SABOTAGE RED FLAGS INDIAN RAILWA

 $T_{\text{grappling with a massive}}^{\text{he Indian Railways is}}$ sabotage for the last one and a half year making it vulnerable for optimum functioning of the passenger and freight train operations. It face risks from LPG cylinder on railway tracks, iron rods, huge boulders and concrete slabs and tree trunks which could have led major accidents.

NIA team has joined the ongoing probe in Kanpur. Kanpur Police has detained six people, including two local history-sheeters, in connection with the case and decided to form a Special Investigation Team and will study if there are any similarities with the recent Sabarmati Express derailment in Kanpur.

"Senior officers are looking into things seriously. Whatever facts come to light, shall be shared," Uttar Pradesh DGP Prashant Kumar told The Pioneer.

Curfew in Manipur after protests for peace in Imphal Valley

urfew and prohibitory orders were imposed in **⊿**three districts of Manipur on Tuesday a day student protests demanding the restoration of peace in the strife-torn state rocked Imphal Valley.

The Manipur Government also suspended internet services in the entire State for five days amid intensified agitation by students

The decision was taken to curb the use of social media for transmission of images, hate speech and hate video, the State home department said in a notification.

It said "In view of the

prevailing law and order situation in the State of Manipur, there apprehension that some antisocial elements might use social media extensively for transmission of images, hate speech and hate video messages inciting the passions of the public, which might have serious repercussions for the law-and-order situation in

"There is an imminent danger of loss of life and /or damage to public / private property, and widespread disturbances to public tranquility and communal harmony, as a of inflammatory material and false rumours,

the State of Manipur."

which might be transmitted /circulated to the public through social media / messaging services on mobile, SMS services and dongle services," it stated.

"To thwart the design and activities of anti-national and anti-social elements and to peace maintain and communal harmony and to prevent any loss of life or danger to public / private Manipur property, it has become officials sa necessary to take adequate measures o maintain l order in public interest, by stopping the spread of misinformation and false rumours, through various social media platform such as WhatsApp, Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, etc on various electronic equipment

like tablet, computer, mobile phone, etc, and sending bulk SMS, for facilitating and /or mobilisation of mobs of agitators and demonstrators, which can cause loss of life and /or damage to public / private property by indulging in arson / vandalism and other types of violent activities," it

'Temporary suspension curbing of internet and mobile data services including Lease Lines, VSATs, broadbands and VPN services (were ordered) in the territorial jurisdiction of the State of Manipur for five days with effect from 3 PM of

September 10 to till 3 PM of total curfew in Imphal East September 15," the notification said.

Meanwhile, tear gas shells were fired as student and women demonstrators on Tuesday clashed with security forces during the agitators' attempt to march towards the Raj Bhavan to press for their demands to remove the DGP and security advisor to the Government, officials said.

Khwairamband Women Market since Monday, tried to march towards the Raj Bhavan along the BT Road but were stopped by security forces near the Congress Bhavan.

The Manipur Government has clamped curfew in Imphal East and West districts and prohibitory orders under Section 163 (2) of BNSS in Thoubal district in view of the student protests.

An indefinite curfew, preventing people from coming outside their houses, was clamped in Imphal East and West districts, while prohibitory orders under Section 163 (2) of BNSS were imposed in Thoubal.

"Due to the developing law and order situation in the district, earlier orders of relaxation stand curfew cancelled with immediate effect from 11 am of September 10. Hence, there is

district with immediate effect until further orders," an order issued by the district magistrate said.

Another order issued by the district magistrate of Imphal West said, "In supersession of all earlier orders, curfew relaxation period for September 10 is hereby lifted with effect from 11 am today. "Restriction on the movement of people outside their Hundreds of students, who respective residences was have been camping at lifted from September 1 last year," it said. Earlier, curfew relaxation for September 10 was lifted from 5 am to 10 pm but was superseded by the latest order. Essential services, including media, electricity, court and health, are however exempted from the purview of

the curfew, it said. The orders from the two Imphal districts came in the wake of students planning to intensify their protests demanding the removal of the DGP and security advisor to the State Government for their alleged inability to deal with the law and order situation in the state.

The prohibitory orders in Thoubal prevented the assembly of five or more persons as police claimed that at least one personnel was hit on the thigh by a bullet fired from the protesting students in the district on Monday.

BJP Leaders criticise Rahul Gandhi for remarks in US on Sikh community

B^{JP} and Congress engaged in a war of words following the Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's series of attack on the Modi Government, BJP and RSS during his interactions with various stakeholders in the United States.

Gandhi remarks in the US about the Sikh community, saying the Congress Leader is trying to create a "dangerous narrative" by speaking on "sensitive issues" abroad. Congress hit back at the BJP over its criticism of Rahul Gandhi's remarks in the US, saying the ruling party should not treat itself as being synonymous with the country. The principal Opposition party in the Lok Sabha also said it would keep criticising the policies of the Government. Rahul is currently on a fourday visit to the United States. His first stop was in Dallas which began on Saturday, and he arrived in Washington DC on Monday.

