## MODI'S 100 DAYS PROJECTS PUSH HISTORIC

Projects worth over ₹15 lakh crores have been launched in the first 100 days of Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led Government for a historic third term. The projects focussed on infrastructure, farmers, middle class, women, and minorities, among others, according to a Government statement. Incidentally, the will Government will complete first 100 days on Tuesday coinciding with Prime Minister Modi's birthday. Before hitting the campaign trail for the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, Prime Minister Modi had given several tasks to officials to be completed within the first 100 days of the third NDA Government.

The central Government has approved projects worth ₹3 lakh crore in 100 days with primary focus on roads, railways, ports and airways, the statement said. This includes approval of eight national high-speed road corridor projects spanning over 900 kilometres. It also includes approval of the Wadhavan Mega Port in Maharashtra at a cost of ₹76,200 crore, which will be among the top 10 ports in the world. The Government has also laid the foundation stone of Shinkun-La Tunnel, to connect Ladakh with Himachal Pradesh. The 17th instalment of Prime Minister Kisan Samman Nidhi was also released. As part of the instalment, ₹20,000 crore has been distributed to 9.3 crore farmers. "So far, ₹3 lakh crore has been

distributed to a 12 crore 33 lakh farmers," the statement added. Furthermore, the Minimum Support Price for Kharif crops for 2024-25 has been increased, which benefitted 12 crore farmers by approximately ₹2 lakh crore. In a relief to middle class, the NDA government announced no tax on income up to ₹7 lakh, helping salaried individuals save up to ₹17,500 in taxes, the Government statement said. "The standard deduction increased to ₹75,000 and the exemption limit for family pension was raised to ₹25,000. A comprehensive review of income tax rules is to be conducted within six months to make them concise, clear, and easy to understand," the statement added.

## Kejriwal to meet LG today, likely to tender resignation

A day after Arvind Kejriwal sent shockwaves across political circles saying that he would step down as the Chief Minister of Delhi, the AAP chief will meet Lieutenant Governor (LG) Vinai Kumar Saxena at 4.30 pm on Tuesday, during which he is likely to tender his resignation. Saxena has given him an appointment for a meeting at 4.30 pm on Tuesday. AAP had earlier said Kejriwal sought time for a meeting with the Lieutenant Governor. Regarding the final decision over the New Delhi CM, the AAP legislative party meeting will be held on Tuesday at CM's house. Meanwhile, the AAP's Political Affairs Committee (PAC) deliberated on the selection of the next chief ministerial candidate and the composition of the Delhi cabinet at Chief Minister's

residence. The committee also reviewed strategies for the upcoming Haryana Assembly elections, as the party aims to broaden its political presence in the neighbouring state. Kejriwal held one-on-one talks with leaders of the Public Affairs Committee of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) for their feedback on who should be the next Chief Minister of the national capital. "During the meeting, he (Kejriwal) sought one on one feedback from each leader on his replacement. Tomorrow, the legislative party meeting is there and this discussion will go into the second round," Bharadwaj said after the meeting. Among those who attended the PAC meeting were Kejriwal, former deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia, Rajya Sabha MPs Sanjay Singh and Raghav Chaddha and five city cabinet Ministers.

## Capital to combat vector borne diseases

In the wake of two deaths by dengue reportedly in the national Capital including a 54-year-old patient who died at Lok Nayak Hospital and another at Safdarjung Hospital, the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) has intensified efforts to combat the spread of vector borne diseases including spraying and fogging of more than 4.20 lakh houses with insecticides. The two deaths due to dengue include a 54-year-old patient who died at Lok Nayak Hospital and another at Safdarjung Hospital. According to data by the MCD, a total of 675 cases of dengue have been reported this year till September 10. A total of 967 cases of vector borne diseases including 260 cases of malaria and 32 cases of chikungunya have been reported in the same period. The maximum numbers of dengue cases were witnessed in the Najafgarh zone with 103 cases, followed by Shahdara North zone with 84 cases, South zone with 71 cases, Central zone with 67 cases, Karol Bagh zone with 60 cases, Rohini zone with 56 cases, Shahdara South zone with 50 cases, West zone with 45 cases, Narela zone with 42 cases, Civil Lines zone with 40 cases, and City SP zone with 33 cases. The lowest was reported from Keshav Puram zone with 24 cases. Amid a surge in cases of the vector-borne disease at several city hospitals in Delhi, the civic body is taking a multi-pronged approach with the officials visiting over 2.59 crore households, with 1,56,932 found to be breeding mosquito sites. "Breeding sites are destroyed on the spot, and homeowners are educated on health and hygiene practices," a senior MCD official said. He added that drains, water bodies, and surface water collections are sprayed weekly using manual and motorised sprayers and larvivorous fishes have been introduced at 213 locations in clean water collections. "23 special drives have been conducted to cover vulnerable areas such as police stations, construction sites, parks, hospitals, schools,

Government offices, and DTC depots," he added. Additionally, MCD has also conducted special fogging operations in Kavad camps, Krishna Janmashtmi pandals, temples, and Lal Quila. The civic body also mentioned that low lying areas along railway tracks are being sprayed by power spray tankers mounted on railway wagons. Chaired by the MCD's Mayor Shelly Oberoi and Commissioner Ashwani Kumar, the civic body has conducted 28 Inter-Sectoral Coordination Committee meetings under the chairmanship of the Mayor and Commissioner at headquarters and zonal levels, involving major stakeholders such as Delhi Development Authority (DDA), Delhi Jal Board (DJB), Delhi Police, Public Works Department (PWD), Central Public Works Department (CPWD), Horticulture, Archaeological Survey of India (ASI), Education, and Irrigation and Flood Control (I&FC) departments to ensure effective coordination and implementation of control measures. "Nodal Teachers of all schools have been trained for prevention of mosquito breeding in schools. Fogging and focal spray operations will be conducted at public gatherings and religious festivals to control adult mosquito populations," he said, adding that outdoor fogging operations will be intensified in September-October, depending on mosquito density and disease situation and legal notices, challans, and administrative charges will be levied on repeated offenders.



## MLA to reward ₹11 lakh to cut tongue of Rahul Gandhi

In a shocking development that has unleashed a massive controversy in Maharashtra, an MLA belonging to the Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena on Monday announced a bounty of Rs 11 lakh to anyone who chops the tongue of Congress leader Rahul Gandhi over the latter's purported comments on reservations. In a video clip that has gone viral landing the BJP-led MahaYuti Government in an embarrassing situation, Shiv Sena (Shinde) MLA Sanjay Gaikwad said: "While on foreign soil, Rahul Gandhi said that he wants to end reservations in India. This has exposed the Congress' true face. Gandhi's statement reveals his party's mindset that is inherently opposed to reservations. I will reward anyone who cuts off Rahul Gandhi's tongue with Rs 11 lakh." "In the Lok Sabha polls, they (the Congress) secured votes by spreading lies that the Constitution is in danger...BJP will change the Constitution and today in the United States he said that his party will put an end to reservations given by late Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar," Gaikwad, an MLA from Buldhana said. As was expected, the Congress-led Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) turned up the heat on Chief Minister Eknath Shinde and deputy Chief Ministers Devendra Fadnis of the BJP and Ajit Pawar of the NCP. Having found themselves on the defensive, Shinde, Fadnis and Ajit Pawar had distanced themselves from Gaikwad's statement.

## Didi, doctors meet positive

With the crucial two-and-a-half-hour meeting between Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee and the agitating junior doctors ending on a "positive note" the State Government is likely to announce "some very important decisions" pertaining to the doctors' demands on Tuesday, sources said. The agitating doctors had been demanding justice for the lady doctor of RG Kar Medical College and Hospital who was raped and murdered in the morning of August 8. Though the doctors had not come out of the meeting venue as minutes were still being written, sources privy to the proceedings said that the doctors had "vividly communicated to the Chief Minister" their demand including administrative actions against the erring officials of the Health Department including the Health Secretary and two directors of Health apart from Kolkata Police Commissioner Vineet Goyal. The Government side told the doctors that as certain decisions including those on administrative actions against the senior officials could be taken only after certain procedures, such issues could be addressed subsequently. On whether the doctors who had been on "cease work" would join duty right away was

not made clear as the sources from the doctors' side said that the delegation would speak to the media after a general body meeting that would take place around midnight at the sit-in site near Swasthya Bhawan Government. They however, said the "meeting has taken place in a very cordial atmosphere and both the sides were eager to cooperate." Earlier, the junior doctors on Monday evening reached Chief Minister's residence. This was hours after the Mamata Banerjee Government tried for "one last time" to break the 36-day impasse and offered a "constructive dialogue". The medics had been asking for punishment for those responsible for the August 9 felony and "destruction" of evidence; departmental action against arrested former

RG Kar principal Sandip Ghosh; resignation of Kolkata Police Commissioner Vineet Goyal and Health Secretary NS Nigam; improved security for healthcare workers; and eradication of the 'threat culture' in Government hospitals allegedly perpetrated by a political lobby that indulges in mass cheating, extraction, victimisation, smuggling of bodies, corruption etc. In the meeting which was a prolonged one "security related issues in the State's medical colleges were being discussed in the initial phase," sources said. "It is still early days and will take a good time to end as the discussions have just started... there are many points and counterpoints that were raised and heard," said an official.

## INDI alliance divided on Article 370, says HM

Launching a frontal attack on the pre-poll alliance partners, Congress and the National Conference on the last day of campaigning in Kishtwar, Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Monday appealed to the voters in the region to punish these parties by voting in favour of the BJP as they (Congress-National Conference) have always "nurtured and nourished" terrorism. Shah vowed to "bury terrorism deep into the earth so that it would not be able to rear its head again." Addressing three back-to-back election rallies in the region Shah said there is a clear fight between the Congress-National Conference alliance and the BJP — one wanting to bring back Article 370, and the other committed to stopping it. Shah reiterated the Constitution's Article 370, which gave special status to J and K, is history and will never come back. The Home Minister also paid tributes to all those who have been killed in terror-related incidents, and specially referred to the deaths of BJP leaders Anil Parihar, Ajit Parihar and RSS leader

Chanderkant Sharma. BJP has fielded former Minister Sunil Sharma from Padder-Nagseni and Shagun Parihar, daughter of Ajit Parihar, from Kishtwar assembly constituency. Reminding the voters about the promises made by the alliance partners in their election speeches and party manifestos, the Union Home Minister emphasised, "NC and Congress say that if they come to power, they will bring back Article 370. Modi revoked Article 370 and it has become history. It has no place in the Indian Constitution," he added. Shah said they will also not allow the NC-Congress to snatch reservations of Gujjars and Paharis. There will be only one

constitution, one Prime Minister and one flag that is our beloved tricolour." Campaigning for the BJP candidates, Shah said attempts were being made to bring back the 1990s-like situation and spread terrorism. "NC and Congress have made promises that their Government will release terrorists. But this is Narendra Modi's Government and none has the guts to spread terrorism." Shah also targeted NC chief Farooq Abdullah and asked him where he was when Kishtwar was bleeding from terror attacks. "He should be asked if he comes here. But I know where he was. He was enjoying summer vacation in London," Shah said. He said the BJP Government

has resolved to wipe out terrorism and initiated some measures. "We have strengthened village defence guards and special police officers. We have replaced their obsolete rifles and they are being equipped with self-loading rifles...we are raising a security grid. Terrorists may come but they will be wiped out." He claimed that NC and Congress had said if they came to power, they would reconsider reservation to Paharis and Gujjars. "Firstly, the reservation would not have been possible, had Article 370 stayed here. Secondly, I am watching the Kashmir situation. Let me tell you that neither Farooq Abdullah nor Rahul Gandhi is going to form the Government," he said. Shah referred to Maharaja Hari Singh, Jammu and Kashmir's last king, and said he was banished from his State. "These parties (NC and Congress) not only insulted Maharaja Hari but also did not allow him to return home. His ashes came back. These parties, who insulted Maharaja Hari Singh, are responsible for the exodus of Pandits, denied rights to women and reservation to marginalised sections...will you bring them back?" he asked.

