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ADANI ISSUE TO HEAT UP WINTER SESSION

political storm erupted in India soon after **A**Billionaire industrialist Gautam Adani was charged by United States prosecutors over his role in an alleged scheme to pay USD 250 million bribe to Indian officials in exchange for favourable terms for solar power contracts.

It may be a coincidence that some of the major controversies, including the latest one, and the ones that came before it such as 'Hindenburg, Pegasus, Soros' have surfaced just before the beginning of a Parliament session. This time, the Winter Session begins on Monday, with the Opposition announcing to raise the issue during the session while ruling

Bharatiya Janata Party calling it preparation for another 'drama' to stall proceedings of yet another important Session. While the BJP said all the states

mentioned in the indictment were at that time ruled by Opposition parties, Congress led INDIA Bloc have demanded immediate arrest of Adani.

The Adani group has denied charges of paying bribes to secure favourable terms for solar power contracts, saying the allegations by US prosecutors are baseless and the conglomerate is compliant with all laws. It said all possible legal recourse will be sought.

According to agency reports from New York, United States prosecutors charged Adani and his Sagar and other nephew defendants for paying over USD

250 million in bribes between 2020 and 2024 to Indian government officials to win solar energy contracts on terms that could

potentially bring in more than USD 2 billion in profit. This, they alleged, was concealed

from the US banks and investors

from whom the Adani group raised billions of dollars for the project. US law allows pursuing foreign corruption allegations if they involve certain links to American investors or markets. The indictment has thrown Adani

Group in yet another financial trouble after it suffered a jolt by US short seller Hindenburg Research's damning fraud allegations.

Senior Congress leader Rahul Gandhi demanded immediate arrest of Gautam Adani. Addressing a Press conference Rahul said it is now pretty clear and established in the US that the businessman has broken Indian as well as American laws. Rahul also demanded Adani's "protector" and SEBI chairperson Madhabi Puri Buch be removed from her post and a probe should be initiated.

From 'severe' to 'very poor

Set up courtroom in Tihar: SC on Yasin Malik case

Dointing out that "how can cross examination be done online," the Supreme Court on Thursday indicated that it may set up a courtroom inside Tihar Jail for the trial of Jammu and Kashmir separatist leader Yasin Malik in a kidnapping case. A Bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Augustine George Masih was hearing a Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) plea against the September 20, 2022 order of a Jammu trial court that directed Malik, serving life term in Tihar jail, to be produced before it physically to cross-examine the prosecution witnesses in the kidnapping case of politician Mufti Mohammad Sayeed.

Observing that even Ajmal Kasab was given fair trial, the bench, however, remarked, "How will cross-examination be done online? There is hardly any connectivity in Jammu... In our country, a fair trial was given even to Ajmal Kasab and legal assistance was given to him in the high court."

The Bench told Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, representing the CBI, to take instructions on the total number of witnesses in the case. Mehta pointed out security concerns and said Malik couldn't be taken to Jammu for the trial. The law officer accused Malik of "playing tricks" for having asked to appear personally and not engaging a lawyer

Mehta said Malik was not an ordinary criminal and showed purported photograph of Malik sharing the dais with terrorist Hafiz Saeed.

The Supreme Court said it could order a trial to take place inside the jail besides asking the judge to come to the national capital for the proceedings. The Bench, however, noted all the accused had to be heard before it passes an order. Mehta said Malik physically appearing in the Supreme Court had raised security concerns previously. Later many jail officials faced suspension and notice for this

goof up. The Bench said Malik could be allowed to appear virtually in the apex court proceedings and posted the matter on life sentence in a terrorfunding case, was brought to the high-security apex court premises in a prison van escorted by armed security personnel without the court's permission.

The CBI said Malik, the top leader of the Jammu and Kashmir Liberation Front, was a threat to national security and cannot be allowed to be taken outside the Tihar jail premises. On September 20, 2022, a special TADA court in Jammu directed Malik to be physically produced before it on the next hearing for him to cross-examine prosecution supremo Arvind Kejriwal witnesses in the kidnapping chaired a meeting of the case. The CBI challenged the trial court order before the Supreme Court as appeals in TADA cases are only heard by the top court.

Ukraine says Russia launched intercontinental missile The attack comes two days

Russia **T**kraine says launched ballistic intercontinental missile overnight targeting Dnipro city in the centraleast of the country, which, if confirmed, would be the first time Moscow has used such a missile in the war. In a statement Thursday on

the Telegram messaging app, Ukraine's air force did not specify the exact type of missile, but said it was launched from Russia's Astrakhan region, which borders the Caspian Sea. It said an intercontinental ballistic missile was fired at Dnipro city along with eight other missiles, and that the Ukrainian military shot down six of them.

You might have heard about wedding crashers, but those pale in comparison t30 this variation of unwanted guests: the infamous 'Band,

Baaja, Baarat' gang is back. Gangmembers gate crash into usually high-profile wedding ceremonies in the city, not to eat free food but rather to steal valuables from unsuspecting guests. Recently this gang looted two lavish weddings in Delhi's Alipur and Chhatarpur's Maidan Garhi on November 12, and 17, respectively.

Located about 800 km from Delhi, a specialized gang of wedding looters recruit from two villages: Kadiya and Gulkhedi in Rajgarh district of Madhya Pradesh where families send their young members to the gang on 'rent'. They are then trained to loot valuables from wedding parties without being noticed. According to police, 50-yearold Raj Kumar alias Raju, who is the 'gang coordinator', manages his operations remotely, sitting in a taxi outside the wedding venue, directing his band of thieves.

