Kejriwal bail plea hearing in SC today

The Supreme Court is scheduled to hear on Thursday Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's pleas seeking bail and challenging his arrest by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in the alleged excise policy scam. According to the cause list, a bench of Justices Surya Kant and Ujjal Bhuyan is likely to hear the matter. The top court had on August 23 allowed the CBI to file its counter affidavit in the matter

and gave two days to Kejriwal to file a rejoinder. Kejriwal has filed two separate petitions challenging the denial of bail and his arrest by the CBI in the case. He has challenged the August 5 order of the Delhi High Court upholding his arrest. He was arrested by the CBI on June 26. On August 14, the top court refused to grant interim bail to Kejriwal in the case and sought a response from the probe agency on his plea challenging his arrest. The Delhi High Court had on August 5 upheld the arrest of the Chief Minister as legal, and said there was no malafide intention in CBI's action which was able to demonstrate how the AAP supremo could influence witnesses who could muster the courage to depose only after his arrest. The HC had asked him to move the trial court for regular bail in the CBI case. It had noted that the loop of evidence against the chief minister closed after the collection of relevant evidence following his arrest by the CBI and it cannot be said that it was without any justifiable reason or illegal.

Phogat, Punia likely to contest Haryana polls on Congress ticket

Wrestlers Vinesh Phogat and Bajrang Punia are all set to join the Congress, amid speculation that they are likely to contest the upcoming Haryana Assembly elections scheduled for October 5. Phogat, is expected to mount challenge for the Julana seat held by the Jannayak Janta Party's Amarjeet Dhandra while Punia is likely to contest from Badli seat. Both Phogat and Punia met Rahul Gandhi, the Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha on Wednesday. They also met Congress general secretary (organisation) KC Venugopal. Phogat and Punia joining the Congress at this time is significant because it is both nominating election candidates and is engaged in seat-sharing talks with the Aam Aadmi Party. Punia is a Tokyo Games bronze medallist, while Phogat became the first woman wrestler to reach the Olympics final, the stage where she was disqualified after being found overweight by about 100 gm in her 50-kg category weigh-in. She subsequently announced her retirement from the sport. The Congress' X handle shared the picture of Phogat and Punia with Rahul. The party as well as the duo have remained tight-lipped

about the speculations. However, a clearer picture could emerge in a day or two. Sources said that Phogat wanted to fight from the Julana seat, but the Congress had initially wanted her to contest from another seat near Gurugram. Sources said deliberations are on to finalise the seats for the two wrestlers with Julana and Badli seats under consideration for Phogat and Punia respectively. The Congress put out a photograph of Gandhi with Phogat and Punia on its official X handle. Asked whether Phogat and Punia could contest on a Congress ticket, AICC

general secretary in-charge of Haryana Deepak Babaria said there is a possibility and it would become clear by Thursday or Friday. Punia is a Tokyo Games bronze medallist, while Phogat became the first woman wrestler to reach the Olympics final, the stage where she was disqualified after being found overweight by about 100 gm in her 50-kg category weigh-in. She subsequently announced her retirement from the sport. The Congress' Central Election Committee (CEC) cleared the names of candidates for 66 seats out of 90 till Tuesday.



BJP releases first list of 67 candidates

Looking to get the first-mover advantage in the Haryana Assembly polls, the BJP on Wednesday released its first list of 67 candidates for the 90 Assembly seats for the upcoming Assembly elections, with Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini to contest the Ladwa seat while former Haryana BJP president Om Prakash Dhankar has been fielded from Badli and veteran party leader and former home minister Anil Vij from Ambala Cantonment. The party has dropped nine sitting MLAs. Saini, who was an MP from Kurukshetra until he replaced Manohar Lal Khattar as the Haryana Chief Minister in March this year, currently represents the Karnal Assembly seat, which he won in a bypoll in June. Vij will be the BJP's candidate from the Ambala Cantonment constituency, a seat he has won three successive times since 2009.

BJP trounces AAP in MCD ward elections

The BJP on Wednesday won the crucial Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) zonal ward elections by defeating the AAP in a close contest with the former bagging the posts of chairman, deputy chairman of the zonal-level ward committees, and one member each for standing committee in seven of 12 zones. The AAP managed to win five zones in the elections which took place amid heavy security arrangements. The Standing Committee of the MCD is considered the most powerful body in the civic body. BJP bagged Narela, Civil Lines, Keshav Puram, Shahdara North, Najafgarh, Shahdara South, and Central Zones, while AAP won Karol

Bagh, West, South, City SP and Rohini zones. Voting in Karol Bagh and City SP did not take place as BJP did not field a candidate, while in Keshav Puram, BJP's was the sole candidate in fray. The elections were conducted smoothly under a heavy security. With the win in the much awaited elections which is taking place after a delay of 18 months due to clashes between AAP and BJP. The BJP will be seen dominating the highest decision making body of the civic agency and MCD's financial backbone - the standing committee. With the elections, the committee has nine councilors from the BJP and eight from AAP. The standing committee is important for giving approval to proposals involving expenditures of ₹5 crore and above.



SC snub for Uttarakhand Chief Minister

Heads of Governments cannot be expected to be "old days' kings" and we are not in a "feudal era", the Supreme Court said on Wednesday, questioning Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami for appointing an IFS officer as the director of the Rajaji Tiger Reserve, disregarding the opinions of the State's Forest Minister and others. However, the State Government told a bench headed by Justice B R Gavai that the order posting the Indian Forest Service (IFS) officer as the director of the tiger reserve was withdrawn on September 3. The bench, also comprising Justices P K Mishra and K V Viswanathan, was hearing a matter concerning the appointment of IFS officer Rahul, a former director of the Corbett Tiger Reserve, as the director of the Rajaji Tiger Reserve. The court observed that there was a specific noting right from the first officer, which was endorsed by the deputy secretary, the principal secretary and also by the state's forest minister that Rahul should not be posted as the director of the Rajaji Tiger Reserve. "There is something like a public trust doctrine in this country. The heads of the executive cannot be expected to be old days' kings that whatever they have said, they will do," the bench observed, adding, "We are not in a feudal era." "Why should the chief minister have special affection for him (the officer)?" the bench asked, adding, "Just because he is the chief minister, can he do anything?" It also observed that a departmental proceeding was pending against the officer concerned. Pointing out that the noting had said the officer should not be posted at the Rajaji Tiger Reserve, the court said the chief minister "just ignores it".

Military top brass deliberates on joint command, control centres

India's top military commanders on Wednesday held extensive deliberations in Lucknow on the Government's ambitious plans to create 'Integrated Theatre Commands' and assessed overall national security challenges including the ones along the frontiers with China and Pakistan. Chaired by the Chief of Defence Staff (CDS), General Anil Chauhan, with chiefs of the Army, Navy and the Air Force and other top military officers in attendance, the deliberations primarily focused on setting up of joint command and control centres and logistics nodes, on the inaugural day of the two-day maiden joint commanders conference, being held in Lucknow, officials said. In his opening address, General Chauhan stressed the need for operational preparedness to meet emerging challenges, underscoring the need of modernisation to stay combat-ready and relevant and achieve strategic autonomy. The theme of the maiden joint commanders' conference is 'Sashakt and Surakshit Bharat: Transforming Armed Forces'. The deliberations on ensuring synergy among the armed forces on various aspects including financial planning, joint logistics infrastructure are taking place amid the Government's ambitious plans to roll out theatre commands. Under the theaterisation model, the

Government seeks to integrate the capabilities of the Army, the Air Force and the Navy and optimally utilise their resources for wars and operations. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh will address the apex-level military leadership at the conference on Thursday. "The conference is focused on shaping the future of India's military to adapt to the changing operational milieu," the Defence Ministry said. Reviewing the current security situation and the defence preparedness of the armed forces, General Chauhan emphasised the importance of integration and future planning for enhancing integration across various domains.

Rain chokes Delhi-NCR, traffic hit

Heavy rain lashed parts of Delhi-NCR, including Gurugram and Noida, on Wednesday afternoon leading to severe waterlogging on streets, roads and traffic congestion in several places in the Capital city. Huge traffic snarls were seen in parts of Delhi, including in South, Central, North, New Delhi and parts of Noida and Gurugram. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a yellow alert for the city. A yellow alert denotes bad weather and the possibility of the weather conditions worsening and disrupting daily life. Heavy waterlogging in various parts of Delhi left arterial junctions choked amid the traffic police issuing advisory to the commuters who were caught in prolonged traffic jams. In the past 24 hours till 8 am on Wednesday, city's primary weather station Safdarjung received 0.8 mm of rainfall, Lodi road 1.4 mm of rainfall, Narela 16 mm of rainfall, Palam 0.3 mm of rainfall, Ridge 0.8 mm of rainfall, Pitampura one mm of rainfall, Pusa 0.5 mm of rainfall and Mayur Vihar's Salwan public school 0.5 mm of rainfall.

Mundka, Dhaura Kuan, Moti Bagh, Mehrauli-Badarpur road, Lajpat Nagar, Karol Bagh, Punjabi Bagh, Khanpur, ITO, Jahangirpuri, Safdarjung, Kashmere Gate ISBT and Okhla Estate were among other areas flooded after the rain causing slowdown of traffic movement with vehicles wading through knees deep water. In a series of posts, the Delhi Traffic Police advised commuters to avoid certain routes including a traffic advisory due to severe waterlogging at Mundka,

which significantly impacted traffic flow on Rohtak Road. "Traffic is affected on Rohtak Road in the carriageway from Nangloi towards Tikri Border and vice versa due to potholes and water logging. Kindly avoid Mundka and take alternate route accordingly," it said. Earlier, traffic was also affected on the GTK Road due to water logging as well as on Ring Road in the carriageway from Safdarjung Hospital towards Dhaura Kuan due to heavy water logging near Satya Niketan Bus Stand. Irked by the complete collapse

of civic infrastructure amid the rainy season, a commuters said, "Today, we are very frustrated with the traffic jam, and we have been stuck in a jam for over an hour while traveling from Noida to Delhi. This jam is approximately 1.5 to 2 kilometres long. Due to the jam, our fuel is burning, and pollution is increasing, but the government is not paying attention to this issue." Another one added that it took her approximately two hours to travel through a 14 kilometre stretch.

