Senior BJP leader Rao Inderjit has influence in around 14 Assembly segments coming under Gurugram, Bhiwani-Mahendergarh and Rohtak parliamentary constituencies of Southern Haryana dominated ly concluded Lok Sabha elections in the state, Congress wrested five of the 10 seats from the Bharatiya Janata Party, but BJP retained its grip on the Bhiwani-Mahendragarh and Gurugram seats in Southern

Understanding the significance of this region electorally, BJP which is looking to ensure to form the Government in Haryana for the third consecutive time under the leadership of State Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini, sources in the Party said that the High Command is likely to give a freehand to a prominent Ahirwal leader and Union Minister Rao Inderjit to strategise the party's campaign and plan in Southern Haryana. BJP Central leadership and its core teams have their own surveys and are counting seat by seat to ensure BJP crosses the majority in this Assembly elections. They are availing all options now to beat anti-incumbency, sources added.

Recently, Gurugram MP Rao Inderjit, who is the strong

face of South Haryana, was invited to attend the meeting of Central Election Committee, which was chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi to select the candidates for Harvana Assembly election. In Haryana, OBCs account for the largest chunk of voters at about 30 per cent, followed by Jats at nearly 25 per cent, and the Scheduled Castes (SCs) at about

The Yadav-dominated Ahirwal belt comprises 11 Assembly seats, Gurugram, Badshahpur, Sohna, Bawal, Rewari, Pataudi, these assembly segments are part of Gurugram Parliamentary seat; Narnaul, Chaudhary, Mahendergarh and Ateli under the Bhiwani-Mahendergarh parliamentary seat and Kosli under the Rohtak Lok Sabha seat. In the Lok Sabha election 2024, BJP candidates dominated in 10 out of the 11 assembly segments of the Ahirwal belt.

As per the previous elections, Rao Inderjit has influence in around 14 assembly segments coming under Gurugram, Bhiwani-Gurugram, Mahendergarh and Rohtak Parliamentary Constituencies. In the last Lok Sabha election, Rao Inderjit was responsible for the victory of two BJP MPs, as he won his own seat and helped Dharambir Singh win the Bhiwani-Mahendragarh seat by ensuring his victory in four assembly segments of the Ahirwal region.

Despite trailing by 2.58 lakh votes from three minority-dominated assembly seats of Nuh, Punhana and Firozpur Jhirka, the BJP candidate Rao Índerjit ensured a strong counter from the remaining six Ahir-dominated areas and



defeated his rival Actor-politician and senior Congress leader votes. With this, Rao Inderjit won his sixth Lok Sabha election and fourth from the Gurugram seat. Even on the Bhiwani-Mahendergarh seat, BJP candidate Dharambir Singh trailed in the Jat-dominated five assembly segments of Bhiwani and Charkhi Dadri districts by 3,788 votes from his opponent Rao Dan Singh of the

Rao Inderjit also helped the Congress form government in 1991 (Bhajan Lal) and 2005 (Bhupinder Singh Hooda) by ensuring the party's victory in this region. However, when he joined BJP in 2014, he was assured that the party would give him the respect he deserved. Haryana assembly polls rescheduled for Oct 5 counting on Oct 8

In the backdrop of some parties seeking the postponement of Haryana Assembly elections due to holidays, the Election Commission on Saturday deferred the poll date by 4 days to October 5 from October 1, saying the decision was taken keeping in mind a centuries-old festival of the

Bishnoi community.

The counting of votes for Jammu and Kashmir and Haryana assembly polls will now be held on October 8 instead of October 4. It has been a practice of the EC to hold the counting of votes on the same day for assemblies that go to polls together as the results of one state could affect trends in others.

