 $B_{\text{Sahib Singh first}}^{\text{JP's Pravesh}}$ rose in national politics in 2014 when he won the West Delhi Lok Sabha seat but his profile took a leap when he emerged as the giant killer in the Delhi Assembly polls after defeating AAP supremo and three-time chief minister Arvind Kejriwal. The 47-year-old Singh was a prominent Jat face of the party in the February 5 polls

and was considered the frontrunner for the post of chief minister which eventually went to first-time MLA Rekha Gupta. Singh was inducted as a minister in the Delhi cabinet.

Pravesh Sahib Singh, a son of former chief minister Sahib Singh Verma, has the reputation of a firebrand leader who publicly declared himself as Kejriwal's rival in the New Delhi seat held by the former Delhi CM for three terms.

By setting himself up for possibly the biggest challenge of the assembly polls, Singh mirrored what Kejriwal had done

Aprominent Sikh leader in Delhi's political landscape, Manjinder Singh Sirsa is an active social worker who was involved in organising 'oxygen langars' during the Covid pandemic. The leader, who turns (53) on February 28, was on Thursday sworn in as a minister in the new Delhi govern-

He took the oath in his mother tongue Puniabi.

His induction into the Delhi cabinet is seen as the BJP's effort to strengthen its support among the Sikh community, which has been critical of the party over its handling of the farmers' agitation, most of whom were Punjab, over the nowrepealed farm laws.

He had secured victory over AAP's Dhanwati Chandela by a margin of 18,190 votes in the Delhi Assembly polls. A three-time MLA Rajouri Garden, Sirsa quit Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) to join the BJP in

He first won the Rajouri Garden seat in 2013 on an Akali Dal ticket before switching to the BJP in 2017, winning subsequent elections under its banner. The Sikh leader has

also been actively involved in various relief efforts like the ones launched after the natural disasters in Nepal, Chennai, Uttarakhand, and



Delhi was first constituted on 17 March 1952 under the Government of Part C States Act, 1951, but it was abolished on 1 October 1956. but it was The legislative assembly of Delhi was re-established on January 2, 1992, following the enforcement (Sixty-ninth Constitution Amendment) Act, 1991, and the subsequent Government of National Capital Territory

of Delhi Act, 1991. In 1993, Madan Lal Khurana, constituency. In 1993, Madan Lal Khurana, Gurmukh Nihal Singh who known as "Delhi ka Sher"

(Lion of Delhi), became the first Chief Minister after the state Legislative Assembly was reinstated through the 69th Constitution Amendment Act, 1991. BJP had won 49 of the 70 seats, while Congress secured 14. Khurana's tenure was short lived. However, in 1995, his name

The seasoned, affable, BJP leader holding the fort successfully for the party in Delhi Assembly, municipal corporation, as head of the State unit free from any controversies, Vijender Gupta, was named as Speaker of the new Vidhan Sabha on Thursday. Vijender will preside from the same chair which on several occasions had got him marshalled out of the proceedings of the Assembly under the chief ministership of AAP supremo Arvind Kejriwal.

Vijender won in 2015 and 2020 from Rohini constituency even as Kejriwal's wave swept Delhi assembly polls. Incidentally, Kejriwal and erstwhile speaker Ram Niwas Goel are no longer members of the new assembly

As soon as Vijender was named as Speaker dramatic visuals of him being marshalled or dragged out of the Delhi Assembly went viral. He was previously also the leader of Opposition. Ten years ago, he was marshalled out of the Delhi Assembly amid much fury over allegedly derogatory remarks by a party colleague, OP Sharma, against then-AAP MLA Alka Lamba.Visuals from within the Assembly showed Vijender Gupta, dressed in a pristine white kurta-pyjama set - being lifted, shouting and twisting, by half-a-dozen marshals. The BJP leader even held tightly onto the furniture, fighting and resisting all the way out the

The ABY, whose implementation had been held back by the previous government, will be implemented in Delhi with a top-up of Rs 5 Lakh from the state government. PM Narendra Modi had announced the scheme for the whole nation, but Delhi could not get its benefits because of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP). This will be done at the earliest after the formalities are completed."

