SECOND DEPORTATION FLIGHT ARRIVES

A plane carrying 119 illegal immigrants from the US landed at the Amritsar airport on Saturday night, the second such batch of Indians to be deported by the Donald Trump administration as part of its promised crackdown on illegal migration. Before the arrival and another scheduled deportee flight for Sunday created a lot of furor and controversy across the country with political parties crossing swords.

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann questioned the move to land another plane at the Amritsar airport, as he accused the Centre of trying to defame Punjab as part of a conspiracy and sought to know under which criteria the Amritsar airport was chosen to land the second aircraft, BJP hit back accusing the AAP leader of playing politics over the matter.

Among the 119 deportees, 100 are from Punjab and Haryana alone. While 67 are from Punjab, 33 are from Haryana, eight from Gujarat, three from Uttar Pradesh, two each from Goa, Maharashtra and Rajasthan, and one each from Himachal Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir. The second batch of illegal Indian immigrants includes four women and two minors, including a six-year-old girl. Most of the deportees are in the age group of 18 to 30, sources said. A third plane carrying 157 deportees is also expected to land on February 16. On February 5, a US military aircraft carrying 104 illegal Indian immigrants landed at the Amritsar airport.

Of them, 33 each were from Haryana and Gujarat, and 30 from Punjab. Mann visited the airport on Saturday and said his government has made arrangements to take the residents of Punjab from among the second batch of deportees to their hometowns. The deportees who hail from other states will head to Delhi from Amritsar in a flight on Sunday morning and then they will be taken to their respective places. Talking to reporters at the airport, Mann continued his attack on the Centre and said, "Do not make our holy city (Amritsar) a deport centre."

Hitting back at Mann, BJP leader Tarun Chugh said on Saturday, "Bhagwant Mann sahab, people of Punjab want to know how the innocent youths went out, why they had to go, who were those who spoiled their lives. Why they had to go adopting illegal routes, who sent them, and who were the fraudulent agents who spoiled their lives." "The youths were forced to sell their land, houses. Rather than

catching the culprits and acting against those who spoiled the lives of these youths, the 'AAP-da' party leader is doing politics over the issue," Chugh, who is also BJP's general secretary, said. BJP's national spokesperson R P Singh also took a dig at Mann, and told him to stop politicising the issue. "Amritsar is the closest international airport for flights entering India from the US. That's why the plane carrying illegal immigrants is landing there. Stop politicising the issue and promoting conspiracy theories due to your lack of knowledge," Singh said in a social media post. Senior BJP leader and former Union minister Uma Bharti lashed out at the US government for the "cruel and extremely shameful manner" in which it deported the illegal Indian immigrants recently. In a post on social media platform, Uma Bharti said, "The manner in which the illegal Indian immigrants were sent back from America in handcuffs and shackles is extremely shameful and a blot on humanity."

"The American governments have shown this cruel and violent attitude towards Red Indians and people of African origin living there many times, she alleged. "When they (deportees) were being sent by a plane, keeping them in handcuffs and shackles shows the cruelty and inhumanity of the American administration. Entering a country illegally is a crime, every country has provisions for its punishment as per the law, but such cruelty is a great sin," the BJP leader said.

The North American Punjabi Association expressed serious concern over human trafficking, saying the government must take immediate action to prevent youths from taking illegal and dangerous routes to reach foreign shores. Satnam Singh Chahal, the Executive Director of the North American Punjabi Association (NAPA) alleged that despite repeated warnings and several tragic incidents, the government has failed to implement effective measures to curb illegal migration.

Destiny plays cruel at Maha Kumbh, again

A devastating road accident in Prayagraj on Friday and a fire in the mela grounds on Saturday marred the festivities in Kumbh as the week came to a close. A fire broke out at the storeroom of a camp in the Maha Kumbh Mela area on Saturday evening, gutting seven tents and destroying some items, including blankets and foodgrains, officials said.

No person was injured, they said. Meanwhile late evening heavy rush led to chaos at New Delhi Railway Station on platform no 14 and 15 from where Prayagraj Express was scheduled to depart. Sources said that passengers forced themselves in all the coaches of train including air conditioned coaches. Several passengers fainted due to heavy rush and Mahakumbh bound passengers barging into coaches. Delhi police and Delhi Fire Service rushed to the spot and along with the RPF tried to control the chaos and prevented a major stampede at the national Capital station. Some of the passengers including female were rushed to hospital for first aid. Northern Railway officials said that

situation was brought under control and rush was cleared by deploying two special trains for Prayagraj.

Accident claims 10 lives in Prayagraj

A late Friday night accident claimed the lives of 10 pilgrims and left 19 others injured. The incident occurred on the Prayagraj-Mirzapur highway in Meja. According to police reports, a Bolero carrying pilgrims collided head-on with a bus. All 10 occupants of the Bolero died on the spot. The deceased were residents of Korba district in Chhattisgarh and were on their way to the Sangam for a holy dip. The bus, carrying pilgrims from Rajgarh district in Madhya Pradesh, was returning from the Sangam and heading toward Varanasi when the accident took place. Nineteen passengers onboard sustained injuries and were rushed to the Community Health Center (CHC) in Ramnagar for treatment. Upon receiving information, local authorities and police reached the site, took control of the situation, and sent the bodies for post-mortem examination. Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath took note of the road accident in Prayagraj and directed the officials to reach the spot and expedite the relief work. The Chief Minister also directed proper treatment of the injured. This is not the first instance that such accidents involving Maha Kumbh devotees occurred.

AAP appointments under scrutiny

In order to crackdown on the 'tentacles' of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) within the Delhi government, Delhi Chief Secretary Dharmendra has asked all Secretaries and Heads of Department to compile a list of appointments of chairpersons and members made by the previous AAP government. The move may spark controversy as the AAP government had faced allegations of appointing party members and close aides of ministers to various non-official posts, allegedly bypassing established laws and government regulations.

In order to crackdown on the tentacles of the Aam Aadmi Party within the Delhi government, Delhi Chief Secretary Dharmendra has asked all Secretaries and Heads of Department to compile a list of appointments of chairpersons and members made by the previous AAP government. The move may spark controversy as the AAP government had faced allegations of appointing party members and close aides of ministers to various non-official posts, allegedly bypassing established laws and government regulations.

According to top sources, the Services Department has already received lists of non-official appointees from multiple departments. Once the compilation is complete, the list will be forwarded to the Chief Secretary for further action. The Chief Secretary had previously discussed the matter in a meeting with HoDs and Secretaries, instructing them to prepare detailed records of all non-official

appointments of chairpersons and members made by the AAP government. As per the minutes of the meeting, "All departments and their organizations shall submit a list of non-official appointments made under various Acts and Rules pertaining to their respective departments." Departments have been directed to submit their lists by February 13, after which further decisions will be made regarding these appointments. Sources indicate that hundreds of AAP workers and supporters have been appointed to key positions in various Delhi government departments over the past decade. Many of these appointments were reportedly made in Mohalla Clinics,

governing bodies of educational institutions, and state public undertakings. Insiders claim that these appointments were primarily given to party volunteers, raising concerns about favoritism and possible violations of government procedures. The review ordered by the Chief Secretary is expected to examine whether these selections were made following due process or if they were politically motivated. In July 2023, the Delhi Services Department had ordered that 437 private persons appointed as advisers, fellows and consultants via "back door entry" by the Aam Aadmi Party government are "void ab initio" (void from the beginning) and directed the departments concerned to stop their services.

The 437 appointments include 140 fellows and associate fellows appointed at the Delhi Assembly Research Centre (DARC) since 2019. The Services department had compiled the information received from 23 departments and agencies of the Delhi government that engaged private persons as "specialists". During the scrutiny by the Services department, it was found that 69 persons were engaged in five departments of Archaeology, Environment, Delhi Archives, Women and Child Development and Industries without the approval of the competent authority. Also, 13 Boards, autonomous bodies which engaged 155 persons, did not take the necessary approval.

Meta's longest undersea cable to connect India, US

Social media major Meta on Saturday tagged India as one of its largest markets to be connected with the company's world's longest undersea cable "Project Waterworth" which is expected to be operational by the end of this decade. Meta has announced "Project Waterworth" which will reach five major continents and span over 50,000 kilometers - longer than the earth's circumference. The project was part of the US-India Joint Leaders' Statement that was released on February 13 following the visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to US. "Meta is investing in India -- one of its largest markets -- bringing the world's longest, highest capacity and most technologically advanced subsea cable project to connect India, the US, and other locations," Meta spokesperson said on Saturday. The undersea cables are crucial for internet operations. These cables connect countries with each other. Local telecom operators connect with undersea cables to provide internet access to their customers.

Sheesh Mahal under CVC lens

In mounting trouble for the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) National Convener and former Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, the Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) has ordered a detailed probe into allegations of irregularities in the construction and expenditures incurred on interiors of his residence, 6, Flagstaff Road, during his tenure in office, on the basis of a factual report submitted by the Central Public Works Department (CPWD). This comes just days after the BJP asked Delhi Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena to cancel the merger of four properties with the 'Sheesh Mahal'. The inquiry is expected to probe whether government regulations were bypassed to facilitate the

construction of what the BJP has dubbed the "Sheeshmahal," spanning 40,000 square yards (8 acres). "After examination of factual report regarding complaint 75059/2024, CVO Central Public Works Department has been advised to conduct a detailed investigation in the matter. Based on the investigation report, suitable action will be taken by the competent authority," CVC said. The Sheesh Mahal controversy was one of the major issues of people discredited Kejriwal and his party during the recently concluded assembly polls here. The BJP had accused exorbitant amount was spent, flouting regulations, for the construction of Kejriwal's residence. The probe was ordered on February 13.

Bengaluru airport to have train connectivity to city

To beat the chronic traffic problem in silicon city Bengaluru, the Indian Railways in a first of its kind has announced to connect the metropolitan to the Bengaluru Airport. Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said that, in addition to road, metro rail, and suburban railway services provided by the State government, Indian Railways will also introduce a train travel option from Kempegowda International Airport to Bengaluru city. However, he noted that a few technical challenges need to be addressed before this can be implemented and the Railway team is working on resolving



them. Addressing media, Vaishnaw said that people currently have access to Bengaluru airport via Metro Rail, road, and the suburban railway project managed by the Rail Infrastructure Development Company (Karnataka) (K-RIDE). K-RIDE, a joint venture between the Centre and the

state, is under construction and aims to enhance urban rail connectivity. "Apart from Metro Rail, road and K-RIDE, we are also creating a railway connectivity option to the airport," Vaishnaw said. He recalled that during his last visit, he travelled by train from the airport to the city. "I realised it was a comfortable 40 to 45-minute ride. However, there were some technical issues, particularly the need to construct a rail flyover. The team has now completed the necessary work and they presented the concept to me today. I will share it with you soon. This will bring significant relief to the people," the Minister said. He also emphasised the importance of suburban and metro projects for Bengaluru, a city with a population of 1.5 crore. "It's a very large city, and we need to rapidly expand metro and suburban rail networks. The state and Centre must work in a synchronised manner," he pointed out.

Biryani, chicken curry included in Singapore's emergency meal kits

Curry chicken with biryani rice is among the five meal options prepared by SATS Ltd, or Singapore Airport Terminal Services, ready-to-eat foods for public consumption during national emergencies. SATS, a Singapore-headquartered solutions company, has spent four to six months on research and development before finalising five meal options. Besides biryani -- a popular Indian dish in the city-state, the other meal options are chicken bolognese pasta, fish porridge with sweet potato and pumpkin, sweet spicy tomato fish with basmati rice, and vegetable marinara pasta. The meals are prepared in a SATS halal-certified kitchen in Singapore, reported

Channel News Asia on Saturday. The report said these meals require no refrigeration, can be eaten at room temperature without reheating and have a shelf life of up to eight months. Leveraging its experience in producing army combat rations, food caterer SATS has developed these products. "As with any ambient product, we have to do a real-time shelf-life study ... once we are assured of the quality, then we launch the commercial production," said Jean Sin, head of innovation and product development at SATS. About 150,000 of these meals will be distributed between Saturday (February 15) and February 28 as part of this year's Exercise SG Ready, a component of Singapore's Total Defence campaign. The exercise allows people in Singapore to

experience simulated power outages and disruptions to food supplies, among other scenarios. More than 100,000 students and teachers from over 90 schools, and three Institute of Technical Education colleges, along with over 8,000 seniors from 111 Active Ageing Centres, will be able to try these meals. While long-shelf-life meals are often assumed to be unappetising, a taste test revealed otherwise. The texture of the meals also closely resembled freshly cooked food, with the chicken, fish and rice maintaining a natural mouthfeel. Nutritional value is another key consideration. Sin said the meals provide essential energy and nutrients, including carbohydrates, protein, fibre and fat.

