# Verma, Bhiduri vs Kejriwal, Atishi: High stakes Delhi polls

Tith less than a week left before the announcement of Delhi assembly polls, the BJP has released its first list of 29 candidates, awarding tickets to four sitting MLAs, two former MPs, and eight former MLAs. The BJP's first list features eight prominent leaders who switched over from the Congress and AAP in recent months.

Former West Delhi MP Parvesh Sahib Singh Verma will contest against AAP Chief Arvind Kejriwal in the Delhi assembly constituency. The New Delhi seat, held by Kejriwal since 2013, will witness the former chief minister taking on the sons of two other former chief ministers. Verma is the son of Sahib Singh Verma, who had a two-year tenure as chief minister in the 1990s. Former West Delhi MP started preparations for contesting from the seat even before he was announced as the official candidate, saying he had been given the go-ahead by national leaders. ### **Kejriwal promises** water bill waivers post elections


As the Delhi Jal Board (DJB) debt accumulated to over Rs 73,000 crore, former Chief Minister and Aam Aadmi Party convener Arvind Kejriwal on Saturday made another promise to the people of Delhi that his party would waive inflated water bills if his party was voted to power in the upcoming Delhi Assembly polls likely to be held next month. Addressing a press conference, Kejriwal urged the people not to pay inflated water bills and said that 12 lakh families got bills of zero amount." But when I went to jail, I don't know what these people (BJP) did behind my back." He assured that these erroneous bills would be waived off after the elections, offering relief to affected residents.The AAP government is providing 20,000 litres of free water to Delhi households. # **Odisha prepares for Pravasi Bharatiya Divas**

PM Modi to launch the event on Jan 9

Prime Minister Narendra on January 8 to inaugurate the Pravasi Bharatiya Divas (PBD) convention, an event to celebrate the Indian diaspora being hosted in Odisha for the first time.

Modi is expected to arrive at the Bhubaneswar airport at 8 pm on January 8 and will stay overnight at the Raj Bhavan. On January 9, he will launch the convention at the Janata Maidan.

The three-day conclave from January 8 to 10 has attracted significant attention among the global Indian diaspora. Registrations have surged in recent weeks with over 7,500 participants from more than 50 countries expected to attend, according to the State Home Department.

The delegates include nonresident Indians (NRIs) primarily from Southeast Asia, the Gulf region and Europe. Domestically, participants



from Kerala, Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh and Odisha will also take part.

The event emphasises Odisha's role as an emerging hub for economic and cultural exchanges. The State's strategic location and its rich cultural heritage have played a significant role in boosting interest, especially in sectors like tourism and port-based infrastructure.

This year marks the 18th edition of Pravasi Bharatiya Divas, an initiative first launched in 2003 by former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee. By hosting the convention, Bhubaneswar joins an elite group of cities such as New Delhi, Mumbai and Bengaluru, showcasing Odisha's growing prominence on the national stage.

To enhance the experience for international and domestic delegates, Odisha is organising parallel events,

including a Night Flea Market, an Adivasi Fair and a Food Festival to highlight the State's cultural vibrancy. The convention aligns

with India's 'Act East Policy,'

aiming to strengthen ties

with Southeast Asia. Odisha Chief Minister, Mohan Charan Majhi called the event "a defining moment in Odisha's journey towards becoming a global destination for investment and cultural exchange."

The programme will commence with the Youth Pravasi Bharatiya Divas on January 8 followed by the Prime Minister's inauguration on January 9. The event concludes on January 10 with the Pravasi Bharatiya Samman awards presented by President Droupadi Murmu.

two others were able to flee. Chaos and tension prevailed in the area as a large crowd gathered around the scene. A pistol and empty cartridges were found at the spot.

Later, police arrived at the scene and took the two apprehended accused into custody. Till last reports, a search and investigation was underway to nab those who fled.

The incident is a glaring case of growing cases of armed robbery in the State. On Friday, a gang of armed men carried out a robbery in broad daylight at the Manappuram Gold Loan office in Sambalpur town. The robbers decamped with gold jewellery worth Rs 20 crore after holding the employees and customers hostage at gunpoint.

# Six Indian Americans sworn-in as members of US House of Representatives

In a momentous occasion for **I**Indian Americans, six of their leaders on Friday were sworn-in as the members of the US House of Representatives, the largest so far for this minority ethnic community in the United States.

