Addressing an impressive poll rally after conducting a road show in the Katra township, base camp of Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine, PM Modi said, "Nobody is giving them (Congress and National Conference) any importance here But in Pakistan, inki balle balle ho rahi hai (they are

being celebrated)? Modi also accused the alliance partners of aligning with Pakistan's interests. The Prime Minister's remarks follow Pakistan's Defence Minister Khwaja Asif's statement in an interview in which he said that Pakistan and the NC-Congress alliance were on the same page on the restoration of Article

"They (Congress-National Conference) are declaring that they will bring back Article 370. They want to return to the of bloodshed. The neighbouring country is asking questions about it. Pakistan seems to be happy with the Congress - National Conference's manifesto. The Defence Minister of Pakistan has openly supported it. The agenda of Congress and the National Conference aligns with Pakistan's agenda," PM Modi said at the rally in Katra. He said that Pakistan has itself exposed the Congress and the National Conference. He went on to say that the BJP government will not allow the implementation of Pakistan's agenda in Jammu and Kashmir.

"Pakistan itself has exposed the Congress and the National Conference. They wanted to implement Pakistan's agenda here... We will not allow the implementation of Pakistan's agenda in Jammu and Kashmir. No power in the world can bring back Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir".

PM Modi also sounded a note of caution saying that a vote for Congress would lead to the reinstatement of Article 370, which he said would pave the way for violence to return to the Valley.

"Every vote given to Congress will implement the manifesto

of PDP and NC. PM Modi said that the upcoming elections will be a turning point for the region, framing the choice as one that will define the future of Jammu

and Kashmir. This election is

about choosing Jammu and Kashmir's future, " PM Modi

Addressing another rally earlier inside the fortified Sheri-Kashmir stadium in Srinagar PM Modi praised the high voter turnout in the first phase stating that it represents a rejection of parties that 'sympathise with stone pelters and terrorists.

Modi said that the three families want to deprive Kashmiris of their fundamental rights, and that "it is their agenda from the very start."The three families, Modi said, think they shouldn't be questioned, "but, J&K will not remain in the grab of these

"They have only given violence to the people of J&K," he said as he continued his attack against them.

The youth of J&K, Modi said, is now challenging dynastic politics. "It is the same youth that these parties didn't allow to move forward," Modi said. "The three families considered

J&K politics as their family property. They didn't let anyone else take the stage". This is why, Modi said, these families stopped the Panchayat elections from happening as

elections from happening as they thought new people would come and replace them. This resulted in youth losing trust in democracy, Modi said.

"They thought whether they would vote or not, power would remain with these three families.


Modi in his trademark style questioned the audience about the past, saying, "Do you remember how elections used to take place in the past"? Everything closed down after evening while door-to-door campaigning was not possible, said Modi. Your rights were snatched while they lived in luxury," Modi highlighted.

This is the first time, Modi said that the elections in J&K are not being held under the "shadow of terrorism."

Naming prominent religious places in the valley namely Hazratbal shrine, Chrar-i-Sharief, Khwaja Sahab's Shrine, Shankaracharya, and Kheer Bawani temple, Modi said that during the reign of three families, these places of sanctity weren't safe either.

"Film shooting was barred, cinemas were locked, while hoisting tricolour in Lal Chowk was equal to playing with fire. However, the picture has changed now,"

Modi said. Before, going to Lal Chowk was scary, but today, there is a buzz till late evening. From shopkeepers to Shikara wala (boatman), everyone earning his livelihood with ease now, claimed the Prime

hief minister Pushkar Singh Dhami averred that the people of Jammu and Kashmir have understood the reality of the Congress, National Conference and PDP and that they will uproot them completely in the Assembly elections. Dhami held a road show and addressed a public meeting at Basholi, Jammu and Kashmir in support of BJP candidate Darshan Singh on Thursday.

He said that India is moving forward as a world leader under Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Dhami said that in last 10 years the country has moved forward in the fields of health, roads, railway and infrastructure development. India has now become the fifth largest economy of the world and now PM Modi has taken a pledge to make the country the biggest economy of the world.

Dhami said that after abrogation of Article 370 of the constitution, PM has moved forward with mantra of Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas and Sabka Vishwas in Jammu and Kashmir. He said that projects

DGP commits to making Uttarakhand police a model of sustainability issue of drug trafficking and

A bhinav Kumar, an IPS officer of the 1997 batch, took charge as the director general of police on November 30, 2023, becoming the 12th DGP of Uttarakhand and one of the youngest DGPs in the country. In an exclusive interaction with Purnima Bisht of The Pioneer, Kumar shared insights on his achievements over the past 10 months while addressing crucial issues like strengthening women's safety and curbing the rising threat of cyber crimes. He also shared his vision for further enhancing the efficiency and capabilities of the State's po-

What measures has the police taken to ensure the safety of both tourists and locals amid increasing tourism in Uttarakhand?

The surge in tourism has indeed put pressure on the infrastructure, particularly in terms of traffic management and road safety. The rise in the number of restaurants, hotels and cafes has exacerbated traffic congestion in popular areas. While the fluctuating tourist population continues to grow, the corresponding expansion of the road network has not happened due to geographical limitations in certain areas. We are currently formulating plans to increase the deployment of police personnel dedicated solely to managing tourist zones. This will help ensure smoother traffic flow, faster response times during emergencies and enhanced safety in general.

The State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) has been doing commendable work during disasters. What is being done to ensure timely access to accident sites and additional resources to enhance their ef-

The SDRF is being consistently trained and upgraded in terms of skills, technology and equipment. Given Uttarakhand's challenging geography, timely response can be difficult, but we are actively working to address these issues. Work is in progress to ensure our teams have the necessary resources to respond more efficiently in remote and mountainous areas. We have also marked land for an SDRF battalion in Almora. We are hopeful that construction will commence by the end of this year, which will significantly improve our disaster response capabilities in the Kumaon area.

What steps are planned or have been taken to tackle increasing cyber crime in Uttarakhand?

Regular training sessions are held to ensure officers are well-equipped to handle cyber crimes. One of our major initiatives is the establishment of a national-level Cyber Crime Centre of Excellence in Dehradun, which will further enhance the police's capability to tackle cyber criminals by providing spe-cialised training and technological support.

You are approaching one year as the Uttarakhand DGP. What would you say are your key achievements, and what challenges remain to be addressed?

transformative.

Also, we are working on ensuring promotions for about 30 officers to the rank of deputy superintendent of police after nine years of service to recognise their dedication and contributions, which will also improve policing. Improving the experience for female victims and complainants at police stations is also a priority. We are setting up dedicated areas in each station to ensure women feel comfortable and secure while discussing their issues. Addressing traffic and parking challenges is also a priority and we are actively working



My primary focus has been on ensuring swift and effective action, particularly in cases involving crimes against women and children. A highlevel committee dedicated to curbing crimes against women was recently established to ensure that perpetrators face strict and timely justice. I have also emphasised professional conduct within the Police department, especially in addressing concerns about the mistreatment of female police personnel by their male colleagues. It is unacceptable in every profession and we have put mechanisms in place to ensure that any complaints of harassment are taken seriously and dealt with immediately to create a safer and more respectful working environment for women in the police.

