Centre replies to SC on convicted MPs

The Centre has opposed in the Supreme Court (SC) a plea seeking life ban on convicted politicians, saying imposing such a disqualification was solely within the domain of the Parliament. In an affidavit, the Centre said the prayer in a plea, seeking the same, amounted to re-writing of the statute or directing the Parliament to frame a law in a particular manner which was wholly beyond the powers of judicial review. "The question whether a life-time ban would be appropriate or not is a

affidavit said. By confining the operation of penalty to an appropriate length of time, deterrence was ensured while undue harshness was avoided, it added.

There was, said the Centre, nothing inherently unconstitutional in limiting the effect of penalties by time and it was a settled principle of law that penalties were limited either by time or by quantum.

In its affidavit, the Centre underlined the apex court had consistently held that the legislative choice over one option or the other couldn't be questioned in courts over its efficacy or otherwise.

Under Section 8 (1) of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, the period of disqualification was six years from the date of conviction or in case of imprisonment, six years from the date of release, it added.

A careful calculation of the BJP's support base seems to have been at work in the Cabinet expansion that took place a day after the party's national president chaired a meeting of the "core group" and before that PM visited Bihar for a rally and announcement of some reforms and projects. Governor Arif Mohammad Khan administered the oath of office to the new ministers

The doors of the Kedarnath temple in the Garhwal Himalayas will be reopened for devotees on May 2, after remaining closed for about six months during the winter season.

The gates will open at 7 am on May 2, as announced by Vijay Prasad Thapliyal, Executive Officer of the Shri Badrinath-Kedarnath Temple

Committee, on Wednesday With the announcement of the opening

of Kedarnath temple, the dates for the opening of all four sacred sites in the Garhwal Himalayas have now been fixed.

Badrinath Dham will open on May 4, while Gangotri and Yamunotri Dhams will open on April 30, on Akshaya Tritiya. These four sites together form the Chota Char Dham, a small

pilgrimage circuit. The auspicious hour and date for the opening of the Kedarnath temple were decided by religious gurus and Vedpathis on the occasion of Mahashivratri, after offering prayers at the Omkareshwar temple in Ukhimath, the winter abode of Baba Kedar, he said. Kejriwal plots lateral entry

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) on Wednesday named Rajya Sabha member Sanjeev Arora as its candidate for the Ludhiana West Assembly bypoll, triggering strong speculations that the seat has been vacated for the entry of AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal in Rajya Sabha. Hours after the AAP dismissed the speculations, saying the 56-year-old former Delhi chief minister would not make his way to Rajya Sabha.

The announcement was made by AAP national general secretary Sandeep Pathak in a post on X. Arora will have to resign from the Rajya Sabha if he wins the bypoll, the date for which is yet to be announced.

Arora, meanwhile, posted on X: "Humbled and grateful to the leadership @AamAadmiParty for reposing faith in me to contest the Ludhiana West by-elections. As someone deeply connected to my hometown, I look forward to serving my people dedication and sincerity."

After the loss of Delhi polls, it was believed that Keiriwal would make his Rajya Sabha entry via Arora's vacant seat. The speculations around Kejriwal began following Punjab Congress leader Partap Singh Bajwa's allegations. "Kejriwal wants to

Punjab is currently the best bet for Kejriwal after his party lost power in Delhi after a decade. Since vacating the government bungalow after resigning as chief minister last year, he has been living in Delhi at another Punjab

MP Ashok Mittal's house. Insiders say Kejriwal had met Arora in New Delhi on Tuesday and asked him to contest Ludhiana West by-elections while assuring him a key role and responsibility in the state government. If Arora contests and wins the by-election, he will have to vacate his Rajya Sabha seat. Insiders say that he could be inducted into the Bhagwant Mann Cabinet as a minister. This potential vacancy in the Upper House has fueled rumours about Kejriwal possibly replacing him. However, a final decision is likely be made only after Arora's election as an MLA.

The AAP will need to make one of them MPs resign for Kejriwal's entry. However, the AAP cannot win back the Rajva Sabha seat if a Delhi Rajya Sabha MP resigns, because the party do not have majority here.

 $S_{\text{excited}}^{\text{tudents have sounded quite}}$ changes implemented by the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) concerning the board examinations for class X students which will now be offered twice a year starting in 2026. The CBSÉ recently approved the draft policy during a meeting presided over by the Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan. Looking happy and relieved, teachers and students said in one voice that this move would open additional opportunities and alleviate the anxiety associated with board examinations.