"When I was first sworn in twelve years ago, I was the sole Indian American Member of Congress and only the third in US history. Now, our coalition is six strong! I am excited to welcome even more Indian Americans to the halls of Congress in the years to come!" Congressman Dr Ami Bera said in a post on X.

Several Indian Americans aspiring to be elected to the House lost

general elections. At least three of them were women: Sushila Jaipal, Bhavani Patel and Krystal Kaul. Dalip Singh Saund was the first Indian American to be elected to the House of Representatives in 1957. Also, the first Sikh, he was elected for three consecutive terms. He was from the Democratic Party. It took nearly five decades for a second Indian American to enter the US House of Representatives. Bobby Jindal represented the First Congressional District of Louisiana from 2005 to 2008. He later went on to become the two-term Governor of Louisiana, making him the first Indian American to be elected as the governor of a US State. Jindal is the only Indian American to be elected to the House on a Republican ticket.

Another farmer committed suicide on Friday night by consuming poison allegedly due to crop loss in Koladiha village under the Aul police station in Kendrapada dis-

The deceased was identified as Kailash Chandra Dhal.

This is the tenth death of a farmer in the last 10 days in the State due to crop loss owing to the depression-induced untimely rainfall, reports said.

As per sources, Dhal had cultivated paddy in eight acres of land but lost the vast majority of it after unseasonal rains in December destroyed his entire crop. Family members of the deceased linked his death to mounting financial burden. Dhal had taken a loan of approximately Rs 2.5 to Rs 3 lakh and was under severe mental distress for several days over concerns about repaying the same after losing his crops.

Kumarsen said his father was under intense depression for the past ten days and despite family intervention took the extreme step after increased debt burden.

The incident once again brought forth an alarming situation in the State where several farmers have either taken their lives or died out of shock after losing their crops in unseasonal and incessant rains that battered the State from December 19.

In the most recent case, two farmers from the Ranpur block of Nayagarh died after reported stress from crop loss and mounting debts. Earlier, at least seven farmers had died by suicide.

government would assist private bus owners in installing these devices which would help detect as well as prevent various cases of negligence and emergency including drunk driving and loss of consciousness.

Such smart devices can also analyse braking and detect loss of steering and other mechanical failures, which can be key elements in preventing

State Transport Secretary Usha Padhee said discussions regarding the manufacturer

and procurement of these devices are ongoing with the IIT

"These smart devices are capable of detecting various scenarios. They can follow the movement of the iris and alert the driver if they fall asleep while driving, a condition known as sleep hypnosis," she said.

Odisha State Bus Owners' Association general secretary Debendra Sahu lauded the move while emphasising the need for such devices not only in buses but in all vehicles plying on the roads. "We had already re-

quested the government for such devices. Not only will it spread awareness but also ensure the safety of drivers and passengers alike," he added.

In the same event, CM Majhi also stated that the government would recruit over 2,000 traffic police personnel with an announcement already made to appoint 500 personnel this year with a vision to streamline traffic and prevent accidents.

# Firecracker blast leaves 2 dead, 2 injured

JAGATISNGHPUR

An explosion claimed the lives of a man and his wife while another couple has been left battling for their lives in Jagatsinghpur. The suspected 'firecracker blast' led to the collapse of a house's roof and walls, killing the two while two others were critically injured.

The deceased were identified as Rajesh Das and his wife Rani Das, residents of Badabag village. Those injured were Rajesh's younger brother Paresh Das and his wife Lakshmipriya. The explosion occurred at night, report-



edly linked to a fireworks inci-

Authorities, including police, fire brigade and National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), arrived at the scene to conduct rescue efforts. The trapped family members were

extracted from the debris and transported to a hospital for urgent medical attention.

Police initiated an investigation to determine the exact cause of the explosion and ascertain whether legal or illegal fireworks were involved.

Shankar Udgata informed, "Families of two brothers were residing in the building. We have recovered a body from the debris. We suspect another body is buried under the rubble. Another couple was rescued and admitted to hospital. Further search operation is on. Fortunately, the children were sleeping in a separate house. We are not sure if the blast occurred due to a cracker burst. But the probe is on.'

