Oh Canada! Student Direct Stream service scrapped

Indian students dreaming of studying in Canada may face hardship now, as it has ended the fast track visa programme. The decision came in the backdrop of ongoing diplomatic tension between the two countries. The decision to cancel the fast-track visa service known as Student Direct Stream (SDS) raised concerns over delays in processing and uncertainty for many international students from India. In 2023, nearly 200,000 Indian students received study permits. The SDS was launched in 2018 to provide faster processing for eligible post-secondary students. It was introduced to simplify the visa application process for students from 14 countries, which included India.



In the latest measure targeting international students planning to study at a Canadian institution, Ottawa has announced that it is immediately ending the SDS initiative. According to a notice from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) late on Friday, SDS was launched in 2018 to "provide faster processing for eligible post-secondary students" and "eventually opened to legal residents" of 14 nations including India. It stated that "Canada's goal is to strengthen program integrity, address student vulnerability, and give all students equal and fair access to the application process, as well as a positive academic experience" to "meet this commitment" the SDS was scrapped on November eight. Study permits applied for after the announcement will be processed under the regular stream. The Canadian government has refrained from giving an explanation for ending the fast-track visa service. The move comes at a time when India and Canada's ties are strained due to the Trudeau government blaming the Indian government agents for the killing of Khalistani terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar. Indian aspirants are now likely to face extended waiting times for their study permits, which can be a significant setback. Indian students now have to navigate additional hurdles to

secure their study permits on time. Meanwhile, a PTI report from Ottawa, on Saturday, said Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau has acknowledged the presence of Khalistan supporters in Canada but said they do not represent the Sikh community as a whole. His comments came during Diwali celebrations at Ottawa's Parliament Hill recently amid an ongoing diplomatic row with India over the killing of Khalistan extremist Hardeep Singh Nijjar. "There are many supporters of Khalistan in Canada, but they do not represent the Sikh Community as a whole. Similarly, there are supporters of Prime Minister (Narendra

Modi's government in Canada, but they do not represent all Hindu Canadians," Trudeau said.

The relations between the two countries came under severe strain following Trudeau's allegations in September last year of a "potential" involvement of Indian agents in Nijjar's killing. New Delhi rejected Trudeau's charges as "absurd".

India expelled six Canadian diplomats and withdrew its high commissioner Sanjay Verma and other "targeted" officials from Canada after strongly dismissing Ottawa's charges.

India has been maintaining that the main issue between the two countries is that of Canada giving space to pro-Khalistan elements operating from Canadian soil with impunity.

Last week, Khalistani supporters disrupted a consular event co-organised by the Hindu Sabha temple in Brampton and the Indian Consulate. The incident was condemned by Trudeau who said every Canadian has the right to practise their faith freely and safely.

In a statement, the Ministry of External Affairs said that New Delhi remains "deeply concerned" about the safety and security of Indian nationals in Canada.

The Indian consulate in Toronto said it was scrapping some of the planned consular events this month because of Canadian "security agencies conveying their inability to provide minimum security protection" to organisers.

Congress turns states into its ATMs: PM Modi

Citing the examples of Himachal Pradesh, Telangana and Karnataka, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday charged that "wherever the Congress forms the government, that state becomes an Automated Teller Machine (ATM) of the party's shahi parivar" and said that the BJP would not allow the Opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) to turn Maharashtra into the ATM of the grand old party. Addressing an election rally at Akola in Vidarbha region of Assembly poll-bound Maharashtra, Modi accused the Siddaramaiah-led Congress government of collecting Rs 700 crore from liquor shop owners in Karnataka.

"Wherever Congress forms the government, that state becomes an ATM of the 'shahi parivar' of the Congress. These days, states like Himachal Pradesh, Telangana and Karnataka have become the ATMs of the royal family of Congress," the Prime Minister said.

"People are saying that these days with elections in Maharashtra, the Congress has doubled the quantum of 'vasooli' (extortion) in Karnataka and neighbouring Telangana. The BJP will not allow MVA to turn Maharashtra into the Congress' ATM for

'Mahaghotalebaaj'," PM Modi said. Singling out the grand old party for allegedly indulging in corruption in states ruled by it, the Prime Minister said that the MVA - comprising the Congress, Shiv Sena (UBT) and NCP (SP) - "stands for multi-crore scams, for extortion and token money. It stands for transfer posting racket and is completely immersed in scandals, loot, and corruption."

Repeating the allegations that he had made in his election speeches on Friday that the Congress was dividing the SCs, STs and OBCs, PM Modi said: "The Congress knows the weaker the country becomes, the stronger the Congress will be. That's why the Congress has all along been resorting to the tactics of divide and rule. Over the years, the Congress created rifts within the SC-Dalits, ST-Adivasis and OBCs"

Describing the BJP as "ek hai toh safe hain" party, Modi said: "For a safe and united Maharashtra, people should choose BJP-led Maha Yuti... ek hai toh safe hain".

A day after he dared the MVA to get Rahul Gandhi to speak in praise of Veer Savarkar, Modi invoked Dr. BR Ambedkar's legacy to tear into the Congress to prove its respect for the architect of the constitution and his contributions to the country.

AMU does not exclusively belong to Muslims, says Yogi Adityanath

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, responding to the recent Supreme Court decision on Aligarh Muslim University's (AMU) minority status, asserted that AMU "does not exclusively belong to Muslims." He also invoked his controversial "batenge to katenge" (If Hindus are divided, they will be slaughtered) statement, calling for unity among Hindus to prevent historical divisions.



The Supreme Court recently overturned the 1967 Azeem Basha judgement, with a regular bench set to make the final determination on AMU's minority status. "AMU doesn't belong solely to Muslims," Adityanath stated at an election rally in Khair, Aligarh, questioning AMU's plans to reserve 50 per cent of its seats for minorities despite receiving central government funding. "If AMU is funded by the government, Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST), and Other Backward Classes (OBC) should also have reservation there," he added.

Adityanath accused opposition parties - Samajwadi Party (SP), Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP), and Congress - of denying reservations at AMU to SCs, STs, and OBCs, alleging that these parties prioritised vote bank politics. "These people are playing with your sentiments. Don't be blinded by them. If we are divided, we will be slaughtered," he said, referring to historical incidents of Hindu oppression through division.

Delhi AQI is likely to worsen

The air quality index (AQI) in Delhi remained in the "very poor" category with an average AQI of 352 on Saturday, marking the ninth consecutive day of smog due to calm wind, and local factors including vehicular emissions. The AQI is likely to worsen in the coming days as per the forecast by the India Meteorological Department (IMD). Meanwhile, the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) has held a meeting with Delhi Chief Secretary and directed to intensify efforts to remove highly polluting end-of-life (EoL) vehicles (petrol vehicles older than 15 years and diesel

vehicles older than 10 years) that are still in use in Delhi. The PM2.5 concentration is currently 32 times the World Health Organization (WHO) annual PM2.5 guideline value. The transport sector is the most significant contributor at 11.43 per cent, as per the Decision Support System data by the Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology (IITM). While the residential sector contribution is 2.872 per cent, industries contributed 2.537 per cent, construction 1.492 per cent, energy sector 1.317 per cent, waste burning 1.043 per cent, and road dust 0.82 per cent. According to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), numerous areas across Delhi still registered AQI levels between 370 and 400, with some zones even surpassing the 400 mark. Nehru Nagar recorded AQI at 431, New Moti Bagh at 411 and Bhawana at 409. In contrast, other locations like Dilshad Garden (220) and Chandni Chowk (257) reported relatively lower AQI readings.

Oops! A Diwali greeting that shocked Varanasi

In an unusual incident, around 40 unmarried girls from Ramna village in Varanasi received messages meant for pregnant women from the Ministry of Child Development on Diwali, sparking confusion and concern among villagers. Following complaints, the Chief Development Officer (CDO), Himanshu Nagpal, acknowledged the error and launched an investigation into the matter, delegating it to the District Panchayati Raj Officer (DPRO). The CDO confirmed that all erroneous data entries have been removed from the portal and attributed the incident to a "human error." Nagpal explained that complaints from the village

indicated that 40 unmarried girls were registered incorrectly as pregnant women on a government portal. As a result, these girls received a message from the Ministry of Child Development on Diwali, stating, "Welcome to Poshan Tracker. As a breastfeeding mother, you can avail services like hot cooked meals or ration, consultation, child health monitoring, and breastfeeding support through home visits with the help of Anganwadi Center."

The message, designed to promote services for pregnant and breastfeeding women, caused confusion and anxiety among the girls and their families. The CDO traced the error to an Anganwadi worker from Ramna village who also serves as a Booth Level Officer (BLO). Currently, as part of the ongoing voter list summary revision, BLOs are required to visit households, collect Aadhaar information for residents above 18 years, and help register them for voter ID cards.

From Tihar, Sukesh Chandrashekar keeps his Bollywood fantasy alive

Offers 1,500 Crore, in cash for 50 per cent stake in Karan Johar's Dharma Productions

In a development that has left both Bollywood and business circles in shock, alleged conman Sukesh Chandrashekar, currently in Tihar Jail on charges of extortion, has made an audacious offer to buy a significant stake in one of India's most prestigious film production houses, Karan Johar's Dharma Productions. In his revised offer to Karan Johar, submitted through the legal firm Anantam Legal, Sukesh said it has been brought to his notice that you (Karan Johar) have finalised

the sale of a 50 per cent stake for Rs 1000 Crore at a company valuation of Rs 2000 Crore. "I am valuing Dharma at a 3,000 Crore valuation. Hereby, I am willing to acquire a 50 per cent stake at 1,500 Crore, all cash deal, this very day. As I mentioned before in my first offer letter to you, I did not want to put a

number as movies are a passion and Dharma comes a legacy, and that is prime to me, and not the value," the letter states.