Union Minister Hardeep Singh Puri told a Press conference at the BJP headquarters that Rahul's remarks were "sinister" in nature as he tried to spread

falsehood among the members of the Sikh community living abroad to "eke out a living and do not have much connection with India. "I condemn in the strongest

terms the statement he has made about Sikhs not being able to wear turbans and kadas," the BJP Leader from the Sikh community said. BJP came down heavily on Addressing a gathering of Chouhan also slammed the

Americans in Herndon, a Virginia suburb Washington DC, on Monday, Rahul Gandhi accused the RSS of considering some religions, languages and communities of being inferior to others and

said the fight in India is about this and not about politics. "First of all, you have to understand what the fight is about. The fight is not about politics. That is superficial," Rahul said as he asked one of the Sikh attendees in the front rows to give his name. What is your name, brother with the

turban," he asked.

The fight is about whether a Sikh is going to be allowed to wear his turban in India or a kada in India. Or he, as a Sikh, is going to be able to go to Gurdwara. That's what the fight is about. And not just for him, for all religions," said Rahul.

Hitting out at the Congress

leader, Puri said Gandhi, of late, has been making statements on sensitive issues. which "involve our national identity, unity, the strength of our unity and diversity". "I think he is trying to set a new kind of narrative which I think is a dangerous narrative," he

said.

Congress leader for alleged remarks accusing him of "defaming" India abroad out of his frustration due to repeated defeat in elections. Haryana: BJP releases second list, drops six MLAs

The BJP on Tuesday released second list of its candidates, dropping sixsitting MLAs, including two Ministers for the Haryana Assembly polls. The BJP has fielded Captain Yogesh Bairagi from Julana against Olympian Congress's candidate Vinesh Phogat while two former Ministers Krishan Kumar Bedi and Manish Grover have been fielded from Narwana and Rohtak seats, respectively. The list also includes two Muslim candidates: Naseem Ahmed from Ferozepur Jhirka and Aizaz Khan from Punahana. With this, the BJP has fielded 87 candidates and three segments where the party is to announce candidates are Faridabad-NIT,

Sirsa and Mahendergarh. party's Pehowa candidate, Sardar Kamaljeet Singh Ajrana, was also replaced by Jai Bhagwan Sharma after he expressed his inability to contest the poll on party ticket citing Opposition from the local Leaders. Ajrana was named in the first list after dropping sitting MLA and former Sports Minister Sandeep Singh, who is an accused in a sexual

harassment case. The BJP denied ticket to Minister Banwari Lal, who represented Bawal in the outgoing Assembly, and fielded Krishna Kumar in his place. School Education Minister Seema Trikha, the incumbent MLA of Badhkal, has also been denied re-nomination. Dhanesh Adlakha has been nominated for the seat. The party has fielded former . Ministers Krishan Kumar Bedi, Manish Grover and Om Prakash Yadav from Narwana, Rohtak and

Narnaul seats, respectively.



Owners of private vehicles equipped with a functional Global Navigation Satellite System (GNSS) will not be charged any amount for travelling up to 20 km on highways and expressways per day, according to a Central government notification. The Ministry of Road Transport

and Highways on Tuesday amended the National Highways Fee (Determination of Rates and Collection) Rules, 2008. Under the new regulations, known as the National Highways Fee (Determination of Rates and Collection) Amendment Rules, 2024, fees will now be charged on the actual distance travelled if the distance exceeds kilometres.

THE HUMAN CONNECTION



 ${f R}$ ecently, I had an experience that might seem odd to some, yet entirely relatable to others. Although I'm not seriously claustrophobic, I do feel trapped in closed spaces, especially when I start thinking about it. If my mind is occupied, it's usually not a problem, but this time was different.

I had been ignoring a persistent pain in my knee for quite some time. After counts times of brushing it off, I finally decided to visit a doctor. He suggested an MRI scan to rule out certain possibilities. Having never undergone this test before, I knew little about it, so I turned asked my friends about what to expect. I learned that I would be placed inside a machine that takes detailed images of the affected area, and I'd need to remain still throughout the process. The thought of being inside a machine triggered my anxiety, and I initially refused to take the test. However, my family convinced me that since only my knee needed to be scanned, the rest of my body wouldn't go inside the machine. This assurance calmed me slightly.

The day of the test arrived, and I entered the room, feeling uneasy at the sight of the machine. I asked the attendants how much of my body would be inside the machine, and they assured me it would only go up to my stomach. That brought some relief. But when they finally positioned me on the bed and moved me into the machine, it stopped above my chest. Only my face and hands were outside. "Thank God for that," I thought. At least I could still breathe. I reassured myself that everything would be fine.

