

MAHAKUMBH DECLARED NO VEHICLE ZONE

¬ollowing the tragic stampede at the Sangam during the Prayagraj Maha Kumbh, which led to multiple casualties, the administration has taken strict measures to prevent such incidents in the future. As part of these efforts, the entire Kumbh Mela area has been declared a no-vehicle zone, barring all types of vehicles from entering the premises and has canceled all

VIP passes till February 4. One of the most significant decisions includes the complete restriction vehicle movement within the fairgrounds. No private or public transport will be allowed inside, ensuring a safer and more organized Additionally, VVIP passes which which previously allowed certain vehicles access, have been revoked. No special passes will grant exemptions, making the rules uniform for

facilitate smooth movement and prevent overcrowding, all major routes within the Kumbh area have been converted into oneway paths. This measure aims to streamline the flow of devotees and reduce the chances of congestion. Furthermore, vehicles coming from neighboring districts are being stopped at the district borders, preventing an influx of additional traffic into the

The strictest measures will remain in place until February 4, with a complete ban on four-wheelers in Prayagraj. The administration has urged devotees to adhere to these guidelines to ensure a smooth experience at the Maha Kumbh. Authorities have also called for public cooperation in maintaining order and avoiding any further mishaps.

Lakhs of devotees heading to Prayagraj for the Mahakumbh Mela are stranded in massive traffic jams but remain

resolute in their quest for a holy dip at the Sangam. Despite extreme congestion, freezing nights, and lack of basic amenities, their faith remains unshaken.

The traffic congestion has

reached alarming levels, with

over 2.5 lakh vehicles stuck at multiple entry points, including Chitrakoot, Varanasi, and Rewa-Prayagraj routes. Traffic jams extend up to 25 kilometers in some bringing vehicular movement to a near standstill. Many devotees, like Atmaram Patil from Maharashtra, have spent days in transit, only to be told to turn back. Others, unwilling to abandon their pilgrimage, have resorted to walking long distances to reach their sacred destination. The situation has been particularly grim along the Varanasi-Prayagraj stretch, where a 20-kilometer-long jam has left hundreds of buses stranded. Vehicles have been halted at key points such as Bhadohi, Gopiganj, and Aurai,

with passengers left without

basic facilities. Many travelers, including Vasudev Bhalladwar from Chhattisgarh, have been forced to endure the bitter cold with no access to food, water, or toilets. The lack of arrangements for the stranded pilgrims has led to growing frustration, yet their devotion remains unwavering. Those approaching Prayagra

from Mirzapur and Bhadohi face similar hardships. Roadway buses have been turned back, and thousands of people are stranded at various points with little assistance. In some areas, local residents have stepped in to provide food and water, but the scale of the crisis has left many without relief. Some devotees have voiced their anger, alleging that VIP vehicles are being given priority while common pilgrims are left to fend for themselves. Despite these challenges, most remain firm in their resolve to reach the Sangam, refusing to consider alternate bathing sites offered to them along the way.

Train travel has also been severely affected, with several passenger trains, including Allahabad-Prayagra Passenger and Jaunpur-Bareilly Passenger, being canceled. The rerouting of other trains, such as the LTT Express via Varanasi, has further disrupted travel plans. At Pratapgarh and other key railway junctions, thousands of devotees are stranded, waiting desperately for alternate transportation. Meanwhile, along the Rewa-Prayagraj route, nearly 50,000 vehicles have been halted at the Uttar Pradesh-Madhya Pradesh border, authorities struggling to manage the situation.

Despite the severe hardships, the spirit of the pilgrims remains unbroken. Braving hunger, cold, and exhaustion, they continue their journey unwavering faith, determined to take their sacred dip in the Ganga. For them, no hardship is too great in pursuit of this once-in-alifetime spiritual experience.

Modi 3.0 Budget session begins; **Kumbh tragedy, Waqf on agenda**

pposition parties at the all-party meeting on Thursday called for a discussion in Parliament on the Maha Kumbh tragedy and the UP government's alleged focus on VIPs rather than the common pilgrims, as Union minister Kiren Rijiju asserted that the Business Advisory Committee will decide on the agenda of the Budget Session starting from January 31.

The Session will commence with President Droupadi Murmu addressing the joint sitting of Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha. The Union Budget will be presented on February 1. The first part of the session will conclude on February 13 and the second part will start on March 10. The session will conclude on April 4. The Session's legislative agenda has 16 bills, including the Waqf (Amendment) Bill and the Immigration and Foreigners Bill.

In the same all party meet BJP's allies in NDA Janata Dal (United) sought an extension in the tenure of the Joint Parliamentary Committee scrutinising the bills proposing simultaneous elections, while its another partner, LJP (Ram Vilas), demanded a "special industrial package"

Rijiju described the meeting chaired by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh constructive and sought cooperation from opposition parties, adding that the customary discussions on the President's address to parliamentarians and the Union Budget are the main priorities in the Budget Session. "Rising" unemployment and farmers' "plight" will also be raised during the Session, several opposition

At the all-party meeting, sources said, $\mathrm{JD}(\mathrm{U})$ leader Sanjay Jha called for an extension in the tenure of the JPC, which was asked to submit its report by the first day of the last week of the Budget Session. Jha is a member of the 39-member committee

formed to discuss what is often referred to as a One-Nation, One-Election (ONOE) proposal. The panel headed by BJP MP P P Chaudhary is scheduled to hold its second meeting on

Jha also wanted Parliament to discuss India's current position in Artificial Intelligence as he pointed out the waves that the Chinese upstart DeepSeek has created in the field, so far dominated by US firms.

Rehab centre secy booked for inmate rape, forced abortion

SAMBALPUR

Secretary of a rehabilitation centre at Putiband under the Dhanupali police station in the district Harish Chandra Das, who was arrested on Tuesday on the charge of physical assault on the inmates of the centre, has again been framed under the charges of rape and aborting the child of a female inmate, and he would be brought on remand for investigation, informed Northern IG Himanshu Lal on Thursday.

Lal said, "Two more people were arrested on Wednesday evening; so far, four people have been arrested in the rehabilitation inmates' torture case. We will bring him on remand on the sexual exploitation charges for investigation."

Police also arrested the son Subhrajit Das of the secretary and an employee of the centre, Subham Behera on Wednesday on the charge of assaulting the inmates.

Currently, there are 41 inmates in the centre, where both male and female and mentally ill prisoners from the



Circle Jail are staying. Noted as per an RTI report, dix inmates have died in the year 2024 for unknown reasons.

District Social Security Officer (DSSO) Thabira Mahananda said, "The deaths of inmates in the centre were not reported to us. The centre started in 2019, but it received government grants in 2023. I have been to the home for mentally ill persons three times and reported the unhygienic condition of the centre to the government. In the month of August, the government reduced the grant for the centre based on my report."

A female inmate filed a

sexual assault case against the secretary. As per the report, she was falling asleep after taking pills given by the centre staffs, and then she was finding herself in an inappropriate form. After four months, she found herself pregnant. The secretary forced her to abort the child. She often objected to the bathing of all male and female inmates in one place. The secretary of the centre had directed them to completely

The visuals went viral on social media after a female exemployee of the centre left the

undress in the group bathing

Rengali MLA Sudarshan Haripal. The MLA reported it to the Dhanupali police in the district who raided the place and arrested the secretary and the female caretaker Swagatika Pradhan, both found in the viral videos physically assaulting the inmates with water pipes and sticks besides using abusive language while serving food to the inmates. The bathing place videos also went viral, where the female inmates were naked in the open bathing place and coming outside to wear clothes.

