Cyber police arrest notorious fraudster

Conman exploited multiple women sexually, financially PNS BHUBANESWAR The Cyber Crime Unit of the CID, Crime Branch has arrested one Biranchi Narayan Nath of Chhendipada in Angul district, who exploited sexually as well as financially several middle-aged women looking for second marriage. The accused had created a profile on a matrimonial website, 'Second Marriage,' and posed as a railway employee, an Income Tax Inspector or officer in Customs and Central Excise Department. He targeted middle-aged women, who were unmarried, separated, widows or divorced. Initially, he approached the victims, sending marriage requests through the website. This was followed by phone conversations and later visits to their homes. He emotionally manipulated them by promising lifelong support for their children and companionship. Many women were attracted by his fake profile and



fell into the trap. He also promised many of his victims to get them job after marriage. He underwent marriage rituals with many women in temples and later cohabited with them at their homes but never took any of them to his own place. He secretly captured the intimate moments with them and also took nude photos and videos of many of victims through video calls. He later extorted money from the victims in shape of cash, gold and other valuables by threatening them to make public their private photos and videos on social media if they did not adhere to his demand. He accused used multiple names such as Manas Rath alias Pravakar Srivastav alias

in Rourkela. On October 7, 2023, Pravakar visited the victim's home and expressed his desire to proceed with the marriage proposal. During video calls, he clandestinely captured her nude videos. He later took her on trips outside Odisha too. Using those videos he forced her into physical relationship at multiple locations. After the deceitful marriage, he lived with her in her house for five months and continued to exploit her sexually and financially. He also physically assaulted her whenever she resisted. He extracted around Rs 5 lakh and 32 grams of gold from her. The victim eventually discovered that Pravakar was involved in similar relationships with other women, prompting her to report the matter to the authorities. The fraudster has also been involved in similar cases in Rajasthan, West Bengal, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Haryana and Delhi. Significant digital evidence, including private photographs, videos of several women and fake IDs have been recovered from him and they are being analysed to determine his involvement in other cases.

In city Mystery shrouds MCA girl student's death

Kin allege murder by boyfriend PNS BHUBANESWAR Mystery shrouded the death of a girl, whose body was found hanging from the out-house of an apartment here on Friday. The deceased was an MCA student and was allegedly staying with a youth in a live-in relationship. However, the family members of the deceased alleged that she had married the youth and she was murdered. The role of her boyfriend has now come under scanner as he has allegedly been miss-



20kg gold seized from passenger at BBSR airport

State Commercial Taxes (CT) and GST officials on Friday seized around 20 kg of gold from a passenger at the Biju Patnaik International Airport (BPIA) here. The huge amount of gold was seized from the passenger, who landed in Bhubaneswar from Mumbai by an IndiGo flight. The consignment was seized as the carrier failed to produce valid documents. The CT GST officials detained the passenger, believed to be a businessman. He was being interrogated for further information. The consignment was being transported in packets that were supposed to be despatched to Kalahandi and Angul. According to sources, the CT and GST officials received information about the gold being transported from Mumbai through the IndiGo flight. The raid team intercepted the carrier while he was coming out with the gold. As per preliminary inquiry, the carrier showed papers for 16 kg gold, but he could not produce a satisfactory tax invoice and other documents for the remaining 4 kg gold. Notably, the GT and GST team had seized about 80 kg of gold and 200 kg of silver ornaments from a container near the BPIA on August 26, 2024.



Odisha to amend Prevention of Cow Slaughter Act

NALINI SAHU BHUBANESWAR In a significant move aimed at addressing animal welfare and boosting Odisha's agricultural economy, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi on Friday announced plans to amend the Orissa Prevention of Cow Slaughter Act, 1960. He was speaking at the 'Monsoon Meet' organised by the Union Ministry of Animal Husbandry and Dairying. "Odisha is laying the groundwork for transformative changes despite the new government being in its infancy," Majhi said, highlighting a roadmap that targets both immediate and long-term sectoral growth across the State. Among the key initiatives unveiled was a "Mukhyamantri Kamadhenu Yojana," a five-year plan with a budget allocation of Rs 1,423.47 crore. This scheme is designed to elevate milk pro-



duction through various support mechanisms, including subsidised calf feed, increased livestock insurance and strengthening of dairy cooperatives. Majhi also emphasised Odisha's partnership with the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB), which is set to enhance milk production and fortify State-run cooperatives. Plans include the establishment of a cutting-edge vaccine production unit in Brahmapur and a feed analytical laboratory in Bhubaneswar. In the poultry and small animal sectors, a "Prani Sampad Samruddhi Yojana" will be launched to promote sustainable livestock farming. Additionally, a "Small Animal Breeding Policy" is being formulated to stimulate growth in this segment. Majhi also introduced a "GOMATA Yojana" (Goal for Management and Treatment of Animals), which aims to improve livestock health through mobile veterinary clinics. He also unveiled a "Mukhyamantri Prani Kalyan Yojana", a scheme focused on the compassionate treatment of stray animals. The Monsoon Meet, a first-of-its-kind event held in Odisha, was attended by key figures, including Union Minister for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying Rajiv Ranjan Singh, and senior officials from 15 States.

BMC issues guidelines for street food vendors

PNS BHUBANESWAR To ensure proper sanitation, consumers' health and cleanliness, the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) on Friday released a new set of eleven guidelines for all the roadside food outlets in the city. All the food outlets were directed to mandatorily obtain food licences. From now on, the food vendors will have to wear headscarves, masks, and gloves while serving food to the customers. They must wear clean clothes with apron on top. They have to keep all the food covered. The BMC also directed the outlets not to serve food to customers on use-and-throw plates but only use steel plates,



spoons, cups and other utensils. The outlets must use oil paper over the plates before serving food to customers. They must provide proper drinking water and use safe water for the preparation of food. They should change the water that is used to clean the plates. They must not serve stale food to the customers. The eateries have also been advised to keep two dustbins, one for dry and another for wet residuals. Besides, for tea vendors, the BMC directed them not to serve tea in use-and-throw cups and, instead, use clay cups. Any deviation from these instructions shall be viewed seriously and the BMC will take measures to impose a fine and shut the shop with the cancellation of trade licence.

BJD leader, govt staff held for 'embezzling' Rs 1.19 cr

Fund was meant for OMBADC projects

The Vigilance police on Friday arrested BJD leader and former Suliapada Block president Dibyalochan Das on the charge of embezzling funds to the tune of Rs 1.19 crore meant for the development of the block and the panchayats in Mayurbhanj district.

The anti-corruption agency also arrested a contractual employee, Manoj Deo, for allegedly assisting Das in the misappropriation of the funds.



Without government approval, they allegedly transferred Rs 1.19 crore to various accounts during Covid-19 period. This came to light days after the arrest of Parikhit Jena, former BDO of Suliapada and current

Baleswar Deputy Collector.

Apart from the BDO, an accountant and a businessman have also been arrested by the Vigilance in this case. At least eight of them have been accused of misappropriating Rs 1.19 crore from the

Odisha Mineral Bearing Area Development Corporation (OMBADC) funds of Suliapada block.

However, the BDO along with the BJD leader and others allegedly embezzled the funds by simply diverting it to their accomplices without any execution of work. Vigilance has registered a case against the eight persons in this connection. Five of them have been arrested so far while the remaining three are reportedly on the run.

The OMBADC fund was meant for financing projects on livelihood intervention, health, water supply, sanitation and education.

Subhadra scheme fraud 3 including couple held for demanding money

The Commissionerate police on Friday arrested three more persons for allegedly demanding Rs 200 each for the registration and application forms of Subhadra Yojana in Bhubaneswar.

Among the three arrested was a couple from the Chandrasekharpur area. They were identified as Sasmita Jena and her husband Ranjit Jena. The duo who runs a Jana Seva Kendra in Chandrasekharpur was allegedly demanding Rs 200 each from applicants for the forms.

On being informed, the



Chandrasekharpur police arrested both and forwarded them to court.

Similarly, another Jana Seva Kendra employee was ar-

rested in the Kharvel Nagar area for selling Subhadra application forms without authorisation from the government.

"Now, everywhere, the registration and form fill-up process is going on for Subhadra Yojana applicants. Bhubaneswar police are making every possible effort to ensure that the process goes on peacefully. Our team is regularly visiting Jana Seva Kendras to ensure that there is no demand for money from the applicants as it is a completely free process," said city DCP Prateek Singh.

Notably, the Commissionerate police have launched a free Helpline Number 7077798111 for those facing scams while applying for Subhadra Yojana.

BJP prepares for PM Modi's visit

The BJP on Thursday held a meeting at the State party headquarters here in view of the forthcoming visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the State on April 17 to launch the much-hyped Subhadra Yojana. Under the Subhadra Yojana, a woman having less than Rs 18,000 income per annum will get Rs 50,000 in 10 equal installments in five years as financial assistance. Over one crore women in

Odisha will be benefited by this scheme. The State Government has allocated Rs 10,000 crore in its 2024-25 Budget for disbursement of Subhadra Yojana assistance.

Modi is also to lay foundation-stones for multiple infrastructure projects in the State. This will be the second visit of Modi to Odisha after the BJP came to power in the State. He had come to the State on June 12 to attend the swearing-in-ceremony of the BJP's first Chief Minister Mohan Majhi.

Town road repairs across State by Oct 5: Min

Road repair works in all towns of Odisha, including Twin City of Cuttack and Bhubaneswar, would be completed by October 5, said Law and Works Minister Prithviraj Harichandan on Friday after a special meeting for the first time ahead of the upcoming Dussehra festival.

Harichandan also ordered the departmental authorities to address the waterlogging issues.

"Meetings will also be held after Dussehra for a perma-



nent solution to traffic issues. Deliberations will be made for the construction of new roads to solve the traffic-related issues in Cuttack and Bhubaneswar," said he.

National Highway Authority were present. Cuttack-Barabati MLA Sofia Firdous said, "I have seen many issues on roads while visiting different places during Ganesh Puja. The list has been provided to the CMC."

"There is a lack of proper coordination during the road and drain works. As a result, people are facing lots of problems. The shoddy roads should be completely dug and new ones should be constructed on the basis of long-term planning," said Bhubaneswar Central MLA Ananta Narayan Jena.

5T schools not able to pay electricity bill: Min

Electricity bills of 5T schools are pending and the students are paying the price, said Energy Minister KV Singh Deo in Assembly on Wednesday. While responding to questions by Jajpur BJD MLA

Sujata Sahu and Deogarh MLA Romanch Biswal, the Energy Minister said that there was no such department in the name of 5T and there was no budgetary provision for the department.

As schools came up under the 5T, the students are now paying the price. Not only this, panchayats are also struggling to pay the electric-

ity bills, said the Minister. "It is 5T shock as such questions are now cropping up. The Odisha government is now providing Rs 105 crore to panchayats to clear their outstanding electricity bills. But they have to clear the current bills; if schools are yet to clear their bills, they can approach Tata Power for deferred payment. They can also

approach the concerned Education Department Minister for a discussion on the matter," the Minister added. Earlier, MLA Sujata Sahu had asked question about a 5T transformation school which is incurring an electricity bill of over Rs 3,000 plus every month and it has now pending dues of around Rs 80,000.

Min urges for maritime institute in State



Commerce and Transport Minister Bibhuti Bhusan has sought the Centre's support for development of ports, maritime infrastructure and establishment of a world-class maritime institute or university in Odisha.

Jena was participating at the 20th Maritime State Development Council meeting in Goa on Friday.

He emphasised Odisha's commitment to transforming its maritime infrastructure. He said Odisha is aligning its initiatives with the Govern-

ment of India's Harit Nauka Guidelines, including introduction of a 20-seater solar-electric boat in the Chilika lake. The State also plans to retrofit 2,696 registered boats to solar electric hybrid boats to reduce emissions and promote green fuels.

Jena also drew the attention of the Centre for development of a major port and cruise terminal to leverage Odisha's 480-km coastline and enhance tourism and maritime connectivity along the eastern coast.

He proposed for the development of fishing harbours and jetties.

'Students' interest neglected for 24 yrs in State'

Says Congress

The BJD and BJP governments have neglected the interest of students in the State. For the last 24 years, the education system has crumbled in Odisha. 'Let Pradhan withdraw remarks on Ravenshaw name change'

Forum urges CM to come out with statement

The Ravenshaw Heritage Forum has urged Union Minister, Education Dharmendra Pradhan to withdraw his remarks made by him in connection with name change of Ravenshaw University. At the same time, the forum urged Chief Minister, Odisha to put the matter at rest through a public statement to assuage the apprehensions of the thinking public and not to allow unnecessary distractions that

affect the State's progress, peace and tranquility.

"As far as the Ravenshaw University brand is concerned it has earned a well-deserved recognition at the national and international levels over more than 150 years. It has been a highly respected name not only for the Ravenshawians, but for people of Odisha at large, to the extent that the institution has been seen as an integral part of Odia identity and pride. The makers of modern Odisha, many of whom passed through the portals of this institution never felt the need for changing the name of Ravenshaw

College or other institutions at Cuttack named after Ravenshaw. Many of these stalwarts were freedom fighters and patriots who cannot even remotely be suspected to be sycophants of or beholden to the colonial masters. If they did not find anything wrong or amiss in the name of Ravenshaw College/University, though they at times were closer to the disastrous famine, we do not find any reason the issue would be raked up now. If anything, any such thought exposes our lack of pride in our past and doubts about our own identity. This would amount to throwing

away a prized brand for no gain whatsoever or rather at an incalculable loss," the forum said in a release.

The issue of TE Ravenshaw's alleged complicity in causing the Great famine of Odisha and the resultant loss of lives has been cited as the justification for changing the name of Ravenshaw University. On the basis of historical evidence, we do not believe that Ravenshaw was solely or majorly responsible for the great tragedy that befell Odisha in 1866. However, whether the allegation is supported by historical evidence is one issue. The other issue is

the contribution of Ravenshaw to Odisha's development, especially in the areas of education, building of Odia identity and taking these factors into account in a holistic evaluation of the person in whose name three institutions, including Ravenshaw College were named, it added.

