≺he star campaigners of the Bharatiya Janata (BJP) have descended in the national Capital going full throttle against the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) ahead of the high-octane Delhi Assembly elections with its prominent leaders including party president and Union president Minister Jaggat Prakash Nadda, and three chief ministers-Uttar Pradesh (UP) Chief Minister (CM) Yogi Adityanath, Madhya Pradesh CM Mohanlal Yadav, and Uttarakhand CM Pushkar Singh Dhamiholding multiple rallies, public road shows and meetings across the length and breadth of the city.

In his maiden speech ahead of the polls, Adityanath accused the AAP of settling Bangladeshi and Rohingya nationals in Delhi and compromising national security while hitting out at the ruling party for being involved in the riots that took place in the national

Capital in 2020. Sounding the poll bugle, the senior BJP leader launched a scathing attack on the AAP and its supremo Arvind Kejriwal. "There is an Okhla industrial area in Delhi but there has been no trade there for the past 10 years. While the AAP took no interest in setting up industries there, they have undoubtedly settled Rohingyas and Bangladeshis

Rahul Gandhi cancels two rallies on consecutive days

ongress leader Rahul Gandhi's rally in the national capital on Thursday was canceled due to his poor health and medical advice. He was scheduled to hold the rally in Mustafabad in northeast Delhi, but people familiar with him said he is from congestion.

The Congress campaign for the Assembly elections was expected to get a big boost from Rahul's three daily rallies on three successive days, starting January 22, but two of these have now been canceled.

"As of now, Rahul Gandhi's election rally in Madipur on

Friday is on schedule, and he is likely to address a massive said Delhi gathering," Congress chief Devendra Yadav, a day after the Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha failed to show up for an election rally near Inderlok metro station in the Sadar Assembly constituency on Wednesday.

Dismissing speculation that the cancellation of Rahul's rallies was aimed at helping the AAP-by preventing a division of Muslim voters-Yadav said, "These are rumors. We are fighting the election independently." "After Republic Day, the party leaders will step up the campaign in Delhi," he said.

India-China continue border talks

Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri will travel to Beijing on a two-day visit starting Sunday to discuss next steps in improving ties between the two nations. This comes after armies of India and China in October last year agreed to disengage from friction points Line of Control(LAC)in Eastern Ladakh.

High level talks between the countries gathered momentum following the pact. It will be the second top level meeting in the last one and half months between the two neighbours. National Security Advisor(NSA)Ajit Doval travelled to Beijing and held talks with Chinese Foreign Minister Wang under the framework of Special Representatives(SR)dialogue on the boundary dispute.

"Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri will be visiting Beijing on January 26 and 27 for a meeting of the Foreign Secretary-Vice Minister mechanism between India and China," Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said on Thursday.

'The resumption of this bilateral mechanism flows from the agreement at the leadership level to discuss the next steps for India-China relations, including in the political, economic, and people-to-people domains," it said in a brief statement.

The decision to revive the SR dialogue mechanism and other such formats was taken at a meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping in Kazan on October 23. In the nearly 50-minute

meeting, Modi underscored



the importance of properly handling differences and disputes and not allowing them to disturb peace and tranquillity in border areas.

The Modi-Xi meeting came two days after India and China firmed up a disengagement pact for Depsang and Demchok, the last two friction points in eastern Ladakh. In the SR dialogue, India

pressed for a fair, reasonable and mutually acceptable settlement of the overall boundary dispute between the two countries.

Doval and Wang also focused on "positive" direction for cross-border cooperation including resuming the Kailash Mansarovar Yatra, river data sharing and border trade.

Last week, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said the India-China relationship is trying to disentangle itself from the complications arising from the post-2020 border situation and more thought needs to be given to the longer-term evolution of the

"At a time when most of its relationships are moving forward, India confronts a particular challenge establishing an equilibrium with China. Much of that arises from the fact that both nations are on the rise," he had

The external affairs minister noted that as immediate neighbours and the only two societies with over a billion people, India-China dynamic could never have been easy. But it has been further"

MEA Jaishankar talks deportation of Indians in US

🗖 ndia has always been open **⊥**to legitimate return of undocumented Indians to their country, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said on Wednesday, noting that New Delhi is still in the process of verifying those from the US who can be deported to India and the number of such individuals cannot be determined vet.

"As a government, we are obviously very supportive of legal mobility because we do believe in a global workplace. We want Indian talent and Indian skills to have the maximum opportunity at the global level. At the same time, we are also very firmly opposed to illegal mobility and illegal migration," Jaishankar told a group of Indian reporters

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NRAI calls for **CCI** probe into **Zomato, Swiggy**

The National Restaurant Association of India (NRAI), which represents half a million eateries nationwide, said it will approach Competition Commission of India over "private labelling" by Zomato and Swiggy and their foray into quick commerce food delivery via Bistro by Blinkit and Snacc,

respectively. In an interview, NRAI President Sagar Daryani raised concerns over "anticompetitive" practices of food delivery aggregators, "data macking" and "deep

discounting".
"We will be adding to our petition in CCI about them (Zomato, Swiggy) private labels through Bistro and Snacc," Daryani shared. He said NRAI will also request CCI to investigate complaints received from its member restaurants that Zomato and Swiggy were procuring from third party commercial kitchens for Zomato Everyday and Swiggy Daily

Queries sent to Swiggy and Zomato remained unanswered

Daryani said NRAI was "very concerned' many restaurants were already shutting down with several workers losing livelihoods.

Addressing an NRAI townhall with restaurant NRAI industry stakeholders on Wednesday, Daryani suggested that restaurants need to look at a "third alternative" like ONDC and could replicate the success achieved through a pilot in Bengaluru, throughout India. During the townhall, top restaurateurs raised concerns over the entry of food delivery aggregators like Zomato and Swiggy into private labelling and dining-in, and stressed the need for alternatives in the market.

Differential pricing: Uber, Ola, Apple under scanner

m ays}$ after a Delhi-based entrepreneur shared his findings on differential pricing by two ride-hailing apps in a series of posts on X, comparing fares across different devices and battery levels, the Consumer Protection has issued notices to tec giant Apple Inc. and cab aggregators Ola and Uber, seeking clarification on reports of alleged differential pricing based on the type of mobile device used to book rides. This comes after reports that the two companies appeared to charge different fares for the same service, depending on whether the customer was using an iPhone or an Android device.

"As a follow-up to the earlier observation of apparent #DifferentialPricing based on the different models of mobiles (#iPhones/ #Android) being used, the Department of Consumer Affairs, through the CCPA, has issued notices to major cab aggregators #Ola and #Uber, seeking their responses," Union Minister for Consumers' Affairs Prahlad Joshi said in a social media post.

Apple has been asked to respond to technical issues reported by iPhone users after a recent software update. Apple has been releasing updates, including iOS 18.0.1 in October, to address screen and camera freezing issues, and the latest 18.2.1 update for bug fixes. In its notice, the CCPA asked the companies to

explain their pricing methods and address concerns about potential discrimination. The ministry described the practice as "apparent differential pricing" and sought a detailed response to ensure transparency and fairness in fare calculations.



Recently, a survey by LocalCircles revealed that 60 percent of iPhone users experienced service problems, with call failures being the most significant issue. Nearly 90 percent of surveyed iPhone users attributed their difficulties directly to an iOS update, with no blame placed on Wi-Fi or mobile networks. Last month, the internet was abuzz with speculation that cab aggregators charged different fares - higher for those making bookings on iPhones - for the same ride. However, other social media users soon joined the chorus, alleging they were being charged different fares for identical rides when booking through Android and iOS devices.

