Rules framed for 10% quota in uniform services

▲ he Odisha Government has framed rules to provide 10% reservations to ex-Angniveers in the State's Uniform Services, said a notification of the General Administration and Public Grievances De-

The rules have been framed by exercising the powers conferred by Article 309 of the Constitution. The 'Uniform Services' refer to police, forest, fire or any other service as may be declared by the State Government from time to time.

As per the rules, a retired Agniveers means a person who has completed four years of service in the Armed Forces under the Agniveers Recruitment Scheme while a retired Soldier means a person as defined in the Retired Soldiers (Employment in State Civil Service and Posts) Regulations, 1985. Earlier in September, the State

Cabinet had approved framing of the Odisha Ex-Agniveers (Recruitment to Uniform Services) Rules, 2024. It was then to provide ample opportunities for ex-Agniveers to secure jobs in uniformed services like police, forest, excise, fire or any services as decided by the government from time to time.

As per the rules, there would be a 10% horizontal reservation for retired Agniveers in uniform service of all 'C' and 'D' category posts. It would be subjected to an additional 10% reservation in addition to the reservation applicable to retired Servicemen. The rules also state that the prescribed age limit for retired Agniveers in uniform services of all 'C' and 'D' category posts filled by direct recruitment of the State be

The Supreme Court on Friday set up a five-Special Investigation Team under supervision of Central Bureau of Investigation the allegations of use of making fat in Tirupati laddus. A Bench of Justices BR Gavai and KV Viswanathan said the Special Investigation Team (SIT) will comprise two officials each from the CBI and the Andhra Pradesh Police besides a senior Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) official.



mum number of Unesco sites with wonders like the Ajanata Ellora Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus, Victorian Gothic and Art Deco Ensembles of Mumbai, and Elephanta

Maharashtra is followed by Karnataka with four Unesco sites including the Western Ghats. Karnataka boasts of the stunning group of monuments at Hampi and Pattadakal, sacred ensembles



ern Ghats.

After Karnataka, comes Rajasthan with four sites including the Hill Forts, Keoladeo National Park, Jantar Mantar, and Jaipur City. Bandh held over 'job grabbing' PNS KORAPUT

Koraput district on Friday witnessed a significant outpouring of public support as local organisations observed a 12-hour bandh advocating for the rights of the youths of the district.

The protest echoed the sentiments of the local youths who alleged job grabbing by non-Koraput people. While hundreds of youths from tribalsdominated districts are in need of jobs, youths from other districts often take away their jobs, the protesters alleged.

Demanding district-based jobs, the organisations observed the bandh from 6 am to 6 pm. Offices, shops, schools



and colleges remained closed.

Marching through the streets with banners and placards, the demonstrators voiced their concerns over a range of issues majorly focusing on jobs taken away by non-Koraput people in the teaching sector. As per reports, out of 922 teaching positions for junior teachers, only 40 people from

Koraput have been selected while the remaining aspirants

are from other districts. "If people from other districts take away all the jobs in our district, where will our boys and girls go? The government is playing with the future of Koraput people," alleged Rupak Turuk, a member of the Milita Kriyanusthan Commit-

The situation is no different in tribals-dominated districts of Malkangiri, Nabarangpur and Rayagada. Out of 860 junior teacher positions in Nabarangpur, only 134 candidates are from the district while the remaining is from other districts, claimed a

BBSR airport to get new terminal, ILS CAT II

The Biju Patnaik International Airport (BPIA) in Bhubaneswar is all set to get a new terminal as part of the mega expansion plans to meet the requirements of domestic and international air travellers in the coming years.

After a review meeting held here on Friday, Union Minister of Civil Aviation Kinjarapu Rammohan Naidu informed that within a month the BPIA would have the permission for a new terminal and the construction work is expected to be completed within two

"I reviewed a lot of things with the Airports Authority of



India and other officials. Bhubaneswar airport has registered massive development and it connects with 20 cities in the country and internationally with four cities. The Centre is working to promote Odisha as far as the civil aviation centre is concerned," said

He said the capacity of Bhubaneswar airport's Terminal 1 is to handle around 40 lakh passengers per year and already around 50 lakh passengers are using it. There is a need to augment its capacity to 80 lakh passengers per year. Permissions will be granted for the new terminal in one month

reorganisation. The new terminal would be constructed in the next two years.

Naidu also informed that already a lot of small works like extension and other passenger amenities in the airport are underway and all this would be completed within a month. Besides, the existing ILS (Instrument Landing System) CAT I would be upgraded to CAT II within a month.

He said there is a growing demand for connectivity from Bhubaneswar to Jammu, Surat, Jaipur and Vizag. His ministry would look into these demands and appropriate steps would be taken at the

STA warns action on illegal money collection from vehicles

In view of illegal money collection from vehicles in Sundargarh district on the pretext of conducting road safety, the State Transport Authority (STA) on Thursday warned of stringent action against the miscreants.

