n a scathing attack on Congress, Prime Minister Narendra Modi Saturday said now it is not the same old party and has become new form of urban Naxal.

Modi also dubbed the Congress as the biggest "dishonest and deceitful" party in the country.

Slamming the grand old party, Modi said "Its politics today has reduced to spreading "falsehoods and anarchy" in the country". Terming the party anti-Dalit

and anti-farmer, Prime Modi Minister stated, "Congress family is the biggest anti-OBĆ, anti-ST and anti-SC; they always hated Babasaheb Ambedkar. Who knows Congress's anti-Dalit stance better than Every Haryana? time Congress forms Government in Haryana, Dalits face hardships?

He said the Congress feels no shame in defaming the country for defaming the BJP. "So you have to be wary of the Congress and their

associates? Kicking off his party's campaign in Haryana by addressing a poll rally in Kurukshetra, he questioned the track record of Congress and said it talks big when it comes to farmers. "If the Congress has the guts, why don't they implement their farmer schemes in Karnataka

and Telangana," Modi said. Modi said the Congress has come to power in Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka and Telangana by making false promises, and has now "destroyed" the States which used to be prosperous. People now repent voting for the Congress in these States, he

said.
"The Congress made hue and cry over Minimum Support Price (MSP), I ask them how many crops they buy at MSP in Congress ruled States-Karnataka and Telangana? Those who trusted Congress are now regretting it. Their only agenda is to empty public coffers to win elections. Just witness the condition of Punjab. The people of Haryana must keep such parties far from power," Modi said. "Did any farmer receive money in their accounts during Congress rule?" Prime Minister asked. Polling for the 90 assembly seats in Haryana will be held on October 5 and the votes will be counted on October 8. Addressing the rally, Modi said, "Two years ago, the Congress Government was formed in Himachal Pradesh. But what is the situation there No citizen of today? Himachal is happy today. Congress fed lies to every section there but none of the promises made were fulfilled." Under the Kissan Samman Nidhi, more than Rs 3.25 lakh crore has been deposited in

head of the maiden visit of APrime Minister Narendra Modi to address an election rally in the land-locked Doda district on Saturday, two soldiers of the Indian army sacrificed their lives while two others received injuries during a counter-terrorism operation in the Chatroo area of

Kishtwar on Friday.

In another overnight operation launched in the kreeri area of North Kashmir's Baramulla district, three terrorists were gunned down by the joint team of security forces on Saturday. The security forces were able to neutralise a group of hiding terrorists after identifying their exact locations inside the building with the help of drone With this, the cameras. number terrorists eliminated in the last three anti terrorist operations have gone

up to seven. Chinar Corps of the Indian army in a post on X confirmed, "Three terrorists have been neutralised by the security forces in the ongoing Operation. Weapons and warlike stores have been recovered. The Chinarcorps has dealt some crippling blows to the terror network in North Kashmir over the past few days with significant recoveries and elimination of terrorists, inspiring confidence and assurance for upcoming events

scheduled in the region". Before the day ended, another army personnel was injured in an encounter with terrorists attempting to infiltrate across the Line of Control (LoC) in Rajouri district.

According to a spokesman of the Nagrota-based White Knight Corps of the Indian army, "Based on the intelligence inputs, a joint operation with J and K Police was launched in Chatroo at Kishtwar. A contact was established and a scout leading the patrol exchanged heavy volume of fire with the terrorists at around 3.30 pm on

Friday. In the ensuing firefight, four army personnel were injured. Later two soldiers who have been identified as Naib Subedar Vipan Kumar and Ārvind Singh succumbed to their fatal injuries during treatment at the military hospital.

It is believed these Pakistani terrorists belong to the Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) terrorist outfit and were responsible for the terror attack on the Indian army in the Desa forest area of Kishtwar on 16 July.

An Indian army captain along with three other soldiers was 'killed in action' during a fierce firefight in the area. mortal Meanwhile, the

remains of the soldiers were dispatched to their native places after a solemn wreath laying ceremony.