The decision to postpone the Haryana elections has been taken to honour both the voting rights and traditions of the Bishnoi community which has upheld a 300-400-year-old practice in remembrance of their Guru Jambheshwar, the EC said. It said it had received a representation from the national president of the All

India Bishnoi Mahasabha, Bikaner, Rajasthan for rescheduling the Haryana assembly

He said generations of families from Punjab, Rajasthan and Haryana visit their native village Mukam in Rajasthan on 'amavas' in the month of 'Asoj' for the annual festival in Bikaner in the memory of Guru Jambheshwar, according to the EC.

This year, the festival falls on October 2 and thousands of Bishnoi families residing in Sirsa, Fatehabad and Hisar will be travelling to Rajasthan on the day, denying them their voting rights. Separately, the ruling BJP and the opposition INLD in Haryana had urged the EC to revise the polling date keeping in mind the long weekend which might result in poor voter turnout as people tend to

go out on extended weekends. The revised polling day would also resolve any concerns about a six-day holiday by taking a day's leave on September 30, sources pointed out. They said the chief electoral officer (CEO) of Haryana sent a report on Saturday wherein he confirmed after holding consultations with the deputy commissioners of Hisar, Sirsa and Fatehabad that the Bishnoi community's annual festival falls on 'amavas' during the month of "Asoj" on October

The CEO noted that thousands of Bishnoi families reside in these three districts, and they have been visiting their native place in Mukam, Rajasthan during this time for the last three centuries. Families from these districts are expected to start their journey on October 1, he said.

In the past too, the EC has adjusted election dates keeping in mind the sentiments of various communities. The EC had postponed the 2022 Punjab assembly elections by a week to accommodate devotees travelling to Varanasi for Guru Ravidas Jayanti. Similarly, the commission changed the dates for the 2022 Manipur polls to respect the Christian community's Sunday prayers. In the 2023 Rajasthan assembly elections, it rescheduled polling as it was originally scheduled to be held on Devuthani Ekadashi, a day significant for mass weddings in Rajasthan.

Punjab to launch 260 Sports Nurseries Next Month; CM to issue appointment letters to newly-recruited coaches

This initiative, spearheaded by the AAP Government, aimed at nurturing the young talent and revitalizing the state's sports culture. The recruitment process for coaches has been completed, and Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann will soon issue appointment letters to the selected coaches, marking the beginning of these nurseries.

The sports nurseries will be established in regions where specific sports are popular, aligning with the local talent pool. This move is part of a broader strategy by the Punjab Government to make the state a hub of sports excellence once

Punjab's former Sports Minister and now Sangrur MP Gurmeet Singh Meet Hayer, announcing this development on Friday, highlighted that the government's efforts are not limited to just launching these nurseries but also include providing stable employment

opportunities for athletes. Hayer revealed that Punjab

would offer jobs to medal winners from the National, Asian, and Commonwealth Games, as well as those who have represented India in the Olympics since 2016. This initiative aims to support athletes who have brought glory to the state and

Criticizing the previous governments for their approach to sports employment, Hayer noted that jobs were often handed out only during election years. In contrast, the AAP Government has established a comprehensive sports policy, creating a cadre of 500 positions specifically for athletes. The policy clearly outlined the criteria for employment, ensuring that athletes who excel in their respective sports receive the recognition and opportunities they deserve.

Punjab Government is also committed to fulfilling its promise of opening 1,000 sports nurseries across the state. This ambitious plan, which includes the installation of astroturfs in the Malwa region, aims to provide young athletes with the best possible training facilities. The government is actively recruiting coaches and support staff for these nurseries, ensuring that the athletes receive top-tier guidance.

Hayer also announced the launch of the third season of Kheda Watan Punjab Dian', which kicked off in Sangrur on Thursday. This season introduces three new sports cycling, taekwondo, and baseball — and expands participation to athletes aged 70 and above. Cash prizes, which were previously awarded only to those under 40, will now be extended to older athletes as

In a first for India, Punjab will establish a dedicated Sports Medicine Cadre, consisting of 113 members, to provide pro-fessional medical support to athletes. Hayer emphasized that no other state has such a cadre, with Punjab setting a new standard for sports medicine and athlete care.

