the Ganga water supply has been halted from October 21 onwards. Subsequently, Ganga water supply to these WTPs has been stopped.

Due to high ammonia content i.e. above 1.5 ppm in raw water at River Yamuna, it is difficult to treat the Yamuna raw water. Hence, the production at Bhagirathi and Sonia Vihar has been curtailed up to 30 percent of the capacity. Further, the production would depend entirely upon the quality of Raw water at River Yamuna and production from these plants shall vary accordingly.

There is no such thing as 'digital arrests': PM

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday cautioned citizens about fraudsters indulging in the cyber crime of so-called "digital arrests". He urged people to adopt the mantra of "stop, think and take action" when faced with such a scam, asserting that these steps will provide digital security to them. In his monthly 'Mann ki Baat' broadcast, he said probe agencies are working with states to deal with the issue but added that awareness is essential in protecting oneself from this crime.

During his broadcast, he also shared a conversation between a victim and a fraudster to highlight the cyber crime. "The fraudsters of digital arrest phone calls, at times, impersonate police, CBI, Narcotics; at times RBI... Using such various labels, they converse as fake officers with a lot of confidence. Many



listeners of 'Mann Ki Baat' have wished that we must discuss that," the PM said.

"Let me tell you how these fraud gangs work. What is this dangerous game? It is very important for you to understand this," he said. Explaining the operandi of such fraudsters, he said they collect personal information as their first

move and then in their second move create an atmosphere of

You went to Goa last month, didn't you? Your daughter studies in Delhi, right'? They collect so much information about you that you will be surprised. The second move - create an atmosphere of fear... Uniform, Government office set-up, legal sections. They will scare you so much on the phone. In the midst of the conversation you will not be able to even think," the PM said. He added that the third move of

such fraudsters is the pressure of time. "You have to decide now or else you will be arrested...' These people create so psychological pressure on the victim that one gets scared.People from every class and age group fall victim to digital arrest," he said, adding that people have lost lakhs of rupees earned through their hard work, out of sheer fear.

Bandra Terminus stampede leaves 10 injured

t least 10 passengers were At least 10 passengers were injured, two of whom severely, in a stampede that took place when scores of passengers rushed board an unreserved compartment of the Gorakhpur-Express bound Antyodaya platform number-one of Bandra Terminus (BDTS) Railway Station in the small hours of Sunday. The incident took place at around

2.45 am, when the 22921 Antyodaya Express was slowly moving onto platform no 1 from the yard to head to Gorakhpur. A large number of passengers made headway into one of the unreserved compartments, leading to utter chaos and consequent stampede. "On 27.10.2024 at about 02.45 hrs,

passenger train number 22921 Antyodaya Express was slowly being placed on platform number 01 from the BDTS yard, when some passengers present on the platform tried to board the moving train and 02 passengers fell and got injured," the Western Railway said in a statement issued here.

Of the ten injured passengers, two an official from the BMC's severely passengers - identified as Noor Shaikh Mohammed (18) and Indrajit Sahani (19), who were initially rushed to the nearby Bhabha Hospital, have been shifted to the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC)-run KEM Hospital. "Both of them have suffered multiple injuries. Noor Mohammed is on Oxygen support. His condition is critical,"

Over 350 hoax bomb threat calls, only two arrests? Begging for a smartphone?

Hoax bomb callers have commercial flights and premium hotels across the country, causing significant financial losses and delays. At least 50 flights belonging to Akasa Air, IndiGo, and Vistara bomb Sunday. So far, more than 350 flights have received hoax bomb threats in the last 14 days.

In some cases, the threats were issued to flights that had already been operated for the day or were not scheduled to operate. Besides, dozens of premium hotels in four states-West Bengal, Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat, and Andhra Pradesh have also received threat messages in the past three days, prompting the security agencies to launch search operations. Most of the threats were issued through social

media. In the backdrop of worrying trends of hoax threat messages to airlines, the government is taking support international agencies, law enforcement wings

threats. Intelligence sources said there is an attempt to hit the economy via the aviation sector and the hospitality sector during the festive season. Meanwhile, airlines and passengers remain in a state of uncertainty due to these hoax call messages. According to sources, IndiGo received threats for 18 flights and Vistara for 17 flights. Akasa Air received threats for 15 flights. At least two IndiGo

Akasa Air issued a statement, confirming in a brief that its Emergency Response Team is actively monitoring the situation and is in contact with security and regulatory authorities. procedures in coordination with local authorities, and the Akasa Air teams on ground are prepared to assist passengers to ensure their safety and comfort," read Akasa Air's statement posted on X. This has created a panic among air passengers amid the ongoing festive season.

According to Akasa Air, on reported on a flight enroute from Bengaluru to Delhi via Gorakhpur, which was found to be a hoax after inspection. During thorough inspection at the Gorakhpur airport, no suspicious item was found, Gorakhpur Airport director RK Parasher said. The flight landed in Gorakhpur at 1.33 pm and the door opened at 1.50 pm. The aircraft was carrying 174 passengers and three infants. The inspection of the aircraft and the passengers continued till 2.42 pm and the flight took off at 3.43 pm for Delhi,

n a surprising discovery, a recent survey by the District Urban Development Authority (DUDA), the Municipal Corporation, and Department has revealed that many beggars in Lucknow are financially better off than several professionals. Some even possess smartphones and PAN cards, challenging common perceptions about the economic conditions of the city's beggars.

The survey found a total of 5,312 beggars in the city, including individuals whose monthly earnings can reach up to ₹80,000-90,000 -

especially pregnant women. The survey is part of a broader campaign to identify beggars and connect them with government welfare schemes. Authorities are documenting their details and registering them for Aadhaar cards to help integrate them into mainstream society. The data collected has brought several startling facts to light.



Initiated under the direction of Divisional Commissioner Roshan Jacob, the survey aims understand backgrounds and living conditions of beggars with a focus on rehabilitation. Findings reveal that many of wishers. these individuals originate from nearby districts such as Barabanki, Sitapur, Hardoi, Rae Bareli, Unnao, and Bahraich. Despite owning homes in their villages, many choose to live on the streets of

The survey found that women, particularly those who are pregnant or accompanied by young children, tend to earn the most from begging. Their

daily income can reach up to ₹3,000, while elderly people and children typically earn between ₹900 to ₹2,000 daily. Besides cash, these individuals often receive food, clothes, and other essentials from well-

Reports suggest that certain groups encourage women to have multiple children, believing that pregnancy attracts more donations from the public.

As a result, many female beggars have as many as eight or nine children. Based on these findings, officials estimate that with an average daily earning of ₹1,200 per beggar, residents of Lucknow collectively distribute over ₹63 lakh in

Fumes, crowds, blaring horns, Diwali shopping is now a challenge Lajpat Nagar and Sarojini Nagar get a footfall of thousands each day during the festive season

Shoppers splurging on clothes, gifts and other items ahead of Diwali, have been making a beeline to markets across the National Capital, the most popular ones include Lajpat Nagar and Sarojini Nagar in south Delhi. Lakhs arrive here as soon as the market opens around 11 am, and the footfalls continue till the closing time of 9 pm. Their cars, motorcycles, auto rickshaws, and taxis add a heavy load on the already busy roads leading to massive jams at all hours. There is also a possible threat to life in case a

stampede like situation arises. The markets of Sarojini Nagar and Lajpat Nagar are bustling with shoppers coming to buy for the festivities ahead. However, with vehicles including cars, motorcycles and autos the spaces become cramped leaving restricted movement. It also leads to a potential threat to restricted

lives with stampede-like situations arising. Meanwhile, the Delhi Police has amped up their security for the festivities and also in light of a blast near a Central Reserves Police Forces (CRPF) public school in Rohini Sector 14.

