BJP, Cong spar, EC responds

The Election Commission (EC) on Saturday wrote to the national presidents of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and Congress, asking them to comment on complaints lodged by both parties against each other for poll code violations violations by star campaigners. In separate letters to BJP president Jagat Prakash Nadda and Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge, the Commission asked them to comment on the alleged violations of the Model Code of Conduct (MCC) during campaigns for the upcoming

Assembly elections in Maharashtra and Jharkhand, as well as bypolls in West Bengal, Punjab, Karnataka and several other states. The Commission shared the complaints with the two parties while seeking their responses.

The EC has sought formal responses from both the party presidents by 1 pm on Monday (November 18), while reminding them of the Commission's earlier advisory to them during the Lok Sabha election to keep star campaigners and leaders under check so that public decorum is not flouted and the model code is followed in its letter and spirit during campaigning. Top leaders of the two parties are campaigning in Jharkhand and Maharashtra for the ongoing Assembly polls in the two states. During the Lok Sabha election too, the poll authority had shared complaints filed by the two parties against the other's star campaigners, including Modi, Shah, Gandhi and Kharge. The BJP filed a complaint



against Congress leader Rahul Home Minister Amit Shah alleging violation of Model Gandhi for his remarks during a rally, where he allegedly accused the BJP and Code of Conduct. Negligence claimed 10 newborn lives JHANSI HOSPITAL FIRE

Instead of being functional safety tools, these extinguishers were mere decorative relics, rendering claimed the lives of 10 newborns late Friday night. them useless in containing the fire. Even as the Uttar Pradesh government has ordered a probe, initial investigations reveal glaring lapses in fire safety protocols, including expired fire extinguishers and non-functional fire alarms, which significantly delayed rescue operations. The ward housed 55 newborns

at the time of the incident. While 45 babies were rescued, the remaining succumbed to severe burns and asphyxiation. The fire quickly spread, engulfing the ward and cutting off access routes, leaving staff and firefighters scrambling to save the infants.

Evidence gathered from the site highlights that the fire extinguishers in the SNCU ward had expired years ago One extinguisher bore a refill date of 2019 with an expiry in 2020, making it non-

Chief Minister Deputy Brajesh Pathak refuted these claims saying hospital's fire safety systems were last inspected in February 2024, followed by a mock drill in June. "If what government claiming is true, one thing is true that these measures failed to prevent Friday's tragedy, exposing the negligence in maintaining

critical equipment, Amarnath Agarwal Congress leader said.

Further compounding the tragedy was the failure of the fire alarms installed in the SNCU. Witnesses reported no alarm sounding when the fire broke out, delaying immediate evacuation efforts. By the time smoke engulfed the ward, panic and confusion had spread, making rescue efforts more challenging.

US returns over 1,400 Indian antiques

Asandstone from sculpture Madhya Pradesh in 1980s and another in green-grey schist, looted from Rajasthan in 1960s are among the over 1,400 antiquities collectively valued at USD 10 Million that the US returned to India.

More than 600 more antiquities looted from India are scheduled to be repatriated in coming months. The pieces were returned at a ceremony with Manish Kulhary from the Consulate General of India here and Alexandra deArmas,



Group Supervisor from the Homeland Investigation of New York Cultural Property, Art, and Antiquities Group, according to а statement from Manhattan District Attorney

Alvin L Bragg, Jr. At least 1,440 antiquities collectively valued at USD 10 million were returned to India at the event, Bragg said in a statement. The sandstone sculpture depicting a celestial dancer was looted from a temple in Madhya Pradesh in the early 1980's. The looters had cleaved the sculpture into two halves to facilitate smuggling and illicit sale and by February 1992, the two

halves were illegally imported Security from London into New York, professionally reassembled, and donated to the Metropolitan Museum of Art (Met)

It remained on display at the Met, until it was seized by the Antiquities Traffic Unit (ATU) in 2023. The second sculpture, Tanesar Mother Goddess, carved from green-grey schist, was looted from a village of Tanesara-Mahadeva in Rajasthan.

First documented in the late 1950s by an Indian archaeologist along with 11 1950s other sculptures of mother goddesses, the Tanesar Mother Goddess and her fellow mother goddesses were stolen one evening in the early 1960s, the statement said on Wednesday

AICC's fateful Partition meet: What happened inside?

One Sunday morning, I was turning the pages of late Jaswant Singh's controversial book: Jinnah- India- Partition- Independence. One chapter drew my particular attention. It was about the eventful All India Congress Committee meeting held in Delhi on June 14 and 15, 1947 during which the Congress ratified the Partition Plan mooted by Lord Mountbatten. All the bigwigs of the party at-tended it and many presented their views either in favour of or against the scheme. Among the major voices of dissent were those of Purushottam Das Tandon and the leader from Sindh Chothram Gidwani. They minced no words while taking the leadership to task for supinely accepting the Mountbatten Plan without putting up even the semblance of a fight. Their fiery speeches courted applause from the majority of the party members.