The government recently announced an allocation of Rs 100 crore annually to improve police housing and develop necessary facilities. Separate housing is also being constructed for the families of police personnel deployed in border areas, ensuring their children have access to quality education and a safe living environment. I also have a vision to make the Uttarakhand police a green Police by reducing our carbon footprint and integrating renewable energy sources wherever possible. The groundwork for this has already begun, and while it will take a few more years, I believe the outcomes will be towards solutions in that re-

Since you took over as DGP, it has been observed that the police are no longer hesitant to engage in encounters when necessary, unlike before. How do you view this shift?

Following the 2009 Ranbir Singh encounter case, the Uttarakhand police entered a defensive mode, which, in my view, made the State a soft target for perpetrators, especially those from outside. The focus may have shifted too much towards friendly policing, which, while important for maintaining public trust, should not extend to criminals. My priority has been to strengthen and empower our police force, which I believe is fully capable of handling any kind of criminal threat. Friendly policing is for the public, the citizens we serve, but we must be firm and decisive when it comes to dealing with criminals. I have instructed all district police officers to act swiftly and decisively against criminal elements, including raising arms when absolutely necessary. In the past 10 months, we have conducted at least 11 encounters, two of which resulted in fatalities. However, the use of force is always a last resort, applied only when the situation demands it.

What steps are being taken to combat the growing

The focus needs to shift from merely arresting peddlers and small-time smugglers to catching the big fish who are deeply entrenched in the drug trade. To address this, the Special Task Force (STF) has been specifically directed to trace the larger networks and those orchestrating these illegal activities from behind the scenes. We are also coordinating closely with the police of neighbouring states, as most of the drugs entering Uttarakhand are trafficked from nearby areas. Cross-border collaboration will help us take stricter action against the major culprits involved.

There is also a pressing need for a comprehensive survey and systematic data collection to identify individuals struggling with addiction, as they are more vulnerable to becoming involved in crime. Arresting drug addicts and putting them in jail alongside serious criminals will only worsen the situation. Rehabilitation is key. We are planning to work on initiatives that focus on providing proper rehabilitation facilities to help addicts recover and reintegrate into society, ensuring they do not become future criminals.

With the State's demographics evolving, what is the current status of the verification drive? Are claims of Rohingyas residing in Uttarakhand also true?

The verification drive is progressing at full pace across all districts. It will continue till October, after which we will have comprehensive data available. As for the claims regarding Rohingyas in Uttarakhand, these are largely baseless rumours being spread on social media. During our verification so far, we have not encountered any Rohingya individuals residing

How do you view the noticeable rise in reports of sexual crimes against women and children in recent times?

What we are seeing is a greater willingness from victims to come forward and report such crimes. This reflects a positive shift—people now feel more empowered to approach the police. Instead of viewing it as a sudden rise in such crimes, I view it as the society evolving and women feeling comfortable speaking out. Law enforcement is also increasingly sensitised to these issues, which has led to more cases being reported and acted upon. This is a step in the right direction.

Congress leaders reject 'one nation, one election' plan

The Uttarakhand Congress has rejected the concept of one nation one election' by terming it as impractical and an attempt by the ruling BJP to divert attention from the "real is-

The leader of opposition (LoP) in the State Assembly, Yashpal Arya questioned how will the Election Commission of India be able to conduct Lok Sabha, Assembly and

ticle 356, President's rule can be imposed in the states and in such a situation, due to unexpected reversal in the political equation of the concerned state, the possibility of reelection arises. All these circumstances are completely opposite to the one nation one election concept," he said.

Arya added that the concept will also increase the threat to the diversity of



local body elections in the entire country simultaneously when it struggles to conduct Assembly elections in just four States simultaneously. He added that 362 votes are required to pass this constitutional amendment act in the Lok Sabha and the NDA has only 293 votes.

Arya said that the constitution gives powers to the President and Governor to dissolve Lok Sabha and Assembly respectively even before their five year term ends. "Under Article 352, in the event of war, external aggression or armed rebellion, the term of the Lok Sabha can be extended by imposing national emergency. Similarly, under Arthe democracy and its federal structure. "The formats and issues of Lok Sabha and Vidhan Sabha elections are completely different. By conducting simultaneous elections, local issues may get overshadowed by national issues. Similarly the national issues may lose their existence in front of regional issues," he said.

The chief spokesperson of Uttarakhand Congress, Garima Mahara Dasauni said that the one nation one election will make the leaders and political activists inactive. She also rejected the notion that staggered elections affect the GDP of the country.

Ravaged roads

The ongoing spell of heavy monsoon rains has wreaked havoc on the road network in the Himalayan State. The Bharatiya Janata Party has claimed that the high-level panel's recommendation of one naby the Union cabinet is in national interest. Stating that this will be a major step towards national progress, the BJP State media incharge Manveer Singh Chauhan said that it is unfortunate that the character of the Congress is limited to opposing reforms. Responding to the statements made by the leader of opposition in the Vidhan Sabha, Yashpal Arya, the BJP State

A highlevel committee of prominent experts considered the advantages and disadvantages of this system before submitting its recommendations. "Implementing this

system in a nation like India will definitely boost the developmental process while also ensuring the economic Congress and its partners of the INDI Alliance have a habit of opposing all reforms planned in the nation. From NRC to the farm laws and UCC, they have done nothing apart from opposing such reforms. They have maintained a negative approach even on plans which are aimed at ensuring welfare of the nation and its citizens," Chauhan added.

Police arrest six accused with counterfeit currency in Haridwar and Dehradun

Haridwar police arrested six accused with counterfeit currency notes late on Wednesday. The accused reportedly learned to make counterfeit notes through YouTube. The officials said that four accused were initially arrested when the police stopped two motorcycles in Ranipur area and the four men were found in possession of 44 fake notes of Rs 500 denomination. During interrogation, the suspects provided information leading to the arrest of two more accomplices in Dehradun, where counterfeit notes amounting to Rs two lakh were found. The four suspects were identified as Saurabh, Nikhil, Anantbir

and Neeraj- all from Uttar Pradesh. It was revealed during interrogation that these individuals learned counterfeit currency production from YouTube tutorials. These accused also revealed the name of two other suspects, Mohit and Vishal, who operated from rented rooms in Suddhowala, Dehradun, as per the officials. They informed that the police team was dispatched to Dehradun, leading to Mohit's arrest in the Premnagar area. Mohit was found with 200 fake notes of Rs 500 denomination. The police also seized a laptop, a printer, two blade cutters and other materials used for printing counterfeit notes from his room. Vishal was subsequently arrested from the Patelnagar area in Dehradun. He allegedly had 207 counterfeit notes of Rs 500 denomination. The police also confiscated a laptop, a printer and other equipment used for counterfeit note production from his residence. The officials said that the accused revealed during interrogation that they made counterfeit notes by scanning real Rs 500 notes and printing its replicas. Then they used to circulate fake currency in busy and crowded areas and among elderly shopkeepers, where the suspects would exchange fake notes for real change, thus making a profit.







Three new medicine counters | Temperature fluctuation triggers viral infections in Doon

hanges in weather conditions and temperature fluctuations have led to an increase in viral infections among the people in Dehradun. It has been observed that temperature variance between day and night have changed considerably in recent days, affecting people's health. Following this, doctors in the city have reported an increase in viral infection cases by an average of five to 15 per cent compared to normal days.

