## Pay present property tax to MCD, clear all past dues

Tn a big relief to the people of Delhi, the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) has announced a house-tax waiver scheme, allowing residents to clear their house tax dues of 2024-25 and have all previous pending taxes written off.

Additionally, in the next financial year, 100 percent of house tax on 100-yard homes and residential-area shops will be scrapped, while properties between 100-500 yards will get a 50 percent waiver. For the first time, 1,300 housing societies - previously ineligible - will receive a 25 percent rebate. This transformative proposal is set to be passed in the MCD House on February

After losing the turf to BJP in governing the national Capital, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP)-led MCD on Monday introduced a major house tax waiver for property owners which can be witnessed as a direct confrontation between the two different regime in Delhi. The announcement, made

ahead of the mayoral polls in April, was delivered at a press conference by AAP leader, Mayor Mahesh MCD Khinchi, Deputy Mayor Ravinder Bhardwaj, and Leader of the House Mukesh Goel.

Announcing the initiative, Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh said those who settle their 2024-25 house tax dues will have all previous outstanding amounts waived. The move aims at easing financial

Singh highlighted that the decision is that those who pay their house tax for 2024-25 will have all their previous outstanding house tax dues, which have been a burden on them, completely waived. is maior "This

announcement: upon paying the house tax for 2024-25, all previous outstanding dues, which were a financial burden, will be written off. Secondly, the house tax for buildings ranging from 100 square yards to 500 square yards will be reduced by half. That is, houses within the 100-500 square yard range will now have their house tax cut by 50%," he said.

He further noted that for buildings below 100 square yards, the house tax will be entirely waived. He said, "So, properties between 100 and 500 square yards will have their tax reduced by half, and those below 100 square yards

Under the scheme, properties measuring up to 100 square yards, including residential shops, will be completely exempt from house tax from the next financial year. Houses measuring between 100 and 500 square yards will receive a 50 per cent waiver, while 1,300 housing societies that previously did not qualify for any exemption will now get a 25 per cent rebate. Singh further added that additionally, residential properties where commercial activities such as shops are running, and properties designated for commercial

Singh said, "There are over 1,300 apartments in Delhi that do not currently receive any tax exemptions or benefits. A crucial decision has been made regarding them as well: 1,300 housing apartments in Delhi will receive a 25% house tax

#### One dead, 10 injured in clash at Bangladesh air force base

man was killed and Aseveral others injured in a clash on Monday between a group of local people and air force personnel at an airbase in Bangladesh's Cox's Bazar, officials said.

The Inter Service Public Relations (ISPR) - the media wing of the military - in a statement said the "miscreants" attacked the Bangladesh Air Force Base Cox's Bazar's Samitipara.

"Bangladesh Air Force is taking necessary actions in this regard," it said.

The ISPR said that "some local miscreants" of the Samitipara area adjacent to the beach resort town "launched a sudden attack" on the airbase after a biker was stopped at a checkpoint as he was crossing the base area without any papers for the vehicle.

It said the biker was taken inside the base for interrogation when over 200 people marched towards the base. The security personnel tried to stop them, sparking a clash that left four Air Force personnel injured

Deputy Commissioner of the district, Mohammad Salahuddin, said: one person was killed, and several others were injured in the incident". The official said a thorough investigation would conducted into the cause of the attack.

#### **Misbehaviour with Nepal students** KIIT directed to take action against guilty staffs

on Monday directed the authorities of the KIIT University to take action against the employees involved in the mistreatment of students following the recent suicide of a Nepalese girl in her hostel room,.

The government's directive came a day after Nepal Foreign Minister D Arzu Rana Deuba spoke over phone with Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi regarding the incident.

Deuba urged removal of teachers and staffs who had misbehaved with Nepalese students.

A government official said they have already issued an instruction to the KIIT authorities to take prompt action to restore the confidence of Nepalese students who have not returned to the campus so

The Nepal Government has also expressed concern that their students may be subjected to reprisal if the "unrulv" teachers and staff mem-

bers remain in the institute. Out of the nearly 1,000 Nepalese students of KIIT, only a few could return to the campus responding to the State Government's assurance and apology by the institute

Police, after examining CCTV footage, have arrested 10 employees of KIIT, including some director-level officials, security guards and others on the charge of assaulting the students.

According to a release issued by KIIT on February 18, two security staffs were terminated from service while two senior hostel officials and one senior administrative officer of the International Relations Office (IRO) were suspended pending inquiry.

The KIIT authorities have also tendered an apology for some of its staffs making disparaging comments and the distress caused to the stu-

# Survival of trapped men bleak in tunnel collapse: Govt

Even as multiple agencies are at war footing in Telangana reminding their efforts in 17days Silkyara Bend rescue operation in Uttarakhand, chances of survival of the eight persons who remain trapped in the SLBC tunnel seems to be "very remote".

miners, who had rescued the construction workers trapped in the Silkyara Bend-Barkot tunnel in Uttarakhand in 2023, to extricate the

Indian Army, Navy, NDRF, SDRF and other agencies are also involved in rescue operations in close coordination with each other.

Despite relentless efforts by the Indian Army, NDRF and other agencies, no breakthrough has been achieved so far in the rescue operations to extricate the eight persons who have remained trapped for over 48 hours inside the tunnel after a section of it collapsed in the Srisailam Left Bank Canal (SLBC) project in Telangana's Nagarkurnool district on Saturday.

The persons who have been trapped

in the collapsed tunnel for the past over 48 hours have been identified as Manoj Kumar and Sri Niwas from Uttar Pradesh, Sunny Singh (Jammu and Kashmir), Gurpreet Singh (Punjab) and Sandeep Sahu, Jegta

#### KIIT girl student death Nepal NHRC seeks speedy investigation

▲ he Nepal National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has sought a speedy probe into the alleged assault and mistreatment of Nepalese students studying at the KIIT University in Bhubaneswar after the girl student Prakriti Lamsal was found dead in the hostel of the university.

The NHRC has expressed its demand for justice, citing serious allegations of improper conduct by the KIIT University authorities. In a communiqué, the NHRC emphasised the need for a secure environment for students, free from fear and intimidation.

The Nepal commission has requested the NHRC of India

to investigate the incident of the girl's suspicious death and provide justice to the victim and to make university officials and others involved in the incident accountable. The Nepal commission's

letter underscored the importance of student safety and called for swift action in addressing the alleged mishandling by the university staffs. The communication also emphasised creating a safe educational atmosphere, crucial for students' wellbeing.

Based on the complaints received, the Nepal commission is also collecting information from the Nepal Embassy in India and media reports about the incident and the situation of the students.