There are 14 CAG reports pending, which were not tabled by the previous government. They will be tabled during the first session of the Assembly. These decisions were taken today. We will take up our other commitments, give shape to each one of them and present them



Manipur Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla has urged the people of the strife-torn state to surrender looted and illegally held weapons within seven days, assuring no punitive action would be initiated against those giving up arms during this period. Centre cracks whip on OTT platforms

mid a row over vulgar jokes on social Amedia, the Centre has cracked the whip and warned OTT platforms against transmitting content that is prohibited by the law. In an advisory to over-the-top (OTT) platforms and self-regulatory bodies, the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting also asked them to strictly adhere to the Code of Ethics prescribed under the IT Rules-2021 ishing content including stricter adherence to the age-based classification of

I&B Ministry's advisory also asked self-regulatory bodies of OTT platforms to take appropriate proactive action for violation of the Code of Ethics by the platforms. The Ministry said it has received complaints from Parliament, Members of statutory organisations and public grievances regarding the alleged spread of obscene, pornographic and vulgar content published by certain publishers of online curated

content (OTT platforms) and social media. "In view of the above it is advised that the OTT platforms adhere to the various provisions of applicable laws, and the Code of Ethics prescribed under IT Rules, 2021 while publishing content on their platforms, including stricter adherence to the age-based classification of content prescribed under the Code of Ethics," the advisory said.

It said the Code of Ethics, inter-alia, require OTT platforms not to transmit any content that is prohibited by law, undertake age-based classification of content, based on general guidelines provided in the Schedule to the Rules, implement access control mechanism



for 'A' rated content to restrict access to such content by a child, and also exercise due caution and discretion.

The advisory also comes in the wake of the Supreme Court suggesting regulation on content on social media platforms.

The apex court had flagged the "vacuum" in law when it comes to sharing content on platforms such as YouTube and said "all kinds of things were going on". The court's suggestion came following a row involving YouTuber Ranveer Allahbadia on the show India's Got Latent. The court was hearing a plea filed by him, where he sought clubbing multiple FIRs against him in the matter. The plea also sought protection from arrest.

The court issued notices to the states of Assam and Maharashtra over Allahbadia's remarks and stayed his arrest in the Guwahati and Thane FIR. Additionally, the court ruled that no further FIRs should be filed against him in the same matter.

Tradition, legacy and ancestry will meet Digital India

dding another feather to the Adigital India movement, the Government has envisioned a unique way to digitise the century old multi-generation ancestry records commonly know as 'pothee' in custody of genealogy priests at various pilgrimage centres in India.

For instance next time a pilgrim visit Kashi Vishwanath temple in Varanasi, they may track the record of past visit to the temple by their ancestors or family members at the flip of their finger or click of a mouse

For this, National Archives of India has envisioned a project to digitise multi-generation ancestry records seeking to harvest traditional knowledge and community repositories and preserve them as a cultural heritage.

"NIA has approached these priests and the project will begin with Madhya Pradesh's Ujjain," said NAI Director General (DG) Arun wen, and the Nama Alemestor Men, and the Police Men, and the Nama Alemestor Men, and the Nama Alem

Singhal in his address at opening session of the meeting of the South and West Asian Regional Branch of the International Council on Archives (SWARBICA) here.

India is hosting a meeting of SWARBICA after a long time, currently in the position of the treasurer of this regional body of the Paris-based International Council on Archives (ICA).

In his address, Singhal also shared some details and figures related to the NAI's "ambitious programme" of digitising 300 million pages in a period of two years, as part of its project that began last year.

Before we started the project, our portal, Abhilekh Patal, was displaying about 10 million pages. In the past 7-8 months, the number has grown from 10 million to 84 million pages.. Every day, we are scanning about 400,000 pages. It is a process going well," said the National Archives of India (NAI) DG. "Shortly, we are



the course of this project that many documents had been left "untouched" in last 50-60 years and nobody had looked at them. "And, we realised these are in urgent need of repair, and conservation was required. So, we had to spruce up our conservation

Another project taken up by the NAI is "harvesting of traditional knowledge and community archives". "In India, if you go to Gaya, Kashi, Allahabad (now Prayagraj), Badrinath, Kedarnath, Jagannath Puri, Dwarka, there are priests there who document every some boxes and perhaps could go

visit by every pilgrim.

These documents are available with them. So, if you go there and tell them about your father's name, your grandfather's name, the place you belong to, they are able to come out with some documents, some 'pothis' (registers), which will contain genealogical records of such families," Singhal said.

He underlined that these ancestry records may even have archival information related to ten generations of many families.

This is traditional knowledge which has been put together in some 'pothis'. And, these 'pothis' can get destroyed. In a major flood in Kedarnath, some of these 'pothis' were wiped out," the NAI chief rued. Singhal emphasised that children

of many of these priests have taken up other career streams and even moved out of these old cities and, therefore, are "not interested in continuing this family tradition". These 'pothis' in all probability could end up getting locked up in

waste, he cautioned. "So, we said, we will try to digitise all these information. And, we approached these priests. And, I am happy to inform, the priests in Ujjain have agreed. So, we will start with Ujjain, we will digitise their records," Singhal said.