In Lajpat Nagar, one can see that there is no free flow of traffic as vehicles are parked on both sides of the road creating massive inconvenience to the public, despite a Delhi police booth right outside the market and police heightened patrolling. People also fear that in a case of emergency, ambulances wouldn't be available on time due to the jams and very limited space for the movement of vehicles.

A frustrated shopper said, "Whole Lajpat Nagar is facing huge traffic. People have parked their cars and vehicles here and there on the roads which are completely filled leaving little space for any movement. Why is



the Delhi Police not taking any action? the peak season, it can inevitably result What if there is any emergency, how can even an ambulance reach?"

Another resident of the area claimed that selective restriction won't work in the area while she blamed the mismanagement of traffic as a reason for such congestion near the market area. "Restriction on all sorts of vehicular movements shall be a solution, not selective ones. As a person who has lived in Lajpat Nagar, I can vouch for the fact that this situation stems from unscientific parking and poor traffic management," she stated.

Similar situations also exist in Sarojini Nagar even as several auto-rickshaws create a menace on the road. "There is a traffic jam created by autos at Sarojini Nagar market entry opposite to the post office in Vinay nagar. Delhi Police, please send some traffic personnel who can manage the situation. If such a situation persists at

GUEST COLUMN = **OROP** rejuvenates lives of veterans

The welfare of the Indian armed forces is often the subject of many discussions and debates during prime time on Indian television channels. We frequently find articles and essays on One Rank One Pension (OROP) in newspapers and maga-zines. On social media, veteran groups are flooded with articles full of disparaging comments to the effect that the government of the day has not fulfilled its promise and commitment of OROP.

lifestyle. It has undoubtedly made the lives of veteran officers comfortable. However, there is still a big scope for improvement for soldiers when it comes to aspects like Personnel Below Officers Rank (PBORs). Let us have a balanced approach between the pre 2014 era and our OROP status in 2024. From the time of this issue, let us look at the origins of the OROP from the time of the birth of our independent nation in the year 1947. Since independence, the model of deciding pensions for our armed forces has been the "one rank one pension model" for almost 27 years. In 1973 after the Indo-Pak war of 1971, the Congress government led by the then Prime Minister Indira terminated the OROP model. Then the third pay commission further reduced the pension of our soldiers/veterans and increased the retirement pension of the civil defense employees. In 1986, the Rajiv Gandhi-led government implemented the Rank Pay Scheme in the

later years. This also caused asymmetry in the pay scales of the armed forces officers and their equivalent officers. This injustice and stepmotherly treatment by the former governments resulted in discontent, rage, and uproar among the veterans. They threatened to agitate and take their demands of one rank one pay to the streets. To address this confusion and disappointment of the veterans, the government appointed Koshyari committee, which consists of a ten-member all-party parliamentary panel chaired by Bhagat Singh Koshyari. It submitted its report after twenty-five years during the UPA government led by the then Prime Minister Manmohan Singh. The commit-tee met the veterans' demands of OROP and stated an equal pension should be paid for an equal length of service of the same rank irrespective of the retirement date.

Beware while bursting crackers on Deepawali, warn doctors

As many people have started to burst fireworks ahead of Deepawali to be celebrated a few days later, doctors in the city have advised individuals, especially children and their wards, to ensure necessary precautions when handling fireworks to prevent injuries like eye allergies, burns and infections. The excitement around burning crackers during Deepawali often leads to accidents, so experts rec-

ommend maintaining a safe distance and wearing protective eyewear.

Senior eye specialist at the Government Doon Medical College (GDMC) hospital Dr Sushil Ojha said that he observed an increase in eye injuries during this time each year and emphasises the importance of taking precautions to avoid such incidents. He added that incidents of eye injuries

and allergies caused by fireworks are more frequently seen in children compared to other age groups. The process of burning fireworks involves dangerous materials, including stones, which can result in eye injuries. In addition to physical harm, the smoke from the fireworks can lead to eve infections and allergies, resulting in itching and redness. To prevent eye injuries, especially in chil-

Another eye specialist Dr Amit Singh said that the burning of crackers can lead to an increase in cases of eye infections, allergies and irritation. To prevent these issues, especially in children who are more susceptible, precautions should be taken. It is recommended to maintain a safe distance while lighting crackers and to wear gloves and protective eyewear to protect against smoke-related eye infections. Singh emphasised that individuals near the burning crackers are also at risk of eye injuries and should remain vigilant. To ensure safety, it is advised that children and individuals with eye conditions opt for smaller crackers instead of larger ones. In the event of any eye problem or injury, seeking medical advice from a

dren, parents should supervise them while they burn fireworks. It is also advised to use paper when burning fireworks to slow down the process and allow for a safe distance. Further, wearing protective eyeglasses can help prevent eye injuries during this activity, he added.

Mishra said that the investigation began after a resident of Rajpur reported to the cyber crime police station that he had been digitally arrested by fraudsters impersonating Greater Mumbai Police and officials of Central Bureau Investigation (CBI).

The victim received

a call on May 20 claiming that a parcel, allegedly containing illegal items like drugs and multiple passports, had been intercepted at Mumbai Airport under his name. The caller provided some of the victim's personal information, which heightened his fear and confusion. When he denied any knowledge of the parcel, he was told it will still be

processed in his name, implying potential legal consequences. The call was then transferred to an individual posing as a senior police officer, who warned him of impending charges for drug traf-ficking and money laundering, Mishra said.

He informed that in a prolonged psychological manipulation, accused kept the victim under digital arrest via WhatsApp video and voice calls, forbidding him from speaking with anyone else or leaving his home. To avoid supposed legal consequences, the victim was convinced to fraudulent bank account cyber crime police.



on plea for Madhumita Shukla murder convict

The Supreme Court has sought the Uttarakhand government's response on a plea seeking the premature release of one of the convicts in the 2003 murder case of 26year-old poet Madhumita Shukla.

A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Augustine George Masih issued notice to the Uttarakhand government on a plea by Rohit Chaturvedi seeking direction to a competent authority for ordering his premature

Additional Advocate General Garima Prasad, appearing for Uttar Pradesh government referred to earlier judgements of the apex court passed in the Bilkis Bano case on January 8 and May 13, 2022 and said that the competent authority in this case will be the Uttarakhand government. She submitted that this court

has held on January 8 that the state in which trial of a criminal case has taken place will be the competent authority to deal with premature release of convicts as per state's policy.

"Since the case was transferred to Uttarakhand from Uttar Pradesh on the orders of this court, in this case the competent authority will be the Uttarakhand government,' submitted.

The bench agreed to issue a fresh notice to the Uttarakhand government and posted the matter for hearing further November 14.

Earlier, the Uttar Pradesh government moved the top court seeking a recall of an order that has asked it to consider a premature release of Chaturvedi.