The tragedy has left the village community in shock with discussions about safety and legalities of fireworks usage.

# Woman allegedly killed over dowry in Koraput

Murder case lodged; husband detained

A pregnant woman was found dead under mysterious circumstances in Beheraguda village under the Semiliguda police station of Koraput district on Friday night.

Despite her pregnancy, her husband and in-laws demanded more dowry as per the serious allegations

brought forward by her family members.

Relatives of the deceased also corroborated the allegations and claimed that her in-laws had demanded a large sum of money from them as dowry and allegedly killed her after their demands were not heeded.

"They initially demanded Rs 5 lakh as dowry. We could not afford that much but still paid them Rs 2 lakh and had requested time to pay the remaining amount," alleged a relative of Rachana. Family members further reported signs of injuries and wounds around the neck and insisted that she was killed by her in-

On the other hand, the woman's mother-in-law refuted the claims and alleged that she died by suicide.

## Satkosia sanctuary shut for tourists for Jan 6-8 & 17-18



and its different sections would remain closed for tourists from January 6 to 8 and again on 17 and 18 owing to the scheduled bird and crocodile census. Satkosia Wildlife Division Forest Officer (DFO) Saroj Panda informed on Saturday that the crocodile census would commence from the evening hours of January 5 and continue until 8.

Besides, Satkosia will again reopen on January 9 before remaining out of bounds for tourists on 17 and 18 for the bird census. All tourism-related activities, including boating in the Mahanadi river, will also be suspended along with a prohibition on local fishermen from entering the gorge during this period.

The census at Satkosia will cover a 23-km stretch along the Mahanadi and involve 70 staff members deployed across 14 teams from the Forest Department. Arrangements, including the use of country boats, have been made for the census activities.

Incidentally, last year's census in Satkosia was held around roughly the same time when the crocodile population had surged with the number of mugger crocodiles rising to and the population of gharials increasing to 14.

However, the DFO had also mentioned a decline in the number of birds visiting the sanctuary last year with approximately 3,330 birds flocking to the gorge against 3,800 birds of 81 species in 2023.

### **Gold loan office robbery** Cops form 4 teams for probe but still clueless

Police on Saturday intensified search operations and formed four specialised teams in the wake of a daring robbery at the Manappuram gold loan office on Friday.

Although extensive searches are being conducted across State borders, no arrests have been made yet.

The robbery saw miscreants decamped with approximately 28 kilograms gold jewellery along with Rs 4.8 lakh in cash. The investigation teams are not just limiting their efforts to Sambalpur alone; the investigation is also on in neighbouring districts though a significant breakthrough continues to elude them.

The Manappuram gold loan office employees recalled the harrowing ordeal where they were held at gunpoint, tied and held captive by the robbers during their getaway with the valuables.

A witness, who is an employee of the office, recounted that between six to seven armed robbers stormed the premises, thrashed everyone and held them at gunpoint. The robbers forced the staff members to comply by intimidation and physical restraint before feeling with the valu-

"As usual we were working in the office when the armed miscreants stormed into the office and began beating up before we could understand anything. They were all armed with pistols and sharp-edged weapons. They tied us all and took off with the gold jewellery weighing around 28 kilos and 200 grams. They have also taken away Rs 4.8L cash," the employee recounted.

The dramatic escape of the robbers was captured by CCTV cameras. Investigators are currently scrutinising this footage in hopes of identifying the perpetrators and tracing their whereabouts.

# Tribals observe Black Day at Kalinganagar

### On 19th anniversary of firing on tribal protesters killing 14

Large numbers of tribal people on Thursday observed 'Black Day' to mark the killing of 14 innocent tribals 19 years ago in Ambagadia village near the Kalingnagar steel hub in Jajpur district.

The police had gunned down 14 people including three women on January 2, 2006 during a congregation of tribals, protesting against the construction of a boundary wall of Tata Steel company.

Slogan-shouting tribals including many women and others took out a procession from Champakoila to Ambagadia and held a meet-



ing at the martyrs' tower. "We have been paying tribute to those who have sacrificed their lives for us and our livelihoods 19 years ago. We have been agitating for the protection of water, forest and land," said VVJM secretary Rabindra Jarika.