But what were the top leaders doing? Maulana Abul Kalam Azad quite intriguingly sat in a chair in a small corner of the room, puffing away his endless cigarettes. He chose to maintain a studied silence on these two critical days. The Congress president during that portentous period of India's history Acharya JB Kripalani sat sleepily- a picture of weary indifference. Mahatma Gandhi saw him in that

him as the bone-tired president. This prompted the socialist leader Ram Manohar Lohia to nudge him out of his somnolence. Kripalani sat up and said he was having a bad headache. Khan Abdul Ghaffar Khan now stood up and spoke briefly. While venting his deep sorrow and consternation with his comrades having accepted the Partition, he pleaded for a small mercy: inclusion in the plebiscite slated in the North West Frontier Province of the alternative of independence alongside the two other choices: accession to India or Pakistan. Jayaprakash Narayan too chose to confine his speech to a few sentences, voicing his anguish against the proposed

drowsy state and referred to

Partition. He though appeared to have completely given in to the fait accompli. Now Mahatma Gandhi stood up. While speaking, he turned to Pandit Nehru and Sardar Patel and said they had not informed him about the Partition Plan before committing themselves double quick to it. Cut to the quick, Nehru interrupted Gandhi and said emotionally he had kept him fully informed. Gandhi shook his head and repeated he had no inkling of the Partition scheme. Now taken aback, Nehru softened his earlier rigid observation and said that as he was far away from Delhi in Noakhali in Bengal, he

could not have described the details but broadly written to him about the Partition Plan. Lohia was, however, unconvinced. He was severely critical in his observation in his insightful book 'Guilty Men of India's Partition.' He wrote that Nehru might have written vague letters doling out hypothetical and insubstantial information. In his opinion, Nehru and Patel had obviously decided between them-



selves not to scare Gandhi away before the deal was finally resolved upon. He fur-ther wrote that Nehru and Patel had been aggressively offensive towards Gandhi at this meeting. "I had a few sharp exchanges with both of them...What appeared to be astonishing then, as now, though I can today understand it somewhat better, was the exceedingly rough behaviour of these two chosen disciples towards their master. There was something psychopathic about it. They seemed to have set their heart on something and whenever they scented that Gandhi was preparing to obstruct them, they shouted violently," he wrote.

While addressing the meeting on the second day, Nehru asserted that the most urgent task at the moment was to arrest the swift drift towards anarchy and chaos by the establishment of a strong Central government. He rejected the view outright that Congress had been coerced into

surrendering to the Muslim League's riot-mongering belligerence. In the same breath, he, however, admitted that they were indeed rattled by the prevailing madness and partition was better than the endless carnage of innocent citizens.

Then Sardar Patel stood up. Lending his unflinching support to the Partition Plan, he said that no airy-fairy formula could work amidst the communally poisonous atmos-Pleading for phere. pragmatism, he said that instead of chasing a chimera, they should rather focus themselves on developing what they would get as India according to her cultural genius, leaving the rest for the League to govern. Then, in his presidential address, Kripalani recounted the horrors unleashed by the communal elements in the two communities. He said he had seen a well where women with their children, 107 in all, had thrown themselves to save their honour. In another

place-a place of worship, 50 young women had been killed by their men folk for the same reason. He further said he had seen heaps of bones in a house where 307 persons, mainly women and children, had been locked up and then burnt alive by an invading mob. He then admitted that it was indeed fear that had propelled them into giving in to the Partition Plan. But it was not a nervous weakness, a weak-kneed capitulation before the macabre narratives of massacres but a chilling apprehension that if they were to let this state of things go on they might be reduced to cannibalism and even worse.

When the time came for the members to approve the resolution Nehru had introduced on the Partition Plan, Lohia suggested an amendment strongly repudiating the

Two-Nation Theory while affirming that India was indivisibly one nation as Nature and culture had fashioned it over millennia

of years and no human agency could alter that shape and thwart India's future destiny. Gandhi supported it. But Nehru exploded, saying that the suggested amendment manifested an obsession with Jinnah's malicious theory. In exasperation, he asked whether there was any point in calling people, who were flying at each other's throat, brothers. Undaunted, Lohia cited America's gory civil war that killed millions of Americans and said that despite that, the Americans never ceased to be brothers.

As tension was mounting up again, Gandhi stood up and said gloomily that rejection of Mountbatten Plan at that juncture would strip the Congress of all its credibility. He reasoned that sometimes a time came in a nation's life when some unpalatable decisions had to be taken to help history march on for better or worse.