Sukesh said if the 50 per cent stake is not possible, Dharma could consider offloading a 20 per cent stake. "I am offering Rs. 600 Crore for the 20 per cent stake, at a valuation of 3000 Crores of your company. If the above mentioned offer is accepted or even under considerations, as of today we could Escrow the amount in full for you to understand our seriousness for this deal. If you consider our offer, the structure of your organisation will remain exactly the same, the way you want it to be, there would not be any riders, as we only want to associate and have no interest in the way the company operates, nor we want to appoint any person from our side in the

company," the letter, shared by Sukesh's legal team, states. "Kindly consider this offer of ours by either offloading the 50 per cent or at least the 20 per cent stake at a valuation, which is way above than anything offered to you. Once again to remind, all our Financials, legality could be produced for your full satisfaction and Due Diligence".

This is the second time that Sukesh has sent a 'letter of Intent', to Dharma Productions. The bid, which Chandrashekar claims is motivated by his admiration for Jacqueline Fernandez, has sparked widespread curiosity, scepticism, and controversy across the country. While Sukesh's reputation is mired in controversy and legal issues, his letter portrays a deep-seated passion for films.

Congress CMs hit back at "fake claims" of BJP leaders

The chief ministers of Congress-ruled states of Telangana, Himachal Pradesh and a deputy chief minister of Karnataka on Saturday hit back at the BJP-led MahaYuti for making "fake claims" that the grand old party had not implemented the guarantees it had given to the people ahead of the Assembly polls in their respective states.

On a day when Prime Minister Narendra Modi accused the Congress for using the states ruled by it as ATMs for loot, scams and corruption, Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhwinder Sukhu, Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and Deputy CM of Karnataka D. K. Shivakumar slammed Modi and BJP for spreading 'lies and falsehoods'.

Sukhu, Reddy and Shivakumar, accompanied by AICC Media and Publicity Chairman Pawan Khera, tore into what they called "fake claims" made by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and BJP leaders and listed out the implementation of their party's guarantees in their respective states.

Shivkumar said that the Congress' six guarantees were not announced overnight but were unveiled after a careful study of the peoples' problems during Rahul Gandhi's two-phased Bharat Jodo Yatra undertaken two years

"As soon as we came to power, Chief Minister D Siddaramaiah started immediately rolling out the promised guarantees. Over 1.22 crore women are getting Rs 2,000 every month under the Grihalakshmi Scheme, 1.64 crore families are getting the benefits of 200 units free electricity through the Gruha Jyothi Scheme and

4.08 crore falling Below Poverty Line are getting 10 kg free rice under the 'Annabhagya Scheme,' Shivkumar said. "Another 3.20 crore women travelled free on State Transport buses vide the Shakti Scheme, and the Yuva Nidhi Scheme has extended Rs 3000 every month to over five-lakh students," Shivkumar said, adding that the Mahayuti leaders should visit Karnataka to see how the Congress' welfare guarantees were benefiting people.

"Whenever the Congress comes to power, it implements one or the other scheme for each section of the society. None of the schemes announced since the days of Jawaharlal Nehru to Manmohan Singh has been withdrawn. We are not looking at votes but development of the state," Shivkumar said.

"In Karnataka, all the schemes were implemented within 60 days after coming to power. A provision of Rs 52,000 crore has been made from Karnataka's budget of Rs 3,65,000 crore, which is higher than many BJP-ruled states," Shivkumar said.

Castigating Modi for "spreading lies" about the performance of the Congress-ruled states in the country, Reddy said: "We are implementing all our guarantees systematically.... After coming to power, we have waived farm loans worth Rs 17,869 crore taken by 22,22,067 farmers"

"In 10 months, our government has provided 50,000 government jobs to the youth, while 50 lakh families have benefitted from the 200 units free electricity scheme, Reddy said. Dismissing the "fake

narrative" being spread by Modi and the BJP, Reddy said: "The BJP does not have any success story to boast of. Even in Maharashtra, the party has moved out big investment projects to Gujarat. I urge the people of Maharashtra not to believe in the BJP's false propaganda and defeat the MahaYuti in a big way," Reddy said.

Explaining the manner in which his government had gone about implementing its promises to the people in Himachal Pradesh, Sukhu said that his government's decision to implement the old pension scheme had benefitted people immensely. "Any person who was getting a pension of Rs 5,000 per month under the New Pension Scheme is getting Rs 50,000 under the Old Pension Scheme. We are giving commodities at Minimum Support Price rates --Rs 30 per kg of maize, Rs 40 per kg for wheat, Rs 45 per litre for cow milk and Rs 50 per litre for buffalo milk," he said.

Sukhu, Reddy and Shivkumar slammed the Prime Minister for writing off nearly Rs 12-lakhs-crore loans of rich industrialists. "See the irony, on one hand the Prime Minister waives loans worth Rs 12 lakh crores taken by the industrialists. On the other hand, the BJP criticises the governments in the Congress-ruled states for utilising the peoples' money for public welfare schemes in line with its guarantees.

Apart from Sukhu, Reddy, Shivkumar and Khera, Mahila Congress President Alka Lamba, AICC Secretary BM Sandeep, UB Venkatesh, state Mahila Congress chief Sandhya Savvalakhe and Charanjit Singh Sapra were among those present on the occasion.

According to the Air Quality Early Warning System for Delhi, mainly smog conditions with predominant surface wind from variable directions with wind speed reaching 04-06 kmph prevailed during daytime and calm winds during night. Predicted maximum mixing depth is likely to be 1900 m on November 9. "The

maximum mixing depth of wind was recorded at 1750 m on Saturday. The ventilation index lower than 6000 m²/s with average wind speed less than 10 kmph is unfavourable for dispersion of pollutants. Meteorological conditions are likely to be extremely unfavourable for dispersion of pollutants," it said. The CAQM meeting also focused on strict discipline and measures to guard

against unauthorised/haphazard parking of private vehicles on metaled roads, markets, public spaces etc. leading to vehicular congestion and high levels of pollution, particularly in winters and called for strict action against violators including for violations of Pollution Under Control (PUC) Certificate regime. Delhi has been witnessing high levels of air pollution

for the past few weeks which has been primarily blamed on stubble-burning in neighbouring states, Diwali fireworks and low wind speed. Notably, the Centre for Science and Environment has claimed that vehicular pollution is the main reason for Delhi pollution. Interestingly, the National Capital Region is currently experiencing four degrees

UP seeks list of corrupt in tax department, sparking division among officials

The Uttar Pradesh government has initiated a rigorous crackdown on corruption within the State Tax Department, directing top officials to identify officers with questionable conduct and poor performance records.

M Devraj, Principal Secretary (State Tax) has ordered all zonal commissioners and joint commissioners to compile a list of officers with tarnished reputations, particularly within the Flying Squad and Special Investigation Branch (SIB). During a recent review meeting, Devraj instructed that each district submit the name of at least one officer from the Flying Squad and SIB who has a history of corruption or poor performance.

Devraj conducted a zone-wise assessment of the department and urged the additional commissioners of Grade-1 and Grade-2 (SIB) to immediately report the names of the most corrupt or poorly performing officers within their zones.

He specified criteria to evaluate SIB and Flying Squad personnel, emphasising the need for accountability. This directive includes identifying officers with inadequate performance at the zonal level and categorizing them for further action.

For transparency and consistency, Devraj outlined performance standards specific to each department. SIB officers will be assessed on tax collection effectiveness, quality of case profiles, accuracy in reporting, and overall reputation. Similarly, the Flying Squad will be evaluated on the volume of tax collected, the ratio of detected tax-evasive vehicles to those inspected, and the impact of e-way bill verification on tax collection. Additionally, officers' reputations within their zones

will influence evaluations. Zonal officers are permitted to implement supplementary criteria to ensure accurate assessments.

The order has stirred anxiety and division among tax officials across the state. Officers argue that by targeting specific positions - Deputy Commissioners, Assistant Commissioners, and Commercial Tax Officers - the directive implies that senior officials are exempt from scrutiny. This perception has fostered tension between level officers and their superiors.

Adding to the discord is the language used in the directive, particularly the term "bad." Officers expressed concern that the lack of a clear, standardised definition for "bad" performance leaves room for subjective interpretation. Some officials believe that alleged corruption cases should be substantiated through a formal investigation process, as detailed in their annual confidential reports. Officers contend that accusations of corruption should undergo due investigation before any label is affixed.

The controversy centers on the need for fair evaluation processes that distinguish between documented misconduct and mere allegations. Some senior officials argue that the broad criteria may undermine morale within the department and potentially overlook the need for systemic reforms.

As the state's fight against corruption in the State Tax Department intensifies, this directive marks a significant move towards greater accountability but also reveals underlying tensions. How this list will impact the careers of implicated officers and the department's operational morale remains to be seen.

In the process, the Anganwadi worker mistakenly entered the Aadhaar details of these unmarried girls on the pregnancy and childcare portal. This unintended crossover of roles appears to have led to the registration error, which has since been corrected. The CDO confirmed that, so far, there is no evidence suggesting that the Anganwadi worker distributed nutritional supplements to the unmarried girls. However, an investigation led by the DPPO is underway to clarify all aspects of the incident. "Though this was a mistake, we are thoroughly investigating it to prevent future errors," Nagpal said.