The STA also directed RTOs to take immediate action in such incidents.

"No one has been granted permission to engage in such activities; and vehicle owners or drivers should neither trust nor pay these individuals," said Joint Transport Commissioner (Road Safety) Pradeep Kumar

Most of the fraudsters are often from outside the State and are primarily active in border districts and mining areas, targeting trucks and

Transport Commissioner Amitabh Thakur also directed the Sundargarh RTO to take the matter seriously and take

action against the miscreants.

Expressing concern against the rise in defrauding people in the name of road safety, Thakur also discussed the issue with the Sundargarh Collector and SP and demanded strict legal action against the

Meanwhile, the STA also appealed to people to report such incidents if they are stopped on highways for illegal money collection.

"Instructions have been issued to all RTOs across the State to take immediate action if such activities are reported in their areas, not just in Sundargarh," the Transport Commissioner said.

The trap was laid on the basis of a complaint received on toll-free No 1064 of the Vigilance Directorate. Sahoo was nabbed while accepting the final instalment of the total Rs 14,000 he had demanded from a beneficiary to return the case record for preparation of muster roll for payment of wages

The foundation stone of the new capital of Odisha, Bhubaneswar, was laid by India's first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru on April 13, 1948. Following this, Bhubaneswar functioned as a Notified Area Council from 1948, then as a Municipality from 1979, and eventually, in 1994, the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation was established.

As Bhubaneswar grew, the need for a dedicated Police Commissionerate, similar to those in cities like Mumbai, Delhi, and Hyderabad, became evident. The Odisha Urban Police Bill of 2003 was introduced in the Odisha Legislative Assembly, and after passing through the necessary channels, it received the President of India's approval on September 24, 2007.

This paved the way for the establishment of the Commissionerate Police under the Odisha Urban Police Act of 2003. Consequently, on

Commissionerate Police was formally established for the Bhubaneswar-Cuttack Twin City, with Binaya Kumar Behera serving as its first Police Commissioner. In May 2008, Bijaya Kumar Sharma replaced him.

During Sharma's tenure as Police Commissioner, and with the support of the then honorary secretary of the Indian Red Cross, Odisha State Branch, Rabiratna Das, the Indian Red Cross Society, Bhubaneswar-Cuttack Regional Branch was formed on October 5, 2008. Sharma became the first and founding chairman of the branch. It has been my privilege to serve as a member of the Executive Comthe Police of Commissionerate Red Cross Branch

since its inception.

The structure of the Red Cross in Odisha is hierarchical, with the Governor of Odisha serving as the president of the Indian Red Cross Society, Odisha State Branch. Every district has its own Red Cross branch, where the district Collector serves as the chairman. In the Bhubaneswar-Cuttack region, a unique branch functions under the name "Indian Red Cross Society, Bhubaneswar-Cuttack Regional Branch." The Police Commissioner is the ex-officio chairman of the branch, the Additional Commissioner is the ex-officio vice-chairman, and the DCP Headquarters serves as the ex-officio secretary.

Notably, the Police Commissionerate Red Cross Branch is the only police-associated Red

Cross branch in India. The Red Cross operates on seven core principles: humanity, impartiality, neutrality, independence, voluntary service, unity, and universality. Our branch adheres to these principles in all its activities, and I take great pride in being actively involved.

The Police Commissionerate Red Cross organizes numerous social service activities such as free health check-up camps, distribution of free medicines, and first-aid boxes to schools and PCR vans. We also provide financial assistance to underprivileged patients, distribute blankets in the winter, and offer free drinking water during the summer. Additionally, our branch donates essential equipment to hospitals, such as tools, beds, washing machines, and geysers to old age

homes, and we conduct plantation drives in the city. Special days such as Red Cross Day and Blood Donation Day are also observed.

A vital initiative of the Police Commissionerate Red Cross has been its role in increasing the percentage of voluntary blood donations in the State. As Bhubaneswar and Cuttack house many of the major medical institutions in Odisha, over 50% of the State's patients rely on the hospitals in these twin cities. Recognizing the urgent need for blood, as it cannot be manufactured but must be donated, our branch launched a dedicated blood donation initiative called "Jibana Aloka". To ensure the success of the programme, a Nodal Officer for voluntary blood donation was appointed to oversee the

Jaishankar to lead Indian delegation to Pakistan for SCO summit: MEA

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar will lead the Indian delegation to Pakistan mid -October for the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit, ministry of external affairs (MEA) spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal announced here on Friday.

The last Indian external affairs minister to visit Pakistan was Sushma Swaraj. She had travelled to Islamabad in December 2015 to attend a conference on Afghanistan. Pakistan is hosting the SCO Council of Heads of Government (CHG) meeting on October 15 and 16.

"The external affairs minister will lead our delegation to Pakistan to participate in the

held in Islamabad on October 15 and 16," Jaiswal said at his weekly media briefing. The spokesperson clarified that the external affairs minister is travelling to Pakistan only to attend the SCO summit.