The UP government has contended that in view of the Bilkis second Bano judgement of January 8 this year, the state has sought a recall or modification of the December 15, 2023 order passed in the case of Chaturvedi.

On January 8, the top court quashed the Gujarat government's remission granted to 11 convicts in a case involving the gangrape of Bilkis Bano and murder of her seven family members during the 2002 Godhra

It had said the Gujarat government was not the appropriate authority to pass the remission order and clarified that the state in and sentenced is competent to decide a remission plea of

The convicts in the Bilkis Bano case were tried in Maharashtra.

In the process, the bench had nullified a May 13, 2022 judgement of another apex court bench that had directed the Gujarat government to consider the remission applications of the 11 convicts, saying it was obtained by "playing fraud on court".

On May 13, 2022, a bench comprising Justices Ajay Rastogi (now retired) and Vikram Nath asked the government Gujarat consider the plea of convict Radheshyam Shah for a premature release in terms of its remission policy of July 9, 1992, holding that the government of the state where the offence had taken place has the jurisdiction to decide the application.

In the present case, on December 15, 2023, a bench of Justices Aniruddha Bose (now retired) and Masih, relying on the May 13, 2022 judgment, asked the Uttar Pradesh government to consider the remission plea of Chaturvedi, who was tried for murder in a court in Uttarakhand.

We, accordingly, direct that the remission plea which was filed by the petitionerconvict (Chaturvedi) be sent to the home secretary, state of Uttar Pradesh by the state of Uttarakhand.

This shall be done within a period of three weeks from

Thereafter, the state of Uttar Pradesh shall examine the question and take a decision in that regard within a further period of eight weeks," it had directed on December 15, 2023.

The UP government has sought a recall of the order that has asked it to decide the convict's remission plea on the ground that the apex court, in the subsequent judgment in the Bilkis Bano case, has held that the state where the convicts were tried is the requisite authority to premature release.

The draft bill proposes the 'emergency concept of arbitration'.

The proposed amendment says arbitral institutions may, for the purpose of grant of interim measures, provide for appointment of "emergency arbitrator" prior to the constitution of an arbitral tribunal.

The emergency appointed will arbitrator conduct proceedings in the manner as may be specified by the (arbitration) council.

At the same time, the draft bill also omits some of the clauses of the present law.

One of the clauses omitted relates to laying of notifications proposed issued, in both Houses of Parliament when it is in session.

The omitted clause read: "A copy of every notification proposed to be issued ... Shall be laid in draft before each House of Parliament, while it

is in session, for a total period of 30 days which may be comprised in one session or in two or more successive sessions, and if, before the expiry of the session immediately following the session or the successive sessions aforesaid, both Houses agree in disapproving the issue of the notification or both Houses agree in making any modification in the notification, the notification shall not be issued or, as the case may be, shall be issued only in such modified form as may be agreed upon by the

Cyber criminals take advantage of user's lack of technical knowledge: CERT-In

Indian cyber-security agency CERT-In on Sunday shared a list that talks about more than a dozen ways in which online scams are being perpetrated by fraudsters in the country, including "digital arrest" to dupe people by stealing their money and private

The public advisory has been accessed by PTI and it came on a day when Prime Minister Narendra Modi too cautioned people against such frauds in his monthly "Mann ki Baat" broadcast.

As part of "tech support scams", cyber criminals take advantage of a user's lack of technical knowledge and stealthily gain access to his computer by warning about a virus and then steal sensitive personal data.

"Investment scams" cash on a person's desire to earn quick money as they promise "unrealistic" returns asked to pay a processing fee via Ponzi or pyramid schemes and in "cash-ondelivery scams", criminals set up fake online stores "Emotional manipulation accepting CoD orders.

When the product is delivered, it is either counterfeit or completely different from what was advertised.

To con people using "fake charity appeal scams", scammers create convincing websites or social media profiles asking for donations for fake causes like disaster relief or health initiatives and use such images or stories that provoke sympathy or urgency.

"Mistaken money-transfer scams" are those in which fraudsters contact a victim via e-mail or social media, claiming that money has been mistakenly sent to his account as they use fake transaction receipts to ask the person to return the funds immediately to avoid

legal issues. "Phone scams" are those where victims receive calls or messages under the fake name of a telecom regulatory body, saying there is an "issue" in their service as they urgently seek one-time passwords (OTPs) and banking information for identity verification. "Parcel scams" are like

"digital arrest" where victims are informed over a call or message that they are under probe as their drugs-laden parcel has been seized and they will be arrested or may have to face legal consequences if they do not pay a fine. As part of the "loan or cards

Karhal by-election: intense rivalry between political kin

 $T^{\text{he Karhal assembly seat in}}_{\text{Mainpuri, known for its}}$ complex political dynamics, is witnessing a fierce contest this by-election season. The battle has garnered significant attention, as the sons-in-law of two political stalwarts are going head-to-head in this high-stakes election. The Samajwadi Party (SP) has

fielded Tej Pratap Yadav, the son-in-law of former Bihar Chief Minister Lalu Prasad Yadav. In response, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has chosen Anuj Yadav, the son-in-law of the late Mulayam Singh Yadav, SP founder and former Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh, as its candidate. This adds a unique twist to the byelection, as both candidates have close familial ties to the legacy of the SP.

Since the formation of the Samajwadi Party, Karhal has remained a stronghold for the party, except for a brief period in 2002 when Sobran Singh Yadav won the seat as a BJP candidate. He later joined the and successfully

in subsequent elections. In the 2022 assembly elections, SP President Akhilesh Yadav chose to contest from Karhal, securing a victory over BJP candidate and Union Minister Dr. S.P. Singh Baghel. After Akhilesh's victory in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections from Kannauj, he vacated the Karhal seat, necessitating the

current by-election. The by-election has become a topic of intense discussion in political circles, as it symbolizes more than just a battle between SP and BJP. It is a clash of prestige involving two prominent political families. For the SP, retaining the seat would be crucial in maintaining its influence in Mainpuri, while the BJP sees this as an opportunity to make inroads into a traditional SP bastion.

Tej Pratap Yadav and Anuj Yadav are not just political rivals; they share a familial bond. Tej Pratap is married to Rajlakshmi, Lalu Prasad Yadav's younger daughter, while Anuj Yadav is married to Sandhya alias Baby Yadav, the daughter of Mulayam Singh Yadav's younger brother, Abhayram Yadav. Anuj is thus the brother-in-law of SP President Akhilesh Yadav, adding another layer of intrigue to this political battle. Interestingly, SP President Akhilesh Yadav recently

acknowledged the family ties during his campaign visit to Barnahal on October 25. Referring to Anuj's BJP candidacy, Ákhilesh remarked, "When BJP couldn't find any other strategy, they fielded our relative."

The political narrative is further complicated by past family tensions. After Anuj Yadav joined the BJP in 2019, brother-in-law, MP Dharmendra Yadav, severed ties with him, publicly stating that he would not maintain relations with any BJP leader. However, Akhilesh's recent acceptance of Anuj as a relative has added a twist to the dynamics.