The issue came to light after Ramna village Pradhan, Aarti Patel, received complaints from the affected families. When Patel approached the Anganwadi worker for clarification, the worker reportedly responded unprofessionally, prompting Patel to escalate the complaint to the District Magistrate (DM). The Anganwadi worker's conduct is now under review as part of the ongoing investigation. "This incident highlights the importance of accurate data handling in government schemes and the need for clarity in responsibilities, especially when employees handle multiple roles. The state has assured that appropriate action will be taken based on the investigation findings," Nagpal said.

Rare Wolf-Hirschhorn syndrome diagnosed at AIIMS-R

The All India Institute of Medical Sciences - Raipur (AIIMS-R) has successfully diagnosed a rare genetic disorder, Wolf-Hirschhorn syndrome, affecting approximately 1 in 50,000 individuals.

An official communiqué said this was made possible through the capabilities of the cytogenetics services led by Prof. Dr. Manisha B. Sinha.

The patient, a child from Uttar Pradesh, was admitted to the pediatric unit under the care of Prof. Dr. Tushar B. Jagzape. The child had concerning symptoms, including poor growth and developmental delays.

Distinctive physical features such as microcephaly, a flat nasal bridge, low-set



ears and other characteristic facial traits were observed.

Additionally, an atrial septal defect and patent echocardiogram revealed an ductus arteriosus. A thorough

karyotype analysis confirmed the diagnosis of Wolf-Hirschhorn syndrome.

Dr. Tripty Singh, an Additional Professor of pediatrics, stated that treatment for this condition was highly individualized and tailored to address each patient's specific symptoms.

In the cytogenetics lab, Prof. Dr. Sinha has conducted tests on some 140 patients, diagnosing various conditions, including Down Syndrome, Turner Syndrome and Balanced Translocations.

Medical Superintendent Prof. Dr. Renu Rajguru said the cytogenetics lab represents a specialized service at AIIMS Raipur, enhancing the hospital's ability to diagnose and treat genetic and chromosomal disorders.

A workshop at the Pt Jawahar Lal Nehru Memorial Medical College in Raipur on Saturday stressed that Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) increases the survival chances of people in cardiac arrest by 30 percent.

Experts from renowned institutes trained students in CPR, defibrillation, cardioversion and pacing in the three-day workshop.

They said the chances of survival decline every minute if CPR is not performed on time. The patient suffers from complete brain damage as it does not get enough oxygen.

Emergency medicine specialist Dr. Shivam Patel said anyone can be trained to perform CPR; it is not necessary to have a doctor or medical team for this.

Nowadays, training on basic cardiac life support is also given in schools and colleges to save as many lives as possible, he said.

He called for promoting such



training programmes.

Dean Dr. Vivek Chaudhary said cardiac arrest can occur to anyone,

anywhere and at any time. In such situations, basic life support training can be lifesaving, he said.

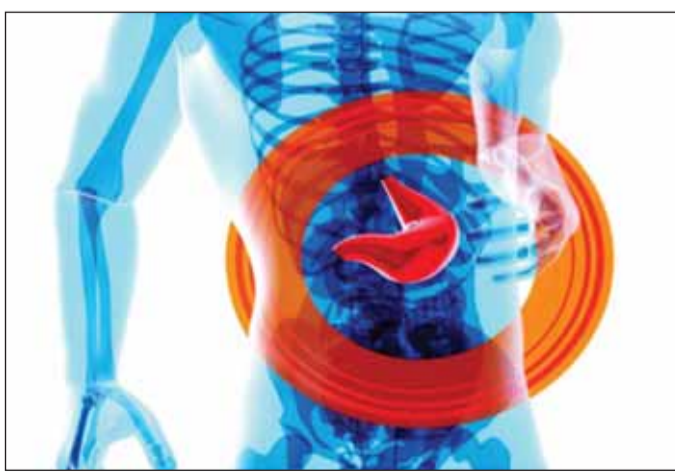
Limit high-fat dairy foods in the diet to ward off fatty liver disease risk: Study

Eating high-fat dairy products which include whole milk, cream, frozen yoghurt, butter, and ghee, may increase the risk of fatty liver disease, according to a study.

The study, published in the Journal of Hepatology Reports, showed that low-medium fat dairy products such as skimmed milk, cottage cheese, and low-fat cheese may be protective, and should be preferred over high-fat dairy to prevent Metabolic dysfunction-associated steatotic liver disease (MASLD).

MASLD is related to nutrition, but evidence of an association between high-fat and



low-fat dairy products is lacking. To fill the gap, a team of

researchers from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, in Israel,

evaluated this association by performing experimental studies in mice and an observational human study.

They found that low-medium fat low-sugar dairy products are more protective than high-fat dairy. In general, high-fat diets may be harmful.

"It would be advisable to prefer low-fat low-sugar dairy products and minimise intake of high-fat dairy products; however, additional evidence is needed to allow generalisability of our findings," the researchers said.

In the animal study, 6-week-old male mice were fed a high-fat diet (HFD) consisting of lard, soybean oil, and milk fat for 12 weeks.

All HFDs induced similar weight gain and steatosis and did not affect liver enzymes. Milk fat increases serum cholesterol and advanced glycation end-products (AGEs) levels more than lard or soybean oil. Further, in 316 patients, the team found that high consumption of low-medium fat low-sugar dairy products was associated with a lower risk for MASLD incidence.

"Constantly high consumption of high-fat low-sugar dairy products was associated with greater odds for new onset/persistence of MASLD". However, the team found that neither low-medium nor high-fat dairy consumption was related to fibrosis.

Shah likens Jharkhand Govt to 'burnt transformer'

Taking a jibe at the JMM-led coalition in Jharkhand, Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Saturday equated it with a "burnt transformer" that "failed" to relay the power of prosperity sent through the "high tension line" of Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led Centre.

He also appealed to the people to vote for the BJP for peaceful Ram Navami celebrations, promising that he would participate in such festival in Hazaribag if the BJP government was voted to power. "Narendra Modi's government is like an HT (high tension) power line. An HT line cannot supply electricity directly to your homes; a transformer is needed. The Hemant Soren government (Jharkhand CM) is like a burnt transformer. The Centre sends lakhs of



crores of rupees through its HT line for development, but it is not transmitted to you. The time has come to change this burnt transformer," Shah claimed addressing a poll rally in Hazaribag.

Shah alleged that the JMM-led regime was involved in multiple scams, including Rs 1,000 crore in MGNREGA, Rs 600 crore in land deals, Rs 1,000 crore in mining, and liquor. He further accused the state

Water quality of Ganga in UP deteriorating due to discharge of sewage, observes NGT

The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has observed that the water quality in the Ganga in Uttar Pradesh is deteriorating because of the discharge of sewage or sullage into the river.

Earlier, while considering the prevention and control of pollution in the Ganga, the green body sought compliance reports from various states, including Uttar Pradesh.

In an order dated November six, a bench of NGT Chairperson Justice Prakash Shrivastava said according to the report from Uttar Pradesh, there was a gap of 128 million litres per day (MLD) in sewage treatment in Prayagraj district.

Also, 25 untapped drains discharged untreated sewage into the Ganga in the district and 15 untapped drains discharged the sullage into the Yamuna, the bench, also comprising judicial member Justice Sudhir Agarwal and



expert member A Senthil Vel, said. "We find that out of the 326 drains disclosed in the report of the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) dated October 22, 247 drains are untapped (in the state) and discharging 3,513.16 MLD of waste water into the river Ganga and its tributaries," the tribunal said.

Expressing dissatisfaction, it directed the state's chief secretary to file an affidavit disclosing the information regarding each drain across different districts, the sewage generated from those, the sewage treatment plants (STP) to which those were proposed to be connected and

the timeline for making the STPs functional.

"The affidavit will also disclose the short-term measures that will be adopted to prevent the discharge of untreated sewage in the river in respect of each of the districts and drain till STPs are made fully functional and 100 per cent household connectivity is achieved," the bench said.

It also took note of the CPCB report disclosing the status of 41 STPs across 16 Ganga-front towns, which said six plants are non-operational and of the 35 operational STPs, only one complied with the rules.

Demonising Constitutional institutions pastime for some, cautions VP Dhankhar

Demonising constitutional institutions and sermonising people is fast becoming a "pastime", Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar said on Saturday and cautioned that such actions are a recipe for chaos.

He also said even those who "constitutionally matter in the political arena" are "sermonising all and demonising our constitutional institutions".

Addressing an event of an educational institution here, the vice president said it is time to "bid adieu to this".

"Also, I say with utmost restraint -- time for our elites to be elites. To them, I appeal -- to be a worthy elite, you have to be spurred by the fervour of nationalism," he said, without naming anyone.

Dhankhar also spoke on the crucial role of the alumni in strengthening the educational ecosystem, urging for active participation and



contributions to alumni associations.

"The alumni of an institution are in several ways its lifeline.... I strongly urge to have an alumni fund. Making annual contributions is all important. Some of the best institutions globally have been on an upward trajectory because these institutions are fuelled by alumni energy," he said.

The vice president said associations of trade, industry, business, and commerce must also come forward to fuel research and spur innovation through liberal financial contributions.

