Police probe suspicious deaths of two women

wo mysterious deaths have been reported in Bhopal, both under suspicious circumstances, with investigations underway but no clear answers so far.

In Lambakheda, Aarti Kushwaha, a 24-year-old woman originally from Vidisha, was found dead in her rented room. Aarti had been living alone after separating from her husband a

On Wednesday, when colleagues repeatedly tried to contact her without success, her family was alerted. Her brother-in-law arrived at her room and, after failing to get a response, forced entry to find Aarti unconscious on the floor. Police suspect she may have taken poison, as a suspicious substance was found in the room. However, her family has not provided a definite reason for her death, and the case

is being treated as suspicious. In a similar manner mysterious death was in Awadhpuri last year in the month of October, where Neha Vijayvargiya, a woman manager at a general insurance company, was found dead under unexplained circumstances in her rented apartment. Neha, who had been living independently for several years after divorcing her husband, was last in contact with her family on the evening of October 22.

¬irst time MLA Rekha Gupta on Thursday was sworn in as Chief Minister of Delhi at Ramlila Maidan in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, his Cabinet colleagues and chief ministers of National Democratic Alliance-governed states, among others.

Along with Gupta, leaders including Parvesh Verma, Ashish Sood, Manjinder Singh Sirsa, Ravinder İndraj Singh, Kapil Mishra and Pankaj Kumar Singh also took oath as ministers. Verma was the first MLA to take oath as the minister, followed by Sood, Sirsa, Mishra, Indraj and Singh.

the newly-elected legislator from Karawal Nagar, was a minister in the first Arvind Kejriwal-led Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Government.

All the ministers took oath in Hindi, except for Sirsa who did so in Punjabi.

The seasoned, affable, BJP leader holding the fort successfully for the party in Delhi Assembly, municipal corporation, as head of the State unit free from any controversies, Vijender Gupta, was named as Speaker of the new Vidhan Sabha on Thursday. Vijender will preside from the same chair which on several occasions had got him marshalled out of the proceedings of the Assembly under the chief ministership of AAP supremo Arvind Kejriwal.

Vijender won in 2015 and 2020 from Rohini constituency even as Kejriwal's wave swept Delhi assembly polls. Incidentally, Kejriwal and erstwhile speaker Ram Niwas Goel are no longer members of the new assembly

As soon as Vijender was named as Speaker dramatic visuals of him being marshalled or dragged out of the Delhi Assembly went viral. He was previously also the leader of Opposition. Ten years ago, he was marshalled out of the Delhi Assembly amid much fury over allegedly derogatory remarks by a party colleague, OP Sharma, against then-AAP Alka Lamba. Visuals from within the Assembly showed Vijender Gupta, dressed in a pristine white kurta-pyjama set - being lifted, shouting and twisting, by half-a-dozen marshals. The BJP leader even held tightly onto the furniture, fighting and resisting all the way out the

Vijender return is likely spell more trouble for a battered AAP. After his election win last week, he promised that 14 pending reports on the Delhi government by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India would be tabled in the House.

Delhi Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena administered the oath of office to Rekha Gupta elected from Shalimar Bagh in noethr Delhi area and her council of ministers.

Her appointment makes her the fourth woman to hold the position in Delhi, following BJP's Sushma Swaraj, Congress' Sheila Dikshit, and AAP's Atishi and also the fourth BJP chief minister of Delhi after Madan Lal Khurana, Sahib Singh Verma and Sushma Swaraj. The 50-year-old MLA, who took charge of her office at the Delhi Secretariat in the afternoon, is also the only woman in the NDA team of chief ministers and the second in the country after TMC supremo Mamata Banerjee in West Bengal.

Congratulating the new chief minister, Modi expressed expressed confidence that she will work for the city's development with full

mid expectations of major Announcements, the newly formed Delhi Cabinet headed by Chief Minister Rekha Gupta in her first cabinet meeting on Thursday approved a proposal reinstating the implementation of Ayushman Bharat Yojna (ABY) with Rs 5 Lakhs top-up and tabling of 14 Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) reports in the first siting of the Assembly.