Now it seems futile- akin to crying over spilt milk-to dissect a momentous chapter of history to fix responsibility which is in danger of getting reduced to a vicious witchhunt with generation of more heat than light, far from an edifying experience. Suffice it to say that all the stalwarts of the country's freedom movement had accepted the Partition Plan under duress with a heavy heart. No one was happy and a profound sadness lurked in their hearts when the ancient nation celebrated its hard-won freedom that came though at a colossal cost.



No more serving alcohol till midnight on weekends in **Dehradun, orders DM**

Considering the rising number of road accidents due beyond the permitted 11 PM, officials said. to drunk driving late at night

and to maintain the law and peace in the district, the Dehradun district magistrate Savin Bansal has used the powers under section 59 of the Excise Manual and cancelled the practice of alcohol being served for one hour extra on weekends in hotels, restaurants, bars, pubs and other licensed businesses. According to officials, this is the first instance in the State wherein a district magistrate has used the powers under this section of the Excise Manual to discontinue the long standing practice of allowing the serving of liquor for an additional hour on weekends. Now the liquor will be served till 11 PM as on weekdays. With orders to this effect being issued by the district magistate, legal action will be taken against any business found serving liquor

In a related development, on the DM's recommendation, the Excise commissioner HC Semwal has cancelled the 24hour bar license issued earlier to the Hyatt Residency hotel. Before Bansal assumed charge as the DM, the Excise commissioner had allowed the establishment to operate its bar 24 hours in August this year. Following the cancellation of this permission by the commissioner, this bar too will remain open only till 11 PM.

It is pertinent to mention here that the district adminis-tration and police have stepped up action to check irresponsible alcohol consumption and drunk driving in the district considering a rise in road acci-dents in which drunk driving is suspected of being a factor.



Seeing the fragile situation, the Centre reimposed the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act in Manipur's six police station areas, including the violence-hit Jiribam on Thursday

The fresh order came after the Manipur government imposed AFSPA in the entire state on October 1, barring 19 police station areas that include these six. The police stations excluded

the Manipur government's October order were Imphal, Lamphal, City, Singjamei, Lamsang, Patsoi, Sekmai, Wangoi, Porompat, Heingang, Lamlai, Irilbung, Leimakhong, Irilbung, Thoubal, Bishnupur, Nambol, Moirang, Kakching, Jiribam. An area or district is notified as "disturbed" under AFSPA to facilitate the operations of

the armed forces. AFSPA gives armed forces operating in disturbed areas sweeping powers to search, arrest and open fire if they deem it necessary for the "maintenance of public

order" The police station areas where AFSPA has been reimposed are Sekmai and Lamsang in Imphal West district, Lamlai in Imphal East district, Jiribam in Jiribam district, Leimakhong in Kangpokpi and Moirang in Bishnupur. More than 200 people have been killed and thousands rendered homeless in ethnic violence between Imphal Valley-based Meiteis and adjoining hills-based Kuki-Zo groups since May last year. The ethnically diverse Jiribam, which was largely untouched by the clashes in Imphal Valley and the adjoining hills, witnessed violence after the mutilated body of a farmer was found in a field in June this year.

BJP claims some Muslim bodies asking community to vote for INDIA bloc, demands strict action

He said that Nomani has appealed to the Muslims to vote for the MVA, saying the outcome of the 2024 Assembly Maharashtra elections will have an impact

not only on the future of the state but also on the future of the entire country.

Earlier the Jamiat Ulema-i-Hind's Lohardaga unit appealed to the Muslims to vote en bloc for the Congress-JMM-RJD-CPI (ML) Liberation combine in Jharkhand, Bhatia claimed.

"This is called vote jihad," he said, adding, "This is the height of appeasement politics" by the MVA in Maharashtra and Congress-JMM in Jharkhand. Bhatia said that an appeal for votes made on the basis of religion amounts to corrupt practices.

"It cannot be tolerated in a democracy like ours where

elections have to be as pure as Mother Ganges. It's a very worrisome trend that we have seen that for the lust of power, the Congress, Sharad Pawar, Uddhay Thackeray are ready to appease, adopt infiltrators and say 'I love you' to illegal immigrants," he said.

He said illegal immigrants can be a threat to national security but it doesn't matter to the INDIA bloc parties. Even as the generation of OSR for panchayats has come into focus to give these rural bodies more financial autonomy, according to the data compiled by the Panchayati Raj ministry, between 2017 and 2022, only an amount of Rs 5,118.98 crore was raised as OSR by the panchayats. This comes down to Rs 59 per capita and Rs 2.27 lakh per panchayat over the five-year

period for 2.25 lakh gram panchayats across the country. The total population coming under these panchayats was more than 86.95 crore in the

Asked about the statements of Congress leaders that there is no mention of restoration of Article 370 in a recentlypassed resolution in the Jammu and Kashmir (J and K) Assembly, Abdullah said they have their own purpose because their party is under attack from the BJP, with Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi and home minister Amit Shah "shouting repeatedly at them just to win the elections"