Addressing the meeting, Jarika said, "The Nabin government had not so far explained the reason behind the firing. The government was only too keen to sign MoUs

with the big corporate houses and to practically give away the best deposits of iron ore as captive mines at a mere amount of royalty. The TATA built the steel plant over the bodies of the tribal people."

Jarika also criticised the decision of the State Cabinet accepting the report of the Inquiry Commission on Kalinga Nagar firing. "In the report, the Inquiry Commission has not blamed the police for the killing of 14 tribal people for which we totally reject it," added Jarika.

Six chopped palms of Kalinganagar victims have been waiting for decent cremation for 13 years. The doctors of the government hospital in Jajpur had chopped off the palms of six bodies on January 2, 2006. Now the family members of the deceased need the chopped palms for the decent cremation," Jarika said.

Security was tightened in Kalinganagar and its nearby areas on Thursday to prevent any untoward incident .The memorial meeting was peace ful with no report of untoward incident, said the Kalinganagar ADM.

Meanwhile, the MLA of Chhatrapur has also written a letter to the Chief Minister requesting to order for a high level inquiry.

### **Dam safety** NHRC directs Keonihar, Sambalpur DMs for steps

The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has directed the district Collectors of Keonjhar and Sambalpur to take steps for the safety of people living in the vicinity of the Hadagarh

The NHRC passed the order taking cognisance of a petition filed by lawyer and human rights activist Radhakant Tripathi in December. The commission has asked the Collectors to take action within eight weeks.

Tripathi stated that the Hadagarh Dam has been built on the Salandi river in Keonjhar district. People of Keonjhar and Bhadrak districts, are benefiting from this. The embankment is being constructed to protect people from floods.

However, the dam has become weak and its restoration and repairs are necessary. Such is also the situation of the Hirakud Dam. He alleged that the safety audit of the dams is also not being done properly and on time. Despite the Dam Safety Act 2021 and the National Dam Safety Authority, many dams are functioning without proper arrangements, which have always put people's lives at risk.

More than 1,000 dams in the country will be around 50 years of age or above in the year 2025. Due to various reasons, the water holding capacity is decreasing while the premises are shrinking. Similarly, the earthen dams and concrete infrastructure are weakening. As a result, there are floods when it rains and there is always a danger to the dams, stated the petitioner.

### Govt's draft protection rules create balance between regulation and innovation while completely protecting citizen rights: Ashwini Vaishnaw

The draft protection rules 1 released government create a balance between regulation innovation while completely protecting citizen rights, Union minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said on Saturday. The Government issued draft rules for the Digital Personal Data Protection (DPDP) Act on Friday for public consultation till February 18.

"Rules have to be within four walls of the Act. It is within the ambit of the Act passed by Parliament. These rules have been framed to ensure a balance between regulation innovation completely safeguarding the rights of citizens," Vaishnaw told PTI in an interview.

The minister said earlier there was only one template available to the world -- the European data protection rule with a high level of regulation. However, Indian rules have attempted to balance the regulation with innovation to safeguard the boom in the innovation ecosystem developing among startups in the country.

said extensive consultations have been held



with the industry and systems complaint registration, their handling and distribution, interaction with digital platforms, have been put in place.

The minister said the final rules will be placed before Parliament in the monsoon session for approval and all handling digitally will get two years to calibrate their systems as per

"We have also kept graded punishments to protect the interests of micro, small and medium enterprises. It is to save businesses who may be running their business using a single computer. However, Big Techs have higher obligations under the rules. Minor breaches will attract small penalties and big breaches will lead to higher penalties," Vaishnaw said.

He said the penal provision will be implemented as per the Act and the rules the prescribe way implement them.

The Act has the provision to impose penalty of up to Rs 250 crore on data fiduciaries.

"There is a provision on voluntary undertaking under the Act where an entity can voluntarily disclose breach to authorities and the Data Protection Board (DPB) will deal with it as per Act,' Vaishnaw said.