The relationship between the two candidates goes beyond mere rivalry. Anuj Yadav's wife, Sandhya Yadav, is Tej Pratap Yadav's aunt, making Anuj and Tej Pratap nephew and uncle. Yet, despite these familial ties, both candidates have emphasized that party loyalty supersedes family connections in this electoral contest.

The Karhal by-election has become a battle not just for political victory but also for the legacy and prestige of two powerful political families. The result will have significant implications for both the SP and BJP, influencing their strategies in the region and potentially impacting the political landscape of Uttar Pradesh. total of 35.95 lakh people Atotal of 33.33 min. Find Odisha have been Dana impacted by cyclone Dana and subsequent flooding in 14 districts, the state's Revenue and Disaster Management Minister Suresh Pujari said on Sunday.

Pujari also said as many as 8,10,896 people were evacuated to 6,210 cyclone relief centres. worst-hit districts

include Kendrapara, Balasore and Bhadrak, while the human casualty "still stands at zero", he told reporters here. "By 10.30 am of Sunday, evacuated people were sheltered in 1,178 cyclone relief centres and they are being provided cooked food and other essential items," the minister said.

Polythene sheets are being given to people who lost their houses in the calamity. He said cyclone Dana, which



struck early Friday, has affected people in 1,671 gram panchayats under 108 blocks spread over 14 districts.

According to preliminary reports, around 5,840 houses have been fully or partially damaged due to the cyclone and subsequent flooding, Pujari said.

"Whenever there is a disaster, people lose their houses and get compensation. This time, we want to bring a permanent solution to the problem and provide pucca houses to them in a phased manner," he said. The Odisha government was also planning to undertake a survey of kutcha houses located in cyclone and flood-

prone areas of the state. Puiari also said there has been "huge crop loss" in the aftermath of the cyclone, which hit the eastern coast early on Friday, triggering torrential rain and high-speed winds.Referring to the swollen Budhabalang river, which has mostly affected Balasore district, he said the water level in the river has remained static and below the danger level, "but above the warning sign".

"As the rainfall has reduced in the region and the upper catchment area, the water level in Budhabalang will not increase further. We hope the situation will improve by this evening," Pujari said. The minister said river

Kansabansa in Balasore district is also in spate and affected some villages under the Soro block.

Clouds of doom

As the US push for de-escalation, the risk of a multi-front war looms large, threatening to destabilise West Asia

The recent Israeli airstrikes on Iran and the subsequent retaliatory measures have intensified the long-standing conflict between the two nations, raising fears of a broader war in West Asia. The airstrikes, which targeted Iranian military installations and reportedly resulted in the deaths of four Iranian soldiers, were framed as a response to Iranian aggression. Iran's ally, Hezbollah, quickly reacted with rocket salvos targeting residential areas in northern Israel, signalling the potential for the conflict to spread. The current episode of hostilities began after Israeli warplanes allegedly used Iraqi airspace to conduct strikes on military and radar installations in Tehran. These actions were framed by Israel as necessary measures to neutralise threats posed by Iran and its regional proxies, including Hezbollah in Lebanon. Iran has condemned the strikes as a violation of its sovereignty, insisting on its right to retaliate. As expected the United States has firmly backed Israel, reiterating its "ironclad" support and cautioning Iran against

further retaliation. Meanwhile, UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres has called for an immediate cessation of hostilities, expressing concern about the potential for the violence to escalate uncontrollably.

The conflict's spillover into Lebanon, where Hezbollah's rocket attacks targeted northern Israel, highlights the interconnected nature of West Asia politics. Hezbollah, a powerful militia with close ties to Tehran, represents Iran's most prominent proxy in the region. Its involvement indicates that the conflict could easily escalate beyond a bilateral confrontation between Israel and Iran, drawing in other state and non-state actors. The conflict's potential to involve additional countries is sig-

nificant. Lebanon, already grappling with a fragile political and economic situation, could become a battlefield, destabilising the broader Levant. Similarly, Iraq's alleged involvement in providing airspace for Israeli operations could trigger responses from Shia militias in the country. Besides, Iran's network of proxies, including militias in Iraq, Syria, and Yemen, could engage in coordinated retaliatory strikes against Israel or the US interests in the region. This would complicate efforts to contain the conflict and could lead to an asymmetric, multi-front war. It goes without saying that diplomatic efforts are urgently needed to prevent the situation from deteriorating further. One country that could convince Israel for ceasefire is the US. It could leverage its influence over Israel and its regional allies to push for restraint, while simultaneously deterring Iranian retaliation through diplomatic channels. In fact even the US does not want the war to spill over. Direct communication between Washington and Tehran could prevent misunderstandings that might trigger further escalation. Besides, international neutral actors such as India, Russia, or regional mediators like Oman could facilitate backchannel negotiations aimed at establishing a ceasefire. The war must be stopped at any cost now else it could be a freefor-all, making it precursor to the World War III.

Come winter, Delhi chokes again




Despite the implementation of the Graded Response Action Plan, including stricter dust control and bans on open burning, smog continues to blanket the city

very year, an estimated 4.2 million deaths are linked to ambient air pollution worldwide, as nearly 91 per cent of the global population resides in areas where air quality exceeds the safe limits set by the World Health Organisation (WHO). In Asia's largest metropolitan regions, rapid urbanisation, unchecked industrialisation, population growth, and the surge in automobiles and construction activities have exacerbated air pollution levels, posing severe health risks. Delhi, one of the most polluted cities in the world, exemplifies this crisis, with its air quality frequent-ly plummeting to hazardous levels, especially during the winter months, making it a focal point in the battle against air pollution in the region. On the morning of October 19, 2024, the Air Quality Index (AQI) reached concerning levels in various parts of the Capital City, particularly in Anand Vihar and Akshardham, where it climbed to 334, placing it in the "very poor" category. The worsening air quality in Delhi can be attributed to sever-

al key factors. First, as easterly winds set in, dust pollution across the National Capital Region (NCR) has become a primary cause of the declining AQI. The Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP), a series of measures aimed at addressing Delhi's air pollution, was implemented on October 15 as the situation began to worsen

These measures include frequent cleaning of roads and restrictions on diesel generators. However, despite these efforts, the problem continues to escalate. One of the most significant contributors to Delhi's declining air quality is stubble burning in neighbouring states, primarily Punjab and Haryana. The Early Warning System (EWS) for Delhi predicts that the contribution of stubble burning to the city's pollution levels is expected to increase significantly over a few weeks. The seasonal practice of burning crop residue adds large amounts of articulate matter (PM2.5) to the air, exacerbating the already poor conditions in the city.

As air quality continues to worsen, there are reports of residents Celsius, slightly above the sea-



These symptoms are affecting children and adults too with complaints of inflammation, and gastrointestinal problems, such as Irritable Bowel Syndrome (IBS) and dyspepsia, which have also been linked to pollution. In this regard, 'climate change' is another factor worsening this situation in Delhi.