Joshi had emphasized "zero tolerance for consumer exploitation" and asked the CCPA to conduct a thorough inquiry into these allegations. He had described this practice as a "prima facie unfair trade practice" and a "blatant disregard" for consumers' right to transparency.

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Poll chai-naastha fixed by EC

The poll watchdog is closely monitoring the rates of chai, pakora, even cholekulche, and how much is spent on garlands and drones while campaigning in the assembly polls in the national capital. The Election Commission of India has specified rates such sabzi, Rs 30 for kulche-chole, Rs 19 for a plate of pakoras, Rs 12 for a samosa or bread pakora, Rs 6 for a cup of tea, Rs 12 for a cup of coffee, Rs 20 for a sandwich, Rs 15 for a kachori, Rs 19 for a one-litre water bottle, and Rs 70 for lunch or dinner.

According to the rates chart approved by the EC, the rate for the use of drones is fixed at Rs 7,000 per day. A small garland cannot exceed Rs 20, while 10-foot garlands cannot cost more than Rs 1,500. Flowers used for stage decorations are priced at Rs 35 per square foot. A candidate can hire a horse at Rs 3,075 per day and an elephant at Rs

6,150 per day. Candidates need to get the poll panel's approval to hire animals for campaigning. The daily wage rate ranges from Rs 692 for unskilled workers to Rs 913 for graduates and above. The EC has also set rates for accommodations in hotels and



for vehicles. The rates for vehicles like Tata Sumo, Toyota Innova, and Mahindra Scorpio, among others, during are Rs 2,421 per day

per vehicle. For a normal car, the limit is Rs 1,499 day. The maximum cost for a two-wheeler is Rs 84 per day. The rate list also

specifies the maximum expenditure limit for tents, chairs, tables, podiums, and generators. For gatherings of up to 2,000 people, for example, the maximum rate, including all related expenses, is set at Rs 30,000 per event. For smaller gatherings of fewer than 250 people, the staging rate is Rs 6,150. A broom, the party symbol of the

ruling Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), used for maintaining party offices, event venues, or campaigning, cannot cost more than Rs 25 each. There are also price limits

Pens used in party election offices cannot exceed Rs 6 each. Among the musical instruments used at campaign events, drums are priced at Rs 500 per day.

According to officials, each returning officer prepares the rate list of services and materials used by candidates. Officials said the itemized rate list is finalized by a committee, which includes

consultation with political parties, candidates, and traders, and is handed over to each person filing nomination papers. Though in a city like Delhi, which has 70 assembly constituencies with an average of 22-25 lakh voters each in an area of 1,483 square kilometers, the prices of most the same but may vary occasionally.

Candidates are required to submit their expenditure report to the poll panel within 30 days of the completion of an election. The expenses are also monitored by the commission through video recording during

campaign. The accounting of expenses is done from the date candidates file their nomination papers until the day of the results. In the event of a violation or claims, incorrect candidacy of the person is canceled as per Election Commission rules. As a norm, the poll panel tracks candidates' expenses item-wise during election during campaigns. The rates are fixed based on feedback from district election officials market dealers, political parties, and the prevailing Consumer Price Index (CPI).

Mohammed Fakir also defended his son by saying his son had never kept his hair long, unlike the person in the video. Shariful was arrested by the Mumbai police from Hiranandani Estate at Thane

(west) on January 19. Police said Shariful hailed from Rajabariya village in Nalchity sub-region of Jhalokati district in southern Bangladesh.


When Shariful was produced before a holiday court on the same day, the accused's lawyer Sandeep D. Sherkhane had contested the claim made by the police that his client was a Bangladeshi who came to Mumbai six months ago.

Seven Nepalese among 13 dead | Local MLA urges faster action in Maharashtra train tragedy

As many as seven of the 13 persons who died in a train accident in Maharashtra's Jalgaon district hailed from Nepal, an official said on Thursday. Yuvaraj Patil, district information officer, said 11 of the 13 victims have been identified, and seven of them belonged to Nepal.

The Railway Protection Force and Government Railway Police have jointly initiated an inquiry into the train tragedy. Thirteen passengers of the Mumbai-bound Pushpak Express, who got off the train after an alarm chain-pulling incident, were run over by the Karnataka Express heading from Bengaluru to Delhi on the adjacent tracks in Maharashtra's Jalgaon district on Wednesday evening.

"Railway Protection Force (RPF) and Government Railway Police (GRP) Police

Aday after the District Administration in Rajouri declared the remote Badhaal village as a 'containment zone,' ruling party MLA from the Budhal Assembly segment, Javed Iqbal Choudhary, on Thursday alleged that critically ill patients are suffering due to a 'dual power centre' and a lack of coordination between different agencies on the ground.

The National Conference MLA claimed that the samples collected by the central teams from the remote Badhaal village are yet to be transported out of Rajouri to their final destinations in Pune, Lucknow, and New Delhi. He also demanded a permanent arrangement for HeliTaxi services in either Jamus or Rajouri to shift critically ill patients without wasting precious time.

Raising the issue of shifting three sisters from GMC Jammu to PGI Chandigarh, the National Conference MLA alleged that despite airlifting the three siblings from Rajouri

via a special flight arranged by the office of the Divisional Commissioner Jammu, the office of GMC Principal failed to make the necessary arrangements in time to shift them to PGI Chandigarh late Wednesday evening. He demanded a high-level probe to determine who prevented the timely shifting of patients with severe symptoms of a 'mysterious disease.' So far, 17 villagers, including 13 children, have died due to the mysterious illness in the remote Badhaal village of Rajouri.

Meanwhile, the district authorities on Thursday shifted around 200 villagers from the containment zone in Badhaal to an isolation ward at GMC Rajouri. An 11-year-old patient identified as Saima Kousar, with similar symptoms, was also admitted to GMC Rajouri on Thursday evening. Medical Superintendent of GMC Shamim Rajouri, Dr. Shamim Choudhary, said that doctors are currently assessing her health condition. "We will start treatment after the team of doctors thoroughly examines her and monitors her," he said another development, Principal of GMC Jammu, Dr. Ashutosh Gupta, responded to the allegations of NC MLA Javed Iqbal Choudhary, claiming that the patients could not be shifted to PGI Chandigarh late Wednesday night because **PGIMER** administration conveyed their inability to accept the children due to the unavailability of beds.

In a written statement issued on Thursday, Dr. Ashutosh Gupta stated that GMC Jammu was informed about the airlifting of three children with signs and symptoms of the mysterious illness from GMC Rajouri to GMC Jammu at approximately 6:30 PM. The authorities were also notified about the availability of beds at PGIMER Chandigarh.

Dr. Gupta further added, "The GMC Jammu authorities immediately readied fully equipped critical care ambulances and dispatched them to the technical airport in Jammu for the immediate transfer of these patients to PGIMER Chandigarh by road."

SC to address lawyer appearance regulations

"Why is this happening? Delhi residents are instead compelled to buy: Royal Green Rich, Dennies Special, Bottoms Up Premium, Old Habbit Premium and Soulmate Blu. Shockingly, 85.4 per cent of the total whiskey sold in Delhi comes from a lesser-known distillery in Punjab."