India ideal investment destination, says Modi in Singapore

During his visit at the invitation of his Singaporean counterpart Lawrence Wong, the prime minister will connect with three generations of Singapore's leadership, officials in New Delhi said. The Prime Minister was warmly hosted by his Singapore counterpart at the iconic Sri Temasek bungalow for dinner. "Welcome PM @narendramodi to Singapore! Delighted to have the chance to catch up over a meal at the Istana, before the official meetings tomorrow," Wong posted on X along with his

photograph with Modi. Fortifying India-Singapore bonds of friendship. PM @narendramodi warmly hosted by PM @LawrenceWongST at the iconic Sri Temasek in Singapore. An evening cherishing the deep and long-standing India-Singapore ties awaits," Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said in a post on X. Modi flew to Singapore after wrapping his visit to Brunei, the first bilateral visit there by an Indian prime minister. "Landed in Singapore. Looking forward to the various meetings aimed at boosting the India-Singapore friendship, India's reforms and the talent of our Yuva Shakti makes our nation an ideal investment destination. We also look forward to closer cultural ties," Modi posted on X soon after his arrival here. "PM @narendramodi lands in the

action-packed agenda lies ahead," the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said in a post on X. Modi, who last visited Singapore

in 2018, was accorded a warm welcome by the Indian community members when he arrived at the hotel. He interacted with the community members and witnessed a traditional dance performance. He also tried his hand at dhol. "Thank you Singapore! The welcome was truly vibrant," he said in another post. Modi will hold bilateral talks with Wong on Thursday and witness the exchange of several memorandums of understanding. The Prime Minister will receive an official welcome at the Parliament House on Thursday and call on President Tharman Shanmugaratnam. This visit comes days after Wong took over and Modi began his third term as prime minister. "I look forward to my discussions to deepen our Strategic Partnership with Singapore, particularly in new and emerging

areas of advanced manufacturing, digitalization, and sustainable development," Modi said ahead of his departure from New Delhi. "The leaders will review the progress of India-Singapore Strategic Partnership and exchange views on regional and global issues of mutual interest," a Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) statement said ahead of his departure for Brunei and Singapore. Modi is accompanied by Minister of External Affairs S Jaishankar, National Security Advisor Ajit Doval and other government officials. He will call on Senior Minister Lee Hsien Loong and Emeritus Senior Minister Goh Chok Tong. Lee will host a lunch for Modi. Modi will also meet with Singaporean business leaders and interact with those in the country's semiconductor ecosystem.

Punjab Assembly Passes 4 Key Bills: Fire Safety Norms Eased, Rs 5L Grant for Unanimous Panchayats

Punjab Vidhan Sabha's three-day monsoon session wrapped up on a decisive note on Wednesday with three of the total four significant bills tabled — including 'The Punjab Fire and Emergency Service Bill, 2024' and 'The Punjab Panchayati Raj (amendment) Bill, 2024' — being unanimously passed.

The session also saw the introduction of the Punjab Panchayati Raj Amendment Bill, 2024, which was brought forward by Rural Development and Panchayats Minister Laljit Singh Bhullar.

One of the major highlights was the passage of the Punjab Fire and Emergency Services Bill, 2024, presented by Local Bodies Minister Balkar Singh.

The bill introduced critical amendments, particularly in the recruitment criteria for women in the state fire department.

Traditionally, the physical test for entry into the fire services mandated both male and female candidates to carry a 60-kilogram sack as part of their endurance test.

However, this stringent requirement has long been a barrier for many aspiring female firefighters, with several candidates failing to meet the physical standards despite passing the written examinations.

In response to these challenges, the new Bill reduces the required weight to 40 kilograms for female candidates, making Punjab the first state in

India to implement such a change.

Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, addressing the House, emphasized the importance of this reform, describing it as a crucial step towards women's empowerment. "This bill was a necessity," Mann stated, "as the previous regulations were outdated and presented unnecessary challenges for women eager to serve their communities."

He further highlighted that the state's fire brigades will be upgraded with the latest equipment and vehicles, modeled on those used in New York City, to better respond to emergencies in Punjab's increasingly urbanized environment.

The session also saw the introduction of the Punjab Panchayati Raj Amendment Bill, 2024, which was brought forward by Rural Development and Panchayats Minister Laljit Singh Bhullar.

The bill aimed at promoting consensus-based governance in rural areas by providing a financial incentive to panchayats that are elected unanimously.

Under this new law, villages that achieve consensus in electing their panchayats will receive a grant of Rs five lakh. In addition, it also bars the contesting leaders to use party symbols to contest panchayat elections.

Articulating the rationale behind the Bill, the Chief Minister noted that elections conducted without party symbols can help reduce factionalism and promote the holistic

development of villages. He recounted a story to underline the significance of unity in panchayat elections, pointing out that consensual elections would save substantial amounts of money, which could be better utilized for village development rather than election expenses.

In addition to these two bills, the assembly also passed the Punjab Goods and Services Tax Amendment Bill, 2024. Introduced by Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema, this Bill aimed at refining the state's GST regime, making it more taxpayer-friendly while ensuring better compliance.

Key amendments include the exclusion of Extra Neutral Alcohol (ENA) used for manufacturing liquor from the GST purview, allowing it to be taxed under VAT instead.

The bill also offered significant relief to taxpayers, including an amnesty scheme for outstanding tax demands from the financial years 2017-18 to 2019-20, provided full payment is made by March 31, 2025.

Furthermore, the Bill extended the deadline for filing returns to avail of input tax credit (ITC) for past financial years, simplifying procedures for businesses. Cheema praised these reforms, asserting that they are designed to enhance the ease of doing business in Punjab.

He criticized the previous governments for their failure to address the state's fiscal challenges, contrasting this with the current administration's proac-

tive measures, which have already led to a noticeable increase in GST collections.

Besides, the Punjab Agricultural Produce Markets Amendment Bill, 2024, introduced by Agriculture Minister Gurmeet Singh Khudian, was also passed with majority without much discussion.

NEW AGRI POLICY SOON: CM MANN

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Wednesday unveiled plans to draft a comprehensive agriculture policy, emphasizing a collaborative approach with all stakeholders.

Addressing the House on the third and concluding day of the monsoon session, Mann highlighted that the policy, which is nearing completion, will soon be discussed with stakeholders.

He underscored the importance of engaging with farmers to ensure that the policy effectively addresses their needs and concerns.

Mann criticized the Union Government for enacting laws without proper consultation, referencing the controversial repeal of three laws that had been enacted without adequate stakeholder engagement.

To enhance industrial growth, Mann also announced the formation of an Industrial Advisory Commission, including leading industrialists, and to be chaired by a Cabinet-rank official.

The commission is set to offer expert advice on indus-

trial policy, continuing the state's commitment to integrating industry feedback into policy-making, said Mann, assuring that this approach mirrors the successful implementation of the state's industrial policy, which was also developed through extensive consultations with industrial leaders.

The Chief Minister also highlighted the success of the One-Time Settlement (OTS) scheme for pending VAT cases, which has yielded an additional Rs 164 crore for the state. Mann criticized previous regimes for ineffective OTS schemes that failed to benefit anyone and expressed his commitment to introducing new OTS schemes in the near future.

On the issue of DAP shortage, Mann revealed that he recently discussed the DAP (Diammonium Phosphate) allocation issue with the Union Minister JP Nadda.

He informed Nadda that Punjab had contributed 120 lakh metric tons to the central pool but had yet to receive its allotted DAP quota.

Nadda advised Mann to send officials to Delhi to resolve the issue. After which our minister and officers had gone to the national capital.

Taking aim on the opposition, Mann advised Congress MLA Sandeep Jakhar to first gather accurate information and inform his uncle—referring to Punjab BJP president Sunil Jakhar — emphasizing that incomplete knowledge can be misleading.

BJP releases first list of 67 candidates for Hry polls, CM Saini to contest from Ladwa

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Wednesday released its first list of 67 candidates for the Haryana assembly elections, with Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini to contest the Ladwa seat. Former Haryana Minister Anil Vij has been fielded from the Ambala Cantt Assembly constituency, Minister Mool Chand Sharma from Ballabgarh, while BJP Rajya Sabha MP Kiran Choudhury's daughter Shruti Chaudhury has got the party ticket to contest the Tosham seat, a party release said. The BJP high-command dropped nine sitting MLAs from the first list while the seats of two MLAs were also changed.

It further stated that the party has fielded former Haryana BJP president Om Prakash Dhankar from Badli, Ram Kumar Gautam from Safidon and Anoop Dhanak from Uklana, Deepak Hooda from Meham, Sunita Duggal from Rati, Gian Chand Gupta from Panchkula, Kanwar Pal Gurjar from Jagadhri, Bhavya Bishnoi from Adampur, and Tejpal Tanwar from Sohna. Ambala Mayor and former Union Minister Vinod Sharma's wife Shakti Rani Sharma, will contest the election from the Kalka assembly constituency.

Devender Singh Bhabli, Sanjay Kablana who joined the BJP recently, will contest from the Tohana and Beri

seats, respectively. Union minister Rao Inderjit Singh's daughter Arti Singh Rao will contest from Ateli. The names of Capt Abhimanyu and Bhavya Bishnoi, the son of Kuldeep Bishnoi are also on the list. Also, Rao Narbir Singh, who met Union Home Minister Amit Shah over his future in the party recently and had reportedly threatened to rebel if not approached by the party high-command, has been fielded from Badshahpur.