BJP claims Congress' Maharashtra unit has assured Muslim body of 10 per cent reservation, other demands

The BJP on Saturday here claimed that the Maharashtra unit of Congress has assured a Muslim body that it will take steps to fulfil its demands including a 10 per cent quota for the minority community in jobs and education and a ban on the RSS if Maha Vikas Aghadi is voted to power in the state assembly polls.

Addressing a press conference at the BJP headquarters, senior party

leader Ravi Shankar Prasad said that the All India Ulama Board (AIUB) has written to Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) offering its conditional support in the assembly elections.

"In its letter, the organisation has said that if Nana Patole (Congress), Uddhav Thackeray (Shiv Sena-UBT), Sharad Pawar (NCP-SP) and other parties want their support they will have to fulfil their demands which include opposition to Waqf Bill, 10 per cent reservation to Muslims in jobs and education..." he

claimed.

It has also demanded a ban on the RSS if the MVA is voted to power in Maharashtra, Prasad claimed, terming the organisation's demands as "divisive and a charter for the disintegration of the country".

What is "painful" here is that the Maharashtra Pradesh Congress Committee in its reply to the organisation has assured that it will "definitely" take steps to fulfil their demands if voted to power in Maharashtra, the BJP leader



claimed.

"We vehemently oppose such disruptive demands. We will never let them be implemented," he said,

adding that the BJP will also "expose the so-called INDIA coalition" before the people and show that they can go to any extent for votes.

Prasad said that Muslims cannot be given a 10 per cent quota on the basis of religion as it is not permissible under the Constitution.

If a 10 per cent quota is given to Muslims on other grounds it will slash the existing share in reservations meant for the OBCs, SCs and STs, he said and asked Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and Rahul Gandhi if it is acceptable to them.

"What has happened to you, Uddhav Thackeray? You forgot your own legacy. Balasaheb Thackeray had struggled so much against these things... You are his son."

"We vehemently condemned

it. It's very painful because we were once together," the BJP leader said as he accused Uddhav Thackeray of deviating from his party's original ideology.

Prasad also took on Sharad Pawar, asking why he has kept silent on the issue. "You are a seasoned player. I know you understand the Constitution. You are 80 plus and you command a lot of respect there. Did you make them understand that it's not possible (to fulfil AIUB's demands)... How far will you go for votes," he said.

Congress poses questions to PM Modi on his vision for Marathwada region

Congress on Saturday posed questions to Prime Minister Narendra Modi on his vision for the Marathwada region including his solution for water scarcity and inadequate rail infrastructure.

"The non-biological PM is in Nanded and Akola. Four questions for him - Where does the BJP stand on the issue of a caste census and raising the cap of 50% once 50 percent cap reservations for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, and OBCs imposed by the Supreme Court?" Congress General Secretary Jairam Ramesh said in a statement.

He claimed the Congress government in neighbouring Telangana is starting its door-to-door caste survey on Saturday and will cover 1.17 crore households.

"Meanwhile, the non-biological PM will be in Vidarbha - which has played such a central role in the struggle for social justice in the country - and will likely be entirely silent on the pressing issue of a caste census and the raising of the cap of 50% on reservations for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, and OBCs.

Why is the non-biological PM so silent? What is he afraid of?" he asked.

Congress leader also asked whether the PM will deliver on his promise to put the BJP's Rajya Sabha MP Ashok



Chavan in jail. Ramesh said while campaigning in Nanded on March 30, 2014, Modi had announced he would send Ashok Chavan to jail "within six months" if he became PM.

Ten years later, Ashok Chavan has joined the BJP and been rewarded with a Rajya Sabha seat.

His daughter is now a BJP contestant from the Bhokar assembly seat, he noted.

"Will this prove to be a promise delayed but not denied - or has the BJP Washing Machine cleared Mr. Chavan of any alleged wrongdoing?" Ramesh asked. The Congress leader also asked why has the Indian Railways performed so poorly in the Nanded division.

The Congress leader said the railway infrastructure in the Nanded division, which serves many areas in Marathwada, has been subjected to blatant neglect by the Modi government.

According to data furnished by the South Central

Railway (SCR) in 2021, Nanded only has 35 km of route electrification and only 83 km of track-doubling.

This puts it at the bottom in terms of electrification and only marginally ahead of the bottom in track-doubling compared to other SCR divisions, Ramesh said.

Additionally, it is the only division in its zone that still has 130 km of colonial-era meter-gauge tracks, he claimed.

In 2019, he said, the then Maharashtra Chief Minister Fadnavis promised a 20,000 to 25,000 crore package to build a water grid from Marathwada that would supply piped drinking water to every village.

Summer this year marked five years of this promise -- and it was one of the most water-scarce years that Marathwada has faced, the former Union minister said. He claimed that more than 600 villages and 178 hamlets in Marathwada were dependent on water tankers.

SC agrees to hear plea seeking to restrain felling of trees in Delhi without its nod

The Supreme Court has agreed to hear a plea seeking to restrain the Delhi government from allowing felling of trees in the national capital without the apex court's permission.

The application, which stated that five trees are felled in Delhi every hour, also sought to restrain the Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change from permitting diversion of forests in Delhi without the top court's nod.

The matter came up for hearing before a bench of Justices A S Oka and A G Masih on Friday. The court asked the Delhi government and others to respond to the

application by November 22.

The application has also sought the constitution of an expert committee, headed by a retired judge of the SC or the Delhi High Court, to assess the tree protection regimen in the national capital. A report containing its recommendation for the protection and preservation of existing trees and forests in Delhi should be submitted by the committee before the apex court, it said.

The application referred to a February 2023 order of the Delhi High Court and said it was recorded that five trees were felled every hour in the national capital, based on the data provided by the Forest Department of Delhi.

It sought to restrain the Delhi



government from allowing felling of trees in the national capital without the apex court's permission.

The preamble of the Delhi Preservation of Trees Act (DPTA), 1994 clearly states that it is "an Act to provide for the preservation of trees in the National Capital Territory of Delhi", it said.

"There are procedural safeguards provided within

the DPTA which are clearly visible in the flow of the Act wherein protection and preservation of trees precede the regulatory mechanism for felling of trees. These procedural safeguards have been grossly violated," it added.

Referring to Section 7 of the DPTA, it said it is clearly enshrined in the Act that it shall be the responsibility of the tree authority to "preserve all trees within its jurisdiction" and also undertake critical study of the proposals of various government departments for construction of buildings, roads and factories with regard to the protection of the existing trees and planting more.

"A comprehensive study of all the meetings of the tree authority revealed that the tree authority has met a total of only eight times since its inception in 1995 till March 2021. Whereas, the tree authority had an obligation to meet once every three months," the application said.

It said the importance of preserving fully grown trees, including generational trees or heritage trees, cannot be undermined and it was the need of the hour.

The law laid down by the apex court has great significance for Delhi as the National Forest Policy mandates that one-third of the total land area of the country should be under forest or tree cover, it said.

BRGavai nominated as executive chairman of NALSA

Supreme Court judge B R Gavai has been nominated as the executive chairman of the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA), which is mandated to provide free legal services to the weaker sections of society.

A notification issued by the Department of Justice on Friday said Justice Gavai's nomination as the executive chairman of NALSA will be effective from November 11.

While the chief justice of India is the patron-in-chief of NALSA, the seniormost judge after the CJI is its executive chair.



As of now, CJI D Y Chandrachud is its patron-in-chief and Justice Sanjiv Khanna is the executive chairperson.

Justice Chandrachud demits office as the CJI on Sunday and Justice Khanna will assume office on Monday. Justice Gavai will be the seniormost judge after the CJI from Monday.

Indian Navy set to demonstrate its maritime capabilities in Odisha on Navy day

This event showcases the Navy's multifaceted competencies, enhances maritime awareness among citizens and honours India's

The 2024 'Operational Demonstration' or 'Op Demo' is set to be held against the backdrop of the pristine Blue Flag Beach that symbolises the connection between the Indian Navy and the maritime legacy of the state of Odisha, the statement said.

Puri received the Blue Flag Beach certification a few years ago.

The Blue Flag designation signifies an eco-tourism model aimed at providing beachgoers with clean and hygienic bathing facilities, a safe environment, and sustainable development practices.

The Indian Navy said it is

working closely with the Odisha government and local authorities to ensure the smooth execution of the event. Seating arrangements would be made to accommodate local spectators and tourists, offering everyone a chance to witness the live demonstration from the beach.

The event will also be broadcast live on national television and streamed via the Indian Navy's YouTube channel to reach a wider audience, it added. In 2022, President Murmu witnessed the operational demonstration by the Indian Navy at Visakhapatnam on December 4.

LJP (Ram Vilas) to counter RJD's 'MY' combine in Bihar with own support base: Chirag

Union minister Chirag Paswan on Saturday claimed that his Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas) would counter the RJD's formidable 'MY' (Muslims and Yadavs) combine in Bihar with its own support base of women and the youth.

The NDA partner was talking to reporters in Tarari assembly constituency, on the sidelines of a rally he addressed for BJP candidate Vishal Prashant along with Chief Minister and JD(U) president Nitish Kumar,

among others.

"I am glad at the candidature of Vishal Prashant who is young. My party had contested and won five seats in Lok Sabha polls. Four of our candidates were young," said Paswan, who himself clinched Hajipur, the pocket borough of his late father Ram Vilas Paswan.

The 42-year leader, who did not mention the RJD by name, said "There are some who speak of an MY combination which is just mobilisation along the lines of cast and religion. My party, too, has its own MY

combination which stands for mahila and yuva. Our stance towards women is obvious with two of our MPs being females".