With changing weather patterns, temperature inversions at regular intervals, and extreme weather conditions even during summer and winter, in this season, pollutants become trapped near the ground, creating a layer of smog. Delhi's minimum temperature of 19.2 degrees

sonal average, contributes to these conditions. Moreover, climate change also aggravates the effects of vehicular emissions by reducing the frequency of rainfall, which would otherwise help to clear particulate matter from the air. The government has taken several measures to curb the rising pollution, including implementing the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP) restrictions – which include different stages I-IV – besides imposing fines for open burn-

ing.
Additionally, authorities have been tasked with identifying local sources contributing to the worsening air quality. To tackle the immediate crises that have engulfed the Capital City, the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) has implemented Stage 1 of the Graded Response Action Plan across Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, and Rajasthan, in response to air quality data and weather forecasts provided by the India Meteorological Department (IMD) and the Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology (IITM), with a series of stringent measures, aimed at mitigating air pollution. Key restrictions include

enhanced dust control protocols at construction sites, improved waste management practices, and rigorous checks on polluting vehicles and industrial emissions, particularly from power plants and brick kilns. Additionally, open waste burning and the use of diesel generators are prohibited, along with a ban on coal and firewood in eateries. Construction and demolition activities exceeding 500 square meters face severe limitations, and diesel/petrol vehicles older than 10-15 years, as well as the use of firecrackers, are banned

until January 1, 2025.

Not only this, traffic management is also prioritised, with increased deployment of police in congested areas to reduce vehicular idling, while visibly polluting vehicles face strict penalties and possible impoundment. These measures form part of a broader strategy to curtail air pollution and improve public health. The situation is also a stark reminder of the need for collective action to address the underlying causes of air pollution, including vehicular emissions, waste burning, and industrial activities, in addition to climate mitigation efforts. What authorities must also look at is the underutilisation of the 'smog tower,' which was introduced as a major inter-

BRICS PRIORITISES DEVELOPMENT

Madam — The power of diplomacy is writ large in the recently concluded bilateral meeting between India and China on the sidelines of the BRICS Summit in Russia. It also broke some ice ever since the deadly clash in 2020. However, notwithstanding a new deal settled on the disengagement of troops, both remain deeply suspicious of each other. That BRICS has a greater relevance in a multipolar and multidimensional context at a time when the world faces multiple challenges like the ongoing wars, economic uncertainty, climate change, terrorism, east-west and north-south divide as the forum reflects the Global South's deeper concerns, with many more countries queuing up to join or partner with the grouping.

The first ever attendance of new member countries like the UAE, Egypt, Ethiopia and Iran opposing the unilateral sanctions by the west on other nations underscores their challenges confronting them and encourages them to unite for a fairer international order. Another case in point is the creation of the New Development Bank, which has emerged as a significant platform for the needs of such countries. India favours greater use of local currencies for cross border payment system. Increasing use of UPI, which has been adopted by many countries including the UAE acts as a bulwark against the west. UNLOCKING THE DIVINE ENERGIE

According to yogic traditions, each day is linked to a specific shakti and Diwali happens to be a special day

he universe operates under the influence of various shaktis (divine energies). As one advances in yogic practice (sadhana), these energies can be experienced directly. Each of the 365 days is associated with a specific shakti, which is why maintaining discipline and consistent daily practice in yoga is crucial. Missing even a single day can disrupt the connection with that day's shakti, potentially setting back the entire year's sadhana. In the cosmos, every element is interconnected, so when one aspect is neglected, it affects everything—our body, the Earth, and even other planets and stars. Each shakti is associated with a day, but accessing these energies does not require rituals. In yogic and tantric traditions, sadhana alone is the key to connecting with shakti. Understanding the form (swaroop) of each shakti is essential. While every form has a specific name, names are revealed only after the body is prepared through particular sadhanas. At a basic level, when you meditate (dhyan) with your guru, you may see different forms manifesting in them, such as the sun or the moon. Have you ever wondered what

Many practitioners have reported seeing the sun during meditation. What makes the sun so significant? If you observe the sun at sunrise or sunset while focusing on the Manipura chakra (navel centre) and chanting the mantra "Ram," you will notice a glow emerging in your body. Within a month, you may begin to look noticeably different. However, a word of caution—any yogic practice should be undertaken under the guidance of a guru who can adapt it to your capacity. Similarly, the moon is a fascinating energy source. It merely reflects the sun's light, yet it can influence tides and even the Earth's surface during a full moon. Have



you ever considered what makes the moon special? On full moon nights, animals may behave aggressively, and incidents of accidents and conflicts tend to rise. These are just basic observations that hint at something deeper about these celestial forms. Understanding their true nature requires direct experience, which is attainable through the proper practice of Sanatan Kriya. The moon may appear calm and peaceful, but it is actually more volatile than the sun. When you observe the moon under a guru's guidance, you can perceive the mantras embedded within its form. Some shaktis are not directly visible and can only be accessed through other shaktis. These experiences form the foundation of voga. Without direct experience, yoga remains incomplete. Nature, with all its wonders—from flowers of various colors to the sky above—contains the hidden forms of shaktis. If you observe these elements without blinking, under the guidance of a guru, you may find that your physical and mental imbalances begin to dissipate. However, discipline (niyam) is essential. The practice must be continuous, and disruptions will occur if one lacks the capacity for the *shakti* or does not have a *guru* to guide them. Everything around us contains the essence of shakti, and these energies are easily accessible. When one becomes steady and focused on a particular shakti, it starts to follow them, empowering their life. The nine days leading up to Diwali hold special significance because of the congregation of specific shaktis during this period. Our ancestors advised observing celibacy (brahmacharya) during these days to strengthen the body and prepare it to receive these energies. During this time, keep your mind centred within yourself, as the sadhana performed during these nine days is equivalent to months of practice. As Diwali approaches, especially on Amavasya (the new moon night), when we light diyas, it is an opportune time for shakti sadhana. Even a layperson who is not an experienced practitioner can perceive the swaroop of shakti by sitting with closed eyes in meditation. With a pure heart, one can experience these divine energies without any elaborate rituals. Let this Diwali be a time to connect with the powerful shaktis, embracing their presence to enrich your spiritual journey

Rising import reliance amid regulatory challenge-



Despite Government efforts to boost domestic production, policy constraints and pricing caps continue to stifle the energy sector's growth



ccording to the Petroleum Planning and Analysis Cell under the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas (MPNG), during the first six months of the current financial year (FY) September 2024, India's consumption of natural gas (NG) increased by almost 12 per cent to 36.850 billion metric standard cubic meters (bmscm) over the corresponding period last FY. However, the import of NG it is imported in a liquefied form commonly known as LNG) increased by 23 per cent to 18.975 bmscm during this period. Taken as a proportion of consumption, imports were 51.5 percent during April-September 2024 up from 46.8 percent during April-September 2023.

The country's production of NG registered a marginal increase of around 2 per cent during April-September 2024. The Stateowned major Oil and Natural Gas Corporation or ONGC (it contributes about 84 per cent of total domestic output) produced 9.407 bmscm of NG during this period, which was 4 per cent less than during the same period of last FY. However, Oil India Limited (it has 8 per cent share) produced 4 per cent more NG at 1.577 bmscm during this period. The share of production in consumption was 48.5 per cent. Delivering the 75th Independence Day address on 15th August 2021, Prime Minister Narendra Modi vowed to achieve self-reliance in energy production by boosting the gas-based economy. He had then wished the share of NG in the total energy mix to go up from subsisting around 6 per cent to 15 per cent. Pertinently, even to comply with the 6 per cent share, India had to import more than 50 per cent of its NG requirement.

