PAKISTAN ADMITS KARGIL WAR FOUGHT BY ITS SOLDIERS, NOT MUJAHIDEENS



Pakistan Army Chief General Asim Munir admits Pak army's role in Kargil war, says several Pak soldiers died in the 1999 Kargil War against India



Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif to order the withdrawal of Army personnel from the Kargil sector. The day is observed as 'Kargil Vijay Diwas' to commemorate India's victory over Pakistan in the war. A total of 545 soldiers laid down their lives fighting the Pakistani intruders. India has always maintained the operation was a strategy by Pakistan to assert its claim over Kashmir. India has several evidence of involvement of the Pakistani army in Kargil, including prisoners of war, their pay books, uniforms, and weapons. The Indian Army buried several dead Pakistani soldiers in Kargil after the war. The Pakistani Army had refused to accept the bodies of soldiers killed in Kargil. The authorities had secretly sought bodies of Pakistani officers killed in the war. India has consistently asserted that the conflict was a direct act of aggression by the Pakistani military. The Pakistani army's intrusion into Kargil with terrorists as a cover became evident from the intercepted conversation between General Pervez Musharraf (while visiting Beijing) and his Chief of General Staff Lt Gen Mohammed Aziz in Rawalpindi on May 26 and May 29.

Pakistan for the first time has admitted its soldiers fought in the Kargil war in 1999. This assertion came from none other than Pakistan Army Chief General Asim Munir. Islamabad, till now, denied any role in the conflict and maintained 'mujahideens' (freedom fighters) waged the war. India had all along reiterated that Pakistan army

soldiers were actively involved in the war. Speaking at an event in Rawalpindi to mark the country's Defence Day, Pakistan army chief General Munir said several soldiers had laid down their lives while fighting the wars in 1965, 1971 and in Kargil in 1999. "Be it 1948, 1965, 1971, or the Kargil war of 1999, thousands of soldiers have sacrificed their lives for Pakistan and Islam," the Army chief said.

"The Pakistani community is a community of braves which understands the importance of freedom and how to pay for it," General Munir said. The event was attended by senior military and governmental officials, and families of soldiers. The Pakistani army has never publicly acknowledged its direct role in the Kargil War and has officially claimed that it was the work of 'mujahideen or freedom fighters.' In fact, it

refused to take bodies of its dead soldiers during the Kargil war. Pakistan suffered a crushing defeat in the war, with Indian soldiers successfully reclaiming the positions occupied by infiltrators on the Indian side of the Line of Control (LOC) in the Kargil sector, including Tiger Hill, after a nearly three-month-long battle. Then US President Bill Clinton also asked Pakistani

HM Shah vows to decimate the Opposition in J and K elections

Predicting the Assembly poll results in advance, Union Home Minister Amit Shah Saturday declared the National Conference and the Congress will never be able to form a government in Jammu and Kashmir. Shah said the BJP will contest and win these elections with full strength. He also emphasized that the election results will be decided by the people of Jammu. Addressing the 'Karyakarta Sammelan', a day after releasing the party's Sankalp Patra (Manifesto) here in Jammu Shah motivated the booth-level party workers to launch a door-to-door

campaign to ensure the formation of the BJP government. "We just don't have to defeat them, we have to seize their deposits." "I am reading the writing on the wall that NC and Congress will never form a government. They are the people who forced Maharaja Hari Singh to exile and only his ashes could be brought back after his death," Shah said. The movement started by Pandit Prem Nath Dogra was ended by PM Modi Ji on August 5, 2019. He said, "It is a coincidence that the first election rally of BJP is starting on the day of Ganesh Chaturthi and we all know that Lord Ganesh destroys all the obstacles of

the path". The Union Home Minister said the upcoming elections are historic. For the first time since the country's independence, the voters of Jammu and Kashmir will cast their votes under the tricolor. For the first time, votes will be cast under the Constitution of Baba Saheb Ambedkar and not under two constitutions. For the first time, no PM will sit in Jammu and Kashmir as only one person can be PM. These elections are taking place out of the shadow of article 370 and we have seen its results in Lok Sabha elections." More than 58 percent of voters participated in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls.

Brij Bhushan gloats Phogat's Olympic miss

Fresh controversies have surrounded former Olympian wrestlers Vinesh Phogat and Bajrang Punia who has joined Congress to contest the forthcoming assembly elections in Haryana. While the wrestlers employer Indian Railways has given a notice seeking explanation to serve the three months notice period, their intentions to join politics were questioned by former BJP MP and Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh against whom wrestlers levelled sexual harassment allegations. Bhushan accused that the protests against him over sexual harassment allegations were nothing but a political conspiracy by Congress two years ago. In his first response Brij Bhushan accused Phogat of "cheating" by taking another wrestler's spot at the Olympics. He claimed Phogat the "face of the Congress conspiracy" and claimed that she was part of a

plot hatched against him by Congress leader Deepender Hooda and the Hooda family. He further added that Phogat of cheating to attend the games saying she could not win a medal because God had punished her. Hitting back, Punia said Singh's remarks reflect his mindset, adding, "It wasn't just Vinesh's medal, it was a medal for 140 crore Indians. He is taking satisfaction in her loss." Punia further alleged that Vinesh Phogat's failure to secure a medal at the Paris Olympics had been a moment of national sorrow, but the BJP's IT Cell launched a campaign to mock and belittle her. While Phogat has been fielded for the polls, Punia was appointed as the working chairman of the All India Kisan Congress. The BJP leader also alleged that Bajrang Punia participated in the Asian Games without completing the trials. Meanwhile, Punia questioned the patriotism of those who

celebrated Vinesh Phogat's disqualification, asking whether they could truly be considered "deshbhakts." He stressed that he and others had been fighting for the country since childhood, while those who criticise them "dare to teach patriotism" and are involved in "molesting girls," he alleged. Congress sources said the BJP's intention to prevent Phogat from contesting after she has resigned from her department will go futile since both the former railways employees have resigned with immediate effect and the railways have no choice but to either waive off the three months notice period or curtail financial benefits. Both have been served a show cause notice by Indian Railways and sources in the railways said as of now the resignations were not accepted and technically they continue to be a government servant. The election commission mandates that the contestant should not be a government employee.

Puja Khedkar discharged unceremoniously

Centre has discharged Puja Khedkar, former probationary civil servant, from the Indian Administrative Service (IAS) with immediate effect, official sources said on Saturday. Khedkar has been accused of cheating and wrongly availing Other Backward Classes (OBC) and disability quota benefits to ensure her selection in the service. She has denied all allegations.

The central government, vide order dated September 6, 2024, discharged Khedkar from the Indian Administrative Service under Rule 12 of IAS (Probation) Rules, 1954, with immediate effect, the sources said. The rules allow the central government to discharge probationers from service if they fail "to pass the re-examination..." or "if the central government is satisfied that the probationer was ineligible for recruitment to the Service or is unsuitable for being a member of the Service", among others.

The Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) had on July 31 cancelled her candidature and debarred her from future exams. Khedkar was serving as a probationary IAS officer in her cadre state Maharashtra. She had allegedly changed her name and parents' names to appear for the examination more times than what is allowed. "The UPSC has examined the available records carefully and found her guilty of acting in contravention of the provisions of the CSE-2022 Rules. Her provisional candidature for the CSE-2022 has been cancelled and she has also been debarred permanently from all the future examinations/selections of the UPSC," a UPSC statement has said.