Since April 2022, the Mann Government has awarded Rs 88 crores in prize money to athletes, demonstrating its unwavering commitment to supporting sports talent in Punjab.

Speaking to reporters, Phogat said the farmers are holding the protest as their demands have still not been accepted. "It hurts to see them," she added.
"Sometimes we feel helpless at not being able to do anything for them. We represent the country at international levels but we could not do anything for our own family. It is a request that the government should listen to them," she said. Replying to a question, the

wrestler said it was sad that although 200 days have passed, the protesting farmers continue to sit on the roads as their demands have not been accepted. 

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In Memorian + **BOSS KAUN THA?** DR CHANDAN MITRA

It has been three years since Chandan Mitra is gone. I left the *Pioneer* in 2012 summer but my phone still has his number saved as Editor. I last met him on January 19, 2019. I presented him a copy of my book Delhi Political 1947-2013 and clicked a picture together. Since we both had French beards and sported similar glass frames, some commented that I was indeed a true disciple, since I did not simply follow him in his writings but also the style of his beard. Covid followed, poor health got the

better of Chandan's physical charm and our interactions got limited to exchange of messages on the phone. My last message to him was on 24 July 2021 on Guru Purnima. Somewhere I had this gut feeling that he may not be there to

receive the customary message on Teachers' Day, September the 5th. It turned out In 1992, I was working as a district correspondent in the Patna edition of the

Hindustan Times. I remember reading a front-page review of Mani Ratnam's film Roja sitting in the dingy district bureau office. It was sometime then that somewhere inside me the thought arose, if I were to make a career in journalism. Chandan Mitra was the writer to follow. Soon after, I came to Delhi and found a job at the newsdesk in The Pioneer. The

newspaper then had a good number of feature and theme pages. The newspaper's then Editor, Ashok Bhattacharya, gave me somewhat of a license to write on these pages if it would not compromise with my desk work. I grabbed the opportunity with both hands.

In 1996, Chandan came as the Editor to Link House, the office of *The Pioneer*. In the first meeting with the newsdesk, then officiating editor Ajoy Bose introduced me saying that I was some kind of a specimen, who despite working till late in the night on the desk could still find time to write. Chandan responded, "I am surprised as I always thought of you to be in someone in the writing departments.

Soon he made me jump the fence, and I was part of the City reporting team. In less than two years' time I was heading the City unit. When I took over, my friends told me that the job was jinxed as, since the launch of the paper in Delhi, nobody completed a year as the Chief Reporter.

When I completed a year, I wrote a thanksgiving note to the Editor, and Chandan in a hand written reply said I survived not because of his benevolence but because of my work. He said I would have many more years in the office. I worked in *The Pioneer* for 18 years on a trot and of which 16 years were with Chandan. We were ideologically not much aligned. Given my military school background was never much amused by the life of glamour which he enjoyed but still we managed to work together. With time I came to look after the newspaper's editions in Dehradun, Chandinarh and Banchi in addition to the Delhi City unit charge Those were tumultuous years. The Thapars gave up on the newspaper and Chandan brought it back from the brink of closure. In those years many left for better opportunities; sometimes I ask myself what held me back. The charm of attending the evening news meetings with Chandan in the chair, things never got boring. They used to be great gatherings with Swapan Dasgupta and Kanchan Gupta, all mahapandits of right wing ideology, with poor me fighting to justify my sympathies for the then Sheila Dikshit Government. Chandan would face a lot of

His corpse was returned in a most undignified manner. The images made one baulk and at the same time angry even as the Government talked of peace. The front page editorial in the paper said, Bend, don't genuflect. Now this was a startling criticism coming from a newspaper known for its ideological proximity to the Government of the day. This must have required a lot of courage on the part of Chandan, and a real large heart on the part of the Government to take the criticism in the right spirit

During those 16 years, Chandan gave me the freedom to make my team. The team had to be made every sixbmonths as someone who had just started to shine would be poached by bigger media houses. Today these 'freshers' are the strength and backbone of many a media house across the country.