The position hasn't changed even today. Increasing the share of NG in the total energy mix to 15 per cent would require its consumption to increase from its current annual of 73.689 bmscm to 184.222 mmscm (73.689x2.5). The current consumption includes domestic production of 35.739 bmscm. If domestic production stagnates at the current level (in sync with the trend of the last few years) then, to achieve the 15 per cent target, the import of LNG will have to be 148.483 bmscm (184.222-35.739) which means India's import dependence will have to increase to over 80 per

increase in total energy consumption. But, it is increasing at a rapid pace. The country's power demand alone is projected to grow at a compound annual rate of 7 per cent during the next five years (as per an estimate by the Central Electricity Authority or CEA).

In that scenario, compliance with the 15 per cent target for NG would mean still higher reliance on imports. What is coming in the way of increasing production? Natural resource endowment is not a problem. India has 26 sedimentors a problem. See the covering an area tary basins (SBs) covering an area of 3.4 million sq km that could be searched for hydrocarbon resources. However, only six of the SBs are under commercial exploitation; these too are sub-optimally utilised. Hydrocarbon exploration is a highly capital-intensive and technology-intensive business involving a long gestation period. It is risky, especially when drilling in deep/ultra-deep and high-pressure/high-temperature (D/UD/HP/HT) fields in offshore areas such as the Krishna-Godavari (KG) basin.

However, these areas offer maximum promise in terms of reserves. Multinational companies (MNCs) such as ExxonMobil, Chevron, Total etc. which have the technology and resources can be enthused to take long-term bets in the Indian hydrocarbon sector provided the government offers them an opportunity to earn an attractive return on their investment in a 'sustained' basis.

This, in turn, requires that their efforts in the discovery and development of NG fields don't face regulatory hurdles and that they can sell the gas 'freely' at a 'remuner-ative' price. Modi – The govern-ment has made a lot of efforts to remove regulatory hurdles. Until recently, of 1.73 million sq km SB area lying offshore, 0.69 million sq km was a 'No go' area, courtesy of security reasons.

The Centre has released almost all

tion (E&P) activity. Now, it is granting lease rights over the entire economic life of the allotted fields (this could extend up to 30 years, even beyond depending on the available reserves) instead of the extant system of short tenure with extensions.

It has also made amendments to the Forest (Conservation) Act to enable prompt access to forest areas for exploration of hydrocarbon resources. Under the Hydrocarbon Exploration and Licensing Policy (HELP), also known as the Open Acreage Licensing Policy (OALP) launched in 2017, E&P firms are allowed to pick up a block of their choice unlike the earlier New Exploration and Licensing Policy (NELP) (launched in 1999) wherein they had to accept what the government offered. Besides, under OALP, an operator gets a composite license to search for hydrocarbon in whatever form viz NG, 'shale gas', CBM (coal bed methane) etc. For long, E&P efforts were ham-strung by cumbersome procedures, multiple approvals and bureaucratic red tape. Approvais

were needed at every stage. As many as 37 procedures were required to be followed by a firmawarded block under NELP. Team Modi has substantially liberalised and de-bureaucratised approvals by providing for self-certification of documents and pre-approved clearance of blocks. While the above helps, without freedom of marketing and the ability to secure a good price, E&P firms won't get enthused. Of the domestic gas, on around twothirds of supplies (mostly from socalled 'legacy fields' given on nom-ination to ONGC and OIL and from fields given under NELP), the Centre has full control over 'to whom' the supplies will be made and at 'what price'. From April 1, 2023, based on the recommendations of the Kirit Parikh committee, this price expressed on a per million British thermal units (Btu) basis is arrived at by taking 10 per cent

of the monthly average of the Indian crude basket in the preceding month and notified every month. The price thus calculated is subject to a ceiling of US\$ 6.50 per mBtu which makes the formula

Now, the bureaucrats have come up with a 20 per cent premium on supplies by ONGC and OIL only from the so-called 'new wells' or well interventions?

If their intent is to give a good price why put a cap in the first place? Moreover, which fields get the benefit of 'new wells' or 'interventions', will also be solely at their discretion. Even the pricing of the remaining one-third of domestic NG supplied from the so-called deep/ultra-deep and high-pressure/high-temperature fields (KG-D6 operated by Reliance Industries and neighbouring KG-DWN-98/2 operated by ONGC in Krishna-Godavari basin off the Andhra Pradesh coast fall in this category) isn't free from 'control' 'discretion' and 'arbitrariness'. Technically though, the firms can go for competitive bidding to determine the price for such supplies (referred to as a 'premium' price), this too is subject to a ceiling linked to the prices of alternate fuels including fuel oil, naphtha, and LNG.

There is an urgent need for a 'predictable' and 'attractive' policy environment to give a fillip to the exploration and production of NG. The Kirit Parikh committee was conscious of this when it recommended de-regulating difficult gas fields' prices by January 1, 2026, and the price on supplies from legacy fields by January 1 2027. The government should implement these recommendations. Meanwhile, it should prepare the ground for giving subsidies directly to major users such as fertilizers, power, CNG, PNG etc instead of creating distortions in the supply chain by controlling the price of basic inputs such as NG. 'Israeli strikes kill 22 in northern Gaza'

sraeli strikes on northern **L**Gaza have killed at least 22 people, mostly women and children, Palestinian officials said Sunday, as its offensive in the hard-hit and isolated north entered a third week and aid groups described a humanitarian catastrophe. In a separate development, a truck rammed into a bus stop near Tel Aviv, injuring dozens of people, according to Israel's Magen David Adom rescue service. The circumstances were not immediately clear, but Palestinians have carried out dozens of vehicle-ramming attacks over the years. The Gaza Health Ministry's emergency service said that 11 women and two children were among those killed in the strikes late Saturday on several homes and buildings in the northern town of Beit Lahiya. It said another 15 people were wounded and that the death toll could rise. It listed the names of those killed, who mostly came from three fami-

The Israeli military said it carried out a precise strike on militants in a structure in Beit Lahiya and took steps to avoid harming civilians. It disputed what it said were "numbers published by the media," without elaborating or providing evidence for its own account. Israel is still carrying out daily strikes across Gaza, even as it wages and air and ground war with the Hezbollah militant group in Lebanon.

Two people were wounded after an explosive drone launched from Lebanon slammed into a building in an industrial area of northern Israel, authorities said. An Israeli airstrike on a southern neighbourhood of Beirut sent flames and smoke climbing into the air.

On Saturday, Israeli warplanes attacked military targets in Iran — which backs both Hamas and Hezbollah — in

Georgia's pro-Western opposition disputes election result that

Georgia's pro-Western opposition disputed the results of the parliamentary election after officials declared Sunday the ruling party led the crucial vote that could decide whether the country remains on the path to joining the European Union or comes under Russian sway.

The Central Election Commission said Georgian Dream won 54.8 per cent of Saturday's vote with almost 100 per cent of ballots counted. Following a divisive pre-election campaign, initial figures suggested turnout is the highest since the ruling party was first elected in 2012.