Fresh violence in Manipur

Five people were killed in fresh violence in Manipur's Jiribam district on Saturday. Security forces, on the other hand, destroyed three bunkers of militants in Churachandpur district on Friday after the insurgents launched rocket attacks in adjoining Bishnupur that killed one person and injured six others. Manipur Chief Minister N Biren Singh called an

emergency meeting with MLAs from the ruling coalition, which comprises the BJP, Naga People's Front, and National Peoples Party (NPP), on Saturday evening to discuss the prevailing law and order situation in the state, official sources said. The meeting, scheduled to take place at the Chief Minister's bungalow, is expected to focus on critical decisions concerning the recent attacks on civilians by armed men from elevated hill areas, sources added. Additionally, the legislators,

along with Singh, may also meet the governor, though this is yet to be confirmed. On Saturday, one person was shot dead in his sleep while four others were killed in subsequent exchange of fire between people of two communities in Jiribam district, a police officer said. Militants entered the house of the person who lived alone at an isolated location around 5 km from the district administration headquarters and shot him dead in his sleep, he said.

Chief Minister to honor tribal students in Khalwa

Chief Minister Yadav will honor selected students going abroad for higher education, including those who have returned after completing their studies abroad, benefiting from the Foreign Study Scholarship Scheme of the State Government. On this occasion, Minister of Tribal Affairs, Public Assets Management and Bhopal Gas Tragedy Relief and Rehabilitation Dr. Kunwar Vijay Shah will also be present. Since the start date of the State Government's Foreign Study Scholarship Scheme, a total of

Both students have returned home after completing their studies. Similarly, the Chief Minister will also honor two students of Indore district, Shri Bharat Chopra and Lawrence David. Both students have been selected for foreign study this year. Due to the special efforts of Tribal Affairs Minister Dr. Kunwar Vijay Shah, promising student Shri Asharam Palavi, who is going to London for foreign studies, will also be honored. Asharam from Garbedi village of Khandwa district has been selected for foreign studies this year. The state government has sanctioned Rs 35 lakh as scholarship to Asharam,

who overcame extremely difficult circumstances and continued his studies. Asharam will now complete his M.Sc. course in Geographical Information Science at the University of Leicester, London. Four minors kill youth over petty dispute

Four minors killed a 24-year-old youth over a minor dispute, accused attacked the youth and killed him, dispute was over staring. The incident happened on Friday night. Police have registered a case of murder against the accused. The minors had attacked him with sharp-edged weapons and injured him seriously. Police said that they have started searching for the absconding accused. Police say that they will be caught soon. Bagh Sewania TI said that the real reason for the murder will be revealed after the arrest of the accused. According to the police, Raj Yadav, who works as a laborer, lives in Arvind

Vihar Colony. On Friday, his nephew Ganesh alias Gajendra Yadav was returning home after work. Then on the way, four minor boys standing on the way near Sharma Complex were staring at him. When Ganesh asked the reason for staring, they started arguing and after a fight, attacked him with a knife and fled. As soon as the news of the attack was received, the police reached the spot and admitted the injured to the hospital for treatment where he died at around 4 am on Saturday. On receiving the information, the police reached the hospital and took the body of the deceased into custody and sent it for postmortem. The uncle of the youth Ganesh told that he was stabbed 3 times in front of him.

Raj Yadav, an eyewitness of the incident, said that my nephew Ganesh and I work as laborers. We both had gone to the grocery store. I was buying goods there, Ganesh sat on a plank nearby. Meanwhile, four youths came, they started staring at my nephew. When the nephew asked the reason for staring, they started abusing. When the nephew protested, the accused stabbed him three times with a knife, one on the neck, one on the hand and the third on a finger of the hand. Additional DCP Mahavir Singh Mujalde said that youths suddenly attacked after a dispute. Four minor suspects have been detained. They are being questioned. After that, the real reasons behind the murder will be revealed.

Political flutter over Digvijay's remarks, Rameshwar calls him new 'Jinnah'

War of words between Congress' Rajya Sabha member Digvijay Singh and the BJP leaders has commenced once again in Madhya Pradesh. BJP MLA Rameshwar Sharma, on Saturday, said that veteran Congress leader Digvijay Singh was trying to establish himself as the new 'Jinnah' in the country. He also accused the Congress of conspiring to give ST/SC's reservation quota to the Muslim community to secure its vote bank. "Digvijay Singh is trying to establish himself as the new Jinnah. I would urge Lord Ganesha to enlighten him," the BJP MLA said. Sharma, a third-time MLA from Bhopal's Huzur Assembly constituency who has established himself as a hardcore

Hindutva leader here in Madhya Pradesh BJP unit, made this remark while responding to Digvijay Singh's statement. He said: "The number of Muslims in government jobs is less than that of the people of SC/ST category." Former Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Digvijay Singh had earlier said while addressing a gathering of the office-bearers of the Association of Muslim Professionals in Bhopal on Friday, "Only 74 per cent of Muslims have formal education and the number of women with formal education is still less than their male counterparts." Responding to Digvijay's statement, Sharma said, "Digvijay Singh should tell why the Congress regime failed to provide education to Muslims. Now they want to give ST/SC's reservation quota to Muslims



for vote bank." Sharma, who often makes controversy with his statements on minority communities and leaves no opportunity to comment on Digvijay Singh, alleged that during the Congress regime, Madrasas were established more than schools. "They (Muslims) would send their children to Madrasas to make them Jihadis, then how would they become SP and Collectors? The BJP govern-

ment is making all efforts to bring them into mainstream education. It will take some time to bring change," the BJP MLA said. BJP State President Vishnudutt Sharma said that Digvijay Singh has no pain for the poor. Digvijay Singh is feeling pain because Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has worked to make SC, ST brothers and sisters in the country comfortable, empowered and capable and has brought happiness in their lives. Digvijay Singh, who does the politics of appeasement, feels that SC, ST have got more and Muslims are getting less. In fact, by saying this, Digvijay Singh is insulting SC, ST brothers and sisters. Shri Sharma said that Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's government is working on the mantra of Sabka Sath, Sabka Vikas and Sabka Vishwas without any

discrimination. Sharma said that Digvijay Singh is trying to appease the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe brothers and sisters by snatching their rights along with supporting terrorists. The Bharatiya Janata Party and I oppose this effort of Digvijay Singh, so he has become nervous. Let me make one thing clear, BJP will not let Digvijay Singh's attempt to appease the Dalit and tribal brothers and sisters by snatching their rights succeed. The kind of language he has used is not right. Digvijay Singh, whatever your effort is for appeasement, I challenge that maleness of yours too. I will not use such words, the small and mild words you have used, but your mentality is unfortunate. Even today Digvijay Singh and Congress are doing appeasement in the country.