The cabinet also discussed the financial assistance scheme, which provides Rs 2,500 to women, aiming to support their welfare and empowerment.

Speaking to reporters after the meeting, Gupta said in Hindi, During the Cabinet meeting, we have taken two big decisions. The ABY, whose implementation had been held back by the previous government, will be implemented in Delhi with a top-up of Rs 5 Lakh from the state government. PM Narendra Modi had announced the scheme for the whole nation, but Delhi could not get its benefits because of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP). This will be done at the earliest after the formalities are completed."

'There are 14 CAG reports pending, which were not tabled by the previous government. They will be tabled during the first session of the Assembly. These decisions were taken today. We will take up our other commitments, give shape to each one of them and present them

before you soon," she added. Performance Audit Regulation and Supply of Liquor in Delhi for 2017-18 to 2021-22, Public Health Infrastructure and Management of Health Services for 2023 and Performance Audit Report on Children in Need of Care and Protection for 2018-19 to 2020-21 are among 14

pending CAG reports.
The implementation of the ABY for medical insurance had become a major flashpoint between the AAP and the BJP. MPs from the BJP had also filed a petition in the Delhi High Court, seeking that the scheme be made available to people in the national capital.

Notably, the previous AAP government, led by former chief minister Arvind Kejriwal, had opposed the implementation of the Centre's Ayushman Bharat scheme in Delhi, saying that it would "amount to downgrading the healthcare initiatives already in place." The AAP government in Delhi had several run-ins with lieutenant governors over various issues in the past decade. However, with the BJP coming to power in the city after more than 26 years, many expect the relationship to improve, paving the way for smooth governance. After chairing the first Cabinet meeting on Thursday, Gupta announced the distribution of portfolios among her ministers, keeping with her finance, services, vigilance, revenue, women and child development among other departments.

Manipur Governor seeks surrender of illegal arms

"It is in this regard that I sincerely request the people of all communities, particularly the youths, to come forward and surrender looted and illegally held weapons and ammunition to the nearest police station, outpost, security forces camp within next seven days, effective from today," he said.

Centre cracks whip on OTT platforms



In an advisory to over-the-top (OTT) platforms and self-regulatory bodies, the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting also asked them to strictly adhere to the Code of Ethics prescribed under the IT Rules-2021 ishing content including stricter adherence to the age-based classification of

I&B Ministry's advisory also asked self-regulatory bodies of OTT platforms to take appropriate proactive action for violation of the Code of Ethics by the platforms. The Ministry said it has received complaints from Parliament, Members of statutory organisations and public grievances regarding the alleged spread of obscene, pornographic and vulgar content published by certain publishers of online curated

content (OTT platforms) and social media. "In view of the above it is advised that the OTT platforms adhere to the various provisions of applicable laws, and the Code of Ethics prescribed under IT Rules, 2021 while publishing content on their platforms, including stricter adherence to the age-based classification of content prescribed under the Code of Ethics," the advisory said. It said the Code of Ethics, inter-alia, require

OTT platforms not to transmit any content that is prohibited by law, undertake age-based classification of content, based on general guidelines provided in the Schedule to the Rules, implement access control mechanism



for 'A' rated content to restrict access to such content by a child, and also exercise due caution and discretion.

The advisory also comes in the wake of the Supreme Court suggesting regulation on content on social media platforms.

The apex court had flagged the "vacuum" in law when it comes to sharing content on platforms such as YouTube and said "all kinds of things were going on". The court's suggestion came following a row involving YouTuber Ranveer Allahbadia on the show India's Got Latent. The court was hearing a plea filed by him, where he sought clubbing multiple FIRs against him in the matter. The plea also sought protection from arrest.

The court issued notices to the states of Assam and Maharashtra over Allahbadia's remarks and stayed his arrest in the Guwahati and Thane FIR. Additionally, the court ruled that no further FIRs should be filed against him in the same matter.

Tradition, legacy and ancestry will meet Digital India

Adding another feather to the digital India movement, the Government has envisioned a unique way to digitise the century old multi-generation ancestry records commonly know as 'pothee' in custody of genealogy priests at various pilgrimage centres in India.