It suggested that the Minister Pradhan rather should concentrate on addressing the long pending priorities in higher education which are crying for his attention so that the nation's long awaited demographic dividend does not turn into a demographic nightmare.

Mahtab again pleads for Ravenshaw name change

Amidst the ongoing political slugfest over Union Minister Dharmendra Pradhan's remarks that the name of Ravenshaw University should be changed, Cuttack BJP MP Bhartruhari Mahtab has once again thrown weight behind the proposal.

Speaking at a seminar here, Mahtab said the proposal to change the name of Ravenshaw University is nothing new. Earlier, there was also a demand voices to rechristen the Ravenshaw College (now

a university) after the completion of the merger of princely states to form a greater Odisha province in 1949.

According to Mahtab, several students' organisations had also staged demonstrations and even the issue of renaming was discussed in the Odisha Assembly during the tenure of the then Education Minister Pandit Lingaraj Mishra. The MP said why an institution should be named after a Britisher when it was funded by Odias. Eminent litterateur Haraprasad Das said, "The Ravenshaw University should

be renamed after Gajapati Kapilendra Deba and it can be done if the Odisha Government wants. We have not been able to give credit to Kapilendra Deba, who had given identity to Odias and Odisha." Congress MLA Tara Prasad Bahinipati said, "Both BJD and BJP are doing this to remain in discussion. There is a need for discussion and debate on unemployment, development and corruption. But it is not happening and discussion is going on Ravenshaw. Those who have studied in Ravenshaw will never tolerate it."

In Cuttack Drunken police van driver injures two

At least two persons, including a cobbler and a cyclist, were injured after being hit by a police vehicle at Biju Patnaik Square in Cuttack on Friday.

It was alleged that the driver of the police vehicle was in an inebriated condition and was driving rashly. After hitting the two per-

sons, the police vehicle lost control and slipped into a drain. Following the incident, tension prevailed among the locals in the area.

However, the driver of the police vehicle was rescued by other staffs of the local police station. Police officials were yet to issue any comment in connection with the incident.

No liquor in beach shacks in Puri

Changes made in Excise Policy

The State Government on Friday imposed restrictions on the operations of beach shacks, which were allowed to serve liquor in a bid to boost tourism as per the new Excise Policy.

Now, the government has made changes and clarified that no beach shacks would be allowed in Puri, the abode of Lord Jagannath.

The modification came in view of massive protests and opposition to the new Excise

Policy.

Earlier, the Excise Policy for 2024-25 which came into effect from September 1, 2024 stipulated that serving of liquor in beach shacks is allowed in the State for the purpose of promoting tourism. However, the licence for location and the number of beach shacks allowed for serving liquor would be based on the approval given by the Tourism Department.

In its latest notification, the Excise Department said that allowing beach shacks in Puri is not in the interest of preserving the socio-religious-cultural significance of the land of Lord Jagannath. Similarly,

there are other places of religious significance within the State, in the vicinity of which beach shacks are likely to create adverse impact on the social-religious-cultural atmosphere.

"Therefore, it is proposed to issue a clarification to the effect that beach shacks will not be allowed in the jurisdiction of Puri Municipality as well as within 5 kilometers of such other places of socio-religious-cultural significance in other parts of the State. Such other places may be decided by the government after due deliberations," the notification stated.

21,357 birds culled in K'pada infected zone

District Collector Smruti Ranjan Pradhan, on Friday evening, informed that a total of 14 Rapid Response Teams (RRTs) have been engaged in culling, mopping, cleaning and disinfection work in the bird flu-hit places since September 8 in the district.

In addition, 6 RRTs have been engaged in surveillance work in 1-10 km corridor area of the epicentres of the flu.

The surveillance work is also being done by the staff of Animal Husbandry Department in Cuttack and

Jajpur districts, covering their own areas within the surveillance zone.

As on September 12, a total of 21,357 chickens, including 7,296 in Ender village and 14,061 in Balia village were culled with disposal of 810 kg of flesh including 160 kg in Ender village and 650 kg in Balia village. Besides, bird feeds and 77 eggs (12 in Ender village and 65 in Balia) were destroyed.

Notably, the avian influenza broke out in Ender and Balia villages of Derabish Block in Kendrapada District on September 7.

From Saturday onwards, cleaning and disinfection work will be done by 14 RRTs covering all the farms located inside the infected zones of the two epicentres till issue of Sanitizations Certificate. As per the surveillance reports received, there is no unusual mortality reported within the Surveillance Zone, stated district Collector Pradhan.

The swab samples collected from 4 poultry farmers in the Infected Zone were found negative for H5N1 virus as per the laboratory examination report of ICMR, Bhubaneswar.

Bank fraud: Farmers swindled of lakhs in K'pada

Hold stir accusing bank officials of complicity

In a case of major bank fraud, lakhs of rupees have allegedly been withdrawn from the accounts of farmers without their knowledge at Baruna Primary Agriculture Cooperative Society, the branch of Cuttack Central Cooperative Bank at Rajkanika in Kendrapada district.

Expressing outrage, farmers who have lost lakhs of rupees to the alleged fraud by the bank official(s) staged a sit-in protest outside the bank. Despite repeated complaints, the farmers alleged no action has been taken against the accused.

While farmers have accused bank secretary Asit Behuria of swindling the money, they also suspect the involvement of other officials. Irate farmers demanded the strictest and exemplary punishment for those involved in the fraud of swindling money of innocent and uneducated farmers.



According to sources, at least 10 farmers have been victims of the fraud. Without their knowledge, the bank official(s) allegedly withdrew money from their account as most of the farmers do not have proper knowledge in withdrawing money, passbook updates, and other banking systems.

Several cases have been lodged with the Rajkanika police. However, no action has

been taken in this regard. Frustrated, the farmers finally resorted to protesting outside the bank.

"Baruna Primary Agriculture Cooperative Society secretary Asit Behuria has swindled lakhs of rupees from the accounts of farmers without their knowledge. Despite several written complaints, no action has been taken against him," alleged farmer leader, Prabesan Mallick.

When contacted, Manager, Cuttack Central Cooperative Bank of Rajkanika Branch Nirod Kumar Nayak said, "The farmers who are sitting in protest have not even held a discussion with me. I have informed my higher authorities about the protest. We want the farmers to put up their demands in writing so that we can talk to them and come out with a solution."

6 yrs on, VIMSAR Super Speciality Hosp not functional yet

Even as all construction works of establishment finished

Though the construction of VIMSAR Super Speciality Hospital at Burla in Sambalpur was completed in 2017, it is yet to be functional even after six years due to alleged apathy and dillydallying by the State Government and the hospital authorities.

As per reports, infrastructure of the hospital constructed by a company from Visakhapatnam is fully ready for operation. However, according to VIMSAR Director Bhabagrahi Rath, some special-



ist doctors for different departments are yet to be appointed and hence, the hospital is yet to be made operational.

"Some works in the hospital are still to be completed. We just received fire and lift clearances. We are going through different processes including water and electricity connections. We can't start the hospital before ensuring safety

According to Mahasangha sources, the leaders of OBM have reportedly discussed the matter with Puri MP Dr Sambit Patra and former Deputy Speaker and BJP leader Rama Chandra Panda among others in the matter seeking their cooperation and support.

Gopalpur Port sale

Protection of corporate interest over State's: Forum

The Human Rights Protection Forum here on Thursday strongly criticised the current BJP government's decision to sell Gopalpur Port, a major commercial hub in Ganjam district, to Adani Group.

Gopalpur Port, which handles the transportation of iron ore, coal, limestone, and alumina, is a key national asset developed through taxpayers' money. However, the Odisha Government has sold 95% of the port's shares, worth Rs 3,800 crore, to Adani.

Until 2006, Gopalpur Port was managed by the State Government. Over the past 18 years, it has seen ownership changes five times, being used more for exploitation than development. In 2006, Noble and Sara Company took over, fol-



lowed by Jindal in 2011 and in 2017. Then it was operated by Shapoorji Pallonji Group in partnership with Odisha Steel Limited.

The forum claimed that both the previous and current State Governments lack concrete plans for the welfare of the people. The BJP Govern-

ment has been accused of acting as a mere "commission agent" by selling national institutions one after another. The forum members further alleged that the Government's failure to operate Gopalpur Port under its own Commerce and Industry Department shows a lack of capability, and that the

sale was done solely to benefit the Adani Group.

The forum fiercely condemned the Government's actions, declaring that the sale of Gopalpur Port is a blatant betrayal of public trust. The decision, driven solely by cronyism, serves to enrich private corporations at the cost of national as-

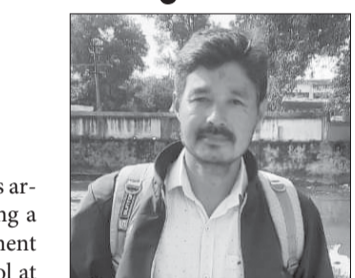
sets and regional development. "This is not just a sale; it's an outright surrender of our economic sovereignty to corporate interests. The Government has failed its people, prioritizing Adani's profit over the welfare and future of Odisha," Forum spokesperson advocate Abani Gaya said.

2 students drowned during idol immersion

As per reports, four Class-XII students of the Ranibhol Adarsha Vidyalaya School had come to immerse the idol.

The students were staying in a private mess where Ganesh Puja celebrations were held recently. The owner of the mess claimed that the students had safely immersed the idol from the bridge. However, they slipped into the canal af-

ter they were chased by a stray dog. The owner claimed that two students were rescued by ODRAF and Fire Service teams while a search operation was subsequently launched to trace the missing two students. Later, the bodies of the two students were recovered after a long operation.

"We want to ask how the hostel authorities allowed them to go for immersion. They are not receiving the phone. It is unfortunate that no boat has arrived at the spot, which is only two km from Baripada town," said a relative of a missing student.

Jaishankar reveals his father was on hijacked flight in 1984

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on Friday revealed that his father was on a hijacked flight in 1984 and said he had a unique window on "both sides" in such situations – the perspective of family members and those in the Government. He disclosed this during an interaction with Indian community in Geneva.

Jaishankar was answering a question about the recently released television series on the hijacking of IC814 in 1999.

Jaishankar told the audience how as a young officer then, he was part of the team dealing with the hijack situation on the one hand and on the other, he was part of the group of families putting pressure on the Government.

During the question and answer session after his address to the Indian community, a member of the audience asked the Minister about his comments on the recently released series 'IC814: The Kandahar



Hijack' on Netflix, which he said, showed "the bureaucracy and the Government dealing with hijacking in poor light." With a disclaimer that he has not watched the series, Jaishankar went on to reveal his personal connection with the hijacking incident.

"In 1984 there was a hijacking. I was a very young officer. I was part of the team which was dealing with it. I rang up my mother,

actually, to tell her, 'Look, I can't come. There's a hijacking,' he said elaborating how it was his turn to go home and feed his young son as his wife too was working. "And then I discovered, my father was on the flight. The flight ended up in Dubai. It's a long story, but fortunately, nobody got killed. It could have ended as a problem," he added.

On August 24, 1984, an Indian Airlines flight from

Delhi to Srinagar was hijacked over Pathankot and ultimately taken to Dubai. After more than 36 hours, 12 pro-Khalistani hijackers surrendered to authorities and released all 68 passengers and six crew members unharmed. Jaishankar was an IFS officer and became a minister after his retirement. His father K Subrahmanyam was an IAS officer and a regular commentator on strategic issues.

"And it was interesting because on the one hand, I was part of the team which was working on the hijacking. On the other hand, I was part of the family members who are pressing the Government for the hijacking. So actually, I have that very unique window on both sides, in that sense of the problem," he added.

"So, often these are situations and movie guys don't make the Governments look good. The hero is supposed to look good. Then nobody would watch the movie and you got to accept that," he commented, evoking peals of laughter from the audience.

WHO grants first authorisation for Monkeypox vaccine

The World Health Organization (WHO) on Friday said it has granted its first authorisation for the use of a vaccine against Mpox in adults, marking a crucial advancement in combating the disease in Africa and elsewhere.

The prequalification of the vaccine from Bavarian Nordic A/S allows organizations like GAVI, the Vaccine Alliance, and UNICEF to purchase it. However, with only one manufacturer currently producing the vaccine, supplies are limited, which could impact the distribution and availability in affected regions.

Last week, India also reported its first mpox case. The patient, a native of Haryana is recuperating at the LNJP Hospital here. However, the Government said that it was an isolated case and there was no immediate risk to the public at large.

The MVA-BN vaccine can be administered in people over 18-years of age as a 2-dose injection given 4 weeks apart. After prior cold storage, the vaccine can be kept at 2-8°C for up to 8 weeks.

The prequalification approval is expected to facilitate timely and increased access to this vital product in communities with urgent need, to reduce transmission and help contain the outbreak. WHO's assessment for

prequalification is based on information submitted by the manufacturer, Bavarian Nordic A/S, and reviewed by the European Medicines Agency, the regulatory agency of record for this vaccine.

"This first prequalification of a vaccine against mpox is an important step in our fight against the disease, both in the context of the current outbreaks in Africa, and in future," said WHO Director-General Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus. "We now need urgent scale up in procurement, donations and rollout to ensure equitable access to vaccines where they are needed most, alongside other public health tools, to prevent infections, stop transmission and save lives."

"The WHO prequalification of the MVA-BN vaccine will help accelerate ongoing procurement of the mpox vaccines by governments and international agencies such as Gavi and Unicef to help communities on the frontlines of the ongoing emergency in Africa and beyond," said Dr Yukiko Nakatani, WHO Assistant Director-General for Access to Medicines and Health Products.



Third edition of INDUS-X Summit concludes in US

During the summit, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between iDEX and the Defence Innovation Unit (DIU) under the US Department of Defence, to increase co-operation in defence innovation and deepen collaboration to facilitate industry, research, and investment partnerships among the stakeholders.

"The Summit offers a platform for joint showcase of next generation technologies by startups/MSMEs. It also enables critical dialogue through Senior Advisory Group and Senior Leaders Forum, the two advisory forums under INDUS-X. The discussions focused, inter-alia, on future technology trends, capacity building of startups, funding opportunities for defence innovations and strengthening defence supply chains.