Bhopal receives 16 pc more rainfall than normal

Bhopal has received 16% more rainfall than normal, i.e., 43.6 inches, Met has observed that the weather will remain the same for the next 4 days. Heavy rain may occur from September 11. After the rain stopped in the catchment area, the gates of Bhadbhada dam have been closed. The gates of Kaliyasot and Kerwa dams are also closed. However, the gates of the dam opened again due to heavy rain. Devotees are carrying the idol of Pratham Pujya Shri Ganesh amidst huge rains. So far, about 43.6 inches of rain has occurred in Bhopal, which is 116 percent in the season. The normal rainfall of the district is 37.6 inches. The quota of the season was full in July and August. The water that is flowing in September is in the form of bonus. That is, 16 percent of the water has been paid in the form of bonus

in the fall. Trend of good rain in September Trend of good rain in the year 1961, there is a record of 30.2 inches of rain in the entire month. This time it is raining heavily in the beginning of September. There is a trend of pouring about 7 inches of water in September. This time more than three and a half inches of rain has been received so far. This time the monsoon in Madhya Pradesh is meeting the expectations. In just 75 days, the quota of normal rain has been filled in 28 districts including Bhopal-Gwalior. Among these, there are 23 districts where more than 100% of the rain has fallen. Sheopur has received the highest rainfall of 167%, while Rewa has received the lowest rainfall of only 60%. There are also 8 districts which are on the verge of normal rainfall. 90% or more water has fallen here. However, one and a half

inch of rain is still needed to complete the quota of normal rainfall in the state. As soon as one and a half inch of rain falls, the quota of normal rainfall will also be completed. Till date 35.8 inches of rain has fallen in the state from 1st June 01 to September 05, whereas till now 32.4 inches of rain should have fallen. 14.5 inches of water fell in August. This is one and a half inches more than the quota. The average rainfall in August is 13.1 inches. This time it rained for about 25 days in August. Due to this, all the dams and ponds of the state were full. Rivers were in spate. There was a spell of heavy rain in the first 3 days of September as well. As soon as 1.5 inches of rain falls, the quota of normal rainfall of MP will also be completed. If this happens, then it will be the sixth consecutive year when there will be more rain than normal.

Train derailed in JBP

Bhopal: Two coaches of the Indore-Jabalpur Express derailed on Saturday (7 September) while the train was approaching the Jabalpur station. No passengers were injured in the incident, which occurred around 5.40 am. The Indian Railways has started restoration work at the site, and a committee has been formed to investigate the derailment. Jabalpur station falls under the jurisdiction of the West Central Railway (WCR) zone. The coaches that derailed were reportedly located just behind the engine, with the accident happening around 50 meters from the platform. However, the loco pilot immediately halted the train, preventing further damage to other coaches. However, no passengers were harmed in the incident. All the passengers disembarked safely, and train traffic on nearby tracks was halted for about 30 minutes.

Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi to visit India on Monday

Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi Sheikh Khalid bin Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan will begin a two-day maiden visit to India on Sunday to hold wide-ranging talks with Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The visit will further reinforce strong ties between India and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and open avenues for partnership in new and emerging areas, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said, announcing the trip. Prime Minister Modi and the Crown Prince will hold talks on Sunday covering a wide range of areas of bilateral cooperation, it said. Besides bilateral issues, the two leaders are also expected to deliberate on the overall situation arising out of the Israel-Hamas conflict. The visiting leader is also scheduled to call on President Droupadi Murmu. He will visit Rajghat to pay tributes to Mahatma Gandhi. The Crown Prince will be accompanied by several Ministers from the UAE Government and a business delegation. After concluding the Delhi leg of his visit, Al



Nahyan will travel to Mumbai to participate in a business forum on Monday. Top business leaders from both countries will participate in the forum. "At the invitation of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi Sheikh Khalid bin Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, will pay an official visit to India on

September 9 and 10," the MEA said on Saturday. The MEA also referred to the boosting of bilateral cooperation in a range of areas in the last few years. "India and UAE share historically close and friendly ties. In recent years, the Comprehensive Strategic Partnership between India and the UAE has deepened in a wide range of areas including

political, trade, investment, connectivity, energy, technology, education, and culture," it said. Following the landmark visit of Modi to UAE in August 2015, bilateral relations between the two countries were elevated to a Comprehensive Strategic Partnership. Both countries signed a Comprehensive Economic

Partnership Agreement (CEPA) in February 2022 and a Local Currency Settlement (LCS) System in July 2023 to promote the use of Indian Rupee and AED (United Arab Emirates Dirham) for cross-border transactions. The two countries are among each other's top trading partners with a bilateral trade of about USD 85 billion in 2022-23, according to official data. The UAE is also among the top four investors in India in terms of foreign direct investments in 2022-23. About 3.5 million strong and vibrant Indian community forms the largest expatriate group in the UAE. The UAE was invited as special invitee for G20 during India's Presidency of the grouping. In February 2023, the India-UAE-France (UFI) trilateral was formally launched. With India's active support, the UAE joined SCO as dialogue partner in May 2023. The UAE also joined BRICS as a member on January 1 with India's support. The India-UAE defence cooperation has also witnessed a renewed momentum in the last few years. In January 2024, the first India-UAE bilateral army exercise 'Desert Cyclone' was held in Rajasthan.

About 62000 cases pending in High Courts since 30 years

There are nearly 62 thousand cases pending in various high courts, which are more than 30 years old, including three awaiting disposal since 1952. According to official data, there are four cases pending since 1954 and nine since 1955 in High Courts. Out of the three cases pending since 1952, two are in the Calcutta High Court and one in the Madras High Court. Addressing the national conference of district judiciary here earlier this week, President Droupadi Murmu had called for a change in the "culture of adjournments" in the judiciary. She said long-standing pen-

denalty and backlog of cases is a big challenge before the judiciary. "All stakeholders have to find a solution by giving priority to this problem," the President said. As many as 58.59 lakh cases, including 42.64 lakh of civil nature and 15.94 lakh of criminal nature, are pending across high courts. According to the National Judicial Data Grid (NJDG), nearly 2.45 lakh cases are pending in high courts which are 20 to 30 years old. Addressing the same event, Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal had called for breaking the perception that Indian courts follow the "tareekh pe tareekh culture". He said the law

Ministry has analysed that there were cases pending since five, 10, 15, 20 and 30 years. He said an analysis of pending cases mentioned on the NJDG shows that parties involved in litigation are either not present or not interested in taking the case forward. He said 25 to 30 per cent of such cases can be closed in one go. In this regard, some high courts have taken effective steps. Referring to the concepts of 'ageing analysis' and 'clubbing of similar cases', he said these have helped settle pending cases in a time-bound manner. More than five crore cases are pending in various courts, including district courts, High Courts and the Supreme Court.



India willing to work with like-minded partners on specific agenda: Jaishankar

India would be willing to work with like-minded partners on specific agenda and its role in the Quad is an example of such an approach, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said on Saturday, while calling for reformed multilateralism. In a virtual address at the FPCI Global Town hall, Jaishankar, delving into major geopolitical developments, said the world is looking at a more "sharpened contestation" between the US and China on a range of areas. He underlined that even as the world looks "complicated", India's desire and determination to ensure its stability and contribute to its prosperity is only getting stronger. The Quad, comprising India, the US, Australia and Japan, has emerged as a key coalition focusing on working towards ensuring a free, open and rules-based Indo-Pacific against the backdrop of

China's growing muscle-flexing in the region. In the context of key directions and developments in international relations over the last few decades, the External Affairs Minister observed that many big powers are now content to do less and the newer ones are more reticent in stepping forward. "In many situations, it is left to the regionally significant players to sort out their own particular mess. Beyond this, we are also looking at a more sharpened contestation between the US and China on a range of areas," he said. "If we also take into account that technology advances like AI, electric mobility, space or drone can shape balances of power more strongly, then the global calculus looks even more daunting," he added. "This, in essence, is the world that we deal with," he said. The External Affairs Minister then explained what a country like India can do in response to such a situation. "First, it can build up its own

national capacities so that there are more options and contributions that benefit the world. We have seen this recently during the Covid pandemic in terms of vaccine production capacity," he said. "Or in the Arabian Sea to strengthen maritime security. As indeed, the supply of food grains to those in great need. Second, to de-risk the global economy from pandemics, climate events and conflicts, help build more resilient, reliable and redundant supply chains," he said. This, Jaishankar argued, means working with global partners more efficiently and create an environment where it is easier to do business. "Many of the recent infrastructure initiatives in India will make a difference in that regard. Third, in the digital domain, create trusted partnerships and trusted vendors," he said. This will ensure that the sensitivities at home that we have about our data are equally respected when they cross the borders, he noted.

