Modi 3.0 Budget session begins; **Kumbh tragedy, Waqf on agenda**

pposition parties at the all-party meeting on Thursday called for a discussion in Parliament on the Maha Kumbh tragedy and the UP government's alleged focus on VIPs rather than the common pilgrims, as Union minister Kiren Rijiju asserted that the Business Advisory Committee will decide on the agenda of the Budget Session starting from January 31.

The Session will commence with President Droupadi Murmu addressing the joint sitting of Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha. The Union Budget will be presented on February 1. The first part of the session will conclude on February 13 and the second part will start on March 10. The session will conclude on April 4. The Session's legislative agenda has 16 bills, including the Waqf (Amendment) Bill and the Immigration and Foreigners Bill.

In the same all party meet BJP's allies in NDA Janata Dal (United) sought an extension in the tenure of the Joint Parliamentary Committee scrutinising the bills proposing simultaneous elections, while its another partner, LJP (Ram Vilas), demanded a "special industrial package"

for Bihar.

Rijiju described the meeting chaired by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh as constructive and sought cooperation from opposition parties, adding that the customary discussions on the President's address to parliamentarians and the Union Budget are the main priorities in the Budget Session. "Rising" unemployment and farmers' "plight" will also be raised during the Session, several opposition leaders said.

At the all-party meeting, sources said, JD(U) leader Sanjay Jha called for an extension in the tenure of the JPC, which was asked to submit its report by the first day of the last week of the Budget Session.

Jha is a member of the 39-member committee formed to discuss what is often referred to as a One-Nation, One-Election (ONOE) proposal. The panel headed by BJP MP P P Chaudhary is scheduled to hold its second meeting on

Jha also wanted Parliament to discuss India's current position in Artificial Intelligence as he pointed out the waves that the Chinese upstart DeepSeek has created in the field, so far dominated by US firms.

EC raids Punjab CM Delhi home

The Election Commission (EC) on Thursday Thursday conducted a search at the Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann's Kapurthala House residence in the national Capital regarding a complaint about 'cash' being distributed from there ahead of the Delhi assembly elections.

This comes a day after Delhi Police registered a case after a vehicle labelled "Punjab government" was intercepted near Punjab Bhawan with liquor and AAP ohlets. "The vehicle cash. pamphlets. bearing a Punjab number plate was caught by the Flying Squad team in the New Delhi district," the official said on Wednesday. The Flying Squad attends to all Model Code of Conduct (MCC) violations house, while not taking any and all complaints related to action against BJP for openly liquor, arms and cash used for distributing money.

An official outside Kapurthala House told the media that a complaint was received regarding 'cash' being regarding 'cash' being distributed from there. "The team was awaiting permission to conduct the search," he added.

EC ask Kejriwal to name Yamuna poison; **AAP says CEC securing retirement job**

Dissatisfied with AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal's reply on mixing poison in the Election Commission on Thursday sought another detailed response from him, saying his remarks prima facie appeared to promote disharmony and enmity between different groups. The Commission has said Kejriwal's responses have been "completely silent" in substantiating his claim of Haryana "poisoning" the Yamuna river. The EC asked Keiriwal what kind of poison was mixed by Haryana, what was the supporting evidence about the quantity, nature and manner of detecting poison and the location where and the method of detection of the poison.

În a sharp response to EC's directives for seeking factual evidence by 11 am on Friday to substantiate his claim of the Yamuna water being "poisoned" by the Haryana government, AAP chief said Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Rajiv Kumar is acting as the BJP stooge. Accusing him of seeking a post-retirement job. Kejriwal said he would send

to Kumar and his Election Commissioners and challenged him to drink the water. Addressing a press conference, Kejriwal alleged that Kumar had "destroyed" the credibility of the Election Commission (EC) and was eyeing a post-retirement position.

The language he has used is Election not the Commission's job. He should contest the election from any seat in Delhi. We will send three bottles to Rajiv Kumar as well. I know they will arrest me in three days, let them do so, I am not afraid," he said. Kejriwal's remarks came hours after the Election Commission shot off another letter to the AAP chief, in which it has stated that

India prepares to take on ChatGPT, Deepseek

Tndia on Thursday outlined Iglobal AI ambitions with plans to build its own foundational model that could take on the might of ChatGPT, Deepseek R1 and others, as it lined up "most affordable" common compute facility powered by 18,693 GPUs to be used by startups and researchers.

India's bold move comes at a time when Chinese company DeepSeek has turned heads after its AI model overtook ChatGPT as the top-ranked free app on Apple's appstore, challenging the AI dominance concentrated so far with the US firms, particularly Silicon Valley frontrunner Open AI. IT Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw exuded confidence that India will build a foundational

model that is world-class, and that it will be able to compete with best models across the globe. The government announced the next steps in its AI blueprint, among them, 18,693 Graphics Processing Unit or GPUs on offer by the empanelled bidders (a list that includes Jio Platforms, CMS Computers, Tata Communications,

E2E Networks, Yotta Data Services, and others), and start of AI safety institution, with 8

projects approved under it. The government is also calling for proposals to develop India's own foundational models that would be aligned to Indian context, Indian languages, culture, basically where datasets are "for our country, of our country and for our citizens" and "biases are removed".

Woman pleads DNA for missing 'monk' husband

m fans}$ on Thursday thronged Arun Jaitley Stadium here to catch a glimpse of their hero leading to chaos for a brief while outside the stadium. He returned to play for the first time the Ranji Trophy after 12 years. The first day Delhi-Railways match saw fans lining outside the stadium from early morning. There was a brief rush and jostling outside the stadium as spectators tried to make their way inside. No one was injured in the incident, police said. Initially, only one gate was open for entry and people started pushing each other to get inside

the stadium, a Delhi Police statement said. "Additional gates were soon opened, easing the situation. No injuries were reported, and the situation is now under control," it said. The 'Gautam Gambhir Stand' was already

packed and it hardly took time to fill the lower tier of the 'Bishan Bedi Stand', taking the crowd count well past 12,000 at toss. The deafening roars of "Kohli, Kohli" could be heard from a distance as the former India captain took the field with the rest of the Delhi

Outside Gate 16, the crowd was involved in pushing each other, which led to a couple of fans falling near the entry gate and getting injured. A police bike was damaged and several left behind their shoes. At least three people got injured in the chaos, reports said. The injured fans were treated by the Delhi and District Cricket Association(DDCA) security and police near the gate. One of the fans also needed a bandage on the leg. A security guard was also injured while trying to get the situation under control.

The Kumbh Mela, often associated with stories of lost families, has taken an unusual turn. A Jharkhand family believes they have found their long-lost relative, but there's a twist-the man they claim is Gangasagar Yadav, who went missing 27 years ago, now lives as an Aghori monk and refuses to recognize them.

Gangasagar disappeared in 1998 after a trip to Patna, leaving behind his wife, Dhanwa Devi, and their two young sons. Over the years, the family had given up hope of ever finding him. But fate intervened when a relative attending the Kumbh Mela in

resembling Gangasagar and sent a photograph home. Murli Yadav, Gangasagar's younger brother, along with Dhanwa Devi and her sons, rushed to Prayagraj to confront the monk-now known as Baba Rajkumar. However, he denied any connection to his past life. The

monk, accompanied by a

Sadhvi, claimed he was from Varanasi and dismissed the family's claims.