In August, Pakistan invited Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the SCO's summit. Jaishankar's visit to Pakistan assumes significance as it is seen as a major decision on New Delhi's part.

The decision to send the senior minister is seen as a display of India's commitment to the SCO which has been playing a key role in boosting regional security cooperation.

The ties between India and Pakistan came under severe strain after India's warplanes

Mohammed terrorist training camp in Balakot in Pakistan in February 2019 in response to the Pulwama terror attack. The relations further deteriorated after India on August 5, 2019 announced the withdrawal of special powers of Jammu and Kashmir and the bifurcation of the state into two union territories.

India has been maintaining that it desires normal neighbourly relations with Pakistan while insisting that the onus is on Islamabad to create an environment free of terror and hostility for such engage-

The SCO council of heads of government conclave is the second-highest platform in the grouping. The SCO heads of state summit is the top



that is generally attended by the Indian prime minister. The SCO, comprising India, China, Russia, Pakistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan, is an influential economic and security bloc that has emerged as one of the largest transregional international organisations.

India was the chair of the SCO last year. It hosted the

format in July last year. India's association with the

SCO began in 2005 as an observer country. It became a full member state of SCO at the Astana summit in 2017. India has shown a keen interest in deepening its securityrelated cooperation with the SCO and its Regional Anti-Terrorism Structure (RATS), which specifically deals with issues relating to security and defence.

The SCO was founded at a summit in Shanghai in 2001 by the presidents of Russia, China, the Kyrgyz Republic, Kazakhstan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan.

Pakistan became its permanent member along with India in 2017. Jaishankar's Pakistan visit will

after he called out the neighbouring country over crossborder terrorism at the United Nations General Assembly.

Tanwar was officially inducted into the Congress at the AICC headquarters by party treasurer Ajay Maken.

Later, Tanwar, accompanied

by party MP Deepender Hooda, also met Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge. 'We are with 36 communities in Haryana. Our resolve is for everyone. We will always raise

the voice of Dalits, tribals, backward classes, minorities and the poor," Kharge said in a post on X.

He also shared pictures from

Addressing a press conference, Tanwar said, "I began my political career with the Congress. In the last few months I was with the BJP, the environment that I saw, I was hurt over a number of issues, the faith that should be there in Babasaheb Ambedkar and the Constitution is not there (in the BJP)."

"On the other hand, Rahul Gandhi is working on strengthening Babasaheb Ambedkar's Constitution and ensuring that people get their rights and unity in the country is strengthened," he said. Tanwar credited the Congress for his political career.

"I request all Dalits and backward classes of Haryana that to make the state number one and to ensure people of Haryana get their rights... All sections, I request them to give a big mandate (to the Congress) to send a message to the country," he said.

The Dalit leader had on Thursday described his decision to return to the Congress as the "will of God".

"It's all circumstances, destiny and will of the people. Let bygones be bygones," Tanwar

had told PTI on phone. "I am joining the Congress exactly five years after I left it. That was the will of God then, today also it is the will of God... Sometimes, there is not much in your hands," he had said.

Asked on Friday about allegations of opportunism and losing from Sirsa parliamentary constituency on a BJP ticket, Tanwar said, "If Ashok Tanwar was an opportunist, he would have gone to the BJP five years ago. So, from this platform, because today we want to start on a positive note, I would not like to say anything negative but the BJP itself knows that Ashok Tanwar did not lose there, the BJP lost there and the BJP's policy lost there."

Tanwar accused the BJP of disrespecting the Constitution and Dalit leaders.

Asked if there was a guarantee that he would now remain with the Congress, Tanwar replied with a Hindi idiom which loosely translates to if a person who loses his way in the morning returns home in the evening, he is not called

"When you also leave home, no matter where you go in the world, you will come back and stay at home. When a person leaves home, then he realises the value of home more... Now I have understood the entire political system 360 degrees and that is why today I am standing with Rahul ji," he said.

At the rally in Bhawaria on Thursday, Tanwar shook hands with Gandhi and greeted former chief minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda, who welcomed him into the party fold and patted his back.

Maldives President to visit India to restore strained ties

Maldives President Mohamed Muizzu will pay a five-day visit to India beginning Monday with an aim to reset ties that came under some strain since November last year.

Though the Maldivian president attended Prime Minister Narendra Modi's swearing-in ceremony in June, it will be his first bilateral visit to India.

The ties between India and the Maldives came under severe strain since Muizzu, known for his pro-China leanings, took charge of the top office in November.

Within hours of his oath, he had demanded the withdrawal of Indian military personnel from his country. Subsequently, the Indian military personnel were replaced by civilians. The Ministry of External

Affairs (MEA), announcing Muizzu's trip, said it is expected to lend further momentum to cooperation and robust people to people ties between the two countries. "President of the Republic of

Maldives Mohamed Muizzu will be travelling to India on a state visit from October 6 to 10," it said.