#### To detect criminals, traffic offenders

Advanced artificial intelligence (AI) cameras would soon be installed in the twin cities of Cuttack and Bhubaneswar to enhance security measures against crimes, criminals and traffic violations, said Twin City Commissioner of Police S Devadatta Singh on Monday. Singh said the use of AI-en-

abled cameras would strengthen public safety in these rapidly urbanising cities. The new AI technology would play a significant role in spotting both traffic offenders and criminal activities. aim to provide the commu-



of AI cameras, plans include expanding closed-circuit television (CCTV) coverage and peace of mind. increasing the number of security personnel. These efforts

Singh said that in Bhubaneswar, already 1,000 CCTV cameras have been in-

stalled at several prominent junctions. Such cameras at present are inadequate in view of population rise and other aspects.

"The AI-enabled cameras will be equipped with facial recognition so that culprits can be clearly identified and the entire analysis will be AIenabled. This will bring in more efficiency in the delivery of services, maintaining law and order and other security measures by the Commissionerate Police," said the Commissioner.

Sources said the locations for the installation of AI cameras have been identified as per an exercise undertaken by respective police stations by taking into account shadow areas, from traffic

point of view and on the basis of suggestions from civil society and others.

The Commissionerate police have detected several burglaries and other cases. Such cases had been learning lessons for the Commissionerate police and highlighted the need for installation of more CCTV cameras, which is possible through public partnership as well, he said. "We had earlier requested

apartments to install CCTV cameras. Several have installed, but some cameras are not in working condition. It is the responsibility of the apartment societies to ensure that all the security mechanisms are in working conditions," the Commissioner

# Supreme Court reprimands Odisha over pension case delays

The Supreme Court has reprimands the Odisha Government over delays in pen-

The court has highlighted a crucial distinction between 'work-charged employees' and 'iob contractors' concerning pension entitlements under the Odisha Pension Rules 1992. This clarification follows numerous delayed petitions from Odisha regarding pension benefits.

Explaining the distinction between the work-charged employee and employees working on a job contract, the apex court observed, "There is

a clear distinction between the employees who are in workcharged establishment vis-àvis those who are in job contract establishment. The distinction becomes obvious from a bare perusal of sub-Rules 3 and 6 of Rule 18 of the Odisha Pension Rules, 1992 where it is given that workcharged employees who have worked in the establishment for a period of five years or more without interruption and are subsequently appointed to the same or another post in temporary or substantive capacity in a pensionable establishment, the period of service rendered by him/her in a work-charged establishment shall qualify for pension under the Odisha Pension Rules 1992."

"Compare this with the provision relating to job contract establishment for whom it has been specifically stated that in case of a job contract employee, after he/she is brought in pensionable establishment, only that much period as job contract service shall be added to regular service as would make him qualify or eligible for pensionary benefits," the court added.

In a notable decision, according to Live Law, the Supreme Court allowed Odisha's delayed petitions to be considered on their merits.

cal protocol but was deemed necessary due to the large number of employees involved and the significant implications for the state's financial resources.

Despite permitting the delayed petitions, the court expressed its discontent with Odisha's tardy management of these pension-related legal proceedings. To address the undue delays caused by these appeals and petitions, the court imposed a financial penalty on the State, charging Rs 1.5 lakh per employee for prolonging the legal process unnecessarily.

This decision highlights the

affected employees and the State Exchequer, emphasising the need for efficient legal proceedings to uphold pension rights effectively.

A Bench comprising Justices Sudhanshu Dhulia and Ahsanuddin Amanullah was hearing the State of Odisha's batch of petitions against the Orissa High Court's Division Bench decision to dismiss their Writ Appeals as timebarred. In this case, the court decided the long-standing dispute over pensionary benefits for employees who were initially hired as job contractors and later regularised in the State of Odisha.

### 1,448 rare turtles seized by DRI in Khordha

A team of the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) seized a large number of rare turtles and arrested a person allegedly involved in the smuggling of turtles from Khordha district.

The DRI officials seized 1,448 Indian Flap Shell Turtles following a raid at Godipada Toll Plaza in the district. The vehicle used in transporting the turtles was also seized,

The DRI officials said Indian Flap Shell Turtles are classified as a Schedule I species and accorded stringent protection under the Wildlife

(Protection) Act, 1972.

Earlier, in March 2024, DRI officials had foiled a major wildlife trafficking attempt and rescued over 300 Indian Tent turtles during a raid near Manguli Toll Plaza in Cuttack district. These are not isolated incidents as several instances of illegal trafficking of turtles have been reported from different parts of the State at regular intervals.

Railway Protection Force (RPF) personnel had rescued 117 live turtles from the Bhubaneswar railway station when they were being illegally transported in the Utkal Express in May 2024. Four persons, including a woman, were arrested in this connection.

#### In Odisha 34.98 lakh farmers benefit Scams plague road projects of Works Dept from PM-KISAN scheme

Utkarsha Odisha in which bitumen worth crores of rupees were procured from a particular hot mix plant in the Dadhi Maccha Gadia area in Khordha, The contractors were forced to procure bitumen from this plant and warned that if they don't procure bitumen from that plant they won't get the contracts.

It is further alleged that though many roads were in good condition yet they were covered with new layers of bitumen only to help the plant owners

To make matters worse, the department's top officials, in nexus with executing agencies and contractors, have misled Harichandan in the name of adopting new technology which is unnecessary and costs sky-high than other materials. A classic example is the use of mastic asphalt. At Capital Hospital Square

Works Minister Prithiviraj

New Airport Road and a few other places mastic asphalt has been laid on the road even though technical experts said there was no need for laying mastic asphalt there which costs 60 per cent more than bitumen. There are plans to lay mastic asphalt at 10 places in the capital city.

Notably, mastic asphalt is a waterproofing material and used as a wearing course for a whole range of construction work of roads and bridges. It protects structural concrete and flexible pavement top from wear and tears due to environmental impact.

However, Capital Hospital Square is downstream and during rains the water flows towards the New Airport Square and there is no waterlogging and there is no roundabout there. So, the use of mastic asphalt at those places is questionable; and it seems that it has been done deliberately to damage the roads so that it can be repaired again,

said experts. It is alleged by reliable sources that some corrupt engineers in a pre-planned manner have misinformed the new Works Minister about use of this technology and materials to collect a huge percentage (PC) from the contractors which is leading to misutilisation of the public

If the State Government orders a Vigilance probe into the scams in the Works Department, there can be some transparency in the projects and the misutilisation of funds can be curbed, opined the experts.