Government making efforts to recognise bright teachers practising innovative methods: PM

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said efforts were being made to recognise bright teachers practising innovative methods as he took an apparent swipe at past Governments, saying he would not talk about what used to happen earlier. In an interaction with teachers who were conferred National Teachers' Awards, he said they could prepare young students for 'Viksit Bharat'. The interaction took place on Friday while its video was shared on Saturday. Modi suggested that the teachers could involve the students in selecting the top 100 tourist destinations in the country by encouraging them to learn about different places they might visit as part of education tours. The teachers awarded were



selected after a long process as their efforts can be useful in the new National Education Policy (NEP), Modi said while noting

that there would be many others doing excellent work. He told the teachers to take their students to nearby uni-

versities and watch sporting events as the experience could fire up their dreams. As many as 82 teachers from

around the country were selected for the award. They included 50 teachers by the Department of School Education & Literacy, 16 by the Department of Higher Education and 16 by the Union Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, an official statement said. Modi suggested that the awardee teachers connect with each other on social media and share their best practices so that everyone could learn, adapt and benefit. He highlighted the impact of the NEP and spoke about the significance of attaining education in the mother tongue. The Prime minister suggested that the teachers teach local folklore to their students in different languages so that they learn multiple languages and also get exposure to India's vibrant culture.

Rahul Gandhi-led Bharat Jodo Yatra a historic mass movement: Congress

States, UTs surpass 50 per cent rural tap water coverage: Government

All States and Union Territories have surpassed 50 per cent coverage of tap water connections in rural households, as per official data. The Har Ghar Jal scheme ie 'Water to Every Household', a program launched in 2019 by the Ministry of Jal Shakti as a part of the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) aims to extend tap water connections to all rural households by the end of this year. Currently, all States and UTs have achieved over 50 per cent coverage, with 11 States and UTs reaching full coverage. As of now, all States and Union territories (UTs) have more than 50 per cent coverage of tap water connections in rural households with 11 States and UTs having 100 per cent coverage. The States and UTs with 100 per cent cov-



erage of tap water connections in rural households are Goa; Andaman & Nicobar Islands; Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu; Haryana; Telangana; Puducherry; Gujarat; Punjab; Himachal Pradesh; Arunachal Pradesh; and Mizoram. The least coverage has been recorded in

West Bengal at 52.30 per cent, Rajasthan at 52.91 per cent, Kerala at 53.62 per cent, Jharkhand at 54.26 per cent, and Madhya Pradesh at 64.84 per cent, according to the data. Out of a total of 19,33,38,234 (19.33 crore) rural households, 16,09,75,396 (16.09 crore) have been provided with tap water connections so far. The Har Ghar Jal scheme was initiated by the Union Ministry of Jal Shakti under the Jal Jeevan Mission in 2019 with the aim to provide 55 litres of tap water to every rural household per capita per day by 2024. According to an official, beyond the numbers, the mission's impact was visible in flood-prone areas such as Assam, where climate-adaptive water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) structures were in place to ensure access to clean water even during natural disasters.

Chhabra is also the chief of the Spine and Rehabilitation Centre at Sri Balaji Action Medical Institute, President of the Spinal Cord Society and Chairman of the Spine Wellness & Care Foundation, further said, "Our ongoing efforts in prevention, early intervention, and comprehensive management including rehabilitation are vital to improving the quality of life for those affected." The programme highlighted the importance of spinal cord injury awareness and the need for comprehensive care and rehabilitation. According to a report of the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, as many as 16,397 persons lost their lives in road accidents in 2021 by not wearing seat belts, including 8,438 drivers and 7,959 passengers.

South enjoys Vinayaka Chaturthi festivities, Telangana CM joins in celebration

Prominent Ganesha temples such as the ones at Pillayarpatti in Sivaganga and Malaikottai in Tiruchirappalli, both in Tamil Nadu, and the Manakula Vinayakar temple in neighbouring Puducherry with devotees. Telangana CM Reddy participated in a well-attended Ganesh Puja at Khairatabad in Hyderabad. JD(S) leader and Union Minister HD Kumaraswamy held prayers at Bengaluru. Celebrations were also held in some temples in Kerala. In Tamil Nadu, the famous Ganesha temple (Malaikottai

Uchhi Pillayar) atop a hill in Tiruchirappalli was decked up for the festival. In keeping with the tradition, a huge Kozhukkattai, a sweet made from rice flour, jaggery and coconut was made for the deity. It was packed in a big vessel and it was suspended from a decorated bamboo pole and it was carried all the way upto the hill temple by people to offer it to Lord Ganesha. Traditional music was played and a pontiff led the procession of offering the mega sized sweet, which weighs over a 100 kilos, to the Lord. Similarly, the festival was celebrated with spiritual fervour at the ancient Pillayarpatti temple with devotees lining up the temple precincts to have darshan and a "Theerthavari" (poojas in temple tank) was held. Clay idols of Lord Ganesha were installed at homes and poojas were held. Market places wore a festive look as people flocked shops and roadside stalls to buy pooja items, flowers and fruits. Ganesh pandals, organised by Hindu outfits and individuals as well featured several themes including 'environment friendly, farmer Ganapathi', (Chennai) and a 'justice dispensing court Ganapathi' (Krishnagiri).



At some places in the state, police denied permission to install Ganesha idols due to alleged violations, like failing to secure proper permission and flouting norms on ensuring environment friendly idols. In Chennai, the actors' association, (Nadigar Sangam-South Indian Artistes Association) held 'Annadhanam,' a distribution

of food to the people. In neighbouring Puducherry, people thronged Manakula Vinayagar temple since early morning to offer worship to the presiding deity. Special poojas and other rituals were performed to Lord Ganesha. Chief Minister N Rangasamy, Home Minister A Namassivayam and leaders of political parties were among those who greeted the people

on the occasion. In Telangana, the nine-day-long festivities commenced on a grand scale and Chief Minister Revanth Reddy attended the puja at the famous pandal at Khairatabad in Hyderabad, known for the giant size of the idol. This year a 70 ft idol was installed for worship at the pandal, which attracts

thousands of devotees during the festival observed for nine days. Several pandals were set up across the state, especially in Hyderabad. The state government has made elaborate security arrangements for the festival and also for the immersion of idols in water bodies after the conclusion of the worship. Clay Ganesha idols are gaining more popularity with each passing year in the state, as part of initiatives to promote greener celebrations. At Kurnool in Andhra Pradesh, a 63-feet Ganesha idol made of eco-friendly materials was set up on the banks of Tungabhadra river and Hubballi in Karnataka witnessed elaborate security arrangements for the festival. In a visual treat, at Koppal (Karnataka), 2,000 students came together and sat down and also stood in patterns to form specific shapes to create the form of a giant Ganesha. Tamil Nadu police said processions for the immersion of the idols will be held on different dates in the state. As many as 64,217 police personnel have been deployed to regulate traffic and maintain law and order during the installation and immersion of the idols.