As per the DPDP Act, the acceptance of the voluntary undertaking by the Board will protect an entity proceedings under provisions of this However, the protection will be subject to the approval of

If a person fails to adhere to any term of the voluntary undertaking accepted by the DPB, it shall be deemed a breach of the provisions of the Act and the board after giving an opportunity of being heard to the person may proceed to act as per the penal

## Cold wave intensifies in Uttar Pradesh, dense fog disrupts normal life

LUCKNOW

The cold wave gripping Uttar Pradesh intensified on Saturday, with icy winds and dense fog plunging tempera-tures and disrupting daily life across the state. For the second consecutive day this season, a cold-day alert was issued in 10 districts, leaving residents shivering as they braved the harsh weather conditions. Kanpur recorded the lowest temperature in the state, with the mercury dipping to 4.6 degrees Celsius in the last 24 hours.

The cold snap was felt statewide, with temperatures in 20 cities falling below 10 Celsius. Meteorological Department issued a yellow alert for dense fog in 26 districts. In Lucknow, visibility dropped to less than 50 meters until 9 a.m., causing significant disruptions to air travel. Two flights to Lucknow from Bengaluru and Delhi were cancelled, while several outbound flights faced delays of up to eight hours. Visibility reached zero in

multiple cities, including

Meerut, Auraiya, Mainpuri, where vehicles struggled to navigate. Slowmoving traffic was reported in Sambhal, Ghaziabad, Hapur, and Ayodhya. In Agra, dense fog caused a tragic accident late Friday night in the Kiravali area, where three vehicles collided. One person died, and 30 passengers were injured in the mishap.

another accident, passenger bus collided with a truck on the Agra-Jaipur

highway at 1 a.m. The bus, traveling from Gujarat, also struck a Max vehicle following the initial collision. Police arrived at the scene to rescue passengers trapped inside the bus. Four passengers and two individuals from the Max vehicle were critically injured. According to reports, the accident occurred after the driver of a trailer truck abruptly applied brakes, causing the bus to rear-end the truck amid low visibility. The

expected on Sunday, with a slight rise in temperature and reduced fog. However, the cold wave is likely to return after Monday as a new western disturbance becomes active This weather system could bring drizzle to parts of western Uttar Pradesh and the NCR, further intensifying cold winds.

# **Judge sets Trump's sentencing** in hush money case for Jan 10

n an extraordinary turn, a In an extraordinary turn, a judge Friday set President-elect Donald Trump's sentencing in his hush money case for January 10 — little over a week before he's due to return to the White House — but indicated he wouldn't be jailed. The development nevertheless

leaves Trump on course to be the first president to take office convicted of felony crimes. Judge Juan M Merchan, who

presided over Trump's trial, signalled in a written decision that he'd sentence the former and future president to what's known as a conditional discharge, in which a case gets dismissed if a defendant avoids

Merchan rejected Trump's push to dismiss the verdict and throw out the case on presidential immunity grounds and because of his impending return to the White House. The judge said he found "no legal impediment to sentencing' Trump and that it was "incumbent" on him to sentence Trump prior to his swearing in on January 20.

"Only by bringing finality to this matter" will the interests of justice be served, Merchan

Trump was convicted in May of 34 counts of falsifying business records. They involved an alleged scheme to hide a hush money payment to porn actor Stormy Daniels in the last weeks of Trump's first campaign in 2016. The payout was made to keep her from publi-cising claims she'd had sex with the married Trump years earlier. He says that her story is false and that he did nothing

After Trump's November 5 election, Merchan halted proceedings and indefinitely postponed the sentencing so the defense and prosecution could weigh in on the future of the

Trump's lawyers urged Merchan to toss it. They said it would otherwise pose unconstitutional "disruptions" to the incoming president's ability to run the country.

Prosecutors acknowledged there should be some accommodation for his upcoming presidency, but they insisted the conviction should stand. They suggested various options, such as freezing the case during his term or guaranteeing him a no-jail sentence. They also proposed closing

both his conviction and his undecided appeal — a novel idea drawn from what some state courts do when criminal defendants die while appealing

as the first former president to be convicted of a crime and the first convicted criminal to be elected to the office. His conviction left the 78-

year-old facing the possibility of punishment ranging from a fine or probation to up to four years in prison. The case centered on how

Trump accounted for reimbursing his personal attorney for the Daniels payment. The lawyer, Michael Cohen,

fronted the money. He later recouped it through a series of payments that Trump's company logged as legal expenses. Trump, by then in the White House, signed most of the checks himself.

tion, his lawyers sought to reverse his conviction for a different reason: a US Supreme Court decision in July that gave presidents broad immunity from criminal prosecution. That request was still pending when the election raised new

While urging Merchan to nix the conviction, Trump also sought to move the case to federal court, where he could also assert immunity. A federal judge repeatedly said no, but Trump appealed.