# Road widening, flyovers just won't help ease traffic woes

**T**he year 2024 witnessed a change in the government in the State of Odisha but the problems of capital city of Bhubaneswar like water logging, congestion, garbage, livelihood and pollution etc continue to remain unaddressed. Meanwhile, like the previous BJD government, the present BJP government too has come up with plans to expand road accessibility, flyovers and ring roads etc.

But what the decision makers are not ready to accept is Bhubaneswar is originally a grid pattern city and is more comfort-



able for cycling, pedestrians and public transport than accommo-

dating highways, flyovers and ring

In the last decades, cities across the globe have undergone massive experiments in either expanding most major roads, leading to an additional congestion or went on investing in slow streets. Adding more wider roads actually accelerates the growth of driving. In other words, widening a street can make traffic even worse than before.

Traffic demand is based on the immediate cost of driving. Reduce the time it takes to drive somewhere, and that trip will become cheaper. People drive more because it now costs less. But as more people choose to drive more miles, the cost of driving settles back to where it was originally.

Where does new traffic come from in Bhubaneswar. In last decades, new driving by individuals contributed between 9% and 39% of induced demand; heavy vehicles contributed between 19% and 29%, increased migration accounted for between 5% and 21%, and people switching from side roads to main roads accounted for 0% to 10%.

More trips and more driving means more social and economic activity that may not have happened before. However, the social and economic benefits of new traffic are generally not argued or even modelled to see if the project's monetary costs (construction and maintenance) and social costs (added pollution and traffic deaths) are worth it.

Planners and engineers are silent on what benefits might actually come from road widenings, choosing instead to believe in the fiction that congestion is beatable. But the fact remains that more road widening leads to more congestions.

Despite having five decades of evidence of its inefficacy, governments still keep widening roads in the capital city. So, rather than congestion, it's more important to understand the politics of road widening or expansion in Bhubaneswar. Many believe widen-

ing will reduce congestion; while others believe the short term benefits of congestion are worth the cost, or that bicycle paths and transit improvements alongside widening will have meaningful impacts. But the fact is Bhubaneswar has not got any relief so far from its flyovers, widened roads and expanded highways over the years. Needless to say, Bhubaneswar, Puri and Cuttack should now have more practical urban planning in

tervention. Perhaps our decision makers need to understand widening or building more flyovers won't solve city's problems; rather it will create more water logging situations, more congestion and health issues. It's like buying larger pants for a bulky body than addressing the obesity challenge that our city inherited from automobile culture. Let's wish 2025 be year of sustainability and sustainable urbanisation.

# Odisha EOW arrests fraudster from Hyderabad

For duping more than Rs 5 cr from investors

he Odisha Economic Offences Wing (EOW) has arrested one Dhanajaya Sahoo from Hyderabad in connection with a fraud of Rs 5 crore.

Sahoo, a resident of Bhadrak district, is accused of duping people on the pretext of doubling the invested amount in 10 months.

Sahoo has been arrested under several sections including the Banning of Unregulated Deposit Schemes. Following the arrest, Sahoo was brought to Bhubaneswar on tion in the court of Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate in Hyderabad.

The EOW arrested Sahoo based on the complaint of one Govinda Chandra Sahoo of of Jajpur district. The complainant alleged that Sahoo duped him and many others by illegally taking the deposits under the promise of doubling the deposits through his company 'Mutual Alliance Global Pvt Ltd' within 10

The EOW said that from 2011 to 2021, the arrested accused had formed five companies, Goodland Happy Home Infra Ltd., Goodland Construction Pvt Ltd, Ltd, Coinex Technology Pvt Ltd and Mutual Alliance Global Pvt Ltd and was operating the same as managing di-

The accused allegedly induced the investors to deposit through his companies for high profits from further investment of the deposited amount in real estate marketing, blockchain in the real estate market, e-commerce, and on online gaming platforms.

It was in 2010 when the arrested accused had formed Mutual Alliance Global Pvt Ltd at the Budheswari in Bhubaneswar. He allegedly induced the general public by holding meetings in different Bhubaneswar seeking deposits in his company in exchange for high returns promising to double the invested amount in 10 months.

The agency said the accused had taken unregulated deposits of Rs.5 crore from around 200 investors mainly from Cuttack, Khordha, Jajpur, Bhadrak, Keonjhar and Mayurbhanj districts. Although the accused paid

#### Segregating waste at source important for environment: SC

The Supreme Court on Monday said segregation of waste at source was of "vital importance" for the environment and asked the NCR states for the compliances made in adherence to the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016.

A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Ujjal Bhuyan said the non-compliance in adhering to the 2016 Rules had affected all cities in the coun-

"In one of the orders, we have observed that all smart city projects are in progress. How the cities can become smart without compliance with the Solid Waste Management Rules?" the bench asked.

The National Capital Region (NCR) comprises Delhi and certain districts of Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan. If there was no proper segregation of waste, the court said, even waste-to-energy projects would create more pollution.

. Senior advocate Aparajita Singh, the amicus curiae in the pollution matter, referred to solid waste management in the NCR while flagging the low percentage of segregation of waste.

She said sending unsegregated waste to waste-to-energy plants caused more pollu-

"As rightly submitted by the amicus curiae, the segregation of waste at source is of ronment. If their is no proper segregation, even waste-toenergy projects will create more pollution," the bench

The NCR states were ordered to file affidavits dealing with the compliances of all the urban local bodies with the provisions of the 2016 Rules

They have been asked to file the affidavits by end of March following which the matter would be taken up.
The bench has also asked the

states to set out a comprehensive plan for waste management along with timelines and implementing agencies and said, "Needless to add that the affidavits will state compliance in relation to all urban local bodies within the NCR."

The authorities were asked to set out the "best practices" they proposed to follow for solid waste management.

The bench in the meantime directed the Central Pollution Control Board to submit a report on the impact of waste-to-energy projects on the environment.

While dealing with the issue of solid waste management in the national capital previously, the court said if there was no real solution to tackle the issue of untreated solid waste generated per day, it would consider passing drastic orders to stop certain construction activities.

It had flagged the failure of the Delhi government and the municipal corporation to comply with the 2016 Rules. "We are facing a huge prob-lem which arises due to the fact that approximately 3,000 tonne of solid waste generated every day in Delhi remains untreated.

The Border Security force 1 (BSF) has ordered mobilisation of additional manpower at posts along the İndia-Pakistan border in Punjab and Jammu as part of its measures to strengthen the anti-infiltration grid and check the intrusion of drones carrying ammunition or drugs, official sources said Monday.