Senior physician at CMI Hospital Dr Anshika Jain noted that the ongoing monsoon season and temperature fluctuations have contributed to the rise in viral infections. She has been checking patients at the OPD presenting symptoms such as cold, cough and fever. Jain emphasised that due to these temperature fluctuations, the body's immunity decreases, leading to a higher risk of viral infections. Additionally, she emphasised that the ongoing monsoon season has led to a rise in water-borne



diseases such as typhoid among the populace. To prevent viral infections, individuals must regulate their body temperature and refrain from consuming chilled water. She further proscribed eating street food to maintain good health.

Paediatrician at the Shri Mahant Indiresh Hospital, Dr Vishal Kaushik

highlighted that the fluctuating temperatures have resulted in an increase in viral infections among children. He noted that compared to regular days, he has seen a rise of five to 15 per cent in children suffering from viral infections. Kaushik observed cases of cold, cough, hand-footmouth disease and other illnesses. He added that the current temperature fluctuations make the body more susceptible to viral

BJP national president JP Nadda on Thursday released the party's 20-point manifesto, "Sankalp Patra", for Haryana ahead of the Assembly poll, promising two lakh government jobs, Rs 2,100 monthly assistance to women and government job guarantee to Agniveers hailing from the State. The party also promised creation of 10 industrial towns and full scholarship to Scheduled Caste (SC) and Other Backward Class (OBC) students of government medical and engineering colleges, among other things. Chief Minister Navab Singh Saini, Union Ministers M⁻L Khattar, Rao Inderjit Singh, Krishan Pal Gurjar and head of the party's poll manifesto

BJP in Haryana, which is eyeing to ride to power for a third consecutive term after the polls next month, also promised to purchase 24 crops at Minimum Support Price (MSP).

The BJP government in Haryana was already buying 14 crops at MSP. Last month after Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini's announcement, the state cabinet gave approval to a proposal of buying 10 more crops at MSP.Facing flak from opposition parties over the Agnipath scheme, which is short-term military recruitment, Nadda said there will be a guarantee of government job for every Agniveer Haryana. hailing

committee were present at Rohtak during the release of the Sankalp Patra.The ruling Rs 2,100 per month for all women under the Lado Lakshmi Yojna. BJP faces electoral challenge in Gurgaon amid internal strife

Gurgaon, a long-time Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) stronghold, may prove to be an electoral challenge for the BJP as Haryana prepares for the October 5 Assembly

The party, thanks to six-time parliamentarian and senior leader Rao Inderjit Singh, has successfully maintained a strong grip on the Gurgaon Lok Sabha seat, winning three consecutive terms since 2014 and successfully defeating the Congress and the regional party, the Indian National Lok Dal (INLD) in prior Assembly

However, the upcoming assembly elections in Gurgaon are interesting due to the internal rifts within the following candidate selections.

The Gurgaon parliamentary constituency, which covers nine Assembly seats across three districts, four in Gurgaon, three in Mewat, and two in Rewari, has always been a critical political battleground. Historically, the BJP has achieved remarkable strength in the urban segments of this region. This time, internal clashes and members threatened the BJP's performance in this segment. The dissatisfaction among the party workers arises after the allocation of tickets, sidelining experienced party and workers igniting rebellion. The impact of this discord could be affecting

voter turnout and lovalty. The selection of candidates may affect party dominance in Gurgaon, which further weakens the party's voter

The Gurgaon includes four seats from the district: Gurgaon, Badshahpur, Sohna, and Pataudi. In the 2019 state assembly elections, the BJP

secured three of these four



seats, except for Badshahpur, which elected independent candidate Rakesh Janghu alias Daultabad. Rakesh had beaten BJP's Manish Yadav by a margin of 10,000 votes.

Gurgaon seat has historically been an urban seat and a mixture of Punjabi, Brahmin and Vaishya (Baniya) castes. In the last election, BJP's Sudhir Singla won comfortably, defeating his closest rival by more than 32,000 votes, while the Congress candidate Sukhbir Kataria finished third.

This time the has denied sitting MLA Sudhir Singla a ticket for the upcoming election, opting instead for Mukesh Sharma, a wrestler turned politician and a close associate of Rao Inderjit Singh, the party's MP from the area from Gurgaon seat.

The party's decision has internal dissatisfaction, leading to the resignation of senior leaders like G L Sharma, a former vice BJP unit, and Navin Goel. Their resignation is likely to affect party voter sentiment significantly. Meanwhile, the Congress party, which has fielded Mohit Grover, a young Punjabi leader, who recently joined the Congress, had secured second position as an independent candidate in the previous assembly election.

The BJP's new candidate, Mukesh Sharma, 's success in this election may not be easy because Gurgaon is currently facing numerous civic issues,s, failures, waterlogging, poor road conditions, pollution, shortages,

Flood situation in WB worsens as Didi blames Centre

Even as the flood situation larger Bengal worsened with large swathes of lands in Hooghly, Burdwan, Howrah, East and West Midnapore going under water following the release of lakhs of cusecs of water by the dams controlled by the Damodar Valley Corporation, Bengal Chief Minister Banerjee once lambasted the Centre for "planning to inundate Bengal." Vowing to snap all the ties with the DVC of which Bengal too is a part Banerjee said, "this is a centrally controlled authority which does not listen to our prayers ... instead of dredging the rivers they release waters and inundate Bengal every year ... so I will go back and snap all the ties with the DVC if they continue to flood Bengal like this."

Banerjee who visited parts of West Midnapore and the Pursura block of Hooghly district said she would go to Howrah to inspect the flood affected areas too.

"For years there is a talk of Ghatal Master Plan but that



has not taken place as yet as a result of which the Ghatal town and the remaining areas sink every year ... will this continue year after year," she

Banerjee alleged how North Bengal gets flooded when there is heavy rains in Nepal, Bhutan and Sikkim alleging nothing is done in that respect. She also alleged that the Centre was not dredging the Ganges at Farakka causing floods in lower regions of Malda and Murshidabad.

seat-sharing talks. The criteria being adopted for the seat-sharing arrangement are the performances of the three parties in the recent Lok Sabha polls, the base of the three parties in the respective constituencies and



he first phase of polling in Jammu and Kashmir, held on September 18 was not only peaceful but also a thumbs up for democracy as 58 per cent voters cast their vote. Approximately 23.27 lakh voters, including 5.66 lakh youths, were eligible to cast their votes to determine the fate of 219 candidates in Phase 1. Though two more phases are left but morning shows the day. Widespread apprehensions arose following a series of attacks in Jammu, raising serious concerns about the high likelihood of disruption. Sri Lanka's pivotal presidential election



With traditional parties in decline and new alliances emerging, this election may spring surprises. The outcome will determine Sri Lanka's capacity to address its urgent challenges

ri Lanka faces a pivotal moment in its political history as it prepares for the presidential election this Saturday, 21 September. This election, the ninth for the executive presidency, unfolds amid severe political polarisation, sharply contrasting with the last election in November 2019. The decline of traditional political parties and the rise of various political alliances are prominent features of this election, with three main candidates competing in a manner distinct from the two-horse races of previous presidential contests. The fragmentation of political parties, the absence of anti-defection laws, and the formation of new alliances driven more by personal interests than by cohesive agendas pose significant risks to democratic stability and governance.The 2019 presidential race featured two main candidates and a notable but relatively minor third-party candidate. It saw a record voter registration of 15,992,096 and a turnout of 83.72% (13,387,951), surpassing previous highs of 81.52% in 2015 and 81.06% in 1982. Despite this high turnout, 135,452 votes were invalid, leaving 13,252,499 votes as valid. Gotabaya Rajapaksa of the Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna won with 52.25% of the valid votes (6,924,255), while his main opponent, Sajith Premadasa of the National Democratic Front, received 41.99% (5,564,239). Anura Kumara Dissanayake of the National People's Power secured a mere 3.16% (418,553 votes). In the subsequent general election on 5 August 2020, Premadasa and Dissanayake faced off again for parliamentary seats. Premadasa won 305,744 votes, while Dissanayake received 49,814 votes.