Georgian electoral observers, who stationed thousands across the country to monitor the vote, reported multiple violations and said the results "do not correspond to the will of the Georgian people." Georgian Dream has become increasingly author-

itarian, adopting laws similar to those used by Russia to crack down on freedom of speech. Brussels suspended Georgia's EU membership process indefinitely because of a "Russian law," passed in June. Bidzina Ivanishvili, the billionaire founder of Georgian Dream who made his fortune in Russia, claimed victory almost immediately after polls closed and said, "It is rare in the world for the same party to achieve such success in such a difficult situation. He had vowed ahead of the election to ban opposition parties should his party win

Tina Bokuchava, the chair of the United National Movement opposition party accused the election commission of carrying out Ivanishvili's "dirty order" and said he "stole the victory from the Georgian people and thereby stole the European future." She indicated the opposition would not recognise the results and "will fight like never before to reclaim our European future."
The UNM party said its headquarters were attacked

on Saturday while Georgian media reported two people were hospitalised after being attacked outside polling stations.

The pre-election campaign in the South Caucasus nation of 3.7 million people, which borders Russia, was dominated by foreign policy and marked by a bitter fight for votes and allegations of a smear cam-

Some Georgians complained of intimidation and being pressured to vote for the governing party. Georgian Dream scored its highest share of the vote

— polling almost 90 per cent — in the Javakheti region of southern Georgia, 135 kilometres west of the capital Tbilisi where it failed to get more than 44 per cent of the vote in any district. Before the election,

The Associated Press travelled to the region where many people are ethnic Armenians who speak Armenian, Russian and limited Georgian. Some voters suggested they were instructed how to vote by local officials while several questioned why Georgia needed a relationship with Europe and suggested it would be better off allied with Moscow.

Around 80 per cent of Georgians favour joining the EU, according to polls, and the country's constitution obliges its leaders to pursue membership in that bloc and NATO. Many fear that Georgian Dream is dragging the country toward authoritarianism and killing off hopes of becoming an EU member.

Satellite reveals damage from Israeli attack at 2 bases in Iran

n Israeli attack on Iran damaged facilities at a Assecretive military base southeast of the Iranian capital that experts in the past have linked to Tehran's onetime nuclear weapons programme and at another base tied to its ballistic missile programme, satellite photos analysed Sunday by The Associated Press

Some of the buildings damaged sat in Iran's Parchin military base, where the International Atomic Energy Agency suspects Iran in the past conducted tests of high explosives that could trigger a nuclear weapon. Iran long has insisted its nuclear programme is peaceful, though the IAEA, Western intelligence agencies and others say Tehran had an active weapons programme up until 2003. The other damage could be seen at the nearby Khojir military base, which analysts believe hides an underground tunnel system and missile production sites.

Îran's military has not acknowledged damage at either Khojir or Parchin from Israel's attack early Saturday, though it has said the assault killed four Iranian soldiers working in the country's air defence systems. Iran's mission to the United Nations did not immediately respond to a request for comment, nor did the Israeli military.

However, Iranian Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei on Sunday told an audience that the Israeli attack "should not be exaggerated nor downplayed," while stopping short of calling for an immediate retal-Netanyahu separately said Sunday that Israel's strikes "severely harmed" Iran and that the barrage "achieved all its goals."

It remains unclear how many sites in total were targeted in the Israeli attack. There have been no images of damage so far released by Iran's military.

Iranian officials have identified affected areas as being in Ilam, Khuzestan and Tehran provinces. Burned fields could be seen in satellite images from Planet Labs PBC around Iran's Tange Bijar natural gas production site in Ilam province on Saturday, though it wasn't immediately clear if it was related to the attack. Ilam province sits on the Iran-Iraq border in west-

The most telling damage could be seen in Planet Labs images of Parchin, some 40 kilometres southeast of downtown Tehran near the Mamalu Dam. There, one structure appeared to be totally destroyed while oth-

ers looked damaged in the attack. At Khojir, some 20 kilometres away from downtown Tehran, damage could be seen on at least two structures in satellite images.

Government plans to issue ALMM to push India's green energy transition

The government is planning to introduce an Approved List of Models and government Manufacturers (ALMM) for solar cells on the lines of module manufacturing to boost India's transition towards green energy.

The government is aiming to make the second list (List II) under the ALMM for solar PV cells effective April 1,

The government introduced the ALMM order (List I) in 2019 for solar modules to boost the manufacturing and usage of made-in-India solar panels. It was made mandatory to source PV modules from models and manufacturers included in the ALMM List I.

According to an office memorandum of the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, the ALMM order dated January 2, 2019,



models specified manufacturers of solar PV modules, whereas List-II will identify and include models and manufacturers of solar PV cells.

However, to date, List II of solar PV cells has not been issued because the installed capacity of solar PV cells in the country was lower than the demand, the government document said.

'With installed capacity of solar PV cells in the country expected

substantially in the next two years, it has been proposed to issue List-II of solar PV cells under ALMM, which shall be effective from April 1, 2026, according to the draft amendment to ALMM order for implementation of ALMM for Solar PV cells.

The draft paper also proposed that the solar PV modules -which are presently enlisted in ALMM List-I (for solar PV modules) with an expiry date beyond Mach 31, 2026 -- will also have to use solar PV cells included in ALMM List-II (for solar PV cells) from April 1, 2026, onwards.

If the modules don't have the cells included in List-II, they will be liable to be delisted from ALMM List-I, as per the

India's top oil and gas producer Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) had, in January 2018, bought the government's entire 51.11 per cent stake in HPCL for Rs 36,915 crore. The nation's third-biggest oil refining and fuel marketing company thereafter became subsidiary of ONGC.

But Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd (HPCL), which initially did not even recognise the new owner, continues to be headed by a chairman and managing director, who does not report to parent firm ONGC or its board. ONGC has got just one board position on HPCL

following the acquisition.
On a prod from the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas, ONGC appointed a three-member panel to work out synergies between ONGC and HPCL. The panel, which comprised former oil secretary GC Chaturvedi, former ONGC chairman Dinesh Kumar Sarraf, and former HPCL head MB Lal, a couple of months back submitted its report to ONGC, which forwarded it to the ministry for further action, two




knowledge of the matter said. The panel in the report said the ONGC chairman and managing director should be the chair of the board of not just ONGC but also all its subsidiaries - ONGC Videsh Ltd, HPCL, Mangalore Refinery and Petrochemicals Ltd, and ONGC Petro additions Limited (OPaL). The subsidiaries should be headed by the CEO and Managing Directors, who would report to the ONGC chairman, they said citing the report.

Except for HPCL, all other subsidiaries - OVL, MRPL and OPaL - are headed by CEO and Managing Director. The ONGC chairman heads the board of OVL, MRPL and OPaL.

"ONGC and all its direct subsidiaries should have one chairman and the different units be run by a board and MD/CEO," a source aware of the report said.

"The board of step-down subsidiaries should be headed by the MD/CEO of the immediate parent firm." The panel was formed to work out synergies between ONGC and HPCL and optimise processes and businesses.



ith the air quality in the national capital already in the "poor" category ahead of Diwali, the Delhi government has swung into action, coinciding with the Centre's directive to implement GRAP Stage 1 and other related initiatives. City residents are bracing themselves for, yet another long winter of air pollution and the health hazards it causes.