A lecturer at Government Inter College at Buranshkhanda, Tehri Ankit Joshi said that India's current education system adheres to the 10+2+3 structure. "However, the National Educational Policy (NEP) proposes a revised framework of 5+3+3+4. This change has been introduced to alleviate the pressures associated with academic studies and the coaching culture prevalent among students. Similarly, the recent decision made by CBSE aligns with the NEP and is commendable. It will definitely yield positive outcomes in the future," he added. Joshi further said that the new policy enabling students to take board examinations twice would have the opportunity to enhance their

performance and this, in turn, would open further avenues for success. "Besides, it will help reduce stress and result in a 100 per cent success rate," he

Initially, the implementation may pose some challenges. "But if executed effectively, the process will ultimately progress smoothly," he opined. Further, a student who will appear for the board examination of class X in 2026, Shivam Bijnoi hailed the move, saying that it would lessen pressure on them. "Nothing can be better than this. CBI names Abhishek Banerjee in job scam chargesheet | India's approach to Africa based on

The political circuit in West The political circuit abuzz on Wednesday after it came to light that the CBI, in its recently submitted third supplementary chargesheet in the multi-crore cash-forschool job case, referred to an audio file of a recorded conversation from 2017 and named a certain Abhishek Banerjee who demanded ₹15 Crore for the illegal appointments.

The central agency, in the chargesheet, never clarified the identity of this Abhishek Banerjee, although the name bears exact resemblance to the name of Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's nephew and Trinamool Congress national general secretary, against whom the state's political opposition has, in the past, repeatedly alleged involvement in the scam.

The 28-page chargesheet in question, a 'certified to be true' copy of which is in possession of PTI, was filed by the CBI on February 21, indicts Sujay Krishna Bhadra alias 'Kalighater Kaku' (uncle of Kalighat) two others in connection with irregular appointments of teachers in state-run primary schools made through the selection Teachers Eligibility Test (TET), 2014. In its chargesheet, the CBI refers to a "meeting held in 2017 at Bhadra's Behala residence" where chargesheeted accused Kuntal Ghosh, Shantanu Banerjee and two others, Aurobindo Roy Barman and Surajit Chanda, were also present. The agency states that at the insistence of accused Kuntal Ghosh, his staff "Aurobindo Roy Barman had recorded the conversation on his mobile phone and later transferred the audio file to his laptop which was later recovered during investigation".

Notably, the ED, responsible for investigating alleged proceeds of crime, has not filed any chargesheet against my client, underscoring the absence of incriminating material against him," the lawyer's statement read alleged supplementary chargesheet is nothing more than a fishing expedition aimed at harassing my client.

The CBI has failed to provide a shred corroborative evidence, with no supporting documents appended to its claims. This is yet another instance of my client being unjustly targeted," the statement

Banerjee referred to the "previous failed attempt by the ED" to implicate him and hit back at the "political forces" who have now turned to the CBI for "misusing central agencies to push their agenda".

Government spent ₹400 Crore in 10 years to contest court cases

The Government has spent more than ₹400 Crore to contest court cases during the past 10 years, official data showed. The Central Government's ₹66 Crore expenditure on litigations in the 2023-24 financial year was over ₹9 Crore higher than the previous fiscal.

The amount incurred on litigations has gone up since 2014-15, barring two fiscals when the Covid pandemic was at its peak, according to data shared government with the Lok Sabha in response to a question in the ongoing Budget session.

In 2014-15, the cost incurred on litigations stood at ₹26.64 Crore while the expenditure for 2015-16 was ₹37.43 Crore. Between the 2014-15 and the 2023-24 financial years, the government spent more ₹409 than Crore on litigations. Separately, the law ministry

GainBitcoin scam: CBI seizes cryptocurrencies worth ₹23.94 Crore

The CBI has seized cryptocurrencies worth more than ₹23.94 Crore during its two-day countrywide search operation in the GainBitcoin scam case that concluded on Wednesday, officials said.

The central probe agency has also seized multiple hardware crypto wallets, 121 documents, 34 laptops and hard disks, 12 mobile phones and multiple email and instant messaging application dumps, they

"Following the nationwide searches conducted February 25 and 26 in connection with GainBitcoin cases, the Bureau Central

Investigation (CBI), using in-house capabilities, has seized significant incriminating evidence and virtual digital assets, further unravelling the extent of the cryptocurrency fraud," a spokesperson said in a statement.

The agency has sent the electronic devices for forensic analysis to uncover further details regarding the misappropriation of funds and potential international transactions linked to the scam, the officials said.

The CBI launched the search operation at 60 locations in Delhi, Pune, Nanded, Kolhapur, Mumbai, Bengaluru, Chandigarh, Mohali, Jhansi, and Hubli on Tuesday as part of its probe into the scam. The

operation concluded on Wednesday.

