 $T_{\text{grappling with a massive}}^{\text{he Indian Railways is}}$ sabotage for the last one and a half year making it vulnerable for optimum functioning of the passenger and freight train operations. ## **Curfew in Manipur after protests** for peace in Imphal Valley

urfew and prohibitory orders were imposed in **⊿**three districts of Manipur on Tuesday a day student protests demanding the restoration of peace in the strife-torn state rocked Imphal Valley.

The Manipur Government also suspended internet services in the entire State for five days amid intensified agitation by students

The decision was taken to curb the use of social media for transmission of images, hate speech and hate video, the State home department said in a notification.

It said "In view of the

prevailing law and order situation in the State of Manipur, there apprehension that some antisocial elements might use social media extensively for transmission of images, hate speech and hate video messages inciting the passions of the public, which might have serious repercussions for

the State of Manipur." "There is an imminent danger of loss of life and /or damage to public / private property, and widespread disturbances to public tranquility and communal harmony, as a inflammatory material and false rumours,

the law-and-order situation in

which might be transmitted /circulated to the public through social media / messaging services on mobile, SMS services and dongle services," it stated.

"To thwart the design and activities of anti-national and anti-social elements and to maintain peace and communal harmony and to prevent any loss of life or danger to public / private Manipur property, it has become officials sa necessary to take adequate o maintain l order in public interest, by stopping the spread of misinformation and false rumours, through various social media platform such as WhatsApp, Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, etc on

various electronic equipment like tablet, computer, mobile phone, etc, and sending bulk SMS, for facilitating and /or mobilisation of mobs of agitators and demonstrators, which can cause loss of life and /or damage to public / private property by indulging in arson / vandalism and other types of violent activities," it

'Temporary suspension curbing of internet and mobile data services including Lease Lines, VSATs, broadbands and VPN services (were ordered) in the territorial jurisdiction of the State of Manipur for five days with effect from 3 PM of

September 10 to till 3 PM of total curfew in Imphal East September 15," the notification said.

Meanwhile, tear gas shells were fired as student and women demonstrators on Tuesday clashed with security forces during the agitators' attempt to march towards the Raj Bhavan to press for their demands to remove the DGP and security advisor to the Government, officials said.

Khwairamband Women Market since Monday, tried to march towards the Raj Bhavan along the BT Road but were stopped by security forces near the Congress Bhavan.

The Manipur Government has clamped curfew in Imphal East and West districts and prohibitory orders under Section 163 (2) of BNSS in Thoubal district in view of the student protests.

An indefinite curfew, preventing people from coming outside their houses, was clamped in Imphal East and West districts, while prohibitory orders under Section 163 (2) of BNSS were

imposed in Thoubal. Due to the developing law and order situation in the district, earlier orders of curfew relaxation stand cancelled with immediate effect from 11 am of September 10. Hence, there is

district with immediate effect until further orders," an order issued by the district magistrate said.

Another order issued by the

district magistrate of Imphal West said, "In supersession of all earlier orders, curfew relaxation period for September 10 is hereby lifted with effect from 11 am today. "Restriction on the movement of people outside their Hundreds of students, who respective residences was have been camping at lifted from September 1 last year," it said. Earlier, curfew relaxation for September 10 was lifted from 5 am to 10 pm but was superseded by the latest order. Essential services, including media, electricity, court and health, are however exempted from the purview of

the curfew, it said. The orders from the two Imphal districts came in the wake of students planning to their protests intensify demanding the removal of the DGP and security advisor to the State Government for their alleged inability to deal with the law and order situation in the state.

The prohibitory orders in Thoubal prevented the assembly of five or more persons as police claimed that at least one personnel was hit on the thigh by a bullet fired from the protesting students in the district on Monday.

## **BJP Leaders criticise Rahul Gandhi** for remarks in US on Sikh community

B<sup>JP</sup> and Congress engaged in a war of words following the Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's series of attack on the Modi Government, BJP and RSS during his interactions with various stakeholders in the United States.

Gandhi remarks in the US about the Sikh community, saying the Congress Leader is trying to create a "dangerous narrative" by speaking on "sensitive issues" abroad. Congress hit back at the BJP over its criticism of Rahul Gandhi's remarks in the US, saying the ruling party should not treat itself as being synonymous with the country. The principal Opposition party in the Lok Sabha also said it would keep criticising the policies of the Government. Rahul is currently on a fourday visit to the United States. His first stop was in Dallas which began on Saturday, and he arrived in Washington DC on Monday.

Union Minister Hardeep Singh Puri told a Press conference at the BJP headquarters that Rahul's remarks were "sinister" in nature as he tried to spread

of the Sikh community living abroad to "eke out a living and do not have much connection with India. "I condemn in the strongest

terms the statement he has

made about Sikhs not being able to wear turbans and kadas," the BJP Leader from the Sikh community said. BJP came down heavily on Addressing a gathering of Chouhan also slammed the Americans in Herndon, a

Virginia suburb Washington DC, on Monday, Rahul Gandhi accused the RSS of considering some religions, languages and communities of being inferior to others and said the fight in India is about

this and not about politics. "First of all, you have to understand what the fight is about. The fight is not about politics. That is superficial," Rahul said as he asked one of the Sikh attendees in the front rows to give his name. What is your name, brother with the turban," he asked.

The fight is about whether a Sikh is going to be allowed to wear his turban in India or a kada in India. Or he, as a Sikh, is going to be able to go to Gurdwara. That's what the fight is about. And not just for him, for all religions," said Rahul.

Hitting out at the Congress

leader, Puri said Gandhi, of late, has been making statements on sensitive issues. which "involve our national identity, unity, the strength of our unity and diversity". "I think he is trying to set a new kind of narrative which I think is a dangerous narrative," he

said.