"They (BJP) are thinking that they will weaken the Congress but we will not allow that to happen," the former J and K chief minister said. "We are hopeful that they (INDIA alliance) will win the elections," he added. On the criticism of Kashmirbased political parties for allegedly misleading people on the resolution by linking it to Article 370, Abdullah said they are free to raise questions. "Our (election) manifesto is before the public and we are following it," he said

Abdullah responded angrily to a question about the restoration of statehood to J and K and asked, "What type of a response do you want from the Centre to the resolution for restoration of statehood? How long has this (NC) government been formed? Do you want statehood to fall from the skv?' "Statehood will be returned



Biden to press Xi on N Korea's ties with Russia Protesters gather at UN climate talks in global day of action

President Joe Biden is expected to use his final meeting with China's leader, Xi Jinping, to urge him to dissuade North Korea from further deepening its support for Russia's war on Ukraine. Saturday's talks on the sidelines of the annual Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation summit in Peru come just over two months before Biden leaves office and makes way for Republican President-elect Donald Trump. It will be Biden's last check-in with Xi someone the Democrat saw as his most consequential peer on

the world stage With the final meeting, officials say Biden will be looking for Xi to step up Chinese engagement to prevent an already dangerous moment with North Korea

from further escalating. Biden on Friday, along with South Korean President Yoon Seok Yul and Japan's Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba, condemned North Korean leader Kim Jong Un's decision to send thousands of troops to help Moscow repel Ukrainian forces who have seized territory in Russia's Kursk border region. Biden called it "dangerous and destabilising cooperation".

White House officials also have expressed frustration with Beijing, which accounts for the vast majority of North Korea's trade, for not doing more to rein in Pyongyang.

Japan's minister visits Ukraine to stress concern over North Korean troops

Kyiv (AP): Japan's foreign Korean and Ukrainian intelminister arrived in Kyiv on Saturday to discuss North Korea's deepening military alliance with Russia, including the deployment of thousands of troops to support Moscow's

war in Ukraine. Foreign Minister Takeshi Iwaya will meet his Ukrainian counterpart, Andrii Sybiha, to reaffirm Japan's "strong support" for Ukraine against Russia's invasion and to discuss further sanctions against Moscow, Japan's Foreign Ministry said. High on the agenda was Tokyo's "grave concern" over

growing military cooperation between North Korea and Russia, the ministry said. According to US, South

Biden, Yoon and Ishiba spent most of their 50-minute discussion focused on the issue, agreeing it "should not be in Beijing's interest to have this destabilising cooperation in the region", according to a senior administration official who spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss their private conversations. The North Koreans also have provided Russia with artillery

ligence assessments, up to 12,000 North Korean troops have been sent to Russia as part of a major defence treaty between the countries. Last week, Ukrainian officials said Ukraine and North Korean troops engaged in small-scale fighting while Ukraine's army fired artillery

at North Korean soldiers in Russia's Kursk border region, where Ukraine launched a surprise push on August 6. The agreement requires both countries to use all available means to provide immediate military assistance if either is attacked. Iwaya's visit comes after the

Biden and Xi have much beyond North Korea to discuss, including China's indirect support for Russia, human rights issues, technology and Taiwan, the self-ruled democracy that Beijing claims as its own.

There's also much uncertainty about what lies ahead in the US-China relationship under Trump, who campaigned promising to levy 60 per cent

tariffs on Chinese imports. Already, many American companies, including Nike and eyewear retailer Warby Parker, have been diversifying their sourcing away from China. Shoe brand Steve Madden says it plans to cut imports from China by as much as 45 per cent next year.

"When Xi meets with Biden, part of his audience is not solely the White House or the US government," said Victor Cha, an analyst at the Centre for Strategic and International Studies in Washington. "It's about American CEOs and continued US investment or trying to renew US investment in China and get rid of the perception that there's a hostile business environment in China."

White House national security adviser Jake Sullivan said Biden administration officials will advise the Trump team that managing the intense competition with Beijing will likely be the most significant foreign policy challenge they will face. Administration officials are concerned that tensions between China and Taiwan could devolve into all-out war if there is a miscalculation by either side, with catastrophic consequences for the world. Sullivan said the Trump

administration will have to deal with the Chinese military's frequent harassment of its regional neighbors.

AP BAKU (AZERBAIJAN)

Hundreds of activists formed a human chain outside one of the main plenary halls at the United Nations climate summit on what is traditionally their biggest protest day during the two-week talks. The demonstration in Baku, Azerbaijan will be echoed at sites around the world in a global "day of action" for climate justice that's become an annual event. Activists waved flags, snapped their fingers, and hummed and mumbled chants in a silent protest, with many covering their mouths with the word "Silenced."

