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## BOMB HOAXES A RED HERRING?

ultiple bomb threats continued to disrupt LV Lairline operations in the country for the third consecutive day. Eight flights, four of IndiGo, two of SpiceJet and one of Akasa Air, received bomb threats on Security Wednesday, leading to long delays and diversions. All the threats turned out to be hoaxes. However, there was also planning putting the hoax callers on 'no-fly list' panic amongst air passengers. It is not clear what triggered the sudden surge in hoax bomb threats since Monday.

The threat message to IndiGo was the 19th confirmed instance of a bomb threat to an Indian carrier's flight over the past 48 hours. Worried over a trend of surge in hoax bomb threat messages, Delhi Police has registered seven FIRs at Indira Gandhi International Airport, in connection with bomb threats to several domestic and international flights in the last two days and launched a probe into the matter

According to sources, top officials of Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), Ministry of Aviation (MoCA), Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), National Investigation Agency (NIA), Intelligence Bureau (IB) and Bureau of Civil Aviation (BCAS) Wednesday met to discuss the bomb threats received by airlines. flights received bomb threats and the total count has climbed to at least 19 in three days. The threats have turned out to be hoaxes. On Wednesday, bomb threats were received by four IndiGo flights, two SpiceJet flights and one flight of Akasa Air. On Tuesday late at night, one flight each of Vistara and Air India Express had received the threats. IndiGo received bomb threats for three flights,

aircraft has been isolated, and all passengers been disembarked," an airline spokesperson said in a statement. Another flight 6E 1011 from Mumbai to Singapore received a securityrelated alert and the flight landed at Singapore. Also, IndiGo's flight 6E 515,

operating from Chennai to Lucknow, received a securityrelated alert. After landing at Lucknow, the aircraft was positioned at an isolated bay and all passengers have been disembarked. safely Meanwhile, late on Tuesday, a Mumbai-bound IndiGo flight

from the national capital was diverted to Ahmedabad after a bomb threat. An Akasa Air flight enroute to Bengaluru Delhi on returned to Wednesday afternoon following a bomb threat. Earlier, three international

flights, one of Air India and two of IndiGo, had received bomb threats on Monday while another nine flights spanning across all major carriers had received threats on Tuesday. All the threats came via social media platforms, and eventually turned out to be fake.

This prompted Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA)to seek a report from Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA), Central Industrial Security Force (CISF), Bureau of Civil Aviation Security, National Investigation Agency (NIA) and Intelligence Bureau (IB) on bomb threats that have received been recently, disrupting services. ## **SC** slams Punjab, Haryana for inaction on stubble burning

Coming down heavily on Punjab and Haryana Governments over nonprosecution of stubble burning, the Supreme Court on Wednesday summoned the Chief Secretaries on October 23 for explanation of no action against the violators. A Bench of Justices Abhay S Oka, Ahsanuddin Amanullah and Augustine

George Maish pointed out "complete insensitivity" on the part of both States, directing the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) to take penal action against both the Government officials for the failure to take action against the violators. The Supreme Court called CAQM a toothless tiger that only passed directions without any implementation.

"This is not a political

matter. If the Chief Secretary is acting at somebody's we will issue behest. summons against them as well. Next Wednesday (October 23) we are going to physically call for the chief secretary and explain everything. Nothing has been done, same is with the Punjab government. The attitude is of complete defiance," the Bench remarked, pointing out that both States have not taken any steps to implement the directions issued by the CAOM, in the national capital region (NCR) in June 2021, to stop stubble burning.

Punjab the Slamming Government, the SC said not even a single prosecution has been carried out in the past three years and it was only tolerating breaches.

## Gold, silver soar

### to a new high NEW DELHI: Ahead of Diwali, Gold prices on

Wednesday touched a new all-time high of ₹78,900 per 10 grams in the national Capital, ie to sustained huving jewellers. The precious metal had closed at ₹78,650 per 10 grams in the previous session on Tuesday.

Silver also followed the suit and surged ₹1,000 to ₹93,500 per kg due to fresh buying from industrial units and coin makers. On Tuesday, it had finished at ₹92,500 per kg. Meanwhile, gold of 99.5 per cent purity jumped ₹250 to hit a fresh record high of ₹78,500 per 10 grams against the previous close of ₹78,250 per 10 grams.

The All India Sarafa Association attributed the rise in gold prices due to strong demand by local jewellers. Besides, the decline in equity markets also aided the rally in the yellow metal as investors moved towards the safe haven assets like gold. In futures trade on the Multi Commodity Exchange (MCX), gold contracts for December delivery climbed ₹268 or 0.35 per cent to ₹76,628 per 10 grams. Silver contracts for December delivery zoomed by ₹580 or 0.63 per cent to

₹92,203 per kg on the exchange. In the international markets, Comex gold futures rose 0.51 per cent to USD 2,692.50 per ounce. The yellow metal remains strongly supported by elevated geopolitical tensions and uncertainty surrounding the United States' Presidential elections. PNS

In a major goof up that has not gone down well with the Bharatiya Janata Party's top leadership, a list of 35 probable candidates for the 81 member Jharkhand Assembly circulated on social media, and several news platforms, prompting the party to defer its "official' announcement for declaration of the contestants.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and top BJP leaders were present in the party's Central Election Committee (CEC) meeting for Jharkhand held late on Wednesday evening. Sources said the meeting continued till late night but the

PM left midway. Sources also said the PM told the members to reconsider some of the Assembly pockets since the party is banking high on the winnability of the

candidates to wrest power from the Jharkhand Mukti Morcha-Congress led government in the mineral rich state.

Soon after the announcement of Assembly and By-Poll elections schedule, BJP's CEC convened a two-day marathon meeting on Tuesday and Headquarters party's national Capital to deliberate on the names of candidates for the upcoming Jharkhand and Maharashtra Assembly polls, as well as candidates for Assembly and Lok Sabha By-Polls.

## Must talk about lack of trust: EAM

Delivering a thinly veiled message to Pakistan from its soil, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on Wednesday said activities across borders characterised by the "three evils" of terrorism, extremism and separatism are unlikely to encourage trade, energy flows and connec-

In his address at a conclave of Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) chaired by Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, Jaishankar asserted that trade and connectivity initiatives must recognise territorial integrity and sovereignty and it is essential to have an "honest conversation" on the lack of trust.

Jaishankar spoke immediately after Sharif's inaugural address

at the 23rd meeting of the Council of the Heads of Government (CHG) of the Member States of the SCO attended among others by Chinese Premier Li Qiang. His remarks came amid the lingering military standoff between Indian and Chinese troops in

eastern Ladakh and concerns over China's increasing military muscle-flexing in the Indian Ocean and other strategic waters. "If activities across borders are characterised by terrorism, extremism and separatism, they are hardly likely to encourage trade, energy flows, connectivity and people-to-people exchanges in parallel," the external affairs minister said without

naming Pakistan Jaishankar arrived in Islamabad on Tuesday, becoming the first Indian foreign minister to visit

Pakistan in nearly a decade. He led the Indian delegation at the SCO-CHG summit in the Pakistani capital city. Ahead of the deliberations, PM

Sharif shook hands with Jaishankar and warmly received him and other leaders of the SCO member nations at the Jinnah Convention Centre, the venue of the summit.

In his remarks, the external offairs minister sai must be based on mutual respect and sovereign equality and that the SCO member nations can benefit immensely if the group-ing moves ahead collectively with mutual trust.

He, especially stressed on adhering to SCO charter, highlighting its underlying essence of strengthening mutual trust, friendship and good neighbourliness

"It should recognise territorial integrity and sovereignty. It must be built on genuine partnerships, not unilateral agendas.