The family, however, remains firm. They pointed out his distinct long teeth, a forehead injury, and a scar on his knee as proof of his identity. Determined to get answers, they have sought police intervention and demanded a

"It is generally said, Kumbh mein bichhde kabhi nahi milte (those who get lost at the Kumbh never reunite), but here the case is different. Kumbh has united the family, but the problem is, the monk is yet to recognize his family,"

said Murli Yadav. The family has decided to wait until the end of the Kumbh Mela. If necessary, they will insist on a DNA test. "If the results prove we are wrong, we will apologize," Murli added. For now, some family members have returned home, while others continue to watch over Baba Rajkumar and his companion, hoping for a moment of recognitionor a scientific resolution-to finally bring closure to a decades-old mystery.

Passenger jet collides with Army helicopter in US

ARLINGTON:

American Airlines carrying 60 passengers and four crew members collided with an Army helicopter while landing at Ronald Reagan National Airport near Washington, prompting a large search-and-rescue operation in the nearby Potomac River. There were multiple fatalities, according to a person familiar with the matter, but the precise number of victims was unclear as rescue crews hunted for any survivors. Three soldiers were onboard the helicopter, an Army official said.

Lucknow (PNS): CSIR-Central Institute of Medicinal and Aromatic Plants (CSIR-CIMAP) brought together farmers from various states for the inaugural session of the two-day Kisan Mela, which kicked off here on

Thursday. CIMAP Director Dr Prabodh Kumar Trivedi welcomed the participants, highlighting that this year's event focuses on sustainable agriculture. He noted that the Kisan Mela, which started 20 years ago, aims to promote the species developed by

CIMAP among the public.
Dr Trivedi shared that CIMAP has worked on medicinal and aromatic plants for over 60 years, developing 160 improved species critical to farming, which have been eagerly adopted by farmers. He emphasised that the Kisan Mela creates a link between farmers and traders, facilitating the sale of highfacilitating the sale of high-quality produce to industries. He pointed out that by adopting CIMAP's peppermint (Mentha piperita) species, India has become a leading exporter of mint. This year, 500 quintals of Mentha plant material (sucker) is being distributed to high-yielding farmers from Lucknow. yielding farmers from Lucknow. He also mentioned the Aroma Mission, run by CIMAP and its laboratories, which has formed over 3,500 farmer clusters, including 20 tribal clusters, to boost self-reliance.

Director of the Horticulture and Food Processing Department, Dr Vijay Bahadur Dwivedi, who was a special guest, addressed the farmers, encouraging them to plant hor-ticultural crops, for which the state government provides financial assistance. He also asked them to form Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs). He also advocated for producing value-added products from farm produce.

Advisor to the Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh and former Drug Controller General, Dr GN Singh, praised CIMAP's role in helping farmers increase their income and improve their livelihoods through medicinal and aromatic plants.

Kisan Mela | Printing press worker found hanging, kin allege murder

 $A^{\mathrm{man}\ \mathrm{working}\ \mathrm{at}\ \mathrm{a}\ \mathrm{printing}}_{\mathrm{press}\ \mathrm{in}\ \mathrm{Krishna}\ \mathrm{Nagar}}$ was found hanging from the grill of the establishment's gate on Wednesday night, triggering a strong protest from his family and local residents. They alleged that he was murdered and then hanged to make it appear as a suicide. To control the situation, a heavy police force from Krishna Nagar and Manak Nagar was deployed. After hours of tension, the police managed to pacify the angry crowd, who eventually cleared the road.

The deceased, Satyaprakash Yadav, a resident of Lalakheda in Alinagar Sunhara under Krishna Nagar Police Station, worked at a printing press in

Manak Nagar. He was rushed to Lok Bandhu Hospital, where doctors declared him dead.

On Thursday, his family placed the body on Krishna Nagar road near Indralok Colony, demanding justice. They claimed he had been murdered before being hanged and staged a protest, prompting a swift response from the local police.

Following a written complaint by Satyaprakash's brother, Shanti Prakash, police registered a case under relevant sections of the BNS.

The body is being cremated by the family, and there is no law and order issue at the site,"

a police spokesperson said. Meanwhile, a youth was allegedly held hostage and

beaten up in the Banthra area, police said. A case has been registered based on a complaint by the victim, Mohit Yaday, a resident of Makka Kheda under Ajgain Police Station in Unnao district.

According to Mohit, he had come to Banthra market on January 28 afternoon to buy tractor spare parts when Ravi Yadav, a resident of Vishnu Nagar Gauri in Sarojininagar, along with five accomplices, forcibly dragged him into a car

and sped away.
The accused allegedly tied
Mohit's hands and legs, stuffed
a cloth in his mouth, and beat him up. The accused allegedly demanded that he disclose the whereabouts of a girl who had eloped and married Mohit's maternal uncle's son. They threatened to kill him if he did not provide the infor-

mation. After 15 hours of captivity and torture, the accused abandoned Mohit near Qasim Kheda forest at around 6:30 am on January 29 before flee-

Before releasing him, they allegedly recorded a video while brandishing weapons, seemingly to cover up the incident. The accused also threatened Mohit, warning that if the girl did not return, his other relatives would also face similar consequences. The accused are currently on

After a holy dip in the Prayagraj Maha Kumbh on Mauni Amavasya, a sea of devotees has started arriving in Ayodhya and the trend continued uninterrupted on Thursday afternoon.

The streets of this sacred city were packed overnight, and as dawn broke, the air resonated with chants of 'Jai Shri Ram'. Experts estimate that approximately 65 lakh devo-tees have reached Ayodhya in 96 hours.

With the swelling crowd, senior officials took over command and personally inspected the arrangements through-out the night. Many pilgrims, carrying bundles on their heads and devotion in their hearts, have made their way directly from Prayagraj to Avodhva.

The ritual bathing commenced on the banks of the Saryu river from 4 am, followed by pilgrimages to Hanuman Garhi and the Ram temple. There was a sea of piltemple. An employee of an e-commerce company has been arrested from Rajasthan for cheating people out of Rs 1 crore, police said here on

The accused had manipulated the orders using the company system and sold 149 expensive mobile phones in Nepal and other places through a broker, police said.

According to reports, Vikas Ahlawat, an employee of a company handling e-commerce goods distribution, had filed a complaint at the cyber police station. He alleged that the fraudster had cheated him out of Rs 1 crore through the e-commerce vendor company.

Preliminary investigations revealed that the employee, Rahul Jonwal, used the company system to order expensive mobile phones from acquaintances.

After this, he cancelled the orders and embezzled lakhs of rupees. Inspector Brijesh Yadav arrested Rahul from Aimer, Rajasthan. Police are looking for Sheikh Abdul Kader Jilani, a resident of Kurnool, Andhra Pradesh, and Tasrun Nazreen, a resident of South 24 Parganas, Tiljala, West

During the investigation, it was found that Rahul was working as a customer support executive for the vendor company under a work-from-home

The company had provided two portals for work. Customers used to call these portals for customer support. In these portals, customers could view their order history, payment details, product returns, and cancellation information, and through these, customer issues were resolved.

The second portal was the e console, which contained delivery information. There was an option for RTO (Return to Origin) in the dashboard of this portal, and through this, an order could be cancelled.

The accused set up some customers and got them to place orders. He then manipulated the e-commerce company's console software.