During his visit, Muizzu will hold discussions with Modi on bilateral, regional and international issues of mutual interest, it said. Muizzu is also scheduled to meet President Droupadi

Besides Delhi, he will also visit Mumbai and Bengaluru where he will be attending business

"The Maldives is India's key maritime neighbour in the Indian Ocean Region and holds a special place in the prime minister's vision of 'SAGAR' (Security and Growth for All in the Region) and India's

'Neighbourhood First Policy', the MEA said in a statement. External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar paid a three-day visit to the Maldives in August that prepared the grounds for Muizzu's upcoming trip.

"The visit of President Muizzu to India after the recent visit of the external affairs minister to Maldives is testimony to the importance that India attaches to its relations with the Maldives," the MEA said. The Maldives is one of India's

The initiative also aims to prevent misleading claims about a product's environmental impact, according to a statement from the Union **Environment Ministry issued**

on Friday here. "Eco-labelling of products enables consumers to make informed purchase decisions as well as encourage manufacturers to transition to the production of environmentfriendly products, leading to the promotion of green industries," said the notification

aligns with the 'LIFE' (Lifestyle for Environment) principle, focusing on lower energy consumption, resource efficiency, and the promotion of a circular economy will cover a wide range of prod-

Talking about the implemen-

tation procedure, an official said that an application for 'Ecomark' will be required to be made to the CPCB. After that, the Board will, either by itself or through a verifier, verify whether the product complies.



"I had a detailed discussion with Fadnavis...since the Indapur seat is going to the sitting MLA from Maha Yuti (Bharne), he (Fadnavis) assured me of another option. Though the option would have been feasible for me, it would not have been acceptable to my supporters and people from my constituency," Patil said.

"During my meeting with Pawar sahib yesterday, he told me that since my supporters want me to contest from Indapur, I should take a call... I spoke to

my supporters and have decided to join the NCP (SP)," Patil said. Welcoming Patil's entry to her party, Baramati MP and NCP (SP) Working President Supriya Sule said: "The family relations between Pawar family and Patil family go back to six decades...I welcome him to the NCP.

engagement with its partners understanding that true progress can only be achieved through collective action and synergy, and due to these efforts, it is now considered as a credible and preferred security partner and first responder in the region.

economic growth and mutual

security," Rajnath said.

Defence Minister The reiterated India's unwavering resolve to a rule-based international order, respect for international law, and adherence to the principles enshrined in the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea, describing them as the cornerstones of foreign policy.

"India has consistently advocated for a peaceful resolution to disputes and has sought to promote cooperation among nations in the Indo-Pacific, with a strong emphasis on the centrality of ASEAN in fostering regional dialogue, stability and collective growth," he said. Rajnath also underscored

How secular is India?

As India grapples with internal strife and external criticism, the debate surrounding its commitment to secularism intensifies

India, a nation characterised by its rich tapestry of religious diversity, has long championed the values of secularism and pluralism. However, the landscape of religious I freedom in the country has come under scrutiny, particularly with the recent designation by the US Commission on International Religious Freedom (USCIRF) of India as a "Country of Particular Concern." This designation has ignited a contentious debate, leading to a sharp rebuke from the Indian government, which labeled the USCIRF a "biased organisation with a political agenda." In its 2024 report, the USCIRF highlighted alarming trends regarding religious freedom in India. The commission reported instances of violence against individuals based on their religious identity, citing cases of killings, beatings and lynchings carried out by vigilante groups. It also noted the arbitrary arrests of religious leaders and the demolition of homes and places of worship, characterising these actions as severe violations of religious freedom. The report further pointed to changes



in India's legal framework that, according to the USCIRF, target and disenfranchise religious minorities. These changes include the controversial Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) and the implementation of a uniform civil code. Such measures, the USCIRF argues, contribute to a climate of fear and marginalisation for non-Hindu communities. In response to the USCIRF's assertions, the Indian Ministry of External Affairs firmly rejected the report. Spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal described the commission's narrative as a "motivated" misrepresentation of facts aimed at maligning India's image on the global stage. The ministry's statement emphasised that the USCIRF's reporting is unsci-

entific and driven by an agenda that fails to reflect the realities of India's democracy. It is true that no external agency or country has right to give us lessons in religious freedom and tolerance as we have practiced it since ancient times. Moreover, they have skeletons in their own cupboard which they would better take care first. The trigger happy policemen in the US don't think twice before shooting a black guy for not pulling over his car. But having said that it is time for us to reflect and introspect. To be fair, religious freedom has eroded in the recent years. There have been lynching incidents and that is not a made up thing. We may say that they are isolated incidents but they are enough to send a message to the community. Moreover, the attacks on churches and other religious places have been reported from across the country all this while the police looked the other way or just took mild action. It is time to ensure one and all that India is safe as it has been for ages for people of all religions and castes. And India as a State does not discriminate people for the religion they practice or food they eat. The concerns raised by the USCIRF may be exaggerated and they may make isolated incidents look mainstream but the government must maintain zero tolerance for such incidents so that no outside agency dare raise a pointing figure at us.