The performance of party-hoppers will count this time in government formation in Delhi as the three major players in the Assembly polls -- AAP, BJP and Congress -have fielded around 20 foeturned-friends in the electoral smooth sailing for these candidates who are now trying to prove themselves in a new setup that has thrown at them multiple challenges including the unease among workers and leaders of their adopted parties.

With elections close by, several prominent leaders of the AAP, Congress and BJP switched sides, seeking to redirect -- and in some cases resurrect -- their political careers. Amid uncertainty over getting tickets for the Assembly polls, around half a dozen BJP leaders crossed over to the AAP which promptly fielded them from different constituencies. These leaders had contested Assembly polls as BJP candi-

dates in 2020. One of them is Pravesh Ratan whom the AAP has fielded from the Patel Nagar (SC) seat against former minister and BJP candidate Raaj Kumar Anand. In 2020 also, they were



rivals, but from different parties -- Anand from AAP and Ratan from BJP.

Jitender Singh Shunty and Surinder Pal Bittu joined the AAP and got tickets from Shahdara and Timarpur constituencies, respectively. Three other BJP leaders -

Brahm Singh Tanwar, BB Tyagi and Anil jha -- joined the AAP and were given tickets to contest these polls. Tyggi is contesting the polls from Laxmi Nagar, Jha from Kirari and Tanwar from Chhatarpur. Kartar Singh Tanwar who defeated Brahm Singh Tanwar

in the 2020 polls is now a BJP candidate from Chhatarpur. Jha was fielded by the AAP from Kirari seat by denying ticket to outgoing party MLA Rituraj Jha. 

"We have been telling it since the beginning that we are keen on finding a solution, not laying down a law," it said. The top court was hearing arguments on a batch of pleas raising the issue of different pension being payable to retired high court

One of the key reasons highlighted before the top court was that the high court judges, who were elevated from the district judiciary, were covered under the New

Pension Scheme.

The two leaders also decided to take the volume of bilateral trade to USD 12 billion in the next five years from around USD seven billion recorded

Egypt has traditionally been one of India's most important trading partners in the African continent. The India-Egypt bilateral trade agreement has been in operation since March 1978. The bilateral trade has increased more than five times in last 10 years. Around 50 Indian companies have invested in various sectors in Egypt with a combined investment exceeding USD 3.25 billion. A joint statement issued during El-Sisi's visit to India two years back mentioned that the Egyptian side is considering

the possibility of allocating a special area of land for the Indian industries in the Suez Canal Economic Zone (SCEZ). The Suez Canal, connecting the Mediterranean Sea with the Red Sea, is one of the world's busiest trade routes. About 12 percent of global trade passes through the canal each day. India and Egypt are also look-

ing at deepening cooperation in the field of agriculture and allied services besides strengthening the supply chain of food articles. The defence and strategic cooperation between India

and Egypt has been on an upswing in the last few years. The Indian and Egyptian Armies conducted the first ever joint exercise in January this year.

Egypt had already shown interest in procuring Tejas light combat aircraft, radars, military helicopters and other platforms from India.



Court refuses FIR over M F Husain paintings

Delhi court has refused to alleging two paintings of late artist and Padma awardee M F Husain hurt religious sentiments and said no further probe was required. Ĵudicial magistrate first class

Sahil Monga said all the facts and circumstances of the case were within the knowledge of the complainant, the CCTV footage of Delhi Art Gallery, and the paintings in question have already been seized. "No further investigation and

collection of evidences is required on the part of investigating agency at this stage, as all the evidences are in the possession of complainant as well as on record," said the court. The matter, it went on, could proceed before the court as a complaint case and issued notice to Delhi Art Gallery Pvt. Ltd., its CEO and MD Ashish Anand, and Director Ashwani Anand for February 12



action taken report said the paintings in question were seized. The report further said the commission of cognisable offence could not be ascertained, the judge noted.

The judge on January 20 ordered the seizure of the paintings displayed at the art gallery and reserved the order

on FIR after hearing arguments.

The paintings feature Hindu deities Hanuman and Ganesh. During the hearing on the plea, complainant and advocate Amita Sachdeva, said the most revered entities of Sanatan Dharma -- Hanuman and Ganesh -- were insulted in Husain's paintings.

"This is obscenity. Depicted most revered deities in obscene manner a deliberate and malicious insult. Husain may be the greatest artist in the world, but he has no right to insult my deities," she argued.

She claimed there was an advertisement and thousands of people saw the painting of "deities being ridiculed"

"Prima facie case is made out for exhibiting such offensive paintings for public viewing ments," added Sachdeva.

Ordering the seizure, Monga cited the police's action taken report, which said the investigating officer seized the security camera footage and the network video recorder of the art gallery.

The report said the art exhibition was held privately and the paintings, including the two in question, were only to display the original work of Husain. "At this stage an application has been moved by complainant for direction to the IO to seize the

painting in question. In light of the facts and circumstances mentioned in the said application, the said application is allowed and IO is directed to seize the said painting," the January 20 order said.

CBI closes case against DHFL in 'fake accounts' case

The CBI has closed the case against the DHFL and its directors pertaining to 2.60 lakh allegedly fictitious home loan accounts, some of which were used to claim interest subsidies under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojna, officials said.

After over three years of probe, the agency could not find evidence suggesting a criminal conspiracy which could have led to the creation of such accounts, they said. The irregularities were pointed out in the report of auditor Grant Thornton, appointed by the new board of the scamhit Dewan Housing Finance Limited (DHFL), they said.

The agency has now submitted its final report before a special court in Delhi, which would take a call on whether to accept the closure report or order further



Kapil and Dheeraj Wadhawan along with the company. It was alleged that DHFL had

opened a fictitious branch in Bandra and fake accounts worth Rs 14,046 crore of home-loan borrowers, who had already repaid their loans, were entered in the database, they said.

A total of 2.60 lakh "fake and fictitious" home loan accounts were created in the non-existent branch from 2007-19 for a total loan worth Rs 14,046 crore, out of which Rs 11,755.79 crore were deposited or routed to several fictitious firms known as Bandra Book firms, the CBI had alleged in the FIR.



The CBI has filed a charge sheet against research and advocacy group Oxfam India and its former CEO Amitabh Behar in connection with alleged violations of rules and regulations related to foreign funds, officials said.

In its chargesheet filed before a special court here, the CBI has named the group and Behar, who is now executive director of Oxfam International as accused.

The FIR against the Indian arm of the global NGO Oxfam was registered in April 2023 based on a complaint from the Ministry of Home Affairs.

An email seeking reaction of Oxfam India remained unanswered till writing of this story. The complaint, which is now part of the FIR, has alleged that though Oxfam India's FCRA registration ceased, it planned to circumvent the law by tak-



ing other routes to channelise funds

Email communication found during IT (income tax) survey by the CBDT shows that Óxfam India has been planning to pressure Indian government for renewal of FCRA through foreign governments and foreign institutions," it had alleged. 'Oxfam India has the reach and influence to request multilateral foreign organisations to intervene on its behalf with the Government of India," it had

In an earlier statement, Oxfam India had said it is fully compliant with Indian laws.

