**SUPREME COURT SLAMS PARASITES**

n political parties promising freebies ahead of polls, the Supreme Court (SC) on Wednesday said instead of bringing people into the mainstream for national development, Aare we not creating a class of parasites?". A bench of Justices BR Gavai and Augustine George Masih said it would be better to make people a part of the society's mainstream and contribute towards national development.

"Rather than promoting them to be a part of the mainstream of the society by contributing to the development of the nation, are we not creating a class of parasites?" it asked. Justice Gavai went on to add, "Unfortunately, because of these freebies, which just on the anvil of elections, are declared, like 'Ladki Bahin' and other schemes, people

are not willing to work.

The top court was hearing a matter concerning the right to shelter of homeless persons in urban areas and said people got free rations and money without working. "We quite appreciate your concern for them but would it not be better to make them a part of the mainstream of society and permit them to contribute to the development of the nation?" the bench asked.

Advocate Prashant Bhushan, appearing for one of the petitioners, said there was hardly anybody in the country who did not want to work, if they had work. The judge said, 'You must be having only one sided knowledge. I come from an agricultural family. Because of the freebies in Maharashtra, which they just announced prior to elections, agriculturists are not getting labourers." The court, however, said it did not want to debate.

Judges said everybody, including attorney general R Venkataramani, was on the same page that providing shelter to the homeless merited due attention. "But at the same time, should it not be balanced?" the bench asked. Venkataramani said the Centre was in the process of finalising the urban poverty alleviation mission, which would address various issues, including the provision of shelter for the urban homeless.

The bench asked him to verify from the Centre the time frame within which the scheme would be applicable and also place on record the aspects covered by it. "In the meantime, the attorney

general is also requested to take instructions as to whether till the implementation of the said scheme. the Union of India would continue with the National Urban Livelihoods Mission," it said.

The bench further asked the Centre to collate information from all states for the consideration of the issue on a pan-India basis.

One of the petitioners during the hearing said it was unfortunate that the cause of the homeless was not being addressed as it was last on the priority.

The bench was irked when he claimed the authorities showed compassion only for the rich, not the poor.

"Don't make a speech of Ramlila Maidan in this court," said Justice Gavai, "And don't make unnecessary allegations. Don't make a political speech here. We won't permit our courtrooms to be converted into a (place of) political battle."

The judge went on to add, "How do you say the compassion is shown only for the rich? Even for the government, how can you say this?" Painting a picture that the

government did not do anything or show concern for the poor was not

in a good taste, the court added. Bhushan said as per a note placed before the bench, as on December 4, 2024, a total of 2,557 shelters was sanctioned by the States or Union Territories and 1,995 shelter homes were functional with a capacity of 1.16 lakh beds. He said a survey showed there were about 3 lakh urban homeless in Delhi alone.

Bhushan said as per the Delhi Urban Shelter Improvement Board the total capacity of the shelters was 17,000 persons of which only 5,900 such facilities had beds.

The DUSIB counsel said the board had 197 shelter homes running in Delhi as on date with a total capacity of 17,000 persons.

In the last four years, he said, the average maximum occupancy was 5,500 in all shelter homes.

## **CBI** arrests **DTC officials**

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has arrested six officials of the Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC) on charges of corruption and bribery. This is the first major crackdown by the apex investigating agency in the national capital after the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) lost recently concluded the Assembly elections. Sources said, the arrests follow multiple complaints alleging widespread corruption in the department. The CBI launched a thorough surveillance operation to verify these claims before taking action. Upon investigation, authorities found prima facie evidence indicating corruption at various levels, leading to the arrests. The arrests are a part of a larger corruption case, which is being investigated by the CBI. The DTC has been in the eye of storm over allegations of corruption against its officials. The BJP had alleged a scam in the purchase of 1,000 low floor buses by DTC during the AAP Government in Delhi. The Chief Secretary of Delhi had then recommended the CBI to investigate the matter. The recommendation was approved by Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena.

## **UPSC** updates registration system online

The UPSC said in the notice that some entries have been made "editable" in the onetime registration for filling up of the online application.

## Sajjan Kumar convicted for Sikh riots murders

Delhi's Rouse Avenue court on Wednesday convicted former Congress MP Sajjan Kumar in a case related to the killings of two men in Saraswati Vihar on November 1, 1984, during the anti-Sikh riots. The arguments on the quantum of sentence in the case will take place on February 18.

The Congress leader who is currently serving a life sentence in another anti-Sikh riots case in Delhi Cantonment, was produced from Tihar jail before special judge Kaveri Baweja, who pronounced the conviction order. "I am of the opinion that Prosecution has been able to prove its case against the Accused beyond reasonable doubt. Thus, Accused Sajjan Kumar S/o Ch.Raghunath Singh is hereby convicted for offences punishable under Sections 147/148/149 IPC and for offences punishable under Sections 302/308/323/395/397/427/ 436/440 read with Section 149 IPC," Special Judge Kaveri Baweja said in her 139 pages order on Wednesday. The order said, "I am of the considered opinion that the Prosecution has been able to bring home the guilt of the Accused. It has been established that the Accused was instigating the mob, which was armed with deadly weapons i.e. lathis and sarias etc. and that the mob being an 'unlawful assembly' within the meaning of Section 141 IPC used force and violence in prosecution of the common object of looting, committed the offence of rioting armed with deadly weapons. On December 13, a first-year student endured extreme physical torture. That night, the accused allegedly entered his room, tied his hands and legs, and restrained him.