There are "more than 25 places" in India where such records exist, he underlined. "If we can digitise all of them, collate and compare the information contained in these records, it can become a very valuable database," the NAI DG

Cases filed against 101 accounts for No water to share with spreading misinformation on Kumbh

Uttar Pradesh Police have intensified their crackdown on misleading social media content and privacy violations related to the Mahakumbh, registering cases against 101 accounts across 10 incidents for spreading misinformation and objectionable material.

Authorities have taken legal action against two social media accounts for allegedly posting and selling explicit videos of women pilgrims bathing at the sacred event. The crackdown follows directives from Uttar Pradesh Police Chief Prashant Kumar to combat offensive content related to the religious gathering

The police's social media monitoring unit detected that certain platforms were uploading videos of women pilgrims bathing and changing clothes, violating their privacy. A case was lodged at the Kotwali Kumbh Mela police station. On February 17, a case was reg-

istered against an Instagram

On February 13, 15 accounts circulated a 2024 Bihar video, originally from a Pushpa 2 film promotion event, falsely claiming nationalist devotees had thrown slippers at army personnel at the Kumbh. On February 12, seven accounts falsely linked a 2021 video from Ghazipur, alleging bodies were floating in the Ganga due to a stampede. On February 9, 14 Twitter accounts misrepresented a Dhanbad, Jharkhand video. claiming UP Police assaulted devotees searching for missing family members.

On February 7, a Facebook account spread false claims about crowd management efforts in the Sangam area, portraying it as a stampede.

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Thursday said the state does not have a single drop of water to share with any other state.

Mann stated this before the Ravi Beas Water Tribunal set up for adjudicating river water disputes between Punjab, Haryana and Raiasthan. At a meeting with the tribunal led

by its chairman Justice Vineet Saran, members Justice P Naveen Rao and Justice Suman Shyam, and registrar Rita Chopra, the chief minister reiterated that the state has no spare water to share with any other state and there is no question of sharing even a single drop of water with anyone. Punjab has no surplus water to share with any other state and reassessment of availability of water is required as per international norms, Mann said, according to an official statement. He also urged the tribunal mem-

bers, who are in Punjab for a site visit of the Ravi water system, to deliver justice to the people of the

Mann pointed out that Punjab's

76.5 per cent blocks (117 out of 153) are over exploited where the stage of ground water extraction is more than 100 per cent, whereas in Haryana only 61.5 per cent (88 out of 143) are over exploited. As most of the river resources of the state have dried up, it needs more water to cater to its irrigation needs, Mann said.

However, Mann said the situation is so grim that Punjab only has scant water, which it is providing to its food growers.

In such a scenario, there is no question of sharing even a drop of water with any other state, Mann said.

The Punjab government has emphatically presented the issue of less availability of water on every platform, Mann said, adding that it is imperative to "protect the rights of our coming generations", the statement said.

The Punjab government is dutybound to ensure that the interests of the state and its people are safeguarded by all means, and no stone will be left unturned for it, Mann asserted. The chief minister also apprised the tribunal that the Yamuna, like Ravi and Beas rivers, also flowed through the erstwhile state of Punjab before re-organisation, but while apportioning river waters between Punjab and Haryana, Yamuna waters were not considered, whereas Ravi and Beas waters were duly taken into account for the apportionment.

Mann said Punjab has been requesting for its association in the negotiations for allocation of Yamuna waters, but "our request has not been considered on the ground that no geographical area of Punjab falls in the Yamuna

Harvana is not the basin state of Ravi and Beas rivers, but Punjab is forced to share waters of these rivers with Harvana, Mann said adding that if Haryana gets Ravi-Beas waters being a successor state of Punjab, Yamuna waters should also be shared with Punjab being a successor state fol-

The Punjab government is making strenuous efforts to use canal water for irrigation purposes, the chief minister said

lowing the same analogy.

Reportedly disgusted with lack of development of North Bengal she said if the Mamata Banerjee Government could not keep its promise then it should better let the northern part of the State go. "If you cannot develop North Bengal then it is better to bifurcate it," she said.

"There has been tall promises made by the Government. They have constructed an Uttar Kanya (a second secretariat at Siliguri in North Bengal), just for the sake of it, nothing happens there.

My simple logic is if you cannot develop North Bengal simply let it get separated," Chatterjee an MLA from Dabgram Phulbari constituency adjoining Siliguri

"This is not my call. This is the people's voice that I am raising. We are people's representatives and we have to listen to the refrains of the common voters

There is massive unemployment roblem, people have minimal facilities, there is continuous river erosion, hosts of other problems that the people are plagued with. They are asking us as to what we are doing in Kolkata. They are telling us to resign and return if we cannot do anything.

So I am forced to raise this issue. If the Government cannot develop let them segregate North Bengal," she said.