PM Modi assures women of swift action against male predators

n the backdrop of the rape and murder of a Kolkata Ldoctor and sexual assault on two kindergarten girls in Maharashtra's Thane region, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday reiterated the need and urgency to ensure safety of women, particularly at the workplace and called for quick disposal of cases of crimes against women. He said, "The faster justice is done in such cases, the greater will be the assurance of safety for half the population."

Speaking at the National District of Conference Judiciary in Delhi, the Prime Minister emphasised that atrocities against women and the safety of children were a serious concern in society today. On this occasion, the Prime Minister also unveiled stamp and coin commemorating 75 years of the establishment of the Supreme Court of India. The conference was organised by the Supreme Court of India to discuss the issues related to the district judiciary such as infrastructure and human resources, inclusive courtrooms for all, judicial security and judicial wellness, case management and judicial

Modi pointed out that many strict laws were enacted to ensure the safety of women in the country. He added that in 2019, the Government had planned to establish fast-track special courts. Explaining further, he said that there was a provision for a deposition center for important witnesses under the fast-track special courts. He further emphasised the important role of district monitoring committees under fast-track special courts, consisting of the district judge,

district magistrate and superintendent of police. "Judiciary is considered as the

Guardian of our Democracy", said the Prime Minister. Referring to the role of judiciary in protecting the Constitution and the spirit of law, the Prime Minister said the judiciary is considered the guardian of the Constitution, and that the Supreme Court and the judiciary have measured up to this responsibility. He added that the committee's role was important in promoting coordination between various aspects of the criminal justice system. Modi stressed on the need to make these committees more active. He

added that the quicker the decisions in cases related to atrocities against women, the greater will be the assurance of safety for half the population.

Speaking to the media, Radhika, who is married to Tamil superstar Sarath Kumar and is daughter of the iconic Tamil actor M R Radha, said that she has seen the these film stars videographing nude visuals with hidden cameras in the caravans hired for exclusive use by the female artists.

"It is done while the artists change their costumes or use the washrooms. I saw this with my own eyes and ever since stopped using the caravans. Though I alerted the director and other crew members, nothing happened. Malayalam film industry is not safe for female artists," said Radhika.

The revelations by the actress come in the wake of the #Me Too movement getting intensified after the release of the Justice K Hema Committee report about the murky happenings in Malayalam film industry. The committee was appointed by the CPI (M)-led Government in 2017 following reports of sexual harassment suffered by female film artists.

It may be recalled that a leading actress of Malayalam films was kidnapped by gangsters led by Pulsor Suni and raped as per the directive of reigning superstar Dileep.

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Remembrance of things past

Three years ago, on the night I of the first of September, 2021, my father, Chandan Mitra, breathed his last. The last few months of his life had been hard for him, and also hard for those around him. Watching the cognitive decline of possibly one of the most intelligent human beings you have ever known is extremely tough and when that person happens to be your own father, it is so so much worse. I write a lot, but I haven't ever written about Baba's passing or my relationship with him. Three years on, I think it is time.

As I rode with his body in an ambulance to the cremation grounds, those 45 minutes gave me a lot of time to contemplate. Well, 45 minutes is nothing when you're trying to think over a 40-year relationship but there was some solitude inside the vehicle. I recall my fathers childhood friend from La Martinere, Paranjoy Guha Thakurta being in the van with me, but I think that we were both lost in thought.

I will be honest, ours was not a simple relationship. Most sons, particularly in India have deeply complicated Chandan Mitra, pursuing his doctorate at Oxford, with son Kushan



relationships with their fathers, not always around. However, but I would like to think mine was more complex than most. As many know, my parents were divorced and had separated when I was around 13 years old. While that is not journalist something easy for a young teenager to process, as a 45year old man today, I understand how relationships him on the straight and narrow. That said, through my can wither away and die.