They then poured lotion all over his body and inflicted injuries using a divider. They also forced another first-year student in the room to record the incident on a mobile phone.

Unable to endure the harassment any longer, three students finally lodged a complaint with the Kottayam Gandhinagar police. College authorities stated that the affected students had not

informed hostel officials, teachers, or parents about the abuse.

Upon receiving the complaint, the college promptly took action. Once the investigation confirmed the allegations, the case was handed over to the police, they added.

The case attracts a maximum punishment of death penalty and lifeterm imprisonment as the minimum sentence. Kumar was produced before the court from Tihar jail to pronounce the verdict. incident? The conviction judgment said, "The complainant who witnessed the brutal killing of her husband and son can certainly not be expected to forget the face of the person who was instigating the mob to carry out the said killings and looting and her deposition in court fortifies her stand that it is accused who was not only present during the alleged incident but also instigating and leading the mob which resulted in commission of the aforesaid offences?

The judge rejected Kumar's argument that the statement of the complainant couldn't be trusted as she named him belatedly and held at the time of the incident, she was not aware of the identity of the accused as she was admittedly new to the area and had never seen him earlier.

## **Farmers' Protest Completes One Year: Mahapanchayat at Khanauri Calls for Unity**

### MONIKA MALIK **–** CHANDIGARH

A<sup>s</sup> the farmers' protest at Punjab-Haryana's Shambhu and Khanauri borders marks its first anniversary under the 'Delhi Chalo Andolan 2.0', thousands of farmers assembled at Khanauri for a massive Mahapanchayat on Wednesday, reaffirming their commitment to the movement and emphasizing the need for unity ahead of crucial talks with the Central Government on February 14. The Mahapanchayat witnessed fiery speeches from farmer leaders, with Jagjit Singh Dallewal — on a hunger strike for 78 days - making an emotional appeal for stronger government intervention to support deported youth and secure a legal guarantee for minimum support price (MSP). Dallewal linked the grow

ing wave of deportations to the deepening employment crisis, stating that over 30 Punjabis were among the 104 Indians deported by the United States recently, and warned that 200 more young individuals face deportation in the coming days. He stressed that only a robust agricultural sector with legally backed MSP can provide sustainable employment and prevent forced migration. Calling out both the Punjab and Central Governments for their indifference, he urged the authorities to rehabilitate deported youth instead of abandoning them.

Amidst the ongoing protest, farmer leader Baldev Singh Sirsa suffered a heart attack at the Khanauri border and was rushed to Rajindra Hospital, Patiala. Meanwhile, BKŰ (Ekta Sidhupur) leader Charanjit Singh Kala succumbed to injuries from a road accident caused by a stray animal, highlighting the challenges faced by protestors camping at the borders.

With the movement entering a critical phase, farmer leaders have outlined a three-step strategy strengthening unity through discussions with Samyukt Kisan Morcha (SKM), presenting their demands before the Central Government on February 14, and preparing

for a massive march to Delhi on February 25 if negotiations fail. The coming days will determine the future course of the farmers' struggle, as pres-sure mounts on the government to address their longstanding demands. Mahapanchayat at Khanauri

The event, which saw participation from farmer unions across states, underscored the demand for a legal guarantee of MSP, resolution of pending farmer issues, and a call for government intervention to rehabilitate deported youth, among others. The Mahapanchayat at

Khanauri was a defining moment in the ongoing farmers' agitation, with leaders emphasizing the need for "unity" among different factions of the protest movement. Farmer leader Dallewal, who addressed the gathering from his trolley, urged the farmers to stay steadfast in their fight. In his emotional speech,

Dallewal raised serious concerns about the growing issue of youth deportation, linking it directly to the agrarian crisis and unemployment in India. Blaming the lack of job opportunities in India for forcing the youth to migrate, he said: "If agriculture is a profitable sector, our youth wouldn't be leaving their homeland. The government needs to secure legal MSP for all crops under Dr Swaminathan's C2+50 formula. Only then will farming become a viable career option, reducing the need for migration," Dallewal

He also accused both the Punjab and Central Governments of failing to support the deportees, calling it a shameful act of neglect". He urged the authorities to provide rehabilitation and employment opportunities for those being forced to return, ensuring that they are not left helpless.

The farmer leaders also made a passionate appeal to the public, urging more people to join the movement. They emphasized that this is not just a farmers' protest, but a fight for the economic stability of the nation. "If the government fails to act now, it will not just be farmers who suffer —the entire ernment into action

economy will feel the impact. We are fighting for every young individual who dreams of a better future in this country," Dallewal said, his voice frail but resolute.

### **Farmers Prepare for Critical** Talks with Centre on Feb 14 With tensions escalating,

farmer leaders are now focused on the upcoming meeting with the Central Government on February 14. The meeting, scheduled to take place in Chandigarh's Sector 26, is expected to discuss key demands, including legal guarantee of MSP for all crops under the Swaminathan Commission's recommendations; debt waiver for farmers; withdrawal of cases registered against protestors during the 2020-21 farmers' agitation; implementation of crop diversification policies to ensure sustainable farming; and compensation for farmers affected by floods and natural

calamities. Dallewal has instructed farmer leaders to thoroughly study all aspects of the negotiation to avoid any missteps. The leaders aim to present a well-researched, data-backed argument before the govern-ment, ensuring their demands are addressed effectively.