"Distinguished experts from defence industry, investment firms, startups, academia, think tanks, accelerators, policymakers, etc. from both nations participated.

"Joint Secretary (Defence Industries Promotion) Amit Satija, who led the Indian delegation said the third edition of INDUS-X Summit reaffirmed the commitment of both the countries in advancing defence technology through innovation and strategic collaboration.

"The INDUS-X initiative is being steered by Innovations for Defence Excellence (iDEX) on behalf of Ministry of Defence and Defence Innovation Unit (DIU) under the U.S. Department of Defense (DoD). Since the launch of INDUS-X during the Prime Minister's State visit to the United States in June 2023, the initiative has been able to achieve significant milestones in a short span of time.



Postal department to provide doorstep delivery to aged pensioners

DRDO, Indian Navy test VLSRSAM successfully

Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and the Indian Navy have conducted back-to-back successful flight tests of the Vertical Launch Short Range Surface to Air Missile (VLSRSAM). The second consecutive test was conducted on Friday from the Integrated Test Range (ITR), Chandipur, Odisha, defence ministry said here.

The missile intercepted a high-speed aerial target, flying at a very low altitude and simulating a sea-skimming threat, which showcased its precision and capability to neutralise targets. This follows the earlier test on Thursday when the VLSRSAM missile effectively engaged another low-altitude target. These consecutive tests not only demonstrate the weapon system's reliability but also validate the recent upgrades made to various components of the system.

'Defence Minister Rajnath Singh lauded the DRDO, the Indian Navy and all associated teams for the successful flight tests and stated that this missile equipped with modern technologies will give further technological boost to the armed forces.

SC halts tree felling for Kolkata metro project

The Supreme Court on Friday directed that no trees would be felled or transplanted from now onwards for the metro rail project in the maidan area adjoining the iconic Victoria Memoria in Kolkata.

A bench of Justices B R Gavai and K V Viswanathan issued notices to the West Bengal Government, the Rail Vikas Nigam Limited (RVNL) and others seeking their responses on a plea challenging the June 20 verdict of the Calcutta High Court.

The high court had dismissed a petition seeking a direction to forthwith stop all metro construction in the maidan area due to alleged felling and transplantation of a large number of trees.

"Till the next date, we direct that no new trees would be felled or transplanted," the bench said and posted the matter for hearing after three

weeks.

"You can continue with the work but don't fell trees from today," the bench told the counsel appearing for the RVNL. The counsel appearing for petitioner 'People United For Better Living in Kolkata (PUBLIC)' told the bench that the maidan area was extremely important for the city.

He said the route chosen for the metro project goes through maidan area and a number of trees would be felled or transplanted for it. "We perceive that a large number of trees will be felled," the petitioner's counsel said, adding, "let them (authorities) come up with a plan for these trees."

The bench asked the counsel appearing for the RVNL to show it how the trees will be transplanted. n" Issue notice, returnable in three weeks," the bench said. It further said, "In the meantime, don't proceed with felling of trees."

SSC warns of legal action for recruitment exam malpractices

Government job recruitment G Agency Staff Selection Commission (SSC) has warned of disciplinary and legal action against anyone found involved in any kind of malpractices related to its recruitment examinations.

The SSC has time and again brought to the notice of candidates and other stakeholders that anyone found to be disclosing, publishing, reproducing, transmitting, storing or facilitating transmission and storage of test contents in any form (verbal or written, electronic or mechanical) of any information by any means "will be considered as serious misconduct and will be debarred/disqualified from exam", an official notice said.

"It said "taking away the rough papers supplied in the exam centre or found to be in unauthorized possession of



test content" will also be considered as serious misconduct, thus liable for necessary action.

"It has come to the notice of the Commission that some persons are engaged in the aforesaid activities through social media i.e. YouTube, twitter, Facebook, etc.," said the SSC notice dated September 10.

'Disciplinary and legal action would be taken against such candidates or persons/individuals involved as per rules and such matters would be reported to police, if

necessary, it added.

"The SSC is one of the largest recruitment agencies of the Government with its main mandate to conduct selections for non-gazetted posts in various central ministries and departments, among others.

'In another related move, the Centre had on Thursday allowed the SSC to perform Aadhaar-based authentication to verify the candidates' identity on a voluntary basis, both at the time of registration and during various stages of examinations and recruitment.

Fungal resistance to antifungals urgently needs Antimicrobial Resistance focus: Scientists

Like bacteria with antibiotics, many fungal pathogens are increasingly developing resistance to antifungal drugs, scientists have highlighted this alarming trend while emphasising the need to include fungal pathogens in the broader Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) discussion. Ahead of the UN meeting on AMR later this month, they have called for including resistance developed in many fungal pathogens to curb the superbugs.

Intriguingly, while the threat of fungal pathogens and antifungal resistance has been on the rise across the world, the public health crisis has largely been "underrecognised" and "left out of the debate" by scientists, Governments, clinicians, and pharmaceutical companies.

Researchers from the University of Manchester, the University of Amsterdam, and the Westerdijk Institute revealed that many fungal



pathogens identified by the World Health Organization (WHO) are either already resistant or quickly acquiring resistance to antifungal treatments. These resistant pathogens are responsible for approximately 3.8 million deaths annually. The researchers have called for immediate global action, in a study published in The Lancet on Friday.

The scientists argued that focussing on bacteria alone will not help fully

combat antimicrobial resistance (AMR). They called for immediate action, without which resistance to fungal disease will escalate.

Aspergillus, Candida, Nakaseomyces glabratus, and Trichophyton indotinea are the major fungicide resistant infections. These can have devastating health impacts on the elderly and people with weak immune systems. Dr Norman van Rhijn from The University of Manchester said that invasive fungal diseases have been responsible for many drug resistance problems over the past decades.

Van Rhijn explained that "the close similarities between fungal and human cells make it hard to find treatments that selectively inhibit fungi with minimal toxicity to patients".

The scientists suggested a global consensus on limiting the use of certain classes of antifungal molecules. They also stressed the need

for collaborating on solutions and regulations that ensure food security and universal health for animals, plants, and humans.

Dr Manish Jhangra, Gurugram based dermatologist who is not related with the study, said that India too is witnessing an alarming growing trend of antifungal resistance problem, with some fungal species exhibiting multidrug resistance. In India, up to 7 per cent of patients have a resistance to fluconazole, particularly non-albicans Candida specie while Tinea cruris and tinea corporis conditions which is endemic to India is resistant to the widely used drug terbinafine (TRB), he said citing various reports.

Also, there has been a significant increase in chronic, relapsing cases of this condition in India. These cases are often resistant to conventional antifungal drugs and doses, he said while stressing the need for global deliberation on the fungal resistance to the drugs.

Rahul Gandhi slams Government over restaurant owner apology video

Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi on Friday slammed the Government over a video in which a restaurant chain owner is purportedly "apologising" to Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman for voicing concerns about GST, and said that when "fragile egos" of those in power are hurt, it seems humiliation is what they will deliver. The opposition party also demanded an apology from the finance minister over the issue.

Tamil Nadu BJP chief K Annamalai said on behalf of the party's state unit, he sincerely apologises for the actions of "our functionaries who shared a private conversation between a



respected business owner and the finance minister".

"I spoke with Thiru Srinivasan Avl, the esteemed owner of the Annapoorna chain of Restaurants, to express regret for this unintended breach of privacy. Annapoorna Srinivasan Anna is a pillar of Tamil Nadu's business community, contributing significantly to the state's and nation's economic growth. I request everyone to lay the matter to rest with due respect," Annamalai said.

"Two videos were being shared by several Congress

leaders and in one of them at an event on September 11, Sree Annapoorna chain of restaurants owner Srinivasan is seen purportedly highlighting concerns over varying GST rates. In the second video, Srinivasan was seen purportedly apologising in person to the Finance Minister.

"Rahul Gandhi said if this "arrogant Government" would listen to the people they would understand that a simplified GST would solve the problems of lakhs of businesses.

"In a social media post, Rahul Gandhi said when the owner of a small business, like Annapoorna restaurant in Coimbatore, asks public servants for a simplified GST regime, his request is met with "arrogance and outright disrespect".

Fierce firefight in Kishtwar ahead of PM visit, two terrorists neutralised

A fierce firefight broke out between a heavily armed group of Pakistani terrorists and the joint team of security forces in the Chatroo area of Kishtwar late Friday evening ahead of the day-long visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to bolster the party's poll campaign in the erstwhile Doda district which is headed to polls in the first phase of polling on September 18.

Two more terrorists were neutralized by the joint team of security forces in the Khandara top area of Basantgarh late Friday evening. Sharing an update Rising Star

Corps of the Indian Army posted on X, "In the Joint operation launched on 11 Sep Two Terrorists Neutralised & Large War Like Stores Recovered. Operations concluded"

Meanwhile, security has been further beefed up in and around the venue of the Prime Minister's rally in Doda. At the same time, a general alert has been sounded in the entire Jammu region to prevent any other incident of terrorist violence ahead of the first round of polling on eight Assembly seats in the region. Additional troops have been deployed at vulnerable places such as party offices, and venues of campaign meetings.

This is the third incident of terrorist violence in the Jammu region in the last five days.

Confirming the incident of a firefight, a spokesman of the Jammu and Kashmir police in a brief statement said, "Exchange of fire has taken place between search teams of security forces and hiding terrorists at Pingal Dugadda forest area, upper reaches of Naidgham village under the jurisdiction of Police Station Chhatroo, District Kishtwar". Official sources claimed a group of three terrorists believed to be the cadre of the Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) outfit were trapped in the upper reaches of Chatroo. A team of the special forces of



The Indian army and the jawans of the special operations group of Jammu and Kashmir police were carrying out searches in the area when a group of terrorists hiding inside a dhok (temporary structure) attempted to

ambush the security personnel. Swift action by the elite para commandos resulted in the ensuing gunfight in the area. Unconfirmed reports claimed a soldier also received injuries and was evacuated to a nearby hospital.

On September 11, two heavily armed Pakistani terrorists, hiding in the upper reaches of Basantgarh bordering Kathua and Udhampur districts, were neutralized by the joint team of security forces.

On September 9, two heavily armed terrorists believed to be Pakistani were neutralized by the troops of the Indian army while they were attempting to infiltrate inside the Indian territory in the Laam sector of Nowshera in

the frontier district of Rajouri on Monday.

The election managers are banking heavily on the popularity of the Prime Minister in the erstwhile Doda district. BJP had won 4 out of 6 assembly seats in 2014 Assembly polls. This time the party is aiming to retain all its four seats and wrest at least two other seats from the opposition camp.

The BJP is facing a tough challenge in the region as the alliance partners Congress and the National Conference have been making all efforts to win more than two seats. Rahul Gandhi also visited Ramban to address an election rally. On the other hand, Omar Abdullah has also

addressed a series of election meetings to boost the morale of the party workers.

A senior BJP leader told The Pioneer, "We are banking heavily on the booster dose which our Prime Minister is expected to administer to the party workers ahead of the first phase of polling". So far the party candidates have received an impressive response on ground zero.

The BJP is contesting all the seats in the Jammu region and aims to replicate its 2014 performance when it won 25 out of 37 seats in the region. PM Modi is also expected to visit the Valley on September 19 when he will address another BJP election rally in Srinagar city.

Left planning attack on doctors to malign Government: Ghosh

The doctors' movement over the rape and murder of a lady doctor inside the RG Kar Medical College and Hospital took a sharp turn with the Trinamool Congress spokesperson Kunal Ghosh on Thursday releasing an audio-tape suggesting some Left groups were planning attack on the agitating doctors to malign the State Government.

"The audio-tape pertains to a conversation between members of two Leftist organizations who are discussing the pros and cons of an attack on the doctors who are staging a sit-in demonstration outside the Swasthya Bhavan," Ghosh playing the tape said.

In the purported discussion between the two persons one is asking to send criminals to attack the doctors after their talks with the State Government fizzled out Thursday. While the other person however is reluctant



To mount such attack on "people who save our lives" the first person reminds him of the political dividend such an attack could produce painting the Mamata Banerjee Government in a bad light, Ghosh said adding the audio tape was forwarded to him by some sources and the police were already investigating it. By late on Friday evening the

Police Commissioner Vineet Goyal, State Health Secretary and two Directors of Health for playing an alleged role in destroying evidence.

Curiously Ghosh's "revelation" came to the media in tandem with reports that the Government had asked the Principals of all the 26 Medical Colleges to prepare a list of junior doctors who had joined the cease work campaign, sources said.

Meanwhile, even as the doctors said that their movement would go on until the Government spreads out the dialogue table and addresses their demands a Kolkata Court on Friday rejected an application filed by the Central Bureau of Investigation seeking Narco Analysis Test of Sanjoy Rai the prime accused in the rape and murder case.

"The ACJM Court while rejecting the CBI application said that such an act goes against the Fundamental Rights of the person concerned if he is forced to undergo such test," a lawyer said.

Bengal Governor snaps social ties with CM, 'the Lady Macbeth'

Bengal Governor C.V. Ananda Bose has compared Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee with Lady Macbeth and snapped all social ties with her in the wake of RG Kar rape and murder case.

Reacting to Bose's remarks TMC spokesperson Kunal Ghosh said that as a Governor he could not make such statements. Jolt for BJP as three-time former MP joins Congress

Maharashtra protests: Rahul takes centre stage as BJP-Congress trade charges

The ruling BJP and Congress traded charges against each other on Friday, as they staged protests in different parts of the Assembly poll-bound Maharashtra in matters relating to the leader of the Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi.

While the BJP held demonstrations against the "anti-reservations" and "anti Constitution" statements made by Rahul Gandhi in the US, the Congress staged protests against the death threats handed to the leader of the Opposition in Lok Sabha by BJP leader from Delhi and former MLA Tarvinder Singh Marwah.