Oxfam India is fully compliant with Indian laws and has filed all its statutory compliances, including Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) returns, in a timely manner since its inception. Oxfam India has been cooperating with all government agencies since its FCRA registration wasn't renewed in December 2021," the NGO had said.





initiative aims to safeguard chinar trees from threats such as urbanisation, deforestation, and habitat

degradation. The project is being spearheaded by J-K Research Institute of J-K Forest

Department.
The QR-based digital plate is affixed to each surveyed Chinar tree using a specialised spring-enabled metal. Each tree is given a unique id like Aadhaar specifying the year the tree is surveyed, the district it is located and a serial number for easy identification.

"Chinar is a part of our culture. We are doing a survey to know the total number of chinars, their status, their height, girth, etc. So, we have taken this initiative of tree geo-tagging," Project Coordinator, FRI, Syed Tariq,

told PTI here. He said so far, around 28,500 chinar trees have been identified, surveyed and their data updated, and the process is going on. We are preserving that data

in the heritage registers of

each district. Each district will

have its own heritage register

so that the credible data is readily available and new data can be added when new ones are planted," he said.

The project head said a chinar atlas of Kashmir will be created once the exercise is completed.

That will give us an idea how many chinar trees are there in each district, with their status. project aims and preserving and conserving the iconic tree of Kashmir," he

having a tree number.

"There is complete information about the specific chinar tree in the QR code. When the code is scanned, it will give instant information about the tree." about the tree.

"A person can get required information about the tree including its location with coordinates, physical characters, health status, height, girth, tree shape, number of main branches, whether the tree is a seed bearer or not, and whether the tree is diseased or not" he said. The district specific codes in the unique code have been taken from the RTO codes. Each tree is photographed and those are uploaded so that they are readily available at the click of a mouse.

said official The department lacked credible data about the number of chinar trees in the valley before this survey.

"We had a rough estimate of 40,000 or 45,000 trees, but there was no exact number. The idea of a unique code came because once we go for a census, there is always an apprehension of duplication. To avoid that, we came up with this unique ID," Tariq

He said the chinar tree, a symbol of cultural heritage, faces threats like urbanisation, deforestation and habitat loss. To ensure its survival, the J-K Forest Department and J-K FRI are leveraging digital tools, including geo-tagging and QR codes, for effective monitoring and conservation. These efforts aim to preserve chinars and their habitats, he

The campaign has revealed that the highest number of chinar trees in the valley are found in Srinagar, followed by Ganderbal, Anantnag and Baramulla districts.

The official said in the top 20 series of chinars in the World Monumental Trees, 11 are in from Kashmir.

■ n a dramatic intervention, US President Donald Trump has asked Russian President Vladimir Putin to bring an immediate end to the ongoing Ukraine war. Labeling the conflict 'ridiculous,' Trump warned of severe economic sanctions and tariffs against Russia if Putin failed to negotiate peace. The threat marks a sharp escalation in Trump's rhetoric on a war that has already claimed the lives of over a million soldiers on both sides. Speaking on Truth Social platform, Trump reaffirmed his affinity for the Russian people and his respect for Putin but did not shy away from criticising the Russian leader for prolonging the bloody conflict. "We must never forget that Russia helped us win the Second World War, losing almost 60 million lives in the process," Trump said, highlighting historical ties while urging an end to the ongoing devastation. Trump's approach combines a mix of hardline economic threats and diplomatic overtures. In his straightforward message he suggested that the economic repercussions of prolonged conflict

would be catastrophic for Russia. He emphasised that his preference was for a peaceful resolution.

The Ukraine war, which began with Russia's invasion in February 2022, has dragged on for nearly three years. The conflict has claimed the lives of nearly a million Russian soldiers and 700,000 Ukrainian troops. These staggering figures underscore the war's devastating impact, making it one of the deadliest conflicts of the 21st century. Economic consequences have also been severe, particularly for Russia. International sanctions, coupled with the strain of prolonged military operations, have left the Russian economy struggling with inflation and stagnation. Trump pointed to these eco-

nomic pressures as a potential leverage point, suggesting that a peace deal is in Russia's best interest. Trump's ultimatum reflects a marked departure from his earlier, more ambiguous stance on the conflict. Trump administration is in direct talks with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky and Trump himself plans to engage with Putin directly. He appears intent on delivering on that promise with a mix of economic coercion and diplomatic engagement. Despite the grim reality of the war, Trump's comments offers a glimmer of hope for an early resolution. He has emphasised that both Zelensky and Putin should pursue a deal, suggesting that the leaders' willingness would be pivotal in ending the conflict. Trump's ultimatum to Putin could signal a turning point in the Ukraine war, but the path forward remains fraught with uncertainty. While the economic pressure could incentivise Russia to negotiate, the deep-seated political and territorial disputes fueling the conflict may prove challenging to resolve. As the world watches, Trump's next moves whether imposing sanctions, brokering a deal, or recalibrating military aid—will shape not only the future of the Ukraine war but also the broader geopolitical landscape. For now, one thing is clear: Trump is determined to make his mark on history by ending a war that has caused untold suffering and reshaped global politics.



Can suspending commodity derivatives rein in food price




The debate over whether speculative trading in futures commodity markets drives food price inflation remains unresolved in India and across Asia

several concerns in India and across Asia, certain policy and key opinion circles that food price inflation is catalysed or influenced somehow by speculative trading in the futures commodity markets. Even while opinions are divided in policy circles and among economists who have studied and examined the nature of the relationship between food inflation and commodity and derivative futures trading contracts, and no empirical evidence hitherto seems to have been found despite numerous studies undertaken in India.

It would be worth mentioning that a detailed empirical research study conducted by leading researchers from the Indian Institute of Management Udaipur specifically studied three suspension events in India of futures traded commodities, which led the researchers to firmly state that the counterfactual for each of the examined episodes confirms that even in the absence of trading suspensions, food prices or inflationary trends would have followed their dynamic path.

Any upward price volatility could ostensibly be the effects or countereffects of various extraneous domestic or global (especially geopolitical) factors. It is also equally understandable and natural for any governing policy institution to be both fully cog-nisant and mindful of food price inflationary trends, and the fact that rising food prices can have a cataclysmic effect on food security and thus, by extension could have substantive socio-economic impact.

Successive policy establishments and ecosystems have always been overly cautious, ever since futures trading commodity derivatives exchanges were established in the early 2000s. Despite the mandate of such commodity exchanges that futures trading contracts encourage effective and fair price discovery and risk hedging, which consequently sateguards the com-modity value chain from price risk which is a result of a fundamental play between demand ic instances studied, such as and supply the apprehensions those of Bengal Gram (Chana)



have been a constant feature since 2007-2008, under the advisement of the price monitoring mechanisms and agencies within the government policy ecosystem, there never has been an occasion when suspensions of commodity trading exceeded more than a year in a single stretch, barring the odd 'sensitive' food commodity. So as a commodity markets expert, with a domestic and world view of ongoing trading in global commodity markets, one begs to specifically ask - Do derivatives trading suspensions really rein in food price inflation?

Researchers have constantly alluded to synthetic control methodologies to apply to their studies for studying specific suspensions, their findings fairly and comprehensively conclude and determine that there is no empirical evidence that derivatives suspension nad any impact whatsoever on food prices.

INDIA'S FOREIGN POLICY: CHAMPIONING THE GLOBAL SOUTH

India's approach balances national priorities with global responsibilities

ndia's External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar attended the US presidential inauguration earlier this week. President Trump's inauguration by itself is an epochal moment for global international relations. India outlined its foreign policy approach a few days ago, during EAM's address at Nani Palkivala's memorial lecture. He mentioned that India's foreign policy in 2025 reflects a deepening commitment to multilateralism, but also recognises the competitive realities of a shifting global order. The nation has embraced issue-based partnerships with major groupings like the Quad, BRICS, and the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC). India's ability to balance multiple memberships and partnerships underscores its evolving diplomatic strategy, driven by a pragmatic approach to international relations.

