Delhi deluged as incessant rains bring Delhi-NCR to a grinding halt

Incessant rain on Thursday brought the national Capital and adjoining areas including Noida, Ghaziabad and Gurugram to a screeching halt with severe water logging, potholes and breakdown of buses witnessed in several parts of the city amid the India Meteorological Department issuing an orange alert for the city. An orange alert denotes heavy rainfall and also potential disruptions to rail, road and air transport. This is the second consecutive day when the commuters and daily office goers were stuck in traffic jams and waterlogging in the Capital city. Besides torrential downpours since late night, the breakdown of buses on

major roads led to traffic jams during the morning and evening peak hours.

The ongoing metro construction works have also worsened the situation including disruptions in the Khanpur area. Traffic around Lutyens' Delhi was affected due to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the second Asia-Pacific Ministerial Conference on Civil Aviation in Pragati Maidan.

Some of the Resident Welfare Associations (RWAs) had to issue caution to the locals to be alert while moving out from the colonies. With the traffic situation becoming a regular menace, the Sainik Farms Welfare Association in south Delhi took to its social media groups to issue alerts and updates particularly the disruption due to metro work and rains in the area that has

disrupted the resident's daily lives. According to the MET department, in the past 24 hours till 8 am on Thursday,

city's primary weather station Safdarjung received 16 mm of rainfall, Ayanagar 15.7 mm of rainfall, Delhi University five mm of rainfall, Lodi road

16 mm of rainfall, Narela 1.5 mm of rainfall, Palam nine mm of rainfall, Ridge 11 mm of rainfall, Pitampura 13 mm of rainfall and Mayur Vihar's

Salwan Public School 13 mm of rainfall. Parts of Delhi-NCR, including India Gate, Janpath Road, R K Puram,

Kalindikunj, Gazipur, Indirapuram, Laxmi Nagar, Dwarka, Connaught Place, Noida, Safdarjung, Uttam Nagar, East of Kailash and Rohini witnessed light to moderate showers. Moti Nagar flyover, which was inaugurated in March this year by Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, was waterlogged along with the potholes in several places. Public Works Department (PWD) pumps were also not working, irking commuters who were caught in major jams. Mundka, Dhaura Kuan, Moti Bagh, Mehrauli-Badarpur road, Lajpat Nagar, Karol Bagh, Punjabi Bagh, Khanpur, ITO, Jahangirpuri, Safdarjung, Kashmere Gate ISBT and Okhla Estate among other areas were flooded after the showers causing slow traffic movement with

vehicles wading through knee deep water. Taking to social media platforms, Delhi police said that traffic was affected on Old Pankha Road in the carriageway from T point Uttam Nagar East Metro Station towards Pankha Road due to a large pothole on the Road. "Traffic is affected on GTK Road on both the carriageway from Mukarba Chowk towards Azadpur chowk and vice versa due to water logging near GTK Depot," Delhi Traffic Police wrote in a post on X. In another post, they said that traffic is affected on MB Road in the carriageway from Khanpur T Point towards Mehrauli and vice versa due to potholes and waterlogging. Similarly, potholes and waterlogging caused traffic jams on Rohtak Road.

SC verdict on Kejriwal bail plea today

The Supreme Court will deliver its verdict today on the plea filed by Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) convener and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal seeking bail and quashing of arrest by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in the Delhi Excise Policy case. As per the cause list of September 13 uploaded on the apex court website, a bench headed by Justice Surya Kant is slated to pronounce the verdict. The bench, also comprising Justice Ujjal Bhuyan, had on September 5 reserved its verdict on the pleas. Kejriwal has filed two separate petitions challenging the denial of bail and against his arrest by the CBI in the corruption case filed by the central agency. Kejriwal was arrested by the CBI on June 26. Manish Sisodia, K Kavitha, Vijay Nair and several other accused in the excise policy scam case have been given bail by the courts.



AAP Rajya Sabha MP Raghav Chadha said they are "hopeful" and are waiting for the Supreme Court's decision on Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's bail. "We are very hopeful. We are waiting for tomorrow," Chadha told reporters. AAP convener has challenged in the apex court the Delhi High Court's August 5 order which upheld his arrest in the corruption case. Kejriwal contended that his arrest was a strategic move. Senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi argued that the arrest, which followed Kejriwal's bail in a related money laundering case, was unexpected after nearly two years without action from the CBI. The high court had noted that the loop of evidence against Kejriwal was closed after the collection of relevant evidence following his arrest by the CBI and it cannot be said that it was without any justifiable reason or illegal. The high court had also granted him the liberty to approach a trial court with his plea seeking bail in the case. The matter relates to alleged corruption in the formulation and execution of the Delhi government's excise policy for 2021-22, which has now been scrapped.

PM at CJI's residence; BJP plays defensive

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the residence of Chief Justice of India (CJI) DY Chandrachud on Wednesday to attend 'Ganapati Puja' celebration has sparked a controversy with senior Supreme Court judges and some opposition leaders expressing concern over the event, the BJP and its ally hit out at the opposition parties on Thursday, calling their reactions "reckless" and said casting "baseless aspersions" on the highest court sets a dangerous precedent. The BJP reminded the Congress of the time when in 2009, former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh invited then CJI, KG Balakrishnan, to attend an Iftaar party.

The video of Narendra Modi attending the Puja celebration alongside the CJI and his wife Kalpana Das has gone viral. In a video, Chandrachud and his wife Kalpana Das were seen welcoming Modi at their house. In a post on X, PM Modi shared his experience stating, "May Bhagwan Shri Ganesh bless us all with happiness, prosperity, and wonderful health". Addressing a press conference at the BJP headquarters here, Lok Sabha MP and national spokesperson Sambit Patra hit back at the opposition and asked if the then Chief Justice of India (CJI) did not attend the Iftaar party hosted by then Prime Minister Manmohan Singh. "They do not have any objection to the prime minister meeting the chief justice of India but Ganpati

Puja," he said and accused the Opposition leaders of indulging in politics. "I am surprised that if the prime minister meets the chief justice of India, you raise an objection. But when he (Rahul Gandhi) meets (US lawmaker) Illhan Omar, who is with Pok, in America, you have no objection," Patra added. Sharing pictures of Singh in a candid laugh with Balakrishnan, BJP leader Shehzad Poonawalla, in an X post, wrote, "Judiciary is safe". "PM Modi attends Ganesh Puja at current CJI House - oh God Judiciary compromised," Poonawalla mocked the Congress in his post. "Ganpati Utsav is being celebrated and people visit each other's house... I don't have information whether the Prime Minister has visited

anyone's house," Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut said.

Ganpati Utsav is being celebrated at several locations in Delhi and Maharashtra Sadan, he said. "However, the Prime Minister visited the CJI's residence. They performed 'arti' together. We think that people will have doubts if guardians of the Constitution meet political leaders," Raut added.

In a post on X, senior lawyer Indira Jaising said the Chief Justice of India has compromised the separation of powers between the executive and the judiciary. "Lost all confidence in the independence of the CJI. The SCBA (Supreme Court Bar Association) must condemn this publicly displayed compromise of Independence of the CJI from the executive," she said in her post. Shiv Sena Rajya Sabha MP Milind Deora also flayed the critics and said it's unfortunate to see "reckless commentary" on Prime Minister Modi's visit to the CJI's residence for Ganapati Aarti.

"When verdicts favour them, the opposition praises the Supreme Court's credibility, but when things don't go their way, they conveniently claim the judiciary is compromised," he charged in a post on X.

Casting such baseless aspersions on the highest court sets a dangerous precedent, he added. "This reckless attempt to undermine the credibility of the CJI by the opposition is not only irresponsible but also damaging to the institution's integrity. India's politics is taking an ugly turn," Deora said.

Militarisation of frontier a big issue with China, says EAM

With tension persisting at the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in eastern Ladakh for the last four years, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has said roughly 75 per cent of the "disengagement problems" with China are sorted out but the bigger issue has been the increasing militarisation of the frontier. His remarks came in the backdrop of China trying to alter the LAC in May 2020 in Ladakh leading to a violent clash between the two armies in Galwan valley on June 15. Twenty Indian army personnel including the commanding officer were killed in the fight and more than 40 Chinese soldiers also died. Elaborating upon the current situation regarding the lingering border row, Jaishankar also said the Galwan Valley clashes affected the "entirety" of India-China ties, asserting that one cannot have violence at the border and then say the rest of the relationship is insulated from it. He made these assertions during an interactive session at a think-tank in Geneva. The external affairs minister said negotiations between the two sides to find a

solution to the problem are underway. "Now those negotiations are going on. We made some progress. I would say roughly you can say about 75 per cent of the disengagement problems are sorted out," he said at the Geneva Centre for Security Policy. "We still have some things to do," Jaishankar said, responding to a question. But there is a bigger issue that both of us have brought forces close up and in that sense, there is a militarisation of the border, he said.

The external affairs minister indicated that the relationship can improve if there is a resolution to the row. "We hope that if there is a solution to the disengagement and there is a return to peace and tranquility, then we can look at other possibilities," Jaishankar said. The Indian and Chinese troops are locked in a standoff in certain friction points in eastern Ladakh even as the two sides completed disengagement from several areas following extensive diplomatic and military talks. India has been maintaining that its ties with China cannot be normal unless there is peace in the border areas.

Indian-origin Israeli soldier killed near West Bank

A 24-year-old Indian-origin Israeli soldier from the Bnei Menashe community was killed in a vehicle-ramming attack close to the West Bank's Beit El settlement, community members said on Thursday. Staff Sergeant Geri Gideon Hanghal was a resident of Nof HaGalil and a soldier in the Kfir Brigade's Nahshon Battalion, the Israeli Army said.