Palwal MLA Deepak Mangla, Faridabad MLA Narendra Gupta, Gurugram MLA Sudhir Singha, Bhawani Khera MLA Vishambhar Malik, Cabinet Minister Ranjit Chautala from Rania, Sitaram Yadav from Ateli, former minister Sandeep Singh from Pehwa, Sanjay Singh from Sohna and Laxman Napa from Ratia have missed the bus.

Union minister and former Haryana CM Manohar Lal Khattar said, "A list of 67 candidates has been issued. Seats have been allocated to almost all senior candidates. The remaining seats will be cleared too and the list will be released in a few days." The Congress party, which is eyeing to wrest power from the BJP after 10 years, is in talks with the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) to contest the assembly elections together.

JJP-ASP RELEASE FIRST LIST; DUSHYANT CHAUTALA TO CONTEST

Jannayak Janta Party-Azad Samaj Party on Wednesday released the first list of 19 party candidates for the Haryana Assembly polls, fielding former Deputy Chief Minister Dushyant Chautala from Uchana Kalan, from where he is a sitting MLA. While 15 candidates in the list are from the JJP, four are from the Chandra Shekhar Azad-led ASP. Among the JJP candidates, party legislator Amarjeet Dhanda will seek re-election from the Julana assembly segment. The JJP has fielded Dushyant's brother and senior leader Digvijay Singh Chautala in Dabwali seat. The party has not named its candidate from Badhra where Dushyant's mother Naina Chautala is the sitting MLA. Former legislator Rajbir Phogat will contest from Charkhi Dabri. In the 2019 assembly polls, Dushyant Chautala had defeated Prem Lata, the wife of veteran leader Birender Singh who was with BJP at that time. Former Union minister Birender Singh, who is now in Congress, is likely to get the ticket in Uchana.

Haryana is set to hold its assembly elections in a single phase on October 5, and the result will be announced on October 8. The deadline for filing nominations is September 12, followed by scrutiny on September 13. Candidates have until September 16 to withdraw their nominations.

CM Mann Vows to Address Sacrilege, Police Firing Issues after AAP MLA raises issue

Punjab Vidhan Sabha on Wednesday witnessed a dramatic escalation as AAP MLA Kunwar Vijay Partap Singh stirred Assembly by putting in dock his own party's government over issue of inaction in the sensitive issue of sacrilege and related firing incidents. Kunwar Vijay, a cop-turned-legislator, demanded a special one-day session to address the unresolved issues of sacrilege and subsequent police

firing incidents of 2015, besides calling for the tabling of SIT report, which investigates the police violence at Behbal Kalan and Kotkapura — the demands that underscored mounting frustration with the State Government's inaction. His move not only ignited a fervent debate but also compelled Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann to break his silence on this emotionally charged issue. Addressing the Assembly, Mann pledged that the State Government is unwavering in

its commitment to deliver justice for the victims of sacrilege and the police violence that followed. Mann revealed that new evidence has surfaced, prompting the State to prepare a fresh report that will be legally vetted to ensure thorough accountability. He promised "no leniency" towards the perpetrators — highlighting a significant shift from the past administrations, which have been criticized for their perceived inadequacy in handling these grave issues.

Vinesh Phogat, Bajrang Punia likely to contest Haryana Assembly Poll as Cong candidate

After meeting Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, wrestlers Vinesh Phogat and Bajrang Punia are likely to contest the Haryana Assembly Elections from Julana and Badli seats, respectively as Congress candidates. The party put out a photograph of Rahul Gandhi with Vinesh Phogat and Bajrang Punia on its official X handle.

The names will be cleared by the Congress Central Election Committee anytime now.

The Congress CEC has approved candidates in 66 of 90 seats so far. Former chief minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda, Lok Sabha MP Kumari Selja and Rajya Sabha MP Randeep Surjewala kept pushing the names of their nominees till the last moment, delaying the list.

Bajrang Punia and Vinesh Phogat were part of the protest over sexual harassment allegations against former BJP MP and then Wrestling Federation of India chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh in 2023. Ever since Phogat returned to India from the Paris Olympics, she has been seen with Congress leaders.

Rohtak MP Deepender Hooda was the first political leader to reach IGI Airport in Delhi to welcome her with a 'Hanuman Gada', a symbol of victory. Phogat had also met former Haryana chief minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda who had

said that the Congress welcomes everyone who wants to join the party.

Talking to reporters, AICC in charge of Haryana Dipak Babaria said that so far, the party's central election committee has been able to clear 66 out of the total 90 assembly seats through consensus but no agreement could be reached on the remaining 24 seats. "We have held two rounds of the CEC and have finalised 66 of the 90 seats.

The remaining seats have been referred to a review committee which will resolve the matter soon," Babaria.

The delay is also because of the talks of an alliance with the Aam Aadmi Party in Haryana. AAP MP Raghav Chadha held talks with Deepak Babaria to explore possibilities of finding a common ground.

"We are exploring possibilities for an understanding. I believe that things cannot proceed unless it is a win-win situation for both parties. So we are looking for a meeting point," Babaria told reporters. Asked how many seats the Congress could give the AAP as part of a deal, he said it would be a "small number" in "single digit".

Babaria also said the CPI(M) and the Samajwadi Party have also put forward a proposal and are expecting to work with the Congress in an alliance.

Himachal Assembly passes Bill barring MLAs disqualified under anti-defection law from pension

Shimla: The Himachal Pradesh Assembly on Wednesday passed a Bill which will bar the members of the House who are disqualified under Tenth Schedule of the Constitution (anti-defection law) from drawing pension.

The Himachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly (Allowances and Pension of Members (Amendment) Bill, 2024 will affect six former Congress MLAs, who were disqualified by the Speaker for defying the whip and abstaining from the House during discussion on cut motions and passing of Budget in February.

The opposition BJP objected to the Bill stating that it smacks of "political revenge" and it cannot be implemented with retrospective effect.

The six former MLAs who will be impacted due to the Bill are Sudhir Sharma, Inder Dutt Lakhanpal, Rajinder Rana, Devinder Kumar Bhutto, Chetanya Sharma and Ravi Thakur. All of them had voted in favour of the BJP nominee

Harsh Mahajan during the Rajya Sabha elections held in February. All six had contested the bypolls on BJP tickets earlier this year. While Sudhir Sharma and Lakhanpal got re-elected, the other four lost.

Himachal is first state in the country to pass such a bill under which "A person shall not be entitled for pension under the Act, if he has been disqualified at any point of time under the tenth schedule of the Constitution". The statement of object and reasons of the Amendment Bill passed by voice vote said it was necessitated as there was no provision in the 1971 Act to discourage the defection of members, protect the mandate given by the people, preserve democratic values and deterrence towards "constitutional sin". The Bill would become Act after the consent of the governor. Replying to discussion on the Bill, Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said six Congress MLAs betrayed the Congress party and the Bill

is aimed at strengthening the democratic values and deter MLAs from defection. Rakesh Jamwal (BJP) said the Bill has been brought in a haste and asked how it can be implemented retrospectively.

Leader of opposition Jai Ram Thakur said the Bill smells of "political revenge" and the Congress members had not joined the BJP at the time of voting for Rajya Sabha polls. The Speaker disqualified them for violating the party whip and as such they do not attract action under the Tenth Schedule, he added.

Randhir Sharma (BJP) said the Bill has been brought out of vengeance and added that the Congress MLAs who voted for the BJP candidate in the Rajya Sabha polls were not defectors and demanded that the Bill be sent to the Select Committee.

Revenue Minister Jagat Singh Negi defended the Bill and said defection weakens democracy and defectors should be punished for this action. (Agencies)

BJP's recruitment drive to solidify power

As the BJP aims to recruit 100 million new members, it continues to strengthen its dominance, despite facing criticism and internal challenges

The ruling Bharatiya Janata Party is working to expand on a two-track basis. The first is by recruiting influential leaders from other parties, particularly Congress. Although this may involve a small number of leaders, their influence is significant.

Second, the party is focusing on enrolling a large number of new members. Former Jharkhand Mukti Morcha Chief Minister Champai Soren joined the BJP after current CM Hemant Soren, allegedly involved in a scam, was released last week and resumed his post. This move adds to the trend of influential chief ministers joining the BJP, highlighting the party's strategic success. The BJP embraces well-known leaders from other parties as they bring their influence and workers along. — Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma, imported from Congress, is a classic example. Sarma has become the go-to man in the northeast. According to the National Election Watch-ADR, the main reasons for defections and party switching are the absence of value-based politics, greed for money and power, rewarding political positions, and lack of efficient, honest, and credible leaders. BJP has plans to recruit 100 million new members on a parallel track.

At last week's meeting, the BJP leadership decided that the drive would be in two phases: September 2 to 25 and October 1 to 15. Over the last decade, the BJP has seen significant growth. In the 1980s, upper-middle-class, urban, and Hindus primarily supported the BJP. It has since built a broader political base, showing its increasing influence. The BJP has overtaken Congress and is already the world's largest party, with 180 million members. The Grand Old Party, Congress, has 130 million members. Between 2014 and 2019, around 180 million people joined the BJP nationwide. Eighty thousand leaders and workers from various parties have joined the BJP, which aims to recruit about 100,000 leaders at national and district levels.



Through this drive, the BJP collects data about its members, including their caste, gender, age, residence, and other details. In the last decade, many influential Congress leaders, including former chief ministers and ministers, shifted to the BJP, revealing their frustration, greed and lust for power. The BJP has rewarded some of them with good positions. Notable leaders among them include Himanta Biswa Sarma, Gulam Nabi Azad, Captain Amarendra Singh, Kapil Sibal, Jitin Prasada, R.P.N. Singh, Milind Deora, and Jyotiraditya Scindia. Former Maharashtra chief minister Ashok Chavan, Ritesh Pandey, Sangita Azad, and others have recently joined the BJP.

