Cong cornered in INDIA bloc truck

Amid growing differences within the INDIA bloc, Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah Thursday dropped clear hints suggesting he was also on the verge of splitting ties with the opposition plank. Omar also demanded the INDIA bloc should be disbanded as the opposition parties were not on the same page in the run-up to the Delhi polls. Acerbic observations made by Omar, a close friend of Rahul Gandhi, have once again sparked speculation over the future of the Congress party in the INDIA bloc. While both AAP and the Congress are part of the INDIA bloc, the parties are contesting the Delhi polls separately.

Mamta Banerjee-led Trinamool Congress along with Uddhav Thackeray's Shiv Sena (UBT) and Akhilesh Yadav's Samajwadi Party (SP) have already announced their support to the Aam Aadmi Party in the Delhi elections leaving Congress party stranded in the multi-cornered poll battle. The subtle timing of Abdullah's remark, a day after Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) leader Tejashwi Yadav said the INDIA bloc had lost its significance and was formed specifically for the Lok Sabha polls, has also raised many eyebrows in the power corridors. "INDIA bloc was formed just for the Lok Sabha elections and to stop the victory march of the BJP. It has no significance now. The bickering between the

Congress and the AAP is not unexpected," the former Bihar Deputy Chief Minister said. Reacting to Abdullah's remark, Congress MP Manickam Tagore said the opinion of INDIA bloc allies was not binding on the party. "INDIA bloc allies will not decide what the Congress wants to do in Delhi," he said. Abdullah, whose National Conference is part of the INDIA bloc, Thursday said "It is unfortunate that no meeting of the INDIA bloc has taken place. Who will lead? What will be the agenda? How will the alliance move forward? There is no discussion on these issues. There is no clarity on whether we will remain united or not." "After the Assembly elections in Delhi, they (INDIA Bloc) should call all the alliance members for a meeting. If this

alliance was only for the parliamentary elections, it should be wound up, and we will work separately. But if it is also meant for Assembly elections, we will have to sit together and work collectively," Abdullah told reporters on the sidelines of a three-day long orientation programme of the newly elected legislators here in Jammu. In December 2024, When Trinamool Congress leaders started a campaign to aggressively push for West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee to head the opposition alliance, the Congress leader Rahul Gandhi directed the party's Lok Sabha MPs not to react to comments of "middle-and low-rung" leaders of INDIA bloc parties. Replying to another query on

increasing support for AAP ahead of next month's Delhi elections, Omar Abdullah said, "I cannot say anything about this at the moment because we have no involvement with Delhi polls. The Aam Aadmi Party, Congress, and other political parties on the ground will decide how to compete with the BJP strongly." Stating that AAP succeeded twice in Delhi previously, Abdullah said, "This time, we will have to wait and see what the people of Delhi decide." Meanwhile, National Conference President Dr Farooq Abdullah on Thursday said his party does not intend to "fight" New Delhi to collaborate with the central government to address the pressing issues of Jammu and Kashmir. Commenting on the unity within the INDIA bloc, Abdullah said the alliance is not just about contesting elections, but it is about strengthening India and eliminating hatred. "The alliance is permanent - it is for every day and every moment." "We don't want to fight New Delhi. We want to work together with Delhi to resolve the state's problems. We don't want to engage in battles. Those who want to fight can do so," the former chief minister told reporters here. Abdullah said the National Conference has nothing to do with the BJP, but it is the responsibility of the central government to support state governments in addressing local issues. "We are not with the BJP, nor do we have any connection with them," he said.

Bijli, Paani free on BJP's poll platter?

What was once criticised as "free ki revri" and "freebies" has now become the central focus for the political parties as they vie for votes in the February 5 Delhi elections. In a bid to match the ruling AAP's raft of pre-poll promises in Delhi, the BJP is likely to announce free electricity of up to 300 units for household, free piped water, and a Ladli Behna-like scheme (financial assistance of Rs 2500 for eligible women) to woo the voters in its manifesto for the upcoming assembly polls. Along with this, the BJP is also planning to provide free electricity of up to 500 units to religious places like temples and gurudwaras. Top sources said these recommendations are expected to be part of the manifesto. The

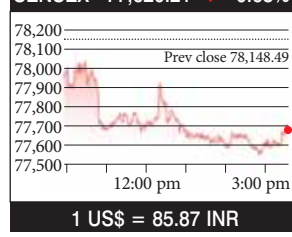

recommendations have been sent to central leadership for approval. According to sources, the manifesto committee has also recommended not doing away with schemes currently in place in Delhi including free public bus travel for women, up to 20 kilolitres of free water per month to domestic consumers, and free electricity to households that consume less than 200 units a

month. The AAP-led Delhi government currently provides free electricity for up to 200 units a month. Under the existing free electricity scheme, the Delhi government provides free electricity to consumers with a monthly consumption of 200 units. Whereas, a 50 per cent subsidy is given to people with a consumption of 201-400 units of electricity.

GRAP III invoked in the Capital

Rising air pollution level has once again forced the authorities to impose vehicle ban on BS 3 petrol and BS 4 diesel cars as the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) for Delhi and its adjoining area has imposed the Stage-III ('Severe' Air Quality) measures under the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP) for Delhi-NCR with immediate effect. The stage 3 also bans the entry of non-essential BS 4 diesel trucks into Delhi. The restrictions are not applicable for commercial vehicles involved in essential services "Persons with Disabilities shall be permitted to ply BS - III Petrol / BS - IV Diesel LMVs, provided that these are specifically adopted for them and are run only for their personal use," the CAQM said in a statement. GRAP Stage 3, which was revoked on Sunday, entails a ban on non-essential construction work.

Indian passport ranking slips

Even as outbound travel from India continues to grow rapidly and a growing number of destinations try to woo Indian tourists, obtaining a visa for travel has become harder for Indian travelers, the global ranking of Indian passport dropped five spots to 85th in Henley Passport Index 2025 even as Singapore reclaimed the top spot and Japan takes the second position. According to a press statement, as per the Henley Passport Index 2025, India has slipped from 80th rank in



the Henley & Partners said. As per the index for 2025, India stands at 85th while the ranking of Pakistan and Bangladesh stood at 103rd (101st in 2024) and 100th (97th in 2024), respectively. According to a data chart available on the firm's website, for the range of years from 2006-2025, India's rank was the lowest at 90th in 2021, while its best score was in 2006 when the country was ranked 71st. According to the passport index, the ranking of Pakistan and Bangladesh stood at 103rd (101st in 2024) and 100th (97th in 2024), respectively.

Naidu visits Tirupati stampede victims

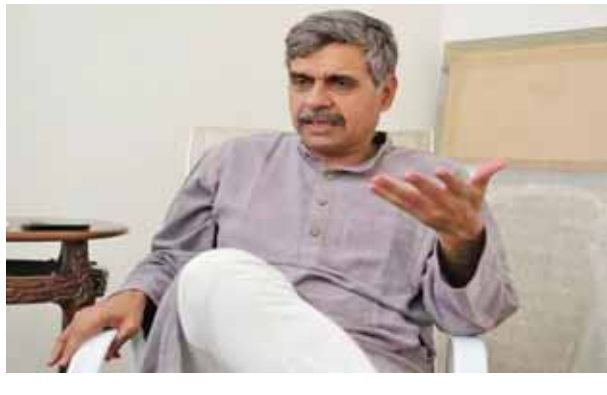

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu on Thursday visited the injured undergoing treatment in a hospital here following a stampede that left six people dead. Six devotees died and nearly 40 more were injured in the stampede at Bairagi Pattada near MGM School in Tirupati on Wednesday night as hundreds of them jostled for tickets for Vaikunta Dwara Darshanam at Lord Venkateswara Swamy temple on Tirumala Hills. Hundreds of devotees turned up from across the country for the 10-day Vaikunta Dwara Darshanam commencing from January 10. Earlier, Naidu visited the accident site where the stampede claimed six lives and injured many.

Congress still relevant in Delhi: Sandeep Dikshit

Congress candidate from the New Delhi assembly constituency and two-time East Delhi MP, Sandeep Dikshit, has accused the AAP of siphoning off Congress votes in other states, at a time when the ruling party has made serious allegation against him and his party for being in cahoots with BJP while dismissing AAP's claim of Centre hindering the Delhi government from functioning. The son of former Chief Minister Sheila Dikshit is a widely known critique of AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal, one of the reasons he stated for pitting him against Kejriwal in the upcoming elections. While the AAP has made several allegations against Dikshit and Congress for being hands in gloves with the BJP, Dikshit, in an interview with The Pioneer, shrugged them off claiming that the BJP is picking his criticisms rather than the other way around. "BJP is repeating what I am saying. They have never attacked Kejriwal on factual information. I have done that and I think it's good whoever is picking that up. Secondly, there is a critique and a criticism of AAP, which is not party-specific. Criticism is opposition-specific," he said. "If Yamuna is dirty, do you expect BJP to say something



else about Yamuna and us to say something else? We are in the opposition, we will attack you for all the things that you have not done. When they were in the opposition, AAP and BJP both called us corrupt in 2012-13. We could very easily say that you are saying exactly what BJP was saying. The role of the opposition is to criticize the government wherever it finds valid criticism," he said. He further raised questions on AAP fighting elections outside Delhi and claimed that they cut Congress votes to help the BJP. "They are really somebody who helps BJP win different elections and then they attack me," Dikshit alleged. Claiming that the AAP is afraid of Congress fighting the elections, he asked why the AAP is scared of him or AICC treasurer Ajay Maken when they say that Congress is not relevant in Delhi. "Their problem is that they are finding that the Congress is fighting full throttle and we are going to damage the prospects of both AAP and BJP very severely," Dikshit asserted. The senior Congress leader also asked for evidence from the ruling party for their allegations against the Central government for stopping their work. Remembering his mother's time, he said that the delay is obvious in Delhi where files have to be delivered to the Lieutenant Governor (LG) first for approval. However, he said that it is a matter of delay rather than denial. He claimed that the BJP has stopped the AAP from working where they believe they are indulging in corruption. "Otherwise, where is it that you've been stopped? Files will get delayed in Delhi because, unlike other states, where the Chief

Minister signs a file and it becomes policy, in Delhi's case, in many of the subjects, files have to go to the LG level," Dikshit added. While the AAP's narrative is centered around 'Phir layenge Kejriwal' (We will bring Kejriwal again), Kejriwal's rival said that even if he becomes one he will be a Chief Minister 'who will be in jail, or he will 'not do any work' because of the conditions put by the Supreme Court on his bail. "In the remote chance that AAP wins Delhi again, and you get elected as their leader, even if you get sworn in as Chief Minister, you cannot perform. Not even for a single day. This promise of Rs 2,100 he made to the women. In reality, if he signs that file, he'll go to jail. He'll break his bail conditions," the leader said, adding that AAP Convenor resigned from his Chief Ministerial post not as a sacrifice but because he knew that he cannot perform its duties. The Congress candidate also plans to remind people of the work his mother has done for Delhi and how Kejriwal has not been able to carry it on even in an 'average fashion'. Dikshit also claims that in case of any post-poll alliance, other parties will have to come to them and not the other way around as he is confident of a good performance by the Congress.

SC to review JEE-Advanced attempt limit

The Supreme Court on Thursday agreed to examine a plea against bringing down from three to two, the attempts given to Joint Entrance Examination (JEE)-Advanced aspirants. When the plea came up before a bench of Justices B R Gavai and Augustine George Masih, the petitioner's counsel said, "This matter pertains to the IIT (Indian Institute of Technology) admission entrance examination in which the number of attempts have been reduced from three to two." The lawyer said a similar plea was listed before the bench on January 10 following which the court directed both to be tagged.