Community members told PTI that they were "in shock at the news of the loss of a young life" on Wednesday near Asaf Junction. Footage from the scene of the attack showed a truck with a Palestinian licence plate veering off a busy highway and barrel full speed into an Israel Defence Forces (IDF) guard post adjacent to a bus stop before coming to a halt. The suspect was named by Israeli security sources as 58-year-old Hayil Dhaifallah, from the central West Bank town of Rafat. Sergeant Hanghal's funeral will be held on Thursday, they said. Hanghal immigrated to Israel from the northeastern part of India in 2020. Some 300 Bnei Menashe youngsters are said to be doing Army duty during the current war, most of them serving in combat units. The Bnei Menashe, hailing from India's north-eastern states of Manipur and Mizoram, are believed to have descended from the Israelite tribe of Menasseh, one of the "lost tribes" of ancient times.

Veteran CPI(M) leader Sitaram Yechury breathes his last at AIIMS

The CPI (M) finds itself orphaned by the unexpected demise of 72-year-old Sitaram Yechury, the general secretary of the party. It is not going to be an easy task for the comrades to find a suitable replacement for Yechury, considered to be suave and quite accommodative in the Left parties. Even his rivals held him in esteem for his soft manners easy accessibility and approachability. The first time he was seen in an embarrassing situation was during the Press meeting convened by the CPI(M) immediately after the 2016 Assembly Election in Kerala. Yechury, with an anguished look, announced that Pinarayi Vijayan would be the Chief Minister of the State. Though it was widely

believed that V S Achuthanandan would be appointed as chief minister, the bigwigs in the party including the proprietor of a publishing house in Chennai had other ideas and they ensured the coronation of Vijayan. Yechury, who was highly critical of Vijayan's crony capitalist friends, wanted the mantle to be given to VS while others chose Vijayan. As a disciplined comrade, Yechury had no other option and he never forgot his crestfallen face during the presser. Though highly critical of the NDA Government at the Center, Yechury was open in private conversations about the good things done by the Vajpayee government (1998-2004). When India conducted a nuclear explosion at Pokhran in May 1998 there was an uproar in the USA,

Pakistan and China. The US even blacklisted India from dual technology deals and Indian scientists were denied permission to attend any international conferences on science and technology.

Yechury, who was then a politburo member visited Chennai to address a Press meeting. "Pakistan assembled and exploded a nuclear bomb in such a short time only because of India. There was no need for India to conduct an

experiment at this juncture," said Yechury. He was adamant in his stance that India was responsible for Pakistan going nuclear soon after India did it. After the Press meeting, this writer got the opportunity for a tete-a-tete with Yechury when he was asked how a country (Pakistan) could assemble a nuclear bomb within 10 days. A smiling Yechury quipped: "Yaar, these are all to score some brownie points. You just report what I told in the press meet." During his younger days, Yechury was the superstar of the CPI(M). He was at ease while dealing with political leaders including rivals which had earned him the reputation that "Sitaram is always at a different level". Even RSS leaders, the only pronounced enemies of the

CPI(M) held Sitaram Yechury in high regard. Yechury, hailing from Telangana remained a popular politician in Tamil Nadu. Yechury's major achievement is the research paper "Oil Pool Deficit or Cesspool of Deceit" published in 1997 in which he questioned the propriety of the government hiking petroleum prices regularly citing the oil pool deficit account. With his demise, what the CPI(M) has lost is the best bridge between the party and the intellectuals as well as the common man. Yechury surpassed all his predecessors in his dealings with the public through his man next door image. He was tasked with selling an outdated ideology to the new generation which was impossible in this era.

Wrestler Vinesh Phogat's entry as Congress candidate makes Jat dominated Julana a high-stakes seat

The Julana Assembly Constituency has drawn attention after the Congress fielded Olympian wrestler Vinesh Phogat from the Jat-dominated constituency. The wrestler-turned-politician is unlikely to have an easy path to victory here as the BJP has fielded Capt Yogesh Bairagi, a former commercial pilot as its candidate while wrestler Kavita Dalal is contesting on Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) ticket.

Indian National Lok Dal (INLD) has fielded former BJP leader Surender Singh Lather as its candidate while the Jannayak Janata Party (JJP) has fielded its sitting MLA Amarjeet Dhandha again from this constituency. In the last Assembly election, Dhandha had won the Julana seat by defeating BJP's candidate Parminder Singh Dhull by a margin of over 24,000 votes. Vinesh's entry as Congress candidate has made Julana a high-stakes seat.

As per the available reports, the constituency has around 1.85 lakh votes in which more than 40 percent belong to the Jat community. Secondly, the Brahmin, Scheduled Caste (SC) and backward community (BC) also have a significant presence.

The Julana seat, situated in the Jat-dominated Bangar region of the State, has long been controlled by parties like INLD and JJP, which have held the seat for

the past 15 years. Parminder Singh Dhull of the INLD won the seat in 2009 and 2014, while Amarjeet Dhandha of the JJP claimed it in 2019.

The constituency was thrust into the spotlight as soon as Vinesh Phogat was fielded by the Congress, just hours after she and fellow wrestler Bajrang Punia joined the party. The two wrestlers had been at the forefront of the protest against former BJP MP and Wrestling Federation of India chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh and Vinesh's popularity has seen a surge recently after she missed out on what would have been at least a silver medal at the Paris Olympics on being disqualified for exceeding the weight limit by 100 grams ahead of the final bout in the 50 kg freestyle wrestling event.

Vinesh, with her immense popularity as an international sports icon, is likely to face a tough challenge from BJP's candidate Capt Yogesh Bairagi, JJP's sitting MLA Amarjeet Dhandha, Dr Surender Lather, a BJP rebel who was nominated by INLD considering his mass connect in the constituency and AAP's candidate Kavita Dalal. With Dalal in the fight, the election in Julana will feature a unique contest - wrestler versus wrestler versus captain.

Dalal brings her own wrestling fame to the campaign, as she is the first Indian female wrestler to participate in WWE, garnering significant attention

and adding to the celebrity factor of the race. While Vinesh would seek votes as Julana's "bahu," Dalal would ask votes for being Julana's "beti". Similarly, JJP's sitting MLA Amarjeet Dhandha would also get significant votes and would be a direct threat to Vinesh's vote bank.

Dalal in the 2016 South Asian Games represented India in weightlifting and won a gold medal. She later transitioned to professional wrestling, and in WWE, she made a significant impact. Dalal showcased her strength to the world during the Mae Young Classic 2017 and received acclaim for her performance at WrestleMania 34. Additionally, in India, she is known as 'Lady Khali'. Dalal weighs over 70 kg and stands 5 feet 9 inches tall.

In April 2022, Kavita began her political career by joining AAP in Haryana. Talking to reporters, Dalal said that she was impressed by the work of Arvind Kejriwal and committed to fulfilling any responsibilities assigned to her. Moreover, after a two-year wait, she has now been given a ticket to contest the Haryana Assembly elections.

Anticipating a tough electoral fight, BJP named Capt Yogesh Bairagi as its candidate. Hailing from Safidon in Jind dis-

trict, he is currently serving as vice president and executive committee member of Haryana BJP's youth wing, Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha (BJYM). The 35-year-old leader is also the convener of the party's Sports cell in the state. Bairagi is also known for his social service during natural disasters and other emergencies. He was involved in relief and rescue operations during floods in Chennai and also participated in the "Vande Bharat" mission, a repatriation effort to rescue Indian nationals stranded abroad during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Talking to reporters, Bairagi said, "I want to express my gratitude to the senior leadership of the party for showing trust in me. The Congress candidate (Vinesh Phogat) is also like our sister and till the time she played, she made the country proud. We will work hard so that BJP wins. I appeal to the people of my constituency to show trust in me. The model with which I will work there will be a model of development."

INLD candidate, Dr Lather, who had studied veterinary sciences from Haryana Agriculture University (HAU), had quit the job of deputy excise and taxation commissioner just before the parliamentary polls and was active in the assembly for the past around six years through his NGO called Samajik Sarokh Parivar. His efforts to open more than 50 libraries in rural areas to ensure students from villages can prepare for the competitive

examination are well acknowledged in the constituency.

As Vinesh, Lather, Amarjeet Dhandha and Kavita Dalal belong to the dominant Jat community, a division of Jat votes among them may be of great benefit to BJP's Bairagi. According to them, Vinesh's opponents have added an element of unpredictability to the contest. Vinesh is married in the Rathi family of Bakhta Khara but the Rathi gotra has an insignificant presence in the constituency. Even her in-laws had left the village a long time back and had no regular connection with the constituency. The only advantage Vinesh, according to locals, is if the khaps of all villages support her and of course her international stature as a fighter.

What has made the contest interesting here is the entry of Olympian wrestler Vinesh stepping into the state's political arena this time with her superb performance in the Paris Olympics and subsequent unfortunate disqualification, Vinesh won the hearts of Indians. She made her community and family proud. Political observers opined that it would not be surprising to see her get votes, cutting across caste divide due to her recent popularity and sympathy after the Paris Olympics. Her entry will boost Congress' chances because of her popularity among Jats, farmers, women, and the youth. It also casts a negative light on the BJP for targeting her for participating in the wrestler protests.

'Son rise' in Haryana Congress as next generation of veteran leaders contest polls

There is a rise of sons of veteran leaders and scions political families in Haryana Assembly polls with several of them contesting the polls on the tickets of the two main parties--BJP and the Congress.

Congress Rajya Sabha MP Randeep Surjewala's son Aditya Surjewala will be making his electoral debut from Kaithal while former Haryana chief minister Bansilal's grandson and cricket administrator-turned-politician Anirudh Chaudhary has been fielded from Tosham.

Rewari MLA Chiranjeev Rao, who has been fielded again, is the son of senior party leader and former state minister Ajay Singh Yadav. Brijendra Singh, the son of former Union minister Birender Singh, is set to take on former deputy chief minister and sitting JJP MLA Dushyant Chautala from Uchana Kalan in

Jind district. Brijendra Singh, a former IAS officer, is also a former MP but that was from the ticket of the BJP. Both father and son joined Congress from the saffron party early this year.