"GOC (General Officer Commanding) White Knight Corps and all ranks salute the supreme sacrifice of the bravehearts; offer deepest condolences to the families," the Army said. Naib Subedar Vipan Kumar,



Joshi takes up issue of pay disparity in Armed forces with Rajnath Singh

Soldier Welfare minister of Uttarakhand Ganesh Joshi met the Defence minister Rajnath Singh in New Delhi on Saturday. In the meeting Joshi took up the issue of salary disparity in different ranks in the Indian army. Joshi requested that the salary multiplication factor of the basic pay as mentioned in the 7th pay commission form Jawans to the Junior Commissioned Officers (JCO) should be revised. He informed the Union minister that in the 7th pay commission a multiplication factor of 2.57 is used for salary calculation of the armed forces personnel below the officer ranks. Joshi said that for Lieutenant, Captain, Major and Lt Colonel a factor of 2.62 is used and for the ranks above lieitenant colonel



a multiplication factor of 2.72 is used. Joshi said that the gap in the salaries of Jawans and officers in the army has increased due to less multiplication factor of Jawans and JCOs. He requested Singh to necessary corrective measures. He also invited the Union minister to visit Uttarakhand. Joshi presented a kit of organic products of Uttarakhand, a silk shawl and sapling of Tulsi to Singh.

Streamline process of claim payment in SHA: Hyanki

The State Health Authority **▲** (SHA) is planning to streamline the process of payment of the claims made by the hospitals under the Ayushman scheme. In a meeting of the SHA held on Friday, the newly appointed chairper-son AS Hyanki directed the officers that the payment of the claims made by the hospitals should be done within the stipulated time period. He said that the pending cases of claims of the listed hospitals under the Ayushman scheme should be disposed of as early as possible. ITBP jawan and porter rescued after 36 hour in cave near Indo-China border

Ajawan of the Indo-Ti-betan Border Police and a porter who had gone missing while patrolling near the Indo-China border were rescued after 36 hours on Saturday. The soldier and porter, who got lost after patrolling with their comrades, spent more than a day in a cave during snowfall in the high altitude region. The rescue team found them 84 kilometres from Munsiyari and brought

A team of ITBP soldiers left from Munsiyari on Thursday to patrol the stretch of the Indo-China border from Pithoragarh to Milam in Kumaon to Malari in Garhwal. ITBP jawan Anil Ram and porter Devendra Singh from Valthi in Munsyari went missing during the patrol. Both of them could not be found anywhere amid heavy snowfall. The rescue team continued searching for them in vain.

The rescue team finally reached them after 36 hours on Saturday morning. According to information received, the duo lost their way due to heavy snowfall in the high altitude region. They spent the night in a cave near Bamras amidst heavy snowfall. Both were rescued and brought to Milam. Sub divisional magsitrate Shrestha Gunsola said that the two men are safe now. The ITBP team conducted the search and rescue operation in an area covered in more than four feet of snow.

The Ministry of Consumer Affairs on Saturday said the government's subsidised onion sale initiative, launched on September 5, has led to price drops in major cities within

In Delhi, retail onion price fell from Rs 60 to Rs 55 per kg, while Mumbai saw a decrease from Rs 61 to Rs 56 per kg. In Chennai, the retail price reduced from Rs 65 to Rs 58 per kg, the ministry said in a statement. The government initiated the sale of onions at a subsidised rate of Rs 35 per kg through mobile vans and outlets of NCCF and NAFED. The program, which began in Delhi and Mumbai, has since expanded to other major cities including Chennai, Kolkata, Patna, Ranchi, Bhubaneswar, and Guwahati. Responding to the growing demand, the government has decided to increase the quantity of subsidised onion and expand dise-commerce platforms, Kendriya Bhandar outlets, and Mother Dairy's SAFAL stores. The government has also initiated wholesale disposal of onion in major cities

It has already commenced in Delhi, Mumbai, and Chennai, with plans to extend to Hyderabad, Bengaluru and Kolkata and eventually all state capitals.