Though this is not the first occasion that a similar demand has been raised what makes Chatteriee's statements different is that it has for the first time made inside the Assembly and was recorded in the proceedings, experts said. Earlier other saffron leaders like John Barla and the saffron MLA from Naxalbari had raised such demands too. When asked to comment on the issue Sukanto Majumdar however said that, "division of Bengal is not the party's stand," adding however that the party wanted a composite development plan for North Bengal.

"We want the development of Bengal along the lines proposed by Dr Shyama Prasad Mukherjee. If regions like North Bengal are neglected then we will see if some other arrangement can be made, but we are not for division of Bengal," he said.

State Parliamentary Affairs Minister Sobhandeb Chatterjee however accused the BJP for hatching divisive plans after having failed to win in elections. They know that they are fast los-

ing the ground beneath their feat. They have failed to win elections repeatedly in North Bengal too they have lost ground losing all the recent by-elections. So they are making a hue and cry for partitioning Bengal. But this will not only be not allowed. This will also boomerang against them,' Chatterjee said.

In a major setback to the BJP-led MahaYuti government, a Nashik district court on Thursday sentenced State Agriculture Minister Manikrao Kokate of the NCP (Aiit Pawar) to two years' imprisonment and imposed ₹50,000 fine in the 1995 document tampering and fraud case

Delivering its judgement in the 30-year-old case, the Nashik district and sessions court convicted Manikrao Kokate and his brother Sunil Kokate in the documents tampering and fraud case and sentenced both of them to two years' imprisonment and imposed a fine of Rs 50,000 each on both of them. The court, however, acquitted two others named in the FIR of the case. With his conviction and sentence in a criminal case, Manikrao Kokate -a five-time MLA from Sinnar in Nashik district in north Maharashtra faces the threat of losing not

only his minister's position but also his membership of the Maharashtra Legislative

Assembly.

In her verdict handing two imprisonment to Manikrao Kokate and his brother, 10th Addl. Chief Judicial Magistrate, Nashik Rupali C. Narwadiya said that though the reputation of Kokate - being state Agriculture Minister "if he is punished" in the case", "law cannot condone such illegal

"No doubt, the reputation of the accused no.1 being a minister of the state in the agriculture department may be ruined if he is punished. But simultaneously, the law cannot condone such illegal acts merely due to the fact that the person is having a reputable position in the society. In view of creating deterrence, it is essential to give a strong message to the society that commission of offence like cheating and forgery are not tolerable irrespective of the post, or reputation of the person, and that justice does not see the culprit's post," the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate stated in 38-page judgement.

The case against Kokate brothers was filed by their political rival and former minister Tukaram Dighole of the Congress. Dighole had alleged that the Kokate brothers had forged documents to fraudulently obtain flats in the Nirman View Apartment, located on College Road at Nashik's Yeolekar Mala locality.

The Prosecution's case is that the Kokate brothers had claimed that they belonged to the low-income group (LIG), their income was lower than ₹30,000 each per annum and that they had no other properties, which allowed them to secure flats under the chief minister's 10 per cent discretionary quota. However, the subsequent investigations by the police revealed that they had falsified the documents to receive these benefits.

Delhi gets a woman CM

Rekha Gupta's appointment as Delhi's CM marks a historic milestone, making her the first woman to lead a BJP-ruled state

ekha Gupta has been sworn-in as the Chief Minister of Delhi, marking a significant milestone as she becomes the fourth woman to hold this esteemed position in the national capital. Budget powers India's green transition with clean tech push



By balancing economic growth with environmental responsibility, the budget boosts India's long-term energy transition and reinforce its commitment to a greener future

hile FM Nirmala Sitharaman's budget is tailored to drive consumption, propel long-term growth, and reinforce India's commitment to a greener world, proposals to power India's journey towards sustainability and net zero through various energy sector reforms, policies, and incentives stand out as they provide for a transformative shift in India's energy landscape. India's demand for power will continue to increase

The country has set an ambitious target of achieving net zero by 2070, a tall order. The power sector accounts for nearly one-third of India's total greenhouse gas emissions. While a country like India can't eliminate its reliance on coal-fired power with one stroke, transformative reforms in the power sector couldn't and must not

The path to carbon neutrality has to be paved with renewables. The Budget has provided the much-needed push to nuclear energy with the target of achieving 100 GW capacity by 2047 as part of India's long-term energy

transition strategy and achiev-

ing long-term economic and environmental goals.

The government wants to position nuclear energy as a significant pillar of the energy mix. This aligns with India's broader objectives of a Viksit Bharat that will be less reliant on fossil fuels. The proposal to launch a Nuclear Energy Mission will promote domestic capabilities, private sector participation, and enhanced deployment of advanced nuclear technologies such as small modular

With an outlay of Rs 20,000 crore for promoting research and development of SMRs, the government targets developing at least five indigenously designed and operational SMRs by 2033. The government will also bring in necessary amendments to the mative step for India's renew-

Liability for Nuclear Damage Act to facilitate the Mission and encourage private sector participation in nuclear power projects. This is a great initiative! The Budget proposal to incentivise electricity reforms and augmentation of inter-state transmission capacity by states will advance power distribution companies' financial health and capacity. Upon meeting the reforms initiated under the revamped distribution system scheme, states can borrow an additional 0.5 per cent of their gross domestic product over and above what they get under the FRBM Act.