It cannot progress if we cherrypick global practices, especially of trade and transit," he said, in remarks seen as an indirect reference to China's assertive behaviour on several critical issues such as trade and connectivity.

"But most of all, our endeavours will progress only when our commitment to the Charter remains firm. It is axiomatic that development and growth requires peace and stability.

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### **Cabinet increases MSP** of six Rabi **crops for 2025-26**

Tn a significant boost for **L**farmers ahead of Diwali, the Union Cabinet chaired Prime increase in Minimum Support Price

(MSP) of six mandated Rabi crops for 2025-26 marketing season in the range of ₹130-300 per quintal. The hike in MSP is significant ahead of

elections in states like Maharashtra, Jharkhand and Delhi. Rabi marketing season begins from April 2025. The decision was announced by Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw

The MSP for wheat has been raised by ₹150 per quintal, moving from ₹2,275 to ₹2,425 for the 2025-26 Rabi marketing season. The ₹150 per quintal hike in wheat support price is significant ahead of elections in states like Maharashtra, Jharkhand and Delhi. Rabi marketing season begins from April 2025. Mustard saw a hike of ₹300, bringing its MSP to ₹5,950 per quintal, while the MSP for Gram/Chana was increased by ₹210 bringing the new rate to ₹5,650 per quintal.

The higher MSP for mustard and chana is expected to provide farmers with better returns and encourage more cultivation of this oilseed, which is crucial for India's pulses and edible oil supply. Mustard is widely grown in states like Rajasthan, Haryana, and Madhya Pradesh while chana is widely consumed by a larger part of the population. Continued on page 2



## Traffic jams on the Ring Road go round and round...


Severe congestions on routes along, Ashram, Sarai Kale Khan, Majnu Ka Tila, Hanuman Setu, Rajghat

BY SANJAY RAI The traffic on Ring Road is anything but a smooth circle, if anything it resembles a 'jalebi' with two wheelers, autos and even rickshaws crossing lanes in a bid to get ahead in the bumper-tobumper traffic on the circular road. From Majnu Ka Tila to Hanuman Temple these jams are making the drivers sweat in their vehicles. There is a severe traffic jam on both sides of this route from Majnu Ka Tila to Hanuman Setu. This adds to the problems of the drivers coming to Majnu Ka Tila from Rajghat side, and those coming to Hanuman Setu from Majnu Ka Tila side.

On Tuesdays, there is a severe traffic jam on both sides in front of Hanuman temple. All efforts to reduce this jam have failed. Recently, traffic signals have been installed at the end of Hanuman Mandir Setu by Delhi Traffic Police. But this has not resulted in much improvement right now.

After the inauguration of Ashram Flyover, and Ashram Flyover Extension, people were expecting some relief from the jam, but due to the bottleneck near Sarai Kale Khan on the Ring

Road, the mess remains. As soon as one descends from the Ashram flyover to the Ring Road, the traffic jams begin, due to which it takes more than halfan-hour for people to cover the



distance of about half a kilometre to Sarai Kale Khan. This is due to the ongoing construction work of the rapid rail at Sarai Kale Khan.

Meanwhile, traffic jams continue on six roads of outer Delhi. Even emergency vehicles, ambulances and fire engines also get stuck in this jam. At the same time, due to the bottle neck near Haiderpur Badli Mod on Outer Ring Road, the traffic of sixlanes gets reduced to four lanes. The jam here is due to the narrow railway bridge. Vehicles coming without stopping from elevated road Pitampura get stuck in traffic as soon as they reach here. Several meetings have also been

held between the Public Works Department (PWD) and Railways. According to PWD sources the width of this bridge can be increased soon if mutual consent is reached. Due to the construction work of

Outer Ring Road Metro, there are traffic jams from Prashant Vihar to Rohini Jail Mod. it takes about 30 to 40 minutes to cover three kilometres in, whereas earlier it used to take five to seven minutes. Vehicles coming from KN Katju

route are stuck in traffic jams as soon as they reach the outer ring road. E-rickshaws and other vehicles parked haphazardly below Rithala metro station, add to the mess.

## School girl gang-raped, bathed in acid in Bengal

The cold horror of RG Kar Medical College and Hospital rape and murder case returned on Wednesday, this time at Krishnagar in Nadia district where a teenage girl was allegedly gang-raped and literally bathed in acid before her body being dumped barely a few hundred metres of the city offices of the District Magistrate and the Superintendant of Police, triggering fresh round of protests. The incident takes place little more than two months of RG Kar rape and murder of an onduty lady doctor and within a fortnight of Joynagar rape and murder case of a 10-

year-old school girl. The body of the 18-year-old victim was found inside a Laxmi Puja pandal in the wee hours of Wednesday, family members said adding her face had melted as acid was poured on her apparently to hamper identification. Rahul Basu the boy friend of the girl has been arrested, police said.

"We have lodged an FIR and arrested the alleged boy friend of the victim based upon the complaints of the family members and two other persons have also been detained for questioning," district SP Amarnath K said adding "investigation is on to discover other information."

"My granddaughter went missing in the evening of

## No necessity of seeking NOC of any kind by power discoms: DDA

The Delhi Development Authority on Wednesday said that there shall be no necessity of seeking any No Objection Certificate (NOC) of any kind from the authority by the power discoms, stating they may provide new or renew old connections at their own level suo

In an official order, the DDA said, "In this regard, in supersession of all previous orders issued, it is hereby clarified that DISCOMs may issue fresh electricity connections suo- moto for constructions within the notified PM-UDAY colonies, lal dora and extended lal dora areas by referring to the list of such areas."It added that for vacant patches of private land completely encircled by PM-UDAY colonies and not situated at the periphery of the boundary of PM-UDAY colonies, the DISCOMS may issue fresh electricity connections

'Cases where pre-existing permanent electricity connections were surrendered in lieu of reconstruction, renovation or change of ownership, the DIS-COMS may issue fresh electricity connections suo-moto," it readIt also stated that the discoms may follow their existing protocol prior to June 26, 2023 in issuing fresh electricity connections in respect of MCD regularized colonies, plots allotted under 20 points programme

and industry/godown situated in non-conforming areas regularized by GNCTD prior to issuance of notification of land pooling regulations.

It will also in regards to JJ clusters where land rights have been given by DDA or any other government agency prior to issuance of notification of land pooling regulations, government establishments and cases where vertical and horizontal extensions were added to the existing construction."Hence, in all the above instances, the DSICOMS may provide new/ renew old connections at their own level suo moto and there shall be no necessity of seeking any clarification / NOC of any kind from

Addressing party workers at the launch, Kejriwal said, "People have been asking why I was arrested and what led to it. I've been answering these questions



Delhiite, I've written a letter addressing their questions. AAP workers will distribute this letter door-to-door until October 29, ensuring that everyone receives the answers they seek."

"Everyone knows that I have never engaged in corruption. So why was I arrested? Because the work we are doing for Delhi, the facilities we are providing to you, have threatened their political dominance. They don't want us to keep delivering services that have never been seen before in India," the letter read.

He claimed that the BJP's fear of AAP's growing influence on a national level was a key driver behind his arrest. Attacking the Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena, the former Chief Minister said, "For two years, the LG held up the Mohalla Clinic file. It was only after intense pressure, including a 10-day sit-in protest by me and my cabinet colleagues, Manish Sisodia, Satyendar Jain and Gopal Rai that we were able to move for-

He warned that if the BJP comes to power, Delhi could return to a time of long power cuts, crumbling public services, and deteriorating infrastructure. "We didn't go to jail for ourselves. If we hadn't worked for you—if we hadn't provided free servicesnone of us would have been arrested," Kejriwal alleged.