A dual transportation strategy involving both road and rail networks is being implemented to improve logistics efficiency and reduce post-harvest losses. The Department of Consumer Affairs is working closely with state governments to ensure targeted supply based on demand and price trends. With a buffer stock of 4.7 lakh tonne of onions and increased kharif sowing area compared to the previous year, "the government expects onion prices to remain under control in the coming months," the ministry said. The combination of enhanced retail and bulk sale strategies is anticipated to stabilize prices and ensure widespread availability of affordable onions, it added.The department has been monitoring price for 22 essential commodities (rice, (arhar) dal, urad dal, moong dal, masur dal, sugar, gur, groundnut oil, mustard oil, vanaspati, sunflower oil, soya oil, palm oil, tea, milk, potato, onion, tomato and salt).

No floor price for basmati rice, onion exports


In a significant step to boost export of basmati rice, a premier GI variety rice of India, the government has removed the floor price on export of basmati rice and onions, a move that will ensure good returns to farmers, ministry of commerce and industry said in a notification on Saturday.

Hailing it, Home Minister Amit Shah said the Narendra Modi government is increasing exports to ensure fair price to the farmers for their crops so that they can get maximum price for their crops.

Shah also said keeping the interests of farmers paramount, the government has taken three important decisions, including removing the minimum export price (MEP) of onions and Basmati rice.

The Modi government has decided to remove the minimum export price (MEP) on onions and reduce the export duty from 40 per cent to 20 per cent. This will increase onion income of the onion producing farmers," he wrote on social media in Hindi.

The home minister said the government has also decided to abolish the MEP on Basmati



farmers producing Basmati rice to earn more profits by exporting it. "Also, the Modi government

has decided to increase the import duty on crude palm, soya and sunflower oils from 12.5 per cent to 32.5 per cent and the duty on their refined oils from 13.75 per cent to 35.75 per cent. This will help India's soyabean farmers get better prices for their crop and increase their income," he said. The Pakistan government is preparing to roll out a comprehensive judicial reforms package in Parliament amid speculation about legis-lation to extend the retirement age of superior court judges, according to a media report on Saturday.

With at least 22 amendments on the docket, these changes are set to overhaul the justice system and revamp the process of appointing the chief justice of the Supreme Court, The Express Tribune newspaper reported, quoting sources. The Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N)-led government has plans to introduce these reforms as early as Sunday, according to the

The proposal's centrepiece is introducing a new appointment process for the chief justice. Under the proposed changes, the parliamentary changes, the parliamentary committee and judicial commission could be merged.

Instead of automatically appointing the senior-most judge, a panel of five senior judges would be sent to the prime minister, who would have the final say. The gov-ernment believes the current practice of appointing the senior-most judge encourages lobbying within the judiciary, allowing the Chief Justice to manipulate the seniority list to favour his preferred succes-

By giving this decision-making power to the prime minister, the government hopes to curb internal politicking within the judiciary.

The reform package also includes a proposal to allow transfers of judges from one high court to another, a move that would increase flexibility within the judicial system. However, one key issue raising the retirement age of judges remains a bone of contention, with no agreement reached as of yet. Despite some disagreements, all coalition parties are reportedly in agreement on the core judicial reforms.

In a recent statement, right-wing Islamic leader Maulana Fazlur Rehman of the Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam-Fazl (JUI-F) indicated that if a reform package on judicial matters is presented, it will be carefully considered.

Sources indicate that the government is keeping its cards close to its chest. Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has discussed the package with a tight circle, including senior Pakistan Peoples Party leadership, but the rest of the coalition has yet to receive a full briefing.

It appears that the government is preparing to throw this package into the National Assembly with little prior information, ensuring the element of surprise.

If passed, the reforms could mark a seismic shift in the country's judiciary, shaking up long-established procedures and leaving a lasting impact on how the judicial and executive branches interact.

The government took an unusual step on Friday as it summoned sessions of both the National Assembly and Senate on a holiday – Saturday.

The hurriedly-called session has given further rise to speculations that the ruling alliance might introduce judicial reforms or constitutional amendments.