Atomic Energy Act and Civil

This will significantly improve the efficiency of the power sector. These reform measures are part of the government's plans to support clean technology. The government also intends to promote clean tech manufacturing to improve domestic value addition and build a local ecosystem for solar cells, electrolysers, wind turbines, highvoltage transmission equipment, and grid-scale batteries, among other technologies.

The Budget marks a transfor-

able energy sector. The government's commitment to the 'Make in India' initiative and the new clean tech manufacturing policy will augment the development of solar PV cells, batteries, and other sustainable technologies locally in India.

These moves will contribute to the nation's clean energy iourney while fostering sustainable economic growth. The full BCD exemption of the scrap of lithium-ion batteries, Lead, Zinc, and 12 more critical minerals will help boost battery manufacturing in India and promote more jobs for our youth.

By reducing the BCD on solar panels by half to 20 per cent, the FM has provided animal spirits to the wind energy sector, which would further reduce the price of the panels and reduce India's imports by facilitating domestic production.

The increased allocation for solar power to promote rooftop solar projects is positive for solar module manufacturers and will boost RE

But do brave men commit suicide? ety, emotional upheavals, unpleasant feelings, panic attacks and phobias are all symptomatic of a fragile and delicate mind. It is an expression of an unpleasant emotion caused by the threat of danger

A fragmented mind is invariably a victim of irrational fear. Such an individual is unable to distinguish between what is logical and what is not. People suffer from extreme or irrational fear or aversion. This is nothing but what is called phobia (the Greek word for fear). A contributor to the magnification of fear is our pent-up emotions. These emotions are not based on a rational or scientific thinking pattern. We end up reacting violently or irrationally rather than responding in a coherent and clear-sighted manner. Humans should be prudent to ponder that if left untreated this situation can become mourning regalia.

A person can suffer from psychosomatic illnesses, loss of appetite, self-deprecatory behaviour or even schizophrenia. This has a multiplier effect in the form of morbid thoughts, persecution complexes and even hallucinations. An element of fear is perhaps required, because then we can patrol our fences. However, this needs to be distinguished from false bravado. Such an attitude will only be tantamount to mere filibustering or posturing. The brain is an organ and the mind is our intellect. The power of the mind needs to be magnified and enhanced to conquer fear. The mind is a movie theatre where the soap opera



of our life is enacted. We play, rewind and rerun an enormous number of movies. These are based on our idiosyncrasies and quality of thoughts. Thoughts are impacted by the kind of food we partake in (Tamasik, Rajasik, Sattvik), the company we keep and the amount of rest we take. The quality (guna) of food has a bearing on our disposition and approach to life. Tamasik food makes us sluggish, Rajasik food makes us feverish or anxious in disposition and Sattvik food makes us feel calm.

The first two lead us to fearful situations. If we are closeted to individuals who have a negative thought process, we imbibe such attributes and evince such a behavioural pattern. "Man is known by the company he keeps" is a very old adage and so is "man is born free but always is in chains". Suppose we have inspirational friends and achievers in our orbit, we will tread such a path. It is cardinal to have adequate physical and mental rest. If we are rested, then we are at peace and do not complain or quibble. Then we are physically and mentally alert and high-yielding. In our minds, we need to keep space to just dump the garbage that disappears into the recycle bin, never to appear again.

We need to pursue passions, hobbies, indulge in sports, participate in extracurricular activities, avoid negative company, take up initiatives, practice meditation, keep the mind occupied, footslog on the treadmill, go for long walks, go for treks, and read autobiographies of entrepreneurs and achievers. Others adopt the spiritual path by practising pranayama, learning yoga, undertaking the Art of Living course or observing the breath through the Vipassana technique

These holistic techniques metamorphose the mind to be in the present moment and overcome fear. To conquer fear, we need to log out of our comfort zone so that the virus of fear does not enter our operating system. And if nothing works out, one should surrender to the Divine and feel grateful.

SC stays Lokpal order on complaints against HC judges

The Supreme Court on Thursday stayed the Lokpal order on entertaining complaints against sitting high court judges saying it was "something very, very disturbing" and concerned the independence of the judiciary. A bench of Justices BR Gavai, Surva Kant and Abhay S Oka issued notice and sought responses from the Centre, the Lokpal registrar and the person who filed complaints against a sitting High Court judge.