Former New India Cooperative Bank GM arrested in ₹122 Crore bank fraud case

Two days after the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) imposed restrictions on New India Cooperative Bank (NICB), the Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of the Mumbai police on Saturday arrested its former General Manager Hitesh Mehta in a ₹122 crore funds' embezzlement case. Mehta's arrest came after the NICB's chief executive officer Devarshi Shishir Kumar Ghosh lodged a complaint against him with the Dadar police on Friday. Mehta will be produced before a holiday court on Sunday. Ahead of Mehta's arrest, the EOW officers raided his residence at Dahisar in north Mumbai and seized some incriminating documents. In his complaint, the Bank's CEO has alleged that Mehta and one of the senior employee of the bank had in their custody the bank's cash in the bank's vaults at its Prabhadevi and Goregaon offices and that together, they had allegedly hatched a criminal conspiracy and embezzled about ₹122 crore. Ahead of Mehta's arrest, the police had begun to investigate the alleged irregularities that took place in the bank between 2020 and 2025. On Friday, the EOW had recorded the statement of a senior official. The EOW officials have registered an FIR under sections 316(5) (criminal breach of trust by a public servant or banker, merchant, broker, attorney or agent) and

61(2) (criminal conspiracy) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). The RBI's decision to impose severe restrictions on the bank, including withdrawal of money from the savings and current accounts of the bank, has sent shocking waves through the country's commercial capital, with thousands of panic-stricken depositors gathering before the branches of the bank to check if their money lying with the bank was "safe" and if they would be allowed to withdraw the same. The RBI's restrictions prevent

the bank from issuing new loans, making investments, borrowing funds or allowing withdrawals for six months due to concerns over its financial stability. Having superseded the bank's board of directors for 12 months, citing "poor governance standards", the RBI has appointed Shreekanth, a former chief general manager of the State Bank of India (SBI), as the administrator to manage the bank's affairs. Additionally, a committee of advisors has been formed to assist him. The RBI has barred the bank

from granting or renewing any loans and advances, making any investment, incurring any liability including borrowing funds and acceptance of fresh deposits, disburse or agree to disburse any payment whether in discharge of its liabilities and obligations without prior approval of RBI in writing. The RBI restrictions came into effect after the close of business on February 13, and will be valid for six months. In all, NICB has 30 branches and a deposit base of ₹2,436 crore as of March 2024. The

bank had posted losses of ₹30.74 crore in 2022-23 and ₹22.78 crore in 2023-24. This is the third major action taken against a co-operative bank in Maharashtra over alleged financial irregularities. Earlier, on September 24, 2019, the RBI had Tuesday placed Punjab & Maharashtra Cooperative (PMC) Bank Ltd under regulatory restrictions, thus barring the bank from carrying out routine and major financial transactions, including withdrawal of cash exceeding ₹1,000 by each of the depositors, for a period of six months.

Sarma continues allegations against Gaurav Gogoi's wife

Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma continued to question Congress MP Gaurav Gogoi's British wife Elizabeth Colburn's links with Pakistan, alleging on Saturday that the "network is now emerging as far more significant and deeply entrenched than initially thought". He shared screenshots of old posts on X by Ali Tauqeer Sheikh, an advisor of the Pakistan Planning Commission and a former colleague of Colburn, and claimed that the relationship between the Gogois and the Pakistani national appeared to be "deeply rooted". Sarma had also targeted the Jorhat MP over the issue, demanding answers from Gogoi over the allegations of ISI links, "leading young individuals to the Pakistan embassy for brainwashing and radicalisation, and the refusal

to take Indian citizenship for the past 12 years", referring to Colburn's nationality status. He had also alleged that Gogoi had raised questions in Parliament on sensitive defence matters after his marriage to the British citizen, a charge termed by the opposition leader as a "false accusation". In his latest charges, Sarma shared a screenshot of a post on X by Sheikh in 2019 in which he commented on the problem of illegal migrants from Bangladesh to India. "Elizabeth Colburn w/o Hon'ble MP worked under Ali Tauqeer Sheikh in the organisation LEAD Pakistan, which operated under the guise of climate change initiatives," Sarma wrote, sharing the screenshot. He claimed that a "closer examination" of Sheikh's works and articles reveals a deeper and more strategic involvement, particularly in Assam.

"The extent of this network is now emerging as far more significant and deeply entrenched than initially thought," Sarma maintained, as he tagged the Union Home Ministry in his post. The CM shared another post by Sheikh from 2020 where the Pakistan national lauds Gogoi and others for raising the Delhi riots issue in the Parliament. Sarma said, "Pakistan National Ali Sheikh of Lead Pakistan who is Elizabeth Colburn's colleague and supervisor shared his anti-India propaganda and also tagged and cheered Hon'ble MP when he raised the Delhi Riots 2020 issue in Parliament. Yes, The relationships appear to be deeply rooted." The BJP had on Wednesday accused Gogoi's wife of having links with Pakistan and the ISI, a charge rejected by the deputy leader of the Congress in the Lok Sabha as "laughable and entertaining".

Maharashtra forms panel on Love Jihad

The Maharashtra Government has set up a seven-member committee headed by the State Director General of Police (DGP) to study the legal aspects for a new law against forced conversions and cases of 'love jihad'. The committee includes secretaries of the women and child welfare, minority affairs, law and judiciary, social justice and special assistance departments, and deputy secretaries of the home department. As per a Government Resolution (GR) issued late on Friday, the committee will study the prevailing situation in the state and suggest steps to tackle the complaints of "love jihad" and forced conversions. The committee will also look at legal aspects and the laws

framed in other States. Accordingly, it will recommend legislation to prevent forced conversions and instances of "love jihad". Love jihad is a term used by right-wing activists and outfits to allege a conspiracy by Muslim men to convert Hindu women to Islam through marriage. Speaking on the development, Maharashtra minister and senior BJP leader Mangal Prabhakar Lodha said the state government is taking strict steps to curb incidents of "love jihad" in the state. Lodha, the joint guardian minister of Mumbai suburban district, thanked Chief Minister

Devendra Fadnis for the step. "Love jihad is a serious issue, and the state government is working towards preventing such incidents. The committee established to address cases of love jihad will work for the protection of women and preservation of cultural values," he said. Lodha had set up the Interfaith Marriage Coordination Committee, which played a significant role in highlighting such incidents, when he was in charge of the Women and Child Development Department in the Eknath Shinde dispensation.

On Tuesday, seven people from Andhra Pradesh, who were returning from the Maha Kumbh, died after their tempo traveller collided with a truck on a highway in Madhya Pradesh's Jabalpur district. On Monday, a couple from Agra died and four others were injured when their car collided with a truck while

they were returning from the Kumbh. According to Station House Officer Rudra Pratap Singh, the truck was seized and the driver was detained. A man from Odisha's Rourkela died and six others were injured when a car carrying them from the Maha Kumbh to their home collided with a bus in Uttar Pradesh's Sonbhadra on Monday, police said.

Vaishnav mentioned that during his visits, he has been reviewing the progress of the K-RIDE suburban railway project in detail. "Each time, the major challenge has been the lack of technical personnel. I will request the state government to appoint a full-time MD from the

Railway technical cadre. Without this, progress will be slow," he said. Regarding the circular rail project around Bengaluru, he said the concept has now been finalised. "Bengaluru is connected to the city by seven railway spokes. About a year and a half ago, we introduced the idea of a circular rail network," he explained. The

Minister also addressed issues related to metro train manufacturing. "Although this does not fall under the railway's purview, we will do our best to ensure that the people of Bengaluru get good facilities, which is the priority. We should not get into whether this falls under the state or Centre's domain," he pointed out.

Further, no information was provided to the Services department about the engagements of 187 persons in Delhi Assembly Research Centre (DARC), Dialogue and Development Commission of Delhi (DDCD) and Department of Planning, about the issue of approval of the competent authority, the statement said. Eleven persons were engaged in 4 departments - Health and Family Welfare, Food Safety, Indra Gandhi Hospital and Transport - with the approval of the Lieutenant Governor. According to the minutes of the meeting, the chief secretary has directed

departments to draft a cabinet note on the implementation of the Ayushman Bharat scheme, a key BJP plank. Officials have also been tasked with finding immediate solutions for waterlogging and sewage problems. To streamline civic administration, a Unified Delhi Control Room will be set up in the NDMC area, ensuring real-time coordination across departments. All departments must outline their 15-day, monthly, and 100-day targets. If any project/scheme needs to be placed before the Council of Ministers, the Department should start preparing the Draft Cabinet Note," read the

directive issued by the chief secretary. Officials have also been instructed to compile PowerPoint presentations detailing their department's structure, roles, challenges, and goals, which will be consolidated by the General Administration Department for review by the incoming government. The directive has stressed the importance of integrating Central government schemes that have not yet been implemented in Delhi. "Departments may take urgent action on these schemes/programmes for taking requisite approval of the Competent Authority," it has stated.

The investment assumes significance as telecom operators have been demanding big techs including Meta to contribute towards building network infrastructure to decongest the data traffic load and improve customer's experience. "Driven by India's growing demand for digital services, this investment reaffirms Meta's commitment to economic growth, resilient infrastructure, and digital inclusion, supporting India's thriving digital landscape and fostering technological innovation," the spokesperson said. According to the US-India joint statement, India intends to invest in maintenance, repair and financing of undersea cables in the Indian Ocean, using trusted vendors. Meta in a blog on Project Waterworth said that the company is deploying first-of-its-kind routing, maximizing the cable laid in deep water

-- at depths up to 7,000 metres -- and using enhanced burial techniques in high-risk fault areas, such as shallow waters near the coast, to avoid damage from ship anchors and other hazards. The Singapore Food Agency, which collaborated with SATS in this initiative, said ready-to-eat meals are a quick way to ensure Singaporeans have access to food in crises. "These meals are shelf-stable and are convenient as they require minimal preparation before consumption," it said in a media factsheet. The agency encouraged Singaporeans to support the nation's food security by being flexible in their choices such as choosing frozen over chilled products or opting for canned alternatives instead of fresh food. Households could keep a reasonable pantry stocked with extra food, enough to last up to two weeks, reported the Channel, citing the agency. Land-short Singapore largely depends on imported food sources but has several farms and a fishing network.

The probe came after the CPWD submitted a factual report on Kejriwal's official residence which was undertaken after a complaint by BJP MLA Vijender Gupta. The renovated bungalow was the official residence of the Aam Aadmi Party national convener, Arvind Kejriwal, during his tenure as the capital's chief minister from 2015 till October 2024, when he vacated the mansion after resigning from the post. The PWD report, released in October 2024, highlighted luxurious renovations and high-end appliances installed at the bungalow. This provided ammunition to the BJP in its campaign against the AAP leadership. Gupta first raised concerns on October 14, 2024, alleging

unauthorized construction at Kejriwal's former official residence. His complaint stated that government properties, including Plot Nos. 45 and 47 on Rajpur Road-previously occupied by senior officials and judges in Type-V flats-as well as two bungalows (8-A & 8-B, Flag Staff Road), were demolished and merged into the new structure. He claimed that the construction violated ground coverage and floor area ratio (FAR) norms and proceeded without proper layout approvals. Following the complaint, the CVC registered the case for examination on October 16. A month later, in November 2024, it forwarded the matter to the CPWD for further scrutiny, assuring that appropriate action would be taken based on the findings.