CRPF launches online platform to adopt retired K9s for second life

The CRPF has launched a first-ever online service that allows common people to adopt retired sniffer and assault dogs from the country's largest paramilitary force to give these four-legged soldiers a comfortable second life. This is probably the first time that any security force has decided to offer their trained dogs for public adoption, as this move was always fraught with the dangers of misuse of these highly-skilled and motivated dogs by anti-national elements. Till now, the central forces and state police were handing over their retired dogs to registered NGOs or reputed organisations for their care. More than 30 canines from four

breeds — Belgian Shepherd Malinois, German Shepherd, Labrador and the indigenous Mudhol Hound — can now be adopted through a rigorous process that will be monitored by the CRPF's specialised Dog Breeding and Training School (DBTS) near Bengaluru. These canines, aged 8-12 years, have undertaken hundreds of operations in the anti-Naxal, counter-insurgency and counter-terrorism theatres across the country, saving lives of numerous troops from improvised explosive devices (IEDs) and deadly ambushes laid by Maoists or terrorists, a senior officer told PTI. Baloo, Sweetie, Veeru, Moby, Coco, Stroll and their colleagues have been trained in various sniffer and combat streams such as explosive

detection and tracking, infantry patrol and assault, etc. The officer said the adoption is free and the adopter can check the force's website to gather basic details and pictures of the dogs up for adoption, fill up a form stating their "motivation and intent" for adopting a retired police K9, and state how they plan to engage the canine — like a companion, guard or a therapy dog — along with details of the proposed accommodation for the adopted dog. "A compatibility meeting between the adopter and the dog will be organised at a designated camp where the retired canine is housed. We have also got these selected canines groomed by dog behaviour experts so that they can adjust in a homely environment,"



the officer said. A brief profile, picture and citation of these "soldier buddies" have been hosted on the CRPF portal, making it clear shall take care of the "K9 hero with dignity, due diligence and compassion". The force, as part of this adoption process, will sign a "legally-

binding" agreement with the adopter and will provide a KCI (Kennel Club of India) registration certificate, medical and vaccination records, and other vital documents of these canines. "Initiating public adoption of our retired dogs is an effort to ensure a happy second life for our canine soldiers," CRPF Deputy Inspector General Moses Dhinakaran told PTI. It has been made clear in the terms and conditions of the adoption process that there shall be no "abuse or ill-treatment" of the K9 and that they should not be sold, used for any purpose to earn money, or deployed against any person. The guidelines state that CRPF officers should be allowed for "periodic verification" of the

adopted dogs, including regular communication with their handlers through short videos and live videoconferencing. "The adopter shall give emotional support if the K9 is found in distress, and extend all therapeutic care as required for a geriatric dog," the guidelines state. The force hopes that these brave loyal soldiers get a good home and family as it writes about Zina, a female Belgian Shepherd Malinois, how she is "loyal with a balanced temperament, making her an ideal companion for families looking for a protective yet gentle dog". With about 3.25 lakh personnel in its ranks, the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) is the leading internal security force of the country which functions under the Ministry of Home Affairs.

TS Singhdeo slams GST regime: Calls it 'For the Rich, by the Rich'

Former Deputy Chief Minister of Chhattisgarh, TS Singhdeo, on Thursday alleged that the current Goods and Services Tax (GST) regime was taking money out of the pockets of the common people. Singh, addressing a press conference at the Madhya Pradesh Congress Committee headquarters in Bhopal, said that the current GST is "of the rich, by the rich, for the rich."



GST, while the bottom 50 percent of the population bears 64 percent of the GST burden, leaving them with less money for their homes and families, as the government takes it away in the form of GST. Singh further said that businesses are facing significant difficulties in paying taxes, with nine different GST rates currently in operation, and sought simplification of the

rates, which he said should ideally be arranged in two or three GST slabs. The Congress party leader said governments are increasing GST on goods to create more sources of income, citing the example of popcorn, where three unrealistic GST rates of 5%, 12%, and 18% have been imposed. Singh also pointed out the discrepancy that, while the middle and lower-income

groups are being charged more GST, large corporations are receiving annual exemptions of up to Rs 2 lakh crore in corporate tax. It is completely impractical to collect GST from lower-income groups while offering corporate tax exemptions. He emphasised that GST should be abolished on food items and that imposing GST on basic items like pencils is unjustifiable. Additionally, citizens who pay for health insurance are being taxed at 18 percent GST. Singh concluded that, while the government should simplify the GST rates, instead of raising them, it should focus on preventing tax evasion and increasing revenue from GST paid by consumers. This would enable a reduction in GST rates while simultaneously boosting the economy.

Statement of Singhdeo on GST is misleading: VD Sharma

BJP State President and MP Khajuraho Vishnudutt Sharma strongly criticized Congress leader TS Singhdeo's recent remarks on the Goods and Services Tax (GST), calling them misleading and detrimental to the nation's progress. Responding to Singhdeo's allegations, Sharma said that Congress is not only spreading confusion about GST but is also causing significant harm to the country by opposing a policy that is fostering India's economic growth. Speaking on Thursday, Sharma highlighted that India is rapidly advancing economically, moving from being the world's fifth-largest economy to potentially becoming the third-largest. He accused Congress of opposing GST because it does not want to see India emerge as

an economic superpower. Sharma added that during Congress's tenure, widespread tax evasion inflicted severe damage on the nation, a problem that has been curbed under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership through the implementation of a unified tax system. Sharma defended the "One Nation, One Tax" policy, stating that it benefits everyone, causes no harm to any state, and creates a uniform tax structure across the country. This, he emphasized, is in the best interest of the nation. The policy has not only curbed tax evasion but has also simplified the process of doing business or setting up industries in any part of India. Sharma reminded Congress of its past stance on GST, pointing out that the idea of a unified tax system was first introduced by Congress in 2009. However, he credited the Modi government

for successfully implementing GST with the consensus of all states, including those governed by Congress and other opposition parties. He noted that the benefits of GST are being equitably distributed among states, proving its effectiveness. The BJP leader further highlighted the positive impact of GST since its implementation. He stated that GST has not only increased tax collection but has also expanded its base, effectively curbing corruption and tax evasion. Sharma stressed that the revenue generated through GST plays a vital role in boosting the country's economy and accelerating development. Sharma dismissed Congress's opposition to GST as baseless and politically motivated, claiming it stems from hatred toward Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government. He accused

Congress of using GST as a tool to keep its political relevance alive, despite lacking factual or logical arguments. Sharma concluded by saying that Congress's opposition to GST is driven by its unwillingness to accept India's rapid progress under the Modi government. He alleged that Congress's anti-GST stance is an attempt to harm the country's growth, but the people of India are wise and will not be misled by the party's rhetoric. The BJP leader emphasized that GST has significantly contributed to the nation's economic development, and Congress's criticism is a reflection of its frustration over the Modi government's achievements. Sharma expressed confidence that the people of India understand the truth and will not be swayed by Congress's attempts to derail the country's progress.

Police Commissioner for further tightening of security at Bhopal jail

Bhopal police commissioner Harinarayan Chari Mishra conducted an inspection of Bhopal Central Jail. During the visit, he directed an increase in the number of cameras on the watchtower and throughout the jail premises. The inspection also involved an investigation into a suspicious drone that had been discovered in the jail on Wednesday. A doctor later claimed that the drone was his. Dr. Sweptal Jain, a professor at Mahavir Institute of Medical Science, stated that he had entered the jail premises with the drone's remote control. The police operated the drone with the remote, but the Police Commissioner has instructed that the drone be forensically examined for further clarity. Dr. Jain reported that he had purchased the drone from

Delhi for his son. On December 31, 2024, he and his son were at IT Park, where they flew the drone together. However, after reaching a high altitude, they lost contact with the drone, which subsequently went missing. After seeing the news report and photo of the drone in the newspapers, Dr. Jain came forward to claim it. He also provided the police with documents related to the drone's purchase. Despite this, the police are still investigating the incident from all possible angles. In another development, a suspicious drone was found at the RGPV campus in Gandhi Nagar. While both drones are suspicious, the color and manufacturer of the drone found at the jail differ from those of the one discovered at the university. The police have seized the university drone as well and have initiated an investigation.

Rs 15L robbery probe leads to Hawala racket

Bhopal: A hawala connection has emerged in the case of a Rs 15 lakh robbery from a businessman in Bhopal. The police have taken two suspects, both of whom are believed to be habitual criminals, into custody for interrogation. The robbery took place when the businessman, who had borrowed Rs 15 lakh for his business, was targeted by two youths riding an Apache bike near Kolar Tiraha. The thieves struck by hitting his scooter, which caused him to fall. The robbers then snatched his bag and fled the scene. Following the incident, the police registered a case of theft. According to the police, Sahil, a grain wholesaler from Janaki Nagar Chuna Bhatti, was returning home around 1:30 pm after borrowing Rs 15 lakh for his business. He was accompanied by his friend Rohit, and they were riding a scooter. The two had just visited Jumerati, where they borrowed the money from an

acquaintance named Sonu Bhai. Sahil was driving the scooter at the time. As they reached a short distance from the Irrigation Department guest house near Kolar Tri-section, two miscreants on an Apache bike hit their scooter, causing Sahil to fall. The robbers then snatched the money and sped off towards the MACT intersection. The victim was unable to note the bike's number, but one of the thieves was reportedly wearing a cream-colored shirt. A team from the Chunarhatti police station is currently reviewing CCTV footage in the area, and the crime branch has also joined the investigation. The police are working to identify the vehicle's number and believe the robbery was premeditated, possibly involving information from someone close to the victim. They are using the footage to trace the route taken by the suspects.

Cyclists rendezvous with Chiklod tiger

A group of cyclists on a forest expedition in the Chiklod range of the state capital were in for a huge surprise when a tiger emerged from the bushes, gave them a once-over, and paced around for 2-3 minutes before stepping back into the bushes and merging into the landscape. The video of the incident, which occurred last weekend, has now gone viral on social media. Dilip Singh, a resident of Awadhपुरi and a part of the cycling group, says he was with a group of 25-30 cyclists who spotted the tiger in the jungle behind the Bhojpur temple. The group was passing through the Chiklod jungle

when the tiger suddenly appeared before them and stood, looking at them. The Chiklod range, at the intersection of Bhopal and Raichur districts, is home to several big cats. Tiger sightings are frequent in the area, where indigenous people, who live in the region, have often complained about the striped carnivore preying on their livestock.

On July 14, 2024, hunters shot and killed a tiger in the forest near Ashapuri village in the Chiklod range. Last month, a tigress died after being hit by an unidentified vehicle on the Ubaidullahganj Highway near Binaka. The location is not far from where the cyclists spotted the tiger.

Meet today to assess affordable urban housing challenges

Man hit by speeding train at Chhola, dies

Bhopal: A man died after being hit by a train on Wednesday night in Bhopal's Kainchi Chhola area. He was trying to cross the railway track. The police have registered a case and started investigating the matter. According to the police, Ravishankar Kushwaha (38), resident of lane number three Kainchi Chhola, had gone out for some personal work and was trying to cross the railway track near his house. During this time, he was hit by a train. After the postmortem, the body was handed over to the family on Thursday. Ravishankar's brother-in-law Rambabu Vishwakarma said that he was an auto driver and he has two children, a boy and a girl. In a separate incident a 16-year-old girl student who committed suicide by jumping from the roof in Shahpura, the police have registered a case against the youth who was harassing her. The accused youth was forcing her to marry him. On the day of the incident, the student had reached the youth's house to talk to him. Here the

youth harassed the student so much that she committed suicide by jumping from the roof. Police station in-charge Lokendra Thakur said that the incident took place on November 25. The girl, who lived in Habibganj area, knew a young man. Some time ago, the girl's family came to know about this. They advised their daughter to stay away from the boy. After this, the girl stopped talking to the boy, but the boy did not stop his antics. He used to call and message the girl continuously. Troubled by this, the girl went to the boy's house on 25 November to convince him. Here also the boy did not stop his antics. He said something to the girl, due to which the girl jumped from his house in fear. The people around took her to the hospital. She died here. During the investigation, the girl's family told about the boy in their statements to the police. On this basis, the police checked the CCTV footage of the day of the incident and the CDR of the mobile number was taken out.

CVS procedure at AIIMS Bhopal paves new path in fetal medicine

Bhopal: Under the guidance of AIIMS Bhopal's Executive Director, Prof. (Dr.) Ajai Singh, the institution has once again demonstrated its excellence in the fields of medical research, innovation, and healthcare. Recently, the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at AIIMS Bhopal successfully completed its first Chorionic Villus Sampling (CVS) procedure. This procedure was performed by Dr. Manupriya Madhavan, Visiting Fetal Medicine Consultant. The chorionic tissue has been sent for genetic analysis. Chorionic Villus Sampling (CVS) is a prenatal test in which a small sample is taken from the placenta (chorionic villi) of the pregnant

woman to detect any potential genetic disorders in the fetus. Speaking about this achievement, Prof Singh said, "Successfully completing the first CVS at AIIMS Bhopal is an important step in advancing fetal medicine services at our institution. This achievement reflects our commitment to providing comprehensive maternal and fetal care with the highest standards of excellence." On this occasion, Officiating Medical Superintendent Prof. (Dr.) Shashank Purwar and Dr. K. Pushpalta (Professor and Head of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology) praised the dedication of the team and referred to the success of the procedure as a significant milestone for the institution.