The BJP leaders -including State party chief Chandrashekhkar Bawankule, its national general secretary Pankaja Munde, senior minister Chandrakant Patil and Mumbai city president Ashish Shellar - accused Rahul Gandhi of trampling upon the Constitution by announcing that his party wanted to annul reservations in the country. Wearing black ribbons, the BJP workers raised vehement slogans against Rahul Gandhi



at various places. While Bawankule led the protests at Akola in Vidarbha region, leaders like Pankaja Munde, Patil and Shellar held demonstrations at Ghatkopar in north-east Mumbai. Simultaneously, the Maharashtra Congress staged vociferous protests against Delhi BJP leader Tarvinder Singh Marwah for allegedly handing a death threat to Rahul Gandhi.

A party activist Akash P. Taywade lodged a complaint with the Sadar Police Station at Nagpur against Marwah for allegedly issuing death threats he made against Rahul Gandhi. Senior party leaders, including State Congress chief Nana Patole, former chief minister Prithviraj Chavan Congress Legislative Party leader Balasaheb Thorat, party's state working president M. Arif Naseem Khan, district party leaders and thousands of activists joined the protests in various district headquarters across the state.

The protestors, including a large number of youth and women, carried posters, placards and banners flaying Marwah for targeting Rahul Gandhi, and raised slogans condemning the BJP for not

taking action against its party leader in the serious matter. The leaders accused the BJP leaders of selectively twisting Rahul Gandhi's statements pertaining to quotas at an interaction during his US visit. Rubbishing the BJP's claims that the Congress wanted to do away with reservation, the Congress leaders said that in its manifesto for 2024 Lok Sabha elections, the party had committed itself to raising the ceiling of quotas beyond 50 per cent to ensure that benefits reached the largest segments of the deprived sections of society.

"Rahul Gandhi has repeatedly stressed the need to conduct a Caste Census to ascertain the backwardness among various sections of the population. However, the BJP is only interested in creating enmity in the name of castes and religions in the country," Patole said.

"Rahul Gandhi has never said that he would stop reservation and is indulging in a fake narrative without verifying the truth. They are spreading falsehoods and then carrying out agitation. The people of the country know very well that the BJP is opposed to quotas and is anti-Constitution," Thorat said.

FSSAI asks officials to increase monitoring of sweet sellers, producers across nation

With demand for sweets, savouries and products such as ghee, khoya, and paneer on surges during the ongoing festive season, increasing the chances of such products being adulterated, the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India has asked its state-level officials to increase monitoring of sweet sellers and producers across the nation.

".....preventive actions including special surveillance and enforcement drives by food safety officers and designated officers can curb such practices effectively and ensure the safety of such products," Inoshi Sharma, executive director, (regulatory compliance) at FSSAI, said in a letter to state and UT

food commissioners. State food safety inspectors have been ordered to investigate the stores and collect samples for quality control. They have been directed to take action against those who have been found to be in violation of quality standards.

The regulator also said frequent enforcement and surveillance drives must be conducted to prevent malpractices and that mobile-testing units must be deployed at key places.

"Also, the Food Safety on Wheels (FSW), where available, are to be positioned in prominent markets and/or on the basis of specific intelligence inputs so as to ensure that such products are safe to consume and are strictly as per the respective food products standards.

Bengaluru court extends judicial custody of Darshan, other accused till September 17

A court here on Friday extended till September 17 the judicial custody of Kannada actor Darshan Thoogudeepa along with his friend Pavithra Gowda and others, who are accused in the Renukaswamy murder case. All the 17 accused, including Darshan and Pavithra, were produced before the 24th Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate court through video conferencing from various prisons across the state, where they are lodged, as their judicial custody ended today. Policed on September 4 had submitted to the court a 3,991-page preliminary chargesheet to the court in the case.

The 47-year-old actor is currently lodged in Ballari prison. He was shifted there from Parappana Agrahara Central jail here by obtaining court

permission, after a photograph of him hanging out with three others, including a rowdy-sheeter, on the lawns of the jail had gone viral, sparking an uproar.

In the picture, the actor is seen in a relaxed mood, sitting on a chair and holding a cigarette and a coffee mug. Also, a purported video of Darshan speaking to a person over a video call from the prison too had surfaced on social media. The court had also permitted shifting of other co-accused in the murder case to various prisons in the state.

Other accused -- Pawan, Raghavendra and Nandish -- are now lodged in Mysuru, Jagadish and Lakshmana in Shivamogga, Dhanraj in Dharwad, Vinay in Vijayapura, Nagaraj in Kalaburagi/Gulbarga Jail, Pradosh in Belagavi Jail. Three accused -' Pavithra

Gowda, Anukumar, and Deepak -- continue to remain at Parappana Agrahara Central Jail here. Four accused -- Ravi, Karthik, Nikhil and Keshavamurthy -- were earlier shifted to Tumakuru prison and they continue to remain lodged there.

Nine prison officials, including the Chief Superintendent of the Parappana Agrahara jail, were suspended over their "lapses" after a preliminary probe into "special treatment" to Darshan.

Also, three FIRs were registered, including against Darshan, under sections of the Prisons Act and the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita.

According to police sources, 33-year-old Renukaswamy, a fan of the actor, had sent obscene messages to Pavithra, which enraged Darshan, allegedly leading to his murder. His body was found near

a stormwater drain next to an apartment in Sumanahalli here on June nine.

Raghavendra, one of the accused who is part of Darshan's fan club in Chitradurga, had brought Renukaswamy to a shed in R R Nagar here, on the pretext that the actor wanted to meet him. It was in this shed that he was allegedly tortured and murdered.

According to the post-mortem report, Renukaswamy, a native of Chitradurga, died due to shock and haemorrhage as a result of multiple blunt injuries.

Police accused number Pavithra, who is accused number one, was the "major cause" for Renukaswamy's murder and claimed that it has been proved from the probe that she instigated other accused, conspired with them, and took part in the crime.

Chargesheet filed against Ex-MP Prajwal Revanna in second case

The Bengaluru police has filed a chargesheet in the second case registered against former MP Prajwal Revanna, who is facing charges of rape and sexual assault, in a special court here.

Revanna is currently under judicial custody at Parappana Agrahara Jail here, and a Special Investigation Team is probing four separate cases against him, officials said on Friday.

According to police, the second case against Prajwal Revanna was filed by the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) on May 1 after a 44-year-old former member of the Hassan Zilla Panchayat accused him of repeatedly raping her. In a statement, police said the SIT team conducted a comprehensive investigation of the case

and during the probe, more than 120 witnesses were interrogated and statements of victims, key witnesses were recorded.

"A 1691 page comprehensive chargesheet has been filed against former Hassan Lok Sabha constituency MP Prajwal Revanna. The chargesheet has been submitted to a special court here after collecting evidence and obtaining expert opinions," it stated.

He was arrested by the SIT on May 31 upon arrival at Bengaluru Airport from Germany in connection with a case registered at the Holarasipura Town Police Station. Prajwal Revanna was remanded to custody the following day. Revanna had failed in his bid to retain the Hassan parliamentary constituency in the recent polls.

Adieu comrade Yechury!

The untimely passing away of Sitaram Yechury is a defining moment for CPI(M) and Indian Left politics

Sitaram Yechury, the General Secretary of CPI(M) and veteran Left ideologue is no more. He died after prolonged illness in Delhi. Yechury, one of India's most prominent left-wing politicians, has left a deep void in the Communist Party of India (Marxist) and Indian politics. As the General Secretary of the party and a key ideologue of India's Left movement, Sitaram Yechury was widely recognised for his ability to bridge ideological divides within the CPI(M) and foster cohesion in a faction-ridden party. Under his leadership, the CPI(M) worked toward navigating the challenges of declining relevance, especially in key states like West Bengal and Kerala, where the party held sway. Yechury's pragmatic approach sought to balance Marxist orthodoxy with the demands of modern politics, often encouraging alliances with non-Left parties to check the rise of right-wing forces, particularly the BJP. His tenure as General Secretary was marked by his efforts to revitalise the party in an era where communist ideologies found not many takers. His ability to remain cheerful in the midst of crisis and light hearted won him many admirers across party lines. His ability to engage with younger generation was indeed remarkable. His influence extended beyond CPI(M) to broader Left coalitions, making him a key figure in shaping progressive political discourse in the country.



The CPI(M) has lost two of its prominent leaders in quick succession. Just a month ago, Buddhadeb Bhattacharya passed away, and now with the departure of Sitaram Yechury, the party may face a significant void in its politburo that will be difficult to fill. While Buddhadeb Bhattacharya brought pragmatic economic

to the Left, it was Sitaram Yechury who steered Left politics towards a more centrist alignment. Yechury's passing poses a significant challenge for the CPI(M). His adeptness at navigating intra-party conflicts, especially between the hardliners and those favouring more pragmatic politics, was pivotal in keeping the party from splitting along ideological lines. His absence may lead to a leadership vacuum that could exacerbate existing tensions. The choice of Yechury's successor will be critical in determining whether the CPI(M) continues his centrist approach or swings toward a more hardline stance. However, replacing someone of Yechury's stature, who had both the intellectual capacity and the political acumen to lead in challenging times, will not be easy. In recent years, the left parties have struggled to maintain electoral relevance in most parts of India as the BJP and regional parties have filled the political space traditionally held by the Left. Sitaram Yechury, a politician and a gentleman, would be missed in Indian politics. His ability to transcend party politics and engage with a broader spectrum of ideas gave him a unique position in Indian politics. Yechury's absence will be profoundly felt, not only by his comrades but also by those who admired him as a kind and compassionate individual.

Perfect parenting: Navigating expectations and aspirations

In an age where parenting seems to be under constant scrutiny, the stress of raising children has evolved into a modern-day burden

In the olden days, it wasn't uncommon to be born in large families and be raised along with several siblings. But for some reason, parents back then did it with a laid-back approach and have not been heard or known to feel pressured by the size of the family they had to support. My paternal grandparents had 13 children and my maternal grandparents had ten.



It is a scenario impossible to even imagine in modern times, where stress has become a staple for all - from kindergarten children to pensioners past their prime. Today's parents are engulfed in a whirlwind of expectations, constantly feeling the weight of being "perfect" while juggling the unrelenting pressures of life.

The irony is not lost on any of us—despite our best efforts, parents often feel they are falling short, outpaced by a society that holds them to impossible standards. Dr Vivek Murthy, the US Surgeon General, recently said that parental stress is a significant public health issue and called for shifts in cultural norms. In our hyper-

connected world, where every action and decision is subject to public scrutiny, the quest for perfection is an unending pursuit that only leads to exhaustion. We need to pause and ask: Are we, as parents, pushing ourselves into a corner, one where our best is never good enough? How far should we go to prove our merits and how much strain can we take before we break at the seams? A young parent recently mentioned how she was waiting for her toddler to grow up by a few years so that the tensions of the difficult years are past, but the truth is the stress of parenting seldom leaves, no matter how old the children become. It is in the psyche of the parent to be ever concerned, with the concerns and expectations only changing with age. Once a parent, always a parent. There is a relentless battle to become the

perfect parents who have raised peerless offspring that the world would appreciate. This pressure to adopt the best practices of parenting is now increased manifold by the social media which presents picture-perfect family lives. What parents often forget is the travails of raising children are never easy and what seems perfect on social media are filtered versions of a life and landscape filled with challenges.

The idea of being a 'perfect parent' is a myth and it would be prudent on the parents' part to recognise that benchmarks set by society, media and peers are often unattainable. Each family should set its priorities and boundaries commensurate with its resources, circumstances and the children's capacity to undertake over-demanding expectations from all around. How parents of yore have been able to divide their attention between the litany of concerns and complaints their children must have presented baffles me. The joke that goes around in our family is this - the children just grew up; no one raised them by following any stringent stan-

dards. This attitude may not work in our times where the bars are set so high and the race for achievement is taken so seriously that parents find themselves caught in the quagmire of worry and anxiety even after the children have flown from their homes and built their nests. The anxiety of being an inadequate parent haunts many and the truth is there is no single right way to parent; neither is there a prescribed format to make children successful and happy except by instilling the right values in them. Embracing their imperfections as parents and learning to let go are difficult but essential traits to pick up in their journey of parenthood. What children need most is not a parent who has everything figured out, but one who loves them, supports them and is present through the highs and lows of life. Constant fretting about children will only take away from the confidence of the children and make them incompetent to face life's numerous challenges.

The statesman who bore the burden of Kandahar

In the Kandahar hijacking, Jaswant Singh stands out for his quiet resolve. He shouldered the responsibility of securing the release of 161 hostages

Beyond the usual 'manufactured-outrage', there was an inadvertent redemption with the role played of the Soldier-Statesman-Scholar, Jaswant Singh, in the recent OTT series IC-814 - The Kandahar Hijack. Undoubtedly, the hijacking saga casts a dark shadow on Indian governance with glaring mismanagement e.g., lack of cohesion among intelligence agencies, slow alignment amongst stakeholders, allowing the aircraft to take off from Amritsar et al, but in public memory, it is the singular image of Jaswant carrying three terrorists to Kandahar to secure the release of passengers and crew of IC-814. Many saw it as a moment of sovereign capitulation. Others saw it as successful negotiations under impossible circumstances, where negotiations were the only option (An entebbe-style raid, clearly wasn't feasible).



It was, as Jaswant himself puts it succinctly, "a choice between a bad decision, and a far worse decision". Negotiating the release of the hijacked passengers was a collective decision of the Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS). The composition of CCS was chaired by then PM Vajpayee, and had included the then Home Minister, NSA, Defence Minister, and of course the External Affairs Minister, Jaswant Singh. If that is so, why was it only Jaswant who carries the can of blame for posterity? The answer can be attempted in a couple of ways - firstly by understanding the inherent construct of Jaswant the individual, and his understanding of his 'duty', and secondly by understanding the impulse of others in the same situation, who were also part and parcel of this complex and questionable decision. Why didn't Jaswant come clean (or at least forcefully enough) to share the blame with his colleagues? For starters, it has to do with Jaswant's imagined sense of himself and his conscience. Honourable soldiers do what is to be done, with no fuss or grandiosity. Major Jaswant Singh was a cavalier from the illustrious Central India Horse and had left

the Indian Army prematurely but always exemplified its finest tenets and values steadfastly, throughout his public life. The institution had defined him, and he had marched out without any usual 'terminal benefit' but with what he reflected, "My service with is my benefit, and what the army gave me, taught me, left me with me is my priceless pension". One such 'officer-and-a-gentleman' quality is what General James Mattis (former US Defense Secretary) alluded to while expressing his measured disagreement with the unhinged Donald Trump i.e., the French expression 'devoir de reserve' (literally, the duty of silence). Perhaps Jaswant was informed by decades of soldiering, politics and statesmanship that to brave a difficult situation like IC-814 was one thing, but to further weaken the 'moment' for India by name calling or finger pointing, even worse. His colleagues were spared the taint, for he had protected them. It is another story that many were incredibly absolving themselves of any knowledge of the exchange or his dash to Kandahar. When one misstep after another was happening with IC-814 with no one taking charge of the situation, Jaswant had stepped up and personally

offered to go to Kandahar to secure the release, with the unpredictable Taliban and amoral ISI, across. The usually blustering and omnipresent Ministers were meekly abstaining from giving media bytes or even talking to distraught relatives, as they knew the hopelessness and intensity of the situation.