Goa celebrates Ganesh Chaturthi; make it eco-friendly, appeals CM

Ganesh Chaturthi marks the beginning of the festival. Chief Minister Pramod Sawant held a puja at his private residence at Kothambi, Pale village, in his constituency of Sankhali in North Goa. In a message released after performing the puja, Sawant said may Lord Ganesh give wisdom and prosperity to everyone in the state. He appealed to people to celebrate the



festival with utmost sensitivity towards the state's ecology. "Let's celebrate an eco-friendly Ganesh festival," he said. Many Sarvajanic Ganeshotsav mandals across the state have set up huge, attractive pandals with elaborate decorations to house big idols. While households immerse their idols of the deity in nearby waterbodies after two days, five days, seven days or eleven days, the Sarvajanic Ganeshotsav at public places continues for a longer time.

Greenpeace India warns of deteriorating air quality in Bengaluru, Mangaluru, Mysuru

Three major cities in Karnataka -- Bengaluru, Mangaluru, and Mysuru -- have registered deteriorating air quality as the air pollution is on the rise, said a Greenpeace India report on Saturday. The report, 'Spare the Air 2' flags serious health concerns as the average PM 2.5 and PM10 levels soar in 10 major cities of southern India, significantly exceeding the air quality guidelines set by the World Health Organization (WHO). PM2.5, or fine particulate matter, is a type of air pollution that consists of tiny particles that are 2.5 micrometers or less in diameter. PM10 is an air quality term for particulate matter that is 10 micrometers. The report has analysed the air quality standards of Bengaluru, Chennai, Visakhapatnam, Kochi, Mangaluru, Amravati, Vijayawada, Visakhapatnam, Bengaluru, Mysuru and



Puducherry. The lead researcher of the report Akanksha Singh said, "Clean air is fundamental to our health, yet this report reveals that particulate matter levels in all cities have surpassed the revised WHO guidelines. While current efforts are focused on cities not meeting the national ambient air quality standards, it is crucial to also address those cities that are currently in compliance. "Proactively managing air quality in these areas can help prevent them from falling

into non-attainment." When compared with WHO guidelines, the annual average PM2.5 levels are found to be six to seven times higher in Hyderabad, Vijayawada, Kochi, Mangaluru, Amaravati, and Chennai. Additionally, comparing PM10 levels with WHO guidelines reveals that Bengaluru, Puducherry, and Mysuru have annual averages that exceed these guidelines by four to five times. "To address this, we continue urging the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) to

adopt a health-based approach in revising the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS), striving to meet WHO's latest scientific guidelines," said Selomi Garnaik, Greenpeace India's campaigner. According to her, given the distinct pollution profiles and climatic conditions of southern cities, it is crucial to establish region-specific air quality standards aligned with local airshed management. "This tailored approach will ensure more effective measures for managing air pollution and safeguarding public health in these regions," added Garnaik. The report strongly advocates for new NAAQ standards considering the unique pollution profiles and climatic conditions of South Indian cities. It also recommends increased investment towards developing a 'hybrid' air quality monitoring network facilitating real-time public access to air quality information.

BJP only party in which people coming from ordinary families can also become PM: Nadda

BJP president J P Nadda on Saturday took a jibe at the opposition saying all other parties are restricted to dynasty politics, while in sharp contrast, BJP is the only party in which people coming from ordinary families can also become the prime minister of the country. Speaking at BJP's online membership drive function here, Nadda said in BJP everybody has equal rights and opportunity. "All other political parties are restricted to just dynasty politics...Or some parties represent certain community...BJP is the only party in which people coming from ordinary families also become the prime minister of the country like Narendra Modi Ji," he said. "In our party...everybody has equal rights and opportunity. In other parties, you can become president only if you belong to a particular family, particular caste etc. But, BJP is the party that represents the



entire society", said Nadda. Speaking on the party's ongoing membership drive, recently launched by PM Modi, Nadda said BJP is the only party in which the prime minister, national president, state president, mandal president, district president, booth president... All have to renew their membership every six years. This is not possible in any other party because all other parties are either parties of a particular caste or a particular community or a family. "BJP is the party of people belonging to all sections of the society. We are the party of villagers, poor, farmers, dalit, tribals, youth, weaker and socially marginalised sections of the society. Under

the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, around four crore houses have been built for the poor so far, out of which about 1.77 crore houses have been distributed among our Dalit and tribal brothers. Similarly, our Dalit brothers are getting the maximum benefits from government development schemes." Nadda also the Union Health minister said. 1 passenger killed, 16 injured after bus overturns in Pathankot

The wounded, two of them with serious injuries, were admitted to a local hospital, they said. Himachal Pradesh roadways bus was coming from Chamba in Himachal Pradesh and was heading towards Amritsar, they added. Police said a 22-year-old passenger from Punjab's Batala died in the accident.

Odisha CM Mohan Majhi flags off Subhadra Yojana Awareness Rath

We will ensure that no beneficiary is left out and all eligible beneficiaries get the benefits of the scheme," she said. The DyCM said that before launching of any major

programme, confusions do prevail and it is natural. The awareness chariot will clear doubts in the minds of the people. "The government will reach out to all beneficiaries. I assure that no one will be left out under the scheme," she said. Under the scheme, the women beneficiaries will receive Rs 10,000 per annum for five years. The first instalment of Rs 5,000 will be given on September 17, on the occasion of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's birth anniversary. Officials said that the state government has set a target to enroll at least 1 crore women beneficiaries under Subhadra Yojana, a promise made by the BJP in its election manifesto.

MP Government announces ₹1 crore assistance for kin of soldier killed in road accident

The deceased soldier originally hailed from Hardua village in Katni district of the state. "I offered floral tribute to the brave soldier at Khajuraho airport. Rs one crore will be given to his parents as the deceased was not married.



The state government stands with the bereaved family in this hour of grief," Yadav said. The last rites of Patel will be performed in Hardua village in the evening. Four Army personnel, including sepoy Pradeep Patel, were killed when a vehicle carrying Army's EMC personnel skidded off a road along the Rhenock-Rongli highway and rolled down into a forest in Sikkim's Pakyong district on September 5, police said.

Police stations in Assam need to be made more people-centric: Himanta

Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Saturday said with militancy-related incidents decreasing in the state, police stations have to be transformed into more people-centric places. Sarma also emphasised the role of 'Nagarik Samitis' (citizen committees) in assisting police personnel in public service responsibilities. "For the last three decades, Assam was fighting insurgency. Counter-insurgency measures were the focus points for police. I won't say that insurgency has been completely wiped out, but incidents are coming down. The police stations have to be transformed into



more people-centric places," he said. The CM was speaking at the first state-level conclave here of 'Nagarik Samitis' from all 307 police stations in the state. Maintaining that the long and difficult nature of duty of police personnel tend to make them tough in their regular dealings, he said the role of Nagarik Samitis in helping the personnel to

engage in civil work can also ease some stress. Sarma said positivity created within the society can lead to slow but permanent social transformation for the better, and the samitis can help the police force in discharging the public service responsibilities entrusted on them. "Policing has two aspects - administration of criminal justice and public service. The first aspect is addressed by the Bharatiya Nyay Samhita. Criminal justice, criminal investigation, filing of chargesheet are dealt in the first aspect by the OCs; the samitis don't have anything to do in this regard. "They (the samitis) have to maintain good relations between the police station and the public," he said.