Naib Tehsildar falls victim to cyber fraud

The incident occurred when she contacted a fake number she found on Google and shared her husband's credit card details. The fraudster then siphoned off Rs 2.64 lakh. The victim, Anukriti Mishra, a Naib Tehsildar posted in Cyber Tehsil, had planned to attend a New Year party at Hotel Taj with her family on December 31. Unable to find the hotel's contact number, she searched for it on Google. She called the first number listed on the hotel's website. The person who answered claimed that only a few tickets were left and urged her to make the booking immediately.

When asked about the payment method, the fraudster suggested using a credit card

When asked about the payment method, the fraudster suggested using a credit card. Trusting the caller, Anukriti shared her husband, Ankit Dubey's credit card details. The fraudster then sent an OTP to Dubey's phone, which Anukriti passed along to the caller after confirming it with her husband. To build trust, the fraudster first transferred Rs 102 to the account. However, shortly after, the

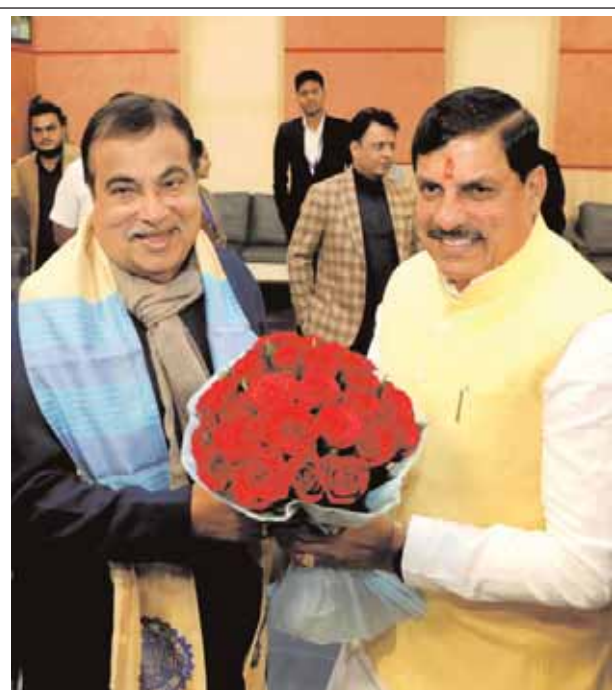
fraudster withdrew Rs 2.64 lakh from the credit card, Ankit Dubey, a CISF Assistant Commandant posted in Chhindwara, realized something was wrong when he received a notification about the large withdrawal. Upon contacting Hotel Taj, he discovered that the booking had never been made, and the number and website were not affiliated with the hotel. Dubey initially attempted to track the fraudster but was unsuccessful. A week later, he filed a complaint at the Shahpura police station. Based on his report, the police registered a case of fraud against the holder of the mobile number 9343287665. Authorities are now attempting to trace the accused using bank account details.

Collector resolves pending revenue cases in Narmadapuram district

Rush at Rabies Deptt points to pet problems, stray menace

Pet animals are turning on their keepers, say those manning the Rabies Department at Hamidia Hospital, in an ostensible effort to downplay growing dog bite incidents on the city streets. Long queues are witnessed at the rabies department, housed in the old hospital building, with 50-80 patients reporting animal bites each day. While admitting that the number of patients shoots up to 80 on certain days, those administering the anti-rabies injections rue the irresponsible approach of pet keepers, who often fail to get their pets vaccinated for rabies and distemper. The hospital workers argue that the long queues outside the

department are not a sign of a spurt in canine attacks, as it includes repeat patients as well as those who have been bitten or attacked by their pet dogs and cats. They inform that there has been a steep rise in cat attack cases since the trend of Persian and other exotic cat adoptions caught on in the city in the last five years. Though cat lovers refuse to accept it, experts say that the fluffy felines may also aggravate underlying allergies and prove harmful for the elderly and young children due to the uninhibited disbursement of fur, dander, and allergens in the domestic air. There has been a significant rise in animal attacks in the city in recent years. Canine attacks alone accounted for over 16,000 incidents in 2023. Though data for

2024 is yet to be compiled, experts say that the growth in the number of attacks is plain to see. Even if growing cat attacks are a more domestic issue, as they take place inside homes, canine attacks, especially those on the streets, are a growing civic menace that warrants immediate attention from the Bhopal Municipal Corporation (BMC). The number of growing strays on the city streets remains unexplainable, as a dedicated dog squad at the civic body has picked up strays and spayed them before releasing them on a daily basis for years. The work of neutering the dogs is contracted to a private agency; however, mystery shrouds the efficacy of the civic body's efforts in the absence of a checking mechanism for the spaying exer-

cise. Following a recent attack on a middle-aged man by ferocious pet dogs, the BMC issued stern directives for the registration of pets. However, only 650 pet keepers had stepped forward to have their pets enumerated by December 31, 2024. Mindful of the civic outrage that the municipal administration faces for its failure to address canine attack incidents, the BMC news brief presents dog squad activities to the media every evening. The claims are, however, proved hollow by the growing number of strays on the streets and the queues outside the rabies department. Maybe it's time for the municipal body to stop patting itself on the back and start shouldering the responsibility.

"I know that a team of NCC cadets will attempt to scale Mount Everest this year, and I am happy to note that they are currently training at the Army Mountaineering Institute in the Siachen Base Camp. My best wishes are with the expedition team," the army chief said, adding that he will eagerly look forward to "see a glimpse of the NCC summit flag atop Mt Everest".

Stating that the Indian Army takes great pride in its association and support to the NCC, Gen Dwivedi said at one time, more than 12,500 army personnel stood posted as staff in the NCC. As part of training support, more than 30,000 NCC cadets have done attachment training with army units thus far, including 4,000 cadets -- boys and girls -- undergoing attachments with military hospitals, the army chief said. A total of 2,361 NCC cadets from around the country are taking part in the month-long Republic Day camp, which began on December 30 and will culminate with the PM Rally on January 27. The annual event is also witnessing the participation of 917 girl cadets, the largest contingent so far.

INSV 'Tarini' with two women Navy officers crosses International Date Line

Indian Naval Sailing Vessel (INSV) 'Tarini' carrying two women officers on Thursday crossed the International Date Line (IDL), achieving a significant milestone during the crew's global circumnavigation expedition, officials said. "As the vessel sailed eastwards, the crew adjusted their clocks to account for the date change, symbolising the blending of two consecutive calendar days," a Navy spokesperson said. "Tarini successfully crossed the International Date Line (IDL) today at approximately 11:30 hours, Indian Standard Time (IST)," he said. This notable achievement marks a significant milestone in the

crew's ongoing global circumnavigation expedition, the official added. "Tarini" is undertaking the global circumnavigation journey under the Navika Sagar Parikrama II, an Indian Navy expedition attempting a double-handed circumnavigation of the earth via the three Great Capes. The boat was flagged off from Goa on October 2, 2024, by Navy chief Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi. Carrying the two women officers, "Tarini" had left the Lyttelton Port in New Zealand on Saturday for the longest and the most challenging leg of its expedition. INSV 'Tarini' had reached Lyttelton on December 22, completing the second leg of the historic circumnavigation

being undertaken by two Indian Navy officers -- Lt Cdr Dilna K and Lt Cdr Roopa A -- symbolising India's growing prowess of maritime exploration. The crew had left the Lyttelton Port for its onward passage -- to Port Stanley (Falkland Islands). This is the longest leg of the expedition with a distance of approximately 5,600 nautical miles (about 10,400 km), the official said. During the stay at Lyttelton, the crew undertook repairs and maintenance of the vessel with particular focus on the next leg where it will cross the South Pacific, pass through the treacherous Drake Passage, before crossing Cape Horn to reach Port Stanley, the spokesperson earlier said.

Kin of woman who died in child birth allege negligence by hospital

A family member of a woman who died on Sunday allegedly that she was expired at the Saksham Health Care hospital due to negligence of the hospital administration. The deceased's family has also filed a complaint against the hospital administration at the Kherki Daula Police Station for further investigation. According to police, the husband of the 30-year-old victim a resident of Manesar has alleged that his wife died due to medical negligence. Cops said on Thursday, they have received a complaint against Saksham Health Care hospital located in Sector-83 Manesar but they will forward the case for preliminary inquiry to the Gurugram health department to get a nod for going



ahead with their investigation (as is norm for cases against doctors). According to the complaint, the deceased's woman husband Manoj Yadav admitted his wife Monika Yadav for delivery around 9 am on January 5. Doctor Shikha Parashar at Saksham Health Care hospital perform normal delivery around 2.20 pm. She delivered baby boy on January 5.

"After delivery she was responding well. The doctors suggested us to go home as the medical staff will take care of the patient. At around 6.40 pm, her condition deteriorated due to bleeding and the doctor failed to control her bleeding and later she died at the hospital," deceased husband Manoj told The Pioneer. He alleged that the hospital administration did not arrange

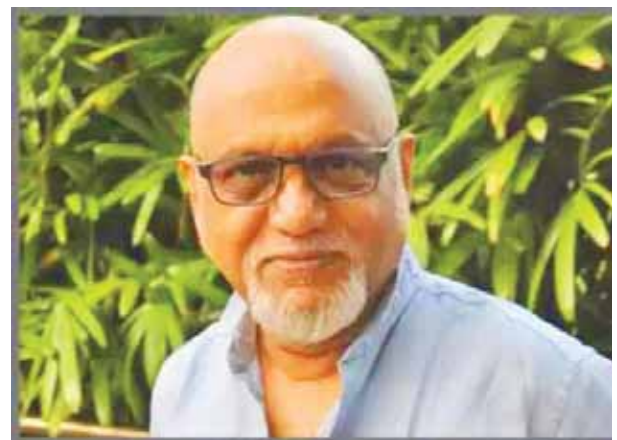
ambulance on time. They even did not use blood unit despite arranged by the family. "My wife was in immense pain and was begging me to save her. I told doctors that she is in pain, but they said this was normal and she will recover soon. Soon after, she lost consciousness. Doctors then put her in an ambulance and asked me to rush to another hospital as the case was beyond their control," the complaint said. She was expired at the hospital but despite this and to misguide us they shifted my wife to another private hospital, where the hospital management informed us that she was expired hours back," he alleged. The Doctors had initially said the treatment would cost around Rs 80,000 and has charged Rs 50,000 after the delivery, he said. "We have lodged a complaint

with the Kherki Daula police station for Manika's death due to medical negligence and also filed complaint with the Gurgaon civil surgeon," he said. When contacted, the hospital administration said that it was rare case of death. Despite all possible care and efforts, she succumbed on January 5. "The patient had previously delivered a girl through operation but the family insisted for normal delivery. We also informed the family about the seriousness of the normal delivery but despite this they were adamant for normal delivery. After the delivery she suffered Postpartum hemorrhage (PPH) which is severe bleeding after giving birth. The family was briefed on her criticality before delivery," Dr Shikha Parashar told The Pioneer.