Demonstrators held up signs calling for more money to be pledged for climate finance, which involves cash for transitioning to clean energy and adapting to climate change.

It comes as negotiators at the venue try to hammer out a deal for exactly that - but progress has been slow and observers say the direction of any agreement is still unclear.

Several experts have said USD 1 trillion a year or more is needed both to compensate for such dam-

ages and to pay for a cleanenergy transition that most countries can't afford on their own. Samir Bejanov, deputy lead negotiator of this year's climate talks said in a press conference that the climate finance talks were moving too slowly. 'I want to repeat our strong encouragement to all parties to make as much progress as possible," he said. "We need everyone to approach the task with urgency and determination."



efending champions India stunned Olympic efending silver medallist China 2-0 to seal a semifinal spot at the women's Asian Champions Trophy hockey tournament here on Saturday.

India scored two field goals through Sangita Kumari (32nd miniute) and skipper Salima Tete (37th) before tournament's highest scorer Deepika (60th) converted a penalty corner in the final minute.

The win against world No. 6 China was India's fourth consecutive win in the tournament. The hosts are now on top of the standings with eight points from four games. China have dropped to the second place with six points from four matches. India will square off their

ICC begins Trophy Tour for Champions Trophy in Pakistan, POK cities dropped

PTI ISLAMABAD

Pakistan **¬**ities in Occupied Kashmir (PoK) found no mention in the Champions Trophy tour unveiled by the ICC on Saturday as the world body moved in swiftly to have them dropped from the host country's itinerary following India's strong objection. The Trophy Tour will now

comprise Karachi, Rawalpindi and Islamabad, apart from Abbottabad in the Khyber Pakhtunwala Region.

The Trophy Tour starts in Islamabad, the capital city of Pakistan, and will travel to other cities of the nation --Taxila and Khanpur (November 17), Abbottabad (November 18), Murree (November 19) and Nathia Gali (November 20) before Karachi concluding in Karachi (November 22-25). Most of these cities are tourist attractions,

Earlier, on November 14, the PCB had announced the Trophy Tour, which included cities like Skardu, Hunza and Muzaffarabad, which fall in the PoK region, a disputed territory between India and Pakistan.



The PTI reported on Friday that the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) secretary Jay Shah had raised strong objections with the ICC to PCB's Trophy Tour plans in the PoK region. However, the global body took swift action to eliminate those cities from the tour as revealed on

Saturday. Following the Trophy Tour in Pakistan, it will tour Afghanistan (November 26-28), followed by Bangladesh (December 10-13), South Africa (December 15-22), Australia (December 25-January 5), New Zealand (January 6-11), England

(January 12-14) and India (January 15-26). The cities for the Trophy Tour outside Pakistan will be announced in due course.

'A series of physical and digital engagements traversing iconic destinations, sporting events key battles in the and international cricket calendar form the Trophy Tour schedule, during which fans will also be treated to a content series titled 'Champion on Tour' that will document the Trophy Tour's journey around the world through the lens of food, music and cricket," ICC said in a release.

Pakistan is the defending champion of the event, having won the title at The Oval in London in 2017, defeating India in the final. As for this edition, India has reportedly denied travelling to Pakistan for the tournament, and the ICC is working with PCB to find a possible solution to it, including hosting it in a hybrid model or shifting the competition out of Pakistan, possibly the United Arab Emirates (UAE) or South Africa. defeating India in the final. Africa. in the PCB Sources



n the enchanting Coastal city of Goa, where the sea whispers the dream and the sand carries the tale, the grand curtains would be raised for the *International Film Festival of India* (IFFI) for the world. The IFFI is the only South Asian festival accredited by the *International Federation of Film Producers' Associations* (FIAPF).

Now, being held in Goa since 2004, IFFI is not only the grand festival for the films showcase but it's a platform, where Indian cinema interacts with world cinema, where filmmakers connect with audiences, and where the magic of storytelling is truly celebrated.

This year, IFFI has received 1,676 submissions from 101 countries, highlighting its expanding global influence after all these years. *The International Film Festival of India* 2024 will showcase over 180 international films from 81 countries, including 15 world premieres, 3 international premieres, 40 Asian premieres, and 106 Indian premieres. Featuring celebrated titles and award-winning films from around the world, this year's festival promises to make a powerful impression on audiences and on the world of cinema.