"By misusing the e-cart console, Rahul, along with his associates, placed orders from different Flipkart accounts between June and August 2024. On the day the ordered product was to be delivered, the RTO status would be marked on the e-cart console using the order ID. It would take 24 hours for the RTO status to be

updated," the police said.

The police added that due to refund requests, the money for the product was refunded even though the product had already been delivered. In this way, Rahul ordered 149 iPhones, Samsung premium phones, tablets, laptops, and other products worth about Rs 1 crore and sold them in the local market with the help of a broker. Additionally, he sent them to Nepal through some mobile dealers.

Congress MP Rakesh Rathore arrested in rape case

Lucknow (PNS): Congress Member of Parliament Rakesh Rathore was arrested by the Sitapur police on Thursday in a rape case. The Congress leader was taken in custody in the middle of a press conference and was taken by the police under heavy police security to the court after he surrendered.

A woman had filed a complaint against Rathore, accusing him of raping her on January 15. In her complaint, the woman alleged that the Congress MP raped her multiple times in a span of four years, promising to push her political career and marry her. The woman also submitted to the police all her call details and call recordings with the MP. The police arrested Rathore a day after his anticipatory bail plea was rejected by the Lucknow bench of the Allahabad High Court in the matter and asked him to surrender.

Speaking to media persons in Sitapur, Rathore said, "The High Court granted me a two-week time to appear before the lower court and follow the legal procedure. So, I am surrendering before the police in this connection... I am confident that I will get justice in the court of people and the court

of law... The matter is sub judice, so it will not be correct to speak on it." Before the High Court, the MP-MLA court in Sitapur had also rejected Rathore's anticipatory bail plea on January 23.

The husband of the woman had also filed a separate complaint accusing Rathore and his son of putting pressure on the family members to settle the case.

Rathore had contested Uttar Pradesh assembly elections as an independent and Bharatiya Janata Party candidate before joining Congress. He has also been associated with Uttar Pradesh's former chief minister Mayawati's Bahujan Samaj Party. It may be mentioned that on Wednesday, the Lucknow bench of Allahabad High Court had rejected the anticipatory bail plea of Rakesh Rathore. The court asked the MP to surrender in the sessions court within two weeks and also said his bail plea should be disposed of as soon as possible without any delay. On January 17, a case was registered against Congress' Sitapur MP Rakesh Rathore after a complaint from a woman, who accused him of sexually exploiting her for the past four years by promising to marry her.

Kumbh tragedy: Search for missing devotees continues

More than 36 hours have passed since the tragic stampede at the Maha Kumbh, but for Manoj Dubey, sleep remains elusive. He has been searching frantically for his 72year-old mother, Kamla Devi, who has been missing since the chaos unfolded.

Kamla Devi had traveled from Jhansi with a group of 18 devotees for the auspicious Mauni Amavasya snan. "We have searched every hospital, every lost-and-found center. but there's no trace of her," said Dubey, his voice breaking. "She was wearing a saffron saree and had an identity card around her neck, but her phone is switched off. We don't know if she is safe or injured." The tragedy struck between 1 a.m. and 2 a.m. on Wednesday when a massive crowd broke through barricades at the ghats, triggering a stampede that left hundreds of devotees trampled. Witnesses described a chaotic scene, with people falling over one another in the dark, shouting for help. Nearly 18 hours after the

Still the incident happened," Akhilesh Yadav said, alleging that instead of concentrating on crowd management, the entire BJP government was busy making a false propaganda of making "historical arrangements" for the Maha Kumbh. Akhilesh Yadav said, "I got information about the accident at 2:48 in the night. In such a situation, the government must have also got the information. It is unfortunate that the government tweeted about the incident early in the morning. It was beyond imagination. The role of the media should have been different. There should have been no hesitation in raising questions on the kind of behaviour of the media.'

"The media was promoting Kumbh. So the government should have told from time to time where the system is not right. Just saying that this incident hap-pened due to VIP movement is unfortunate. Because the government itself was distributing cards. Check the past records, no one was ever given cards. Devotees come on their own. Those who did not get the card lost their lives. Those who got the card did not lose their lives. Those who were VIPs got the card," Akhilesh Yadav added.

He said that people came to the Maha Kumbh with religious sentiments. "People do not join any government; they come because of faith in Kumbh. The government is responsible for whatever has happened. The BJP cannot back out from it. Both the governments of Lucknow and Delhi are responsible for it," the Samajwadi Party chief said.



A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Ujjal Bhuyan said each and every member of the armed forces who was awarded relief of disability pension from the Armed Forces Tribunal need not be dragged to the top court and the Centre ought to exercise some discretion in filing appeals.

"There has to be some pragmatic view. An army personnel works for 15, 20 years and suppose there is some disability, and order of the Armed Forces Tribunal directs payment of disability pension. Why should these persons be dragged to the Supreme Court?" asked

It went on, "We are of the view that the Union govern-



ment must evolve a policy. There has to be some scrutiny before a decision is taken to drag members of the armed forces to the Supreme

India to seal Rafale-M, Scorpene deals with France soon

Tndia is expected to seal in the Inext few weeks procurement of 26 naval variant of Rafale jets and three Scorpene submarines from France to further crank up its naval prowess, people familiar with the matter said on Thursday. It is expected that the procurement will be announced during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Paris next month to attend a summit on artificial intelligence. Modi and French President Emmanuel Macron are expected to hold bilateral talks on the sideline of the summit, being held on February 10

The people cited above said all the two deals are in the final stage of finalisation and that the Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) will have to look at them. In July 2023, the defence ministry approved the purchase of 22 Rafale (marine) jets from France, primarily for deployment on board the indigenously built aircraft carrier INS Vikrant. The Defence Ministry had also cleared pro-



curement of three Scorpene submarines from France. Under the Indian Navy's Project 75, six Scorpene submarines have already been constructed in India by Mazagon Dock Limited (MDL) in cooperation with the Naval Group of France. The procurement of the Rafale (M) jets along with associated ancillary equipment including weapon systems and spares would be based on an inter-Governmental agreement

The Indian Air Force bought 36 Rafale fighter aircraft in flyaway condition. There is a thinking in the IAF that it should go for at least two more squadrons of the Rafale jets. The defence and strategic ties between India and France have been on an upswing in the last few years. In July 2023, India and France announced a raft of ground-breaking defence cooperation projects including the joint development of jet and helicopter engines. The two strategic partners also had expressed commitment to cooperate in the co-development and co-production of advanced defence technologies, including for the benefit

ED cracks down on adulterated milk products manufacturer, freezes ₹6.26 Crore

The Enforcement Directorate on Thursday Enforcement said it has frozen fixed deposits worth crores of rupees, seized Rs 25 lakh in cash, a few highend vehicles and property documents worth more than Rs 60 crore during raids against a Madhya Pradesh-based milk products manufacturing com-

pany. The searches were undertaken on January 29 in Bhopal, Sehore and Morena as part of a money laundering investigation against Jayshri Gayatri Food Products Pvt. Ltd. And its key persons like Kishan Modi, Payal Modi, Amit Kuklod and

The ED alleged that the company manufactured "adulterated" milk products and used "false" laboratory certificates purportedly issued by BIS/NABL to secure certification from the Export Inspection Agency (EIA) located at Indore.

This certificate was used for export of the adulterated milk products, it claimed.

The agency found that these certificates were either originally issued to other companies or obtained "fraudulently" by the accused.