For instance next time a pilgrim visit Kashi Vishwanath temple in Varanasi, they may track the record of past visit to the temple by their ancestors or family members at the flip of their finger or click of a mouse

For this, National Archives of India has envisioned a project to digitise multi-generation ancestry records seeking to harvest traditional knowledge and community repositories and preserve them as a cultural heritage.

"NIA has approached these priests and the project will begin with Madhya Pradesh's Ujjain," said NAI Director General (DG) Arun April," he added.

Singhal in his address at opening session of the meeting of the South and West Asian Regional Branch of the International Council on Archives (SWARBICA) here.

India is hosting a meeting of SWARBICA after a long time, currently in the position of the treasurer of this regional body of the Paris-based International Council on Archives (ICA).

In his address, Singhal also shared some details and figures related to the NAI's "ambitious programme" of digitising 300 million pages in a period of two years, as part of its project that began last year.

Before we started the project, our portal, Abhilekh Patal, was displaying about 10 million pages. In the past 7-8 months, the number has grown from 10 million to 84 million pages.. Every day, we are scanning about 400,000 pages. It is a process going well," said the National Archives of India (NAI) DG. "Shortly, we are



the course of this project that many documents had been left "untouched" in last 50-60 years and nobody had looked at them. "And, we realised these are in urgent need of repair, and conservation was required. So, we had to spruce up our conservation

Another project taken up by the NAI is "harvesting of traditional knowledge and community archives". "In India, if you go to Gaya, Kashi, Allahabad (now Prayagraj), Badrinath, Kedarnath, Jagannath Puri, Dwarka, there are priests there who document every some boxes and perhaps could go

visit by every pilgrim.

These documents are available with them. So, if you go there and tell them about your father's name, your grandfather's name, the place you belong to, they are able to come out with some documents, some 'pothis' (registers), which will contain genealogical records of such families," Singhal said.

He underlined that these ancestry records may even have archival information related to ten generations of many families.

This is traditional knowledge which has been put together in some 'pothis'. And, these 'pothis' can get destroyed. In a major flood in Kedarnath, some of these 'pothis' were wiped out," the NAI chief rued.

Singhal emphasised that children of many of these priests have taken up other career streams and even moved out of these old cities and, therefore, are "not interested in continuing this family tradition". These 'pothis' in all probability could end up getting locked up in

waste, he cautioned. "So, we said, we will try to digitise all these information. And, we approached these priests. And, I am happy to inform, the priests in Ujjain have agreed. So, we will start with Ujjain, we will digitise their records," Singhal said.

There are "more than 25 places" in India where such records exist, he underlined. "If we can digitise all of them, collate and compare the information contained in these records, it can become a very valuable database," the NAI DG

Many people from India and broad travel to religious sites like Gaya in Bihar or Haridwar in Uttarakhand to perform rituals for attaintment of salvation for souls of their deceased ancestors.

In Gaya, the 'Pitra Paksha Mela' is held annually on the bank of the Saryu River and 'Gayawal Pandas' (genealogy priests) maintain records of multiple generations of people about their ancestors such as year of birth, pilgrimage, caste, and year of death and perhaps even cause of death Similarly, in Ujjain and Haridwar,

two of the four sites of Kumbh Mela in India, the other being Prayagraj in Uttar Pradesh and Nasik in Maharashtra, such priests diligently maintain ancestry records in 'pothis', stacks of which are stored physically in rooms and cupboards.

"Harnessing traditional knowledge and such community archives is another thing, we have discussed with SWARBICA. Perhaps, a blueprint for future collaboration could be discussed," Singhal said.

Union Culture and Tourism Gajendra Minister Shekhawat in his address said the venue of the event — India International Centre (IIC) was also significant that allows space to voice different strands of opinions, as he welcomed participants from different counties who are attending the meeting of SWARBICA. This occasion should be used "to learn from each other and share best practices", he said.

Cases filed against 101 accounts for No water to share with spreading misinformation on Kumbh

Uttar Pradesh Police have intensified their crackdown on misleading social media content and privacy violations related to the Mahakumbh, registering cases against 101 accounts across 10 incidents for spreading misinformation and objectionable material.