The ponzi scam perpetrated through a web of platforms, including flagship site www.gainbitcoin.com, was allegedly masterminded by Amit Bhardwaj (now deceased) and his brother Ajay Bhardwaj, the officials

said. Launched in 2015, the illicit operation was camouflaged under the facade of Variable Tech Pvt. Ltd, they said.

Punjab Government alleges CBSE dropped Punjabi from Class 10 exam

The Punjab government on Wednesday alleged that the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) had dropped Punjabi from the list of subjects for the Class 10 Board exams in the Class 10 Board exams in the new draft norms while the Board officials maintained that the list was only indicative and no subjects would be

dropped.
The CBSE officials clarified that the draft norms do not mention 13 other languages and reiterated that they would continue to be offered. The 13 other languages are Russian, Nepali, Limboo, Lepcha, Sindhi, Malayalam, Odia, Kannada, Assamese, Kannada, Kokborok, Telugu, Arabic and

Persian, they said.
The CBSE on Tuesday approved draft norms for conducting the Class 10 Board exams twice a year. The draft norms will now be put in the public domain and the stakeholders can submit their feed-back by March 9, following

Punjab Education Minister Harjot Singh Bains alleged that the new policy was attempting to drop Punjabi from the subjects' list and claimed that his government would not tolerate any attack on the language

"We strongly object to the CBSE's new exam pattern scheme which attempts to erase Punjabi. Punjabi must be designated as the main language in Punjab and, further, be included as a regional language for the rest of the nation as it is spoken and read across multiple states. Any attack on Punjabi will not be tolerated," Bains said in a video shared on social media.

CBSE Examination Controller Sanyam Bhardwaj, however, said there would be no change in the list of subjects. "There is no change in the list of subjects offered at present. The list in the draft policy is indicative. All subjects offered at present will continue in the Class 10 Board exams in both phases," he said. According to the draft norms,

which the policy will be Class 10 students will be able finalised. Class 10 students will be able to take the CBSE Board exam twice in an academic session or choose between the two one in February and another in May — from 2026 onwards The first phase will be held from February 17 to March 6 and the second between May 5 and 20. Candidates will also have the option to appear for

> both phases. Additionally, students will be allowed to skip specific subjects in the second attempt if they are satisfied with their performance in the first. They can skip particular subjects in the first phase as well. The National Education Policy (NEP) recommended allowing (NEP) recommended allowing all students to take exams on up to two occasions during any given school year to eliminate the "high stakes" aspect of the Board exams

both phases.

The CBSE has clarified that no separate supplementary exam would be conducted under this system. Instead, the second phase will serve as the supplementary exam for those students who want to improve

When Saxena refused to let go, the accused pushed her onto the road, inflicting injuries. An FIR was lodged at the Cantt police station, and the constables were immediately suspended. After a thorough investigation, police filed a chargesheet, leading to the court's conviction. Saxena, an IPS officer of the 2010 batch, is currently serving as a deputy inspector general (DÎG) in the Ghaziabad Police Commissionerate.

Where faith, tradition fuse: Maha Kumbh ends on note of devotion

The Maha Kumbh, billed to be the world's largest gathering, ends on Wednesday as it began 45 days ago with lakhs of devotees surging towards the waters of the Sangam, the confluence of the Ganga, Yamuna and mythical Saraswati, for a dip on the auspicious day of

Shivratri. The mega religious carnival wound to a close in a montage of images of the stampede that killed at least 30 people, the devout across every spectrum taking a dip in the belief it would cleanse their sins, huge crowds jostling not just at the Sangam but also stations and bus stands in north India and many a political slugfest over contested numbers and how

clean the waters were. According to the Uttar Pradesh government, 64.77 crore people have visited Prayagraj since January 13, a number that exceeds the populations of all countries except China and India. President Droupadi Murmu, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, top ministers and film stars were among those who went to the Kumbh. It was a gathering of the faithful and believers but also of those driven by interest in the fabled Kumbh, where religion meets culture, where spiritual-

ity and tradition fuse, and where AI and modern-day technology this time blended with ancient stories of gods and miracles. The stars were aligned too with seers claiming that celestial permutations and combinations during the event took place after 144 years. It was a massive logistical exer-

The religious fair witnessed unprecedented security measures, including anti-drone systems and AI-enabled cameras, to man the Mahakumbh Nagar's UP's makeshift 76th district set up for the event. It was spread across 40 hectares which remained abuzz with activity 24x7 over the past six