On October 21, Gupta filed another complaint with the Vigilance Commission, this time focusing on the alleged misuse of public funds for extravagant renovations and interior decorations at Kejriwal's residence. He accused the former CM of spending crores of taxpayers' money on luxury amenities, far exceeding reasonable limits, raising serious concerns about financial irregularities. Taking note of the allegations, the CVC acknowledged the seriousness of the matter on November 5. Later, on December 5, the CPWD's chief vigilance Officer (CVO) submitted a factual report based on Gupta's complaint, which ultimately led to the CVC's decision to launch a full-scale

investigation. A year ago, in September 2023, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) had registered a preliminary enquiry on the matter months after the Ministry of Home Affairs asked the Comptroller & Auditor General of India to conduct a special audit into the alleged irregularities and violations in the reconstruction of the bungalow. A Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) report in the case detailing the audit of the house's repair and renovation shows that from a preliminary estimate of ₹7.91 crore in 2020, the total cost of the work at the property shot up to ₹33.66 crore by the time it ended in 2022. During a political rally, Prime Minister Narendra

Modi made a veiled attack on Mr Kejriwal, stating: "In the last 10 years, Delhi has been plagued by an 'AAPda'. AAP has descended as a calamity on Delhi. I could have built a 'Sheeshmahal' too, but I chose to build more than 4 crore homes for the poor." Gupta, a newly elected BJP MLA from Rohini, said in a press conference that his first complaint to the CVC on October 14, 2024, alleged that Kejriwal flouted building regulations to construct a lavish mansion covering 40,000 square yards (8 acres) of land. Government properties, including plot Nos. 45 and 47 on Rajpur Road (previously housing senior officials and judges in Type-V flats) and two bungalows (8-A and 8-B, Flag Staff Road) were

demolished and merged into the new residence, violating ground coverage and floor area ratio norms and lacking proper layout plan approvals, Gupta alleged. "The CVC registered the complaint on October 16, 2024, and forwarded the matter to the CPWD submitted its factual report on December 5, 2024, confirming the violations. Following this, on February 13, 2025, the CVC directed CPWD to conduct a full-scale investigation into the matter," he said. Gupta asserted the Aam Aadmi Party and its supreme Arvind Kejriwal should not be under the "illusion" that they would get away from facing the law, as PM Narendra Modi had said that those who have "looted the public money" will have to pay back.

Three AAP councillors turn coat to BJP Congress welcomes Sheesh Mahal probe

In another blow to Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) national convener Arvind Kejriwal, three AAP councillors switched over to the BJP on Saturday, boosting its chances of victory in the upcoming MCD mayoral poll. The three councillors are Anita Basoya (Andrews Ganj), Nikhil Chaurana (Hari Nagar) and Dharamvir (R K Puram). With the joining of three AAP Councillors, BJP has a majority in the MCD.

Welcoming the councillors, city BJP president Virendra Sachdeva said Delhi will have a "triple engine" government -- at the Centre, assembly and municipal level -- at the right time to develop it as the capital of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision under a 'Viksit Bharat'.

Sachdeva said the councillors joined the BJP to make Delhi a clean and beautiful city. In the wake of its recent resounding victory in the Assembly polls, the BJP is eyeing a "triple-engine government" in Delhi by securing the post of mayor. The BJP won 48 of the 70 Assembly seats, ousting the AAP from power after a decade.

During the press conference, Media Head Praveen Shankar Kapoor remarked that the truth is, "AAP was being held together by the glue of power, but soon, all nationalist workers will abandon it."

The mayoral election is scheduled to be held in April. The AAP had won the last mayoral election, held in

November 2024, by three votes. Besides the councillors, the seven Lok Sabha MPs (all of BJP), three Rajya Sabha MPs (all of AAP) and 14 nominated MLAs in Delhi are voters in the polls for mayor and deputy mayor of the Municipal Corporation of Delhi. With the joining of the three councillors, the BJP tally is now higher than that of the AAP.

The BJP is also going to have 10 of its MLAs nominated to the MCD, while the AAP will have four nominations for the civic body, said BJP leaders. In the February 5 Assembly polls, eight

BJP councillors and three AAP councillors got elected to the assembly. In December 2022, the AAP had ended 15 years of rule of the BJP in the municipal corporation. The AAP had won 134 wards, the BJP 104, the Congress nine, and Independents three. In 2022, 2023 and 2024 mayoral polls, AAP succeeded to elect its mayors. In 2024 mayoral polls, AAP candidate got elected but the victory margin was just 3 as the winning party candidate got 133 votes while losing party got 130 votes.

With the joining of three councillors

into the saffron camp and three have been elected as MLAs, AAP's total number in civic agency has reduced from 121 to 115. The BJP had 120 councillors out of which 8 have been elected MLAs hence its number is also 115. Besides the councillors, the seven Lok Sabha MPs (all of BJP), three Rajya Sabha MPs (all of AAP), and 14 nominated MLAs (10 BJP & 4 AAP) in Delhi are voters in the polls for mayor and deputy mayor of the MCD. Delhi Congress chief Devender Yadav on Saturday welcomed the Centre's decision to order a probe into alleged irregularities in the renovation of Arvind Kejriwal's official residence when he was the chief minister, and said the Congress was the first to raise the issue. Yadav's comment came after the Central Vigilance Commission ordered a probe into the alleged merger of properties to expand the 6, Flagstaff Road bungalow and the expenditures incurred on its interior works.

The bungalow, which the BJP has labelled as 'Sheesh Mahal' to highlight the alleged corruption in its renovation, was occupied by Kejriwal from 2015 till the first week of October 2024 as the chief minister of Delhi. Yadav welcomed the CVC decision to order a probe by

the Central Public Works Department. "We should not have any problem with any kind of investigation. If some irregularities are found in the investigation, action must be taken," he told PTI Videos. "When this Sheesh Mahal was being constructed, people in Delhi and the entire country were not getting oxygen and beds were not available in hospitals," he said, referring to the COVID-19 situation in Delhi and the country. The Delhi Congress was the first to raise the issue of alleged corruption in the renovation of the chief minister's residence and the implementation of the liquor policy, Yadav claimed. "There should definitely be an investigation and whoever is found guilty should be punished. No one should be afraid of the investigation nor should they run away from it," he said.

He also attacked the BJP over "renaming and rebranding" of government welfare measures. "The BJP is constantly engaged in rebranding and renaming. That is their politics. But the rebranding and renaming should not affect the things people are getting," he said. As a responsible political party, the Congress will adopt a wait and watch policy for three-four months, but if the BJP government does not address people's issues "we will strongly raise them", the Delhi Congress chief said. AAP challenges BJP on Sheesh Mahal claims

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has hit back at the BJP, asking it to abandon its negative politics and focus on fulfilling promises made to the people of Delhi. AAP's chief spokesperson, Priyanka Kakkar, questioned why the BJP barred media from inspecting the Chief Minister residence if there were alleged rule violations. She challenged the BJP to reveal whether claims of a golden toilet, swimming pool, and mini bar were facts or just political theatrics. Turning the tables, the AAP demanded an investigation into the extravagant Rs 2,750 crore "Raj Mahal," including a

Rs 300 crore carpet and Rs 200 crore chandeliers, questioning who approved such opulence. AAP's Chief Spokesperson urged the BJP to shift towards positive politics now that Delhi's people have elected them. She reminded the BJP of its many promises, particularly its commitment to providing Rs. 2,500 to every woman in Delhi by 8 March. "The BJP must focus on delivering this promise," she said. Questioning BJP's actions, Kakkar raised concerns over media restrictions at 6 Flag Staff Road. "If there was any rule violation, why didn't BJP allow the media inside?"

Because the truth would have been exposed-there is no golden toilet, no swimming pool, and no mini-bar. That's why the media was kept out," she said. She further demanded an impartial probe, pointing to the extravagant expenditure on PM Modi's 'Rajmahal' during COVID. "The public's Rs. 2,750 crore was spent on this mansion. Who approved Rs. 300 crore for carpets, Rs. 200 crore for chandeliers, and Rs. 150 crore for a throne? Who sanctioned the tunnel inside this palace? They must acknowledge all this and conduct an impartial investigation," she asserted.

Jamia students boycott classes over suspensions

The Left-affiliated All India Students' Association has called for a boycott of classes at Jamia Millia Islamia on Monday, claiming 17 students have been suspended by the university for protesting against the disciplinary action against two PhD scholars. The university is yet to issue a response to the claims about the suspensions of students. The National Students' Union of India (NSUI) has condemned the authoritarian and undemocratic actions of the Jamia Millia Islamia administration, which has suspended over 15 students, facilitated police detentions, and threatened peaceful student protesters with legal action. The controversy began after the university suspended two PhD scholars for allegedly



leading an unauthorised protest in December last year. The administration defended its actions, stating that protests disrupted academic activities and resulted in property damage, including vandalizing the central canteen and breaking the gate

of the security advisor's office. However, student activists argued that the administration was attempting to stifle dissent. Jamia's action triggered a stir with several students claiming they received suspension notices, citing their alleged involvement in "acts of vandalism, unauthorised protests, and defamation of the university". NSUI National President Varun Choudhary addressed a letter to the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Mazhar Asif, demanding the immediate revocation of suspensions, cessation of police intimidation, and strict action against those responsible for the data leak. According to the All India Students' Association (AISA), the university administration suspended 17 students overnight, prompting students from various departments to declare their participation in the boycott. Students of Sociology, Social Science, Geography, Hindi, Social Work, Spanish and Latin American Studies, French and Francophone

Studies, Korean Language, and the Center for Culture and Media and Governance have announced their support, the student body said in a statement. "You can suspend students, but you cannot suspend resistance," AISA added. A disciplinary committee is set to meet on February 25 to review the role of the two scholars in organizing 'Jamia Resistance Day' on December 15, 2024, an annual event marking the 2019 protests against the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA).

MCD raises fees for street encroachments

The Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) has revised its enforcement rates for composition fees, removal charges, and storage charges for goods and vehicles obstructing public streets and spaces. The new rates, which supersede the previous circular issued on July 19, 2023, aim to streamline enforcement and deter encroachments. The new rates will apply to hawkers, shopkeepers, transport companies, vehicle showrooms, second-hand car

dealers, and others, the MCD said in a statement. Under the new structure, composition fees range from Rs 600 for hawkers and squatters to Rs 15,000 for water trolleys. Removal charges are based on load weight, categorized into four slabs-starting at Rs 300 for loads up to 40 kg and increasing to Rs 2,000 for loads exceeding five quintals. Storage charges for confiscated goods, excluding vehicles, have been set at Rs 100 per day for items weighing less than one quintal and Rs 200 per quintal

per day for heavier goods. Vehicle storage fees range from Rs 500 per day for two-wheelers to Rs 8,000 per day for multi-axle trailers. The revised charges are part of MCD's efforts to ensure cleaner, encroachment-free public spaces. The civic body has adopted a zero-tolerance policy against the unauthorized occupation of public streets and areas. It urges all stakeholders to comply with regulations to enhance civic amenities and improve traffic flow across the city. A street vendor in Chandni Chowk expressed his frustration: "The new charges are too high for small hawkers like us. We understand the need for regulation, but there should be some relief for daily wage earners." On the other hand, commuters and residents have appreciated the strict enforcement, hoping for improved pedestrian safety and better road conditions. "Delhi's roads are often blocked by unauthorized stalls and parked vehicles. This step will hopefully bring some order," said a commuter in Connaught Place.

CBSE Board exams for begin with mixed emotions

The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) Class X and XII board examinations began on Saturday, with students expressing mixed emotions, from initial nervousness to relief after taking the exams. Raghav Goyal, a student from DPS Vasant Kunj, said, "We had solved sample papers and studied NCERT for preparation. Initially, I was nervous, but the exam went well, though it was quite lengthy," said Goyal. CBSE's Controller of Examinations Sanyam Bhardwaj said, "Today marked the beginning of the CBSE Class X and XII board examinations for 2025, with students sitting for their English and entrepreneurship papers." He said the exams were conducted smoothly across the country in a conducive environment. "For class 10, the exams took place at over 7,780 centres, with approximately 23,86,000 students appearing. Meanwhile, the class 12 exams were held at 995 centres, with nearly 23,000 students participating," Bhardwaj added. Some students raised minor concerns about the exam format. DMRC reacts to viral jumping incident at Jama Masjid station

A video from the Delhi Metro has gone viral on social media, showing passengers jumping over the exit gate at Jama Masjid Metro Station. The incident took place on February 13 at 11.22pm. According to officials, the surge in commuters occurred when two trains arrived at the station simultaneously, leading to a heavy rush at the exit gate. At that moment, the gate reportedly stopped functioning, further adding to the congestion. In response, authorities allowed passengers to exit through a side gate. In the video, a large number of people could be seen jumping over the automated fare collection (AFC) gates with many filming the act on their cellphones. Reacting to the incident, the

Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) on Saturday reacted to a viral video showing people jumping over automated fare collection gates at the Jama Masjid metro station, saying there was a temporary surge in the number of passengers for a brief period of time. "Due to this, a huge crowd gathered at the exit gate and the exit gate stopped working at that very moment," the DMRC said in an official statement. In response to the congestion, the crowd was directed to a side gate, where passengers were seen jumping over the gate. Some individuals also began making noise, adding to the confusion. Despite the brief disruption, the situation was quickly brought under control and the crowd dispersed shortly thereafter," DMRC clarified.

