## Disengagement complete at LAC

Troop disengagement process at two friction points in Depsang Valley and Demchok at the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in eastern Ladakh is complete. Patrolling by India and China will commence soon as agreed upon between the two countries. The two sides will exchange sweets on Thursday on the occasion of Diwali. Giving this information here on Wednesday, sources said the local commanders of the level of Brigadier from both the sides will continue their talks. The two officials will decide on patrolling modalities in the two areas, they said. India on October 21 announced that the two countries have reached an agreement on patrolling. Sources said that verification post-disengagement is in progress and patrolling modalities are to be decided

between ground commanders. On October 25, sources here said the disengagement process was likely to get completed by October 28-29. The agreement framework was signed first at the diplomatic level and then military-level talks took place, they had said, adding the nitty-gritty of the agreement was worked on during the Corps Commander-level talks which was signed last week. Adhering to agreements between the two sides, Indian troops then began to pull back equipment to rear locations in these areas. The process follows the agreement firmed up between the two countries on patrolling and disengagement of troops along the LAC in eastern Ladakh, a major breakthrough to end the over four-year standoff.

Ties between the two Asian countries had nosedived following a fierce clash in the Galwan Valley in June 2020 that marked the most serious military conflict between the two sides in decades. Sources earlier said the areas and patrolling status were expected to be moved back to pre-April 2020 level. Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri on October 21 had said in New Delhi the agreement was finalised following negotiations over the past several weeks and that it would lead to a resolution of the issues that arose in 2020. On October 23, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping endorsed the agreement on patrolling and disengagement along the LAC in eastern Ladakh during their bilateral meeting on the sidelines of the BRICS Summit in Kazan in Russia.

## Delhi's 'Anywhere Registration Policy' will end touts' careers!

The Delhi government has approved a policy titled 'Anywhere Registration Policy', with this the sale and purchase of properties in the National Capital can be registered at any sub-registrar's office. The move will help the thousands who have to visit Sub-Registrar Offices, at different locations, and is also aimed at curbing corruption and harassment. Under the policy, buyers can now take an online appointment at any of the 22 Sub-Registrar Offices, across the National Capital for their property registration. They do not have to physically visit any sub registrar office to register the sale/purchase deed of their properties. The policy will save people from long queues for property registration, thus promoting transparency to help curb corruption. Traditionally, to buy or sell property in Delhi, people need to visit a designated Sub-Registrar Office. Whether it's a property transaction or registering the property through other means, one has to go to the Sub-Registrar Office. However, this process often led to challenges, including long waiting lines and delays in booking appointments at certain offices, while others remained underutilised. All Sub-Registrars in Delhi will now function as joint sub-registrars and their jurisdiction will cover the entirety of Delhi. The new registration software, National Generic Document Registration System, now allows people to upload the necessary documents required for the registration of sale deeds, power of attorney and wills from the comfort of their homes, make payment and take appointments at the sub-registrar office to complete the remaining formalities. "So, anyone residing in Delhi can make an online appointment for property registration at any of the 22



Sub-Registrar Offices in Delhi," said a sub registrar official. According to an estimate, nearly 2,000 documents of 28 different categories are registered at 22 Sub-Registrar offices on a given working day. Some offices get 50 applications and there are a few which receive up to 150 documents in a day. In 2022, 1.25 lakh documents were registered at the offices of the sub registrar. While Janakpuri, Kashmere Gate, Model Town and Pitampura are among the most-crowded offices, Sarojini Nagar, Preet Vihar and Defence Colony witness the least number of applicants. The Delhi government recently appointed joint sub-registrars at six of its most crowded offices to ease the rush. Explaining this, Delhi Chief Minister Atishi said that the 'Anywhere Registration' policy is being introduced to resolve these problems. "Under this policy, anyone seeking property registration can go to any sub-registrar office in Delhi. Residents will no longer be limited to just one designated office for property registration," Atishi added. The government has received a number of complaints and suggestions to improve the functioning of the sub registrar office which is one of the major departments to contribute to the state's financial health.



## Why did Punjab cops give 'studio' to Lawrence?

In a scathing remark, the Punjab and Haryana High Court said that police officers in Punjab provided a studio-like facility to gangster Lawrence Bishnoi to facilitate his interview with a news channel. A Bench of Justices Anupinder Singh Grewal and Lapita Banerji made the remark while hearing a suo motu matter related to inmates' use of mobile phones within jail premises. The High Court ordered further probe, rejecting the report of the Special Investigation Team (SIT) and directed the Director General of Police (DGP) to file an affidavit in this regard. "The police officers allowed the criminal to use electronic devices and provided a studio like facility to conduct the interview which tends to glorify crime with the potential to facilitate other crimes including extortion by the criminal and his associates. Involvement of the police officers may suggest receipt of illegal gratification from the criminal or his associates and constitute offences under Prevention of Corruption Act. Therefore, the case requires further investigation," the Court said in an order dated October 28. The Bench made the remarks while questioning the SIT's decision to file a cancellation report in a case related to the interview given by Bishnoi.