Congress leader for his alleged remarks accusing him of "defaming" India abroad out of his frustration due to repeated defeat in elections. 'Only a frustrated person can defame the country and spoil its image abroad. Now he is raising questions not only on the Government but also the Election Commission, Chouhan said. Rahul Gandhi

is the Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha and the position carries responsibility, he said. Congress' media and publicity

department head Pawan Khera said, "Since when has BJP become synonymous with India that if one condemns BJP, it is equated with condemning India. The BJP and Narendra Modi should not have this misunderstanding that condemning them is like condemning India."

### **Haryana: BJP** releases second list, drops six MLAs

The BJP on Tuesday released second list of its candidates, dropping sixsitting MLAs, including two Ministers for the Haryana Assembly polls. The BJP has fielded Captain Yogesh Bairagi from Julana against Olympian Congress's candidate Vinesh Phogat while two former Ministers Krishan Kumar Bedi and Manish Grover have been fielded from Narwana and Rohtak seats, respectively. The list also includes two Muslim candidates: Naseem Ahmed from Ferozepur Jhirka and Aizaz Khan from Punahana. With this, the BJP has fielded 87 candidates and three segments where the party is to announce candidates are Faridabad-NIT,

Sirsa and Mahendergarh. The party's Pehowa candidate, Sardar Kamaljeet Singh Ajrana, was also replaced by Jai Bhagwan Sharma after he evnressed his inability to contest the poll on party ticket citing Opposition from the local Leaders. Ajrana was named in the first list after dropping sitting MLA and former Sports Minister Sandeep Singh, who is an

## Delhi LG lays foundation stone for 47 developmental projects

ieutenant Governor Delhi Lieutenam Governo. 2. Vinai Kumar Saxena on Tuesday laid the foundation stone of 47 developmental projects worth around Rs 45 crore in 29 villages of North Delhi under Dilli Gramodaya Abhiyan (DGA).

Speaking on the occasion, Chairman of Delhi Development Authority (DDA) Saxena said, "The developmental works undertaken in the villages will have huge and positive transformation in the life of the villagers," adding rural Delhi will have all the amenities in the coming days.

He also inspected various developmental works undertaken, including road and drain work, renovation of cremation ground at Singhu Village. "Besides, plantation was done under "Ek Ped Maa ke Naam" campaign and fruit saplings were distributed to the villagers. To empower women and their self-help groups, Drone Didi programme was also inaugurat-



ed," a Raj Niwas official said. North West Delhi BJP MP Yogender Chandolia and Vice Chairman DDA Subhasish Panda, were also present on the occasion. A week earlier, Saxena had inaugurated 22 developmental projects in 18 urbanised villages of South West Delhi.

"Dilli Gramodaya Abhiyan' was launched in December 2023 to improve living conditions in villages by extending civic amenities. For development of these villages, Gram Sabha Area Fund of about Rs 960 crore that was

lying unused with Delhi Government, was transferred to DDA for undertaking various developmental works in villages of Delhi," a senior Raj Niwas official said.

He added that the LG is spearheading various works to address rural challenges and to ensure that development works through various civic agencies including DDA are effectively implemented. "Till date, 573 works worth Rs 523 crore have been sanctioned under this Abhiyan. These include 89 projects of DDA," the officer said.

## Delhi BJP accuses AAP of not improving slum dwellers' lives in last ten years

Delhi BJP President Virendra Sachdeva on Tuesday accused the AAP government of not improving the lives of slum dwellers in the last ten years even as senior AAP leader Manish Sisodia visited southeast Delhi's Madrasi Camp, where residents have been served eviction notices to make way for the construction of a new flyover, and said the party "will fight strongly against dictatorship to save people's houses'

The Public Works Department (PWD) pasted eviction notices in the Old Barapullah Bridge area last week, asking the locals to vacate their homes within five days. The residents, however, have refused to leave unless they are given an alternative site. "Injustice against slum dwellers

will not be tolerated in 'Bulldozer Raj'. Thousands of people living in slums of Madrasi Camp in Delhi are an integral part of Delhi. If LG sahab and BJP try to remove or demolish their houses, we will not tolerate it at all. We will fight strongly against dictatorship to save people's houses. Whether we have to fight in



court or on the ground for this," Sisodia said in a post on ments.

He added that the AAP government has given shelter to the needy and built houses for people. "Free electricity, water and better education for children. But the BJP has only destroyed people's well-established homes. The level of education has gone from bad to worse. We will fight against this from the court to the streets,"

he added in the same post. Meanwhile, the Delhi BJP chief alleged, "The Delhi government's PWD issued a notice to the residents of Madrasi Basti to vacate, which the Delhi BJP has continuously opposed. Now, Manish Sisodia is trying to avoid responsibility for this notice by making hollow state

He also claimed that the central government has undertaken the rehabilitation work of slum dwellers in Kalkaji, Jailer Bagh, and Kathputli Colony. "Manish Sisodia should name a single slum cluster in Delhi where the Kejriwal government has improved the lives of slum dwellers in the last ten

years," he added. He also mentioned that, like many other slum settlements in Delhi, Madrasi Basti in the Jangpura constituency was a case in court, but neither the Delhi government nor its DUSIB department presented any proposal to the court to save this settlement or for the rehabilitation of its residents.