"Only you can protect the work in Delhi and the facilities you are receiving through the power of your vote. I trust that together, we will defeat every conspiracy by BJP to stop the work in the upcoming assembly elections with the power of your vote," the

letter read.

Responding to the letter, Leader of the Opposition in the Delhi Assembly Vijender Gupta called it a product of frustration. 'Kejriwal is agitated as he sees power slipping from his hands because he now realizes that AAP will lose the upcoming assembly elections and BJP's return to power is certain," he

Gupta accused Kejriwal of desperately trying to hide his corruption and scare the public by claiming that if the BJP comes to power, the free electricity and water schemes currently provided will be discontinued. While assuring residents of Delhi that no welfare scheme would be halted under the BJP, he said that the party would implement central government welfare programs in Delhi, such as the "Ayushman Bharat'

## Bomb boayes a red herring?

The issue of multiple hoax threat messages to various airlines came up before a parliamentary committee on Transport, Tourism and Culture where Civil Aviation Secretary Vumlunmang Vualnam cited the sensitivity of information due to the ongoing probe into the matter to decline to share more details.

Notably, most bomb threats turn out to be fake, the security checks, which often take a few hours, result in disruptions like delays and even rescheduling of the remainder of the flight in some cases, which hit the airlines financially. On getting a threat like this airports/aircraft, passengers are off-loaded from the plane along with cabin baggage, check-in baggage and cargo, and they are all screened again. Engineering and security teams also search the plane before it is cleared for flying again.

In the latest incident, Delhi-bound IndiGo aircraft from Mumbai was diverted Ahmedabad receiving a bomb threat, which later turned out to be a hoax. In another incident, no bomb was found aboard an Air India Express plane which landed in Singapore more than an hour after its scheduled arrival time. A Bengaluru-bound Akasa Air flight with more than 180 people on board returned to the National Capital on Wednesday afternoon following a bomb threat. Sources said the flight QP1335 landed safely at the Delhi airport.

Meanwhile the Canadian Air Force aircraft is ferrying 191 stranded passengers of an Air India flight from Iqaluit airport, landed safely in Chicago.

Intelligence sources said most of the social media accounts that issued the hoax bomb threats to airlines were found to be operating from outside the country and were immediately suspended. Cyber security agencies are also on alert and are tracking social media accounts that are linked to these false threats.

Jaishankar said the SCO's objective was to strengthen mutual trust, friendship and good neighbourliness.

## Cabinet approves increased...

Several factors contributed to the MSP hike, including a moderation in inflation, the availability of adequate wheat stocks, and softening global prices. Last year, the government had raised the wheat MSP by 7.05 per cent, the largest increase since 2014-15, to incentivise farmers to boost output.

The Commission Agricultural Costs & Prices (CACP) recommends MSP for 22 crops before the sowing period each year. There are 14 Kharif crops and seven Rabi crops covered under MSP.

The minister said the support price for wheat has been increased to ₹2,425 per quintal for 2025-26, from ₹2,275 per quintal in the previous year. The support price for safflower was increased by ₹140 to ₹5,940 per quintal from ₹5,800 per quintal in the previous

year. In case of pulses, support price for lentil (Masur) increased by ₹275 to ₹6,700 per quintal, while that for gram MSP raised by ₹210 to ₹5,650 per quintal for the 2025-26 marketing season.

Support price for barley increased by ₹130 to ₹1,980 per quintal for 2025-26 Rabi marketing season, from ₹1,850 per quintal in the previous year. The increase in Rabi crops MSP is in line with the Union Budget 2018-19 announcement of fixing the MSP at a level of at least 1.5 times the All-India weighted average cost of production

The expected margin over the All-India weighted average cost of production is 105 per cent for wheat, followed by 98 per cent for rapeseed & mustard; 89 per cent for lentil; 60 per cent for gram; 60 per cent for barley; and 50 per cent

The cabinet has set a target of procuring 160 lakh tonnes of paddy



in the Kharif season.

The biometric system for procurement at the support price will continue as it was in the previous year and electronic weighing machines will be used at all procurement centers.

## New chip-based blood test can diagnose heart attacks in minutes

 $S_{\text{ed}}^{\text{cientists}}$  on Wednesday reported a new blood test that can diagnose heart attacks in minutes rather than hours, and could be adapted as a tool for first responders and people at home. Developed by researchers at

Johns Hopkins University in the US, the stand-alone blood test provides results in five to seven minutes. It's also more accurate and more affordable than current methods.


Peng Zheng and his team created a tiny chip with a groundbreaking nanostructured surface on which blood is tested. "We were able to invent a new

technology that can quickly and

accurately establish if someone is having a heart attack," said Zheng,





closed without its conclusive redressal and the Action Taken in with the supporting information and documents at the time of closure of grievance, it "Ministries/departments shall

undertake monthly review of pension related grievances, pending on the portal to ensure the qualitative redressal of grievances within the prescribed time limit," the statement said.

Their inter se senior-

The terror began in March, and by July, attacks had escalated, with wolves often targeting children sleeping inside their homes.

With this development, it is speculated that the election on this seat could be scheduled alongside other byelections in the state.

The Milkipur Assembly seat was vacated after Samajwadi Party (SP) leader Awadhesh Prasad won the Faizabad Lok Sabha seat. The SP has already named Awadhesh Prasad's son, Ajit Prasad, as its candidate for the by-election, aiming to retain its hold on the constituency.

the Allahabad High Court. The petition challenged the validity of documents submitted by SP candidate Awadhesh Prasad during the 2022 assembly elections, where he defeated BJP's Baba Gorakhnath by over 13,000 votes. The pending petition had prevented the Election Commission from announcing the by-election for this seat.

In a video statement, Baba Gorakhnath's lawyer, Advocate Rudra Vikram Singh, clarified that the legal case, which had blocked the by-election process, would be withdrawn. He emphasized that since Awadhesh Prasad is no longer an MLA from Milkipur, the petition no longer holds ground. "We will appeal to the

High Court to withdraw the petition within the next couple of days, allowing the by-election process to move forward," Singh said

By-Elections Announced for Nine Seats in Uttar Pradesh The Election Commission has announced by-elections for nine out of the 10 assembly seats in Uttar Pradesh. The Milkipur seat in Ayodhya was initially excluded from this announcement due to the pending legal petition. Voting for the by-elections on the nine seats is scheduled for November 13, with the counting of votes set for November

The by-elections will be held in Karhal (Mainpuri), Sisamau (Kanpur), Katehari (Ambedkarnagar), Kundarki (Moradabad), Khair (Aligarh), Phulpur Ghaziabad, (Prayagraj), Majhwa (Mirzapur) and Meerapur (Muzaffarnagar)

The Sisamau seat became vacant following the conviction of SP MLA Irfan Solanki, while the remaining nine seats were vacated as the respective MLAs became members of the Lok

## **Election time**

The elections in the two states, along with by-elections, will provide a clear snapshot of the public sentiment

It is election time once again. The last round of elections in 2024 would be held in November. The Election Commission has announced that Assembly elections in Maharashtra and Jharkhand will begin on November 13. Jharkhand will go to the polls in two phases, on November 13 and 20, while Maharashtra will hold a single-phase election on November 20. The votes for both states will be counted on November 23. Additionally, dates for several Lok Sabha by-elections, including in Wayanad, Kerala, where a bypoll is needed after Rahul Gandhi vacated the seat, have been announced. The Assembly elections in Maharashtra and Jharkhand are critical for both the ruling and the Opposition parties, as they serve as key battlegrounds to gauge their standing. In Maharashtra, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) faces a formidable challenge from the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) coalition, comprising the Shiv Sena (UBT), the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) and the Congress.