The sources said that the Western Command of the Border Security Force headquartered in Chandigarh has also directed for setting up of nine "tactical" headquarters along the front in these two regions with the maximum intelligence and operations paraphernalia being "shifted" here under the monitoring of

a newly created control room. A tactical or 'tac headquarter' is a forward base which is closer to the border, just near the border post, and ahead of the battalion base in the rear. The 'tac headquarter', as per the sources, will also have the presence of one senior commander from all verticals including the commanding officer (CO) of the battalion whose unit is deployed at these vulnerable border posts, the sources said. Directions have also been

issued to mobilise "maximum" manpower of the force to border guarding units all across these two regions after shifting them from the battalion headquarters, they said. Sources in the security establishment said the measure had been taken late last week keeping in mind the "vulnerability and the constant threat to these border areas from the point of view of cross-border infiltration and drone flights emanating from Pakistan.

The directions mandate these steps to be taken immediately," a senior officer based in

Punjab said. However, officials said that asking the commanding officers to be present at their respective tac headquarters all the time" will lead to command and administration issues.

Kashi Vishwanath Temple's Chief Executive Officer, Vishw Bhushan Mishra said on Monday that the number of visitors to the temple has significantly increased due to the return flow of devotees from the ongoing Maha Kumbh in nearby Prayagraj. With Mahashivratri falling on February 26 this year alongside the Kumbh Mela, pilgrims from across the country, along with saints from various akharas, including Naga sadhus, are expected to arrive in large numbers to offer

prayers, he noted. 'On this occasion, the Naga akharas will also take out a grand procession, which will temporarily block general access through gate number four of the temple. This is likely

regular devotees. Given the hot and humid weather conditions, prolonged waiting could pose health risks, especially for children, women, and elderly visitors.

Keeping this in authorities have decided to completely suspend VIP darshan for the three-day period," he said. Mishra noted that last year, around 12 Lakh devotees visited Kashi Vishwanath Dham Mahashivratri.

## Fadnavis approves 109 names as OSDs, PS to ministers

Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis on Monday said he cleared 109 out of 125 names referred by cabinet ministers for their appointment as personal secretaries or OSDs but didn't approve others because they are either facing inquiries or known as "fixers" "I have received some 125 names of officials whom my cabinet colleagues wanted to appoint as either personal secretaries (PS) or as officers on special duty. Out of it, I have cleared the names of 109.
"The reasons behind not

clearing the names of the remaining (16) is either there is some inquiry going on against those officials or they are known as fixers in the administrative circles,' Fadnavis told reporters.

He also said the rest (16) are facing various types of allegations. "Even if it would hurt someone, I will not clear such names".

Fadnavis also snubbed Agriculture Minister Manikrao Kokate, who belongs to the Nationalist Congress Party, over his remarks that even PS and OSDs are appointed by the chief minister, "leaving nothing in our hands"

Kokate had said that Fadnavis issued a stern warning to all his cabinet colleagues to maintain strict discipline within their respective departments. "He (Fadnavis) stated that any

minister who attempts to deviate from the government's plan risks losing their position. There is nothing left in our hands, as even the PS and OSDs are appointed by the chief minister. We will have to perform now," Kokate said. When asked about the agriculture minister's remarks, Fadnavis said Kokate probably didn't know approving the appointments of PS and OSDs is the CM's prerogative.

"A minister can propose candidates, but the final decision rests with my office, the CM added.

Fadnavis also expressed concerns regarding the issue of illegal constructions near Mumbai, which have led to court interventions.

### **German election Tik Toked**

As Germany votes to elect its new chancellor, far right may make substantial gains thanks to its Tik Tok campaign

nermany votes in a snap federal election, a political shake-up triggered by the collapse of the three-party coalition government at the end of last year. With 59.2 million eligible voters, this election is set to reshape the country's political landscape, potentially heralding a shift towards conservatism and a stronger far-right presence. At the forefront of the race is Friedrich Merz, the 69-year-old leader of the conservative Christian Democratic Union (CDU). Merz has emerged as the frontrunner to become Germany's next chancellor, advocating for economic stability, stricter immigration policies, and a reassertion of Germany's leadership in Europe. The far-right Alternative for Germany (AfD) is poised to make historic gains, emerging as the second-largest political force. This comes at the expense of Chancellor Olaf Scholz's Social Democratic Party (SPD), which has suffered due to economic stagnation and dissatisfaction with the previous coalition government. The Green Party and the Free Democrats (FDP), both

part of the fallen coalition, have also struggled to maintain voter confidence. Meanwhile, the Left Party is fighting to remain relevant amid internal divisions and the broader shift in political sentiment.

This election is taking place at a critical juncture for Germany, with pressing domestic and international challenges shaping the national narrative. Germany, the EU's largest economy, is grappling with slow growth, rising inflation, and concerns about industrial competitiveness. Many voters are looking for a leader who can restore economic stability and drive innovation. Besides, the country has faced growing debates over migration policies, with many Germans expressing con-

cerns about integration and border security. The AfD has capitalised on this sentiment, calling for stricter immigration controls. With growing geopolitical tensions, including relations with China, Russia, and the United States, Germany's next leader will need to navigate foreign policy challenges carefully. But the biggest factor that is being analysed is why the AfD is gaining ground? Indeed, the rise of the AfD can be attributed to several factors. Firstly, economic dissatisfaction has pushed voters towards populist rhetoric, with the AfD portraying itself as the party of change. Secondly, frustration with the previous coalition's handling of immigration and energy policy has bolstered nationalist sentiments. An interesting aspect of this election has been the role played by social media, particularly TikTok. The AfD has effectively leveraged TikTok to reach younger audiences, spreading populist messages through short, engaging videos, often laced with negative content. Meanwhile, mainstream parties have struggled to counteract misinformation and viral narratives that favor the far-right. This election underscores the growing influence of digital platforms in modern politics, raising questions about regulation and the impact of algorithm-driven content on democratic processes. Whatever the outcome, it will have far-reaching implications for Germany, the EU and beyond.

The UGC's draft guidelines, while ostensibly aimed at ensuring uniformity in VC appointments, have opened a Pandora's box of political and constitutional concerns

he University Grants Commission's (UGC) guidelines proposing a shift in the appointment of Vice-Chancellors (VCs) have ignited a political storm. By granting Chancellors—predominantly Governors—the authority to constitute search-cum-selection committees for appointing VCs, the UGC has stirred concerns about federalism, state autonomy, and academic independence.

Adding to the controversy, noncompliance with these guidelines could disqualify state universities from UGC funding schemes, creating a direct clash between the Centre and opposition-ruled states such as Tamil Nadu, Kerala, West Bengal, Punjab, and Himachal Pradesh. This move, seen as a veiled attempt to centralise power over state universities, places the spotlight on India's federal structure and the simmering tension between state governments and Governors, especially in opposition-led states. At the core of the debate is the growing role of Governors, often viewed as proxies of the Centre, in state governance.