Sambalpur Sub-Collector Puspanjali Panda said, "We have recorded the statement of the female inmate filing a complaint of sexual assault. The medical examination of her has also been done; the report is awaited. She looks fine, but doctors can only give the status of her mental condition. I have submitted the report of enquiry to the district Collector; action will be taken as per his instructions. We have suggested blacklisting of the organisation and legal action against the owner and the caretaker."

Dense fog warning issued till Sunday

he capital city saw a slight dip in the night temperature in the last 24 hours with mercury levels dropping to 19.2 degree Celsius from 21.8 degree the previous day.

Cuttack recorded 18.5 degree compared to 20 degree the previous night.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Thursday forecast a gradual rise in the minimum temperature by 2 to 3 degree Celsius across the State during the next four to five days.

India prepares to take on ChatGPT, Deepseek

India on Thursday outlined **I**global AI ambitions with plans to build its own 'foundational model' that could take on the might of ChatGPT, Deepseek R1 and others, as it lined up "most affordable" common compute facility powered by 18,693 GPUs to be used by startups and researchers.

India's bold move comes at a time when Chinese company DeepSeek has turned heads after its AI model overtook ChatGPT as the top-ranked free app on Apple's appstore, challenging the AI dominance concentrated so far with the US firms, particularly Silicon Valley frontrunner Open AI. IT Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw exuded confidence that India will build a foundational

model that is world-class, and that it will be able to compete with best models across the globe. The government announced the next steps in its AI blueprint, among them, 18,693 Graphics Processing Unit or GPUs on offer by the empanelled bidders (a list that includes Jio Platforms, CMS Computers, Communications,

Networks, Yotta Data Services, and others), and start of AI safety institution, with 8 projects approved under it. The government is also calling

for proposals to develop India's own foundational models that would be aligned to Indian context, Indian languages, culture, basically datasets are "for our country, of our country and for our citizens" and "biases are removed".

Govt extends ration card e-KYC deadline to Feb 15

The Odisha Government has announced an extension to the deadline for completing the electronic Know Your Customer (e-KYC) process for ration cards. The deadline for updating the e-KYC details for ration cards has been extended to February 15, informed Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare Minister Krushna Chandra Patra on

Many residents had expressed concerns about meeting the earlier deadline, prompting the government to accommodate those who needed more time to complete the process.

"The last date for ration card e-KYC was on January 31. However, a few of our friends have not been able to complete the process due to various reasons. I have got requests to extend the deadline. After much consider-

ation, we have decided to extend the deadline to February 15," said Patra.

It has been reported that the verification process of approximately 4 million beneficiaries across the State is still pending. The e-KYC procedure is essential for beneficiaries to continue receiving their subsidies under various government welfare schemes.

The extension provides some relief to ration cardholders who were con-

cerned about meeting the original deadline. However, the minister urged all beneficiaries to complete their e-KYC at the earliest opportunity to avoid disruption to their benefits

Ration cardholders can update their e-KYC details through designated government platforms or in person at authorised centres. They need to bring the necessary documentation for the verifi-

IT payers to return ration cards: Minister

 $F_{\rm ood\ Supplies\ and\ Con-}$ sumer Affair Minister Krushna Chandra Patra cleared the air on Thursday on the prevalent confusion regarding the return of ration cards by contractual workers across the State.

In a statement, he specified that the directive was not aimed at all contractual workers but meant for those not in substantial positions and with lower income levels. "Those earning between Rs 10,000 and Rs 12,000 per month should not encounter any problems concerning the ration card policy," he said.

He further clarified that those who are liable to file Income Tax (IT) returns, particularly with monthly salaries ranging around Rs 25,000 to Rs 40,000, are required to relinquish their ration cards. He warned, "Failure to comply may lead to appropriate legal action being taken against those persons." "Ration cards are meant for poorer sections of society. I have appealed only to those persons belonging to the higher income groups to return their ration cards as soon as possible. In case they are found in possession of the cards at a later stage, we will not spare anyone," the minister reiterated.

ECoR launches drive to alert selfie takers on rly tracks

The East Coast Railway (ECoR) has launched a campaign aimed at warning teenagers and college students about the dangerous habit of taking selfies near railway tracks.

The initiative comes in response to a disturbing rise in accidents where young people have tragically lost their lives while attempting to shoot short videos and take selfies near railway tracks.

Taking selfies at railway stations or on tracks may seem like a fun activity in social media, but it's a deadly risk. In recent years, many accidents have been reported where students or youth were mowed down by moving trains while taking selfies in unsafe locations. Many of

cause people weren't paying attention to the dangers around them-like moving trains, overhead electrical power equipment and crowded station areas.

To address the growing concern, the Indian Railways has implemented strict regulations. Under Section 147 and 153 of Railway Act, anyone caught taking selfies near moving trains or on railway tracks could face heavy fines, legal consequences, or even jail. It's a reminder that safety always comes first, and no photo is worth risking your life for.

Official sources said the violators can be booked under sections 147 and 153 of the Railway Act that deal with trespassing and causing threat to public life.

BMC to deploy 4 more fogging machines

The Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) will soon have four more fogging machines to tackle the mosquito menace in the capital city. This decision was taken at a recent high-level meeting held to address the increasing mosquito population.

Minister of Housing and Urban Development Krushna Chandra Mohapatra said the mosquito population in the city has increased by many folds and it needs stronger control measures.

"As fogging is currently conducted only in the evening and it takes two to three hours to complete a ward, the existing resources are insufficient. To address this, we have decided to procure four additional fogging machines," he said.

He further stated that the meeting also highlighted a shortage of manpower for mosquito control efforts. "To

overcome this challenge, we have planned to increase recruitment within the next four months. Both fogging and mosquito oil spraying will be carried out as needed,"

There would be fogging once in seven days on both sides of the Daya West Canal, which is known as a mosquito breeding ground. The BMC would also identify mosquito-prone areas or 'hotspots' across the city and

he assured.

take targeted actions to stop mosquito breeding at those places, the minister said.

With these steps, the authorities hope to curb the inflation of diseases such as dengue and malaria, which are greatly attributed to the mass breeding of mosqui-

SUM to set up hospitals in all dists

Rs 1K cr to be invested

The Odisha Government has accepted a proposal of the SUM Health Care Services for setting up 50-bed multi-speciality hospitals in each district of the State to extend affordable and quality healthcare to the people at the grassroots

The Rs 1,000-crore project aims to provide primary, secondary, trauma, emergency, physiotherapy facilities along with pharmacy outlets in each district headquarter town, said Anurag Nayak, Project Manager of SUM Healthcare Services.

The investment would create direct employment for 900 people and indirect job opportunities for around 6,000 persons, he said.

The acceptance of the proposal was announced at the Utkarsh Odisha Conclave here in the presence of Minister for Health and Family Welfare Dr Mukesh Mahaling.

HC to oversee conservation diagnostic, geriatric care and of State's 6 Ramsar sites PNS BHUBANESWAR

The Orissa High Court has scheduled February 12 to begin its overseeing of the conservation of six Ramsar wetlands in Odisha. This includes monitoring efforts around the Chilika lake, Bhitarkanika mangroves, Satkosia gorge, Tampara lake, Hirakud Reservoir and Ansupa lake, spanning a collective expanse of 345,628

This follows the Supreme Court's directive on December 11, 2024 when it ordered the State and Central wetland authorities to complete

ground verification and demarcation of wetland boundaries as identified by the Space Applications Centre Atlas (SAC Atlas) 2021 within three months. Additionally, the High Courts were instructed to ensure the protection of Ramsar sites under their jurisdictions.

Led by Acting Chief Justice Arindam Sinha and Justice MS Sahoo, the High Court initiated a suo motu Public Interest Litigation (PIL) dedicated to these significant conservation efforts. The court has requested affidavits from relevant State authorities such as the State Wetland Development Authority by February 12 to report on the progress made on the Supreme Court's directive.