### Mpox patient admitted to LNJP hospital in stable condition: Health Minister

Delhi Health Minister Saurabh Bharadwaj on Tuesday said that the mpox patient admitted at Lok Nayak Jaiprakash (LNJP) Hospital is in a stable condition. Bharadwaj conducted a sur-

prise inspection of the hospital to assess preparations for dealing with mpox and dengue and also spoke to the mpox patient. "This patient of mpox has a travel history. So, it is believed that he got this infection when he was outside the country. Right now, the patient has been kept in isolation in the disaster management ward here. His condition is said to be stable," said the minister. Bharadwaj emphasised that

there was no need to panic over mpox, as it spreads through contact, not through the air. "We have reviewed that how the doctors will identify a dengue patient if they come in emergency and then how will they be shifted to a different ward. Similarly, surprise inspections will be conducted in other hospitals as well so that if the need arises, all facilities are available in the hospitals," said the health minister.

### **MCD Standing Committee polls to be** held on September 26

The Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) Standing Committee elections will be held on September 26 to fill the vacancy after BJP councillor Kamaljeet Sehrawat was elected as an MP in the Lok Sabha The elections will be held in the

MCD House meeting, which will convene on the same date. During this session, a member will be elected to the civic body's highest decision making committee and MCD's financial backbone Standing Committee to fill the vacancy. Once the elections are done. the process to elect the chairman and vice-chairman of the Standing Committee is expected to begin in October. These positions are crucial, as they have a significant influence over the MCD operations, including the allocation of funds and overseeing the development projects in the city. No project costing more than Rs 5 crore can proceed without



the standing committee's approval making the significance of the body important. The committee consists of 18 members out of which the BJP recently strengthened its position by securing seven seats in the ward committee. Twelve members from the ward committees will join the Standing Committee, with seven of them being the BJP councillors.

For the remaining six seats, both the BJP and the AAP secured three each in the previous Standing Committee elections in 2022. One of the BIP's seats became vacant after Kamalieet Sehrawat's election to the Lok Sabha and the upcoming election will fill this

## 127 candidates file nomination papers today for Assembly polls in Haryana

total 127 candidates filed Atheir nomination papers on Tuesday, taking the number of nominations submitted so far to 277 for the assembly polls in Haryana. The enforcement agencies have seized Rs 14 crore so far which include Rs 10.45 lakh in cash, 2.44 lakh liters of liquor, 2,079 kg of drugs valued at Rs 4.36 crore, 30.5 kg of precious metals, and freebies/ any other items worth Rs 1.35 crore.

Haryana Chief Secretary Dr. TVŚN Prasad on Tuesday provided a detailed update on the state's election preparedness and law and order situation during the Inter-State Border Meeting convened by the Election Commission of India in light of the upcoming Haryana Legislative Assembly elections.

During the meeting, Dr. Prasad said that since the announcement of the elections, authorities in Haryana have seized illegal liquor, narcotics, cash, and valuables totaling Rs 14



To further strengthen law and order,, Haryana has established 435 flying squads and 377 Static Surveillance Teams (SSTs) across the state. Additionally, 133 inter-state nakas have been set up along border points to prevent the movement of illegal substances, unlicensed weapons, and individuals with criminal backgrounds. Another 140 intrastate nakas have been established to curb the trafficking of liquor, drugs, and other illegal items within Harvana. The Haryana Police have also

seized 96 unlicensed weapons 113 cartridges.

Furthermore, since the election announcement, 176 proclaimed offenders, 129 bail jumpers, and 210 warranted persons have been arrested. Dr. Prasad said that the law and order situation in Haryana is peaceful and under full control. For coordinating logistics and accommodation for security personnel, Nodal Officers of DSP rank have been appointed in each district. Dr. Prasad emphasized that no

unauthorized persons will be allowed to stay in Harvana during the crucial 48 hours leading up to the election, in order to ensure a free and fair voting

## 16 children rescued from clutches of child labour, 11 establishments sealed by SDM

In a major breakthrough, Prayas JAC Society with the help of Labor Department, the local police and led by the SDM Dwarka carried out a rescue operation and successfully freed 16 children from the clutches of child labour on Monday.

The operation, which was carried out under the authority of three different police stations namely, Dwarka South, Sagarpur and Palam where 6,8 and 2 children were rescued respectively, marks a key milestone in the ongoing fight against child exploita-

The children aged between 13-18 hailed majorly from UP, Bihar, Delhi and Haryana and were found working in different establishments. ¬he Delhi police is taking a The Delli police is the proactive approach to manage law and order in the university area now witnessing campaigning for the Delhi University Students Union (DUSU) polls to be held on September 27.

The police have already registered FIRs against leaders of different student unions including Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP) and Congress' National Students' Union of India while heightening the security deployment in a three step

Amid campaigning ahead of the keenly contested DUSU elections in full swing with posters up on walls, DCP North Manoj Kumar Meena said that a total of 23 FIRs have been lodged in the last 15 days in regards to defacement of public property including 18 against those leaders whose posters have been up on the walls of the north campus university area, which has prestigious colleges like Sri Ram College of Commerce (SRCC), Miranda House, Ramjas among others. Posters and banners of differhave been pasted across the campus despite the 'democracy walls', which are dedicated spaces provided by the administration to paste campaign material.

To ensure that we maintain the law and order situation ahead of the DUSU elections and see that no violence happens, we have taken a proactive approach. First, we have registered FIRs against 18 student leaders whose posters have been put up outside the walls of the college and will continue to do so till the elections," Meena said. The five other

The FIRs have been lodged under Section 3 of the Delhi Defacement of Public Property Act, 2007 which states "whoever defaces any property in public view by writing or marking with ink, chalk, paint or any other material except for the purpose of indicating the name and address of the owner or occupier of such property, shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to one year,

to fifty thousand rupees, or with both."