"We cannot afford to be unprepared. This is a battle for our rights, for our future, and for the dignity of Indian farmers. The government must understand that we are not going to back down," said Kisan Mazdoor Morcha convener and senior farmer leader Sarwan Singh Pandher, echoing the determination of protestors

In case the February 14 talks fail to produce a breakthrough, farmers have already chalked out their next course of action. "We will continue to hold meetings with Samyukt Kisan Morcha (SKM) and other factions to ensure a unified stance. In case, the government fails to meet our demands, we will intensify the agitation across Punjab and Haryana," said Pandher.

As a last resort, the protestors are prepared to march towards Delhi on February 25, similar to the 2020-21 movement, to pressurize the gov-

### Farmer Unity Talks Remain Inconclusive Ahead of Key Meeting with Centre

Efforts to forge unity among Punjab's farmer unions suffered a setback on Wednesday as the third round of talks between Samvukt Kisan Morcha (SKM) and Kisan Mazdoor Manch (KMM) remained inconclusive due to the absence of the Jagjit Singh Dallewal-led SKM (Non-Political)

The three-hour-long meeting, held in Chandigarh, saw both SKM and KMM agreeing on the need to synchronize their protests and fight jointly for farmers' demands. However, no final agreement could be reached without the participation of Dallewal's faction, which has been leading a separate protest at the Khanauri border for the past year.

Dallewal, convener of SKM (Non-Political), has been on an indefinite hunger strike at Khanauri since November 26, demanding a legal guarantee for MSP and other farmer-related issues. KMM leaders will now take up the unity proposal with Dallewal's faction before the crucial February 14 meeting with the Centre, aimed at break ing the deadlock.

### **Baldev Sirsa Faces Cardiac Issues, Another Farmer** Leader Dies

The Mahapanchayat also witnessed moments of distress, as farmer leader Baldev Singh Sirsa suffered cardiac issue during the mahapanchayat. He was immediately rushed to Rajindra Hospital, Patiala, where he is currently under treatment. This is the second time in a month that Sirsa has suffered the cardiac issues, yet he remained committed to the movement, refusing to abandon his fellow protestors.

In a separate tragic incident, BKU (Ekta Sidhupur) leader Charanjit Singh Kala succumbed to injuries sustained in a road accident. Kala was traveling back from PGI Chandigarh after receiving medical treatment when a stray animal suddenly appeared in front of his vehicle, causing a fatal crash. He was 48 years old and left behind a grieving family, including a 19-year-old son and a 21-year-old daughter.

## Anil Vij submits his reply to show-cause notice to BJP high command for breaching party discipline

Haryana Minister Anil Vij On Wednesday submitted his reply to show-cause notice to the BJP high command for allegedly breaching party discipline through his public state-ments against Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini and state party chief Mohan Lal Badoli. Vij, BJP's senior most MLA

in the state, was earlier issued a show-cause notice by the Haryana unit of BJP for allegedly breaching party discipline through his public statements against CM and state party chief Badoli. The Minister, who holds the Number two position in the Nayab Singh Saini government, was asked to respond within three days. A seven-

time MLA, he said, "I have sent an eight-page reply to the show-cause notice given to him by the party state president.

Speaking to Reporters in Ambala, Vij said, "I had gone to Bengaluru for three days. I returned yesterday night

(Tuesday) and then went home (Ambala) where I took a bath with cold water and ate chap-

atis. Then, I wrote my reply." Vij further said, "I was asked to give my reply within three days and I have submitted my reply in time. Before I got the hard copy of the notice, it was already in the media." Vij, however, refused to share the details of his reply. "I have told the party that if it wants to get a reply on any other issue, then I will give them," he said.

The senior BJP leader also raised questions over the showcause notice being leaked in the media and said it was a matter of investigation. The notice, issued by Badoli on the directions of the national party president, accuses Vij of making "serious allegations that are

against the party's policy and internal discipline".

In the show-cause notice, Badoli had said, "You (Vij) are informed that recently you have given statements in public against the Chief Minister and state party president. These are serious allegations and it is against the party's policies and internal discipline".

The notice further stated, "Your step was not only against the BJP's ideology, but was also taken at a time when the party was campaigning for elections in a neighbouring state (Delhi). You knew that such statements made during the elections despite holding a respectable ministerial post would damage the party's image. Such an act is completely unacceptable."

This arrest is a significant breakthrough in the case, which has already seen seven government officials and 16 private individuals arrested. So far, the VB has recovered Rs 86 crore, and with the latest developments, the total recovery is expected to cross Rs 100 crore.

He then conspired with the prime accused Bhupinder Singh, a resident of Bakarpur, to falsely declare the presence of mature, fruit-bearing guava orchards on the land, making it eligible for higher compensation. To ensure the fraudulent

claim was successful, Sukhdev Singh and Bhupinder Singh bribed the concerned Horticulture Development Officer, who falsely recorded the trees as being over three years old. This made them elible for maximum comp tion under government rules, allowing them to siphon off crores of rupees from the Greater Mohali Area Development Authority (GMADA). To cover their tracks, the accused destroyed the original Khasra Girdawari (2016-2021) of Bakarpur village, and replaced it with a forged register in 2019. This was done with the help of revenue patwari Bachittar Singh, who manipulated official land records to falsely reflect that well-established guava orchards existed on the land.

records, Sukhdev Singh and his wife Harbinder Kaur fraudulently received Rs 2.40 crore (Rs 2,40,96,442) and Rs 9.57 crore (Rs 9,57,86,642), respectively, from the GMADA's Land Acquisition Collector (LAC).