As the machine started, the attendants placed headphones on my ears and left the room. Initially, I didn't realize they were no longer there. I assumed they were monitoring everything from a distance. The machine began making rumbling sounds, which fluctuated between high-pitched and low tones. I tried to focus on the ceiling above, telling myself that my was outside the machine, that I could breathe, and that I needed to stay still for the test to be

However, after about 10 minutes, discomfort began to set in. I felt as though I was completely alone in the room, and panic started to creep in. I couldn't move, not even my head. The machine seemed to engulf me, and soon, the claustrophobia took over. Despite trying to calm myself, I could feel the panic rising, and I couldn't hold it back any longer. I shouted, asking if anyone was there. A voice came through the headphones, instructing me to stay still. I responded, saying I couldn't because I was panicking and needed someone in the room with me.

Within moments, attendant appeared and held my hand. I clutched it tightly, not wanting to let go. She comforted me with her soft words, holding my hand firmly. Just the thought of another human being in the room instantly calmed my nerves. Her presence and touch gradually helped me relax, and my breathing returned to normal. After what felt like an eternity, the test finally ended, and I was wheeled out of the machine. The relief I felt was incredible.

As I hurried out of the room and the hospital, I prayed I would never have to go through that again. But something struck me about the whole experience: the stark difference between man and machine. The relief I felt when the attendant held hand—the human touch—immediately calmed my panic. In a world hurtling towards greater reliance on machines, I found solace in the simple truth that no matter how far technology takes us, the essence of our humanity-the ability to com-

stand—must never be lost. The irony is stark - while technology is designed to and each other, it can also create a distance, an emotional void that no algorithm or software can fill. The convenience and capabilities that technology offers are undeniable, but they come with a risk: the erosion of human empathy, warmth, and the simple but powerful act of one person reaching out to another in a moment of need. Can we afford to lose that?

192 bovine animals rescued from smugglers in 72 hrs in Palamu

D alamu police have upped its drive against smuggling of the bovine animals.

In the last 72 hours there has been a big haul of 192 bovine animals here with the latest 149 buffaloes under the Nawa Bazar police station limits.

Five containers have so far been seized, 4 under the Nawa Bazar police station and 1 in sadar police station limits.

The number of arrests so far is 11. Six arrests by the Nawa Bazar police and 5 by the sadar police.

In the rescue of the 149 buffaloes, seizure of 4 containers and arrests of 6 the role of the SDPO Bishrampur Rakesh Singh, ASP, is a lesson to be learnt by the young police officers, said sources.

This IPS officer Rakesh Singh knew there would be containers where stuffed bovine animals like sand bags. Among the 4 containers seized, 1 had Nagaland registration for the container while 3 of the Jharkhand police officer Chintu Kumar.

Again all the 6 arrested are Muslims well below 35 years of age. All the 6 are drivers / apprentices.

Sources said it points towards a well knit network of smuggling with Nagaland vehicle registration to men of Muradabad and a couple of districts of Jharkhand and one district of Bihar.

Officer in charge of the Nawa Bazar police station Chintu Kumar said, "These buffaloes were being shipped from Lohardaga. It's really a matter of inquiry as to how so many buffaloes are of Lohardaga."

There is a logic behind Chintu Kumar's reference to the buffaloes. Lohardaga is a tribal dominated district and adivasis are not known to be any rearer of the buffaloes.

Bombay and founder of the Energy Swaraj Foundation, shed light on the pressing issue of climate change, emphasizing the urgent need for everyone to become part of the solution. Highlighting the grave consequences of global warming, he advocated for the 'AMG principle' – Avoid, Minimise, and Generate – as a practical way to conserve energy.

He pointed out that 80-85% of global energy is derived from fossil fuels, warning that the Earth has already warmed by 1.1°C since the industrial era. If this continues, the global temperature could rise by 1.5°C within just a few years, making climate changes irreversible. He introduced the concept of the 'Climate Clock', which indicates that only 4 years and 316 days remain to avert the 1.5°C threshold.

Prof. Solanki urged attendees to take personal responsibility for reducing energy consumption by at least one-third. He provided practical advice on reducing energy waste in daily activities, such as buying fewer clothes and using electronics more wisely. He also cautioned against over-reliance on solar power, calling instead for a balanced approach through local energy production, a key principle of the 'Energy Swaraj' ini-The interactive event concluded with participants pledging to support the 'Energy Swaraj' movement and make climate action a mass movement in Jamshedpur.

Visiting BJP leaders Chouhan, Sarma provoke hatred: Govt to EC

The Jharkhand government has accused Assam chief minister Himanta Biswa Sarma and Union agriculture minister Shivraj Chouhan of spreading hatred across communities with their regular visits to State after Chouhan and Sarma were appointed as State BJP election in-charge and co-incharge respectively.

The State government in this connection has also written a letter to Election Commission (EC). Jharkhand government has urged the EC to ask Union Home Minister Amit Shah to issue an advisory to BJP leaders Himanta Biswa Sarma and Shivraj Singh Chouhan to desist from "instigating" communal tension in the state for "narrow political gains" by misusing the official machinery.