Further, along with this, the police are also providing necessary security when drives by Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) and administration of the university are being carried out to remove such posters and banners. Strengthening and increasing

security deployment round the clock around the campus zone from September 1 is another step taken by the police to ensure that nothing untoward happens in the anticipation of the elections. These

ly increased in the coming days till elections take place. Firstly, police personnel have deployed in day and night to ensure vigilance in the area with increased deployment in

the night. "We deploy 35 more police officers at night in addition to the existing ones to make sure no untoward incident happens," Meena stated. Further, the police are also patrolling the area by cars and pikes to keep the environment around the campus safe for college students. Additionally, vehicular checks around the area are also being done.

## Expedite recruitment for effective implementation of three new laws: LG

Giving details, Raj Niwas officials said on Tuesday, Saxena on Monday reviewed the ongoing implementation of the three new criminal legislations in the National Capital. Expressing satisfaction over the status and pace of the roll out, the LG asked for the recruitments against various posts required to be expedited. In this regard, he asked the Chief Secretary to form a Committee of all departments concerned so as to expedite the recruitment process of permanent employees by smoothening out processes like finalization of RRs, advertising of posts, etc. in one go. The departments involved in



include Services, Administrative Reforms, Finance and the user departments, FSL, Directorate of Prosecution and Prisons.

Apart from the Chief Secretary, heads of all stakeholder departments viz, Home Department, GNCTD, Delhi Police, Forensic Science National Laboratory, Informatics Centre, Directorate of Prosecution, GNCTD, Health Department, Finance and Administrative Reforms Department were present in the meeting.

The high court asked the authorities to file their status reports within 10 days on whether the colony is impeding the flow of water.

Ādvocate Prabhsahay Kaur, representing the Delhi Development Authority (DDA), submitted that this colony was falling on Barapullah drain and it was impeding the water flow and said the PWD may give complete details to the court.



### Power discoms battling menace of illegal e-rickshaw charging facilities

The power discoms are battling the menace of illegal e-rickshaw charging facilities that cause an estimated loss of around Rs 120 crore annually besides posing safety risks in the national capital.

Delhi has around 1.6 lakh erickshaws out of which just 50,000 are registered with with Transport Department of the city government. The department has been conducting a drive to seize and scrap unregistered e-rickshaws.

The discoms and Power Department in the past tried to curb power theft in charging of e-rickshaws and address safety issues. Around 4,000 legal e-rickshaw charging connections have been given to individuals and operators. Each connection is capable of charging multiple e-rickshaws, discom officials said.

"Besides revenue loss, illegal charging and sub-standard batteries pose significant safety hazards," said a discom official.

Various incidents of fire and electrocution due to faulty charging facility have been reported recently in the city. Last week, a man was electrocuted while charging an erickshaw in northeast Delhi. "This is a new kind of power theft being witnessed now. It's estimated that over 60 per cent of e-rickshaws are involved in power theft, resulting in a loss of 15-20 MW across the city, translating to an annual loss of around Rs 120 crore," they

Illegal charging through direct theft and the use of sub-standard batteries pose significant safety hazards. Exposed electricity wires left open during illegal charging and non-adherence to safety standards often cause sparks and short circuits, they said.

"Large-scale illegal charging of e-rickshaws at single, unplanned locations can also lead to breakdowns and voltage issues. Many e-rickshaws involved in power theft are charged in batches as part of an organized illegal network controlled by local strongmen, official sources said. "E-rickshaw owners or drivers pay a fixed fee of Rs 200-300 per day per e-rickshaw to the 'parking and charging

# PM focuses on localised solutions Amit Shah urges use of Al to combat to global issues at ANRF meeting Cybercrime at I4C Foundation Day

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday urged cyber security agencies to use Artificial Intelligence (AI) to identify the modus operandi of criminals duping people of their hard-earned money, spreading fake news and abus-ing women and children online.


India hosts around 46 per cent or almost half of global digital transactions, making the job of these agencies "challenging", he said while delivering a keynote speech during the first foun-dation day celebrations of the I4C or Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre here.

The I4C, established in 2018, is a department under the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA). It is tasked with establishing a national-level coordination centre to address all cybercrime-related issues in the country.

During the event, Shah launched four platforms of the I4C —cyber fraud mitigation centre (CFMC), the 'Samanvaya' platform, a cyber commandos programme and a suspect

With no let up in the death by suicide in India particularly among youth, mental health experts have called for a critical shift in understanding and addressing the trend, emphasising the need to consider socio-economic factors along-

side mental health issues. This comprehensive approach is crucial given the country's alarming suicide statistics-171,000 lives lost in 2022 alone, said Dr Rakhi Dandona, Professor of Public Health at the Public Health Foundation of India in a new six-paper series published in The Lancet Public Health. It was released on World Suicide Prevention Day marked on Tuesday.

India's National Suicide Prevention Strategy released recently aims to reduce suicide deaths by 10 percent by 2030. While the strategy focuses primarily on mental health interventions, the authors have highlighted the importance of integrating a wider range of socio-economic factors. Police data suggests that variables like gender, employment, and stressful life events also sig-nificantly influence suicide

It includes measures such as establishing effective suicide surveillance systems and integrating mental well-being curricula into educational institutions

The series outlines six key aspects of a public health approach to suicide prevention. These include examining social determinants and a model that considers how suicide may arise from various social conditions

Dr Dandona stressed the need for national policies to mitigate economic hardships, such as maintaining minimum wage levels. She also highlighted how exposure to suicide-related information can increase risk, suggesting restrictions on media portrayals of suicide defence ties amid China tensions PIONEER NEWS SERVICE