Authorities have taken legal action against two social media accounts for allegedly posting and selling explicit videos of women pilgrims bathing at the sacred event. The crackdown follows directives from Uttar Pradesh Police Chief Prashant Kumar to combat offensive content related to the religious gathering.

The police's social media monitoring unit detected that certain platforms were uploading videos of women pilgrims bathing and changing clothes, violating their privacy. A case was lodged at the Kotwali Kumbh Mela police station. On February 17, a case was reg-

istered against an Instagram

Adityanath's directive to curb misinformation, police have launched a cyber patrolling initiative to monitor and counter fake news regarding the Mahakumbh. Several cases have been registered for spreading

misleading content. On February 19, police booked 26 accounts for linking a Pakistanbased video to a false claim about a Maha kumbh stampede. On February 14, 22 accounts misrepresented a video from Champawat, Uttarakhand, alleging a violent clash and stone-pelting at the Mahakumbh.

On February 13, 15 accounts circulated a 2024 Bihar video, originally from a Pushpa 2 film promotion event, falsely claiming nationalist devotees had thrown slippers at army personnel at the Kumbh. On February 12, seven accounts falsely linked a 2021 video from Ghazipur, alleging bodies were floating in the Ganga due to a stampede. On February 9, 14 Twitter accounts misrepresented a Dhanbad, Jharkhand video. claiming UP Police assaulted devotees searching for missing family members.

On February 7, a Facebook account spread false claims about crowd management efforts in the Sangam area, portraying it as a stampede.

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Thursday said the state does not have a single drop of water to share with any other state.

Mann stated this before the Ravi Beas Water Tribunal set up for adjudicating river water disputes between Punjab, Haryana and Raiasthan. At a meeting with the tribunal led

by its chairman Justice Vineet Saran, members Justice P Naveen Rao and Justice Suman Shyam, and registrar Rita Chopra, the chief minister reiterated that the state has no spare water to share with any other state and there is no question of sharing even a single drop of water with anyone. Punjab has no surplus water to share with any other state and reassessment of availability of water is required as per international norms, Mann said, according to an official statement. He also urged the tribunal mem-

bers, who are in Puniab for a site visit of the Ravi water system, to deliver justice to the people of the

Mann pointed out that Punjab's

76.5 per cent blocks (117 out of 153) are over exploited where the stage of ground water extraction is more than 100 per cent, whereas in Haryana only 61.5 per cent (88 out of 143) are over exploited. As most of the river resources of the state have dried up, it needs more water to cater to its irrigation needs, Mann said.

However, Mann said the situation is so grim that Punjab only has scant water, which it is providing to its food growers.

In such a scenario, there is no question of sharing even a drop of water with any other state, Mann said.

The Punjab government has emphatically presented the issue of less availability of water on every platform, Mann said, adding that it is imperative to "protect the rights of our coming generations", the statement said.

The Punjab government is dutybound to ensure that the interests of the state and its people are safeguarded by all means, and no stone will be left unturned for it,' Mann asserted. The chief minister also apprised the tribunal that the Yamuna, like Ravi and Beas rivers, also flowed through the

Aset of BJP and Trinamool Congress MLAs on Thursday competed against each other needling up regional and sub-regional slogans - the former once again asking for a separate North Bengal State and the latter demanding an exclusive State

Manoranjan Vyapari a TMC MLA from Hooghly while delivering a speech inside the Assembly "floated an idea" for an exclusive state flag for Bengal even as he reasoned, "There are quite a few States that have their distinct State songs and State flags, so why cannot Bengal have its own state flag.

We already have a state song. Thanks to our Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee. I only offered a small idea to the House to ponder about it, besides there is no constitutional hindrance for having a state flag.

Though there is no instance of a state flags some Indian states do have their own songs.

These include Assam, Bihar. Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, as well as Bengal. The BJP and the Left promptly reacted to the idea of a state flag wondering whether the TMC was plotting a secessionist plan. Union Minister and state BJP president Sukanto Majumdar chided Vyapari saying, "they came to Bengal after being kicked out of Bangladesh, now they are trying to divide India, but we warn them against any such sinister design, any poke at India's

national sovereignty will be very ruthlessly dealt with." Not to drop behind North Bengal BJP MLA Shikha Chatterjee too roll out rolled out a competing idea: this time proposing to effect a partition of Bengal. Reportedly disgusted with lack of

development of North Bengal she said if the Mamata Banerjee Government could not keep its promise then it should better let the northern part of the State go. "If you cannot develop North Bengal then it is better to bifurcate it," she said.