The MVA aims to capitalise on public dissatisfaction over issues like economic distress and governance failures while projecting a united front despite internal tensions.

In Jharkhand, the contest is equally poised, with the incumbent Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM)-Congress alliance seeking to fend off the BJP's challenge. The ruling coalition is banking on Chief Minister Hemant Soren's popularity and social welfare schemes to retain power. However, the BJP is expected to emphasise issues like law and order and tribal rights to swing the vote in its favour. Apart from the Assembly polls, by-elections will be con-

ducted on November 13 for four Assembly seats in Punjab—Dera Baba Nanak, Chabbewal (SC), Gidderbaha, and Barnala. These bypolls are seen as indicators of the prevailing political sentiment in the regions, potentially setting the tone for broader electoral battles. In addition, the by-election for the Wayanad Lok Sabha seat in Kerala presents another crucial contest. Speculation is rife that Priyanka Gandhi Vadra may make her electoral debut from this constituency, adding a significant dimension to the Congress's campaign strategy. Elections in India are not only a period of heightened activity for political parties but also a monumental task for the Election Commission and government machinery. Conducting elections in the country is no small feat, as ensuring a peaceful, free and fair process presents significant challenge. The upcoming assembly elections in Maharashtra and Jharkhand, along with the bypolls, will serve as critical indicators of India's evolving political dynamics. As the states prepare for high-stakes battles, various political scenarios could unfold, influenced by factors like coalition strategies, regional issues and leadership challenges. But ultimately it would be the unpredictable and elusive voters who would decide the fate of the political parties.

## Haryana setback exposes cracks in INDIA Bloc




The Congress defeat has not only dampened the party's resurgence narrative but also underscored the need for a recalibrated approach to coalition politics

he Grand Old Congress Party faces criticism from its INDIA coalition partners for mishandling the recent Haryana Assembly polls, allowing the BJP to win for a third time despite ten years of anti-incumbency. Most exit polls had predicted a clear win for the Congress, but the BJP secured 48 out of 90 seats, a victory even the BJP itself was surprised by. A win in Haryana would have boosted the Congress resurgence story. However, Congress lost this fifth Assembly election recently due to internal conflicts, adding to its previous losses in Punjab, Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh. It is uncertain whether the partners will be united in fighting against the BJP. Questions like whether an alliance with AAP would have favoured Congress to win in the Haryana polls are being debated. Secondly, the defeat would impact the upcoming elections in Maharashtra and Jharkhand. The immediate impact of the Haryana result is likely in seat sharing in the forthcoming Assembly elections in Delhi, Maharashtra and Jharkhand. Thirdly, it is uncertain whether the Congress and AAP will have an alliance. The AAP has already said it will go solo. The INDIA bloc performed well in the 2004 Lok Sabha polls due to its adaptability and compro-mise. The main aim of the Coalition was to give a one-toone fight with the BJP and not split the anti-BJP votes. The Coalition put irritable issues on the back burner and managed to work well. They functioned with the sole aim of defeating the BJP and, to a certain extent, succeeded. The BJP majority was reduced, and the govern-

Leaders from the Trinamool Congress, AAP, Shiv Sena (Uddhav), National Conference, RJD, Nationalist Congress Party, and others were critical of the Congress for messing up the Haryana polls. Shiv Sena mouthpiece Saamna said, "No one thought the BJP government would be elected in Haryana again. It seems Congress's overconfidence and arrogance of local Congress leaders led to the party's defeat," the Marathi paper said in its editorial on Wednesday. Repeating the

Lok Sabha polls for seat sharing is crucial, at least in the Maharashtra and Jharkhand polls. The subdued Congress will not have the upper hand in seat sharing with most of its allies. The present mood in the INDIA coalition must impact Congress's relations with its partners.

The Opposition may not be able to withstand any more shocks. Congress must focus on the 286 seats in a direct fight with the BJP. The 2024 polls proved the Congres' strike rate against the BJP rose to 29 per cent from 8 per cent in 2019. Significantly, the number of seats in which the Congress fought with the BJP was 286, down from 370 in 2014. Congress came to power in 2004 and 2009 because of its cordial relationships with the partners. The onus for keeping the alliance is broadly on the Congress. It must realise that every partner, small or big, is essential. Congress has had introspection sessions, and Panchmadi and Shimla are good examples. It is time for one more such session.

ndian women are increasingly taking on obliga-Lions that exceed 55 hours per week. They manage to pursue their professional careers while also managing a household—what one may refer to as the "second job." It reveals an unsettling fact about the intimidating pressure on women to perform above their capabilities. Although this problem between job and private life affects women all over the world, it is especially difficult for Indian women due to cultural expectations, societal standards and the long-held conviction that they "must do

The question arises: why is there so much pressure on Indian women to push themselves beyond their breaking point? The answer lies in deeply ingrained gender roles and societal expectations. While strides have been made in women's empowerment, the onus of managing the household and caring for children continues to largely fall on their shoulders, even as they excel in their careers.

As more women enter the workforce and pursue professional goals, the expectation

## Stubble burning crisis needs practical solutions

Without swift and sustained efforts, northern India would face yet another year of deteriorating air quality, leaving millions to grapple with bad air quality



he Supreme Court has taken a strong stance against the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) for its failure to control stubble burning, a major contributor to air pollution in Delhi-NCR. The court's rebuke, delivered during a hearing on October 3, emphasised the need for effective ground-level interventions and questioned why the Commission had not implemented any provisions of the relevant Act to curb pollution from crop residue burning. Stubble burning, especially in the northern states of Punjab, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh, has been a major environmental challenge for years. Farmers often resort to burning crop residue after harvesting paddy and wheat due to the increasing mechanisation of farming, the use of combined harvesters, a shortage of labour, and rising labour costs. This practice, prevalent in October and November following the paddy harvest, results in the release of lar amounts of particulate matter into the atmosphere, contributing to the hazardous air quality in Delhi-NCR.

The Supreme Court's criticism of the CAQM reflects a broader frustration over the Commission's inability to effectively tackle this issue. Despite being set up three years ago to address pollution in the National Capital Region and surrounding areas, the CAQM has been criticised for its slow pace and lack of tangible outcomes. The court particularly highlighted that the Commission meets only once every three months, a frequency deemed inadequate for addressing a recurring crisis like stubble burning.

Moreover, the Commission has issued only 82 directives since its inception, a number that the court described as insufficient to deal with the scale of the problem. A significant concern raised by the Supreme Court is the lack of adequate staffing within the pollution control boards of Delhi-NCR and other affected states, including Uttar Pradesh. The

court ordered that these vacant posts be filled by April 30, 2025, to improve monitoring and enforcement capabilities. Effective staffing is critical for implementing measures on the ground, particularly when dealing with farmers who rely on burning crop residue as a quick and cost-effective way to clear their fields.

Despite repeated interventions from both the National Green Tribunal (NGT) and the Supreme Court, stubble burning incidents continue to surge. Last year alone, more than 33,000 incidents of stubble burning were recorded in Punjab, even after explicit instructions to engage with farmers to explore alternatives. The lack of a coordinated effort between the state governments and the CAQM has only exacer-MECHANISATION bated the pollution crisis during the winter months.

Turning Stubble into a

Resource: While the focus remains on the failures of the CAQM and the continued challenges in states like Punjab, Uttar Pradesh has emerged as a notable example of how stubble can be managed more sustainably. The state has successfully implemented initiatives that transform stubble into an energy resource and natural fertiliser, benefiting both the environment and the agricultural community.