Historically, state governments have played a central role in appointing VCs by constituting independent search committees. However, the UGC's draft proposes a shift, granting Governors—functioning as Chancellors of state universities—control over these committees

Governors, constitutionally expected to act as neutral figures, have increasingly been accused of serving partisan interests, particularly in states like Tamil Nadu, Kerala, and West Bengal. By formalizing the Governor's role in academic appointments, the UGC guidelines risk politicising the process, potentially undermining academic independence and turning universities into ideological battlegrounds. The fears of state governments are not



appointments. The new guidelines only add fuel to these already volatile relationships. The UGC's draft guidelines also raise significant constitutional questions. Education, as subject under the Concurrent List, allows both the Centre and states to legislate on it. However, the Constitution also upholds federal principles, granting states substantial control over their universities.

The new guidelines, by empowering Governors to dominate the VC appointment process, are being viewed as an encroachment on states' jurisdiction. Several states may challenge these guidelines in court, arguing that they violate the federal structure enshrined in the Constitution. States like Tamil Nadu have already passed laws to curtail the Governor's powers in academic governance, reflecting a broader pushback against what they see as an overreach by the

For opposition-ruled states, where educational institutions are often viewed as bastions of intellectual and political autonomy, the UGC's guidelines have deepened fears of central overreach. The ruling dispensations in states like Tamil Nadu, Kerala, and West Bengal have expressed strong apprehensions about Governors using this newfound authority as an extension of the Centre's political influence.

the educational domain. The UGC guidelines could exacerbate this friction, allowing the Governor to influence appointments to academic institutions. Such moves, critics argue, undermine the intellectual independence that universities in the state have historically enjoyed.

In Kerala, where the Left Democratic Front (LDF) government has vociferously defended educational autonomy, the guidelines are being seen as an outright encroachment on the state's constitutional rights. The state government fears that politicised appointments could compromise the ideological neutrality and academic standards of its universities.

The DMK-led Tamil Nadu government has also repeatedly opposed the Governor's increasing interference in educational appointments. The state has even passed legislation to reduce the Governor's control over the VC selection process, only to have it stalled by the Governor. For Tamil Nadu, these new guidelines are a direct challenge to the state's efforts to safeguard its educational institutions from external political influence. Universities, as centres of

higher learning, thrive on autonomy and academic freedom. The UGC's intervention threatens to compromise these principles by potentially turning VCs into political appointees. Critics argue that such appointments could erode academic independence, with VCs prioritising political allegiance over educational excellence. In opposition-led states, this concern is particularly acute.

The fear is that such interference could stifle intellectual diversity, with universities becoming vehicles for propagating the central government's political agenda. This interference also undermines the confidence of academicians and researchers.

Scholars worry that political considerations will outweigh merit in appointments, leading to a decline in the quality of higher education. The resulting chilling effect could discourage free thought and innovation in academic insti-

The controversy over VC appointments is emblematic of a larger tussle between the Centre and states over federalism. For states like Tamil Nadu, Kerala, and West Bengal, the guidelines represent an erosion of their autonomy in managing critical domains such as education. This growing centralisation also poses questions about the role of Governors in a federal structure.

A balanced approach, one that respects state autonomy while ensuring accountability in academic governance, is the need of the hour. Without such a resolution, the guidelines risk becoming another flashpoint in the Centre-state relationship, with significant implications for India's federal structure and the future of its education system.

have been trying to set up a small library within my condominium complex. A lady was apprehensive about the criticism from a select few for the expenditure on this noble venture. #### THE HANDWRITING BLUES: A STORY OF DECLINE

Some see handwriting as a reflection of character, but it shifts, evolves and often declines beyond recognition



ome conjecture that a person's handwriting can give a glimpse into that person's character. But I am a sceptic in this regard, because, in my opinion, the handwriting of an individual is not a constant, but keeps on morphing as time goes by. A case in point is your humble friend, who has seen his handwriting deteriorate over the past few decades, till now, in my fifth decade, it is nothing more than a painstaking, almost illegible scrawl- although, with the advent of the now ubiquitous personal computer and other sundry devices, the negative impact of this deterioration has been minimised, especially in official work. Because today, when I write a note on any file with my hand, others find it rather difficult to 'decrypt'.

Even filling simple financial documents like a cheque is a nightmare now, a stiff challenge, that is increasingly being left to my better half to handle, as bank people, on a few occasions, have raised doubts about the authenticity of my signature. But before the readers start commiserating about the sad and agonising state of my handwriting, I will share with them that this was not always the case. In the early years of school, I was the darling of my teachers because of my neat and clean handwriting, which made me the cynosure of my peers. Writing on four-line copies, I would get full marks in English handwriting.

The slide commenced from middle school onwards, when I shifted from writing with a pencil to writing with a ball pen, and the copy changed from one with four lines to that with two lines. But the hand was still steady, and teachers did not have any problem reading my answer sheets, as was evident from the good grades I continued to get in my exams. But I am sure, that as I entered college and the university in the mid-eighties, the good professors would have become



increasingly impatient in poring over my messy answer sheets, with scribbles galore. Throughout, my father, a diligent and thorough gentleman, with very precise and beautiful handwriting, kept counselling me to stem the rot, even as I secured a job in the public sector in 1991. He gently warned that it would adversely impact my prospects of growth in the corporate world, especially when this was the period when all office work was conducted on well-defined sheets of paper- which, in my case, were to be yellow pages

Before leaving for Bombay (as Mumbai was then called), I scoffed at Dad's gentle, but consistent reprimands. It was only when I took my first, tentative steps in the company did I realise that what Dad had been emphasising over the years was not an iota away from the truth. I faced a mild, personal nudge from some bosses on this account, but others were not so kind, and their reaction bordered on outright contempt, reprimand and disapproval. But Dad was an eternal optimist. He still harboured a strong wish to get my handwriting back on track, even at this stage, for which he purchased a book- 'Techniques to improve your handwriting'. I was back in

So, whenever I came home to Delhi for a break, he would insist that I sit with him, at least for some time, and practice on ways to improve my, by now abominable handwriting. But by this point, my mind, like that of all young men, was engrossed in finer things of life than improving my writing ability, which, I realised, was destined to be an exercise in futility. This cat-and-mouse game continued even after I got married in 1993. It was only after I became a father in 1995 did Dad finally buried his desire to improve my handwriting to a decent

# RBI should go for an 'accommodative' stance



While inflation has been steadily declining, the RBI opted to retain its 'neutral' stance, signaling a measured approach rather than give push to boost liquidity and demand



n February 7, 2025, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Sanjay Malhotra announced the decisions taken by the six-member Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) in its sixth bi-monthly meeting of the current financial year (FY). It has reduced the policy rate or the repo rate (the interest rate at which the RBI lends to banks) by 25 basis points to 6.25 per cent. This marks the first repo rate cut in nearly five years. Moreover, it has continued with a neutral stance which it shifted in its fourth bimonthly review/announcement on October 10, 2024, from its earlier stance of "withdrawal of accommodation". In 2016, the Union Government put in place an institutionalized framework to enable the MPC to formulate monetary policy and determine the key interest rates including the policy rate for inflation targeting. It mandated the RBI to fix the policy rate in such a manner as to maintain the Consumer Price Index or CPI (it corresponds to a basket that includes food, fuel, manufactured goods, and select services) within the target range of 4 per cent (+/-2 per cent).