As tourists and pilgrims from distant corners began returning home and vendors, from across the country, readied to shut shop, many were seen trying to take a dip before the Kumbh finally ends. The ritual bath is at the centre of the pilgrimage. Devout Hindus believe the coveted sacred dip at the Sangam leads to 'moksha' or salvation, especially during the once-in-12-years planetary

alignments. To me, the Maha Kumbh would conclude when the last of the devotee has taken the dip. Put differently, you can say that the mela would end with

the start of the new day at 'Brahm Muhurt' or early morning on Thursday," Chidanand Saraswati, the president of Parmarth Niketan Ashram, Rishikesh, who is camping at Prayagraj, told PTI. Held every 12 years, the Maha Kumbh showcased India's age-old spiritual traditions, from the grand orocessions of akharas (monastic orders) and the ash smeared Naga sadhus, to modern techsavvy babas, all of whom camped by the Sangam banks, drawing devotees from across the globe. The akhara seers participated

in three of the total six 'snans', known as Amrit snans -Makar Sankranti (January 14) Mauni Amavasya (January 29) Basant Panchami (February 3). Though not a Amrit Snan, Maha Shivratri dip was among the last of the total six 'snans', the other two being Paush Purnima (January 13) Maaghi Purnima (February 11-12).

The second Amrit Snan on January 29 is when chaos - and tragedy — broke out. The stampede near Sangam banks, leading to 30 deaths allegedly due to overcrowding. The tragedy triggered a political slugfest with West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee slamming the Yogi Adityanathled government to say it was an

ahead of the Kumbh. Faith was the overriding factor, bypassing all considerations and apprehensions. This was apparent with the arrival of devotees like Bihar's Raushan Sah, who arrived for the dip along with his octogenarian mother and other family members. His brother was there on the day of the stampede but it mattered little.

"It was god's will so I could attend the Kumbh. I was here on Makar Sankranti day, and on the day the stampede happened," added Kirpal Singh from Jhansi.

The division between night and day blurred with pilgrims pouring into the ghat areas at all hours and vendors selling 'puja' ware while security personnel sought to manage the surge. With 'Divya Kumbh, Bhavya Kumbh, Surakshit Kumbh' as its tagline, the Kumbh was billed as a great example of security and cleanliness. Security and sanitation personnel worked round-the-

clock in multiple shifts to keep

the area safe and clean. State

officials said 37,000 police per sonnel, 14,000 home guards were deployed at Maha Kumbh for security arrangements while 2,750 AI-based CCTVs, three Jal Police stations, 18 Jal Police control rooms, 50 watchtowers were installed.

Besides large-scale security arrangements, there has been regular monitoring of the social media 24x7 to check any spread of misinformation regarding the Maha Kumbh," DIG (Kumbh) Vaibhav Krishna told PTI as he oversaw law and order throughout the mega

Disparities rising

One billion Indians have minimal purchasing power despite rapid growth says a Blume Ventures and Marcellus report

n a startling revelation about the state of the Indian economy, recent findings of a study highlight that nearly one billion Indians possess little to no spending power. According to a report by Blume Ventures— supported by insights from Marcellus Investment Managers—India's consumer market is undergoing profound structural changes, marked by deepening disparities and a shifting focus towards premium products for the wealthy. At the heart of the report is the disconcerting revelation that India's true "consuming class" is far smaller than what many might assume. The report identifies only about 130–140 million people as part of this active consumer base—roughly equivalent to the entire market of a country like Mexico. In addition, an extra 300 million Indians are categorised as 'emerging' or 'aspirant' consumers. The report underscores that India's consumer market is not broadening by adding new entrants into the wealthy segment; instead, it is deepening. In practical terms, while the overall size of the affluent popula-

tion remains relatively stagnant, the existing wealthy are growing even wealthier.

This trend of 'premiumisation' has seen brands pivot towards offering high-end, upgraded products that cater specifically to the rich. For example, ultra-luxury housing and premium smartphones are experiencing surging sales. In contrast, lower-priced alternatives are struggling. Affordable homes now represent a mere 18 per cent of the overall market. Moreover, the booming 'experience economy'—evident in the rapid sellout of high-priced concert tickets for international artists like Coldplay —further illustrates the evolving consumption pattern that favours upscale offerings over mass-

market products. A critical dimension of the report is its analysis of income inequality in India. The long-term trend of widening disparities has been stark. The top 10 per cent of Indians now control 57.7 per cent of the national income—a dramatic increase from 34 per cent in 1990. Conversely, the bottom 50 per cent have seen their share decline from 22.2 per cent to just 15 per cent. The affluent continue to prosper, while the majority of the population grapples with stagnant incomes, diminished savings, and mounting debt. The situation is particularly alarming for India's middle class. The report reveals that the middle 50 per cent of India's tax-paying population has experienced income stagnation over the past decade. The situation is alarming as financial savings are nearing a 50-year low. The insights from the report paint a sobering picture of the Indian economy. While the nation boasts rapid growth in certain sectors and an expanding base of emerging consumers, the benefits of this growth are unevenly distributed. The government must focus on strategies that not only promote growth but also ensure that economic gains are more broadly shared. Investments in education, upskilling and initiatives to revive the middle class's purchasing power will be crucial in steering India towards a more balanced and inclusive economic future.