So far, 63 "forged" lab certificates have been identified which were used for the export of adulterated milk products to various countries as well as for domestic consumption, the ED

Greenland gambit

Trump's attempt to acquire Greenland carries serious risks, threatening stability and undermining peace in the region

fter assuming office, President Donald Trump has taken an aggressive approach, disrupting the global order—first economically and now through forceful tactics. His push to acquire the Danish island of Greenland by any means signals a potential standoff between the US and Denmark, and possibly even Europe. The push by the US President Donald Trump to acquire Greenland has led to tension between the United States and Denmark. While the idea was initially dismissed as implausible, Trump's administration has intensified efforts to assert influence over the resourcerich Arctic territory under Denmark though autonomous. Denmark has reacted with caution but with significant military reinforcements to protect its territory from any US misadventure. Greenland, the world's largest island, holds immense strategic value. With its rich reserves of rare earth minerals, vital for modern technology and defence systems, Greenland has become a focal point in the global competition. China dom-

inates the rare-earth market, and the US sees Greenland as a potential alternative source to reduce its dependency on Chinese supplies.

Besides, Greenland's location provides a strategic foothold in the Arctic to dominate region. With climate change melting the Arctic ice and opening new shipping routes and exposing untapped resources, global powers, including the US, Russia, and China, have shown heightened interest in securing influence. The island is also home to the Thule Air Base, a key US military installation that plays a pivotal role in missile defence and early warning systems. Denmark has firmly rejected Trump's ambitions, reinforcing

its commitment to Greenland's autonomy. In response to the escalating pressure, Denmark has announced a significant military expansion, allocating an additional 14.6 billion Danish crowns (\$2.05 billion) to enhance security in the region. The new military strategy includes the acquisition of three Arctic naval vessels, two long-range drones, and satellite surveillance systems. These enhancements aim to address the limited military presence in Greenland so far. While Greenland remains a semiautonomous territory under Danish sovereignty, its growing geopolitical relevance has placed it at the center of international power struggles. The implications of US bid to take control over Greenland would be profound. Such a move would dramatically shift Arctic geopolitics, altering the balance of power and potentially heightening tensions between the US, Denmark, Russia, and China. The European Union has also expressed concerns over any potential shift in Greenland's status, as it would affect security dynamics in the region. It remains to be seen whether Trump's push to acquire Greenland will gain momentum or fade into history. Greenland has now become a pivotal battleground, and the Arctic, a once peaceful region, could soon become a new flashpoint the world can ill afford.

Seed innovation: Key to agricultural growth



Unlocking India's full agricultural potential demands strong policies, industry collaboration and a commitment to technological advancements, especially in seed innovation

ndia stands at the cusp of a transformative shift in its agricultural landscape, driven by its growing population, expanding economy, and the mounting challenges posed by climate change. With the Union Budget 2024 allocating Rs 1.52 lakh crore to agriculture, the government's recognition of the sector's importance in ensuring India's economic future is clear. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision for agricultural growth focuses on innovation, sustainability, and resilience. For India to realise its agricultural potential by 2025, however, clear policy frameworks and effective industry collaboration are essen-

At the core of this transformation is the need for a robust, resilient, and technologically advanced seed sector. As India transitions from a traditional, productioncentric agricultural model to one that prioritises farmer welfare and income generation, there is a fundamental opportunity to improve livelihoods and promote sustainable agricultural practices. A critical aspect of Îndia's agricultural future lies in scientific advancements, particularly in the development of genetically modified (GM) crops. Globally, GM crops have proven successful in increasing yields, improving pest resistance, and reducing dependency on chemical inputs. Yet, India has been cautious in adopting GM technology, and a transparent, science-based approach to its reg-ulation could help unlock its potential. A national consensus on the safe deployment of GM crops would support the goal of reducing reliance on imports, especially in essential crops like oilseeds and pulses.

The importance of collaboration between the private sector and public institutions such as the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) cannot be overstated. Such partnerships drive significant research and developent efforts across key crops like oilseeds, cotton, and maize, while also protecting intellectual property rights (IPR) to incentivise further innovation. A strengthened IPR framework could position India as a global leader in agricultural research and technol-



a last resort. Programmes targeting youth education and entrepreneurship in agriculture are gaining traction, with initiatives like the National Agriculture Market (eNAM) and various skill development programs helping young farmers access better technologies and market opportunities. Moreover, youth-led startups in agritech are making an

impact in areas like precision farming, farm-to-table models, and sustainable agriculture practices, providing innovative solutions to long-standing For example, the 'Agri-

Startups' ecosystem is seeing rapid growth, with over 3,100 agritech startups currently operating in India (as of 2023), and an investment influx that has grown by 20 per cent annually. This demonstrates the growing interest among youth to innovate and lead the agricultural transformation. Furthermore, sectoral integration across the agricultural value chain is becoming more pronounced. India's agri-

cultural ecosystem is complex, with each sector, such as poultry, dairy, horticulture, and rural development, playing a distinct yet interconnected role in the overall growth. The government is focusing on strengthening these individual sectors as part of a holistic approach. The GST framework currently presents challenges for the agricultural sec-tor, particularly about the costs and complexities of compliance for farmers and seed

companies. Simplifying the GST system could reduce operational bur-dens and make agricultural practices more sustainable and profitable. Additionally, targeted tax relief or incentives for Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) in agriculture, particularly in seed production, agro-processing, and machinery manufacturing, could support growth and job creation, especially in

Restoring the 200 per cent income tax deduction for research and development (R&D) expenditure could significantly boost innovation in the seed industry. By reducing the financial pressures sociated with R&D, such a policy would incentivise greater investment in developing drought-resistant and higher-yielding crop varieties. This would be particularly important in critical sectors such as oilseeds and pulses,

where India faces challenges in achieving self-sufficiency.In addition, a unified nationallevel registration process for seeds, along with the "One Nation, One License" policy, would simplify operations for seed companies. The current multi-state registration process often leads to inefficiencies and delays, hindering the growth of the industry.

A streamlined system would enable companies to operate more efficiently and ensure that high-quality seeds reach farmers promptly, fostering growth and innovation in the sector. Research Linked Incentive (RLI) schemes could further encourage innovation by offering financial incentives for successful R&D outcomes. This would accelerate the development of new seed varieties that are climate-resilient and high-yielding, reinforcing India's position as a leader in global agricultural research. Looking ahead, the future of seed research holds exciting possibilities, particularly in areas like biofortified crops, climate resilience, and hybrid development. Breeding drought-tolerant varieties of rice, oilseeds, and pulses will be essential to ensure food security in an era of unpre-

Challenging menstrual taboos in rural India



Cultural taboos and lack of awareness often confine girls and women to their homes, keeping them away from school, kitchens and religious spaces

In India, approximately 335 million women experience menstruation but the majority of them are uncomfortable about speaking about it or discussing their menstrual hygiene problems. Parents, especially in rural areas are often ignorant and unprepared to discuss this subject with their adolescent daughters. However, an ongoing campaign called 'Red Achcha Hai' (Red is Good) running in three states is breaking the silence around menstruation and debunking taboos and restrictions that confine girls and women to their homes and bar them from attending school, entering the kitchen and participating in cultural and religious

First started in 2018 as a programme to make women and adolescents in rural areas in Gujarat aware of body literacy, fertility and menstrual hygiene by CHETNA, a notfor-profit working on nutri-tion, health and women's empowerment, it acquired a new urgency in 2020 when newspapers headlined the shocking story of how girls in a college hostel, supported by a religious trust, were asked to

strip by the college authorities for breaking the hostel's rules for menstruating girls.