"Known for the practice of 'renting' out families to criminal gangs, the residents functions, and are used to carry out



of Kadiya and Gulkhedi villages often enter into agreements known as 'Anubandh', where families receive financial compensation for sending families from their families to participate in theft operations," a senior police official said. The gang gives a 'crash course' to the young people so they can lift bags and added. steal valuables from the big fat weddings. "They use young recruits, trained to blend in at wedding

crimes without drawing any attention towards them. The practice is seen as a form of a social contract, where impoverished backgrounds are exploited by criminal elements for thefts at weddings, typically targeting the wealthy," he

The officer also said that in previous instances, once an accused gets bail, they never turn up before the court for trial. "Thus, they have been declared proclaimed offenders throughout India," he stated.

However, the Delhi Police's Crime Branch finally busted the syndicate by arresting four members of the gang including Kumar, 30-year-old Mohit, 19-year-old Sumit, and 30-year-old Karan, near Ghitorni Metro Station, who were the primary perpetrators, executing the bag-lifting operations and stealing valuables from wedding guests. "After the thefts, Raj Kumar would distribute the stolen items among the gang members," another officer added. On the night of November 12, Sumit

and Karan stole cash and valuables from two wedding ceremonies in Alipur, and on the night of November 17, they also stole a bag filled with cash and valuables from a wedding ceremony at a farmhouse in Maidan Garhi in Chhatarpur. "While they entered the ceremonies to commit the thefts, Raj Kumar and Mohit waited outside in a private taxi, keeping watch and giving them directions over mobile phones," the officer said, adding that they recovered five mobile phones along with 13 SIM cards being used for fake identity.

The common symptoms were persistent cough and whistling or crackling sound while breathing, chest tightness and shortness of breath.

TA recruitment rally chaos linked to Danapur cancellation: Goswami

The sudden cancellation of the recruitment rally in Danapur (Bihar) for the Territorial Army (TA), coupled with a lack of communication to the officials, led to the massive chaos that unfolded during the recent recruitment rally Pithoragarh, according to district magistrate Vinod Goswami. He said this in response to the confusion faced by candidates at the TA recruitment rally, where a large number of youths stormed the recruitment site after encountering difficulties in reaching the location. Goswami explained that a preliminary meeting to prepare for the recruitment rally was held with colonel Uttam Kumar Singh on November 8. During this meeting, Singh had said that while fewer candidates were expected on the days scheduled for other States, a larger turnout was anticipated on the dates set for Uttarakhand, the DM said. Conseadditional quently, arrangements would be necessary since recruitment was

taking place nearby, potentially increasing the number of local candidates. Colonel Singh also added that recruitment would occur in Sagar (Madhya Pradesh), Danapur (Bihar) and Pithoragarh (Uttarak-

However, hand). Goswami further revealed that the recruitment scheduled in Danapur was abruptly cancelled by the TA on November 17 and the district administration was informed the following day via letter. There was no phone call or email communication from the Army officials regarding this cancellation. Due to the sudden cancellation in Danapur, candidates from Bihar and Uttar Pradesh who were supposed to participate there arrived in Tanakpur by train on November 18 and 19 to take part in the recruitment scheduled for Pithoragarh. Upon learning about the large crowd of candidates in Tanakpur on November 18, He asked

the officials of the Transport department to arrange additional buses for the estimated 10,000 to 15,000 candidates. From November 12 to 17, 30 buses from the Uttarakhand Transport Corporation were available daily. As a result, the recruitment process proceeded smoothly until November 17. He further added that till November 19, transport and other arrangements remained efficient in the district. He further added that due to the sudden cancellation of the recruitment in Danapur, the failure to communicate this change to the administration in a timely manner resulted in all candidates from the places flocking to Pithoragarh. He further added that if the administration had been promptly informed of the TA's decision to cancel the Danapur recruitment, the candidates would not have faced such inconvenience. Goswami noted that as of now, approximately 25,000 candidates

have arrived in Pithoragarh, of which 18,000 candidates had returned by the afternoon of Thursday after completing the recruitment process

hief minister Pushkar Singh Dhami has directed the officers of the State administration to complete the process of shifting of people affected under the Song dam project in Dehradun. Chairing a meeting of the senior officers of the administration at the State secretariat on Wednesday, the CM said that the work in the Song dam drinking water project should start soon. He said that the land should be provided without any delay to the affected families which are needed to be displaced. The CM added that all the basic amenities should be provided to the affected families. He said that based on discussions with the affected families, community halls, temples and roads should be constructed depending upon the requirement and consent. In the meeting the CM also directed the officers to expedite work on the ambitious Jamrani dam project. The Song dam project is designed to meet this challenge of supplying drinking water to Dehradun city and its sub urban areas. The project is proposed on Song river, which is the trib-



utary of the Ganga, with a budget of Rs 2,021 crore. The project would provide 150 MLD of drinking water to a population of 11 lakh. This gravity water would end the dependency on the underground water for fulfilling the drinking water requirement of Dehradun city. It would result also in an increase in the ground water table and release of greenhouse gases. The project also entails creation of a lake which would help in promoting tourism and employment generation. The dam will also provide safety from floods to ten villages located downstream. The meet-

ing was attended chief secretary Radha Raturi, secretaries Shailesh Bagauli, Vinay Shankar Pandey, R Rajesh Kumar, principal chief conservator of forest Dhananjai Mohan, additional secretary Ranvir Singh Chauhan, Lalit Mohan Rayal, chief engineer of Irrigation department Jaipal Singh and other officials.