BJP polarising people ahead of assembly polls in Jharkhand: D Raja

CPI general secretary D Raja on Saturday accused the BJP of poaching leaders from other parties and raking up issues like infiltration to polarise people ahead of the assembly polls in Jharkhand. Raja arrived in Jharkhand earlier in the day to discuss the party's strategy for the assembly elections in the eastern state later this year. "The BJP and its conservative allies are targeting ruling parties in Jharkhand. In order to cripple functioning, they poach leaders from ruling parties if possible. This is happening in Jharkhand," he told reporters here. "On the issue of infiltration, if they are serious about it, the Union home minister should give an explanation to the country. Instead, they are targeting



some states in order to create confusion and conflict among communities," Raja alleged. The saffron party has been making allegations of increased infiltration in Jharkhand, especially in the Santhal

Parganas. The senior CPI leader also claimed that the BJP would face defeat in the upcoming assembly elections Jammu and Kashmir, Haryana and Maharashtra. "The way the wrestlers were treated during their protests at Jantar Mantar Delhi was shameful. Now, there is anger not only among sports persons but also among people of Haryana," he said. Raja also said there is "resentment" among people of Maharashtra, who are now "questioning the policies of the central government". He said the Communist Party of India (CPI) would try to unite all secular democratic parties, which have come under the banner of the INDIA bloc, to win the assembly polls in Jharkhand, and "teach a lesson to the BJP and right-wing forces".

16-year-old girl killed, two injured as truck hits school goes in UP; kin, students protest

A 16-year-old girl lost her life and two other teenagers were injured here on Saturday morning when they were hit by a truck, while they were on their way to school on their bicycles, police said. Angered over the incident, the victims' family members, villagers, and the school's students staged a sit-in protest. According to the police, the accident took place near Pyarepur turn in Salon



police station area of Raebareli district. Shaileja died on the spot, while two other girls -- Kanchan (17) and Aarti (16) -- got injured and were admitted to the district hospital, they said.

The victims were students of a government-aided school in Raebareli, they added. Family members of the girls and villagers started protesting on the Raebareli-Pratapgarh road. A large number of girl students of

the school also joined them and sat on the road in protest, the police said. Traffic on the stretch was disrupted for a long time before police officials intervened and pacified the protestors. Salon Circle Officer Salon Pradeep Kumar said the villagers called off the protest after they were pacified. He said that the body of the deceased has been sent for postmortem, and added that the search for the truck driver is on.

Starliner returns to earth, without crew

Boeing's first astronaut mission ended Friday night with an empty capsule landing and two test pilots still in space, left behind until next year because NASA judged their return too risky. Six hours after departing the International Space Station, Starliner parachuted into New Mexico's White Sands Missile Range, descending on autopilot through the desert darkness. It was an uneventful close to a drama that began with the June launch of Boeing's long-delayed crew debut and quickly escalated into a dragged-out cliffhanger of a mission stricken by thruster failures and helium leaks. For months, Butch Wilmore and Suni Williams' return was in question as engineers struggled to understand the capsule's problems.

Boeing insisted after extensive testing that Starliner was safe to bring the two home, but NASA disagreed and booked a flight with SpaceX instead. Their SpaceX ride won't launch until the end of this month, which means they'll be up there until February — more than eight months after blasting off on what should have been a quick trip. Wilmore and Williams should have flown Starliner back to Earth by mid-June, a week after launching in it. But their ride to the space station was marred by the cascade of thruster trouble and helium loss, and NASA ultimately decided it was too risky to return them on Starliner. So with fresh software updates, the fully automated capsule left with their empty seats and blue spacesuits along with some old station equipment.



"She's on her way home," Williams radioed as the white and blue-trimmed capsule undocked from the space station 260 miles (420 kilometers) over China and disappeared into the black void. Williams stayed up late to see how everything turned out. "A good landing, pretty awesome," said Boeing's Mission Control. Cameras on the space station and a pair of NASA planes caught the capsule as a white streak coming in for the touchdown, which drew cheer. There were some snags during reentry, including more thruster

issues, but Starliner made a "bull's-eye landing," said NASA's commercial crew program manager Steve Stich. Even with the safe return, "I think we made the right decision not to have Butch and Suni on board," Stich said at a news conference early Saturday. "All of us feel happy about the successful landing. But then there's a piece of us, all of us, that we wish it would have been the way we had planned it." Boeing did not participate in the Houston news briefing. But two of the company's top space and defense officials, Ted

Colbert and Kay Sears, told employees in a note that they backed NASA's ruling. "While this may not have been how we originally envisioned the test flight concluding, we support NASA's decision for Starliner and are proud of how our team and spacecraft performed," the executives wrote. Starliner's crew demo capped a journey filled with delays and setbacks. After the space shuttles retired more than a decade ago, NASA hired Boeing and SpaceX for orbital taxi service. Boeing ran into so many problems on its first test flight with no one aboard in 2019 that it had to repeat it. The 2022 do-over uncovered even more flaws and the repair bill topped \$1 billion. SpaceX's crew ferry flight later this month will be its 10th for NASA since 2020. The Dragon capsule will launch on the half-year expedition with only two astronauts since two seats are reserved for Wilmore and Williams for the return leg.

As veteran astronauts and retired Navy captains, Wilmore and Williams anticipated hurdles on the test flight. They've kept busy in space, helping with repairs and experiments. The two are now full-time station crew members along with the seven others on board. Even before the pair launched on June 5 from Cape Canaveral, Florida, Starliner's propulsion system was leaking helium. The leak was small and thought to be isolated, but four more cropped up after liftoff. Then five thrusters failed. Although four of the thrusters were recovered, it gave NASA pause as to whether more malfunctions might hamper the capsule's descent from orbit. Boeing conducted numerous thruster tests in space and on the ground over the summer, and was convinced its spacecraft could safely bring the astronauts back. But NASA could not get comfortable with the thruster situation and went with SpaceX.

FROM J&K BATTLEFIELD TO PARALYMPICS BRONZE: SEMA'S INSPIRATIONAL JOURNEY THROUGH HARDSHIPS

On a quiet October day in 2002, a young soldier's dreams were shattered in a heartbeat in the volatile terrain of Jammu and Kashmir's Chowkibal. An unexpected explosion ended the ambition of Havildar Hokato Hotozhe Sema to join the Special Forces. That landmine blast during an anti-terrorist operation claimed his left leg below the knee, inflicting immense physical pain and mental trauma. Sema's world went dark, or everyone thought so. But for Sema, it was the beginning of an extraordinary journey of resilience, courage, and fierce determination to rebuild life — a process he went through at the Army Paralympic Node, BEG Centre in Pune. Twenty-two years later, at the swank State de France, the 40-year-old Indian shot-putter came up with his career-best throw of 14.65 metres to secure a bronze medal in the men's F57 category at the Paralympics to swell the country's medal haul to 27 (six gold, nine silver and 12 bronze). His rise in para-athletics has been nothing short of inspiring. He quickly distinguished himself with his sheer willpower in the F57 category, which includes athletes with limb deficiencies and impaired



muscle power. Sema was encouraged by senior army officials at the Pune-based Artificial Limb Centre to take up shot put after seeing his fitness as he embraced the sport in 2016 at the age of 32. That year, he travelled to Jaipur to compete in the National Para Athletics Championships. A silver at the Morocco Grand Prix in 2022 was followed by a bronze medal at the Asian Para Games in Hangzhou. He narrowly missed a medal at

the 2024 World Championships, finishing fourth. But Sema's determination never wavered. The defining moment came during his Paralympics debut, when he battled against a fiercely competitive field. Strapped to a throwing chair, each of his six throws was a manifestation of grit and physical strength. He touched the 14m mark on his second throw and then improved further with a heave of 14.40m.