## Will never surrender: Trump after assassination attempt

Hours after another failed attempt on his life, former US President Donald Trump on Monday said he will never surrender and never stop fighting for Americans. The Republican presidential candidate also thanked the US Secret Service and other law enforcement officials for their "outstanding" job after what the FBI said was an apparent assassination attempt while playing golf on one of his golf courses in Florida's West Palm Beach. The former President remained unharmed in the latest assassination bid about two months after another attempt on his life at a Pennsylvania rally. "I am Donald J. Trump. FEAR NOT! I am safe and well, and no one was hurt. Thank God!", the Republican presidential candidate said on his campaign website. "There are people in this world who will do whatever it takes to stop us. I will not stop fighting for you. I will Never Surrender! I will always love you for supporting me. Through our UNITY we will Make America Great Again! I will Never Surrender!" Trump said. "THE JOB DONE WAS ABSOLUTELY



OUTSTANDING," the former President said in a post on Truth Social. "I would like to thank everyone for your concern and well wishes — It was certainly an interesting day! Most importantly, I want to thank the US Secret Service, Sheriff Ric Bradshaw and his Office of brave and dedicated patriots, and, all of the law enforcement, for the incredible job done today at Trump International in keeping me, as the 45th President of the United States, and the Republican nominee in the upcoming presidential election, SAFE," Trump said.

Local authorities said the US Secret Service agents protecting Trump fired at a man pointing an AK-style rifle with a scope while the former President was golfing with donor Steve Witkoff when shots were fired, CNN quoted a source familiar with the development as saying. President Joe Biden and Vice-President Kamala Harris were briefed and updated on the investigation. Harris, the Democratic presidential candidate and Trump's rival in the upcoming election, in a statement, said "violence has no place in America." "I have been briefed on reports of gunshots fired near former President Trump and his property in Florida, and I am glad he is safe. Violence has no place in America," Harris said on X. Biden echoed that thought in his statement, adding that he had directed his team to ensure the Secret Service "has every resource, capability and protective measure necessary to ensure the former President's continued safety." "As I have said many times, there is no place for political violence or any violence ever in our country," Biden said on X, adding that he was "relieved the former President is unharmed."

# MP creates new records with innovations in Mission

## SWACHH BHARAT MISSION ANNIVERSARY

Chief Minister Mohan Yadav has said that Madhya Pradesh has set many records in the cleanliness campaign started in the country on the initiative of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. As per the wishes of the Prime Minister, the people of the state have established new dimensions in the field of cleanliness with full enthusiasm and public cooperation. While Madhya Pradesh got the status of the cleanest state in the Swachh Survekshan for 2022, Indore city got the distinction of being the cleanest city in the country for the 7th consecutive time. Along with this, an innovation was also made to produce bio-CNG from wet waste in the state in 2023. Yadav informed that the

'Swachhata Hi Seva' campaign is starting on September 17, the birthday of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, and will continue till October 2, the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. This year the theme is "Swabhav Swachhta-Sanskaar Swachhta". Emphasis has been laid on greater public participation and participation of local bodies. Madhya Pradesh has set new records in many cases in Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban). All the cities of the state have made their best efforts during the last 10 years. With the cooperation of the public, Swachh Bharat Mission has been transformed into a mass movement. He said that this time also various cleanliness-related activities will be conducted on a large scale with public participation in urban

and rural areas. Indore City bagged the 'Cleanest City of the Country' award for the 7th consecutive time in the Swachh Survekshan Award-2023. This is an excellent example of public participation in Indore. Madhya Pradesh is the first state to prepare guidelines and issue work orders for STP Inception and Diversion-based sewage treatment systems at low cost. This year, in March 2024, Madhya Pradesh published "Utility Water and Septage Management Policy" for urban bodies, in which 100 percent mechanized cleaning of sewers and septic tanks has been ensured. Indore is the first city in the country to achieve Water Plus certification and a 7-star rating. Recently, in the Clean Air

Survey-2024 under the National Clean Air Programme, Jabalpur has got second position in the country for improvement in air quality in the category of cities with a population above 10 lakh. More than 7 thousand 82 motorized vehicles are being used to operate the garbage collection system in urban areas of the state. The vehicles have compartments made in them to hold dry, wet, household hazardous, and sanitary waste separately. Vehicle monitoring and cleanliness issues are being promoted through GPS and PA systems. Spot composting is being encouraged for processing and disposal of wet waste. It is being done by more than 850 solid waste producers in the state. Giving priority to the disposal of faecal sludge in the state, 399 Faecal Sludge

Treatment Plants (FSTP) are being operated in 368 urban bodies and 55 Sewage Treatment Plants (STP) are being operated in 20 urban bodies. 401 urban bodies in the state are doing composting with 368 centralized units. For processing dry waste, 360 material recovery facility units have been constructed in 401 urban bodies. Continuous efforts are being made to scientifically eliminate legacy waste in civic bodies. Legacy waste of 108 urban bodies of the state is being treated. In the first phase of the Swachh Bharat Mission, 50 urban bodies have completely disposed of their legacy waste. State-of-the-art self-propelled units are working in Katni and Sagar for composting wet waste. In these units, garbage is being brought from 16 cities and converted into compost.

# Victim ended life after being raped by the roommate

Further investigation in the suicide by a BSc Nursing student girl, has revealed that the girl committed suicide after her boyfriend refused to marry her. After the police grilled the boyfriend of the victim, he narrated that he had refused to marry her because his friend with whom they lived in Baghsewania flat, had sexually assaulted her. A shocking revelation has been made in the case of a girl committing suicide by hanging with the ceiling in a flat in a colony of Baghsewania police station area in Bhopal three days ago. The girl came to Bhopal leaving her family with the intention of marriage, but her boyfriend's friend had

sexually assaulted her. Not only this, the boyfriend had also refused to marry her. Depressed by the incident the girl committed suicide. The police said that the 19-year-old girl lived in a village in Narsinghpur district. About a month ago, she came to Bhopal with her boyfriend. The two stayed at the house of the boyfriend's friend living in the Baghsewania area who operates a shop in the area. Two days ago, the boyfriend reached Baghsewania police station and told the police that the girl had committed suicide. As soon as the information of the incident was received, the police reached the spot and started investigation. The short PM report revealed that the girl died due to hanging. Meanwhile, the family members had accused the

lover of murder in this case. When the police questioned the accused lover strictly after taking him into custody, he revealed the truth of the death. He told that his friend had raped his girlfriend the night before the suicide. When the lover came to know about this in the morning, he also refused to marry. There was a fight between the friend and his wife regarding this matter. After the entire facts came to light, the police have registered a case against the lover Mayank Parihar, friend Harshil Thakur and the friend's wife Urvashi Thakur. All three accused have been arrested. The lover has been accused of instigating suicide and the friend's wife of hiding evidence while Harshil has been accused of rape.

# Trouble brewing in State BJP unit after influx of Congmen

Growing factionalism in the party state unit in Madhya Pradesh is fast shattering perceptions of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) being the most disciplined political outfit in the country. After decades of hyperbole over its ability to quell dissent, the BJP seems to have lost its rhythm since a large number of Congress leaders were inducted into the party. Party insiders say that trouble has been brewing in the state unit since the influx of Congress leaders into the BJP fold. They say that there have been several instances where these newcomers have instigated party workers against established leaders. They add that in some instances, old-timers have also been raging due to the meteoric rise of these leaders in the party. Whatever the reasons, the party can no longer

deny that there is trouble in its ranks. In a recent incident, party leaders have been vocal in their criticism of Tikamgarh MP and Union Minister Virender Kumar Khatik. Though Khatik has always been in the party, there have been several verbal duels between senior party leaders and the newly inducted leaders from other parties. BJP watchers say that the functioning of the Mohan Yadav government and the party state unit have been impacted by these outbursts. Khatik is under fire over appointing an alleged Congress worker as his representative in the constituency. Up in arms, party workers in Tikamgarh say that the former Congress leader has a criminal background. Echoing the allegations first made by former minister Manvendra Singh, MLA Lalita Yadav has also

accused Khatik of sidelining party workers while choosing his representative. Responding to the widely publicized accusations, the Union Minister said that he is a simple person whose politics has also been simple. And launched a counterattack while terming those accusing him as 'imported.' 'I stand with the workers. Those making accusations against me are imported people who themselves have not been in the party for a long time,' he added. The incident involving Khatik is not isolated. In the recent past, the party's image suffered a setback when Minister of State Narendra Shivaji Patel and Narmadapuram MP Darshan Singh Choudhary were involved in a stand-off over protocol. The yet another skirmish between senior party leaders, Choudhary and Patel, was a stand-off after the invitation

card sent out by a school, where they were to attend a program, carried the MP's name above that of the MoS. Patel took strong exception to the incident and reportedly warned the school of serious repercussions. While the school management was immediate in issuing an apology, the party had a tough time responding to pointed questions over the matter. In a saving grace for the party, MP Choudhary later said that he was not even aware of the dispute. Similarly, Rewa MP Janardan Mishra commented on BJP MLA Siddharth Tiwari's grandfather and former Assembly Speaker Shrinivas Tiwari at a program. He said that Tiwari was indulging in the politics of loot, corruption, and hooliganism. Responding to the pronouncements, Tiwari's grandson and BJP MLA from Tyonthar, Siddharth Tiwari, said that such comments on the

late leader were uncalled for. He iterated that his late grandfather had sacrificed his life in the service of people and did not need a certificate from anyone. Notably, Siddharth joined the saffron party just before the 2023 assembly elections, after the Congress party denied him a ticket. He joined the BJP and won the seat for the party. It is worth noting that growing bitterness among BJP leaders has provided the Congress with an opportunity for criticizing the party leadership. Leader of Opposition Umang Singh said that this is cutthroat competition or a feeling of jealousy going on between ministers and MPs in the BJP. BJP State Spokesperson Rajneesh Agrawal told The Pioneer that he is not aware of any such incident and expressed confidence in the state unit chief's abilities to resolve any issues brought to his notice.