Rajnath Singh holds bilateral talks with US Secretary of Defence

India and US on Thursday reviewed the entire spectrum of their bilateral defence ties during talks between Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and US Secretary of Defense Lloyd J Austin on the sidelines of 11th ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting (ADMM)-Plus at Vientiane,

The two leaders commended the progress achieved by the India-US defence partnership, based on increased operational coordination, information-sharing, and industrial innovation, defence ministry

Both sides recognised the remarkable progress made under the US-India Defence Industrial Cooperation Roadmap, including ongoing collaboration to advance priority co-production arrangements for jet engines, munitions, and ground mobility

Rajnath Singh recalled his recent productive and successful visit to the US in August 2024, wherein two important documents were concluded - the Security of Supplies Agreement (SOSA) and the Memorandum of Agreement regarding the deployment of Liaison Officers. Both sides welcomed ongoing efforts to deepen the



military partnership and interoperability to maintain a free and open Indo-Pacific. Drawing attention to the successful QUAD Summit attend-

Number of hoax bomb threats to airlines | Powergrid to revive crematoriums, have reduced: Civil Aviation Secretary

Authorities have successfully handled the menace of hoax bomb calls to airlines and such calls have reduced. To a query about hoax bomb calls, Civil Aviation Secretary Vumlunmang Vualnam also said that authorities have tackled them successfully. He fur-ther said that procedures being adopted to deal with fog-related disruptions have been streamlined.

A few weeks back, hundreds of flights had received bomb threat calls that later turned out to be hoaxes. These threats had significantly impacted flight operations of various domestic carriers. "Our security have tackled this (hoax bomb calls) and we have seen also that we have been successful. The numbers have now gone down and from the airport threat assessment committee also, the consultation process has been streamlined. They have been made more responsive, (for) quick response..

"We have successfully handled the hoax cases so that passengers and flights are not disrupted by hoax calls," Vualnam

As part of preparations for the



fog season during which generally there are flight disruptions due to low visibility conditions, the secretary said airlines have been instructed to timely inform passengers about delays or cancellations. "We will be issuing fresh instructions to remind airlines and airports for the arrangements for passen-"If there is any unavoidable

delay in flights or cancellations, the procedures being adopted have been streamlined... BCAS has issued the circular and the drills are taking place. With this, there will be a better handling of fog season this year,"

Other steps include allowing passengers to exit from an aircraft through an airport departure gate in case there is a long delay in operating the flight after boarding. In this regard, the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS) had issued a circular earlier this year.

"Now, with the drills and the space being earmarked, it has been activated. It requires holding areas to be earmarked and those things... It will be applicable everywhere (airports) but Delhi is the top priority because of the weather and the volume of people," the secretary said on the sidelines of an event in the national cap-

India's first indigenous antibiotic drug Nafithromycin for resistant infections launched

In a ground breaking step for India's biotechnology sector, Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh has formally launched the first indigenous antibiotic 'Nafithromycin' for resistant infections at an event here. The drug is now awaiting final approval from the Central Drugs Standard Control Organization (CDSCO) for manufacturing and public use, marking a major leap forward in India's fight against AMR. The antibiotic has been developed with the support of "Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council" (BIRAC), a unit of the Department of Biotechnology and has been brought to market under the trade name "Miqnaf" by pharma company "Wolkardt".

It is the country's first indigenously developed antibiotic aimed at tackling tackling Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR).

This innovation is designed to treat Community-Acquired Bacterial Pneumonia (CABP), a



resistant bacteria, which disproportionately affects vulnerable populations, including children and the elderly as well as immune compromised hosts like Patients with Diabetes, Cancers etc, said the Minister, as per a statement here.

Dr. Singh described the threeday treatment regimen of Nafithromycin as a gamechanger in addressing drugresistant pneumonia, a condition responsible for over two million deaths globally each

Índia, which bears 23% of the

world's community pneumo-nia burden, faces challenges with existing treatments, including widespread resistance to drugs like azithromycin. The new antibiotic is said to be ten times more effective than current options and offers a safer,

faster, and more tolerable solution for patients. Nafithromycin's efficacy stands out as it targets both typical

new antibiotic in this class has

been developed worldwide for

over three decades.

ISRO and ASA strengthen ties with landmark agreement **PTI** ■ BENGALURU

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

Mending fences with China

Faced with a slowing economy and increasing geopolitical challenges, Beijing seems eager to seek a thaw with India

n a notable shift, the Chinese government has signalled its intent to recalibrate its ties with India following a series of disengagement measures along their disputed border. The thaw reflects both strategic considerations and economic imperatives as Beijing grapples with slowing economic growth and rising geopolitical challenges. After years of strained relations exacerbated by the 2020 Galwan Valley clash, which resulted in casualties on both sides, the disengagement at friction points offers a moment to 'look into the future.' Chinese officials and business leaders have expressed optimism about a potential reset in ties, framing peace and stability as prerequisites for deeper bilateral engagement. China's economy has been under pressure from multiple fronts: sluggish growth, weakening consumer demand and the looming threat of escalating tariffs from the United States under Donald Trump's proposed policies. Beijing has already announced two rounds of monetary and fiscal stimulus packages, with a third expect-



Despite a persistent trade imbalance—India's imports from China stood at \$99.59 billion in 2023, dwarfing its exports of \$16.23 billion—there is scope for collaboration. Chinese businesses see opportunities in India's pharmaceuticals, services and burgeoning electric vehicle market. China's business leaders and scholars have called for a pragmatic approach that separates border issues from economic and cultural ties.