How antibiotic-free poultry empowered a mother and her community

By raising chickens with natural remedies instead of antibiotics, women in Uttar Pradesh are safeguarding their health and boosting their incomes

¬our-month-old Angel Singh is a post-term baby. Having been born after a ten-month pregnancy, many of her family members were afraid she would be weak and sickly. But Pinky always knew her child would be healthy despite being born a month after what is considered a normal nine-month pregnancy period

Angel's weight and other health indicators at birth proved her mother right. Much of Pinky's confidence stemmed from the fact that she was regular with her antenatal checkups (ANC). She also focussed on a nutritious diet of leafy greens which she sourced from her small vegetable patch at the back of her house in Uttar Pradesh's Samsa Tarhar village in Bahraich, the second most backward district in India. As her pregnancy progressed, Pinky, a small poultry farmer, diversified her diet to include antibiotic-free eggs and poultry. This was to be a smart move.

Not only because it helped her stay healthy and increase her weight and haemoglobin levels, but more importantly, thanks to her poultry training, she was able to ensure whatever she ate was free of antibiotics. By using natural feed and herbal remedies while raising her chickens, she was able to cut the risk of developing antimicrobial resistance (AMR), a condition arising from the consumption of meat and eggs of poultry fed with antibiotics to promote quick growth and prevent diseases. Just how critical this practice



was can be gauged from the worrying fact that, in 2019, over 297, 000 deaths in India were directly attributed to AMR. Moreover, the poultry environment has been a reservoir of multi-drug resistant bacteria according to the most recent study of four poultry farms in Uttar Pradesh by the Centre for Science and Environment which found

prevention. The WHO recognizes the non-therapeutic use of antibiotics in feed and water in food-producing animals to contribute to the development of AMR in humans. Pinky realised this was possible only after she joined the backyard poultry (BYP) farming initiative to empower women and enhance food security and incomes implemented by the Aga Khan Foundation (ÅKF) under their aspirational district programme. After being trained by them in poultry farming techniques, biosecurity, and disease management using proven herbal and natural formulations to prevent the development of antibiotic resistance, Pinky, then in her second trimester of pregnanrampant use of antibiotics for cy, understood that the bene-

fits of being a poultry entrepreneur were more than just being economically empowered. "It was an opportunity to take charge of my own health and destiny and that of my unborn child," says Pinky. It is not just Pinky who is bringing

Like her, 60 women from marginalised communities in 120 villages in four blocks in Bahraich trained as poultry farmers by AKF are making a team. Yet, many died.

difference in their lives and communities through sustainable and ethical poultry farming practices after each was given 50 pre-vaccinated 21-day-old Sonali breed chicks free along with support for feeding and constructing chicken coups

It was the AKF strategy to impart rigorous, yet easy-tounderstand hands-on demonstration and training on using commonly found medicinal plants and herbs as alternatives to antibiotics that helped the women, mostly uneducated; understand the importance of adopting ethnoveterinary methods or traditional practices for treating animal health and illness. "I used to give antibiotics to keep my poultry healthy before I met the AKF

After joining their programme, I gave a health tonic of turmeric water mixed with jaggery, chirata for deworming and azola, a protein rich fern, to boost their immunity. None of my chicken fell ill," shares a Rambha Devi, a poultry farmer in village Samroha. Raghvendra Singh, AKF district coordinator, skill development, who is closely associated with the BYP programme, contends the 10 per cent mortality rate normally associated with chicks has come down to 4.5 per cent among the 3000 chicks given to AKF poultry farmers because of the luse of natural feed and traditional herbal remedies.

Consequently, almost 90 per cent of their chicken was sold and the remaining was used for home consumption. The

health of families, especially children, consuming these antibiotic-free poultry and eggs, has improved say frontline health workers working in these villages. Further, an AKF evaluation shows that each poultry farmer made a profit ranging between Rs 10,000-14,000. This success has prompted the women to invest in another 50 chicks even if it means taking a loan from their self-help group as it will no longer be given free. But this isn't stopping them, especially Pinky, who is buying 100 chicks. "The benefits

plans are being drawn up for Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy to travel to Washington to meet President Donald Trump, according to one of the Ukrainian officials.

Another official said the agreement would provide an opportunity for Zelenskyy and Trump to discuss continued military aid to Ukraine, which is why Kyiv is eager to finalise

Trump, speaking to reporters in the Oval Office, said he'd heard that Zelenskyy was coming and added that "it's okay with me, if he'd like to, and he would like to sign it together with me".