## Rash and drunk drivers may lose their licences soon

In a bid to tackle problems regarding road safety and discourage habitual offenders, the Delhi Traffic Police has written to the Secretary of the Delhi Transport Department to cancel the driving licences of owners of vehicles, which have had three violations relating to dangerous driving and drink and driving or more than five relating to normal challans. This comes in the light of a recently released Delhi road crash report of 2023, which revealed that a pedestrian or



a motorist travelling on the roads of the National Capital are among the most prone to road fatalities as data reveals

that they constitute 43 and 38 per cent of such casualties respectively. "In 2023, 622 pedestrians died in 618 fatal crashes caused by all types of vehicles as compared to 629 pedestrian deaths in 2022. The maximum pedestrian casualties were caused due to car, jeep and taxis which have increased to 76 this year compared to 69 in 2022," the report read. It also revealed that two-wheeler riders have emerged as second most fatal crash-prone victims. "The above figure shows 538 fatal crashes of two-wheelers in 2023 as compared to 539 in

2022. These two-wheelers were the worst hit by Heavy Vehicles (HTVs) (89) followed by Car/Jeep/Taxis (66) in 2023," it stated. According to the report, prepared by the traffic police and released by Delhi Police Commissioner Sanjay Arora, the number of deaths in road crashes has however decreased from 1,264 in 2022 to 1257 in 2023 despite the increase in the number of vehicle registrations. Moreover, the number of drivers booked under traffic violation has increased from 4,38,052 in 2022 to 6,39,097 in the Year 2023.

## SIT to probe tusker deaths

Four wild elephants were found dead in the BTR on Tuesday while four others, part of the same herd of 13 tuskers, were found ill during routine patrolling, officials earlier said. ## Bomb Threat Assessment Committee set up

Amid the multiple hoax bomb threat messages to airlines, the Ministry of Civil Aviation, along with security agencies, has come up with new protocols and guidelines to evaluate bomb threats on Indian airlines, especially those emerging via pseudonymous social media accounts. The guidelines are structured to more effectively distinguish between credible threats and hoaxes. As per the new protocols, the Bomb Threat Assessment Committee (BTAC) will establish the identity of the person or organisation making the threat, check their credentials to see if they belong to a terrorist or proscribed outfit, and ascertain the motive and specific socio-economic and political situation within the country or around the globe that could be linked to the threat.



## When brake lights lit up peak traffic chaos

Serpentine snarls were witnessed across the National Capital on Diwali eve

The festival of lights is here, and for thousands of commuters it also means the brake lights of the scores of vehicles in front of them. It was difficult to enumerate the number and location of these serpentine traffic snarls that were witnessed across the National Capital on the eve of Diwali. The roads were jammed, the pavements had been taken over as shops set up display counters outside, and inside buyers stood six rows deep waiting for their turns. Many others made a beeline for malls, to grab just the perfect gifts to make the festival of lights a memorable affair for their loved ones, creating significant delays and inconvenience to commuters. Even as traffic police made arrangements to minimise inconvenience to commuters, social media was rife with tales of commuting woes. Videos on social media showed long lines of vehicles stuck in traffic in Laxmi Nagar, Chirag Dilli, Kashmiri Gate, Kamla Nagar, Lajpat Nagar, Sarojini Market, Karol Bagh, Sarai Kale Khan and several other parts of Delhi.



Expressing frustration over the significant jams against the Delhi Traffic Police, a commuter said, "Please deploy your teams on the roads. There is not a single traffic police available on roads in Delhi despite heavy festive rush. From Sheikh Sarai flyover to Moolchand flyover, traffic is choked." Another commuter travelling around the Laxmi Nagar area said, "Delhi is experiencing significant traffic congestion due to the festive season, causing delays for commuters. A big reason has also been the mismanagement of traffic despite authorities knowing well in advance that such a situation will arise." The other massive congestion reported at Dhaura Kuan, Khajuri Khas, Model Town, Sadar Bazar, Rohtak Road, Kishan Ganj, Chandni Chowk, Connaught Place, Mangolpuri, Rajouri Garden and Najafgarh. "Nangloi-Najafgarh road is seeing very heavy traffic and no traffic police are available here. I am stuck for the last hour. Should we enjoy Diwali by sitting in our cars?" Commuters took to X saying the traffic was heavy at several places including Badarpur flyover, CV Raman Marg, Punjabi Bagh,