Sema achieved his best throw in his fourth attempt, bettering his personal best to 14.49m en route to the bronze. Iran's Yasin Khosravi, the 31-year-old two-time para world champion, clinched the top spot with a Paralympic record of 15.96m, while Brazil's Thiago Dos Santos took the silver (15.06m). Prime Minister Narendra Modi described Sema's win a "proud moment" for the nation while hailing his incredible strength and determination.

"A proud moment for our nation as Hokato Hotozhe Sema brings home the Bronze medal in Men's Shot Put F57! His incredible strength and determination are exceptional. Congratulations to him. Best wishes for the endeavours ahead," PM Modi wrote on X. Sema has been supported by the Khelo India initiative and his training, boarding, and lodging were taken care of by the National Centre of Excellence (NCoE) scheme.



England pacer Wood to miss Pakistan and New Zealand test series due to elbow injury

will continue to work closely with the ECB medical team on his management and rehabilitation. England said Wood is aiming to return to full fitness by early 2025, in time for England's white-ball tour of India and the Champions Trophy in Pakistan that's scheduled to begin in February.

India look to start fresh after Olympic bronze, eye title defence

The Indian men's hockey team will look to press the restart button after a successful Olympic campaign and defend its Asian Champions Trophy title when it opens its campaign against hosts China here on Sunday. After bagging back-to-back Olympic bronze medals, India will start as favourites to defend their ACT title against top hockey playing nations of Asia in the form of China, Japan, Pakistan, Korea and Malaysia. Last year, India won the title at home, making them the only team to bag four titles in the history of the tournament. Back from a short break after the Paris Olympics, India skipper Harmanpreet Singh is keen on continuing their dominance in the continental championships. "The Asian Champions Trophy last year gave us the right momentum going into the Asian Games and followed it up with the Olympic Games triumph of standing on the podium yet again. This time too, we want to begin the fresh Olympic cycle by winning this tournament," Harmanpreet said ahead of their tournament opener. "While we have 10 members from the Olympic side playing in this tournament, we have a few youngsters trying to make their impact in the team. In terms of game point-of-view, our attacking and penalty corners are our forte but we will be looking to play a structured defence, particularly against teams like Japan, Malaysia and Pakistan. This is an important

tournament for us in terms of world ranking points and we are ready for the challenge," he added. After China, India will take on Japan in their second match on September 9, followed by games against last year's runners-up Malaysia on September 11, Korea on September 12 and arch-rivals Pakistan on September 14. The semifinal and final are scheduled for September 16 and 17. Young India midfielder Vivek Sagar Prasad, who has been named as Harmanpreet's deputy for this tournament, said this would give them a chance to see other teams' progress ahead of the 2026 Asian Games. "This tournament is one of the most exciting ones in the Asian Hockey calendar. We will also get to see the progress the Asian teams are making in the new cycle as they will play with a fresh group of players keeping in mind the Asian Games in 2026," said Vivek, who will replace Hardik Singh as vice-captain. Vivek is mesmerised by the scenic view and facilities on offer here. "We arrived here earlier this week and have got good time on the pitch. The weather is suitable for us, but it gets a bit cold in the evening. The facility is incredible and perhaps one of the most beautiful hockey venues in the world. "The excitement of hosting the first international tournament here is quite evident and we are looking forward to playing quality matches and entertaining the hockey-loving people of this region," he said.

flavoured toasted popcorn. This creation was so innovative and delicious that it could easily become a signature dish on its own.

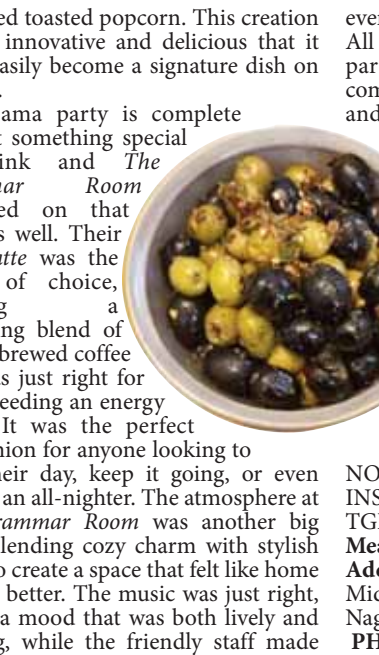
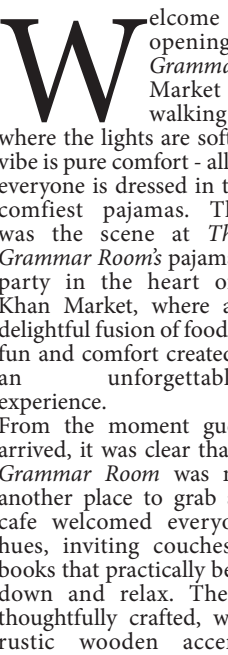

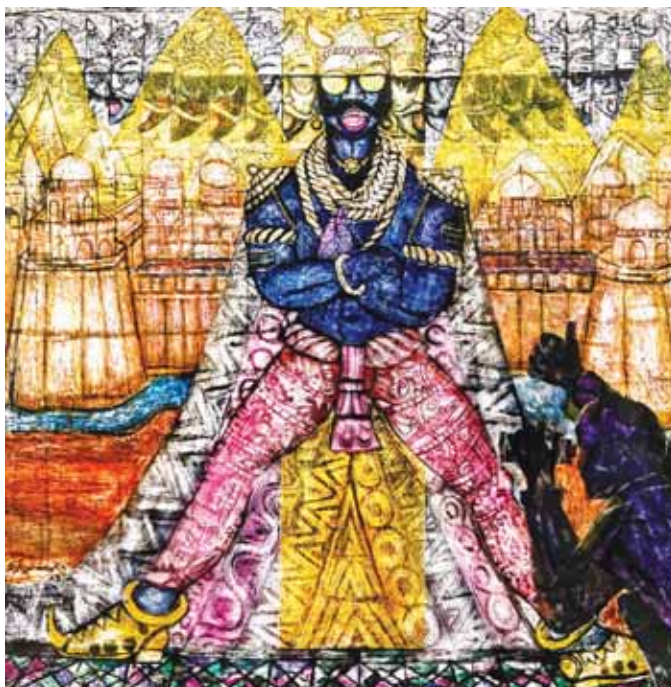

They were captivated by India's opulence and natural beauty, pushing the country to the forefront of desirable travel destinations.

INDIA'S TOURISM BOOM: A JOURNEY BEYOND THE ICONS

UNVEILING THE FUTURE OF INDIA'S HOSPITALITY AND TOURISM INDUSTRY

PRADEEP SHETTY, President of the Federation of Hotel and Restaurant Associations of India (FHRAI), is currently preparing for the association's 54th annual convention, set to take place in October 2024. In an exclusive interview with *Kumar Chellappan*, Shetty shared insights into the immense potential of India's hospitality and tourism sector, its challenges, and the expectations from both the central and state governments

What is the real potential of the hospitality and tourism industry?
India's hospitality and tourism industry is on a remarkable growth trajectory. According to Mordor Intelligence, the sector is projected to reach a valuation of USD 247.31 billion by 2024, with forecasts indicating it could soar to USD 475.37 billion by 2029, growing at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 13.96%. Key trends driving this growth include a shift towards sustainable tourism, with eco-friendly accommodations and community-based initiatives gaining traction. India's rich cultural heritage, diverse landscapes, and geopolitical stability further bolster this expansion. However, to fully capitalize on its potential, the industry must address sustainability, infrastructure development, and adaptability to evolving consumer preferences.