In a missive to the Chief Election Commissioner of India, the Jharkhand government has also urged him to advise Shah "not to allow the misuse of the official position of CM, Assam and the state official machinery at the



expense of public exchequer for political gains and desist from direct interference in internal affairs of the state in blatant violation of constitutional norms"

Sarma and Chouhan are overseeing Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP's) election efforts in Jharkhand which will go to polls later this year. The two have made several visits to the state since June even though the election schedule is yet to be announced.

In its letter, dated September 2, the Jharkhand government questioned 'false statements' made by these two leaders and asked if they would amount to character assassination of the host



state's government functionaries, including top bureaucrats. The letter, signed by principal secretary Vandana Dadel from the cab-

In a communication to the Chief Election Commissioner of India, the Jharkhand government requested it to prevent the misuse of the official positions of Assam's Chief Minister and the state machinery. The letter highallegations intimidate attempts to administrative and police officers to hinder lawful actions intended to maintain order ahead of the state elec-

These appeals come as

the Jharkhand assembly elections approach. Vandana Dadel, Principal Secretary of the Cabinet Secretariat and Vigilance Department in Jharkhand, further accused the BJP of attempting to disturb communal harmony by exploiting religious sentiments. She requested an impartial inquiry before any action is taken against government officials.

The Assam Chief Minister has been raising Bangladeshi influx in Jharkhand. Assam Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma had said the upcoming Jharkhand assembly elections are crucial for protecting tribals and Hindus, as the "demography of the state is changing due to Bangladeshi infiltration".

Sarma expressed concern that after Assam and West Bengal, Jharkhand might be Bangladeshi infiltrators.

He claimed that in several districts of Jharkhand, the Muslim population has reached up to 30 per cent, stressing that the elections are crucial for safeguarding the interests of tribals and

Bauri said that BJP has been exposing the failures, loot, lies, corruption of the Hemant government for the last 5 years. It is agitating

High Court has also taken the issue of changing demography of the state due to Bangladeshi intruders seriously. Strict instructions have also been given to the state government.

The Meteorological Center Ranchi has issued an orange alert for September 10 and September 11 and a yellow alert for September 12. Most of the districts of the state including Ranchi are likely to receive heavy rain from September 10. There is also a possibility of thunderstorms in many areas. Therefore, the Meteorological Department has appealed to the people to be cautious.

Meteorologist Abhishek Anand said that the deep low pressure area formed in the Bay

of Bengal crossed the Odisha coast late on Monday evening, moving at a speed of 8 km per hour. Due to its effect, rain and strong winds have started in Jharkhand, he said. Anand said that heavy rain is expected in the state's Garhwa, Palamu, Latehar,

Lohardaga, Gumla and Simdega districts, Ranchi received intermittent rains throughout the day on Monday. "There was light rain and cloud cover in the morning, while there was some sunshine in the afternoon. Heavy rain was recorded by the evening. In the last 24 hours, the temperature has dropped in most districts of Jharkhand including Ranchi," he


India hosts around 46 per cent or almost half of global digital transactions, making the job of these agencies "challenging", he said while delivering a keynote speech during the first foun-dation day celebrations of the I4C or Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre here.

The I4C, established in 2018, is a department under the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA). It is tasked with establishing a national-level coordination centre to address all cybercrime-related issues in the country.

During the event, Shah launched four platforms of the I4C —cyber fraud mitigation centre (CFMC), the 'Samanvaya' platform, a cyber commandos programme and a suspect

"I would urge you to use Artificial Intelligence to identify the MO (modus operandi) deployed (by criminals)...This will help (you) to find new ways to fight cybercrimes, the Home Minister said.

He urged the cyber security agencies to shun the age-old

He cited some figures to show how Internet and cyber penetration has increased in the country. The Minister said the '1930' national cyber helpline telephone number needs to be popularised during a special campaign being launched by the I4C from Wednesday to spread awareness about cyber-crimes. "We need to do more against this (cybercrimes)...

We have reached a point but the target is far," he said. At the event, the Home

Minister spoke at length about the importance of preparing effective counter-measures against cybercrimes while asserting that the country's development was "impossible in current times" without keeping cyber security in

"The increasing use of technology is also causing many threats. That is why cyber security is no longer limited to the digital world but has also become an important aspect of national security," he said. Shah urged for "greater coor-

dination" between the agencies of the centre and the states as this combat cannot be undertaken by one organisation alone. It is essential that "everyone comes together", he said. Cybercrimes see "no boundary" and common people should be made aware of these offences, the Union Home Minister said. "I appeal to all state governments to join this movement and ensure that cyber awareness percolates to

Stressing the importance of vigorously running awareness campaigns, Shah said newer cyber frauds were being witnessed each day and even children are getting involved in

the grassroots level."

The government has planned to train and prepare 5,000 cyber commandos over the next five years to deal with such crimes, he added.

With no let up in the death by suicide in India particularly among youth, mental health experts have called for a critical shift in understanding and addressing the trend, emphasising the need to consider socio-economic factors alongside mental health issues.