Mehrauli Badarpur Road, Taimur Nagar-Maharani Bagh Road, Ashram and Yamuna Vihar. This situation remains despite the Delhi Police saying that they have made elaborate arrangements for smooth flow of traffic. A senior traffic police officer said they have intensified checking on the road. "We have deployed personnel on bikes to check the encroachment on busy roads which could lead to traffic congestion in the area. People who are coming to the markets are also informed that they should park their vehicles at designated places," it said. "The personnel have loud speakers on their bikes to make the flow of traffic smooth. Non-destined vehicles are not being allowed to enter the national capital. Continuous anti-encroachment drives are also being carried out in the crowded places," the officer said. In view of the festive season, the Delhi Metro also stated that it will introduce additional 60 trips on Tuesday and Wednesday in a bid to enhance commuter convenience and ease congestion. There are around 4,000 daily Metro trips.

# AAP's Protest against BJP Over Paddy Lifting Delays; 6 Ministers Detained

Am Aadmi Party (AAP) on Wednesday launched a high-profile protest in Chandigarh against the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) condemning the Central Government's handling of paddy procurement and delayed grain lifting in Punjab's markets. The demonstration saw a massive turnout, with key AAP Ministers and hundreds of party supporters confronting the Chandigarh police action, demanding urgent action for Punjab's farmers.

The protest, led by prominent AAP leaders and Cabinet Ministers like Harjot Singh Bains, Harbhajan Singh ETO, Tarun Preet Singh Sondh, Lal Chand Kataruchakk, and others, attempted to gherao the BJP office in Chandigarh. However, the demonstrators were halted just 150 meters from their target, the Punjab BJP Office in Sector 38, near Batra Cinema, where police officers, after repeated warnings, deployed water cannons to disperse the crowd. The police also detained numerous party workers and six Ministers as tensions escalated.

During the scuffle, Minister Harjot Bains's turban was knocked off, a moment that stoked outrage among AAP supporters. Bains later addressed the crowd, voicing his sorrow over the incident, stating, "They could have attacked me, and it would have been less painful. But attacking my turban is a personal affront. We, the children of Guru Gobind Singh Ji, believe in both standing up to oppression and refusing to tolerate it."

The protest, AAP leaders argued, was a response to what they allege is the BJP Government's retaliatory approach toward Punjab's farmers, especially following the farmers' movement against the controversial agricultural laws. Bains condemned the Central Government's inaction, emphasizing the ongoing Diwali season, during which Punjab's farmers are struggling in overcrowded mandis. He stated, "It is deeply painful to see our farmers stranded in markets while the rest of the country celebrates Diwali."

Minister Harbhajan Singh ETO echoed these sentiments, accusing the BJP of blocking the

necessary removal of old stocks from godowns, leaving markets overflowing and placing undue pressure on farmers and local traders. He said that the Punjab Government has persistently urged the Food Corporation of India (FCI) to expedite the grain lifting, sending 15 official letters and even dispatching Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann to meet central ministers. However, no concrete action has yet been seen from New Delhi, he said.

Senior AAP leaders, addressing the demonstration, questioned the motives behind the BJP's actions. Minister Laljit Singh Bhullar remarked, "This treatment of Punjab is not new; it reminds us of the injustices under Indira Gandhi. Today, Narendra Modi's Government appears to be following a similar path." Bhullar further criticized the BJP for attempting to delay the financial and operational lifelines needed by Punjab's farmers, insinuating a political agenda behind the delay in crop lifting.

As the protest continued, Minister Tarun Preet Singh Sondh highlighted the heavy-

# Punjab Police's Crackdown on Drug Smugglers: Rs 208-cr Property Seized, Over 10,500 Arrests in 2024

Punjab Police's efforts in the fight against drugs have resulted in the arrest of 10,524 drug smugglers and the attachment of Rs 208 crore worth of assets linked to narcotics trafficking since January 2024. The state Director General of Police (DGP) Gaurav Yadav on Friday reported these achievements, emphasizing the multi-layered approach being employed to dismantle the drug trade across urban and rural Punjab.

DGP Yadav highlighted Punjab Police's intensified operations, which include sweeping cordon-and-search drives in affected regions, vigil

ilant checkpoints on high-risk routes, and a broad clampdown on drug distribution networks within towns and villages. He confirmed that 153 major smugglers, or "big fish", were among those apprehended, along with substantial seizures of contraband. This year alone, authorities have confiscated 790 kilograms of heroin, 860 kilograms of opium, and 367 quintals of poppy husk. Additionally, 93 kilograms of charas, 724 kilograms of ganja, 19 kilograms of ICE, and over 2.9 crore pharma opioid tablets and injections were recovered from various traffickers and networks.