They come from various political parties such as Congress, Bahujan Samaj Party, All India Trinamool Congress, and YSRCP. The BJP has benefited the most from members switching sides, while the Congress has suffered the most since 2014. Even after winning, the Opposition parties are concerned that the BJP will try to persuade their legislators to switch—many defectors at crucial moments, such as during government majority voting. Why do they defect? If there is

a reason for the defectors to leave their respective parties, the BJP also embraces them without hesitating. These leaders fear becoming politically irrelevant when their party loses power. By aligning with the dominant BJP, they hope to gain control and secure a political future for their children. The BJP's successful strategy of attracting leaders from other parties is evident in the ADR analysis. It shows that 22% of re-contesting candidates who switched parties joined the BJP, followed by 10% joining the Congress and 6% joining the BSP. Over the past decade, the BJP has attracted several leaders from other parties, contributing to the rise of leaders like Himanta Biswa Sarma in the northeastern region. Why does the BJP welcome these defectors? There are three key reasons: First, it weakens the party from which the defection occurs. Second, it allows the BJP to absorb known leaders from established parties, strengthening its ranks.

Third, given the BJP's lack of second-rung leaders, it is easier to absorb the defectors. It is not as if dissenters have not left the BJP. Some, like Kalyan Singh, Shankar Singh Vaghela, and Yediyurappa (all chief ministers), launched their par-

ties but returned to the BJP when they failed. The BJP's deeply ideological glue holds it together.

The BJP's long-time loyal members are unhappy when newcomers get good positions while they have been faithful to the party. This has happened in the past. During Vajpayee's leadership, the party could only accommodate some, and others left. While the party has been expanding, its leadership is still dominated by the Upper caste.

The BJP has strengths but receives criticism for its limited ideology, aggressive attitude, complacency, and arrogance. The BJP's upcoming membership drive will test its strength in the post-2024 poll period. Though it emerged as the single largest party, it got only 240 seats in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls, 32 short of the majority. Prime Minister Narendra Modi wants to achieve a "Congress-Free India," but it may be challenging.

You cannot eliminate a 140-year-old party in a day, as the Congress showed revival instincts. The BJP must refrain from repeating the mistakes of the Congress to stay in power. (The writer is a popular columnist; views are personal)

Despite all these strengths the political party possess in the state, to fight the elections on its own without an alliance and form the government on its own is difficult and hence we will have to see the partners with whom he forges alliance in the 2026 TN assembly elections which he has announced to fight.

Reviving the legacy of quality in teacher education

This year's Teacher's Day celebrations carry a special resonance as they align with the enduring concerns of Dr S Radhakrishnan, who passionately advocated for quality in education

Teacher's Day celebrations this year are indeed special in the context of quality, which was the major concern expressed on several occasions by Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, whose contributions are recalled with gratitude on this day every year. Necessary academic and professional preparations have been made and the Integrated Teacher Education Programme - ITEP - has already been launched in 64 institutions. This initiative is based on the recommendations of the National Education Policy -NEP-2020 - that after 2030 all of the pre-service teacher preparation programmes would be only of four-year duration and all others shall be scrapped. It would be prudent to recall an earlier experiment in quality teacher preparation which was initiated in 1965 by the then-newly established organization, the National Council of Educational Research and Training - NCERT - in its four Regional Colleges (now Institutes) of Education, located in Ajmer, Bhopal, Bhubaneswar, and Mysore.

It was acknowledged at the level of experts and accepted by national decision-makers that the one-year teacher preparation programmes were inadequate in preparing quality teachers and must be replaced by the four-year integrated programmes after senior secondary. The products of these four-year integrated courses established a distinct reputation for themselves in the education sector, and also in other professions as well, which they preferred to join. It is indeed heartening to note that the NEP-2020 made the recommendation on ITEP based upon the solid evidence offered by the NCERT institutions. One is convinced that the growth, development and progress of any nation would be a direct consequence of the quality of education it achieves.

This quality is invariably a product of the level of excellence achieved by the Teacher Education Institutes - TEIs - of the nation. It is the work culture of the TEIs that mandates - without ever saying so formally - the work culture of the schools. The level of competence, commitment and performance witnessed in the TEIs by the student-teachers flows directly to schools and creates practically a comparable environment for school children. It is possible to achieve comprehensive personality evolution over four years and this is well-established in India, courtesy of the NCERT.

One must hasten to add that the proposed ITEP version of the earlier four-year programmes of the NCERT must be handled with great caution and care. Any inadequacy of academic, professional physical and financial resources could inflict irreversible damage to the great initiative. The future of the planet Earth and humanity depends on how education deals with man-nature mutuality. India decided in 2020 that 'The rich heritage of ancient and eternal Indian knowledge and thought' would be a guiding light for the NEP-2020.

It has, thus, accepted that education in India must be 'rooted in a culture committed to new knowledge.' In every alert and active culture, the tradition of knowledge quest has to remain dynamic in word and deed. It is because of this inherent strength, that Indian culture and its tradition of knowledge quest with its

unique objectives and vision are now receiving global attention in the world. Yes, the knowledgeable and concerned persons of the world must come together and realize that the wanton destruction of natural resources without caring for their replenishment has forced scientists to calculate how long the planet Earth could survive.

They must inspire everyone to wake up and realize the dreadful magnitude of the devastation being inflicted on nature must stop, and much more, present big plans before people, but there it all ends. There is a solution that Indians are aware of from 'ancient times: 'Aparigraha'. It was put up before the world in very simple terms in his indomitable style by Mahatma Gandhi: Nature has a sufficient resource to meet the needs of everyone but not the greed of anyone'.

This is the only alternative. "To me, hope lies in the Teacher! The Teacher can do it if they resolve to do it and the 'Teachers of the world' unite! A new chapter has to be written in every discipline and an emphasis on multidisciplinary concerns of the human knowledge quest, the process of transfer and acquisition of knowledge.

Towards this, teachers shall have to realize, accept and internalize that they are makers of the future of human existence on planet Earth! It is their responsibility to shape every learner coming to them as an unaware and uninitiated person into a personality! That would shape the future generations, would prepare citizens committed to their nation, and their people but fully conscious of their role as international cit-

izens as well. The legendary philosopher, revered statesman and worthy teacher Dr. S. Radhakrishnan was one of the finest intellectual brains of the 20th century. He was a matchless interpreter of Eastern and Western thought, philosophy and the 'concept of a man'. We recall his greatness, and his multifarious contributions, but allow his philosophy and guiding principles for teachers to remain confined to a few shelves of some reputed libraries.

He pleads particularly to institutions of higher learning: "The ideal of the university is the promotion of liberty of mind and or freedom of thought. It has little to do with the protection of privilege or a call to conformity. It contests privilege which is something other than that excellence which follows on intellectual eminence or spiritual greatness. It contests conformity, for each individual has a right to develop his own convictions." Once this is accepted at each appropriate level by all those dealing with higher education, it becomes clear that the seeds for creating such an environment in institutions of higher learning have to be sown in schools!

Schools in the present context just cannot become the nourishing and nurturing grounds for the flowering of new ideas unless school teachers are well-equipped and well-endowed with the determination that every child, every learner is to be encouraged to express himself in whichever way he chooses to; may be in music, sports, mathematics, painting, imagination, creativity, and the like! In India right from the Ministry of Education to primary schools is just forgotten after

every discussion and deliberation! One is referring to the most distinct role of teacher education institutions; TEIs. Quality, ideas, innovations, and imagination are nurtured in schools and universities but how to do so is learnt, internalized and tested in TEIs. To universalize this comprehension, one must be ready with a reality test! We are proud of India of ancient times because of the universality of its culture and acceptance of the essential unity of mankind despite all the apparent diversities.

Academic institutions need to pose an internal query: are we functioning at a level of self-confidence, conviction, determination and passion that could bring credibility to each one of us and our institution? As academics 'have we accepted and succumbed to being 'teachers less original, to ambitions less exalted and to tame compliance with old forms! We were warned over seven-eight decades ago by Dr Radhakrishnan on this count: "There was a dread of venturing outside the safe limits of guaranteed ideas. The country seems to suffer from exhaustion." The future belongs to those equipped with learning that encourages ideas, imagination, curiosity and creativity. The fittest and finest tribute to Dr. Radhakrishnan and in fact to the great Indian tradition of teaching, learning and knowledge quest would be to respect teachers, and treat them as the creators of the future of not only the individual learner but of the society, community and the nation.

The true power and purpose of teaching in a changing world

On this Teacher's Day, let us reflect on the challenges and triumphs of this noble profession

Born into a family of accomplished women, I've often faced a question that has puzzled me for years: "Why did you choose to be a teacher?" This question, posed by family, friends, and even strangers, stems from two assumptions. First, that teaching is a lesser profession, inferior to careers like medicine or bureaucracy, which my sisters have pursued. Second, and more disheartening, is the belief held by some that only those who fail in other "proper" professions resort to teaching. The underlying notion is that teaching is easy and requires no special skills—a perception I find not just ironic but profoundly misguided. The irony lies in the fact that we all remember teachers

who profoundly impacted our lives. We recall the teachers whose classes we eagerly attended, whose kindness and encouragement shaped who we are today. Conversely, we also remember those whose classes were dull, who seemed to take pleasure in demeaning students, or who treated teaching as nothing more than a paycheck. The truth is, teaching is easy only for those who see it as mere-

ly a job—a means to an end, rather than a calling. For those who aspire to be remembered as "good" teachers, the profession is far from easy. It requires dedication, empathy, and a genuine desire to make a difference in students' lives.