After receiving the com-pensation, Sukhdev Singh attempted to launder the fraudulently obtained money by transferring land to Bhupinder Singh at undervalued rates. In 2022, he sold approximately six bighas of land in Chappar Chiri, SAS Nagar, and 32 Kanals in Kailon village — both at significantly reduced prices, to Singh as part maer their criminal agreement to share the illicit funds. With Sukhdev Singh's arrest and the expected recovery of Rs 12 crore, the total amount retrieved in the Guava Orchard Scam is expected to reach Rs 100 crore. So far, Rs 86 crore has already been deposited by other accused individuals. The VB has already arrested seven government officials and 16 private individuals, and further investigations are ongoing. The Bureau is now focusing on identifying other officials and middlemen who facilitated the scam, ensuring that all culprits are brought to justice.

### Punjab's Fisheries Sector Sees Major Growth, Over 14-cr High-Quality Fish Seedlings Produced Annually vesting.

### PNS CHANDIGARH

Punjab's Fisheries sector has witnessed remarkable growth with the implementation of various initiatives aimed at enhancing fish production and aquaculture development, said the state Animal Husbandry, Dairy Development and Fisheries Minister Gurmeet Singh Khudian on Wednesday. He said that government-run Fish Seed Farms are producing over 14 crore high-quality fish seedlings annually, which are being provided to farmers at subsidized rates to boost the industry.

The Minister highlighted that 16 Government Fish Seed Farms, 11 fish feed mills, and seven laboratories are actively supporting fish farmers in the state. He revealed that fish seedling production increased to 14.74 crore by December 2024, compared to 13.90 crore

in 2023. Punjab currently has 43,973 acres under fish farming, with an annual production of 1,81,188 tonnes of fish from

natural waters, private, and panchayati ponds. Encouraging the state's youth and women to take up

fisheries as a profession, Khudian stated that financial assistance ranging from 40 percent to 60 percent of unit costs has been provided for various projects. So far, over Rs 27 crore has been granted to more than 500 beneficiaries under schemes supporting fish and shrimp farming, Recirculatory Aquaculture System (RAS), biofloc culture systems, fish feed mills, fish kiosks, and vehicle purchases for fish transport.

To ensure technical support, elementary training in fish and shrimp farming is being offered free of cost every month, along with expert guidance on pond preparation, seed stocking, fish rearing, and har-

The Minister emphasized that Punjab is committed to a "blue revolution", adopting modern aquaculture techniques and strengthening infrastructure to increase fish production and improve farmers' incomes. The establishment of

a new Government Fish Seed Farm in Killian Wali (Fazilka district) and a retail fish market in Ghalauri (Patiala district) are key steps towards this goal.

Khudian also acknowledged the achievements of six outstanding fish and shrimp farmers from Punjab, who were felicitated by the Fisheries Department (GoI) on Republic Day in New Delhi, recognizing their contributions to the sector's development.

Urging more farmers to embrace fisheries as a profitable allied occupation, the minister reiterated the state government's commitment to making Punjab a leader in aquaculture and sustainable fish production .

### Punjab Police's SIT intensifies crackdown against travel agents, Total 10 FIRs

Stepping up its efforts against fraudulent immigration networks, the Punjab Police's Special Investigation Team (SIT) has registered two more FIRs against travel agents accused of deceiving individuals with false promises of illegal entry into the United States. With this, the total number of FIRs in the crackdown has reached 10, marking a significant escalation in the campaign against human trafficking and immigration fraud.

The latest FIRs — both registered on February 11, 2025 were registered at the NRI Police Station in Hoshiarpur. The accused in the first case include Jaskaran Singh, Mahinder Singh, Hardev Kaur, and Sujan Singh — all residents of Tahli in Tanda, Hoshiarpur district. The second FIR names agent Happy of Tanda, Hoshiarpur; and agent Gill of Tarn Taran. They face charges under the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and the Emigration Act for their alleged involvement in sending people abroad illegally, resulting in deportations and financial losses for their victims.

The SIT, led by ADGP added. ADGP Sinha said that both

NRI Affairs Praveen Sinha, has been gathering evidence from deportees who were misled by unscrupulous travel agents. Many of these victims were promised smooth passage to the US but instead found themselves stranded, detained, or deported after spending lakhs of rupees on fraudulent arrangements. The police have recorded multiple statements from deportees and their families to build a strong case against the accused.

The state DGP Gaurav Yadav reaffirmed the Punjab Police's commitment to dismantling fraudulent immigration networks that exploit vul-nerable individuals. "We are fully committed to taking stringent action against all travel agents engaged in illegal immigration rackets. Public cooperation is crucial in identifying and

arresting these culprits," he said. DGP Yadav also urged citizens to verify the credentials of immigration agents before making payments and to report suspicious activities to the authorities. "We need to raise awareness so that others do not fall prey to these fraudulent immigration consultants," he

the NRI Affairs Wing and district police are working in close coordination to ensure swift action against those named in the FIRs. "We are examining all forward and backward linkages to dismantle the entire network of illegal immigration," he said, indicating that more arrests and FIRs could follow in the coming days. The Punjab Police has

issued a strong advisory, urg-ing aspiring migrants to seek legal avenues for immigration. Officials have warned against trusting unauthorized agents who operate without licenses and manipulate unsuspecting individuals with false promises of work permits, asylum status, or easy access to the US and other countries.