"Issue notice to the Union of India, Registrar, Lokpal of India and the complainant, returnable on March 18 at 10.30 am," the bench said. Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Centre, said a High Court judge would never fall within the ambit of the Lokpal and Lokayuktas Act, 2013. Dealing with Lokpal's order on

two specific complaints against the sitting High Court judge, the bench, issued an injunction to prevent the complainant from disclosing the name of the judge and directed him to keep the complaint confidential. The top court was dealing with a suo motu case initiated after the Lokpal passed the order on January 27. The bench directed the regis-

trar concerned to mark the identity of the complainant and serve notice upon him at his residence through the registrar (judicial) of the High Court. "In the meantime there shall be stay of the order dated January 27, 2025 passed by the Lokpal of India...," it added. The top court went on to hold, "We injunct the complainant from disclosing the name of the judge against whom he has filed the complaint. The complainant is further directed to keep the complaint strictly



When the bench assembled, Justice Gavai told Mehta, "We propose to issue notice to the Union of India.

The Lokpal passed the order on two complaints filed against a sitting additional judge of the High Court. The complaints allege that he influenced an additional district judge in the state and a judge of the same High Court slated to deal with a suit filed against the complainant by a private company to favour the firm. The private company, it was alleged, was earlier a client of the high court judge in question while he was practising as an advocate at the Bar.

In its order, the Lokpal directed the complaints and relevant materials received in its registry in two matters be forwarded to the office of the CJI for his kind consideration. "Awaiting the guidance of the Chief Justice of complaints, for the time being, is deferred until four weeks from today, keeping in mind the statutory time frame to dispose of the complaint in terms of Section 20 (4) of the Act of 2013," said the Lokpal bench headed by Justice AM Khanwilkar on January 27.

The Lokpal added, "We make it amply clear that by this order we have decided a singular issue finally — as to whether the judges of the high court established by an Act of Parliament come within the ambit of Section 14 of the Act of 2013, in the affirmative. No more and no less. In that, we have not looked into or examined the merits of the allega-tions at all." The order noted it would be "too naive" to argue that a High Court judge would not come within the ambit of expression "any person" in clause (f) of section 14 (1) of the 2013 Act

The ministry in its reply, claimed that against a pro-rata requirement of 35.52 LMT from October 1, 2024, to December 3, 2024, a total of 38.27 LMT of DAP had been made available across states, with a closing stock of 9.05 LMT as of December 3.

"This response is not only eva-sive but also factually misleading. Reports from multiple states, including West Bengal, clearly indicate that there was a severe shortfall in the supply of fertilisers, directly contradicting the Ministry's assertion of adequate availability," Azad

He said the Chief Secretary of West Bengal, in an official communication dated October 29, 2024, explicitly stated that despite repeated requests and approved allocations, the state received only 57,510 MT of DAP, which he said is less than one-third of its sanctioned requirement for the Rabi season.

"This is an alarming gap that has severely impacted farmers at a crucial juncture in the agricultural cycle. Moreover, while the Ministry insists that sufficient stocks were available, ground reports reveal a grim reality. Farmers in various



regions struggled to procure fertilisers at critical sowing times, with many forced to stand in long queues or pay exorbitant prices in the black market," he said.

He added that even more concerning is the ministry's selective silence on the inadequate supply of other fer-tilisers. He said in November 2024, West Bengal requested 2 lakh MT of NPK (nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium), but received only 1.16 lakh MT — a mere 58 per cent of what it demanded.

"This is despite the fact that West Bengal produces over 20 lakh MT of chemical fertilizers annually. If a fertilizer-proannually. If a fertilizer-producing state itself faces such dire shortages, one can only imagine the plight of farmers in states that rely entirely on external supplies," he said.

He urged the agriculture minister to take action in this regard.

'Given the gravity of the situation, I urge the Ministry to take immediate corrective measures. This includes ensuring adequate and timely supplies of fertilisers, addressing logistical bottlenecks, and most importantly, acknowledging the existing shortfalls rather than evading responsibility," Azad said. The Delhi High Court has refused to quash an FIR against AAP MP Swati Maliwal for allegedly disclosing the identity of a 14-year-old rape victim who succumbed to injuries.

Justice Neena Bansal Krishna said Maliwal's claim that she was protected from prosecution as her actions were in good faith would have to be proved at an appropriate stage and there was no ground for closing the proceedings in the pre-

Delhi Police registered the FIR against Maliwal in 2016 when she was the chairperson of Delhi Commission for Women, and said there was a blatant violation of provisions of Juvenile Justice Act, which protect the identity of a minor victim of sexual offence.