Two co-accused in the case, Shokat Ali and Mohabbat Ali, were brought from Saudi Arabia on April three, 2024 and August 17, 2023, respectively in an operation coordinated by the Global Operations Centre of the CBI with Interpol NCB-Riyadh and the NIA

It is alleged that Khan along with the co-accused had provided gold bars to be smuggled from Riyadh into Jaipur. Gold bars weighing 18.56 kilograms worth Rs 9 crore in the market



were seized while being smuggled into the country at the Jaipur airport from Saudi Arabia in 2020 as part of the "criminal conspiracy to derail the country's economic security and monetary stability", the NIA said in a statement on August 17, 2023. The bars had been concealed inside a battery on Tuesday. of emergency lights for smug-

"He (Khan) is involved in international gold smuggling from Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, to Jaipur, Índia. The subject was charge-sheeted by the NIA on March 22, 2021, before the NIA Special Court, Jaipur. He was wanted for criminal conspiracy for offences under Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act," the spokesperson said.

## Israel approaches **India for 15,000** workers to plug their skill gap

I srael has approached India to carry out recruitment drive again for 10,000 construction workers and 5,000 caregivers simultaneously to plug their skill gap in the infrastructure

and health sector. This comes on the back of a similar request made by Israel, earlier in the year, National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC)said here

The Population, Immigration, has put in a request across four specific job roles: Framework, Iron Bending, Plastering, and

Ceramic Tiling. A team from PIBA, comprising of assessors, is to visit India in the coming week to carry out the necessary skill tests for selecting those who meet their criteria and skill

requisites. The second round of recruitment drive for construction workers is to take place in Maharashtra, it said.

Further, Israel also requires 5,000 caregivers to boost its healthcare services. They have stated candidates who have completed at least their 10th standard along with holding a certificate issued by a recognised Indian institute and completing a care giving course with at least 990 hours of onthe-job training can apply.

In the first round of recruitment of construction workers for Israel, a total of 16,832 candidates appeared for skill tests in their trade out of which 10349 candidates were select

Those selected will earn a salary of Rs 1.92 lakh per month, along with medical insurance, food, and accommodation. A bonus of Rs 16,515 per month is also provided to these candidates.

The NSDC reached out to all states to carry out recruitment after the government-to-government (G2G) agreement was signed in November 2023. The first round of recruitment drive was carried out in Uttar Pradesh, Haryana and Telangana.

The agreement was signed after India and Israel initiated a Framework Agreement on Temporary Employment of Indians in May 2023.

All the candidates, going through the G2G pathway are mandated to undergo predeparture orientation train-

ing. This encompasses a manual to understand Israeli culture and way of life and get accustomed to their new home.

## Siddha medicine effective in treating anaemia in adolescent girls: Ayush Ministry

Integrating Siddha medicine, a traditional system of healing from South India, into anaemia treatment strategies could support the flagship Anaemia Mukt Bharat programme by combating this condition among adolescent girls, the Union Ayush Ministry has stated, citing findings from a recent study.

Titled "A Combination Siddha Drug Reduces Anaemia Among Adolescent Girls in Virudhunagar District of Tamil Nadu, India," the study was conducted at a hospital in the Southern State under the Public Health Initiative to mainstream 'Siddha' drugs for anaemia treatment.

Published in the Indian Journal of Traditional Knowledge, it highlights the potential of Siddha medicine in addressing this public health challenge. The study found that a combination of Siddha drugs

effective in improving various anaemia indicators such as haemoglobin levels, packed cell volume, and mean corpuscular hemoglobin. Anaemia in adolescent girls often stems from poor diet,

menstrual blood loss, and underlying health conditions. If Siddha remedies prove effective, they could complement conventional treatments like ABMN, which includes iron supplements and dietary Annapeticenturam, Bavana adjustments. The research was katukkay, Matulai manappaku, carried out by experts from

Siddha institutions, including the National Institute of Siddha Dr. R Meenakumari, Director

of NIS and a senior author of the study, emphasised, "Siddha' medicine plays a notable role in the public health initiatives of the Ministry of Ayush."

She noted that awareness among adolescent girls, dietary advice, and Siddha drug treatment provided therapeutic benefits, making it a cost-effective and accessible treatment

### Strategic partnership

Following PM Modi and UAE Crown Prince Al Nahyan talks, India-UAE relations reach new heights with landmark energy pacts

■ ndian diplomacy is soaring to new heights. As nations around the world eagerly welcome Indian businesses and forge strategic alliances, India is experiencing an unprecedented wave of global goodwill and influence not seen in years. The recent UAE-India energy pact is yet another case in point. UAE crown prince Sheikh Khaled bin Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan is presently in India and had a meaningful dialogue with Prime Minister Modi. India and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) continue to strengthen their strategic partnership, with a significant boost in the energy sector, as both nations signed four major agreements aimed at deepening cooperation. The agreements span key sectors, including liquefied natural gas (LNG) trade, petroleum supplies, nuclear plant operations, and production concessions, marking a pivotal moment in the bilateral relationship. As both leaders emphasised, the pacts signal a broadening of collaboration, particularly in emerging areas such as nuclear ener-

> gy, critical minerals, green hydrogen, artificial intelligence, and advanced technologies.