In the 2015 parliamentary elections, Premadasa garnered 112,645 votes from Hambantota, whereas Dissanayake, contesting from Colombo, secured 65,966 votes.Ranil Wickremesinghe, one of main three main contenders, in this year's race but absent from the 2019 presidential election, leads the United National Party. His party received 249,435 votes (2.25%) in the general elections, including 30,875 from Colombo and 28,282 from Gampaha. Although his party did not win a parliamentary seat, Wickremesinghe was appointed to a national list position. Amid severe social upheaval caused by economic mismanagement, which resulted in the resignation of both the President and Prime Minister, Wickremesinghe, a seasoned politician and six-time Prime Minister, capitalised on the moment to make his comeback. After Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa was forced to resign, Wickremesinghe was appointed as Prime Minister.

However, protests demanding the resignation of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa led to his dramatic escape, first to Trincomalee by navy ship, then back to Colombo by air force chopper, and finally to the Maldives by air force cargo flight. Rajapaksa officially resigned on 14 July 2022. Subsequently, Prime Minister Wickremesinghe was appointed as President by the constitutional process. Wickremesinghe's appointment highlights the complexities of Sri Lanka's

political system. According to the constitution, the President must appoint a Prime Minister who commands the majority's confidence in Parliament, illustrating the considerable unchecked powers inherent in the executive role. Rajapaksa's assumption that Wickremesinghe, who came to Parliament through the national list, was the candidate who earned the majority's confidence reflects the intricate dynamics of Sri Lankan

politics. However, Wickremesinghe has effectively stabilised the situation after the social upheaval. In this context, Wickremesinghe has emerged as a major candidate, yet the Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna has nominated its candidate, Namal Rajapaksa.

Reports suggest that Rajapaksa's ambitions to secure the prime ministership were opposed, leading a faction of his party to break away from Wickremesinghe. Rajapaksas candidacy appears more focused on maintaining his family's political lineage rather than presenting a genuine bid for leadership. Nonetheless, his endorsement of supporting Sajith Premadasa, where he appeals to supporters to cast their second vote for Premadasa, could be a decisive factor in the election outcome. Meanwhile, the NPP, initially opposed to the public uprising that led to Rajapaksa's removal, has become a significant

political entity Anura Kumara Dissanayake, who ironically led his political party into alliances with traditional parties to secure ministerial positions over the past few decades, has skilfully capitalised on widespread dissatisfaction with corruption and the growing anger towards conventional politicians to bolster his standing. His alliance's emotionally charged propaganda has infiltrated every corner of society, despite its lack of deep ideological substance. The Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna (JVP), his original party, has skilfully harnessed this discontent to challenge

the status quo. However, Dissanayake's path to victory remains uncertain, especially with three major candidates in the race. Voter statistics reveal additional obstacles: with 17.1 million registered voters and an anticipated 80% turnout (13.7 million), a candidate would need approximately 7 million votes to secure the presidency in the first count. The NPP's past performance shows

limited success, receiving 418,553 votes (3.16%) in 2019 and 445,950

votes (3.84%) in parliamentary

elections in 2020. The party faces challenges in Tamil-majority districts like Nuwara-Eliya, Jaffna, Batticaloa, Wanni, Trincomalee, and in areas with lower voter counts, such as Polonnaruwa and Matale. To succeed, the NPP must secure substantial votes from Colombo, Gampaha, Kalutara, Kandy, and Kurunegala, requiring an estimated 700,000 to

800,000 additional votes. Given these dynamics and the competition among three candidates, the NPP or JVP may struggle to achieve significant success in this election. However, the election remains crucial in determining the country's social and governance structure.

Conversely, Sajith Premadasa

appears to have significant potential to garner a majority of the votes, while Wickremesinghe has also gained substantial ground. Therefore, it is unlikely that any candidate will secure over 50% of the vote in the first round of counting, which may necessitate counting the second votes.

This uncertainty could trigger a new wave of political instability if major alliances and key candidates fail to manage the results effectively and refuse to accept the people's verdict. Despite flashy manifestos and hefty campaign budgets, none of the candidates have provided a clear plan to tackle the staggering \$100 billion national debt. They all parrot the same old IMF rhetoric, yet almost none offer a concrete strategy beyond this wornout solution.

The situation in the island nation is dire, and there's no straightforward path for the incoming leader to steer the country out of its deepening crisis. As of 1 July 2024, about 24.8% of Sri Lanka's population lives in poverty, with rates varying dramatically between districts—3.5% in Colombo versus 44.2% in Nuwara-Eliya.

Poverty in rural areas has surged from 15% to 32%, while urban poverty has tripled from 6% to 18%. A recent survey revealed that 31% of the population is impoverished, with 33% skipping meals and 47% cutting back on meal sizes. Malnutrition affects nearly onethird of children under five, and over 40% of women aged 18-60 are overweight or obese, reflecting severe economic and health issues. Regardless of the election's outcome, Sri Lanka's entrenched political divisions threaten to entrench a fragmented legislative body, where effective governance and decisive action may become increasingly



Exploding devices dealt a major but not crippling blow to Hezbollah, analysts say

¬he waves of remotely triggered explosions that ■ hit pagers and walkietalkies carried by Hezbollah members in grocery stores, on streets and at a funeral procession this week made for an eerie and shocking spectacle. Analysts said Hezbollah will be able to regroup militarily and communications workarounds after the attack, but the psychological effects will likely run deep.

The explosions blamed on Israel, which has neither confirmed nor denied involvement — killed at least 37 people, including two children, wounded more than 3,000 and deeply unsettled even Lebanese who have no Hezbollah affiliation.

The detonating devices hit workers in Hezbollah's civilian institutions, including its health care and media operations, as well as fighters, dealing a blow to the militant group's operations beyond the battlefield. It is not clear how many civilians with no link to Hezbollah were injured.

The attacks also exposed the weaknesses in the low-tech communications system the group had turned to in an attempt to avoid Israeli surveillance of cellphones.

Retired Lebanese army Gen. Elias Hanna described the attacks as the "Pearl Harbor or 9/11 of Hezbollah.

Mohanad Hage Ali, a senior fellow at the Carnegie Middle East Center think tank who researches Hezbollah, said that because the blasts hit people across the group's institutions, the attack was "like a sword in the guts of the organization." Hundreds of people were severely wounded, including many who lost eyes or hands. "It will require time to heal and replace those who were target-ed," he said.

But Hage Ali and other analysts agreed that the loss of manpower is not a crippling blow. Hezbollah leader Hassan Nasrallah has said the group's fighting force numbers more than 100,000, meaning that the attack — as dramatic as it was — would have put only a small percentage of its militants out of commission even if all those wounded and killed were fighters.