Talking about the past, the journey of the International Film Festival of India (IFFI) dates back to 1952 when India was struggling to find its cinematic voice post-independence. The Government of India had organised the first IFFI which was held in Mumbai, and it showcased 40 films from 23 countries. The IFFI 1952 marked the first time India had its own international film festival, bringing global cinema to Indian shores. The initial editions of IFFI were held across various Indian cities, including Delhi, Chennai, and Kolkata, with the festival traveling from one city to another to reach a broader audience. The past 20 years spent by IFFI in Goa, contributed to Goa being the official place for the IFFI keeping in mind the advantage of its cultural vibrancy and scenic beauty. IFFI is a unique one distinct from other film festivals worldwide. Known as the "Film Festival of Goa," IFFI blends seamlessly with Goa's local culture, attracting an international audience to India's favourite tourist destination. Goa's vibrant art scene, beach culture, and heritage architecture complement the festival's spirit, creating an inviting space where cinema lovers from all corners of the world can gather for a shared celebration. The Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, in collaboration with the National Film Development Corporation (NFDC) and the Entertainment Society of Goa (ESG), is set to host the 55th International Film Festival of India (IFFI) in Goa from 20th to 28th November 2024. The Country Focus section will allow viewers to experience the best of international cinema, linking to cultural exchange. The Country of Focus for IFFI 2024 will be Australia. This will be made sure by a dedicated package of Australian films giving a strong presence at the festival. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) has been signed between Screen Australia & NFDC, for participation by leading Australian filmmakers in the festival and the Film Bazaar, and a showcase by AusFilm, promoting Australia's unique filming locations & co-productions. Apart from Australia, in partnership with the British Film Institute, the United Kingdom will be showcased as the "Treaty Country," presenting British cinema through a carefully crafted package. Celebration of the pioneers is very important to lead the way, give examples, and keep the generations inspired by looking over to the people who have done it no others. Like every other year, the stars of the cinema, keeping up with the entertainment industry would be facilitated by awards at the IFFI 2024. Chef Pillai takes you to experience Kerala's rich flavours with modern twists at his first-ever North India pop-up at The Westin Gurgaon, New Delhi, writes ABHI SINGHAL

ispelling the long-held notion that South Indian cuisine revolves solely around idli, dosa, and sambar, 21 Michelin-star Chef Suresh Pillai brought a culinary extravaganza to North India with his first-ever pop-up at The Westin Gurgaon, New Delhi. The experience was a symphony of Kerala's

authentic flavours, masterfully infused with *Chef Pillai's* signature modern tweaks and twists. From the aromatic embrace of the South spices to the delicate finesse of seafood delicacies, the pop-up menu was an ode to South India's rich gastronomic heritage taste.

The extraordinary culinary journey took the eaters through the vibrant flavours of Kerala, in collaboration with renowned *Restaurant Chef Pillai* (RCP). The mouthwatering dishes were a presentation through an exclusive 10-course tasting menu curated by *Chef Pillai*.

It all started with the welcome drink of the season, *Aarambam*, a bit of a sour drink. The meticulously curated vegetarian and non-vegetarian menus transported guests straight to the heart of Kerala, offering a true taste of the region's culinary treasures. Each dish was crafted with precision and passion, showcasing the soul of Kerala's

cuisine, from its spices blending to its delicate yet robust flavours. For the Hors d'oeuvres, there was the mouth watery *Sambharam Kadumanga*, blending the Kerala summer butter milk & pickled mango inside paani poori. One sitting in North India would never imagine blending paani poori with a South Indian twist, which stole the show.

"We created a menu from the Kerala essence, for example, our pani poori, one of the starters, actually, it's a North Indian pani poori out of it's a buttermilk we used to serve in Kerala along with a mango pickle. So the puri, we stuff with the mango and the cold buttermilk generally you say chach." explained *Chef Suresh Pillai*, excited about his first pop up in the north side.

As guests savoured the thoughtfully crafted hors d'oeuvres, the starters gracefully took center stage, led by the Pazham Pori Chaat. This Keralainspired masterpiece featured golden, batter-fried banana fritters a bit crispy on the outside, tender within, elevated by a drizzle of honey-yogurt blend that perfectly balanced sweetness and creaminess. Following this, guests were treated to *Cauliflower Porippu*, a dish that beautifully showcased Kerala's rich spicy taste. Crispy, marinated cauliflower florets were deep-fried to golden perfection and then stirfried with *thenga porippu*—an aromatic blend of grated coconut, fragrant curry leaves, and a hint of chili powder.

The starters in both the vegetarian and the non-vegetarian segments were a delightful interplay of textures and flavours, with the crunch of the cauliflower perfectly complementing the earthy, spicysweet coconut mixture.

The main course featured Chef Suresh Pillai's signature dishes

recommended by himself, offering both vegetarian and nonvegetarian options that embodied the essence of Kerala's culinary artistry. For vegetarians, there was *Paneer Nirvana*: tender mari

Paneer Nirvana: tender marinated cottage cheese, pan-fried to perfection, and then slow-cooked in creamy coconut milk. The dish was elevated with the earthy flavours of ginger, green chilies, and aromatic curry leaves, all beautifully encased in a banana leaf for a touch of traditional authenticity. For non-





vegetarians, the highlight was the *Neymeen Nirvana*, *Chef Pillai*'s iconic creation.