Unfortunately, there has been a shift in attitudes towards teaching, influenced by a growing corporate mentality and consumer culture. Many teachers today seem more concerned with holidays, salary increments, and perks than with the students they are supposed to nurture. While it's not wrong to seek these benefits, when they become the sole focus, teaching is reduced to a transactional relationship. This attitude contributes to the neg-

ative perception of teachers in society, where they are often seen as nothing more than paid servants in an "easy" profession.

Yet, the disillusionment among teachers is not entirely self-inflicted. The idealism that once characterized the profession has been eroded by systemic issues that go beyond individual attitudes. Over the three-plus decades I've spent in education, I've witnessed changes that have not always benefited teachers or students. One of the most significant changes has been the shift from an annual examination system to a semester system at the undergraduate level. While the intention of aligning with global patterns is understandable, the semester system has

reduced teaching to a race to complete syllabi, leaving little room for individualized attention or meaningful engagement with students.

This shift is particularly ironic in an era when "quality education" is a buzzword. The question we must ask is whether the semester system truly enhances quality or merely ensures that all the boxes are ticked on time. Teachers who feel they cannot do justice to the curriculum or their students are bound to feel frustrated. Even the most resilient educators may eventually succumb to the pressures of the system, abandoning the high ideals that initially drew them to the profession. The space that the annual system once provided for exploring innovative

teaching methods has been replaced by a relentless focus on deadlines, leading to a sense of exhaustion and apathy among teachers.

The accreditation system, though well-intentioned, has also added to the burden. While it has encouraged institutions to improve infrastructure, training, and community outreach, the process itself is cumbersome. Hours are spent documenting activities and ensuring they conform to prescribed criteria for a good grade. This bureaucratic approach to education often detracts from the unique qualities of individual institutions, fostering a spirit of competition that can be more self-defeating than motivating. Another challenge is the rapid

succession of educational reforms—CBCS, LOCF, NEP, and others. While each reform is introduced with the intention of improving education, the pace of change has led to confusion, inadequate curriculum revision, and a lack of clarity about the objectives of these reforms among both teachers and students.

The result is a situation where "a little learning," as Alexander Pope warned, becomes a "dangerous thing." Instead of fostering deep understanding, these rapid changes have led to superficial learning and a sense of disillusionment among educators.

Despite these challenges, I remain steadfast in my belief that teaching is one of the

most powerful professions in the world. A teacher has the potential to drive away the clouds of ignorance to teach empathy and integrity, and to guide students toward a brighter future. Rabindranath Tagore, captured this sentiment beautifully in his poem "Where the Mind is Without Fear," envisioning a world led by reason, truth, and freedom. On this Teacher's Day, I urge my fellow educators to remember the profound role we play in shaping the future. Despite the odds, we must strive to create a better world by becoming more humane and resilient, even if we are the last ones standing.

Grenfell tower fire: Inquiry blames UK government, industry failures

A damning report on a deadly London high-rise fire said Wednesday that decades of failures by government, regulators and industry turned Grenfell Tower into a "death trap" where 72 people lost their lives.
This was concluded that there was no "single cause" of the tragedy, but said a combination of dishonest companies, weak or incompetent regulators and complacent government led the building to be covered in combustible cladding that turned a small apartment fire into the deadliest blaze on British soil since World War II. The inquiry's head, retired judge Martin Moore-Bick, said the victims' deaths were all avoidable, and "those who badly failed over a number of years" by multiple people and organisations. "All contributed to it in one way or another, in most cases through incompetence

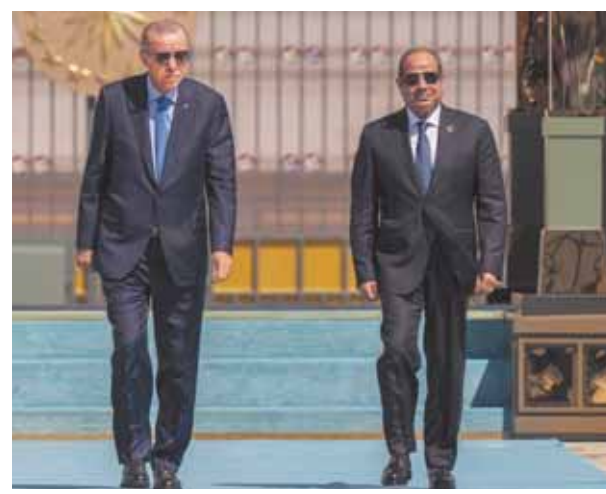
but in some cases through dishonesty and greed," he said. Prime Minister Keir Starmer apologised on behalf of British state, saying the tragedy "should never have happened" and promising the victims justice.
While the report may give survivors some of the answers they have long sought, they face a wait to see whether anyone responsible will be prosecuted. Police will examine the inquiry's conclusions before deciding on charges. Natasha Elcock, of Grenfell United, a group representing survivors and bereaved families, urged authorities to "deliver justice and bring charges against those who are culpable for the deaths of our loved ones." "Today's report speaks to the lack of competence, understanding and fundamental failure to perform the most basic duties of care," said Elcock, a survivor of the fire who lost her uncle in the tragedy. "We paid the price for systematic dishonesty,

institutional indifference and neglect." The fire broke out in the early hours of June 14, 2017, in a fourth-floor apartment and spread up the 25-story building like a lit fuse, fuelled by flammable cladding panels on the tower's exterior walls. The tragedy horrified the nation and raised questions about lax safety regulations and other failings by officials and businesses that contributed to so many deaths. "How was it possible in 21st century London for a reinforced concrete building, itself structurally impervious to fire, to be turned into a death trap?" asked the report. It concluded: "There is no simple answer to that question." Grenfell Tower, built from concrete in the 1970s, had been covered during a refurbishment in the years before the fire with aluminium and polyethylene cladding - a layer of foam insulation topped by two sheets of aluminium sandwiched around

a layer of polyethylene, a combustible plastic polymer that melts and drips on exposure to heat. The report was highly critical of companies that made the building's cladding. It said they engaged in "systematic dishonesty", manipulating safety tests and misrepresenting the results to claim the material was safe. It said insulation manufacturer Celotex was unscrupulous, and another insulation firm, Kingspan, "cynically exploited the industry's lack of detailed knowledge". It said cladding panel maker Arconic "concealed from the market the true extent of the danger".
The combustible cladding was used on the building because it was cheap and because of "incompetence of the organisations and individuals involved in the refurbishment" - including architects, engineers and contractors - all of whom thought safety was someone else's responsibility, the report said.

Egyptian President makes his first visit to Turkey as relations thaw

Egyptian President Abdel Fattah el-Sissi on Wednesday is making his first official visit to Turkey since assuming power, after the two regional powers ended years of tensions. El-Sissi and Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan are set to discuss bilateral relations, the conflict in Gaza and escalating tensions in the Middle East, among other topics. They are also expected to oversee the signing of more than a dozen cooperation agreements to strengthen the relationship between their nations, including in energy, defense and tourism.
In February, Erdogan made his first visit to Egypt in more than a decade after the two countries agreed to mend ties and reappointed ambassadors. Erdogan declared that the two countries wanted to boost bilateral trade to \$15 billion from the current \$10 billion.
Relations between Egypt and Turkey, a long-time backer of the Muslim Brotherhood group, soured after the Egyptian military ousted Islamist President Mohammed Morsi amid mass protests

he led the military's overthrow of Morsi. El-Sissi will be accompanied by a large delegation of officials and businessmen, Egyptian media reported. Egypt, together with Qatar and the United States, a key Israeli ally, has been working for months to try and broker a cease-fire and the return of the remaining 100 hostages held by Hamas. The negotiations have been dragged out since Israel introduced new demands, including lasting Israeli control over the Philadelphi corridor between Gaza and Egypt and a second corridor running across the Palestinian enclave.
Egypt has accused the Israeli prime minister of obstructing the negotiations. It is opposed to any Israeli presence along the Gaza side of its border and says it would threaten the decades-old peace treaty between the two countries, a cornerstone of regional stability. Hamas has tried unsuccessfully to have Turkey added as a guarantor in the cease-fire talks. The war began with Hamas' assault into Israel on Oct 7, in which the militants killed about 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and abducted around 250.

Emhoff says he's 'gutted' after hostage killings in Gaza

Washington (AP): Doug Emhoff, the husband of Vice President Kamala Harris — and the first Jewish person married to a nationally elected US leader — said he is "gutted" after the killing of American Hersh Goldberg-Polin and five other Israeli hostages taken by Hamas.
Speaking Tuesday at a vigil for the hostages at his synagogue in Washington, Emhoff said, "I haven't been able to stop thinking about Hersh and his parents, or about the five others and their families." He added: "This is hard. I feel raw. I'm gutted." Emhoff, who stands to become the nation's "first gentleman" if Harris is elected pres-

ident in November, has emerged as a prominent administration liaison to the Jewish community and a voice in countering antisemitism, particularly in the wake of Hamas' October 7 attack on Israel. About 1,200 people, including at least 40 Americans, were killed in the assault, and about 250 more were taken hostage. "How you feel right now is how I feel," Emhoff said at the event at the Adas Israel Congregation organised by local and national Jewish groups. "And how we all feel is something Kamala hears directly from me."
He added: "Hersh's loss feels personal to the two of us. We're both grieving." Emhoff recounted

his and Harris' conversation with Goldberg-Polin's parents on Sunday, a day after Israeli forces discovered their bodies in a tunnel under Gaza. He said that even while mourning the loss of their son, Rachel Goldberg-Polin and Jonathan Polin were pressing Harris about the latest on the negotiations to reach a cease-fire deal that would free other hostages. "Part of Rachel and Jon's world had just ended, and they somehow are still looking forward and looking out for others," Emhoff said. He continued: "Jon and Rachel's hearts have room to hold everyone. They are not giving up, and neither can we. Not on this 333rd day. Not ever. Not

until every hostage is reunited with their family." Emhoff added that Harris and President Joe Biden are working "around the clock to get a hostage and cease-fire deal done." He said, "The time to bring them home is now." Goldberg-Polin and Polin spoke at last month's Democratic National Convention in Chicago as part of their family's global tour to raise awareness about the hostages and their plight. Emhoff said they understood "that unless we tell the story again and again, we have no hope of never again," and said the Jewish community must continue to tell the stories of the hostages.