The RBI decides the policy rates once in two months during each FY. The mandate initially given for five years ending March 31, 2021, has since been extended for a further period of five years. The current mandate will continue till March 31, 2026. The other crucial policy instrument the RBI uses for targeting inflation is Liquidity - jargon for the quantum of credit available in the banking system. Pumping more liquidity along with a reduction in the policy rate represents a scenario which in jargon is described as an 'accommodative' policy stance. The terminology was coined by the outgoing governor Shaktikanta Das in June 2019 when he started going for aggressive cuts in the policy rate and an increase in cred-

Since June 2022 the RBI changed its stance to "withdrawal of accommodation" and had stuck to it till October 9, 2024, when in the fourth bi-monthly review, the MPC decided to go for a "neutral" stance. A

Put simply, he meant there was no need to start reducing interest rates until inflation reached the target of 4 per cent and stayed at that level. The incumbent DISINFLATION IS Governor has continued with this mindset. In February 2023, the policy rate was at a peak of 6.5 per cent. During FY 2022-23, the CPI inflation was hovering around 8 percent.

decreasing from 7.4 per cent in July 2023 to 5 per cent in September 2023, 4.8 per cent in October 2023 and 5.1 per cent during January/February 2024. For FY 2023-24, it was 5.4 percent. During the current FY also, it has kept low; 5.08 percent in July of 2024. After a brief spurt of 6.2 per cent in October 2024, in January 2025, it

declined to 4.3 per cent.

During FY 2024-25, the RBI has estimated it at 4.8 percent. Given the above, from the third quarter of FY 2023-24, the CPI inflation has remained well within the target range of 4 per cent (+/- 2 per cent). This position continues during the current FY. For FY 2025-26, the RBI expects it to be 4.2 per cent. Thus, there was a strong case for a significant reduction in the repo rate besides the injection of sufficient liquidity. This would have helped in stimulating demand thereby giving a boost to economic growth besides helping millions of borrowers reduce their EMIs and helping industries, especially MSMEs reduce the cost of servicing their loans. But, this was not to be.

The problem is RBI's obsession with inflation. Malhotra recognizes that inflation is on a downward trajectory. Yet, he doesn't want to relinquish his neutral stance citing global economic challenges "progress in global disinflation is stalling."
Put simply, he fears imported infla-

tion impacting CPI hence, a "neutral stance will provide MPC flexibility to respond to evolving macro-economic environment." A major factor contributing to wide variations in CPI inflation is food inflation which has a weight of around 40 per cent and is impacted predominantly by supply side/seasonal factors whereas monetary policy instruments work on the demand

tains an upward trend even as a small disruption in supply caused by seasonal factors can lead to spiralling prices.

As long as food remains a part of the CPI basket, inflation targeting will always remain a problem. There is an urgent need to exclude it while setting benchmark interest rates, an idea that was mooted by the Chief Economic Advisor in the Economic Survey (ES) for 2023-24. The CEA argued that monetary policy has no bearing on the prices of food items, which are dictated by supply-side

For instance, during 2021-22, wheat output was affected by unusually high temperatures. During 2022-23, rains accompanied by hailstorms acted as a spoiler. During the first half of FY 2023-24, food inflation went up due to a spike in the prices of vegetables caused by seasonal factors. The spurt in food prices during October 2024 also had to do with supply-side pressures only. The KBI can achieve little to con trol them by keeping the policy rate mooted in the ES - 2023-24 on

high. The RBI should take the idea board. Meanwhile, it should consider reducing the weight of food inflation in CPI to reflect the contemporary reality. The current 40 per cent weight is based on the Consumption Expenditure Survey (CES) of 2011-12 whereas Summary Statistics from the 2022-23 CES point towards a significant reduction.

While formulating its monetary policy, the RBI's prime responsibility is to ensure macro-economic stability its pivotal focus being on keeping inflation within reasonable bounds. However, it can't be oblivious of the dire need to support economic growth which could be adversely impacted if it doesn't relax the credit environment.

¬he recent escalation of violence in the eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) is a stark reminder of the region's deeprooted instability. Rwanda's involvement, whether direct or indirect, remains contentious, as accusations of its support for

M23 persist. While Kigali denies these allegations, the sophistication of M23's operations raises serious questions about its backing. At the heart of this crisis lies a complex mix of ethnic ten-

For years, Rwanda has been accused of providing M23 with financial and military support, a claim reinforced by multiple UN reports and statements from Western governments. The capture of Rubaya, a coltan-rich area, by M23 last year suggests that economic interests play a crucial role in shaping the rebellion's trajectory. M23 claims to be fighting for the rights of ethnic Tutsis in eastern DRC, arguing that the Congolese government has failed to protect there is historical evidence of ethnic violence against Tutsis in the region, M23's actions undermine its credibility. Rather than advocating for political rights through diplomatic means, the group has engaged in violence, forced displacement, and human rights violations. Its strategy of seizing key cities and resourcerich territories suggests an agenda extending far beyond self-defence. The DRC, backed by the inter-

national community, has dismissed M23's claims, arguing that the group is acting as a proxy for Rwanda's regional ambitions. The latest attempt by regional leaders to broker peace, with the Southern Development African Community (SADC) and the



(EAC) calling for an immediate ceasefire, reflects a growing recognition that the crisis cannot be resolved through military means alone. However, the reality on the ground tells a different story. M23 had briefly declared a ceasefire before resuming attacks, signalling that diplomatic efforts are struggling to keep up with battlefield developments.

The DRC's call for UN sanctions against Rwanda, coupled with protests in Kinshasa containment and political

where demonstrators burned portraits of President Paul Kagame, indicates a deepening rift between the two countries. With diplomatic ties severed and hostilities intensifying, the prospects for a negotiated settlement remain bleak.