# Imran Khan claims he was given chance to leave country on exile for 3 years

Pakistan's jailed former prime minister Imran Khan has claimed that he was offered a chance to leave the country on exile for three years but he declined.

In a post on X on Friday, the 72-year-old former cricketerturned-politician said, "I was offered the opportunity of a three-year exile while I was in Attock Jail, but I will live and die in Pakistan." In conversation with media

persons at Rawalpindi's Adiala Jail where he is incarcerated since August 2023, Khan said he has been "indirectly approached" with an offer to transfer him to his Bani Gala residence in Islamabad.

However, he said on X that he refused the offer. "My stance is clear: release my detained workers and leaders first. Only then will I consider discussing my personal situation."

The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder further said that he believes Pakistan's decisions should be made within the country.

"However, when it comes to basic human rights, voices will naturally rise globally. Institutions like the United Nations exist for this purpose.

Enlightened people all over the world raise their voices against violation of basic rights."

Khan said during this "authoritarian era", the breach of personal freedoms, violation of fundamental legal rights, and destruction of institutions have not only disrupted the country's social and political systems but also its legal and economic frameworks.

The absurd manner in which Khalid Khurshid (former Gilgit-Baltistan chief minister) was sentenced to 34 years in prison demonstrates that there is no rule of law in our country any more, and a terrible undeclared dictatorship prevails," he said.

Even in Musharraf's era, we criticised military interference but never faced such oppression and fascism," he said

Rohit "opted to rest" from the


Sydney Test, handing over the leadership duties to Jasprit Bumrah, sparking widespread speculations about his future. "I have not retired. I stood down, that is what I would say. Basically the chat that I had with the coach and the selector was very simple. I am not able to score runs, there is no form, it is an important match and we need a player with form," Rohit told Star Sports.

"As it is, in our batting, the form of the boys is not that good. So you cannot carry a lot of out of form players in the team. This simple thing was going on in my mind. I am not going anywhere," he added.

The 37-year-old said the team management and selectors backed his decision.

"I wanted to tell the coach and the selector that this is what is going on in my mind. They backed my decision. They said that you have been playing for so many years. You know what you are doing. 

# the pioneer

'If you want to understand today you have to search yesterday"







hat began as a routine inspection by district officials to check noise levels from loudspeakers and illegal electricity connections in the Muslim-dominated Khaggu Sarai area of Sambhal has turned into a historic archaeological discovery. On 14 December, a team led by the District Magistrate (DM) and Superintendent of Police (SP) stumbled upon a locked structure. Breaking open its doors revealed not just an abandoned Shiva temple but also a wealth of history hidden beneath layers of soil and silt.

The discovery of the temple, which had been locked for 46 years, has prompted a flurry of activity, including surveys by the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI). Early reports suggest the temple, and other relics unearthed nearby, may date back several centuries, providing invaluable insights into Sambhal's rich cultural and religious history.

### **Locked Temple, Unlocked History**

M Dr. Rajendra Pansiya recalled the unexpected nature of the find. "This discovery was purely accidental. We were investigating noise and electricity issues near a mosque, but what we found behind the locked doors was remarkable," he said. The temple, which had been shut since the 1978 communal riots, housed a Shiva idol and a statue of Hanuman. Nearby, a well contained three additional statues that were uncovered during excavation.

The riots of 1978, which displaced many from the local Hindu community, had led to the temple being abandoned. "Local accounts suggest the temple is over 500 years old," Dr. Pansiya added. To confirm its antiquity, the district administration reached out to the ASI for carbon dating and further investigation.

The ASI Steps In ollowing the DM's request, a four-member → ASI team from Meerut and Delhi conducted an extensive eight-hour survey of the site last week. The team examined the temple, the adjacent well, and five other pilgrimage sites, including Bhadrak Ashram, Swargdeep, and Chakrapani. During their survey, they documented their findings through photography and collected evidence for further analysis.



In addition to the temple, the ASI team identified 19 wells, including the historically significant Chaturmukh Koop, Moksha Koop, and Dharma Koop. The ASI's investigation aims to establish the historical and cultural significance of these sites.