Trump called it a big deal that

could be worth a trillion dollars. "It could be whatever, but it's rare earths and other things.

According to one Ukrainian official, some technical details are still to be determined. However, the draft does not include a contentious Trump administration proposal to give the US USD 500 billion worth of profits from Ukraine's rare earth minerals as compensation for its wartime assistance to Kviv.

Instead, the US and Ukraine would have joint ownership of a fund, and Ukraine would in the future contribute 50 per cent of future proceeds from state-owned resources, including minerals, oil, and gas.

One official said the deal had better terms of investments and another one said that Kyiv secured favourable amendments and viewed the outcome as "positive".

The deal does not, however, include security guarantees. One official said that this would be something the two presidents would discuss when they meet.

The progress in negotiating the deal comes after Trump and Zelenskyy traded sharp rhetoric last week about their differences over the matter. Zelenskyy said he balked at signing off on a deal that US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent pushed during a visit to Kyiv earlier this month, and

the Ukrainian leader objected again days later during a meet ing in Munich with Vice President JD Vance because the American proposal did not include security guarantees.

Hamas will return the bodies of four dead Israeli hostages on Thursday in exchange for Israel's release of hundreds of Palestinian prisoners, the group said, just days before the first phase of the ceasefire between the warring parties was to expire. Israel has delayed the release of

some 600 Palestinian prisoners since Saturday to protest what it says is the cruel treatment of hostages during their release by Hamas. The militant group has said the delay is a "serious violation" of their ceasefire and that talks on a second phase are not possible until the Palestinians are freed.

Hamas spokesman Abdul Latif al-Qanou told The Associated Press on Wednesday that Hamas would hand over the bodies of four Israelis the next

In exchange, Israel would release the Palestinian prisoners, as well as an unspecified number of women and minors detained since the militant group's October 7, 2023 attack on Israel that sparked the con-

An Israeli official confirmed

that the bodies of four hostages were expected to be turned over but provided no further details. The official spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorized to talk to the media.

Israel and Hamas had already said on Tuesday that an agreement had been reached to return the bodies of the hostages, but no date had been announced.

Hamas has released hostages and the bodies of four dead hostages, in large public cere-monies during which the Israelis were paraded and forced to wave to large crowds. Israel, along with the Red Cross and UN officials, have said the ceremonies were humiliating to the hostages, and Israel last weekend delayed the scheduled

prisoner release in protest. The deadlock over the exchange had threatened to collapse the ceasefire when the current six-week first phase of the deal expires this weekend. The latest agreement would complete both sides' obligations of the first phase of the ceasefire — during which Hamas is returning 33 hostages, including eight bodies — in exchange for nearly 2,000 Palestinian

It also could clear the way for an expected visit this week by the White House's Mideast envoy, Steve Witkoff, to the

Macron got no promises on Ukraine but called meeting with Trump 'turning point'

PTI WASHINGTON

French President Emmanuel Macron travelled to Washington seeking to convince US President Donald Trump to stand by Europe's side in his talks with Russia about ending the war in Ukraine.

As Macron left the White House, he called the meeting a "turning point" — yet Trump made no promises.

Macron was the first European leader to visit Trump since his reelection, aiming to capitalise on their friendship to urge Trump not to "be weak" in dealing with Russian President Vladimir Putin.

Trump's recent statements that echo Putin's narrative and plans to have direct negotiations with Moscow have left European allies and Ukrainian officials worried.

Following Monday's meeting, Macron praised Trump's move towards Putin in an interview on Fox News, saying it may lead to a truce between Russia and Ukraine in the coming weeks.

'But my message was to say be careful' because we need something substantial for Ukraine," Macron said. We want peace swiftly, but we

don't want an agreement that is weak," Macron said earlier in a joint news conference with

Trump. Any deal with Russia. Macron insisted, must be able to be "assessed, checked and verified". Asked at the news conference by an Associated Press reporter what makes Trump believe he can trust Putin in negotiations about Ukraine, Trump answered, "I may be wrong, but I believe he wants to make a deal?

Macron is known for his bold diplomatic moves. In February last year, he was

the first European leader to publicly consider sending Western troops to Ukraine. In December, as he welcomed Trump to Paris to celebrate the reopening of the Notre Dame Cathedral, he hastily arranged a three-way meeting at the Elysee Palace with Ukrainian President Volodymyr

Zelenskyy. And last week, he called an emergency meeting of key EU leaders and British Prime Minister Keir Starmer — who is scheduled to meet with Trump Thursday — to insist Europeans have a say in talks to end the war in Ukraine. Macron, who came into office

in 2017, is one of the few leaders who got to know Trump during his first term. We call each other several

ple. The main shrine and the temple premises have been eloquently decorated with flowers, colourful lights, paper flags and banners, creating a stunning night-time To streamline temple visits, officials have arranged eight queues inside and four outside the tem-

Authorities have designated different routes to manage the crowd effectively.