Chander Mohan, the elder son of former Haryana chief minister Bhajan Lal has been fielded by the Congress from Panchkula. Also, Hissar MP Jai Prakash's son Vikas has been fielded from Kalayat.

However, the party dashed the hopes of those MPs harbouring a desire to contest the polls. Congress MP Kumari Selja had expressed her desire to contest the assembly elections and return to state politics. Also, there were reports that Randeep Surjewala was also interested in contesting the polls. Congress, however, had made its intentions clear early, declaring that no MP would be given permission to contest.

With the candidates announced for all seats, the

Congress ended up having a tie-up with the CPI (M) alone. The party had engaged in seat-sharing talks with the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) for the Haryana polls which hit a deadlock following hard bargaining from both sides. Some Congress leaders had expressed reservations over a tie-up with the Arvind Kejriwal-led party.

While Rahul Gandhi is understood to have nudged the state unit to explore possibilities for a tie-up with the AAP, sources said former chief minister Bhupinder Hooda and his supporters were against giving much importance to the AAP and are confident of a good performance by the party going solo. Hooda, the leader of opposition in the outgoing assembly, is contesting from Garhi Sampla-Kiloi. His son Deepender Singh Hooda is an MP from Rohtak and is one of the leading faces of the party's campaign along with other senior leaders.

Major Administrative Overhaul in Punjab, 38 IAS, 1 PCS Transferred

In a sweeping administrative reshuffle, Punjab Government on Thursday transferred and issued posting orders of 38 IAS officers and one PCS officer, including Deputy Commissioners of 10 districts and commissioners of four Municipal Corporations.

Among the notable changes,

Showkat Ahmad Parry has been moved from Patiala to Bathinda as the new Deputy Commissioner (DC), while IAS officer Sakshi Sahney will take over as the Amritsar DC, with Ropar's outgoing DC Preeti Yadav is now assigned to Patiala. Jitendra Jorwal will be the new DC of Ludhiana. Other significant appointments include Rajesh Dhiman, who transitions from Ferozepur to Nawanshahr; and Amarpreet Kaur Sandhu, who will now oversee Fazilka. Himanshu Jain is set to replace Preeti Yadav as the DC of Ropar, and Sonu Thind has been appointed as the DC of Fatehgarh Sahib. Sandeep Rishi will assume the role of DC in Sangrur.

The reshuffle extends to the Municipal Corporations as well. Patiala's Municipal Corporation will now be led by Rajat Oberoi, who is also the president of the PCS Officers' Association. T Benith has been appointed as the new Commissioner of Mohali MC, Aaditya Dachalwal will oversee Ludhiana MC, and Gulpreet Singh Aulakh will head Amritsar MC. Several senior officers have been assigned new roles. Krishan Kumar now holds the charge of the Additional Chief Secretary of Taxation Department, previously managed by Vikas Pratap—who will now hold the charge of Additional Chief Secretary (Excise). Alok Shekhar has been appointed as the Additional Chief Secretary for Prisons, while Ravi Bhagat, the Special Principal Secretary to the Chief Minister, will handle the Public Works Department (PWD).

Gurpreet Singh Khaira has been designated as the Director of Local Government, and Anindita Mitra, returning from her deputation in Chandigarh, has been

appointed as Secretary for Cooperation along with the charge of Punjab State Cooperative Bank managing director. Priyanka Bhatti, formerly heading PWD, will now oversee the Science, Technology, and Environment Department as administrative secretary.

The Tourism and Cultural Affairs Department has seen a leadership change with Malwinder Singh Jaggi as the new Secretary, along with his previous departments of Information and public relations, and civil aviation; while Amrit Singh has been given additional charge of the Tourism and Cultural Affairs Director. Paramjit Singh has been appointed Director of the Rural Development Department, while Jaspreet Singh will take on the role of State Transport Commissioner. Varjeet Singh Walia has been introduced to the Chief Minister's Office as the Additional Principal Secretary.

The services of Fazilka DC Senu Duggal has been placed at the disposal of Cooperation Department for posting as Sugarfed managing director.

As per the orders, 1999-batch Ajoy Sharma will continue to work as Financial Commissioner Forests and Wildlife Preservation in addition to Principal Secretary Governance Reforms and public grievances. A 2000-batch Rahul Tiwari will continue to work as Administrative Secretary (Housing and Urban Development) in addition to Power.

Gurkirat Singh Kirpal, 2001-batch IAS, will also continue to work as Administrative Secretary of Home Affairs, in addition to Mines and Geology, and Gurudwara Elections commissioner.

Punjab power employees extend strike until Sept 17: Demands unmet

Amid escalating tensions in Punjab, the state power department employees have decided to extend their strike until September 17. The Joint Forum Punjab, Power Employees Unity Forum, and Junior Engineers Association are at loggerheads with the state government, accusing it of disregarding their demands and failing to take their grievances seriously. As a result, power supply issues are likely to persist, causing significant inconvenience to the public.

Despite several meetings between the leaders of these organizations, including Power Minister Harbhajan Singh ETO and Power Secretary, no resolution has been reached. The leaders expressed frustration over the government's lack of commitment to address their concerns. They argued that while discussions have been ongoing, the Administration has failed to offer tangible solutions, instead

only offering empty assurances.

The core of the dispute revolved around demands for substantial changes, including the recognition of employees who lose their lives while on duty as martyrs and the provision of significant financial aid to their families. According to the union leaders, the government has been reluctant to meet these demands, reflecting a broader pattern of neglect towards the welfare of power employees. If the demands remain unmet, the power employees have threatened to continue a work-to-rule policy until September 30. This means that they will strictly adhere to their job descriptions without performing any additional tasks. In addition, all employees will proceed on mass leave until September 17, halting their work and potentially exacerbating power disruptions.

The employees' strike, which began with a pen-down and work stoppage over the past three days, has now escalated to a full-scale protest. The ongoing strike has meant that neither

grievances will be addressed nor any official work conducted during this period. Consequently, the general public may face prolonged delays and inconveniences as they struggle with power outages and administrative bottlenecks.

Adding to the situation, private sector power employees have pledged their support and are preparing to join the strike from September 13. They plan to organize protests, including demonstrations and gate rallies, culminating in a state-level protest in front of the Patiala headquarters on September 17.

The leaders of the Punjab State Electricity Board Employees Joint Forum, Power Employees Unity Forum Punjab, and the Association of Junior Engineers, including prominent figures such as Ratan Singh Majhari and Gurpreet Singh Gandhwind, have stated that while the government had promised to address their issues before the elections, it has since reneged on these commitments. Although some minor demands have been met,

the major issues remain unresolved.

The leaders criticized the government's response as authoritarian and claimed that efforts are being made to undermine trade union rights and instill fear among employees. Reports indicated that unauthorized tasks are being assigned to employees and officials, including clerical and lower-grade staff, in an attempt to suppress the strike.

Major Demands

The power employees have outlined several key demands, including recognition of employees who die on duty as martyrs, with significant financial aid provided to their families; reduction in the promotion period from RTM to ALM for sub-station staff; provision of pay bands, security, and overtime for sub-station staff; reinstatement of allowances that were discontinued, effective from 2021; and assurance of third-scale promotions, filling of vacant positions, and a halt to recruitments from other states.

Saragarhi War Memorial inaugurated in Ferozepur: Tribute to 21 Sikh heroes

About 127 years after 21 brave Sikh soldiers of the 36th Sikh Regiment heroically defended the Saragarhi fort against 10,000 Afghan tribesmen, the 'Saragarhi War Memorial' was inaugurated on Thursday at the historic Gurudwara Saragarhi Sahib in Ferozepur Cantt.

"Punjab Government is committed to preserve the legacy of the 21 Sikh warriors who laid down their lives in the historic Saragarhi War 127 years ago," declared the state's Social Security, Women and Child Development Minister Dr Baljit Kaur, during the inauguration ceremony.

The newly-inaugurated memorial features an eight-foot statue of Sardar Ishar Singh—the hero of the battle, along with a 41-foot mural wall depicting key moments from the battle. Lit up at night, the memorial stands as a powerful reminder of sacrifice and valor, destined to become a center of

attraction for tourists from around the world.

The Minister, speaking at a gathering after the akhand path sahib held in memory of the martyrs, highlighted the government's dedication to connect the younger generation with Punjab's rich and proud heritage.

Dr Baljit stressed that through various initiatives, the Punjab Government is actively promoting the development of historical sites across the State. The Saragarhi War Memorial, built at Ferozepur, is the first of its kind dedicated to the battle, symbolizing Punjab's commitment to honouring its martyrs.

According to UNESCO, the Saragarhi War is among the eight most important battles in world history, a fact that fills every Indian heart with pride. She further noted that the soldiers who sacrificed their lives in the war were posthumously awarded the Indian Order of Merit—the highest military honour of the time, equivalent to the Victoria Cross.

Chandigarh Blast: Hunt for suspects intensifies, Rs 2 lakh reward announced

A day after an explosive device was thrown at a House in Sector 10, a team from Chandigarh Police, along with CFSL experts, arrived at the scene to investigate. The teams conducted a search for explosives in and around the property. In the meantime, the police have traced the route of an auto-rickshaw involved in the incident. Sources revealed that the two suspects, who are currently on the run, had hired the vehicle from ISBT Sector 43. The auto driver who was arrested the same day is being interrogated.

Sources further said that the National Investigation Agency (NIA) team will now investigate

the incident. The Ministry of Home Affairs has asked for a detailed report from the Chandigarh police.

The Chandigarh Police have announced a reward of Rs 2 lakh for anyone providing information leading to the arrest of the other two suspects involved in the blast case at Sector 10. "Chandigarh Police announces reward of Rs 2 lakhs for providing any information leading to the arrest of other two suspects involved in the blast case at sector 10. In clue of said two suspects persons, information can be given on Police control room no. 0172-2749194 or 112 and WhatsApp no 9465121000," Police said in a statement.