A purely military solution is unlikely to yield lasting peace. The Congolese army has historically struggled to contain well-equipped rebel groups, and the presence of the UN peacekeeping mission, MONUSCO, has done little to prevent the latest wave of violence. Foreign military intervention, whether from regional forces or international actors, risks escalating the situation rather than resolving it. The most viable path forward is a combination of military

engagement. Strengthening the DRC's security forces to prevent further territorial losses is crucial, but diplomatic efforts must also address the root causes of the conflict, including ethnic grievances and economic exploitation. The global demand for coltan

and other precious resources ensures that armed groups can sustain themselves through illegal mining operations. Without stronger international regulations and accountability measures, companies sourcing minerals from conflict zones will remain complicit in financing violence. Holding both state and non-state actors accountable for their role in resource exploitation is essential for breaking the cycle of conflict. The ongoing crisis in eastern

DRC is not just about M23 or Rwanda's alleged involvement-it is part of a larger geopolitical struggle that has plagued the region for decades. Unless regional actors commit to genuine peace efforts and the international community enforces stricter measures against illegal mineral trade, the conflict will persist.

The path to stability requires addressing both security concerns and economic incentives that drive armed groups. Without meaningful action, eastern DRC will remain trapped in a cycle of violence, with its people bearing the brunt of a war that serves the interests of powerful actors far beyond its borders.

## China holds live-fire exercises in Gulf of Tonkin as Vietnam marks territorial claims

**PTI** BANGKOK

Chinese authorities said they began live-fire exercises in the Gulf of Tonkin on Monday, only days after Vietnam announced a new line marking what it considers its territory in the body of water between the two coun-

China's Maritime Safety

Administration said the exercises would be focused on the Beibu Gulf area, closer to the Chinese side of the Gulf of Tonkin, and would run through Thursday evening. It gave no further details, but the drills follow an announcement last week by Vietnam establishing a baseline used to calculate the width of its territorial waters in the Gulf of Tonkin.

State-run Vietnam News reported that the baseline was in compliance with the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea and would provide "a robust legal basis for safeguarding and exercising

Vietnam's sovereignty, sovereign rights and jurisdiction". Vietnam has not publicly responded to the Chinese

China and Vietnam have long had a maritime agreement governing the Gulf of Tonkin, but have been locked in competing claims in the nearby South China Sea over the Spratly and Paracel Islands and maritime areas.

China has been been growing aggressive in pursuing those claims, and in October assaulted 10 Vietnamese fishermen near the Paracel Islands, three of whom suffered broken limbs. China claims almost the entire South China Sea as its own, though it has not publicly released exact coordinates of its claim other than a map with 10 dashed lines broadly demarcating what it calls its

In addition to Vietnam, China's claims overlap with those of the Philippines, Malaysia, Brunei and Taiwan, while Indonesia has also fig-

with the Chinese coast guard and fishing fleets in the waters around the Natuna Islands. Tensions have been particularly high with the Philippines, with regular confrontations between the two countries.

Most recently, a Chinese navy helicopter flew within 10 feet (3 metres) of a Philippine patrol plane last week over the South China Sea, near the hotly disputed Scarborough Shoal off the northwestern Philippines.

Leaders in Australia and New Zealand also said China should have given more warning before its navy conducted an unusual series of live-fire exercises in the seas between the two countries, forcing flights on Friday and Saturday to divert on short notice. Political leaders from both countries emphasized that China didn't breach interna-

tional law, but said they had only been given "a couple hours notice" rather than the usual 12 to 24 hours.

### Federal workers confront mass confusion as Musk's deadline to list accomplishments looms

onfusion and chaos loom as hundreds of thousands of federal employees begin their workweek on Monday facing a deadline from President Donald Trump's costcutting chief, Elon Musk, to explain their recent accomplishments or risk losing their jobs. # Trump's abrupt change of US policy on Ukraine raises questions about Taiwan support

Trump's abrupt reversal of three years of American policy toward Ukraine has raised concerns China might become emboldened to push its territorial claim on Taiwan, though experts say Beijing is most likely in a wait-and-see mode right now to see how the situation in Europe plays out.

In the past two weeks, Trump has falsely claimed Ukraine "should have never started the war," said Ukraine "may be Russian someday" and ques-tioned the legitimacy of President Volodmyr

Zelenskyy's government, while upending the longstanding American position of isolating Russia over its aggression by beginning direct talks with Moscow and voicing positions

sounding remarkably like the Before heading to Washington

for talks with Trump on Monday, French President Emmanuel Macron said he would emphasize "you can't be weak in the face of President

"It's not you, it's not your trademark, it's not in your interest," Macron said he would tell Trump. "How can you, then, be credible in the face of China if you're weak in the face of Putin?"

What does Ukraine have to do with Taiwan? Like Moscow's claim Ukraine is rightfully Russian territory, China claims the self-governing island of Taiwan as its own. Chinese President Xi Jinping has not ruled out taking it by force. Trump on Friday appeared to walk back his earlier com-

ments inaccurately blaming Ukraine for starting the war, but his administration's overall abrupt shift in policy on the conflict could cause some in Taiwan to question "whether the United States could pull the rug out from underneath them as well," said Russell Hsiao, executive director of the Global

Trump was quite popular in Taiwan when he left office in 2021 and was widely credited with bringing the US and the democratically governed island closer together.

By American law, the US is

obligated to supply Taiwan with sufficient hardware and technology to fend off invasion from the mainland, but maintains a policy of "strategic ambiguity" on whether it would come to Taiwan's defense. Recently, Trump has been more critical of Taiwan, saying it should pay the US for its military defence. On several occasions, he also has accused Taiwan of taking computer chip manufacturing business away from the US and suggested earlier this month he might impose tariffs on semiconductors.

At the same time, Trump has

appointed many China hawks in his administration, including in top-level positions such as Secretary of State Marco Rubio and Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth.

After meeting NATO allies in Brussels earlier this month, Hegseth stressed that if the US were to pull back support from Ukraine, it would be to concentrate on the Asia-Pacific region and leave European defense primarily to Europeans.

The deterrent effect in the Pacific is one that really can only be led by the United States," Hegseth said.

A few days later, Rubio issued a joint statement with his counterparts from Japan and South Korea after they met on the sidelines of a security conference in Munich, stressing the "importance of maintaining peace and stability across the

Taiwan Strait as an indispensable element of security and prosperity for the international community." In a move that irked Beijing, the State Department also removed a line on American opposition to independence for Taiwan in a revised U.S. government fact sheet on the island.