The Supreme Court's instruction is part of its continued efforts since April 3, 2017, urging 15 High Courts, including Orissa, to initiate suo motu PILs for the preservation of 26 Ramsar wetlands in their jurisdictions. Initially, the Orissa High Court registered a PIL for Chilika lake Bhitarkanika mangroves, recognised as Ramsar sites in 1981 and 2002, respectively. Advocate Mohit Agarwal was appointed as amicus curiae in 2017 to as-

The ongoing case from 2017 is now linked to the recent PIL initiated in January, extending the High Court's supervision to include Satkosia gorge, Tampara lake, Hirakud Reservoir and Ansupa lake. Over the last seven years, the High Court monitored issues such as illegal prawn farming, eviction of unauthorised occupants and filing criminal charges against violators. Proactive steps followed a comprehensive report by the amicus curiae addressing critical challenges affecting Chilika lake and Bhitarkanika mangroves.

Wooing investors to Odisha People on margin must get benefit from economic growth

◄he people of Odisha must take note of a series of events taking place in the State to attract investors for economic growth. The Pravasi Bharatiya Divas 2025, visit of President of Singapore, Utkarsh Odisha Conclave 2025 and many official visits of the Chief Minister of Odisha to meet the investors in the country and abroad are some of the events in this direction. What is notable in them is the active presence of PM Narendra Modi in most

of them. Vedanta has signed one lakh crore rupees MoU for bauxite driven business in the State. Similar interests have been shown by other corporates including Tata. The Union Cabinet has approved National Critical Mineral Mission to facilitate the mining and mineral based business by making it extremely investor- friendly with steps such as fast track regulatory approval process for critical mining projects. The Central government has already made amend-

ment in the MMDR Act 1957 to in-

crease mining activities of critical and also strategic minerals towards more open market approach involving national as well as global players of mining industries.

It is observed that among other sectors, mining is one of the most attractive destinations in Odisha for investors. Currently, Odisha, Chhattisgarh and Jharakhand together have a major share in the

mining sector of the country in terms of production. The slogan by the Central government for a sunrise in East in matter of economic growth of the country mostly means the investment in mineral sector of the mineral resource rich zones of the country. The mineral zones in the East are also known for their persistent economic backwardness with high rate of poverty and distress migration. The eastern States are deprived of major infrastructure investment by the Union government. It is important to note that these

States are also having a sizeable ST and SC population who are very poor. The mining and mineral based industries have not impacted much in upgrading their livelihood and employment opportunities; rather a majority of them lost their traditional livelihoods.

It is an irony that an MoU between the mining investors and government headed by a Chief Minister belonging to ST is taking place at a time while the locals in many parts of the bauxite reserve areas are registering their protests against extractive industries and are not able to visualize a bright future of their children with mega invertors entering to their area for growth. The STs are dying in hunger by consuming mango kernel

Germany and India and among these countries India is the most unequal country having highest form of income and wealth disparities among its people and also its per capita income is lowest among the five countries. Specially the

and distress migration is rampant in these areas.

So while going for investment, there are many questions the people of Odisha, mostly the marginalized sections, must put before the government and investors, ie, how the growth will percolate down. How the new investment coming to the State in general and to their area in particular is going to generate employment for them in many ways is the moot

It is observed that the top five countries of the world having highest GDP are USA, China, Japan, marginalised sections in the bottom are in the worst position while the top few have all the powers and privileges and control over economic assets. They are the owners of the national wealth and enjoy all the benefits of the growth. The last 75 years of constitutional governance has not contributed much to change the traditional social and economic structure that has enforced extreme form of exploitation and inequalities in social life.

The State of Odisha having deposits of strategic and critical mineral resources has not excelled much in comparison to other de-

veloped States of India in spite of presence of PSUs and private mining companies. The most striking issue is the condition of the marginalised section in mineral resource rich zone has not improved much. It was proved by the Saha Commission of inquiry on mining scam in Odisha that the mining companies are not honest in doing business while it comes to follow rules and maintaining transparency. Mostly, the NRO mining companies have no interest in development of Odisha; rather they have interest in their profit over the business.

It is proved in a number of times that the mining companies are a violator of environmental and human rights laws and not concerned much about the development of the locals, its environment and ecosystem, and people at large. The mining areas of Odisha are also the most polluted area and the whole eco-system has been disturbed.

The last fifty years of mineral industry in Odisha have contributed to the growth of a few families in

the name of economic growth of the State and accentuated the marginalisation process by alienating the locals from their traditional control over local resources such as land, forest, water and a living friendly eco-system. There must be a social and economic audit of the mineral sector in Odisha to assess the real growth and its impact on the economy, more particularly on the growth of local economy.

Especially in the context of investment in mining sector, there is a point to mark how these investments are being helpful in overall growth of the State, especially in terms of giving a fair share to the marginalised sections and locals. We should not forget that our future generation has a right over our mineral resources. While encouraging unrestricted private investment, it is time to question the distribution aspect of the growth; otherwise in future the State will have no resources but will be left with more deprivations and inequalities in terms of economic assets.

Political slugfest over finance workers' kidnapping

BJP, BJD accuse each other of links with kidnappers, ganja smugglers

he abduction of a finance worker in Chikiti area of Ganjam district has ignited a fierce political debate, with accusations flying between the ruling and opposition parties.

Allegations of ganja cultivation linked to the arrested suspect have further fuelled the controversy.

Leaders from the ruling BJD alleged that Prithviraj Sahu, a suspect in the abduction case, has ties with Chikiti

BJP MLA Manoranjan Dyan Samanthara. However, BJP leaders have denied the claim, arguing that ganja cultivation in the area dates back to the tenure of the BJD government.

BJD MLA candidate Chinmayananda Srirup Dev accused the BJP of turning a blind eye to illegal activities. He accused the new government of negligence, which they claim has allowed illegal activities to thrive.

Notably, four finance workers were abducted on Sunday from Brahmapur and confined in a run-down house in Chikiti, where the kidnappers demanded a Rs 2 crore ransom. Following investigations, police arrested

Prithviraj Sahu and uncovered ganja cultivation at the location.

SP Dr Saravana Vivek M stated that raids are ongoing to apprehend four other suspects, including Jak Maharana, Ayushman Subudhi, and Sagar Sahu. Police have also linked illegal liquor trading to the suspects, pointing to a broader nexus of criminal activities in the re-

In a related development, Sunita Kumari Behera was arrested on Tuesday for her alleged involvement in ganja cultivation. Police reported the destruction of a 4,000square-foot ganja farm and have launched an in-depth

investigation to identify other parties involved.

The incident has intensified a blame game on social media, with both BJD and BJP accusing each other of connections to the accused. Chinmayananda Srirup Dev has called for strict action against all culprits, emphasizing that such incidents highlight the need for stricter law enforcement.

Meanwhile, the police have assured that the main accused and their accomplices will be brought to justice. Authorities are also investigating the increasing prevalence of crimes such as kidnapping and illegal trade in Chikiti.

Brahmapur online trading scam 9 held for duping 150 investors of Rs 4 cr



Police on Wednesday arrested as many as nine persons for allegedly duping more than 150 investors of Rs 4 crore after luring them into an online trading scam here.

The fraudsters had collected Rs 4 crore from over 150 investors from Khaja Sahi and the surrounding areas of Brahmapur after promising to double their money in a short period through online trading.

The matter came to light when some victims abducted one of the scammers after the alleged fraudster failed to return the money. Getting information, the Town police rescued the abducted youth from

Digapahandi and arrested three suspects.

Not long after the arrest, reports of a dispute arose between two groups marred with violent clashes over recovering the lost money also surfaced.

Following this, police arrested six more individuals, bringing the total number of arrests to nine. Till the last reports came in, authorities were carrying out a detailed investigation into the modus operandi of the group.