At the heart of India's foreign policy is a strong solidarity with the Global South, rooted in post-colonial values of independence, sovereignty and resistance to external pressures. This unique perspective sets India apart from traditional alliance structures, as it champions the rights of developing nations while pursuing its strategic interests. While India continues to engage in global dialogues, it maintains its core principle of nonalignment and the freedom to choose partners based on national priorities. Recent shifts in India's domestic policies—across politics, economics and security—have influenced its foreign relations



Notably, India's relationship with the United States has transformed, moving past historical hesitations to embrace a deeper strategic partnership. This cooperation spans security, technology, trade, and science, benefiting both nations. India's diaspora also plays a crucial role, acting as a living bridge to enhance bilateral ties. Despite occasional policy shifts in the US, the foundation for a robust relationship is now firmly established. However, India's engagement with China remains a complex challenge. As the two largest Asian nations with over a billion people each, their dynamic is shaped by historical disputes and differing political systems. The boundary issue, exacerbated by tensions since 2020, continues to complicate bilateral relations. The guiding principles for India's approach to China are mutual respect, sensitivity, and shared interests, with an emphasis on long-term stability and a multi-polar Asia. In the Indo-Pacific, India has extended its Act East policy, fostering deeper relationships with Japan, Australia and ASEAN countries, and strengthening the Quad alliance.

This partnership has progressed in areas such as climate action, maritime security, and digital connectivity. Similarly, India's collaboration with Russia remains a pillar of its foreign policy, with growing economic ties and shared strategic interests. India advocates for diplomacy in addressing global challenges, such as the Ukraine conflict, and seeks to provide solutions to global problems, including food security and climate

It has assisted smaller neighbours during crises, including the 2023 financial support to Sri Lanka, reinforcing its role as a regional leader. However, India's relationship with Pakistan remains strained due to ongoing crossborder terrorism. India is also engaged in strengthening ties with Myanmar and Afghanistan, maintaining its people-to-people connections despite political complexities. India's global ambitions are reflected in its increasing role in international organisations. As a proponent of multilateral reform, India has pushed for changes in the United Nations, advocating for greater representation of the Global South. It also leads initiatives such as the International Solar Alliance and Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure. These efforts highlight India's growing responsibility as a global power, dedicated to addressing pressing issues like climate change, digital governance, and humanitarian crises.

Budget 2025: A roadmap to empower

farmers and reignite rural India



The Budget must go beyond promises—it must deliver feasible solutions to secure livelihoods, strengthen rural demand and bridge the rural-urban divide

inance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman gears up to present the Union Budget 2025-26 on February 1, the nation stands at a pivotal crossroads. With GDP growth projected to dip to a four-year low of 6.4 per cent in FY 2024-25, the spotlight turns to revitalising the rural economy, a cornerstone of the country's consumptiondriven progress.

The urgent call for agricultural reforms has grown louder, fueled by ongoing farmer protests, including the fast-unto-death by 70-year-old farmer leader Jagjit Singh Dallewal at Punjab's Khanauri border, which has captured national attention, demanding a legal guarantee for Minimum Support Price (MSP). Agriculture, which employs nearly 45 per cent of the country's workforce and sustains over 60 per cent of its rural population, is at a breaking point. Stagnant productivity, declining incomes, and policy neglect have left farmers in crisis. This Budget cannot be limited to lofty promises—it must deliver practical solutions to secure livelihoods, strengthen rural demand, and narrow the rural-urban divide. Revitalising agriculture is not just an economic necessity but a moral obligation to foster inclusive growth. Here's how Budget 2025 can introduce transformative measures to bolster the agricultural sector and ensure rural spending—currently contributing 60 per cent of total consumption —fuels India's economic resurgence.

1. Boost Agriculture Budget and

The allocation for agriculture and allied sectors constitutes only 3 per cent of the Union Budget, which needs to be raised to at least 7.5%. Unspent funds in this category should be carried forward to address critical gaps in research, education, and infrastructure for crop storage and processing. Investing in agricultural research institutions to develop climate-resilient crop varieties and sustainable farming techniques can enhance productivity. Encouraging public-private partnerships in agrarian innovation can further drive

the sector's growth.

2. Provide Legal Backing to MSP

The persistent demand for Minimum Support Price (MSP) with legal guarantees highlights the sector's vulnerabilities. Implementing the MS Swaminathan Commission's recommendation of setting MSP at C2 (comprehensive cost of production) +50 per cent and granting it legal status can ensure private buyers do not exploit farmers. This reform would not put a significant financial strain on the government but could protect farmers from distress sales. Furthermore, creating a robust monitoring mechanism to enforce MSP and extending its coverage to more crops can improve farmers' incomes. Enhancing the transparency of procurement processes through digital platforms and integrating MSP enforcement with local market committees can also make the system more

3. Enhance PM-KISAN Support

The Rs 6,000 annual support to around 10 crore small and marginal farmers under NEEDED FINANCIAL PM-KISAN to help meet their working capital needs, unchanged since its launch in 2018, has not kept pace with inflation. However, with inflation averaging 6 per cent over the past six years. The government should consider doubling this support to Rs 12,000 annually to address farmers' growing financial needs. This increase could significantly impact

small-marginal farmers, who struggle to meet their expenses amid rising input costs for seeds, fertilisers, and irrigation.

4. Transform the Kisan Credit Card (KCC)

The KCC scheme provides shortterm loans with an interest subsidy for up to Rs 3 lakh. However, the rigid repayment schedule often forces farmers to rely on private moneylenders to meet short-term cash requirements.

A more farmer-friendly approach would be to convert KCCs into running overdraft accounts, increase the credit limit to Rs 10 ROBUST lakh, and cap interest rates at 4 per cent. Removing usage restrictions on loans would further empower farmers to make long-term agricultural investments. Additionally, simplifying the KCC application process and enhancing awareness CONTRIBUTORY through rural outreach programs PENSION OF can improve access to credit. Expanding the scheme to include RS3,000 PER sharecroppers, tenant farmers, and farm labourers can promote MONTH FOR financial inclusion in agriculture.

SMALL AND 5. Introduce a Pension Scheme

SMALL AND for Small Farmers India's farmers lack a robust social MARGINAL security net. A non-contributory FARMERS AGED 60 pension of Rs3,000 per month for small and marginal farmers aged AND ABOVE, 60 and above, owning up to 2 hectares of land, could provide OWNING UP TO 2 much-needed financial security. HECTARES OF Contributions from state governments could further augment this LAND, COULD scheme. Implementing such a pension system can alleviate poverty among elderly farmers and reduce their dependence on fam-

ily support. 6. Strengthen Animal Husbandry and Dairy Sectors:

Livestock contributes over 25 per cent to agricultural GDP but suffers from fluctuating milk prices and restrictive cattle rearing and

A simple yet impactful step would

be legally mandating private dairies to match or exceed the milk procurement prices set by cooperatives like Amul. Additionally, incorporating milk and eggs into the mid-day meal scheme can improve farm incomes while tackling malnutrition among children. Promoting cattle insurance schemes and increasing budgetary allocation for veterinary services can enhance livestock productivity. Encouraging the adoption of modern technologies like artificial insemination and genetic improvement can further boost the sector's

contribution to rural livelihoods.