Devotees can enter through various points such as Mitrapark, Gaushala, and Pingalasthan, with systematic queues ensuring smooth movement.

Additionally, planners have prepared a separate lane via Tilganga Ram Temple if needed. The Shivaratri Main Celebration Committee has been formed under the chairmanship of Minister for Tourism and Culture Badri Prasad Pandey to offer free meals, drinking water, and medicines to the devotees on the occasion in coordination with different organisations. Maldives Parliament passes amendment to reduce number of Supreme Court judges, suspends three

he Maldives Parliament on Wednesday passed an amendment to reduce the number of Supreme Court judges from seven to five and hours later three top judges were suspended prompting the main opposition to allege misuse of the ruling party's major-

ity.
The suspension of the judges came shortly before a hearing on a petition to quash the constitutional amendment that disqualifies MPs for changing political parties was to take place, local media reports said. A row erupted in Parliament as the main opposition Maldivian Democratic Party (MDP) accused the ruling People's National Congress (PNC) of using its absolute majority to completely disregard the concerns raised by Counsel General Fathima Filza regarding the bill.

The Parliament took the floor vote on the bill on Wednesday morning after ejecting three parliamentarians from the MDP and the bill was passed with a majority vote of 68-9, news portal Sun.mv said. "This legislative change,

according to the bill, seeks to firmed by the JSC to PSM align the judiciary more closely with the nation's constitutional principles and ensure it serves the best interests of the people," Public Service Media (PSM News), the state-run news agency, said.

"As the highest judicial authority in the Maldives, the Supreme Court wields considerable influence over the nation's legal framework," the PSM News added.

The newly passed amendment mandates that the Supreme Court bench consist of five justices, including the Chief Justice. "Additionally, the Judicial Services Commission (JSC) is now tasked with recommending the removal of any justice deemed unfit for their role, with such recommendations submitted to parliament," it said, adding, a twothirds majority vote in parliament is required to remove a

Accordingly, hours later, the Judicial Services Commission (JSC) announced the suspension of three Supreme Court justices: Justice Dr Azmiralda Zahir, Justice Mahaz Ali Zahir, and Justice Husnu Al Suood. These suspensions were conNews as "a consequence of an ongoing criminal investigation conducted by the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) pursuant to Section 25(o) of the Judicial Services Commission Act."

Earlier in November 2024, a subsection was added to Article 73 of the Constitution, specifying new conditions for the removal of MPs, prompting former Kendhoo MP Ali Hussain to petition the court to quash the amendment, news portal Adhadu.com said.

A hearing of the constitutional case was scheduled for 11:00 am on Wednesday after Ali requested the court to issue an interim order to suspend procedures for MP disqualification until a final decision is reached in the case, it added.

The justices were suspended without ratifying the new bill, the portal said, adding, "Last night, Counsel General Fathimath Filza advised that it is unfair to investigate and dismiss a judge solely for the purpose of the bill."

Opposition and legal experts have said the bill is unconstitutional and its only purpose is to exert the government's influence on the courts, it added. Sun.mv said that the amendment to the Judicature Act was submitted on Sunday night and the bill was presented, debated on and accepted into the Parliament on Tuesday.

Counsel General Filza noted that downsizing the Supreme Court's bench would mean that two justices would need to be removed. She questioned whether removing the justices without giving them a chance to defend themselves is fair, it

Filza opined that if Supreme Court justices, who the JSC has not raised competency questions regarding, are to be removed due to a legislature to downsize the court's bench, it creates a situation where the justices' competency is called into question, the news portal "The Judiciary Committee

Iran accelerates production of near weapons-grade uranium

Iran has accelerated its production of near weaponsgrade uranium as tensions between Tehran and Washington rise after the election of US President Donald Trump, a report by the United Nations' nuclear watchdog seen by The Associated Press on Wednesday showed.

The report by the Viennabased International Atomic Energy Agency said that as of Feb. 8, Iran has 274.8 kilograms of uranium enriched up to 60%. That's an increase of 92.5 kilograms since the IAEA's last report in November.

That material is a short, technical step away from weaponsgrade levels of 90%.

A report in November 2024 put the stockpile at 182.3 kilograms. It had 164.7 kilograms last August.

"The significantly increased production and accumulation of high enriched uranium by Iran, the only non-nuclear weapon State to produce such nuclear material, is of serious concern," the confidential

and Priority Matters, during his meeting with the Secretary-General on February 7 in New York, the BSS said.