This made CHETNA realise that they needed to accelerate and escalate their efforts. Thus, the Red Achcha Hai campaign. Started with a new vigour first in rural areas of Gujarat, and Rajasthan and later in Madhya Pradesh, the eye-catching Red Achcha Hai campaign tapped the power of drama and visual communication with the CHETNA team dressed in red explaining the menstrual process, the need for menstrual hygiene and breaking myths and taboos around menstruation. The positive impact of this awareness programme and distribution of 2199 menstrual hygiene management (MHM) kits containing three information booklets, a

clothes brush, a nail cutter

and a rope to dry the washed

cloth, led to its continuation in 47 schools of Sansad block of Ahmedabad since February 2024. Even while focusing on adolescents, the campaign continued to reach

out to women too. In 2023, when the campaign was being conducted across 16 villages of Jhagadia block, Bharuch district of Gujarat, a woman sarpanch was invited as a chief guest for an event to celebrate nutrition week organised on the grounds of an adjoining temple.

The sarpanch expressed her reservations as it was the fourth day of her period. However, after some discussions on the myths surrounding menstruation, the CHET-NA team motivated her to come to the function. The sarpanch not only came for the function and sat on the temple steps but entered the

This act made her an icon for breaking the myths and taboos surrounding menstruation and helped to inspire other women shackled by societal barriers imposed by their families during their menstrual cycle. A mother of a malnourished child, who writing on development andwas also one of the partici-

pants, was menstruating on the day of the function and was reluctant to attend However, when she was informed that the sarpanch, who was also menstruating, had entered the temple, she took courage and followed

The sarpanch's actions challenged traditional taboos and set a powerful example. It highlighted the power of education and support in overcoming menstrual stigma. The campaign has reached more than 10,000 women and girls and many young people are coming forward to support the campaign.

The students of Riverside School of Ahmedabad City supported the campaign by raising funds for the initiative to end discrimination against women and girls. Poor menstrual hygiene practices may lead to recurring reproductive tract infections which may increase the risk of cervical cancer. The 'Red Achcha Hai' campaign is changing mindsets and empowering women and girls to break free from restrictive cultural norms. (The author is a journalist gender; views are personal)

CASH PROMISES TO WOO VOTERS

Madam — It is with reference to the news "AAP-BJP fight it out on social media over Guarantees"- January 30 While election freebies are not a new trend in Indian elections, the issue has become hotly debated in recent months. Recently, AAP, BJP and Congress have announced schemes and cash benefits to woo voters in poll-bound Delhi. They have made tens of promises to fulfil the needs of the poor, the middle class, women, youth, priests, and other sections of society if they form a government in Delhi.

When AAP announces Rs 2100 per month to every unemployed woman of Delhi resident, BJP promises Rs 2500 to those below the poverty line and Rs 21,000 to pregnant women, and Congress promises Rs 2500 to every woman under the proposed Pyari Didiyojana. Also, AAP promises full financial assistance to children from dalit families for pursuing higher education. When BJP promises Rs 15000 for up to two attempts for students preparing for competitive examinations, Congress promises Rs 8500 under the Yuva Udan Yojana apprenticeship scheme for a year. While RBI has warned that rising expenditure on subsidies, including cash transfers to women, could limit productive invest-

Activists are yet to arrive at a consensus on whether such schemes actually empower women or not. There are so many cases in the Supreme Court about freebies and cash transfers to residents. A few months ago, SC has issued notices to some state governments and the central government, also to the Election Commission of India, on the plea seeking comprehensive guidelines to bar political parties from distributing cash and other freebies at the expense of taxpayers. A total ban on freebies should be implemented by enacting laws at the centre.

TRUMPS INFLUENCE ON **INDIAN ECONOMY**

How India's digital economy could be shaped by his policies

onald Trump, the 45th President of the United States. has left an indelible mark on both American and global politics. While much of the discussion about his policies and influence has focused on traditional industries like trade, defence, and foreign relations, Trump's impact could extend beyond these sectors — especially to economies like India. Freebies could push Delhi to fiscal disaster -



Despite repeated warnings from the Supreme Court about the detrimental impact of freebies on free and fair elections, political parties continue to offer them



n the din of blistering campaign in Delhi with the central theme of major political parties being on "freebies" - an acronym for 'something given free of charge' – it may be worthwhile to remind them about two observations made by the Supreme Court (SC). In an order in S Subramaniam & Ors given in July 2013, the SC had observed that the distribution of freebies of any kind influences all people. "It shakes the root of free and fair elections to a large degree." A decade later, hearing a PIL on 'freebies', on January 25, 2022, it observed "This is no doubt a serious issue, budget for freebies is going above the regular Budget".

But, all this seems to have fallen on deaf ears. The state elections held since 2022 have witnessed political parties intensely competing with each other to mes-merise voters with a deadly combination of free goods and services and cash assistance. These have played a domineering role in winning elections. In Delhi, the offers have reached their 'NADIR'. The starting point was an announcement by the finance minister Atishi in the budget for 2024-25 reg. The Mukhyamantri Mahila Samman Yojana (MMSY) under which, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government will give Rs 1000 per month to all the women above the age of 18 in the national capital. Meanwhile, the ex-Arvind Kejriwal promised an increase in THAT AMOUNTS TO Chief Minister and convener of AAP income support under the MMSY to Rs 2,100 a month for every woman.

AAP has also promised free medical services to all above 60 at all hospitals; financing foreign education for Dalit students; free bus travel for all students; 50 per cent concession on metro fares; life insurance cover of Rs 10 lakh, accident insurance of Rs 5 lakh for all auto-rickshaw drivers and e-rickshaw pullers; wedding aid of Rs 1 lakh for their daughters and free coaching for their children; Rs 18,000 per month for all pujaris and granthis etc.

Not to be left behind, the BJP has come up with a package that is far more lucrative. It has promised Rs 2,500 a

Taking the average expense of educating a child in India at the bare minimum of Rs. 20,000 per annum, the total expense on "needy students" in the city would be about Rs 2200 crore annually. The additional burden of these four guarantees alone on the Delhi government's budget is Rs 27,950 crore (20,100+3150+2500+2200).

Other freebies would bloat this figure by several thousand crore. Already, the finances of the Delhi government are in a precarious Against the total expenditure of Rs 76,000 crore during FY 2024-25, the total revenue is estimated at around Rs 58,000

This leads to a fiscal deficit (FD) of Rs 18,000 crore which is 80 per cent higher than the FD for FY 2023-24 at Rs 10,000 crore. The surge in FD is despite a steep reduction of over 30 per cent in capital expenditure from the bud-

get estimate (BE) of Rs 22,000 crore for FY 2023-24 to Rs 15,000 crore for FY 2024-25.

The government's current debt is about Rs 40,000 crore. But, this is not all. We also need to add the loans taken by its departments such as Delhi Jal Board (DJB): Rs 70,000 crore and Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC): Rs 10,000 crore as the liability for servicing those debts is vested entirely in the NCT government. This takes the total debt of Delhi to Rs 120,000 crore. The situation has come to such a

pass that CM Atishi has approached the Centre seeking a loan of Rs 10,000 crore from the National Small Savings Fund (NSSF). The precariousness of the state's finances has a lot to do with the freebies which are estimated to cost about Rs Add to this at least Rs 30,000 crore being the impact of guarantees given during this election, freebies alone would dent the exchequer by Rs 41,000 crore annually.