NATO's eastward march





This is, however, not a new phenomenon. This is how we "civilisations" behave. The history of military alliances has consistently illustrated a paradoxical truth: nations often proclaim peace while simultaneously preparing for war and engaging in it.

The recent rise of Japan's Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba, who has advocated for an 'Asian NATO,' is nothing but a sign of a looming storm ahead. Ishiba's call for deeper ties among Asian nations and the establishment of a NATO-like grouping echoes sentiments that prioritise militarisation over diplomacy. This vision stands in stark contrast to the scepticism expressed by India's External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, who highlighted India's unique historical position and its reluctance to embrace the treaty alliances that such a framework would entail. Ishiba's proposition to station Japanese troops on the US soil and share control of nuclear weapons nighlights the extreme lengths to which some leaders are willing to go in the name of security, yet it has not

betray a far more sinister agen-The alliance has not only pro-

longed conflicts but has also turned them into battlegrounds for competing ideologies and geopolitical power plays. This relentless devastation not only lays waste to nations but also serves the insatiable appetites of the arms industry, which reaps substantial profits from the chaos of ongoing warfare. Evidence reveals that the US government perceives conflicts as lucrative ventures rather than humanitarian crises. Nations that align themselves with NATO risk becoming collateral damage in a power struggle that has little regard for their sovereignty or cultural identity. The allure of NATO's promises can be enticing, but history teaches us that aligning with powerful military alliances often leads to disastrous outcomes. Karl Marx posited that "history repeats itself, first as tragedy, second as farce." NATO's past interventions, from the Balkans to Afghanistan, and today's Ukraine showcase a pattern of destruction that is all too familiar.

The question remains: will Asia fall into this trap once received significant backing from again, sacrificing its autonomy

for the sake of Western agendas? Moreover, the political discourse surrounding NATO often ignores the implications of its militarisation on social stability and development. This is particularly relevant as Asian nations find themselves increasingly pressured to align with NATO's militaristic strategies. The focus on military expenditure detracts from addressing pressing social issues, economic development, and environmental sustainability. The growing arms race in Asia, driven by NATO's expansion, threatens to spark regional conflict with catastrophic consequences, echoing the historical precedent set before World War I.

The belief that increased military presence fosters stability is fundamentally flawed, often leading to insecurity and competition as nations rush to arm themselves against perceived threats. This environment heightens the risk of miscalculations and unintended escalations, with incalculable costs in human lives and economic stability. Additionally, engagement in militaristic alliances under NATO's banner risks placing Asian nations in a moral quagmire, contradicting the region's philosophies that prioritise peace, harmony, and cooperation, as espoused by Confucianism, Hinduism, Islamism, and Buddhism. The very qualities that were undermined by colonialism, after

years of suffering and the sacrifices of millions, must be protected and promoted, as aligning with NATO may ultimately undermine these cultural values in favour of a destructive path centred on military solutions.

Moreover, the consequences of such an alignment are not limited to immediate military conflicts. Long-term geopolitical ramifications could destabilise the entire region, further entrenching power struggles that lead to conflict. Embracing a militaristic alliance may offer a temporary illusion of security but ultimately leads to self-inflicted wounds-akin to harakiri. The path toward a more peaceful and stable future lies not in militarisation but in diplomacy, cooperation, and mutual respect. Instead of succumbing to the pressures of NATO's warmongering agenda, Asian countries should seek to forge their paths, grounded in their cultural philosophies and values that prioritise harmony and coexistence. The rhetoric of security and defence masks a more insidious agenda one driven by the militaryindustrial complex that thrives on conflict and arms sales. For Asian nations, the choice to align with NATO is a perilous one, iraugnt with the potential for self-destruction.

Bangladesh's interim Govt's crackdown on secularists

Shahriar Kabir's arrest, amid controversial charges linked to his long-standing fight for secularism reflects Bangladesh fundamentalists working behind the interim government



t is important to examine in some detail Shahriar Kabir's arrest in Dhaka on September 17, 2024, and the subsequent related developments, to understand the forces driving Bangladesh's interim government and direction in which it is taking the country. To start with, one must briefly look at who Kabir is. Author, journalist, film-maker and an internationally respected champion of human rights, secularism and democracy, he has also been at the forefront of the struggle to bring to justice those who had collaborated with the Pakistanis during Bangladesh's liberation war of 1971 and were their accomplices in the perpetration of crimes against humanity including mass murder and rape. He played an important role in the formation of the Ekattorer Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee (Committee for the Uprootment of the Killers and Collaborators of Seventy-One) under the leadership of Jahanara Imam whose husband and one of whose sons were savagely killed by the Pakistanis in 1971. Kabir, who subsequently became the organ- INTERNATIONALLY the-scenes effort. sations president, was, at the time of his arrest, president of its advisory committee. Second, one needs to look at the circumstances of his arrest, the charges against him and his accusers and their ties with the interim government. According to a report in The Dhaka Tribune, datelined September 17, 2024 and carried under the heading "Shahriar Kabir arrested in Dhaka," Mufti Harun Izhar Chowdhury, joint secretary of the Hefazat-e-Islam (Hefazat), filed, on August 20, 2024, a complaint with the International Crimes Tribunal (ICT) in Dhaka, against Sheikh Hasina and 23 others—one of them being Kabir--accusing them of crimes against humanity and mass murder in connection with a rally by Hefazat on May 5, 2013.