"Security personnel and other staff were adequately present to counsel the passengers and the situation was never out of control," Anuj Dayal, the Principal Executive Director of DMRC Corporate Communications explained. It was a momentary reaction of some passengers due to a sudden surge near the AFC gates, he added. The video, which has been widely circulated, also appears to have been edited, with added sound effects, including the noise of a metro train and background music. However, DMRC emphasized that similar incidents had occurred before, and no formal complaints had been filed following the episode. Delhi Police, who monitor security at Metro stations, also confirmed that no complaints have been lodged.

CBSE exams for Classes 10, 12 begin

The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) exams for Classes 10 and 12 began on Saturday, with more than 42 Lakh students set to take the tests at over 7,800 centres across the country and abroad. According to board officials, a total of 24.12 Lakh Class-10 students will take the test in 84 subjects, while more than 17.88 Lakh students will appear in the Class-12 exams across 120 subjects. The exams are scheduled to be conducted at 7,842 centres in India and 26 abroad. On the first day of the exams, the Class 10 students appeared for the English (Communicative) and English (Language and Literature) papers, while the Class-12 students appeared in the Entrepreneurship exam. "The CBSE board exams for Classes 10 and 12 have started. Today, the Class-10 English and Class-12 Entrepreneurship exams were



held. The Class-10 exam took place at 7,780 centres, with over 23.86 Lakh students appearing, while the Class-12 exam was conducted at 995 centres with around 23,000 students," CBSE Examination Controller Sanyam Bhardwaj said.

"The exams were organised smoothly. I hope all the students reached their exam centres with enthusiasm and were able to take the tests in a positive environment," he added. Bhardwaj said the CBSE has ensured that all necessary guidelines and

security measures are in place to maintain the integrity of the examination process. "Schools and exam centres have been briefed on strict protocols to facilitate a fair and seamless examination experience. The CBSE had organised a live webcast on

Friday in the presence of school principals from Delhi-NCR, outlining the essential exam guidelines for the schools and stakeholders," he added. The Class-10 exams are scheduled to end on March 18, while the Class-12 exams will conclude on April 4. The CBSE started its annual counselling service ahead of the board exams to alleviate examination-related stress and support the students as they prepare for their theory exams. "A team of 66 trained professionals, principals, counsellors, special educators from CBSE-affiliated schools and psychologists will offer voluntary support to the students. The services are available from 9:30 am to 5:30 pm from Monday to Saturday," Bhardwaj said. "Fifty-one counsellors are based in India while 15 counsellors will connect from Nepal, Japan, Qatar, Oman and the United Arab Emirates to guide the students," he added.

Congress questions India's need for F35 fighter jets

Congress general secretary Randeep Surjewala on Saturday raised several questions on whether the country required expensive fighter jets like F35 aircraft from the US and if security experts and armed forces were consulted in the national interest. During Prime Minister Narendra Modi's recent visit, India and the US unveiled an ambitious plan to sign a new 10-year defence partnership and pursue co-production of key weapons and platforms with President Donald Trump announcing that Washington would increase sales of military hardware to New Delhi by millions of dollars including possible supply of F-35 stealth fighter jets. In multiple posts on X, Surjewala claimed there are many flaws in the F 35 aircraft and many accidents have happened, with some calling



them "junk" and others "useless". "There is a lot of discussion about Prime Minister Modi buying F 35 fighter aircraft from America, but did the Modi government consider these aspects in the interest of the country," he asked. The cost of flying an F 35 fighter aircraft is \$35,000 per hour, i.e. ₹28,00,000 per hour, he said, adding F 35 is the most expensive fighter aircraft in the world and the cost of one aircraft is approximately USD 110 million, or ₹968 Crore. "Does the Modi government think that the cost of Rs 28 lakh per hour is right for India and was the opinion of the Indian Air Force and defence experts taken in this regard," Surjewala asked. "Prime Minister Modi is buying F 35 fighter aircraft from America, but did the Modi government consider these aspects in national interest before taking a unilateral decision to buy F 35 aircraft at the behest of President Trump. Does the Indian Air Force want to buy F 35 fighter aircraft in accordance with the country's defence interests? Was the Air Force's opinion taken?" the Congress leader asked in another post in Hindi.

Kerala nurses council to bar ragging accused from continuing their studies

Amid widespread outrage over the brutal ragging incident at the Government Nursing College, the Kerala Nurses and Midwives Council (KNMC) on Saturday decided to bar all five accused students from continuing their studies. A council meeting convened here observed that the accused did not deserve to complete their studies or enter the service profession. The council further noted that those entering the nursing profession should be humane and compassionate—whereas the accused displayed cruelty toward their juniors—behaviour that is unacceptable in any circumstance. A council member described the Kottayam ragging incident as an "extremely cruel act" and said it cannot be justified under any circumstances. "We will never justify the incident. What we want to emphasise is



that allowing such individuals into the nursing profession would be a disaster," said Usha Devi, a council member. She said the Council would soon inform the concerned authorities of its decision. With this decision, the accused students can no longer continue their studies in Kerala, she added. The Council's ruling came a day after the state Health Minister indicated that strict action would be taken against those involved in the brutal incident. On Friday, the department suspended Principal Sulekha A T and Assistant

Professor/Assistant Warden-in-Charge of the student hostel, Ajeesh P Mani, pending an inquiry for allegedly failing to prevent ragging and effectively intervene in the matter. The hostel's housekeeper-cum-security staff was also ordered to be removed immediately, according to a statement issued by the Health Minister's office late Friday night. The action was taken following an inquiry conducted by the Director of Medical Education, as per the instructions of Health Minister Veena George, the statement added.

Delhi HC seeks CBIC's stand on betel nuts for customs

The Delhi High Court has sought the stand of Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) on a plea for resolving the issue of alleged mis-classification of betel nuts for the purpose of customs duty. The petitioner, a customs house agent, claimed the ambiguity on whether betel nuts would attract 100 per cent or 50 per cent basic customs duty has allegedly resulted in large-scale mis-classification, enabling duty evasion and causing significant financial harm to the government. The court was informed by the petitioner's advocate that complaints have also been filed with the Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) and other higher government authorities for action to be taken against the officers who are allegedly engaging in large scale duty evasion on the basis of this ambiguity in spite the



clarification provided by the Supreme Court. A bench of Justices Prathiba M Singh and Dharmesh Sharma noted that despite advance copies of petition being served to the authorities, their counsel have not been given any instructions. The court granted time to the counsel for the respondents to take instructions in the matter and listed it for further hearing on February 27.

The court said if no decision has already been taken on the complaints, it should be taken on an "early date". Advocate Kamini Lau, representing petitioner Bajrang Lal Sharma, said the issue has created enormous difficulties for customs house agents like the petitioner as no decision has been taken despite repeated complaints against the senior officials. The plea said the petitioner, along with several customs

house agents, are facing repeated harassment from a group of customs officers, even as the National Customs Targeting Centre (NCTC) received multiple complaints regarding the alleged mis-declaration and mis-classification of imported betel nuts under various names such as "boiled supari, API supari, chikni supari, and flavoured supari", being wrongly classified. It claimed this mis-

classification allowed importers to evade the 100 per cent basic customs duty (BCD) by paying only 50 per cent, and also bypass the Minimum Import Price conditions set by the Directorate General of Foreign Trade. The plea said the petitioner submitted a complaint to the CVC in March 2022, seeking urgent intervention against senior custom officer for his alleged involvement in duty evasion in collusion with others as the ongoing clearance of goods through mis-classification was causing significant revenue loss. However, the respondent departments failed to take any effective action, thereby allowing the duty evasion scam to continue unchecked, it claimed. The petition has arrayed the Centre through Ministry of Finance, CBIC, CVC and the Directorate General of Vigilance, Customs and Central Excise as respondents.

CIABC urges government to curb dumping of imported spirits

The Confederation of Indian Alcoholic Beverage Companies (CIABC) on Saturday urged the government to impose stringent measures to curb dumping of imported spirits and ensure greater market access for domestic products. The Confederation of Indian Alcoholic Beverage Companies (CIABC) said the Indian liquor manufacturers are not against reduction in import duty, though they have sought the import duty cuts in a phased manner. India on February 13 slashed import duty on bourbon whiskey to 100 per cent. It is mainly imported from the US. The confederation "has urged the government to address the concerns of the Indian companies and ensure a level-playing field in FTA (free



trade agreement) negotiations and set in stringent effective measures to check and curb dumping of imported spirits and seeking better international access for Indian alcoholic products which face several non-tariff restrictions at present," it said in a statement. It has also requested the states to withdraw excise duty concessions given to imported liquor in view of reduction in customs duty.

The government needs to safeguard the interests of Indian liquor manufacturers while deciding on issues related to customs duty cuts and other concessions under FTAs, CIABC Director General Anant S Iyer said. "Though we have already recommended to the government to cut basic customs duty on spirits over a period of 10 years, we also want the government to ensure better international

market access especially the Western countries and safeguard interests of Indian companies against any dumping of products through transfer price mechanism at lower prices specifically for India," Iyer said. He added non-tariff barriers imposed by other countries prevent a vast majority of Indian products being sold in the Western markets. "We also want these markets to recognise Indian whiskeys at par with other global products," he said, adding the industry needs to be protected as there is always the fear of cheap imports in spirits and wines eroding the domestic industry. The alcoholic beverage industry contributes over Rs 3 lakh crore to the exchequer of states apart from adding central government's revenue in terms of customs duty and GST on a host of inputs.

India needs strong production base, not empty words: Rahul Gandhi

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Saturday said while India has the talent, it needs a strong production base, and not empty words, to build industrial prowess in new technology to give its youth jobs. In a post on X, Gandhi highlighted how China has started producing drones which are revolutionising warfare across the world, saying India needs to develop a strategy to become competitive in this area. "Drones have revolutionised warfare, combining batteries, motors and optics to manoeuvre and communicate on the battlefield in unprecedented ways. But drones are not just one technology -- they are bottom-up innovations produced by a strong industrial system. "Unfortunately, PM Modi has



failed to grasp this. While he delivers 'teleprompter' speeches on AI, our competitors are mastering new technologies. India needs a strong production base, not empty words," he said in the post, taking a swipe at Prime Minister Narendra Modi. "India has immense talent, scale and drive. We must have a clear vision and build real industrial prowess to give our youth jobs and lead India into the future," Gandhi added.

The Congress leader also tagged a nine-minute video on drone technology with the post, saying India has the talent and engineering skills to develop such technology for the future. He also referred to his speech in the Lok Sabha while speaking on the Motion of Thanks to the president's address, where he talked about new technology. In the video, Gandhi is heard saying that drones have

completely transformed the way wars are fought. "But drones are not just a technology -- they are a grassroots and small-scale innovation being produced by a robust industrial system. "Drones have diminished the importance of tanks, artillery and even aircraft carriers, bringing air power to the platoon level and reshaping intelligence and precision on the battlefield. But this revolution is not just limited to warfare -- it is also about industry, AI and next-generation technology," he said. "Unfortunately, PM Modi has failed to understand this. While he is busy giving speeches on AI by simply reading from a 'teleprompter', our competitors are mastering new technologies. India needs a strong production base, not empty speeches," Gandhi said.

Textbooks not challenge for intelligence, be smarter than smartphone: Sadhguru

Textbooks are not a challenge for intelligence and stress means the brain is not being oiled enough, spiritual leader Sadhguru Jaggi Vasudev said, as he shared mantras for playful learning and avoiding stress ahead of exams with students as part of the prime minister's latest 'Pariksha Pe Charcha' episode aired on Saturday. Sadhguru told students that they have to be smarter than their smartphones. He also shared tips on how to avoid overthinking during a special session of 'Pariksha Pe Charcha' -- an annual event in which Prime Minister Narendra Modi interacts with students appearing for board

examinations. In a shift from the traditional town hall format, Modi preferred a more informal setting this time and took students to Delhi's iconic Sunder Nursery for his annual interaction. Eminent personalities such as boxer MC Mary Kom and Bollywood actress Deepika Padukone have also shared their experiences and knowledge on key aspects of life and learning in different episodes of 'Pariksha Pe Charcha'. Next in the series are Bollywood actors Vikrant Massey and Bhumi Pednekar sharing tips on cultivating positivity, managing negative thoughts, and tackling exam stress with confidence. "For #ExamWarriors, among the biggest allies during

exam time is positivity. Tomorrow's 'Pariksha Pe Charcha' episode delves into this topic and we have @VikrantMassey and @bhumipednekar share their insights," PM Modi wrote on X. Teaching students how to practise meditation, Sadhguru said intelligence is not about usefulness. "Intelligence creates a profundeness of experience of life. If you feel stressed, it means the brain is not being oiled well," he said. "Your textbook is not a challenge for your intelligence, no matter who you are. No matter if you have not done well in school till now, I'm telling you for your intelligence that textbooks are not a challenge.