Paswan, who is known to have excellent personal relations with the family of RJD supreme Lalu Prasad, extended birthday greetings to the latter's son and heir apparent Tejashwi Yadav, calling himself a "big brother" of the young leader.

When asked whether he would like to give any political advice to Yadav, the third-term MP broke into a sheepish grin and remarked



"Given his family background, he has no dearth of good advisors".

Paswan, however, deplored a statement by RJD's Buxar MP Sudhakar Singh who

recently threatened to "beat up with sticks" BJP workers in Ramgarh assembly constituency where assembly by-poll has been necessitated by his election to Lok Sabha and his party has fielded his younger brother Ajit. Paswan said, "This is the type of language and behaviour that is always associated with RJD, a reason why the party is blamed for jungle raj in Bihar while it was in power. I was a teenager back then and still remember how much the bad reputation of the state used to rile its self-

respecting people".

Responding to another query, the Union minister said "Hindus are being targeted, in countries where they are in a minority, by extremists from other faiths. Canada is an example. But, it is disgusting that when Narendra Modi government brought the CAA for persecuted Hindus, the opposition criticized it".

"Fear-mongering has become the defining trait of INDIA bloc. They claimed CAA would deprive a section of population of citizenship though there was

no such provision in the Act. They also said Modi, in his third term, will do away with quotas and scrap the Constitution. That too has been proven false", Paswan said.

Asked about Independent MP Rajesh Ranjan alias Pappu Yadav's claims of getting threatening calls from people posing as aides of jailed gangster Lawrence Bishnoi, the Union minister "if he is making such complaints, these must be investigated and he must be provided with adequate security".

Safety must get highest priority while constructing roads: Gadkari

Union minister Nitin Gadkari has drawn attention to the rising number of road accidents and consequent deaths, and stressed on giving safety the highest priority while constructing pathways in the country. Addressing the 83rd annual session of the Indian Roads Congress at Pt Deendayal Upadhyay Auditorium here on Friday, he said if anyone dies in an accident due to road engineering fault in the future, then he will hold himself guilty for it. Highlighting the Centre's

efforts to prevent road accidents, he urged government engineers to quit their jobs and start a good DPR (detailed project report) making company, assuring them to give work on a priority basis. The Minister of Road Transport and Highways emphasized on production of bitumen and CNG from stubble in agriculture-dominated Chhattisgarh, arguing the move will cut dependence on fossil fuels and check pollution. He announced a slew of road projects for Chhattisgarh and said he believes the state will have a road network

similar to that of America in the next two years. "Every year 1.50 lakh deaths due to road accidents are reported which has now increased to 1.68 lakh. Efforts are on to improve the shortcomings in road engineering and automobile engineering but defective DPR has created a major problem," the minister maintained. He advised government engineers to quit their jobs and start a good DPR-making company. "We have been making serious efforts to prevent road accidents. Nearly 60 per cent victims of road



accidents are aged between 18 and 34 years. I would like to urge you to build roads where no accidents take place (due to defective engineering works)," he said.

Improvement in road engineering will curb accidents and save lives, Gadkari asserted. "We have made rules in automobile engineering. If anyone dies in an accident due to road engineering in the future, then I will feel that I am guilty for it," he told participants at the event. Pointing at the gathering of officials and engineers, the minister said no tenders should be issued without carefully examining DPR for projects. Road safety should be given the highest priority to prevent accident deaths, he added.

Gadkari emphasized the significance of waste-to-energy technologies and urged Chhattisgarh to work on producing CNG and bitumen using paddy straw. The Central Road Research Institute (CRRI) and the Indian Institute of Petroleum, Dehradun, have developed bio-bitumen from paddy straw and it is being used in Meghalaya, he told the gathering. "It (paddy straw) can be used up to 35 per cent in bitumen. The country's requirement of bitumen is 90 lakh metric tonnes and capacity of refinery is 40-50 lakh metric tonnes. We are importing 50

lakh metric tonnes," Gadkari said. If Chhattisgarh starts producing bitumen from stubble, it will be a waste-to-wealth move, he said. Similarly, 400 projects for producing bio-CNG and bio-LNG from paddy straw have started in Punjab and Haryana. If Chhattisgarh will do the same, no petrol and diesel will be required in the state, the Union minister opined. Gadkari underlined the need to develop robust infrastructure to realise Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of "Aatmanirbhar Bharat" (self-reliant India).

Indian Army flags off motorcycle expedition in Arunachal Pradesh

A motorcycle expedition organised by the Indian Army was flagged off from Mipi in Arunachal Pradesh's Dibang Valley, an official said on Saturday. The expedition was organised to honour the soldiers who fought for the nation during the 1962 Sino-India conflict and commemorate the Battle of Walong, defence spokesperson Lt Col Mahendra Rawat said. Dao Division's General Officer Commanding Major General VS Deshpande flagged off the expedition on Friday in the presence of Anini MLA Mopi Mihi and state government officers. The expedition team, comprising 10 personnel of the Army's Spear Corps and 10 civilians, have scheduled halts at Roing in the Lower Dibang Valley district and Hayuliang in the Anjaw district. Lt Col Rawat said the motorcyclists will ride through the Mishmi ranges and cross the pristine Dibang and Lohit valleys. The ride will end at the historic Walong War Memorial in Anjaw district on November 11, he said. The fierce Battle of Walong unfolded in the unforgiving terrain of Kibithu, Namti Tri Junction (famously known as



Tiger's Mouth), Walong and adjoining features in the easternmost parts of Arunachal Pradesh, according to the Army. "In October 1962, as Chinese forces advanced aggressively into Indian territory, the responsibility of defending the strategically crucial Walong sector fell upon the gallant 11th Infantry Brigade of the Indian Army's esteemed 2nd Infantry Division," the Army earlier said. This brigade, comprising the battle-hardened units of 6 Kumaon, 4 Sikh and 3/3 Gorkha Rifles, was tasked with holding their ground against an adversary that was not only numerically superior but also better equipped and entrenched in advantageous positions, it added. The valiant stand of the 11th Infantry Brigade delayed the Chinese advance, providing a

critical morale boost to the nation and demonstrating the unyielding courage of the Indian soldiers, the Army said. The route, tracing a historic path through the beautiful landscapes of Arunachal Pradesh, symbolises the Indian Army's commitment to fostering unity and promoting adventure tourism in border areas, Lt Col Rawat said. Each halt will be an opportunity for the riders to connect with the local communities, highlighting the strength, resilience and solidarity that define the spirit of the region, and promote national integration, he said. The motorcycle expedition is a part of the month-long celebrations that started on October 17 to mark the 62nd anniversary of the Battle of Walong fought during the 1962 Sino-Indian War.

India has effective mechanism to monitor oceans: Navy Chief

India has a highly effective mechanism for monitoring the oceans, known as maritime domain awareness, and is fully aware of "who is where and who is doing what" to ensure the country's interests are not compromised, Chief of Naval Staff, Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi has said. The Navy Chief also dismissed the dual carrier operation by China in the South China Sea as "nothing we should be concerned of". Addressing the media after the grand finale of THINQ 2024, a nationwide quiz competition organised by the Indian Navy on Friday evening, Tripathi also said India keeps a "close watch" on activities in its "area of interest". He made these remarks at the Ezhimala Naval Academy here in response to a question on China's growing influence in the region through its cooperation with Sri Lanka. "What China does in any part of the globe, let them do it. What they do in our area of interest, we are keeping a close watch. Nothing happens in our part of the world which we do not know," CNS added. He said the Navy is keeping a very close watch in our areas so that India's national interests are not



compromised in any way, anywhere. "When their units, whether military or non-military, operate in the Indian Ocean region, we do ensure that our national interests are not compromised. We have got a fantastic organisation to keep the oceans under watch, which is maritime domain awareness, and we know exactly who is where and who is doing what," the Navy Chief said. He said the dual carrier operation is nothing concerning India. "We have done these dual carrier operations for many years now," he added. Tripathi also said the Indian Navy is very proud of the two young women Naval officers who are now on a mission to circle the globe in a boat as part of the Navika Sagar Parikrama-2. "They are reaching their first port of call in Australia on Saturday. During the voyage, they will only touch four ports across the globe. It is a very challenging journey, as

they will have to face rough seas and weather. But they are well-equipped and well-trained. They already have training for 36,000 nautical miles," Tripathi said. Talking about the initiatives like THINQ quiz competition, he said that the Navy has several such initiatives to popularise the force among the countrymen, especially youths, and educate them on what the Navy does during peace and during 'not-so-peaceful times'. He said innovation is one of the top priorities for the Navy, and the Indian Navy always wanted to remain on top of the technology curve. "There is a process in which we recruit our officers and cadets. We assess the suitability. I am not worried about the quality (of resources) which we are getting," he added. He said the Navy also involved big public sector undertakings, medium, small, and micro establishments, and start-ups for technology sessions in an initiative to popularise the Navy's pursuit of technological mastery. For the THINQ 2024 editions, as many as 12,600 schools from 3,800 cities and towns in the country participated. Sixteen teams entered the semifinals, and eight teams contested in the grand finale held here.