Further, according to a report in The Daily Star, datelined September 18, 2024, and carried under the heading "Shahriar Kabir placed on 7-day remand", Kabir, along with Mozammel Babu, was produced before the court with a 10-day remand plea by the police, in a case concerning the death of a domestic help, Liza Akter, during the quota

reform protests. The report cited a sub-inspector of police present in the court as saying that Dhaka's Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate, Md Sanaullah, passed the orders remanding him custody

for seven days.
A report datelined September 17, 2024, and published in *Prothom Alo* English under the heading, "Shahriar Kabir, Nurul Islam arrested," cited sources as saying that Kabir was an accused in several murder cases filed with Jatrabari and other police stations in Dhaka. According to information available with this writer, seven murder cases have so far been levelled against him besides the one the ICT. The levelling of murder charges against a person of Kabir's stature is not only laughable but suggests, as in a number of other cases, planned and coordinated behind-

As seen, the case before the 1C1 has been filed by Mufti Harun Izhar Chowdhury, joint secretary of the Hefazat-e-Islam (Hefazat) accusing Sheikh Hasina and 23 others, including Kabir, of crimes against humanity and mass murder in connection with a rally by Hefazat on May 5, 2013.

According to a report in The Dhaka Tribune (August 19, 2024) under the heading "Hefazat rally in Shapla Chattar: Odhikar publishes list of killed people," Odhikar, a human rights organisation, published on Monday (August 19) a list of people allegedly killed during the Awami League-led government's crackdown on the Hefazat's rally on May 5-6, 2013, at Shapla Chattar in Dhaka. The list, originally published in 2013, had led to action against the organisation by the Awami League government.

Citing persecution by the latter gov-

report, urged the interim government to immediately form an independent inquiry commission headed by a Supreme Court judge and conduct an impartial investigation into the extrajudicial killings committed on May 5 and 6 of 2013 and bring the perpetrators to justice.

The Dhaka Tribune report did not mention whether Odhikar had

named the perpetrators. As seen above, Hefazat's complaint was filed on August 20, 2024, the day after Odhikar's post. Three questions arise here. What was the number of people killed? Was the rally peace-

What was the context in which it was held and what were the Hefazat's demands? Against the Odhikar's figures, a BBC report, datelined May 6, 2024, stated that at least 27 persons had been killed and dozens hurt in the clashes. It also said that at least two of the dead were policemen. Also, the fact that the police, according to the report, "used stun grenades and rubber bullets" to disperse the protestors indicates an effort to keep the casualties to minimum.

The rally was extremely violent. The report cites one witness as saying that the demonstrators "were very aggressive, some people were throwing stones and the situation quickly become violent... the police had no option but to respond". The wit-ness further told the BBC, "Rioters vandalised markets and set fire to bookshops where the Holy Koran is sold. Thousands of Koran and religious books burned. They also attacked the ruling party's political office and national mosque."

The Hefazat's 13-point programme includes the enactment of an antiblasphemy law with provision for death penalty, exemplary punishment to all bloggers and others who "insult Islam," cancellation of

Bangladesh's policy for women's development, bans on the erection of sculptures in public places, the mixing of men and women in public, candlelight vigils, and "shameless behaviour and dresses," besides declaring Ahmadiyas as "non-Muslims." Nadia Sarmin, covering its rally for ETV, was mercilessly beaten for daring to be a woman "in a men only" event. Grievously injured, she was rescued by other iournalists.

It is not surprising if all this reminds one of the Taliban's agenda, A DW report (May 9, 2013) by Graham Lucas under the heading "Bangladesh Chaos," cited Maulana Habibur Rahman, one of the Hefajat leaders, as boasting of his role in the 1980s Afghan war and his support to the former al Qaeda leader Osama bin Laden.

The interim government has close and warm relations with the Herazat. It has lifted the ban on the organisation. The advisor for religious affairs, AFM Khalid Hossain, is the latter's Nayeb-e-Amir. Chief Advisor Mohammad Yunus had a long and cordial meeting on August 31, 2024, with Mamunul Haque, the organisations head. The Hefazat is holding rallies and processions all over the country.

It is in this context that one has to see Shahriar Kabir's arrest and continued detention, in the teeth of demands for his release by international human rights activists and organisations.

The idea is to send a clear message to people in Bangladesh: do not champion secular democracy and humanism and oppose Islamic fundamentalism. If we can send Shahriar Kabir to jail, we can also send you there.