"Prima facie, offence under Section 74 read with Section 86 of the Iuvenile Iustice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 is clearly disclosed. Insofar as the petitioner's claim that she has protection under Section 100 of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 for her actions done in good faith is concerned, it is her defence which is required to be proved in accordance with law at the said on February 13. The judge added, "Therefore,

there is no ground for quashing of the FIR and the proceedings..."Maliwal sought a courtmonitored probe in the matter, saying despite the minor's death, the police did not invoke the murder charge in the FIR.

The court said the prayer was infructuous as a chargesheet was filed in the two cases in relation to the incident and the cases were pending trial.

It is now for the trial court to consider them and no fruitful purpose would be served by referring further investigation to an SIT, the court said.

Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) director general (DG) Major General Mohammad Ashrafuzzaman Siddiqui also said "many new issues" under the common heads were discussed during his high-level talks with an Indian delegation headed by BSF DG Daljit Singh Chawdhary here.

The BSF chief, however, said the agenda points "more or less were the same with few changes here and there" as the Indo-Bangla border was a very "dynamic and active" border. This was the first high-level meeting of the two forces after the regime change in Bangladesh in August last year. Siddiqui, while speaking to reporters during a joint press conference with Chawdhary, asserted that authorities of his country took steps for the protection of the minorities as he

gave example of his force "personally" extending security cover to Durga Puja pandals within eight km of their jurisdiction along the international border.

The BGB DG also said they raised "objections" and "flagged a number of cases" during the bi-annual DG-level talks with regard to the fencing being done by India along the International Border and has requested for a "joint inspection" before the work is done. "The attacks on minorities in the recent past, I would say, that this is an exaggeration and to be honest such attacks on minorities per se did not hap-

er the BSF personnel," Chawdhary said. On the issues related to fencing discussed during the threeday talks that concluded on Thursday at the BSF head-quarters, the BGB DG said they have "highlighted the number of potential cases" where the construction of development works close to the IB were being done and this was the "most focussed" agenda during the latest talks.

He said 150 yards on either side of the zero line is considered a "no man's land" and both sides are not allowed to construct any permanent structure or any structure that has "defence potential", without the consent of the other party.

"The communication gap occurs when the fencing is required within the 150 yards...Beyond 150 yards we don't mind at all how long, how heavy or how high the fence is made," Siddiqui said.

Both he and the BSF DG said that they "hope to resolve these issues in the future" with the BGB DG saying a joint inspection will be carried out in such areas.

Asked about the instances of illegal infiltration from Bangladesh into India, both the chiefs said such instances had actually gone down across the 4,096 km long IB, post August five of last year.

'Enthiran' plagiarism case: ED attaches director's assets over ₹10 Crore

 $A^{\text{ssets worth more than}}_{\text{710 crore of the director of}}$ 2010 movie 'Enthiran' facing charges of plagiarism and copyright violations have been attached under the anti-money laundering law, the Enforcement Directorate said on Thursday.

This is possibly the first attachment of assets in the country under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), on grounds of plagiarism or copyright violation while making a movie, as per officials.

A provisional order was issued on February 17 under the PMLA attaching three immovable properties of the director, S Shankar, the ED said in a statement. The total value of these assets is ₹10.11 crore, it said. The money laundering case stems from a complaint filed by Aarur Tamilnadan, author of a story titled 'Jiguba', against Shankar before a court at Egmore in Chennai on

May 19, 2011. The complaint alleges that the storyline of the Tamil movie



Shankar, was copied from 'Jiguba' thereby rendering Shankar liable for violations under the Copyright Act, 1957 and some sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC), the ED said. 'Enthiran' was released in 2010 and featured Rajinikanth and Aishwarya Rai as the main lead. It grossed ₹290 crore world-wide, making it an all-time blockbuster at the time, the ED said. The federal probe agency said

its investigation found that Shankar received a "substantial" remuneration of ₹11.5 crore for his "multi-faceted" contributions to 'Enthiran', including story development, screenplay, dialogues, and direction.

by the Film and Television Institute of India (FTII) identified "striking" similarities between the story 'Jiguba' and the movie 'Enthiran'. This report, which examined narrative structure, character development, and thematic elements, lends significant support to the plagiarism allegations against Shankar, the agency said. 'Based on the substantial evi-

dence and records in hand, it has been determined that S Shankar has violated Section 63 of the Copyright Act, 1957,? a violation now classified as a scheduled offence under the PMLA," the ED said.

Five high court judges challenge recent | China begins repatriation of over 1,000 online transfers in Pakistan's Supreme Court

The controversy over the appointment of judges in the Islamabad High Court deepened on Thursday after five judges of the court challenged the recent transfers in Pakistan's Supreme Court.

Pakistan authorities last month appointed three judges to the IHC by transferring them from other high courts and shortly after appointed Justice Sarfraz Dogar as the chief justice.