Delhi government could be staring at an FD of close to Rs 50,000 crore. And, its debt would balloon to Rs 150,000 crore. The ball won't stop here. When used to doles, people will want more and more and parties can't say no. Those indulging in extortion will be booked under MCOCA: Ajit Pawar tells party workers

A mid ongoing clamour for his party's minister Dhananjay Munde's resignation over the recent murder of a sarpanch, Maharashtra deputy chief minister and NČP president Ajit Pawar on Thursday told his party workers saying that those found indulging in extortion would be booked under Maharashtra Control of Organised Crime Act (MCOCA).

Addressing his party workers on his first visit to Beed district after taking over as the guardian minister of the district, Pawar exhorted his party workers to "maintain clean character" and "not to mingle with wrong people".

Munde, Pawar said: "Maintain a clean character. Everybody should take care not to mingle with the wrong people. Our image among the people here (in Beed) should be good. Political interference will not be tolerated in the administrative works and anyone demanding extortion money in development works would be severely dealt with."

Pawar's statement should be seen in the context of the arrest of Walmik Karad, a close aide of Munde, in an extortion case linked to the murder of sarpanch Santosh Deshmukh in Beed district. An NCP MLA from Parli constituency in his home district of Beed, Munde is the Food, Civil Supplies and

Minister in the Devendra Fadnavis-led MahaYuti gov-

Incidentally, Pawar's statement came a day after Munde said that he would not hesitate to resign from his post if asked to do so either by Pawar or Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis. Munde was present when Pawar made the state-

Maintaining that he would not hesitate to invoke MCOCA against those indulging in extortion, Pawar said: "If I come to know about such activities, I will not spare anyone and invoke MCOCA against those persons. I have already told (Chief Minister) Devendra Fadnavis that when I am taking this responsibili-

The police have found a link between the extortion case involving a windmill company and the Sarpanch murder case. In the previous (extortion) case lodged by the local windmill company, one of the accused was Walmiki Karad, who is linked to Munde. Karad is currently under police custody. Decrying the trend of brandishing guns in the public and firing in the air being witnessed in Beed district, Pawar said: "I am also going to tell the police department to act against those found brandishing a revolver or firing in the air or moving around the place with revolver holsters on their waist. Their arm licences will be cancelled.

Hamas frees 8 more hostages

Israel puts prisoner release on hold

AP KHAN YOUNIS

Hamas-led militants freed eight hostages on Thursday as part of the cease-fire in the Gaza Strip, but the chaotic handover of some of the captives, who masked militants shuttled through a rowdy crowd of thousands, drew an angry protest from Israel.

Israel was supposed to release 110 Palestinian prisoners later in the day, including around 30 serving life sentences for deadly attacks against Israelis. But Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said the move was put on hold until the "safe release" of hostages can be assured.

assured.

Over six weeks, Hamas is to free
33 Israeli hostages — roughly
one third of those held— in
exchange for nearly 2,000
Palestinian prisoners. As part of
the truce, Israel has also pulled its forces back from major cities and allowed hundreds of thousands of displaced Palestinians to return to their homes in war-torn Gaza.

The sides are also to begin talks on a second phase aimed at winding down the deadliest and most destructive war ever fought between Israel and Hamas, whose October 7, 2023, attack into Israel sparked the

fighting.
The hostages released Thursday included a female Israeli soldier, a 29-year-old Israeli woman, an 80-year-old Israeli man, and five Thai labourers who had been working in southern Israel

when they were captured.
The first hostage, soldier Agam
Berger, 20, was released after
Hamas paraded her in front of a crowd in the heavily destroyed urban Jabaliya refugee camp in northern Gaza.

Hours later, a chaotic scene unfolded at a handover of the other seven hostages in the southern city of Khan Younis, in front of the destroyed home of slain Hamas leader Yahya

Hundreds of militants from Hamas and the smaller Islamic Jihad group arrived with a convoy, and thousands of people

gathered to watch, some from the tilted rooftops of bombedout buildings.

Footage showed hostage Arbel Yehoud looking stunned as masked militants hustled her through the shouting crowd, sometimes pushing people About 20 friends of Yehoud

gathered in southern Israel watched as the tense scene unfolded on live television. Some cried. Others had their hands over their eyes or mouths. One friend yelled at the news anchor to "shut up" when she said the situation appeared dangerous. The crowd then burst into tears after she was turned over to the Red Cross. Netanyahu condemned the "shocking scenes" and called on international mediators to ensure the safety of hostages in

future releases. The other Israeli released Thursday was Gadi Moses, 80. Five Thai nationals were freed and identified by Israel as Watchara Sriaoun, 33, Pongsak Tanna, 36, Sathian Suwankam, 35, Bannawat Seathao, 27, and Surasak Lamnau, 32.

The Israeli army confirmed all eight were brought into Israel. The government released footage of Berger, who was among five young, female soldiers abducted in the October 7 attack, hugging and crying with her parents.

Earlier, people cheered, clapped and whistled in a square in Tel Aviv as Berger's handover unfolded on big screens next to a large clock that's counted the days the hostages have been in captivity. Some held signs saying: "Agam we're waiting for you at home."

At the square, the White House's Mideast envoy, Steve Witkoff, met briefly with families of hostages. "My message is that we're with the families and that we care for them," he told The Associated Press.

A number of foreign workers were taken captive along with dozens of Israeli civilians and soldiers during Hamas' attack. Twenty-three Thais were among more than 100 hostages released during a week-long ceasefire in November 2023. Israel says three Thais remain in captivity, two of whom are believed to be dead.

Among the people set to be released from prisons is Zakaria Zubeidi, a prominent former militant leader and theatre director who took part in a dramatic jailbreak in 2021 before being rearrested days later. Israel said Yehoud was sup-

posed to have been freed on Saturday and delayed the open-ing of crossings to northern

Gaza when she was not.

The United States, Egypt and Qatar, which brokered the ceasefire after a year of tough negotiations, resolved the dispute with an agreement that Yehoud would be released on Thursday. Another three hostages, all men, are set to be freed Saturday along with dozens more Palestinian pris-

On Monday, Israel began allowing Palestinians to return to northern Gaza, the most heavily destroyed part of the terri-tory, and hundreds of thou-sands streamed back. Many found only mounds of rubble where their homes had been. In the first phase of the ceasefire, Hamas is set to release a total of 33 Israeli hostages, including women, children, older adults and sick or wounded men, in exchange for nearly 2,000 Palestinian prisoners. Israel says Hamas has confirmed that eight of the hostages to be released in this phase are

Palestinians have cheered the release of the prisoners, who they widely see as heroes who have sacrificed for the cause of ending Israel's decades-long occupation of lands they want for a future state.

Israeli forces have meanwhile pulled back from most of Gaza,

allowing hundreds of thousands of people to return to what remains of their homes and humanitarian groups to surge assistance.

The deal calls for Israel and Hamas to negotiate a second phase in which Hamas would release the remaining hostages and the ceasefire would continue indefinitely. The war could resume in early March if an agreement is not reached. Israel says it is still committed

to destroying Hamas, even after the militant group reasserted its rule over Gaza within hours of the truce. A key far-right part-ner in Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's coalition is already calling for the war to resume after the ceasefire's first phase. Hamas says it won't release the remaining hostages without an end to the war and a full Israeli withdrawal from Gaza.