7. Reform Fertiliser Subsidy The current system treats fertilis-

er subsidies as farmer benefits but deducts the subsidised amount while calculating MSP. This practice lowers farmers' actual remuneration. MSP calculations should instead consider the market price of inputs, ensuring fairer returns for farmers. The government could also promote balanced fertiliser use by incentivising organic farming practices and providing subsidies for bio-fertilisers. A shift towards a direct benefit transfer system for fertiliser subsidies can reduce leakages and ensure benefits reach the intended beneficiaries.

8. Simplify Crop Insurance

The PM Fasal Bima Yojana requires farmers to navigate complex procedures to claim compensation. The government should shoulder the entire premium initially, including the state's share, and simplify the claim process. This would reduce the administrative burden on farmers while ensuring timely compensation for crop losses.

Leveraging technology like satellite imagery and AI-driven risk assessment models can streamline the verification process and minimise disputes. Expanding insurance coverage to include post-har-

vest losses and natural calamities can make the scheme more comprehensive and farmer-friendly. 2. Reassess Inflation Control **Policies**

Policies like export bans, stock limits on agricultural produce, and the Food Corporation of India (FCI) dumping grains at below-market prices undermine farmers' proftability. These interventions should be re-evaluated to balance inflation control with fair returns for farmers. Encouraging exports of surplus produce and ensuring better storage infrastructure can reduce post-harvest losses. Developing a decentralised agricultural pricing system driven by real-time market data can align domestic policies with global demand trends. A Vision for Fairness and Growth India's agricultural sector has long been the backbone of its economy, yet farmers have faced systemic neglect and economic disparity.

Over the last decade, the government has written off Rs12.30 lakt crore in big corporate loans, while farmers continue to struggle under mounting debt (Rs 18 lakh crore) and policies that fail to guarantee fair prices for their produce. The 2025 Budget presents an opportunity to correct these imbalances. By addressing these critical issues, the government can improve farmers' lives, spur rural demand, catalyse GDP growth and lay the foundation for a more equitable and sustainable agricultural future. It's time to honour the farmers who feed the nation by delivering the support they deserve.

Trump threatens Russia with tariffs, sanctions

US President Donald Trump has warned his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin to end the 'ridiculous war' in Ukraine or face high tariffs and further sanctions. Trump, who was sworn in as the 47th President of the United States on January 20, said this on Truth Social on Wednesday, a social media platform owned by him.

Trump called out Russian President Putin by name in the social media post, arguing that he always had a good relationship with the leader, but that it was time to settle "this ridiculous War!

Asserting that he is looking to hurt Russia, Trump said he wants no more lives to be lost in the war.

"Let's get this war, which never would have started if I were President, over with! We can do it the easy way, or the hard way - and the easy way is always better. It's time to "MAKE A DEAL." NO MORE LIVES SHOULD BE LOST!!!" Trump said.

"I love the Russian people, and always had a very good relationship with President Putin - and this despite the Radical Left's Russia, Russia, Russia HOAX. We must never forget

that Russia helped us win the Second World War, losing almost 60,000,000 lives in the

process," he said. He also warned that if there was not a ceasefire deal soon, he would "have no other choice" but to impose tariffs, taxes and sanctions on "anything being sold by Russia to the United States, and various other participating countries." "All of that being said, I'm going to do Russia, whose Economy is failing, and President Putin, a very big FAVOUR. Settle now, and STOP this ridiculous War! IT'S ONLY GOING TO GET WORSE. "It sounds likely," Trump told reporters when asked if the US will impose additional sanctions on Russia if Putin doesn't come to the negotiation

Trump also said that Ukraine's President Zelensky told him that he would like to have He's told me that he wants to

have peace very strongly, but it takes two to tango. We'll see what happens. Anytime they want, I'll meet. I'd like to see that end. Millions of people are being killed. It's a vicious situation," he said

House passes immigrant detention bill

The Republican-led House on Wednesday gave its final approval to a bill that requires the detainment of unauthorised immigrants accused of theft and violent crimes, marking the first legislation that US President Donald Trump can sign as Congress, with some bipartisan support, swiftly moved in line with his plans to crackdown on illegal immigra-

Passage of the Laken Riley Act, named after a Georgia nursing student who was murdered last year by a Venezuelan man, shows just how sharply the political debate over immigration has shifted to the right following Trump's election vic-

Immigration policy has often been one of the most entrenched issues in Congress, but a crucial faction of 46 politically vulnerable Democrats joined with Republicans to lift the strict proposal to passage on a 263-

156 vote tally

"For decades, it has been almost impossible for our government to agree on solutions for the problems at our border and within our country," Senator Katie Britt, an Alabama Republican, said.

She called the legislation "perhaps the most significant immigration enforcement bill" to be passed by Congress in nearly three decades. Still, the bill would require a

massive ramp-up in US Immigration and Customs Enforcement's capabilities, but it does not include any new funding. Meanwhile, the new president

has launched a slew of executive orders intended to seal off the border of Mexico to immigration and ultimately deport millions of immigrants without permanent legal status in the

On Wednesday, Trump also cancelled refugee resettlement while his administration signalled intentions to prosecute local law enforcement officials who do not enforce his new immigration policies.

Republican congressional leaders have made it clear they intend to follow suit, though their toughest challenge will be finding a way to approve the funding to actually implement

Trump's hard-line plans.

What he's doing is kick-starting what will ultimately be our legislative agenda," said House Speaker Mike Johnson. House Republicans initially passed the legislation last year with support from 37 Democrats in a move that was intended to deliver a political rebuke to then-President Joe Biden's handling of the southern border.

It then languished in the Democratic-controlled Senate. This year, Republicans, now with control of both congressional chambers, have made it their top priority. When it came before the Senate, 12 Democrats voted in favour of passage, and when the House voted on a version of the bill earlier this month, 48

Democrats supported it. The vast majority of US adults favour deporting immigrants convicted of violent crimes, according to a recent survey by The Associated Press-NORC Center for Public Affairs Research.

However, only about 37 per cent of US adults are in favour of deporting immigrants who have not been convicted of a

crime. "While the bill is not perfect, it sends a clear message that we think that criminals should be deported," said Rep Tom Suozzi, a New York Democrat who has called on his party to support tougher immigration enforcement.

Under the legislation, federal authorities would be required to detain any migrant arrested or charged with crimes like shoplifting.

The scope of the proposal was widened in the Senate to also include those accused of assaulting a police officer or crimes that injure or kill some-The bill also gives legal stand-

ing to state attorneys general to sue the federal government for harm caused by federal immigration decisions.

That gives states new power in setting immigration policy when they have already been trying to push back against presidential decisions under both the Trump and Biden administrations.

Democrats unsuccessfully pushed to have that provision stripped from the bill in the Senate, saying it would inject even more uncertainty and partisanship into immigration

policy. Ultimately, even the Trump administration is likely to

struggle to implement the new requirements unless Congress follows up later this year with funding.
Republicans are currently

strategising how to push their priorities through Congress through a party-line process known as budget reconciliation. They have put the cost of funding Trump's border and deportation priorities at roughly USD 100 billion.