While Defence Minister Khawaja Asif reportedly asserted that the government is all set to table a 'constitutional amendment' in the assembly on Saturday as it has achieved the 'magic number', Minister for Law and Justice Azam Nazir Tarar reportedly denied that the government is likely to go for any constitu-

Despite the contradictory statements, the notion is that the government is likely to make some constitutional changes, such as increasing the retirement age of judges. Such a move can lead to an extension in the tenure of incumbent Chief Justice Qazi Faez Isa, who is set to retire on October 25, upon reaching the age of superannuation - 65

Though Chief Justice Isa has expressed that he was not interested in a person-specific extension, experts closely monitoring political and judicial developments say that cial developments say that this varied statement has kept the door open for an exten-

Currently, the retirement age of Supreme Court judges is 65, while the same for high court judges is 62. Reports and statements by different law-makers in Parliament suggest that the government intends to increase the retirement age of Supreme Court judges to 68 and high court judges to

The debate about constitu-tional amendment was triggered soon after the Supreme Court's landmark decision on July 12 in favour of jailed former prime minister Imran Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) about the allocation of reserved seats in national and other assemblies. The decision deprived the ruling alliance of a twothirds majority.

The ruling coalition would need to meet the required number of 224 out of 336 members of the National Assembly and 64 out of 96 in the Senate to get the twothirds majority to pass the constitutional amendment. Currently, the ruling party lacks a two-thirds majority in both houses, which is required for passing a constitutional


Since ancient times, Nanda Devi is being venerated in Uttarakhand as the patron goddess and the Naina Devi Mandir cradled in Nainital is a sacred shrine dedicated to the goddess.

The present temple came up in 1883 after the old one was razed in the devastating landslide of 1880. Since its foundation, it saw repeated expansions till it became what it is now. Devotees in their hordes



from across India and even abroad throng this sacred shrine to pay obeisance to the goddess and the Nanda Devi Mahotsav sees the collective devotion for the Divine Mother reach its pinnacle. The 122th edition of the festival is now underway with goddesses sister Nanda and Sunanda being worshipped with devotion and dedication. The facial representations goddesses Nanda and Sunanda are made from Kadli (plantain stems) and bamboo while organic colours are used. Bamboo is used to craft the eyebrows. Appropriate and attractive natural colours are used to paint the deities.

Thereafter, the faces are adorned with ornaments. These include crowns made of silver, gold crafted ornaments for forehead, earrings and nath (traditional nose ring) among other items. After the crafting and decorating processes are completed, the idols are reverentially

Harmanpreet double drives India 2-1 win over Pakistan in ACT hockey

Harmanpreet Singh made the difference as he converted two penalty corners to hand unbeaten India a close 2-1 win over arch-rivals Pakistan in their final league match of the Hero Asian Champions Trophy hockey tournament here on Saturday

It was India's fifth consecutive win in the six-team roundrobin competition.

Pakistan took the lead through Ahmad Nadeem minute) before Harmanpreet (13th, 19th) converted two penalty corners to lead India to win. It was Pakistan's first loss in this tournament.

Both India and Pakistan have already qualified for the semifinals. The victory also enabled India to maintain their supremacy over Pakistan since 2016.

In their previous meeting at the Hangzhou Asian Games last year, India thrashed Pakistan 10-2. A few months before that, the Indians beat

Pakistan 4-0 during the Chennai edition of the ACT. At the Asia Cup in Jakarta (2022), a relatively young Indian side held Pakistan to a 1-1 draw while at the 2021 ACT in Dhaka, India defeated Pakistan 4-3 to clinch the bronze medal.

As like any Indo-Pak hockey match, the first quarter saw end-to-end action with both the teams giving their all to gain the bragging rights.

The Indians started brightly dominating the early share of exchanges but Pakistan grew in confidence as the match progressed. India were at the receiving end

for the first time in the tournament when Pakistan drew the first blood.

It was a selfless Hannan Shahid whose brilliant work from the midfield split the Indian defence and Nadeem found himself at the right place to direct the ball into the Indian goal.