The detailed statements of the family members have not been recorded yet.

# SC to hear muslim plea on Krishna Janmabhoomi-Shahi Idgah dispute

The Supreme Court is scheduled to hear on Tuesday a plea of the Muslim side against the Allahabad High Court order rejecting their petition challenging the maintainability of 18 cases related to the Krishna Janmabhoomi-Shahi Idgah dispute in Mathura. A bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Sanjay Kumar will hear the plea filed by the Committee of Management Trust, Shahi Masjid Idgah against the August 1 order of the high court. The mosque management committee's plea has been filed through advocate RHA Sikander.

On August 1, the high court rejected the plea challenging the maintainability of 18 cases related to the temple-mosque dispute in Mathura, and ruled that the "religious character" of Shahi Idgah needs to be determined.

The high court had dismissed the Muslim side's contention that the suits filed by Hindu litigants relating to the dispute over the Shahi Idgah mosque complex adjoining the Krishna Janmabhoomi temple violated the Places of Worship (Special Provisions) Act, and were thus not maintainable. The 1991 Act prohibits changing the religious character of any shrine from what existed on the day of the country's Independence.

It exempted only the Ram Janmabhoomi-Babri Masjid dispute from its purview. The cases filed by the Hindu side seek the "removal" of the Aurangzeb-era mosque they claim was built after demolishing a temple that once stood there.

In its ruling, the high court had said the 1991 Act did not define the term "religious character" and the "disputed" place cannot have a dual religious character -- of a temple and a mosque, which are "adverse to each other" -- at the same

time. "Either the place is a temple or a mosque. Thus, I find that the religious character of the disputed place as it existed on August 15, 1947 is to be determined by documentary as well as oral evidence led by both the parties," the high court judge had said.

Justice Mayank Kumar Jain of the high court had concluded that the cases "do not appear to be barred by any provisions of the Walf Act, 1995; the Places of Worship (Special Provisions) Act, 1991; the Specific Relief Act, 1963; the Limitation Act, 1963 and Order XIII Rule 3A of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908." On August 9, the top court had extended its stay till November on the operation of the Allahabad High Court order that allowed a court-monitored survey of the Shahi Idgah mosque complex.

A bench headed by Justice Sanjiv Khanna had ordered continuation of the stay the apex court had imposed on January 16 on the operation of the December 14, 2023 order of the high court.

The high court in its December 14, 2023 order had allowed a court-monitored survey of the Shahi Idgah mosque complex and agreed to the appointment of a court commissioner to oversee it.

The Hindu side claims the premises hold signs suggesting that a temple once existed at the site. A bunch of petitions has been filed by the mosque management committee in the apex court including the one challenging the May 26, 2023 order of the high court transferring to itself all matters related to the dispute pending before a Mathura court.

In Mathura, a suit was filed in the court of Civil Judge Senior Division (III) for shifting the Shahi Idgah mosque, claiming that it was constructed on a part of the 13.37 acre land of the Shri Krishna Janmabhoomi Trust.



# Cambridge researchers unveil blueprint behind floral patterns in Hibiscus

Do you know flowers not only captivate with their colors but also guide pollinators like bees with their intricate patterns, much like a road map to their nectar? A team of researchers from the University of Cambridge's Sainsbury Laboratory has unveiled a hidden blueprint behind these floral designs, particularly in hibiscus flowers (Gudhal in Hindi). They found that bees prefer larger bullseyes over smaller ones and fly 25% faster between artificial flower discs with larger bullseyes - potentially boosting efficiency for both bees and blossoms.

This blueprint, laid down early in petal formation, determines the size and shape of the eye-catching bullseye patterns that can significantly influence a flower's appeal to pollinators, said the study published in Science Advances.

"Remarkably, bees are drawn to larger bullseyes, which could boost their foraging efficiency by 25%. This discovery not only deepens our understanding of how plants attract pollinators but also reveals the sophisticated strategies flowers use to evolve and thrive in their ecological niches," explained Dr Edwige Moyroud, main author of the study understanding the mechanisms underlying pattern formation in petals. The researchers discovered that

a pre-pattern forms on the petal surface very early in the flower's development, long before the petal displays any discernible color.

"The petal acts like a 'paint-by-numbers' canvas, where different regions are predetermined to develop specific colours and textures long before they start looking different from one another."

The research also revealed that plants can precisely regulate and alter the shape and size of these patterns through various mechanisms, which could influence plant evolution. By refining these designs, plants might enhance their ability to attract pollinators or potentially draw different insect species.

"If a trait can be produced by different methods, it gives evolution more options to modify it and create diversity, similar to an artist with a large palette or a builder with an extensive set of tools. By studying how bullseye patterns change, what we are really trying to understand is how nature generates biodiversity."

Lead author Dr. Lucie Riglet said in the study that she explored the mechanism behind hibiscus petal patterns by studying the development of petals in three hibiscus flowers that had identical overall sizes but varied bullseye patterns. She observed that the pre-pattern starts as a tiny, crescent-shaped area long before the bullseye becomes visible on petals smaller than 0.2mm.

# SC to hear pleas on demolition of properties of person accused of crime

The Supreme Court is scheduled to hear on Tuesday pleas which have raised grievances that properties of persons, who are accused of some crime, were being demolished in several States. While hearing these petitions on September 2, the apex court had questioned how can anybody's house be demolished just because he was an accused.

The apex court had said it proposes to lay down certain guidelines on the issue that would be enforceable across the country. "How can anybody's house be demolished only because he is an accused? Even if he is a convict, still it can't be done without following the procedure as

prescribed by law," observed the bench comprising Justices B R Gavi and K V Viswanathan. However, the court dais it will not protect any unauthorised construction or encroachment on public roads.

"We propose to lay down certain guidelines on 'pan-India basis' so that the concerns with regard to the issues raised are taken care of," the bench had said on September 2.

It had asked the counsel appearing for the parties to give suggestions so that the court can frame appropriate guidelines.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for Uttar Pradesh, had referred to an earlier affidavit filed by the state in the matter. He had said the affidavit states

that merely because a person was alleged to have been a part of some offence can never be a ground for demolition of his immovable property.

According to Mehta, the state has said demolition of an immovable property can take place "only for violation of and in accordance with the procedure prescribed in the respective applicable municipal law or law governing development authorities of the area".

The top law officer had said no immovable property can be demolished solely on the ground that the owner or occupant of such property was involved in a criminal offence. The counsel appearing for one of the petitioners had said almost every state was now indulging in this and demolishing properties.

# Congress to chair external affairs, agriculture, rural development committees in LS

The Congress will chair the parliamentary standing committees on external affairs, agriculture, and rural development in the Lok Sabha and education in the Rajya Sabha, party sources said on Monday, with talks between the government and the opposition over the panels' chairship concluding.

Development and Panchayati Raj in the Lok Sabha; and Education, Women, Children, Youth and Sports in the Rajya Sabha, a source told. Significantly, the Congress will chair the crucial committee on external affairs after a gap of five years. Senior Congress leader Shashi Tharoor headed

the panel on external affairs between September 2014 and May 2019.

The Congress last held the chairship of two department-related standing committees in the Rajya Sabha and one in the Lok Sabha.

While Jairam Ramesh headed the committee on Science and Technology, Environment, Forests and Climate Change, Abhishek Singhvi chaired the panel on Commerce. Tharoor headed the Committee on Chemicals and Fertilisers in the Lok Sabha.

# Varicose veins linked to serious health risks, new treatments enhance safety, effectiveness

Often dismissed as merely a cosmetic nuisance, Varicose veins, the enlarged and twisted veins typically found in the legs, can pose significant health risks and should not be underestimated, health experts have warned. For individuals with varicose veins face up to a five-fold increased risk of developing deep vein thrombosis (DVT), a potentially life-threatening condition.

Varicose veins are also linked to peripheral arterial disease and other vascular disorders, caution health experts. In a study published online in Cureus, Chukwuyem Ekhatior, Neuro-Oncology from New York Institute of Technology, College of Osteopathic Medicine, Old Westbury, USA said while some individuals remain asymptomatic, others experience discomfort such as

pain, itching, and throbbing. "If left untreated, chronic venous insufficiency can progress to more severe stages, leading to complications like edema, skin changes, ulcers, and bleeding.

Recent advancements in treatment have enhanced safety, effectiveness, and long-term success, said co-author Sophia B Bellegarde, Pathology and Laboratory Medicine, American University of Antigua, Coolidge, ATG. Dr. Vimal Bhandari, former head of the National Organ Transplant and Tissue Organisation (NOTTO) and Professor of Surgery at ESI Hospital and Medical College, explained,

"The condition arises when the valves within veins fail to function properly, leading to blood pooling and causing the veins to become twisted and enlarged. This malfunction is not only a cosmetic issue but a



precursor to serious complications if left untreated."

He advised seeking medical attention if varicose veins cause discomfort, swelling, or affect daily activities. Symptoms such as persistent pain, swelling, skin ulcers, sudden vein enlargement, or changes in skin color or texture should prompt a consultation with a healthcare provider. Early intervention can prevent complications such as venous ulcers, redness, eczema, and, in severe

cases, ruptured veins. Diagnosis of varicose veins and related complications often involves a Doppler ultrasound, which helps detect issues like DVT. Treatments include modern techniques such as radiofrequency ablation, which burns the affected veins to close them off and improve blood flow, said Dr Achintya Sharma, Senior Consultant and Incharge of Vascular and Endovascular Surgery at Max Hospital and Tirath Ram Shah

Hospital. He highlighted the prevalence of varicose veins, noting they affect approximately 40-60% of women, often due to factors like pregnancy and weight gain, and 15-30% of men.

"Modern methods focus on minimally invasive procedures rather than traditional invasive surgeries. Options include compression therapy, sclerotherapy, and laser therapy. Sclerotherapy involves injecting a solution into the vein to cause it to collapse and fade over time." Dr Aakash Patel from Shalby Hospitals, Ahmedabad talked about the Glue therapy, a minimally invasive and highly effective solution for treating varicose veins. He said that the therapy allows patients to return to their daily activities with minimal downtime.

It has been effectively used in the United States and Europe for the last 5 years.