Legal tussles over EWS quota violations undermine RTE Act in Delhi

The violation of the Economically Weaker Section quota under the Right to Education Act continues to plague India's education system

he consistent violation of the Economically Weaker Section (EWS) quota under the Right to Education (RTE) Act has become a troubling issue across India, particularly in major cities like Delhi. Despite clear legal mandates, several private schools continue to deny admissions to children who rightfully qualify under this provision, creating a barrier to equal educational opportunities for underprivileged communities.

Recent legal proceedings in the Delhi High Court have once again brought this issue to the forefront, highlighting the need for stricter enforcement of the law to safeguard the rights of EWS students.A case in point is Master Ayan



Saifi, a 4-year-old son of Shahid who had been allotted a seat through a computerised draw of lots conducted by Delhi's Directorate of Education (DoE) for the academic year 2024-25. But, a leading private Senior Secondary School in Rohini denied the admission and that ensued a legal tussle. Shahid approached to Delhi ensures free and compulso-

High Court with his plight ry education for all children and sought justice. It is misconception that lawyers are reluctant to take up such cases especially for people coming from lower strata of society. Credit goes to a young Delhi lawyer Aman Sharma who took up the case for the kid and secured provisional admission for Ayan Saifi to the school.

The Delhi High Court, under the guidance of Justice Swarana Kanta Sharma, acknowledged the violation of the RTE Act and in an interim order granted provisional admission to the child, emphasising the school's legal obligation to comply with the EWS quota. The RTE Act 2009 is a landmark legislation that aged 6 to 14. One of its key provisions mandates that 25 per cent of seats in private unaided schools be reserved for children from EWS and disadvantaged groups (DG). This quota is intended to promote inclusive education and bridge the gap between socio-economic disparities. However, despite the importance of this provision, its implementation has been met with resistance from many private schools, not only in Delhi but schools across the country.

The refusal of admission highlights the ongoing challenge in enforcing this law. It violates a child's fundamental right to education under Article 21-A of the Constitution. "Denying chil-



weaker sections the education they are entitled to, despite a confirmed allotment, not only goes against the spirit of the Right to Education Act but also creates unnecessary hurdles for families already facing socioeconomic challenges," argues

advocate Sharma.

tunately, it has become pervasive across private educational institutions. Ayan's case is not an isolated incident. Private schools in Delhi have repeatedly been found guilty of disregarding the EWS quota, prompting legal battles that seek to restore the rightful educa-

underprivileged children. In March 2024, the Delhi High Court revised the income threshold for EWS admissions, reinforced eligibility criteria and offered clearer guidance. However, schools have continued to evade their responsibilities. A similar ruling in 2022 in the case of Rameshwar Jha v. Principal Richmond Global School set a precedent for punitive action against schools that refuse EWS

The Delhi High Court had then warned that schools could face severe consequences under the Delhi School Education Act, 1973, for non-compliance with the RTE Act. Yet, schools still engage in tactics that delay A pattern of non-compliance tional opportunities for or deny admission to EWS

students, forcing families to take the matter to court. The larger issue at hand is the erosion of trust in educational institutions and the judiciary's role in upholding constitutional rights. Advocate Sharma urges the Directorate of Education (DoE) and the judiciary to take stringent actions against schools that defy the RTE Act, calling for penalties and stricter enforcement measures. It becomes imperative for

policymakers, educators, and civil society to collaborate in upholding the principles of the RTE Act and to work towards a more inclusive education system. (Author is a senior journal-

Malaysia's Anwar in B'desh for talks | EU to impose duties

Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim arrived in Bangladesh's capital on Friday to meet with interim leader Muhammad Yunus, who took over in August after the former prime minister fled during a

mass uprising.
Anwar's hourslong visit will focus on trade and investment, migrant workers and the Rohingya refugee crisis, offi-cials and media reports said. Yunus received Anwar in Dhaka's Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport where he was welcomed with gun salutes and a red carpet reception. It is the first visit by a foreign leader to Bangladesh since

Kim threatens to destroy South Korea if provoked

AP SEOUL

North Korean leader Kim Jong Un threatened to use nuclear weapons and destroy South Korea permanently if provoked, state media reported on Friday, after the South's leader warned that Kim's regime would collapse if he attempted to use nuclear arms. The exchange of such rhetoric between the rival Koreas is nothing new, but the latest comments come during heightened animosities over the North's recent disclosure of a nuclear facility and its continuation of missile tests. Next week, observers say North Korea's rubber-stamp parliament is expected to constitutionally declare a hostile "two-state" system on the Korean Peninsula to formally reject reconciliation with South Korea and codify new national borders.