Dogar made headlines when he was transferred to the IHC from the Lahore High Court (LHC). The move drew the ire of judges, lawyers and opposition parties as he was 13th on the seniority list of the judges but rose to the second position in IHC.

He rose to the top and was appointed as acting chief justice after the elevation of his predecessor, Aamer Farooq, to the Supreme Court.

His transfer to IHC and subsequent elevation was contested by five judges, including justices Mohsin Akhtar Kayani, Babar Sattar, Tariq Mehmood Jahangiri, Saman Rafat Imtiaz, and Sardar Ejaz Ishaq Khan, who claimed that they were senior to him and his appointment as chief justice was a violation of

They filed a 49-page constitutional petition under Article 184(3) through senior lawyers Munir A. Malik and Barrister Salahuddin, arguing that the recent transfer of judges violated relevant rules. The petition contends that judicial transfers cannot be made without public interest

seniority list. It further states that Article 200 only allows temporary transfers, and the current process violates Article 175(A) of the Constitution.

The judges have urged the Supreme Court to invalidate the Islamabad High Court's current seniority list, citing its inconsistency with Article 194 and the Constitution's Third Schedule.

SEBI considers fast track offers for REITs, InvITs

Markets regulator, Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) on proposed Thursday framework for undertaking fast-track follow-on offers by Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITs) and Infrastructure Investment Trusts (InvITs) to make fundraising more efficient.

Additionally, the regulator has proposed a lock-in provision of three years for preferential issue of units of REITs and

InVITs allotted to sponsors.
The SEBI has sought public comments by March 13 on the proposals.

In its consultation process, SEBI proposed that 15 per cent of the units allotted to sponsors and sponsor group will be locked-in for a period of three years from the date of trading approval granted for

Further, the remaining units allotted to them will be

year from the date of trading approval granted for the units. With regards to follow-on offer, SEBI said that the FPO is one of the mechanisms for raising funds subsequent to issue of units after initial public offer.

SEBI proposed that REIT and InvIT making an FPO needs to ensure that they made an application to all stock exchanges on which their units are listed and seek an invitation of the listing and seek and and principle approval for listing their units on such exchanges. They need to choose one of them as the designated stock exchange. The manager and the

merchant bankers should be responsible for obtaining inprinciple approval and final listing and trading approvals from the stock exchanges. The minimum public unit holding should be at least 25 per cent of the total outstanding units of the REIT on a post issue







Mahendra Singh Dhoni became a life coach for once to share his secrets for a stress-free existence, describing himself as a careless person who would not give up on a good night's sleep by paying attention to what others think The 43-year-old former India

wicketkeeper-batter, considered one of the game's greatest for captaining India to two World Cup titles in a storied international career, set a high benchmark for a leader with his calm and focused approach on the field.

He is now gearing up for what most believe is his final IPL season as a player with Chennai Super Kings and at an event here, he turned philosophical when asked to give advice to fans and followers.

"I think, keep life simple. Be honest to yourself, have gratitude towards people for whatever they have been doing for you. Don't always think, 'this is my birthright' and ask for more," the enigmatic big-



hitter said here on Wednesday evening during the launch of his app 'DHONI' powered by Single. Id where injured India keeper-batter Sanju Samson was also present.

'I know the whole app (DHONI) says 'thoda aur' (a little more), but the whole thing is to have that gratitude, to say thank you, to respect the elders (and) to give love to the younger ones," he added. He then went on to stress on the need to have a forgiving attitude, which he feels is in

short-supply right now.

"I always felt having a smile on your face solves half the problem. Even if you're not in a comfortable position, even if it's tough to do, have the power to forgive. That is one thing that not many of us have," said the cricketer who has never responded to the personal attacks on him by anyone, including former teammates or critics, some of whom have even accused him of hurting

"We have become a very revengeful people. Isne mujhe aisa bola, main aisa bola (He said something to me, I said something back)... Just forgive, move on, be happy in life, because whatever we do... When we're growing up, we always wanted to be happy in life," he further stated.

Dhoni said being careless towards a few things helps in balancing the pressure of day-

to-day life. "We all feel the pressure. We always say the grass is greener on the other side. We always feel that his or her life is better, but what is important is how you manage that stress, how prepared you are," he said. "I keep it very simple. Growing

up, we were told 'you cannot be careless'. But I feel in today's environment, it is important to be a bit careless because you can't worry about each and everything that is happening around vou. You cannot do things that are not in your control," he added.

Dhoni said those who are obsessed with perception are not particularly constructive. He felt not every opinion merits a response or even consideration.

"If you get carried away with what others are saying, what others are feeling, then that important thing of what needs to be done, often you are not really giving utmost attention to that," he said.

I am a bit careless in life. I don't give everything my 100 per cent attention because I feel this is important, (or) that's not important,"