Odisha DCM announces date for three-phase disbursement of Subhadra Yojana's first installment

Odisha Deputy Chief Minister Pravatī Parida on Saturday said that around 20 lakh more beneficiaries under the Subhadra Yojana are likely to receive their first instalment of Rs 5,000 by November end in the third phase of disbursement. The state government so far has disbursed Rs 5,000 each to about 60 lakh beneficiaries in two phases. Parida told reporters that about 20 lakh women beneficiaries during the third phase of disbursement are likely to get the money in their bank accounts on November 24 at a function to be held at Sundergarh. Union Ministers Dharmendra Pradhan and Jual Oram are scheduled to attend the function. The remaining eligible beneficiaries will get the money in the 4th phase of disbursement sometime in December, she said. The scheme was launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on September 17. The state government's flagship Subhadra Yojana is aimed at empowering women under which each beneficiary is entitled to get Rs 50,000 over a period of five years. The beneficiaries will receive



Rs 10,000 in two instalments in a year. While around 25 lakh women received the money in the first phase, the amount was credited to the bank accounts of 35 lakh beneficiaries in the second phase on October 9. Asked about the applications rejected so far, Parida said that every panchayat office has been asked to publish the rejection list. "We also have a list of those with problems in their bank details. They can be included in the subsequent phase," she said adding that applications of around 2.67 lakh women beneficiaries have reportedly been rejected for various reasons. Stating that about 1 crore women would be covered under the Subhadra Yojana, Parida said the government would expand its coverage, extending the benefits to Anganwadi workers, without a government employee in their family.

AP CM launches demo seaplane flight from Vijaywada to Srisaillam

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu on Saturday launched a seaplane demo flight from Prakasam Barrage in Vijayawada to Srisaillam in Nandyal district. Within an hour, he landed on water at Srisaillam project (reservoir) in Nandyal. After disembarking from the flight, the chief minister, who was also accompanied by Union Civil Aviation Minister K Ram Mohan Naidu, was received by the district officials. Later, the CM took a ropeway to reach the top of a hill at Srisaillam project and boarded

a bus to visit Sri Bhramaramba Mallikarjuna Swamy Varla Devasthanam (temple). Earlier, addressing a meeting during the launch of the demo flight at Punnami Ghat on the Krishna river in Vijayawada, the CM said, "This is a new experiment (seaplane demo flight). I am very happy. If anything new happens in the country, it should happen in Amaravati. We are going ahead with that motto." According to Naidu, seaplane services would be an innovative opportunity which will promote economic activities to create employment.

Air quality poor in large parts of Punjab, Haryana; Chandigarh very poor

The air quality in several parts of Punjab and Haryana was recorded in the 'poor' category on Saturday, while it was worst in the joint capital city of Chandigarh with an AQI of 322 which falls in the 'very poor' band. According to the Central Pollution Control Board's Sameer App, which provides hourly updates, Haryana's Bahadurgarh recorded an Air Quality Index of 314 -- also in the 'very poor' category -- at 9 am. Among other places in Haryana, the AQI at Sonapat was 290, Hisar (285), Bhiwani (277), Jind (275), Charkhi Dadri (258), Gurugram (259), Faridabad (220), Yamunanagar (213), Rohtak (238), Kurukshetra (202), Kaithal (205), Fatehabad (198), Ambala (160), Sirsa (181), and Karnal (144). In Punjab, the AQI was registered at 264 in Mandi Gobindgarh, 258 in Amritsar, 257 in Rupnagar, 248 in Jalandhar, 197 in



Ludhiana, 183 in Bathinda, 176 in Khanna, and 133 in Patiala. An AQI between zero and 50 is considered 'good', 51 and 100 'satisfactory', 101 and 200 'moderate', 201 and 300 'poor', 301 and 400 'very poor', 401 and 450 'severe', and above 450 'severe plus'. The rise in air pollution levels in the two states and Delhi during this time of year is often blamed on farm fires. Punjab reported 730 farm fire incidents on Friday, taking the total count to 6,029 in the state this season. As the window for the Rabi crop -- wheat -- is very short after paddy harvest, some farmers set their fields on fire to quickly clear off the crop residue for sowing of the next crop.

I-T raids Soren's aide ahead of Jharkhand polls

The Income Tax Department on Saturday conducted searches at multiple locations in poll-bound Jharkhand, including on the premises of a person linked to Chief Minister Hemant Soren, as part of a tax evasion probe, official sources said. A total of nine premises in the state's capital Ranchi and Jamshedpur are being raided in an operation that started early morning. A security team of the CRPF is assisting the I-T sleuths, the sources said. The locations linked to Sunil Shrivastava, an aide to the CM, are also being searched, they said. The action is linked to recent probes launched by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) over alleged illegal liquor trade and mining in the state, the sources said. The assembly elections are scheduled for November 13 and 20, and the counting of votes will take place on November 23.

IAS officer in dock for Mallu Hindu Officers WhatsApp Group

The controversial WhatsApp groups-Mallu Hindu Officers and Mallu Muslim Officers-- were created using the same phone, according to the Forensic Science Laboratory of the Kerala Police. Sources in FSL said that a serious scrutiny of the phone belonging to IAS officer K Gopalakrishnan has shown that the phone number was not at all hacked and the groups would not have been formed without the concurrence of the person who owns the phone. On 30th October two WhatsApp Groups were set up based on communal lines from the phone used by Gopalakrishnan, director of industries, government of Kerala. When some of the officers whose names figured in the WA Group Mallu Hindu Officers questioned the admin (none other than Gopalakrishnan) about the propriety of including their names in the Group, the IAS officer washed his hands off the controversy and said that his phone has been hacked. He also said that he had filed



a police complaint against the hacking of his phone. Both the Groups have been taken off the cyberspace following widespread condemnation of the same. Initial investigation by the Kerala Police with WhatsApp, Google and the Internet Service Provider proved that Gopalakrishnan's phone was not hacked. They also established the fact that the Mallu Muslim Officers' Group too was formed making use of the same phone and that too hours after the formation of the Hindu Officers Group. "It has been done to ward off any adverse comments arising out of the charge that a WA Group was formed to create a communal

divide among the officers," said a police official. The initial investigation found that no unauthorized applications have been installed in the handset. Dr M G Gireeshan, a cyber expert and hackathon specialist, had said that hacking was possible when strange and unfamiliar applications were installed by the phone users. If the findings of the FSL are true, Gopalakrishnan stands facing serious charges of attempting to divide the bureaucracy on communal lines destroying the secular fabric of the society. The officer remained incommunicado while his office staff said that he was travelling.

VHP demands liberation of Sabarimala shrine from Government control, wants Vavar mosque to go

In a major development akin to the agitation for the control of Kasi Viswanatha Temple and Lord Krishna Temple, Mathura, a demand has been made by the Kerala wing of Viswa Hindu Parishad (VHP) to "liberate" the holy shrine of Lord Ayyappa atop the Western Ghats from the shackles of government control and hand over the administration to the devotees. Viji Thampi, president, Kerala VHP, told the media after a daylong conclave of the "Save Sabarimala Action Committee" at Chengannoor

that political parties like the CPI(M) and Congress are working overtime to make Sabarimala Temple a milch cow to harvest the income received by the shrine to fill their party coffers. "It has been thrice proved through Deva Prasnam (astrological probe) that there never was a character by name Vavar in the history associated with Lord Ayyappa whose birth is recorded in Bhagavata Purana. Ayyappa was born out of the union between Lord Shiva and Mohini (the female form of Lord Vishnu) and there never was an Islamic character named Vavar in

this chronicle," said Thampi while addressing the media after the deliberations. The VHP as well as the Save Sabarimala Action Committee demanded that the ritual of worshipping at Vavar Mosque by Ayyappa devotees should be stopped forthwith. "There is no evidence of any connection between Vavar and Lord Ayyappa. The Ayyappa devotees paying obeisance at the Mosque during the pilgrimage to Sabarimala shrine is against tradition and customs. Vavar is part of created history by vested interests," said Thampi. Interestingly, this demand



has been made a week ahead of the annual 41-day festival (Mandala Pooja) in the holy shrine which commences on 16th November. This is the period when lakhs of devotees assemble at the shrine after observing a stringent 41-day observation of fasting, celibacy and prayers. The VHP also alleged that mainline political parties are trying to create a wedge among the followers of Sanatana Dharma. Those who attended the conclave and addressed the gathering include Kummanam Rajasekharan, former governor of Mizoram

and the representative of the Pandalam Royal Family, the traditional trustee of the shrine. Thampi exhorted the devotees making the pilgrimage to the shrine not to make any financial offerings at the temple as the entire income generated in the temple is diverted to non-spiritual purposes. "The Travancore Devaswam Board that administers the shrine is charging exorbitant rates for the prasadam which has not been blessed by Lord Ayyappa. The Board is cheating the believers," said Thampi. This is the first time Ayyappa

devotees, who through the shrine from India and abroad cutting across caste, communities, religions and nations, coming out with a statement openly condemning the concept of Vavar and 'mismanagement' of the temple administration. A Constitution Bench of the Supreme Court is all set to hear a petition filed by believers challenging the earlier order of the apex court allowing women devotees between the age group of 12-55 from worshipping at the sanctum sanctorum of the temple situated in the dense forests of the high ranges.

27 killed, 62 hurt in suicide attack on railway station in Pakistan

Starring *Blake Lively* and *Justin Baldoni* as the lead actors, *It Ends With Us* is all set to release on Netflix after a phenomenal box-office response from the cinema in August. The film is the cinematic adaptation of the best-seller novel *It Ends with Us* by Colleen Hoover.