The main course also offered a rich tapestry of Kerala's culinary heritage, featuring dishes like *Ulli Theeyal*, a dark, flavourful curry of slow-roasted coconut, shallots, and tamarind, and *Baby Corn Vendaka Manga Muringa Charu*, an Alleppey-style coconut

Alleppey-style coconut mango curry with baby corn, okra, and tender drumsticks. *Kathrikai Thakkali Roast* brought tangy and spicy South Indian flavours to life with marinated brinjal and tomatoes in a rich onion-tomato gravy. Accompaniments included

the delicate, lacy-edged *Appams*, perfect for mopping up curries, and the soft, flaky *Malabar Nool Porotta*, rounding out a meal that celebrated Kerala's diverse and bold flavours. For dessert, the menu delighted both vegetarian and non-vegetarian guests with indulgent creations. Vegetarians savoured the *Tender* *Coconut Pudding*, a light and fluffy treat infused with the delicate flavour and soft flesh of the tender coconut, alongside the *Coco Nutty Choco Brownie*, a decadent eggless chocolate dessert enriched with crunchy nuts and fragrant coconut, served with a scoop of creamy ice cream. Non-vegetarian diners were treated to the *Palada Cheesecake*, a unique fusion dessert layering the traditional *Kerala Palada* (rice flakes) flavour atop a crisp, crusty base, offering a delightful blend of tradition and sophistication to end the meal on a sweet note.

Certain dishes have become my go-to orders, each offering something special. The *Lychee Chaat*, a Thaiinspired creation, is an absolute must-try. Bits of *lychee* and *avocado* sit atop a crispy rice puff base, accompanied by a flavourful *Nam Jim* sauce one bite, and you won't want to stop. The *Chicken Chilli Dim Sum* features a delicate wrapper and pairs perfectly with the accompanying sauces. Another standout is the *Taiwanese Mushro*

standout is the Taiwanese Mushrooms, crisp-coated and served with pickled chilli

and a sweet-sour sauce, accented by crunchy peanuts for extra texture. Not every dish was flawless. The

nachos were slightly too salty for my taste. However, the ramen from their global menu made up for it with its rich, layered flavours. It's a generous portion, perfect for a hearty appetite or sharing with friends.

My companions thoroughly enjoyed the *Lamb Adana Kebab* as much as they did the sushi. While Poiz has a wide range of Indian dishes, I found myself drawn to the global offerings, including their expertly crafted *Neapolitan pizza*.

A meal here would be incomplete without the *Belgian Nutella Chocolate*. This dessert not only excels in taste but also impresses in presentation. The smooth *Belgian chocolate* and *Nutella sweetness* are cleverly balanced with blueberries and hazelnuts, creating a perfect finale.



hough Kurukshetra is a significant pilgrimage site for Hindus and is located close to Delhi, it has not always attracted large numbers of visitors. Mentioned in various Hindu scriptures, particularly the Mahabharata, Kurukshetra holds great spiritual importance. According to Acharya Some Nath Gautam, priest at the *Katyayani Temple*, visiting all the ancient temples here would require at least a year. This journey, known as the *Kurukshetra* 84 Kos Parikrama, encompasses numerous sacred and historical sites. However, modern pilgrims often focus on the most important temples, holy places, and archaeological monuments due to

time constraints. The city offers a variety of accommodation options, from budget-friendly 2- and 3- star hotels to numerous dharamshalas. For those seeking luxury, the Noormahal Palace in Karnal stands out as Haryana's only 5-star hotel, offering exceptional amenities such as a spa, jacuzzi, modern gym, and fine dining. Blending heritage with modern comforts, this ultra-luxurious hotel features the Frontier Mail restaurant, housed in a life-sized train compartment from the historic Frontier Mail. This sculpture has become a popular photography spot. Another notable site is the ancient *Chandra Kup*, a well where, according to legend, water turns into milk during a lunar aclines. It is also said to lunar eclipse. It is also said to be the place where Draupadi washed her hair after the infamous bloodshed by

Dushasana.

The Kali Kamli Temple, built by Kali Kamli Baba of Bengal in the 19th century, is a siddha peeth located near Brahma Sarovar. Devi Kup, also known as the BhadraKali Temple, is one of the 51 Shakti Peethas and Haryana's only such temple. Pandit Satpal Sharma explains that the temple holds significance for Lord Krishna and Balarama, who visited before the *Kurukshetra War*. Devotees continue to donate clay, ceramic, or silver horses here, a tradition rooted in sacred history. Special pujas for Maa Kali and Lord Shani are held every Saturday.

every Saturday. The Sthanu Mahadev Temple is another important site, where Lord Krishna and the Pandavas sought Lord Shiva's blessings before the war. Nearby, the historical Harsh ka Tilla and Sheikh Chilli's Tomb offer fascinating insights into the region's past. History enthusiasts can also explore the Sri Krishna Museum and Kurukshetra Panorama, which Kurukshetra Panorama, which showcases key artifacts. For children and astronomy lovers, the Kalpana Chawla Planetarium provides a fun and educational experience.