Film personalities remember 'creative genius' and 'brilliant' Pritish Nandy

Filmmakers Sudhir Mishra, Hansal Mehta, actors Kareena Kapoor Khan, Sayani Gupta, and Sanjay Dutt paid rich tributes to veteran journalist, poet and filmmaker Pritish Nandy, who died in Mumbai on Wednesday. Nandy died after a cardiac arrest at his home in south Mumbai. He was 73. As a film producer, Nandy backed films such as "Hazaaron Khwahishen Aisi", "Kaante", "Jhankaar Beats", "Chameli", "Shabd", and "Pyaar Ke Side Effects". Mishra expressed gratitude towards Nandy for producing his acclaimed 2005 film "Hazaaron Khwahishen Aisi". "Pritish Nandy changed my life. Only he could make 'Hazaaron Khwahishen Aisi'. He taught me so much. I am so sorry Pritish Da. I couldn't come up with an idea for the sequel," he wrote on X. Mehta said his most personal work, the 2017 movie "Omerta", had lost "one of its greatest patrons". He revealed that it was Nandy who encouraged him to make Rajkumar Rao-starrer which was based on the life of British-Pakistani terrorist Ahmed Omar Saeed Sheikh. "I remember when I first met him in 2005 I had shared the



idea for 'Omerta'. Let's make it he said. When nobody had belief in me or my ideas Mr Pritish Nandy gave me the strength to dare, to dream and to tell stories that mattered to me - no matter what. "He did not end up producing 'Omerta' eventually but I owe the film and a lot of my journey beginning from Shahid to him. We had the most delightful conversations, he was always candid with me and I always left his room very energized. So hard to believe that he is gone," he posted on X. Kareena, who received critical acclaim for her performance as a sex worker in "Chameli", shared a picture from the set of the 2004 movie with an infinity symbol and a folded hands emoji as a caption. Dutt said Nandy was "a true

creative genius and a kind soul" who would be missed. The actor worked in "Kaante" and "Shabd". "Fierce. Fearless. Fine. Godspeed Pritish Uncle," director Meghna Gulzar wrote on Instagram. Anil Kapoor posted on X, "Shocked and heartbroken by the loss of my dear friend Pritish Nandy. A fearless editor, a brave soul, and a man of his word, he embodied integrity like no other." Nandy was the "youngest guy in the room, the most articulate and brilliant", said Sayani Gupta, one of the lead actors of Prime Video series "Four More Shots Please!", which is backed by Nandy's banner Pritish Nandy Communications. "Always smiling, always warm and with that glint in his eyes.

He loved a good conversation. He loved Bong women. And I knew he loved me. He would always express his love & never shied away from appreciating the people around him. There are very few people who are this magnetic. "An absolute stalwart. A true visionary. A rock star feminist who has created some of the most iconic women characters for cinema. I thought of him a lot when his very close friend Mr. Ratan Tata passed away recently. How he must be holding up. Cannot believe he left us so soon. The head of our family just left us. Hasn't sunk in. I am grateful for his grace, wisdom & the moments spent under his light. A deep deep loss," Gupta wrote in an Instagram post. Bhumi Pednekar, who will next be seen in Netflix series "The Royals" produced by Nandy, described Nandy as a visionary that disrupted the ways in his time. "Deeply saddened by the passing of Pritish Nandy sir. His vision shaped stories that touched millions, and I'm grateful to have been a part of a project he believed in," Pednekar said in an Instagram post. Actor-filmmaker Anupam Kher shared news of Nandy's death on social media on Wednesday night.

SC orders status quo on construction under PM Awas Yojana on Abbas Ansari's land in Lucknow

The Supreme Court on Thursday ordered status quo on the construction of housing units under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana at a disputed site in Lucknow's Jiamau whose ownership is claimed by the sons of late gangster-turned-politician Mukhtar Ansari. In 2020, the Lucknow Development Authority had bulldozed the bungalow that belonged to Ansari and his sons including Abbas Ansari. The government plans to build flats on the land under the PM Awas Yojana. An SC bench of Justices Surya Kant and N Kottiswar Singh took note of submission by senior advocate Kapil Sibal, appearing for Abbas Ansari, that the plea regarding the possession of land was listed before the Division Bench of Allahabad High court repeatedly, but no interim stay was passed. On October 21 last year, the top court asked the High Court to take up the application for interim stay for hearing as early as possible. When the matter came up for hearing in the SC on Thursday, Sibal informed the bench that despite its order, the case has not been taken for hearing. "Some High Courts, we don't



know what will happen. Allahabad High Court is one of the high courts which one should be worrisome about," the bench said. While granting the status quo on construction, the top court bench directed the high court to hear the matter expeditiously. "Since we have not issued notice and have also not obtained any report from Registry of the High Court, we are not inclined to express any opinion as to what were the circumstances in which the petitioner's writ petition could not be taken up for hearing by the bench, though it was listed from time to time," the bench observed. It said that the petitioners have specifically stated that the

authorities have commenced construction at plot No 93 located in Village Jiamau, Lucknow, which they claim to be under their ownership. If third party rights are created it is likely to cause irreversible loss to the petitioners, the court observed. "We dispose of this application with a direction to the authorities as well as to the petitioners to maintain status quo at the site till the matter is heard by the High Court," it said. According to Abbas Ansari, his grandfather purchased a share in a plot in Jiamau and the deed was registered on March 9, 2004. The said property was allegedly gifted by him to his wife Rabia Begum, who then bequeathed the same through a registered will dated June 28,

2017 to the petitioner and his brother. The plea said that the Sub-Divisional Magistrate, Dalibagh, Lucknow allegedly passed an ex parte (in their absence) order on August 14, 2020 declaring the plot a government property. Thereafter, the petitioner and his brother were dispossessed in August 2023. Abbas Ansari then filed a petition in 2023 before the Lucknow bench of the Allahabad High Court. Some other co-owners of the plot, who were also affected by the SDMs order, also approached the High Court and the matter was listed before a division bench. When Abbas Ansari's writ petition came up for hearing before the single judge on January 8, 2024, he ordered it to be listed along with other matters so as to avoid conflicting orders. Abbas Ansari contended that his writ petition has been listed before the division bench repeatedly, but no interim stay has been passed in their favour, as was done by the division bench in the case of other affected persons. "Resultantly, the authorities, after taking physical possession of the petitioner's plot, have started construction of some dwelling units at the site under the Prama Minister Awas Yojna," the plea said.

Besides them, Chess Olympiad medallist, Bridge World Games silver medallist and Snooker World Championship gold medallist have been invited as special guests as they have made country proud with their performances, the ministry said. PM Modi to global community: India's heritage shows future lies in peace, not war

in Buddha)," he said. Modi said he has always considered the diaspora as India's ambassador to the countries they live in. "We are not just the mother of democracy, but democracy is part of our lives, our lifestyle. We don't

have to be taught diversity, rather, our life runs on diversity. That's why wherever Indians go, they become part of the society of that particular place. We respect the rules and traditions of that country and also honestly serve that

country and its society, contributing to its growth and prosperity. At the same time, our hearts continue to beat for India," he said. The PM said it was because of the diaspora, that he keeps his head high wherever he goes.

"I do not forget the love, affection and prestige I receive across the world. I would like to say thank you. This is because of you, I keep my head high across the world. During the last 10 years, I have met several leaders across the world. The

world leaders praise the Indian diaspora. It's because of the social values you add to their society," he said. "Your safety and welfare are our top priority. We consider it our responsibility to help our diaspora during crisis situations no matter where they are. This is one of the guiding principles of India's foreign policy today. Over the last decade, our embassies and offices have been sensitive and proactive," he said. Modi said that earlier in many countries, people had to travel long distances to access consular facilities and wait for days for help. "Now, these problems are being solved. In the last two years, 14 embassies and consulates have been opened. The scope of the OCI card is also being expanded," he said. The PM said the diaspora played a major role in Independence in 1947, and sought their help to make India a developed country by 2047. He said India is not only a young country but also a country of skilled youths.

Uttarakhand to implement UCC this month says CM Pushkar Singh Dhami

Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami on Thursday highlighted the various initiatives undertaken in the state, reaffirming the implementation of the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) in the "Devbhoomi" this month. Uttarakhand is the first state in the country to have UCC Act, which seeks to establish a uniform and an equal set of rules on marriage, divorce, succession and inheritance for all citizens in the state, except the Scheduled Tribes (STs), irrespective of religion. It makes registration of all marriages and live-in relationships mandatory. "We have formulated the Uniform Civil Code law in Devbhoomi Uttarakhand. This is the state's first honour and will be implemented within this month," Dhami said during the inauguration of the 29th Uttarayani Mela in Bareilly. He compared the UCC to India's sacred rivers such as Sharda, Ganga, Saraswati and Kaveri, stating that just as they sustain life across the country, the UCC will work similarly. Regarding the state's tourism and infrastructure initiatives, Dhami said, "In Haridwar and Rishikesh, we are planning to develop the Ganga Corridor. Work on a corridor along the Sharda River has also begun." He added that Uttarakhand continues to see an increasing influx of devotees and tourists which would be bolstered by the reconstruction efforts in Kedarnath and the master plan underway at Badrinath

Dhami. Dhami also announced beautification and restoration efforts for temples in the Kumaon region and development at Purnagiri. "It gives me immense joy that more devotees from Uttar Pradesh visit Purnagiri. We are creating the Sharda Corridor, which will enhance the ghats and beautify the area," he said. The chief minister expressed hope for Uttarakhand becoming a hub for destination weddings and tourism, emphasising the state's growing reputation. "Handicraft products from Uttarakhand are gaining recognition among multinational companies and women in the state are doing excellent work. Over one lakh women in Uttarakhand are now earning a substantial income. We will provide them with interest-free loans," he said. On governance and security, Dhami shared progress on several legal reforms, including the anti-conversion law, the introduction of anti-riot legislation and measures to counter exam malpractice. "We have taken strong steps by enacting an anti-riot law. Any damages caused during riots will be recovered from the perpetrators. Similarly, with our anti-cheating law, over 100 individuals involved in exam malpractice have been jailed. This ensures fair opportunities for deserving candidates," he added. Dhami mentioned initiatives to combat "land jihad", stating that 5,000 acres of encroached land have been freed.

First case of HMPV detected in Lucknow, health department on alert

Lucknow has reported its first case of Human Metapneumovirus (HMPV) after a 60-year-old woman tested positive. A private laboratory confirmed the diagnosis, and her sample has been sent to King George's Medical University (KGMU) for further testing. The woman, a resident of the Cantt area, was initially admitted to Charak Hospital before being transferred to Balrampur Hospital late Wednesday night. She is currently in isolation in Ward 11, where her condition is being monitored. The detection of HMPV has put the health department on alert as 11 cases have been reported nationwide so far. Experts assure that there is no need for panic, as HMPV is a seasonal virus that causes symptoms like cold, fever, cough, and chest tightness. Dr. Shailendra Kumar, a senior health official, said that the infection is manageable with proper care and precautions. Human Metapneumovirus belongs to the Pneumoviridae family and has been present in the environment for decades, although it was officially identified in 2001. The virus is typically associated with winter seasons and flu-like symptoms. It was first confirmed in India in 2003 in children, as per studies conducted by BJ Medical College and the National Institute of Virology, Pune. While the virus is not new, health experts recommend staying vigilant.

India, Bangladesh border forces hold informal meeting at Petrapole to strengthen border coordination

Amidst recent objections by the Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) over the Border Security Force's (BSF) attempts to erect fences in certain areas along the India-Bangladesh border, the two forces held an informal meeting at the Integrated Check Post (ICP) at Petrapole in West Bengal's North 24 Parganas district on Thursday. The pre-scheduled meeting, aimed at fostering mutual cooperation and enhancing coordination along the border,



was attended by BSF South Bengal Frontier inspector-general Maninder PS Pawar and BGB brigadier-general Mohammad Humayun Kabir. The discussions between the two forces focused on effective border management, measures to prevent illegal crossings, combating cross-

border crimes, and fostering a secure and peaceful environment in the region, a statement by the BSF South Bengal Frontier said. The meeting assumes significance in the wake of recent instances of BGB raising objections to BSF's efforts to build border fences in certain areas along the Indo-Bangladesh border. Pawar emphasised the importance of mutual cooperation in ensuring the stability and prosperity of border regions, while Kabir expressed the BGB's readiness to work closely with their Indian counterparts to resolve

issues amicably, the statement added. Both sides reaffirmed their commitment to strengthening bilateral relations and pledged to enhance joint efforts to address border challenges, it added. The fencing work in Sukdevpur area of Malda's Kaliachak III block was briefly paused on Monday after the BGB claimed it was being conducted on Bangladeshi territory. However, the issue was resolved through discussions, and construction resumed without further disruptions on Tuesday.