Influential figures in China's economic hubs—Beijing, Shanghai and Shenzhen—have emphasised the benefits of collaboration. Companies like Shanghai Pharmaceuticals and carmaker BYD have expressed interest in leveraging the Indian market, highlighting areas like healthcare and electric vehicles as promising fields for cooperation. While Beijing appears eager to reset relations, New Delhi's emphasis on resolving border disputes as a precondition for normalisation remains a sticking point. India is likely to continue leveraging its trade policies to address the trade deficit and ensure balanced economic ties. Additionally, mutual trust needs rebuilding after years of diplomatic and military standoffs. Indeed, the disengagement along the border is a significant step toward restoring confidence between the two nations. If both sides prioritise dialogue and economic cooperation, the thaw could lead to a more stable and mutually beneficial relationship. China's acknowledgment of India's potential as a key trade and investment partner, coupled with India's focus on reducing its trade deficit and securing fair access to Chinese markets, could lay the foundation for a new era in Sino-Indian relations. Whatever the reasons behind China's willingness to engage in dialogue, this is an opportunity that must be fully seized.

The glaring contradiction between Congress party's diatribes against Adani and its actions underscores a deeper issue of political expediency eroding its trust

he relationship between the Congress Party and the Adani Group is a masterclass in political hypocrisy. For all its vocal criticisms of the Adani-BJP nexus, Congress's historical and current actions tell a different story-one of close collaboration and mutual benefit. While Rahul Gandhi and his party present themselves as crusaders against crony capitalism, the truth is that Congress has been instrumental in the growth of the Adani empire. If anything, Congress's attacks on Adani only serve to highlight its duplicity.

Adani's early growth can be traced back to the 1990s when the Congress Party was in power. In 1993, under the Chimanbhai Patel-led Congress government in Gujarat, Adani was granted land at just 10 paise per square meter for his Mundra Port project. Further land allocations were made by Shanker Singh Vaghela, who was supported by the Congress Party. Interestingly, only about a third of Adani's total land acquisitions in Gujarat occurred during Modi's tenure as Chief Minister.

Despite Rahul Gandhi's relentless attacks on Adani, Congress-ruled states continue to roll out the red carpet for the conglomerate. In Rajasthan, Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot's government has signed agreements with Adani for a massive 10,000 MW solar power project and handed over operational control of Jaipur International Airport.

In Chhattisgarh, Bhupesh Baghel's administration has approved Adani's role as a Mine Developer and Operator for coal blocks, while Himachal Pradesh's Congress Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu brokered a deal to reopen Adani-owned cement plants. These are not isolated incidents but part of a broader trend where Congress governments actively court the same group their leaders lambast at the national level. This two-faced approach isn't

just political theatre—it's deeply cynical. The group's ability to

deliver large-scale infrastructure projects, attract investments, and create jobs makes it indispensable to state governments, including those led by Congress. Yet, instead of owning this reality, Congress chooses to vilify Adani on the national stage, using him as a convenient punching bag to score political points against the

From understaffed schools and ill-equipped hospitals to failing sanitation systems, taxpayers are left wondering: where is their money really going?

Despite decades of commitments and the collection of hundreds of billions in taxes, numerous regions still suffer from shockingly inadequate basic infrastructure. But in the recent years, the Ganga has become not suitable for drinking purposes and more pathetically for bathing too since it is severely polluted with human waste and industrial contaminants. Three quarters of sewage from the northern plains is discharged into the Ganga without treatment. The Central Pollution Control Board states that BOD levels should be less than 3 mg per litre for bathing, but in the Ganges, BOD levels can be up to 6.4 mg

Therefore, swimming in the river, which has high levels of harmful bacteria and toxic chemicals, can increase the chance of developing diseases like viral fever, nausea, typhoid, hepatitis, gastroenteritis and so on. The Ganga Action Plan was launched in 1985 with the aim of improving water quality through interception, diversion and treatment of domestic sewage and to prevent toxic and industrial chemical wastes from identified polluting units from entering the Ganga should be strictly implemented. he cell rang and dropped from her hands. There was an agonising silence across continents. Her only son in the US, a brilliant student, committed suicide. We play, rewind, and rerun an enormous number of movies. Thoughts are impacted by the kind of food we partake in (Tamasik, Rajasik, Sattvik), the company we keep and the amount of rest we take. The quality (guna) of food has a bearing on our disposition and approach to life.

Tamasik food makes us sluggish, Rajasik food makes us feverish or anxious in disposition and Sattvik food makes us feel calm. The first two lead us to fearful situations. If we are closeted with individuals who have a negative thought process, we imbibe such attributes and evince such a behavioural pattern. Dedicated bank for MSMEs to boost credit access



This new initiative seeks to bridge that gap and stimulate job creation and economic activity by providing MSMEs with the financial support they desperately need

he government plans to estab-lish a dedicated bank to lend directly to Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) to enhance credit availability in this crucial sector. The industry has called for increased financial support, as current institutions like the Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI) primarily focus on refinancing loans rather than providing direct funding. In contrast, state financial and industrial development corporations do lend directly to MSMEs.