The situation was fluidic, and anything could have happened requiring quick decision-making, and so Jaswant put himself in the line of fire. His colleagues were better politicians, and he, was a soldier to his country and conscience, first and foremost. We were to engage frequently at the Rashtrapati Bhawan when he was earlier an opposition MP, and later a Cabinet Minister (Defence, External Affairs & Finance), and then again, as an opposition MP. Each time in a gathering of civilians he would catch the eye of those in 'Uniform' and acknowledge them with a gracious nudge or salute when saluted.

In all his varied professional capacities, his sole and avowedly apolitical questions were about the welfare of the President's Bodyguards or about their magnificent horses, on whom too, his eyes rolled rather gently. Many questions can be posed about

Jaswant's decisions e.g., IC-814, but he remained an essentially decent and dignified voice of reason. So winds of politics in his partisan camp changed, and he became an 'outsider' in the new sensibilities. Like a noble soldier, he left his camp but didn't join the 'other side', as done by most. He was too proud to do that, so he passed away silently like a ship at night, saving his colleagues, party, and the country, like he saved the moment in Kandahar.

He was to profoundly introspect in, A Call to Honour, "between this 'right' act of saving 161 lives, or standing up against terrorism and letting them all 'go', for all to die - will that be another 'right' act? By choosing that which is otherwise extinguished for always - Life, for, in any event this fight against terrorism will continue, from one challenge to another". Just for the fact that the Gentleman (an old-fashioned word that he'd understand best) stood up for all his decisions (right or wrong) and never really blamed others (when he could have), he certainly deserves a better memory.

RIISING SUICIDES: A SERIOUS CONCERN

Madam - According to the recently released National Crime Record Bureau data, only in 2022 more than 1 lakh 71 thousand Indians chose the path of suicide due to various reasons. On the other hand, according to the report of Lancet Public Health, this number worldwide is about 7 lakh 76 thousand. The brutal presence of global suicides simultaneously calls into question the overall social order of our individualistic lives. According to NCRB data, 12 out of every 1 lakh Indians take suicide-like decisions. More than 10 percent of them are farmers. An average of 154 Indian farmers commit suicide every day mainly due to unprofitable agriculture, failure to find a way out of chronic poverty, inadequate institutional financial credit system. Loneliness, family turmoil, childhood trauma, extramarital affairs, illness, and financial insecurity have emerged as causes of suicide among other segments of the population. Besides, the suicide of students makes us worried. Almost every day we come across such incidents, driven by the pressure of academic ambition as well as the artificial glamor of social media, which is increasingly drowning inexperienced teenagers in the darkness of gloom. In this situation, it is urgent to take appropriate measures to prevent this mental epidemic.

The Lancet study claimed that a dollar increase in daily income reduced the number of suicides by an average of 8,000 per year during the period 2006-2016, which was confirmed by the study. At the same time, the government should implement poverty alleviation programs quickly. According to the NCRB study, there is a direct correlation between the increase in the pace of housing projects and the decrease in suicides. Counseling should be arranged in every school and coaching center for the students so that they are able to strike a balance between expectations and reality. Besides, it is imperative to include mental health as a subject in the syllabus.

New world order: Is Western hegemony crumbling

In an unprecedented joint public appearance, CIA Director William Burns and MI6 Chief Richard Moore assert the enduring strength of their intelligence agencies

Last week, the heads of major Western intelligence agencies made a striking public appearance, first with a provocative op-ed and then in a high-profile interview with the Financial Times editor. Although some questions remained unanswered, their statements provided critical insights into their covert and overt operations. William Joseph Burns, Director of the CIA, and Richard Peter Moore, head of MI6/SIS, both distinguished diplomats before their current roles, asserted with conviction that their organisations are more formidable than ever. Their strong professional alliance highlights a key strategy: confronting their main adversaries, Russia and China. This unprecedented public engagement reflects Sun Tzu's strategic principle from The Art of War: "Appear weak when you are strong, and strong when you are weak." So, who is truly weak? Is this a perfect example of Orwellian doublespeak in the era of Artificial General Intelligence? The nuances of their statements suggest an intriguing answer when read between the lines.

This marks the first joint public appearance by Burns and Moore since their appointments, though separately they have spoken occasionally in public gatherings, signalling a departure from the traditionally more secretive approach of their predecessors. This dramatic 'openness' may be part of a broader strategy to project strength and capability in a shifting global power dynamic. Their commentary suggests that Western hegemony is waning, and those within the system must awaken and confront Russia before China is brought into the strategic equation, challenging the rise of Asia and the Global South. The article's audacious claim, if accurate, that "We have no more trusted or esteemed allies," starkly reveals the widening chasm among their partners.

This intensifying polarization is driven by rising discontent with the United States and the United Kingdom, whose actions have exacerbated global crises and dragged others into worsening conflicts. Burns and Moore emphasised the crucial role of transparency in the 21st century and democratic systems, noting that public engagement is key to demonstrating their agencies' priorities and building trust.

Burns highlighted the importance of visibility for attracting talent and enhancing public understanding of their work. The discussion also revealed the deep collaboration between their agencies, which has been instrumental in global events, such as providing early warnings about the war in Ukraine. Moore praised their joint efforts and the "best athlete model," where the most suitable agency handles specific operations, showcasing a high level of trust and effectiveness. They also addressed broader geopolitical issues, noting the threat posed by the cooperation among China, Russia, Iran, and North Korea. While these nations share military technology, their collaboration is described as pragmatic rather than value-based, unlike the alliances within the Western intelligence community. Burns and Moore mentioned the lack of direct evidence of weapon transfers from China to Russia and the stalled status of the gas pipeline from Russia to China, attributing its likely incompletion to sanctions and shifting geopolitical factors.

However, they offered no new information on the widely reported Nord Stream pipeline sabotage, where it was suggested the CIA had prior knowledge. Regarding the increasing military cooperation between Russia and

North Korea, including the use of North Korean missiles in Ukraine, both spies recognised the heightened threat to US allies in Asia. Moore highlighted the gravity of the situation, stating, "North Korean weaponry and dual-use materials from China are already impacting the battlefield in Ukraine, and this cooperation poses a significant danger." Both leaders also stressed the critical importance of ongoing support for Ukraine, with Burns noting the severe and methodical nature of the conflict, where "Putin is using a traditional tactic of taking village by village, leaving nothing behind."

Despite the grim outlook, the resilience of the Ukrainian forces remains a focal point. Moore lauded Ukraine's bold strategy, such as the move into Kursk, as a game-changer. He remarked, "The Ukrainians, by going in and taking Kursk, have really brought the war home to ordinary Russians," disrupting Putin's narrative and demonstrating the effectiveness of their counteroffensive. Addressing the broader implications of the conflict, Burns acknowledged that while Putin's grip on power remains firm, it is not necessarily stable. "Putin's grip on power doesn't seem to be weakening, but don't ever confuse a tight grip with a stable grip," he stated. The recent Kursk offensive and past events, such as the Prigozhin mutiny, have exposed vulnerabilities within Russia, challenging Putin's confident narrative. Burns and Moore discussed the differing approaches of the US and UK in providing military aid to Ukraine. Burns reaffirmed the US's substantial support despite concerns over escalation, emphasising the ongoing commitment to Ukraine even amid Russia's nuclear threats. Moore echoed this, stressing that the West must not be intimidated. They also addressed Russia's intelligence operations in Europe, noting a shift toward using criminal elements for sabotage,

which has made these operations easier to detect.

The discussion also highlighted the threat of Russian intelligence, citing the 2018 Salisbury poisoning as a stark example of their reckless tactics. Moore emphasised the importance of dealing with such threats through intelligence sharing and collaboration. They also touched on Russian military intelligence activities in the Americas, particularly concerns about Russian agents operating in Mexico and potentially aiding illegal migration into the US. Burns assured that this issue remains a top priority, with law enforcement agencies closely monitoring and countering such threats. Burns updated on efforts to secure a ceasefire and hostage deal in Gaza, based on a three-phase plan proposed by President Biden: ceasefire, hostage release, and reconstruction. Despite progress, finalising the deal remains challenging, requiring strong political will and mediator support.

He hopes new proposals will drive action, with both leaders urging external pressure on Hamas for humanitarian aid and peace. Burns also backed the two-state solution but no questions were raised about the US's double standards—hosting ICC-wanted Benjamin Netanyahu while pushing other nations to arrest Putin on an ICC warrant. This highlights the hypocrisy in the US approach to international justice. Regarding Iran, Moore expressed concern about potential retaliation for the assassination of Qasem Soleimani. "We shouldn't let our guard down regarding the type of activity Iran might pursue," he cautioned, citing Iran's history of destabilising actions and support for militant groups. But the overthrow of Mosaddegh, the shooting down of Iran Air Flight 655, and unilateral sanctions show the real picture. The discussion then shifted to the strategic challenge posed by China. Burns and Moore both underscored that China remains a top pri-

ority for their respective agencies. "The CIA has reorganised to reflect this priority," Burns noted, highlighting a significant increase in resources dedicated to addressing China's challenges. Despite economic difficulties in China, Moore observed that Xi Jinping remains a powerful and ambitious leader, making understanding China crucial for global strategic dynamics. Burns and Moore discussed the transformative role of AI in intelligence operations, with Moore emphasising its use in data analysis and counterterrorism, while Burns stressed the importance of maintaining open channels with China. They highlighted the need to balance AI advancements with human oversight.

Their public appearance reflects a shift in Western strategy, focusing more on leadership than on traditional destabilisation tactics. With the US elections approaching, it is clear that a broader alliance is working to secure Vice President Kamala Harris's victory against her main contender, Donald Trump. In his book, The Back Channel, Burns comments on Trump, stating, "In the age of Trump, America is diminished, the president's worldview smaller and meaner, the world full of difficult currents." The entire discussion highlights how the absence of decisive political leadership is not only eroding the system but also accelerating the West's decline. This decline follows decades of destabilising nations in the Global South and Europe to maintain hegemony, which is now cracking. This situation goes beyond the simplistic notion of new adversaries emerging against the West. It signifies a profound awakening from the deep-seated colonial legacies that have long influenced many Asian, African, and Latin American countries. Consequently, the old mantra of manipulation, isolation, and elimination may no longer work.

social isolation, and even death. The psychological damage endured by survivors is difficult to quantify, and the ripple effects on society are immense.

A recent case that shook the conscience of the nation was the rape and murder of a trainee doctor at RG Kar Hospital, Kolkata. This brutal crime recalled the infamous

Nirbhaya case, igniting nationwide outrage. Yet again, it posed a critical question to both the central and state governments: Is the judicial system adequately addressing crimes against women? Are victims truly receiving the justice they seek?

Another notorious example is the 1992 Ajmer gang rape and blackmail scandal, where over 100 girls were blackmailed with obscene photographs, many subjected to gang rape. Justice, in this case, was only served 32 years later, with six accused sentenced to life imprisonment and fined 25 lakh each. This shocking delay once again raises concerns about whether the Indian legal system is equipped to tackle cases of sexual violence effectively.

India, with its population of 1.5 billion, has over 750 fast-track courts designed to expedite justice. Yet, cases like the Ajmer gang rape, Nirbhaya, Unnao, and Balrampur drag on for decades. The slow pace of justice signifies a collective failure of the government and law enforcement agencies in a country that claims to be the world's largest democracy. This begs the question: Do we need a judicial overhaul to ensure timely justice for victims of sexual violence?

The global landscape shows a diverse range of approaches to preventing violence against women. The UK, for instance, has recently passed a bill recognizing violence against women as a 'national security threat,' equating it with Islamist terrorism. Several European



countries, such as Denmark, Iceland, and Switzerland, have adopted stringent laws under the umbrella of 'Zero Tolerance' policies, which even include the death penalty for those convicted of sexual violence. These examples offer potential models for India to consider as it grapples with its own crisis of gender-based violence. Preventing rape and abuse

requires a multifaceted approach, one that addresses the root causes of these crimes. Education and awareness programs about consent, healthy relationships, and respect are essential starting points. Engaging communities, especially involving men and boys in discussions around women's safety, can help shift societal attitudes and reduce the prevalence of such crimes.

Equally important is providing accessible support services for survivors, such as counseling and legal aid. These services are vital for helping victims heal and pursue justice. Policy reforms aimed at strengthening laws to protect women and ensure swift accountability for perpetrators are also crucial. Empowering women and girls plays a critical role in prevent-

ing rape and abuse. This can be done by promoting economic independence, which helps reduce vulnerability to violence, and fostering safe spaces where women can report incidents without fear. Encouraging survivors to speak out against violence can help break the silence that often surrounds these crimes, lifting the stigma and encouraging others to come forward. In today's digital age, technology can also play a pivotal role in enhancing women's safety. Innovative tools such as safety apps, which allow women to alert family or friends in emergencies, and online support platforms for survivors offer new avenues for protection and support.

Data analytics can help identify patterns and hotspots of

violence, enabling authorities to target prevention efforts more effectively.