Union Minister Chirag Paswan confident of alliance's victory in Bihar assembly polls

Union minister Chirag Paswan on Thursday asserted that all constituents of the NDA in Bihar will "together" contest the assembly elections, due in less than a year. 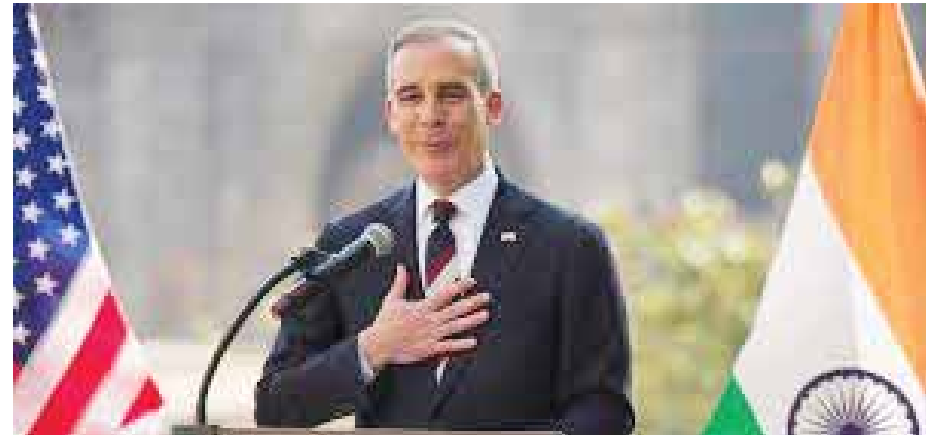


Ram Manjhi's Hindustani Awam Morcha and Rajya Sabha MP Upendra Kushwah's Rashtriya Lok Morcha. Last month, Union Home Minister Amit Shah had, in an interview, cryptically said that the BJP's parliamentary board would take a call on whether to go without a chief ministerial candidate in Bihar. This was viewed, in political circles as well as a section of the media, as a signal from one of the most powerful leaders in the BJP to Kumar, who is in his 70s and has been chief minister for close to two decades.

US has independent criminal justice: Garcetti on proceedings against Adani

US Ambassador to India Eric Garcetti on Thursday declined to comment on the ongoing legal proceedings in the United States involving Adani Group chairman Gautam Adani and other executives. Talking to reporters in Mumbai, Garcetti expressed optimism about continuing collaborations between the US and India to enhance capacity-building efforts in the region. "No, I don't have any comment on that. Obviously, we have an independent criminal justice (system that is different) from our political (system). It's different than a lot of countries," Garcetti said when asked about the Adani issue. "We have had amazing partners with the great industrialists here, with the big companies. We have sometimes been funding directly, new factories, ports



and other things," said Garcetti, who was named the 26th US Ambassador to India on March 15, 2023. "And I would hope that that vision continues no matter what, because we are seeing a great new India being built. We are seeing a capacity of Indian companies to do that outside of India, whether it is in the

region, in places like Sri Lanka or whether it is in the eastern coast of Africa," he said. "I would hope we keep our eye on the ball. That is the most important thing, of who has the capacity, how can we partner and ensure that (instead of) debt traps and state-based, you know, more autocratic visions, we have

democratic-led industrialists from across both the nations," he said. US prosecutors have charged Adani for allegedly being involved in a scheme to bribe Indian officials with USD 265 million (around Rs 2,200 crore) in exchange for favourable solar power contracts.

Three Naxalites killed in Chhattisgarh encounter amid ongoing anti-naxal ops

Three Naxalites were killed in an encounter with security forces in Chhattisgarh's Sukma district on Thursday, state Deputy Chief Minister Vijay Sharma said. The security forces have achieved success in the anti-Naxal operation in Sukma, he said. So far, bodies of three Naxalites have been recovered and the search operation is still underway, Sharma, who holds the Home portfolio, told reporters in Raipur. Referring to the IED blast triggered by Naxalites on January 6 wherein eight security personnel and a civilian driver of their vehicle were killed in Bijapur district, the deputy CM said, "There is huge anger among security forces after what Naxalites have done." "I have met them (security forces). I reiterate that with the strength and courage of our jawans, the (Naxal) menace will be eliminated within the stipulated time," he said. Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Monday vowed to eliminate Naxals from the country by March 2026 and asserted that the sacrifice of those killed by the extremists in Chhattisgarh will not go in vain.

Ayodhya emerges as a thriving economic hub after Ram Mandir consecration

Almost a year after the consecration of Ram Lalla at the grand Ram Mandir, Ayodhya has witnessed a remarkable transformation. Once known for its tranquil religious gatherings and modest economy, the city has become a bustling hub of economic activity. While standing as a symbol of devotion, the Ram Mandir has also emerged as the cornerstone of Ayodhya's economic resurgence. "The faith of millions has brought prosperity to Ayodhya," said Anil Shukla, a shopkeeper near the temple. "Earlier, people barely had enough to survive. Now, thanks to Ram ji ki kripa, everyone is earning well. Even



small vendors are flourishing." The influx of pilgrims has been staggering. Government figures reveal that from January 22 to September 30, 2024, Ayodhya received 13.77

The India-Afghanistan talks reflect India's shift from non-recognition of the Taliban to a pragmatic approach to engagement

In a significant step towards recalibrating ties, India and the Taliban-led Afghan government held a high-level meeting in Dubai. The dialogue, attended by India's Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri and Afghanistan's Acting Foreign Minister Mawlawi Amir Khan Muttaqi, revolved around enhancing bilateral relations and addressing regional challenges. The talks, focusing on economic, humanitarian, and strategic cooperation, underscore India's pragmatic approach toward engaging with Afghanistan despite the complex political dynamics following the Taliban's return to power in 2021. India's relations with Afghanistan have been historically robust, characterised by cultural and economic collaboration. However, the Taliban's return disrupted bilateral ties, with India maintaining a cautious stance while continuing to provide humanitarian aid. The evolving geopolitical landscape, Pakistan's actions in the region, and Afghanistan's dire humanitarian crisis have necessitated a renewed engagement. The discussions also



gain relevance amidst regional tensions, notably Pakistan's airstrikes in Afghanistan, which New Delhi strongly condemned. This shared concern over Islamabad's destabilising actions further aligns Indian and Afghan interests, fostering mutual cooperation.

Navigating Trump redux: India's tightrope

While Trump's focus on countering China could strengthen Indo-US strategic ties, his erratic temperament and divisive policies present challenges

In India, there is a mix of excitement, tentativeness, and even concern, with the second coming of Donald Trump as the President of the United States. While Trump's excitable temperament is well known, he ought to be served better with hindsight of experience. But he may not. While India will remain resolutely relevant and critical in his foreign policy calculus, the handling of certain issues could test Indian reaction and patience. His inevitable fixation with managing China will necessitate nurturing the strategic 'pivot' of India as a counterbalance, Delhi's deep-rooted equations with countries like Russia or Iran, could earn his ire and vitriol.

A lot will depend on 'Team Trump' who will aid and assist Trump as he attempts the shape his poll promises of MAGA i.e., Make America Great Again! However, unlike the first term when he did inherit and heed reputation and professionalism as the criteria for key jobs in the Trump administration (though subsequently, he developed a penchant for 'revolving door' ousters of many), this time the criteria only seem to be 'loyalty' to Trump, personally. There is a disconcerting and contradictory logic to many recent appointments that begs the question if it indeed will be 'business as usual' - something Delhi had got used to, irrespective of the dispensation in Washington DC. Sadly, that vital presence of 'adults in the room' from the first Trump administration who were able to navigate and manage Trump out of his outlandish and fickle ideas, will not be present anymore. If anything, in a room filled with 'loyalists' (read, obsequious staff), chances that someone will play the 'adult in the room' anymore, will be starkly lesser than before, as there could be competitive grovelling to valourise Trump's ideas, whatever be the portent. How will Trump's purported 'non-interventionist' preferences sit with Sino-wary countries like India, Japan or Australia (the other three from QUAD framework) that are in the direct line of Chinese belligerence and expansionism? Will Trump's 'non-interventionist' instinct embolden Beijing to finally bite the bullet on Taiwan and storm the same, knowing that beyond mouthing platitudes, Washington DC will not intervene militarily? The picture emerging out of a beleaguered (and potentially isolated) Ukraine does not seem reassuring from a security angle, as the possibility of America pushing its 'allies' under the bus, seems very plausible. Even disconcerting memories of the Summer of 2020 when the Chinese aggression pushed through Indian frontiers, with a seemingly disinterested Trump offering to 'negotiate a deal' instead of adopting a more assertive stance, are still raw. Indeed, the Americans had expedited the exports of weaponry to Delhi, but all that made imminent commercial sense to the die-hard businessman in Trump. Just how ramrod and unflinching will the Trump support be in meeting any such exigency in the future, is worth considering. Even in bilateral relations, there is a fresh bunch of unrestrained radicals who make up the Trump redux cabinet. They may or may not play by the traditional rulebook of diplomacy and could make comments that are unpalatable to Indian sensibilities. Delhi will be under immense pressure to moderate the bilateral



engagement and conversations, as the Indian democracy has its dynamics and imagined perceptions that will disallow unruly comments, even if they were to come from the USA. Adding to the complexity is the contradiction that many amongst this new Trump cabinet are trigger-happy interventionists (e.g., Secretary of State Marco Rubio, Elise Stefanik the Ambassador to UN etc.) a neoconservatives whom Trump rubbish repeatedly - how this contradiction will manifest will be interesting. Even on non-security issues like immigration, trade terms, or commitment towards the environmental issues, could be a very rocky ride for Delhi. India has made ambitious commitments towards the global environmental cause, whereas Trump's rhetoric has cockily been, "We're going to drill, baby, drill," and confirmed that, "I will terminate the green new scam". While India isn't on top of its target list on immigrant issues, it will only be a matter of time before the bogy "stealing your jobs" impacts India. Trump will be a mega populist who will dance to the 'redneck' wish list and this will impact relations with the world's largest democracy, a lot more gravely than other countries. Trump has demonstrated a ter-

INDIA'S GDP GAP WITH CHINA WIDENS

Madam — An analysis of the economies done by a start-up highlights the pressing necessity to boost India's lacklustre growth. In 1980, India's Gross Domestic Product was \$186 billion, close to China's \$303 billion. But, by 2024, India's GDP had grown 21 times to \$3.93 trillion, while China's GDP had surged to \$18.5 trillion—61 times its 1980 level. To put it differently, China's GDP in 2004 was 2.82 times greater than India's. In 2014, it was 5.13 times greater and in 2024, 4.71 times greater. India's GDP surged 2.94 times from \$694 billion to \$2,043 billion between 2004 and 2014, while it grew merely 1.92 times, reaching \$3,930 billion between 2014 and 2024. Had the GDP growth in the decade starting in 2004 persisted in the decade beginning in 2014, the GDP disparity would have further decreased.

The decade before 2004 was a period of consolidation after structural reforms were initiated. India has to rejig its economic strategy to achieve a consistent 9-10 per cent rate of growth. India chose a mixed economic system, which combines the features of both socialist and free-market economic systems. The recent push towards private investment in government-owned assets has served only as an easy route for crony capitalists to enrich themselves into billionaires. Democratic India can consider a new economic system aimed at fostering faster growth.

However, growth in Southern India, which accounts for about 31 per cent of GDP, has thrived under the current system and can accelerate further with adequate support from the Centre. Northern India needs to explore strategies to bridge the gap with the South. And the ostrich-like attitude and constant denials hinder progress in addressing realities. The nation must embark on a rapid growth path that creates jobs, elevates the living standard of common man and reduces inequality.

TRUMP 2.0: CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR ASEAN

With Trump's return, Southeast Asia finds itself bracing for another era of US ambiguity

With the return of Donald Trump to the US presidency, Southeast Asia braces for another era of unpredictability in American foreign policy. Southeast Asian nations, while expressing formal congratulations following Trump's victory, are now focusing on how his administration will impact their economies and strategic interests. As the region's governments gear up for a distinctly different governance style than the one under President Joe Biden, the potential for dramatic shifts in trade relations, diplomatic ties and regional stability is palpable. The ten members of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN)—spanning from Indonesia to Myanmar—are acutely aware that Southeast Asia may not be at the top of the new administration's priority list.