As per reports, over 59,000 persons were cheated over the past six years in various cyber crimes in the State. A massive rise in cases was seen in 2024 with 472 cases affecting more than 40,000 people.

Yet another Nuapada migrant dies in Telangana

Tripun Chinda, a resident of Talakot village in Sinapali block of Nuapada district, like many others from his village, migrated nearly 800 kilometers to Telangana in search of work. He tragically lost his life after falling from a kiln located in a village near Chintapalli town on Sunday.

Neither his 30-year-old wife Gauri nor anyone from his village knew the exact location of the kiln where Tripun worked. The only information came from other migrant workers who revealed over the phone that the kiln, named "CMR Factory," is located in Kurmel, roughly two hours by bus from Secunderabad.

Such is the plight of these workers. They labour in distant, unfamiliar places, often without knowing the exact location of their worksites. They remain at the mercy of middlemen or "Labour



Sardars," whose details are equally vague. In Tripun's case, his elder brother Jethuram, working at another kiln in

Telangana, could only identify the Sardar as Supen from Boden, a large village 40 km

Tripun had left his home three months earlier, accepting an advance payment of Rs 40,000 from the Sardar. Half of this amount was paid to a brick maker in the village to buy bricks for constructing a pucca house. But fate had other plans. The employer sent his body back to the village after a postmortem, wrapped in white cloth. Their three-and-a half-year-old son, and other family members received the lifeless body in tears. The young boy, sensing the pain of the moment, began crying in his mother's lap.

The money Tripun had left behind with his wife, meant to build a better future, was spent on his funeral rituals. After that the family is left with nothing but uncertainty. Gauri, who had dreamed of a stable home, must think of ways to survive. Her circumstances might force her to follow in her late husband's footsteps, joining the endless cycle of migration that traps so many like her.

Armed with HC order

Nilgiri Tehsildar removes brick kilns from eco-sensitive zone

he district administration has directed the tehslidar of Nilgiri to ensure no brick kiln exists within the eco-sensitive zone of the block.

The direction was given following an Orissa High Court order which directed to remove all illegal brick kilns under the jurisdiction of the eco-sensitive zone of Nilgiri.

According to reports, former MLA(Nilgiri) Sukanta Nayak had lodged several petitions against illegal brick kilns in the area with the district administration, urging their removal. He alleged the kilns polluted the environment as a result of which the inhabitants became victims of various incurable diseases.

Citing the complaint, the district administration had

demolished two kilns and promulgated CrPc 144 against another brick kiln. However, one of the kiln owners moved the HC against the action.

Later, a HC monitored team visited the block for assessment and submitted a report. On January 16, the HC disposing of the case directed the district administration to remove all illegal brick kilns in the eco sensitive zone within two weeks. District Collector SM Vikash stated that after receiving HC's order, the demolition drive was taken.

The owners of the kilns were informed about the order through the tehsildar and further they were told that stern action would be taken if anyone doesn't comply with the order of the HC within two weeks period latest by January

'Most villagers not allowed to Essar public hearing'

More than 500 people of three affected villages such as Tikarpada, Kadagarh and Dhatika under Sadar block of Keonjhar district have submitted a petition to the district Collector, Keonjhar, alleging illegality and violation of rules in a public hearing of Essar unit iron ore beneficiation plant held on January 18. They have also sent a copy of the petition to the President, Prime Minister, Chief Minister, besides Chairman, National Green Tribunal among

Their main allegation is that the police did not allow the affected villagers and obstructed them on their way to the venue of a public hearing. As a result, only 50 out of 2,500 villagers were allowed to participate in the public hearing. Three days before the public hearing the police created a panic in the area by detaining the villagers in the police station without any reason. When the police failed to influence the villagers to speak in favour of the Essar company, the police adopted force, they said. President and secretary,

Anti-Essar Forum Madhusudan Sahoo and Thakur Mardi respectively said that if the proposed plant is allowed then not only will it create pollution but also a large number of adivasi people who are dependent on the vast fertile agricultural

land for maintaining their family since generations will be displaced. Moreover, they also alleged violation of PESA Act as the area is coming under Shedule area for which gram sabha is mandatory for a project. In this case, the gram sabha was ironically skipped, the petition alleged. The petition further said

Army pension row: SC criticizes Centre for 'dragging' retired personnel to court, demands policy reform

 $T^{\text{he Supreme Court on}}_{\text{Thursday pulled up the Centre for "dragging" retired}}$ armed forces personnel to court and asked it to frame a policy on the issue.

A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Ujjal Bhuyan said each and every member of the armed forces who was awarded relief of disability pension from the Armed Forces Tribunal need not be dragged to the top court and the Centre ought to exercise some discretion in filing appeals.

"There has to be some pragmatic view. An army personnel works for 15, 20 years and suppose there is some disability, and order of the Armed Forces Tribunal directs payment of disability pension. Why should these persons be dragged to the Supreme Court?" asked the bench.

It went on, "We are of the view that the Union govern-



ment must evolve a policy. There has to be some scrutiny before a decision is taken to drag members of the armed forces to the Supreme

"You say whether you are

India to seal Rafale-M, Scorpene deals with France soon

India is expected to seal in the next few weeks procurement of 26 naval variant of Rafale jets and three Scorpene submarines from France to further crank up its naval prowess, people familiar with the matter said on Thursday. It is expected that the procurement will be announced during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Paris next month to attend a summit on artificial intelligence. Modi and French President Emmanuel Macron are expected to hold bilateral talks on the sideline of the summit, being held on February 10

The people cited above said all the two deals are in the final stage of finalisation and that the Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) will have to look at them. In July 2023, the defence ministry approved the purchase of 22 Rafale (marine) jets from France, primarily for deployment on board the indigenously built aircraft carrier INS Vikrant. The Defence Ministry had also cleared procurement of three Scorpene submarines from France. Under the Indian Navy's Project 75, six Scorpene submarines have already been constructed in India by Mazagon Dock Limited (MDL) in cooperation with the Naval Group of France. Stampede at Maha Kumbh: Desperate search for missing devotees continues

BISWAJEET BANERJEE

More than 36 hours have passed since the tragic stampede at the Maha Kumbh, but for Manoj Dubey, sleep remains elusive. He has been searching frantically for his 72year-old mother, Kamla Devi, who has been missing since the chaos unfolded.

Kamla Devi had traveled from Jhansi with a group of 18 devotees for the auspicious Mauni Amavasya snan. "We have searched every hospital, every lost-and-found center, but there's no trace of her," said Dubey, his voice breaking. "She was wearing a saffron saree and had an identity card around her neck, but her phone is switched off. We don't know if she is safe or injured.

The tragedy struck between 1 a.m. and 2 a.m. on Wednesday when a massive crowd broke through barricades at the ghats, triggering a stampede that left hundreds of devotees trampled. Witnesses described a chaotic scene, with people falling over one another in the dark,

shouting for help. Nearly 18 hours after the administration confirmed at a press briefing that 30 people had lost their lives and at least 60 were injured. A judicial probe has been ordered to determine the cause of the

mishap. Among those still unaccounted for is Munni Devi from Fatehpur. Her son, Shivnath Maurya, who works in Surat,

rushed to Prayagraj upon hearing the news. "My parents and uncle had come for a holy dip. After the snan, my mother got separated from the group. We have searched every possible place, but no one has seen her," he said, his face lined

with worry

Similar is the plight of Sunita Yaday from Ballia, who had traveled with her extended family to Prayagraj. "We all gathered at Sahso Chauraha after the dip, but in the rush, Sunita got separated," said her husband, Dinesh Yadav. "We have spent the past day searching and filing complaints,

but there's no information. The authorities are overwhelmed, and we are losing hope."