# I want Haryana to be number one once again: Congress veteran Hooda

"I want to fight this battle not for myself but for you... I want Haryana to be number one once again." Congress veteran Bhopinder Singh Hooda declared from the dais while addressing a poll rally in his home constituency Garhi Sampla-Kiloi here a few days ago. The former Haryana chief minister, who turned 77 on Sunday, has remained a four-time MP from Rohtak and defeated former deputy prime minister Devi Lal from the parliamentary seat in the 1990s. Although the Congress has made it clear that its MLAs and the high command will pick the chief minister if the party wins the elections, Jat stalwart Hooda is virtually the face of the Congress for the upcoming Assembly polls. The Congress is contesting 89 seats - except Bhiwani which it has left for the CPI(M) --

and the majority of these have gone to Hooda loyalists or those considered close to him. Besides, the party has re-fielded all 28 sitting MLAs, most of whom owe allegiance to Hooda. In the recently concluded Lok Sabha polls, barring the Sirsa seat contested and won by his bete noire Kumari Selja, Hooda's choice prevailed in the remaining eight of the nine constituencies from where the Congress contested. It won five seats, including Sirsa, while its INDIA bloc ally AAP unsuccessfully fought the Kurukshetra seat. In the Assembly polls, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) is fighting solo after talks with the Congress to stitch an alliance did not materialise. It is believed that Hooda was opposed to any tie-up with the Arvind Kejriwal-led party for the Assembly polls. Notwithstanding opposition from some of his detractors

within the party, Hooda has managed to maintain a tight grip on the affairs of the Haryana Congress. The Garhi Sampla-Kiloi assembly segment, a Jat-dominated rural constituency in Rohtak from where the former chief minister is seeking a re-election, came into being in 2007, following the delimitation of constituencies. It is considered as a "gadhi" (bastion) of the Hooda family. Before the delimitation, this seat was known as Kiloi. In 2005, the Congress high command handpicked Hooda, who was then a Rohtak MP, to be the chief minister of the state after the party returned to power winning 67 seats. Hooda had edged out party veteran Bhajan Lal from the chief ministerial race and remained in office till 2014. After filing his nomination papers last week, Hooda told the people of his constituency, "You gave me a chance.



Whatever I am today, it is due to you and your blessings". He said even at this age, he wanted to fight an "aar paar ki ladai (do-or-die battle)", not for himself, but for the people of the state and sought their support to oust the BJP from power. "I want our state to be number one once again in all spheres," he asserted. Hooda reiterated that in the next month's elections, peo-

ple will "reject the vote katu (vote cutter) parties" and there will be a direct fight between the BJP and the Congress, which has been out of power for more than a decade. Asked how confident he is about Congress' victory, Hooda said, "We will win with a big majority. Chhattis biradari (people of all sections) have made up their minds to bring Congress back

to power. The BJP is on its way out and the Congress is coming back to power." Hooda said when he got the opportunity to run the government, Haryana was way ahead in various developmental parameters -- per capita income, investments, law and order, employment generation, welfare of farmers and poor, among others. "But today, the state has fallen behind. Unemployment is at its peak, crime is increasing and people are feeling insecure," he said. Hooda said the people are fed up with the 10-year rule of the BJP. Slamming the BJP's claims of ensuring a transparent administration, equitable development and jobs on merit, the Congress leader said, "Everyone knows their claims on development are hollow and this government has been hit by various scams". "But they are experts in event management and they always

try to cover up their failures," he said. Hooda has assured doubling of pension for the elderly, filling up of two lakh "vacant" posts, 300 units of free electricity and gas cylinders at Rs 500 each, and restoration of the old pension scheme for government employees if the Congress comes to power. The BJP has fielded 35-year-old Manju Hooda, Rohtak Zila Parishad chairperson, against the senior Congress leader in Garhi Sampla-Kiloi. Asked if she considers the contest a challenge, Manju Hooda said, "I have been among the people and getting their work done (as Zila Parishad chairperson). I have ensured development. So, I don't look at it as a challenge. I trust the hard work which I have been putting in and I am confident that the people will give their blessings to me," she said. Before the withdrawal of nominations, 11 candidates

from the INLD, the JJP, the AAP and some Independents were in the fray from the constituency. Among the Independents is 26-year-old Amit Hooda, a commerce graduate, who is currently pursuing his post-graduation. "I come from a non-political background and this is my first election. I have always been motivated by my grandfather who did a lot of social service. I also wanted to do something for my people, so that is the inspiration behind my fighting election," he said. Meanwhile, Rajender, a Congress supporter claimed that Hooda will win by a huge margin as Garhi Sampla-Kiloi is his pocket borough. A BJP supporter, however, claimed that Manju Hooda would emerge victorious as she has the support of the people, especially the youth, due to her work and the development carried out by the BJP government in the state.

## BJP may back sitting MLA, withdrawn nomination: Jangra

Rohitash Jangra on Monday said he has withdrawn his nomination and hinted that the party may back sitting MLA Gopal Kanda, who has been supporting the state government. Kanda is the supremo of the Haryana Lokhit Party (HLP) and is seeking re-election from the Sirsa Assembly seat. "I have withdrawn my nomination. The decision has been taken in the interest of the state and the country... We have to ensure a 'Congress-mukt Haryana'," Jangra told PTI over the phone. Asked if he had withdrawn in the HLP leader's favour, Jangra said, "Gopal Kanda has supported us (BJP) for five years. We have taken this decision for Sirsa's development." However, Interacting with



reporters in Sirsa later, Jangra said, "The party had given the ticket and it was the party's directive (regarding withdrawing of nomination)". The BJP, like the Congress, will now be contesting 89 of the 90 Assembly seats in the state. The Congress has left the Bhiwani seat for CPI(M).

Last week, the BJP released its third and final list of candidates for the Haryana polls, in which the party fielded Jangra from Sirsa. The Indian National Lok Dal (INLD) said on Thursday that it was extending support to Kanda in Sirsa. However, following the BJP's

withdrawal of its candidate, INLD leader Abhay Chautala said he would hold discussions with his party leaders to decide whether to continue supporting Kanda. "If they (BJP) have supported Gopal Kanda and if he has taken their support...I will speak to Kanda regarding this and discuss the issue within our party and then take a decision (on whether to continue support to Kanda)", Kanda told reporters while campaigning in his Ellenabad constituency in Sirsa district. The INLD is contesting the assembly polls in alliance with the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP). Meanwhile, speaking to reporters in Sirsa after withdrawing his nomination, Jangra said he has been associated with the BJP for more than four decades and had fought the Zila Parishad polls in 1994. Senior BJP leader and former MP Ashok Tanwar, who

accompanied Jangra, said, "There is only one aim which is to form a BJP government for the third time and to have a Congress-mukt Bharat and Congress-mukt Sirsa". Reacting to Congress allegations that the BJP had "surrendered" before Kanda, Tanwar said, that the opposition party had surrendered before foreign powers. "On foreign soil, they give statements to weaken the country. And those who have accepted defeat can say anything. We have to keep the Congress at bay," he added. Polling for the 90 Assembly seats in Haryana will be held on October 5 and the votes will be counted on October 8. The ruling BJP is eyeing a hat-trick of wins but faces a stiff challenge from a resurgent Congress, which is looking to cash in on the anti-incumbency factor.

## Great need to improve basic facilities all over Gurugram: Badshahpur BJP candidate

BJP candidate from Badshahpur assembly constituency and former minister Rao Narbir Singh said that there is a great need to improve basic facilities all over Gurugram including Badshahpur. "Most of the government schools and hospitals here are in a bad condition. The weak hands leading Badshahpur during the last five years are responsible for these conditions. If the people of Badshahpur support him and send him to the assembly, then every government school in Gurugram will become a model school like a private school," he said. Rao Narbir Singh said that during the last 20 years, the condition of Gurugram has

wants to improve the system of government schools and government medical facilities. There are 827 government schools in Gurugram. To make all these government schools model schools, cooperation will be taken from multinational companies. There are more than 400 MNC offices here, with whose help the condition of every government school will be improved and made the best," he added. Apart from this, it is necessary to have four civil hospitals in the four corners of Gurugram. "There should also be four vegetable markets here so that the people of this city with a population of millions do not have to face any kind of problem. I also want to build a dozen more underpasses and flyovers in Gurugram so that there is no problem at all," he asserted.

## Will try to make Gurugram most modern city in State: BJP candidate

BJP candidate from the Gurgaon seat, Mukesh Sharma, said that he will try to make Gurgaon the most modern city of the state; only then will Gurgaon be recognized on the lines of Indore in India and Singapore abroad. ## Last day of campaigning for J and K Assembly polls

The high-octane campaigning for all 24 Assembly constituencies spread across seven districts of Jammu and Kashmir came to a close on Monday evening with top leaders of the BJP, National Conference, Congress, Peoples Democratic Party, and a new entrant, the supremo of the Awami Ittehad Party making a last-minute effort to woo voters. The candidates conducted roadshows and public meetings before winding up their two-week-long hectic campaigning ahead of the first round of polling on September 18. The high-profile Assembly constituencies of Doda, Kishtwar, Banihal, Padder-Nagseni, Bhaderwah, Bijbehara-Srigufwara, Pulwama, and Kulgam are to be watched out in the first phase of polling in which over 23.27 lakh voters will decide the fate of 219 candidates in the fray.



Out of nine female candidates in the fray, five are contesting from the Kashmir division while four others are from the Jammu division. Candidates fighting elections from the Kashmir division include 37-year-old Iltija Mufti, daughter of PDP Chief and former Chief Minister Mehbooba Mufti from Bijbehara-Srigufwara constituency on Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) ticket, Afroza Bano as an independent from Kulgam and Sakeena Masood Itoo from D

H Pora constituency on National Conference ticket. The political parties have deployed a large number of women cadres to reach out to the women voters in their respective constituencies. Candidates contesting from the Jammu division include Shagun Parihar from Kishtwar on a BJP ticket, Meenakshi Bhagat on Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) from Bhaderwah, Meenakshi Kalra an independent candidate from Doda West, Pooja Thakur from Padder-Nagsani

on NC ticket. 29-year-old Shagun Parihar is challenging former minister Sajjad Ahmed Kitchloo of the National Conference while Pooja Thakur of NC is contesting against BJP organization secretary Sunil Sharma. Meanwhile, the Peoples Democratic Party has fielded its youth leader Waheed-ur-Rehman Parra from the South Kashmir constituency of Pulwama. He is fighting against Mohd Khalil Band of the National Conference. Parra unsuccessfully contested the Lok Sabha polls in May 2024. Another constituency of Pahalgam is witnessing a triangular contest between Altaf Ahmad Wani of the National Conference, Shabir Ahmed Sediqui of the PDP, and Rafi Ahmed Mir of JKAPNI. From Kulgam, CPI (M) leader Mohd Yusuf Tarigami is defending his turf for the fifth time in a row. Tarigami has won all four previous Assembly elections of 1996, 2002, 2008 and 2014. This time he is facing a tough

challenge from an Independent candidate Sayar Ahmad Reshi supported by the banned Jammat-e-Islami. The Kokernag Assembly segment, reserved as an ST category seat, is also witnessing an interesting contest between Zafar Ali Khatana of the National Conference and Haroon Rashid Khatana of the PDP. BJP has also fielded its candidate Roshan Hussain Shah Gojar. Six independent candidates are also in the fray from the reserved seat to try their luck. According to official sources, out of 23.27 lakh voters 5.66 lakh youths are eligible to exercise their electoral franchise during Phase-I polling. These 5.66 lakh young electors are between the age group of 18-29 and include 1,23,922 First Time Voters between the age of 18-19 years, with 6552 of them male and 58380 female electors. In Phase- I, 28,310 Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) and 15,774 voters above the age of 85 are eligible to cast their vote.