The signing of a long-term supply agreement for one million metric tonnes of LNG per annum between Abu Dhabi National Oil Company (ADNOC) and the Indian Oil Corporation Ltd (IOCL) is among the most prominent developments. This is the third such deal in just over a year, reinforcing India's energy security while further consolidating ties with one of the world's leading energy producers. In addition, a groundbreaking production concession pact was signed between Urja Bharat and ADNOC for Abu Dhabi's Onshore Block One. This marks the first instance of an Indian com-

pany holding an energy production concession in the UAE. An equally crucial development is the agreement between the Emirates Nuclear Energy Company (ENEC) and the Nuclear Power Corporation of India Ltd (NPCIL). This pact is designed to enhance collaboration in the operation and maintenance of nuclear power plants, sourcing nuclear goods from India, and fostering mutual investments in the civil nuclear domain. During their discussions, PM Modi and Crown Prince Al Nahyan acknowledged the rapid progress made under the India-UAE Comprehensive Strategic Partnership, which was first established during Modi's 2015 visit to the UAE. With about 3.5 million Indian expatriates forming the largest community in the UAE, the deepening of ties in key sectors like energy, nuclear cooperation, and trade will continue to be a cornerstone of this growing relationship. Crown Prince also paid tribute to Mahatma Gandhi at Rajghat, where he planted a sapling, continuing a tradition started by his grandfather in 1992. The crown prince's visit is more than just about pacts. It strengthens the historic ties between the two countries. The recent implementation of the Local Currency Settlement (LCS) System, which facilitates cross-border transactions in Indian Rupees and UAE Dirhams is yet another example of growing affinity between the two countries.

## 9/11: The day that changed the world



As we commemorate the lives lost and honor the bravery of those who responded, we must also commit to building a future grounded in peace, tolerance and mutual respect

n September 11, 2001, the world stood still as a series of events unfolded that would forever alter the course of history. The terrorist attacks of 9/11 not only shook the United States to its core but also had profound repercussions globally, leaving an indelible mark on international politics, security frameworks, and societal attitudes. Now, 23 years later, the legacy of that day continues to influence the world in significant

The attacks, orchestrated by 19 members of the extremist group Al-Qaeda, led by Osama bin Laden, were intended to instill fear and challenge American power. The immediate aftermath saw the U.S. respond swiftly with the launch of the "War on Terror." Just weeks later, in October 2001, the U.S. invaded Afghanistan, targeting the Taliban regime that harbored Al-Qaeda operatives. The war, which initially focused on dismantling the Taliban, expanded in 2003 to include Iraq, resulting in the toppling of Saddam Hussein's regime.

The costs of these wars, however, were staggering. Over two million people lost their lives, and the financial toll was estimated at \$4.5 trillion. The Middle East was plunged into a state of instability, with extremist groups like ISIS rising in the wake of regime collapses. The U.S. intervention, initially framed as a campaign to liberate oppressed nations, came under heavy criticism due to incidents like the torture of detainees in Abu Ghraib and Guantanamo Bay. These actions tarnished the U.S.'s reputation, fueling anti-American sentiment and exacerbating tensions between the West and the Islamic

Beyond military campaigns, 9/11 also had far-reaching societal impacts. In the U.S. and elsewhere, fear and suspicion of Muslims surged. Islamophobia became more entrenched, as communities and individuals were unfairly associated with terrorism. The clash of civilizations narrative, which framed Islam as inherently opposed to Western values, gained traction, deepening divisions and fueling preju-

dice. This legacy of suspicion and distrust continues to shape political discourse and societal attitudes today.

The seeds of 9/11 were planted decades earlier during the Cold War, when the U.S. supported Islamist fighters in Afghanistan to counter Soviet influence. Figures like Osama bin Laden, initially seen as allies in the fight against communism, turned against the U.S. after the Soviet withdrawal. Bin Laden's growing resentment of U.S. involvement in the Middle East culminated in the deadly attacks on September 11, a day that redefined global security priorities.

In response to 9/11, the Bush administration implemented a range of measures to protect national security. The Department of Homeland Security was established, and stringent airport security protocols became the norm worldwide. The U.S. also adopted the Bush Doctrine, which justified preemptive strikes against nations that harbored or supported terrorists. This doctrine underpinned the invasions of Afghanistan and Iraq and marked a significant shift in U.S. foreign policy.

However, the invasions, espe-

cially that of Iraq, became highly controversial. While the Bush administration ini-

tially claimed that Saddam Hussein possessed weapons of mass destruction (WMDs), none were found, leading to widespread skepticism about the true motives behind the war. The failure to uncover WMDs highlighted the dangers of misinformation and flawed intelligence, further eroding public trust in the government

In the years that followed, 9/11 and its aftermath shaped not only U.S. foreign policy but also the broader international order. Counterterrorism became a global priority, with governments implementing new laws to enhance surveillance and prevent further attacks. However, this focus on security often came at the expense of civil liberties, as governments expanded their powers to monitor citizens, raising concerns about privacy and individual freedoms. The physical site of the World Trade Center has since been rebuilt, with the One World Trade Center standing as a symbol of resilience. At the base of the original towers, a memorial and museum have been constructed to honor the victims. Yet for many, the emotional scars remain. Survivors, first responders, and the families of victims continue to grapple with the trauma of that fateful day.

he 47th edition of the biannual WorldSkills Competition-2024 is set to begin in Lyon, France. The competition featured a 60-member young contingent from the WorldSkills India Team competing in 52 skill categories against participants from over 70 countries. Often considered the "Olympics of Skilling", this international skilling competition is expected to attract over 2.5 lakh participants and will take place from September 10-15. It will include more than 1,400 competitors and 1,300 experts. The WorldSkills Competition is a platform that celebrates excellence in a wide range of skills, from construction and manufacturing to information technology and creative arts.

The 60-member India team, with 20 per cent women, is a breakthrough in this edition as they will compete in traditionany maie-dominated fields like welding plumbing, and heating. They have received rigorous training supported by leading corporations in the manufacturing sector and expertise from industry leaders and institutions across the country. Unfortunately, the same approach is missing in the female-dominated (67%) beauty and wellness sector, as its skills potential still needs to be appropriately recognised in the current contingent in the WorldSkills Competition.