While many families continue their anxious wait, a few have been lucky to reunite with their loved ones. Among them is 65year-old Annapurna Mishra from Odisha's Puri, who was found after being missing for nearly two days.
"My mother disappeared after

our evening bath at the Sangam. We feared the worst," said her son, Abhishek Mishra. "Finally, a volunteer spotted her in Sector 20, disoriented and exhausted but safe. We are relieved beyond words."

In another case, 70-year-old Tara Devi from Aligarh, who had traveled alone for the pilgrimage, lost her belongings and went missing. However, she managed to board a train home

on Wednesday night. "She always undertakes religious trips alone," said her son, Ravi Sharma. "When she didn't call us after the snan, we panicked. But by some miracle, she found her way back. Her lost purse was recovered and is now at the Mela's lost-and-found center in

UP Government summons experienced officers for ongoing Maha Kumbh

A fter a tragic stampede during the ongoing Maha Kumbh that left 30 people dead, the Uttar Pradesh government has summoned officers who had successfully conducted the 2019 Kumbh Mela.

IAS officers Ashish Goyal and Bhanu Chandra Goswami have been instructed to reach Prayagraj immediately to take charge. The duo had played a crucial role in organizing the 2019 Ardh Kumbh, along with Vijay Kiran. At that time, Bhanu Chandra Goswami served as the District Magistrate (DM) and Vice-Chairman of the Kumbh Mela Authority, while Ashish Goyal was the Commissioner of Allahabad and in charge of the Ardh Kumbh Mela. In addition to these two seasoned officers, five more Special Secretary-rank officials with prior experience large-scale management have been

assigned to the Maha Kumbh. However, as of now, no additional officers from the police department have been officially deployed for the event. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath conducted a late-night video conference with senior government officials, district magistrates, and police officers from multiple districts,

including Prayagraj, Kaushambi, Varanasi, Ayodhya, Mirzapur, Basti, Jaunpur, Chitrakoot, Banda, Ambedkar Nagar, Pratapgarh, Sant Kabir Nagar, Bhadohi, Rae Bareli, and Gorakhpur. He directed the ADG Zone Prayagraj and the Prayagraj DM to remain highly alert and ensure seamless arrangements for the fair.

While the fire has caused significant damage, there were no casualties, as the affected area was unoccupied at the

Senior officials have arrived at the site to assess the situation, but the cause of the fire remains unclear. Authorities have assured devotees that safety measures are in place and that efforts are being made to prevent further incidents.

This incident comes just a day after a tragic stampede on Mauni Amavasya, which resulted in the deaths of over 35-40 pilgrims. The large influx of devotees during the auspicious bathing period has created massive logistical challenges, despite extensive preparations administration.

The Mahakumbh fairground has been equipped with over 350 fire brigades, more than 2,000 trained personnel, 50 firefighting centers, and 20 fire posts to ensure a fire-free environment. Additionally, fire protection equipment has been installed across Akhadas and tents to enhance safety and preparedness. This is not the first fire

Greenland gambit

Trump's attempt to acquire Greenland carries serious risks, threatening stability and undermining peace in the region

fter assuming office, President Donald Trump has taken an aggressive approach, disrupting the global order—first economically and now through forceful tactics. His push to acquire the Danish island of Greenland by any means signals a potential standoff between the US and Denmark, and possibly even Europe. The push by the US President Donald Trump to acquire Greenland has led to tension between the United States and Denmark. While the idea was initially dismissed as implausible, Trump's administration has intensified efforts to assert influence over the resourcerich Arctic territory under Denmark though autonomous. Denmark has reacted with caution but with significant military reinforcements to protect its territory from any US misadventure. Greenland, the world's largest island, holds immense strategic value. With its rich reserves of rare earth minerals, vital for modern technology and defence systems, Greenland has become a focal point in the global competition. China dom-

> inates the rare-earth market, and the US sees Greenland as a potential alternative source to reduce its dependency on Chinese supplies.

Besides, Greenland's location provides a strategic foothold in the Arctic to dominate region. With climate change melting the Arctic ice and opening new shipping routes and exposing untapped resources, global powers, including the US, Russia, and China, have shown heightened interest in securing influence. The island is also home to the Thule Air Base, a key US military installation that plays a pivotal role in missile defence and early warning systems. Denmark has firmly rejected Trump's ambitions, reinforcing

its commitment to Greenland's autonomy. In response to the escalating pressure, Denmark has announced a significant military expansion, allocating an additional 14.6 billion Danish crowns (\$2.05 billion) to enhance security in the region. The new military strategy includes the acquisition of three Arctic naval vessels, two long-range drones, and satellite surveillance systems. These enhancements aim to address the limited military presence in Greenland so far. While Greenland remains a semiautonomous territory under Danish sovereignty, its growing geopolitical relevance has placed it at the center of international power struggles. The implications of US bid to take control over Greenland would be profound. Such a move would dramatically shift Arctic geopolitics, altering the balance of power and potentially heightening tensions between the US, Denmark, Russia, and China. The European Union has also expressed concerns over any potential shift in Greenland's status, as it would affect security dynamics in the region. It remains to be seen whether Trump's push to acquire Greenland will gain momentum or fade into history. Greenland has now become a pivotal battleground, and the Arctic, a once peaceful region, could soon become a new flashpoint the world can ill afford.

Seed innovation: Key to agricultural growth



Unlocking India's full agricultural potential demands strong policies, industry collaboration and a commitment to technological advancements, especially in seed innovation

ndia stands at the cusp of a transformative shift in its agricultural landscape, driven by its growing population, expanding economy, and the mounting challenges posed by climate change. With the Union Budget 2024 allocating Rs 1.52 lakh crore to agriculture, the government's recognition of the sector's importance in ensuring India's economic future is clear. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision for agricultural growth focuses on innovation, sustainability, and resilience. For India to realise its agricultural potential by 2025, however, clear policy frameworks and effective industry collaboration are essen-

At the core of this transformation is the need for a robust, resilient, and technologically advanced seed sector. As India transitions from a traditional, productioncentric agricultural model to one that prioritises farmer welfare and income generation, there is a fundamental opportunity to improve livelihoods and promote sustainable agricultural practices. A critical aspect of Îndia's agricultural future lies in scientific advancements, particularly in the development of genetically modified (GM) crops. Globally, GM crops have proven successful in increasing yields, improving pest resistance, and reducing dependency on chemical inputs. Yet, India has been cautious in adopting GM technology, and a transparent, science-based approach to its reg-ulation could help unlock its potential. A national consensus on the safe deployment of GM crops would support the goal of reducing reliance on imports, especially in essential crops like oilseeds and pulses.

The importance of collaboration between the private sector and public institutions such as the İndian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) cannot be overstated. Such partnerships drive significant research and development efforts across key crops like oilseeds, cotton, and maize, while also protecting intellectual property rights (IPR) to incentivise further innovation. A strengthened IPR framework could position India as a global leader in agricultural research and technol-



and market opportunities. Moreover, youth-led startups in agritech are making an impact in areas like precision farming, farm-to-table models, and sustainable agriculture practices, providing innovative solutions to long-standing problems.

For example, the 'Agri-Startups' ecosystem is seeing rapid growth, with over 3,100 agritech startups currently operating in India (as of 2023), and an investment influx that has grown by 20 per cent annually. This demonstrates the growing interest among youth to innovate and lead the agricultural transforma tion. Furthermore, sectoral integration across the agricultural value chain is becoming more pronounced. India's agri-

cultural ecosystem is complex, with each sector, such as poultry, dairy, horticulture, and rural development, playing a distinct yet interconnected role in the overall growth. The government is focusing on strengthening these individual sectors as part of a holistic approach. The GST framework currently presents challenges for the agricultural sector, particularly about the costs and complexities of compliance for farmers and seed companies.