## Kin mourn deaths of ten people in three-storey house collapse

Never before had so many bodies lined up at the graveyard at the same time. Two days after a three-storey house collapsed, killing 10 people, residents of Zakir Colony recount with a shudder the loud explosion, the clouds of dust and the terrible aftermath of the tragedy. Not far away, seven-year-old Riya retells the horror of seeing her home crumble right in front of her eyes, killing her father and sister. Her entire family was inside when it happened on Saturday afternoon. The burial was held late on Sunday evening. Shops and markets remained shut in view of the last rites procession. "There was a loud explosion when it happened. Clouds of dust engulfed the area and in no time, the three-storey building had turned into rubble," said Naseem, a resident of the locality. Fifteen people were trapped under the debris of the col-



lapsed structure. Five persons injured in the incident are under treatment in hospitals. Riya, who lost her father Sajid (40) and sister Sania (15), has been very quiet since the incident, her relatives said. When mediapersons asked her about the incident, she said she saw the house collapse right in front of her eyes as she was playing just outside. All of her family was inside. Riya's mother is still battling for life in the hospital. Sajid's relative Hafiz Shahrukh said he was unable to understand whether to take care of the injured relatives or make

arrangements for burial of the dead. Others in the locality said Farhana (27), who was among the 10 who died, was seven-month pregnant. As the bodies arrived in the locality on Sunday, a day after the incident, residents were overwhelmed with emotion. Around 6 pm, the 'Namaz-e-Janaza' was read before the burial. Some people of the locality came out on the street to express their condolence as the last procession of the victims was taken out. Grieving family members and neighbours went to pay their

last respects at the graveyard. A small crowd had to stand outside for the last rites. Meanwhile, the site of the house collapse has been sealed by authorities. Leaders of many political parties, including ministers, met family members of the victims and offered their condolences. UP minister Dharampal Singh, who met the family members on Monday, also inspected the site where the building collapsed. Speaking to reporters, Singh, who is the minister in-charge of Meerut, called it a "painful and unfortunate" incident. "People were sleeping. They had no idea what kind of calamity would happen," the minister said. "UP Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath ji is very sensitive towards such incidents. I have come here today on his instructions. We will provide more help than expected. We will even make arrangements for the livelihood of the kin of the victims," he said.

UP Minister of State for Energy Somendra Tomar met the relatives of the victims late on Sunday evening. Tomar, who is also the Meerut South MLA, assured family members of all possible help from the government. Leaders of Samajwadi Party, Bahujan Samaj Party, Congress and Azad Samaj Party (Kanshi Ram) also met the victims' kin. ASP district president Surendra Singh Rachauti demanded that the government should immediately pay a compensation of Rs 10 lakh to family of each deceased and Rs 5 lakh to kin of injured persons. Houses for the victims' families should also be built, he said. Congress MP from Saharanpur Lok Sabha constituency Imran Masood said "The government should provide all possible help to the family members of the deceased persons. Top leadership of the Congress party will be informed about the entire incident and all possible help will be provided at the party level," he said.

## Family of deceased boy refuses compensation by WB Government

Turning down the compensation of Rs 2 lakh, the family of a 10-year-old boy who died at a state-run hospital in Dakshin Dinajpur district rejected the West Bengal government's claim that the ongoing agitation of the junior doctors caused his death. Shivam Sharma, a class 3 student, was injured in a road accident, following which he was taken to the Balurghat hospital. His family alleged that he died there due to the negligence of a senior physician who despite being on duty was late in attending to him. "There are no junior doctors at this hospital. And he died on August 12, three days after the incident at the RG Kar hospital when the agitation by the junior doctors was at a nascent stage. So any claim that he was a victim of junior



doctors' cease work is wrong," said Shivam's uncle Anand Sharma. Shivam died as the senior medic on duty did not attend him on time, he alleged. "Instead of passing the buck, the authorities must take action against the senior physician whose negligence took away a precious life," he said. Turning down the compensation offered by the state government, he said, "We want action against the guilty,

not monetary help." Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Friday announced that the state government would pay a compensation of Rs 2 lakh each to the families of 29 people who died allegedly after not getting treatment due to the ongoing cease work of the junior doctors. Shivam was among them. Officers of the state Health Department could not be reached for comment.

### Kejriwal's resignation announcement sparks speculation about the move and the future of AAP

In a move that has surprised many, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal is set to resign on September 17. As speculations swirl about the reasons behind his decision, political observers are divided—some see it as a strategic manoeuvre, while others suggest it might be a forced move driven by internal and external pressures. The resignation raises serious questions about the future of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and crucially, who might succeed him as the next Delhi chief minister. Kejriwal, known for his populist style of politics, has in the past made many bold announcements that appeared to be strategic gambles, often aimed at galvanising his voter base. His decision to step down as Delhi's Chief Minister in 2014 over the Jan Lokpal Bill is a notable example. He is vocal about it and implores other CMs not to resign come what may. However, there are also compelling arguments that this resignation may be more than just a stunt, an attempt to revive the party. His resignation is perhaps a necessary response to salvage his image as an honest and selfless leader and boost his party's standing in the upcoming elections. He would have an advantage when he goes to voters and tells them about his resignation and plays a victim card. Regardless of whether Kejriwal's resignation is a tactic or a forced measure, it undeniably leaves AAP at a critical juncture. Kejriwal has been the face of the party since its inception, and his exit from the Delhi Chief Minister's office could destabilise the party's core support base. More so as second-in-command, Manish Sisodia will also not be named as the new CM. AAP has worked hard to position itself as an alternative to the national parties, with a focus on governance, education, healthcare, and anti-corruption measures. However, the party's fortunes have largely depended on Kejriwal's leadership. His potential resignation could either pave the way for the party to mature into a broader, more stable entity or expose its dependency on a single individual. The pressing question now is: Who could be the next CM? Many AAP leader could take his place—Sanjay Singh, Atishi Marlena, Raghav Chadha or even his wife Sunita but it would be Kejriwal's choice for sure. As AAP looks ahead, the question remains: can the party make a comeback in the next elections despite its top brass embroiled in serious charges of corruption and wrongdoing. Well, Delhities would know better.

As the digital age unfolds, one thing is clear: conspiracy theories have never been easier to spread, nor harder to debunk. In 2024, as humanity embraces cutting-edge technologies like artificial intelligence, it's a strange paradox that ancient prophecies and far-fetched theories still hold a powerful grip on the collective imagination. From claims that the Moon landing was faked to the spread of false narratives about the COVID-19 pandemic, conspiracy theories shape our perception of world events, offering an alluring—if misleading—explanation for the chaotic times we live in.

Our fascination with the unknown has deep historical roots. Figures like the 16th-century mystic Nostradamus and the blind Bulgarian prophet Baba Vanga have captivated millions with their supposed ability to foresee global disasters, political upheavals, and even pandemics. For centuries, people have tried to align Nostradamus' cryptic quatrains with real-world events, from the rise of Hitler to the assassination of JFK. Similarly, Baba Vanga's alleged predictions of 9/11, Brexit, and natural disasters have only fueled modern fears of impending doom. Yet, despite the scepticism that surrounds their claims, these figures remain symbols of the human desire to make sense of a world that often seems beyond our control. In today's world, conspiracy theories have evolved. No longer confined to whispered conversations in dimly lit rooms, they now dominate social media platforms and news outlets. The Flat Earth Society, which defies centuries of scientific evidence to insist that the Earth is flat, finds new believers daily. The widely debunked theory that NASA staged the 1969 Moon landing still draws attention, as do theories that connect Nostradamus' prophecies to modern political figures like Donald Trump. While such theories may seem harmless or even entertaining to some, the consequences are often real and dangerous. The COVID-19 pandemic, for exam-



ple, was a breeding ground for conspiracy theories. False claims that the virus was engineered as a bioweapon, or that 5G technology spread the disease, circulated rapidly. These beliefs not only stoked fear but also fueled vaccine resistance, leading to a slower public health response. As artificial intelligence continues to revolutionize our world, it's also becoming a powerful tool for both the spread of and the fight against conspiracy theories. AI itself has become a subject of suspicion, with some fearing it as a means of mass surveillance or control. But AI is also being deployed to combat misinformation. Researchers have recently begun experimenting with AI chatbots, like GPT-4, to engage with conspiracy theorists directly. In a controlled study, participants were invited to express their beliefs in specific conspiracy theories. The AI then engaged them in a three-round dialogue, offering counterarguments and evidence to debunk their claims. Remarkably, these conversations led to a 20% reduction in participants' belief in their chosen conspiracy theory, and the effect lasted for at least two months. While these results are promising, they only scratch the surface of a much larger issue. Conspiracy theories persist because they provide simple, emotionally charged explanations

for complex global events. In times of uncertainty, people naturally seek out answers that make sense of their fears. Whether it's the belief that the U.S. government orchestrated the 9/11 attacks or that NASA faked the Moon landing to win the space race, these theories offer a false sense of order in a disorderly world. Social media algorithms amplify these ideas, often pushing the most extreme narratives into the spotlight, further fueling distrust and division. Even AI, with its potential to debunk misinformation, cannot overcome the deep-seated fear and scepticism that drive people to embrace conspiracy theories in the first place. The rise of AI has sparked its own set of conspiracies, with some claiming that it's part of a grand plot for world domination or that it's being used to control the masses. As much as AI can engage and educate, its ability to change hearts and minds is limited when faced with the sheer emotional power of fear and distrust. And it's not just AI or social media that keeps conspiracy theories alive. Historical events like the 9/11 attacks, the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, and the AIDS epidemic have all been used to fuel false narratives. One long-standing theory claims that HIV was a man-made biological weapon designed to target specific

populations, particularly African Americans and Latinos. Despite decades of scientific research disproving such claims, these ideas continue to find an audience among those who mistrust government and scientific authorities. At the heart of every conspiracy theory lies a fundamental distrust of authority. As Roman historian Tacitus once observed, when governments or those in power lose the trust of the people, manipulation and suspicion take root. And in today's hyper-connected world, these suspicions spread with unprecedented speed. Yet, there is hope. While AI alone cannot solve the problem of misinformation, it can be a valuable tool in the broader effort to rebuild trust and foster dialogue. The challenge is not just to debunk falsehoods but to address the deeper emotional and psychological needs that drive people to believe in them in the first place. It requires a concerted effort from governments, media, educators, and individuals to promote transparency, critical thinking, and open communication. As the world becomes more connected, the stakes grow higher. Misinformation, once confined to fringe groups, now has the power to shape global events. # Taliban suspends Af polio vax drives

The Taliban have suspended polio vaccination campaigns in Afghanistan, the UN said on Monday. It's a devastating setback for polio eradication, since the virus is one of the world's most infectious and any unvaccinated groups of children where the virus is spreading could undo years of progress. Afghanistan is one of two countries in which the spread of the potentially fatal, paralyzing disease has never been stopped. The other is Pakistan. It's likely that the Taliban's decision will have major repercussions for other countries in the region and beyond.