"There has been tall promises made by the Government. They have constructed an Uttar Kanva (a second secretariat at Siliguri in North Bengal), just for the sake of it, nothing happens there.

My simple logic is if you cannot develop North Bengal simply let it get separated," Chatterjee an MLA from Dabgram Phulbari constituency adjoining Siliguri

"This is not my call. This is the people's voice that I am raising. We are people's representatives and we have to listen to the refrains of the common voters

There is massive unemployment roblem, people have minimal facilities, there is continuous river erosion, hosts of other problems that the people are plagued with. They are asking us as to what we are doing in Kolkata. They are telling us to resign and return if we cannot do anything.

So I am forced to raise this issue. If the Government cannot develop let them segregate North Bengal," she said.

Though this is not the first occasion that a similar demand has been raised what makes Chatteriee's statements different is that it has for the first time made inside the Assembly and was recorded in the proceedings, experts said. Earlier other saffron leaders like John Barla and the saffron MLA from Naxalbari had raised such demands too. When asked to comment on the issue Sukanto Majumdar however said that, "division of Bengal is not the party's stand," adding however that the party wanted a composite development plan for North Bengal.

"We want the development of Bengal along the lines proposed by Dr Shyama Prasad Mukherjee. If regions like North Bengal are neglected then we will see if some other arrangement can be made, but we are not for division of Bengal," he said.

State Parliamentary Affairs Minister Sobhandeb Chatterjee however accused the BJP for hatching divisive plans after having failed to win in elections.

They know that they are fast losing the ground beneath their feat. They have failed to win elections repeatedly in North Bengal too they have lost ground losing all the recent by-elections. So they are making a hue and cry for partitioning Bengal. But this will not only be not allowed. This will also boomerang against them,' Chatterjee said.

In a major setback to the BJP-led MahaYuti government, a Nashik district court on Thursday sentenced State Agriculture Minister Manikrao Kokate of the NCP (Aiit Pawar) to two years' imprisonment and imposed ₹50,000 fine in the 1995 document tampering and fraud case

Delivering its judgement in the 30-year-old case, the Nashik district and sessions court convicted Manikrao Kokate and his brother Sunil Kokate in the documents tampering and fraud case and sentenced both of them to two years' imprisonment and imposed a fine of Rs 50,000 each on both of them. The court, however, acquitted two others named in the FIR of the case. With his conviction and sentence in a criminal case, Manikrao Kokate -a five-time MLA from Sinnar in Nashik district in north Maharashtra faces the threat of losing not

only his minister's position but also his membership of the Maharashtra Legislative

Assembly.

In her verdict handing two imprisonment to Manikrao Kokate and his brother, 10th Addl. Chief Judicial Magistrate, Nashik Rupali C. Narwadiya said that though the reputation of Kokate - being state Agriculture Minister "if he is punished" in the case", "law cannot condone such illegal

"No doubt, the reputation of the accused no.1 being a minister of the state in the agriculture department may be ruined if he is punished. But simultaneously, the law cannot condone such illegal acts merely due to the fact that the person is having a reputable position in the society. In view of creating deterrence, it is essential to give a strong message to the society that commission of offence like cheating and forgery are not tolerable irrespective of the post, or reputation of the person, and that justice does not see the culprit's post," the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate stated in 38-page judgement.

The case against Kokate brothers was filed by their political rival and former minister Tukaram Dighole of the Congress. Dighole had alleged that the Kokate brothers had forged documents to fraudulently obtain flats in the Nirman View Apartment, located on College Road at Nashik's Yeolekar Mala locality.

The Prosecution's case is that the Kokate brothers had claimed that they belonged to the lowincome group (LIG), their income was lower than ₹30,000 each per annum and that they had no other properties, which allowed them to secure flats under the chief minister's 10 per cent discretionary quota. However, the subsequent investigations by the police revealed that they had falsified the documents to receive these benefits.