Ultimately, women's safety is a collective responsibility. It demands the involvement of individuals, communities, organizations, and governments. By addressing the root causes of rape and abuse and implementing solutions at various levels, we can create a society where women and girls live free from the fear of violence. It is time for decisive action. The protection of women should not be seen as an afterthought but as a fundamental pillar of societal well-being. Only by working together can we create a safer, more equitable world for all.

UK slams 'baseless' Russian claim of diplomat-spies

The UK on Friday attacked Russia for "completely baseless" claims that its diplomats were engaged in spying after Moscow revoked the accreditation of six British officials said to have left the country some weeks ago. The Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) said the UK remains "unapologetic" about protecting its national interests as it dismissed allegations made by Russia's FSB security service. The news comes as British Prime Minister Sir Keir Starmer arrived in Washington for talks with US President Joe Biden about the war in Ukraine and whether to give President Volodymyr Zelenskyy the nod to fire Western missiles at targets inside Russia. "The accusations made today by the FSB against our staff are completely baseless," the FCDO said in a statement on Friday. "The Russian authorities revoked the diplomatic accreditation of six UK diplomats in Russia last month following an action taken by the UK government in response to Russian state-directed activity across Europe and in the UK. We are unapologetic about protecting our national interests," it added. The FSB said the six British diplomats had shown signs of conducting intelligence and were tasked with inflicting a "strategic defeat on our country". In a Telegram post, Russian Foreign Ministry Spokesperson Maria Zakharova said Moscow "fully share[s] the assessments" made by the FSB on the activities of the diplomats. "The British embassy has gone far beyond the limits outlined by the Vienna Conventions [UN treaty on diplomatic relations]," she said. An FSB officer told Russian media that "hints" to "stop this practice [of gathering intelligence]" were not heeded. The security service added that it would revoke accreditation from more British diplomats if they

were found to be involved in similar activity. The diplomats involved were named and pictured on Russian state TV earlier on Friday. The expulsion of diplomats on all sides has become common practice since the Russia-Ukraine conflict broke out in February 2022. According to rules set up by the United Nations (UN), diplomatic accreditation is given by a host nation to recognise the status of another country's staff. Diplomatic accreditation is essential for an official based as a diplomat in any country. Earlier this week, UK Foreign Secretary David Lammy and US Secretary of State Antony Blinken made a first-ever joint visit to Kyiv as a precursor to the Starmer-Biden talks. "The UK's support to Ukraine is unwavering. Our commitment of over GBP 600 million worth of support is the latest instalment in our enduring support to Ukraine. This will provide vital support to Ukrainians as they continue to

endure relentless Russian attacks," said Lammy. "Alongside the United States, we are committed to giving Ukraine what it needs to resist Russia's illegal invasion. Their fight for freedom, liberty and democracy is also a fight for British, European, and global security. With the US, we stand firmly with Ukraine for as long as it takes," he said. Since February 2022, the UK claims to have provided GBP 695 million in bilateral non-military support alongside USD 2.5 billion in fiscal support (loan guarantees), which will rise to USD 5 billion by 2027. Ukraine is hoping to get the go-ahead to use British-made Storm Shadow missiles against targets in Russia. Meanwhile, Russian President Vladimir Putin has told the country's state television that North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO) countries would be "at war" with Russia if the West allowed Ukraine to use long-range missiles against its territory.

Islamic extremist plotted to attack German soldiers
Berlin (AP): An alleged Islamic extremist has been arrested in connection with plotting an attack on German soldiers during their lunch break in Munich, killing as many of them as possible and causing a feeling of insecurity among the larger population, authorities said on Friday. The 27-year-old Syrian is a suspected supporter of radical Islamic ideology, according to the Munich public prosecutor's office. The suspect procured two machetes, each about 40 centimeters (15.75 inches) long, earlier this month, and allegedly planned to attack the soldiers with them. The suspect was brought before a judge on Friday following his arrest a day earlier, the prosecutor's office said in a statement. His name was not released in line with German privacy rules. The arrest comes after an August 23 attack in Solingen that left three people dead and eight wounded. A 26-year-old Syrian suspect was arrested. He was an asylum-seeker who was supposed to be deported to Bulgaria last year but reportedly disappeared for a time and avoided deportation.

US approves \$165 million in weapons sales to Israel

The U.S. has approved \$165 million in weapons sales to Israel to fund heavy-duty tank trailers, the State Department announced Thursday. The systems include spare and repair parts, tool kits and technical and logistics support. They are not expected to be delivered until 2027. Earlier this year, the U.S. announced a mammoth \$20 billion weapons support package for Israel to include F-15 fighter jets. Like the tank trailers, those systems will not be delivered for several years and will not affect current Israeli military operations amid its 11-month-old war against Hamas militants in Gaza. The Biden administration has had to balance its continued support for Israel with a growing number of calls from lawmakers and the public to curb military support there due to the high number of civilian deaths in Gaza. It has curbed one delivery of 2,000-pound bombs amid continued airstrikes by Israel in densely populated civilian areas in Gaza.

One person shot during scuffle at pro-Israel rally in Boston suburb

A pro-Israel rally in a Boston suburb turned violent on Thursday evening when a passerby was shot during a scuffle after confronting a group of demonstrators, authorities said. Police were called at 6:40 p.m. to the scene of what they described as a small rally in Newton. Words were exchanged before a passerby rapidly crossed the street and tackled one of the demonstrators, Middlesex County District Attorney Marian Ryan said. "A scuffle ensued. During that scuffle, the individual who had come across the street was shot by a member of the demonstrating group," Ryan said during a news conference late Thursday. Scott Hayes, 47, of Framingham, was arrested on charges of assault and battery with a dangerous weapon and violation of a constitutional

right causing injury. He is scheduled to be arraigned in district court Friday, Ryan said. The shooting victim, who was not identified, was being treated at a hospital for life-threatening injuries, Ryan said. Acting Newton Police Chief George McMains asked witnesses to provide investigators with photos or videos of the confrontation. He said police would provide extra patrols at "houses of worship" over the next several days. Newton Mayor Ruthanne Fuller called the shooting a "frightening incident" and asked for everyone to remain calm as police investigate. "I know people will have a lot of questions, and we will share information with Newtonians and the press when we are able," Fuller said. "It's really early stages of an active investigation."

Justice Department, FBI ready criminal charges in Iran hack of Trump campaign

Washington (AP): The Justice Department is preparing criminal charges in connection with an Iranian hack that targeted Donald Trump's presidential campaign, two people familiar with the matter said Thursday. It was not immediately clear when the

charges might be announced or whom precisely they will target, but they would be the result of an FBI investigation into an intrusion that investigators across multiple agencies quickly linked to an Iranian effort to influence this year's U.S. presidential election. The prospect of

criminal charges comes as the Justice Department has warned about countries including Russia and China seeking to meddle in the presidential election between Trump and Democratic nominee Kamala Harris, including by hacking and using covert social media campaigns designed to shape

public opinion. Iran "is making a greater effort to influence this year's election than it has in prior election cycles and that Iranian activity is growing increasingly aggressive as this election nears," Assistant Attorney General Matthew Olsen, said in a speech Thursday in New York.

Boeing workers on strike

Aircraft assembly workers Awalked off the job early Friday at Boeing factories near Seattle and elsewhere after union members voted overwhelmingly to go on strike and reject a tentative contract that would have increased wages by 25 per cent over four years. The strike started at 12:01 a.m. PDT, less than three hours after the local branch of the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers announced 94.6 per cent of voting workers rejected the proposed contract and 96 per cent approved the work stoppage, easily surpassing a two-thirds requirement. The labour action involves 33,000 Boeing machinists, most of them in Washington state, and is expected to shut down production of the company's best-selling airline planes. The strike will not affect

commercial flights but represents another setback for the aerospace giant, whose reputation and finances have been battered by manufacturing problems and multiple federal investigations this year. The striking machinists assemble the 737 Max, Boeing's best-selling airliner, along with the 777, or "triple-seven" jet, and the 767 cargo plane at factories in Renton and Everett, Washington. The walkout likely will not stop production of Boeing 787 Dreamliners, which are built by nonunion workers in South Carolina. Outside the Renton factory, people stood with signs reading, "Historic contract my ass" and "Have you seen the damn housing prices?" Car horns honked and a boom box played songs such as Twisted Sister's "We're Not Gonna Take It" and Taylor Swift's "Look What You Made Me Do."

The machinists make USD 75,608 per year on average, not counting overtime, and that would rise to USD 106,350 at the end of the four-year contract, according to Boeing. However, the deal fell short of the union's initial demand for pay raises of 40 per cent over three years. The union also wanted to restore traditional pensions that were axed a decade ago but settled for an increase in new Boeing contributions of up to USD 4,160 per worker to employee 401(k) retirement accounts. Under the rejected contract, workers would have received USD 3,000 lump sum payments and a reduced share of health care costs. Boeing also had met a key union demand by agreeing to build its next new plane in Washington state. Several workers said they considered the wage offer inadequate and were upset by a recent company decision to change the criteria on which annual bonuses are paid. Toolmaker John Olson, 45, said he has received a 2 per cent per cent raise during his six years at Boeing. "The last contract we negotiated was 16 years ago and the company is basing the wage increases off of wages from 16 years ago," Olson said. "They don't even keep up with the cost of inflation that is currently happening right now." Boeing responded to the strike announcement by saying it was "ready to get back to the table to reach a new agreement."

"The message was clear that the tentative agreement we reached with IAM leadership was not acceptable to the members. We remain committed to resetting our relationship with our employees and the union," the company said in a statement.

Faked video targeting France-UAE ties likely came from Russia post-Telegram CEO arrest

AP ■ DUBAI

A fake video that ricocheted across the internet claiming tensions between France and the United Arab Emirates after Telegram CEO Pavel Durov's detention in Paris likely came from Russia, an analysis by The Associated Press shows, despite Moscow's efforts to maintain crucial ties to the UAE. It remains unclear why Russian operatives would choose to publish such a video falsely claiming the Emirates halted a French arms sale, which appears to be the first noticeable effort by Moscow to target the UAE with a disinformation campaign. The Emirates remains one of the few locations to still have direct flights to Moscow, while

Russian money has flooded into Dubai's booming real estate market since President Vladimir Putin launched his full-scale invasion of Ukraine in 2022. France, however, remains one of the key backers of Ukraine and its President Volodymyr Zelenskyy as the war grinds on. Meanwhile, Russia likely remains highly interested in what happens to Telegram, an app believed to be used widely by its military in the war and one that's also been used by activists in the past. And the move comes amid concerns in the United States over Russia, Iran and China interfering in the upcoming US presidential election. Russia's Embassy in Washington did not respond to a request for comment.

The fake video began circulating online August 27, bearing the logos of the Qatar-based satellite news network Al Jazeera and attempting to copy the channel's style. It falsely claimed the Emirati government had halted a previously announced purchase of 80 Rafale fighter jets from France worth 16 billion euros (USD 18 billion) at the time, the largest-ever French weapons contract for export. It also sought to link Dubai's ruler and his crown prince son to the decision, as Durov holds an Emirati passport and has lived in Dubai. Such a decision, however, was never made. The UAE and France maintain close relations, with the French military operating a naval base in the

country. French warplanes and personnel also are stationed in a major facility outside the Emirati capital, Abu Dhabi. Reached for comment, Al Jazeera told the AP that the footage was "fake and we refute this attribution to the media network". The network never aired any such claim when reporting on Durov's detention as well, according to an AP check. On the social platform X, a note later appended by the company to some posts with the video identified it as "manipulated media". The video also appeared to seek to exploit the low-level suspicion still gripping the Gulf Arab states following the years-long Qatar diplomatic crisis by falsely attributing it to the news network.

Markets breathe marginally low after record rally

Equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty took a breather on Friday after a record rally in the previous session and ended marginally lower on the emergence of profit-taking. In a volatile trade, the 30-share BSE Sensex fell by 71.77 points or 0.09 per cent to close at 82,890.94. During the day, it dived 309.49 points or 0.37 per cent to

82,653.22. The NSE Nifty dropped 32.40 points or 0.13 per cent to 25,356.50. A d a n i Ports was the biggest loser in the Sensex pack, declining 1.37 per cent, followed by ITC, Bharti Airtel, NTPC, Maruti, Asian Paints, Sun Pharma, Power Grid, Hindustan Unilever and Larsen & Toubro. I n contrast, Bajaj Finserv, Bajaj Finance, IndusInd Bank, Tata Steel, Axis Bank and Tech

Mahindra were among the gainers. In Asian markets, Tokyo and Shanghai settled lower, while Seoul and Hong Kong ended in positive territory. "The market took a breather and ended on a flat note after the previous day's sharp uptick. Despite domestic CPI inflation being within the RBI's target band, the increase in food prices may influence the central bank to remain prudent on rates.

"Higher liquidity from FIIs to the domestic market and a slide in US 10-year yield increased the prospects of the FED rate cut, which will aid domestic sentiment," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services. Retail inflation in August inched up to 3.65 per cent, though vegetables and pulses witnessed price rise in double digits, according to official data released on Thursday.

The retail inflation based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI), however, remained below the Reserve Bank's median target of 4 per cent for the second month in a row. It was at a five-year low of 3.6 per cent in July. The headline inflation was 6.83 per cent in August 2023. European markets were trading higher in the mid-session deals. The US markets ended with gains on Thursday. A sharp fag-end rally on Thursday drove the BSE benchmark to the 83,000 level for the first time. The barometer surged 1,593.03 points or 1.95 per cent to hit its lifetime intra-day peak of 83,116.19. The index ended at a record high of 82,962.71, up by 1,439.55 points or 1.77 per cent. The NSE Nifty surged 470.45 points or 1.89 per cent to settle at a record closing high of 25,388.90. The benchmark hit its fresh all-time intra-day high of 25,433.35, a jump of 514.9 points or 2 per cent. Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) bought equities worth Rs 7,695 crore on Thursday, according to exchange data. G l o b a l oil benchmark Brent crude climbed 1.03 per cent to 72.71 a barrel.