The crackdown comes in the wake of a larger probe initiated in late 2024, when the Punjab Police's NRI Affairs Wing and Cyber Crime Wing, in collaboration with the Protectorate of Emigrants, Chandigarh, booked 43 travel agencies for illegally advertising overseas job opportunities on social media without the required licenses.

## India, France to develope modern nuclear reactors

India and France on Wednesday expressed an intent to jointly develop modern nuclear reactors, emphasising that nuclear power was crucial for energy security and transition to a low-carbon economy.

The two countries signed a let-ter of intent on Small Modular Reactors (SMRs) and Advanced Modular Reactors (AMRs), according to a joint statement issued after Prime Minister Narendra Modi met French President Emmanuel Macron in Paris.

"Prime Minister Modi and President Macron stressed that nuclear energy is an essential part of the energy mix for strengthening energy security and transitioning towards a low-carbon economy," according to the statement.

SMRs are compact nuclear fission reactors that can be manufactured in factories and then installed elsewhere. They typically have a smaller capacity than conventional nuclear reactors.

The two leaders also acknowledged the strong civil nuclear ties between India and France and efforts in cooperation on the peaceful uses of nuclear energy,

dum of understanding between India's Department of Atomic and France's Energy Commissariat a l'Energie Atomique et aux Energies Alternatives of France, concerning cooperation with the Global Center for Nuclear Energy Partnership (GCNEP). Both the nations agreed to enhance collaboration in training and education for nuclear professionals. Later on Wednesday, Modi is scheduled to meet US President Donald Trump, with nuclear power expected to be among the

topics of discussion. India aims to generate 100 gigawatts of nuclear energy by 2047 as part of its transition to clean energy. Earlier this month, the government announced plans to launch a Nuclear Energy Mission with a budget of Rs 20,000 crore to support research and development of SMRs. As part of the initiative, India plans to operationalise at least five indigenously developed SMRs by 2033. To enable private sector participation, the government is considering amendments to the Atomic Energy Act and the Civil Liability for Nuclear Damage Act.

At present, nuclear power plants contribute 1.8 per cent of India's total installed power capacity of 462 gigawatts and around 3 per cent of total electricity generation. This helps save around 41 million tonnes of carbon dioxide annually.

## Yunus Govt in the crosshair

Bangladesh army shifts away from the Yunus Government as it calls for stronger ties with India amid chaos and downward slide

n angladesh is currently facing a period of political uncertainty and unrest as the government led by Muhammad Yunus finds itself increasingly at odds with the D country's powerful military establishment. The recent statements made by General Waker-uz-Zaman, the Chief of Army Staff, at the Dhaka International Marathon 2025, indicate a significant shift in the military's stance towards the civilian government. His emphasis on peace, stability and international cooperation-particularly with Indiasuggests growing dissatisfaction within the army ranks regarding the Yunus administration's policies and governance approach. The military in Bangladesh has historically played a crucial role in maintaining internal stability, often stepping in when political crises spiral out of control. With political tensions escalating under the Yunus government, the army appears to be distancing itself from the administration, signalling a potential realignment in the country's power dynamics. Several factors seem to be driving



the military's dissatisfaction with the Yunus government. This indicates the military's concerns over the deteriorating economic conditions and increasing social divisions under Yunus's leadership. Persistent political unrest could be damaging to foreign investments and economic growth, both of which are essential for national development.

The military appears to be worried about governance inefficiencies and security concerns, especially as political violence and mass protests become more frequent. The Yunus government's inability to control these disruptions may be viewed as a failure to ensure stability, a key concern for the army. Bangladesh's military

leadership values strong bilateral relations with key regional powers. General Waker's remarks about India underscore the army's desire for a pragmatic foreign policy approach that prioritises stability and mutual benefits rather than ideological stances or populist rhetoric. General Waker-uz-Zaman's statement emphasising India as an important neighbour and a key partner in regional security and economic cooperation suggests a strategic recalibration in Bangladesh's foreign policy. His remarks that Bangladesh "depends on India in many matters" and that both countries should respect each other's strategic interests signal a clear endorsement of closer ties with New Delhi. India and Bangladesh share deep economic linkages, including trade, energy cooperation and infrastructure projects. A stable relationship with India ensures continued economic growth and regional connectivity. Cooperation in counterterrorism efforts and border management is crucial for maintaining peace and stability. Bangladesh's military leadership might be viewing stronger ties with India as a means to maintain a balanced foreign policy, ensuring that Dhaka does not become overly reliant on any single regional power. the balance of power between the civilian leadership and the military will be crucial in determining the country's direction in the coming months.

# The MBA dilemma: Why degrees alone no longer guarantee success

Once considered a guaranteed gateway to lucrative careers, the MBA is under scrutiny as unemployment rates rise—even among graduates from elite institutions



he job market for MBA grad-uates has reached a critical juncture, sparking conversations that resonate with a growing number of aspirants and professionals grappling with the changing realities of employment. Once seen as a surefire ticket to high-paying corporate roles, the MBA degree is scrutinised for relevance in an evolving economic landscape. This issue is not confined to India alone; even graduates from elite institutions like Harvard, Stanford, and Wharton feel the squeeze. The Wall Street Journal recently reported that in 2024, 23 per cent of Harvard Business School's MBA graduates were jobless. Other top-tier business schools like Stanford and Wharton have seen similar dips, with unemployment rates hovering around 20 per cent.