"You're unnecessarily making it difficult for yourself by approaching it in a certain way. Why can't you learn playfully? If you make it playful, your textbook will not be a challenge," Sadhguru added. The Isha Foundation chief

told students that they have to be smarter than their smartphones, while urging them to not treat exams as a "challenge to their intelligence." "If you look at the grass or that motorcycle, you should think what is the physics,

math and chemistry of it. Education gives you fundamentals and eventually an access to life. To find this access, one aspect is active dynamic intelligence," he said. Responding to a student's query on addiction to social media and phone, he said that a person should decide how to use a smartphone, not the other way round. He also said that there is no such thing as overthinking, as one must think beyond to be able to do something worthwhile. "You may call it stress or anxiety, but the problem is that you don't know how to keep your mind aligned. What is not well aligned will cause friction, further causing stress," Sadhguru said. Emphasising the power of

meditation, the spiritual leader said studies have shown that when the 'Shambhavi Mahamudra' is practised, a large part of the brain lights up. "This is what needs to happen, that everything is lit up. The more you activate your intelligence, the more access you have to everything that you see. If your body is well-exercised, you can function better. Then why is that not true with your mental faculties?" he asked. Sadhguru also warned against comparing the intelligence of people. "Am I as intelligent as this person or that person? There is no such thing. It's a farce that's been spread in the world. Everybody can sparkle and do things that others cannot imagine. Only

thing is, because there is no striving, that sparkle doesn't happen," he told students. Nutrition and health experts Shonali Sabherwal, Rujuta Diwekar and Revant Himatsingka; YouTuber Gaurav Chaudhary popularly known as 'TechGuruji' and Radhika Gupta, MD and CEO, Edelweiss Mutual Fund are among the other guests who have been part of the programme so far. The first edition of the interactive programme with school and college students was held at Delhi's Talkatora Stadium in 2018. Its seventh edition was held in a town hall format at the Bharat Mandapam last year, involving participants from around the country and abroad.

Digital lost and found centers reunite 20,000 at Mahakumbh

Akhilesh urges UP government to extend Maha Kumbh duration

Samajwadi Party (SP) chief Akhilesh Yadav has urged the Uttar Pradesh government to extend the duration of the ongoing Maha Kumbh, citing the overwhelming influx of devotees still hoping to participate. Yadav claimed that in previous years, the Maha Kumbh and Kumbh Mela spanned 75 days, whereas the current schedule is significantly shorter. "Even now, many people wish to visit the Maha Kumbh but are unable to do so. In such a situation, the government should extend its duration," Yadav said. Visuals circulating on social media depict overcrowded trains, congested roads, and massive crowds making their way to the pilgrimage site. Earlier this week, roads leading to the Maha Kumbh Mela witnessed severe traffic congestion stretching for kilometers, while the Prayagraj Sangam railway station was temporarily shut down due to the overwhelming rush of pilgrims. Yadav also accused the state

government of concealing the true number of deaths caused by a stampede at the Maha Kumbh last month. However, government officials have not yet responded to his allegations. The Maha Kumbh, considered the world's largest spiritual gathering, commenced on January 13 and is scheduled to conclude on February 26, coinciding with Maha Shivaratri. According to state government data, over 50.14 crore devotees have taken a holy dip at the

Sangam as of Saturday evening. Akhilesh Yadav also took aim at the BJP-led central government, alleging that the Waqf (Amendment) Bill tabled in Parliament was an attempt to divert public attention from pressing issues and mask the government's economic failures. "The government has introduced this legislation to engage people in unnecessary debates and distract them from real issues," he alleged.

J and K government fires three for terror links

The Union Territory administration on Saturday terminated the services of three government employees including a jailed policeman for their alleged involvement in terror-related activities. So far services of 79 government employees have been terminated by the Lieutenant Governor (LG) in the Union Territory for their terror links in the past few years. The sacked employees have been identified as police constable Firdous Ahmad Bhat, government school teacher Mohammad Ashraf Bhat, and orderly in the forest department Nisar Ahmad Khan who was earlier arrested in connection with the killing of a National Conference minister in 2000. Reacting strongly to the fresh termination orders of government employees Chief Minister Omar Abdullah said the law says everyone is innocent until anything is proven. "They should be given a chance to speak in the court and

if they cannot prove their innocence, only then appropriate action should be taken." The officials said the Lieutenant Governor invoked Article 311 (2) (c) of the Constitution to terminate the services of the three employees after an investigation by law enforcement and intelligence agencies established their terror links. According to official sources, the dismissed policeman, who was arrested in May last year, was initially appointed as a Special Police Officer (SPO) in 2005 and subsequently promoted to constable in 2011. Currently lodged in Kot Bhalwal Jail, Bhat was posted at a sensitive position in the Electronic Surveillance Unit in the J-K Police but started working for terror outfit Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT). However, he got exposed when two terrorists - Waseem Shah and Adnan Beigh - were arrested in Anantnag with a pistol and a hand grenade as they were planning to attack non-local civilians and tourists, the officials said. During the interrogation, Bhat

revealed his sinister design and led to the recovery of a sizable quantity of arms including pistols, ammunition and explosives from his residential quarter in Police Housing Colony in Srinagar and a newly constructed house in Mattan, Anantnag. According to the official sources, Firdous Ahmad Bhat used his police constable cover, to transport arms, ammunition, and explosives for terrorists and investigation also revealed that he was also working for Hizbul Mujahideen's Commander Khurshed Dar and LeT terrorist Hamza Bhai and Abu Zarrar besides Jutt. "He not only provided classified information about security forces movement, collection, storage and delivery of arms ammunition but also guided terror attacks," the officials said. They said he was also found involved in an attack on a police party in 2020 which led to the killing of sub-inspector Ashraf Bhat, an attack on a group of tourists in Pahalgam on May 18 last year that left two persons

injured. Ashraf Bhat, a resident of Reasi who was appointed as 'Rehbar-e-Taleem' Teacher in 2008 and later regularised in June 2013, was affiliated with LeT. "For many years his activities were undetected but eventually came to light in 2022 and he was arrested and currently lodged in district jail, Reasi," the officials said. During the course of investigation, it was revealed that Bhat's handler was the most wanted LeT terrorist Mohd Qasim, who is based in Pakistan. "LeT found him to be very useful because as a teacher Bhat was best placed to radicalise youth and carry out terror activities. He helped LeT to raise finances for terror activities and coordinated transport of arms, ammunition and explosives," they said. Khan, who joined the forest department in 1996 as a helper and currently posted as an orderly at the forest range office, Verinag (Anantnag), was found working for Hizbul Mujahideen, the officials said.

Travel advisory against Assam hinders foreign investment: Himanta

Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Saturday said that travel advisory against the northeastern region by several countries is a major challenge in attracting investments, even as the state gears up for a mega business summit here later this month. Sarma said he has requested the countries to view Assam in isolation and not club all the North Eastern states together. He said talks are already underway with Japan, Australia and other nations to persuade them to withdraw the adverse advisory as the local government is pushing for viewing Assam "in isolation" from the other states of the region. Addressing a press conference in the run-up to Advantage Assam 2.0 Investment and Infrastructure Summit, Sarma said, "Most embassies have marked Assam in

'grey' and have a statutory warning for its citizens against visiting Assam, as the state is clubbed together as 'North East'. Removing these advisories is topmost priority for us." He said countries like Japan and Australia are being persuaded to change this advisory, with a team from the Asian country

already here to look into the matter while an Australian delegation is scheduled to reach shortly. There is no adverse situation in Assam, and all stakeholders, including government, media and public, have to be together to drive home this point, he asserted. "As Chief Minister of Assam, I

cannot influence other states. What I am doing is asking them (foreign nations), to view Assam in isolation," he added. "To attract foreign investment, the travel advisory has to be withdrawn. And at the same time, we also have to show them our strengths, like skilling options for our human resources, peace and stability - politically, economically and in law and order," he said. Non-availability of vast tracts of land needed for setting up big industries is also a problem for the state, which the government is working on to address, the CM added. "In spite of these limitations, we are in the process of ensuring foreign investment this time. And if we can address these issues, more investment will come. The people have a major role in taking forward the spade work being done by the government through the upcoming Summit," he maintained.

Telangana Congress slams claim on Reddy Government's collapse

BJP backs new faces for Municipal elections

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has expressed confidence in new faces while selecting candidates for upcoming Municipal Elections. Talking about the former councillors of the BJP, only five have secured tickets. Out of a total of 36 wards, new candidates will contest in 31 wards. Earlier in the day, the BJP announced the names of ward councillor candidates for the MCG elections. Rajrani Malhotra will fight on the party's mayor ticket which was announced on Friday night. According to the list, among the former councillors, Brahm Yadav from Ward 9, Kuldeep Yadav from Ward 11, Aarti Yadav from Ward 24, Anoop Singh from Ward 25 and Dharambir from Ward 28 have BJP tickets.

At the same time, many old faces contested the 2017 elections as independents and this time BJP has given them tickets. Madhu Batra, wife of former senior deputy mayor Yashpal Batra from Ward 30, won the 2017 corporation election as an independent candidate. Dilip Kumar Sahni has got a ticket from Ward 31. In the 2017 elections, his wife Rajni contested as an independent candidate and defeated Geeta Rani of BJP by 2,984 votes. Sheetal Bagdi from Ward 33 and Rekha Saini, wife of former councillor Dinesh Saini from Ward 36, have been given tickets by the BJP. Dinesh Saini contested the 2017 corporation election as an independent candidate from Ward 8 and won by 98 votes. Sheetal Bagdi also contested as an independent and won. In the 2017, MC elections, 14 candidates won on BJP tickets. But this time the tickets of

many have been refused. Shankutala Yadav contested the election from Ward 2 on a BJP ticket and won by 2010 votes. But this time the party did not give her a ticket. Similarly, Ravinder Yadav from Ward 3 secured his victory by 1249 votes on a BJP ticket, but this time he lagged in the race for the ticket. Former Mayor Vimal Yadav's wife, Rimple Yadav, got a ticket from Ward 5, and she won by 906 votes. This time she did not get a BJP ticket. Ashwini Sharma from Ward 23 and Sunita from Ward 33 were victorious on BJP tickets, but this time they could not get the ticket. In the 2017 elections, BJP won 14 out of a total of 35 seats. Congress did not contest the election on its symbol, due to which several independent candidates won. Many of them later joined the BJP. After this, the BJP got a total of 27 members in the corporation house.

SC's Justice Oka pulls up Maharashtra government for poor infrastructure

Supreme Court (SC) Justice Abhay Oka on Saturday criticised the Maharashtra government for lack of basic infrastructure for the judiciary, while asserting the situation in neighbouring Karnataka was different. Justice Oka was a judge in Bombay High Court before he was appointed as Chief Justice of Karnataka High Court, from where he was elevated to the apex court. Speaking at the Ashok Desai Memorial Lecture on the topic 'What ails our criminal justice system - some thoughts', Justice Oka said, "We struggle to get infrastructure from Maharashtra government. We lack basic infrastructure. It is very difficult to get infrastructure from Maharashtra government." He said judges of the civil court complex in Pune do not even have separate chambers. He, however, was quick to add that there has been change in the last five years. "It is very very different in Karnataka. There whatever the judiciary asks the Government gives. The scenario in Maharashtra is very different," Justice Oka said while pointing out that Kalaburagi bench of Karnataka HC looks like a five-star hotel. The ailments that plague the criminal justice system are too many and collectively the system has not fulfilled the expectations of the common man, Justice Oka opined. Speaking on capital punishment, the SC judge said he was personally against the concept and called for a debate on it with all stakeholders. "We really need to introspect if our system needs capital punishment. It is a debate whether the State can take someone's life. We need to see if capital punishment is a deterrent," Justice Oka said. The senior SC judge also emphasised that bail was the

rule and jail the exception. Referring to Section 41 of Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC), he said it was not necessary or mandatory for the police to arrest each and every accused even in cases where the offence is punishable with a jail term of more than seven years. "Presence of accused for investigation can be secured by issuing summons. But the ground level reality is very different. There is lot of pressure exerted on police machinery by citizens, NGOs, political leaders and media. Political leaders make statements that they will ensure the accused is arrested and put behind bars," the apex court judge said. "This is the sad reflection of the retributive tendency which still exists in our society. People still believe that once a person is arrested he is guilty," he said while criticising the ongoing trend of trial on social media. "Every citizen has right to criticise judgements. But it has to be constructive criticism. But this media trial or trial on social media platforms is not correct. People lack basic elementary knowledge of our criminal justice system. They do not know the difference between bail and acquittal. As judges we

cannot go by perceptions - what people say, what social media says. We have to go by evidence," he asserted. Justice Oka said two or three decades back, courts used to grant bail without going into the merits of the case but the same cannot be done now. With restrictions imposed on bail in new legislations like Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA), Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) and Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (NDPS), courts are forced to, prima facie, go into the facts of the case even while deciding bail pleas, Justice Oka pointed out. "Courts burdened with these cases are not able to hear regular bail matters. If you see very old cases, the HC used to just say bail granted. And no one used to say anything. But nowadays, the high courts and the Supreme Court have to do very tightrope walking," he said. "We need to go into details. Sometimes we say why so much details, sometimes we say why such short cryptic orders. Judges face criticism for not giving bail to people in some cases," Justice Oka remarked.