Simplifying the GST system could reduce operational bur-dens and make agricultural practices more sustainable and profitable. Additionally, targeted tax relief or incentives for Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) in agriculture, particularly in seed production, agro-processing, and machinery manufacturing, could support growth and job creation, especially in rural areas. Restoring the 200 per cent

income tax deduction for research and development (R&D) expenditure could significantly boost innovation in the seed industry. By reducing the financial pressures associated with R&D, such a policy would incentivise greater investment in developing drought-resistant and higher-yielding crop varieties. This would be particularly important in critical sectors such as oilseeds and pulses,

where India faces challenges in achieving self-sufficiency.In addition, a unified nationallevel registration process for seeds, along with the "One Nation, One License" policy, would simplify operations for seed companies. The current multi-state registration process often leads to inefficiencies and delays, hindering the growth of the industry.

A streamlined system would

enable companies to operate more efficiently and ensure that high-quality seeds reach farmers promptly, fostering growth and innovation in the sector. Research Linked Incentive (RLI) schemes could further encourage innovation by offering financial incentives for successful R&D outcomes. This would accelerate the development of new seed varieties that are climate-resilient and high-yielding, reinforcing India's position as a leader in global agricultural research. Looking ahead, the future of seed research holds exciting possibilities, particularly in areas like biofortified crops, climate resilience, and hybrid development. Breeding drought-tolerant varieties of rice, oilseeds, and pulses will be essential to ensure food security in an era of unpredictable weather patterns.

Challenging menstrual taboos in rural India



Cultural taboos and lack of awareness often confine girls and women to their homes, keeping them away from school, kitchens and religious spaces

n India, approximately 335 million women expe-**⊥**rience menstruation but the majority of them are uncomfortable about speaking about it or discussing their menstrual hygiene problems. Parents, especially in rural areas are often ignorant and unprepared to discuss this subject with their adolescent daughters. However, an ongoing campaign called 'Red Achcha Hai' (Red is Good) running in three states is breaking the silence around menstruation and debunking taboos and restrictions that confine girls and women to their homes and bar them from attending school, entering the kitchen and participating in cultural and religious

First started in 2018 as a programme to make women and adolescents in rural areas in Gujarat aware of body literacy, fertility and menstrual hygiene by CHETNA, a notfor-profit working on nutrition, health and women's empowerment, it acquired a new urgency in 2020 when newspapers' headlined the shocking story of how girls in a college hostel, supported by a religious trust, were asked to

strip by the college authorities for breaking the hostel's rules for menstruating girls. This made CHETNA realise

that they needed to accelerate and escalate their efforts. Thus, the Red Achcha Hai campaign. Started with a new vigour first in rural areas of Gujarat, and Rajasthan and later in Madhya Pradesh, the eye-catching Red Achcha Hai campaign tapped the power of drama and visual communication with the CHETNA team dressed in red explaining the menstrual process, the need for menstrual hygiene and breaking myths and taboos around menstruation. The positive impact of this awareness programme and distribution of 2199 menstrual hygiene management (MHM) kits containing three information booklets, a

clothes brush, a nail cutter

cloth, led to its continuation in 47 schools of Sansad block of Ahmedabad since February 2024. Even while focusing on adolescents, the campaign continued to reach out to women too.

In 2023, when the campaign was being conducted across 16 villages of Jhagadia block, Bharuch district of Gujarat, a woman sarpanch was invited as a chief guest for an event to celebrate nutrition week organised on the grounds of an adjoining temple.

The sarpanch expressed her reservations as it was the fourth day of her period. However, after some discussions on the myths surrounding menstruation, the CHET-NA team motivated her to come to the function. The sarpanch not only came for the function and sat on the temple steps but entered the

This act made her an icon for breaking the myths and taboos surrounding menstruation and helped to inspire other women shackled by societal barriers imposed by their families during their menstrual cycle. pants, was menstruating on the day of the function and was reluctant to attend. However, when she was informed that the sarpanch, who was also menstruating, had entered the temple, she took courage and followed

The sarpanch's actions challenged traditional taboos and set a powerful example. It highlighted the power of education and support in overcoming menstrual stigma. The campaign has reached more than 10,000 women and girls and many young people are coming forward to support the campaign.
The students of Riverside

School of Ahmedabad City supported the campaign by raising funds for the initiative to end discrimination against women and girls. Poor menstrual hygiene practices may lead to recurring reproductive tract infections which may increase the risk of cervical cancer. TRUMPS INFLUENCE ON INDIAN ECONOMY

How India's digital economy could be shaped by his policies

onald Trump, the 45th President of the United States, has left an indelible mark on both American and global politics. While much of the discussion about his policies and influence has focused on traditional industries like trade, defence, and foreign relations, Trump's impact could extend beyond these sectors — especially to economies like India. Freebies could push Delhi to fiscal disaster



Despite repeated warnings from the Supreme Court about the detrimental impact of freebies on free and fair elections, political parties continue to offer them



n the din of blistering campaign in Delhi with the central theme of major political parties being on "freebies" - an acronym for 'something given free of charge' - it may be worthwhile to remind them about two observations made by the Supreme Court (SC). In an order in S Subramaniam Balaji vs the Government of Tamil Nadu & Ors given in July 2013, the SC had observed that the distribution of freebies of any kind influences all people. "It shakes the root of free and fair elections to a large degree." A decade later, hearing a PIL on 'freebies', on January 25, 2022, it observed "This is no doubt a serious issue, budget for freebies is going above the regular Budget".

But, all this seems to have fallen on deaf ears. The state elections held since 2022 have witnessed political parties intensely competing with each other to mesmerise voters with a deadly combination of free goods and services and cash assistance. These have played a domineering role in winning elections. In Delhi, the offers have reached their 'NADIR'. The starting point was an announcement the finance minister Atisni in the budget for 2024-25 reg. The Mukhyamantri COURT OF LAW. IT unless a claim for the amount Mahila Samman Yojana (MMSY) under which, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government will give Rs 1000 per month to all the women above the age of 18 in the national capital. Taking the average expense of educating a child in India at the bare minimum of Rs. 20,000 per annum, the total expense on "needy students" in the city would be about Rs 2200 crore annually. The additional burden of these four guarantees alone on the Delhi government's budget is Rs 27,950 crore (20,100+3150+2500+2200).

Other freebies would bloat this figure by several thousand crore. Already, the finances of the Delhi government are in a precarious state. Against the total expenditure of Rs 76,000 crore during FY 2024-25, the total revenue is estimated at around Rs 58,000

This leads to a fiscal deficit (FD) of Rs 18,000 crore which is 80 per cent higher than the FD for FY 2023-24 at Rs 10,000 crore. The surge in FD is despite a steep According to an estimate, there reduction of over 30 per cent in are about 15 lakh pregnant capital expenditure from the bud-

get estimate (BE) of Rs 22,000 crore for FY 2023-24 to Rs 15,000 crore for FY 2024-25. The government's current debt is

about Rs 40,000 crore. But, this is not all. We also need to add the loans taken by its departments such as Delhi Jal Board (DJB): Rs 70,000 crore and Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC): Rs 10,000 crore as the liability for servicing those debts is vested entirely in the NCT government. This takes the total debt of Delhi to Rs 120,000 crore. The situation has come to such a

pass that CM Atishi has approached the Centre seeking a loan of Rs 10,000 crore from the National Small Savings Fund (NSSF). The precariousness of the state's finances has a lot to do with the freebies which are estimated to cost about Rs 11,000 crore during 2024-25. Add to this at least Rs 30,000 crore being the impact of guarantees given during this election, freedies alone would dent the exchequer by Rs 41,000 crore annually.