'Boko Haram militants kill over 100 in Nigerian village'

At least 100 villagers were killed in northeastern Nigeria when suspected Boko Haram Islamic extremists opened fire on a market, on worshippers and in people's homes, residents said Wednesday, the latest killings in Africa's longest struggle with militancy.
More than 50 extremists on

motorcycles rode into the Tarmuwa council area of Yobe state on Sunday evening and began firing before setting buildings ablaze, according to Yobe police spokesperson Dungus Abdulkarim. The police blamed the attack on Boko Haram, which since 2009 has launched an insurgency to establish its radical interpretation of Islamic law, or Sharia, in the region. Boko Haram has

since splintered into different factions, together accounting for the direct deaths of at least 35,000 people and the displacement of more than 2 million, as well as a humanitarian crisis with millions of people in dire need of foreign aid. At least 1,500 people have so far been killed in the region this year in attacks by armed groups, according to the US-based Armed Conflict Location

& Event Data Project, or ACLED. Yobe Deputy Gov. Idi Barde Gubana gave a much lower death toll of 34 from Sunday's attack. Contradictory statistics are a common trend in the security crisis, with the death toll from survivors' count often higher than the official figure. The 34 dead cited by the deputy governor were the ones buried in a single village, said a community leader.

EU chief pushes for gender parity

AP ■ BRUSSELS
European Union chief Ursula von der Leyen said Wednesday she is doubling down and pushing full steam ahead to achieve gender parity in her executive Commission team that runs the day-to-day affairs of the massive bloc — despite stubborn resistance from some of the 27 member states. The German, who is setting up the college for her second five-year mandate, may be beholden to the candidates that each member state chooses to provide.
But she has been twisting arms in capitals to make sure that the original tally of 21 men and 6 women changes to at least a semblance of balance. In her first term, she achieved near gender parity among EU commissioners. "I have throughout my whole political life been fighting for women having access to decision-making positions and leading positions," von der Leyen told reporters. "My experience is that if you don't ask for it, you don't get it. It does not come naturally."
She sent the member states a letter insisting she should have a choice between at least one man and a woman, giving her some leverage though legally she has no right to insist on such a gender constraint.
Without the letter, she said she would have faced a fait accompli of having the most lopsided male-dominated Commission in over two decades. Now, at least she is continuing the fight.
"It is absolutely worth it. The process is ongoing. By now we are at two digits — women — but I haven't seen all potential candidates, she said. When it

comes to gender issues, the 27-nation EU is often seen as perhaps the most progressive grouping of countries in the world, leaving behind other nations and continents where the dominance of men in political institutions is still the order of the day.
She acknowledged that government leaders are often restricted in their choice by national politics giving one party the right one year, and another the next time. If not governments, parliaments can also get involved — making life even more difficult.
And quality is equally important, she said. "The Commission needs competence," she said, calling it "the first and most important criterion."
So far though, the EU will have several women — there is the president of the European Parliament, Roberta Metsola of Malta, and foreign policy chief Kaja Kallas from Estonia, along with von der Leyen's top posting. Once von der Leyen completes the mix and match of political group, nation and post, the full list goes to the European Parliament for approval. Each prospective commissioner can still be rejected by lawmakers. There is no set date for when a vote will happen, but debate will continue for most of September.



Ukraine's Foreign Minister Kuleba resigns

Foreign Minister Dmytro Kuleba, one of Ukraine's most recognisable faces on the international stage, submitted his resignation Wednesday ahead of an expected major government reshuffle. Russian strikes, meanwhile, killed seven people in a western Ukraine city, a day after one of the deadliest missile attacks since the war began. Kuleba, 43, didn't give a reason for stepping down. His resignation will be discussed by lawmakers at their next session, parliamentary Speaker Ruslan Stefanchuk said on his Facebook page. Four other Cabinet ministers tendered their resignations late Tuesday, making the Cabinet reshuffle likely the biggest since Russia's February 2022 invasion. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy indicat-

ed last week that a reshuffle was imminent, with the war poised to enter a critical stage and as its 1,000-day mark looms in November.

Zelenskyy needs to keep up Ukraine's morale amid the grinding war of attrition with its bigger neighbour and steel the country's resolve for what will be another hard winter. Russia has been smashing Ukraine's power grid, knocking out some 70% of generation capacity and rupturing heat and water supplies. And Wednesday's deadly attack on Lviv — a city near the border with NATO member Poland and far from the front lines — underscored how all of Ukraine is at the mercy of Moscow's long-range capabilities. The Ukrainian army's risky incursion almost a month ago into Russia's Kursk border region raised Ukrainian spirits and

countered months of grim news from the front line in eastern Ukraine. The incursion's ultimate goals are unclear, though Zelenskyy says Ukraine wants to create a buffer zone there that would prevent cross-border Russian attacks. Russian President Vladimir Putin remains bent on pushing his army deeper into eastern Ukraine, meanwhile. Russia's onslaught in Donetsk, where Ukraine is short of troops and air defences, and long-range missile strikes that repeatedly hit civilian areas of Ukraine signal that Putin will remain uncompromising and unrelenting in his efforts to crush Ukrainian resistance. The Institute for the Study of War, a Washington think tank, said late Tuesday that Putin believes Russia "can slowly and indefinitely subsume Ukraine through grinding advances and



That Russia can achieve its goals through a war of attrition against Ukrainian forces and by outlasting Western support for Kyiv, Zelenskyy is also keeping in mind the US presidential election in November, which could bring a shift in key

US military support for his country. During the war Kuleba has been second only to Zelenskyy in carrying Ukraine's message and needs to an international audience, whether through social media posts or meetings with foreign dignitaries. In July, Kuleba became the highest-ranking Ukrainian official to visit China since Russia's invasion. He has been foreign minister since March 2020. Kuleba's successor is not yet known but is expected to be announced on Thursday. Several Ukrainian media outlets, citing unnamed sources, said Kuleba's deputy, Andrii Sybiha, would become the country's chief diplomat.

The new foreign minister will likely accompany Zelenskyy to the UN General Assembly in New York next week, which is an opportunity to lobby global leaders for

their support. More than half the current Cabinet will undergo changes, said Davyd Arakhamia, a leader of Zelenskyy's party in the Ukrainian parliament. Ministers will be resigning on Wednesday and new appointments will be made Thursday, he said. Zelenskyy's five-year mandate expired in May. He remains in power under the provisions of martial law. Meantime, the nighttime strike on Lviv injured 52 people as well as killing seven, Ukraine's Rescue Service said. The strike was carried out with a Kinzhal missile and drones and targeted defence industry enterprises, Russian news agency Tass said, citing the Russian Defence Ministry. Local officials disputed the targeting claim. Lviv Mayor Andrii Sadoviy and the Ukrainian Catholic University published a photo of a family

whose mother and three daughters were killed in the attack that struck their home. The father survived but was in critical condition, Sadoviy said. The eldest daughter, 21-year-old Yaryna, was a programme manager at the European Youth Forum, a platform of the continent's youth organisations, her colleagues wrote on Facebook. "We will neither forget nor forgive" the attack, they said in the post.

Another Russian attack injured five people in Kryvyi Rih, Zelenskyy's hometown, regional head Serhiy Lysak said. Kuleba said the Lviv and Kryvyi Rih attacks showed Ukraine's need for more Western support. "To put an end to this terror, Ukraine's partners must promptly deliver the promised air defense systems and ammunition, as well as strengthen Ukraine's defence capabilities

and allow us to launch long-range strikes on all legitimate military targets in Russia," he wrote on X. Zelenskyy reacted to the attacks by urging Ukraine's allies to give Kyiv "more range" to use Western weapons to strike deeper into Russian territory. The attack happened a day after two ballistic missiles blasted a military academy and nearby hospital in Poltava in eastern-central Ukraine, killing 53 people and wounding almost 300 others, Ukrainian officials said. The missiles tore into the heart of the Poltava Military Institute of Communications's main building, causing several stories to collapse. Poltava is about 350 km (200 miles) southeast of Kyiv, on the main highway and rail route between Kyiv and Ukraine's second-largest city, Kharkiv, which is close to the Russian border.

Serbia is a Russian ally and will sneer impose sanctions against Moscow or join NATO, the Balkan nation's deputy prime minister said Wednesday as he met with Russian President Vladimir Putin.



down for talks. Putin expressed hope that Serbia's deputy prime minister will be able to "take a close look and evaluate the possibilities of cooperation with such a large and promising region" as Russia's far east.

The remarks by Aleksandar Vulin, a former intelligence chief who is under US sanctions, reflect persistent close relations between Belgrade and Moscow despite Serbia's proclaimed bid to join the European Union. "It's a great honour for me to have the privilege to talk to you," Vulin told Putin. "Please believe me when I say it is a great encouragement for all Serbs, wherever they may live."