Hamas started the war when it sent thousands of fighters storming into Israel. The militants killed some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and abducted around 250.

Israel's ensuing air and ground war among the deadliest and most destructive in decades. More than 47,000 Palestinians have been killed, over half of them women and children, according to Gaza's Health Ministry, which does not say how many of the dead were militants.

The Israeli military says it killed over 17,000 fighters, without providing evidence, and that it went to great lengths to try to spare civilians.

It blames civilian deaths on Hamas because its fighters operate in dense residential neighbourhoods and put mili-tary infrastructure near homes,

schools and mosques. The Israeli offensive has transformed entire neighbourhoods into mounds of gray rubble, and it's unclear how or when anything will be rebuilt.

Around 90 per cent of Gaza's population has been displaced, often multiple times, with hundreds of thousands of people living in squalid tent camps or shuttered schools.

Jet with 64 aboard collides with US Army helicopter

n American Airlines jet An American Airlines Jet Carrying 60 passengers and four crew members collided Wednesday with an Army helicopter while landing at Ronald Reagan National Airport near Washington, prompting a large search-and-rescue operation in

the nearby Potomac River. There were multiple fatalities, according to a person familiar with the matter, but the precise number of victims was unclear as rescue crews hunted for any survivors.

Three soldiers were onboard the helicopter, an Army official

There was no immediate word on the cause of the collision, but all takeoffs and landings from the airport were halted as dive the airport were natied as dive teams scoured the site and helicopters from law enforce-ment agencies across the region flew over the scene in methodical search for bodies.

"We are going to recover our fellow citizens," District of Columbia Mayor Muriel Bowser said at a somber news conference at the airport Thursday morning in which she declined to say how many bodies had been recovered. Sen. Roger Marshall of Kansas

said, "When one person dies it's a tragedy, but when many, many, many people die it's an unbearable sorrow."

President Donald Trump said he had been "fully briefed on this terrible accident" and, referring to the passengers, added, "May God Bless their

Passengers on the flight included a group of figure skaters, their coaches and family members who were returning from a development camp that fol-lowed the US Figure Skating

Championships in Wichita. "We are devastated by this unspeakable tragedy and hold the victims' families closely in our hearts," US Figure Skating said in a statement.

The Federal Aviation Administration said the midair crash occurred before 9 p.m. EST when a regional jet that had departed from Wichita, Kansas, collided with a military

helicopter on a training flight while on approach to an airport runway. It occurred in some of the most tightly controlled and monitored airspace in the world, just over three miles south of the White House and the Capitol.

Investigators will try to piece together the aircrafts' final moments before their collision, including contact with air traffic controllers as well as a loss of altitude by the passenger

American Airlines Flight 5342 was inbound to Reagan National at an altitude of about 400 feet and a speed of about 140 miles per hour when it suf-fered a rapid loss of altitude over the Potomac River, according to data from its radio transponder. Canadian-made Bombardier CRJ-701 twinengine jet, manufactured in

2004, can be configured to carry up to 70 passengers.

A few minutes before landing, air traffic controllers asked the arriving commercial jet if it could land on the shorter

Runway 33 at Reagan National and the pilots said they were able. Controllers then cleared the plane to land on Runway 33. Flight tracking sites showed the plane adjust its approach to the new runway. Less than 30 seconds before the

crash, an air traffic controller crash, an air traffic controller asked the helicopter if it had the arriving plane in sight. The controller made another radio call to the helicopter moments later: "PAT 25 pass behind the CRJ." Seconds after that, the two airgreft collided craft collided.

The plane's radio transponder stopped transmitting about 2,400 feet short of the runway, roughly over the middle of the river. Video from an observation camera at the nearby Kennedy Center showed two sets of lights consistent with aircraft appearing to join in a fireball. "I know that flight. I've flown it several times myself," said Sen. Jerry Moran of Kansas. He said he expected that many people in Wichita would know people who were on the flight. This is a very personal circumstance," he said. The collision occurred on a warm winter evening in

Washington, with temperatures registering as high as 60 degrees Fahrenheit, following a stretch days earlier of intense cold and

On Wednesday, the Potomac River was 36 degrees Fahrenheit, according to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. The National Weather Service reported that wind gusts of up to 25 mph were possible in the area throughout the evening. American Airlines CEO Robert Isom expressed "deep sorrow" for the crash and said the company was focused on the needs of passengers, crew, first responders and families and loved ones of those involved. Some 300 first responders were on scene. Inflatable rescue boats were launched into the Potomac River from a point along the George Washington Parkway, just north of the airport, and first responders set up light tow-ers from the shore to illuminate the area near the collision site. At least a half-dozen boats were scanning the water using searchlights.

"It's a highly complex operation," said D.C. fire chief John Donnelly. "The conditions out there are extremely rough for

the responders."
The US Army described the helicopter as a UH-60 Blackhawk based at Fort Belvoir in Virginia. The helicopter was on a training flight. Military air-craft frequently conduct training flights in and around the congested and heavily-restricted airspace around the nation's capital for familiarization and continuity of government plan-

The crash is serving as a major test for two of the Trump administration's newest agency leaders.Pete Hegseth, sworn in days ago as defence secretary, posted on social media that an investigation has been "launched immediately" by the Army and the Defence Department.

Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy, just sworn in earlier this week, said at a somber news conference at the airport early Thursday that his agency would provide all possible resources to the investigation.

 ${\mathbb F}$ or a few hours last week, the International Criminal Court looked poised to take a Libyan warlord into custody. Instead, member state Italy sent the head of a notorious network of detention centres back home. That has left the court without a single trial ahead for the first time since it arrested its first suspect in 2006. And it's now facing serious external pressure, notably from US President Donald Trump. Though its docket remains empty, the court still wields an USD 200 million annual budget and a large number of legal eagles keen to lay their hands on Russian President Vladimir Putin and Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu.

"The lack of trials damages the court's reputation," said Danya Chaikel of the International investigate and prosecute those most responsible for international crimes."

Empty courtrooms show how hard it is to end impunity The only permanent global court of last resort to prosecute individ-uals responsible for the world's most heinous atrocities has not been in this position for almost two decades.Congolese warlord Thomas Lubanga became the first person convicted by court in The Hague. In 2012, he was sentenced to 14 years in prison for conscripting child soldiers.Since Lubanga's trial began, the court has had a slow but steady stream of proceedings. "They haven't issued arrest warrants for people who they are likely to arrest," says Mark Kersten, an international criminal justice expert at University of the Fraser Valley in Canada. Ultimately, countries are responsible for physically apprehending people and bringing them to The Hague, says Chaikel, whose group oversees nearly 200 human rights

organisations worldwide.

Bill introduced in US Senate to restrict birthright citizenship

Washington (PTI): A group of Republican Senators has introduced a bill in the US Senate to restrict birthright citizenship to the children of illegal immigrants and nonimmigrants on temporary visas.

According to Senators Lindsey Graham, Ted Cruz and Katie Britt, who introduced the bill, the exploitation of birthright cit-izenship is a major pull factor for illegal immigration and a weakness for national security.

The US is one of only 33 countries in the world with no restrictions on birthright citizenship, they said.
The legislative move comes after an exec-

utive order on the matter, signed by President Donald Trump on the first day of his presidency, has been blocked by a federal judge in Washington state.