The problem is not just limited to the United States. According to the International Labour Organisation's Global Employment Trends for Youth 2024, 13 per cent of the global youth labour force was unemployed in 2023a staggering figure representing nearly 65 million people. This unsettling trend makes traditional, generalist MBA degrees less appealing than targeted skill certifications. A recent Forbes report highlighted how some MBA graduates have succeeded by lowering their expectations and opting for less conventional roles. In an era where industries are shifting dynamically, the rigid, cookie-cutter MBA model is struggling to keep pace. The need for a 360-degree reimagination of this degree has never been more press-Degrees Alone Won't Cut It Anymore One fundamental truth is becoming evident: degrees alone no longer guarantee job or entrepreneurship security. The future belongs to professionals who continuously upskill and adapt to meet the ever-changing demands of the workforce. What used to be a clear, structured career trajectory for MBA graduates-typically leading to consulting, finance, or management roles-is now blurred. The stark reality is that a prestigious qualification, while valuable, no longer provides

immunity against unemployment or underemployment. Even more telling is the global shift in job seekers' mindsets. While travelling to Canada, I recently observed an MBA graduate running a salon branded "MBA Barber Shop." This reflects an important realitymany skilled gig jobs are vital for holistic growth, but traditional academic pathways have often dis-missed such careers as unworthy. Yet, most developed nations respect one's skills rather than qualifications or family background. We must ask: Why does-n't Indian society do the same? Skill Respect Over Degree Prestige

The changing job landscape demands a fundamental shift in how we perceive employment, education, and career success. Skill acquisition is about individuals learning new competencies and families being sensitised to alter-native career paths. It is about communities understanding the implications of an evolving job market. It is about cities and regions acknowledging and respecting those who possess the skills necessary to sustain a livelihood, irrespective of whether they hold an MBA or a B.Tech degree. The MBA has been a gateway to professional and financial success for decades. However, the economy's evolution demands a departure from this narrow thinking. In India and many other countries, social conditioning has led to an unspoken hierarchy of professions. White-collar corporate roles are celebrated, while vocational or blue-collar jobs are often overlooked. This mindset is outdated and damaging in a world where adaptability and skills matter more than mere academic credentials. A 360-Degree Skills Revolution What we need now is a complete rethinking of education and skill development. The traditional MBA

must evolve from a broad-spectrum business degree into a dynamic, skills-focused program that integrates emerging industry trends. A 360-degree approach should include everything from finance to marketing and HR.

MBA programmes must incorporate niche skills such as data analytics, digital transformation, sustainability management and entre-preneurship in beauty-wellness, the most emerging sector. Instead of theoretical coursework, there should be a stronger focus on apprenticeships, live projects and problem-solving in real-world business scenarios.

Understanding AI, automation, and emerging technologies should be a core part of the curriculum to prepare graduates for future-ready roles. Rather than treating entrepreneurship as an alternative, business schools should actively promote and equip students with the skills to start and sustain their ventures. Business schools must recoga chef, a salon owner or a renewable energy technician, they should be seen as pioneers, not failures. The Need for Institutional Change

Educational institutions must move beyond outdated frameworks and align themselves with industry demands. Business schools should foster adaptive thinking, preparing students for unconventional but lucrative career paths. The focus should be on problem-solving, digital proficiency, and entrepre-neurial agility rather than rigid academic theories.

Governments and industries should also contribute by incentivising skill-based education. Scholarships, subsidies, and awareness campaigns can help shift societal perspectives on what constitutes a respectable and rewarding career.

## Investigators file criminal complaints against Duterte

Manila (PTI): Philippine gov-ernment investigators filed criminal complaints, includ-ing sedition, against Vice President Sara Duterte on Wednesday over her public threat to have the president assassinated if she herself was killed in an escalating politikilled in an escalating political storm.

Bureau National Investigation Director Jaime Santiago said at a news conference that the complaints of inciting to sedition and grave threats against Duterte were filed at the Department of Justice, which would decide whether to dismiss the com-plaints outright or elevate

The vice president's father himself, whose presidential term ended in 2022, is facing legal troubles. 

## Relatives of Israeli hostages terrified as Gaza ceasefire teeters

A fter 16 months of excruciat-finally received word this week that her 24-year-old son, a hostage in Gaza, is still alive. She said she fainted upon hearing the brutal details of his captivity from freed hostages who had been held with him by Hamas since October 7, 2023. Bound by chains in an under-ground tunnel, Alon Ohel has subsisted on a piece of bread or less each day. "He hasn't seen sunlight in 493 days," she told reporters on Monday. As the fragile ceasefire between Israel and Hamas seems increasingly at risk of falling apart — Hamas says it will not free three hostages on Saturday as planned, and Israel says it's ready to resume the war if it doesn't — families of the hostages are struggling to main-PD(1476)C tain hope. They are pleading with

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu not to give up on the ceasefire framework, and to speed up the timeline of releases if possible. Their worries about the ceasefire collapsing have been exacerbated by President Donald Trump's demand that all of the hostages be freed by Saturday — and his insistence that Gaza be emptied of all Palestinians and redeveloped as a tourist enclave controlled by the United States. The emaciated state of three hostages released last Saturday has infuriated Israelis and terrified families of the remaining hostages, especially as more details come out about the conditions of their captivity. The situation is especially difficult for relatives of hostages who are not on the list of 33 hostages expected to be released in the ceasefire's first, six-week phase, which began on January Cohen's fiancée, Ziv Abud, 27, 19.The agreement requires Israel told reporters on Tuesday.