How do you view the current and future employment trends in the hospitality sector?
Despite challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the hospitality sector is expected to rebound strongly. The India Food Services Report-2024 projects that by 2025, the sector will employ approximately ten million people. The industry's resilience, coupled with advancements in accommodation and government initiatives to promote tourism, supports its significant role in job creation.

What are the prospects for job creation in the hotel and restaurant industry over the coming years?
India's hospitality and tourism sector has the potential to generate 50 million direct and indirect jobs in the next 5-7 years. This growth will depend on robust government support, including granting industry and infrastructure status at various levels. The sector's resilience and strategic investments, along with effective policy implementation, are critical for shaping its employment landscape. Notably, the industry has already seen a 14% increase in Revenue Per Available Room (RevPAR) in the first half of the current fiscal year, with expectations of a further 15-20% growth in the latter half of FY24.

What does the industry expect from the Government of India and state governments?
The industry seeks favorable policies that encourage investment, reduce regulatory burdens, and provide tax incentives. Essential infrastructure development, such as improved roads, airports, and connectivity, is crucial. State governments should align regional policies with national goals, streamline hotel project approvals, and support skill development through training programs. Promoting India as a global destination requires targeted campaigns that highlight its cultural diversity and unique experiences. Post-pandemic, enforcing health and safety protocols is vital for rebuilding traveler confidence, while state governments should foster sustainable tourism and create a

business-friendly environment by simplifying licensing and permits. Public-private partnerships and engagement with industry stakeholders are also key to enhancing tourism growth.

Has the Government of India shown any commitment to granting infrastructure status to the hospitality sector?
The Government of India's interest in granting infrastructure status to the hospitality sector is a promising development. If approved, this status could attract more investments and empower the sector to contribute to the development of the 50 new destinations recently announced by the government.

What benefits would infrastructure status bring to the industry?
Granting infrastructure status to the hospitality sector could provide access to more favorable financing options, including better interest rates. Currently, the lack of industry status in several states results in higher power tariffs and interest rates. Infrastructure status would incentivize both domestic and international investments, fostering stability and growth within the sector.

As the current President of FHRAI, how well is the Federation positioned to address these issues with regulators?
The Federation of Hotel and Restaurant

Associations of India (FHRAI), founded in 1955, is the apex hospitality association in India and the third largest globally. It represents 55,000 hotels and 500,000 restaurants across the country. FHRAI advocates for the industry's interests, engaging with government bodies, regulatory agencies, and other stakeholders to promote growth and address challenges.

What are the major issues facing the industry, and what do you expect the government to do about them?
The hospitality industry faces several critical challenges that require strategic solutions. First, GST rationalization is needed to implement a uniform rate of 12% across all hotels. Second, separating GST on food services from room rates would address high costs and complex regulations. Third, granting infrastructure status would provide access to better financing options and encourage investment. Finally, uniform sectoral reforms and streamlined business processes under the Business Reforms Action Plan (BRAP) would attract more investments. The government should simplify regulations, support infrastructure development, and provide incentives for training and technology to foster a vibrant and resilient tourism industry. Addressing these issues will enhance service quality and support industry growth.

Behave like a child when Nature is your Mother ...

THE TUNING FORK

Is climate change here? Is it on its way? Is it still some time away? Or is it ...?

So ... how long does one wait, for the inflection point to be reached. Or ... have we just started tipping over and we want to safely wish it away. And stay in denial. The jury is still out in the open. However, two things are in our face - the enormity of the situation (if it is here or for others when it will be) and the pivotal role Nature has in our life and existence on earth. Our ancient texts have always given the highest status to Nature - The Maternal status. Devoted. Nurturing. Pliable (to the maximum extent). Warm. Affectionate. Effusing warmth and care. Protecting. Tender. Strict when rules bend beyond a point. Gentle. And perhaps the most important - Trusting. Nature signified as the Maa Prakriti or Mother Nature and the consequent behaviour of the Child (the inhabitants) plays a key role in Vedic philosophy. The Indian scriptures give precious insights and reflect a deep philosophical significance to this. This concept and understanding are rooted in the Vedas, Upanishads and Smritis elucidate the relationship between us humans' conscious beings and the natural world, personifying nature as a fostering mother. The oldest of scriptures available to us (The Vedas) depict the portrayal of Nature as The Divine Mother form. This portrayal



encourages the reverence for the natural elements and the understanding that they have been and continue to be the main sustaining force for all life forms. One of the earliest mentions can be found in the Rig Veda, where various hymns celebrate the Mother Earth (Prithvi) as a maternal figure who caters to the sustenance and nourishment of all living beings.

स धाता पृथ्वी भवत्यजायमानायां विश्वायुः कवयाम अग्रभूर्देवा विवस्वानमानमृतयेमे sa dhātā pṛthvī bhavatyajāyamānāyām viśvāyuh kavayām agrabhūrdēvāīm vivasvānamāmūṭayeme

'He is the establisher of the Earth when she was being born, the Sage, the lord of what

has been and what will be, all-seeing, the light of lights.' This hymn compliments Mother Earth as the provider and sustainer of life. It emphasizes its role akin to a nurturing mother who supports and nourishes all living beings. If Nature and the Earth are The Mother ... we palpably are Her children, often having to be brought to book because of frequent infringements with Mother Nature. The spiritual analogy of behaving like a child in the context of Vedic interpretation symbolizes qualities such as innocence, trust, spontaneity, and a sense of awe and wonder. I wish I could add the word 'simple' here. If only we were simple, tolerant, and sensitive to the value of coexistence with Mother Nature. The Chandogya Upanishad (7.26.2)

explores the nature of reality and self and uses the metaphor of a child to illustrate the point.

तं विद्याकर्म शान्तः समः प्रज्ञानं ब्रह्म। ताम् विद्याकामाह सान्ताह समाह प्रज्ञानाम् ब्रह्म। Desiring that wisdom, he becomes tranquil, disciplined, restrained, self-controlled, patient, and refined.' This verse underscores the qualities of tranquility, patience, and wisdom that are often compared to those found in a child who is innocent and trusting - What we need to imbibe as inhabitants (children of Mother Nature) Integration of Concepts The Vedic construal highlights this integration as a holistic worldview where we humans are inseparably interconnected with the Nature and the It encourages humility, sensitivity, veneration, a sense of responsibility towards nature, viewing it not merely as a resource but as a living entity deserving reverence and care. The Bhagavad Gita, reflects these principles (9.17)

पिताहमस्य जगतो माता धाता पितामहः वेद्यं पवित्रमोकार ऋक्साम यजुर्वे च।? pitāhamasya jagato mātā dhātā pitāmahāḥ vedyaṃ pavitraṃ oṃkāra ṛksāma yajureva ca

"I am the father of this world, the mother, the support, and the grandsire; I am the object of knowledge, the purifier, the syllable Om, and also the Rig, the Sama, and the Yajur Vedas." Here, Lord Krishna identifies himself with various aspects of creation, reinforcing the idea of divinity permeating all existence and nurturing it, akin to a loving parent. Nature and its inhabitants are indivisible, like mother and her child entwined in a spiritual understanding. It lends not only reverence for life and existence but for spiritual growth and self-understanding.