This comprehensive approach is crucial given the country's alarming suicide statistics-171,000 lives lost in 2022 alone, said Dr Rakhi Dandona, Professor of Public Health at the Public Health Foundation of India in a new six-paper series published in The Lancet Public Health. It was released on World Suicide Prevention Day marked on Tuesday.

India's National Suicide Prevention Strategy released recently aims to reduce suicide deaths by 10 percent by 2030. While the strategy focuses primarily on mental health interventions, the authors have highlighted the importance of integrating a wider range of socio-economic factors. Police data suggests that variables like gender, employment, and stressful life events also sig-nificantly influence suicide

It includes measures such as establishing effective suicide surveillance systems and integrating mental well-being curricula into educational institutions

The series outlines six key aspects of a public health approach to suicide prevention. These include examining social determinants and a model that considers how suicide may arise from various social conditions

Dr Dandona stressed the need for national policies to mitigate economic hardships, such as maintaining minimum wage levels. Israel approaches **India for 15,000** workers to plug their skill gap

I srael has approached India to carry out recruitment drive again for 10,000 construction workers and 5,000 caregivers simultaneously to plug their skill gap in the infrastructure

and health sector. This comes on the back of a similar request made by Israel, earlier in the year, National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC)said here

The Population, Immigration, has put in a request across four specific job roles: Framework, Iron Bending, Plastering, and

Ceramic Tiling. A team from PIBA, comprising of assessors, is to visit India in the coming week to carry out the necessary skill tests for selecting those who meet their criteria and skill

requisites. The second round of recruitment drive for construction workers is to take place in Maharashtra, it said.

Further, Israel also requires 5,000 caregivers to boost its healthcare services. They have stated candidates who have completed at least their 10th standard along with holding a certificate issued by a recognised Indian institute and completing a care giving course with at least 990 hours of onthe-job training can apply.

In the first round of recruitment of construction workers for Israel, a total of 16,832 candidates appeared for skill tests in their trade out of which 10349 candidates were select

Those selected will earn a salary of Rs 1.92 lakh per month, along with medical insurance, food, and accommodation. A bonus of Rs 16,515 per month is also provided to these candidates.

The NSDC reached out to all states to carry out recruitment after the government-to-government (G2G) agreement was signed in November 2023. The first round of recruitment drive was carried out in Uttar Pradesh, Haryana and Telangana.

The agreement was signed after India and Israel initiated a Framework Agreement on Temporary Employment of Indians in May 2023.

All the candidates, going through the G2G pathway are mandated to undergo predeparture orientation train-

ing. This encompasses a manual to understand Israeli culture and way of life and get accustomed to their new home.

Siddha medicine effective in treating anaemia in adolescent girls: Ayush Ministry

Integrating Siddha medicine, a traditional system of healing from South India, into anaemia treatment strategies could support the flagship Anaemia Mukt Bharat programme by combating this condition among adolescent girls, the Union Ayush Ministry has stated, citing findings from a recent study.

Titled "A Combination Siddha Drug Reduces Anaemia Among Adolescent Girls in Virudhunagar District of Tamil Nadu, India," the study was conducted at a hospital in the Southern State under the Public Health Initiative to mainstream 'Siddha' drugs for anaemia treatment.

Published in the Indian Journal of Traditional Knowledge, it highlights the potential of Siddha medicine in addressing this public health challenge. The study found that a combination of Siddha drugs

effective in improving various anaemia indicators such as haemoglobin levels, packed cell volume, and mean corpuscular hemoglobin. Anaemia in adolescent girls often stems from poor diet, menstrual blood loss, and

Following PM Modi and UAE Crown Prince Al Nahyan talks, India-UAE relations reach new heights with landmark energy pacts

■ ndian diplomacy is soaring to new heights. As nations around the world eagerly welcome Indian businesses and forge strategic alliances, India is experiencing an unprecedented wave of global goodwill and influence not seen in years. The recent UAE-India energy pact is yet another case in point. UAE crown prince Sheikh Khaled bin Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan is presently in India and had a meaningful dialogue with Prime Minister Modi. India and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) continue to strengthen their strategic partnership, with a significant boost in the energy sector, as both nations signed four major agreements aimed at deepening cooperation. The agreements span key sectors, including liquefied natural gas (LNG) trade, petroleum supplies, nuclear plant operations, and production concessions, marking a pivotal moment in the bilateral relationship. As both leaders emphasised, the pacts signal a broadening of collaboration, particularly in emerging areas such as nuclear ener-

gy, critical minerals, green hydrogen, artificial intelligence, and advanced technologies.