News of the suspension was relayed to UN agencies right before the September immunisation campaign was due to start. No reason was given for the suspension, and no one from the Taliban-controlled government was immediately available for comment.

A top official from the World Health Organisation said it was aware of discussions to move away from house-to-house vaccinations and instead have immunisations in places like mosques.



The WHO has confirmed 18 polio cases in Afghanistan this year, all but two in the south of the country. That's up from six cases in 2023. "The Global Polio Eradication Initiative is aware of the recent policy discussions on shifting from house-to-house polio vaccination campaigns to site-to-site vaccination in parts of Afghanistan," said Dr. Hamid Jafari from the WHO. "Partners are in the process of discussing and understanding the scope and impact of any change in current policy." Polio campaigns in neighbour-

ing Pakistan are regularly marred by violence. Militants target vaccination teams and police assigned to protect them, falsely claiming that the campaigns are a Western conspiracy to sterilise children.

As recently as August, the WHO reported that Afghanistan and Pakistan were continuing to implement an "intensive and synchronised campaign" focusing on improved vaccination coverage in endemic zones and an effective and timely response to detections elsewhere.

During a June 2024 nationwide

campaign, Afghanistan used a house-to-house vaccination strategy for the first time in five years, a tactic that helped to reach the majority of children targeted, the WHO said.

But southern Kandahar province, the base of Taliban supreme leader Hibatullah Akhundzada, used site-to-site or mosque-to-mosque vaccination campaigns, which are less effective than going to people's homes.

Kandahar continues to have a large pool of susceptible children because it is not carrying out house-to-house vaccinations, the WHO said.

"The overall women's inclusion in vaccination campaigns remains around 20 per cent in Afghanistan, leading to inadequate access to all children in some areas," it said. Any setback in Afghanistan poses a risk to the program in Pakistan due to high population movement, the WHO warned last month.

Pakistani health official Anwarul Haq said the polio virus would eventually spread and continue affecting children in both countries if vaccination campaigns aren't run regularly and in a synchronized manner.

"Afghanistan is the only neighbour from where Afghan people in large numbers come to Pakistan and then go back," said Haq, the coordinator at the National Emergency Operation Centre for Polio Eradication. "People from other neighbouring countries, like India and Iran, don't come to Pakistan in large numbers."

There needs to be a united effort to eliminate the disease, he told The Associated Press. The campaign suspension is the latest obstacle in what has become a problematic global effort to stop polio. The initiative, which costs about USD 1 billion every year, has missed multiple deadlines to wipe out the disease and technical mistakes in the vaccination strategy set by WHO and partners have been costly.

The oral vaccine has also inadvertently seeded outbreaks in dozens of countries across Africa, Asia and the Middle East and now accounts for the majority of polio cases worldwide. This was seen most recently in Gaza, where a baby was partially paralysed by a mutated strain of polio first seen in the oral vaccine, marking the territory's first case in more than 25 years.

# Ex-BBC news anchor gets suspended sentence

Former BBC news anchor Huw Edwards, once one of the most prominent media figures in Britain, was given a suspended prison sentence Monday for images of child sexual abuse on his phone. Edwards, 63, pleaded guilty in Westminster Magistrates' Court in July to three counts of making indecent images of children, a charge related to photos sent to him on the WhatsApp messaging service by a man convicted of distributing images of child sex abuse. Chief Magistrate Paul Goldspring sentenced Edwards to a six-month prison term suspended for two years. He will be listed on a sex offenders register for seven years. "It is not an exaggeration to say your long-earned reputation is in tatters," Goldspring said. Edwards' fall from grace over the past year has caused turmoil for the BBC after it was revealed the publicly funded broadcaster paid him about 200,000 pounds (USD 263,000) for five months of his salary after he had been arrested

in November while on leave. The BBC has asked him to pay it back.

"We are appalled by his crimes," the BBC said in a statement after the sentencing. "He has betrayed not just the BBC, but audiences who put their trust in him."

Edwards had been one of the BBC's top earners when he was suspended in July 2023 over separate claims made last year involving a teenager he allegedly paid for sexually explicit photos. Police investigated and decided not to bring charges. Although Edwards was not publicly named at the time those allegations surfaced, his wife later revealed he was the news presenter investigated and said he was hospitalised for serious mental health issues. He never returned to the air but the BBC kept him on the payroll until he resigned in April for health reasons. Edwards began his BBC career in Wales four decades ago. He went on to become lead anchor on the nighttime news for two decades and led the coverage of the funeral of Queen Elizabeth II in 2022 as well as

election coverage.

The BBC said at the time of his guilty plea that it was shocked to hear the details of the charges against him.

More than 375 sexual images were sent to him on WhatsApp between December 2020 and August 2021. More than 40 were indecent images of children, including seven classified as "category A" — the most indecent — with children estimated to be between 13 and 15. One child was aged between 7 and 9. In chats with Alex Williams, who was later convicted of distributing child sex abuse images, Edwards was asked if he wanted sexual images of a person whose "age could be discerned as being between 14 and 16," and Edwards replied, "yes xxx," prosecutor Ian Hope said.

"From that chat in December 2020, Alex Williams said that he had a file of vids and pics for you of someone special," Hope said. Edwards asked who the subject and was then sent three images that appeared to be the same person who appeared to be aged 14 to 16, Hope said.

# 3 journos allegedly attempting to flee Bangladesh arrested

Three journalists and another person were taken into custody while allegedly attempting to flee Bangladesh through the northern Mymensingh border with India, the police said on Monday. Prominent journalists Mozammel Babu, the chief editor of the private Ekatoor TV, and Bhorer Kagoj editor Shyamol Dutta, who were among the four detained while attempting to flee in a car early on Monday, were considered close to ousted premier Sheikh Hasina's regime and face "several cases" in Dhaka.

Others taken into custody included Ekatoor TV reporter Mahbabur Rahman and driver Selim, the police said. They were initially detained by the neighbourhood people near the zero line of the Dhobaura border of Mymensingh district at 6 am, the police said. The vil-



lagers later handed them over to Mymensingh police, it said. Private Samoy TV channel reported that Babu and Dutta, both prominent faces, were assaulted by locals who snatched away the money they were carrying before calling the police.

"They are now in our custody and their safety has been ensured during their stay in the police station. We have enhanced the security vigil," a police officer said. The official

said the Mymensingh police were awaiting concerned officials to take them to Dhaka for required legal procedures. The police in Dhaka on August 21 arrested another journalist couple Farzana Rupa and Shakil Ahmed while they were preparing to onboard a France-bound aircraft. The couple has been charged with murder during the anti-reservation students movement that eventually turned out to be a mass upheaval leading to the ouster of the Sheikh Hasina-led Awami League government on August 5. Identical murder charges have been lodged against several other journalists, drawing concern from international journalist rights groups and watchdogs. The interim government of Nobel Laureate Professor Muhammad Yunus indicated they were unlikely to be arrested until thorough investigations into the allegations against them.

# Israeli airstrikes kill 16 in Gaza

Jerusalem (AP): Palestinian officials say Israeli airstrikes have killed 16 people in the Gaza Strip, including five women and four children. A strike early Monday flattened a home in the built-up Nuseirat refugee camp in central Gaza, killing at least 10 people, including four women and two children. The Awda Hospital, which received the bodies, confirmed the toll and said another 13 people were wounded.

Hospital records show that the dead included a mother, her child and her five siblings.

Another strike on a home in Gaza City killed six people, including a woman and two children, according to the Civil Defence, first responders who operate under the Hamas-run government. Israel says it only targets militants and accuses Hamas and other armed groups of endangering civilians by operating in residential areas. The military rarely comments on individual strikes, which often kill women and children.

# Houthis down another US-made drone

Yemen's Houthi rebels claimed Monday that they shot down another American-made MQ-9 Reaper drone, with video circulating online showing what appeared to be a surface-to-air missile strike and flaming wreckage strewn across the ground. The U.S. military did not immediately respond to a request for comment on the Houthis' claim of downing of a drone over the country's southwestern Dhamar province. The Houthis have exaggerated claims in the past in their ongoing campaign targeting shipping in the Red Sea over the Israel-Hamas war in the Gaza Strip.

However, the online video bolstered the claim, particularly after two recent claims by the Houthis included no evidence. Other videos showed armed rebels gathered around the flaming wreckage, a propeller similar to those used by the armed drone visible in the



flames. One attempted to pick up a piece of the metal before dropping it due to the heat. Brig. Gen. Yahya Saree, a Houthi military spokesperson, identified the drone as an MQ-9, without elaborating on how he came to the determination. He said it was the third downed by the group in a week, though the other two claims did not include similar video or other evidence. The U.S. military similarly has not acknowledged losing any aircraft. Saree said the Houthis used a locally produced missile.

CIA over Yemen for years. The Houthis have targeted more than 80 merchant vessels with missiles and drones since the war in Gaza started in October. They seized one vessel and sank two in the campaign that has also killed four sailors. Other missiles and drones have either been intercepted by a U.S.-led coalition in the Red Sea or failed to reach their targets, which have included Western military vessels as well.

The rebels maintain that they target ships linked to Israel, the U.S. or the U.K. to force an end to Israel's campaign against Hamas in Gaza. However, many of the ships attacked have little or no connection to the conflict, including some bound for Iran.

Those attacks include a barrage that struck the Greek-flagged oil tanker Sounion in the Red Sea. Salvagers have begun towing away the burning oil tanker, hoping to avoid a catastrophic leak of its 1 million barrels of oil on board.

# French EU commissioner resigns after attacking leadership of top official

An influential French member of the European Union's powerful executive branch resigned on Monday, calling into question the leadership of European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen just as she tries to assemble a new team for the next five years. Thierry Breton, a French business executive and commissioner for the EU's vast internal market who recently clashed with tech billionaire Elon Musk, suggested that von der Leyen had gone behind his back to get another French official named in his place to the next commission. In a post on social media platform X containing his resignation letter to the EU's top official, Breton said that von der Leyen's move was "further testimony to questionable governance -- I have to conclude that I can no longer exercise my

duties in the college". The commission proposes legislation for the 27 EU member countries and ensures that the rules governing the world's biggest trading bloc are respected. It's made up of a College of commissioners with a range of portfolios similar to those of government ministers, including agriculture, economic, competition, security or migration policy.

With an eye to keeping a gender balance within the commission for her second term at the helm, von der Leyen had asked each member country to supply the name of a male and female candidate for policy commissioner. Most only proposed one candidate, often a man.

The commission chief, a former German defence minister, has been pressuring smaller countries to change their minds. In recent weeks, a man who was the preferred candi-

date of the government in Slovenia withdrew and a woman was proposed in his place. Von der Leyen decides which country gets which portfolio, and some of them, like those involving trade or finance or EU enlargement, are coveted by certain countries. Plum jobs like the post of "vice president" -- the commission has seven of these -- are also much sought after. Breton suggested that he was a victim of these political machinations. Few days ago, in the very final stretch of negotiations on the composition of the future College, you asked France to withdraw my name -- for personal reasons that in no instance you have discussed directly with me -- and offered, as a political trade-off, an allegedly more influential portfolio for France in the future College," he wrote in his resignation letter.