How many travel agents booked for human trafficking, Bajwa asks CM Mann

Punjab Congress leader Partap Singh Bajwa on Saturday alleged that the Bhagwant Mann government in the state has "failed" in curbing human trafficking. His remarks came on a day when a second plane carrying 119 Indian deportees from the US will land at Amritsar airport. Bajwa, Leader of the Opposition in the Punjab Assembly, asked CM Mann how many travel agents were booked for human trafficking in the last three years. He said the Punjab Prevention of Human Smuggling Act 2012 regulates the profession of travel agents to check and curb illegal activities. "Can CM Bhagwant Mann, who also holds the Home portfolio, let the Punjabis know how many travel agents have been booked under the same law in the last three years," Bajwa asked. "Mann said that illegal immigra-

tion is not only a problem in Punjab but a national problem. True, but, is his government not responsible if any illegality happens in the state? He seems to have been running away from his responsibilities," the Congress leader said in a statement. It was AAP's one of the main

election planks to stop the brain drain by motivating youngsters to explore careers in the home state, he added. Bajwa said it has been 10 days since the first flight carrying 104 deportees including 30 Punjabis arrived in Amritsar. But the Mann government "failed" miserably to provide a

helping hand and announce any rehabilitation programme for deportees hailing from Punjab, he alleged. Mann has not announced any compensation for them, he further said. The AAP government has not assured them that the government would help them get their

money refunded by the illegal travel agents, said Bajwa. "Mann says he is going to receive the 119 deportees arriving today in Amritsar. In the absence of a rehabilitation programme and compensation, this act of Mann is nothing more than a publicity stunt," he said. A plane carrying 119 illegal immigrants from the US will land at the Amritsar airport on Saturday, the second such batch of Indians to be deported by the Donald Trump administration as part of its crackdown on illegal migration. The flight is expected to land at the airport around 10 pm on Saturday, official sources said. Among the 119 deportees, 67 are from Punjab alone. Of the rest 52 deportees, 33 are from Haryana, eight from Gujarat, three from Uttar Pradesh, two each from Goa, Maharashtra and Rajasthan, and one each from Himachal Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir.

TRUMP'S UNSETTLING POLICIES

Two top European leaders stiffened their spines on Saturday over unsettling new policies from Washington under President Donald Trump, as Ukraine's president urged creation of an "armed forces of Europe" and the leader of Germany denounced meddling in its election after US Vice President JD Vance met

with a German far-right leader. Strident speeches from Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and German Chancellor Olaf Scholz on Day 2 of the Munich Security Conference testified to the impact of a blizzard of Trump decisions that have resonated at home and in Europe,

notably his hopes to end the Russia-Ukraine war and nurture perceived allies on the continent. Ramping up his desire for a more muscular and mighty Europe, Zelenskyy said Ukraine's three-year fight against an invading Russian army has proved that a founda-

tion exists for the creation of a European army that has long been discussed among some continental leaders. "I really believe that time has come," he said. "The armed forces of Europe must be created." It's unclear whether the idea will catch on with European leaders. Zelenskyy has sought greater military and economic support from the European Union for years and repeatedly warned

that other parts of Europe could be vulnerable to Russia's expansionist ambitions too. While the bloc — along with the United States — has been one of Kyiv's strongest backers, pockets of political disagreement in EU over its approach to Moscow and economic realities, including national debt levels that have crimped defence spending, have gotten in the way of greater support. Earlier, German Chancellor Olaf Scholz said he was "pleased" at what he called a shared commitment with the United States to the "preserving the sovereign independence of Ukraine," and agreed with Trump that the Russia-Ukraine war must end.

But also Scholz took aim at the new political tack from Washington, affirming his strong stance against the far-right and said his country won't accept people who "intervene in our democracy" — alluding to remarks by US Vice President JD Vance who scolded European leaders over their approach to democracy. Ahead of February 23 elections in Germany, polls show the far-right Alternative for Germany (AfD) party — whose co-leader met with Vance on Friday — currently in second, ahead of Scholz's own Social Democrats.

Hamas-led militants released three male Israeli hostages on Saturday and Israeli forces freed hundreds of prisoners in return, in the latest indication that a fragile ceasefire that had teetered in recent days is holding. Militants in the southern Gaza Strip paraded the three hostages — Iair Horn, 46, a dual citizen of Israel and Argentina; American-Israeli Sagui Dekel Chen, 36; and Russian-Israeli Alexander (Sasha) Troufanov, 29 — before a crowd before releasing them. They were transported to Israel to be reunited with their families and to receive medical evaluation in a hospital. All had been abducted from Kibbutz Nir Oz, a community that was hard-hit in the October 7, 2023, attack that ignited the war. They appeared pale and worn, but seemed in better physical condition than the three men released last Saturday, who emerged emaciated from 16 months of captivity. A tense dispute had jeopardised the nearly four-week-old truce in recent days and threatened to renew the fighting.

US President Donald Trump's controversial proposal to remove more than 2 million Palestinians from Gaza and settle them elsewhere in the region has cast even more doubt on the future of the ceasefire. But Hamas said on Thursday it would move ahead with the release of more hostages after talks with Egyptian and Qatari officials. The group said the mediators had pledged to "remove all hurdles" to ensure Israel would allow more tents, medical supplies and other essentials into Gaza. As with previous exchanges, the hostage release was heavily choreographed, with the captives made to walk onto a stage and speak into microphones before the crowd. Dozens of masked, armed Hamas fighters lined up near the stage festooned with Palestinian flags and banners of militant factions. In Tel Aviv's Hostages Square, a huge cheer went up as the hostages were transferred to the Red Cross. "Iair, Sagui and Sasha are on their way home!" an announcer said. In return for the hostages' release, Israel began releasing 369 Palestinian prisoners and detainees. A bus carrying the first

released prisoners arrived in the occupied West Bank town of Beitunia and were greeted by a cheering crowd of relatives and supporters. Some appeared gaunt, and the Palestinian Red Crescent emergency service said four were immediately taken for medical treatment. Most of those released were transported to Gaza, where a large crowd greeted them in Khan Younis, the same town where the hostages had been released hours earlier. It is the sixth swap since the ceasefire took effect on January 19. Before Saturday, 21 hostages and over 730 Palestinian prisoners were freed during the first phase of the truce. Horn was abducted along with his brother, Eitan Horn, who had been staying with him at the time. Eitan, 37, remains in captivity and is not on the list of hostages expected to be released in the ceasefire's first stage. "Now, we can breathe a little. Our Iair is home after surviving hell in Gaza," his family said in a statement. "Now, we need to bring Eitan back so our family can truly breathe." Dekel Chen had been working outside when militants stormed the kibbutz. His pregnant wife, Avital Dekel Chen, hid in a safe room with their two daughters. She gave birth to their third daughter two months later. Speaking to Israeli media Saturday, she said she was overwhelmed with happiness to see Sagui back in Israel, where he will meet his youngest daughter, Shachar, for the first time. Troufanov, whose father was killed during the October 7 attack, was taken hostage along with his grandmother, mother and girlfriend. The three women were released during a brief ceasefire in November 2023. Troufanov was informed of his father's death after his release, shortly before being reunited with his family, who said they were "overwhelmed with emotion and gratitude" as he crossed into Israeli territory.

February 23, and then the Men in Blue will take on New Zealand on March 2 to round off their league engagements. The confidence - of the fans and the team - has been boosted by India's recent 3-0 ODI series whitewash at home over England. Those supporters assembled at the Mumbai airport will be hoping that the icons led by Rohit and Kohli will pull off another triumph like they did in the West Indies last year. One last opportunity for greats? Few months ago, Hardik Pandya had walked out with the T20 World Cup trophy hoisted on his shoulders to join a sea of passionate fans on the streets near the Wankhede Stadium for an open bus parade. If those scenes are to be repeated next month, then India will need some runs from Rohit and Kohli, who have topped heavy criticism after repeated failures in Test cricket. But they replied in kind, as Rohit made a characteristically fluent hundred - a 90-ball 119 in Cuttack ODI against England - and Kohli his 73rd fifty in Ahmedabad.

Wrestlers appeal for Albania Ranking Series approval

Asian champion Sunil Kumar, U-23 Asian Championship gold winner Minakshi and several other Indian wrestlers gathered at Sports Minister Mansukh Mandaviya's residence on Saturday, seeking his intervention to secure approval for their participation in the upcoming Ranking Series in Albania. The ministry has withheld approval for the wrestlers to participate in the second Ranking Series of the year scheduled to take place in Tirana, Albania, from February 26 to March 2. "We are unable to participate in the tournament and hence we came to the minister's residence to request him to let us participate in the tournament," Kumar said. "It will help us in the Asian Championship in Amman in March (as points will decide) the draws and first-round bouts," he added. However, the minister was travelling and unavailable. The gathered bunch of 8-10 wrestlers waited till about 2pm outside his residence before dispersing. "Earlier, we were not allowed to participate in World Ranking Championship in Croatia, and now we are not allowed to go to Albania. We came here to

request, we don't know the reason," Minakshi said. "We are 30 wrestlers, there is no response. We came here and got to know that the minister is not here." The ministry has cited the Wrestling Federation of India's (WFI) failure to submit the necessary recommendations on time as the reason for withholding the approval. WFI had sent the proposal to the Sports Authority of India (SAI)

on January 30, almost a month before the start of the tournament, a WFI source had told PTI on Friday. Due to the ongoing tussle between the ministry and the suspended WFI, the wrestlers had also missed the first Ranking Series in Zagreb, Croatia. Although the WFI was suspended by the ministry in December 2023, it remains recognised by the international wrestling body (UWW).

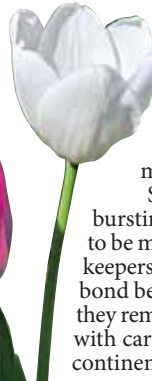
TULIPS BLOOM IN DELHI

The movie is directed by Dani Girardwood and Charlotte Fassler, this film is an English-language adaptation of the 2023 Spanish hit and people's loved Culpa Mía, based on Mercedes Ron's Wattpad-originated Culpables trilogy. A SKY FULL OF WINGS

Discover a world untouched by noise, where only the wings of birds break the silence, says **SAKSHI PRIYA**



There's something deeply soothing about the presence of birds. No matter where you are, the soft flutter of wings or the distant call of a bird can instantly transport you to a place of peace. Birds seem to fill the air with a quiet kind of company that makes you feel connected to the world around you. Unlike most popular nature spots, this wetland remains hidden from the typical tourist routes, untouched and unhurried, just waiting for someone to notice its magic.