The key to this transformation has been the establishment of Compressed Biogas (CBG) plants that convert crop residue into energy and high-quality compost. This approach has not only addressed environmental concerns but has also created an additional income stream for material for the CBG process. In this way, stubble has shifted from being a burden to becoming a valuable asset in Uttar Pradesh's rural economy. As of last year, Uttar Pradesh led the country in CBG production, with ten operational plants. Currently, 24 CBG units are active, and another 93 are under construction. The state aims to have more than 100 CBG plants operational soon, a goal endorsed by Union Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister Hardeep Singh Puri. During a March 2024 announcement, he highlighted the state's plan to double its bio-coal and biodiesel production by 2025. The success of CBG production in Uttar Pradesh has been bolstered by the Uttar Pradesh State Bio-Energy Policy 2022, which offers various incentives for establishing bio-CNG and CBG units using agri-

The policy aims to set up CBG plants in every district, providing local solutions for managing stubble while promoting energy self-sufficiency. A significant milestone in this journey was the inauguration of a CBG plant in Dhuriyapar, Gorakhpur, on March 8, 2023, by Union Petroleum Minister Hardeep Singh Puri and Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath. The plant, built for Rs 165 crore, processes 200 metric tonnes of straw, 20 metric tonnes of press mud, and 10 metric tonnes of cattle dung daily. It produces 20 metric tonnes of biogas and 125 metric tonnes of organic manure, contributing to higher agricultural yields while reducing dependency on chemical fertilisers. This initiative allows farmers to diversi-

cultural waste.

a crucial role in the energy sector. By reducing the practice of stubble burning, the state is making strides in environmental protection. The Yogi Adityanath government has expressed confidence that the enhanced produc-tion of bio-coal and biodiesel will help reduce air pollution in the region over the next five years. The Supreme Court's critique of the CAQM underscores the urgency of finding a balanced approach to stubble burning that respects both environmental concerns and the practical chal-lenges faced by farmers. Uttar Pradesh's model of converting stubble into a resource could serve as a blueprint for other states grappling with similar issues. However, the broader challenge remains: implementing such solutions at scale requires consistent policy support, ade quate resources, and a willingness to engage with farmers directly. The court's directive for the CAQM to improve its approach and for state governments to fill vacant posts by 2025 is a step towards accountability.

Yet, the real test will lie in translating these directives into action before another winter brings the familiar, suffocating haze back to the skies of Delhi-NCR. The question remains whether the CAQM, in partnership with state governments, can adapt and adopt innovative solutions like those seen in UP. Without swift and sustained efforts, the region risks facing another year of deteriorating air quality, leaving millions to grapple with the health consequences of inaction.

## Urbanisation and youth: Building a healthier future amid rapid growth

By 2050, with 70 per cent of the global population expected to live in cities, engaging youth in shaping sustainable urban future is more crucial than ever

rbanisation, an engine for economic prosperity and resources, sits at the centre of modernity and impacts health outcomes. With rapid urbanisation, the UN projects that by 2050, 7 of 10 people will live in cities, and the youth will likely be the most dominant population. The future will be forged by the ever-increasing global youth, who are integral to playing a dynamic and revolutionary role in creating and building strong, prosperous, sustainable, and vibrant societies. In recent years, international organisations have emphasised the meaningful involvement of youth as vital to accelerating progress towards the SDGs while development continues to grow globally.

that exist within it. Not all city residents experience or can access these benefits equally. For instance, 40 per cent of India's population will reside in the urban setup by 2030, with 24 per cent being the youth (15-29), making it a relatively young country. Although rapid urbanisation will continue to improve India's average household socio-economic condition and child health status, it is expected to disproportionately affect the health of urban youth, who are likely to become more vulnerable to health challenges.

Urbanisation without accounting for the primary healthcare amenities results in significant health disparities. As gentrification grows with urbanisation, a large chunk of the

urban slums and low-income areas. These areas carry distinct health challenges that are influenced by broader socioeconomic determinants such as poverty, education and employment.

Youth from low-income families and areas are more likely to face barriers to accessing education, which in turn limits job opportunities and perpetuates a cycle of poor health outcomes.

These informal settlements may sit adjacent to an affluent neighbourhood. Still, the people living there lack access to safe water and sanitation infrastructure, becoming hotspots for waterborne and vectorborne diseases due to flooding, open sewers, and overcrowding. With such poor hygiene,

In addition to infectious diseases, urban youth in lowerincome areas are increasingly exposed to non-communicable diseases such as diabetes and hypertension, which are often exacerbated by poor diet, stress, and lack of access to early diagnosis or regular health checkups.

These substantial regional disparities affecting urban youth's

living and health conditions are also caused by the inequitable distribution of clinics and healthcare centres, which limits care options. According to NFHS-3, only 39.9 per cent of urban poor children get full immunisation compared to 65.4 per cent of urban non-poor children. Lower vaccination rates and a lack of awareness of ongoing health issues negatively impact school attendance and cognitive development.

The National Urban Health Mission (NUHM), launched in 2013, has been instrumental in meeting the regulatory, reformatory, and developmental public health priorities for urban settings.

Over the years, NUHM has improved access to healthcare, allowing the urban poor

to choose public over costly private services. Among the other initiatives to focus on urban youth health, the National Youth Policy (NYP) 2021 outlines a 10-year vision for youth development by 2030, aligning with the United Nations' SDGs.

The NYP prioritises youth health as essential for India's holistic growth and progress by addressing critical health com-ponents of urban youth and acknowledging mental health. Further, India's pioneering step towards building inclusive health that benefits all and focuses on the youth also found prominence in the recent G20 New Delhi Leaders'

Declaration in 2023. The report encompasses ways to eliminate hunger and malnutrition and advance with

more health collaborations, especially when facing challenging mental health. While policies like NUHM and NYP have made strides in addressing urban youth health, more needs to be done and implemented to improve primary

Many urban healthcare centres still struggle with under-staffing, lack of resources, and accessibility issues for slum-dwelling youth. To ensure that India's urban youth thrive, it is crucial to increase investments in health services, prioritise mental health care, and continue engaging youth in the decision-making process for urban development.

## Israel strikes southern suburbs of Beirut for the first time in nearly a week

sraeli jets struck the southern suburbs of Beirut early ■ Wednesday for the first time in six days, Lebanese state media reported. The casualty count was not yet clear.

The attack comes just one day after caretaker Prime Minister Najib Mikati said the United States government gave him some assurances of Israel easing its strikes in the Lebanese

Israel says it is striking Hezbollah assets in the suburbs, where the militant group has a strong presence, but it is also a busy residential and commercial area. The Israeli military said the Wednesday strike hit a weapons warehouse under a residential building.

The Israeli military posted an evacuation warning on the X platform saying it is targeting a building in the Haret Hreik neighborhood. An Associated Press photographer who witnessed the strikes said there were three in the area. The first strike was documented less than an hour after the notice.

Hezbollah began firing rockets into Israel on Oct. 8 in solidarity with the Palestinian militant group Hamas, following their surprise attack on southern Israel. A year of low-level fighting escalated

into all-out war last month, and has displaced some 1.2 million people in Lebanon. Elsewhere, Israeli strikes late Tuesday in the southern town of Qana killed at least 15

people, according to Lebanon's Civil Defense. Nuhad Bustanji, a spokesperson for the first responders, said rescue efforts were still underway and the toll could rise. Videos

shared on social media showed the smoking ruins of a building targeted in the strike with surrounding structures damaged as well. Local media said there were sever-

al strikes in the southern town Tuesday night. Qana was the site of an Israeli artillery strike on a United Nations compound that killed dozens of civilians in 1996.