Aiming to curb drug-related financial gains, Punjab Police has also frozen assets totaling Rs 208 crore, associated with 362 high-profile traffickers. The police force has initiated the seizure of assets worth an additional Rs 289 crore, with cases pending approval. Seized assets play a crucial role in debilitating drug lords' financial strength, effectively undercutting their influence.

One of the most significant recent arrests involves Avtar Singh, alias Tari, a notorious trafficker from Shahur Kalan village in Gurdaspur district. Singh was detained under the Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (PIT-NDPS) Act and has been sentenced to two years in Central Jail, Bathinda. This detention represents the first instance

### PUNJAB GANGSTER SHOT DEAD IN EXCHANGE OF FIRE WITH POLICE IN AMRITSAR DISTRICT

**Amritsar:** A gangster was shot dead on Wednesday while trying to escape police custody when he and a few other accused in a murder case were taken to a place here to make some recoveries, officials said. Gangsters Gursharan and Paras, and another person were taken to a place in this district to make some recoveries when the two gangsters picked up guns they had previously hidden in the bushes and fired at the Amritsar Rural police personnel in their attempt to flee, police said. The police personnel fired in self-defence, killing Gursharan while Paras managed to jump into a river and escape and a hunt is on to nab him, a police official said. In a statement, Deputy Inspector General of Police Satinder Singh said the gangsters were brought to the spot where they had concealed the weapons according to their disclosure statement to police. However, the two gangsters suddenly pushed the police officials and ran. They fired upon the police party after getting possession of their weapons that they hid behind the bushes, he said. The DIG said the accused were held in various criminal cases, including that of murder.

### 45.76 LAKH METRIC TONNES OF PADDY PROCURED IN HRY

**Chandigarh:** Haryana Government on Wednesday said that so far 47.44 lakh metric tonnes of paddy has arrived in the mandis, out of which 45,76,822 metric tonnes of paddy has been procured. Besides this, so far 4,42,759 metric tonnes of millet (bajra) has arrived in various mandis, out of which 4,33,021 metric tonnes has been procured at MSP. An amount of more than Rs 9810 crore has been sent directly to the bank accounts of paddy and millet growing farmers. This includes Rs 8880 crore for paddy procurement and Rs 930 crore for millet procurement.

### HRY STF NABS THREE CRIMINALS FOR KILLING BOUNCER IN GURUGRAM

**Gurugram:** The Special Task Force (STF) of the Haryana Police on Wednesday arrested three criminals, having a bounty of Rs 1.20 lakh, for their alleged involvement in killing a 23-year-old bouncer. According to police, the victim, Anuj, a resident of Kadarpur village, was gunned down by the accused at Ullawas Chowk when he was returning home. CCTV footage captured the chilling attack, showing the perpetrators firing on the victim on June 28. The armed assailants wearing t-shirts with an online food delivery service logo fired multiple shots at Anuj. The accused have been identified as Vikram alias Vicky alias Chaku (30), Dalbir alias Dinesh (20) and Narender Bhati (27) all residents of Sohna. The team have also recovered three country-made pistols, .32 bores and four live cartridges from their possession. A case under various sections has been registered at the Sector 65 police station. The accused kept changing their locations to avoid arrest.

### PUNJAB LAUNCHES HELPLINE NUMBERS TO REPORT ILLEGAL TAGGING OF PRODUCTS WITH DAP, OTHER FERTILIZERS

**Chandigarh:** Punjab Government on Wednesday launched helpline numbers for the state farmers to report any pesticide dealers who tag other products with di-ammonium phosphate (DAP) or other fertilizers. Farmers can also report issues such as excessive pricing, illegal hoarding, or black marketing of DAP fertilizer. Sharing the details, Punjab Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Minister Gurmeet Singh Khudian informed that farmers can call the helpline number 1100 or send a WhatsApp message to the contact number — 98555-01076 — to lodge complaints against pesticide dealers engaged in corrupt practices.

# Punjab announces 4 pc hike in DA to govt employees and pensioners

In a Diwali bonanza to the families of more than 6.50 employees and pensioners of the State Government, Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Wednesday announced a hike of four percent in their dearness allowance (DA).

The Chief Minister gave approval to give four percent DA to the employees and pensioners, with effect from November 1, 2024, thereby enhancing it to 42 percent from 38 percent, said a spokesperson of the Chief Minister's Office.

Mann said that the decision will benefit more than 6.50 lakh employees, pensioners and their families. He said that the employees were a critical

segment of the state administration and safeguarding their interests was the government's top priority. Mann said that no stone is being left unturned for this noble cause and every effort is being made to ensure welfare of employees.