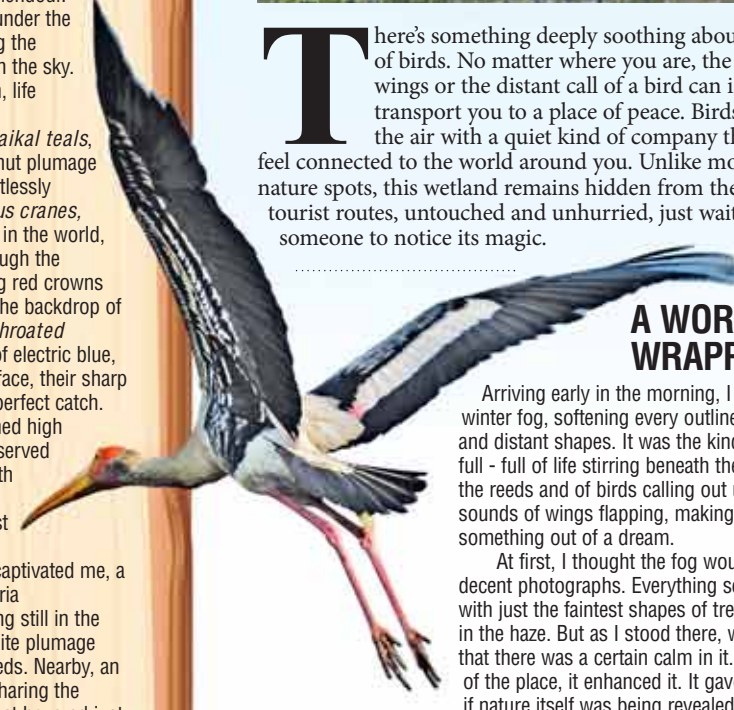
I found this solace in the *Dhanauri Wetlands*, near *Thasrana* in *Uttar Pradesh*, a place that feels like a hidden sanctuary untouched by the noise of modern life. Unlike crowded nature reserves, it does not call out for attention. Instead, it waits patiently, its beauty unfolding only for those willing to step into its stillness. It was in this mist-laden landscape that I discovered the true magic of being among birds, where silence speaks, and nature embraces you without asking for anything in return.

WHEN THE SKY COMES TO LIFE

Around 11 AM, the sun began to work its magic. The first rays of sunlight began to filter through, slowly dissolving the fog. The *Dhanauri Wetlands* were finally revealed in all their splendour. The lake shimmered under the golden light, mirroring the movements of birds in the sky.

In every direction, life unfolded in the most mesmerising ways. *Baikal teals*, their green and chestnut plumage gleaming, glided effortlessly across the water. *Sarus cranes*, the tallest flying birds in the world, waded gracefully through the shallows, their striking red crowns standing out against the backdrop of endless blue. *White-throated kingfishers*, streaks of electric blue, darted across the surface, their sharp beaks poised for the perfect catch. *Black drongos*, perched high on bare branches, observed their surroundings with quiet confidence.

Then, in the midst of it all, I spotted something that truly captivated me, a *Painted stork* (*Mycteria leucocephala*), standing still in the water, its pink and white plumage vibrant against the reeds. Nearby, an *Ibis* sat motionless, sharing the space with an egret that hovered just above. They did not interact, nor did they compete. They simply coexisted, bound by the same stillness that surrounded them. It was a reminder that nature does not rush, nor does it seek control, simply is.



A WORLD WRAPPED IN FOG

Arriving early in the morning, I was greeted by a thick blanket of winter fog, softening every outline, blurring the edges of trees, water and distant shapes. It was the kind of silence that didn't feel empty but full - full of life stirring beneath the mist, of whispered movements in the reeds and of birds calling out unseen. The cold air carried distant sounds of wings flapping, making the entire landscape feel like something out of a dream.

At first, I thought the fog would ruin my chance of getting any decent photographs. Everything seemed swallowed up by the mist, with just the faintest shapes of trees and water appearing like ghosts in the haze. But as I stood there, waiting for the fog to clear, I realised that there was a certain calm in it. The mist didn't obscure the beauty of the place, it enhanced it. It gave everything a sense of mystery, as if nature itself was being revealed slowly, almost deliberately.

A FRAGILE HAVEN WORTH PROTECTING

Yet, as untouched as it seems, the *Dhanauri Wetlands* are not invincible. Like many natural spaces, they face growing threats from habitat destruction, pollution and human encroachment. It's easy to assume that places like this will always exist, remaining undisturbed and waiting for the next visitor to discover them. However, the truth is, without conscious effort to protect them, they may not. For those who have ever found comfort in nature, who have stood still just to listen to the world breathe, places like *Dhanauri* are not simply landscapes. They are living sanctuaries, home to thousands of species, each playing its part in the delicate balance of life.

A PLACE THAT DEMANDS NOTHING BUT PRESENCE

One of the most striking things about *Dhanauri Wetlands* is not just its visual beauty but its quietness. In a world constantly buzzing with movement and noise, finding a place that does not demand attention, but instead rewards those who choose to be present, is rare. There were no distractions here, no honking cars, no flashing screens, just the simple, unbroken sounds of water lapping against the shore, wings flapping overhead and birds calling out to one another.

It is a place that does not overwhelm but instead invites you to slow down. Whether you're there to watch the birds, capture the beauty through your camera or just enjoy a moment of peace, it offers more than a pretty sight, it gives you a sense of connection to something much bigger than yourself.

A SANCTUARY ON THE BRINK

The *Dhanauri Wetlands* are at risk, once a sanctuary for birds like the *Sarus Crane* and *Painted Stork*, now threatened by encroachment and neglect. With land repurposed for construction, the ecosystem is shrinking and disrupting its delicate balance. Water pollution and disappearing green buffers worsen the crisis. Without urgent protection, this vital habitat, which supports biodiversity, flood control and climate regulation, may soon be lost, leaving behind only memories of its once-thriving wildlife.



Recognised as an Important Bird Area (IBA) by BirdLife International and extensively studied by the Bombay Natural History Society (BNHS), *Dhanauri* plays a pivotal role in global bird conservation. Each year, between November and March, the wetland transforms into a sanctuary for over 50,000 migratory waterfowl, reinforcing its importance as a breeding and nesting ground



A MOMENT WITH NATURE

At *Dhanauri Wetlands*, you'll find yourself surrounded by the beauty of nature. Expect to spot the striking *Baikal Teal*, the towering *Sarus Crane* and the graceful *White-throated Kingfisher*. The *Black Drongo* and *Citrine Wagtail* add charm to the scenery, while the *Painted Storks* and *Ibis* soar across the sky, truly making you feel one with the wilderness. The *Bull-headed Shrike* perches quietly, surveying the land, while flocks of birds move in perfect harmony, painting the wetlands with life.

The *Sarus Crane*, the world's tallest flying bird, glides through wetlands with elegance, its vivid red head and long legs creating a breathtaking sight in nature's tranquillity

At a time when rapid urbanisation threatens natural ecosystems, *Dhanauri Wetlands* stands as a critical stronghold for avian biodiversity. Home to over 150 *Sarus cranes*, the state bird of *Uttar Pradesh* and sheltering 217 bird species, including 23 endangered and vulnerable ones, this wetland is an ecological necessity.

waterfowl, but the push for conservation has yet to gain the urgency it deserves. With habitat loss accelerating, the fate of *Dhanauri* is about the larger battle to protect our natural heritage before it is too late.

A JOURNEY WORTH TAKING

If you decide to visit, go early in the morning, before the mist lifts completely. Walk quietly along the lake's edge, listen to the calls of unseen birds and let yourself be immersed in the stillness. Watch as the fog dissolves into golden light, revealing a world teeming with life. *Dhanauri Wetlands* is an experience, a reminder that, in the presence of birds, you are never truly alone.

And let us talk about Bhagyesh Tekriwal and Utkarsh Khandelia, the brains behind *Sorbo*, a Mediterranean restaurant that speaks volumes of their dedication. While not as young as the others, their work reflects the

same meticulous approach, one where the food is the hero, not just the ambiance.

Moving beyond the NCR, Jaipur has its own rising star in Sagar Naggal, the force behind *Swinton House*. Built within an old haveli once owned by a British architect, the restaurant curates a menu inspired by his favourite dishes from around the world. The charm of the setting, combined with a well-thought-out culinary selection, makes it a standout in the Pink City's ever-growing food scene.

Further north, in Mohali, Arpit Singh is making waves with *Prey*, an avant-garde concept built over a dam.

With open-air dining lit by kerosene lamps, the space exudes a dreamy, romantic charm, setting the stage for an unforgettable dining experience. His vision proves that ambience and cuisine can come together to create something truly special.

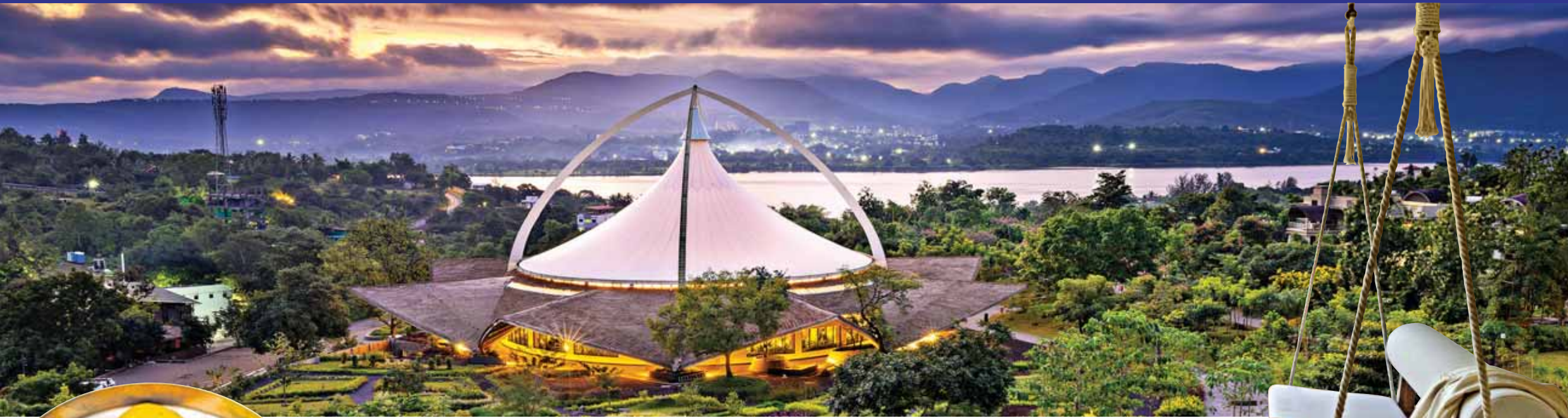
Just today, I met Muskan Katyal, the niece of Porus

Arora, the name behind *Sticky Rice, Enoki*, and more. She is the same age as Tusheeta and Anant and is already making waves with *Mala Project*, a Gurgaon-based restaurant dedicated to the fiery flavours of Chinese Mala cuisine. Her involvement in the project along with Porus and Tanvi Arora is not just token ownership, she is hands-on, ensuring the authenticity of every bite.

As a newcomer to wellness retreats, I wasn't sure what to expect. My understanding of wellness was limited to exercise and meditation, which I had found rather mundane. However, in search of a reset, I embarked on a three-day journey that would challenge my preconceptions in the most delightful way.

Upon our arrival in Pune, we were greeted by a gracious driver who took us on a scenic 1.5-hour drive to the retreat. Having expected bland, restrictive meals, I indulged in a Vada Pav before arriving at *Swastik*. But from the moment we stepped onto the property, the experience exceeded all expectations. The resort's design, crafted by TAOSTUDIO, is deeply inspired by the five core elements, Earth, Air, Water, Fire and Space, which form the foundation of its architectural brilliance. The property is structured around five key dimensions of life, Health, Wealth, Love, Bliss and Spirituality, ensuring that nature is woven into every aspect of the experience.



Unique Rituals and Therapies

That evening, we experienced *Swastik's* signature sleep ritual. Two therapists arrived at our Guha to perform a soothing bedtime routine, applying calming oils, offering a relaxing foot massage, and tucking us in with mindful silence. Whether it was

the exhaustion, the tranquility, or the therapy itself, I drifted into deep, restful sleep almost instantly.

Architectural & Philosophical Vision

Swastik's philosophy is embodied in its logo, a blooming flower representing the four core values of Health, Wealth, Love, and Bliss, all rooted in Spirituality, the central force of its existence. 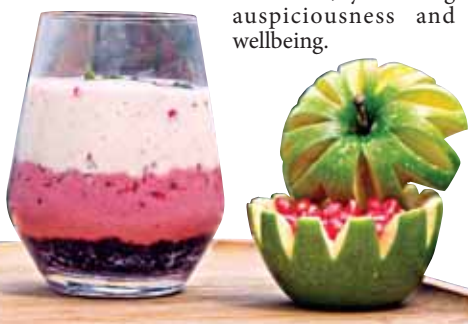

Each meal was a five-course experience, crafted from locally sourced, seasonal ingredients, many of which were grown on-site. Chef Arvind Joshi's thoughtfully curated menu transformed my understanding of healthy eating. It was nourishing, flavourful, and fulfilling without feeling restrictive.