However, many, such as the Punjab State Industrial Development Corporation (PSIDC) and Punjab Finance Corporation (PFC), are experiencing funds crunch and have stopped credit flow. PSIDC gathered liabilities worth Rs 4700 crore, therefore, has not given any fresh loans to any company for the last 16 years. According to an Ernst&Young(EY) report, MSME credit penetration in India is only 14 per cent, significantly lower than in larger economies like the US and China, where the figures are 50 per cent and 37 per cent, respectively. Indian MSMEs face a critical credit shortage of? 25 trillion, indicating a substantial untapped credit market. Increasing lending to MSMEs can stimulate economic activity and create jobs. The proposed establishment of a separate bank dedicated to the MSME sector would help address these direct credit shortages. However, the government needs to finalise various details, such as the bank's ownership structure, which may adopt a hybrid public-private partnership model. Although large banks operate in the sector, they often struggle to meet the unique needs of MSMEs.

Countries in Europe provide valuable lessons by grouping MSMEs with home loan customers, both considered small borrowers. If the government does not establish a new bank, SIDBI could be transformed into a full-fledged bank focused on direct lending to MSMEs instead of merely refinancing. SIDBI plays a vital role in financing India's MSMEs and is owned by a consortium that includes the government and major financial institutions. In 2023-24, the National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) supported the agricultural sector with a loan portfolio of Rs 6.68 lakh crore, with the agriculture CREATE JOBS.THE sector contributing 18 per cent to the country's GDP. On the other hand, SIDBI had a refinancing loan portfolio of? 84,000 crore in FY 2023-24, with the MSME sector contributing 30 per cent to the GDP.For micro and small enterprises to grow, obtaining capital remains one of their most significant challenges.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has designated MSMEs as a priority sector and directed banks to allocate 40 per cent of the Adjusted Net Bank Credit (ANBC) to priority sectors, including MSMEs. However, a study by the RBI has found that most banks do not exceed 25 per cent for MSME credit. SIDBI's future growth depends on how effectively commercial banks fulfil their priority sector lending targets. A report by ICRA warns that if banks successfully meet their quotas, there could be a reduced need for SIDBI's refinancing services. Challenges: Despite the vital role MSMEs play in the country's economy, access to adequate, timely, and low-cost finance poses a significant hurdle to the sector's growth prospects. Limited credit history, insuf-



The importance of MSMEs to the Indian economy cannot be overstated. They drive innovation, generate employment, and contribute significantly to exports and GDP. By fostering entrepreneurship and supporting large-scale industrialisation, MSMEs play a pivotal role in reducing regional imbalances, uplifting economically weaker sections, and stimulating socio-economic development. ships, alliances, and collaborations, MSME financing will continue to face challenges. One pressing issue is the introduction of interest subvention to address high borrowing costs, which range from 10 to 12 per cent. This creates an uneven playing field when compared to countries like China, where the borrowing rate is 3.1 per cent, the US at 4.37 per cent, and the European Union, which averages 5.1 per cent for MSMEs. In the US, MSMEs can access

funding through various federal and state programmes. The Small Business Administration (SBA) plays a vital role by offering loan guarantees and encouraging banks and other financial institutions to lend to small businesses. The Microloan Programmes provide capital for various business needs, including working capital, equipment purchases, and real estate acquisitions. Furthermore, the US government supports MSMEs through grants, venture capital initiatives, and state-specific funding programs tailored to local business environments. This diverse range of financial products ensures that MSMEs can find suitable funding options for their specific requirements.

In European Union countries, MSMEs benefit from robust financial support frameworks facilitated by institutions such as the European Investment Bank (EIB) and the European Investment Fund (EIF). These entities provide funding through intermediaries like banks and microfinance institutions, offering loans, guarantees, and equity

MSME funding through programs focused on the competitiveness of enterprises and small and medium-sized enterprises, which emphasise innovation and competitiveness.In China, the government has implemented several measures to enhance MSMEs' access to finance through dedicated banks, such as the China Development Bank, which offers targeted lending. Local governments have established credit guarantee funds as well. Moreover, China's financial technology sector has significantly grown, with online lending platforms and digital financial services providing alternative funding sources for MSMEs.

Way Forward: The inherent challenges faced by MSMEs cannot be overlooked. It is essential to address the issues within the MSME sector that hinder financial accessibility. As recommended by the Parliamentary Committee on Finance, the comprehensive approaches in the US, EU, and China serve as valuable models for India to enhance its financing landscape for MSMEs, improve credit access, and make these enterprises globally compet-

The government also proposed establishing a Merchant Credit Card (MCC) Scheme for traders and a Vyapar Credit Card (VCC) for micro-units, similar to the Kisan Credit Card (KCC). Under the Credit Guarantee Fund, a scheme to provide short-term loans with interest subvention is still awaited. There is still much work to be done to ensure that all MSMEs can access affordable

and timely financing.

The death toll in the Gaza Strip from the 13-month-old war between Israel and Hamas has surpassed 44,000, local health officials said Thursday.

The Gaza Health Ministry does not distinguish between civilians and combatants in its count, but it has said that more than half of the fatalities are women and children. The Israeli military says it has killed over 17,000 militants, without providing evidence.

The Health Ministry said 44,056 people have been killed and 104,268 wounded since the start of the war. It has said the real toll is higher because thousands of bodies are buried under rubble or in areas that medics cannot access.