A stunned India kept up their composure and patiently built their attacks and secured their first penalty corner in the 13th



Harmanpreet scored with a powerful drag-flick to the left of a hapless Pakistan goalkeeper Munneb. The Indians continued to

press in the second quarter and gained their second penalty corner in the 19th minute and once again Pakistan defence had no answer as Harmanpreet was bang on target as India went

While India were the better side in terms of possession in the second quarter, Pakistan also had their chances, penetrating the rival circle on quite a few occasions. Just 45 seconds from half-time

Pakistan had an opportunity to draw level through a penalty corner but they wasted the chance as Sufyan Khan's flick, which hit the top of the bar, was rejected for a raised ball.

Indians sustained possession after the change of ends and secured their third penalty corner in the 37th minute, but Pakistan defended

attacks helped Pakistanis to bag four penalty corners in

quick succession but lacked the firepower to breach the Indian defence. In the last quarter, both the sides stitched relentless

attacks and India secured three more penalty corners but failed to convert. The match also witnessed a

heated encounter between Harmanpreet and Pakistan's Ashraf Waheed Rana after the latter shouldered Jugraj Singh inside the Indian circle.

Jugraj was felled by the impact and was seen grimacing in pain. Harmanpreet and Jarmanpreet Singh were quick to counter the offender. The on-field umpires and

Pakistan captain Butt and other players of both teams rushed in to control the situation but Rana was shown vellow card, which resulted in a 10-minute suspension after the umpire went for a referral for a serious misconduct. Meanwhile, in the first match







PARA ATHLETES BASK IN GLORY AND GOLD

The accomplishments of para athletes at Paris Paralympics are not just sporting success but a story of grit and determination, a story of indomitable spirit that soars high despite hardships and challenges, writes RISHABH MALIK

he Paris 2024 Paralympics will go down as one of the most celebrated sporting moments in India's history. The Indian contingent's extraordinary performances were not just a display of athletic prowess but also a powerful reminder of human resilience, willpower, and the ability to triumph against all odds. From setting new records to inspiring millions, the Indian athletes left a remarkable imprint on the global stage. India's Paralympians wasted no time in making their presence felt at Paris 2024. In 12 days of competition India registered 29 medals includes 7 gold, 9 silver, and 13 bronze. India's medal count marked significant landmark and breakthroughs in Indian history of Paralympics. India's first medal in the Paralympics

came in the 1972 Games, with Murlikant Petkar winning a gold medal in swimming. Up to the recent 2024 Games, India have won 60 medals across all Paralympic Games, with the most successful Paralympic campaign being the Paris 2024 Games with 29

Shooting has traditionally been one of India's strong suits in both the Olympic and Paralympic arenas. In Paris, India's para-shooters continued their stellar run from previous Games. Avani Lekhara, a name that had already become synonymous with Indian Paralympic shooting, won gold in the women's 10m air rifle standing SH1 category. Avani's calm demeanor and laser-focused concentration were on full display as she once again climbed to the top of the podium. This win made her a two-time Paralympic champion and reinforced her place among the world's elite shooters.

India's shooting success didn't end there. Manish Narwal, competing in the men's 10m air SH1 pistol event, clinched silver, narrowly missing out on gold. His performance was another testament to India's dominance in precision sports, along with Rubina Francis in the same women's 10m air pistol category clinched bronze in shooting.

India witnessed some historic milestone in the paralympics event, For the first time India won 17 medals in athletics, with Dharambir winning gold and Pranav Soorma taking silver in the men's club throw F51 event. Dharambir also established a new Asian record of 34.92 metres. Later, Praveen Kumar set an Asian record by winning the high jump T64 championship, giving India its sixth gold medal at the Paralympics. Mariyappan Thangavelu became the first Indian to win medals at three successive Paralympic Games when he won a

bronze in the T42 high jump event. He took home silver in Tokyo 2020 and gold in Rio 2016. With a personal best time, Preethi Pal won bronze in the women's 100-meter T35 competition. It was the first-ever medal for India in a Paralympic track event. Being the only athlete from India to win two medals at the Games, her bronze in the 200m made her the most successful competitor. 