A Retreat in Nature's Embrace

Nestled in the peaceful Peacock Valley, *Swastik* overlooks the backwaters of Khadakwasla Lake and the majestic Sinhagad, with the Sahyadri mountain range as its backdrop. Designed to honour nature's rhythms, from sunrise to moonrise, *Swastik* seamlessly integrates spirituality and wellness. The name itself, derived from Sanskrit, combines well, being associated with, symbolising auspiciousness and wellbeing.



Chettinad: Unleashing the Ghosts of Imagination

Though known for its stunning architecture, rich cultural heritage, and unforgettable cuisine, Chettinad hides a deeper mystery, the kind that stirs the imagination

less blend of European and Indian architectural styles. Built in the early 20th century, the palace boasts imported wood, marble, tiles, and mirrors from around the world. Its interiors, maintained with painstaking care, offer a rare glimpse into the grandeur of the Chettiars' past.

For those with a spiritual inclination, Chettinad is home to some remarkable temples. A visit here would be incomplete without exploring the Ariyakudi Thiruvangadamudaiyan Temple, dedicated to Lord Srinivasa. Built in the 17th century by Sevungan Chettiar, a devout Saivite, this temple was constructed after the divine Lord Venkateswara appeared to Chettiar in a dream, instructing him to build a temple in his village.

Chettinad also holds its share of ancient fortifications. The Thirumayam Fort, built in 1687 by Raja Raghunatha Thevar of Ramanathapuram, sits atop a hilllock. It encompasses temples, caves, a jail, and even a mysterious pond. From the highest point, I was rewarded with a stunning 360-degree view of the region—a moment of pure enchantment.

Another hidden gem is the Sathyamoorthi Perumal Temple, nestled in a cave. Here, a colossal reclining Vishnu statue lies in tranquil repose, flanked by celestial beings. The origins of this temple are shrouded in mystery, but it likely dates back to the 7th or 8th century, making it a fascinating site for both history buffs and spiritual seekers.

Beyond temples and mansions, Chettinad offers experiences that are equally

enchanting. One of the most fascinating aspects of the region is the unique Chettinad tiles, which are found in nearly every household. These tiles are not just decorative elements; they carry a rich legacy passed down through generations, each one telling a distinct story.

My journey through Chettinad also took me to what my guide called 'ghost villages.' I was intrigued by the idea of supernatural experiences. But as it turned out, there were no ghosts in the village. The term 'ghost village' actually refers to abandoned villages, deserted after families moved away in search of better opportunities. Over time, these homes have transformed into silent storytellers, their intricate exteriors and forgotten interiors speaking volumes of the past. Though these villages may be vacant now, they still stand resilient, holding onto the memories of a bygone era.

For accommodation, I stayed at The Park's Lotus Palace Chettinad, a stunning 17th-century mansion that transports you back in time. The moment I stepped in, I was captivated by the grandeur of the main courtyard, which featured hand-painted walls and a traditional lotus rangoli inspired by the Sahasradala Padma

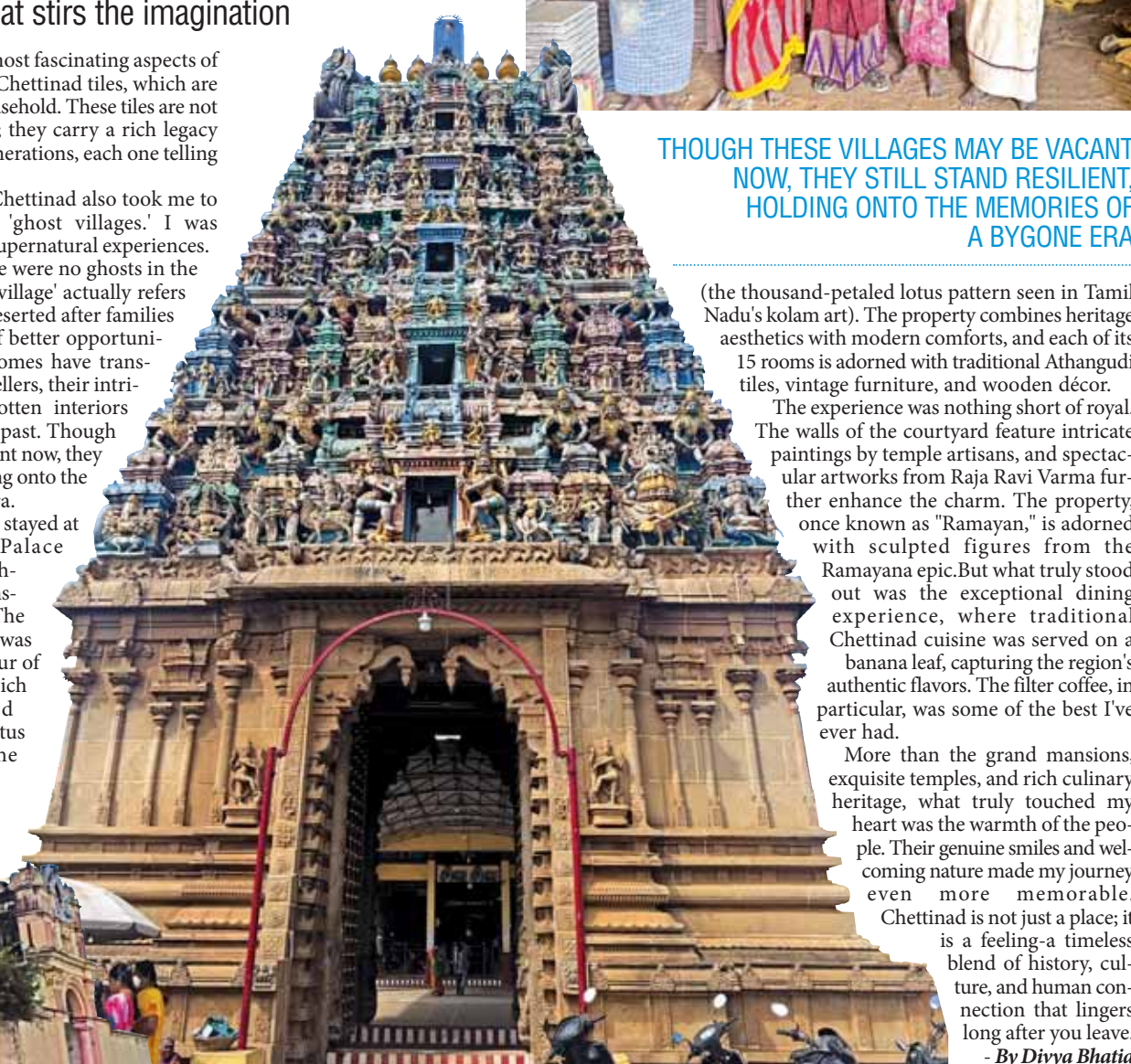
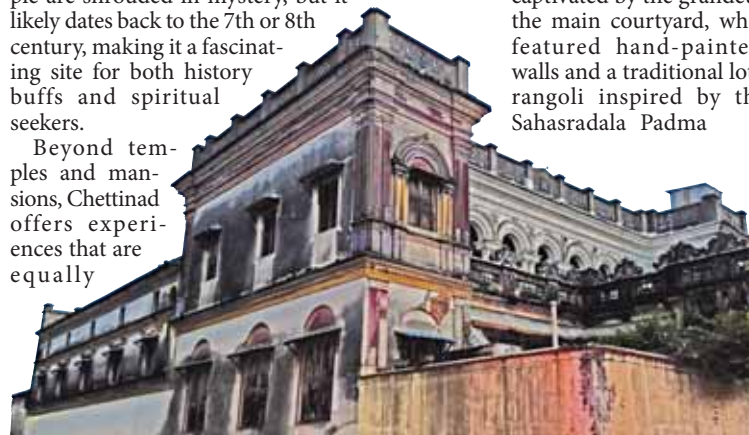
(the thousand-petaled lotus pattern seen in Tamil Nadu's kolam art). The property combines heritage aesthetics with modern comforts, and each of its 15 rooms is adorned with traditional Athangudi tiles, vintage furniture, and wooden décor.

The experience was nothing short of royal. The walls of the courtyard feature intricate paintings by temple artisans, and spectacular artworks from Raja Ravi Varma further enhance the charm. The property, once known as "Ramayan," is adorned with sculpted figures from the Ramayana epic. But what truly stood out was the exceptional dining experience, where traditional Chettinad cuisine was served on a banana leaf, capturing the region's authentic flavors. The filter coffee, in particular, was some of the best I've ever had.

More than the grand mansions, exquisite temples, and rich culinary heritage, what truly touched my heart was the warmth of the people. Their genuine smiles and welcoming nature made my journey even more memorable.

Chettinad is not just a place; it is a feeling—a timeless blend of history, culture, and human connection that lingers long after you leave.

Sacred Confluences: Reflections on Kumbh and Spirituality

On this quiet evening, as I sat with my friend while the sun painted the sky in gentle hues, memories of my recent visit to Kumbh Mela flooded back, sparking a deep conversation about spirituality and human nature. The cooling evening air seemed to sharpen our thoughts as we recalled the extraordinary scenes witnessed at Prayagraj.

The vivid images remained crystal clear in my mind – the swirling smoke from countless sacred fires, the endless sea of humanity moving like waves toward the Triveni Sangam, and the fascinating sight of sadhus wielding smartphones alongside their traditional implements. Each memory carried its own weight of meaning, prompting us to contemplate the unique blend of ancient and modern that defines today's spiritual gatherings.

As the evening shadows lengthened, I found myself describing the remarkable atmosphere at Kumbh – how the air seemed charged with collective faith and anticipation. The memory of millions of devotees waiting patiently, some for years, to take their sacred dip at the confluence sparked an interesting discussion about human psychology and spiritual seeking. What particularly struck us both was the contemporary evolution of this ancient gathering. I shared stories of seeing sadhus actively engaged with social media, posting their spiritual journeys online, their orange robes bright against the glow of mobile screens. This observation led us to ponder



how technology has transformed even the most traditional spiritual practices, creating a new kind of sacred space that exists both in the physical and digital realms.

Our conversation naturally flowed to broader questions about mental well-being in modern times. We discussed how the mind, like the converging rivers at Sangam, seeks its own confluences – between tradition and modernity, between spiritual seeking and everyday life, between individual practice and communal experience.

The evening's discussion reminded me of the various factors affecting mental health that I had observed during my visit. While

obvious threats like substance abuse were visible, we found ourselves more intrigued by the subtle, everyday habits that can gradually erode mental well-being. The irony of seeing people seeking spiritual awakening while simultaneously being tethered to their devices sparked a thoughtful dialogue about digital detachment and mindful engagement.

We explored how seemingly innocent modern habits can impact our cognitive health – from insufficient sleep to excessive solitude, from sedentary lifestyles to mindless overconsumption. The contrast with the disciplined lives of traditional sadhus pro-

vided an interesting perspective on balance and well-being.

As dusk settled around us, our conversation turned to the role of community and connection. The Kumbh experience highlighted how human beings naturally seek confluence – with others, with higher meaning, with themselves. Yet modern life often pulls us toward isolation, even as our devices promise greater connectivity.

The memory of watching countless devotees take their sacred dip led us to reflect on transformation – how people seek it, whether through traditional spiritual practices or modern means. We pondered

whether the sacred waters of Sangam truly awakened everyone who bathed there, or if the real awakening came from the intention and belief they carried within.

As our evening of reflection drew to a close, we realised that the Kumbh had offered us more than just spiritual spectacle – it provided a powerful lens through which to examine our own relationship with tradition, technology, and mental well-being. The smoke from the sacred fires, which had seemed so prevalent during my visit, now felt like a metaphor for the way old and new intermingle in our quest for meaning and mental peace.

Our twilight discussion revealed that while the tools and expressions of spiritual seeking may evolve, the fundamental human desire for connection, meaning, and well-being remains unchanged. Whether through ancient ritual or modern practice, we all seek our own version of the sacred confluence, where the rivers of tradition, innovation, and personal growth meet to form something greater than their individual streams.

As the first stars began to appear in the darkening sky, the insights gained from examining these memories of Kumbh through the lens of our conversation felt both profound and practical – a reminder that sometimes the greatest understanding comes not from the experience itself, but from the thoughtful reflection that follows.