Trump is a known figure for his transactional and often unpredictable style of diplomacy. ASEAN countries, while understanding the volatility that a Trump administration can bring, remain cautiously optimistic that his return might lead to a return to serious trade talks. Many regional leaders believe that Trump's preference for direct, bilateral negotiations could lead to more favourable deals for specific countries, particularly those that are not bound by multilateral negotiations, like those seen under Biden's tenure. Yet, for many in Southeast Asia, the most pressing concern remains the US-China relationship. Since Trump's first term, ASEAN nations have had to balance their relationships with both China and the US, seeking to maintain economic growth and regional security without angering either side. The dynamic has changed considerably in the



post-pandemic era, as China and ASEAN emerged as each other's largest trade partners. The direction of US-China relations will have profound consequences for Southeast Asia's economic stability and security.

Under Trump, this relationship was tense, marked by the trade war and military posturing, and the nomination of headline China critics, such as Marco Rubio for Secretary of State and Mike Waltz as National Security Advisor, signals that the US will continue to confront China head-on in ways that could disrupt regional dynamics. While many ASEAN leaders are concerned about the economic impact of a hard-line US-China policy, there is also hope that Trump's presidency could bring much-needed attention back to Southeast Asia's trade and strategic importance. This could be particularly appealing to resource-rich nations like Indonesia and the Philippines, which are in high demand for critical minerals used in electronics and green technologies. On the other hand, a significant worry for ASEAN countries is that they may become collateral damage in the US's efforts to reduce its trade deficit.

Despite these uncertainties, ASEAN's primary goal will remain stability and balance. ASEAN countries will push for steady relationships with both global powers, aiming to shield themselves from the worst effects of US-China tensions while seeking to expand their own economic and diplomatic space. To avoid being left behind, India is watching the space closely, as it is well aware that Trump will target Delhi soon.

Delhi is trying to rebuild bilateral relationships with several ASEAN groups of countries, even as it participates with full vigour on the multilateral platform. The chief guest for 2025 Republic Day would be the President of Indonesia, a key country in ASEAN. India's exports to the US could be hit due to Trump's overtures and it needs to find new markets for its products, while gently easing out domestic compliances and trade barriers. The region's future relationship with the US will depend not only on Trump's domestic agenda but also on how ASEAN and India navigate the delicate balance between American and Chinese influence in the years to come.

Recently, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has praised the film *The Sabarmati Report* produced by Ekta Kapoor and her Balaji Motion Pictures. Before this also PM has been praised films - *The Kashmir Files* and *The Kerala Story*. Filmmaker M K Shivaaksh made the film *Accident or Conspiracy: Godhra* which is based on the infamous case of Godhra in Gujarat, where fifty-six Ram devotees were burnt alive in a train coach of the Sabarmati Express by one particular community. Again the film became the victim of the ecosystem and got a very limited release so the film can't be seen by many people in the country. While *The Sabarmati Report* not only got praise from the PM but also Yogi Adityanath, Pushkar Singh Dhami and Naib Singh Saini took time to watch the film along with the crew and casts and made the film tax-free in their respective states UP, Uttarakhand and Haryana because of Ekta Kapoor - Smriti Irani connection. But Shivaaksh was not that lucky at all.

He had planned to release his film *Accident or Conspiracy: Godhra* in February but the censor board delayed the process for seven months. They have asked for literally all the evidence and the makers have provided all the related evidence based on the

Nanavati - Mehta Commission Report, Court Verdicts, eyewitness records as well as all the supporting documents.

To study the material the censor board took seven months and even after that they gave the certificate where they chopped about fifty per cent of the content, informed Shivaaksh. Unfortunately, some renowned actors also took advantage of the situation from these novice young independent filmmakers to bully them, those who have good connections with the government agencies as well as some strong political backing. Initially, they talk big to bag the role and comparatively good remuneration, but after the film is completed, instead of helping the film for smooth sailing, they even discourage the other co-actors from not promoting their film just pretending to be secular. Forget to help with the censor process, they don't even come forward to promote the film, nor even post on social media.

Pushpendra Singh director of *Ajmer 92*, Kamal Chandra director of *Humare Baraah* and *Shivaaksh*, all of them have the same terrible experiences with some of their actors. Akashaditya Lama's *Bengal 1947* described the hardships faced by the displaced Hindu refugees from the then East Pakistan now Bangladesh to the completely unknown, unfamiliar terrain of present days Chhatisgarh.

A few political leaders' high ambitions divided the country into three different territories and created devastating for the crores of innocent people in the country. The film was released in very limited theatres. Akashaditya said that when he made the film in Chhatisgarh, the then Congress government helped him a lot

without imposing many terms and conditions, then Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel, told him only not to show Pundit Nehru in a bad light.

Even a cabinet minister came to receive the shooting team at the airport, and arranged the full-proof security for the entire team, with overwhelming hospitality. By the time the film got ready to release BJP government came to power in Chhatisgarh, but unfortunately, the film never got any special attention or tax rebate from the local government. However, the films have been screened at various film festivals. In the same manner, another film *The Diary of West Bengal* directed by Sanoj Mishra has suffered massively at the hands of the government and political elements of West Bengal.

Finally, the film was released, which too a very limited release by the order of the court. All of these films are not only talking of the great human rights violations by one particular religious community towards the majority Hindu community but also these films are unbiased, true documentation of time a political era as well as the impact on society. Unfortunately, none of these films got any recognition, big awards or even tax rebates from the government. In this situation, a special section "The untold stories" could have been curated in the just concluded International Film Festival of India (IFFI) which would have been very much appropriate to showcase the film to the larger audiences, as well as the screening at IFFI would have certainly boosted the morale of the filmmakers.

What gaming regulation can learn from SEBI'S F&O regulations

India's gaming sector stands at a critical juncture. Thoughtful regulation can help it realise its immense potential while safeguarding consumers

Two seemingly disparate sectors—India's gaming industry and capital markets—are drawing significant attention in public policy discourse. Both sectors hold immense promise: gaming contributes to job creation, while capital markets foster capital formation. However, both also pose substantial challenges. Gaming can lead to habit formation and addiction, while the Futures and Options (F&O) segment of capital markets carries risks of speculative losses. Policymakers have tackled these challenges differently, with contrasting approaches in gaming and F&O regulation.

around 568 million players—and employing 15,000 developers. The sector's revenue is projected to grow from \$3 billion in 2023 to \$6 billion by 2028, potentially creating 250,000 new jobs over the next decade. With development costs in India nearly 50 per cent lower than the global average, gaming has the potential to generate significant export revenues. However, this growth depends

on balanced regulation, particularly concerning gaming's habit-forming nature. Unfortunately, current proposals by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), the Advertising Standards Council of India (ASCI), and other stakeholders lean toward rigid, prescriptive measures, drawing inspiration from China's heavy-handed regulatory framework.

Flaws in Current Gaming Regulation

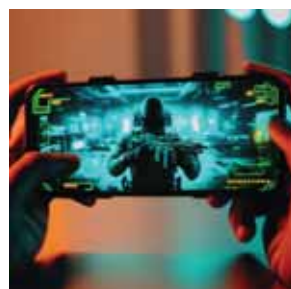
1. Time and Age Restrictions
Proposals to impose strict time limits and age restrictions on gaming apps are touted as innovative but raise significant concerns. Forcing intermediaries to monitor minors' activities infringes on privacy and contravenes the data minimi-

sation principle of India's Digital Personal Data Protection Act (DPDPA). Such policies may inadvertently lead to surveillance overreach, compromising minors' online privacy.

Parents, who have a far greater vested interest in their children's wellbeing, are better positioned to manage their gaming habits. Handing this responsibility to unelected bureaucrats not only undermines parental discretion but also risks creating intrusive and overly broad policies.

2. Blanket Warnings and Advertising Restrictions

The Ministry of Education's 2021 advisory linking online gaming to "gaming disorder" is an overgeneralisation. Such broad statements, without clinical substantiation, stigmatise



gaming and equate it with gambling. Similarly, ASCI's restrictions on advertisements portraying gaming as a viable career path stifle creativity. These measures lump educational and cerebral games with gambling-like activities, disincentivising developers from creating "good habit-forming" games. This could slow innovation and limit the gaming sector's growth potential.

Learning from SEBI'S Approach to F&O Regulation

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) faced a similar challenge with F&O trading, where explosive volumes exposed retail investors to speculative risks. Instead of resorting to outright bans,

Key Steps by SEBI:

Increased Contract Sizes: Raising the minimum investment size by 50 per cent reduced speculative trading by retail investors.

Disclosure Requirements: Brokers were mandated to display potential downsides prominently, promoting informed decision-making.

Structural Adjustments: Limiting weekly expiries to one per exchange curbed excessive speculative activity. These steps exemplify a bal-

anced approach—relying on nudges and incentives rather than bans. SEBI recognised that heavy-handed policies could undermine broader goals, such as increasing equity market participation.

India's gaming sector can benefit from SEBI's measured approach to F&O regulation. Policymakers must embrace strategies that balance innovation, consumer protection, and industry growth. Here are three actionable recommendations:

1. Nudges and Incentives Over Mandates:

Rather than micromanaging user behavior, regulators can incentivise responsible gaming through voluntary measures. For instance, gaming platforms could offer rewards for adhering to healthy gaming limits.

2. Transparent Education Over Stigma

Policymakers should prioritise honest disclosures about gaming's potential downsides instead of messaging that fosters shame. Clear and factual communication can empower gamers to make informed choices without demonising the industry.

3. Consideration of Unintended Consequences:

A tunnel-vision approach risks stifling innovation and creating barriers to growth. Policymakers must evaluate how restrictive measures might deter investment, hinder creativity, or drive users to unregulated platforms.

Hollywood Hills fire breaks out as deadly wildfires burn out of control across Los Angeles

A fast-moving fire broke out in the Hollywood Hills on Wednesday night, threatening one of Los Angeles' most iconic spots as firefighters battled to get under control three other major blazes that killed five people, put 100,000 people under evacuation orders and ravaged the city from the Pacific Coast to inland Pasadena.

The Sunset Fire was burning near the Hollywood Bowl and about a mile (kilometer) from the Hollywood Walk of Fame. The streets around Grauman's Chinese Theatre and Madame Tussauds were packed with stop-and-go traffic as sirens blared and low-flying helicopters soared by on their way to dump water on the flames. People toting suitcases left hotels on foot, while some onlookers walked towards the flames, recording the fire on their phones.

More than 1,000 structures, mostly homes, have been destroyed, and more than 130,000 people are under evacuation orders in the metropolitan area. Winds eased up some Wednesday, a day after hurricane-force winds blew embers through the air, igniting block after block, and hundreds of firefighters from other

states have arrived to help, but the four fires burning out of control showed the danger is far from over.

More than half a dozen schools in the area were either damaged or destroyed, including Palisades Charter High School, which has been featured in many Hollywood productions, including the 1976 horror movie "Carrie" and the TV series "Teen Wolf," officials said. Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass said air operations were dousing flames. She warned they still faced "erratic winds," though not of hurricane force like Tuesday evening, when much of the destruction occurred.

In Pasadena, Fire Chief Chad Augustin said between 200 and 500 structures have been damaged or lost from the Eaton Fire that started Tuesday night. He said the city's water system was stretched and was further hampered by power outages, but even without those issues, firefighters would not have been able to stop the fire as embers blown by the intense winds ignited block after block. "We were not stopping that fire last night," he said. "Those erratic wind gusts were throwing embers for multiple miles ahead of the fire."

On the Pacific Coast west of downtown Los Angeles, a

major fire leveled entire blocks, reducing grocery stores and banks to rubble in the Pacific Palisades, a hillside area along the coast dotted with celebrity homes and memorialized by the Beach Boys in their 1960s hit "Surfer USA."

More than 1,000 structures were destroyed in the Palisades fire, the most destructive in the modern history of LA. Many people were hurt, including

first responders, LA County Fire Chief Anthony Marrone said.

The scope of the destruction was just becoming clear: Block after block of California Mission Style homes and bungalows were reduced to nothing but charred remains dotted by stone fireplaces and blackened arched entryways. Ornate iron railing wrapped around the smoldering frame of one

house. The apocalyptic scenes spread for miles. Swimming pools were blackened with soot, and sports cars slumped on melted tires. As flames moved through his neighborhood, Jose Velasquez sprayed down his Altadena home with water as embers rained down on the roof. He managed to save their home, which also houses their family business of selling churros,

a Mexican pastry. Others weren't so lucky. Many of his neighbors were at work when they lost their homes.