# Punjab reaps Rs 2060-cr in e-auction of real estate

Punjab's Housing and Urban Development Department has set a new benchmark in real estate revenue generation, securing Rs 2060 crore through a recent e-auction of properties. The state's Housing and Urban Development Minister Hardeep Singh Mundian on Wednesday credited the success to the Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann's transparent and investment-friendly policies, emphasizing that these initiatives are fostering a resurgence in public trust and investment in Punjab's real estate.

The properties auctioned spanned key commercial and residential sites, including group housing, petrol pumps, hotels, SCOs, booths, and industrial and residential plots under various development authorities. Since August, Punjab has raised a cumulative Rs 5,000 crore from e-auctions — a figure that the Minister noted underscores the government's success in creating a conducive environment for investment and urban development.

The e-auction, which commenced on October 18 and concluded on Tuesday, garnered a robust response, drawing significant bids across Mohali, Amritsar, Patiala, Ludhiana, Bathinda, and Sangrur. Among the highlights, the petrol pump site at Mohali's IT City in Sector 83-A fetched Rs 31.16 crore, while the group housing site in Sector-78 drew a whopping Rs 163.87 crore. The hotel site in the same sector was auctioned at Rs 33.47 crore, demonstrating the high demand in Mohali's thriving real estate market.

Breaking down the auction proceeds, the Greater Mohali Area Development Authority (GMADA) led the revenue collection with Rs 1894 crore. Other contributions included Rs 61.75 crore from GLADA, Rs 16.08 crore from BDA, Rs 59.62 crore from PDA, Rs 12.25 crore from JDA, and Rs 16.30 crore from ADA.



# India to play international FIFA friendly against Malaysia on Nov 18 in Hyderabad

PTI ■ NEW DELHI  
Winless in three matches after chief coach Manolo Marquez took charge as head coach, the Indian men's football team will play Malaysia in an international friendly in Hyderabad on November 18, national federation (AIFF) said on Wednesday. The All India Football Federation (AIFF) had last month announced that the match will be played on November 19 but did specify the venue. On Wednesday, it advanced the match by a day and also announced the venue. "The FIFA Friendly match between India and Malaysia will be played on November 18, 2024, at Gachibowli Stadium in Hyderabad, Telangana," the AIFF said. November 11-19 is the last FIFA international match window of this year. In international matches scheduled during a FIFA window, clubs are mandated to release players for national duty. The Gachibowli Stadium in Hyderabad had also hosted the three-team Intercontinental Cup tournament last month. India had played out a goal-less draw with Mauritius on September 3 before losing 0-3 to Syria, the eventual champions, on September 9 in that tournament. India then travelled to Vietnam to play an international friendly against the hosts on October 12. The match ended 1-1. The November 18 match will be Marquez's fourth match in charge of the national team and he would be looking for a win against a lower-ranked team, though it will not be an easy one. Malaysia are ranked 133rd in the FIFA chart while India are at 125th. The last time the two teams met was in October 2023 in the Merdeka Cup semifinal. India had lost 2-4.

# Ronaldo misses late penalty as Al-Nassr eliminated from Saudi cup

Cristiano Ronaldo missed a stoppage-time penalty and Al-Nassr was eliminated from the King's Cup in a 1-0 loss to Al-Taawoun. The five-time Ballon D'Or winner has yet to win a major trophy since signing for the club almost two years ago. Playing at the round-of-16 stage of Saudi Arabia's premier knockout competition, Al-Taawoun took the lead on Waleed Al-Ahmad's header with 20 minutes remaining. Al-Ahmad was then whistled for a foul in the area in the 95th minute. Ronaldo had converted all 18 of his previous penalties for Al-Nassr but this time shot over the bar to the shock of the home crowd of 14,519. The defeat is the first for Stefano Pioli since the Italian succeeded Luis Castro as head coach in September. Ronaldo and Al-Nassr still have two chances at silverware this season but are already six points



behind leader Al-Hilal after eight games of the Saudi Pro League and have seven points from three games in the group stage of the Asian Champions League. "Technically we performed well but we couldn't win the game," Pioli said. "We feel disappointed to be out of the cup. But we still have two trophies to go for and we will give our best in them."

# Brazil's Atletico Mineiro draws at Argentina's River Plate and reaches Copa Libertadores final

Brazil's Atletico Mineiro drew 0-0 at Argentina's River Plate and reached the final of the Copa Libertadores for the second time. The team of veteran striker Hulk had beaten its rivals 3-0 in the first leg of the semifinal. The festive atmosphere at the full Monumental de Nunez Stadium with more than 80,000 fans did not affect the Brazilian side, which had some of the clearest chances to score. Atletico's rival in the decider will be decided on Wednesday, and it is very likely to be fellow Brazilian side Botafogo. The Rio de Janeiro-based team will play at Uruguay's Penarol after

winning the first leg 5-0. Brazilian teams have won the tournament for the past five years. The final will be played on Nov. 30 at the same Monumental de Nunez Stadium in Buenos Aires. Atletico's win also affected the race to be the last South American qualifier for the 2025 Club World Cup, as it eliminated Olimpia of Paraguay from contention. Olimpia would have advanced to the 32-team tournament in the United States had River Plate won this Copa Libertadores edition. River Plate already qualified based on its consistent results in the continental competition across four seasons. FIFA will make the draw for the June 15-July 13 tournament on a date in early December it has not yet confirmed.