## Zelenskyy's 'victory plan' includes big hurdle for West **'NATO** membership for Ukraine'

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said Wednesday his plan to win his country's fight against Russia's invasion could bring peace next year, but it contains a step that some crucial Western allies have so far refused to countenance: inviting Ukraine to join NATO before the war ends.

"If we start moving according to this victory plan now, it may be possible to end the war no later than next year," Zelenskyy told his country's parliament.

He has recently been trying to win approval for the plan from Western partners, who so far have stopped short of publicly voicing their support for it.
The first point in Zelenskyy's five-

point plan that was presented in a speech to the Verkhovna Rada, Ukraine's parliament, is perhaps the most ambitious and the most likely to make Western allies balk: letting Ukraine into NATO while the fighting continues.

Zelenskyy said granting Ukraine membership in the alliance would be a "testament of (allies') determination" to support Ukraine. It may, however, be too ambitious a step.

NATO's collective security guarantee — Article 5 of the military alliance's treaty — is the pillar on which its credibility is based. It is a political commitment by all member countries to come to the aid of any member whose sovereignty or territory might be under attack.

NATO makes its decisions by consensus, and many allies including the United States and Germany — refuse to allow Ukraine in while fighting continues because they fear being dragged into a wider war with Russia.

At their summit in Washington in July, NATO's 32 members declared Ukraine on an "irreversible" path to membership in the Western military alliance. Any decision on offering to start membership talks is probably not likely before the next summit in the Netherlands in June.

Ukraine's troops are having trouble holding back Russia's military might, especially in the eastern Donetsk region where they are gradually being pushed backward. Though Russia's gains have been incremental, its steady forward movement is slowly adding up and Ukraine keenly feels the need for more large-scale Western help.

But there are signs that Western support may be waning, diminished by a focus on the Middle East wars and domestic political concerns. The US elections next month could bring a major shift in Ukraine's fortunes, as Washington has been the biggest provider of military aid. Zelenskyy publicly acknowl-

edged for the first time that in private talks with Ukraine its Western partners are increasingly talking about "negotiations" with Russia and much less frequently use the word "justice" in conversations about the war.

He also dialled up the stakes in Ukraine, repeating his recent claims that North Korea is now sending military personnel to help Russia's war effort, as well as delivering ammunition, and that Iran and China are also aiding

Zelenskyy's "victory plan" contains confidential sections which he didn't mention in Parliament, officials said.

Other aspects of the plan include continued striking of targets on Russian soil, including the incursion into Russia's Kursk border region that began in August and more long-range drone strikes on Russian infrastructure.

Ukraine, he said, also needs more air defence systems and access to a broader range of intelligence from allies.

Zelenskyy noted that Ukraine is rich in natural resources, including critically important metals 'worth trillions of US dollars," such as uranium, titanium, lithium, graphite and others.

Those Ükrainian assets, as well as the country's agricultural production, are among Russia's key targets in the war, he said, but could be shared in postwar times with partners.

Also in a postwar period, battlehardened Ukrainian troops would be an asset for NATO efforts to keep Russia at bay.

## At least 100 killed as gasoline tanker explodes in Nigeria

More than 100 people have been killed and 50 others injured after a gasoline tanker overturned in Nigeria and sparked an explosion as dozens of people rushed to the vehicle to scoop up the fuel, police said Wednesday. The explosion occurred past midnight in Jigawa state's Majiya town after the tanker driver lost control of the vehicle while

town after the tanker driver lost control of the vehicle while travelling on a highway close to a university, police spokesper son Lawan Adam said. Deadly tanker accidents are common in Nigeria, Africa's most

populous country, where traffic regulations are not strictly enforced in many places and there is a lack of alternatives such as an efficient railway system to transport cargo.

It is also common for people to salvage fuel after such acci dents, especially with Nigeria's soaring fuel prices. Residents who heard about the latest accident rushed to the scene and were scooping up fuel, "sparking a massive infer-

no that killed 94 people on the spot," Adam said. Videos that appeared to be from the scene showed a massive fire stretching across the entire area, with what appeared to be bodies littered at the scene.



### Jinping's rare visit to province facing Taiwan

AP TAIPEI (TAIWAN)

China's President Xi Jinping made a rare visit to a province facing Taiwan following military exercises that mobilised China's navy, air force, missile force and land troops to simulate a blockade of the self-governing island democracy that Beijing claims as its own territory and threatens to annex by force.

Xi did not comment on the mil itary exercises during his visit to Fujian province, according to the official Xinhua News Agency, but his visit came on the heels of China's dispatch of a record 125 aircraft, as well as its Liaoning air craft carrier and ships, in largescale military exercises surround ing Taiwan and its outlying islands on Monday.

Xi has largely avoided public over the past year, but bringing Taiwan under Beijing's control remains a priority for his administration as head of the ruling Communist Party and its military, the People's Liberation Army. Taiwan's newly elected president Lai Ching-te has been vociferously criticized by Beijing for rejecting its position that Tawian is a part of China.

The drills came four days after Taiwan celebrated the founding of its government on its National Day, when Taiwanese President Lai Ching-te said in a speech that China has no right to represent Taiwan and declared his commitment to "resist annexation or encroachment"

## Mexican president acknowledges killings of 3 civilians by military

President Claudia Sheinbaum said a soldier was killed in one of the shootouts, as well as two adults and an 8-year-old girl. She said the events on Friday and Saturday are under investigation. But Sheinbaum gave no sign of backing away from the outsized role that she and her predecessor have given to the armed forces. The events in Nuevo Laredo, across the border from Laredo, Texas, started Friday when a nurse, her husband and son found themselves on a road where soldiers were pursuing suspects' vehicles. The husband, . Víctor Carrillo Martínez, told

of Nuevo Laredo said a young man's tortured body was found nearby in a truck that the army and National Guard had been pursuing. Sheinbaum confirmed the two deaths, saying the shootings had involved the militarized National Guard.

"In case there has been any misbehavior by any member of the guard or the army, or any official,

it will be punished," she said. The Defense Department, which controls the National Guard, said it had no immediate com ment on the shootings.

Last week, the army was involved in another shooting that killed six migrants and wounded 10. In the incident near Tapachula, close to the border with Guatemala. soldiers claimed they heard "detonations" and opened fire on a truck carrying migrants from Egypt, Nepal, Cuba, India, Pakistan and El Salvador.

The dead included an 11-yearold Egyptian girl. The area is often used by migrant smugglers, but warring drug cartels also operate in the region.

#### Bodies of 5 Russian climbers who died on Nepal peak have been retrieved **AP** KATHMANDU

The bodies of five Russian mountaineers who died on the world's seventh-highest peak were retrieved from the mountain on Wednesday and flown to Kathmandu.

The bodies were picked up by rescue helicopters from base camp on Wednesday. They were then transported from the airport in Kathmandu to the morgue at Tribhuvan University Teaching Hospital. The Russians were climbing the 8,167-metre (26,788-foot) high Mount Dhaulagiri during Nepal's autumn climbing sea-

The climbers were reported missing on Oct. 6 and a rescue helicopter spotted their bodies two days later. Bad weather and the location of the bodies made it difficult for rescuers to retrieve the bodies.

Two of the climbers reached the summit, the while other three had turned around without reaching the top before teammates at base camp lost radio contact with them.



## **Indian-origin candidates in race** for Oxford University Chancellor

The University of Oxford on Wednesday announced the 38 finalists in the race to be elected the new Chancellor of the University of Oxford, which includes Indian-origin candidates but excludes former Pakistani prime minister Imran Khan.