Keeping the book aside, and talking about the film baldly for those unfamiliar with the book, the film gives a complete glimpse of a relationship with physical abuse with what comes with mental instability. It is a complete package initially starting from the butterflies of a relationship to the phase of its exciting and it and then beyond.

The characters fit in their role perfectly watching from the movie purpose *Blake Lively* as *Lily Bloom*, *Justin Baldoni* as *Ryle Kincaid*, *Jenny Slate* as *Allysa* (*Ryle's* sister) and *Brandon Sklenar* as *Atlas Corrigan*.

is the core strength of the film.

The many songs and the background scores in the film add life to the shot scenes categorising them as sad, loving and broken. The scores like *Opening*, *It Was Nice Meeting You*, *Lily's Past*, *Seeing Atlas* add the needed depth to the scenes with the sensual and reciting tunes.

The dialogues in the film, talking about my favourite one by *Atlas* to *Lily*, "*In the future, if you ever find yourself in the position to fall in love again, fall in love with me*". The dialogue will make your heart heavy and touch your emotional quotient. The characters have well fitted into the frame except *Lily*. *Blake* could have played more with expressions and body language. *Blake's* dressing in the movie seemed like a fashion disaster. *Ryle* aced the game with his reactions and attitude playing an aggressive man.

The climax with *Lily* having a baby and finally deciding if she would continue it with *Ryle* or not (continue to watch the film for the answers) is the whole sort of courage depicted in the film. The film addresses the social issue with the beauty of giving a message of having courage and stepping up to speak up for the steps that personally affect your mind and life.

Overall, the film depicts a journey of physical abuse initiated with romantic days in a relationship. *It Ends With Us* is a must watch with learning and lessons.

The film introduces many fresh elements, linking its storyline loosely to the epic *Ramayana*, blending it spiritually with its typical action-packed spectacle. New characters include *Arjun Kapoor* as the antagonist, and *Deepika Padukone* as *DCP Shakti Shetty*, along with *Tiger Shroff* as *ACP Satya Bali*.

Ajay Devgan, the hero, felt a little undermined from his role if compared to the super hit cop film *Singham*. *Kareena* played her role well in the movie.

The characters have somewhere done justice to their characters except some. The entry of *Jackie Shroff* as *Omar Hafeez* and *Arjun Kapoor* playing *Zubair Hafeez*, dominate the first half of the film and bring intensity and menace to their roles as the villainous duo. *Jackie Shroff* could have been better in his little time on the screen. *Deepika Padukone's* role wasn't of much need and looked forceful just to introduce the character to the film.

Tiger Shroff playing *Satya Bali* looked too flat for the film. Enhancement of these two strong



actors could have changed the outcome of the film.

Akshay Kumar comes with a dashing helicopter entry in the very end fitting into the well said cameo role.

Ranveer Singh enters later in the film, and his comedy grips the audience giving a reason to hold on till the end. *Ranveer* as *Simmba* single handedly takes off the second half. His entry linking

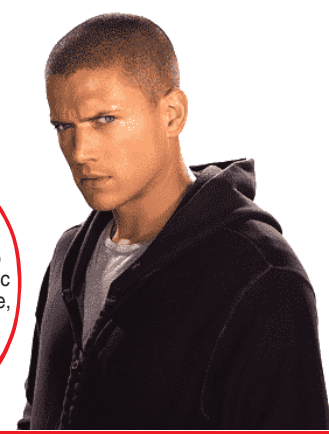

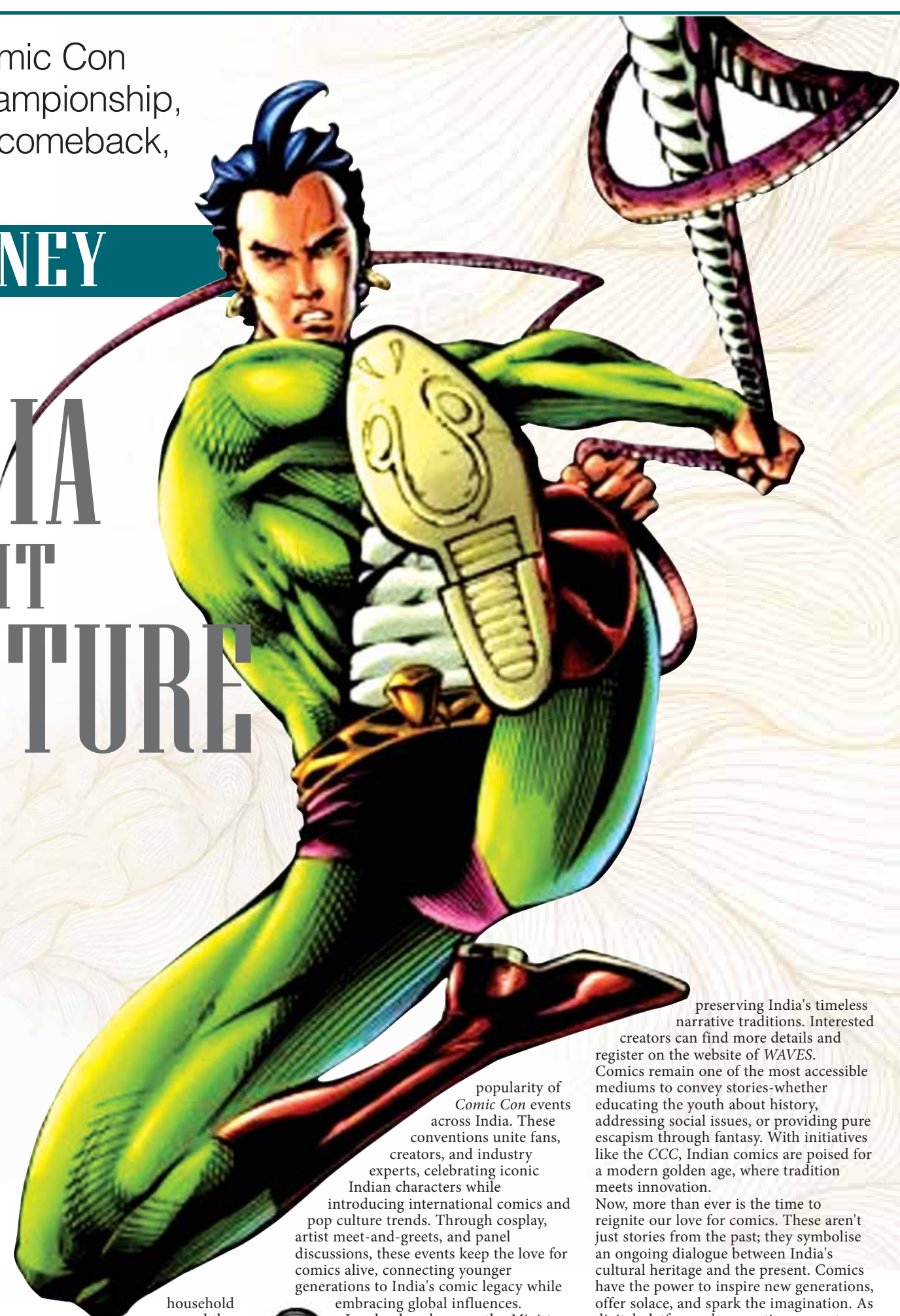

Next up, I moved on to the Dim Sum & Bao section. The Truffle Edamame offered a delightful twist on the classic, with a subtle truffle flavour that complemented the beans beautifully, giving them a soft yet earthy taste. However, the Tofu Bao with Chilli Bean Relish turned out to be my absolute favourite. The silken tofu paired with the chilli bean relish was a perfect blend of soft and spicy, all encased in a delicate, fluffy bao bun. This dish encapsulated the balance of textures and flavours that make Chinese cuisine such a treat. Moving into the Appetisers, the Chilled Mould Tofu with Peanut Sauce was a refreshing change, delicate, smooth tofu dressed in a creamy, slightly tangy peanut sauce. As someone who isn't a big tofu fan, I found it intriguing. It's a dish that might take some getting used to, but the pairing of tofu with peanut sauce certainly creates a unique, palate-expanding experience. This dish left a lasting impression, as did the Mogu with Dry Red Chili and Sichuan Pepper, a crispy fried button mushroom stir-fry that managed to stay crunchy even as it cooled. This level of attention to texture and flavour is a hallmark of authentic Chinese cooking, blending tradition with a modern twist. The bold, balanced flavours in each appetiser felt like a true celebration of Chinese culinary heritage. Moving on to the main course, the Mapo Tofu was a definite standout. Known for its bold, spicy flavours, the tofu here was incredibly silky,

Devotion to our rishis, sages, Gurus and following their guidance, one must unfold the meaning of and uphold their teachings, and sacred wisdom

These are cleared by yajnas sacrifice, studying and learning of the Vedic texts and looking after children. A successful person accomplishes these before forsaking the body. The sacred texts, including the Matsya Purana, elaborate on 5 primary debts -

The first 3 one is born with **Debt to the Gods (Deva Rina)** **Debt to the Ancestors (Pitru Rina)** **Debt to the Sages (Rishi Rina)** **Debt to Fellow Humans (Manushya Rina)** **Debt to Nature and All Living Beings (Bhuta Rina)** **Deva Rina:** The debt to the Gods emphasizes Bhakti devotion, worship, performing rituals and Yajnas sacrifices paying obeisance to the Divine power seen as nourishing and sustaining the cosmic order. यज्ञशिष्टाशिनःसन्तोमुच्यन्तेसर्वकिल्बिषः । भुञ्जतेतेत्वघ्नपापायेपचन्त्यात्मकारणात् ।। Yajñashishtāshino santomuchantesarvakilbīṣaiḥ Bhūñjate te tvaghñāṁ pāpā ye pachantyāt-makāraṇāt The wise and spiritually-minded, who eat the food that is first offered in sacrifice, are released from all kinds of sin. Others, who eat food for their own enjoyment, verily eat only sin. A reminder to eat food as prasada (sanctified food from the rituals) as a sense of gratitude towards the Divine order that is the provider. **Pitru Rina:** The debt to ancestors involves rituals like Shraadh and Tarpanto ensure the peace and well-being of our forefathers - an expression of reverence and connection to the Cosmic order reinforcing the values of family lineage.