Talking to reporters, Sub

Inspector Lakhwinder Singh said that the investigation is ongoing and a Central Forensic Science Laboratory team will arrive at the incident spot also, as the investigation could not be completed on Wednesday because it was dark. Singh added the security has been deployed to safeguard the evidence.

"The CSFL teams will come. The investigation could not be completed yesterday because it was dark in the night. A three-wheeler has been recovered, but the accused are yet to be nabbed. The investigation is going on. Teams have been sent all over. The security has been deployed to safeguard the evidence," Sub Inspector Singh said.

On being asked if the suspi-

cious explosion is connected with the officer's family residing in the concerned house previously, he said, "The investigation will be carried out on that point." Earlier on Wednesday, police and forensic teams reached the incident spot to gather evidence. One person has been arrested in connection with the blast. A low-intensity explosion occurred at a house in the upscale Sector 10 area on Wednesday evening with its owner claiming that two persons in an auto-rickshaw had hurled a grenade. There was no casualty but some windows and pots kept in the garden were damaged in the incident, Chandigarh Police said, adding an investigation to ascertain the cause of the blast is underway.

With candidates' nominations, battle lines drawn for political parties in Haryana

With the completion of the filing of nominations by the candidates on Thursday, the battle lines have been drawn in Haryana for the Assembly election.

The Congress leadership on Thursday cleared candidates for 89 seats, leaving one seat for the CPI(M) in the House of 90 seats in the State. The scrutiny of the nomination papers will be conducted on September 13 and nominations can be withdrawn till September 16.

The Congress has expressed confidence in two MPs' sons in Kaithal district. It has fielded Rajya Sabha MP Randeep Surjewala's son Aditya Surjewala and given ticket to Hissar MP Jai Parkash's son Vikas Saharan from the Kalayat Assembly segment. Aditya is facing sitting MLA Leela Ram, while Vikas will contest against sitting MLA Kamlesh Dhandha. Congress has also fielded Devinder Hans from the Guhla (SC) Assembly segment, and former MLA Sultan Singh Jadola from Pundri. Hans contested as an Independent in 2019, finishing third with 29,473 votes. This time, he will be pitted against former MLA and BJP candidate Kulwant Ram Bazigar and JJP's Krishna Bazigar. Sultan Singh Jadola, who won the Pundri seat as an Independent in 2009, is also seeking to revive his political career with Congress's backing. The Congress named former Deputy CM Chander Mohan as its candidate for the Panchkula seat, while the AAP has fielded Prem Garg and OP Gujjar from the Panchkula and Kalka seats, respectively.

In a surprising move, the

BJP has dropped veteran leader and two-time party state president Ram Bilas Sharma (74) and named former district president Kanwar Singh Yadav its nominee from the Mahendragarh Assembly constituency, dominated by the Ahir community. In 42 years, it would be the first Assembly poll in Mahendragarh when Sharma would not be in the fray as a BJP candidate. Sharma, a former minister, began his electoral journey from Mahendragarh during the 1977 Assembly poll as a Janata Party candidate. He lost in a close contest, only to win the next four elections in a row in 1982, 1987, 1991 and 1996 on BJP ticket. On Wednesday, Sharma had—without waiting for the announcement of the ticket—filed his papers as the BJP candidate.

Days after the incumbent BJP in Haryana fielded its sitting MLA and minister Kamal Gupta from Hissar, party leader Savitri Jindal, 74, filed her nomination from the same constituency as an Independent candidate on Thursday.

Candidates file nomination after conducting rallies

Senior Congress leader Randeep Singh Surjewala's son Aditya Surjewala and BJP candidate Shrutu Choudhry, former chief minister Bansilal's granddaughters, were among several leaders who filed nomination papers on Thursday being the last day of the nomination for Assembly polls. Former Haryana deputy chief minister and Congress candidate Chander Mohan filed his nomination papers from the Panchkula assembly seat. Aditya Surjewala filed his

papers from the Kaithal assembly seat. He was accompanied by his father and Rajya Sabha MP Randeep Surjewala. BJP leader Shrutu Choudhry filed her papers from the Tosham seat. She was accompanied by her mother and Rajya Sabha MP Kiran Choudhry and the BJP's Haryana in-charge Biplab Kumar Deb. Congress nominee Ashok Arora filed his papers from the Thanesar seat. He was accompanied by senior party leader and former Haryana chief minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda.

Rebellion, tears in Cong over denial of tickets

The rebellion grew in the Congress in Haryana after the party leadership cleared candidates for 89 seats, leaving one seat for the CPI(M) with at least 12 leaders quitting the party one after another in the last couple of days, citing the party's indifference towards them despite their dedication. Congress MLA Lalit Nagar, who represented the Tigaon seat, was in tears after the party denied him a ticket on Thursday and quit the party forthwith. Nagar was replaced with Lalit Nagar, son of senior leader Yashpal Nagar. The change of nomination at the last minute upset Lalit Nagar, who convened a meeting with his supporters where he announced his decision to contest as an Independent candidate.

He told his supporters that he was hoping to get a ticket but "some conspirators stabbed me in the back". In the 2014 elections, Lalit Nagar won the Tigaon seat by defeating the BJP's Rajesh Nagar. However, in the 2019 elections, Rajesh

Nagar defeated Lalit Nagar. "Had my party nominated a strong candidate, I would have understood. But they have given the ticket to such a candidate whom people don't even know," the former legislator added.

Former Panchkula Mayor and leader Upinder Kaur Ahluwalia, Sharda Rathore and Jitender Kumar Bhardwaj are among the ticket hopefuls who expressed resentment over the party's decision. Rathore, a former MLA and ticket hopeful from Ballabgarh, burst into tears in front of supporters on Thursday after she was denied a ticket by the Congress. Her supporters said she had been "betrayed" by the party.

Joining the race of rebels, party leader Jitender Kumar Bhardwaj, who was denied nomination from Sohna in Gurugram, wrote in a social media post, "Sorry friends, today, service, dedication and devotion have lost." The Congress nominated Rohtash Khatana, who was previously associated with the Jannayak Janta Party (JJP).

Former minister Chaudhary Nirmal Singh's daughter Chitra Sarwara left the Congress after she was denied a ticket from Ambala Cantonment. The party has fielded Parimal Pari from this seat. So did Rohita Revari, a former legislator from Panipat city, who resigned from the party after being denied a ticket. Justifying the decision of the leadership on ticket allocation, All India Congress General Secretary Kumari Selja on Thursday said when the tickets are distributed, "someone supports one person and someone supports another person."

Punjab CM to dedicate 30ft tall statue of Shaheed Bhagat Singh at Mohali airport on Sept 28

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann is set to unveil a 30-foot statue of Shaheed-e-Azam Bhagat Singh at the Shaheed Bhagat Singh International Airport, Mohali, on September 28, to mark the birth anniversary of the legendary freedom fighter. The statue, made of gunmetal, is expected to stand as a symbol of inspiration for generations to come, reminding all visitors of the extraordinary contributions and sacrifices made by Bhagat Singh in the fight for India's independence.

Mann, during a meeting on Thursday with officials from the Public Works Department (PWD), reviewed the ongoing work for the statue's installation. He emphasized that this tribute not only honours Bhagat Singh's bravery but also aims to instill a sense of patriotism among the

youth. "This statue will serve as a catalyst to perpetuate the legacy of Shaheed Bhagat Singh, motivating younger generations to selflessly serve the nation," Mann said.

The Mohali International Airport was officially renamed in honour of Shaheed Bhagat Singh last year, following years of debate and a legal dispute between the governments of Punjab and Haryana over its naming. The airport, which serves travelers from various northern states including Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, and Jammu and Kashmir, will now be home to this impressive statue, further cementing Bhagat Singh's place in the hearts and minds of the people.

The Chief Minister reflected on the long-standing demand to name the airport after the martyr, which dates back to 2007 during Bhagat Singh's birth centenary

celebrations. At the time, Punjab had pushed for the naming of the airport in Bhagat Singh's honour, but Haryana expressed a preference for naming it after its leader, Mangal Sen. The issue escalated to the Punjab and Haryana High Court, which advised both state governments to resolve the matter through dialogue.

After multiple discussions, an agreement was finally reached in August 2022, during a meeting between Mann and Haryana Deputy Chief Minister Dushyant Chautala. Both states consented to name the airport after Bhagat Singh, honouring his legacy as one of India's most revered freedom fighters.

Speaking about Bhagat Singh's ideology, Mann said: "His philosophy of socialism and fight against injustice is as relevant today as it was during the freedom struggle. The statue will remind visitors of his supreme

sacrifice and inspire them to follow his ideals."

Punjab Government's decision to erect Bhagat Singh's statue at such a prominent location aligned with its broader mission to ensure that the ideals of the country's freedom fighters continue to resonate with future generations. By naming airports, universities, and institutions after iconic martyrs, Mann believed that the country can keep their legacies alive and inspire youth to contribute to the nation's progress with unwavering dedication.

Mann reiterated the government's commitment to realizing Bhagat Singh's dream of a just and equitable society. "We are leaving no stone unturned to ensure that Bhagat Singh's legacy lives on in the hearts of Punjab and people across the country," he said, urging all to take inspiration from the young martyr's life and philosophy.

The Union Cabinet extends Ayushman Bharat to senior citizens Above 70; a move that would benefit six crore people

In a significant move the Union Cabinet has approved the extension of the Ayushman Bharat health insurance scheme to all citizens above 70 years of age, regardless of their income or social standing. The Cabinet's decision fulfils a key promise made by Prime Minister Narendra Modi during the 2024 Lok Sabha election campaign. This move is expected to transform healthcare for senior citizens, providing much-needed relief to millions who have been struggling with rising medical costs and insufficient insurance coverage. Since its launch over five years ago, Ayushman Bharat has provided healthcare access to millions across India, covering hospitalisations and treatments for families that otherwise couldn't afford medical care. However, data has shown that nearly every fourth person admitted to hospitals under this scheme has been a senior citizen, highlighting their disproportionate need for medical support. Out of over one crore admissions, 24% were of citizens aged 60 and above, demonstrating how essential this safety net is for the elderly.