The war began when Hamasled militants stormed into southern Israel on Oct 7, 2023, killing some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and abducting another 250. Around 100 hostages are still inside Gaza, at least a third of whom are believed to be dead. Most of the rest were released during a cease-fire last year.

ICC issues arrest warrants for Netanyahu

The Hague (AP): The International Criminal Court issued arrest warrants on Thursday for Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, his former defence minister and Hamas officials, accusing them of war crimes and crimes against humanity over the war in Gaza and the October 2023 attacks that triggered Israel's offensive in the Palestinian territory.

The decision turns Netanyahu and the others into internationally wanted suspects and is likely to further isolate them and complicate efforts to negotiate a cease-fire to end the 13month conflict.

But its practical implications could be limited since Israel and its major ally, the United States, are not members of the court and several of the Hamas officials have been subsequently killed in the conflict.

Netanyahu and other Israeli leaders have condemned ICC Chief Prosecutor Karim Khan's request for warrants as disgraceful and antisemitic.

US President Joe Biden also blasted the prosecutor and submitted two legal briefs challenging the ICC's jurisdiction expressed support for Israel's right to defend itself against and arguing that the court did not provide Israel the oppor-Hamas. Hamas also slammed the request. "The Chamber tunity to investigate the allegations itself before requesting considered that there are reathe warrants. "No other democracy with an sonable grounds to believe that both individuals inten-tionally and knowingly

independent and respected legal system like that which exists in Israel has been treated in this prejudicial manner by the Prosecutor," Foreign Ministry spokesperson Oren Marmorstein wrote on X.

He said Israel remained "steadfast in its commitment to the rule of law and justice" and would continue to protect its citizens against militancy. The ICC is a court of last resort

that only prosecutes cases when domestic law enforcement authorities cannot or will not investigate. Israel is not a member state of the court. The country has struggled to investigate itself in the past, rights groups say. Despite the warrants, none of the suspects is likely to face judges in The

The court itself has no police to enforce warrants, instead relying on cooperation from its member states

Even so, the threat of arrest could make it difficult for Netanyahu and Gallant to travel abroad, although Russian President Vladimir Putin, who is wanted on an ICC warrant for alleged war crimes in Ukraine, recently showed he could still visit an ally when he traveled to Mongolia, one of the court's member states, and was not arrested.

Khan sought warrants in May, accusing Netanyahu and Gallant of crimes including murder, intentionally attacking civilians, and persecution.

In a statement at the time, Khan alleged that Israel "has intentionally and systematically deprived the civilian population in all parts of Gaza of objects indispensable to human survival" by closing border crossings into the territory and restricting essential supplies including food and

COP29 produces streamlined climate finance draft, but key issues remain

fter an all-nighter, a draft text on After an all-nignter, a trial text on the new climate finance package for the developing world finally dropped Thursday morning — shrunk from 25 pages to 10, but the major sticking points remain. With less than two days left for the UN climate conference to close, negotiators face a gargantuan task to hammer it out.

A quick glance at the text shows developed countries are still dodg-ing a key question: How much climate finance are they ready to give developing countries every year starting in 2025?

This has led to significant frustration among developing countries, who have repeatedly said they need at least USD 1.3 trillion to tackle the escalating challenges. "The revised draft text, while more streamlined, presents a spectrum of options some good, some bad, and some outright ugly," said Harjeet Singh, a climate activist and Global Engagement Director for the Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty Initiative. He said it acknowledges the need for public funds from developed countries but dodges the key question of how much finance is

needed, shifting the burden onto developing countries to raise more domestic funds. The veteran COP watcher also said the text fails to set clear financial targets for mitigation, adaptation, and losses and damages from climate impacts — areas with growing needs and limited resources. A real, just transition from fossil

fuels requires strong public finance, not empty promises," Singh said. Vaibhav Chaturvedi from Delhibased think tank Council on Energy, Environment and Water said it is great that the structure is streamlined, but there is no high-level number from the developed world.

David Waskow, the Director of WRI's International Climate Initiative, said the text leaves a lot of work to be done.

'Time is very tight, and to get to bridging texts, even bridging texts with options, is going to take quite a lot of work, and the presidency and the ministerial pair and parties above all, are going to need to really work hard over the next 48 to 72 hours to reach a conclusion," he said Developing countries' perspective in the text is that the new climate finance package should be in trillions and be given by developed countries every year from 2025.

'Failure is not an option'

Baku (PTI): UN climate chief Simon Stiell on Thursday issued a strong call for global unity and ambition to secure a groundbreaking finance goal to support climate action in the developing world, saying, "Failure is not an option."

As negotiators raced against time to resolve outstanding issues related to the critical objective of COP29, Stiell said a major push was needed to bring discussions to the finishing line.

"It might jeopardise both nearterm action, and ambition in the preparation of the new national climate action plans, with potential devastating impacts as irreversible tipping said that despite areas of conall parties can deliver new national plans aligned with 1.5 degrees – as they must," he said. Stiell warned that delays at COP29 could complicate the road to COP30 in Brazil next year. "This COP must deliver justice in the face of climate catastrophe," he urged. Australia's parl considers legislation banning social media for under 16s

ustralia's communications minis-Ater introduced a world-first law into Parliament on Thursday that would ban children under 16 from social media, saying online safety was one of parents' toughest challenges. Michelle Rowland said TikTok, Facebook, Snapchat, Reddit, X and Instagram were among the platforms that would face fines of up to 50 million Australian dollars (\$33 million) for systemic failures to prevent young children from holding accounts.