"You will now be proposed a

different candidate," he said. It was not immediately clear who French President Emmanuel Macron might name in his place. Macron's office did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

In any case, nothing is set in stone. The commission nominees must still pass a grilling in the European Parliament to take office.

Breton has irritated some in the commission with his go-it-alone approach. Acting last month without von der Leyen's approval, he took to X to warn Musk of possible "amplification of harmful content" by broadcasting an interview with former US President Donald Trump. Musk, who owns the social media platform, posted a derogatory reply. Trump campaign spokesperson Steven Cheung urged the EU to "mind their own business instead of trying to meddle in the US presidential election."

# Starmer, Meloni discuss curbing migrant boats to UK and Italy

Rome (AP): UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer is meeting Italian Premier Giorgia Meloni in Rome on Monday, as the two very different politicians, from left and right, seek common cause to curb migrants reaching their shores by boat. The visit comes after at least eight seaborne migrants died off the French coast over the weekend. Support for Ukraine is also on the agenda for the trip, part of Starmer's effort to reset relations with European neighbours after Britain's acrimonious 2020 departure from the European Union.

The centre-left Labour Party prime minister isn't a natural ally of Meloni, who heads the far-right Brothers of Italy party. But migration has climbed the UK political agenda, and Starmer hopes Italy's tough approach can help him stop people fleeing war and poverty trying to cross the English Channel in flimsy, overcrowded boats.

More than 22,000 migrants have made the perilous crossing from France so far this year, a slight increase from the same period in 2023.

Several dozen people have perished in their attempts, including the eight killed when a boat carrying some 60 people ran

aground on rocks late Saturday. The same day, 14 boats carrying 801 migrants reached Britain.

Starmer promised "a new era of international enforcement to dismantle these networks, protect our shores and bring order to the asylum system."

"No more gimmicks," he said before his trip to Rome -- a reference to the previous Conservative government's scuttled plan to send some asylum-seekers on a one-way trip to Rwanda.

Meloni pledged a crackdown on migration after taking office in 2022, aiming to deter would-be refugees from paying smugglers to make the dangerous Mediterranean crossing to Italy. Her nationalist conservative government has signed deals with individual African countries to block departures, imposed limits on the work of humanitarian rescue ships, cracked down on traffickers and taken measures to deter people from setting off.

Italy also has signed a deal with Albania under which some adult male migrants rescued at sea while trying to reach Italy would be taken instead to Albania while their asylum claims are processed. The number of migrants arriving in Italy

by boat in the first half of this year was down 60 per cent from 2023, according to the country's Interior Ministry.

Starmer wants to learn from Italy's mix of tough enforcement and international cooperation, though Italy's approach has been criticised by refugee groups and others alarmed by Europe's increasingly strict asylum rules, growing xenophobia and hostile treatment of migrants.

The leader of Italy's right-wing League, Matteo Salvini, who is deputy prime minister in Meloni's government, has been accused by prosecutors of alleged kidnapping for his decision to prevent a rescue ship carrying more than 100 migrants from landing in Italy when he was interior minister in 2019. British Home Secretary Yvette Cooper defended the government's decision to seek advice from Italy's right-wing administration, saying "we've always had a history of working with governments that have different political parties that are not aligned". She said the UK was interested in Italy's experience in fighting organised crime, as well as its deals with countries such as Tunisia to stop migrants' journeys before they reach the sea, and its deal with Albania.

# Columnists resign from Jewish Chronicle over Gaza articles fabrication claims

London (AP): Three prominent columnists have resigned from the newspaper Jewish Chronicle over allegations it published fabricated articles about the Israel-Hamas war.

The resignations on Sunday came after the London-based newspaper removed multiple articles by a freelance journalist and apologized to readers, saying it conducted an investigation into the writer and was "not satisfied with some of his claims". The newspaper did not specify which articles by the journalist, Elon Perry, were problematic. Among other claims, Perry -- who described himself as a commando in the Israel Defense Forces -- alleged that Hamas leader Yahya

Sinwar planned to smuggle himself and Israeli hostages out of Gaza through the border area with Egypt known as the Philadelphi corridor. The claims were questioned by Israeli media outlets.

Long-time Jewish Chronicle columnist Jonathan Freedland resigned in protest on Sunday, saying "the latest scandal brings great disgrace on the paper" and that it has "departed from the traditions that built its reputation as the world's oldest Jewish newspaper". "Too often, the JC (Jewish Chronicle) reads like a partisan, ideological instrument, its judgements political rather than journalistic," Freedland wrote on the social media platform X.

# Typhoon Bebinca makes landfall in Shanghai

Bebinca, the strongest typhoon to have hit China's Shanghai city in 75 years packing wind speed of 42 meters, made landfall on Monday bringing the megacity of 25 million to a grinding halt.

The typhoon, with the maximum wind force near its center reaching 42 meters per second, churned ashore at the Lingang area of Shanghai's Pudong District, the Shanghai central meteorological observatory said. The city has already mobilised thousands of relief and rescue workers to attend to emergencies.

Bebinca is believed to be the strongest typhoon to land in Shanghai in 75 years. It is the 13th typhoon to hit China this year.

The State Flood Control and Drought Relief Headquarters on Sunday activated a Level IV emergency response for east China's Anhui Province and raised the response in Shanghai and Zhejiang to Level III, state-run Xinhua news agency reported. Bebinca has already led to flight cancellations over Shanghai and the suspension of passenger ferry operations in the city. Shanghai Railway Station has announced plans to suspend passenger trains on

several routes passing through the city from Sunday to Monday. More than 414,000 people in the megacity of 25 million have been relocated by the end of Sunday, and all highways in the city were closed in anticipation of the typhoon, Hong Kong based South China Morning Post reported.

All flights from Pudong and Hongqiao airports were cancelled from 8 pm on Sunday. Ferries have stopped running, while bus services have been suspended in the waterfront district of Fengxian. The operator of Shanghai's airports stated that temporary rest areas have been prepared for passengers, and in-house catering vendors and convenience stores have been instructed to offer continuous service.

# Sensex hits new high

Equity benchmark index Sensex rebounded nearly 100 points to hit a lifetime closing high on Monday, while the broader Nifty ended just shy of its record peak, propelled by bargain hunting in energy, utility and banking stocks amid sustained foreign fund inflows.

The 30-share BSE Sensex climbed 97.84 points or 0.12 per cent to settle at a new record peak of 82,988.78. During the day, it jumped 293.4 points or 0.35 per cent to hit a fresh lifetime intraday high of 83,184.34.

The NSE Nifty rose 27.25 points or 0.11 per cent to settle at 25,383.75, over 5 points lower than its previous record. During the day, the benchmark gained 89.2 points or 0.35 per cent to hit a new intra-day high of 25,445.70.

"The domestic market traded in a narrow range with a positive bias as the participants are keenly awaiting the Fed's decision this week. The weakness in the US job market and benign inflation are pointing at a slew of rate cuts on the table. The inflow of foreign money and an expectation of

policy announcements," Vikram Kasat, Head - Advisory, PL Capital - Prabhudas Lilladher, said.

In the broader market, the BSE smallcap gauge climbed 0.28 per cent while the midcap index ended marginally up by 0.01 per cent. Among the indices, utilities jumped 1.97 per cent, power (1.93 per cent), metal (0.56 per cent), capital goods (0.56 per cent), consumer durables (0.49 per cent) and industrials (0.33 per cent). IT, telecommunication, tech, services and FMCG were the laggards.

In Asian markets, Hong Kong ended with gains. Markets in Japan, mainland China and South Korea were closed for holidays. European markets were trading mostly higher. The US markets ended in positive territory on Friday. Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) bought equities worth Rs 2,364.82 crore on Friday, according to exchange data. Domestic Institutional Investors (DIIs) also bought equities worth Rs 2,532.18 crore. Global oil benchmark Brent crude climbed 0.35 per cent to USD 71.90 a barrel.

# SEBI withdraws its press release on unprofessional work culture

Capital markets regulator Sebi on Monday withdrew its press release issued in September 4, which addressed claims of unprofessional work culture, stating that these concerns are "misplaced" and reaffirmed that employee-related issues will be managed internally.

The withdrawal came days after a protest by a large number of Sebi employees outside the regulator's headquarters on September 5, a day after the press release. They had demanded the withdrawal of the statement and the resignation of Sebi chief Madhabi Puri Buch. In a statement on Monday, Sebi acknowledged the critical role its employees have played over the past thirty-six years in shaping the Indian securities market into one of the most dynamic and well-regulated markets globally.

Sebi said it addresses employee-related matters through appropriate internal mechanisms. "Following constructive discussions with representatives of all grades of officers, Sebi and its employees have reaffirmed that such issues are strictly internal and will be managed in accordance with the organization's high standards of governance and within a



time-bound framework," the regulator said. Accordingly, the press release issued on September 4 has been withdrawn. The decision to retract the press release came after employees strongly condemned the unauthorized dissemination of internal communications. Sebi employees have reiterated their commitment to resolving concerns amicably through established internal channels, ensuring that such matters remain internal and managed within a time-bound framework.

"Employees have strongly condemned the unauthorized release of internal communication and have confirmed that all concerns shall be addressed amicably through established internal channels," the statement noted. For Puri, protests and internal issues have come at a time when she is probably facing the most challenging times in her stint. The career

banker-turned-regulator is battling speculations on whether a conflict of interest made her go slow on the probe against Adani Group and a raft of other allegations around it. In what is unprecedented for any financial regulator, around 500 employees wrote to the Finance Ministry on August 6, against the top management, for what they called a "toxic" work environment, which includes instances of public humiliation and shouting down.

After the publishing of a media report about the letter, Sebi responded with a press release, which stated such claims are "misplaced", which seemed to have irked the employees. The regulator stated that some "external elements" had instigated its employees into believing that they shouldn't be held to high standards of performance and accountability, though, it did not provide specific details.

# DGGI proposes global cooperation to curb GST evasion in OIDAR

GST investigation arm DGGI has suggested reciprocal arrangements with foreign governments for information sharing and enforcement measures as well as blocking of websites to prevent tax evasion in OIDAR services like e-gaming, online education and advertisement. The move has been necessitated as it has come to DGGI's notice that there are entities, including online casinos that are based out of tax havens and also those which operate through offshore VPNs and cloud-based platforms. These entities are non-cooperative and appear to intentionally avoid tax compliance, and hence an information exchange with global law enforcement agencies would help crack down on any evasion.

Online Information and Database Access or Retrieval (OIDAR) services are those which are delivered over the internet or electronic network and whose supply is essentially impossible without Information Technology. It includes a wide array of services viz cloud services, digital content, online gaming, online advertising etc. When such services are provided by an offshore entity to a non-taxable recipient, the supplier becomes liable for obtaining registration and discharging GST on the same.