Comments seem likely to give Beijing pause: "If I were Beijing, I would be paying the most attention to what Hegseth said about why the U.S. is changing its support to Ukraine," said Meia Nouwens, senior fellow for Chinese security and defense policy at the International Institute for Strategic Studies in London. Hegseth said this is about the Indo-Pacific, that the US has priorities elsewhere, and I don't think, from Beijing's perspective, that would have been

comforting," Nouwens said. The shift on Ukraine will give China the opportunity to push a message that the US is an unreliable partner, she said, but it was unlikely Beijing would read Washington's seeming willingness to concede Ukrainian territory as it being somehow open to Taiwan falling into Chinese hands.

"The broader trend lines of each country, of the US and China, looking forward aren't necessarily changing," Nouwens said. "Neither wants to give up any space, both want to continue on a trajectory that increases their national strength."



### Trump meets Macron amidst uncertainty over US ties with Europe, Ukraine

President Donald Trump welcomed French President Emmanuel Macron to the White House for talks on Monday at a moment of deep uncertainty about the future of transatlantic relations, with Trump transforming American foreign poli cy and effectively tuning out European leadership as he looks to quickly end Russia's war in Ukraine. The two leaders were starting their day by taking part in a virtual meeting with fellow leaders of the Group of Seven economies to discuss the war. Trump also has made demands

for territory — Greenland Canada, Gaza and the Panama Canal — as well as precious rare earth minerals from Ukraine. Just over a month into his second term, the "America First" president has cast an enormous shadow over what veteran US diplomats and former government officials had regarded as America's calming presence of global stability and continuity. Despite some notable hiccups the military, economic and moral power of the United States has dominated the post-World War II era, most notably after the Cold War came to an end with the collapse of the Soviet Union. All of that, some fear, may be lost if Trump gets his way and the US abandons the principles under which the United Nations and numerous other international bodies were founded.

# Chinese aggression brings Japan, Philippines closer

Tapan and the Philippines agreed on Monday to further deepen their defense collaboration and talk about protecting shared military information in the face of mutual alarm over China's increasing aggressive actions in the region.

Japanese Defence Minister Gen Nakatani and his Philippine counterpart, Gilberto Teodoro, forged the agreements in a meeting in Manila where their concern over China's actions in the disputed South China Sea and East China Sea was high in the agenda. Japan and the Philippines are treaty allies of the United States, and the three have been among the most vocal critics of China's assertive actions in the region, including in the contested waters.

At the opening of his meeting with Nakatani, Teodoro said the Philippines was looking forward to boosting defense relations with Japan "against unilateral attempts by China and other countries to change the international order and the

Nakatani said after the meeting that he agreed with Teodoro "to strengthen operational cooperation", including joint and multinational defense trainings, port calls and informa-

India and the UK on Monday announced the resumption of negotiations for the proposed free trade agreement (FTA), which is expected to double or even triple bilateral trade from the current \$20 Billion in the next 10 years.

The announcement was made by Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal and UK Secretary of State for Business and Trade Jonathan Reynolds

"Today, the Republic of India and the United Kingdom (UK) have resumed negotiations towards a trade deal between our two countries," a joint statement issued after the meeting said.

Both sides have agreed to resume talks towards balanced, mutually beneficial and a forward-looking deal that delivers mutual growth and builds on the strengths of the two complementary economies.

The strengthening of the trading relationship has the

### Indian tech sector revenues to grow 5.1 per cent in FY25

**PTI** MUMBAI

Indian tech sector's revenues Lare set to grow 5.1 per cent to \$282.6 Billion in fiscal year 2025, and likely to climb up further to \$300 Billion in fiscal year 2026, lobby grouping Nasscom said on Monday.

The revenue growth is on the "right trajectory", the body's president Rajesh Nambiar told reporters here, pointing out to revenue growth of four per cent in fiscal year 2024, 5.1 per cent in fiscal year 2025 and the over 6.1 per cent needed to cross its expectation of crossing \$300 Billion in fiscal vear 2026.

It has been a good outcome broadly given everything happening around us," Nambiar said pointing to aspects like geopolitics, and tariffs which are dominating the worries at present.

Nasssom said the sector, which includes companies, business process management companies, global capability centres and ecommerce companies, added 1.26 Lakh new jobs in fiscal year 2025 to take the overall employment to 58 Lakh.

Nambiar hinted that the industry will continue to add employees in the same pace that it did last year.

The Indian IT sector's fiscal year 2025 growth is likely to be faster than the 4.7 per cent growth in global tech services spending in the calendar year 2024, Nasssom said, adding that India's share in global sourcing stood at 58 per cent as of fiscal year 2025.

Among the segments, the IT services companies' revenues will grow 4.3 per cent to \$137.1 Billion while the BPM industry will see its revenues grow by 4.7 per cent to \$54.6 Billion.

The engineering research and development space is the fastest growing at seven per cent at \$55.6 Billion, Nasscom

The domestic revenues for the sector which has been focused on traditionally exports will grow seven per cent to \$58.2 Billion, outpacing exports 4.6 per cent growth at \$224.4 Billion, Nasscom said.

The body said the export revenues between Indian and global multinationals are evenly split at present, and denied that the heft of the foreign 'companies increased courtesy of the global capability centres (GCC) play. It pegged the total number of GCCs at 1,760 and added that such units employ 19 Lakh people at present.

#### Retail inflation eases slightly for farm workers

With a 2-0 win at the home of the four-time defending champion on Sunday, Liverpool produced a statement performance to move 11 points clear of Arsenal at the top of the standings.

"Special" was how Mohamed Salah described the latest victory that left the away fans chanting "We're gonna win the league" after the final whistle.

City manager Pep Guardiola, meanwhile, accepted the title was now Liverpool's to lose.

First-half goals from Salah and Dominik Szoboszlai put Arne Slot's team on course for a win that leaves it in command of the title race after 27 games. Liverpool is now 20 points above fourth-placed City after completing a league double over Guardiola's once allconquering team.

While Slot tried to dampen title talk with months still remaining of the campaign, Liverpool's advantage is undeniable. "What we do know is that no one

saw us as a title contender when we started in the beginning of the season. And I think no one in the world of football would have expected City not to be so close to the one that leads the league," the Dutch coach said.

This was City's eighth defeat in the league this season and 14th overall. The most games City had lost under Guardiola in any of his previous eight seasons was 12 in the 2019-20 campaign, which was the last time it failed to win the

Then, as now, it was Liverpool that led the way, and the Merseyside club looks likely to win a recordequaling 20th league title this year. City, meanwhile, faces a fight to secure a top-four finish and a return to next season's Champions League. It is above fifth-placed Newcastle on goal difference and just two points ahead of Aston Villa in eighth.