"It breaks my heart to know he was chained and to know what happened to him in the tunnels from people in the tunnels,"

The returned hostages said that Cohen had lost more than 20 kilograms (44 pounds) and had a bullet in his leg that did not receive medical attention. While they were with him, Cohen was unaware that Abud had survived the Hamas attack on the bomb shelter where they were hiding. During the October 7 attack militants tossed grenades and sprayed bullets inside the concrete bomb shelter near the music festival, where almost 30 people had crammed inside. At least 16 people inside the shelter were killed. Abud said she was protected by the crush of bodies above her. For families of hostages who are not scheduled for release in the first phase of the ceasefire, its uncertainty is even more difficult to bear.

## Germany extends border controls by six months

**Berlin (PTI):** Germany's outgo-ing government on Wednesday extended by six months the border checks it imposed on all its frontiars last fall as it its frontiers last fall as it attempts to cut the number of migrants arriving in the country, an issue that has become a top issue in the campaign for the February 23 election.

Chancellor Olaf Scholz said his government notified the European Union's executive commission of the extension to September 15. "With the border controls, we are pushing irregular migration down suc-cessfully. The figures prove this," he said.Germany turned back 47,000 people back at its borders, seeing one-third fewer asylum requests year-on-year and arresting 1,900 smugglers. The country was already controlling its borders with Poland, the Czech Republic, Austria and Switzerland before it

extended the checks last September to its remaining borders, with France, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Belgium and Denmark. The EU has a visa-free travel

area known as Schengen that allows citizens of most member states to travel easily across borders for work and pleasure. Switzerland also belongs to Schengen although it is not an

EU member. According to the EU, member states are allowed to temporarily reintroduce border controls in cases of a serious threat, like internal security.

But it also says border controls should be applied as a last resort in exceptional situations, and must be limited in time. German opposition leader Friedrich Merz, the front-runner in the election, wants to go further than the current government.



# **New tax bill introduces Tax** Year, omits Assessment Year

### PTI 📕 NEW DELHI

The simplified Income Tax bill 2025, which brings in the concept of 'tax year' and abolishes the archaic and complicated terms 'previous' and 'assessment years', is likely to be introduced in Parliament on Thursday.

The bill comprises 536 sections 23 chapters and 16 schedules in just 622 pages. It does not bring in any new taxes, but only simplifies the language of the existing Income Tax Act, 1961. The six-decade old legislation has 298 sections and 14 schedules. It had 880 pages when the Act was introduced. The new bill seeks to replace the Income Tax Act, 1961 which has become too voluminous due to the amendments made over the last 60 years. The new

'explanations or provisos', thereby making it easier to read and comprehend. Also, the word 'notwithstanding', which was used excessively in the Income Tax Act, 1961, has been done

with the term 'irrespective'.

The bill uses shorter sentences and has been made reader friendly with the use of tables and formulae. Tables have been provided for provisions relating to TDS, presumptive taxation salaries, and deductions for bad away with in the new bill and debt . The 'Taxpayer's Charter almost everywhere replaced has been included in the bill which outlines the rights and

obligations of the taxpayers. The bill replaces the term previous year' as mentioned in the Income Tax Act, 1961 with 'tax year'. Also, the concept of assessment year has been done away with. Currently, for income earned in the previous year (say 2023-24), tax is paid in assessment year (say 2024-25).

previous vear and assessment year (AY) concept has been removed and only tax year under the simplified bill has been brought in.

Once introduced in the Lok Sabha likely on Thursday, the Bill will be sent to the Parliamentary Standing Parliamentary Committee on Finance for further deliberations.

The Statement of Objects and Reasons of the new I-T bill said that the Income-tax Act passed in 1961 has been subjected to numerous amendments since its passage 60 years ago. these

"As a result of amendments the basic structure of the Income-tax Act has been overburdened and language has become complex, increasing cost of compliance for taxpayers and hampering efficiency of direct-tax administration," it said. Tax administrators, practitioners and taxpayers had also raised concerns about the complicated provisions and structure of the Income Tax act.

United States (US) President Donald Trump is taking additional action to upset the world trade system, with plans to sign an order as soon as Wednesday that would require that US tariffs on imports match the tax rates charged by other countries. "It's time to be reciprocal,"

Trump said earlier this week. "You'll be hearing that word a lot. Reciprocal. If they charge us, we charge them. The president had suggested

that the order would come on Tuesday or Wednesday. But when Tuesday passed without the tariffs being officially announced, Trump was asked if he would sign the order on Wednesday and Trump answered: "We'll see what happens."

As Trump has unleashed a series of tariffs after being in power for less than a month, he has fully taken ownership of the path of the US economy.

It's a bet that his economic ideas can eventually deliver meaningful results for voters,

even if by Trump's own admission the import taxes the 1890s when taxes on imports were government's could involve some financial dominant pain in the form of inflation source of revenues.

> But should job gains never materialise and should inflation stay high, it's an easy line of attack for Democratic lawmakers and candidates that Trump helped the ultrawealthy at the expense of the middle class.