Rupee rises six paise against US \$

The rupee witnessed range-bound trade and settled for the day higher by 6 paise at 83.90 (provisional) against the US dollar on Friday supported by weakening of the American currency in the overseas market and significant foreign fund inflows. Forex traders said rupee trade was range-bound as the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is maintaining a firm grip on the domestic currency. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened at 83.92 and witnessed an intraday high of 83.85 and a low of 83.98 against the American currency. The domestic unit

finally settled for the day at 83.90 (provisional), higher by 6 paise over its previous close. On Thursday, the local unit settled 3 paise higher at 83.96 against the US dollar. Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was down 0.46 per cent to 100.90 points. Brent crude, the international benchmark, gained 1.03 per cent to USD 72.71 per barrel in futures trade. In the domestic equity market, the 30-share BSE Sensex declined 71.77 points, or 0.09 per cent, to close at 82,890.94 points, while the Nifty fell 32.40 points, or 0.13 per cent, to 25,356.50

points. Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) were net buyers in the capital markets on Thursday, as they purchased shares worth Rs 7,695.00 crore, according to exchange data. On the domestic macroeconomic front, retail inflation in August inched up to 3.65 per cent, though vegetables and pulses witnessed price rise in double digits, according to official data released on Thursday. India's industrial production output decelerated to 4.8 per cent year-on-year in July 2024, mainly due to poor performance of the manufacturing and mining sectors, as per official data released on Thursday.

Indian bioeconomy hits USD 151 billion, contributes 4.25 per cent to GDP

India's bioeconomy has experienced significant growth, reaching a valuation of USD 151 billion by the end of 2023, according to a new report, which said that the surge highlights the bioeconomy's critical role in national development, contributing 4.25 per cent to the country's GDP and positioning India among the top five global bioeconomies. The report, prepared by the Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council (BIRAC) and the Association of Biotechnology Led Enterprises (ABLE), outlines transformative advances across biotechnology, agricultural innovation, healthcare, and biomanufacturing, driving the sector's expansion. It was released during a session at the Global Bio-India Summit 2024. The report said that India's bioeconomy has experienced significant growth, reaching a valuation of USD 151 billion by the end of 2023. "This surge highlights the bioeconomy's critical role in national development, contributing 4.25 per cent to the country's GDP and positioning India among the top five global bioeconomies," it said. One of the major drivers of

this growth has been the BioE3 (Biotechnology for Economy, Environment, and Employment) Policy, the report said, noting that the policy focuses on bio-based chemicals, precision biotherapeutics, climate-resilient agriculture, and advanced research in marine and space technologies. Rajesh S Gokhale, Secretary DBT, Chairman BIRAC & DG-BRIC said the India bioeconomy report 2024, launched at the 4th edition of Global Bio India, marks a pivotal moment in India's journey to becoming a global leader in biotechnology. "The report underscores India's bioeconomy growth from USD 10 billion in 2014 to USD 151 billion by 2023, driven by rising demand for vaccines and biopharmaceuticals. With the new BioE3 Policy, we are poised to accelerate this momentum, aiming to reach USD 300 billion by 2030. This report sets the foundation for India's bio-revolution and highlights our path towards global leadership in biotechnology," Gokhale told PTI. The report also emphasises the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in biomanufacturing, with plans to create biomanufacturing and Bio-AI hubs. These efforts are expected to create

new employment opportunities, particularly in tier-II and tier-III cities, while supporting the integration of biotechnology across various industries, the report said. The bioindustrial sector remains the largest contributor to India's bioeconomy, accounting for USD 72.6 billion or 48.09 per cent of the total market, the report said. This sector includes biofuels, bioplastics, and enzymatic applications in industries such as textiles and detergents. Biofuels, in particular, have seen a sharp rise, with ethanol production capacity increasing to 13.8 billion litres in 2023, making India the world's third-largest producer of ethanol. The Ethanol Blended Petrol (EBP) programme, which promotes domestic ethanol production, has been central to reducing India's dependency on imported fuels and enhancing energy security, the report added. The biopharma sector also saw impressive growth, contributing USD 53.8 billion or 35.65 per cent to the bioeconomy. India's vaccine manufacturing capacity continues to be a global leader, with companies like Serum Institute of India (SII) producing over 3 billion doses annually. Major breakthroughs, such as the R21/Matrix-M malaria vaccine and India's first quadrivalent Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine, have highlighted India's prowess in vaccine production. The diagnostics and medical devices segment, which grew to USD 19.4 billion, has also played a crucial role in addressing healthcare challenges, particularly through advancements in early disease detection and personalized medicine, the report said.

Passenger vehicle wholesales dip two per cent in August as OEMs cut dispatches

Domestic passenger vehicle wholesales declined by about 2 per cent year-on-year in August as companies curtailed dispatches to reduce inventory at dealers amid a drop in demand. According to data issued by the industry body Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM), the total passenger vehicle dispatches in the domestic market stood at 3,52,921 units last month compared to 3,59,228 vehicles in August 2023, a dip of 1.8 per cent.



Two-wheeler wholesales rose 9 per cent to 17,11,662 units last month against 15,66,594 units in the year-ago period, it added. Scooter dispatches

last month climbed to 6,06,250 units from 5,49,290 units in August 2023, a growth of 10 per cent. Similarly, motorcycle dispatches from companies to dealers increased by 8 per cent to 10,60,866 units last month from 9,80,809 units in August 2023. The total three-wheeler sales grew 8 per cent to 69,962 units last month against 64,944 units a year ago. "Looking ahead, as the country enters the festive season, demand for vehicles is expected to grow, which will also be duly augmented by the recent announcements of PM E-DRIVE and PM-eBus Sewa Schemes of Government of India," SIAM Director General Rajesh Menon said.

Food ministry inks pact with FCI to boost grain operation efficiency

The food ministry has signed an agreement with the state-run Food Corporation of India (FCI) for the 2024-25 fiscal year, aiming to enhance efficiency and accountability in foodgrain procurement and distribution. The MoU (Memorandum of Understanding) sets specific performance benchmarks, including metrics for FCI depots, and outlines accountability measures to optimise public fund usage in food security operations. "Depot efficiency parameters like capacity utilization, operational losses, security measures, and modernisation of processes are part of the performance benchmarking," the ministry said in a statement. This initiative underscores the government's commitment to refining the Public Distribution System (PDS) and ensuring efficient management of food subsidy funds through improved FCI operations. Established in 1965, FCI handles the purchase, storage, transport, distribution, and sale of foodgrains. It relies entirely on central government food subsidies, having no independent income source. "Such large public expenditure must be evaluated for cost-effectiveness and value for money. This requires benchmarking operational parameters and establishing institutional accountability," the ministry added.

Government mandates use of fire-resistant upholstery fabrics in non-domestic furniture

The Government has introduced stringent regulations mandating the use of fire-resistant upholstery fabrics in non-domestic furniture, a move expected to improve public safety with respect to fire-related tragedies. Effective from October, the Quality Control Order (QCO) now requires all upholstery components used at public spaces to comply with the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) norms. The QCO applies to upholstered composites and fabrics used in non-domestic furniture found in public areas such as offices, malls, airports, restaurants, underground shopping



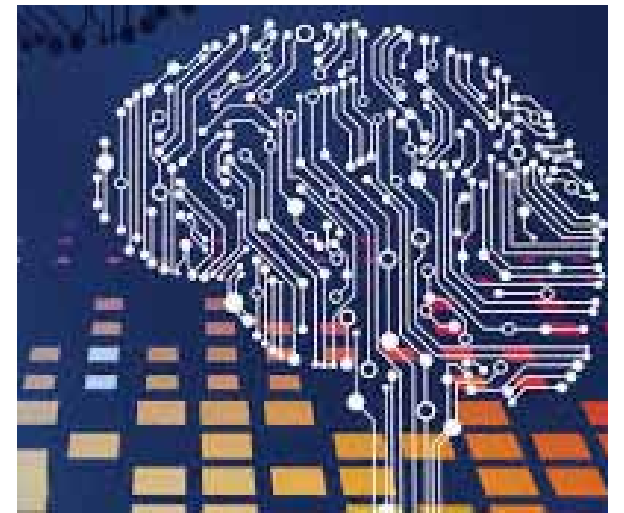
complexes, museums, hospitals, places of worship, and educational institutions. The order is also applicable on all imports of complete furniture or sub-assemblies having upholstered fabric meant for public use,

however relaxation till March 31, 2025 has been provided on the request of industry. "This decisive action underscores the government's commitment to enhancing fire safety in public spaces and ensuring that all non-

domestic furniture meets the highest standards of quality and safety, thereby safeguarding lives and property," an official statement by the Ministry of Textiles said. QCOs are part of the government's broader strategy to ensure quality and safety in critical products. "While BIS certification is voluntary for many products, compliance with these standards for strategic items like fire-retardant upholstery is now compulsory. This regulation is a significant step towards creating safer public spaces and ensuring that the furniture used in these environments meets the highest safety standards," the statement said.

Competition Commission selects Management Development Institute to conduct market study on AI

Fair trade watchdog CCI has selected the Management Development Institute (MDIS) to conduct a market study on artificial intelligence and competition that will examine various aspects, including potential competition issues in the AI ecosystems. In April this year, the Competition Commission of India (CCI) had issued a request for proposal to conduct the market study on Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Competition. The Gurugram-based MDIS has been engaged to conduct the study that will seek to understand certain key AI ecosystems, including



stakeholders, resources, value chains, market structures and parameters of competition, CCI said in a release on Friday. It will also examine the

emerging and potential competition issues in these markets/ecosystems as well as look at the scope and nature of AI applications/use cases, and assess associated opportunities, risks and ramifications from a competition standpoint. Among other aspects, the study will focus on the existing and evolving regulatory/legal frameworks governing AI systems and applications in India and other major jurisdictions. Earlier this year, in an interview to PTI, CCI Chairperson Ravneet Kaur said AI and machine learning can drive efficiency and innovation but also raise concerns related to market concentration and potential anti-competitive behaviour.

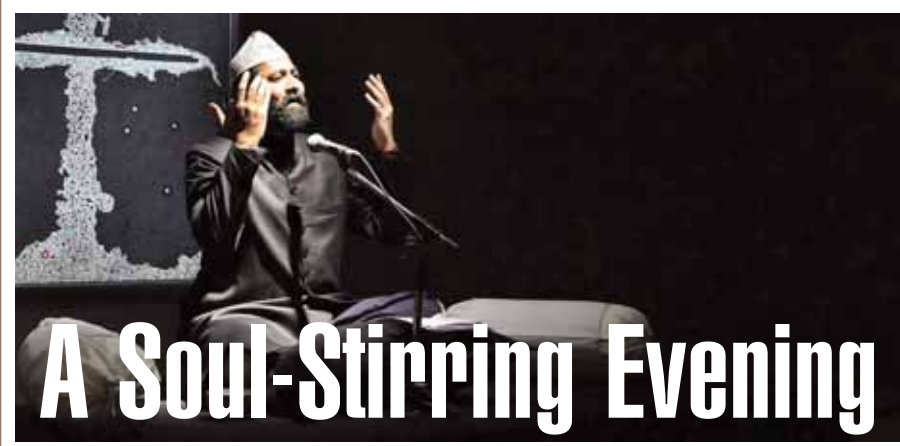

His work is inspired by wabi-sabi, a Japanese concept that finds beauty in imperfection and the fleeting moments of life. Walking through the exhibition feels like stepping into Japan itself. Askari Naqvi's *Soz Khwani* at the Kiran Nadar Museum of Art was an evening of deep reflection, blending history and emotion in a powerful tribute to MF Husain's legacy, writes TEAM VIVA

Some evenings stay in the mind long after they're over, moments that leave a mark on the heart. The recent *Soz Khwani* performance by Askari Naqvi at the Kiran Nadar Museum of Art was one such evening. From the moment the audience settled, there was a visible sense of anticipation, a shared expectation of something extraordinary. Naqvi took the stage with a quiet, humble presence, his demeanor reflecting the deep responsibility of carrying forward a tradition so rich and meaningful. As he began to sing, it became immediately clear this was more than just a performance. *Soz Khwani*, with its melodies and poetic verses, is an ancient practice of remembering grief, a way of turning sorrow into something sacred. Naqvi's voice seemed to carry not just notes, but stories, memories and emotions, each phrase a bridge connecting the audience to the distant, tragic fields of Karbala. There was a depth in his voice, a gravity that pulled everyone into a shared experience of loss. This was not just a musical event; it was a collective meditation on the nature of grief and remembrance. The room seemed to hold its breath, each note touching something deep and universal within every listener. For those moments, the boundaries between past and present, between individuals, seemed to dissolve. This event was part of a broader collaboration with the Italian Cultural Centre, leading up to an exhibition in Venice celebrating M.F. Husain's works, including his



evocative piece "The Battle of Karbala." Husain, with his bold and expressive strokes, seemed to find a perfect companion in Naqvi's singing. Both the painter and the singer were speaking the same language of human suffering, resilience and the search for meaning - one through art, the other through voice. For those present, it wasn't just an artistic experience but a profound reminder of art's power to connect people across time and culture. In that room, the sorrow of Karbala became a shared sorrow; the ancient grief felt strikingly contemporary. Observers felt moved by Naqvi's ability to evoke such raw emotion with such simplicity. It was a powerful illustration of how, in a world so often divided, an evening like this could unite people through a shared feeling. When the final note faded, a heavy, meaningful silence filled the room. It was a stillness filled with thought, reflection and a quiet peace that comes from touching something eternal. Those present could see that others felt it too - a rare, communal moment of introspection. The subsequent discussion at the Italian Cultural Centre, led by Prof. Chiara Rostagno and Roobina Karode,

underscored how art in both Italy and India has long grappled with similar themes: pain, hope and the human condition. It was a reminder that, whether through paintings or poetry, art continues to seek understanding, connection, and meaning. Reflecting on the evening, it became clear that it was more than a cultural event - it was an experience that resonated deeply. It was a powerful reminder of how a simple song sung with sincerity can reach across barriers, make strangers feel less alone and transform a room into a place of healing. One guest captured the essence of the evening when they remarked, "There was such sadness in his voice, but also such beauty. It made me feel less alone." And perhaps that is the true purpose of art: to make the vast, complicated world feel a little smaller, a little more connected. This *Soz Khwani* left behind more than memories; it left a sense of connection and a quiet peace that continues to resonate. TEAM INDIA BEGINS PRACTICE IN CHENNAI FOR FIRST TEST AGAINST BANGLADESH

It is back to business for Rohit Sharma's side following its much-deserved month-long break, as the team began its preparations in right earnest under new coach Gautam Gambhir here on Friday, for the upcoming two-Test series against Bangladesh. With the first Test against Bangladesh scheduled here from September 19, the entire squad, including Rohit and batting stalwart Virat Kohli, assembled at the MA Chidambaram Stadium with new bowling coach, South African great Morne Morkel, and batting coach Vikram Rathour also in attendance. BCCI posted images of the first day of practice and wrote, "The countdown starts as Team India begin their preps for an exciting home season." The images showed the entire squad listening attentively to Gambhir, his support staff and



skipper Rohit. Earlier, India skipper Rohit arrived in Chennai on Thursday, while Virat flew in directly from London for the opening Test. Wearing a yellow jersey, Rohit was seen emerging from the airport escorted by security

personnel, in a PTI Video on Thursday night, while Kohli came from London in an early-morning flight. The likes of India pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah, KL Rahul and wicketkeeper-batter Rishabh Pant had earlier reached the city on Thursday.