"So we had to call a few people and then we had people messaging, asking if their house was still standing," he said. "We had to tell them that it's not." Beyond the burned areas, residents worked wearing N95 masks, unable to escape the toxic smoke wafting over huge

sections of the city.

Actors lost homes: The flames marched toward highly populated and affluent neighborhoods, including Calabasas and Santa Monica, home to California's rich and famous. Hollywood stars. Mandy Moore, Cary Elwes and Paris Hilton are among the stars who said Wednesday they had lost homes. Billy Crystal and his wife Janice lost their home of 45 years in the Palisades Fire. "We raised our children and grandchildren here. Every inch of our house was filled with love. Beautiful memories that can't be taken away," the Crystals wrote in the statement. In Palisades Village, the public library, two major grocery stores, a pair of banks and several boutiques were destroyed. "It's just really weird coming back to somewhere that doesn't really exist anymore," said Dylan Vincent, who returned to the neighborhood to retrieve some items and saw that his elementary school had burned down and that whole blocks had been flattened. The fires have consumed a total of about 42 square miles (108 square kilometers) — nearly the size of the entire city of San Francisco.

Landmarks get scorched and studios suspend production: President Joe Biden signed a federal emergency declaration

after arriving at a Santa Monica fire station for a briefing with Gov Gavin Newsom, who dispatched National Guard troops to help. Several Hollywood studios suspended production, and Universal Studios closed its theme park between Pasadena and Pacific Palisades.

With an estimated 1,000 structures destroyed and the fire still active, the Palisades Fire is by far the city's most destructive in modern history, topping the Sayre fire in 2008 that destroyed just over 600 structures, according to statistics kept by the Wildfire Alliance, a partnership between the city's fire department and MySafe:LA. Structures refers to homes and other buildings. Southern California Edison shut off service to thousands because of safety concerns related to high winds and fire risks. More than 1.5 million customers could face shutoffs depending on weather conditions, the utility said.

Several Southern California landmarks were heavily damaged, including the Reel Inn in Malibu, a seafood restaurant. Owner Teddy Leonard and her husband hope to rebuild. "When you look at the grand scheme of things, as long as your family is well and everyone's alive, you're still winning, right?" she said.

Body of Israeli hostage found in Gaza, possibly alongside his son's remains

Israeli soldiers recovered the body of a 53-year-old hostage in an underground tunnel in southern Gaza, the military said Wednesday, and the army was determining if another set of remains belongs to the man's son. The discovery of Yosef AlZayadni's body comes as Israel and Hamas are considering a ceasefire deal that would free the remaining hostages in Gaza and could halt the fighting. Israel has declared about a third of the 100 hostages dead, but believes as many as half could be alive.

Yosef and his son Hamzah AlZayadni were thought to still be alive before Wednesday's announcement, and news about their fate could ramp up pressure on Israel to move forward with a deal.

The military said it found evidence in the tunnel that raised "serious concerns" for the life of Hamzah AlZayadni, 23, suggesting he may have died in captivity. Col. Nadav Shoshani, an Israeli military spokesperson, said the circumstances behind Yosef AlZayadni's death were being investigated. AlZayadni and three of his children were among 250 hostages taken captive after Hamas-led militants stormed into southern Israel, killing 1,200 people. AlZayadni, who had 19 children, worked at the dairy farm at Kibbutz Holit for 17 years, said the Hostages Families Forum, a group representing the relatives of captives. AlZayadni's teenage children, Bilal and Aisha, were released along with about 100 hostages in a weeklong ceasefire deal in November 2023.

The family are members of the Bedouin community, part of Israel's Palestinian minority who have Israeli citizenship. The traditionally nomadic community is particularly impoverished in Israel and has suffered from neglect and marginalisation. Palestinians make up some 20 per cent of Israel's 10 million population, and millions more live in Gaza and under Israeli military occupation in the West Bank. Eight members of Israel's Bedouin minority were abducted in the October 2023 attacks. Yosef AlZayadni appeared on a list of 34 hostages shared by a Hamas official with The Associated Press earlier this week who the militant group said were slated for release. Israel said this was a list it had submitted to mediators last July, and that it has received nothing from

Hamas. US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said Wednesday that a ceasefire and hostage deal between Israel and Hamas is "very close" and he hopes "we can get it over the line" before handing over US diplomacy to President-elect Donald Trump's administration later this month.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu expressed sorrow at the news of AlZayadni's death, and said in a statement he had "hoped and worked to bring back the four members of the family from Hamas captivity." Israeli Defence Minister Israel Katz earlier said the bodies of both Yosef and Hamzah AlZayadni had been recovered, but the military said the identity of some remains were not yet determined.

The Hostages Families Forum said the ceasefire deal being nego-

tiated "comes far too late for Yosef - who was taken alive and should have returned the same way." "Every day in captivity poses an immediate mortal danger to the hostages," the group said in a statement.

The bodies of around three dozen hostages have been recovered in Gaza, including the two on Wednesday, and eight have been rescued by the army.

Many of the families fear their loved ones' fate is at risk as long as the war in Gaza rages on. Israeli forces are pressing their air and ground war against Hamas, and Palestinian medics said Israeli airstrikes killed at least five people in the Gaza Strip on Wednesday, including two infants and a woman. Israel's military says it only targets militants, accusing them of hiding among civilians.

Impeached President Yoon's lawyers warn detention may spark 'civil war'

South Korean opposition parties introduced a bill Thursday calling for an independent investigation into impeached President Yoon Suk Yeol's brief martial law declaration, as thousands of his supporters and critics held tense rallies near his residence ahead of his potential detention.

The bill, jointly submitted by six parties, including the main liberal opposition Democratic Party, proposes that a special prosecutor investigate whether Yoon's martial law decree on December 3 constituted an attempted rebellion. The bill also calls for an investigation into opposition claims that Yoon sought to provoke a clash with North Korea by allegedly flying drones over Pyongyang or discussing the possibility of shooting down trash-laden balloons launched from North Korea across the border, to justify a power grab at home. Yoon's lawyers and the South Korean military have denied the suspicions. Yoon remained holed up at his official residence in the capital city of Seoul, where the presidential security service has fortified the grounds with barbed wire and rows of vehicles blocking the roads, anticipating another attempt by law enforcement to detain him after last week's failed effort.

The Corruption Investigation Office for High-Ranking Officials, leading a joint investigation with police and the military, has pledged to work with police to make a more forceful effort to detain Yoon. It has warned that members of the presidential security staff could be arrested if they obstruct attempts to apprehend the embattled president.

Yoon's lawyers argued against bringing him to custody, claiming he isn't a threat to flee or destroy evidence. They claimed that images of him being dragged out in handcuffs could spark a "civil war" in the divided country. At a news conference Thursday, Seok Dong-hyeon, a lawyer on Yoon's legal team, highlighted the fervent protests by Yoon's supporters and claimed that the anti-corruption office's "reckless" attempts to detain Yoon would "provoke a significant backlash from outraged citizens."

"It would essentially be a civil war situation," he said, claiming that attempts to detain Yoon are aimed at humiliating him by displaying him in handcuffs. Separated by police lines and fences, thousands of Yoon's supporters and crit-

ics continued their daily rallies near his residence, shouting passionate slogans either vowing to protect him or calling for his ouster. They occasionally exchanged verbal insults, though there were no immediate reports of major clashes. The opposition has claimed that an independent investigation is crucial because separate investigations led by the country's anti-corruption agency and public prosecutors have been hindered by Yoon's unwillingness to cooperate.

The new bill proposes that the Supreme Court's chief justice recommend two candidates to Yoon, who would then select one as the special prosecutor. If Yoon refuses to appoint anyone, the elder of the two candidates would automatically assume the role.

The opposition's earlier bill proposing an independent investigation was rejected by the National Assembly on Wednesday, as members of Yoon's conservative party opposed a clause allowing only opposition parties to recommend special prosecutor candidates. That bill was voted down by just two votes, and the Democrats were hopeful that the new bill would get through.

China concerned over new Syrian regime appointing Xinjiang Uygur militants to top military posts

China said it is greatly concerned over the new Syrian government appointing foreign terrorist fighters, especially from the banned Uygur militant group "the East Turkestan Islamic Movement", to senior military ranks. The East Turkestan Islamic Movement (ETIM) is active in China's volatile Xinjiang province. These remarks were made by Fu Cong, China's permanent representative to the UN, at the UN Security Council Briefing on Syria on Wednesday.

China is greatly concerned about the reports that said the Syrian Army has recently granted senior military ranks to a number of foreign terrorist fighters, including the head of Council, a listed terrorist organisation, the Turkistan Islamic Party, also known as the ETIM, Cong said. He called on Syria to fulfil its counter-terrorism obligations and to

prevent any terrorist forces from using Syrian territory to threaten the security of other countries, according to official media reports here.

Reports from Syria say that the new Syrian regime headed by de-facto leader Ahmed al-Sharaa has appointed 50 new military officials of which six were foreign fighters, including that of ETIM.

The Army is being re-organised by Hayat Tahrir al-Sham (HTS), the Islamist group that is now effective in charge of the country following the overthrow of former President Bashar al-Assad earlier this month.

Based on the names that have been published, they are said to include Chinese Uyghurs, a Jordanian and a Turkish national. All are said to have been given high-ranking positions as colonels or brigadier-generals, BBC reported. China has supported the Assad regime and was caught unawares by its sudden fall. Assad himself fled to Russia where he was

granted asylum. Thousands of fighters from many different countries joined the uprising against Assad as it became an all-out armed conflict when mass protests were met with violence by the security forces.

The new appointments appear to have been made in order to reward those fighters - whether from Syria or elsewhere - who played a significant role in the final triumph over the regime. The issue is just one of many that could complicate any successful transition to a new political and social framework in Syria, the BBC report said. For China, ETIM is a red rag as it blames the Uygur militant group for a number of militant strikes in different cities in China and Xinjiang where the Uygur Muslims who constituted the majority were restive over the large-scale settlements of ethnic Hans from other provinces. For over a decade China has deployed thousands of security forces to control the militancy.

Austin leaves a consortium that now has more than a half dozen independent coalitions of those countries who are focused on Ukraine's longer-term security capabilities and who have committed to continuing to stand up those needs through 2027. Globally, countries including the US have ramped up domestic weapons production as the Ukraine war exposed that all of those stockpiles were woefully unprepared for a major conventional land war.

Taiwan demonstrates sea defences against potential Chinese attack

PTI ■ KAOHSIUNG (TAIWAN) Taiwan on Thursday demonstrated its sea defences against a potential Chinese attack as tensions rise with Beijing, part of a multilayered strategy to deter an invasion from the mainland. The island's navy highlighted its Kuang Hua VI fast attack missile boats and two Chiang-class corvettes in waters near Taiwan's largest port of Kaohsiung, a major hub for international trade considered key to resupplying Chinese forces should they establish a beachhead on the island.

India has potential to increase organic products' exports to ₹20,000 Crore in 3 years: Goyal

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

India has the potential to increase exports of organic products up to Rs 20,000 crore in the next three years, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said on Thursday. He said this while releasing the eighth edition of National Programme for Organic Production (NPOP) with new regulations aimed at enhancing clarity and transparency in organic product standards as well as aligning with global standards. "Currently, our organic product exports are at Rs 5,000-6,000 crore. In the next three years, we can easily achieve Rs 20,000 crore exports, about 3-3.5 times increase from the current level," Goyal said at an event organised in partnership with industry body Ficci. He said the global demand for these products is about Rs 1 lakh crore, which can grow up to Rs 10 lakh crore in the coming years, a unique opportunity India should not miss. India already has one of the largest numbers of farmers in the world undertaking organic farming.



He also asked startups to come out with solutions that help in growth of the sector. The NPOP has undergone several revisions since its inception in May 2001. The eighth edition marks a significant update to the regulatory framework governing organic products in India, with the last revision occurring in 2014. Key features of the eighth edition of

Mohol, Minister of State for Commerce Jitin Prasada and Cooperation Secretary Ashish Kumar Bhutani were also present at the event. NPOP plays a crucial role in enhancing the credibility of organic products in both national and international markets. It ensures that agricultural products labelled as "organic" meet stringent standards, thereby protecting consumer interests and promoting sustainable agricultural practices. It is overseen by the Commerce Ministry, with the Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA) managing its implementation. TraceNet 2.0, an upgraded traceability platform of NPOP for seamless operations and enhanced tools for regulatory oversight, was also launched. On the occasion, a dedicated NPOP portal was launched for more visibility and ease of Operations for Organic stakeholders. An upgraded redesigned APEDA portal as well as an agri exchange portal were also unveiled.