## The silent crisis: Rising suicide cases demand urgent attention

As mental health continues to be overshadowed by the pursuit of success, it is crucial to provide support to those who need it most

¬he rising number of suicides in India, especially among young people and businessmen, is an alarming and heart-wrenching issue that demands serious attention. News about students and entrepreneurs ending their lives after facing failure or distress has become all too frequent. It is high time that society, including teachers, psychiatrists, and responsible citizens, reflects on why these individuals are so prone to taking such extreme measures in moments of despair.

In recent years, the suicide epidemic has gained prominence, particularly among students preparing for competitive exams. The pressure to succeed, exacerbated by societal expectations and the fear of failure, has devastating conse-

the Lok Sabha, over 35,000 students in India committed suicide between 2019 and 2021. In 2019, the number of student suicides stood at 10,335, which increased to 12,526 in 2020 and further to 13,089 in 2021. These figures paint a grim picture of the pressures that students face. The constant comparison to peers, the relentless competition, and the desire to meet the high expectations of parents, teachers, and society often leave young individuals feeling trapped, hopeless, and unable to cope with failure. Former president of the Indian Medical Association, Dr. Vinay Aggarwal, emphasizes that merely expressing concern over the rising number of sui-

On World Suicide Prevention Day, which falls on September 10th, a seminar will be held in New Delhi to discuss the causes behind youth, businessman, and other suicides. The event will bring together psychiatrists, journalists, and social workers who will share their experiences and insights. Following this, strategies will be developed to curb the rising suicide rates. In the realm of student sui-

cides, efforts are being made by some coaching centers to ease the pressure on students. Counseling services have been introduced, and parents are being engaged in the process to ensure students' well-being. These initiatives aim to reduce the intense stress associated with high-stakes examinations. However, more compre-

The National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) reports that in 2020, a student committed suicide every 42 minutes. This statistic is both shocking and indicative of the mental health crisis that young people are facing. It underscores the need for parents, teachers, and society to create an environment of success.

that allows students to pursue their academic goals without undue pressure. Social worker Brother Solomon George of the Delhi Brotherhood Society (DBS) echoes this sentiment. He stresses that students should not be subjected to unnecessary comparisons or interrogations about their family background, income, or caste. Such actions, often unwittingly, can weaken a child's self-esteem and lead to despair. George advocates for a holistic approach to education that nurtures the child's mental health alongside academic success. He also emphasizes that children should have the freedom to choose careers that align with their interests and abilities, rather than being forced into predefined molds

The suicide epidemic is not limited to students. Businessmen, too, have been increasingly taking their lives due to financial losses.

The NCRB also reveals that in 2020, during the peak of the Covid-19 pandemic, 11,716 businessmen in India committed suicide. This marked a 29% increase from 2019 when 9,052 business-related suicides were recorded. The economic turmoil brought on by the pandemic dealt a severe blow to businesses, particularly small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs). These enterprises, already vulnerable to financial shocks, were further burdened by debt and losses. Karnataka recorded the highest number of suicides by businessmen in 2020, with 1,772 deaths—a staggering 103% increase from

the previous year. Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu also reported significant increases in suicides by businessmen, with 1,610 and 1,447 cases, respectively. The plight of India's business community, especially SMEs, is often overlooked in discussions about mental health. The issue of suicide among students, businessmen, and others cannot be ignored any

It is imperative that both the government and society at arge take concerted action to address the mental health challenges facing these vulnerable groups. Preventive measures, including counseling, mental health awareness, and creating supportive environments, must be prioritised.

## 'Israeli strike on Gaza camp kills at least 19'

n Israeli strike on a crowded An Israell surke on a state of a state of the state of th displaced by the war in Gaza killed at least 19 people and wounded 60 early on Tuesday, Palestinian officials said. Israel said it targeted senior Hamas militants with precise munitions.

The overnight strike hit Muwasi, a sprawl of crowded tent camps along the Gaza coast that Israel designated as a humanitarian zone for hundreds of thousands of civilians to seek shelter from the Israel-Hamas war. Gaza's Health Ministry said it confirmed that at least 19 people were killed in the strike, and that the toll may rise as more bodies are recovered. The Civil Defence, first responders who operate under the Hamas-run government, had earlier said 40 people were killed. The Israeli military disputed that toll.

The ministry is also part of the Hamas-run government but its figures are widely seen as generally reliable. It maintains detailed records and its tallies from previous wars have largely coincided with figures from independent researchers, the United Nations and even the Israeli military.

Both the Health Ministry and the Civil Defence did not immediately respond to a request for comment on the discrepancy of their

Associated Press footage shows three large craters at the scene. First responders dug through the sand and rubble with garden tools and their bare hands, using mobile phone flashlights until the sun

came up. They pulled body parts from the sand, including what appeared to be a human leg. "We were told to go to Muwasi, to

the safe area... Look around you and see this safe place," said Iyad Hamed Madi, who had been sheltering there. "This is for my son," he said, holding up a bag of diapers. "He's 4 months old. Is he a fight-

er? There's no humanity." One of three hospitals that took in casualties from the strike, Nasser Hospital in Khan Younis, said around two dozen bodies were brought in. An Associated Press cameraman saw 10 bodies in the hospital's morgue, including two children and three women."We were sleeping, and suddenly it was like a tornado," Samar Moamer told the AP at the hospital, where

she was being treated for injuries.

