often come with glowing reviews and little extras that enhance the stay dramatically. Though some might say it's controversial, I recommend booking your London



Airbnb well in advance — falling in love with a place only to discover it's fully booked is disheartening. Once you find an Airbnb that fits your budget and has good reviews, seize the opportunity and don't look back. After finalising my travel plans, I saved two or three potential Airbnb options. I compared them and made my booking a month in advance. Exploring London was the true highlight of my trip. Visiting London without indulging in afternoon tea is akin to going to Paris and skipping the Eiffel Tower.



## LONDON EXPERIENCES

My tea experience began at Sketch, nestled in a stunning 18th-century building in Mayfair. I was enchanted by the restaurant's signature pink dining room, adorned with whimsical artwork by David Shrigley. By night, this charming tea room transformed into a

vibrant restaurant and cocktail bar led by renowned French chef Pierre Gagnaire. For more culinary adventures, I discovered the modern European flair of The Ivy Cafe Marylebone, the Art Deco elegance of The Wolseley, the fresh seafood at Scotts Mayfair, and the decadent Austrian charm of Fischer's Marylebone. No shopping spree is complete without a visit to Selfridges on Oxford Street, a landmark since 1909, followed by a stroll down Marylebone High Street, where boutiques like Le Labo and Lululemon await. Culturally, I explored The Wallace Collection, housed in a historic Marylebone townhouse, featuring masterpieces by Titian, Rubens, and Rembrandt. I also visited the renowned British Museum nearby. I discovered a world of luxury at the UK's premier shopping destination, Bicester Village. Just a train ride from Marylebone, I explored over 150 chic boutiques in the charming Oxfordshire countryside. With brands like Gucci, Armani, and Givenchy, I indulged in a rich retail

experience and enjoyed savings of up to 60%. As a special guest, I even received an extra 10% off the Village price—truly a shopper's paradise. Surrounded by beautiful parks, my London experience was truly unforgettable.

## THE LAST LEG

As my journey from London began, I couldn't help but feel excitement for my return home after a good two weeks in London. I had chosen a Premium Economy seat with Virgin Atlantic after extensive research. For those who don't know, Virgin Atlantic, founded by Richard Branson in 1984, stands out as a refreshing alternative to conventional carriers. Flying in Premium, simply called Premium, was a transformative experience. The leather seats offered noticeably more space than standard Economy, with an extra inch of width and enhanced recline, making the long-haul flight far more comfortable. I appreciated the adjustable headrest and the additional luxuries, like a pull-out footrest. The in-seat entertainment system, Vera, featured a 13-inch screen packed with an impressive selection of films. Boarding the Yesvantpur Superfast Express, excitement coursed through me as I made my way to a small town in Andhra Pradesh, often called the "Kailash of the South." This enchanting place is home to Sri Mallikarjuna Swamy, one of the twelve sacred Jyotirlingas, and Goddess Bhramaramba, one of the eighteen Mahashakti Peethas, giving it an aura of deep spiritual significance. Nestled in the picturesque Nandyal district, Srisailam is a town where natural beauty and profound spirituality merge, offering a treasure trove of experiences waiting to be uncovered.

Markapur Road railway station serves as the gateway for devotees bound for Srisailam, with convenient connections to this revered destination. Upon arrival, travellers can hire autos for ₹30 to reach Markapuram bus stand, where buses run regularly to Srisailam. The 2.5-hour journey, costing ₹250, offers breathtaking views of the lush landscape, especially during the monsoon season. After arrival, the Shiva temple is within walking distance from the bus stand. Affordable accommodations, such as Kakatiya Anna Satra Sangam (?1100), cater to pilgrims' needs.



The Mallikarjun Swami and Mata temple, a primary attraction, welcomes devotees until late evening. Local eateries like Trishul Family Restaurant provide delicious refreshments. Srisailam's well-organised transport and amenities ensure a hassle-free experience for pilgrims, making the spiritual journey truly unforgettable.

## JOURNEY TO SERENITY

After a refreshing night's sleep, one can start the morning with a visit to the ancient



Hatkeshwar Mahadev Temple, where Lord Shiva defeated the demon Tripurasura. Following the blessings of Lord Shiva, visitors often head to the unique Sakshi Ganapati Swamy temple, where Lord Ganesha is depicted seated with a pen and paper,