Trump has "laid out the largest domestic logistical undertaking of our lifetimes — that being the deportation of the vast majority of illegal aliens present in the United States", Ken Cuccinelli, who directed US Citizenship and Immigration Services during Trump's first presidency, recently told a Senate panel.

Cuccinelli said it would require a surge of immigration judges, prosecutors and other staff, but Trump has also paved the way to use military troops, bases and other resources to carry out the mass deporta-

Bid to block Trump's cancellation of birthright citizenship in federal court

Washington (PTI): A federal judge in Seattle is set to hear the first arguments on Thursday in a multi-state lawsuit seeking to block President Donald Trump's executive order ending the constitutional guarantee of birthright citizenship regardless of the parents' immigration

US District Judge John Coughenour scheduled the ses-sion to consider the request from Arizona, Illinois, Oregon and Washington. The case is one of five lawsuits being brought by 22 states and a number of immigrants rights groups across the country. The suits include personal testimonies from attorneys general who are US citizens by birthright, and names pregnant women who are afraid their children won't become US cit-

The order, signed by Trump on Inauguration Day, is slated to take effect on February 19. It could impact hundreds of of the United States and of the

thousands of people born in the country, according to one of the lawsuits. In 2022, there were about 255,000 births of citizen children to mothers living in the country illegally and about 153.000 births to two such parents, according to the fourstate suit filed in Seattle. The US is among about 30 countries where birthright citizenship

 the principle of jus soli or "right of the soil" — is applied. Most are in the Americas, and Canada and Mexico are among them. The lawsuits argue that the 14th Amendment to the US Constitution guarantees citizenship for people born and naturalised in the US, and states have been interpreting the amendment that way for a

Ratified in 1868 in the aftermath of the Civil War, the amendment says: "All persons born or naturalised in the United States and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens

State wherein they reside.' Trump's order asserts that the children of noncitizens are not subject to the jurisdiction of the United States, and orders fed eral agencies to not recognise citizenship for children who don't have at least one parent who is a citizen

A key case involving birthright citizenship unfolded in 1898. The Supreme Court held that Wong Kim Ark, who was born in San Francisco to Chinese immigrants, was a US citizen because he was born in the country. After a trip abroad, he faced being denied reentry by the federal government on the grounds that he wasn't a citizen under the Chinese Exclusion Act. But some advocates of immigration restrictions have argued that case clearly applied to children born to parents who were both legal immigrants. They say it's less clear whether it applies to children born to parents living in the country

illegally.

Thousands line up for whiff of flower smelling like gym socks

The rare unfurling of an **▲** endangered plant that emits the smell of decaying flesh drew hundreds of devoted fans to a greenhouse in Sydney on Thursday where they joined three-hour lines to experience a momentous bloom -- and a fragrance evoking gym socks

and rotting garbage.
Tall, pointed and smelly, the corpse flower is scientifically known as amorphophallus titanum — or bunga bangkai in Indonesia, where the plants are found in the Sumatran rainfor-

But to fans of this specimen, she's Putricia — a portmanteau of "putrid" and "Patricia" eagerly adopted by her followers who, naturally, call themselves

Putricians. For a week, she has graced a stately and gothic display in front of a purple curtain and wreathed in mist from a humidifier at the Royal Sydney Botanic Garden.

Her rise to fame since has been rapid, with up to 20,000 admirers filing past for a moment in her increasingly pungent presence. No corpse flower has bloomed at the garden for 15 years.

"The fact that they open very rarely, so they flower rarely, is obviously something that puts them at a little bit of a disadvantage in the wild," said garden spokesperson Sophie Daniel, who designed Putricia's kooky and funereal display. When they open, they have to hope that another flower is self-pollinate."

There are thought to be only 300 of the plants in the wild and fewer than 1,000 worldwide — including those in cultivation. Among them is Putricia, which arrived at the garden seven years ago. When her flower was spotted

in December she was just 25 centimeters (10 inches) high. By Thursday, she was 1.6 metres (5 feet 3 inches) tall -and her flower spike was slowly opening like a pleated skirt around a majestic central tuber, the yellow-green outer curling to reveal a burgundy centre. As excitement grew in Sydney about the moment of her bloom, garden staff erected crowd barriers, giving the Victorian greenhouse the air of open nearby, because they can't a rock concert. Fans trod a red

carpet to view Putricia from behind velvet ropes in a display inspired by Queen Victoria's funeral, the Rocky Horror Picture Show and the oeuvre of the late director David Lynch. Inside, fans took selfies and leaned in for a sniff - an increasingly perilous prospect as Putricia's odor developed. One young woman raised her hands and bowed as though in worship. On social media, garden staff performed a viral dance to Chappell Roan's summer hit HOT TO GO! against a backdrop of the stately plant. It was difficult to say why the regal, mysterious and stinky

'Russian victory in Ukraine will hurt NATO's credibility'

NATO Secretary-General Mark Rutte warned on Thursday that a Russian victory over Ukraine would undermine the dissuasive force of the world's biggest military alliance and that its credibility could cost trillions to restore

NATO has been ramping up its forces along its eastern flank with Russia, Belarus and Ukraine, deploying thousands of troops and equipment to deter Moscow from expanding its war into the territory of any of the organisation's 32 member countries. "If Ukraine loses then to restore the deterrence of the rest of NATO again, it will be a much, much higher price than what we are contemplating at this moment in terms of ramping up our spending and ramping up our industrial production," Rutte said. "It will not be billions extra; it will be trillions extra," he said, on the sidelines of the World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland.

Rutte insisted that Ukraine's Western backers must "step up and not scale back the support" they are providing to the



We have to change the trajectory of the war," Rutte said, adding that the West "cannot allow in the 21st century that one country invades another country and tries to colonise it". "We are beyond those days," he said.

Anxiety in Europe is mounting that US President Donald Trump might seek to quickly end the war in talks with Russian President Vladimir Putin on terms that are unfavourable to Ukraine, but Rutte appeared wary about trying to do things in a hurry. "If we got a bad deal, it would only mean that we will see the president of Russia high-fiving with the leaders from North Korea, Iran and China and we cannot accept that," the former

Dutch prime minister said. 'That would be geopolitically a big, big mistake.

Polish Foreign Minister Radek Sikorski welcomed Trump's acknowledgement that it must be Russia which should make the first peace moves, but he cautioned that "this is not the Putin that President Trump knew in his first term".

On Wednesday, Trump threatened to impose stiff taxes, tariffs and sanctions on Moscow if an agreement isn't reached to end the war, but that warning will probably fall on deaf ears in the Kremlin. Russia's economy is already weighed down by a multitude of US and European sanctions.

Sikorksi warned that Putin should not be put at the centre of the world stage over Ukraine. "The president of the United States is the leader of the free world. Vladimir Putin is an outcast and an indicted war criminal for stealing Ukrainian children," Sikorski said. "I would suggest that Putin has to earn the summit that if he gets it early, it elevates him beyond his, significance and gives him the wrong idea about the trajectory of this," he

Growing geo-economic fragmentation can decrease global GDP: WEF report

Growing geo-economic fragmentation can decrease global GDP by up to \$5.7 trillion, giving it a bigger blow than the financial crisis of 2008 or the COVID-19 rowing geo-economic pandemic, a new showed on Thursday.

other India and some emerging economies can bear the biggest burden in the most extreme fragmentation scenario, it cautioned.