# Bopanna-Ebden advance to quarterfinals of Paris masters

Veteran Indian tennis player Rohan Bopanna and his Australian partner Matthew Ebden advanced to the quarterfinals of the men's doubles event of the Paris Masters here. The Indo Australian pair eked out a 6-4 7-6 win over the Brazilian-German combine of Marcelo Melo and Alexander Zverev in one hour 16 minutes at the ATP 1000 event on Tuesday. Bopanna and Ebden won 91 percent of their first serve and hit four aces in the course of the match. The third seed Indo-Australian duo made a crucial break in the first game to take the opening set. The reigning Australian Open champions then had the opportunity to break their opponents in the fifth game of the second set but Melo and Zverev managed to hold with the match heading to a tie-breaker. Earlier this week, Bopanna and Ebden had clinched a spot in the prestigious season-ending ATP Finals.

# Alcaraz and Tsitsipas reach 3rd round at Paris Masters but Rublev loses temper and match

Carlos Alcaraz overcame some crusty moments on his serve to beat Nicolas Jarry 7-5, 6-1 and reach the third round of the Paris Masters. The second-seeded Spaniard was troubled by Jarry's strong forehand at times. The Chilean broke his serve in the ninth game and held for 5-5. But Jarry double-faulted in his next service game to lose the first set. "It was a little bit complicated, really happy to get through the first set," Alcaraz said. "I have to get used to the speed of the court. It's really fast for me." Alcaraz saved a break point in the third game of the second set with an ace and broke for a 4-1 lead with a crisp forehand winner.

Serving for the match, Alcaraz saved another break point with an ace to make it deuce and won the next two points, clinching victory when the erratic Jarry's two-handed backhand clipped the net and went out. "He's a really dangerous player on these courts," the 21-year-old Alcaraz said. "I'm super happy to win here." The four-time Grand Slam champion is looking for his fifth title of the year and next plays either 15th-seeded Ugo Humbert or American qualifier Marcos Giron. "It's been a great year so far," said Alcaraz, who won major titles at the French Open and Wimbledon. Tenth-seeded Stefanos Tsitsipas of Greece beat Alejandro Tabilo 6-3, 6-4 to stay in contention to reach the



season-ending ATP Finals for the top eight players. It is being held in Turin, Italy, next month. Seventh-seeded Casper Ruud of

Norway, a three-time Grand Slam runner-up, started well before losing 7-6 (3), 3-6, 6-4 to unseeded Australian Jordan Thompson. In an earlier second-round match, sixth-seeded Andrey Rublev lost two tiebreakers and his temper as his hopes of qualifying for the Finals took a hit. Rublev lost 7-6 (6), 7-6 (5) to Francisco Cerundolo and was so frustrated at one point in the second set that he smashed his racket against his left knee at least seven times in succession and made it bleed. The Russian player held the eighth and final qualifying place in the race for the Finals and could be overtaken by rivals. U.S. Open runner-up Taylor Fritz became the fifth player to qualify

for the Finals. The big-serving American reached the season-ending tournament for the second time in three years. The indoor event takes place from Nov. 10-17. Fritz joined U.S. Open champion Jannik Sinner, Alcaraz, Alexander Zverev and Daniil Medvedev in the field. Sinner pulled out of the Paris Masters on Monday, citing a virus. The Italian player is guaranteed to finish the year as No. 1. He was the second high-profile player to pull out following seven-time champion Novak Djokovic. In remaining first-round play, Holger Rune - who beat Djokovic in the 2022 final - advanced with a 6-4, 6-4 victory over Matteo Arnaldi. No. 9 seed Alex de Minaur beat Mariano Navone 7-5, 6-1 to stay in

outside contention for Turin, while No. 12 Hubert Hurkacz lost 6-1, 6-3 to Alex Michelsen. U.S. Open semifinalist Jack Draper won 7-5, 6-2 against Jiri Lehecka; American Ben Shelton beat Corentin Moutet 6-3, 6-7 (8), 6-3, and Frenchman Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard hit 28 aces in defeating U.S. Open semifinalist Frances Tiafoe 6-7 (5), 7-6 (4), 6-3. Fresh from his title in Basel, Mpetshi Perricard next plays Karen Khachanov and will look to add to his 512 aces. Frenchman Arthur Fils also progressed by edging Croatian Marin Cilic 7-6 (5), 6-4 and next faces Jan-Lennard Struff. But veteran Richard Gasquet, who plans to retire after next year's French Open, lost 6-3, 6-4 to Zizou Bergs.