But as a result of that, Baba was later teens and early twenties,

my younger brother and I did spend time with him and also stayed nights at his place in Vasant Vihar. I would also like to thank his landlady, the Shymala Shiveshwarkar, who herself passed away earlier this year, for helping him and keeping we were barely on talking terms, Baba's place was a place I only dropped into to party. Could it have been better or different? I don't know, but I do know that by this time, he had found companionship with the first of his many Labradors, Loin. As I begun my career as a

writer and journalist, Baba was always there to provide advice, and as he went beyond dipping his toes into politics, and started his time as a Member of Parliament, visits to his bungalows at Humayun Road and then Ferozeshah Road were common. He was someone I could always turn to for career advice and also talk about life and love. It was here I decided that I would help him

in The Pioneer. This newspaper was his soul by then, he had revived it from a moribund newspaper, to one of Delhi's most reliable and trusted newspapers, and when the rest of the Indian english media had bent over during the UPA-era, which they have all conveniently forgotten today, The Pioneer,

remained steadfastly right-

wing, despite the newspaper

paying a severe commercial price for that, although my father maintained strong relationships with many on the other side of the aisle. Many journalists across the

media today got their start with The Pioneer and worked with my father and many of those keep on reaching out to me, from India and abroad to have a proper memorial service for 'Boss' because he passed away while Covid restrictions were on. This December would have been his 70th Birthday, and God willing, if things go right, I, along with many of those who loved him, hope to celebrate his life. A lot of what has happened in

the past few years is water under the bridge, and I hope a decision or resolution that honours the memory of my father is found soon. Unfortunately his trusting nature in some people allowed them to take advantage of him. I wish he was that trusting of me and others who had the best interests of the newspaper in mind, but it is what it is. And it is a damn crying shame, and that is all I will say other than to hope that the stag can jump high again in the near future in memory of the man who kept

it going.

ndia's Yuki Bhambri and Albano Olivetti advanced to the men's doubles third round of the US Open with a hard-fought win over 15th seeds Austin Krajicek and Jean-Julien Roger here. Indo-French

defeated the USA-Dutch team 4-6 6-3 7-5 in the second round that lasted two hours and five minutes on Friday. This is only the second time that Bhambri has reached the

third round at a Grand Slam,

having reached the same stage at the Australian Open back in 2014 Second seeds Rohan Bopanna and Matthew Ebden also moved to third round with a

6-2 6-4 win over Spain's

Argentina. Bopanna also won in the mixed doubles Indonesian partner Aldila Sutjiadi. Seeded eighth, they won 7-6 (7) 7-6 (5) against Germany's Tim Puetz and Dutch player Demi Schuurs in the opening round.

However, another Indian in the fray, N Sriram Balaji and his Argentine partner Guido Andreozzi exited the US Open after losing to Michael Venus of New Zealand and Neal Skupski of Great Britain. The Indo-Argentine pair lost 6-7 (4), 4-6 in the secondround match that featured just one break of serve in the second set.

In total, Venus and Skupski

received seven break points, and converted one, while Balaji and Andreozzi failed to capitalise on their lone opportunity for a service

"The first step is to consistently play at this level. It's starting from here. Now the next step is to get my ranking higher slowly," Balaji told PTI, reflecting upon his campaign.

"Game" wise I'm feeling confident and moving in the right direction. I also have to keep working on certain aspects of my game and keep getting better. This year the difference was a coach/trainer travelling with me almost every other week, doubles program," he said.

Defending champion Novak Djokovic is shocked at the US Open one night after Carlos Alcaraz's loss

Tovak Djokovic did not go Neasy on himself when assessing the listless way he performed from the start of the U.S. Open, pointing to his sloppy serving as the main reason the defense of his 2023 title surprisingly ended in the third round.

"I have played some of the worst tennis I have ever played, honestly," Djokovic said, just after midnight as Friday turned to Saturday. "Serving - by far - the worst

With 14 double-faults, raising his tournament total to 32, Djokovic bowed out with a 6-4, 6-4, 2-6, 6-4 loss to 28th-seeded Alexei Popyrin of Australia, another shocking result at Flushing Meadows one night after Carlos Alcaraz exited.