"This bill seeks to set a new norma-

tive value in society that accessing social media is not the defining feature of growing up in Australia," Rowland told Parliament.

"There is wide acknowledgement that something must be done in the immediate term to help prevent young teens and children from being exposed to streams of content unfiltered and infinite," she added.

X owner Elon Musk warned that Australia intended to go further, posting on his platform: "Seems like a backdoor way to control access to the Internet by all Australians." The bill has wide political support. After it becomes law, the platforms would have one year to work out how

to implement the age restriction. "For too many young Australians, social media can be harmful," Rowland said. "Almost two-thirds of 14- to 17vears-old Australians have viewed extremely harmful content online including drug abuse, suicide or selfharm as well as violent material. One quarter have been exposed to content promoting unsafe eating habits."

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50 killed, 20 injured in Pak's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa ambush

PTI PESHAWAR

At least 50 people were killed and 20 others injured when several vehicles carrying passengers were targeted by mili tants in northwest Pakistan on Thursday, officials said.

The militants ambushed the vehicles in the Kurram district of restive Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province bordering Afghanistan.

The vehicles were travelling in a convoy from Parachinar to Peshawar, the capital of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa when gunmen opened fire, the officials said. Rescue authorities said 50 people, including eight women and five children, and 20 others were killed in the attack.

Most of the victims belonged to the Shia community, they said The vehicles were ambushed in areas dominated by the Taliban, a local journalist said.

According to local media, there were over 200 vehicles in the

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Khan Gandapur strongly condemned the attack and directed a delegation comprising the provincial law minister, lawmakers from the region, and the chief secretary to immediately visit Kurram to assess the situation and submit a report. He also instructed relevant authorities to work on establishing a Provincial Highways Police unit to secure all roads in the province

Gandapur extended condolences to the bereaved families and announced financial assistance for the families of the vic-

"Targeting innocent civilians is extremely tragic and con-demnable. Those involved in this incident will not escape the grip of the law," he said.

Pak court grants 5-day physical remand of Imran Khan

An anti-terrorism court in Pakistan on Thursday granted a five-day physical remand of former prime minister Imran Khan, who was arrested formally by police hours after his bail in a corruption case was accepted.

Khan, 72, was arrested by Rawalpindi police in the New Town police station case on Wednesday night after securing bail in the second Toshakhana case and was produced before the Anti-Terrorism Court in

The police prosecution team sought a 15-day physical remand but the court granted the five-day physical remand and ordered to continue the investigation inside the jail.

The court also rejected the PTI lawyer Salman Safdar's plea to discharge his client from the case.

The Islamabad High Court (IHC) on Wednesday granted Khan bail in the second Toshakhana case related to the purchase of an expensive Bulgari jewellery set at a throwaway price, igniting hopes of his release.

However, hours later, Rawalpindi police arrested him late at night in connection with a case registered at New Town Police Station on terrorism and other charges.

The police alleged that

Khan, while imprisoned in Adiala Jail in Rawalpindi, had called for a protest in Rawalpindi on September 28.

Dawn newspaper quoted a police spokesperson as saying that Khan had been detained in the case filed on September 28 and a team has been tasked to probe the charges.

The charges include violations of the Anti-Terrorism Act, defying the government ban on public gatherings, obstructing police duty, damaging police vehicles and endangering public safety.

Even before the formal arrest in the case, federal information minister Atta Tarar doused the idea of his release, saying Khan was wanted in eight cases related to May 9, 2023 violence and should secure bail before being set free from jail. Dawn reported that Khan

needs to secure bail in nearly two dozen other cases regisacross Lahore, Rawalpindi and Islamabad before being released.

According to Islamabad police, at least 62 cases were registered against Khan in various police stations of the capital, while his PTI party said that another 54 cases were Punjab registered in province. Meanwhile, an accountability court on Wednesday held a hearing on the GBP 190 million case at the Adiala Jail and was informed that Khan and Bushra Bibi have yet to submit responses to the questionnaires issued to

The court granted Bibi's request for an exemption from court appearance on medical grounds and adjourned the hearing till November 22. Separately, the Lahore High Court dismissed a plea by Khan's sister, Noreen Niazi, seeking bail for her brother in all cases against him in Punjab and Islamabad.An assistant

Khan's party on Sunday. Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) gave a call last week for a long march to press for three demands: the release of the incarcerated party founder, against the alleged "stolen mandate" during February 8 elections and restoration of the judiciary by revoking the recent 26th amendment to the Constitution that granted legislators more power in appointing top judges.

The government has decided to deploy the Pakistan Rangers and Frontier Constabulary (FC) personnel in Islamabad from Friday onwards under Sections 4 and 5 of the Anti-Terrorism Act.

According to a notification by the Interior Ministry on Wednesday, the exact number of personnel and the date and area of their deployment would

with concerned stakeholders", while the date of de-requisitioning of troops would be decided after mutually consulting all relevant stakeholders. Earlier, the Islamabad police, in

a letter dated November 14, had asked for the deployment of Rangers and FC personnel ahead of the PTI rally.

According to the letter, the Islamabad police chief requested 5,000 Rangers personnel and 4,000 FC personnel "in addition to the 1,000 FC personnel already provided to ICT police."

The federal government already imposed Section 144 in the capital and banned all kinds of rallies for two months. Similarly, the Punjab government. which also exercises jurisdiction over Rawalpindi near Islamabad, placed police on high alert throughout the province.