NPOP include farmer-friendly regulations, streamlined certification, enhanced transparency and revamped traceability system. The eighth edition aims to bolster India's organic export sector, with an ambitious target of reaching USD 2 billion in organic food exports by 2030. Ministers of State for Cooperation Krishan Pal Gurjar and Murlidhar

Govt to soon launch new credit guarantee scheme for MSME sector

Financial Services Secretary M Nagaraju on Thursday said the government would soon launch a new credit guarantee scheme for the MSME sector covering loans up to Rs 100 crore. "We are likely to come up with a scheme, which was announced by Finance Minister in her last Budget, that could provide loans up to Rs 100 crore without guarantee, if they are already having the enterprise," he said at the concluding day of Grameen Bharat Mahotsav. The scheme is expected to be placed before the Union Cabinet soon for its approval. "For facilitating term loans to MSMEs for purchase of machinery and equipment without collateral or third-party guarantee, a credit guarantee scheme will be introduced. The scheme will operate on pooling of credit risks of such MSMEs. A separately constituted self-financing guarantee fund will provide, to each applicant, guarantee cover up to Rs 100



crore, while the loan amount may be larger," the Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman had announced in Budget 2024-25. The borrower will have to provide an upfront guarantee fee and an annual guarantee fee on the reducing loan balance, she had said. MSMEs exports have witnessed a remarkable rise, increasing from Rs 3.95 lakh crore in 2020-21 to Rs 12.39 lakh crore in 2024-25, underscoring their critical role in boosting India's economy and strengthening global trade. The MSME sector in India has consistently demonstrated remarkable resilience and adaptability, significantly contributing to the nation's GDP over the years. The Gross Value Added (GVA) by MSMEs in India's GDP was 29.7 per cent in 2017-18, rising to 30.1 per cent in both 2022-23. To promote entrepreneurship in rural India, Nagaraju said, the government is very keen to lend more to rural areas through its various schemes. As the country surges ahead, he said, there is need to focus on four things, quality, linkages for exports, capacity building, and support to achieve the vision of Vikshit Bharat.

Inflows into mutual funds' equity schemes increase 14 per cent in December

Inflows into mutual funds' equity schemes increased by over 14 per cent on-month to Rs 41,156 crore in December, even as market volatilities continued. The small and midcap schemes of mutual funds continued to attract investor interest with inflows touching record highs during the month, despite the concerns being expressed about the two segments for the risk they portend, industry body Amfi said. Inflows into systematic investment plans came at Rs 26,459 crore, up from November's Rs 25,320 crore. The SIP assets under management stood at Rs 13.63 lakh crore, which is around a fifth of the overall. The overall assets under management of mutual funds came at Rs 66.93 lakh crore as on December 31, 2024, which was down from Rs 68.08 lakh crore in the month-ago period.



Venkat Chalasani, chief executive of the Association of Mutual Funds of India (Amfi), attributed the decline to market-to-market losses on corrections as well as outflows of Rs 1.27 lakh crore in debt schemes, which is in line with previous experience of a pull out at the end of a quarter. Responding to a question on the continued interest in equity funds and what to expect in the future, Chalasani acknowledged that there are uncertainties which may

influence the market, like the change in the US administration with Donald Trump as the President in January, but added that Indian investors continued to repose faith in the equity market. Pointing to the continued interest in SIPs, Chalasani said these inflows illustrate the optimism of the investors in the Indian markets over a long term. Asset management companies launched a total of 33 new fund offers during the month

through which over Rs 13,643 crore of money was mobilised, Amfi said, adding that this was higher than the 18 schemes that collected over Rs 4,000 crore in November. "Culmination of NFOs, SIPs and lump sum purchase led to an increase in net sales numbers. Investor confidence on mutual funds are an efficient tool for investments continue to remain strong," Kotak Mahindra AMC's national head for sales, marketing and digital business Manish Mehta said. Within the equity schemes, sectoral or thematic category attracted investors with the highest net inflow at Rs 15,331 crore, which is almost double of the Rs 7,658 crore in November. The midcap category saw inflows of Rs 5,093 crore in December 2024, while the smallcap category saw inflows of Rs 4,667 crore, Amfi said, adding that these are record inflows.

Government to give ₹35,000 Crore LPG subsidy to IOC, BPCL, HPCL

The government is likely to provide a subsidy of Rs 35,000 crore to state-owned Indian Oil Corporation Ltd (IOC), Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL), and Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd (HPCL) to make up for losses they incurred on selling the fuel this fiscal, sources said. The three fuel retailers have kept the price of domestic LPG unchanged at Rs 803 per 14.2-kg cylinder since March 2024 despite a rise in input raw material cost. This led to under-recoveries on LPG sales, and the resultant drastic fall in their earnings in the April-September (first half of current 2024-25 fiscal year). The total under-recovery on LPG sales for the industry in the current fiscal is estimated at about Rs 40,500 crore. Against this, the government is likely to provide Rs 35,000



crore in total spread over two financial years, two sources with knowledge of the matter said. IOC, BPCL and HPCL are likely to get Rs 10,000 crore during the current 2024-25 fiscal and the remaining Rs 25,000 crore in the next, they said, adding that provision of the subsidy is likely to be made in the Union Budget for 2025-26 that Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman will present on February 1. Sources said there is an under-

recovery (or loss) of about Rs 240 per 14.2-kg cylinder that the state-owned fuel retailers sell to domestic households at the current price of Rs 803. Prices of domestic LPG are regulated by government to insulate domestic households from high market rates. Regulated prices are lower than the Saudi CP - the international benchmark used to price domestic LPG. This is because domestic LPG production is not sufficient to meet the local demand and the

fuel has to be imported. This leads to under-recoveries and consequent losses to the fuel retailers. Government from time to time compensates IOC, BPCL and HPCL for these losses. The three were previously paid Rs 22,000 crore compensation for 2021-22 and 2022-23 fiscal year. This was against Rs 28,249 crore of under-recovery. Of the Rs 40,500 crore under-recovery estimated for the current fiscal, IOC is likely to account for Rs 19,550 crore, HPCL Rs 10,570 crore and BPCL Rs 10,400 crore, according to sources. Domestic LPG prices have remained unchanged since March 9, 2024, when they were cut by Rs 100 per 14.2-kg cylinder just before general elections were announced. Sources said international LPG prices have remained moderately high in 2024, even during summers, leading to under-recoveries.

Software migration caused error in gold import computation; issue largely rectified: Sources

The government's initiative to migrate SEZ data from NSDL software to ICEGATE system for streamlined reporting of import data

caused double counting of gold imports, resulting in inflated figures and the issue has now been largely rectified, government sources said. The downward revision has provided the actual picture of

trade deficit (difference between imports and exports), which was earlier looking very high. The deficit for November will now be revised downwards from USD 37.84 billion to about USD

32.8 billion. Similarly, there will be a revision in overall import numbers as well. On account of the correction, the commerce ministry has revised downwards the gold import data for November by USD 5 billion to USD 9.84 billion and for the first eight months of the current fiscal by USD 11.7 billion to USD 37.38 billion. The double counting occurred as imports into the country and the clearances from SEZs (special economic zones) to domestic tariff area (DTA) were counted twice due to technical glitches. The double counting which occurred on account of migration of NSMDL to ICEGATE has now being



largely rectified, but the migration is still underway, the sources said. "Correction and revision of data is part and parcel of framework of statistics world

over. The data compilation is a complicated process as it involves collection of data from over 500 locations and from over 2.5 lakh transactions take place every day," they said.

They added that corrections and revisions of data is a standard practice and an integral part. "Revision and corrections do happens in data. This is a normal drill of statistics," they said. Exports and imports take place mainly from two places — airports and seaports. SEZ (special economic zones) numbers were earlier counted separately (on NSDL system) as these zones are treated as foreign entities in terms of provisions related to customs. In May last, it was decided to migrate from NSDL to ICEGATE. India's trade data compilation process starts with exporters and importers filing Shipping

Bills (for exports) and Bills of Entry (for imports) through the Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) system at Customs. All the data comes to the server of ICEGATE. The Indian Customs Electronic Gateway (ICEGATE) is the national portal of Indian Customs of the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) that provides e-filing services to trade, cargo carriers and other trading partners electronically. Customs officials verify these documents for compliance and assign a unique transaction number upon clearance. The verified data is then transmitted to the DGCIS in real-time.

TCS Q3 net profit rises 11.95 per cent to ₹12,380 Crore, employee base dips

PTI ■ MUMBAI

India's largest IT services company TCS on Thursday reported an 11.95 per cent jump in net profit at Rs 12,380 crore in the December quarter while the overall workforce reduced by over 5,000 employees. The Tata Group company had reported a net profit of Rs 11,058 crore in the year-ago period, and Rs 11,909 crore in the preceding September quarter. The company's revenue grew 5.6 per cent to Rs 63,973 crore as against Rs 60,583 crore a year earlier. However, it was down from Rs 64,259 crore in the September quarter. New order bookings came at USD 10.2 billion in what is termed as a seasonally challenging quarter due to the holiday season. Chief Executive K Krithivasan said the new orders were across industries,



geographies and service lines, which lends a "good visibility to long-term growth". He said the banking, financial services and insurance, along with consumer businesses are returning to growth and there are early signs of a revival in discretionary spend in some verticals.

These two trends, along with continuing strong growth in regional markets makes the company confident for the future, he added. The operating profit margin came at 24.5 per cent as against 24.1 per cent in the quarter-ago period, but still lower than the aspirational

bracket. The overall workforce reduced by over 5,000 employees during the three months under review, and the overall base stood at 6.07 lakh as of December this year. The IT services attrition stood at 13 per cent. Chief Human Resources Officer Milind Lakkad said campus hirings are going according to plan and the company is preparing to onboard a higher number of campus hires next year. The company board announced a dividend of Rs 76 per share, including a special dividend of Rs 66 per share. TCS also announced the acquisition of land bank in Bengaluru from a Tata Group company for Rs 1,625 crore. The TCS scrip closed 1.72 per cent down at Rs 4,036.65 apiece on the BSE on Thursday, as against a 0.68 per cent correction on the benchmark.







LOVE, LOSS AND PSYCHE

Rithwik Aryan's *Out of Madness* is a riveting debut that masterfully intertwines themes of mental health, love, loss and the fragility of human sanity. It is a novel born from an extraordinary journey of self-discovery, research and lived experience, offering readers an unfiltered glimpse into the complexities of the human psyche. Aryan's path to writing *Out of Madness* is as unconventional as the book itself. A dropout from Harvard Extension School, Aryan chose the



unpredictable path of storytelling over academia, immersing himself for over a year in the raw and unsettling environment of India's most notorious mental asylums. This decision infuses the novel with an authenticity that is rare and striking. The narrative follows Mason Moron, a psychology professor at Nalanda University who stages his death after discovering his wife's infidelity. Critiques of Aryan are equally accompanied by Aryan's own ability to navigate through and critique

Aryan's anguish, the same sheds light on how men are coerced into hiding their feelings. Using Aryan's masculinity and its portrayal through the character of Mason and Barbrugio, Aryan contemplates on how masculinity comes with grief and vulnerability, wherein, Aryan poses those males do not have to stoically conform to societal gender norms. Aryan in a more sensitive manner showcases the effect of societal pressures and expectations in suppressing feelings in men. What can be termed as one of Aryan's strongest suit shines in this very novel, the other novels that Aryan has penned encapsulate emotion through an extremely fact-based and observational lens. Aryan unlike many others who idealistically view and comment on other's pain, stayed in a

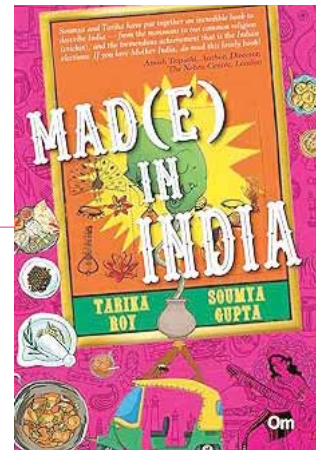

The Essence of Indian Life