Qassim Qassir, a Lebanese analyst close to Hezbollah, said the detonating devices actually struck mostly civilian workers within the group and not military or security officials, which

"Telecommunications is the nerve of military operations

and communications," said retired Lebanese army Gen. Naji Malaeb, an expert on security affairs. A delay in communication could spell disaster, he said.

During a speech in February, Hezbollah's leader, Nasrallah, warned members against carrying cellphones, which he said could be used to track them and monitor their communications.

But long before that, Hezbollah relied on pagers and its own private fiber-optic landline network to avoid the monitoring of its communications.

The pagers that detonated Tuesday were a new model the group recently began using. It appears that small quantities of explosives had been implanted in the devices at some stage in the manufacturing or shipping process and then remotev detonated.

Hanna said the group might rely more heavily on its landline network — which Israel has attempted to tap into on multiple occasions — going forward, or on even lower-tech solutions such as hand-delivered letters.

"Maybe you have to go back to human communication, the postman," he said. "This is what is really helping (Hamas

leader) Yahya Sinwar not to be targeted" in his hiding spot in

Orna Mizrahi, a senior researcher at the Tel Aviv-based think tank Institute for National Security Studies and former intelligence analyst for the Israeli military and prime minister's office, said losing the ability to communicate through pagers is a "dramatic blow," but the militant group has other communication methods and will rebuild their communication network. The bigger damage to Hezbollah was psychological, she said.

"It's the humiliation of having such an operation, it shows how much the organization is exposed to the Israeli intelligence," she said.

Amal Saad, a lecturer in politics and international relations at Cardiff University in Wales who researches Hezbollah, said much of the attack's impact was the "demoralization and the fear" it sowed.

"It's not just a security breach against the military," she said. 'Hezbollah's entire society is going to be extremely concerned because everything is liable now to being hacked and rigged." The group will "be rethinking many things now, not just the pagers," Saad said.

'Israeli indicted for role in Iranian assassination plot'

rsraeli security officials on Thursday said an Israeli citizen has been indicted for involvement in an Iranian assassination plot against top Israeli leaders, including Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu. A statement from the Shin Bet internal security agency said that the citizen was recruited by Iranian intelligence to "carry out terrorist activities" on Israeli soil and "promote assassination attacks" on Netanyahu, Defense Minister Yoav Gallant and the head of the Shin Bet, Ronen Bar.

It was unclear how far the alleged plot had advanced.

The statement did not say whether the Israeli had obtained a weapon or developed a concrete plan. The statement said the Israeli had traveled to Iran twice — once

in August following the assassination of top Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh in an explosion in Iran's capital that was widely blamed on Israel. Israel has not said whether it was involved.

The Shin Bet said the assassination plot was an attempt by Iran to follow through on its pledge to avenge his death. The statement said the Israeli was paid 5,000 Euros (USD

5,575.60) but had demanded a million dollars before doing anything. The Iranians refused the demand but said they would be in touch, according to the Shin Bet. Earlier this week, the Shin Bet said an explosion in a Tel Aviv park last September was linked to an attempt by Hezbollah to assassinate Moshe Yaalon, a former military chief of staff and defense minister. The Lebanese militant group is closely allied with Iran.

Starmer faces backlash over freebies; insists he's done nothing wrong

ess than three months after Less than unce monesche was elected on a promise to restore trust in politics, British Prime Minister Keir Starmer is trying to shake off criticism over donations from a wealthy businessman and the hefty salary of his most senior aide. The Labour Party leader, who

won power in a landslide victory on July 4, denies impropri ety over thousands of pounds (dollars) worth of clothes and eyeglasses paid for by Waheed Alli, a media entrepreneur and longtime Labour donor. Starmer is also facing grumbling among his own employees over the salary of chief of staff Sue Gray. The BBC disclosed that she is paid 170.000 pounds (\$225,000) a year about 3,000 pounds more than the prime minister's salary. Gray's salary is at the top of a set of pay bands for political advisers, which have been



raised since the election. The government said it did not interfere in setting the pay scale. "The pay bands for any official, any adviser, are not set by politicians. There's an official process that does that," Business Secretary Jonathan Reynolds said Thursday. In recent days British media have been full of largely anonymous grumbling from government officials about Gray, a former senior civil servant best known for leading an investigation into lockdown-breaching parties in government buildings during the COVID-19 pandemic. Gray's findings helped topple Conservative Prime Minister Boris Johnson, and her subsequent move to work Starmer led the Conservatives to claim the "partygate" probe was politically biased, something Gray denies. Labour claims the leak of Gray's salary and the donation revelations -- branded 'frockgate" in the press after dresses bought for the prime minister's wife, Victoria Starmer — is being whipped up by the Conservatives and their media supporters to tarnish the government.

Lawmakers are allowed to accept gifts but have to declare donations and extra-parliamentary income within 28 days. Starmer missed the fourweek deadline to declare the donations of clothes and a personal shopper for his wife from Alli. He says the delay was due to his staff seeking advice on

exactly what needed to be declared. "I'm very consistent with following the rules," Starmer said this week. He rejected suggestions that prime ministers should get a wardrobe budget, saying taxpayers should not have to pay for politicians' clothes. The scale of the freebies accepted by Starmer has raised eyebrows even among supporters. Sky News reported that Starmer has declared "gifts, benefits and hospitality" worth more than 100,000 pounds since December 2019, more than any other lawmaker.

The donations include thousands of pounds' worth of tickets for Premier League games involving Starmer's beloved team Arsenal. "I'm a massive Arsenal fan," Starmer told reporters during a trip to Rome this week. "I can't go into the stands because of security reasons. Therefore, if I don't accept a gift of hospitality I can't go to

Voters view Harris more favourably as she leads Democratic ticket, poll says

Until recently, Lillian Dunsmuir of Bullhead City, Arizona, "didn't really think about" Kamala Harris and had no opinion of the vice president. But now she likes what she's seeing.
"She's funny. I think she's very

smart. She can speak well," said Dunsmuir, a 58-year-old real estate agent. "I would feel safe with her because I think she can handle herself with foreign leaders. I like her because she's for pro-choice, and so am

Voters view Harris slightly more favorably than they did in July, just after President Joe Biden dropped out of the race, according to a new poll from The Associated Press-NORC Center for Public Affairs Research. The Democratic presidential nominee is now seen more positively than negatively. Former President Donald Trump's favorability ratings remained steady,

although the poll was conducted prior to the apparent assassination attempt of the Republican nominee on his golf course in Florida on Sunday. According to the survey, about half of voters have a somewhat or very positive view of Harris, and 44% have a somewhat or very negative view. That's a small shift since late July, just after Biden dropped out of the race, when views of Harris were slightly more unfavorable than favorable. Six in 10 voters, meanwhile, have a somewhat or very unfavorable view of Trump, while about 4 in 10 have a somewhat or very favorable view of him. Changes in views of national figures like Biden, Trump or Harris have been rare over the past few years. Trump's favorability rating didn't budge over the course of the summer, despite a felony conviction, a close call with a would-be assassin in Pennsylvania, and

a new opponent in the presi-

dential contest. But Trump has prevailed in the past with similarly low favorability ratings. He won the 2016 election despite being broadly unpopular, and came close to winning in 2020 under similar conditions.