In the coming years, the *ISKCON Temple*, currently under construction and expected to be completed by 2026, will be a must-visit site. 



Rekindle your spirit with silence

▶ EEPING silence is very useful. It purifies our speech. Deep silence is the mother of creativity. No creativity can come out of one who is too busy, worried, over-ambitious or lethargic. There is no need to maintain silence in our daily routine but there is also no need to speak too much. If you maintain some silence, you will think before you speak. If you keep talking, you yourself will not understand what you are saying.

Have you ever observed the impact of your speech on others? Often we do not bother to notice this, we go on blabbering. We just want to say all that we want to say and become free. No, you must see what impact your speech has on others. There is a beautiful couplet in the Bhagavad Gita which says, "The words that do not rattle the minds of people and which is truth; truth which is benevolent and which is pleasant, those type of words are to be spoken. That is called the penance of speech."

Tapas (penance) for the speech is to speak only those words that do not rattle the minds of others. Krishna was the most skillful because his silence was so deep. Sometimes we think we are right and, perhaps, we are right. You may be speaking the truth, it may be benevolent, it may be good for the other person as well but if it is not pleasant and it is rattling the other person's mind then it is not



complete. This is not an easy thing to do. It requires skill - not to rattle anyone's mind or give them pain. So speak words that are pleasant, true and benevolent but ensure that you don't speak pleasing lies. Don't crush the minds and hearts of others with your unpleasant words. Now how do we do this? You may say, "I don't intend to hurt anybody but hurtful words just fly out of my mouth. What do I do?"

Silence and meditation awaken our potential and abilities. That is why everyone should remain silent and meditate for a while. Yog and Vedanta have been referred to as the highest forms of knowledge and that is what they are. The inner space or your inner form can be

experienced through them. Your brain benefits so much from this. Depending on the situation, we must accept whatever is happening around us. If we are sitting in meditation and a phone is ringing somewhere, we must accept it instead of getting irritated. Take it as background music. As Shri Krishna says in the Bhagavad Gita, as long as something or the other is occupying our mind, we cannot go into meditation. So surrender your sankalpa (intention) during meditation. Afterwards, when you are working on something, put everything into it. We do the opposite; during meditation we keep thinking about all we have to do and while working we think that God will look after

everything. Put everything into any work you do.

Take a sankalpa (intention) about what you want in the future. Then form a plan accordingly. Worry drains you of energy and strength. You don't gain anything. You acquire inner strength through silence. In spite of all that, if it comes, if it happens then you can't do anything about it, then just ask for forgiveness. When you are getting into silence ask for forgiveness -'By my thought, word or deed if I have done anything or caused any hurt to someone, may I be forgiven." That completely uplifts us from being bogged down.

Some questions can be answered only in silence. It is the goal of all answers. If an answer does not silence the mind it is "no" answer. Thoughts are not the goal in themselves. Their goal is silence. Deep silence is the mother or source of creativity. When the body, mind and spirit are in tune with each other, then creativity happens. When you are tired, exhausted, stressed, over-ambitious or lethargic, when you are not in touch with yourself, your creativity and talents are stifled. When feverishness clogs your head, your mind is not clear; poetry cannot dawn, no creative thought will come. Meditation and yoga can clear your mind and kindle skills and creativity in you. It puts you in touch with the space of silence within you and

becomes an unending well-spring of creativity. It relieves you of stress and strain, strengthens your nervous system and mind, releases toxins, makes you more capable and enhances you in every way. The easy way to silence the thoughts is to arouse feelings. For through feelings only peace, joy and love dawn. And they are all your very nature.

To the question, "Who am I?" the only relevant answer is silence. You need to discard all answers in words, including "I am Nothing" or "I am the Cosmic Self" or "I am the Self" — and just stick to the question "Who am I?" All other answers are just thoughts. Thoughts can never be complete. Only silence is complete. And spirituality is a harmonious blend of outer silence and inner celebration; and inner silence and outer celebration. When you ask the question, "Who am I?" you get no answer, there is silence. That is the real answer. This solidified silence is wisdom, is knowledge. You are solidified silence, awareness. A thousand hours of speech cannot equal one glance: a hundred glances cannot equal a minute of silence. Prayer within breath is silence. Love within Infinity is silence. Wisdom without word is silence. Compassion without aim is silence. Action without doing is silence. Smiling with all the Existence is silence. And God is nothing but solidified silence.