Delhi government could be staring at an FD of close to Rs 50,000 crore. And, its debt would balloon to Rs 150,000 crore. The ball won't stop here. When used to doles, people will want more and more and parties can't say no. When, even a die-hard reformist and fiscal disciplinarian like Modi is forced to give way to freebies (courtesy, of Kejriwal's brand of politics), things will only worsen. What if people stop working (very likely when they get money sitting at home) and tax-payers stop paying taxes (likely when they see their earnings being frittered away in distributing doles to those who don't work)? The National Capital could be staring at fiscal disaster.

Hamas frees 8 more hostages

Israel puts prisoner release on hold

PTI KHAN YOUNIS

Hamas-led militants freed eight hostages on Thursday as part of the ceasefire in the Gaza Strip, but the chaotic handover of some of the captives, who masked militants shuttled through a rowdy crowd of thousands, drew an angry protest from Israel.

Israel was supposed to release 110 Palestinian prisoners later in the day, including around 30 serving life sentences for deadly attacks against Israelis. But Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said the move was put on hold until the "safe release" of hostages can be assured.

Over six weeks, Hamas is to free 33 Israeli hostages — roughly one third of those held- in exchange for nearly 2,000 Palestinian prisoners. As part of the truce, Israel has also pulled its forces back from major cities and allowed hundreds of thousands of displaced Palestinians to return to their homes in war-torn Gaza.

The sides are also to begin talks on a second phase aimed at winding down the deadliest and most destructive war ever fought between Israel and Hamas, whose October 7, 2023, attack into Israel sparked the fighting.

The hostages released Thursday included a female Israeli soldier, a 29-vear-old Israeli woman, an 80-year-old Israeli man, and five Thai labourers who had been working in southern Israel when they were captured.

The first hostage, soldier Agam Berger, 20, was released after Hamas paraded her in front of a crowd in the heavily destroyed urban Jabaliya refugee camp in northern Gaza.

Hours later, a chaotic scene unfolded at a handover of the other seven hostages in the southern city of Khan Younis, in front of the destroyed home of slain Hamas leader Yahya

Hundreds of militants from Hamas and the smaller Islamic Jihad group arrived with a convoy, and thousands of people

gathered to watch, some from the tilted rooftops of bombedout buildings.

Footage showed hostage Arbel Yehoud looking stunned as masked militants hustled her through the shouting crowd, sometimes pushing people About 20 friends of Yehoud

gathered in southern Israel watched as the tense scene unfolded on live television. Some cried. Others had their hands over their eyes or mouths. One friend velled at the news anchor to "shut up" when she said the situation appeared dangerous. The crowd then burst into tears after she was turned over to the Red Cross. Netanyahu condemned the 'shocking scenes" and called on international mediators to ensure the safety of hostages in future releases.

The other Israeli released Thursday was Gadi Moses, 80. Five Thai nationals were freed and identified by Israel as Watchara Sriaoun, 33, Pongsak Tanna, 36, Sathian Suwankam, 35, Bannawat Seathao, 27, and Surasak Lamnau, 32.

The Israeli army confirmed all eight were brought into Israel. The government released footage of Berger, who was among five young, female soldiers abducted in the October Saturday and delayed the opening of crossings to northern

7 attack, hugging and crying with her parents.

Earlier, people cheered, clapped and whistled in a square in Tel Aviv as Berger's handover unfolded on big screens next to a large clock that's counted the days the hostages have been in captivity. Some held signs saying: "Agam we're waiting for you at home.

At the square, the White House's Mideast envoy, Steve Witkoff, met briefly with families of hostages. "My message is that we're with the families and that we care for them," he told The Associated Press.

A number of foreign workers were taken captive along with dozens of Israeli civilians and soldiers during Hamas' attack. Twenty-three Thais were among more than 100 hostages released during a week-long ceasefire in November 2023. Israel says three Thais remain in captivity, two of whom are believed to be dead.

Among the people set to be released from prisons is Zakaria Zubeidi, a prominent former militant leader and theatre director who took part in a dramatic jailbreak in 2021 before being rearrested days later. said Yehoud was sup posed to have been freed on

Israel says it is still committed to destroying Hamas, even after the militant group reasserted its rule over Gaza within hours of the truce. A key far-right partner in Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's coalition is already calling for the war to resume after the ceasefire's first phase. Hamas says it won't release the remaining hostages without an end to the war and a full Israeli withdrawal from Gaza.

Hamas started the war when it sent thousands of fighters storming into Israel. The militants killed some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and abducted around 250.

Israel's ensuing air and ground war among the deadliest and most destructive in decades. More than 47,000 Palestinians have been killed, over half of them women and children, according to Gaza's Health Ministry, which does not say how many of the dead were militants.

The Israeli military says it killed over 17,000 fighters, without providing evidence, and that it went to great lengths to try to spare civilians.

It blames civilian deaths on Hamas because its fighters operate in dense residential neighbourhoods and put military infrastructure near homes, schools and mosques.

The Israeli offensive has transformed entire neighbourhoods into mounds of gray rubble, and it's unclear how or when any thing will be rebuilt.

Around 90 per cent of Gaza's population has been displaced, often multiple times, with hundreds of thousands of people living in squalid tent camps or shuttered schools.

Jet with 64 aboard collides with US Army helicopter

n American Airlines jet Acarrying 60 passengers and four crew members collided Wednesday with an Army helicopter while landing at Ronald Reagan National Airport near Washington, prompting a large search-and-rescue operation in the nearby Potomac River.

There were multiple fatalities, according to a person familiar with the matter, but the precise number of victims was unclear as rescue crews hunted for any survivors.

Three soldiers were onboard the helicopter, an Army official

There was no immediate word on the cause of the collision, but all takeoffs and landings from the airport were halted as dive teams scoured the site and helicopters from law enforcement agencies across the region flew over the scene in methodical search for bodies.

"We are going to recover our fellow citizens," District of Columbia Mayor Muriel Bowser said at a somber news conference at the airport Thursday morning in which she declined to say how many bodies had been recovered.

Sen. Roger Marshall of Kansas said, "When one person dies it's a tragedy, but when many, many, many people die it's an unbearable sorrow

President Donald Trump said he had been "fully briefed on this terrible accident" and, referring to the passengers, added, "May God Bless their souls.

Passengers on the flight included a group of figure skaters, their coaches and family members who were returning from a development camp that followed the US Figure Skating Championships in Wichita.

'We are devastated by this unspeakable tragedy and hold the victims' families closely in our hearts," US Figure Skating said in a statement. Aviation The Federal

Administration said the midair crash occurred before 9 p.m. EST when a regional jet that had departed from Wichita, Kansas, collided with a military helicopter on a training flight while on approach to an airport runway. It occurred in some of the most tightly controlled and monitored airspace in the world, just over three miles south of the White House and the Capitol.

Investigators will try to piece together the aircrafts' final moments before their collision, including contact with air traffic controllers as well as a loss of altitude by the passenger

American Airlines Flight 5342 was inbound to Reagan National at an altitude of about 400 feet and a speed of about 140 miles per hour when it suffered a rapid loss of altitude over the Potomac River, according to data from its radio transponder. Canadian-made Bombardier CRJ-701 twinengine jet, manufactured in 2004, can be configured to

carry up to 70 passengers. A few minutes before landing, air traffic controllers asked the arriving commercial jet if it could land on the shorter Runway 33 at Reagan National and the pilots said they were able. Controllers then cleared the plane to land on Runway 33. Flight tracking sites showed the

new runway. Less than 30 seconds before the crash, an air traffic controller asked the helicopter if it had the arriving plane in sight. The controller made another radio call to the helicopter moments later: "PAT 25 pass behind the CRJ." Seconds after that, the two air-

At least a half-dozen boats were scanning the water using searchlights.