The latest decision to extend coverage to all citizens over 70 is particularly significant as this age group is often neglected by private insurers. Most health insurance companies either refuse to offer policies to those above 70 or charge prohibitively high premiums. Even when insurance is available, pre-existing conditions are often excluded for the first two to three years, leaving many senior citizens without immediate access to treatment for serious ailments like heart disease, kidney issues, and diabetes. With the new policy, six crore people over 70 years of age are expected to benefit, receiving health insurance coverage up to Rs 5 lakh per year. This applies on a family basis, ensuring that elderly individuals, even those abandoned by families or facing financial hardships, can now access free or affordable medical care. The extension of Ayushman Bharat to all citizens above 70 comes at a critical time. Procedures like dialysis, heart surgeries, and cancer treatments are not only expensive but also frequent among senior citizens. The new policy provides a safety net for seniors who have, until now, been forced to bear these expenses themselves or rely on insufficient public health programs. Rs 5 lakh coverage under Ayushman Bharat will lift much of this financial burden, enabling families to access quality healthcare without worrying about their savings. Apart from the direct medical benefits, this policy could have far-reaching social implications. India's senior citizens, especially those in rural or economically disadvantaged areas, often face neglect and abandonment when they become ill. This policy not only promises improved healthcare outcomes but also offers dignity and security to millions of older Indians at a time when they need it most. As this initiative rolls out, its impact on families, communities, and the healthcare system at large will likely be profound, marking a significant leap toward inclusive and accessible healthcare for all.

Resignation shakes Trinamool Congress





Jawahar Sircar's resignation from Rajya Saha highlights growing discontent in Bengal over the State's response to crimes against women

Trinamool Congress Member of Rajya Sabha and former Chairman of Prasar Bharati Jawahar Sircar has resigned both from parliament and the party. Sircar tendered resignation to protest the 'mishandling' of the trainee-doctor rape-cum-murder case at RG Kar Medical in Kolkata. The resignation is significant as Sircar is part of 'Kolkata Bhadrak' which has so far remained steadfast in its support of West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee. The move also indicates that the West Bengal assembly passing a 'very stringent anti-rape law' bill has not cut much ice with the people, who so far have resisted condoning the errors committed by the Mamata government in the matter.

The West Bengal bill, which has now been referred by the Governor to the President, has also not found much echo outside the state. The Aparajita Woman and Child (West Bengal Criminal Laws Amendment) Bill, 2024, passed by the West Bengal Assembly is not the first of its kind. In the past five years, Andhra Pradesh (Disha) and Maharashtra (Shakti) passed similar bills with a death penalty clause against the rapists but they are still to bring any change in the matter. All these bills were preceded by Criminal Law (Amendment) Act, 2013 through which Capital Punishment for rape made its entry into the Indian Penal Code.

This followed the public outrage after the brutal gang rape and murder of a woman on a moving bus in Delhi on December 16, 2012, which shook the collective conscience of the nation. Parliament passed the Criminal Law (Amendment) Act, 2013 to allow the death penalty in rape cases where the accompanying brutality leads to death or leaves the victim in a persistent vegetative state. Whatever name you may give Aparajita, Disha or Shakti, these bills are meaningless as long as cases about rape remain pending in the courts for years together. In 2022, com-



combined with those brought in the previous years, courts had around 2 lakh cases for trial. However, trials could be completed in only a little over 18,000 cases, which was less than the number of incidents as well as police charge sheets filed that year. Finally, the conviction rate of 27.4% in rape cases means seven out of every 10 accused persons were acquitted. So just making the laws doesn't help. Speaking at a function some months back, Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud had quoted BR Ambedkar saying, "However bad a Constitution may be, it may turn out to be good if those responsible for its functioning happen to be a good lot." Maker of the Constitution in the concluding speech before the Constituent Assembly had said, "However good a Constitution may be, it is sure to turn out bad because those who are called to work it, happen to be a bad lot. However bad a Constitution may be, it may turn out to be good if those who are called to work it, happen to be a good lot. The Constitution can provide only the organs of the State such as the Legislature, the

Executive and the Judiciary. The factors on which the working of those organs of the State depends are the people and the political parties they will set up as their instruments to carry out their wishes and their politics." If the rapes are not stopping in this country or if the anti-rape laws are not proving to be effective in punishing the rapists, its a failure of culture more than the law. Our society is not very forthcoming the accommodating the woes of a rape victim, and in most cases, the survivor and the family are subjected to terrible humiliation. Those tasked with implementing the Constitution have to possess the spirit of public service rather than political expediency. There is a recent case study carried out by the Uttar Pradesh Police in Ghaziabad district which reiterates the a f o r e m e n t i o n e d premise. There is an existing government policy for establishing Pink Police Outposts under every police station. The rules have been there but not much work has been done beyond the customary launching of the programme with much fanfare. However, Ghaziabad Police last year

decided to implement the programme in mission mode, and 20 Pink Booths exclusively manned by female police personnel were established in September 2023. A year later the results were for all to see. The mere presence of a force for women's safety had its impact. According to the data released by Crime and Criminal Tracking Network & Systems of Uttar Pradesh Police, crime against women which included dowry deaths, dowry-related cases, molestation, rape and kidnapping came down by approximately 24 per cent. The biggest fall of over 36 per cent was in dowry deaths thus at least securing women inside their homes. If such an initiative by Ghaziabad Police can achieve such results one is sure at the state government level such steps can be taken more effectively. One is not sure how effectively have these pink police outposts been functioning in West Bengal, where the government has just brought a more stringent anti-rape law. The erosion of local cultures and the rise of digital colonisation

We are increasingly relying on digital platforms which have a huge impact on local cultures and thought processes. This raises critical concerns about the future of our cultural identity

There was a time when people from a village knew each other. A minute change in a person's behaviour shall bring to the attention of others. Children were safe in that society. Every town or every place in our country has a uniqueness in its culture, traditions, language, food habits, products produced, and even a story to tell. Colonisation, both external and internal, characterised by the exercise of control by one group over another, has profoundly impacted rewriting history.

The term "digital colonisation" refers to the dominance of numerous multinational technology businesses, the majority of which are based in the United States and a few wealthy nations, over the digital infrastructure and data of the entire world. For all of our day-to-day requirements, we began to rely more on digital platforms, reducing the amount of personal interaction. This new digital culture has infiltrated even the remotest parts of our country. These digital titans prioritise everything in our lives, including what we should buy, who we should be friends

DIPLOMATIC BOOST TO SEMICONDUCTORS

India and Singapore are building a resilient semiconductor supply chain

Domestic politics may be a key issue for the ruling NDA alliance, however, it has not taken away Prime Minister Narendra Modi's focus on constantly working on fine-tuning India's foreign policy. PM Modi recently was in Brunei a first for any Indian Prime Minister on a bilateral state visit, to a country located strategically in the South China Sea. Brunei's visit was topped by the PM's visit to Singapore, an important technology ally for India in the region. India and Singapore will be entering into the 60th year of diplomatic relationship next year and both countries have decided to upgrade their existing bilateral partnership to a Comprehensive strategic partnership, which would in turn expand the areas of cooperation.

One of the key focus, during PM Modi's visit to Singapore was expanding the digital cooperation between the countries. The joint statement released read "Both Prime Ministers welcomed the signing of the MoU on cooperation in the field of Digital Technologies and affirmed common interests in data, AI and cybersecurity. Building on this, both Prime Ministers agreed to deepen collaboration in the digital space, including in facilitating trusted cross-border data flows, cybersecurity, and the interoperability of digital systems." A crucial element of the partnership was a demonstration under the trade trust framework. Singapore is home to many large Technology companies, many of whom have regional headquarters in the island state, with the business geography, spread all across Asia primarily India.



Advance technology manufacturing and semiconductors formed another crucial element of the PM's visit. The statement read "Both Prime Ministers agreed to explore cooperation in the area of critical and emerging technologies. Both Prime Ministers agreed that advanced manufacturing, particularly in developing resilient semiconductor supply chains, can be a new pillar of bilateral cooperation.

Both Prime Ministers welcomed the signing of the MoU on the India-Singapore Semiconductor Ecosystem Partnership. Immediately after the PM visited Singapore the US government also announced a new partnership with India to explore supply chain opportunities in India. Funded under the International Technology Security and Innovation (ITSI) Fund, created by the CHIPS Act of 2022 (CHIPS Act) of the US, it allows the department to spend some money on developing a trusted supply chain ecosystem with partners and allies. A US State Department press release read, "The initial phase includes a comprehensive assessment of India's existing semiconductor ecosystem and regulatory framework, as well as workforce and infrastructure needs. The state anticipates that key Indian stakeholders, such as state governments, educational institutions, research centres, and private companies, will participate in this analysis steered by the India Semiconductor Mission. The insights gained from the assessment will serve as the basis for potential future joint initiatives to strengthen and grow this critical sector. The United States and India are key partners in ensuring the global semiconductor supply chain keeps pace with the global digital transformation currently underway. Manufacturing of essential products ranging from vehicles to medical devices relies on the strength and resilience of the semiconductor supply chain."

This week India also hosted SEMICON a global conference that attracts investments in the Indian semiconductor ecosystem. India is trying to attract investments for a crucial component of most modern equipment and machinery called chips. The recent visits by the PM to Singapore and the Memorandum of Understanding with the US may provide the much-needed kickstart for India's semiconductor ecosystem.

It was a spectacle, with each athlete embodying a harmonious blend of strength, determination, and skill – almost like poetry in motion. As an avid follower, I found myself engrossed in nearly every performance, regardless of the challenging (IST) time difference that saw events commence under the glowing silhouette of the Eiffel Tower. On the rare occasions when I could not watch live, social media provided timely updates, fuelling my enthusiasm and admiration for these remarkable athletes.