Budget powers India's green transition with clean tech push



By balancing economic growth with environmental responsibility, the budget boosts India's long-term energy transition and reinforce its commitment to a greener future

hile FM Nirmala Sitharaman's budget is tailored to drive consumption, propel long-term growth, and reinforce India's commitment to a greener world, proposals to power India's journey towards sustainability and net zero through various energy sector reforms, policies, and incentives stand out as they provide for a transformative shift in India's energy landscape. India's demand for power will continue to increase

The country has set an ambitious target of achieving net zero by 2070, a tall order. The power sector accounts for nearly one-third of India's total greenhouse gas emissions. While a country like India can't eliminate its reliance on coal-fired power with one stroke, transformative reforms in the power sector couldn't and must not

The path to carbon neutrality has to be paved with renewables. The Budget has provided the much-needed push to nuclear energy with the target of achieving 100 GW capacity by 2047 as part of India's long-term energy transition strategy and achiev-

Upon meeting the reforms initiated under the revamped distribution system scheme, states can borrow an additional 0.5 per cent of their gross domestic product over and above what they get

under the FRBM Act. This will significantly improve the efficiency of the power sector. These reform measures are part of the government's plans to support clean technology. The government also intends to promote clean tech manufacturing to improve domestic value addition and build a local ecosystem for solar cells, electrolysers, wind turbines, highvoltage transmission equip-

ment, and grid-scale batteries,

among other technologies.

The Budget marks a transfor-

able energy sector. The government's commitment to the 'Make in India' initiative and the new clean tech manufacturing policy will augment the development of solar PV cells, batteries, and other sustainable technologies locally in India.

These moves will contribute to the nation's clean energy iourney while fostering sustainable economic growth. The full BCD exemption of the scrap of lithium-ion batteries, Lead, Zinc, and 12 more critical minerals will help boost battery manufacturing in India and promote more jobs for our youth.

By reducing the BCD on solar panels by half to 20 per cent, the FM has provided animal spirits to the wind energy sector, which would further reduce the price of the panels and reduce India's imports by facilitating domestic production.

But do brave men commit suicide? ety, emotional upheavals, unpleasant feelings, panic attacks and phobias are all symptomatic of a fragile and delicate mind. It is an expression of an unpleasant emotion caused by the threat of danger

A fragmented mind is invariably a victim of irrational fear. Such an individual is unable to distinguish between what is logical and what is not. People suffer from extreme or irrational fear or aversion. This is nothing but what is called phobia (the Greek word for fear). A contributor to the magnification of fear is our pent-up emotions. These emotions are not based on a rational or scientific thinking pattern. We end up reacting violently or irrationally rather than responding in a coherent and clear-sighted manner. Humans should be prudent to ponder that if left untreated this situation can become mourning regalia.

A person can suffer from psychosomatic illnesses, loss of appetite, self-deprecatory behaviour or even schizophrenia. This has a multiplier effect in the form of morbid thoughts, persecution complexes and even hallucinations. An element of fear is perhaps required, because then we can patrol our fences. However, this needs to be distinguished from false bravado. Such an attitude will only be tantamount to mere filibustering or posturing. The brain is an organ and the mind is our intellect. The power of the mind needs to be magnified and enhanced to conquer fear. The mind is a movie theatre where the soap opera



of our life is enacted. We play, rewind and rerun an enormous number of movies. These are based on our idiosyncrasies and quality of thoughts. Thoughts are impacted by the kind of food we partake in (Tamasik, Rajasik, Sattvik), the company we keep and the amount of rest we take. The quality (guna) of food has a bearing on our disposition and approach to life. Tamasik food makes us sluggish, Rajasik food makes us feverish or anxious in disposition and Sattvik food makes us feel calm.