Ankur Shiv Bhandari, the first Indian-origin Mayor of Bracknell Forest in Berkshire; Nirpal Singh Paul Bhangal, a Professor of International Entrepreneurship; and Pratik Tarvadi, a medical professional, will go head-to-head with academics, politicians, philanthropists and entrepre-

Former Conservative Party leader Lord William Hague and former Labour politician Lord Peter Mandelson are among the senior politicians selected, with Khan deemed to have been disqualified following the selection process.

"Applications were considered by the Chancellor's Election Committee solely on the four exclusion criteria set out in the university's regulations. All applicants have been notified whether their submissions have been successful," a university statement reads. Under some of the declared university criteria, candidates for the unremunerated role had to demonstrate outstanding achievements in their field and the ability to command

respect beyond it. They also had to prove a deep appreciation for the university's research and academic mission, its global community, its ambition to remain a world-class research and teaching university; and the ability and willingness to enhance the reputation of the university locally, nationally and abroad.

While the university did not specify any reasons for individual disqualifications, some experts had indicated that Khan's criminal convictions in his country may disqualify the former Oxford alumni.

Members of the world-leading university's Convocation, consisting of staff and graduates of Oxford University, will now vote online to elect the successor of Lord Patten, a former governor of Hong Kong, who retires at the end of Trinity Term 2024 after 21 years as Chancellor.

During the first round of voting, in the week commencing October 28, voters will have the opportunity to rank as many candidates as they choose. The top five candidates, who will be announced in the week commencing November 4, will proceed to the second round of voting scheduled for the week beginning November 18. The University of Oxford's new Chancellor will be announced in the week of November 25. The incoming Chancellor will

## Senior US official warns of N Korean nuclear threats

US Deputy Secretary of State Kurt Campbell said on Wednesday that Washington and its allies are "alarmed" by North Korea's nuclear and missile threats as well as its increasing military support for Russia's war in Ukraine, but said he couldn't confirm Ukrainian claims that Pyongyang was also sending soldiers to fight for Moscow.

Campbell spoke with reporters following discussions with South Korean and Japanese counterparts on reinvigorating an international pressure campaign against North Korea, which faltered in recent years amid a deepening divide at the UN Security

Earlier on Wednesday, Washington, Seoul and Tokyo announced plans with eight Western governments to launch a new multinational team to monitor the enforcement of sanctions against North Korea. Russia in March vetoed a UN res-

olution in a move that effectively abolished monitoring by UN experts of Security Council sanctions against North Korea, which prompted Western accusations that Moscow was acting to shield its arms purchases from Pyongyang to fuel its war in Ukraine.

North Korea was increasing its support of materials, including artillery and missiles, to support Russia's war on Ukraine, which he said was "creating further instability in Europe".

Campbell said there are signs that

ue to monitor the situation closely," Campbell said about the claims.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has claimed that North Korea is sending military personnel to help Russia's war effort without providing details. Ukrainian media reported earlier this month that six North Koreans were among those killed after a Ukrainian missile strike on October 3.

North Korea has also been making increasingly provocative threats against rival South Korea, including accusing the South of infiltrating drones to drop anti-North Korean propaganda leaflets over Pyongyang and threatening to attack the South if it happens again.

North Korea also on Tuesday blew up the northern sections of unused road and rail routes that once linked it with South Korea in a choreographed demolition aimed at demonstrating its growing anger with South Korea's conservative government.

Musk has taken on Indian billionaires Mukesh Ambani and Sunil Bharti Mittal over the allocation of spectrum wireless communication using satellites, calling their demand for the auction of airwaves "unprecedented".

While Ambani's Reliance Jio has been vocal about the need to allocate such spectrum through an auction to give a level-playing field to legacy operators who buy airwaves and set up infrastructure like telecom towers, Mittal on Tuesday articulated the need satellite companies



ambitions to buy spectrum as telecom companies do. Starlink Musk-led demanding administrative allotment of licences in line with the global trend, as it looks to tap into the world's fastest-growing

mobile telephony and internet market. This has found some backing in Telecom Minister Ivotiraditya Scindia, who said on Tuesday that such airwaves will be given out through administrative allocation and

authority for telecom, and that regulatory authority has been empowered by the constitution to decide what that administrative pricing is going to be," he had said. The minister had said that he

is very confident that Trai will come up with the best pricing that should be adopted, provided that it is being given in an administrative manner. "Satellite spectrum across the world is allocated administratively. So, India is not doing anything different from the rest of the world. Conversely, if you do decide to auction it then you would be doing something, which is different from the rest of the world." the minister said. world," the minister said.

Pointing out that satellite spectrum is shared airwaves, Scindia said, "If the spectrum is characteristics about the satellite spectrum is characteristics." is shared then how can you price it individually".

## India reiterates opposition to China's Belt and Road Initiative

India on Wednesday once again refused to endorse China's ambitious 'One Belt One Road' initiative, becoming the only country in the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) not to support the controversial connectivity project connectivity project.

joint A joint communique unveiled at the end of the SCO's Council of Heads of Government conclave hosted by Islamabad said Russia, Belarus, Iran, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan reaffirmed their support for the Chinese connectivity initiative.

It said the countries noted ongoing work on the implementation of project, including efforts to link the Eurasian Economic Union with the One Road One Initiative (OBOR).

India has been refusing to endorse OBOR in previous SCO conclaves as well.

India has been severely critical of the OBOR, previously known as the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), as the project includes the socalled China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) that passes through Pakistanoccupied Kashmir.

There has been growing global criticism against the OBOR as a number of countries are reeling under the burden of debt while implementing projects relating to the initiative.



In his address at the SCO conclave, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said, "debt is a serious concern" but did not elaborate further. "Collaborative connectivity can create new efficiencies, he said.

The joint communique said the heads of delegations noted the proposal to create a Eurasian 'Greater Partnership' with the participation of the SCO, Eurasian Economic Union, Association of Southeast Asian Nations as well as other states interested multilateral associations.

"The heads of delegations, reaffirming their desire to ensure stable economic and social development in the SCO region, noted the importance of implementing SCO Economic Development Strategy for the period up to 2030 and the programme of multilateral trade and cooperation of the SCO member states," it said.

India head coach Santosh Kashyap is expecting a close contest. "I have watched Pakistan's recent matches, including the one against Singapore, where they put up a tough fight and narrowly lost 1-0. They have strong physicality and play good football.

"All the teams are very close in terms of quality, and they fight hard. Whether it's the men's or women's teams, we can't afford to think we are the favourites and will win easily. When asked about Ashalata

Devi's milestone, coach Kashyap said, "It's a great achievement for her as well as for women's football. I always tell young players to look up to her and how she has maintained herself for such a long time."

Pakistan, who have players like Maria Khan and Nadia Khan in the ranks, will not be pushovers. Skipper Maria is an experienced midfielder, who plies her trade for Saudi Arabian pro side Eastern Flames. position. The top six teams in the region will secure automatic berths in the next World Cup. The seventh-place team, currently Bolivia, will play in an international playoff for a spot in the tournament in 2026.

Two more rounds of South American World Cup qualifying will be played in November.

## When Rohit Sharma explained "significance of Gabba" to young Pant

m or}$  some time, Rishabh Pant couldn't understand why fans had gone hysterical after his unbeaten 89 against Australia at the Gabba in 2021 until Rohit Sharma stepped in to tell him that his knock was not just another match-winning effort in an epic Test.

A second string India, without its then regular skipper Virat Kohli, senior player KL Rahul and three main bowlers, had beaten Australia by three wickets at a venue which was considered a fortress for the home team there since 1989.

It was a chase of 328, and Pant's counter-attacking knock was not just a match-defining one. It was to find a place among the greatest innings by an Indian in adverse overseas conditions.