Their tenacity and commitment to realizing their dreams on the global stage were evident as they competed and excelled across multiple disciplines, leaving an indelible mark on the world of sports. India delivered its best-ever performance at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games, achieving a historic 29-medal haul that included seven gold, nine silver, and 13 bronze medals. This outstanding achievement surpassed the 19-medal tally from Tokyo 2020, where India had won five golds, and marked a significant milestone as the country crossed the 50-medal mark in its Paralympic history. A record 84 para-athletes represented India across 12 disciplines, including the debut participation in para-cycling, para-rowing, and blind judo. Among the shining stars, Avani Lekhara became the first Indian woman to win two golds at the Paralympic Games, defending her title in the women's 10m air rifle standing SH1 shooting event with a world-record score. Meanwhile, India saw its first-ever one-two finish in athletics, with Dharambir and Parnav Soorma clinching gold and silver in the men's club throw F51 event. Dharambir also set a new Asian record of 34.92m. In athletics, several Indian para-athletes etched their names in the record books. Praveen Kumar set an Asian record en route to winning the high jump T64 title, securing India's sixth gold medal – their highest total at the Paralympics. Javelin thrower Sumit Antil made history as the first Indian man to defend his Paralympic title, winning gold in the men's javelin throw F64 with a stunning throw of 70.59m, breaking his record from Tokyo 2020 not once but

three times. Mariyappan Thangavelu, with a bronze in the high jump T42 class, became the first Indian to win medals at three consecutive Paralympic Games, having previously won gold at Rio 2016 and silver at Tokyo 2020. Preethi Pal secured India's first-ever medal in a track event at the Paralympics with a bronze in the women's 100m T35 race and won another bronze in the 200m, becoming India's most successful athlete at the Games with two medals. The track events also saw Deepthi Jeevanji become the first intellectually impaired Indian athlete to win a Paralympic medal with a bronze in the women's 400m T20 class. India's achievements extended beyond the track and field to other disciplines. In archery, armless archer Sheetal Devi briefly set a world record in the ranking round and later teamed up with Rakesh Kumar to achieve a world record score in the compound mixed team qualification event. It was a perfect example of poetry in motion.

At just 17, Sheetal made history as India's youngest Paralympic medalist by winning a bronze in the mixed team event. Moreover, India's dominance in archery was further confirmed when Harvinder Singh became the country's first-ever Paralympic archery champion. The outstanding performances by Indian para-athletes at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games underscored India's emergence as a formidable contender on the global stage. Originating in 1948 with a sports event for World War II veterans with spinal injuries, organized by Sir Ludwig Guttmann in Stoke Mandeville, England, the Paralympics evolved into an international event in 1960 in Rome with 400 athletes from 23 countries. Since then, the Games have grown significantly, challenging stereotypes and promoting inclusivity, while celebrating the exceptional talents and resilience of athletes

with disabilities. India began its Paralympic journey in 1968, overcoming numerous challenges such as limited resources, inadequate facilities, and low public awareness. Despite these hurdles, Indian para-athletes gradually rose to prominence on the global stage. A pivotal moment came in 2004 when Devendra Jhajharia won India's first Paralympic gold, setting a world record in the F46 javelin throw. This achievement heralded a new era for Indian para-sports, culminating in 35 medals across 12 Paralympic Games. The Paralympics exemplify India's commitment to inclusiveness, reflecting a broader national strategy to promote equity in sports. Government initiatives such as the "Target Olympic Podium Scheme" (TOPS), 'Khelo India,' and increased funding for para-sports provide athletes with special abilities access to advanced training facilities, coaching, and financial support. To foster a more inclusive sports ecosystem, India regularly hosts events like the National Para Games and Para Athletics Championships, enhancing visibility and opportunities for para-athletes. What is needed is corporate sponsorships and media coverage which are crucial in transforming societal perceptions of disability, empowering athletes and promoting social inclusion and awareness. Globally, several countries have successfully promoted inclusiveness through sports.

The United Kingdom, for example, has been a pioneer in fostering an inclusive sports culture. Looking back at the success of Team GB at the London 2012 Paralympics, where they ranked third with 120 medals, which stemmed from years of investment in para-sports proves this point.

The UK government, along with organizations like the British Paralympic Association, provided substantial funding, advanced training facilities, and comprehensive

support for athletes.

The extensive broadcasting and marketing of the London 2012 Paralympics also helped transform public perceptions of disability, inspiring a new generation of para-athletes. Similarly, Australia has excelled in promoting inclusivity in sports through the Australian Paralympic Committee, which focuses on talent identification, athlete development, and grassroots inclusivity.

Further, Japan's efforts during the Tokyo 2020 Paralympics highlighted its commitment to accessibility, with significant investments in inclusive infrastructure, such as accessible public transport, venues, and accommodations, demonstrating a strong commitment to para-sports.

Moreover, the Paralympic Committee's 'ImPOSSIBLE' program, an educational initiative by the Agitos Foundation, was introduced in schools across Japan to educate children about the Paralympic values of courage, determination, inspiration, and equality, fostering a culture of inclusivity from a young age. In India, the road to achieving inclusiveness in sports has been long and challenging, but progress is evident.

The success of para-athletes at the Paralympics 2024 has helped break down barriers and challenge stereotypes, paving the way for a more inclusive society. However, there is still much work to be done to ensure that people with special abilities have equal access to sports and the opportunity to compete at the highest level.

The future of Indian para-sports looks promising, as it is a powerful reminder that success in sports is not limited by physical ability but defined by determination, skill, and the spirit to overcome adversity. WE CAN is the catchword.

Blinken wraps up Europe trip with arms request

AP ■ WARSAW

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken is wrapping up a three-nation, Ukraine-focused European tour in Poland after hearing repeated appeals from Ukrainian officials to use Western-supplied weaponry for long-range strikes inside Russia.

Blinken traveled to Warsaw on Thursday after spending a day in Kyiv with British Foreign Secretary David Lammy during which they pledged to bring the Ukrainian requests to their leaders. President Joe Biden and British Prime Minister Keir Starmer are to meet in the United States on Friday

amid signs both Washington and London are growing more receptive to allowing the Ukrainians to use their arms to hit targets farther inside Russia than previously okayed. NATO member Poland, which shares a border with Ukraine, has been supportive of the Ukrainians and Blinken is likely to hear further requests for easing weapons-use restrictions from Polish President Andrzej Duda, Prime Minister Donald Tusk and Foreign Minister Radoslaw Sikorski.

On Wednesday, Blinken and Lammy announced that the United States and Britain had pledged nearly \$1.5 billion in additional aid to Ukraine during their visit to Kyiv.

Blinken announced more than \$700 million in humanitarian aid, while Lammy confirmed that his country would provide another \$782 million in assistance and loan guarantees. Much of the effort was aimed at bolstering the energy grid that Russia has repeatedly pounded ahead of an expected difficult winter. Ukraine's wish list is long and non-military assistance is certainly on it, but Ukrainian officials made clear their most important ask is for easing restrictions on where Western weapons can be used. Air-raid sirens sounded repeatedly during the visit, causing delays in their schedule and forcing them to cancel a wreath-laying ceremony.

Blinken would bring the discussion with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy about the missiles "back to Washington to brief the president" and that Biden and Starmer will "no doubt" talk about the issue when they meet in Washington. "Speaking for the United States, we have adjusted and adapted as needs have changed, as the battlefield has changed. And I have no doubt that we'll continue to do that as this evolves," Blinken told a news conference. His language was very similar to that which he used in May, shortly before the U.S. green lit Ukrainian use of U.S. weapons just inside Russian territory.

Court seeks clarification on Imran's military trial

A Pakistani high court on Thursday asked the government to clarify the uncertainty surrounding the possible military trial of jailed former prime minister Imran Khan.

The Islamabad High Court (IHC) was hearing a petition filed to prevent Khan's possible military custody and trial over his involvement in the May 9, 2023 violence in which supporters of his Pakistan

Teheek-e-Insaf (PTI) party allegedly attacked military installations following his arrest.

The court raised concerns over the potential trial of a civilian in a military court, emphasising that the issue is a matter of serious concern for both the petitioner and the judiciary.

During the hearing, Justice Miangul Hassan Aurangzeb asked Assistant Attorney General Azmat Bashir Tarar to seek directions from the Attorney General's office over the issue and provide a clear

response to the court. "You are saying there is no case now, but could there be one later?" the judge asked, highlighting the uncertainty surrounding the matter. The court adjourned the hearing until September 16, giving the federal government time to submit its response. PTI in a WhatsApp message also confirmed that the IHC ordered the government to file a reply on "possible military trial of Imran Khan by Sep 16". If the government denies any plans for a military trial, the petition will

be rendered moot. However, if such a trial is under consideration, the court will proceed to hear and decide the case. The 71-year-old PTI party founder has been in jail since August last year after being convicted in some of the nearly 200 cases slapped on him since his ouster in April 2022. Various government officials have been indicating about holding the military trial of Khan, but any such decision will depend on the final judgment of the Supreme Court.

Lawyers for Kremlin's foe Navalny face trial

Three lawyers who once represented the late Russian opposition leader Alexei Navalny went on trial Thursday in Russia, part of the Kremlin's unrelenting crackdown on dissent that has in recent years reached levels unseen since the Soviet times.

The three — Vadim Kobzev, Igor Sergunin and Alexei Liptser — were arrested in October 2023 on charges of involvement with an extremist group.

When they were arrested, Navalny was already serving a 19-year prison term on several criminal convictions, including extremism. The extremism charges against the opposition politician stemmed from a 2021 court ruling that outlawed his organisations in Russia — the Foundation for Fighting Corruption and a vast network of regional offices — as extremist groups.