During a visit to a special operation forces unit on Wednesday, Kim said his military "would use without hesitation all the offensive forces it possesses, including nuclear weapons", if South Korea attempts to use armed forces encroaching upon the sover-eignty of North Korea, according to the North's official Korean Central News Agency. "If such a situation comes, the

permanent existence of Seoul and the Republic of Korea would be impossible," Kim said, using South Korea's official name. Kim's statement was a response to South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol's speech at his country's Armed Forces Day on Tuesday. Unveiling South Korea's most powerful Hyunmoo-5 ballistic missile and other conventional weapons that could target North

Korea, Yoon said the day that North Korea tries to use nuclear weapons would be the end of the Kim government because Kim would face "the resolute and overwhelming response" of the South Korean-US alliance.



Dockworkers' pause strike until Jan 15

Detroit (AP): Some 45,000 dockworkers at East and Gulf coast ports are returning to work after their union reached a deal to suspend a strike that could have caused shortages and higher prices if it had dragged on.

The International Longshoremen's Association is suspending its three-day strike until Jan 15 to provide time to negotiate a new contract. The union and the US Maritime Alliance, which represents ports and shipping companies, said in a joint statement that they have reached a tentative agreement on wages.

A person briefed on the agreement said the ports sweetened their wage offer from about 50% over six years to 62%. The person didn't want to be identified because the agreement is tentative. Any wage increase would have to be approved by union members as part of the ratification of a final contract.

Talks now turn to the automation of ports, which the unions says will lead to fewer jobs, and other sticking points.

Industry analysts have said that for every day of a port strike it takes four to six days to recover. But they said a short strike of a few days probably wouldn't gum up the sup-

ply chain too badly.
The settlement pushes the strike and any potential shortages past the November presidential election, eliminating a potential liability for Vice President Kamala Harris, the Democratic nominee. It's also a big plus for the Biden-Harris administration, which has billed itself as the most union-friendly in American history. Shortages could have driven up prices and reignited inflation.

The union went on strike early Tuesday after its contract expired in a dispute over pay and the automation of tasks at 36 ports stretching from Maine to Texas. The strike came at the peak of the holiday season at the ports, which handle about half the cargo from ships coming into and out of the United States.

Most retailers had stocked up or shipped items early in anticipation of the strike. "With the grace of God, and the goodwill of neighbours, it's gonna hold," President Joe Biden told reporters Thursday night after the agreement. In a statement later, Biden applauded both sides "for acting patriotically to reopen our ports and ensure the availability of critical supplies for Hurricane Helene recovery and rebuilding".

Biden said that collective bargaining is "critical to building a stronger economy from the middle out and the bottom up".

The union's membership won't need to vote on the temporary suspension of the strike Until Ian 15 the workers will be covered under the old contract, which expired on

The union had been demanding a 77% raise over six years, plus a complete ban on the use of automation at the ports, which members see as a threat to their iobs. Both sides also have been apart on the issues of pension contributions and the distribution of royalties paid on containers that are moved by workers.

to sit down and get exactly the language they can both live with." Kohler said the surprise end to the strike may catch railroads with cars, engines and crews out of position. But railroads are likely to work quickly to fix that. Just before the strike had begun, the Maritime Alliance said both sides had moved off their original wage offers, a tentative sign of progress. Thursday's deal came after Biden administration officials met with foreign-owned shipping companies before dawn on Zoom, according to a person briefed on the day's events who asked not to be identified because the talks were private. The White House wanted to increase pressure to settle, emphasizing the responsibility to reopen the ports to help with recovery from Hurricane Helene, the person said. Acting Labour Secretary Julie Su told them she could get the union to the bargaining table to extend the contract if the carriers made a higher wage offer. Chief of Staff Jeff Zients told the carriers they had to make an offer by the end of the day so a manmade strike wouldn't worsen a natural disaster, the person said. By midday the Maritime Alliance members agreed to a large increase, bringing about the agree-

Melania says she supports abortion rights, putting her at odds with GOP

In a video posted to her X account on Thursday morning, the former first lady defended women's "individual freedoms" to do what they want with defended their bodies — a position at odds with much of the Republican Party and her own husband, who has struggled to find a consistent message on abortion while wedged between anti-abortion supporters within his base and the majority of Americans who support abortion rights.

"Individual freedom is a fundamental principle that I safeguard," Melania Trump said in the video. "Without a doubt, there is no room for compromise when it comes to this essential right that all women possess from birth:

individual freedom. What does 'my body, my choice' really mean? The video appears to confirm excerpt of her self-titled memoir reported by

The Guardian on Wednesday.

Melania Trump has rarely publicly expressed her personal political views and has been largely absent from the campaign trail. But in her memoir, set to be released publicly next Tuesday, she argues that the decision to end a pregnancy should be left to a woman and her doctor, "free from any intervention of pressure from the government", according to the published excerpts.

Why should anyone other than the woman herself have the power to determine what she does with her own body?" she wrote, according to The Guardian. "A woman's fundamental right of individual liberty, to her own life, grants her the authority to terminate her pregnancy if she wishes." Melania Trump writes that she has "carried this belief with me throughout my entire adult life".