Meanwhile, PTI Information Secretary Sheikh Waqas Akram, briefing reporters at Peshawar, said that protest was a fundamental right. "Nobody can take it away from us," he said, adding that governments do not threaten or bully their citizens like thugs.

He also warned to bring a sea of people to the capital on November 24 from across the country for the proposed long march to Islamabad.

Mobile and internet services are likely to remain suspended in various parts of Pakistan, particularly in Islamabad and Punjab, during the protest, ARÝ News reported, citing

Gen Munir urges people to prioritise nation over 'personal interests'

Karachi (PTI): Pakistan's Army Chief General Asim Munir has said that "nothing, including politics," was above the country and urged people to prioritise the nation over "personal interests". "People must prioritise Pakistan over everything else, including politics and personal interests," he said while visiting an ongoing defence exhibition in Karachi on Wednesday. He also made it clear that "digital terrorism" was a real threat to the country and said social media was being used to spread anarchy and lies about the armed forces.

The protection of a country's digital borders and the digital security of its citizens is the responsibility of the state," he said.

Gen Munir also warned that unrestricted freedom of speech was "leading to the degrada-

tion of moral values in all societies". Earlier meeting with the business leaders in Karachi, he said everyone needed to understand the importance of putting the country above everything else.

Sri Lanka tapped the IMF for a facility at the height of the economic crisis under the presidency of Gotabaya Rajapaksa, the president who was made to flee the country by months-long public protests. Mid April of 2022 Sri Lanka announced its first-

ever debt default. The negotiations with the IMF began thereafter and the Wickremesinghe's government clinched the bailout, a year later in March 2023.

US regulators seek to break up Google, force sale of Chrome browser

AP WASHINGTON

US regulators want a federal judge to break up Google to prevent the company from continuing to squash competition through its dominant search engine after a court found it had maintained an abusive monopoly over the past

The proposed breakup floated in a 23-page document filed late Wednesday by the US Department of Justice calls for sweeping punishments that would include a sale of that would include a sale of Google's industry-leading Chrome web browser and impose restrictions to prevent Android from favouring its

own search engine.
A sale of Chrome "will permanently stop Google's control of this critical search access point and allow rival search engines the ability to access the browser that for many users is a gateway to the internet," justice department lawyers argued in their filing. Although regulators stopped short of demanding Google sell Android too, they asserted the judge should make it clear the company could still be required to divest its smartphone operating system if its more transparency into how it continues to see evidence of misconduct.

The broad scope of the recommended penalties underscores how severely regulators operating under Biden's believe Google should be punished following an August ruling by US District Judge Amit Mehta that branded the company as a monopolist.

justice department The decision-makers who will inherit the case after president-elect Donald Trump takes office next year might not be as strident. The Washington, DC court hearings on Google's punishment are scheduled to begin in April and Mehta is

aiming to issue his final decision before the Labour

If Mehta embraces the government's recommendations, Google would be forced to sell its 16year-old Chrome browser within six months of the final ruling. But the company certainly would appeal any punishment, potentially prolonging a legal tussle, which has dragged on for more than four years

more than four years.
Besides seeking a Chrome spinoff and a corralling of the Android software, the justice department wants the judge to ban Google from forging multibillion-dollar deals to lock in its dominant search engine as the default option on Apple's iPhone and other devices. It would also ban Google from favouring its own services, such YouTube or its recentlyartificial launched intelligence platform, Gemini. Regulators also want Google to license the search index data it collects from people's queries to its rivals, giving

them a better chance at competing with the tech giant. On the commercial side of its search engine, Google would be required to provide sets the prices that advertisers pay to be listed near the top of some targeted search results. Kent Walker, Google's chief legal officer, lashed out at the justice department pursuing "a ra radical pursuing interventionist agenda that would harm Americans and America's global technology." In a blog post, Walker warned the overly broad proposal would threaten personal privacy while undermining Google's early leadership in artificial intelligence, intelligence, "perhaps the most important innovation of our time.

Wary of Google's increasing use of artificial intelligence in its search results, regulators also advised Mehta to ensure websites will be able to shield their content from Google's

AI training techniques. The measures, if they are ordered, threaten to upend a

business expected to generate more than \$300 billion in revenue this year. "The playing field is not level because of Google's conduct, and Google's quality reflects

the ill-gotten gains of an advantage illegally acquired," the Justice Department asserted in recommendations. remedy must close this gap and deprive Google of these advantages."

It's still possible that the Justice Department could ease off attempts to break up Google, especially if Trump takes the widely expectation. takes the widely expected step

of replacing Assistant Attorney General Jonathan Kanter, who was appointed by Biden to oversee the agency's antitrust division. Although the case targeting

Google was originally filed during the final months of Trump's first term in office, Kanter oversaw the high-profile trial that culminated in Mehta's ruling against Google. Working in tandem with Federal Commission Chair Lina Khan, Kanter took a get-tough stance against Big Tech that triggered other attempted powerhouses such as Apple and discouraged many business deals from getting done during the past four vears.

Trump recently expressed concerns that a breakup might destroy Google but didn't elaborate on alternative penalties he might have in mind. "What you can do without breaking it up is make sure it's more fair," Trump said last month. Matt Gaetz, the former Republican congressman that Trump nominated to be the next US Attorney General, has previously called for the breakup of Big companies.

Gaetz faces a confirmation hearing.





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