THE LIFE AND TIMES OF NANDINI SATPATHY RETOLD

NANDINI SATPATHY, former union minister and chief minister of Orissa was one who lived during the days of titans of Indian politics. Though not a leader in the true sense of the word, she too had her successes and failures. Nandini's life sketch is introduced to the readers 18 years after her demise but she had disappeared from public life much earlier. Author **PALLAVI REBBAPRAGADA** deserves kudos for bringing Nandini back amongst us.


The art of writing a book, whether it is novel, essays, short stories, poetry or history is a job of creativity. It is the writer's hands-on experiences or tough realities he/she faced in life that come out as literary works. Lessons one learnt from the course of life, certain incidents which leave unforgettable experiences in the mind and conversations with individuals who leave an impact in the heart are the epicenters of these literary works. One who sets out to write the life-sketch of eminent persons should have first hand interaction with the subject. Those experiences alone would help the writer to come out with something new that would remain etched in the minds of readers for decades to come.

Dr Samuel Johnson is rated as the most distinguished man of letters in English history. Johnson (1709-1784) was a literary critic par excellence and he was the trendsetter in this field. His style and thought process has resulted in the Samuel Johnson's school of criticism and continues to be the benchmark of this field of literature. But what is equally important is the biography of Johnson authored by James Boswell, a lawyer and writer. Scotland-born James Boswell wrote "Life of Samuel Johnson" which was published in 1791 based on the series of interviews and dialogues he had with Johnson. This biography stands out as

the "most famous single work of biographical art in the world of literature" even after 223 years after it hit book stalls across Europe and US.

It cannot be stated that Boswell was a genius as not much has been heard or discussed about his other literary pursuits. Literature students were told by the English lecturers to compulsorily read "Life of Samuel Johnson", a complete guide on how to write biographies. What Boswell did was to write the biography in a style which could be comprehended by even ordinary people. Thus was born a great literary work.

In India, there is no shortage of biographies and life-sketches on freedom fighters, social leaders and politicians. But most of the works are hagiographies and blare out qualities of the subjects even the latter themselves would be shocked to hear. Books on the Father of the Nation, first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru, his daughter and late Prime Minister Indira Gandhi are proof of this kind of works. Dhananjay Keer (1913-1983) is unique among the Indian biographers and he chose his subjects meticulously. His works on Veer Savarkar and Dr Ambedkar are path



breaking books as he had personal contacts with these great sons of India.

Those who lambast Savarkar for reasons known to them only should take time and read Keer's books.

The biography of the great freedom fighter Dadabhai Naoroji, Pioneer of Indian Nationalism, authored by Dinyar Patel is an outstanding work as the author has been successful in maintaining a strict balance in describing Naoroji. Naoroji, was the real Father of the Nation. But he was sidelined with the honorific Grand Old Man of India! It was gross injustice.

Similarly, the biography of JRD Tata "Beyond The Last Blue Mountain" by R M Lala is a splendid work. Lala could not have retired from the scene without presenting the unknown JRD to the world. There is no sycophancy or prolix throughout this book and this made it interesting. The book remains memorable as it was written by Lala, a close associate of the Grand Old Man of Indian Corporates.

Of late our politicians and businessmen have made it a point to publish their biographies by hiring writers. Needless to say that these works would

not be read even by the persons who review the same. There are people whose biographies and life-sketches should be written. This is because they serve as a beacon of light for the readers.

A biography of Nandini Satpathy, the former chief minister of Orissa has been published by Simon and Schuster and authored by Pallavi Rebbapragada, a journalist and public policy consultant based in New Delhi. It is a good mission as nothing much has been heard about Nandini Satpathy since 1980 as she withdrew from active politics and faded out since her rejoining the Congress. Nandini had an uneventful career at the Center as deputy minister for information and broadcasting. Those were the days when Akashvani was described as Indirawani because the babus in Mandi House preferred to pay obeisance to the Prime Minister than their profession as broadcasters.

Nandini returned to Orissa in 1972 and was crowned as chief minister at the instance of Indira Gandhi. Her tenure saw hundreds getting imprisoned for questioning the declaration of internal emergency. By December 1976, towards the fag end of emergency, Nandini quit the Congress along with Jagjivan Ram, Chandra Sekhar, Mohan Dharia and Hemavati Nandan Bahuguna to form Congress For Democracy. The slogan coined by the opponents of Indira Gandhi at that period read like this: "Jagjivan Poyi, Jivan Poyi, Bahuguna Poyi, Gunavum Poyi, Nandini Poyi,

Nanavum Poyi" which was the Malayalam for "With Jagjivan's exit, the party lost its life, With Bahuguna's exit, the party lost quality and with Nandini gone, the party lost the last vestige of whatever reputation". To be candid, Nandini Satpathy's name hogged the national limelight when she left the Congress party.

Had she been effective as chief minister of Orissa, the State should have made giant strides in development and progress. But Orissa remains one of the least developed regions in India. A thorough probe should be held on how the politicians managed to make Orissa remain as a poverty stricken State despite its vast natural resources and sufficient assistance from the Center.

The author has used theatrics in the narration to sell Satpathy to the readers. Her claim that Nandini Satpathy was the Iron Lady of Orissa is far-fetched. The designation Iron Lady was used by international experts to describe Gold Meir, the fourth Prime Minister of the State of Israel (1969-1974). Perhaps, the over dependence on TV anchorpersons might have put the author in a minefield of wrong information. Biju Patnaik would have been an ideal topic for her to write about since not much has been written about the titan from Eastern India.





Suhanaa Setty's debut book, *Invisible - Hands of the Indian Economy*, is a compelling and insightful examination of the often-overlooked contributions of women to India's economy. 
reminder of the importance of recognising and valuing work that sustains the economy but is frequently taken for granted.

While Setty's book does not offer specific policy recommendations, it

effectively prompts readers to question entrenched societal norms and economic assumptions. By raising questions about why certain types of work are valued over others, the book encourages a broader discussion on how to more accurately reflect the value of all forms of labour in economic metrics.

Invisible - Hands of the Indian Economy is a significant and thought-provoking addition to the discourse on gender, economics, and social justice. Setty's ability to blend emotional storytelling with a critical examination of economic systems makes this book a powerful call to action. It urges readers to acknowledge and value the invisible labour that supports both families and the broader economy. 
DRAUPADI'S MEMOIRS

A new perspective on mythic fiction

In *The Empress of Indraprastha*, Sonali Rajee brings a refreshing contemporary voice to one of the most complex female characters in Indian epics - Draupadi writes **SANJAY CHANDRA**

Through her first-person narrative, Rajee explores the layers of Draupadi's life, from her enigmatic marriage to the five Pandavas to her strategic foresight in a hostile world. With easy-to-follow language and modern mythic fiction style, Rajee's debut offers a fresh take on ancient tales, appealing to readers of all ages. Draupadi is one of the most polarizing characters in Indian epics—adored and maligned in equal measure. Her silent acceptance of her mother-in-law Kunti's words, which made her the shared wife of five men, remains puzzling to many. Equally difficult to comprehend are her dismissive remarks towards Karna, rejecting him as low-born

during her swayamvar, despite her intelligence. *The Empress of Indraprastha*, the first book in Sonali Rajee's five-part series, opens with preparations for Draupadi's wedding. Draupadi recalls her mother's empowering words: she has the right to refuse any suitor, even if they succeed in the challenges set for her swayamvar. Her mother's strength leaves a deep impression on Draupadi, shaping her into a strong-willed woman. The story also introduces her twin brother Dhrishtadyumna, both born from a sacred fire, and Shikhandi, her older transgender sibling, who leads the army—an indication of the gender inclusivity of their times. The swayamvar becomes a pivotal



moment when Draupadi refuses to let Karna attempt the challenge, leading to Arjuna's triumph. However, Draupadi's life takes an unexpected turn when Kunti unknowingly orders her sons to share whatever they have brought home, including Draupadi. While shocked by this command, Draupadi soon realizes the deeper need for unity among the brothers to navigate a dangerous world. Her acceptance is portrayed as both strategic and pragmatic. As the story unfolds, Draupadi's foresight comes into play. She repeatedly urges her husbands to seek partition, a move that eventually grants them a kingdom—though not as they imagined. The

Pandavas are given Khandavaprastha, a barren wasteland, but with confidence in their abilities, they set out to build a mighty empire. Sonali Rajee's *The Empress of Indraprastha* is told in the first person, offering Draupadi's own perspective on the events of her life. The 138-page book, part of a new genre of contemporary mythic-fiction, is accessible and engaging for readers of all ages. Rajee's scientific background and experience as an associate professor of chemistry add a unique depth to her storytelling, especially in revisiting a subject that has been explored by many authors before her.

Retail inflation rises to 3.65 per cent, remains within RBI target

Retail inflation marginally increased to 3.65 per cent in August and remained within the Reserve Bank's target of 4 per cent, the government data showed on Thursday.

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) based retail inflation was 3.6 per cent in July 2024 and 6.83 per cent in August 2023. Inflation in the food basket was 5.66 per cent in August, marginally up from 5.42 per cent in July, according to the data released by the National Statistical Office (NSO). The inflation also was below 4 per cent on either side.

The government has tasked the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to ensure that the CPI inflation remains at 4 per cent with a margin of 2 per cent on either side. The combined inflation (rural and urban) fell to 3.65 in August 2024, compared to 6.83 in August 2023. However, it has increased by 110 basis points when compared to the previous month's 3.54%. This was the second time in nearly five years that overall retail inflation fell below the Reserve Bank of India's 4%



inflation target. The last time was July 2024.