The signing of a long-term supply agreement for one million metric tonnes of LNG per annum between Abu Dhabi National Oil Company (ADNOC) and the Indian Oil Corporation Ltd (IOCL) is among the most prominent developments. This is the third such deal in just over a year, reinforcing India's energy security while further consolidating ties with one of the world's leading energy producers. In addition, a groundbreaking production concession pact was signed between Urja Bharat and ADNOC for Abu Dhabi's Onshore Block One. This marks the first instance of an Indian com-

pany holding an energy production concession in the UAE. An equally crucial development is the agreement between the Emirates Nuclear Energy Company (ENEC) and the Nuclear Power Corporation of India Ltd (NPCIL). This pact is designed to enhance collaboration in the operation and maintenance of nuclear power plants, sourcing nuclear goods from India, and fostering mutual investments in the civil nuclear domain. During their discussions, PM Modi and Crown Prince Al Nahyan acknowledged the rapid progress made under the India-UAE Comprehensive Strategic Partnership, which was first established during Modi's 2015 visit to the UAE. With about 3.5 million Indian expatriates forming the largest community in the UAE, the deepening of ties in key sectors like energy, nuclear cooperation, and trade will continue to be a cornerstone of this growing relationship. Crown Prince also paid tribute to Mahatma Gandhi at Rajghat, where he planted a sapling, continuing a tradition started by his grandfather in 1992. The crown prince's visit is more than just about pacts. It strengthens the historic ties between the two countries. The recent implementation of the Local Currency Settlement (LCS) System, which facilitates cross-border transactions in Indian Rupees and UAE Dirhams is yet another example of growing affinity between the two countries.

9/11: The day that changed the world



As we commemorate the lives lost and honor the bravery of those who responded, we must also commit to building a future grounded in peace, tolerance and mutual respect

n September 11, 2001, the world stood still as a series of events unfolded that would forever alter the course of history. The terrorist attacks of 9/11 not only shook the United States to its core but also had profound repercussions globally, leaving an indelible mark on international politics, security frameworks, and societal attitudes. Now, 23 years later, the legacy of that day continues to influence the world in significant

The attacks, orchestrated by 19 members of the extremist group Al-Qaeda, led by Osama bin Laden, were intended to instill fear and challenge American power. The immediate aftermath saw the U.S. respond swiftly with the launch of the "War on Terror." Just weeks later, in October 2001, the U.S. invaded Afghanistan, targeting the Taliban regime that harbored Al-Qaeda operatives. The war, which initially focused on dismantling the Taliban, expanded in 2003 to include Iraq, resulting in the toppling of Saddam Hussein's regime.

The costs of these wars, however, were staggering. Over two million people lost their lives, and the financial toll was estimated at \$4.5 trillion. The Middle East was plunged into a state of instability, with extremist groups like ISIS rising in the wake of regime collapses. The U.S. intervention, initially framed as a campaign to liberate oppressed nations, came under heavy criticism due to incidents like the torture of detainees in Abu Ghraib and Guantanamo Bay. These actions tarnished the U.S.'s reputation, fueling anti-American sentiment and exacerbating tensions between the West and the Islamic

Beyond military campaigns, 9/11 also had far-reaching societal impacts. In the U.S. and elsewhere, fear and suspicion of Muslims surged. Islamophobia became more entrenched, as communities and individuals were unfairly associated with terrorism. The clash of civilizations narrative, which framed Islam as inherently opposed to Western values, gained traction, deepening divisions and fueling preju-

dice. This legacy of suspicion and distrust continues to shape political discourse and societal attitudes today.

The seeds of 9/11 were planted decades earlier during the Cold War, when the U.S. supported Islamist fighters in Afghanistan to counter Soviet influence. Figures like Osama bin Laden, initially seen as allies in the fight against communism, turned against the U.S. after the Soviet withdrawal. Bin Laden's growing resentment of U.S. involvement in the Middle East culminated in the deadly attacks on September 11, a day that redefined global security priorities.

In response to 9/11, the Bush administration implemented a range of measures to protect national security. The Department of Homeland Security was established, and stringent airport security protocols became the norm worldwide. The U.S. also adopted the Bush Doctrine, which justified preemptive strikes against nations that harbored or supported terrorists. This doctrine underpinned the invasions of Afghanistan and Iraq and marked a significant shift in

U.S. foreign policy.

However, the invasions, especially that of Iraq, became highly controversial. While the Bush administration ini-

tially claimed that Saddam Hussein possessed weapons of mass destruction (WMDs), none were found, leading to widespread skepticism about the true motives behind the war. The failure to uncover WMDs highlighted the dangers of misinformation and flawed intelligence, further eroding public trust in the government

In the years that followed, 9/11 and its aftermath shaped not only U.S. foreign policy but also the broader international order. Counterterrorism became a global priority, with governments implementing new laws to enhance surveillance and prevent further attacks. However, this focus on security often came at the expense of civil liberties, as governments expanded their powers to monitor citizens, raising concerns about privacy and individual freedoms. The physical site of the World Trade Center has since been rebuilt, with the One World Trade Center standing as a symbol of resilience. At the base of the original towers, a memorial and museum have been constructed to honor the victims. Yet for many, the emotional scars remain. Survivors, first responders, and the families of victims continue to grapple with the trauma of that fateful day.