## **US** accuses Iran of sending ballistic missiles to Russia

The United States formally accused Iran on Tuesday of supplying shortrange ballistic missiles to Russia for its war in Ukraine and will take measures to punish those involved. US Secretary of State Antony Blinken, speaking alongside British Foreign Secretary David Lammy during a visit to London, said that sanctions would be announced later Tuesday.

"Russia has now received shipments of these ballistic missiles and will likely use them within weeks in Ukraine, against Ukrainians, Blinken said. "The supply of Iranian missiles enables Russia to use more of its arsenal for targets that are further from the front line." His comments came as he and Lammy prepare to make a joint visit to Ukraine on Wednesday and as the Kremlin tries to repel

Ukraine's surprise offensive that has claimed hundreds of miles of territory in Russia's Kursk region.

President Ukrainian Volodymyr Zelenskyy also has ramped up pressure on the US and other allies to allow his country to use Western-supplied missiles to strike deep inside Russia and hit sites from which Moscow launches aerial attacks.

Lammy called the Iranian missile transfers to Russia "a troubling pattern that we're seeing. It is definitely a significant escalation."

Iran has denied providing Russia with weapons for its war in Ukraine.

"Iran considers the provision of military assistance to the parties engaged in the conflict — which leads to increased human casualties, destruction of infrastructure, and a distancing from ceasefire negotiations — to be inhumane," according to a recent statement from Iran's

Nations. "Thus, not only does Iran abstain from engaging in such actions itself, but it also calls upon other countries to cease the supply of weapons to the sides involved in the conflict.



ir India Express, which is Aset to complete the merger of AIX Connect with itself next month, will phase out business class seats in its aircraft in 2025, according to a senior airline official.

Currently, the carrier, part of Tata Group, has a fleet of 85 aircraft -- 25 A320 family planes and 60 Boeing 737s. By year-end, the total number is expected to be around 100. The airline has 34 white tail

Boeing 737-8 aircraft and out of them, 29 have business class seats of varying numbers. Their count will rise to 50 by the end of this year. Generally, white tail planes are those that were originally manufactured for a particular airline and later taken by another airline.

The airline official told PTI that aircraft with the business class seats will be phased out by reconfiguring them next year as business class does not fit into the Air India Express model.

These white tail aircraft have varying number of business class seats, the official added. In the existing fleet of Air India Express, there are 20 A320s, 5 A320 neos, 26 B737-NGs and 34 B737-8 planes. At present, the airline offers economy and business class seats. The global aviation industry continues to grapple with supply chain woes that have also resulted in instances of delayed aircraft deliveries and shortage of planes amid rising air traffic demand post

the coronavirus pandemic. Air India Express, a subsidiary of Air India, operates more than 380 daily flights, connecting 32 domestic and 14 international destinations. In February 2023, Tata Group-owned Air India placed orders for 470 planes comprising 250 from Airbus and 220 from Boeing. Out of the total, 400 are narrow body aircraft. Tata Group has four airlines Air India, Vistara, Air India Express and AIX Connect --





## Paralympic champs return to hero's welcome

Swarmed by hundreds of supporters, garlanded and fed sweets, India's Paralympic medal-winners returned to a jubilant welcome on Tuesday

There was the customary dhol and euphoric chants hailing them as the athletes made their way out of the Indira Gandhi International Airport this morning. Supporters, sports administrators and families of the athletes lined up to show their appreciation for the contingent.

"Thank you so much for this grand welcome," javelin thrower Sumit Antil told PTI. He clinched a second successive gold in the F64 category by breaking his own Games record with a throw of

70.59m. The reigning world champion became the second Indian after shooter Avani Lekhara to defend the Paralympics title. Avani had won gold in women's 10m air rifle standing SH1 event in Paris after winning a yellow metal in the same event in the Tokyo Games. She returned to the

## Anwar banned for four months: AIFF PSC judgment

MOHUN BAGAN ELIGIBLE FOR ₹12.90 CR COMPENSATION

The All India Football Federation on Tuesday imposed a four-month suspension on India international Anwar Ali after finding the defender "guilty" of illegally terminating his fouryear contract with Mohun Bagan who are also eligible for a huge compensation of Rs 12.90 crore. The Players Status Committee of the

AIFF also ruled that the Anwar's parent club Delhi FC and East Bengal, with whom the defender had entered into a lucrative five-year deal, have been banned from registering players for two transfer windows — 2024-25 winter and 2025-26 summer.

Anwar Ali, East Bengal and Delhi FC are all jointly "liable" for the compensation amount which includes Rs 8.40 crore for the residual value of the contract, Rs 2 crore already paid to Delhi FC under loan agreement, and Rs 2.50 crore for other "damages suffered by the club," stated the decision of the AIFF Players Status Committee

Newey has spent nearly two decades with Red Bull and is widely credited with putting the team on its path to dominance in F1. Now he's joining a team that has big ambitions to challenge for the title and the backing of billionaire Lawrence Stroll but no race wins yet.

Newey will arrive in his new role as "managing technical partner" in time to help shape how Aston Martin responds to the new F1 car regulations coming for 2026. He'll also be made a shareholder in the

Newey said he and Stroll got to know each other while training in the gym during F1 race weekends in Asia. Newey visited Aston Martin's new headquarters in June as Stroll closed in on a signing which the Canadian billionaire called "another demonstration of our ambition to build a Formula 1 team capable of fighting for world championships."

"You have to be honest with yourself and you have to keep yourself fresh and so I felt I needed a new challenge," Newey said.

Newey's departure is also part of a broader exodus of senior Red Bull staff in a season which began amid legal turmoil when team principal Christian Horner was accused of misconduct by an employee. Red Bull's parent company dismissed a complaint against Horner and an appeal was dismissed last month.