The survey also found that relatively small shares of voters — around one-third — say the phrase "would change the country for the better" describes Trump or Harris extremely or very well, suggesting that voters retain some gloom about their options in the race. "Everyone talks about how polarized we are. I don't see the election solving that," said Sean Luebbers, a 55-yearold high school history teacher in Upland, California, who supports Harris. "I don't see Harris solving that. I think a lot of the damage has already been done, so I'm not hopeful that the election will solve that Right now, you might call it triage. We can't make things

Pak-origin man jailed for stirring up racial hate during UK riots

London (PTI): A Pakistani-origin man who used a fake identity to stir up racial hatred online during last month's riots in different parts of the UK has been sentenced to two years and four months imprisonment after admitting to disseminating offensive messages on social media. Ehsan Hussain, 25, was sentenced at Birmingham Crown Court on Wednesday after a West Midlands Police investigation revealed he had used a fake name belonging to an innocent member of the public. He is said to have posted "numerous and vile messages" through the app Telegram in a chat group containing over 12,000 members during far-right and anti-immigrant violent disorder in August. The police presented screenshots captured of the posts, which called for disorder in Alum Rock and Bordesley Green in Birmingham and incited racial violence.

Canada cuts study permits for foreign students

Ottawa (PTI): Canada has announced to reduce study permits for international students, a move that is likely to affect many Indian nationals.In a post on X late Wednesday night, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said, "We're granting 35% fewer international student permits this year. Authorities have also reported seven deaths each in Poland and Romania, and five in Austria. Authorities across the



affected region have deployed their militaries. In the two hardest-hit regions in the northeast Czech Republic, troops joined firefighters and other emergency officials to help residents with cleanup and recovery efforts. Army helicopters have been used to distribute humanitarian help while soldiers are building temporary bridges after many were destroyed in the flooding.

Further upriver, in a region known as the Danube Bend, homes and restaurants near the riverbanks were inundated as officials and volunteers continued to place sandbags to reinforce levees. Nearly 6,000 professionals, including members of Hungary's water authority and military, have been mobilised to assist in flood preparations, Prime Minister Viktor Orbán said in a news conference Thursday morning. Inmates from prisons had also been mobilised to help fill sandbags, Orbán said.

The Danube rose nearly one metre (3.3 feet) in 24 hours, and by Thursday morning stood at

771 cm, approaching the 891-cm record set during major flooding in 2013. In southwestern Poland, the high water reached the city of Wroclaw and a stretched-out wave was expected to take many hours, even days to pass, exerting pressure on the embankments. Concerned by the scope of the destruction and the need for immediate aid, Prime Minister Donald Tusk invited von der Leven to Wroclaw to see the situation with her own eyes. Government leaders from the Czech Republic, Slovakia and Austria are also to be present. More than two dozen top American lawmakers have expressed outrage over the recent vandalism of a Hindu temple in New York, which came days ahead of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the US. The road and the signage outside the BAPS Swaminarayan Temple in Melville, New York, were sprayed with expletives on Monday. Melville is located in Suffolk County, on Long Island and is about 28 kilometres from the 16,000-seater Nassau Veterans Memorial Coliseum, where Prime Minister Modi is scheduled to address a mega community event on September 22. "The desecration of this Hindu house of worship is vile. Hate has no place on Long Island or anywhere else in New York or across America," Senate Majority Leader Senator Chuck Schumer said. "I am deeply saddened by the desecration of the BAPS Mandir in Melville, NY. This act of vandalism is a clear attempt to incite hatred against Hindus and has no place in our country. We must come together to show that love and understanding will always triumph over intolerance and division," Congressman Rich McCormick said.

Kim bolstering nuclear, conventional weapons

North Korea said Thursday that leader Kim Jong Un supervised successful tests of two types of missiles - one designed to carry a "super-large conventional warhead" and the other likely for a nuclear warhead, as he ordered officials to bolster up his country's military capabilities to repel United States-led threats.

The tests appear to be the same as the multiple missile launches that neighbouring countries said North Korea performed Wednesday, extending its run of weapons displays as confrontations with the US and South Korea escalate.

The official Korean Central News Agency said that Kim oversaw the launch of the country's newly built Hwasongpho-11-Da-4.5 ballistic missile tipped with a dummy "4.5tonne super-large conventional warhead." It said the test-firing was meant to verify an ability to accurately hit a 320 kilometre-range target, suggesting it's a weapon aimed at striking sites in South Korea. KCNA said Kim also guided the launch of an improved "strategic" cruise missile, a word implying the weapon was developed to carry a nuclear warhead.

After the tests, Kim stressed the

need to continue to "bolster up the nuclear force" and acquire "overwhelming offensive capability in the field of conventional weapons, too," according to KCNA. It cited Kim as saying that North Korea can thwart its enemies' intentions to invade only when it has strong military power.

region. North Korea typically test-launches missiles off its east coast, and it's highly unusual for the country to fire missiles at land targets likely because of concerns about potential damages on the ground if the weapons land in unintended areas.

Jung Chang Wook, head of the Korea Defence Study Forum think

tank in Seoul, said North Korea likely aims to show it's confident about the the accuracy of its new ballistic missile. Jung said the missile's highpowered warhead is meant to attack ground targets, but North Korea hasn't acquired weapons that can penetrate deep into the earth and destroy underground structures. The Hwasongpho-11-Da-4.5 missile's first known test occurred in early July. North Korea said the July test was successful as well, but South Korea's military disputed the claim saying one of the two missiles fired by North Korea travelled abnormally during the initial stage of its flight before falling at an uninhabited area near Pyongyang, the capital. North Korea hasn't released photos on the July launches.

North Korea has been pushing to introduce a variety of sophisticated weapons systems designed to attack both South Korea and the mainland US to deal with what it calls its rivals intensifying security threats. Many foreign experts say North Korea would ultimately want to use its enlarged arsenal as leverage to win greater concessions in future dealings with the US. Worries about North Korea deepened last week as it disclosed photos of a secretive facility to enrich uranium for nuclear weapons. KCNA said that Kim, during a visit to the facility, called for stronger efforts to "exponentially" produce more nuclear weapons.

It was unclear whether the facility is at North Korea's main Yongbyon nuclear complex. But it was the North's first unveiling of a uraniumenrichment facility since it showed one at the country's main Yongbyon nuclear complex to visiting American scholars led by nuclear physicist Siegfried Hecker in 2010. In an analytical piece jointly written with another expert, Robert Carlin, that was posted Wednesday on North Korea-focused website 38 North, Hecker said the centrifuge hall shown in the recent North Korean photos was not the same one that he saw in November 2010. Hecker and Carlin said they believe the new centrifuges provide "only a modest increased capacity," though North Korea could increase enrichment capacity just by building more centrifuge plants. In another joint analysis also posted Friday on 38 North, other experts said that the centrifuges shown in the photos are not the ones observed by Hecker but a more advanced design. They said the images send "a strong message that the country has ample capacity and continued will to expand its nuclear program.

Sri Lanka announces preliminary pacts on debt restructuring

PTI COLOMBO

ash-strapped Sri Lanka on Thursday announced that it has reached an in principle agreement with external commercial creditors the restructuring of approximately USD 17.5 billion of external commercial debts. The agreements have been reached with holders of its International Sovereign Bonds, following negotiations with the Ad Hoc Group of Bondholders (AHGB), a representative group of international investors, and the Local Consortium of Sri Lanka (LCSL), a representative group of domestic financial institutions. A statement from the President's Media Division (PMD) said, collectively, the two groups hold in excess of 50 per cent of the Bonds.