As we reflect on the 23rd anniversary of 9/11, it is clear that the world has changed in profound ways. We must explore the potential of specific skill sets to excel as the standardised competition environment guarantees a level playing field



he 47th edition of the biannual WorldSkills Competition-2024 is set to begin in Lyon, France. The competition featured a 60-member young contingent from the WorldSkills India Team competing in 52 skill categories against participants from over 70 countries. Often considered the "Olympics of Skilling", this international skilling competition is expected to attract over 2.5 lakh participants and will take place from September 10-15. It will include more than 1,400 competitors and 1,300 experts. The WorldSkills Competition is a platform that celebrates excellence in a wide range of skills, from construction and manufacturing to information technology and creative arts.

The 60-member India team, with 20 per cent women, is a breakthrough in this edition as they will compete in traditionany maie-dominated fields like welding plumbing, and heating. The silent crisis: Rising suicide cases demand urgent attention

As mental health continues to be overshadowed by the pursuit of success, it is crucial to provide support to those who need it most

¬he rising number of suicides in India, especially among young people and businessmen, is an alarming and heart-wrenching issue that demands serious attention. News about students and entrepreneurs ending their lives after facing failure or distress has become all too frequent. It is high time that society, including teachers, psychiatrists, and responsible citizens, reflects on why these individuals are so prone to taking such extreme measures in moments of despair.

In recent years, the suicide epidemic has gained prominence, particularly among students preparing for competitive exams. The pressure to succeed, exacerbated by societal expectations and the fear of failure, has devastating conse-



quences on the mental health of young individuals. The city of Kota in Rajasthan, famous for its coaching institutes, has become a hub for student suicides. Thousands of students flock to the city each year with the singular goal of cracking entrance exams for top medical and engineering colleges. Yet, under the immense weight of academic expectations,

many crumble. According to data presented in identify solutions to this crisis.

the Lok Sabha, over 35,000 students in India committed suicide between 2019 and 2021. In 2019, the number of student suicides stood at 10,335, which increased to 12,526 in 2020 and further to 13,089 in 2021. These figures paint a grim picture of the pressures that students face. The constant comparison to peers, the relentless competition, and the desire to meet the high expectations of parents, teachers, and society often leave young individuals feeling trapped, hopeless, and unable to cope with failure. Former president of the Indian Medical Association, Dr. Vinay Aggarwal, emphasizes that merely expressing concern over the rising number of sui-

cides is insufficient. He argues

On World Suicide Prevention Day, which falls on September 10th, a seminar will be held in New Delhi to discuss the causes behind youth, businessman, and other suicides. The event will bring together psychiatrists, journalists, and social workers who will share their experiences and insights. Following this, strategies will be developed to curb the rising suicide rates. In the realm of student sui-

cides, efforts are being made by some coaching centers to ease the pressure on students. Counseling services have been introduced, and parents are being engaged in the process to ensure students' well-being. These initiatives aim to reduce the intense stress associated with high-stakes examinations. However, more compre-



hensive measures are required at both institutional and societal levels to alleviate the crushing burden placed on students.

The National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) reports that in 2020, a student committed suicide every 42 minutes. This statistic is both shocking and indicative of the mental health crisis that young people are facing. It underscores the need for parents, teachers, and society to create an environment of success.

that allows students to pursue their academic goals without undue pressure. Social worker Brother Solomon George of the Delhi Brotherhood Society (DBS) echoes this sentiment. He stresses that students should not be subjected to unnecessary comparisons or interrogations about their family background, income, or caste. Such actions, often unwittingly, can weaken a child's self-esteem and lead to despair. George advocates for a holistic approach to education that nurtures the child's mental health alongside academic success. He also emphasizes that children should have the freedom to choose careers that align with their interests and abilities, rather than being forced into predefined molds

The suicide epidemic is not limited to students. Businessmen, too, have been increasingly taking their lives due to financial losses.

The NCRB also reveals that in 2020, during the peak of the Covid-19 pandemic, 11,716 businessmen in India committed suicide. This marked a 29% increase from 2019 when 9,052 business-related suicides were recorded. The economic turmoil brought on by the pandemic dealt a severe blow to businesses, particularly small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs). These enterprises, already vulnerable to financial shocks, were further burdened by debt and losses. Karnataka recorded the highest number of suicides by businessmen in 2020, with 1,772 deaths—a staggering 103% increase from

the previous year. Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu also reported significant increases in suicides by businessmen, with 1,610 and 1,447 cases, respectively. The plight of India's business community, especially SMEs, is often overlooked in discussions about mental health. The issue of suicide among students, businessmen, and others cannot be ignored any

It is imperative that both the government and society at arge take concerted action to address the mental health challenges facing these vulnerable groups. Preventive measures, including counseling, mental health awareness, and creating supportive environments, must be prioritised.

'Israeli strike on Gaza camp kills at least 19'

n Israeli strike on a crowded An Israell surke on a state of a state of the state of th displaced by the war in Gaza killed at least 19 people and wounded 60 early on Tuesday, Palestinian officials said. Israel said it targeted senior Hamas militants with precise munitions.