"Sometimes, there are performances that you remember for a lifetime, and one of them for me is the Gabba Test," the 27year-old told Star Sports' 'Star Nahi Far' event.

Initially, it was just satisfaction of winning a tough Test for India but as time went by, Pant understood the magnitude of his achievement, something that Rohit had told him about.

"At the time, I didn't realise how significant it was. Rohit bhai was there, and he told me, 'You have no idea what you've done.' I was like, 'What have I done? My aim was just to win the match.' Rohit bhai said, 'Later, you'll understand what you've done," he recalled.

"Now, whenever I hear people

talking about that Gabba match, I understand what he meant and how important it was," the Delhi player said. No greater feeling than beating Australia

Pant has commanded the cricketing world's awe and respect for coming back after recovering from a life-threatening car accident in 2022. This was after he made a name for himself Down Under for being a significant contributor to India's back-toback Test series wins.

His career-best 159 came in Sydney during the 2018-19 In the 2021 series, he scored 97

in Brisbane to earn respect and adulation from both the fans and the opposition team.

"When you go to Australia, you have to work more on handling the bounce and short balls because the wickets are different there, and the atmosphere is dif-

ferent," he explained.
"They don't want you to win, which makes it more fun. There's no greater feeling than going to Australia and beating them in their home."

What impresses Pant about Australia is their strategy to always hunt in a pack and the gutsý keeper-batter is a firm peliever in counter-punching. "In general, Australia fights as a team. They don't give you anything easy, and they play aggressive cricket. I won't throw the first punch, but if someone throws the first punch at me, I won't hold back

"That's the kind of mentality you need to have when playing against them," he said.

## Neetu David becomes second Indian woman to be inducted into ICC Hall of Fame

 $F^{\rm ormer\ India\ spinner\ Neetu\ David,\ who}_{\rm still\ holds\ the\ record\ for\ the\ best\ figures}$ (8/53) by a woman in an individual Test innings, on Wednesday became only the second female cricketer from the country to be inducted into the ICC Hall of Fame. David, the current chairman of selectors for Indian women's team, enters the ICC Hall of Fame a year after the induction of former captain Diana Edulji.

David made more than 100 appearances (10 Tests and 97 ODIs) for India as a prolific left-arm spinner and was inducted alongside South Africa and England legends AB de Villiers and Alastair Cook, joining a long list of great cricketers.
The 47-year-old David is the second-

highest wicket-taker for India in ODIs cricket with 141 scalps and was also the first female player from the country to claim 100 wickets in the 50-over game. Topping the wicket-taking list at the World Cup in 2005, to inspire her country to their first-ever final, is also among her

standout achievements. David said in an ICC release: "It is truly an honour to be inducted into the ICC Hall of Fame, something that I consider to be the highest recognition available to anyone who puts on their national team jersey.

'This comes after a lifetime of dedication to this great sport, and it caps a very special journey for me to get to this point. "To be considered a Hall of Famer alongside the greatest players that ever σ and part of this exclusive club."

Following some impressive performances with the ball at domestic cricket for Uttar Pradesh, David won a first international appearance for India as a 17-year-old in a



Test against New Zealand in Nelson in

She impressed with four wickets in that contest and was again selected for the ODI leg of that tour as India claimed the New Zealand Women's Centenary Tournament. In late 1995, David truly rose to prominence as she recorded sensational figures of 8/53 — still the best individual bowling spell in a single innings of a women's Test — against England in Jamshedpur as India fell to a narrow two-

While David excelled at Test cricket with 41 wickets from 10 matches, it was in ODI cricket that she performed best with 141 scalps from 97 matches at a miserly bowling average of 16.34.

David retired from international cricket in 2006, only to reverse that decision two later for a brief return in ODI cricket at the Asia Cup and on India's tour of

England. She played her final domestic match in Women's T20 League title.

Cook represented England over 250 times in international cricket, making his most significant impact in the longest format. He retired from international cricket in 2018 as England's highest Test run-scorer and century-maker, spearheading notable successes both home and away with the bat and as captain.

In his 14-year-long career, de Villiers hit over 20,000 international runs across all three formats.

De Villiers, fondly known as "Mr 360", excelled in Test and T20I cricke while setting South African records for the fastest fifty, century and 150 in ODI cricket to earn a reputation of being one of the most feared, destructive batters in the history of the game.

# Handling pressure will play a big part in Jaiswal's success

Yashasvi Jaiswal was oblivious to the cheers of a handful of spectators as he walked across a soaked M Chinnaswamy Stadium turf on Wednesday, chatting intensely with assistant coach Abhishek Nayar.

for him to spend an hour at indoor nets as rain held up the first day's play of the opening Test between India and New Zealand.

After all, he is going through a roseate phase in Test cricket for over a vear now.

But that deep caring for his craft and a focused mind will come handy when Jaiswal crosses over to Australia next month for the biggest challenge yet in his fledgling career, feels his childhood

coach Jwala Singh.
"At this level, it is more about how you handle pressure. You can always work on technique, but if you don't have the right attitude and mindset then you will end up as a failure. But fortunately, Yashasvi has a mature head on his shoulder," Iwala told PTI when he was informed about skipper Rohit Sharma's high evaluation of his younger colleague.

"It is even more true when you go and play in Australia because they play some hard cricket there and put a lot of pressure on opposition," he added added.

As someone who saw Jaiswal from a very young age, Jwala feels that the 21-year-old has grown as a batsman since making his debut in 2023 against the West Indies.

"I think being around players like Rohit and Virat has helped him a lot. After all, there is nothing like learning from such masters," he said.

Since his baptism international cricket, Jaiswal has made 1217 runs from 11 Tests at an average of 64.05 and has three daddy knocks - 171, 209 and 214.

So, what are the changes that he has observed in the lefthander in the last one year or

"He always has been aggressive as a batsman. Earlier, he had a tendency to attack almost every ball, especially fast bowlers, but now he uses aggression more judiciously. "Yashasvi now has more awareness of his game. He has

better awareness about which ball to attack and which one to let go. Of course, he has also

become a very good fielder now, especially in slip region,' Iwala noted. The trait was visible in Jaiswal's

batting while going through a breakout series against England earlier this year. The way he handled

legend James Anderson was impeccable. At Rajkot, Jaiswal respectfully patted a fuller length delivery from Anderson back to the bowler in the 85th

But once the pacer erred in length, Jaiswal creamed the Lancastrian's next three balls for sixes — a sweep over square leg, a loft over mid-wicket and straight mousse over the

bowler's head. Jaiswal was highly effective against Anderson throughout the series — extracting 98 runs from 150 balls that he faced off the quick and getting out twice. It was not entirely surprising then that he became only the second Indian batter after the legendary Sunil Gavaskar to score over 700 in a series.

But then it is always easy to play down that wonderful run citing home advantage, as Australia offers a vastly different challenge. What are the challenges a sub-continent batter will face

Down Under?

"First thing first, what India did in Australia during their last two visits here has been fantastic. Not many teams have managed that (winning backto-back series). So, the Aussies will go hard at Indians to overturn it.

"I am sure they are going to pepper them with some short stuff and I guess the pitches too could offer some more

"In that sense, I think the batters coming here should be well-prepared to play a few more cuts and pulls," former England pacer Alan Mullaly, who is now settled in Perth, told PTI.

India skipper Rohit Sharma had little doubt about the skill level and adaptability of Jaiswal.

"He has got the game to play in all sorts of conditions. You can bet on him and expect him to do wonders for the team. We've found a great player.

'Now, it is just about how he manages himself in the next couple of years," said Rohit.