Currently, as many as 574 offshore entities providing OIDAR Services have registered themselves with the GST department, and annual revenue from this sector has increased from Rs 80 crore for the FY 2017-18 to Rs 2,675 crore for 2023-24 fiscal. The Directorate General of GST Intelligence (DGGI) in its annual report noted that since the OIDAR service providers are located abroad it becomes a challenge in GST enforcement and hence the sector remains relatively untapped and holds tremendous revenue potential.

On dealing with such offshore suppliers, it has also dawned that several such suppliers are ignorant of the law, and upon conveying the legal position clearly, such suppliers agree to comply with the GST mandate, it said. These include the likes of Udemey Inc (USA), Canva Pty (Australia), OVH group (France), Blackboard (Netherlands) etc who registered themselves following efforts of DGGI and discharged significant tax

liability. "However, there are other entities that are non-cooperative and appear to intentionally avoid tax compliance. These include various online casinos based out of tax-havens like Malta, Cypress, Curacao, BVI etc. There are also other entities that are difficult to reach out to on account of them operating through VPN or cloud-based platforms," the DGGI said.

The GST intelligence wing said that unique challenges in tax enforcement in this sector necessitate out-of-the-box interventions to plug revenue leakage. The DGGI suggested steps like registering with the KODEX platform to receive the data/information in respect of offshore suppliers, as well as coordination with the Reserve Bank of India to obtain relevant data pertaining to forex transactions for purpose code falling under Group 8 (i.e. Computer and Information Services) of RBI's Purpose Codes for Reporting Forex Transactions to deal with evasion in the sector.

# Rupee rises four paise to close at 83.88 against US \$

The rupee witnessed range-bound trade and settled for the day higher by 4 paise at 83.88 (provisional) against the US dollar on Monday supported by weak American currency and significant foreign fund inflows, while firm crude oil prices capped sharp gains.

Forex traders said market participants are eagerly awaiting cues from the US Fed policy on Wednesday, with a rate cut all but certain. However, the magnitude of the cut remains uncertain. Moreover, the rupee continues to hold steady within a well-defined range on active intervention by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), they added. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened at 83.89 and witnessed an intraday high of 83.87 and a low of 83.90 against the American currency. The domestic unit finally settled for the day at 83.88 (provisional), higher by 4 paise over its previous close, amid a positive trend in domestic equities. On Friday, the local unit settled higher by 4 paise at 83.92 against the US dollar.



"We expect Indian rupee to trade with a slight positive bias on continued weakness in the US dollar ahead of the FOMC meeting this week," said Anuj Choudhary - Research Analyst at Sharekhan by BNP Paribas. which will also be played on Tuesday. Meanwhile in the fifth-sixth place classification match, Japan beat Malaysia 4-2 in shoot-out following a 4-4 stalemate in normal time. In the second semifinal as expected, the Indians started on the offensive and tested the Korean defence with persistent attacks from the world go. The Koreans, on the other hand, were content to sit back and defend and rely on sporadic counter attacks. Abhishek came tantalisingly close to handing India the lead in the fourth minute but his reverse hit was brilliantly saved by Korean goalkeeper Kim Jaehan. The Indian made promising build ups and penetrated the Korean circle on consistent basis in the first quarter. India's attacking intent finally paid off in the 13th minute when Uttam positioned himself at the right place

at the right time to tap in Arajjeet Singh Hundal's supply from the right. A minute from the first break, Korea secured back-to-back penalty corners but failed to utilise the chances. Four minutes into the second quarter, India secured their first penalty corner and Harmanpreet scored his sixth goal of the tournament to hand his side a 2-0 lead. At the stroke of half-time, custodian Suraj Karkera came out of his line to save an effort from the opposition player. India continued in the same vein after the change of ends and extended their lead two minutes into the third quarter. A brilliant scoop from Sumit from the right finds Jarmanpreet just outside the circle on the left flank and the latter neatly collected the ball and took a step or two to get inside the circle and slap the ball into the Korean goal to extend India's lead.

The goal hardly bothered the Indians as they continued their attacking game and dominated the share of exchanges. With a second left for the third quarter, India secured another penalty corner when Korean goalkeeper Jaehan was shown the yellow card for handling the ball outside the circle, and Harmanpreet made no mistake to extend the lead. Eight minutes from the final hooter, India's second goalkeeper Karkera made a fine double save to deny Park Cheolon, but the Koreans secured a penalty corner which went in vain. Thereafter, it was controlled show from the Indians as they defended their lead with consummate ease to march into their fifth final appearance in the tournament.



## Sharma finishes T-42nd as Hojgaard pips McIlroy to Irish title

Indian golfer Shubhankar Sharma had a choppy back nine leading to a round of 1-over 72 as he finished a disappointing T-42nd at the Amgen Irish Open at Royal County Down. Sharma, who was in the top-15 after the first two days, ended with a total of 4-over 288. He parred through the front nine and two more holes before finding his first birdie on the 12th. He bogeyed 13th and the 15th but birdied 16th only to drop a shot on 17th and close with a par. Meanwhile, Rasmus Hojgaard holed out twice and produced a stunning finish with four birdies in last five holes as he beat local favourite Rory McIlroy. McIlroy looked on course to claim his first professional win on home soil when he led by two shots with four holes to play at a venue just an hour from where he grew up. However, Hojgaard's superb closing 65 saw him claim his fifth DP World Tour title and move to second in the Race to Dubai Rankings and to the top of the European Ryder Cup standings. McIlroy had taken a one-shot lead into the final round and made the ideal start with birdies on the first and second. With playing partner Matteo

Manassero then dropping shots on the third and fourth, McIlroy briefly enjoyed a four-shot lead before making a bogey on the seventh after failing to get up and down from left of the green. He then missed from inside ten feet for birdie on both the eighth and the ninth as Hojgaard kickstarted his challenge with an outrageous chip-in for birdie on the tenth. A birdie on the 11th edged McIlroy two in front again, but that advantage was wiped out as Hojgaard birdied the 16th and McIlroy bogeyed the 15th. Hojgaard then dramatically holed out from a greenside bunker on the 17th and, although McIlroy drew level with a birdie on the 16th, he charged his birdie putt on the 17th past the hole and missed the return. Hojgaard's third birdie in a row on the 18th meant McIlroy needed to make an eagle on the same hole to force a play-off and a towering approach from 191 yards gave him a chance from 15 feet, only for the eagle putt to slide just wide. "I was nervous. I was shaking out there the last few holes. I obviously knew that Rory was going to be there because he's got the whole support on his back there. It was nerve-wracking going down the last few holes knowing that he was right behind me," Hojgaard said.

Rohit Sharma and Co had another extensive training session in the build up to the first Test against Bangladesh with all 16 squad members turning for practice at the Chepauk here on Monday. After a day off, the India squad members took part in their third training session since their arrival here last week. The first Test begins on Thursday. As it is often the case, Virat Kohli was among the first set of batters to hit the nets. In the adjacent net was southpaw Yashasvi Jaiswal as both him and Kohli faced Jasprit Bumrah and home hero R Ashwin. The next set of batters included skipper Rohit, Shubman Gill and Sarfaraz Khan, the last named player arriving here after taking part in the second round Duleep Trophy match in Anantapur. The captain focussed on playing spinners keeping Bangladesh's slow bowling attack in mind. Ravindra Jadeja, Rishabh Pant

and pacer Mohammed Siraj too faced local bowlers and significant amount of throwdowns. The practise pitch at the main square offered a decent amount of bounce. India will have two more practice sessions scheduled before the series opener against Bangladesh, who are riding on the confidence of their series sweep in Pakistan. Most players in the playing eleven select themselves. The Chennai surface usually favour the spinners and there is likelihood of India going into the game with three spinners and two pacers. The spinners expected to feature are Ashwin, Jadeja and Kuldeep Yadav while Bumrah and Siraj will share workload in the pace department. Axar Patel, despite his impressive all-round returns across formats, may have to sit out. On the batting front, Pant is expected to make his Test return after a gap of almost two years. Dhruv Jurel, who impressed his debut series against England, will be benched in that case.

## Sakshi Malik, Aman Sehrawat and Geeta Phogat announce Wrestling Champions Super League

Olympic medallists Sakshi Malik and Aman Sehrawat, along with former world championship bronze-winner Geeta Phogat, on Monday announced that they would soon launch a Wrestling Champions Super League (WCSL) for the country's budding grapplers but the national federation has refused to sanction the initiative. Sakshi, along with Bajrang Punia and Vinesh Phogat, had spearheaded the wrestlers' protest against ousted Wrestling Federation of India President Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, who was accused of sexual harassment. She has, however, distanced herself from the latter two after they took the political plunge by joining Congress ahead of next month's Haryana assembly elections. She won the 58kg bronze in 2016 Rio Olympics, and announced the project with Phogat, a 55kg bronze winner in 2012 World Championships through their social media handles. The two, while announcing that they had Paris Games bronze-winner Aman on board, did not provide any details. Phogat told PTI that she is



hopeful of support from the federation and the government. "Sakshi and I have been planning this League for long. Soon it will take a final shape. We have not yet spoken to the WFI but it would be great if WFI and government support us. It will be the first league that will be operated only by the players," Phogat said. "We are doing it for the players, for their benefit. That is the idea and vision, so no one should have any problem with it. It's a proud moment for us. We won't step anyone from getting involved in it, if WFI or government comes on board, even better. We have not yet spoken to them. "There will be international wrestlers, and coaches involved, so it should help our

junior wrestlers. They will get good exposure." The WFI said it would not give its sanction to the league. "We won't approve it. We are reviving our pro wrestling league and hopefully we will have it soon. The wrestlers are free to do their own league, they can promote the game, but we won't be linked with that," WFI President Sanjay Singh said. Asked if there will be prize money involved, and about the format and venue for the event, Phogat said, "You will have to wait a bit to know all this. We will share the details very soon." Sakshi, who retired from wrestling after Sharan Singh's close aide Sanjay Singh became WFI head, said she hopes to give back to the sport

through this initiative. "The only way to repay your trust is to dedicate our sporting talent, experience, grit & success to the service of the sport. The 2 of us have therefore come together to create the Wrestling Champions Super League (WCSL)," she posted on X. "The WCSL, a world class international league, will skill & strengthen our wrestlers to dominate the sport globally by taking on the world's best in a hyper competitive, expertly supervised environment with best-in-class support systems in place." She also said that Sehrawat, who won bronze in 57kg in Paris Olympics, also "shares our vision and is joining us on this journey." "This league is a very commendable initiative which will help Indian wrestling greatly and therefore I want to be a part of it and support it fully," Aman was quoted as saying by Sakshi. Daughter of noted wrestling coach Mahavir, Geeta is a cousin of Vinesh, who will be contesting from Julana constituency during the Haryana elections. Sakshi said the aim of the league is to build a culture of sustained high performance in the sport in the country.