Air Quality Index (AQI) is a measure of the quantum of harmful particles, fumes, chemicals, and oxides in the air. It gauges levels on a scale from 0 to 500 and plays a crucial role in understanding the scale of the air pollution crisis. While the AQI under 50 is ideal and under 100 is liveable, once it crosses this level, it progressively indicates that the air we breathe is getting more harmful. AQI levels (100-200) can lead to eye and throat irritation, while higher levels can have several serious health impacts.

During the winter months, Delhi's AQI levels become hazardous, exceeding 200 resulting in prolonged exposure to unhealthy levels of PM2.5. Several medical studies show that such exposure can lead to a range of serious health issues, including reduced lung function and development, cancer, premature mortality, cardiovascular symptoms such as unusual chest pain, and hematological abnormalities like anemia, leukemia, thrombocytosis, and venous

To mitigate exposure, people are advised to limit outdoor activities, especially in the early morning and after sunset to

thromboembolism.

Mandating vehicle electrification,
curtailing emissions from vehicles running on petrol and diesel, and retiring highly polluting older models where the emissions can't be reduced must be

considered. While this will not be easy, the time for action is now or it may get too late. Concerns about the environmental impact of increased electricity demand for EVs will be addressed by transitioning to renewable energy sources. As India makes more strides in this direction, the growth of clean energy can mitigate the reliance on coal, ultimately benefiting the

Globally, 4,000 young women and girls will become infected with HIV every week in 2022.


The Role of Sleep in Academic

INDIAN BATTERS WERE EXPOSED BY SANTNER; KOHLI'S FORM NOT A CONCERN: SIMON DOU

¬ormer New Zealand →pacer Simon Doull pacer Simon attributed India's shocking series defeat to their inadequacies batsmen's against spin bowling but he was not ready to write off underwhelming star batter Virat Kohli.

Left-arm spinner Mitchell Santner grabbed 13 wickets as the Kiwis walloped India by 113 runs in the second Test here on Saturday to take an unassailable 2-0 lead in the three-match series.

"There's a misconception that Indian players are better players of spin. I think they've had better spinners and they've been able to expose the opposition batters. But in this Test (at Pune), their batters were exposed a little bit by a very, very good performance from Mitchell Santner," Doull told PTI Videos.

Even though Doull said negating spin is no longer a forte of many teams, he conceded that Indian batters' capitulation against "not a world-class spin bowling attack" of New Zealand offered some worrying signals.

"I think you get used to playing on such good wickets. And when it does turn, techniques get exposed a little bit. For a long time, when



India played on turning surfaces, they still had the best spinners in the world in Jadeja and Ashwin.

"So, they've been able to undo other sides. In this Test match, they were undone by a New Zealand side that, with all due respect, is not a world-class spin bowling attack. So, that will be a concern of some sort," he detailed.

Kohli's modest run in the ongoing series was one of the talking points, as the veteran batter succumbed to spin three times in four innings.

But Doull did not read too much into the former Indian captain's dismal form, and said it would not have an effect in the upcoming fivematch Test series against Australia.

"There're issues against spin but he's not the only one. You're not going to find those (spin-friendly) conditions in Australia. He (Kohli) had a

great series Down Under.
"He plays quick bowling as well as he has for the last four or five years. So, I don't think it's a concern," he noted.

"They have to forget about this series. They could go out and win the third Test in Wankhede and go to Australia with a little bit more confidence. In Australia, quick bowlers will be required. India batters, I think, will be a lot better off on good surfaces. That's what you tend to get in Australia." you tend to get in Australia." Doull said India have good enough players to tackle the Australian challenge.

"It'll come down to how they play the quick bowlers from Australia - the tall, slightly bouncier bowlers. But they've got the batters to do the job, I think, in good conditions.

"And if later on in the Test matches, whether it be in Perth or whether it be in Sydney, it starts to turn and bounce a little bit, then their spinners will come into play.' New Zealand also became the first visiting side to win a Test series in India after 12 years, Doull termed remarkable

"I think it's one of the greatest moments in New Zealand cricket history. Teams don't come here and beat India once, let alone twice. And for a New Zealand team to do it without one of their star batters - Kane Williamson it's just a phenomenal performance," he signed off.

Move over Messi-Ronaldo, new generation of soccer stars lining up to win Ballon d'Or

No Lionel Messi. No Cristiano Ronaldo. When the Ballon d'Or is presented at a gala ceremony in Paris on Monday, it will feel like the start of a new era in soccer. There is also a sense of void now that one of sport's most engrossing rivalries is likely over. "It's interesting that as it starts to come to an end, we are sort of saying, what's the next equivalent rivalry going to be," soccer author Jonathan Wilson told The Associated Press. "As if that kind of rivalry was a natural state. But, there's never been a rivalry like that

before.

Messi and Ronaldo won soccer's most prestigious individual award a combined 13 times over 16 years of unprecedented dominance. Neither has been nominated this vear. Instead Real Madrid winger Vinicius Junior is the favourite to be crowned the world's best player and become the first winner born this century. He underlined his credentials this week with a stunning Champions League hat-trick against Borussia Dortmund.

"Vinicius had an incredible season where he was a key player... He proved he's the best player in the world," Madrid teammate Lucas Vazquez said.

But, rather than Vinicius spearheading a new era of dominance, it seems likely the award will revert to a time before Messi and Ronaldo when multiple winners were relatively rare. France great Zinedine Zidane, for

instance, only won it once. The same goes for Ronaldinho, Rivaldo, Luis Figo and George Best. Originally limited to European players, it was never won by Pele or Diego Maradona.

Before Messi, the last player to win back-to-back awards was Dutch striker Marco van Basten in 1988 and '89. Messi won a recordextending eighth Ballon d'Or last year after leading Argentina to triumph at the World Cup in 2022. Wilson, who wrote about the history of Argentinian soccer in his book "Angels With Dirty Faces," sees no obvious successor to the Barcelona great, now at Inter

"Messi's been phenomenal for 17, 18 years," he said. "It's not a pure tallying process, but in terms of greatness over a protracted period, Messi is the greatest there has ever

been by quite some margin. "I don't think there's anybody in the world now who has anything remotely close to that talent.

Such was the dominance of Messi and Ronaldo, not only would Vinicius Junior become the first winner born this century, but there has never even been a recipient born in the '90s.

Vinicius Junior, whose goals helped Madrid to a record-extending 15th European Cup last season, is part of a new generation of stars that are flourishing as Messi and Ronaldo reach the final stages of their careers. Kylian Mbappe, Erling Haaland, Jude Bellingham and Lamine Yamal make up a field of contenders who could challenge for years to come.

Robert Lewandowski scored twice ruin Kylian Mbappé's first clasico as Barcelona routed Real Madrid 4-0. The lopsided victory in Spain's capital ended the host's unbeaten run in La Liga at 42 games, one shy of Barcelona's record streak in 2017-18. Carlo Ancelotti's side suffered its first loss since Sept. 23 last year. And what a loss it was.

Lewandowski got the visitors going from a superb pass by Barcelona's latest vouth talent Marc Casadó in the 54th minute and rose up to head in a fine header three minutes later to silence Santiago Bernabeu Stadium. Yamal made it a rout in the 77th when the teenage phenom rifled a shot from an angle over goalkeeper Andriy Lunin. That goal made him the youngest scorer in a clasico at 17 years, 105 days, surpassing teammate Ansu Fati, who was about 250 days older in October 2020.