Serbia has refused to join Western sanctions against Russia over the war in Ukraine though it has condemned Moscow's aggression. Populist President Aleksandar Vucic has said that imposing the sanctions wasn't in Serbia's national interest. "Serbia is not only a strategic partner of Russia, Serbia is also Russia's ally," Vulin said. "This is why pressure on us by the West is huge." Vulin's meeting with Putin in Russia's far-eastern city of Vladivostok came just days after French President Emmanuel Macron visited Serbia when Belgrade signed an agreement to buy French Rafale fighter jets, a move that was seen as possible a shift away from Moscow. German Chancellor Olaf Scholz earlier also visited Belgrade for the signing of a tentative EU deal with Serbia on raw materials needed in green transition. The two met in Vladivostok on the sidelines of an economic forum designed to attract foreign investment and showcase Russia to them. Greeting Vulin as the two sat

down for talks, Putin expressed hope that Serbia's deputy prime minister will be able to "take a close look and evaluate the possibilities of cooperation with such a large and promising region" as Russia's far east. Vulin told Putin that Serbia's close ties with Russia will continue in the future. "Serbia led by Aleksandar Vucic is a Serbia that will never become a member of NATO, which will never impose sanctions against the Russian Federation and which will never allow its territory to be used for any anti-Russian actions," he said. "Serbia has not become and will not become part of anti-Russian hysteria," Vulin said. The US imposed sanctions on Vulin last July, accusing him of involvement in illegal arms shipments, drug trafficking and misuse of public office and aiding Russia's influence in the volatile Balkans. Vulin has received two medals of honour from Russia. The US sanctions against individuals and companies in the Balkans are designed to counter attempts to undermine peace and stability in the volatile region and Russia's "malign" influence. The West has stepped up efforts to lure the troubled region into its fold, fearing that Russia could stir unrest to avert attention from the war in Ukraine. The Balkans went through multiple wars in the 1990s, and tensions still persist.

Four Indians burnt alive in Texas road accident

Houston (PTI): Four Indian nationals, including a woman, lost their lives and several others were injured in a tragic multi-vehicle road accident in the US state of Texas during the Labour Day weekend. According to the Collin County Sheriff's Office, the accident involving five vehicles occurred on the northbound US 75 just past White Street at Anna near Dallas. Consul General of India in Houston D C Manjunath confirmed the identities and shared that the Consulate General of India (CGI) is in touch with the families and community organisations, providing full support during

this tragic moment. According to witnesses and preliminary reports, traffic was at a standstill on the highway and an SUV was among those vehicles that were halted when the accident took place on Friday afternoon. A truck travelling at a high speed failed to slow down and struck the rear of the SUV. The force of the collision was

such that the SUV caught fire and the four occupants were trapped inside which resulted in their deaths. It took days to officially identify the victims as the bodies were charred beyond recognition. Several others sustained non-life-threatening injuries though the exact number remains unclear. The victims were identified as Aryan Raghunath Orampatti from Kukatpally suburb of

Hyderabad, his friend Farooq Sheikh, Lokesh Palacharla, another Telugu student, and Darshini Vasudev from Tamil Nadu. Orampatti and Sheikh were returning after visiting a cousin

in Dallas while Palacharla was heading to Bentonville to reunite with his wife. Darshini Vasudev, a postgraduate from the University of Texas, was on her way to visit her uncle in Arkansas.

Pope urges Indonesia to fight extremism

AP ■ JAKARTA

Pope Francis urged Indonesia to live up to its promise of "harmony in diversity" and fight religious intolerance on Wednesday, as he set a rigorous pace for an 11-day, four-nation trip through tropical Southeast Asia and Oceania that will test his stamina and health. Despite the gruelling itinerary, an energetic Francis joked and laughed his way through a packed first full day in Indonesia, meeting with outgoing President Joko Widodo and other Indonesian officials at the presidential palace and then greeting Catholic priests, nuns and seminarians at Jakarta's main cathedral in the afternoon.

Cannons boomed as Francis joined Widodo on the veranda of the palace along with President-elect Prabowo Subianto. A marching band, stiff-legged troops and children in traditional Indonesian dress welcomed the first pope to visit in 35 years.

In his remarks to officials, Francis compared Indonesia's human diversity to the archipelago's 17,000 islands. He said each one contributes something specific to form "a magnificent mosaic, in which each tile is an irreplaceable element in creating a great and original and precious work".

And yet, Francis warned that such diversity in a country with the world's largest Muslim population can also become a source of conflict — an apparent reference to episodes of intolerance that have flared in recent years in Indonesia as well as a broader concern about conflicts raging around the world.

Sensex, Nifty tumble on global downturn

Stock markets closed lower on Wednesday with Nifty taking a breather after a 14-day winning run and Sensex dropping by 202 points due to weak global trends on worries of potential slowdown in the US market.

The 30-share BSE Sensex dropped 202.80 points or 0.25 per cent to settle at 82,352.64. During the day, it tumbled 721.75 points or 0.87 per cent to 81,833.69.

Snapping its 14-day rally, the NSE Nifty declined 81.15 points or 0.32 per cent to 25,198.70. Intra-day, it tanked 196.05 points or 0.77 per cent to 25,083.80.

Nifty has surged nearly 1,141 points or 4.59 per cent in 14 straight days.

Among the 30 Sensex firms, ICICI Bank, State Bank of India, Axis Bank, Mahindra &



Mahindra, Infosys, Larsen & Toubro, Tata Steel, Tata Consultancy Services, Bajaj Finance and Adani Ports were the major laggards.

Asian Paints, Hindustan Unilever, UltraTech Cement, Sun Pharma and Reliance Industries were among the

gainers.

In Asian markets, Seoul, Tokyo, Shanghai, and Hong Kong ended sharply lower. European markets were also trading in the red.

The US markets ended significantly lower on Tuesday.

“The warning signals from weak US manufacturing data added concerns about a potential slowdown in the US economy, which dragged the domestic indices.

Due to a lack of major domestic triggers, the indices will take direction based on global cues,” said Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) bought equities worth Rs 1,029.25 crore on Tuesday, according to exchange data.

Rupee falls four paise against US dollar

The rupee fell 4 paise to close at 84.02 (provisional) on Wednesday amid a sharp decline in the domestic equity markets as investors stayed away from riskier assets.

However, a weak dollar against major currencies overseas and a drop in crude oil prices capped further losses in the local unit, forex traders said.

At the interbank foreign exchange market, the rupee opened at 83.96 and traded in the range of 83.95-84.01 during the day.

The unit moved in a tight range of 83.95-83.97 for most part of the session. However, it slipped at the fag-end of the trading hours to settle at 84.02 (provisional), 4 paise below its previous close of 83.98.

“Weak domestic markets and risk aversion in the global

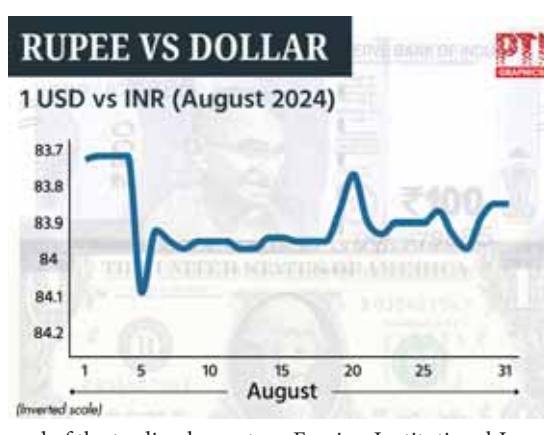
markets pressurised the rupee. However, a decline in crude oil prices and FII inflows cushioned the downside. India's services PMI expanded to 60.9 in August vs forecast of 60.4 and a reading of 60.3 in July,” Anuj Choudhary - Research Analyst at Sharekhan by BNP Paribas, said.

At the domestic equity markets, Sensex dropped 202.80 points to settle at 82,352.64, while Nifty slipped 81.15 points to 25,198.70.

The dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was down 0.17 per cent to 101.65.

Brent crude, the international oil benchmark, declined 0.46 per cent to 73.41 in futures trade.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) were net buyers in the capital markets on Tuesday, as they purchased shares worth Rs 1,029.25 crore, according to exchange data.



Interest equalisation scheme for exporters extended for another month

The government has extended the interest equalisation scheme on pre- and post-shipment rupee export credit for one more month till September 30 to promote the country's outbound shipments.

The scheme, which provides exporters interest benefits, ended on August 31. In June, it was extended for two months.

In a trade notice, the Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) said, “Trade and industry is hereby informed that the Interest Equalization Scheme for Pre and Post Shipment Rupee Export Credit, which had

earlier been extended up to August 31 as a fund limited scheme, has been further extended for one month i.e., up to September 30, 2024.”

It said, however, this extension is applicable only for MSME manufacturing exporters.

On December 8, 2023, the Union Cabinet approved an additional allocation of Rs 2,500 crore for the continuation of the scheme up to June 30.

The scheme helps exporters from identified sectors and all MSME manufacturer exporters to avail of rupee export credit at competitive rates at a time when the global economy is facing headwinds. Exporters get subsidies under

“The government is strongly pushing the idea of India manufacturing its own planes,” Naidu said, adding that a special purpose vehicle will be set up with industry stakeholders and others.

Speaking at a conference organised by industry body PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Naidu also said there is a lot of potential in the country for MRO (maintenance, overhaul and repair) activities.

India targets 1 billion dollar liquor exports

With the global demand for Indian spirits growing at a healthy rate, the government is planning to promote both Indian alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages in the international markets and is eyeing USD one billion (about Rs 8,000 crore) exports in the next few years.

The commerce ministry's arm APEDA (Agricultural & Processed Food Products Export Development Authority) said that India currently ranks 40th in the world for alcoholic beverage exports. As per estimates, the country has huge unrealised export potential.

The authority, as part of the 'Make in India' initiative, has been targeting to increase exports of Indian spirits to major foreign destinations.

“It is potentially eyeing USD 1 billion in export revenue over the next few years,” it said in a statement on Wednesday.

The country's alcoholic beverages exports stood at over Rs 2,200 crore in 2023-24. The major destinations include UAE, Singapore, Netherlands, Tanzania, Angola, Kenya and Rwanda.

APEDA also said that Diageo India (United Spirits Ltd.) is set to launch ‘Godawan’, in



the United Kingdom. It is a single-malt whiskey made in Rajasthan.

Commenting on the USD one billion target, Vinod Giri, Director General, the Brewers Association of India said that huge potential is there in the different countries for Indian products.