The players are returning to the field after a much-needed break of more than a month and would look to put behind the disappointment of losing the ODI series against Sri Lanka in August and get back to winning ways quickly under Gambhir.

This will be India's first Test under Gambhir and his new support staff, and it would be interesting to see how Rohit's side approaches the game against a Bangladesh side, which is riding a wave following their 2-0 Test series win over Pakistan.

Vital World Test Championship (WTC) points are at stake in the two-match series as India get ready for a gruelling 10-match Test season, which also includes a three-Test series at home against New Zealand and the five-match Border-Gavaskar series later this year in Australia. India are currently heading the table with 68.52 percentage points, while Australia are a close second with 62.50 percentage points. Bangladesh have jumped to fourth spot with 45.83 percentage points following their 10-wicket win against Pakistan in the opening Test and their amazing fight-back in the second Test where wicketkeeper-batter Litton Das scored a century to singlehandedly guide the side to a series triumph. The second Test of the India-Bangladesh series will be played in Kanpur from September 27.



ACT hockey: Favourites India look to continue supremacy over Pakistan

A semifinal berth already secured, unbeaten India will look to continue the winning run and supremacy over arch-rivals Pakistan in their last and most-awaited round-robin match of the Hero Asian Champions Trophy here on Saturday. With four wins out of as many games, defending champions India are leading the points table, followed closely by Pakistan. Starting the tournament as clear favourites, Paris Olympics bronze-medallists India haven't disappointed so far, beating hosts China 3-0, Japan 5-1, trouncing Malaysia 8-1 before registering a 3-1 victory against Korea in their last match. Pakistan, on the other hand, have been resilient in the campaign. Playing under the guidance of legendary forward Tahir Zaman, the Ammad Butt-led side has improved with every passing game. Pakistan drew 2-2 against Malaysia and Korea, before beating Japan and China 2-1 and 5-1 respectively to climb to the second spot. Going by recent results, India enjoy an upper-hand over Pakistan. In their last meeting at the Hangzhou Asian Games last year, India thrashed Pakistan 10-2. A few months before that, the Indians beat Pakistan 4-0 when the ACT was held in Chennai. At the Asia Cup in Jakarta in 2022, a relatively young Indian side held Pakistan to a

1-1 draw while at the 2021 ACT in Dhaka, India beat Pakistan 4-3 to clinch the bronze medal. India captain Harmanpreet Singh, regarded as one of the best drag-flickers in the world, is continuing his good form from Paris, and is excited to resume the rivalry against Pakistan. "I have been playing with some of the players in the Pakistan team since my junior days and we share a special bond with them. They are like my brothers. Of course, on the field, we will go about the match like we would against any other opponent and make sure we keep our emotions in check," he said. "In world hockey, the rivalry the two teams share is unparalleled and I am sure fans across the globe will be waiting for an India-Pakistan match." Though India enjoys an edge over Pakistan, Harmanpreet is least bothered about past results. "Past results will not matter when we take on a team like Pakistan. They are a tough side and have the potential to bounce back at any stage in the game," he said. The Indians can also take heart from the fact that the team's young forward-line is living upto the expectations and scoring a lot of field goals, an area which was a bit of concern in Paris. Pakistan's skipper Butt is also confident about Saturday's contest and said his side has improved with each passing game.



Agarwal, Pratham give India A edge after Devdutt makes 92 for India D in Duleep Trophy

Half-centuries by skipper Mayank Agarwal and Pratham Singh helped India A reach 115 for one in their second innings and extend their hold over India D after second day's play of the Duleep Trophy here on Friday. India A, who made 290 in their first innings, earlier bowled out their opponents for 183 despite India batter Devdutt Padikkal's valiant 92 to gain a lead of 107 runs. Now, India A have an advantage of 222 runs, with Agarwal (56, 87b, 8x4) and Pratham (59 batting, 82b, 6x4) leading their run glut in the second innings. However, Agarwal, who is eager to chart his way back into selectorial reckoning, will be kicking himself for falling on the last ball of the day to part-time spinner Shreyas Iyer, spooning a simple return catch. But till that point, Agarwal and Pratham played fluently and executed some fluent drives and cuts as the run-rate never came under four. However, that's just one part of India A's story of domination on the day as earlier pacers Khaleel Ahmed and Aaqib Khan bagged three wickets apiece to rattle the India D line-up. Only one of their batters defied the constant challenge of judgement - Devdutt who stroked his way to a 124-ball

92 with 15 hits to the ropes. The Karnataka left-hander who made his Test debut earlier this year against England was particularly harsh on his offering on his pads or away from the off-stump. A century was there for his taking, but the 24-year-old fell just eight runs shy as his attempt to play a shot on the up off state-mate Prasidh Krishna ended up in a simple catch to stumper Kumar Kushagra. The 11-4-30-1 figures do not fall under the hallow-spell category, but for Prasidh it was important in his comeback journey. This was the pacer's first outing in competitive cricket since Karnataka's Ranji Trophy game against Gujarat in January this year. Since that match, the 28-year-old was recuperating from a quadriceps injury. Harshit Rana made a 31 off 29 balls, including two back-to-back sixes off left-arm spinner Shams Mulani, but his effort was not enough for India D to close the gap with their rivals. However, Rana can take a slice of comfort as he completed a four-wicket haul in the opening session of the day to bowl out India A for 290 in their first dig. India A were resuming from their overnight 288 for eight, but lost Mulani and Aaqib to Rana who ended up with 4 for 51.

Maxwell excited about Kohli vs Smith showdown in Border-Gavaskar Trophy

Australia all-rounder Glenn Maxwell is thrilled about the prospect of watching modern-day greats Virat Kohli and Steve Smith battle for supremacy in the Border Gavaskar Trophy against India later this year. Kohli and Smith are among the "Fab Four" batters of the modern generation, alongside England's Joe Root and New Zealand's Kane Williamson. "I think the way that the two superstar batters, Steve Smith and Virat Kohli, probably head-to-head. Seeing how their dominance I suppose is asserted on the series and how much of an influence that has on who takes home the Border Gavaskar Trophy," Maxwell told Star Sports. "One of those two is going to



make a lot of runs, if not both of them, and it's going to be pretty exciting to watch the two of the finest players of our generation go head-to-head," he added. Both Kohli and Smith are

former captains, and have indulged in fiery on field exchanges early in their careers but their relationship has evolved in recent times. Smith recently said that Kohli was an Australian amongst the

Indian players in terms of attitude. "I believe Virat Kohli is Australian in thoughts and action. The way he gets into a battle, the way he gets into the challenge and tries to get on top of the opposition. He's probably the most Australian of the Indian players, I'd say," Smith had said. India travel to Australia for the marquee five-Test series, starting in Perth on November 22. Since 2014-15, Australia have failed to lay their hands on the Border Gavaskar Trophy, with India winning four consecutive series including the historic triumphs Down Under in 2018-19 and 2020-21.

Rafael Nadal withdraws from Laver Cup in Berlin

Rafael Nadal withdrew Thursday from next week's Laver Cup in Berlin, leaving it unclear when the Spanish great will play again. The Laver Cup - the tournament where Roger Federer retired in 2022 after teaming up with Nadal in doubles - would have been Nadal's first event since the Paris Olympics and potentially one of his last ever. "I'm really disappointed to share that I won't be able to compete at the Laver Cup in Berlin next week," the 38-year-old Nadal said. "This is a team competition and to really support Team Europe, I need to do what's best for them and at this moment there are other players who can help the team deliver the win." The 22-time Grand Slam champion didn't address his current fitness after a spate of



injuries in recent years, or when he might play again. Nadal withdrew last month from the U.S. Open, meaning he missed three of the four Grand Slam tournaments in 2024. He last played in reaching the men's doubles quarterfinals at the Olympics,

where he also lost in the second round of singles to Novak Djokovic. The Laver Cup, to be held from Sept. 20-22, is an indoor hard-court men's competition pitting Team Europe against Team World in a format reminiscent of golf's Ryder Cup.

Verstappen faces challenge in Baku as Red Bull's F1 dominance under threat

Lando Norris is only one of Max Verstappen's problems at the Azerbaijan Grand Prix. The other is his own car. Verstappen needs to tame a car he's called a "monster" to hold off Norris and defend his Formula 1 title, all while the Red Bull team's years of dominance in Formula 1 seem to be nearing their end. Verstappen and Red Bull haven't won any of the last six races going into the Azerbaijan Grand Prix on Sunday. Norris will now be favored by McLaren over teammate Oscar Piastri but will likely need some big slip-ups from Verstappen or Red Bull to overhaul the Dutch driver's 62-point lead in the last eight races of 2024. The target is much closer in

the constructor's standings, with the McLaren team just eight points behind Red Bull, so that lead could change hands in Azerbaijan on Sunday. New rivals to Red Bull are emerging, powered by Red Bull expertise. The departure of Red Bull's car design guru Adrian Newey to Aston Martin in 2022, a sign of the long-term ambition of a team backed by billionaire Lawrence Stroll. Dubbed "the team of the future" by driver Fernando Alonso, they have an eye on designing a car to exploit the new F1 regulations in 2026 - just like Newey did for Red Bull in 2022. Aston Martin has even signaled it would be open to signing Verstappen, who has a Red Bull contract through 2028.

Another key lieutenant to Red Bull team principal Christian Horner, sporting director Jonathan Wheatley, is leaving at the end of the season before heading up the ambitious new Audi works team arriving in 2026. More immediately, there simply isn't much room to improve Red Bull's once-dominant car. McLaren and Mercedes seem to have more stable, adaptable designs. The car "was basically on rails and I could do whatever I wanted," enthused Verstappen after winning the Chinese Grand Prix in April, his fourth in five races at the start of the season. Each upgrade seems to have made the car less stable and increased tire wear. "We basically went from a very dominant car to an undrivable car in the space of, what,

six to eight months?" he said in Italy. Papaya rules' confusion The confirmation that McLaren will have a "bias" toward Lando Norris over his teammate Oscar Piastri from now on should boost Norris' title challenge. But key questions remain unanswered. Racing under the team's vaguely defined "papaya rules" - named for McLaren's orange color - at the Italian Grand Prix, Norris and Piastri started first and second but neither got the win. Piastri overtook Norris early on, allowing Ferrari's Charles Leclerc to get by too, and when Norris and Piastri competed to set fast lap times, it hurt their tires and let Leclerc take a win with smart strategy. What "papaya rules" meant was never fully explained, and

the team's "bias" is almost as mysterious.

- Use natural clay for making of idols instead of baked clay, plaster of paris etc.
- Use water soluble and nontoxic natural dyes for painting of idols instead of toxic non-biodegradable chemical dyes.
- Height of the super structure of the idol shall be limited to 40ft and of the idol shall be limited to 20ft in height.
- Immerse idols only at the identified immersion sites constructed by the District authorities or Local bodies.
- Remove worship materials like flowers, decorating materials before immersion of idols and to be disposed of in municipal dump site and make sure that they are not burnt near the immersion site.
- Do not use single use plastic or thermocol materials for decoration purpose and Prasad sevan or distribution.

District Authorities or Local bodies

- Aware the public regarding water pollution caused by idol immersion.
- Aware the public to purchase eco-friendly idols made up of natural clay and coloured with natural dyes.
- Identify adequate number of designated immersion sites and inform the Puja Committee authorities well in advance.
- In case of immersion of idols in rivers and lakes, arrangements may be made for construction of temporary confined ponds with earthen bunds and removable synthetic liner for the purpose of immersion of idols. Identify the immersion sites at the points where the flow in stream is naturally available.
- Within 24 hours of the immersion, the left over materials from the immersion site shall be removed for disposal at designated municipal dump site and the supernatant water may be allowed to flow into the river after adding lime to clear the water.

Individual Households

- Individual households are encouraged to use only eco-friendly idols made of natural clay and bio-degradable materials as decorative and puja materials.
- Immersion the idols at their homes in eco-friendly manner or immerse the idols in the designated on-land temporary artificial ponds or tanks located nearby or artificial movable tanks arranged by the Local Bodies.
- Do not throw puja left overs tied in polythene bags into the river or any waterbody, rather dispose in designated immersion sites.

Penal Provision

- As per the Odisha Prevention and Control of Water Pollution (Procedure for Immersion of Idol after Pujas) Rules, 2021, for violation of Rule 3 by idol makers, they may be prohibited from idol making for 2 (two) years by the concerned local bodies; and deposition of the idol manufacturers towards registration fees shall be forfeited by the respective local body in addition to the prohibition of idol making for 2 (two) years.
- Further, violation of Rules 5 and 6 by the Puja Committee Organisers, the concerned local bodies may impose penalty on Puja Committee Organisers as below.
 - in case the Puja Committee is located in the area of Panchayat, Rs. 3,000/-;
 - in case the Puja Committee is located in the area of Municipality or Notified Area Councils, Rs. 5,000/-;
 - in case the Puja Committee is located in the area of Municipal Corporation, Rs. 7,000/-;