"It's a highly complex opera-tion," said D.C. fire chief John Donnelly. "The conditions out there are extremely rough for the responders."

The US Army described the helicopter as a UH-60 Blackhawk based at Fort Belvoir in Virginia. The helicopter was on a training flight. Bill introduced in US Senate to restrict birthright citizenship

Washington (PTI): A group of Republican because it is being abused in so many ways, tivise illegal migration, and ensure Senate to restrict birthright citizenship to the children of illegal immigrants and nonimmigrants on temporary visas.

According to Senators Lindsey Graham, Ted Cruz and Katie Britt, who introduced the bill, the exploitation of birthright citizenship is a major pull factor for illegal immigration and a weakness for national

security.
The US is one of only 33 countries in the world with no restrictions on birthright citizenship, they said.

The legislative move comes after an executive order on the matter, signed by President Donald Trump on the first day of his presidency, has been blocked by a federal judge in Washington state.

The Center for Immigration Studies estimates that in 2023, there were 2,25,000 to 2,50,000 births to illegal immigrants, amounting to close to seven per cent of births in the US.

It is long overdue for the United States to change its policy on birthright citizenship

tourism, where wealthy individuals from China and other nations come to the United States simply to have a child who will be an American citizen. When you look at the magnets that draw people to America, birthright citizenship is one of the largest," he said. "I also appreciate President Trump's executive order to address birthright citizenship. It is time for the United States to align itself with the rest of the world and restrict this practice once and for all," Graham said.

B'desh minority rights group blames interim govt for neglect

Dhaka (PTI): Bangladesh's largest minority rights group accused the country's interim government on Thursday of failing to protect religious and ethnic minorities from attacks and harassment, a claim the government has denied. The Bangladesh Hindu Buddhist Christian Unity Council said the government headed by Nobel Peace Prize laureate Muhammad Yunus is also using state institutions to suppress minority groups. Yunus took over after a studentled uprising last year in which hundreds of people died forced former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to flee to India on August 5, ending her 15-year rule. The council earlier said 2,010 incidents of communal violence took place across the Muslim-majority country between August 4 and 20. The Yunus-led government disputed the claim, saying that most of the incidents were caused by "political reasons" and not by communal issues. Traditionally, Hindus and other members of minority groups have been seen as supporters of Hasina's Bangladesh Awami League party.

In a news conference on Thursday, the council reiterated its claim of earlier attacks and said 174 new incidents of communal violence had taken place between August 21 and December 31 last year in which 23 members of minority groups were killed and nine women were raped. It said other incidents involved arson, vandalism, looting and forcible takeover of property and businesses. It said at least 15 members of minority groups were either arrested or tortured for allegedly undermining Islam. Manindra Kumar Nath, the group's act-

Challenges galore as Sitharaman, team frame FY26 Budget

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

Pinance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, set to make history with her eighth consecutive Union Budget, has worked tirelessly with key officials, including Finance Secretary Tuhin Kanta Pandey, to prepare a budget of over ₹50 lakh crore for FY26.

The Budget will have to address several challenges, including decelerating economic growth, falling value of Rupee against the US dollar and moderation in consumption demand.

The economic growth is estimated to slow to a four-year low of 6.4 per cent in FY25. This is the lowest growth since the outbreak of the COVID pandemic which hit the world

Sitharaman, who had steered the Indian economy through difficult phases, including once-in-a-century pandemic, is again confronted with economic deceleration, moderation in consumption,

stagnant private investment, and an uncertain geopolitical situation.

On account of various factors, the rupee plunged to an all-time low of 86.7 per US dollar earlier this month.

The team, assisting the Finance Minister to frame Budget proposals for 2025-26, includes Revenue Secretary Pandey, Economic Affairs Secretary Ajay Seth, Expenditure Secretary Manoj Govil, Department of Investment and Public Asset Management (DIPAM) Secretary Arunish Chawla, Financial Services Secretary M Nagaraju, and Chief Economic Advisor V Anantha Nageswaran.

The uphill task before the Finance Minister and her team would be to bolster growth without sacrificing prudence.

The government is also expected to stick to the fiscal glide path of reducing the fiscal deficit to below 4.5 per cent of Gross Domestic Product

The Russian government is in talks with the Indian External Affairs Ministry for a final agreement on the number of people comprising a group from India to avail this facility," Moscow City Tourism Committee Chairman Evgeny Kozlov told PTI.

Kozlov further said India is an important country and ranks second in terms of source market among far abroad countries after China.

"India is a priority market for us. For us among the far China abroad countries, ranks at the number one position, followed by India. Indians are also good spenders while travelling, spending around USD 2,000 per person per travelling. per person per trip," he said on the sidelines of an event on Wednesday evening.

Former CWG gold-winning boxer Manoj Kumar retires to take up coaching

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

 $F_{\text{gold-winning boxer Manoj Kumar,}}^{\text{ormer Commonwealth Games}}$ who dominated the light welterweight (64kg) division in India at his prime and did not hesitate to voice his disagreements with national federation's policies, announced his retirement on Thursday to begin a career in coaching.

The 39-year-old, who won his first and only CWG gold in the 2010 Delhi Games, is also a two-time Asian Championships bronze-medallist. His second and last CWG medal, a bronze, came in Gold Coast in 2018

He is also a two-time Olympian, having competed in the 2012 London and 2016 Rio de Janeiro Games, finishing as a pre-quarterfinalist in editions after fighting performances that ultimately fell just short of pushing him over the line.

"It's a carefully thought out decision because once I turn 40, I can anyway not compete in amateur events as per international rules. I am retiring as a content man after representing my country to the best of my ability," Manoj, who hails from Kaithal in

Harvana, told PTI.

"I have just gratitude for the opportunities I got," he added.

The outspoken pugilist, who began his

boxing career at the junior level in 1997, completed his coaching diploma from the National Institute of Sports, Patiala in 2021. Injuries and a dispute with the national federation on selection issues hampered his India career after the

Gold Coast CWG and he was not seen in any international event after that. He now intends to devote time to the academy that he has set up with elder brother and long-time personal coach Rajound Kumar Kurukshetra.

"For any athlete, saying goodbye to the sport is an extremely emotional moment. If it weren't for Rajesh sir, I wouldn't have been recognised as an Olympian boxer. He made me dream big and cleared every obstacle in my path to achieve them," he said reiterating his reverence for the man who was, at times, his only support

system. 'This academy will serve as a medium to share our experiences and lessons with young athletes who will one day



win medals for India in the Olympics,

he added. Not among the most physically domineering boxers, Manoj created a niche for himself with his workmanlike approach to the sport which meant wearing down his opponents in the ring with his deceptive defensive

He could frustrate rivals with his shell guards and at the same time, surprise them with his very effective counterattacks, which relied heavily on accurately placed straight punches. But despite a reasonably successful career, he could never find a steady sponsor who could stand by him when

injuries chipped away at his fortunes.

Manoj was elected as the athletes

representative in the Boxing

Federation of India's executive committee in 2016 but had to quit over disagreements with the body on its ever-changing selection policy, which included doing away with the traditional practice of trials for a while. 'While in that commission, I raised my voice for fellow boxers. And when you do that too frequently, there are consequences. But I have never really cared. I still don't care," he said. Manoj's many other battles included a

court case to get the Arjuna award in 2014 when the Kapil Dev-led selection panel ignored him despite the fact that he fulfilled the laid-down criteria as per the points system established for the honour.

He won that fight in the Delhi High Court and was presented the award by the then sports minister Sarbananda Sonowal a few months after the traditional ceremony.

He also fought a long and futile battle to get promotion in the Railways, which had promised him the elevation after the 2010 CWG gold but failed to fulfil it eventually. He is the only Indian boxer aside from the iconic Vijender Singh to have won two CWG