'No matter which way you slice it, costs are going to climb for consumers," Senate Democratic leader Chuck Schumer of New York said earlier this month. "I will work with my colleagues to undo this mess, get costs down and get these billionaires out of the way.'

Trump put 10 per cent tariffs on China over its contributions to the production of the illicit drug fentanyl, and China has taken retaliatory measures. ouble Olympic medallist Manu Bhaker finished second in women's 25m pistol in her return to competitive shooting after Paris Olympics as Rhythm Sangwan emerged winner in the event on day five of the Rifle/Pistol National Selection Trials (Group A) here on Wednesday.

Paris Olympics bronze medallist Swapnil Kusale and Arya Rajesh Borse also won the men's 50m rifle 3 positions (3P) T1 and the women's 10m air rifle T2 events at Dr Karni Singh Shooting range (DKSSR) here. Haryana's Rhythm beat Bhaker -who won a bronze each in the women's individual and mixed team events in the Paris Olympics -- for the top spot after a couple of shootoffs from the final group that had four other Olympians in the fray.

Swapnil was next, a class apart in the men's 3P T1 final, while Borse registered a memorable triumph in a high-quality high scoring women's air rifle T2 final, falling just one short of the world record score achieved at the same venue.

Rhythm wins via shoot-off Manu has been relentless in her first competition after the Paris Games, topping the women's 25m pistol



294 in the second rapid-fire qualifying round in the morning giving her a total of 591. Punjab's Simranpreet Kaur Brar, among the most consistent shooters in recent times in the event, was second with 588.

## Saint-Etienne fans banned from French league game

### PTI PARIS

Saint-Etienne supporters bave been banned by French authorities from traveling to Marseille for this weekend's Ligue 1 game between the two clubs with the biggest fan bases in France.

In an order published Wednesday, France's interior ministry said there is a "real and serious risk of confrontation" between the rival fans.

Second-placed Marseille takes on struggling Saint-Etienne at the Stade Velodrome on Saturday. While Marseille vs. Paris

Saint-Germain remains the biggest match in French soccer, and is known as "Le Classique," Saint-Etienne and Marseille have a special rivalry of their own. They were the two most decorated clubs in French football before PSG started its dominance after Oatari investors took over in 2011.

Saint-Etienne — which has 10 league titles to its name, one more than Marseille dominated French football during the 1960s and '70s. Mediterranean club Marseille

became one of Saint-Etienne's strongest rivals after regaining a spot in the topflight in 1966. Marseille, still the only French club to win the Champions League (in 1993), finished runner-up behind "Les Verts" in 1970 and won its first title in 23 years ahead of Saint-

Etienne in 1971. Although their rivalry softened eventually with Saint-Etienne's sporting decline, both clubs still enjoy the support of a national fan base and their matchups are always intense.

Off the field, relations between Marseille and Saint-Etienne fans have been marked by animosity for decades.

Justifying its decision to ban away fans at the Velodrome,

the interior ministry said "this strong antagonism has on several occasions led to serious clashes requiring the intervention of the police, some of whose members have been injured, and to the throwing of missiles and the lighting of fireworks."

In March 2024, Saint-Etienne fans ambushed Marseille fans on a motorway and threw stones at their bus convoy. In response, Marseille supporters got off their bus to attack a Saint-Etienne supporter who had reportedly announced

their arrival. Marseille is second in the French league, 10 points behind runaway leader PSG. After 21 matches, Saint-Etienne is languishing in 16th

place in the 18-team league.

Algerian boxer Imane Khelif says she has 'never stayed down'

The IBA said this week it will file criminal complaints against the International Olympic Committee in the U.S., France and Switzerland. The Swissbased IOC allowing female boxers Khelif and Lin Yu-ting to compete and win gold medals in Paris last year "may serve as grounds for criminal prosecution," the IBA claimed. Khelif responded by saying she "will take all necessary legal steps to ensure that my rights and the principles of fair competition are upheld." "Those responsible of these actions must be held accountable, and we will pursue all available legal avenues to ensure that justice prevails," she added. The Russian-led IBA has been banished from the Olympics but it cited an executive order on transgender athletes by United States President Donald Trump to justify the criminal complaints.

## India thrashes England by 142 runs, sweeps series 3-0

robust batting show led by the Shubman **L** Gill's attractive century heralded India's 142-run hammering of England in the third and final ODI as the hosts completed a dominant 3-0 clean sweep to culminate preparations for the Champions Trophy, here on Wednesday. India ticked all the

remaining boxes with vicecaptain Gill (112) following up his twin fifties earlier in the series with a seventh ODI ton of his career while middle-order mainstays Virat Kohli (52) and Shreyas Iyer (78) pushed India to a formidable 356 in the first half.

Indian bowlers then took over the mantle to complete the England demolition job, bundling out the visitors for a mere 214 in 34.2 overs to complete a comprehensive victory - their second largest in ODIs in terms of runs against a familiar opponent.

There was no change in the script for English, who came crashing down against spin after a sparkling start against pace, which was provided by the pair of Ben Duckett (34) and Phil Salt (24) in tow.



Kohli made the most of a juicy overpitched delivery from Mark Wood which he drove through the covers for his first four, then got on top of the ball from Saqib Mahmood to swat it for another boundary through mid-wicket and punished the England pacer for being wayward as he cut him for his third four.