Sri Lanka declared its first-ever sovereign default in mid-April 2022, having run out of its foreign exchange reserves. The halt to the debt services meant that the multilateral creditor nations and commercial lenders could not extend fresh financing to the country. In July, the Sri Lankan government reached a debt restructuring deal with international sovereign bondholders after protracted negotiations with countries such as China, India, France and Japan. President

Wickremesinghe on Wednesday said that the island nation's bankruptcy is officially due to end on Thursday, remarks aimed at boosting his re-election chances on the last day of the presidential election campaign ahead of the September 21 elec-

The PMD statement said, the agreements provide Sri Lanka with enhanced debt relief compared to the Joint Working Framework agreed in July 2024, including a further reduction in interest payments provided in the new agreement. "Sri Lanka also announced that it has finalised agreement in principle with China Development Bank (CDB) on the key financial terms of the restructuring of approximately USD 3.3 billion of sovereign debt," the PMD added.

AP VATICAN CITY

The Vatican on Thursday gave the green light for Catholics to continue flocking to a southern Bosnian village where children reported seeing visions of the Virgin Mary, offering its approval for devotion in one of the most contested aspects of Roman Catholic practice in recent years. In a detailed analysis after nearly 15 years of study the Vatican's doctrine office didn't declare that the reported apparitions in Medjugorje were authentic or of supernatural origin. And it flagged concerns about contradictions in some of the "messages" the alleged visionaries say they have received over the years. But in line with new Vatican criteria in place this year, the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith ruled that the "spiritual fruits" stemming from the Medjugorje experience more than justified allowing the faithful to organise pilgrimages there and permit public acts of devotion. The decision essential ly overrules the original doubts about the alleged apparitions at Medjugorje by the region's past diocesan bishops. And it ignores current concerns about the economic interests that have turned Medjugorje into a thriving destination for religious tourists But with Pope Francis' approval, the doctrine office decided that "the abundant and widespread fruits, which are so beautiful and positive," justified its decision.

SC rejects telecom companies curative pleas on AGR computation

In a jolt to telecom firms, the Supreme Court has dismissed a batch of pleas filed by companies, including Vodafone Idea and Bharti Airtel, seeking correction of alleged errors in the Adjusted Gross Revenue.

A bench comprising Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud and Justices Sanjiv Khanna and B R Gavai also rejected the plea of telcos seeking to list the curative petitions for open court hearing.

A curative petition is the last legal recourse in the apex court and is generally considered in-chamber unless a prima facie case is made out for reconsideration of the verdict.

"Application for listing the Curative Petitions in open Court is rejected. We have



gone through the Curative Petitions and the connected

documents. In our opinion, no case is made out within

the decision of this court in Rupa Ashok Hurra v Ashok Hurra. The Curative Petitions are dismissed," the bench observed in an order dated August 30, which uploaded on Thursday. On October 9 last year, the

top court had taken note of t e l e c o m m u n i c a t i o n companies seeking listing of their pleas on Adjusted Gross Revenue (AGR) due issue. The telcos had referred to alleged errors in the arithmetic calculation for arriving at the AGR-related dues by the Department of Telecommunications (DoT). In July 2021, the Supreme Court dismissed a plea seeking correction of errors in the demand of AGR dues. The telecom companies had

there were several errors in arriving at the AGR dues which totalled over Rs 1 lakh

Vodafone-Idea's total liability was Rs 58,254 crore and Bharti Airtel's Rs 43,980

Earlier, the top court had given the telecom companies years to clear their outstanding dues to the government. The top court held that the demand raised by the DoT witha respect to AGR dues would be final. It also said that telecom companies shall not raise any dispute and there shall not be any re-assessment.

It had said telecom operators shall pay 10 per cent of the total dues as demanded by DoT by March 31, 2021, and the rest in yearly instalments commencing from April 1, 2021, to March 31, 2031

India-US trade potential worth 500 billion USD: Hardeep Puri

The United States is India's sixth largest energy trade partner and the growing bilateral trade has the potential to cross the USD 500 billion-mark from USD 200 billion at present, Petroleum Minister Hardeep Singh Puri has said.

The hydrocarbon trade between the two countries has reached USD 13.6 billion in 2023-24 nearly double the figure from 2018-19, Puri said at a roundtable with energy companies. The roundtable, held on the sidelines of the global energy conference Gastech 2024, here was attended by Mukesh Aghi, President and CEO of USISPF, and Consul General of India in Houston, D C Manjunath, among others.

Puri said that the US is now India's sixthlargest energy trade partner, with hydrocarbon trade valued at USD 2.43 billion in the first two months of FY 2024-25.

This momentum indicates the potential for total bilateral trade to soar from around USD 200 billion to over USD 500 billion, he said. During his visit the minister also engaged with stakeholders from the US-India Business Council (USIBC), the US-India Strategic Partnership Forum (USISPF), and industry leaders to underscore the significance of the US-India energy partnership.

The conference was organised by USISPF, an advocacy group dedicated to strengthening



the strategic partnership between the US and India. Puri highlighted India's leadership during its G20 Presidency, where it launched the Global Biofuels Alliance in collaboration with the US and other like-minded countries. This initiative aims to develop and deploy lowcarbon solutions, further reinforcing the commitment to sustainable energy practices. In a meeting with Brad Crabtree, Assistant Secretary of the Office of Fossil Energy and Carbon Management at the US Department of Energy, Puri discussed the unique challenges India faces as the third-largest hydrocarbon consumer while aiming for net zero emissions

The discussion covered issues such as carbon capture, utilization, and storage (CCUS) as a vital solution for enhancing energy security and emissions reduction, alongside advancements in CO2 removal and innovative

you need to have a robust and resilient system for which every now and then you need to make sure that the firewalls are adequate, any emergency drill which you need to do. what if situation so you know to handle if there is an emergency in terms of digital insecure incidents".

The minister also highlighted the rising popularity of the UPI in driving digital payments, saying 45 per cent of all real-time payments globally take place in India.

Centre announces steps to resolve shipping related woes of traders

government on The gov Thursday announced steps, including reducing certain charges at ports and purchase of five additional second-hand container vessels by SCI, to resolve shipping sector-related problems of exporters and importers.

measures announced after a meeting of all the concerned stakeholders of the international trade segment, including senior officials of ministries like commerce and industry, shipping, ports, finance, civil aviation and railways; apex exporters (federation of Indian export organisations), customs officials, freight forwarders, transport operators and shipping companies.

Exporting community and experts have flagged shipping sector issues which are hurting the country's exports, which has contracted by 9.3 per cent in August.

The issues figured in the discussions include container shortage, surge in ocean freight rate and shipping cost,

Briefing media after the deliberations, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goval said that several issues were discussed to look at addressing the challenges that exporters and importers are facing in the shipping area.

"I am confident that it (decisions taken today) will result in significantly bringing down the shipping cost, improve the availability of empty containers, help faster evacuation of export consignments, and

significantly reduce the congestion at ports," he said. It was announced that the Shipping Corporation of India (SCI) will "purchase five additional second-hand container vessels to further additional boost cargo handling capacity. The SCI also announced that they are chartering container ships to significantly increase the container capacities, on an immediate basis capacity will be enhanced by 9,000 TEUs (twenty-foot equivalent unit).