DOUBTED HIS ABILITY AFTER FAILURES BUT SKY, COACH'S SUPPORT HELPED HIM: SAMSON

India batter Sanju Samson reflected on his early struggles in international cricket, saying that a string of failures made him doubt his ability, but self-belief and support of the captain and coach helped him stage a strong comeback. Samson hit back-to-back centuries in T20 Internationals with a breathtaking 50-ball-107 to headline India's comfortable 61-run win over South Africa in the opening game here on Friday. "I have faced a lot of failures in my career. I think when you go through that failure, you have lot of doubts in your mind. People definitely say that social media definitely plays a role," Samson told reporters in the post-match press conference. "But you also think a lot about yourself. Sanju, are you not made for international level? I think you are doing well in IPL. Why are you not doing well internationally? So I have a lot of such thoughts. But after so many years of

experience, I know what my ability is. "If I spend some time in the wicket, then I have a shot-making ability in spin and pace and I know that I can definitely contribute well to the team. I can win the match. This is also a reality. There are definitely a lot of downs happening but the upside is also really good. So I kept telling myself that." Samson, who turns 30 on Monday, has often been criticised for not fulfilling his potential despite abundant talent. He had scored successive ducks in Sri Lanka but responded with a 111 against Bangladesh in the third T20I and followed it up with another ton on Friday. The Kerala batter acknowledged the crucial support he received from Captain Suryakumar Yadav and Coach Gautam Gambhir during his low phase. "When you have a supporting captain like Suryakumar Yadav and Gautam bhai and VVS Laxman sir, they all support you during failures. The way they communicate with you



in your failures is very important. Everyone knows that if we are going through a negative phase, then the

player can get lost there," he said. "So at that time, I received a lot of phone calls from

Gautam bhai and Surya, telling me what to work on. Your spin is a little bit like that. You collect all the

spinners in Kerala and practice in rough wickets there. You do this, you do that. "So if your Indian

team's captain is calling you and telling you how to practice after a duck, then you have confidence that the captain is trusting you. He wants you to do well. So I think all those small, small things plays a huge role, I think, coming back here," Samson said. "I'm very grateful about the trust shown on me. I think I've been able to give it back to my team management. I feel that it's just a start. I would like to just practice hard, train hard, just be very grateful walking out to play for my country and just look to contribute and win games for my country every time I walk in." His innings included as many as 10 monstrous sixes which propelled India to 202 for 8 in 20 overs. "When you score 100 for your country, it's definitely a very special feeling. The wicket was a little more bounced, a little spongy in the beginning. It's been raining here for 3-4 days, so I think it was a bit more challenging condition," Samson said. "So according to that, we are talking to the team and we

are preparing accordingly. Even when it rained for 3-4 days, our team came here and practiced. We did batting for 2-3 hours, so it was a little beneficial." "We're the World Champions and we need to play like that," Samson said they are focused on playing an aggressive brand of cricket, regardless of conditions, to live up to their reputation as world champions. "What we have been talking in the dressing room from so many seasons right after winning the World Cup or even from last 2-3 years is even if you lose the toss and even the conditions are tough, we have to go all in." "We can't think that we will have to look for something like 160-170 in these wickets because I think chasing becomes a bit easier. We were just looking to attack even knowing that the condition is slightly helping the bowlers," he said. "We are definitely the world champions at the moment. So I think we have to play like that and just keep on looking to dominate in this format," he said.

Stewart Cink maintains lead in PGA Tour Champions finale, with 67-year-old Langer 2nd after a 64

Stewart Cink shot a 5-under 66 to maintain a three-stroke lead in the PGA Tour Champions' season-ending Charles Schwab Cup Championship. Bernhard Langer, the 67-year-old German star who has a Champions-record 46 career victories, was second after a 64 on Friday. He shot his age or better for the 21st time on the tour. "Every once in a while I look back at my career and have to almost pinch myself and say, 'Man, that's pretty amazing what you've done the last whatever so many years,'" Langer said. "Like a day today, to shoot 64 - 3 under my age - not a whole lot of people can do that." The 51-year-old Cink had a 12-under 130 total at Phoenix Country Club, shooting a 64 of his own in the first round. The Ally



Challenge winner in August in Michigan for his first senior title, Cink entered the week 12th in the season standings. "It was actually probably a cleaner round than yesterday as far as just my processes and the quality of the shots was probably a little bit better overall," Cink said. "I just didn't have the hot long putts going in today quite as much, but it was a really solid round. I would love to play golf like that every day." Langer birdied five of the first seven holes and closed strong with birdies on 17

and 18. He's trying to win at least one event for the 18th consecutive year. "It's fun to make some putts, that's what the game is all about," Langer said. "If you want to score low, you've got to make some putts." Alex Cejka was third at 7 under after a 66. Defending champion Steven Alker, second behind Ernie Els in the season standings, was tied for fourth at 4 under after a 68 - putting himself in position to pass Els for the \$1 million bonus. Vijay Singh (65), Miguel Angel Jimenez (68), Jerry Kelly (70) and Cameron Percy (68) also were 4 under. Els was 3 under after a 70. Stephen Ames, third in the standings, was 2 under after a 72. The top 36 players on the points list qualified for the event, with Steve Stricker the lone qualifier not in the field.

Czech legend Zelezny comes on board as Neeraj's coach ahead of 2025 season

Star Indian javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra on Saturday roped in three-time Olympic champion and world record holder Jan Zelezny as his coach, setting the ball rolling for the upcoming season, where he will defend his World title. Zelezny, 58, is widely considered the greatest javelin thrower of the modern era. The Czech won three Olympic gold medals (1992, 1996, 2000) and as many world titles (1993, 1995, 2001) in his illustrious career.

Zelezny holds the world record of 98.48m in the event. Chopra till recently worked with German biomechanics expert Klaus Bartonietz, who also doubled up as his coach. Neeraj, after becoming the first Indian athlete to win a gold at the Tokyo Olympics, finished second best at the 2024 Paris Games. The star Indian athlete said he was a great admirer of Zelezny in his formative days and watched the Czech legend's videos to hone his skills. "Growing up, I admired Jan's technique and precision and



spent a lot of time watching videos of him. He was the best in the sport for so many years, and I believe that working with him will be invaluable because our throwing styles are similar, and his knowledge is unmatched," Neeraj said.

"It's an honour to have Jan by my side as I push towards the next level in my career, and I can't wait to get started," he added. Neeraj, who has not crossed the 90m mark in competition so far, would be eager to break the 'barrier' and Zelezny's experience could come in handy. The collaboration also symbolises a fusion of generations, with the young champion drawing inspiration and expertise from what many consider the greatest javelin thrower of all time.

Zelezny's expressed his happiness, saying he was always looking forward to train the Indian star as he still has a lot of potential. "I have already spoken about Neeraj as a great talent many years ago. When I saw him early in his career, I realised great possibilities for top results," Zelezny said in a statement. "I also said that if I should start to coach somebody from outside Czechia (Republic), my first choice would be Neeraj. I like his story and I see big potential, as he is young and able to improve.

India needs top-order to bat better in second T20I against South Africa

Sanju Samson will look to continue his domination of the bowlers but India need more stability in the top order when they clash with South Africa in the second T20I South Africa, aiming to extend their superior run in the shortest format, here Sunday. Samson's stunning 107 off 50 balls powered India to a commanding 61-run victory in the series opener, but the lack of runs from other key batters remains a concern for the visitors. India need address this issue to ensure that the burden doesn't fall too heavily on their in-form keeper-batter. The continued failure of opener Abhishek Sharma, who has squandered multiple opportunities, would be worrying the team management. Apart from his memorable 47-ball century against Zimbabwe in Harare earlier this year, Sharma has struggled for runs with scores of 0, 10, 14, 16, 15, 4, and 7 in recent outings. The dashing left-hander's lack of consistency at the top of the order could prompt India to rethink their options moving forward. While the team management is unlikely to make changes to the playing XI, it will be disappointed with Sharma's continued failure, especially as India look for second-line opening option after Yashasvi Jaiswal following Rohit Sharma's retirement from the format. Tilak Varma showed promise with a quick-fire 33 off just 18 balls in the first match but will need to convert such cameos into bigger knocks. Varma has been largely off the radar since his last appearance



against Afghanistan in January, and with competition for spots in the middle order heating up, the young batter will want to cement his place in the side. Skipper Suryakumar Yadav

also got a start but fell cheaply, while all-rounder Hardik Pandya was unable to live up to his potential in the opening match. India's middle-order, which looked solid on paper, struggled to build partnerships as they lost six wickets for just 36 runs, slipping from a commanding 166/2 to 202/8 by the end of their 20 overs. This collapse highlighted the fragility of India's middle and lower order, something that they will aim to address before the second T20I.