"It was just an awful match for me," the No. 2-seeded Djokovic said. "I wasn't playing even close to my best. It's not good to be in that kind of state where you feel OK physically, and of course you're motivated because it's a Grand Slam, but you just are not able to find your game. That's it. The game is falling apart, and I guess you have to accept that tournaments like this happen."

Not often for him, though. After all, Djokovic was trying to become the first player in tennis history with 25 Grand Slam singles titles. Instead, after knee surgery in June, he finishes a year without claiming at least one major

Wimbledon, and acknowledged his energy was lower than he realized after getting eliminated by 74th-ranked Botic van de Zandschulp 6-1, 7-5, 6-4 on Thursday night.

Djoković then replaced Alcaraz as the money-line pick to take the men's title, according to BetMGM Sportsbook, but that status didn't last long at all.

For the 25-year-old Popyrin, this represents a real breakthrough: He had been 0-3 against Djokovic and 0-6 in third-round matches at majors. But the strong-serving Popyrin is playing as well as ever, coming off the biggest title of his career less than three weeks ago at a hardcourt tournament in Montreal, where he picked up five wins against opponents ranked in the top 20.

South African cricket legend Jonty Rhodes on Saturday called Ravindra Jadeja a "complete all-round" fielder in the world right now, and also spoke highly about former India player Suresh Raina's abilities on the ground. The 55-year-old Rhodes, regarded as

one of the greatest fielders of all time who became the first South African cricketer to take 100 ODI catches, played for the national team from 1992 Post retirement, Rhodes became

associated with several IPL teams, including Mumbai Indians, Punjab Kings and most recently Lucknow Super Giants, as fielding coach.

"I am a big fan of Suresh Raina. I enjoyed his playing days but now he has retired. In the past in India, the cricketing infrastructure wasn't there to support the passion and love for cricket. Suresh Raina was someone who used to throw himself around the field," said



Rhodes, who was roped in as the brand ambassador of Hero Pro Corporate cricket tournament

"Unlike Raina, I had a very fortunate upbringing. I played football, hockey and cricket on good grounds. So I was very fortunate.

"I think Jadeja is at the next level, he doesn't dive as much but he is so fast to the ball. And his accuracy at throwing down the stumps is somewhat like Ricky Ponting. He fields on the boundary, he fields on the circle. He is a complete all-round fielder," added Rhodes. Rhodes also gave a meaningful insight on what it takes to become a good fielder.
"It has nothing to do with the hands; it's

actually all about the legs because if you

time, you can get your hands in good position. You can have the best hands in the world and the most magnetic hands but if you don't have the legs you cannot

It's more about quick body positions. It' all about technique," he added. Rhodes said that at 55 he still doesn't think twice about diving on the field.

"Flying is not the problem for me right now, the landing is the problem. When I am on the field I am not thinking about 'should I dive or should I not'. think that's what made me successful on the field," he said.

'So, if you are thinking about (not) diving you can never stop the ball. My father, who was my coach, and and a school principal used to tell me that the 'practice makes perfect 'is not saying correct but what matters is perfect practice. Practice like you play in the match." he added.

A CONVERSATION WITH PAWAN SONI

Pawan Soni shares insights into his transition from corporate life to food blogging, the challenges he faced in the early days and his commitment to transparency and excellence in The Big F Awards. He provides valuable perspectives on the growth of his blog, the influence of his corporate background and what to expect from this year's prestigious

You left a successful career as Vice President at MNCs like HSBC and GE Capital to follow your passion for food. What motivated this career shift, and how did your corporate experience shape your approach to food blogging and awards?