The charges of Rs 3,000, that is being levied beyond 90 days, are now halved to Rs 1,500. Further, the storage and handling rates will be reduced for containers from Rs 9,000 to Rs 2,000 (for a 40 ft container) and from Rs 6,000 to Rs 1,000 (for a 20 ft

container). The Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) announced that custom clearances at the ports will be expedited by simultaneous screening of two twenty feet containers.

Further, the shipping ministry said that the port capacities have already been enhanced by 2.3 million TEUs.

Furthermore, the Jawaharlal Nehru Port Trust (JNPT) assured to eliminate any congestion and bottleneck at NhavaSheva port.

The shipping lines assured that all charges like container transportation and Lift-on-Lift-off at yards would be embedded in the delivery Corporation order given to shippers.

India, South Korea begin to share electronic bill of lading

India and South Korea have started sharing the bill of lading in an electronic transfer mode between the customs of both sides, a move that will help promote ease of doing business, a senior

official said on Thursday.

A bill of lading is a legal document that serves as a receipt, contract, and proof of ownership for shipped goods. Director General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) Santosh Kumar Sarangi said as and when the system becomes a norm for all the countries, there will be no requirement for physical submission of records.

"India in collaboration with South Korea has now started this concept of sharing the bill of lading in an electronic transfer mode between the customs of both sides," he said while addressing a session in the 'Deloitte Government Summit' here.

South Korea is a key trading partner of India and both countries have implemented a comprehensive free trade agreement in 2010. India's exports to the country stood at USD 6.41 billion in

2023-23, while imports aggregated at USD 21.13



billion. Sarangi added that doing with physical submissions may happen in the next 1-1.5 years.

A RICH TRIBUTE TO THE DHRUPAD MAESTRO

18th Pandit Siyaram Tiwari Music Festival Celebrates the Legacy of Dhrupad

The 18th edition of the Pandit Siyaram Tiwari Music Festival paid a grand tribute to one of the most revered figures in Indian classical music.

The festival honoured the life and legacy of Pandit Siyaram Tiwari, a maestro of the ancient Dhrupad tradition. Dhrupad, the oldest form of North Indian classical vocal music, has roots in the chanting style of the Samaveda, a sacred Sanskrit text dating back over 3,000 years.

meditative This contemplative genre, once confined to Hindu temples and royal courts, has evolved into a sophisticated art form over the centuries. A key feature of *Dhrupad* is its deep connection to nada yoga, the practice of exploring the inner sounds and vibrations of the body, believed to be the fundamental building blocks of the universe. Dhrupad vocalists cultivate an extraordinary resonance, enabling them to express a wide range of tones and microtones.

It is this ancient tradition that Pandit Siyaram Tiwari, a leading exponent of the Darbhanga gharana, championed throughout his life until his passing in 1998. Born on March 10, 1919, Pandit Siyaram Tiwari was celebrated for his mastery of Dhrupad and was particularly known for introducing fastpaced laykari (rhythmic play) within the genre. His contributions were recognised with prestigious awards such as the Padma Shri in 1971 and the Sangeet Natak Akademi Fellowship in 1984, India's highest honor for musicians. The Pandit Siyaram Tiwari Memorial Sangeet Trust, under the curatorship of Dr. Sumeet Anand Pandey, organised this festival to preserve and promote the rich tradition of Dhrupad. Dr. Pandey, Tiwari's maternal grandson and an acclaimed Dhrupad vocalist, continues to uphold the family's musical legacy. As the

This year's festival featured captivating performances, beginning with Shashi Kant Pathak, who delivered a mesmerising solo on the Pakhawaj, a classical Indian drum. Pathak's performance earned him the "Navodit Kalakar Samman" award. He was accompanied by Rajesh Mishra on the Sarangi and Dr. Pandey himself on vocals.

The evening concluded with a masterful Sarod recital by Pandit Biswajit Chowdhury, who performed ragas from the Malhar family, accompanied by Pandit Durjay Bhaumik on Tabla. The noted music critic Pandit Vijay Shankar Mishra served as the compère for the event, guiding the audience through the evening's rich offerings. Speaking at the event, Dr. Pandey said, "It's a great honor to continue the legacy of my grandfather, Pandit Siyaram Tiwari, through this annual festival

Dhrupad is a timeless tradition that deserves to be celebrated and shared with the world. We hope that this festival will inspire new generations to appreciate and learn this beautiful art form." This year's festival held particular significance as the Pandit Siyaram Tiwari Memorial Sangeet Trust marked its 10th anniversary. Over the past year, the Trust organised 10 festivals

across India, showcasing the beauty of Indian classical music. Two notable initiatives, Geetam Vadyam Nrityam and Vani Veena Venu, received widespread acclaim. Additionally, Dr. Pandev launched the "Naya Swar" series in Delhi, featuring performances by young maestros, with plans to expand to cities like Kolkata, Mumbai, and Bengaluru in the coming year. The Darbhanga school, to which Pandit Siyaram Tiwari belonged, is known for producing versatile vocalists skilled in *Dhrupad, Khayal,* Thumri and Bhajans. Pandit Tiwari's exemplary mastery in these forms continues to serve as a guiding light for future generations of musicians.

Dr. Pandey's dedication to his craft extends beyond India. He has been invited as a Fulbright visiting fellow for 2024-25 at the University of California, Los Angeles, where he will engage in teaching, research, and concerts. His recent tour of seven European countries, where he presented Dhrupad on prestigious stages, further solidifies his role in taking Indian classical music to a global audience. ASHWIN, JADEJA TANGO SAVES INDIA AFTER HASAN MAHMUD'S EARLY STRIKES

off-spinner easoned Ravichandran Ashwin sparkled on home turf with his sixth Test hundred as he combined with Ravindra Jadeja to steer India out of trouble and post a formidable 339 for six on day one of the first Test against Bangladesh

here on Thursday. Ashwin (102 batting) and Jadeja (86 batting) added 195 runs (174 minutes, 225 balls) for a riveting unbroken seventh wicket stand after young pacer Hasan Mahmud (4/58) reduced India to 144 for six, despite Yashasvi Jaiswal making a solid 56.

The ebb and flow of the day's proceedings was quite and remarkable mostly around revolved Ashwin, Jadeja and Mahmud, who made his Test debut in March this year and was just three games old in the format before this match.

In a stunning first spell of 5-2-6-3, the 24-year-old Mahmud accounted for the cream of Indian top-order -- Rohit Sharma (6), Shubman Gill (0) and Virat Kohli (6) -- before snapping Rishabh Pant's return to Test cricket (39 off 52 balls) in the initial moments of the second session

KL Rahul, another Indian batter who is re-entering the Indian Test establishment, fell for 16 to off-spinner Mehidy pendulum stayed firmly in Bangladesh's quarter.

Sensing that Ashwin was in good touch, the lefthander had the simple job of keeping his end going and he



A past master in operating from behind the giant shadows of superstars, Jadeja looked extremely comfortable doing that once more, providing the assurance Ashwin needed.

But there were moments, the showman in Jadeja came forth and Shakib was the aggrieved party, getting hammered for three fours.

Bangladesh's star of the day Mahmud, too was not spared as Jadeja, who raised his fifty off 73 balls, played a drag-pull off the pacer to send him for a