“While the single-malt will play a greater role in making India's reputation as a high-quality whiskey producer, the volumes will come from beverages which are more palatable taste-wise and price-wise such as premium Indian whiskeys and premium rum,” he said.

Price-wise Giri added that huge export potential is there in the US, Africa and Europe. He suggested the government to urge states to include the element of export promotion in state excise policies.

PANT IN FOCUS ON RED BALL RETURN; SELECTORS EYE BACKUP OPTIONS

Rishabh Pant's red-ball return will be closely monitored but the national selectors will also trace suitable backup options to frontline stars when Duleep Trophy, which precludes an important Test season, begins across Bengaluru and Anantapur on Thursday.

Pant, who returned to white-ball formats after that horrific car crash, is yet to play in a longer-duration match. His last red-ball outing was against Bangladesh in December 2022. Now, he will turn out for Abhimanyu Easwaran-led Team B against Shubman Gill-captained Team A at the Chinnaswamy Stadium.

Satisfying his outings in the shorter versions were, but this four-day tournament offers him a unique challenge - batting and "keeping for an undefined number of overs. Pant is the designated stumper in Team B, and it is evident that the Ajit Agarkar-led selection panel is intending to take a deep look into his role as the wicketkeeper-batter in a season that will culminate with the World Test Championship Final at the Lord's next June. But that is just one piece of the puzzle as other worthy

contenders are there for the wicketkeeper-batter's slot. The front-runner is Dhruv Jurel (Team A), who was impressive in his debut series against England earlier this year.

Then there's Ishan Kishan, who will play for Team D which is marshalled by Shreyas Iyer at Anantapur.

Kishan, though a long shot, will be eager to use Duleep Trophy as a platform to stake his claim for an India return after an unsavoury train of incidents saw him losing the BCCI central contract in the current cycle.

The return of veterans Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma for the Bangladesh series will gobble up two batting slots along with Gill at No. 3.

Hence, there will be a jostle between KL Rahul, Shreyas Iyer, Sarfaraz Khan, who impressed all with an excellent Test debut against England, for settling into the available middle-order space.

It's imperative for Rahul, who is in Team A as a pure batter, and Shreyas to come good in Duleep Trophy as they missed a large chunk of the home matches against England - the former with an injury and the latter was dropped after the second Test at Visakhapatnam.



BOWLING BACK-UP: India have been well-served by the troika of Jasprit Bumrah, Mohammed Siraj and Mohammed Shami in Tests for a while now, but it's unwise to enter a long Test season without sufficient alternates. More so because Siraj will miss the first round of Duleep

Trophy with an illness and Shami, whose last competitive outing was the 2023 50-over World Cup final, is still recuperating after a surgery. The selectors will keep a close eye on Bengal duos of Mukesh Kumar and Akash Deep, both of whom had bright initiations into traditional format, along

with Arshdeep Singh, Avesh Khan, Khaleel Ahmed, Vidwath Kaverappa, Vysakh Vijayakumar and Harshit Rana. While the pace department needs some urgent solutions, the spin has a slightly different landscape.

Ravindra Jadeja, who was released from Team B, Kuldeep Yadav and Axar Patel form a formidable Indian spin unit. While there is no pressing demand for the support cast, the selectors would like to be ready with instant supply in case of an eventuality.

In that context, spinners such as Washington Sundar, also a capable batter, R Sai Kishore, top wicket-taker in the previous Ranji season with 53 scalps, Manav Suthar and Saurabh Kumar will be hoping to be in the range of the five wisemen's radar.

DARK HORSES: There is a litany of fringe players who would want to give a further fillip to their career after showcasing talent at various levels.

Karnataka's Devdutt Padikkal had a roaring Ranji season in 2023-24, which earned him a Test debut against England at Dharamsala.

Baba Indrajith of Tamil Nadu is a consistent domestic performer and he once again underlined his prowess making 767 runs in the last Ranji season, and Musheer Khan, younger brother of Sarfaraz, smoothly graduated to First-Class cricket for Mumbai after blazing the Under-19 circuit.

B Sai Sudharsan of Tamil Nadu, who made white ball debut for India, too has given an early indication of his readiness for red-ball cricket with a hundred for Surrey in English county cricket. He will play for Team C under Rituraj Gaikwad.

I've worked on my defence against spinners: Gill eyes improvement in Test performance

Shubman Gill understands that his Test career has not touched the expected peaks yet, but the right-hander is banking on an improved defence against spinners to make a mark in the upcoming season that will feature 10 traditional format matches.

Gill made close to 500 runs in the home series against England this year in, perhaps, his best sustained outing in Test cricket so far, and now he wants to build on that from the two-match series against Bangladesh, starting from September 19, where he will be challenged by a set of experienced visiting spinners.

"I worked on my defence a little bit more against spinners. You should be able to defend a lot more when you are playing on a turning track against spinners, then you can play the scoring shots," Gill, who will lead Team A in the Duleep Trophy, said here on Wednesday.

"With more T20s being played...I won't say on flat tracks but on batting-friendly tracks, I think it takes away a little bit of your defensive game. So, that was my focus in the England series," he added.

Unlike in white ball formats where Gill is a storm force, the 24-year-old is yet to blaze the Test arena, and he hoped for a turnaround sooner than later.

"In Test cricket, my performance has not matched my expectations so far. But we are going to play 10 Test matches this season, and when I look back after those 10 Tests, hopefully, my expectations will be matched," he said. Gill also emphasised on his growing maturity as a person and cricketer, which he directly linked to the captaincy stints of India and in the IPL with the Gujarat Titans.

"Every match or tournament that you play, you look to learn more about yourself irrespective of whether you are captain or not the captain. More so because of the captain you will get to know about other players too. It's important for the captain to have a connect with the players.

"You should know their strength and weaknesses. Yeah, there are some changes in me especially when you are captain or vice-captain and having those conversations," he elaborated.

But does being a part of the

leadership group add an extra layer of pressure on him? "Not really extra pressure (being part of the leadership group). My role as a batsman does not really change, even if I am the captain or vice-captain. It's all about scoring runs for the team," he said.

In that context, Gill termed the Duleep Trophy, beginning here and at Anantapur from Thursday, as a fine opportunity to tune himself to the demands of red ball cricket.

"This (Duleep Trophy) is a big tournament as every match is important for us. We are playing against some players whom we generally play with in the Indian team. So, we will get to see a good competition," he noted.

Gill, who is set to open against Team B here, also said there have been some early talks between players and management about workload allocation considering the long duration of the season.

"There is definitely talk among the selectors and players about the workload. But I think everyone has played a lot of cricket to be able to understand what they need to do when they are playing the match, more so for the bowlers I would say. "I am sure the bowlers had a conversation with the selectors about how they are going to manage their workload," he said.

Meanwhile, Gill confirmed that India pacer Prasidh Krishna will not be available for the first round of the Duleep Trophy.

"Prasidh Krishna is not ready for this match," he said. The Karnataka pacer has been recuperating from surgery that he had in February this year and did not play in the recently concluded KSCA Maharaja Trophy T20 despite being roped in by eventual champions Mysuru Warriors.

Pakistan drop to 8th in Test rankings following loss to Bangladesh

Pakistan's first-ever series loss to Bangladesh has resulted in Shan Masood's team slipping down to the eighth position in the ICC Test rankings besides hitting a historic low of lowest rating points since 1965.

Pakistan were thrashed by 10 wickets in the first Test while the hosts lost the second by six wickets with Rawalpindi hosting both the matches.

"Pakistan dropped two places in the ICC Men's Test Team Rankings to go to eighth position after suffering a shock series loss at home to Bangladesh," the ICC said on its website.

"The hosts were sixth in the rankings table before the series, but back-to-back losses



have seen them drop below West Indies to eighth with 76 rating points.

"This is the lowest rating points Pakistan have had in the Test rankings table since 1965, barring a brief period where they did not have a place in the rankings due to an

insufficient number of matches." Bangladesh's chase in the second Test of 185 was also the third highest successful chase in Pakistan for any visiting side, but there was a little in terms of promotion for the 'Tigers'.

Bangladesh remained in ninth position and behind Pakistan despite gaining 13 rating points.

However, the 2-0 series win has bolstered Bangladesh in the points table for the World Test Championship cycle 2023-25 as they are now placed fourth behind table-toppers India, Australia at second and New Zealand at third.

Bangladesh, who will now focus their attention on a two-Test series against India starting in Chennai on September 19, have 45.83 percentage points and 33 points with three wins and as many defeats in six Tests.

In WTC, teams get 12 points for a Test win, four for a draw and six for a tie while being ranked according to percentage of points won.



Rahul Dravid set to be appointed Rajasthan Royals head coach for IPL 2025

Rahul Dravid, who masterminded India's T20 World Cup 2024 triumph, is set to take over Rajasthan Royals' head coach role in the IPL 2025.

Dravid, who is currently on a short career-break since India's victory at Barbados in June, will soon start working with the franchise on important issues such as player retention ahead of the auction later this year.

"The talks have reached the final stages and he will soon step into the head coach job," a source close to the development told PTI.

Kumar Sangakkara, who has been Royals' Director of Cricket since 2021, will continue in his role and is likely to be more hands-on with Barbados Royals (CPL) and Paarl Royals (SA20).

Dravid has a long-standing association with Royals as their captain for two seasons in 2012 and 2013 before serving as mentor for two more years.

Dravid then moved to Delhi Capitals in a similar role in 2016 and continued with the team till he assumed the role of the head of National Cricket Academy in Bengaluru.

In 2021, he moved on from NCA to take up India's head coach role from Ravi Shastri.

Now at Royals, Dravid will reunite with Sanju Samson, who is all set to be retained as RR captain for another season. Samson blossomed first under the 52-year-old.

As a crucial qualification event for the World Table Tennis Championships and the Asian Games, the Asian Championships hold significant importance for the Indian team.