The first two lead us to fearful situations. If we are closeted to individuals who have a negative thought process, we imbibe such attributes and evince such a behavioural pattern. "Man is known by the company he keeps" is a very old adage and so is "man is born free but always is in chains". Suppose we have inspirational friends and achievers in our orbit, we will tread such a path. It is cardinal to have adequate physical and mental rest. If we are rested, then we are at peace and do not complain or quibble. Then we are physically and mentally alert and high-yielding. In our minds, we need to keep space to just dump the garbage that disappears into the recycle bin, never to appear again.

We need to pursue passions, hobbies, indulge in sports, participate in extracurricular activities, avoid negative company, take up initiatives, practice meditation, keep the mind occupied, footslog on the treadmill, go for long walks, go for treks, and read autobiographies of entrepreneurs and achievers. Others adopt the spiritual path by practising pranayama, learning yoga, undertaking the Art of Living course or observing the breath through the Vipassana technique

These holistic techniques metamorphose the mind to be in the present moment and overcome fear. To conquer fear, we need to log out of our comfort zone so that the virus of fear does not enter our operating system. And if nothing works out, one should surrender to the Divine and feel grateful.

The controversy over the appointment of judges in the Islamabad High Court deepened on Thursday after five judges of the court challenged the recent transfers in Pakistan's Supreme Court.







Germany votes on Sunday; new govt to shape Europe's response to assertive Trump

AP ■ BERLIN

German voters go to the polls Sunday to elect a new parliament that will determine how the country is run for the next four years. Europe's biggest economy is

the 27-nation European Union's most populous nation and a leading member of NATO, as well as the second-biggest weapons supplier to Ukraine, after the United States, following Russia's full-scale invasion in 2022. Germany's next government will be central to Europe's response to an assertive new US administra tion. Here's a look at what to expect for Sunday and

What happens on election day? Polls are due to open at 8 am and close at 6 pm. Germans can also vote by postal ballot, but their ballot must arrive by the time polling stations close on election day to be counted. Exit polls will come and votecounting will begin immediately after voting ends, and the general picture of the outcome should be clear very quickly. A final official result is expected early Monday.

Who are the contenders?: Four candidates are running to be Germany's next leader: incumbent Chancellor Olaf Scholz, of the center-left Social Democrats: Friedrich Merz, the candidate of the mainstream conservative

Merz is favored to replace Scholz as chancellor, but it's not yet clear what governing coalitions will be possible after the election. How easy it is to form a government may depend in part on how many parties are in the new parliament. Opinion polls show three parties hovering around the 5% of the vote needed to win seats.

All mainstream parties say they won't work with AfD.

What's up for grabs?: At least 59.2 million people in a country of 84 million are eligible to vote for the new Bundestag, or lower house of parliament. It is the 630-member Bundestag that will elect the next chancellor, Germany's equivalent of a prime minister.

There are 29 parties on the ballot, but it's likely that between five and eight of them will get enough votes to win seats in parliament. In most cases, parties must win at least 5% of the vote to get a share of the seats.

Christian Democratic Union What happens after polls close?: Germany's electoral system rarely gives any party an absolute majority and opinion polls suggest that no party is anywhere near one this time. The country has no tradition of minority governments at national level, which means that two or more parties will most likely form a coalition.

There is no formal referee for the process of forming a new government, and no set time limit. Parties hold exploratory talks to determine who they have most common ground with, and one combination of parties then moves on to formal coalition talks.

Those negotiations typically produce a detailed coalition agreement setting out the new government's plans. That will typically need approval at least from conventions of the parties involved. Some parties may choose to put it to a ballot of their entire membership.

Once that process is complete, the Bundestag can elect the new chancellor.

What's at stake?: A strong German government would be important to Europe's response to the new US administration and to turmoil in Ukraine and elsewhere.

Germany and neighboring France have traditionally been the motor of the EU, but both heavyweights have been conin recent months.

This election is being held seven months earlier than originally planned because Scholz's three-party coalition collapsed

sumed by domestic political instability in November as it argued about how to reinvigorate the economy, which has shrunk for the past two years. One of the new government's most urgent tasks will be to find a coherent response to that

Another challenge will be further reducing irregular migration, which has been a top issue in the campaign. Merz has said he hopes to form a new

government by mid-April if he wins. Scholz's outgoing government will remain in office on a caretaker basis until the Bundestag elects the new chancellor.