# Punjab FC, Chennaiyin FC clash following a string of good run

In-form sides Punjab FC and Chennaiyin FC will square off in the Indian Super League here on Thursday as the battle for playoffs spots heats up. Punjab FC are placed fourth in the table after as many matches while Chennaiyin FC are positioned sixth with two victories and draws each in their five games thus far. They are arguably two definite contenders for the top-six and hence this fixture carries significance for both teams, giving them an opportunity to move up the standings and develop pressure on the higher-ranked opponents. So far, across both seasons, Punjab FC have scored 34 goals in the ISL - boiling down to 1.30 strikes per game. Impressively though, only once have they gone back-to-back



matches without finding the back of the net in the competition, which was a sequence of two clashes in December last year. Given that they didn't score in the previous game, Punjab FC run the risk of equalling that record, something that they would want to avoid especially with the coming game taking place at their home turf. In their last home match, Punjab FC held their own

to achieve positive outcomes. For instance, they have won seven points from losing situations this season - the joint-most with Kerala Blasters FC. Contrastingly, Punjab FC have claimed no such points so far, highlighting the need of an early lead for the Marina Machans. The Owen Coyle-coached side have also emerged as a force to reckon with on the road. They are unbeaten in their last three ISL away games - winning twice and drawing once. The last time Chennaiyin FC registered a longer such streak was for five games from January-February 2020. Interestingly, they had made it all the way to the final that year, under the tutelage of Coyle. "We want to follow our style," Punjab FC head coach Panagiotis Dilmperis

expressed confidence by saying that he wants his team to take the lead in setting the tempo of the game regardless of the ideas and plans that Chennaiyin FC come up with. "The main topic before us this season is that we want to make the opponents follow our style of play. That's our biggest concern. Chennaiyin FC have good players and a good style of play but we want to follow our style," Dilmperis added. Chennaiyin FC and Punjab FC have faced each other twice in the ISL, winning once each. "I want us to believe we can win every game," Chennaiyin coach Coyle said. "I want my players to believe that they can win every game. That won't be possible. But the intent should be there always and that's the kind of players I like working with," Coyle added.



# Jürgen Klopp defends his decision to join Red Bull after fan backlash

Jürgen Klopp has defended his decision to head up Red Bull's group of soccer clubs, saying he "didn't want to step on anybody's toes" after his decision prompted a backlash from fans of his former teams in Germany. Klopp is taking over as the drinks company's head of global soccer from January in what was widely seen as a surprise move. It will be his first job after leaving Liverpool at the end of last season. "I didn't want to step on anybody's toes, definitely not, and personally I love all of my ex-clubs," Klopp said in an interview released Wednesday on a podcast hosted by former Real Madrid and Germany midfielder Toni Kroos. Klopp suggested any decision he made to coach another club would also have disappointed

some fans. "I really don't know what exactly I could have done for everyone to be happy," he said. Red Bull, and especially its Leipzig team, are widely resented by many German soccer fans, who see the drinks company as an unwelcome corporate presence trying to buy success. Fans at Klopp's former clubs like Borussia Dortmund have criticized the move, and Mainz fans held up banners this month expressing their disappointment and questioning whether he was "crazy." Klopp spent 18 years at Mainz as a player and coach before joining Dortmund in 2008, where he went on to lead the club to two Bundesliga titles and the Champions League final. Klopp said he had never viewed Red Bull's involvement in soccer "so critically," and

suggested it played an important role in bringing high-level club soccer back to the former East Germany with the Leipzig project. Klopp previously said he planned to take a "long break" from soccer after leaving Liverpool, where he coached his last game in May after nine years with the club. "I'm 57 so I can still work for a couple more years but I don't really see myself on the sideline (as a coach) for the time being," he said. "But it was always clear that I wasn't going to do nothing at all. And then this story with Red Bull came into the picture, and for me it's outstanding." Klopp said he saw his Red Bull role primarily as an "adviser" working together with coaches at the clubs backed by the drinks giant. "I always had the feeling that the coach is very, very often the loneliest person at the club," he said.