Back in our day, social media wasn't a thing. Like many, I followed the conventional route—completing an MBA and then diving into the world. escape. Traveling the world, I discovered hidden culinary gems and started writing for newspapers and magazines. Eventually, I launched my own blog, Indian Food Freak. Before I knew it, my passion for food had grown into a full-blown

In foodie terms, my corporate career was a recipe for success, but my love for food was the secret ingredient. I traded PowerPoint for paprika and now, I'm serving up a plate of purpose. Jokes aside, my corporate experience was invaluable. It taught me critical skills in sales, operations, and more, which I still use in my second career. Having worked with ethical companies, I've always prioritized transparency. Even after 11 years of running the food awards, I ensure there's no money exchange involved, whether for nominations, attending the awards or in any other aspect.

When you started Indian Food Freak food blogging was relatively new in India. How did you introduce the concept to an unfamiliar audience, and what strategies did you use to build your initial following?

Introducing food blogging to India was like adding a new spice to a traditional recipe—initially unfamiliar, but now indispensable. I focused on creating content that was relatable, authentic, and sprinkled

with humor. I remained honest and objective in all my reviews, even if it meant ruffling a few feathers among friends in the industry. By avoiding fancy jargon and staying true to my readers, I built trust and loyalty. My guiding principle has always been to write for my readers, not for the restaurants.

How did you address the skepticism or resistance from both the public and industry professionals during the early days of food blogging, especially when it was an emerging

Skeptics are like stale spices - they need to be replaced with fresh perspectives. I proved that food blogging wasn't just a flash in the pan by consistently delivering quality community. Facebook played a significant role in this, as I created a space where food enthusiasts could exchange opinions and learn from

What were some of the biggest challenges you faced in creating content for your blog in the early days, and how did you overcome issues related to resources, technology audience engagement?

The early days were like cooking with limited ingredients-creativity was key. I tackled challenges by infusing my content with storytelling, leveraging social media, and engaging with my audience like a master chef. Content was never an issue because food is something we encounter daily. To improve the visual appeal, I invested in a DSLR. As the saying goes, a picture is worth a thousand words.

Indian Food Freak has grown into one of the largest food and travel blogs in India. What were some of initial challenges you encountered when starting your blog and organising The Big F Awards, and how did your corporate experience help you navigate these obstacles?

My corporate experience was the yeast that helped Indian Food Freak rise. The biggest challenge in organizing the awards was securing sponsors who believed in the vision but didn't influence the results. My sales and marketing skills were crucial here. Convincing people of the brand visibility that our awards could offer was key, and looking back, I'm proud to say that I delivered on those promises.

This year, The Big F Awards has expanded to cover the entire Delhi-NCR region. What motivated this expansion, and what new opportunities and challenges do you anticipate?

Expanding The Big F Awards to Delhi-NCR was like adding a new course to the menu—a natural progression. Since it takes nearly six months to organize the awards, with our jury visiting each restaurant to taste the food before

delivering a verdict, venturing into other cities wasn't feasible. However, Delhi-NCR should be treated as one city, with people frequently traveling for work and pleasure. Including Delhi has given us broader and, in some cases, better choices, helping foodies make informed decisions when they dine out.

The introduction of categories for home bakers and home chefs is a unique and thoughtful addition. What inspired these new categories, and how do they reflect current trends in the food industry?

Home bakers and home chefs are the new spice merchants—they're trends. These categories reflect the democratisation of food and the rise of culinary entrepreneurship. I'm pleased to see that home chefs and bakers are now taken seriously. Not only have their businesses expanded, but many new ventures are focused solely on this segment, helping them grow by organising pop-ups at five-star hotels, developing apps for delivery, and introducing them to wider audiences.

Winning the Best Influencer Award by BBC Good Food in 2018 is a significant achievement. How did this recognition impact your career and the growth of Indian Food Freak and The Big F Awards?

We all seek acknowledgment and appreciation. Winning the award was a validation that I was on the right path. It boosted my morale and increased confidence in the products and content I deliver.

The Big F Awards are known for their transparency and integrity. How are you ensuring these values are upheld in this year's expanded edition, especially with addition of new categories?