The Center for Immigration Studies estimates that in 2023, there were 2,25,000 to 2,50,000 births to illegal immigrants, amounting to close to seven per cent of births in the US. It is long overdue for the United States to

change its policy on birthright citizenship

because it is being abused in so many ways, said Graham. "One example is birth tourism, where wealthy individuals from China and other nations come to the United States simply to have a child who will be an American citizen. When you look at the magnets that draw people to America, birthright citizenship is one of the largest," he said. "I also appreciate President Trump's executive order to address birthright citizenship. It is time for the United States to align itself with the rest of the world and restrict this practice once and for all," Graham said.

'The promise of American citizenship should not incentivise illegal migration, but that's exactly what has happened for far too long," said Britt.

'Senator Lindsey Graham's and my Birthright Citizenship Act would codify President Trump's commonsense stance and end the abuse of birthright citizenship that I do not believe is consistent with the original meaning of the 14th Amendment's Citizenship Clause," she added. "This will protect our nation's sovereignty, disincen-

tivise illegal migration, and ensure America's citizenship practices are stronger and better aligned with peer countries

around the globe," Britt said.
The three Senators said in September 2024, two individuals from California were found guilty in a "birth tourism" scheme. Predominantly Chinese clients paid the operators of a "maternity hotel" tens of thousands of dollars to come to the US to give birth. Clients were coached on how to lie during the admissions process. A 2022 Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee report found a birthing company catering to the wives of Russian oligarchs, celebrities, athletes and public figures. The Birthright Citizenship Act of 2025 specifies who can receive citizenship by virtue of their birth in the United States, including children born to at least one parent who is either a citizen or national of the US, a lawful permanent resident of the US, or an alien performing active service in the armed forces. This bill only applies to children born after the date of enactment.

State-owned gas utility GAIL (India) Ltd on Thursday reported a 36 per cent rise in net profit in the December quarter after a one-off gain from compensation received from an overseas LNG supplier for non-delivery of committed cargoes.

It posted a standalone net profit of ₹3,867.38 crore in October-December period of FY25 compared with ₹2,842.62 crore in the year-ago period, India's biggest gas transportation and marketing company said in a stock exchange filing.

Revenue from operations was almost unchanged at ₹34,957.76 crore with all business three major segments - natural gas and LPG transportation services, natural gas marketing and petrochemicals-reporting nearly the same revenues as the previous year.

The company had exceptional income ₹2,440.03 crore compensation received from a former unit of Russian energy giant Gazprom.

GAIL had in December 2023 initiated legal proceedings against SEFE

International Arbitration for non-delivery of Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) under a long-term contract.

SEBI imposes ₹7 lakh fine on Motilal Oswal Financial

Services PTI NEW DELHI

Markets regulator, Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) on Thursday imposed a penalty of Rs seven lakh on Motilal Oswal Financial Services Ltd for flouting stock broker and depository participant rules. It has been directed to pay the fine within 45 days, according to an order passed by the SEBI. This came after SEBI conducted inspection of the stock broker and depository participant, MotilalOswal Financial Services Ltd, jointly with stock exchanges and depositories for the inspection period from April 2021 to June

In its probe, the regulator found that Motilal Oswal Financial Services did not resolve 26 complaints within a period of 30 days, transferred securities of credit balance clients to "client unpaid securities account", and incorrectly reported Margin Trading Funding (MTF) collaterals to the exchange. Additionally, it had

wrong reporting and short collection of margin on one instance in CM (capital market) segment, on one instance in FO (futures and options) segment and on five instances in currency derivative segment.

The regulator noted that 39 clients had traded in June 2022 but these clients were considered as inactive by the broker and their funds were parked aside as on June 2022.

I find that the allegation that the Noticee (Motilal Oswal Financial Services) while setting aside funds of ₹3.50 crore belonging to 39 active clients, has shown incorrect reasons viz. Non-availability of client's bank account and nontraceability of client, stands established," SEBI Adjudicating Officer Amar Navlani said.

The regulator said the "Noticee being a SEBI-registered stock broker and depository to be dealt with suitable penalty".

PCB, ICC to organise Champions Trophy opening ceremony on February 16 in Lahore

The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) in conjunction with the ICC will hold the opening ceremony of the upcoming Champions Trophy February 16 in Lahore.

A source in the PCB told PTI that chairman Mohsin Naqvi had approved a scheduled list of events prior to the first match of the tournament on February 19 at the National Stadium in Karachi between Pakistan and New Zealand. The PCB will officially open the renovated Gaddafi stadium

on February 7 for which Prime Minister Shahbaz Sharif has been invited as the chief guest. On February 11, the PCB will launch the renovated National Stadium in Karachi with a ceremony in which President Asif Ali Zardari has

been invited as the chief guest.



The source said the PCB and ICC were also working out the schedule of the captains press conference and photoshoots. They are likely to be held in Lahore on February 16.

The opening ceremony is scheduled at Huzoori Bagh at the historic Lahore fort in which officials of different boards, celebrities, legends of the game, and government officials will be invited.

The ICC and PCB are vet to confirm if Indian captain, Rohit Sharma, would be travelling to Lahore for the events.

India will be playing their Champions Trophy matches in Dubai as part of a hybrid model deal between the ICC, PCB and BCCI and if they qualify for the final, then the title clash would also be held in the UAE city on March 9.

Brevis took a one-handed catch at the boundary to Cape batter Tom Abell (1), which was the highlight of their splendid efforts in the field.

"Fielding put us ahead in the game. Ground fielding was amazing, and I think it plays a huge role. It was important to finish with the bonus point and in top two," said MI Cape Town captain Rashid Khan after the match. Former CWG gold-winning boxer Manoj Kumar retires to take up coaching

Former Commonwealth gold-winning F Games gold-winning boxer Manoj Kumar, who dominated the welterweight (64kg) division in India at his prime and did not hesitate to voice his disagreements with national federation's policies, announced his retirement on Thursday to begin a career in coaching.

young athletes who will one day win medals for India in the Olympics," he added. Not among the most physically domineering boxers, Manoj created a niche for himself with his

workman-like approach to the sport which meant wearing down his opponents in the ring with his deceptive defensive game. He could frustrate rivals with

his shell guards and at the same time, surprise them with his very effective counter-attacks, which relied heavily on accurately placed straight punches.

But despite a reasonably successful career, he could never find a steady sponsor who could stand by him

when injuries chipped away at his fortunes.

Manoj was elected as the athletes' representative in the Boxing Federation of India's executive committee in 2016 but had to quit over disagreements with the body on its ever-changing selection policy, which included doing away with the traditional practice of trials for a while. While in that commission, I raised my voice for fellow boxers. And when you do

that too frequently, there are consequences. But I have never really cared. I still don't care," he said. Manoj's many other battles

included a court case to get the Ariuna award in 2014 when the Kapil Dev-led

selection panel ignored him despite the fact that he fulfilled the laid-down criteria as per the points system established for the honour.

He won that fight in the Delhi High Court and was presented the award by the then sports minister Sarbananda Sonowal a few months after the traditional ceremony. He also fought a long and

futile battle to get promotion in the Railways, which had promised him the elevation after the 2010 CWG gold but failed to fulfil it eventually. He is the only Indian boxer aside from the iconic Vijender Singh to have won

two CWG medals.