# FIFA announces first Club World Cup sponsor with Chinese electronics firm branding VAR checks

FIFA finally announced a first sponsor for its revamped Club World Cup on Wednesday in a deal that will brand video review checks at the tournament in the United States next year. The Chinese consumer electronics firm Hisense will have "branding appearing in the video operation room and on pitchside screens," FIFA said in a statement, when match officials study key incidents in the 32-team tournament being played in 11 American cities from June 15 to July 13. Though no previous FIFA

tournament has had a sponsor for video reviews since the technology was approved before the men's 2018 World Cup in Russia, Hisense was the official "VAR Screen Provider" for this year's European Championship organized by UEFA in Germany. Less than eight months before the Club World Cup opens - with Lionel Messi's Inter Miami hosting the first game of a tournament that sees Real Madrid, Manchester City and Bayern Munich play their first competitive games in the U.S. - it now has one sponsor but still lacks any broadcast deals. FIFA's talks for a global streaming deal with Apple+ stalled several

months ago and U.S. Sponsors have been more focused on deals for the men's 2026 World Cup that will be co-hosted with Canada and Mexico. Saudi Arabian sponsors are expected to sign soon and help FIFA President Gianni Infantino fulfil promises to clubs that the tournament's total prize money will run to hundreds of millions of dollars every four years. FIFA is set to confirm Saudi Arabia as the 2034 World Cup host on Dec. 11. The new Hisense deal "paves the way for further sponsorship deals for FIFA's new flagship club competition to be announced in the coming weeks," soccer's world body said. FIFA did not specify the value of the

deal sealed with Infantino at a signing ceremony in Shanghai. Reviews of referee decisions in key incidents - for goals, penalty awards and red cards - can extend to at least two minutes, despite FIFA's aim during trials in 2016 of completing checks in about 10 seconds. Hisense first signed up as a FIFA sponsor for the 2018 World Cup and it renewed for the 2022 edition in Qatar. The television and laptops manufacturer also signed its first sponsor deal with UEFA, when Infantino was still the European soccer body's general secretary, ahead of Euro 2016.

# EASWARAN, NITISH REDDY, PRASIDH TO BE UNDER CLOSE SCRUTINY

The outings of Abhimanyu Easwaran, Nitish Kumar Reddy and Prasidh Krishna will be the primary focal points of India A's four-day match against their Australian counterparts, starting here on Thursday. Easwaran, Nitish and Prasidh have been included in India's squad for the five-Test Border-Gavaskar Trophy series, beginning on November 22, and the thinktank will be eager to know how they fare in Australian conditions. Easwaran's performance will, however, have far more significance as the 29-year-old opener could potentially replace Rohit Sharma's replacement if the captain skips a match or two against Australia for personal reasons. Easwaran, who is also the vice-captain of India A here, is a vastly experienced campaigner having played 99 First-Class matches to score 7638 runs with 27 hundreds and 29 fifties. He has also been part of the India squad in the past but what inspires confidence is his recent form in First-Class matches. The right-hander struck 157 and 116 for India B in the Duleep Trophy before making a 191 against Mumbai for Rest of India in the Irani Trophy and made another hundred in his final red-ball game before flying out to Australia - an unbeaten 127 against Uttar Pradesh in the Ranji Trophy. So, he has the body of work to feel in fine fettle ahead of the match against Australia A, though the conditions here will be vastly different from what he has experienced so far this season in India. On the other hand, Nitish does not boast of such impressive First-Class numbers, as he has been drafted into squad for his perceived ability as a pace-bowling all-rounder and, even in that, batting is his stronger suit. In the Duleep Trophy earlier this year, Nitish made two



ducks with a highest of 40 in five matches while grabbing just two wickets. But the selectors have backed him ahead of senior names such as Shardul Thakur, who has resumed playing domestic matches after recovering from an injury. So, this will be a good opportunity for the selectors to check how the Andhra man measures up to a very capable Australia A side that includes the likes of Camrean Bancroft, Marcus Harris, Michael Neser, Cooper Connolly and Scott Boland. Prasidh is a late addition to the India A squad in place of initially picked up Yash Dayal, and the Karnataka pacer needs to find some rhythm here. Since his return from injury, Prasidh has picked up just seven wickets in as many innings across Duleep Trophy, Irani Cup and Ranji Trophy. But the selectors seemed to have been influenced by the theoretical advantage his height brings in on the

Australian decks. Prasidh can use this opportunity to keep himself ready if he gets a call-up to the first eleven as the third seamer behind Jasprit Bumrah and Mohammed Siraj or if the management wants to rest one of the frontline pacers as part of workload management during the tour. Other than this aforementioned troika, the likes of skipper Rituraj Gaikwad, top-order batter B Sai Sudharsan, pacers Yash Dayal and Navdeep Saini and middle-order batter Devdutt Padikkal can look forward to churn out some good efforts to keep themselves on the periphery of selection in case of an eventuality in the senior side. Ishan Kishan, the wicketkeeper batter, too will be eager to make the most of this chance after a finding his favour back with the powers that be.