The RBI's inflation target is 4% with a tolerance band of +/- 2 percentage points, meaning that the target is within the range of 2% to 6%. Urban inflation fell to 3.14% in August 2024, compared to 6.59% in August 2023. Rural inflation fell to 4.16% in August 2024, compared to 7.02% in August 2023. The combined Consumer Food Price Index (CFPI), which shows food inflation was 5.66% in August 2024, compared to 9.94% in August 2023. Urban food inflation fell to 4.99% in August 2024, compared to 10.42% in August 2023. Rural food inflation fell to 6.02% in August 2024,

compared to 9.67% in August 2023. Tomatoes have exhibited the lowest year on year inflation (-47.91%) as well as lowest MoM change in index (-28.8%). The prices of vegetables rose the most by 10.71%, compared to the other item categories. In urban areas, the rise was 13.22% and in rural areas, it was 13.22%. Bihar witnessed the highest combined inflation among all Indian states in August 2024 at 6.62%, followed by Odisha at 5.63% and Assam at 5.03%. On the other hand, Telangana had the lowest combined inflation of 2.02% followed by Uttarakhand at 2.37% and Delhi at 2.52%.

Nifty hits lifetime high

Benchmark Sensex hit the historic 83,000 level for the first time on Thursday and the Nifty settled at a lifetime high after a rally in blue-chip shares, surge in global markets and foreign fund inflows.

A sharp fag-end rally drove the 30-share BSE Sensex to the 83,000 level for the first time. The barometer surged 1,593.03 points or 1.95 per cent to hit its lifetime intraday peak of 83,116.19 in the last hour of trade. The index closed at a record high of 82,962.71, up by 1,439.55 points or 1.77 per cent.

The NSE Nifty surged 470.45 points or 1.89 per cent to settle at a record closing high of 25,388.90. The benchmark hit its fresh all-time intra-day high of

25,433.35, a jump of 514.9 points or 2 per cent. Nifty and Sensex opened higher and traded in a range till late afternoon trade.

Among the 30 Sensex firms, Bharti Airtel, NTPC, JSW Steel, Mahindra & Mahindra, Adani Ports, Tech Mahindra, Larsen & Toubro, Tata Steel, State Bank of India and Kotak Mahindra Bank were the biggest gainers.

Nestle emerged as the only laggard from the blue-chip pack. While the session remained subdued for the most part, strong buying in heavyweight stocks across sectors propelled the indices sharply upward in the final hours,

Harmanpreet's brace hands India 3-1 win over Korea in ACT hockey

Skipper Harmanpreet Singh scored a brace as defending champions India beat Korea 3-1 to register their fourth consecutive win at the Hero Asian Champions Trophy here on Thursday.

Paris Olympics bronze medalist India had defeated China 3-0, Japan 5-0 before thrashing last years runner-up Malaysia 8-1.

Already assured of a semifinal berth, India will play arch-rivals Pakistan on Saturday in their last league match in the six-team competition.

The top four teams from the league stages will qualify for the semifinals scheduled on Monday, while the final will be played next Tuesday.

India continued their fine form and struck twice early in the first quarter to take a 2-0 lead. Arajiet Singh Hundal, who scored a brace against Malaysia, scored the first goal in the eighth minute before Harmanpreet, regarded as one of the worlds best dragflickers, converted two penalty corners in the ninth and 43rd minutes. Korea's lone goal was scored by Jihun Yang in the 30th minute from a penalty corner.

As has been the case in the tournament so far, the Indians started on an aggressive note with Arajiet handing his side the lead with a brilliant strike after being fed by Sukhjeet Singh.

A minute later, the promising Raj Kumar Pal, who struck a hat-trick against Malaysia on Wednesday, earned a penalty corner for India and captain Harmanpreet converted the chance with a powerful dragflick.

Indias reserve goalkeeper Suraj Karkera was impressive under the bar, denying Korea on a few occasions in the second quarter.

After an impressive first quarter, the Indians seemed to have gone into a shell in the next 15 minutes as Korea dominated the proceedings with continuous forays on the rival citadel.

The Indian defence stood tall until Korea pulled a goal just at the stroke of half-time through Yang whose effort went into the net after getting a deflection from Manpreet Singhs stick from a penalty corner opportunity.

The Koreans secured back-to-back penalty corners in the 35th minute but India defended bravely.

India secured their second penalty corner two minutes later but wasted the chance.

The holders managed to restore their two-goal lead in the 43rd minute when Harmanpreet scored with a powerful low flick to the left of the Korean goalkeeper Jaehan Kim.

At the start of the fourth quarter, Jarnanpreet Singh conceded a penalty corner but the Indian defence was up to the task.

Thereafter, the Indians controlled the proceedings and did not let Korea create any scoring opportunity.

Ponting also lauded the contributions of former head coach Rahul Dravid, who stepped down from the post after guiding India to the T20 World Cup title triumph in June.

"Going back to Kohlis start of captaincy, (he) played a big role in turning the cricket around, and (Rahul) Dravid has continued the same in the recent four years. The influence of someone like that (Kohli) around a team would be great, and theyve got star players," Ponting told Sky Sports.

Under Kohlis captaincy, India became the first Asian side to win a Test series



in Australia, besides recording some memorable wins elsewhere.

With his aggressive captaincy, Kohli made everyone believe that the Indian team can win overseas as well, and his confidence rubbed on the side even when he was not around.

During the last Test series in Australia in 2020-21, Kohli left for India after the first match due to the birth of his daughter Vamika. But India, under the captaincy of Ajinkya Rahane, battled injuries and the absence of key players to eke out a historic 2-1 series win.

"They won a game at the Gabba, which just doesnt happen. I think their batters adapt to overseas batting conditions very well.

"I dont think theyre as daunted by the Gabba or the Optus Oval as they maybe once were. Maybe it is a selection thing, or they just dont fear the big stage anymore," observed Ponting.

During Kohlis tenure, India won 40 matches and lost 17, with 11 ending

in draws out of the 68 Tests they played.

This time around, Kohli will tour Australia under longtime India colleague Rohit Sharmas captaincy.

"Their fast-bowling depth is great. The leadership in the last 6-7 years has been strong."

Ponting also praised the Indian Premier League for producing players who like to play fearless cricket.

"For the last 10 years being around the IPL, Ive noticed that a lot of the young guys (play aggressively without fear) as the IPL is high-pressure. It is like a World Cup for them.

"Their batsmen are all very aggressive stroke-making players. They are not scared of failing," he concluded.

The Aussies have failed to win the Border-Gavaskar Trophy since their last series victory in 2014-15 at home. The Indians have claimed the title on four successive instances since then, winning twice each at home and away.

Mbappé rejects mediation offer in \$60M financial dispute with PSG

Kylian Mbappé is not ready to compromise with Paris Saint-Germain.

The France superstar rejected a mediation offer by the French soccer leagues legal commission on Wednesday in his dispute with his former club over wages and bonuses.

PSG officials and Mbappés representatives met in Paris after Mbappé asked the commission to get involved. Mbappé, who joined Real Madrid this summer on a free transfer, says PSG owes him 55 million euros (\$60 million).

In a statement to The Associated Press, Mbappés representatives said the player asked the commission to take note of the non-payment of three months salary and the last third of a loyalty bonus.

"The eventuality of a mediation was mentioned this morning," the statement read. "This possibility was rejected during the meeting by the players representative. A mediation would be useless to record a lack of payment that would be seen from a simple analysis of the players payroll."

PSG, which said it was pleased with the two-hour hearing at the commission on Wednesday, said in a statement it recalled that Mbappé had formerly made "clear, repeated public and private commitments that must be respected, having been afforded unprecedented benefits by the club over seven fantastic years in Paris."

PSG has argued that it does not owe money to the World Cup winner under an agreement when Mbappé was sidelined ahead of the 2023-24 season - following his decision not to prolong his contract with the club - with the player allegedly stipulating that he would



relinquish bonuses over his reintegration into the team.

"To avoid its payment obligation, the club seeks to demonstrate the existence of a secret agreement that would justify it. But the club fails to demonstrate the existence of such an agreement," Mbappés representatives said.

PSG said that the leagues legal commission recommended "mediation between the parties," which the club said it had been seeking for months. The French league did not respond to a request for comments from the AP.

The players representatives did not say what action they will now take. In light of the current deadlock, its likely the case will ultimately be settled by an employment court.

Mbappés relationship with PSG ended amid deep tensions during his final season at the club.

PSG felt let down by Mbappé after offering him the most lucrative contract in the clubs history when he signed a new contract in 2022. But Mbappé was frustrated because he felt promises to sign key players were not kept.

When he signed the new deal, he was paraded in front of

Chopra, Sable spearhead Indian challenge in Diamond League season finale

Javelin throw star Neeraj Chopra will have lofty expectations to live up to, while for steeplechaser Avinash Sable, it would be an opportunity to make up for a disappointing Olympics, when the star-studded Diamond League season finale begins here on Friday, featuring the best of world athletics.

The showpiece is spread over two days for the first time and the field features top athletes from all continents, including an unprecedented number of Olympic medal winners, who will be vying for the top honours in 32 disciplines.

Pole vault world record holder Armand DuPlantis, American sprint queen ShaCarri Richardson, and superstar hurdler Sydney McLaughlin-Levrone are among the big names who will light up the King Baudouin Stadium here.

National record-holding 3000m steeplechaser Sable, after finishing 11th in the Olympic Games, will be in action on Friday in his maiden appearance in the DL season finale.

Chopra, who added a silver to his Olympic medal tally in Paris following a historic gold in the Tokyo Games, will be aiming to end his season on a high on Saturday.

It is for the first time that a DL finale features two Indians.

Sable finished 14th in the overall Diamond League standings with three points from two meetings. But four

made the DL final cut after finishing fourth in the overall standings with 14 points from his two second-place finishes in the one-day meets held in Doha and Lausanne.

Each Diamond League season finale champion is awarded a Diamond Trophy, USD 30,000 prize money and a wild card for the World Athletics

Championships. The runner-up gets USD 12,000.

Chopra skipped the last series meet in Zurich last week.

The 26-year-old finished two points behind Czechias Jakub Vadlech. Grenadians Anderson Peters and German star Julian Weber took the top two spots with 29 and 21 points respectively. Chopra has been