Countries are increasingly using the global financial and trading systems to advance geopolitical objectives through sanctions, industrial policies, and other economic measures, the World Economic Forum said while releasing the report here during its Annual Meeting 2025.
The Navigating

Financial System Fragmentation estimated that fragmentation resulting from statecraft policies could cost the global economy \$0.6 trillion to \$5.7 trillion – up to 5 per cent of global GDP – due to reduced trade and cross-border capital flows as well as lost economic



It could also increase global inflation by more than 5 per cent in a very high fragmentation scenario, it added. The report, developed in collaboration with Oliver Wyman, showed that the economic impact of rising geo-economic fragmentation could surpass the disruptions caused by the 2008 financial crisis or the COVID-19

Among BSE sectoral indices, Consumer Durables rose the most by 1.95 per cent, Commodities by 1.86 per cent, Focused IT by 1.79 per cent, Information Technology by 1.51 per cent, Services 1.42 per cent and Consumer Discretionary and Healthcare went up 1.28 per cent each. On the other hand, Energy, Bankex and Oil & Gas were

the only laggards. Overall, the market breadth was positive as 2,119 stocks while 1,842 advanced declined and 106 remained unchanged on the BSE.

Significant progress in talks | Budget should announce tax on India-EU FTA: Official

is a significant ress in the negotiations for the proposed free trade agreement (FTA) between India and European Union (EU), an official said on Thursday.

Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal was in Brussels last week to meet European Commissioner for Trade Maros Sefcovic to take stock of the progress of the negotiations.

"Good progress is there on India-EU FTA. There is a significant progress in talks," the official said, without divulging more details.

During the meeting between Goyal and Sefcovic, the two sides agreed to build a commercially meaningful trade agenda and work towards a mutually beneficial trade pact. The two leaders have also

outlined political directions for both the teams to develop a mutually beneficial agenda for and robust FTA in an expedited manner to meet global challenges. The meeting came ahead of the



10th round of talks between India and the EU, which is scheduled from March 10-14 in Brussels In the ninth round, both sides

discussed trade issues covering goods, services, investment and government procurement along with necessary rules such as rules of origin, SPS (sanitary and phytosanitary), and technical barriers to trade In June 2022, India and the 27nation EU bloc resumed the negotiations after a gap of over eight years. It was stalled in 2013 due to differences over several issues.

The total trade stood at \$180 billion in 2023-24. India exported \$75.18 billion in ls and \$31.13 billion services to the EU, while the EU exported \$63.44 billion in goods and \$31.35 billion in services to India.

cuts for individuals: Barclays

The government in FY26 Budget should announce an "effective" personal income tax cut to support consumption and demand, Barclays said on Thursday. In its FY25-26 Union Budget preview, Barclays said the key ask from the Budget, to be presented on February 1, is to support growth adhering consolidation path.

Chief Barclays, India Economist, Aastha Gudwani said in a quest to support consumption, the finance minister should provide an effective personal income tax rate cut by further tweaking the tax slabs. This is unlikely to have a sizable fiscal cost.

"That said, improved tax buoyancy will likely make up for revenue foregone under this announcement. We think a boost to consumption is needed, especially with private investment also now awaiting the increase in demand

Barclays Finance expects Minister Nirmala Sitharaman to announce changes to the new tax regime, making it



lucrative for more and more taxpayers.

In the last Budget, the government had increased standard deduction for salaried taxpayer to ₹75,000, and deduction on family pension for pensioners to Rs 25,000 under the new tax regime, which offers lower rate of taxes.

The new tax regime exempts income up to ₹3 lakh. Those earning annually between ₹3-7 lakh pay 5 per cent tax, Rs 7-10 lakĥ (10 per cent), ₹10-12 lakh (15 per cent), ₹12-15 lakh (20 per cent) and above ₹15 lakh (30 per cent).

Barclays said another potential option to boost disposable income and purchasing power could be a reduction in excise duty for fuel.

Retail prices for fuel have remained almost constant

since 2022 despite lower global crude prices. Barclays said customs duty announcements in Budget will be pivotal to understand government's response to tariffs under Trump 2.0. Given the uncertainty that

Trump 2.0 brings along with, slower global trade and a fragmented world order is a reality India needs to prepare for. "We thus expect multiple tweaks in customs duty structure, especially on items where dumping concerns from China are rising (eg, steel, glass, basic metals). We expect a modest increase in customs duty collections in FY25-26 FY24-25, Gudwani said.

Barclays expects government to overachieve the fiscal deficit target for current fiscal by 20 basis points, at 4.7 per cent of GDP and 2025-26 deficit to be pegged at 4.5 per cent of GDP or about ₹16.3 lakh crore.

Barclays said it awaits the debt consolidation roadmap from when the finance minister sees general government debt-to-GDP fall to the 60 per cent

BPCL Director (Finance) Vetsa Ramakrishna Gupta told in an analyst call on Thursday that Russian oil had been booked for January and February in the previous two months but for March "we are not getting sufficient cargoes".

The company saw Russian oil in the overall basket of crude oil it processes into fuels like petrol and diesel, falling to 20 per cent in March from 31 per cent in the October-December quarter, he said. Russian oil made up for 34-35 per cent of all oil that BPCL processed at the start of the current financial year

in April 2024.



'Becoming the Storm' Stands Witness to India's Tryst with Modernity, writes **DEEPAK KUMAR JHA**

t the age of 86 years, veteran journalist Rami Chhabra made a debut in novel writing with her book 'Becoming the Storm'. She had been India's one of the first few women journalists who broke the glass ceiling to straddle the media space in the national capital. *Chhabra* had also been a prominent face in women's movements. She also led South Asian women's movements. Her reports also formed the basis for some of the measures of government empowerment of women. Having spent decades in the women's movements in South Asia, Chhabra aptly has given centre stage to a woman's tryst

with modernity. With Indu as

the protagonist of the novel, Chhabra takes readers on a

journey that saw women of Índia battling conflicts of traditions with modernity. Chhabra headed an NGO Streebal which worked against early marriages and dowry. In the 1970s, several women organisations had come together to fight against dowry. Her campaigns for empowerment of women find resonance in her fictional accounts of the conflicts between modernity and tradition. Importantly, Chhabra's accounts of Indu's fight for identity are set in the backdrop of India also gaining strength in the early years since Independence. Yet, the backdrop to Indu's tales is also set by India's three wars in quick succession - 1962 with China, 1965 with Pakistan, and the 1971 War of Independence of Bangladesh. Chhabra takes readers through the sombre mood in Delhi in the wake of the All India radio breaking the news



"Of the 1,000 supporters who have nevertheless planned to travel without a stadium that some will try to force their way into the stadium," it said. Later Wednesday, Feyenoord's match against Bayern Munich was stopped for seven minutes after kickoff because of poor visibility from clouds of smoke after fans lit flares and fireworks behind one of the

In May 2022, there were violent clashes in France between Marseille and Fevenoord fans outside the Stade Velodrome stadium before the return leg of their Europa Conference League semifinal.

this season that have rocked his team's campaign. The biggest of those is Rodri, the Spain midfielder

and Ballon d'Or winner who is out for the season with an ACL injury City also has been hit with injury issues at centre back,

with Ruben Dias, John Stones and Nathan Ake all having time out of action. That explains the moves for Khusanov and Reis, who Guardiola says are ready to come into the team immediately if required. Not only is City struggling in the Champions League,

the team is in fifth place in its Premier League title defense - 12 points behind leader Liverpool having played one game more.

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