In a letter to Yunus on February 25, Guterres said he shared the Bangladesh chief adviser's concerns regarding the impact of the Rohingya crisis on Bangladesh and the region, as well as the worsening humanitarian situation in Rakhine in Myanmar.

"I will continue to exercise my good offices, including through my Special Envoy on the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, to work closely with regional actors, the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) and other stakeholders, towards a political solution to the crisis in Myanmar, including creating conditions conducive to the safe and volto Rakhine," his letter read. Everyone who is in the US illegally must register, give fingerprints and provide an address, the Department of Homeland Security said in a statement. It cited a section of the Immigration and Nationality Act — the complex immigration law — as justification for the registration process, which would apply to anyone 14 and older.

New India Cooperative Bank's Prabhadevi branch had a capacity to keep ₹10 Crore at a time, but the cash in hand book showed there was ₹122.028 Crore in the safe on the day of Reserve Bank of India (RBI) inspection, police have said.

Police's Mumbai Economic Offences Wing (EOW) is conducting a probing into the embezzlement of ₹122 crore at the New India Cooperative Bank and has so far arrested three persons, including two former top executives of the lender. The RBI's inspection team

visited the corporate office branch of the bank at Prabhadevi on February 11, where they found ₹122 Crore cash was missing from the safe, an official said on Tuesday. The balance sheet at the

corporate office branch was showing ₹133.41 Crore at the bank's safe at Prabhadevi and Goregaon branches, and ₹122.028 was the figure on the balance sheet of Prabhadevi branch on that day, he said. During the probe, the EOW found the capacity of the safe at the corporate office to store cash was only ₹10 Crore, and they actually found ₹60 Lakh in

the vault.

At the Goregaon branch safe, they found ₹10.53 Crore cash on the day of the RBI inspection, according to the official.

The vault at the Goregaon branch also had a capacity to store ₹10 Crore. The EOW is now probing why

auditors looking into the bank's financial records did not raise an alarm over the missing cash from the bank, he said. Various CA firms audited the

industry Since 2014, the country has signed three such agreements with Mauritius, the UAE and Australia, and EFTA (European Free Trade Association).

India is actively negotiating similar pacts with the UK and February 24, EU. On and Industry Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal and UK Secretary of State for Business and Trade Jonathan Reynolds announced resumption of negotiations for the proposed FTA between the two countries. The India-UK negotiations are resuming after a gap of over eight months. The talks were

A free trade agreement is a pact between two or more countries to eliminate or reduce import duties on a maximum number (90-95 per cent) of goods traded between them. Vijender calls for 'fresh and fair' elections in BFI

India's first and only male boxer to have won an Olympic medal, Vijender Singh has called for "fresh and fair" elections in the crisisridden Boxing Federation of India (BFI) and said that he won't hesitate to be among the candidates "given a if responsibility'

The 39-year-old, whose 2008 Beijing Olympics bronze marked the beginning of arguably the best phase of Indian boxing before things went downhill little over a decade later, is currently plying his trade in the professional circuit. However, he hasn't competed since 2022.

"I wou elections whenever they happen. I have fought all my life, it would be another fight for me. I have no idea whether I will find support but I am not afraid to place myself out there," Vijender said.

"If there is an opportunity for me to make a change, I will give it my best. But that does not mean I am retiring as an athlete. I would never do that," he added.

In a post on his X account, the star boxer said for Indian boxers to do well, it is imperative that they train abroad.

"For that, we need to conduct fresh and fair elections ASAP to build a strong federation. I will be more than happy to contribute my experience if given any responsibility by our government. @PMOIndia @mansukhmandviya," posted

the Haryana-pugilist, who was the first Indian male boxer to win a world championship medal (a bronze) back in 2009 and to be ranked world number one.

His comments come a couple of days after the Indian Olympic Association (IOA) over boxing's administration to an ad-hoc committee, citing a delay in the conduct of Boxing Federation of India's (BFI) elections.

The Ajay Singh-led BFI has promised to challenge the decision in the Delhi High Court and has called the IOA's order illegal. The tenure of BFI office-bearers ended on February 3.

The administrative mess has months owing to internal complaints against alleged financial misconduct, and turf wars between officials, who do not have a history of cohesive functioning.

The IOA's five-member adhoc committee has been entrusted to oversee the sport's administration until

elections are held.

The panel is led by former
Athletics Federation of India
(AFI) treasurer Madhukant
Pathak and includes long-time
boxing federation officials such as Rajesh Bhandari (vicechairman), DP Bhatt, Virendra Singh Thakur, and former Asian champion Shiva Thapa, who serves as the sole players' representative.

The administrative logjam has had a cascading effect on the boxers' performance and training as well.