The overnight strike hit Muwasi, a sprawl of crowded tent camps along the Gaza coast that Israel designated as a humanitarian zone for hundreds of thousands of civilians to seek shelter from the Israel-Hamas war. Gaza's Health Ministry said it confirmed that at least 19 people were killed in the strike, and that the toll may rise as more bodies are recovered. The Civil Defence, first responders who operate under the Hamas-run government, had earlier said 40 people were killed. The Israeli military disputed that toll.

The ministry is also part of the Hamas-run government but its figures are widely seen as generally reliable. It maintains detailed records and its tallies from previous wars have largely coincided with figures from independent researchers, the United Nations and even the Israeli military.

Both the Health Ministry and the Civil Defence did not immediately respond to a request for comment on the discrepancy of their

Associated Press footage shows three large craters at the scene. First responders dug through the sand and rubble with garden tools and their bare hands, using mobile phone flashlights until the sun

came up. They pulled body parts from the sand, including what appeared to be a human leg. "We were told to go to Muwasi, to

the safe area... Look around you and see this safe place," said Iyad Hamed Madi, who had been sheltering there. "This is for my son," he said, holding up a bag of diapers. "He's 4 months old. Is he a fight-

er? There's no humanity." One of three hospitals that took in casualties from the strike, Nasser Hospital in Khan Younis, said around two dozen bodies were brought in. An Associated Press cameraman saw 10 bodies in the hospital's morgue, including two children and three women."We were sleeping, and suddenly it was like a tornado," Samar Moamer told the AP at the hospital, where she was being treated for injuries.



ir India Express, which is Aset to complete the merger of AIX Connect with itself next month, will phase out business class seats in its aircraft in 2025, according to a senior airline official.

Currently, the carrier, part of Tata Group, has a fleet of 85 aircraft -- 25 A320 family planes and 60 Boeing 737s. By year-end, the total number is expected to be around 100. The airline has 34 white tail

Boeing 737-8 aircraft and out of them, 29 have business class seats of varying numbers. Their count will rise to 50 by the end of this year. Generally, white tail planes are those that were originally manufactured for a particular airline and later taken by another airline.

The airline official told PTI that aircraft with the business class seats will be phased out by reconfiguring them next year as business class does not fit into the Air India Express model.

These white tail aircraft have varying number of business class seats, the official added. In the existing fleet of Air India Express, there are 20 A320s, 5 A320 neos, 26 B737-NGs and 34 B737-8 planes. At present, the airline offers economy and business class seats. The global aviation industry continues to grapple with supply chain woes that have also resulted in instances of delayed aircraft deliveries and shortage of planes amid rising air traffic demand post

Air India Express, a subsidiary of Air India, operates more than 380 daily flights, connecting 32 domestic and 14 international destinations. 



Anwar banned for four months: AIFF PSC judgment

MOHUN BAGAN ELIGIBLE FOR ₹12.90 CR COMPENSATION

The All India Football Federation on Tuesday imposed a four-month suspension on India international Anwar Ali after finding the defender "guilty" of illegally terminating his fouryear contract with Mohun Bagan who are also eligible for a huge compensation of Rs 12.90 crore. The Players Status Committee of the

AIFF also ruled that the Anwar's parent club Delhi FC and East Bengal, with whom the defender had entered into a lucrative five-year deal, have been banned from registering players for two transfer windows — 2024-25 winter and 2025-26 summer.

Anwar Ali, East Bengal and Delhi FC are all jointly "liable" for the compensation amount which includes Rs 8.40 crore for the residual value of the contract, Rs 2 crore already paid to Delhi FC under loan agreement, and Rs 2.50 crore for other "damages suffered by the club," stated the decision of the AIFF Players Status Committee



F1 car design great Adrian Newey to join Aston Martin after leaving Red Bull

 $F^{ormula\ 1\text{'s most influential}}_{car\ designer,\ Adrian\ Newey,}$ is joining Aston Martin in March 2025 after leaving Red Bull, ending months of speculation over a backroom figure who seemed more indemand than any driver.

Newey has spent nearly two decades with Red Bull and is widely credited with putting the team on its path to dominance in F1. Now he's joining a team that has big ambitions to challenge for the title and the backing of billionaire Lawrence Stroll but no race wins yet.

Newey will arrive in his new role as "managing technical partner" in time to help shape how Aston Martin responds to the new F1 car regulations coming for 2026. He'll also be made a shareholder in the team.

Newey said he and Stroll got to know each other while training in the gym during F1 race weekends in Asia. Newey visited Aston Martin's new headquarters in June as Stroll closed in on a signing which the Canadian billionaire called "another demonstration of our ambition to build a Formula 1 team capable of fighting for world championships."

"You have to be honest with yourself and you have to keep yourself fresh and so I felt I needed a new challenge," Newey said. He added that Stroll's hands-on approach as an owner was an "old-school model" that reminded him of his old bosses at teams like Williams and McLaren, which both won titles with Neweydesigned cars in the 1990s.

"I was very flattered to have a lot of approaches from various teams, but really, Lawrence's passion and commitment and enthusiasm is very endearing, it's very persuasive." The last time the regulations