Dr. Pansiya expressed optimism about the findings. "Once we have the ASI's report, we will have a clearer picture of the historical importance of these sites. Based on their recommendations, we will prepare a plan for their preservation and development," he said.

### **The Stepwell of Laxman Ganj** dding to the list of discoveries, a 250-

1857, was unearthed in Sambhal's Laxman Ganj area last week. Named Rani ki Bawdi, the stepwell came to light after the ruins of an ancient Banke Bihari temple were discovered earlier this month.

Kaushal Kishore, the state publicity chief of the Sanatan Sevak Sangh, had written to the DM, pointing out the historical significance of the site. "The stepwell and the ruins are remnants of the royal family of Sahaspur. These finds are a testament to our history," Kishore said. The excavation, which involved two bulldozers, also revealed a two-storey structure near the stepwell. Work at the site is ongoing, with authorities halting operations at night due to

visibility issues. "Encroachments on the site have been identified, and notices will be issued to families occupying the land illegally," Dr. Pansiya said, adding that the administration is committed to restoring and beautifying the area. The discovery of the ancient stepwell, or

Bawdi, in Sambhal has brought to light the rich history of the region, linked to the erstwhile royal family of Sahaspur State in Bilari. Official records list the *Bawdi* as a pond spanning 400 square metres. However, recent excavations have revealed much more—a well-preserved three-storey structure featuring intricate architecture and significant historical relevance.

"The Bawdi was constructed during the reign of the king of Bilari and is believed to be approximately 150 years old," Dr. Pansiya said. The structure includes two marble floors and one brick floor, along with a well and four rooms, all part of an elaborate underground complex. Signs of encroachment on the site have also been identified, and the

administration plans to address this issue

The site, once a vital part of the Sahaspur State, served as a rest stop for soldiers and the royal family during their travels. Shipra Gera, a relative of the roval family, recounted the historical importance of the Bawdi. "This place was a strategic stopover for soldiers travelling from Sahaspur (Bilari) to villages under the State's control, which now fall in the Badaun district. The royal family also used the underground complex during their journeys to escape the scorching summer heat," she said. The Bawdi's corridors were manned by soldiers, and the site served both functional and leisure purposes. The underground chambers provided a cool retreat for the royals, while the stepwell itself ensured a steady water supply for their needs.

As restoration and research continue, the Bawdi and its surrounding structures are set to become a beacon of Sambhal's historical legacy, offering locals and visitors alike a chance to reconnect with the region's storied past.

### A Shared History Unearthed

√he discoveries in *Sambhal* are a poignant reminder of the region's layered history, which is often obscured by present-day tensions. The proximity of the temple to the Shahi Jama Masjid, where violence had erupted during a protest against a court-ordered survey, underscores the intertwined histories of communities that have lived together for centuries.

Local historian and archaeologist Dr. Arvind Sharma highlighted the significance of the finds. "These discoveries provide a window into the past, showcasing Sambhal's role as a cultural and religious hub. The preservation of these sites is not just about protecting relics but also about understanding our shared heritage," he said. The district administration, in collaboration

with the ASI, is now focused on ensuring that these historical sites are preserved and developed responsibly. Plans include creating tourist-friendly infrastructure while maintaining the integrity of the sites.
The discoveries have sparked excitement and curiosity among locals. "We've always heard stories about these places, but seeing them

come to light is incredible. It feels like a part of our history has been revived," said Sunil Kumar, a Śambhal resident. As excavation and research continue, the findings in Sambhal are expected to shed more

light on the region's past, offering lessons for the present and inspiration for the future. The accidental unearthing of the Shiva temple and subsequent discoveries serve as a reminder of the hidden treasures that lie buried beneath the surface, waiting to be rediscovered and celebrated.







don't let that deter you—this serene sanctuary is worth the extra steps. My lucky pick was an Apartment with a breath-taking medieval ambience and charming views of the cobbled street buzzing with tansa of the cobbled street buzzing with tapas bars. Talk about living the fairy tale! The room's ambiance, a mix of sophisticated neutrals and delicate fabrics, made the stay luxuriously cosy. A peaceful oasis with both a bathtub and rain shower, mood lighting, and Molton Brown products.




